Since its formation, HYDRA has focused on removing unauthorized structures, regardless of their history or previous



approvals. One of its most high-profile actions was the swift demolition of Tollywood actor Nagarjuna's N-Convention Center, a facility long surrounded by legal disputes. Within hours of HYDRA's intervention, the site was razed, generating media buzz and sparking discussions about the agency's methods. Another notable case involved the removal of encroachments at the Madapur lime pond, which led to public protests and political backlash due to the speed and scale of the demolitions.

However, HYDRA's actions have not been without controversy. Allegations of selective enforcement have surfaced, particularly from the BJP, which accuses HYDRA of targeting less influential

structures while ignoring more prominent establishments tied to influential figures, such as Owaisi College. These claims suggest that HYDRA's actions may be politically motivated, rather than purely regulatory, raising concerns about the fairness of its approach.

HYDRA's mission goes beyond demolition, focusing also on holding officials accountable for permitting illegal constructions. Commissioner Ranganath emphasized that the agency will target both physical violations and regulatory lapses, aiming to address systemic issues within the city's planning framework. While this commitment is welcomed

by some, it raises concerns about the impact on officials who approved such structures, potentially leading to major upheavals within regulatory bodies.

The agency's operations have sparked political debates and scrutiny, with some questioning whether HYDRA's aggressive actions serve its stated goals of urban management and public safety, or if they are politically motivated. The rapid pace of enforcement has fueled speculation about the true objectives behind HYDRA's activities. This underscores the need for HYDRA to maintain transparency and consistency in its operations to earn public trust.

Deputy CM Calls for GST Reduction on Health Insurance Premiums

TPN, Telangana: Telangana Deputy Chief Minister and Finance Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka has proposed a significant reduction in the Goods and Services Tax (GST) rate on health insurance premiums. During the recent GST Council meeting, chaired by Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, Vikramarka advocated for lowering the GST on health insurance premiums from the current 18% to 5% across all age groups.

Accompanied by SAM Rizvi, Principal Secretary of the Revenue Department, Vikramarka highlighted the need to ease the financial burden on middle and lowermiddle-class families, especially senior citizens, who are grappling with rising medical expenses. "The government has a responsibility to ensure that quality healthcare is accessible and affordable for all," Vikramarka said, emphasizing the need to make health insurance more attainable for citizens.



In addition to the health insurance proposal, Vikramarka also called for the exemption of GST on research grants or donations received from both government and private entities. He recommended the formation of a Group of Ministers (GoM) to further investigate these issues and devise a future action plan. He also expressed his willingness to be part of this proposed GoM.

Addressing the Compensation Cess

The Deputy Chief Minister also raised the issue of the compensation cess. He suggested that once the loan amount borrowed by states is settled, the cess should be incorporated into the State Goods and Services Tax (SGST) component, as the compensation cess was initially designed to support state finances.

Additionally, regarding the recovery of excess ad hoc IGST apportionment, Vikramarka pointed out that Telangana originally received an allocation of 4.02% based on 2015-16 revenue data. However, the recovery rate is now being adjusted to 5.07% using a revised formula. To address this, Vikramarka proposed the creation of a Committee of Officers (CoO) to analyze the situation and develop a comprehensive recovery formula. The Council agreed to this suggestion and has instructed the CoO to submit its findings within one month for review in the next GST Council meeting.

Kondareddypalli Set to Become Telangana's Solar Model Village



TPN, Telangana: In a significant move towards sustainable energy, Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has initiated a project to transform Kondareddypalli into a model

solar village. To kick off this ambitious plan, a comprehensive house-to-house survey is now underway.

The project has garnered attention from top officials, including Mr. Musharraf Farooqui, Chairman and Managing Director of Dakshina Telangana Electricity Distribution Company, Nagar Kurnool District Collector Mr. B. Santhosh, and Redco Vice Chairman and Managing Director Mrs. Anila. Mr. K. Ramulu, Director of the company, along with other key departmental officials, also visited the village to oversee the preliminary phase.

During their visit, the officials engaged

with local residents, farmers, public representatives to explain the details and benefits of the solar project. Kondareddypalli, which serves 1,451 consumers—encompassing 499 domestic, 66 commercial, 867 agricultural, and other categories—was chosen for this pilot project to promote the increased use of solar power within the state.

The house-to-house survey aims to assess the village's current energy needs and solar capacity requirements. Once completed, the survey results will help in determining the appropriate amount of solar power needed, guiding the next steps in implementing the solar initiative effectively.

High Court Orders Fresh Mop-Up Round for Engineering Admissions

TPN, Hyderabad: In a significant ruling, the B.Tech Computer Science Engineering (CSE) course Telangana High Court on Monday directed authorities to conduct a fresh mop-up round of counselling for engineering admissions for the 2024-25 academic year. This decision, made by a division bench comprising Chief Justice Alok Aradhe and Justice J. Sreenivas Rao, overturned an earlier order by a single judge and comes as a major relief to private engineering colleges.

The ruling was issued in response to appeals filed by several private engineering institutions that had contested the government's refusal to approve their request for additional seats. The colleges sought to increase the intake for the

by merging 60 seats from other branches, along with an additional 120 seats approved for spot admissions by the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) and Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University (JNTU).

This decision is expected to benefit private engineering colleges by allowing them to expand their intake capacities, particularly in highdemand courses like B.Tech-CSE. The fresh counselling round will provide students with additional opportunities for admission, while also addressing the growing demand for CSE seats across the state.



KTR Slams CM Revanth Reddy Over Loan Waiver Failures

BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) has sharply criticized Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, accusing him of failing to deliver on his promises regarding loan waivers. KTR's remarks came in response to reports from Pentlavelli village in Nagarkurnool district, where none of the 499 farmers who applied for loan waivers received any relief.

KTR described Pentlavelli as "living proof" of the Chief Minister's false claims about the completion of the loan waiver program. He questioned how the Chief Minister could boast about the program's success

when no loans were waived for any of the farmers in the village. This situation, according to KTR, represents a significant fraud and failure to fulfill promises made to the farming community.

The BRS leader demanded an explanation from Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, who had set deadlines from December to August 15 for the completion of the loan waiver process. KTR challenged Reddy to justify why the promised waivers had not been granted, despite repeated assurances. He expressed skepticism about the Chief Minister's sincerity, highlighting the discrepancy between the claimed 100% completion and the reality of zero waivers.



Farmers in Pentlavelli have been vocal about their grievances, staging a dharna in front of the Primary Agricultural Cooperative Society (PACS) office on Monday. Despite their repeated visits and requests over the past month, they received no response from the authorities. The lack of action has intensified their frustration and underscored the perceived failure of the loan waiver initiative.

KTR's criticism underscores the growing discontent among farmers and the opposition's scrutiny of the government's promises and performance. The situation in Pentlavelli has become a focal point in the debate over the effectiveness and honesty of the loan waiver program.

AICC Appoints Key Election Observers and War Room Chairpersons

TPN, Telangana: In a significant move ahead of the state assembly elections, the All India Congress Committee (AICC) convened a crucial meeting in Delhi, chaired by AICC President Mallikarjun Kharge. The meeting focused on strategic planning for the upcoming elections in Jharkhand, Maharashtra, Haryana, and Jammu and Kashmir.

During the meeting, several key appointments were announced. The AICC designated observers for the Lok Sabha constituencies in Jharkhand and Maharashtra. Specifically, the observers for Jharkhand, which has 14 Lok Sabha constituencies, and for Maharashtra, which has 48 Lok Sabha constituencies, were appointed to oversee election activities and ensure effective management.

Leaders from the Telugu states were appoint-

ed as AICC election observers for various constituencies. Gidugu Rudraraju will oversee the Beed constituency in Maharashtra, while Suresh Shetkar will focus on Nanded. Chamala Kiran Kumar Reddy has been assigned to Chandrapur, and Kusumakumar will observe Shirur. Kota Neelima will

monitor Amaravati. Bellaiah Naik will handle Gadchiroli-Chimur, and Mallu Ravi will be responsible for Yavatmal-Wasim.

In addition, Santosh Kolkunda, General Secretary of Yuvaiana Congress, was appointed as Chairman of the Jharkhand "War Room". Dr. Vamsi Chander Reddy will head the Maharashtra "War Room". These appointments are part of the AICC's strategic efforts to ensure a well-coordinated and effective election campaign across these important states.

Danam Nagender Criticizes BRS **Amid Party Defection Controversy**

He questioned how the post could be assigned to an MLA who defected to the ruling party. He further alleged that the position was given to Arikepudi to prevent the opposition from highlighting the government's shortcomings.

Prashant Reddy also mentioned that Harish Rao, a senior leader in his party, had said they would reject the nomination for this post. He demanded to know why the election for the PAC Chairman position had not been held, despite receiving four nominations. He criticized the move, asking how Arikepudi could take the post when the Congress had previously embraced him. He also recalled that Congress MP KC Venugopal was appointed as PAC Chairman in the Lok Sabha.

Maheshwar Reddy Questions Congress's Integrity On PAC Chairman

TPN, Telangana: BJP Legislative Party leader A Maheshwar Reddy has criticized the Congress government's decision to appoint Serilingampally MLA Arekapudi Gandhi, who defected from the BRS party, as Chairman of the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) in the Telangana Assembly. Reddy argued that this move violates long-standing democratic traditions, where the post of PAC chairman is typically given to a member of the Opposition.

In a press conference, Reddy questioned how the Congress could appoint an MLA who switched from the opposition to the ruling party to such a critical position. He claimed that this

decision undermines parliamentary customs and the spirit of democracy. "By breaking this tradition, the Congress has lost the trust of the people," Reddy remarked.

The BJP leader further accused Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy of taking unilateral decisions and disregarding established rules and norms. He alleged that, despite opposition from senior Congress leaders, the Chief Minister has been actively encouraging defections from opposition parties. Reddy pointed to Congress leader Ponnam Prabhakar's



approval of the High Court's decision on the MLA defection case, suggesting that several Congress members are not in favor of such defections.

Reddy's criticism reflects the BJP's stance that the Congress is eroding democratic practices by promoting political opportunism, particularly in the appointment of key positions like the PAC chairman. The BJP has expressed concerns that such moves may further alienate the public and damage the credibility of the Congress-led government in Telangana.

Hyderabad Bans Ganesh Idol Immersion at Tank Bund



TPN Hyderabad: Ahead of Ganesh Visarjan on Monday, September 16, the Telangana police have announced a ban on the immersion of Ganesh idols at Tank Bund. This decision follows orders from the High Court of Telangana State, which has prohibited the immersion of Plaster of Paris (PoP) idols in Hussain Sagar Lake. To accommodate the immersion, the police have set up heavy cranes for use at NTR and PV Marg necklace roads. Meanwhile, the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) has prepared 73 portable immersion ponds across the city to ensure an eco-friendly process. These include 27 "baby ponds" inside lakes, 24 portable prefabricated water tanks, and 22 excavated ponds, catering to idols ranging from 2 to 6 feet in height.

In light of these arrangements, Hyderabad traffic police have issued a travel advisory with significant traffic diversions from September 10 to September 16, focusing particularly on routes near Necklace Road (P.V.N. Marg). Traffic will be restricted and rerouted as follows: Sailing Club 'T' Junction: Traffic from Karbala Maidan towards Upper Tankbund will be diverted at Sailing Club to Kavadiguda Cross Roads. The annual average concentrations of PM2.5, the fine particulate matter linked to severe health issues, were found to be five to six times above the World Health Organization (WHO) revised guidelines at several sites, including Central University, New Malakpet, and Somajiguda. In industrial areas like Bollaram, IDA Pashamylaram, and Kokapet, PM2.5 levels were even more alarming, ranging seven to eight times above WHO standards.

dire. Locations such as Bollaram, IDA Pashamylaram, and Zoo Park showed PM10 concentrations six to seven times higher than WHO guidelines. Other areas like IITH Kandi and Somajiguda had levels four to five times above the revised standards.

The report also notes that while PM2.5 levels at five monitoring stations were slightly above the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS), PM10 levels across all stations were either slightly or up to 1.5 times above NAAQS limits.

Monthly trends throughout 2023 indicate consistently high PM2.5 levels from January to April and again in November and December. Similarly, PM10 levels exceeded NAAQS standards from January to June, and again in August, October, November, and

Syria outclass India, lift Intercontinental Cup in Hyderabad



TPN Hyderabad : Syria clinched the Inter continental Cup with a commanding 3-0 win over India at the GMC Balayogi Athletic Stadium in Hyderabad on Monday. Mahmoud Alaswad, Daleho Mohsen Irandust, and Pablo David Sabbag scored for Syria, securing a dominant performance that marked a tough start for India's new coach, Manolo Marquez.

The match began with Syria setting a swift pace. They opened the scoring in the seventh minute when Mahmoud Alaswad capitalized on a defensive lapse by Indian defenders and goalkeeper Gurpreet Singh Sandhu, making it 1-0. The Indian defense was shaky, and just minutes later, Aldin Yasin Dali's powerful strike hit the post. Syria continued to apply pressure, with Noah Leon Shamoun missing a golden opportunity in the 20th minute, his attempt saved by Sandhu.

In the second half, Marquez made tactical changes, introducing Asish Rai and Lalengmawia to inject energy. The changes led to several corners and attacking opportunities, with Chhangte's shot in the 55th minute saved by Syrian goalkeeper Eias Hadaya. However, Syria extended their lead in the 76th minute when Irandust scored after a clever run into the box.

India pressed for a comeback, but Hadaya's crucial saves kept Syria's clean sheet intact. In the dying moments of the match, Pablo Sabbag added a third goal for Syria, sealing a 3-0 victory and the Intercontinental Cup.

Telangana Task Force Raids Hyderabad Tiffin Centres and Hostels

TPN Hyderabad : A task force from the Food Safety Department of Telangana conducted extensive raids at several well-known tiffin centres and hostels across Hyderabad, uncovering numerous health and safety violations.

Raids targeted Padmavathi Tiffins, Sri Sidhi Vinayaka Udupi Tiffins, Balaji Darshan Tiffins, My Home Luxury Girls Hostel, and Chetan PG for Boys Hostel. At Padmavathi Tiffins in Ashoknagar, inspectors discovered a live cockroach in the storeroom, raw food items stored improperly on the floor, and rat burrows. wearing hair caps or aprons.

Ashoknagar, was found lacking insect-proof screens and maintaining poor kitchen hygiene. At Balaji Darshan Tiffins, water was found stagnating in drains and open dust bins were present in the kitchen area.

Junior Doctors Continue Protest Despite Supreme Court's 'Back to Work' Order

Kolkata, September 10, 2024: Junior doctors at Kolkata's RG Kar Hospital have vowed to continue their protest against the brutal rape and murder of a young doctor at the facility, despite a Supreme Court directive ordering them to return to work by 5 PM on Tuesday. The doctors are adamant that their movement is a fight for justice, which they termed as "a people's movement" that neither the government nor the Supreme Court should overlook.

The protest, which has stretched into its 28th day, began after the horrific incident involving the 31-year-old doctor last month. A civic volunteer with Kolkata Police, Sanjoy Roy, was arrested in connection with the crime. The case, which initially gripped public attention, was transferred from the state police to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and shifted from the High Court to the Supreme Court.

"We are extremely disappointed by the Supreme Court hearing," a spokesperson for the protesting junior doctors said late Monday. "Despite the transfer to the Supreme Court and the involvement of the CBI, justice remains elusive. We will not return to work until justice is served."

Earlier on Monday, the Supreme Court, led by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, urged the doctors to resume their duties, warning that continued abstention could lead to disciplinary actions by the government. "They are in a system to render service. If doctors do not resume work, we cannot stop the government from taking action," Chief Justice Chandrachud said during the hearing. He emphasized that the doctors' movement had severely impacted healthcare services, calling for an immediate end to the strike.

However, the junior doctors are standing firm in their decision to continue the protest. "This is about more than just a strike. It is a people's movement. Neither the government nor the Supreme Court should forget that," the spokesperson said, reflecting the deep sense of injustice and frustration felt by the doctors.

The doctors' concerns extend beyond the delay in justice for their colleague. They also accuse the state government of providing misinformation to the Supreme Court regarding the strike's impact on the healthcare system. According to the state health

department, 23 deaths have been attributed to the disruption caused by the strike. The doctors, however, dispute this claim, arguing that healthcare services have not been completely paralyzed.

In a statement, the Indian Medical Association (IMA), Bengal branch, declared its support for the junior doctors, saying, "We were expecting a positive outcome keeping in mind the brutality of the offense. However, we are disheartened by the proceedings of the court and the actions of the CBI. No steps have been taken to expedite the trial or deliver justice for our colleague."

The IMA also condemned the portrayal of junior doctors as being responsible for the alleged deaths. "It is shocking that junior doctors are being blamed for hospital deaths. The truth is that healthcare services have not completely halted due to the protests," the statement read.

The protesting doctors have been observing a "cease work" at state-run hospitals for nearly a month, causing widespread disruption to healthcare services across the state. Despite this, the doctors argue that senior physicians have continued to work, maintaining essential services in many hospitals. They contend that their protest is aimed solely at demanding justice for their colleague and improving safety measures for healthcare workers, especially female staff.

During Monday's Supreme Court hearing, Chief Justice Chandrachud reassured the doctors, stating that no adverse action would be taken if they returned to work by the Tuesday deadline. However, he also emphasized that the government would be free to take disciplinary action if the strike continued beyond the deadline.

As the standoff between the junior doctors and the authorities continues, the focus remains on the fight for justice for the murdered doctor, a cause that has united the medical community across Bengal. While the Supreme Court's ruling has brought the protest to a critical juncture, the junior doctors' firm stance indicates that the road to resolution remains uncertain.

For now, the doctors stand resolute, calling their protest a fight for justice and pledging to continue until they see tangible steps toward justice for their fallen colleague.

Fukushima Nuclear Debris Removal Begins 13 Years After Tsunami

Tokyo: Japan has embarked on a pivotal step in the decades-long decommissioning of the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear plant, initiating a complex operation to remove a small sample of radioactive debris. The operation marks a significant moment in the aftermath of the 2011 tsunami and nuclear disaster, one of the worst nuclear accidents in history.

Tokyo Electric Power Company (TEP-CO), the operator of the Fukushima plant, announced on Tuesday that a "pilot extraction operation" had officially started after technical difficulties delayed earlier efforts. The debris, found inside the reactors, remains a major hurdle in the plant's decommissioning process, which could take decades to complete.

The removal operation is expected

to last about two weeks and is being undertaken with extreme caution. TEPCO aims to retrieve a mere three grams (0.1 ounces) of highly radioactive material, a tiny fraction of the estimated 880 tons of nuclear debris that still resides within the reactors. Despite the small size of the sample, it is a crucial step in understanding the conditions inside the reactor and moving forward with the massive decommissioning project.

TEPCO had originally planned to commence the operation on August 22, but technical issues with the equipment caused delays. The company discovered problems during the installation phase, forcing a temporary suspension. With the current operation underway, TEPCO is cautiously optimistic about the outcome.

Fukushima's Legacy

The Fukushima disaster occurred on March 11, 2011, when a massive tsunami, triggered by a 9.0-magnitude earthquake, hit Japan's northeastern coast. The tsunami crippled the Fukushima Daiichi plant, leading to the meltdown of three of its six reactors. Since then, the plant has remained a symbol of the catastrophic power of natural disasters and the long-lasting dangers of nuclear energy.

TEPCO and the Japanese government have been working for more than a decade to contain and mitigate the damage from the meltdown. One of the most controversial aspects of this effort came last year when Japan began releasing treated wastewater from the plant into the Pacific Ocean.

This action, although deemed safe by Japan and supported by the UN atomic agency, sparked a diplomatic dispute with China and Russia, both of which banned Japanese seafood imports in response.

Fukushima's Future and Global Concerns

In addition to the debris removal, Japan continues to grapple with the international fallout from its decision to release treated wastewater. The government insists that the release is scientifically sound, but the move has raised concerns among environmental groups and neighboring countries.

Meanwhile, TEPCO has launched initiatives to promote agricultur-

al products from the Fukushima region, aiming to boost local industries impacted by the disaster. Last weekend, the high-end London department store Harrods began selling peaches grown in Fukushima, a region renowned for its high-quality fruit. However, these peaches come at a premium price, with reports indicating that a box of three peaches is selling for as much as 80 pounds (\$100).

As Japan continues its long road to recovery from the Fukushima disaster, the latest steps in removing radioactive debris offer hope that progress is being made. However, the full decommissioning of the plant, and the resolution of its environmental and diplomatic challenges, remain long-term goals.




Amit Shah Announces Major Cybersecurity Initiatives, Including 5,000 Cyber Commandos

Rahul Gandhi Criticizes BJP and RSS, Highlights India's Diversity at Virginia Event

Congress leader and Leader of Opposition of languages, traditions, and histories, in the Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi, took a pointed dig at the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and its ideological parent, the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS), during an event with the Indian diaspora in Herndon, Virginia. Gandhi accused the BJP of promoting a singular ideology while undermining India's rich diversity. Using a food analogy, Gandhi said, "In India, everything works together... if someone says chawal (rice) is more important than dal (pulses) and sabji (vegetables), then what will happen? That's what the BJP does." He emphasized that India is a "union of states," representing a blend

contrasting this with the BJP's view, which he claimed centers around a single ideology.

The Congress leader further accused the RSS of propagating a belief that certain states and communities are superior to others. During his three-day visit to the US, Gandhi also visited Dallas and Washington DC, where he described the Indian diaspora as a "vital bridge" between the two nations.

Hardeep Puri Criticizes Rahul Gandhi for his "Sikhs are not Safe" Comments

Union Minister Hardeep Puri has sharply criticized Congress MP Rahul Gandhi for his recent remarks made during a visit to the United States, where he alleged issues faced by Sikhs in India, including the freedom to wear religious symbols such as turbans and kada. Puri accused Gandhi of spreading a "dangerous narrative" and criticized him for criticizing the Indian government while abroad.

Speaking to reporters, Puri questioned the basis of Gandhi's claims about Sikh community struggles, stating, "I have worn a turban for over 60 years and a kada for longer, and I have never encountered anyone expressing anxiety about wearing them." He accused Gandhi of propagating misinformation, particularly highlighting the tragic 1984 anti-Sikh riots, which he claims were a result of the Congress government's actions under Gandhi's family.

It is true that the car involved in the Nagpur accident is registered in the name of Sanket Bawankule, and he was in that car. Let the law take its own course," said Danve, a former Union minister. The incident has sparked political debate, with accusations and defenses circulating as the legal process unfolds.

Manipur Government Limits Internet Suspension to Five Districts Amid Student Protests

The Manipur government has revised its earlier order on internet suspension, now limiting the measure to five valley districts rather than the entire state. This adjustment comes amid intensified student protests and escalating tensions between the Meitei and Kuki communities.

Initially, the state government had announced a blanket suspension of internet services across Manipur for five days. However, the amended order now specifies the suspension of internet, mobile data services, Lease Lines, VSATs, Broadbands, and VPN services only within the territorial jurisdictions of Imphal West, Imphal East, Thoubal, Bishnupur, and Kakching districts. This suspension began at 3:00 PM on September 10,

The revised order excludes the hill districts from the internet blackout. The government cited an imminent threat of loss of life, property damage, and widespread disturbances as reasons for the measure. Authorities are concerned about the potential for inflammatory material and false rumors to spread via social media and messaging services, which could exacerbate the unrest.

Manipur has been experiencing severe ethnic clashes for over a year, primarily between the Hindu Meitei majority and the Christian Kuki community, leading to division and violence across the state. Last week, 11 people were killed in renewed hostilities, and rival militias have established blockades in affected areas.

In response to escalating violence, a curfew was imposed in Imphal and the surrounding valley after student protests on Monday led to clashes with police. The protesters have been demanding action against insurgents accused of using improvised weapons and drones, marking a significant escalation in the state's conflict.

The government's internet suspension aims to prevent the spread of disinformation and false rumors that could lead to further violence and damage to public and private property. By curbing the mobilization of agitators and maintaining peace, the authorities hope to restore stability and communal harmony in the region.



Kiren Rijiju Slams Zakir Naik for "False Propaganda" on Waqf **Amendment Bill**

Union Minister Kiren Rijiju has accused fugitive Islamic preacher Zakir Naik of spreading "false propaganda" and attempting to mislead Indian Muslims over the government's proposed Waqf Amendment Bill. Naik, wanted in India for alleged money laundering and hate speeches, criticized the Bill, warning of its "evil repercussions" and urging at least 5 million Indian Muslims to send rejections to the Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) examining the legislation. He shared a QR code and URL for an online petition, asking for submissions by

Rijiju dismissed Naik's comments as "misleading," urging him not to influence Indian Muslims from abroad. "India is a democratic country, and people have the right to their own opinion. False propaganda will lead to wrong narratives," said the Union Minister.

The Waqf Amendment Bill proposes 44 changes, including the addition of two non-Muslim members, a Union Minister, three MPs, and senior IAS officers to the Waqf board. It also mandates the inclusion of women. The amendments, which aim to improve transparency and protect inheritance rights for women and children, have been criticized by opposition parties as "draconian."

The Bill emphasizes that Waqf boards must use their funds for the welfare of widows, divorcees, and orphans in accordance with government guidelines. Rijiju defended the Bill, stating that it seeks to restore justice to ordinary Muslims, asserting that Waqf boards have been "captured by some people."

BJP Unveils Second List of Candidates for Haryana Assembly Elections

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has released its second list of candidates for the upcoming Haryana Assembly elections, adding 21 more names to its roster. With this announcement, the party has now declared 87 candidates for the 90-member assembly, leaving just a few seats to be filled.

Among the notable candidates is Captain Yogesh Bairagi, who will challenge Olympian Vinesh Phogat, running on a Congress ticket from the Julana constituency. In the first list, the BJP had fielded Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini from the Karnal to Ladwa seat. Saini previously served as the MP from Kurukshetra from 2019 to 2024.

The party has also included prominent leaders in its lineup. Former state BJP president Om Prakash Dhankar, now a national secretary, will contest from the Badli constituency. Veteran party leader and former state minister Anil Vij is set to defend his stronghold of Ambala Cantt.

The BJP's list features several political heavyweights who recently joined the party. Devender Singh Babli, a former Jannayak Janta Party (JJP) member, will run from Tohana. Shruti Choudhry, granddaughter of former Haryana Chief Minister Bansi Lal, is set to contest from Tosham. Aarti Singh Rao, daughter of Union Minister Rao Inderjit Singh, will contest from Ateli.

With the assembly elections scheduled for October 5, the BJP is seeking a third consecutive term in Haryana. However, the party faces strong competition from a resurgent Congress. The results will be counted on October 8, determining the future political landscape of the state.









India and UAE Forge New Nuclear Cooperation Agreement During Abu **Dhabi Crown Prince's Visit**

A significant development in international nuclear collaboration has emerged as India and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) aimed at enhancing cooperation in the operation and maintenance of nuclear power plants. The MoU was formalized during the ongoing visit of Abu Dhabi Crown Prince Sheikh Khaled bin Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan to India.

The agreement was signed by Bhuwan Chandra Pathak, Chairman and Managing Director of Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited (NPCIL), and Mohamed Al Hammadi, Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer of the Emirates Nuclear Energy Corporation

The agreement underscores the strengthening partnership between the two nations in the nuclear energy sector, reflecting a shared commitment to advancing safe and efficient nuclear technology.

Harris and Trump to Face Off in High-Stakes Debate Ahead of November Election

US Vice President Kamala Harris and former President Donald Trump are set to engage in their first and likely only televised debate today, just under two months before the US election. This debate, hosted by ABC News, will be a crucial opportunity for both candidates to present their platforms and shape voter

The debate comes in the wake of President Joe Biden's decision to withdraw from his re-election campaign following a lackluster performance in his debate with Trump earlier this year. According to a recent poll by The New York Times and Siena College, Trump leads Harris by a narrow margin of 48% to 47% nationally, with the results showing little change from the July poll conducted after



Biden's exit.

The poll also revealed that 28% of voters want to know more about Harris, compared to just 9% regarding Trump. This indicates a significant opportunity for Harris to clarify her policies and position in the run-up to the election. Harris' campaign has so far been cautious about outlining specific policies, a strategy that could allow Trump's team to frame her vice presidency negatively. The debate will be a chance for Harris to counter these narratives and present her own vision.

On the other hand, Trump must navigate the debate with care, avoiding a domineering demeanor. At 78, Trump is now the older candidate compared to Harris, who is 59. This shift may affect the dynamic of the debate, especially considering the ridicule Trump previously directed at Biden over his age. Harris may leverage this to counter Trump's criticisms and appeal to voters concerned about age and leadership.



India Open to Chinese Investment, but Seeks Terms and Sector-Specific Engagement

India remains open to engaging in business with China but insists that the terms and sectors of such engagements need to be carefully considered. This stance was emphasized by Indian Foreign Minister Subrahmanyam Jaishankar during a conference in Berlin on Tuesday.

The relationship between the two nucleararmed Asian giants has been strained since clashes between their troops occurred along the Himalayan frontier in 2020. In response to these tensions, India tightened scrutiny on investments from Chinese companies and halted several major projects involving Chinese firms.

Despite these restrictions, statements from Indian officials suggest a potential shift in policy. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman and other government representatives have expressed support for increased Chinese investment, particularly in sectors where India currently lacks expertise.

The latest economic survey released by the Indian government highlights two potential strategies for enhancing global exports: integrating into China's supply chain or promoting foreign direct investment (FDI) from Chinese sources. This has led to discussions about easing restrictions on Chinese investments in non-sensitive sectors, such as solar panels and battery manufacturing, where India could benefit from additional expertise and technology. Jaishankar clarified, "We are not closed to

business from China... I think the issue is, which sectors do you do business and on what terms? It's far more complicated than a black and white binary answer." The diplomatic and military negotiations

aimed at resolving the standoff in the Himalayas have progressed slowly. In addition to the investment scrutiny, India has implemented near-total restrictions on visas for Chinese nationals since 2020. However, there are ongoing considerations to relax these restrictions for Chinese technicians to facilitate investments and address critical gaps in domestic manufacturing capabilities.

India's cautious approach reflects a desire to balance economic opportunities with national security and strategic interests, navigating a complex landscape of international relations and economic engagement.

India's New UN Ambassador **Pledges Commitment to Reform** and Multilateralism

Ambassador Parvathaneni Harish has officially assumed his role as India's Permanent Representative to the United Nations, presenting his credentials to Secretary-General Antonio Guterres on Monday. Harish emphasized India's dedication to reformed multilateralism and revitalization of the UN under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership.

Following the credential presentation, Harish promptly engaged with the UN Security Council, advocating for a more inclusive decision-making process peacekeeping operations, particularly involving major troop-contributing countries.

In his initial interactions, Harish outlined India's commitment to strengthening and reforming multilateral institutions. He and Guterres agreed on the need



for both political and economic reforms within the UN to address contemporary challenges and seize emerging opportunities. The move comes in the wake of the withdrawal of two Assam Rifles battalions for operational duties in Jammu and Kashmir and other parts of Northeast India.

Congress Criticizes Adani Groups New China **Venture Amid National Security Concerns**



The Congress party has **I** raised concerns over the Adani Group's latest move to establish a subsidiary in China, alleging that it threatens India's national security and sovereignty. On Tuesday, Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh criticized Prime Minister Narendra Modi's past statements and policies regarding China, calling them damaging to India's interests.

The Adani Group recently formed Adani Energy Resources (Shanghai) Co. (AERCL), a wholly-owned subsidiary based in Shanghai. This new venture aims to provide supply chain solutions and project management services, a development that has sparked controversy.

Ramesh accused the Prime Minister of giving China a "clean chit" in 2020, which he claims undermined India's stance on Chinese incursions and led to a lack of robust action against Chinese imports and investments. "The clean chit has effectively become a letter of support," Ramesh said, criticizing the government's economic policies towards China as inadequate

and inconsistent.

He pointed out that while the Indian government has banned apps like TikTok, Chinese imports have surged, negatively impacting domestic industries. Ramesh also alleged that the Indian government's visa policies and encouragement of Chinese investments have been contradictory to the country's security interests.

Ramesh further criticized the Adani Group's past activities in China and East Asia, mentioning allegations of connections with smuggling operations and suspicious firms. He warned that Adani's global investments, including in Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Kenya, and Australia, have often been detrimental to India's interests.

"The risk is now that Modani's investments in China, given their dubious history, will add national security and territorial sovereignty to the list of sacrifices India has made," Ramesh warned. His remarks underscore the growing concerns over the intersection of business interests and national security in India's foreign

NCLAT Halts Insolvency Proceedings Against Essar Oil and Gas

The National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT) has stayed the insolvency proceedings against Essar Oil and Gas Exploration and Production Ltd., a subsidiary of the Essar Group. This decision comes after the Ahmedabad bench of the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) initiated insolvency proceedings based on a petition by Greka Green Solutions (India) Ltd., which claimed an unpaid amount of ₹24.38 crore (approximately \$2.96 million).

On Tuesday, the NCLAT issued a stay on the NCLT's order and sent a notice to Greka Green in response to a petition filed by Pankaj Kalra, the suspended director of Essar Oil and Gas Exploration. The next hearing is scheduled for 6 November.

Kalra's counsel argued that a settlement agreement specifying a final installment payment had been made before the in-



solvency petition was filed, which was overlooked by the tribunal. He contended that the insolvency petition should not have been admitted without considering this settlement agreement. Essar Oil and Gas Exploration, with a turnover of ₹8 billion and 425 employees, should not face insolvency under these circumstances, he claimed.

The NCLAT has acknowledged these submissions and stayed the NCLT's order.

Mohit B. Adatiya of NPV Insolvency Professionals Pvt Ltd, appointed as the interim resolution professional (IRP) in the case, stated that the company's assets in Mehsana and Raniganj are under control, and all processes required under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC) are being followed. He added that the management and former directors are fully cooperating while awaiting the written order from the NCLAT.

The NCLT's Ahmedabad bench had initiated the insolvency proceedings on 6 September and appointed Mohit Bipinchandra Adatiya as the IRP to manage the company's affairs. The insolvency claim stemmed from a 2013 contract for drilling services, which was transferred to Essar Oil and Gas Exploration in 2017.

Indian Equity Markets Edge Higher with Key Stocks Leading Gains

Tndian equity markets $oldsymbol{1}$ were trading higher early on Tuesday, buoyed by gains in major stocks such as Bharti Airtel, Axis Bank, Power Grid, Nestle, NTPC, Sun Pharma, HCL Tech, and Infosys. At 9:45 a.m., the Sensex was up 43 points, 0.05%, reaching

81,605, while the Nifty gained 13 points, or 0.05%, to stand at 24,950.

al notable tax reductions, as announced by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman. The revised GST rates will apply prospectively. Here are the key changes:

Cancer Drugs The GST on cancer medications, including Trastuzumab Deruxtecan, Osimertinib, and Durvalumab, has been reduced from 12% to 5%. This move aims to make life-saving treatments more affordable.

Namkeens and Savory Foods The GST on namkeens and savory food products will drop from 18% to 12%. However, unfried or uncooked snack pellets will continue to be taxed at 5%.

Al's Dark Data Problem in India: A Growing Concern

s artificial intelligence (AI) technologies rapidly advance, the race to develop and deploy new models has become increasingly fierce. In the pursuit of speed, some companies, including startups and larger firms, are cutting corners by sourcing illegal or unregulated data from dark marketplaces. This problem is particularly acute in India, a country with a massive population and a seemingly endless supply of data. The demand for training data to fuel AI models has made India a hub for these dark marketplaces, raising concerns about the quality and ethics of the data being used.

AI and the Need for Quality Data



Data is the lifeblood of AI. Just as a student improves by reading more and learning from diverse sources, AI models become more accurate and nuanced as they are exposed to more data. However, if the data used to train AI models is flawed or biased, the AI's learning process will be similarly compromised. In India, the increasing reliance on unregulated data sources means that many AI systems are being built on unreliable foundations.

Umakant Soni of AI Foundry highlights the danger of this approach: "With large language models (LLMs), we're seeing AI develop general intelligence. Unlike humans, who don't scale their biases easily, AI will scale biases exponentially." He compares training AI models to educating humans, emphasizing the need for regulated, high-quality data to prevent dystopian outcomes.

The Consequences of Bad Data

The use of flawed data can have far-reaching consequences, particularly when AI models are deployed in critical sectors

like healthcare and finance. AI systems trained on biased or incomplete data may make erroneous decisions, potentially putting lives and livelihoods at risk. For example, healthcare systems relying on AI for diagnosis or treatment recommendations could deliver inaccurate results if trained on unreliable data.

In India, the demand for AI training data is driven by the rise of LLMs, which require vast amounts of information to function effectively. A basic AI prototype needs at least 1 million data points, each costing up to INR 6,000. However, the reliability of this data is often questionable, contributing to the creation of biased or incomplete AI models.

India's Unique Challenges



India's linguistic diversity further complicates the situation. Most datasets used to train AI models in India are heavily focused on English, leaving regional languages underrepresented. As AI ethicist Jibu Elias notes, "Despite India's connectivity and diversity, machine-usable data, particularly in Indian languages, remains limited." This scarcity of high-quality, region-specific data forces many AI developers to turn to unregulated markets, exacerbating the issue of bias in AI models.

Elias also points out that these dark data marketplaces often operate in legal gray areas, bypassing important consent and privacy norms. This is particularly concerning when the data involves sensitive information such as healthcare records or financial details. When AI systems are trained on incomplete or flawed data in these critical areas, the risks to public trust and safety are immense.

The Societal Impact of Flawed AI

The growing use of flawed data in AI development is damaging public trust in these technologies. As biased or unreliable AI models proliferate, the public may become more skeptical of AI's potential benefits. This could stifle innovation, particularly if the solutions being developed are seen as unreliable or harmful.


To address these challenges, India must establish robust regulations and ethical frameworks to govern the use of data in AI. Globally, companies are already facing legal repercussions for misusing data, with Europe's General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) serving as a prime example of how regulation can keep AI data usage in check.

Building Responsible AI in India



Elias argues that stringent regulatory oversight and ethical frameworks are essential for ensuring the responsible use of data in AI. These solutions would help ensure that AI systems are built on solid, reliable foundations.

Ultimately, if data is the "food" that powers AI, feeding it low-quality or "junk" data will only lead to poor outcomes. India's booming AI industry has the potential to lead the world, but it must do so responsibly by prioritizing the quality and ethics of the data it uses to train its AI models.

YouTube Develops **Tools for Managing AI-Generated Content**



TouTube is advancing its efforts to give creators greater conf I trol over AI-generated content that mimics their likeness. The platform announced on September 5 that it is developing new technology aimed at helping YouTubers automatically detect and manage AI-generated vocal simulations of their voices.

The upcoming feature, known as the synthetic singing ID tool, will be integrated into YouTube's Content ID system. This system, established in 2007, helps creators and artists protect their work by claiming copyright and licensing content for reuse. The new technology aims to refine the detection of synthetic voices, allowing creators to better manage how their likeness and voice are used in AI-generated content.

YouTube plans to launch a pilot program for this technology early next year, in collaboration with its partners. This move is part of YouTube's broader initiative to address the challenges posed by AI advancements in content creation and ensure that creators maintain control over their intellectual property.

Australia Proposes Minimum Age for Social Media Use Amid Backlash



Australia is considering introducing a minimum age limit for social media use, driven by concerns over mental and physical health impacts on children. Prime Minister Anthony Albanese announced plans to trial age verification before implementing laws, with the minimum age likely set between 14 and 16.

Albanese emphasized the goal of encouraging children to engage in physical activities rather than spending excessive time online. "We want them to have real experiences with real people because we know that social media is causing social harm," he stated.

This potential legislation would position Australia among the pioneering nations to enforce such restrictions, joining few countries with similar measures. Previous international efforts, such as those by the European Union, have failed due to concerns over reducing minors' online rights.

Major social media companies have responded with reservations. Meta, which enforces a self-imposed age limit of 13, prefers to empower young users with parental support rather than restricting access. YouTube owner Alphabet and TikTok did not provide comments on the proposed measure.

Australia boasts a high social media engagement rate, with 80% of its 26 million citizens active online. A 2023 University of Sydney study noted that 75% of Australians aged 12 to 17 use platforms like YouTube and Instagram.

The age restriction proposal comes as part of a parliamentary inquiry into social media's effects on society, revealing both the mental health impacts on teenagers and concerns about enforcement and unintended consequences. Critics argue that such restrictions might push children to less regulated and potentially harmful online spaces.





Italy Tops Nations League Group with Win Over Israel

Italy continued their resurgence after Euro 2024 with a narrow 2-1 victory over Israel in their Nations League clash on Monday. The match, held at Budapest's Bozsik Arena due to security concerns in the Middle East, saw Italy secure the top spot in Group A2.

Davide Frattesi and Moise Kean were the scorers for Italy, netting one goal each in a game played in front of a modest crowd of 2,000 fans. The Azzurri's win came on a rainy night in the Hungarian capital, following France's 2-0 triumph over Belgium in Lyon. This

result allowed Italy to take the lead in their group, with a perfect six points from two matches, three points ahead of both France and Belgium.

AIFF Suspends Anwar Ali, Imposes Transfer Bans on Delhi FC and East Bengal

After a detailed investigation, the AIFF has imposed a four-month suspension on Ali for violating the terms of his four-year loan agreement with Mohun Bagan.

Additionally, all three parties—Anwar Ali, Delhi FC, and East Bengal—are required to pay Rs 12.90 crores in compensation to Mohun Bagan.

This ruling underscores the AIFF's commitment to enforcing contractual agreements and maintaining fair play standards in Indian football. The suspension and transfer bans are likely to impact team strategies and player movements in the upcoming seasons.
