SAME OFFICER INVOLVED IN JATWANI'S CASE?


TPN, Andhra Pradesh: A Lady Sub-Inspector named A. Durga Devi is allegedly under the protection of higher officials, also named in the FIR of Kadambari Jatwani raising eyebrows across the board. It may sound unusual, but even an order from the President of India to investigate the actions of this Sub-Inspector has reportedly been neglected by these police officials. She is described as aggressive and highly loyal to her superiors, handling any assignment given to her with efficiency. This is speculated to be the reason why the President's order for an investigation seems to have been ignored.

The latest buzz suggests that this same Lady Sub-Inspector was involved in the controversial case of Mumbai actress Kadambari Jatwani. She is rumored to have been a part of the team that handled Jatwani's case. Allegedly, she was the officer who brutally assaulted Jatwani, with reports circulating within the

department that the Sub-Inspector acted like a "goon," kicking Jatwani in the stomach during the altercation.

The same officer has also been accused of framing false cases against another individual, alleging that he assaulted women. The accused wrote a letter to the President of India regarding these false allegations, which prompted the President's office to order an investigation into the Sub-Inspector. However, it is alleged that the Commissioner of Police ignored this directive.

The higher official involved in the Jatwani case is reportedly shielding and supporting the Lady Sub-Inspector. With these serious allegations making the rounds, the Andhra Pradesh Police Department has faced nationwide criticism, tarnishing its reputation. remains to be seen how the current government will address these issues and restore the state's image.

TPN, Andhra Pradesh: Union Civil Aviation Minister Rammohan Naidu stated that efforts are being made to start direct flights from Vijayawada (Gannavaram) Airport to Dubai and Singapore. He inaugurated the approach road connecting the National Highway to the entrance of Gannavaram Airport on Saturday. The minister also launched a new Indigo service to Delhi.

Later, Minister Rammohan Naidu mentioned that CM Chandrababu Naidu and Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan had requested improved air connectivity for Amaravati to ensure easy travel from any city in the country. In response, new services have been introduced. He highlighted that four new services have been added from Gannavaram Airport in the past three months. He also noted that the number of air passengers has increased significantly compared to the preelection period. Previously, an average of 85,000 people traveled per month, but that number has now risen to 100,000.

TPN, Vijayawada: The removal of boats stuck at Prakasam Barrage has now entered its sixth day. During the recent floods, several boats washed away from upstream collided with the barrage gates and got stuck. The government has expressed suspicions of a conspiracy, as each boat weighs between 40-50 tons and they were tied together before hitting the gates. All five boats impacted the barrage gates. Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu himself alleged that this might be a deliberate attempt to tarnish the government's reputation by damaging the gates.

The government has initiated efforts to remove the boats that crashed into the gates. However, the first attempts failed. Efforts to break the boats apart and remove them were also unsuccessful. In response, the Kakinada Abbulu team is using iron ropes to pull the boats out with the help of poclains. After three days of continuous effort, the boats have only moved about 20 meters. The process has become more complicated as the boats are now stuck in the sand.

Officials Working Hard to Contain Eleru Canal Breach

TPN, Andhra Pradesh: The Eleru canal, which was swollen with floodwater, has suffered a breach. A 10-foot embankment collapsed in Rachapalli, Makavaram Mandal, Kakinada district. As a result, floodwater from the underground tunnel is seeping into nearby lands. Upon receiving information from locals, officials promptly arrived at the scene and assessed the situation, concluding that there was no immediate danger.

To prevent further water wastage, the officials quickly began excavation work. They are using

poclains to place sandbags at the breach site to stem the flow of water. They assured that the situation would be brought under control within two to three hours.

Local farmers are expressing concern as the Eleru canal frequently floods, inundating their crops. Some have voiced their frustration, saying that their harvest, which is often close to completion, is being destroyed. Farmers are demanding that the authorities find a permanent solution to this recurring problem.

Are All Government Medical Colleges in AP Being Privatized? Is Roja's Statement True?

TPN, Andhra Pradesh: The condition of government medical colleges in Andhra Pradesh (AP) continues to worsen, with the blame being placed on controversial decisions made by the ruling Telugu Desam Party (TDP)-Jana Sena-Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) coalition government, led by Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu and Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan.

A heated exchange of words is ongoing between the leaders of the ruling TDP alliance and the YSR Congress Party (YSRCP). Former minister and YSRCP spokesperson RK Roja strongly criticized Health Minister Y Satyakumar's statements.

Satyakumar had earlier pointed out that the central government, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, sanctioned 17 medical colleges to



Andhra Pradesh during YS Jagan's tenure. He criticized the Jagan-led government for failing to complete even a single one of these colleges in the past four years, with more than half still in the foundation

stages. Satyakumar alleged that the Rajahmundry Medical College was opened last year without completing the hostel buildings, forcing secondyear students to conduct classes in temporary facilities this year. He also reminded that the Medical while Chandrababu's government Council had denied permission to these colleges in July. Moreover, he highlighted that the construction of the medical college in YS Jagan's own constituency, Pulivendula, remains incomplete and that 48% of the teaching staff is missing.

Satyakumar further noted that the YSRCP's popularity had drastically reduced from 151 to 11 seats in the state assembly, suggesting that the public had grown weary of their governance. He urged the YSRCP to reflect on public opinion.

In response, RK Roja reacted sharply, accusing Chandrababu Naidu's government of attempting to privatize medical colleges in the state. She defended Jagan's record, stating that his government had made substantial contributions to medical education,

failed to bring a single government medical college to the state. Roja described the alleged plan to privatize newly established medical colleges under a Public-Private Partnership (PPP) model as an "unforgivable crime" by the TDP.


Roja further criticized Chandrababu for writing to the Medical Council to cancel seats allotted to Pulivendula Medical College, calling it an "evil" act. She claimed that Chandrababu, out of jealousy and hatred towards Jagan, was trying to undermine the future of AP students and deprive talented, underprivileged students of medical education. Roja, on behalf of the YSRCP, demanded that all medical colleges built by Jagan's government should remain under public management, ensuring that the poor have access to medical education.

Welfare Did Not Stop Even During the Covid Crisis - What Is Your Situation??

TPN, Andhra Pradesh: The situation in government medical colleges in Andhra Pradesh (AP) is worsening day by day. This is attributed to the controversial decisions made by the Telugu Desam Party (TDP)-Jana Sena-Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) coalition government, led by Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu and Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan.

He emphasized that providing quality ed-



sponsibility of any government. "No family should have to sell their property to ensure their children receive a good education and proper medical treatment," Jagan stated. He questioned how the state government could neglect these responsibilities, suggesting that if it does, it cannot be called a government.

Jagan highlighted that the YSRCP government initiated the construction of 17 medical colleges, with an investment of Rs. 8,480 crore, to ensure a medical college in every Lok Sabha constituency. He questioned the harm caused to the government by this initiative. He noted that ical decisions related to seat allocation classes began in five colleges during the

2023-24 academic year, adding 750 MBBS seats to the state. He pointed out that many underprivileged students are now studying medicine as a result. Jagan also stated that 750 more seats will be available in five more colleges-Madanapalle, Pulivendula, Adoni, Markapuram, and Paderu—this year, giving more students the opportunity to pursue medical careers. Jagan criticized the reduction of Paderu Medical College to only 50 seats and the state's attempt to prevent the allocation of 50 seats to Pulivendula Medical College, questioning the government's motives to privatize medical colleges. He further pointed out that even during

the Covid crisis, Rs. 2,403 crore was spent on the construction of medical colleges, classes began in five colleges, and preparations were made for five more to start this year. He asked why Chandrababu's government couldn't spend gradually to complete the remaining colleges.

Jagan accused the TDP government of prioritizing the privatization of public health institutions and questioned its hostility toward government-run institutions. He warned that there should not be any obstacles in managing new medical colleges and emphasized that poor students should not suffer due to politduring elections.

government medical colleges in AP under a Gujarat Public-Private-Partnership (PPP) model. Sharmila demanded that Chandrababu Naidu address the ongoing speculation and provide clarity on the privatization of medical colleges.

Sharmila condemned Chandrababu's let-

dula, Adoni, Markapuram, Madanapalle, and Paderu would not receive the necessary facilities this year, and that it would be impossible to maintain them or add additional seats. She questioned whether any state would willingly forgo additional seats in the public sector, calling it a disgrace for the coalition government. She pointed out that the failure to add 750 new medical seats is a direct result of Chandrababu's negligence, noting that this has shattered the hopes of students who invested heavily in long-term coaching for these seats. Sharmila further criticized that students from AP are being forced to seek medical seats in neighboring states. She claimed that while the YSR Congress Party government was accused of selling medical seats under a self-financing policy, the current coalition government had promised to abolish this policy but has failed to do so.

He revealed that the construction of 17 medical colleges was started during the previous YCP government's regime, but even after four years, not a single college has been completed. Minister Satyakumar explained that more than half of the colleges are still in the foundation stages.

He mentioned that a medical college was started in Rajahmundry last year before its construction was even completed, and now there is a situation where second-year students do not have a classroom. "Mr. Jagan... where should the students study? Should they study under the trees?" he asked, facing criticism.

Minister Satyakumar further stated that the construction of Pulivendula Medical College is still incomplete. "Does Jagan not know that 48% of the teaching staff is absent at Pulivendula College?" he asked.

"If there are no classrooms, how can we manage? And if there are no teaching staff, who will teach the lessons?" he questioned. "Will you teach the lessons yourself, Professor Jagan?" he added sarcastically. "Why do you want to play with the future of the students?" Minister Satyakumar expressed his anger.

He also stated that false claims are being spread, limiting them to only 11 seats. Minister Satyakumar said that Jagan should understand the public's opinion and change accord-

Budameru **Flood Rumors Turns Out Fake: Minister** Narayana

NTR District Collector Srujana urged people not to believe the rumors that Budameru was in trouble. She clarified that no floodwaters were coming to Budameru. The Collector mentioned that they discovered some miscreants had posted these rumors on social media and warned that strict action would be taken against such acts.

It is worth noting that Budameru recently caused flooding in many parts of Vijayawada due to heavy rains. Several people lost their lives, and there was significant damage to property and crops. Those who suffered from the floods for about a week are just now recovering. The rumors of another flood caused renewed worry, but they breathed a sigh of relief when it was confirmed to be false.

Old Classics Make a Big-Screen Comeback: Theatres Bet on Nostalgia

Theatres across India are witnessing an unexpected trend in 2024 – the re-release of old superhit films. In cities like Chennai, films such as *Vaaranam Aayiram*, *Vettaiyaadu Vilaiyaadu*, *Kushi*, *Vinnaithandi Varuvaayaa*, and *Ghilli* have drawn large crowds, often outperforming some of the newer releases. This wave of nostalgia has even reached Bollywood, with classics like *Maine Pyar Kiya*, *Gangs of Wasseypur*, *Rehnaa Hai Terre Dil Mein* (RHTDM), and *Jab We Met* creating a buzz once again at the box office.

One of the driving forces behind this trend is the power of nostalgia. Many of these films were released over a decade ago, with fans from Gen Z, who were school children at the time, now eager to relive these cinematic experiences on the big screen. The memories these films evoke, coupled with iconic soundtracks that continue to be popular, create an emotional connection for viewers.

An example of this is *Rehnaa Hai Terre Dil Mein*, which, though not a box-office hit upon its release, has since become a cult classic. Actor R. Madhavan, who starred in the film, recently spoke about the surprising response to its rerelease, noting how fans flocked to theatres



despite the movie being widely available on digital platforms. The success of *RHTDM* speaks to the enduring appeal of such films and how they resonate with new and old audiences alike.

The film industry has seen significant changes in recent years, especially post-pandemic, with shifting audience preferences. Big-budget films that were once guaranteed hits are now

struggling, leading producers and distributors to explore new strategies to fill theatres. Nitin Datar, President of the Cinema Owners and Exhibitors Association of India, highlighted how re-released films have been helping theatres engage audiences differently, especially as newly released films fail to draw crowds. This has become an effective way to keep the exhibition industry afloat amidst fewer new films in the pipeline.

Another reason for the resurgence of these old hits is that many films were ahead of their time when they were originally released. *Gangs of Wasseypur*, for instance, did not perform as expected at the box office, possibly due to its raw content and language. However, over time, it has gained recognition as a cinematic masterpiece, particularly for its innovative storytelling and soundtrack. Now, its re-release is garnering the kind of attention it originally missed.

While the re-release trend is doing well, it seems to be largely limited to multiplexes in urban areas rather than rural cinemas. Nevertheless, the big screen experience offers something irreplaceable – a sense of collective enjoyment. Despite the convenience of watching films at home, there is something magical about sitting in a theatre, enjoying a classic film, singing along to the songs, and indulging in popcorn.

With fewer new films in production and audiences eager for nostalgic experiences, theatres are betting on this trend to continue, providing both an opportunity for box office success and a chance for audiences to reconnect with the movies that defined their past.

Clean Air And Blue Skies Still Far For India

India continues to grapple with one of the highest levels of air pollution globally, with its capital, Delhi, frequently ranking among the most polluted cities. This poses significant risks to both public health and the country's economy. According to a World Bank report, all of India's 1.4 billion people are exposed to harmful levels of particulate matter (PM2.5), a dangerous pollutant emitted from various sources. As India marks the International Day of Clean Air for Blue Skies on 7 September, the day serves as a reminder of the urgent need for decisive action to address this critical issue.

Delhi's winter season, historically marked by hazardous air quality, looms on the horizon. However, this year, the state government seems more prepared. Last week, the Supreme Court (SC) criticised pollution control boards in Delhi, Punjab, and Haryana for their ineffectiveness. The SC asked the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM), the body responsible for managing pollution in the region, for a concrete plan to address the issue, including controlling stubble burning—a significant contributor to air quality deterioration during winter months.

For over four decades, the SC has been at the forefront of efforts to mitigate air pollution in Delhi, with varying degrees of success. Landmark decisions, such as the switch to compressed natural gas (CNG) for public transport, have helped reduce pollution. However, the number of private vehicles has surged, contributing to worsening air quality. Meanwhile, measures like the installation of smog towers, mandated by the SC, have failed to produce significant results.

On 31 August, the CAQM submitted its action plan for 2024 in an affidavit to the SC. The states of Punjab and Haryana, both major contributors to air pollution due to stubble burning, also submitted their targets for achieving "zero paddy residue burning." However, recent data shows a slight increase in paddy cultivation in Punjab, from 3.1 million hectares in 2023 to 3.154 million hectares in 2024, resulting in a corresponding rise in paddy straw production. As these states prepare for the winter season, their ability to manage the additional stubble will be a key factor in determining whether air quality will improve.

One of the SC's more controversial directives was its recommendation to withhold Minimum Support Price (MSP) benefits from farmers who engage in stubble burning. This has become a sensitive issue, particularly in politically significant regions like Punjab, Haryana, and Delhi, where elections are scheduled. The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government in Delhi, which has historically pointed fingers at neighbouring states for the city's pollution problems, faces a challenging test ahead. The annual smog in Delhi-NCR is likely to become a major election issue, with both political parties and the public demanding solutions.

Delhi's Environment Minister, Gopal Rai, recently claimed that pollution in the city had decreased by 30% over the last nine years. Citing a report by the Centre for Science and Environment (CSE), Rai noted that only 31% of the pollution is generated within Delhi, with the rest



coming from neighbouring states. Despite this claim, the AAP government was criticised last year for its failure to effectively address the issue of stubble burning.

Data from Punjab and Haryana indicates a reduction in stubble burning incidents, with Punjab reporting 36,663 cases in 2023, a 27% decrease from 2022, and Haryana showing a 37% reduction. However, these improvements did not translate into better air quality in Delhi-NCR, which remained among the worst in the country last year.

Another major source of pollution in Delhi is vehicular emissions. Recent data from the Delhi Transport Department reveals that out of 8.29 million registered vehicles in the city, 2.62 million vehicles are operating without valid Pollution Under Control Certificates (PUCCs). This is concerning, especially given a study by the Delhi government and IIT-Kanpur, which found that vehicle emissions accounted for nearly 38% of Delhi's air pollution in November 2023.

During the winter months, air quality plummets further due to a combination of adverse weather conditions, vehicular emissions, firecrackers, and paddy straw burning. Exposure to air pollution has been linked to numerous health problems, including asthma, bronchitis, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), lung cancer, and cardiovascular diseases. A 2019 study found that air pollution contributed to 1.67 million deaths in India, or 17.8% of the country's total mortality that year.

In response, the Indian government launched the National Clean Air Programme (NCAP) in 2019, aiming to reduce PM levels through targeted mitigation strategies. However, the programme has not been particularly effective, with many states lacking sufficient air quality monitoring stations and relying on outdated technology. The situation is exacerbated in rural and remote areas, where a lack of awareness leads to poor monitoring and data collection, resulting in significant gaps in AQI massurements.

Elections 2024

The Influence of 'Others' Looms Large Once Again

As India gears up for the 2024 state elections, 'Others'—comprising smaller parties and independent candidates—are once again positioned to play a decisive role in shaping the political landscape. With key states like Jammu & Kashmir, Haryana, Jharkhand, and Maharashtra heading to the polls, the impact of these candidates could be pivotal, particularly in the context of hung assemblies and internal dissent within major parties.

The upcoming elections are set to unfold in phases, beginning with Jammu & Kashmir and Haryana, where the campaigning has intensified. Smaller parties and independents, who have historically influenced election outcomes, are expected to exert considerable influence once more, especially given the recent history of hung assemblies in these regions.

In Jammu & Kashmir, the past three elections (2002, 2008, and 2014) have all resulted in fragmented verdicts, with 'Others' consistently securing a significant portion of the vote share. The upcoming election is no different, with 458 candidates contesting 50 seats, signalling fierce competition. Independents have made notable inroads in the region, and with 25% of the vote share in the last general elections, they remain a force that could tip the balance in a tightly contested race.

Meanwhile, in Haryana, 'Others' have also played a significant role in previous elections, with two of the past five state elections (2009 and 2019) resulting in hung assemblies. While 'Others' won eight seats in the 2019 assembly polls, the local nature of state elections suggests that they could perform better in 2024, despite a reduced presence in the general elections. The potential alliance between smaller parties like the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) and Indian National Lok Dal (INLD), and the rising number of independents dissatisfied with the major parties, could fracture the vote and disrupt expected outcomes.

Jharkhand, known for producing unpredictable electoral outcomes, has also seen 'Others' take center stage in past elections. In the 2005 and 2009 elections, independents and smaller parties commanded around half of the vote share, and despite their diminishing presence in the 2014 and 2019 elections, they still secured a third of the vote. The state even elected an Independent, Madhu Koda, as Chief Minister in 2006, showcasing the potential of 'Others' to rise in a fragmented political environment. With key alliances shifting in 2024, their influence may either diminish or disrupt the plans of the major parties.

Maharashtra, too, has seen the 'Others' leave a mark, with a 25% vote share and significant influence in 86 constituencies in 2019. Regional parties such as the Bahujan Vikas Aaghadi (BVA), All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM), and the Vanchit Bahujan Aaghadi (VBA) have the ability to alter the course of elections in several seats, making the 2024 elections a complex affair.

In all these states, 'Others' could once again be kingmakers or spoilers, depending on how the vote splits. With rebellion within major parties and the rise of multicornered contests, the 2024 state elections are set to see these smaller players and independents flex their political muscles, potentially influencing the formation of new governments in key states.





PM Slams Congress, Accuses Gandhi Family of Anti-Reservation Agenda

In a rally held in Kurukshetra, Haryana, ahead of the state Assembly elections on October 5, Prime Minister Narendra Modi accused the Congress party, specifically the Gandhi family, of opposing reservations for Dalits, Other Backward Classes (OBCs), and tribals. He alleged that the Congress leadership has historically sought to do away with the reservation system. Modi emphasized that as long as he remains in power, he will protect the quota system established by B. R. Ambedkar, stating, "I will not allow a fraction of the reservations to be looted or removed." Modi criticized former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi, claiming that he referred to those who received reservations as "fools" and that Congress has always been opposed to the Mandal Commission and other reservation policies.

The prime minister also highlighted past incidents of violence against Dalits in Harvana, such as the Gohana (2005) and Mirchpur (2010) incidents, accusing the Congress of remaining silent during these events. He urged the Dalit community to remain vigilant against Congress's



alleged anti-Dalit stance.

Modi reiterated his commitment to development and transparency, stating that under the BJP government, over 1.5 lakh jobs were provided in a fair manner, contrasting it with the Congress era of alleged

favoritism. He concluded by promising that the BJP would continue working for "sabka vikas, tez vikas" (development for all, rapid development).

Haryana will go to polls on October 5, with results to be announced on October 8.

Kejriwal to Resign in 48 Hours, BJP Questions "Why Not Today?"

Responding to Arvind Kejriwal's announcement of resignation, BJP's Harish Khurana questioned why the AAP leader is creating a drama by delaying his resignation.

Two days after being granted bail and released from prison following six months of incarceration, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal made a shocking announcement during a party meeting, stating that he will resign from the top post in 48 hours. "I will not sit on that chair until the people announce their verdict. Elections in Delhi are months away. I got justice from the legal court; now I will seek justice from the people's court," Kejriwal said. He emphasized that he would sit in the Chief Minister's chair only with the people's approval.

Kejriwal also announced that a new Chief Minister from the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) would be chosen within the next two days. He expressed his intent to go to the people to seek their support and called for Delhi's elections, scheduled for February,



to be held in November alongside the Maharashtra polls.

In his address to AAP workers, Kejriwal criticized the Modi government, accusing it of being more dictatorial than the British. He claimed he did not resign earlier to protect democracy. The BJP's Harish Khurana criticized the timing of the resignation, saying, "Why after 48 hours? He

should resign today." Meanwhile, Delhi BJP chief Virendra Sachdeva noted that the people had already given their verdict during the Lok Sabha elections.

Delhi Congress welcomed Kejriwal's decision, stating it was better late than never and hoping for a new Chief Minister who can effectively handle the city's administration.



Opposition Offered To Back Me For PM, But I Asked...': Nitin Gadkari

Nitin Gadkari, however, did not name the Opposition leader.

Union minister Nitin Gadkari on Saturday revealed that an Opposition leader approached him before the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, offering support to make him the Prime Minister. However, he declined the offer, stating that he did not have such an ambition.

"There was a surprising incident. I will not name anyone that person said, 'If you are going to become Prime Minister, we will support you'," Mr. Gadkari, a senior Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader, said at a journalism awards function in Nagpur, Maharashtra.

"But I asked why you should support me, and why should I take your support? Becoming the Prime Minister is not the aim of my life. I am loyal to my conviction and my organisation, and I am not going to compromise for any post because my conviction is foremost for me," he said.

The 67-year-old leader, who scored a hat-trick by winning the Nagpur seat in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, said he believes that "this conviction is the biggest strength of Indian democracy." In his address, he also emphasized the importance of ethics in both journalism and politics.

Nitin Gadkari has often received praise from the Opposition. He retained the road transport and highways portfolio in the third Narendra Modi government after his stellar work in expanding road connectivity in the country during the first two terms.

Mr. Gadkari entered politics as a student leader in the Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP) and later joined the Janata Yuva Morcha, the youth wing of the BJP.

He also headed the Maharashtra BJP until 2009, before being elevated as the BJP National President, becoming the youngestever party president.

"There May Be Nexus": CBI to Court After Cop's Arrest in Kolkata Horror

Dr. Sandip Ghosh and Abhijit Mondal were produced in court today and remanded in CBI custody for two days.

Dr. Sandip Ghosh, former principal of Kolkata's RG Kar Medical College, spoke to Tala Police station's officer-in-charge, Abhijit Mondal, in the hours after a 31-year-old doctor was found dead on the hospital premises. The CBI told a Kolkata court today that there may be a nexus, which needs to be uncovered.

The central agency arrested Mr. Mondal last night on charges of tampering with evidence in the rape-murder case that has shocked the nation. Dr. Ghosh, who was earlier arrested in a

charges of evidence tampering.

The two were produced in court today and remanded in CBI custody for two days. The case will be heard again on September 17.

"The FIR was registered at night. We have call records showing communication between the OC and Sandip Ghosh. There may be a nexus, and we need to uncover the case. We want to confront both of them." the CBI's counsel told the court.

"There is no clash between the CBI and the police. We want to get to the truth. For us, he is not a police officer; he is a suspect," the counsel added.

Both the Calcutta High Court and the financial irregularities case, also faces Supreme Court have questioned the

delay in registering the FIR, which was filed over 14 hours after the doctor's body was found. The courts have asked why the hospital administration, then led by Dr. Ghosh, did not register a police complaint that would have ensured the filing of an FIR.

"He was under an obligation to register the FIR. They tried to downplay it as suicide. There was a lapse on his part. It was a case of sexual assault, and he should have handled it cautiously. He was in conspiracy with other people," the CBI told the court today.

The lawyer for Mr. Mondal responded, "They allege there was a delay. They don't say whether I am an accused or a witness. There is no ground for arrest



here. This is, at best, a case of alleged dereliction of duty. For that, a departmental inquiry could have been done." The CBI clarified that Mr. Mondal is not an accused in the rape and murder case but may have played a role in a larger conspiracy related to an alleged cover-up.



These are the CBI's first two arrests in the rape and murder case following their month-long investigation. Earlier, Kolkata Police had arrested civic volunteer Sanjoy Roy in the case. The CBI took Roy into custody after the High Court transferred the probe to the central agency.

Commenting on the ongoing war of words between the RJD and Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, following Tejashwi Yadav's claim that Nitish Kumar had apologized with folded hands for joining the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA), Mr. Kishor said both leaders have harmed Bihar. "This issue is between Nitish Kumar and Tejashwi Yadav, and it doesn't matter who apologized with folded hands to whom; both have caused damage to Bihar. The people of Bihar have witnessed both

Earlier, Mr. Kishor launched a scathing attack on Bihar's Deputy Chief Minister Tejashwi Yadav, questioning his ability to lead the state's development. Starting Tuesday, the Indian Navy's top commanders will convene at the new Naval Headquarters in Delhi for a critical four-day meeting to assess and respond to emerging security challenges. This high-level conference, the first since Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi assumed the role of Chief of Naval Staff in April, aims to address several pressing concerns, including the recent regime change in Bangladesh and escalating Chinese military

A key agenda item will be the shifting political landscape in Bangladesh, where an in-

crease in extremist radical groups is raising regional security concerns. The meeting will also focus on the growing Chinese presence in the Indian Ocean region and its military support to Pakistan, which has been a point of increasing anxiety for Indian defense officials. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh's recent call for heightened readiness in the face of unexpected challenges at the Joint Commanders' Conference in Lucknow underscores the urgency of this gathering. The Navy's strategic review will include discussions on the cre-

operational efficiency and responsiveness. Admiral Tripathi has directed all naval commanders to ensure peak operational preparedness. The Navy will also evaluate its successful operations in the Gulf of Aden, where it has effectively countered piracy and drone threats earlier this year.

The outcomes of this meeting are expected to shape India's naval strategy and operational focus in the coming months, reflecting the country's commitment to safeguarding its maritime interests amid a complex and ation of new theatre commands to enhance evolving regional security environment.

Missile Fired from Yemen Falls into Central Israel, Escalating Regional Tensions

On Sunday, a missile launched from Yemen fell into central Israel, adding to the already heightened regional tensions amid ongoing conflicts. The Israeli military confirmed that the missile, a surface-to-surface projectile, crossed into central Israel and landed in an open area, causing no injuries. The incident marks a significant escalation as the Gaza conflict continues to draw in various regional actors.

The missile landed near Lod and Modin, both southeast of Tel Aviv. AFP photographers reported that firefighters were seen addressing a brush fire caused by the missile, and broken glass was observed at a nearby train station.

This retaliatory strike marked Israel's first direct military action in Yemen.

Punjab Police Bust Scam Involving 25 Travel Agencies Offering Fake Jobs Abroad

In a significant crackdown on fraudulent travel agencies, the Punjab Police have lodged FIRs against 25 travel agencies across the state for duping young people with fake job opportunities abroad. The operation, spearheaded by the NRI and Cyber Crime wings of the Punjab Police in coordination with the Protectorate of Emigrants, Chandigarh, has uncovered widespread deceit involving bogus job offers in Western countries and Russia.

The authorities have filed a total of 20 FIRs under Sections 24/25 of the Emigration Act at various NRI police stations in Amritsar, Jalandhar, Hoshiarpur, Ludhiana, Patiala, Sangrur, and SAS Nagar. These agencies were found to be illegally advertising job opportunities on social media platforms, including Instagram and Facebook, promising "guaranteed" employment with questionable or non-existent documentation processes.

Assistant Director General of Police (ADGP) Praveen K. Sinha explained that the agencies involved operated without the necessary licenses and permissions required for legal employment services. "Our investigation involved monitoring online platforms and verifying the credentials of these agencies. Upon confirming their illicit activities, FIRs were registered against them," ADGP Sinha said, according to the Tribune.

The crackdown comes amid increasing incidents of travel agencies facilitating illegal migration to Western nations or even sending youths to Russia for involvement in the ongoing conflict in Ukraine. ADGP Sinha has urged the public to exercise caution and thoroughly verify the credentials of travel agents before sharing personal documents or money.



Eight **Migrants** Die in Channel Crossing as Crisis Continues

French maritime authorities have confirmed that eight migrants lost their lives early Sunday when their overcrowded vessel capsized while attempting to cross the English Channel from France to England. The tragic incident occurred shortly after the boat set sail, highlighting the ongoing dangers faced by those making the perilous journey in small, unseaworthy crafts. The disaster comes less than two weeks after the deadliest Channel crossing of the year, which resulted in the deaths of 12 migrants, mostly from Eritrea. This brings the total number of migrant deaths in the Channel this year to 37, a sharp increase from 12 deaths recorded in

French and British governments have been grappling with the issue of migrant crossings for years, as thousands of people pay smugglers exorbitant fees to make the dangerous journey from France to England. Despite efforts to curb the flow, the perilous crossings continue. Over the past 24 hours, maritime authorities rescued around 200 people attempting similar crossings.

In response to the ongoing crisis, British Prime Minister Keir Starmer and French President Emmanuel Macron have pledged to enhance cooperation to manage the surge in undocumented migrants.

Authorities in France have indicated that they are focusing on rescue operations and have refrained from intervening with migrants once they are afloat due to safety concerns.



Jefferies, a global investment firm, projects that the RBI's forex reserves will increase by \$53 billion, reaching \$700 billion within the current fiscal year. This surge is attributed to the rupee's stability, which has become the most stable among major cur- \$4.631 billion. rencies.

India's forex reserves recently hit a new peak of \$689.24 billion as of September 6, up by \$5.2 billion. Foreign currency assets (FCAs) also rose by \$5.10 billion to \$604.1 billion.

The country is experiencing robust domestic financial flows, with foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) significantly boosting the market. FPIs invested Rs 16,800 crore in Indian equities last week, bringing their total investment to Rs 27,856 crore by SepRs 70,737 crore to date.

In 2019, SEBI had directed the NSE to disgorge Rs 624.89 crore and imposed a five-year ban on seven senior officials, including Ravi Narain and Chitra Ramakrishna, who were former managing directors and CEOs. Other banned

individuals included Anand Subramanian (former group operating officer), Ravindra Apte and Umesh Jain (former chief technical officers), Mahesh Soparkar (former senior vice president – special projects), and Deviprasad Singh (former head of IT operations).

Human Tooth Found in Mooncake: Sam's **Club Investigates**



 \mathbf{S} am's Club is under scrutiny following a disturbing incident at its Changzhou location in Jiangsu province, China. A customer discovered a human tooth embedded in a meat-filled mooncake, sparking an investigation by the supermarket chain. The South China Morning Post reported that the woman, who posted a video of the unsettling find on Douyin, revealed the tooth in the 30-yuan (\$4) pastry. The footage shows a molar covered in meat filling, found next to a partially eaten mooncake. The woman confirmed the tooth was not from her family and reported the issue to the police.

Sam's Club has launched an investigation into the incident, while the mooncake manufacturer, Liu, has denied any possibility of contamination. Liu stated that the manufacturing process includes mincing meat and scanning it with X-ray machines to detect bone fragments. He emphasized the company's decade-long record of incident-free production and provided surveillance footage to Sam's Club and the local market regulatory department for review.

Reactions online ranged from disgust to dark humor, with one user sarcastically commenting, "Mooncake: now with meat and a side of calcium!" Another user suggested the possibility that the tooth might have come from a family member who lost it unknowingly.

This isn't the first time Sam's Club has faced food safety issues in China. In 2022, a Fujian province resident reported finding three artificial human teeth in Swiss rolls purchased from a Sam's Club store, though no conclusive findings were released following the promised investiga-

The ODI series, which begins on Thursday at Trent Bridge in Nottingham, will see Brook lead England against the reigning 50-over world champions.

Raghava Lawrence's Next Film: Not a Remake, but an Original Script


