# **CM Warns to Officials Citing Kaleswaram Project as an Example**

TPN, Telangana : Chief Minister Revanth Reddy issued a stern warning to officials, using the Kaleswaram project as an example of why mistakes should not be made in life. Addressing 700 newly selected Assistant Executive Engineers in the Telangana Water and Drainage Department, who were given appointment documents by the CM, he spoke at a program organized at Jalasaudha in Erramanzil.

The CM emphasized that if the quality of work is compromised, projects will not endure. "Projects like Nagarjuna Sagar and Srisailam have stood the test of time because of their quality. However, the Kaleshwaram project, built just five years ago, has already collapsed," he remarked.

Referring to the Nagarjuna Sagar and Srisailam projects, the Chief Minister pointed out how they continue to provide water to lakhs of acres, even decades after their construction. In contrast, the Kaleshwaram project, touted as a "world wonder" by previ- ity and commitment in their work.

# **KTR Alleges Multi-Crore Scam Behind Pharma City Cancellation**

Organized by the National BC Welfare Association and the Konda Laxman Bapuji Foundation, the conference aimed to address issues of social justice and caste discrimination.

R. Krishnaiah, National President of the BC Welfare Association and former MP, emphasized that despite some progress, BCs still face invisible discrimination and exploitation. He called for a large-scale movement to secure 50% reservation and address BC issues, stating that achieving BC statehood would be a true tribute to Konda Lakshman Bapuji.

Speakers at the conference, including MLC L. Ramana and former BC Commission Chairman B.S. Ramulu, highlighted the importance

TPN, Telangana: BRS Working President and Sirisilla MLA KTR has claimed that a scam worth thousands of crores is behind the cancellation of Hyderabad Pharma City, calling it a "genuine real estate scam." He made these remarks while addressing the media at BRS Bhawan in Rajanna Sirisilla.

KTR accused the Congress party of misleading the public and the judiciary. He recalled that, before the elections, several Congress leaders, including Revanth Reddy and Komatireddy Venkat Reddy, had announced plans to cancel Pharma City and return the lands to the farmers. However, KTR pointed out that after coming to power, the Congress government did not cancel Pharma City, leading some farmers to seek legal recourse. He questioned the government's intentions, asking if they have acquired even a single acre for their proposed "Fourth City," "Future City," and "AI City"

projects. KTR accused the government of attempting to repurpose the Pharma City lands for these projects without any proper land acquisition.

KTR warned that farmers would not remain silent if their lands were diverted for real estate benefits. He urged the government to clarify its stance in court, questioning whether it intends to build Pharma City, which was expected to generate employment for lakhs of people, or repurpose the land for other projects.

He also alleged that the government is planning to profit by diverting the 14,000 acres acquired under the Pharma City project to various real estate ventures, calling it a massive real estate scam. He demanded that the government either continue with the Pharma City project on the 14,000 acres or return the land to the farmers.

Many of these residents are daily wage laborers, and they are concerned about their livelihoods if they are displaced. Some have even criticized Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, warning that his actions may lead to widespread discontent.

# **Define FTL of Ramanthapur Pedda Cheruvu: Telangana HC to HMDA**

**TPN, Hyderabad:** The Telangana High Court has instruct- A key point of contention during the hearing was the ed the Hyderabad Metropolitan Development Authority's (HMDA) lake protection wing to issue a final notification defining the Full Tank Level (FTL) of the Ramanthapur Pedda Cheruvu, a key water body in the region. The directive was issued by a bench led by Chief Justice Alok Aradhe and Justice J. Sreenivas Rao while addressing a long-standing writ petition filed in 2005 by a retired Osmania University professor.

The petition sought judicial intervention to combat illegal encroachments in buffer zones of several lakes, including Ramanthapur Pedda Cheruvu, and raised concerns about the encroachment of buffer zones around 532 lakes and 200 gardens. The court emphasized the importance of public consultation, mandating that authorities consider objections from the public regarding both the buffer zone and the FTL before finalizing the notification.

actual area of the lake, with discrepancies regarding whether it covers 17.26 acres or approximately 30 acres. The court has directed that the final FTL notification must clarify this issue. The court also stressed the urgency of issuing this notification within three weeks, particularly after a preliminary notification was issued in October 2023.

Additionally, the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) was instructed to complete fencing around the lake within six months to protect it from further encroachments and degradation. The case, a Public Interest Litigation (PIL), includes 25 implead petitions challenging the lake protection committee's preliminary notification. Local residents have voiced concerns about the shrinking of the lake and its use as a dumping ground, arguing that the committee's assessment does not accurately reflect its current state.

The four-storeyed structure, built without the necessary permissions, had been a point of concern for the community. The building owner had even constructed a ramp and a staircase leading directly to the lake, exacerbating the encroachment. Officials revealed that the construction occurred 12 years ago, with the owner and family frequently visiting the site for weekends, during which a swimming pool was also under development.

This marked the first instance of using explosives for demolition in the ongoing campaign against illegal structures

Due to the building's location, which made it inaccessible by vehicle, authorities opted for a controlled explosion. Police maintained stringent security measures during the demolition, though a home guard sustained minor injuries in the process.

In response to the recent floods in various districts, including Khammam and Mahabubabad, Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has directed district collectors to identify and demolish buildings constructed within the FTL and buffer zones of lakes. This initiative aims to protect water bodies and prevent future encroachments.

# **SCR Announces Special Train** Services for Dasara, Diwali, and **Chhat Festivals**

TPN, Hyderabad: To accommodate the increased passenger rush during the Dasara, Diwali, and Chhat festivals, the South Central Railway (SCR) has announced special train services connecting various destinations.

The service includes 14 trips of Train No. 07063/07064, running between Kacheguda and Tirupati. Train No. 07063 will operate on Tuesdays—October 1, 8, 15, 22, and 29, as well as November 5 and 12. Meanwhile, Train No. 07064 will run on Wednesdays—October 2, 9, 16, 23, and 30, along with November 6 and 13. These trains will stop at Umdanagar, Shadnagar, Jadcherla, Mahbubnagar, Wanaparthi Road, Gadwal, Kurnool City, Dhone, Gooty, Yerraguntla, Cuddapah, Razampeta, and Renigunta stations in both directions.

Additionally, Train No. 07041 from Secunderabad to Tirupati will operate on Wednesdays and Fridays on October 2, 4, 9, 11, 16, 18, 23, 25, 30, and November 1, 6, 8, 13,

and 15. The return service, Train No. 07042 from Tirupati to Secunderabad, will run on Thursdays and Saturdays on October 3, 5, 10, 12, 17, 19, 24, 26, 31, and November 2, 7, 9, 14, and 16, stopping at stations including Jangaon, Kazipet, Warangal, and more in both directions.



# Successful Liver and **Kidney Transplants at Osmania General Hospital**

pital (OGH) has achieved significant success in organ transplantation over the past two months, performing two cadaver liver transplants and four cadaver kidney transplants, along with several other organ donations.

On August 29, the transplant team conducted a life-saving liver transplant on Dr. Ravi Sundar, a 45-year-old Associate Professor from Suryapet Medical College, who was suffering from acute liver failure due to a viral infection. Despite his critical condition, the surgery was successful, and he has since recovered and been discharged. Another liver transplant was performed on September 18 for Bathina Narender, a 46-year-old farmer from

The Nephrology and Urology departments at OGH collaborated to carry out two cadaver kidney transplants, and in-house organ donations were made from declared brain-dead patients, with one more donation currently in progress. OGH authorities noted that through these organ donations, they also facilitated four cornea donations and skin donations for burn patients.

# **CM Directs BC Commission to Study Enumeration Process**

TPN, Hyderabad: Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has instructed the Telangana State Backward Classes (BC) Commission to conduct a comprehensive study on the enumeration procedures for BCs in the state. This directive was given during a recent meeting with the commission's chairman, G. Niranjan, and members, including TPCC president B. Mahesh Kumar Goud.

The Chief Minister highlighted the importance of learning from the caste enumeration methods used in other states to ensure that the process in Telangana is efficient and legally sound. He urged the

commission to initiate this exercise promptly and assured them of the state government's full support, emphasizing the need for a timely completion.

In February 2024, the state cabinet unanimously approved the proposal for a caste census and allocated Rs. 150 crore to support the initiative. The BC Commission has developed a detailed 53-question survey to gather comprehensive data on the socio-economic and educational conditions of various castes, including minorities. To enhance the survey's effectiveness, the commission is seeking collaboration with research institutions such as the Centre for Economic and Social Studies (CESS), Administrative Staff College of India (ASCI), Centre for Good Governance (CGG), and the Directorate of Economics and Statistics (DES).



The caste census was a key electoral promise made by the Congress party during the 2023 Assembly elections. After their victory on December 7, 2023, Chief Minister Revanth Reddy reiterated his commitment to this initiative. The census aims to provide essential data for evidence-based policy-making and the development of social welfare schemes, especially for marginalized communities.

The proactive measures taken by the Telangana government are intended to ensure a thorough and legally compliant caste census. This data will be crucial in shaping policies and programs to support the socio-economic upliftment of BCs and other disadvantaged groups in the state.

Srihari highlighted that the BRS, under its current leadership, has resorted to unethical political tactics, which have become a hallmark of its governance.

He claimed that the Congress party is fully prepared for any by-elections and expressed confidence that BRS would not even be able to secure its deposit if elections were held. This indicates the Congress party's strong positioning and readiness to contest against the ruling party. Srihari accused the BRS of becoming synonymous with corruption and illegal activities, eroding public trust in the government.

The MLA also emphasized the Congress party's respect for the judiciary, contrasting it with the BRS's alleged disregard for legal and ethical standards. According to Srihari, the BRS has repeatedly violated democratic



norms, weakening the legislative and administrative frameworks of the state. He urged the people to recognize these issues and support the Congress party in its efforts to restore integrity and transparency in governance.

These remarks highlight the deepening political rivalry in Telangana and Srihari's efforts to position the Congress as a credible alternative to the BRS, focusing on ethical governance and respect for democratic institutions.

# **KTR Warns Officials Misusing Power**

TPN, Telangana: Sirisilla MLA and BRS Working President KTR has strongly criticized officials who he claims are acting with the same enthusiasm as Congress party leaders and activists. He warned that those misusing their power with arrogance will face consequences, even if they have retired, stating that he will ensure accountability and recovery.

Speaking to the media in Rajanna Sirisilla district, KTR expressed disappointment over the behavior of certain officials. He pointed out that, under the BRS government, small villages were upgraded to gram panchayats, and 54 new ration shops were established to support local savings societies, providing them with a source of income. However, he alleged that Congress leaders are now acting as if they run the government, with officials aligning themselves with these leaders.

KTR emphasized that no one, including All India Service Officers, police, RDOs, or collectors, is above the law. He stated that those who disregard the law and act arbitrarily will face repercussions. Referring to a recent incident in Andhra Pradesh where officials were suspended, KTR warned that similar action could be taken in Telangana if officials continue to misuse their authority.

He also addressed allegations from Congress leaders that the 54 ration shop positions were sold for lakhs of rupees without transparency. He called on the authorities to release the merit list and clarify the selection process immediately. KTR assured that he will take the matter to the High Court on behalf of the victims if necessary, reiterating that those found guilty of corrupt practices will be held accountable, regardless of their retirement status.





# New Developments in Harshasai **Sexual Harassment Case**

TPN, Hyderabad: The case involving popular YouTuber Harshasai has taken another turn as the young woman who initially accused him of sexual harassment has filed an additional complaint with the police. The latest report indicates that she, along with her advocate, has alleged that they are being subjected to harassment.

Currently, Harshasai is evading arrest on charges of sexual harassment. Authorities are actively searching for him. The initial complaint was filed by a contestant from Telugu Bigg Boss OTT, who stated that Harshasai had sexually assaulted her multiple times. Following her allegations, the police registered a case under various sections, including 376 (rape), 354 (assault or criminal force to woman with intent to outrage her modesty), and 328 (causing hurt by means of poison).

In response, Harshasai's lawyer has claimed that the case was fabricated for monetary gain. Compounding the situation, a separate complaint related to copyright infringement has been filed



by Mega Cinema against the accused. The victim has also reported receiving harassing emails, prompting her to approach the police once again.

As the investigation unfolds, law enforcement is working diligently to gather evidence and bring clarity to the situation.

## Devadaya Department **Issues Alert Following Quality Concerns in Temples**

TPN, Hyderabad: The Telan- Telangana Revenue Department gana Devadayasa Department has issued a statewide alert in response to the revelation that Tirumala Laddu Prasad was found to contain animal fat. This has prompted an immediate quality check of prasads across several major temples in the state. Officials have dispatched samples of ghee and other essential ingredients used in prasadam preparation to laboratories for thorough testing.

In an effort to address concerns that might affect the sentiments of devotees, the Devadayasa Department has mandated inspections in all temples. The Department of Religion has specified that only Vijaya ghee and approved prasadam should be utilized moving forward. The

has also instructed officials to inspect the quality of various raw materials, including ghee, cardamom powder, cashew nuts, sugar paste, boondi, and others involved in preparing laddus and pulihora.

Following these orders, the Executive Officers (EOs) conducted inspections in various temples, sending ghee samples to a laboratory in Hyderabad for analysis. In addition to routine checks, some temples employ specialized committees to oversee the preparation of prasads. Samples from temples such as Vemulawada, Yadagirigutta, Bhadrachalam, Basara, and Hanumakonda Bhadrakali have already been tested.

An ASI official mentioned, "We recently visited the site with the Mandal Revenue Officer and Defence officials. The Army has claimed ownership of 108 acres of land, including the Patancheru Darwaza, cannon top, and fort walls. They requested clarity on some open land they assert is theirs."

The Patancheru Darwaza, located near Katora Houz lake, has been neglected, resulting in garbage accumulation at its entrance. However, its moat still retains some water, turning into a green habitat during the monsoon season. This historical structure is one of the last remnants of the fortification dating back to the Qutb Shahi period.

Golconda Fort's history dates back to the 14th century when it was initially a mud fort built by the Kakatiya Kingdom. It later became a prominent citadel under Sultan Quli, who founded the Qutb Shahi kingdom. The fort is known for its impressive architecture and historical significance, serving as a symbol of the region's rich heritage.

The primary goal of the inspection was to assess and implement measures aimed at reducing traffic and enhancing the overall road infrastructure.

The inspection team included GHMC Zonal Commissioner Upender Red-TGSPDCL Assistant Engineer dy, Prashanth, Madhapur Traffic Assistant Commissioner Satyanarayana,



and Madhapur Traffic Inspector G. Narsiah. They also reviewed ongoing work to widen the carriageway from Cyber Towers Junction to Yashoda Hospital, a crucial initiative for easing traffic flow.

Additionally, on September 23, top officials, including Hyderabad City Police Commissioner C.V. Anand and MA&UD Principal Secretary Dana Kishore, met with senior representatives from GHMC, HYDRA, HMDA, and both Rachakonda and Cyberabad police to enhance coordination for traffic management during flash floods. They discussed strategies for effective traffic diversions, timely weather notifications, and improved engineering measures to prevent waterlogging and facilitate better drainage, aiming to address Hyderabad's long-term traffic challenges. A joint workshop was proposed to train officials on immediate response strategies, particularly for traffic management during adverse weather conditions.

# **EOW Arrests Goldfish** Abode MD for Alleged **Financial Fraud**

**TPN, Hyderabad:** The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of the Cyberabad police has arrested V. Chandra Sekhar, the Managing Director of Goldfish Abode Private Limited, on charges of financial fraud and misappropriation of funds meant for the Zresta Villas Owners' association. This action follows a complaint lodged by S. Vikranth Reddy, Secretary of the Zresta Villas Owners MMACS, who alleged that Chandra Sekhar executed unauthorized villa registrations through his directors from 2020 to 2023.

According to EOW Deputy Commissioner of Police K. Prasad, the complaint indicated that Chandra Sekhar violated the AGP cum Development Agreement and misappropriated approximately ₹6.81 crore collected from villa owners for the Corpus Fund and maintenance charges. In response to the complaint, the EOW registered a case and subsequently arrested the suspect, who was produced before the court and remanded to judicial custody.

The investigation revealed that Chandra Sekhar has a history of legal troubles, with seven criminal cases filed against him in the Narsingi police limits and one in Gachibowli. Additionally, the Preventive Detention Act was invoked against him by Narsingi Police.

EOW officials found that Chandra Sekhar executed property registrations for villas within the Zresta Gated Community through his Additional Directors, while personally signing sale agreements. He allegedly collected ₹3,96,38,781 as Corpus Fund and ₹2,85,39,945 as maintenance charges from villa owners between 2021 and 2023, without transferring the total amount to the Zresta Villas Owners MMACS Ltd.

Commissioner CV Anand highlighted the growing number of complaints about loud DJ sounds during festivals such as Ganesh Chaturthi and Milad-un-Nabi. He noted that loud music, especially during rallies, is causing distress to elderly residents and raising concerns about potential health risks, including heart attacks. Anand emphasized that DJ music in rallies often resembles publike dancing, which many communities find disruptive.

The meeting was called to gather opinions from different groups to address these issues. Anand stated that a comprehensive report would be prepared and submitted to the government, which will then make a decision on regulating DJ music in religious processions. He stressed that uncontrolled DJ sounds can negatively impact public health.

Concerns over the use of adulterated ghee have previously caused significant uproar, especially related to Tirumala Laddu Prasadam, with devotees worldwide expressing outrage. In light of these issues, the state government has taken decisive action, establishing a Special Investigation Agency (SIT) to investigate allegations of adulteration and malpractice associated with Tirumala prasads. Guntur IG Sarva Shrestha Tripathi has been appointed as the Special Officer for the SIT, which includes key members from various police departments.

## **Film Actor Abhishek Arrested** in Hyderabad Drug Case

TPN, Hyderabad: The Anti-Narcotics Control Bureau has arrested film actor Abhishek in Hyderabad as part of an ongoing drug investigation. Abhishek, who is implicated in drug-related cases connected to the SR Nagar and Jubilee Hills police stations, had been evading legal proceedings, resulting in warrants issued for his failure to appear in court.

Reports indicate that Abhishek fled to Goa, where he operated a restaurant while avoiding authorities. However, the Telangana Narcotic Enforcement Wing (TG NYAB) police apprehended him and have since transferred him to the Hyderabad City Crime Station (CCS) for further investigation.

The arrest marks a significant development in the efforts to combat drug-related offenses in the region, with authorities committed to holding individuals accountable for their involvement in the narcotics trade.

Even if some investors may be overestimating the speed at which AI can revolutionize industries, the technology's potential to transform sectors like healthcare, logistics, and customer service is undeniable.

The truth may lie somewhere in the middle. While there may be elements of overexuberance, AI is still in its early stages, and its full potential has yet to be realized. Much like the dot-com bubble of the late 1990s, which birthed the internet giants that dominate today's economy, the AI "bubble" could eventually produce breakthroughs that redefine industries.

## What Does This Mean for India?

For India, the question of whether we are in an AI bubble is crucial. The country has the potential to become a global leader in AI, but it must navigate this landscape carefully. While Indian entrepreneurs are betting big on AI's future, they must also be mindful of the high costs and the skepticism surrounding the technology. India's large talent pool, growing tech ecosystem, and government support for AI initiatives put the country in a unique position to capitalize on AI innovations. However, the challenge will be ensuring that these investments are directed toward solving real-world problems and not simply chasing trends.

This has emboldened the opposition, with the BJP and Janata Dal (Secular) (JD(S)) calling for Siddaramaiah's resignation.

Siddaramaiah, however, has dismissed the calls to step down, vowing to fight the case in court and claiming that the allegations are part of a larger political conspiracy orchestrated by his rivals in the BJP and JD(S). He remains firm in his stance, asserting that he will eventu-

Shivakumar, Siddaramaiah's long-time rival within the party, has not hidden his ambition to occupy the top post. While Shivakumar has publicly expressed support With by-elections looming for Siddaramaiah, calling the allegations a BJP conspiracy, there are concerns that the internal power struggle could escalate if the legal issues surrounding Siddaramaiah worsen.

At the heart of Congress's challenge is the potential alienation of Siddaramaiah's strong support base, known as AHINDA, which stands for minorities, backward classes, and Dalits. These groups have traditionally been loyal to Siddaramaiah, and any forced leadership change could fracture the party's voter base ahead of future the party must brace itself elections.

The party's high command faces a delicate balancing act. Despite the legal troubles, Siddaramaiah still enjoys considerable support from Congress MLAs. While Shivakumar's influence cannot be overlooked, any attempt to replace Siddaramaiah now may lead to internal dissent and a leadership crisis.

Meanwhile, the opposition, especially the BJP, has seized





# **BJP's Core Voter Base Did Not Like Alliance With NCP": Devendra Fadnavis**

Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis acknowledged on Thursday that the BJP's alliance with the Ajit Pawar-led Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) was initially unpopular with the party's core voter base. Speaking at the India Today Conclave, Fadnavis attributed the BJP's disappointing performance in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls in Maharashtra to poor vote transfers from the NCP.

The BJP-led alliance, which includes Eknath Shinde's Shiv Sena, managed to win just 17 of the 48 Lok Sabha seats in the state, with the BJP securing only nine, down from 23 in the 2019 polls. Fadnavis admitted that the BJP's "core voter base" was uncomfortable with the alliance, but added that "80 per cent" of the voters have now accepted the necessity of such "political compromises."

"It is true this is the BJP's worst performance in recent general elections. We contested 28 seats but won very few. However, we lost 12 seats by a margin of just 3,000 to 6,000 votes, and we still received the highest number of votes overall," Fadnavis said.

He explained that the BJP's long-standing alliance with Shiv Sena made vote transfers easier, but the NCP, being a former rival, faced challenges in transferring its votes to the BJP. Fadnavis expressed confidence that these issues would not affect the upcoming Maharashtra Assembly polls.

The senior BJP leader also admitted that the alliance was a difficult decision for the party's base, but necessary for political reasons. "There are compromises that go against what you truly believe, but you still move forward. I can guarantee that at least 80 per cent of our voter base is now convinced of the need to ally with NCP," he said. Fadnavis further stated that discussions over 80 per cent of the state's 288 assembly seats are complete and that "winnability" would be the primary focus in the upcoming elections, likely to be held in November.

# **PM Launches 3 Supercomputers, Says Science For Self-Reliance Our Mission**

Lauding the progress since the launch of the National Supercomputing Mission in 2015, PM Modi highlighted that India's leadership in quantum computing technology is poised to boost industries such as IT, manufacturing, MSMEs, and startups. He underlined the government's focus on making scientific research accessible to benefit the common man.

The supercomputers will support research across various domains. Pune's Giant Metre Radio Telescope (GMRT) will explore astronomical phenomena like Fast Radio Bursts (FRBs), while the Inter University Accelerator Centre (IUAC) in Delhi will advance material science and atomic physics. In Kolkata, the S N Bose Centre will drive research in cosmology, physics, and earth sciences.

The HPC systems, named 'Arka' and 'Arunika,' are specially designed for meteorological applications, improving the accuracy of predictions for extreme weather events such as cyclones, heatwaves, and heavy rainfall.

PM Modi also reaffirmed India's efforts to build a domestic semiconductor ecosystem, ensuring the nation plays a crucial role in the global supply chain. He further noted that preparations for India's Mission Gaganyaan, which aims to establish a space station by 2035, are underway.

## **False Records Created In Police Station": Agency's Big Claim In RG Kar Case**



In a major development in the RG Kar Hospital rape-murder case, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has revealed that false records related to the case were created at the Tala Police Station in Kolkata. This revelation comes as part of the agency's investigation into the killing of a 31-year-old junior doctor last month. The CBI also stated that it had obtained CCTV footage from the police station, which has been sent to a central forensics lab for examination.

Abhijit Mondal, the officer-in-charge of Tala Police Station at the time, has been arrested on charges of tampering with evidence. He is currently in judicial custody, along with Dr. Sandip Ghosh, the hospital's former chief, who has been arrested over financial irregularities. The prime suspect in the case, Sanjay Roy, a civic volunteer, was also arrested after being seen on CCTV footage entering the room where the doctor's body was found.

The CBI is investigating a possible conspiracy between Mondal, Ghosh, and Roy, highlighting a suspicious delay in seizing key evidence. Additionally, both the High Court and Supreme Court have raised concerns over the 14-hour delay between the discovery of the body and the filing of a police case.

## **CBI Biased: Karnataka** Withdraws Agency's **Permission to Investigate Cases in State**

Karnataka on Friday officially withdrew open consent for the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) to conduct inquiries within its jurisdiction, citing concerns over the agency's alleged bias. Law Minister HK Patil explained that the decision was driven by the state's dissatisfaction with the CBI's handling of investigations, ruling out any direct connection to the ongoing MUDA land scam involving Chief Minister Siddaramaiah.

"We are withdrawing open consent for the CBI investigation in the state due to concerns about their biased actions," Patil said during a press briefing, adding that the move aimed to "control the CBI from taking the wrong path." He emphasized that the state's cabinet stood in solidarity with Siddaramaiah, encouraging him to fight back against allegations.

The decision places Karnataka among a growing list of opposition-ruled states, including West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, and Kerala, which have also revoked open consent for the CBI. Without this consent, the CBI now requires specific approval from the state government for each investigation.

This move comes amid heightened tensions between opposition states and the BJP-led central government, with many opposition leaders accusing the BJP of using the CBI to target political opponents ahead of elections. Patil noted that in several cases referred to the CBI by the Karnataka government, the agency failed to file chargesheets or refused to investigate.

## **Hemant Soren** "Pretending To Be Martyr" After Going To Jail: Rajnath Singh

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Thursday launched a scathing attack on Jharkhand Chief Minister Hemant Soren, accusing him of "pretending to be a martyr" following his imprisonment on corruption charges. Speaking at a Parivartan rally, Singh urged the public to remove the JMM-led government from power, arguing that a leader involved in corruption cannot guide Jharkhand toward development.

"Hemant Soren is pretending to be a 'martyr' after going to jail on corruption charges. Such corrupt CM cannot lead Jharkhand towards development. Show the exit door to such forces and give two consecutive terms to BJP for unparalleled development of the state," Singh declared.

Singh also accused the current administration of encouraging "infiltration and conversion" for political benefits, contrasting this with the BJP's promise to provide housing for all within three years if voted back into power.

The Defence Minister further advocated for the "one nation, one election" policy, stating that it could save the exchequer ₹4 lakh crore, as frequent elections currently cost around ₹7 lakh crore. Singh also took aim at Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, accusing him of tarnishing India's image abroad and asserting that India is no longer a weak nation. He warned that any provocation against India would have consequences, referencing the country's actions against Pakistan as an example.

On Thursday, President Droupadi Murmu visited the Siachen base camp, addressing soldiers stationed at the world's highest battlefield. She praised their bravery and resilience in the face of extreme conditions, acknowledging the sacrifices they make to protect the nation. As the supreme commander of the armed forces, President Murmu said she felt immense pride, declaring, "All citizens salute their bravery."

The President highlighted the challenges soldiers face, such as heavy snowfall and temperatures dropping to minus 50 degrees, yet they remain steadfast in their duty. She emphasized that all Indians recognize and respect their sacrifice and commitment.

During her visit, President Murmu, dressed in military attire, paid tribute to the fallen soldiers at the Siachen War Memorial. She remarked that the memorial stands as a testament to the courage of those martyred since the launch of Operation Meghdoot in 1984, under which India gained control over the Siachen Glacier.

# Saudi Arabia's Warning on Pakistani Begging Crisis

Pakistan is knocking on every door for loans and is struggling to sustain its government due to lack of funds. The economic situation in the country has become dire, with people suffering from food shortages and many fleeing to neighboring countries. French President Emmanuel Macron has strongly endorsed India's bid for a permanent seat on a reformed United Nations Security Council (UNSC), alongside Germany, Japan, Brazil, and two African nations. Macron's call for reform comes amid growing global consensus on the need to reshape the UNSC to better reflect current geopolitical realities.

Speaking at the 79th session of the UN General Assembly in New York, Macron emphasized that the Security Council, often stymied by conflicting interests, needs to evolve. "Germany, Japan, India, and Brazil should be permanent members, as well as two countries that Africa would designate to represent it. New elected members should also be admitted," he said. Macron stressed that these changes would make the UN more effective and representative, ensuring it remains relevant in addressing modern global challenges.

Macron also advocated for limiting the use of veto power in cases of mass atrocities and improving the operational capabilities of the UNSC to maintain international peace and security. He expressed hope that these reforms would enhance the council's decision-making processes.

India's bid for permanent membership has gained increasing global support. US President Joe Biden reiterated Washington's backing during a recent bilateral meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov also called for better representation of developing countries in the council.



Pakistan is preparing for economic "transitional pain" after the International Monetary Fund (IMF) approved a \$7 billion loan package aimed at stabilizing the country's faltering economy. The IMF announced an immediate disbursement of around \$1 billion as part of the deal, marking Pakistan's 24th IMF bailout since 1958.

Pakistan's Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb acknowledged the challenges ahead, stating that while the loan provides critical relief, the country must implement structural reforms to ensure this is the last IMF program it relies on. "There will be transitional pain, but if we are to make it the last programme, then we have to carry out structural reforms," Aurangzeb said in an interview with Geo News.

The three-year loan program from the IMF is contingent on Pakistan pursuing sound economic policies and reforms to foster more inclusive and resilient growth. Among the required reforms are unpopular measures, including reducing power subsidies and expanding Pakistan's narrow tax base.

day ceasefire in the conflict with Hezbollah, ignoring a joint push by the United States, European Union, and several Arab states. The truce proposal followed a week of intense Israeli airstrikes on Hezbollah positions in Lebanon, which resulted in hundreds of deaths and the displacement of tens of thousands of civilians.

Netanyahu's office confirmed that the prime minister had not responded to the ceasefire request, which was spearheaded by US President Joe Biden, French President Emmanuel Macron, and other global allies. The joint call for a ceasefire was issued by Western powers, along with Japan, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, and the United Arab Emirates, during meetings on the sidelines of the United Nations General Assembly in New York. The leaders expressed deep concern over the escalating violence, stating that the situation in Lebanon had become "intolerable" and that it was in the best interest of both Israelis and Lebanese civilians to halt the conflict.

"We call for an immediate 21-day ceasefire across the Lebanon-Israel border to provide space for diplomacy towards the conclusion of a diplomatic settlement," the joint statement said.

Despite these appeals, Israeli military actions intensified, with Israeli army chief Lieutenant General Herzi Halevi instructing soldiers to prepare for a potential ground offensive against Hezbollah. The group, in response, has launched rocket barrages into Israel and claimed to have targeted Tel Aviv with a ballistic missile.

The advisory, issued on Thursday, provides options for registration through the embassy's website or by scanning a QR code. Alternatively, individuals can use the direct link [https://www.eoibeijing.gov.in/indian\_national\_registration] (https://www.eoibeijing.gov.in/indian\_national\_registration) to access the registration form.

Upon successful submission, a registration document containing the applicant's name, passport number, and registration number will be automatically generated and sent to the registered email ID. The embassy advised Indian nationals to keep this document handy, as it will need to be attached to future applications for consular services, including passport renewals, document attestations, police clearance certificates, and birth or marriage registrations. Failure to attach the registration document may result in delays in the processing of consular services, the advisory warned.



The question of whether Hindu religious institutions should be freed from state control has sparked significant debate in India. This issue recently gained renewed attention following controversies such as the discovery of beef and fish oil in the Tirupati Laddu, one of the most sacred offerings in the country. The broader discussion revolves around the extent of government involvement in the administration of Hindu temples and their vast wealth, which some view as discriminatory compared to the relative autonomy enjoyed by religious institutions of other faiths.

## **The Financial Power of Temples**

Temples like the Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD), Kerala's Sabarimala Temple, and Maharashtra's Shirdi Sai Baba Temple are among the wealthiest religious institutions in the world, attracting millions of devotees and generating enormous revenue. The Centre for Policy Studies estimated that Hindu temples collectively hold assets worth around ₹5 lakh crore. Religious tourism, driven largely by pilgrimages to these temples, contributes approximately 2.32% to India's GDP, according to a 2019 study by the National Institute of Public Finance and Policy (NIPFP).



Despite this immense financial clout, Hindu temples remain under significant government control. For example, the Tirupati temple, controlled by the state since 1933, generates an annual revenue of ₹3,000-₹4,000 crore, while the Shirdi Sai Baba Temple has generated around ₹29,000 crore since coming under government supervision in 1922. These figures reflect the substantial wealth managed by the state, raising concerns about whether government intervention is necessary or appropriate.

## **Roots of State Control**

State control of Hindu temples dates back to British colonial rule. The British, recognizing the economic power of these temples, implemented measures to manage their administration, primarily to safeguard temple wealth and align it with colonial interests. This system of control persisted post-independence, with the Indian government expanding its authority over temple administration. Laws like the Tamil Nadu Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments Act of 1959 granted the government powers to appoint trustees, manage properties, and direct how temple funds should be allocated.

The rationale behind this intervention was to prevent mismanagement, corruption, and ensure that

temple wealth contributed to public welfare in areas like education, healthcare, and infrastructure. However, this control has sparked controversy, with many Hindus questioning the fairness of this arrangement, especially when religious institutions belonging to other faiths are not subject to similar scrutiny.

## A Question of Equality and Religious Freedom


One of the primary arguments against government control of Hindu temples is the apparent disparity in how different religious institutions are treated.



While Hindu temples are subject to strict government oversight, mosques and churches are managed by community boards, such as the Waqf Board for Muslims and diocesan authorities for Christians. These institutions enjoy significant financial autonomy, a privilege that Hindu temples do not share.

Critics argue that this difference amounts to religious discrimination and violates Article 25 of the Indian Constitution, which guarantees the freedom of religion. India's unique approach to temple management raises questions about whether the state is genuinely maintaining a secular stance or perpetuating a system of unequal treatment between religions.

As renowned advocate Fali S. Nariman pointed out, \*"While the state may regulate secular activities, the moment it interferes with the religious essence of an institution, it steps onto dangerous ground where constitutional rights can be trampled."\* This sentiment resonates with many who believe that government control of Hindu temples infringes on religious freedom and undermines the community's right to manage its sacred institutions.

## Conclusion

The debate over state control of Hindu temples remains complex, rooted in India's colonial past and the challenge of balancing religion and governance in a secular democracy. With growing demands for temple autonomy, the question persists: Should Hindu religious institutions be granted the same freedom as their counterparts from other faiths, or does the government's role in managing temple wealth serve a necessary public good? As this debate continues, it raises important questions about religious freedom, equality, and the role of the state in modern India.



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



# Kangana Ranaut's Film 'Emergency' **Set for Release**


