The Budameru flood has claimed 32 lives, caused extensive property damage, worsened the lives of many, and tarnished the image of Andhra Pradesh, especially in the state capital. Beyond the Krishna River flood, the damage caused by a drain canal is particularly striking. How did this happen? The drain, intended to regulate floods, has itself become the source of the flood. Is this due to government negligence, official leniency, political corruption, or a combination of these factors? It is crucial to investigate and reflect on these issues, which serve as a lesson for both the perpetrators and the public, who often remain passive observers of such problems.

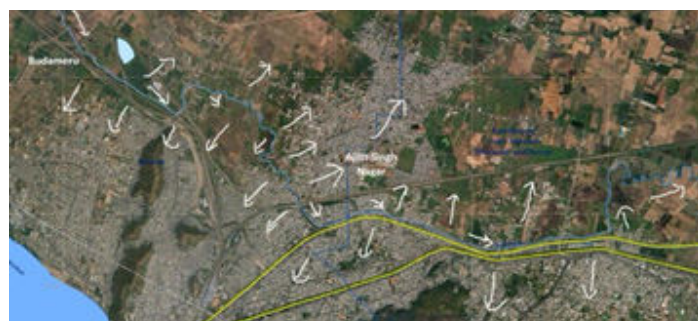
The causes for the breaches and flooding in Budameru are multifaceted. Firstly, the excessive rainfall and the floodwaters from the Krishna River contributed significantly. However, a major factor is the encroachments in the Budameru catchment area.

Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan has officially acknowledged the significant encroachments in the Budameru catchment area. Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu also promised measures to address these encroachments and regulate the Budameru stream. However, it is important to note that these encroachments took place during both Naidu's and Jagan Mohan Reddy's administrations.

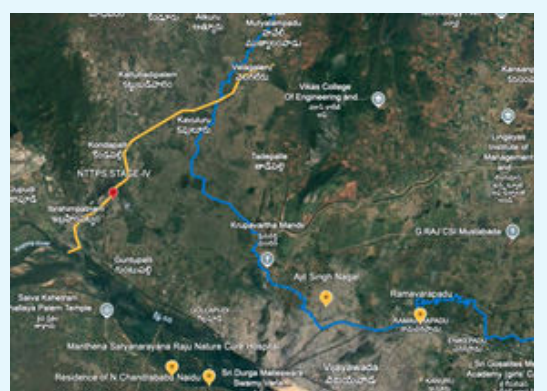
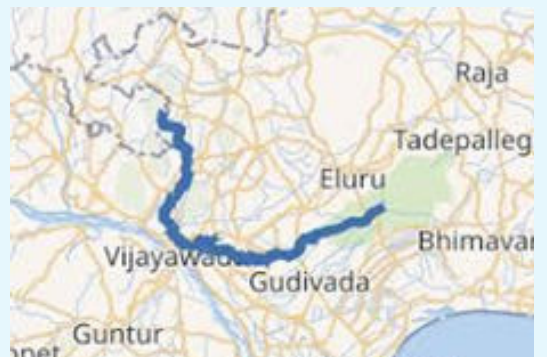
Budameru originates from Mylavaram and G. Konduru hill areas, flowing up to Velagaleru, where it splits into two channels. One channel flows towards the Krishna River through Agiripalli and Ibrahimpatnam, while the other leads to Kolleru through Eluru. Over time, encroachments have severely impacted

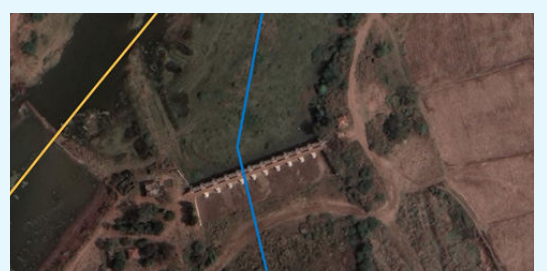


## HOW DID THE FLOOD HAPPEN?

From the night of August 30th onwards, the rainfall intensified significantly. Heavy rain continued into the following day. On August 31st, Vijayawada City experienced severe waterlogging on its roads, exposing the inadequacies of the drainage system. Many outlets, which should not have been used, were found filled with water in the cellars of numerous complexes. Vehicles were stalled in the water, and residents struggled to travel within the city. Despite the rising levels of the Krishna River, there was no expectation of floods. People assumed it would be the same as before, with only a few officials considering the possibility of flooding in Budameru. The general public did not anticipate the severity of the situation.



However, around 2 AM, 11 gates of the Velagaleru regulator of Budameru were suddenly opened without prior public warning. The floodwaters typically take over three hours to reach the affected areas, so an alert could have enabled many to take precautionary measures. Despite obtaining permission from the government, officials failed to notify the public. The sudden release of water caused a breach in the bund at Kavuluru, leading to floods in northern Vijayawada colonies such as Singnagar, Rajarajeswaripeta, Jakkampudi, Ambapuram, Nunna, Payakapuram, and other nearby areas, resulting in substantial damage. It wasn't until the morning of September 1st that the extent of the flooding became widely known.



The Polavaram canal, linked to Budameru at the Velagaleru regulator,

could have allowed floodwater from the Krishna River to revert into the Budameru canal. Fearing potential inundation of the NTPS plant, officials decided to open the 11 gates of the regulator, leading to a high flow of floodwater in Budameru and the subsequent breach at Kavuluru. Budameru's capacity is 7,500 cusecs, but on August 31st, the flow exceeded 40,000 cusecs, indicating the flood's severity. The failure to warn the public, despite having time to do so, highlights a significant lapse on the part of the officials and the government.





Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu has been residing at Lingamaneni's Guest House since 2014. In 2019, then-Chief Minister Y. S. Jagan Mohan Reddy raised concerns about the legality of this residence, pointing out that it was built within the Krishna River basin, violating regulations. He also declared Praja Vedika as illegal and demolished it as a demonstration. Notices were subsequently issued to all constructions in the Krishna River basin, permitting only farmhouses and prohibiting concrete structures.

In addition to Lingamaneni's Guest House, other structures such as the Nature Cure Hospital of Mr. Mantena Satyanarayana Raju, guest houses owned by Gokaraju Gangaraju and Pathuri Nagabhushanam, and even the Vijayawada Club are situated in the same area. These properties have been affected by recent floods. Despite notices from the government, many of these constructions obtained stay orders from the court, allegedly due to political influence. Although Mr. Reddy initially pursued the issue, there are claims that he later backed down due to political considerations.

The continued residence of Mr. Naidu at Lingamaneni's Guest House has sparked questions. If both the Chief Minister and Deputy Chief Minister are addressing illegal constructions in the Budameru catchment area, they should also respond to concerns about Naidu's residence. In Telangana, the HYDRA initiative is targeting illegal constructions in buffer zones and at Tank Full Levels (TFL), yet Naidu's residence remains a topic of discussion. While TDP supporters argue that Mr. Naidu will move to Amaravati once his official residence there is completed, the opposition suggests that his preference for a riverfront location is evident in his choice of Amaravati as the capital.

IS THERE A CONSPIRACY BEHIND THE BOATS HITTING PRAKASAM BARRAGE?

The recent floods in Budameru and the Krishna River have heightened tensions. The Prakasam Barrage, experiencing a record flow of 11.4 lakh cusecs, saw several fishing and sand transport boats sink, causing minor damage to its concrete pillars. This barrage, being old and now overwhelmed by the unprecedented flood flow, shocked many with the extent of the damage. Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu has suggested a possible conspiracy behind the incident and has promised an investigation.

Y. S. Jagan Mohan Reddy's tenure, when a boat stalled at the barrage obstructed water flow, exacerbating flooding at Lingamaneni's Guest House, Naidu's residence. At that time, TDP leaders alleged an attempt to depict Amaravati as a flood-prone area.

Current rumors suggest a similar conspiracy, with allegations that the boats were deliberately placed to cause disruption. Critics argue that such incidents are unlikely to occur purely by accident, pointing to similarities in tactics from the past. This has led to suspicions that YCP circles might be

involved in orchestrating these events.



Chandrababu Narrowly Escapes Mishap During Flood Inspection



TPN, Vijayawada: Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu had a close call while inspecting the flood-affected Budameru stream near Maduranagar this afternoon. The incident occurred when Chandrababu, along with party activists, climbed onto a railway track to get a better view of the flooded area.

While on foot atop the railway bridge, a train suddenly approached, causing alarm among those present. The train reportedly passed within just three feet of Chandrababu, leaving everyone worried for his safety. In a quick-thinking move, Chandrababu stepped to the side of the track, narrowly avoiding the train.

The Chief Minister remained calm throughout the incident, standing cautiously on the bridge as the train passed. Officials and party leaders accompanying him breathed a collective sigh of relief as Chandrababu safely avoided the mishap. The inspection continued without further incident, but the moment left everyone visibly shaken by the close encounter.

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## YCP Leader Nandigam Suresh Remanded for 14 Days in TDP Office Attack Case

TPN, Mangalagiri: YCP leader and former Bapatla MP Nandigam Suresh has been remanded for 14 days by the Mangalagiri court in connection with the attack on the TDP central office in Amaravati. The Andhra Pradesh police had registered a case against Nandigam Suresh and several other YCP leaders following the incident. The High Court had earlier dismissed their pleas for anticipatory bail.



Nandigam Suresh, speaking on the case, alleged that the TDP has been harassing him since 2014 and that he has been targeted with false cases as part of a political vendetta. He maintains his innocence in the matter.

There is a likelihood that the police will soon transfer Nandigam Suresh to Guntur Jail. Reports suggest that the police may also file a petition to take the YCP leader into custody for further interrogation. The investigation into the TDP office attack case continues, with more arrests expected.

After going into hiding to avoid arrest, Nandigam Suresh was tracked down by police in Hyderabad, where he was arrested. He had reportedly switched off his phone and gone underground since Wednesday, evading police attempts to apprehend him. Based on mobile phone signals, the police located him and brought him to Mangalagiri, where he was produced in court. The court then ordered his remand for two weeks.

## Is Amaravati safe? Who is responsible for the death of 32 people?

## YCP Leaders Go Into Hiding Amid Arrests Following TDP Headquarters Attack

TPN, Andhra Pradesh: Several YCP leaders in Andhra Pradesh have gone into hiding following the arrest of former Bapatla MP Nandigam Suresh, who is accused in the attack on the TDP headquarters in Amaravati. Andhra Pradesh police apprehended Nandigam Suresh in Hyderabad after an intense search, leaving other YCP leaders, including former minister Jogi Ramesh and YCP leader Devineni Avinash, on the run.

The case stems from an incident where YCP leaders and party workers allegedly attacked the TDP headquarters in Amaravati. In addition to Nandigam Suresh,

other key YCP leaders like Talashila Raghuram, Appireddy, and Vijayawada Deputy Mayor Shailaja's husband Srinivas Reddy are facing charges in connection with the attack. All involved leaders had approached the Andhra Pradesh High Court seeking anticipatory bail, but the court refused to grant it.

After this legal setback, many YCP leaders went into hiding to avoid arrest. Despite efforts to evade the police, solid information led officers to locate Nandigam Suresh in Hyderabad, where he was arrested and taken to Mangalagiri Police Station for questioning. The arrest has

sent shockwaves through the YCP ranks, with leaders like Jogi Ramesh and Devineni Avinash reportedly fearing imminent arrest and also fleeing from public view.

The police, who are simultaneously managing flood relief operations in Vijayawada, have intensified their investigation into the TDP headquarters attack using CCTV footage from the scene. The arrest of Nandigam Suresh has increased the pressure on the remaining accused YCP leaders, with speculation rising about how many more arrests could follow in the coming days.

## TDP Suspends Satyavedu MLA Amidst Sexual Harassment Allegations

TPN, Chittoor: In a shocking development, the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) high command has taken decisive action by suspending Satyavedu MLA Adimulam from the party following serious sexual harassment allegations. Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu made the announcement after a woman accused the MLA of sexually assaulting her at Bimas Hotel in Tirupati. The decision was made after gathering essential details about the incident.



According to reports, the victim, who is also affiliated with the TDP, disclosed that she had repeatedly faced harassment from MLA Adimulam. She revealed that despite her attempts to avoid him, Adimulam continuously pressured her to meet him at various locations, ultimately leading to her being sexually assaulted. The woman stated that she had informed both CM Chandrababu Naidu and TDP leader Nara Lokesh about the MLA's actions through a letter.

The victim alleged that Adimulam threatened to kill her and her family if she spoke out about the incidents. She further disclosed that he had assaulted her on three separate occasions, and to expose his actions, she used a pen camera to capture evidence. The woman stated that Adimulam would regularly harass her through phone calls and messages, threatening dire consequences if

she did not comply with his demands.

The allegations have caused an uproar within the TDP, with party leadership responding swiftly by suspending the MLA from the party. The victim claimed that the MLA had harassed other women in the past, stating that he exploited his position to prey on vulnerable individuals. She emphasized that the MLA's actions were well-documented, with multiple instances of harassment.

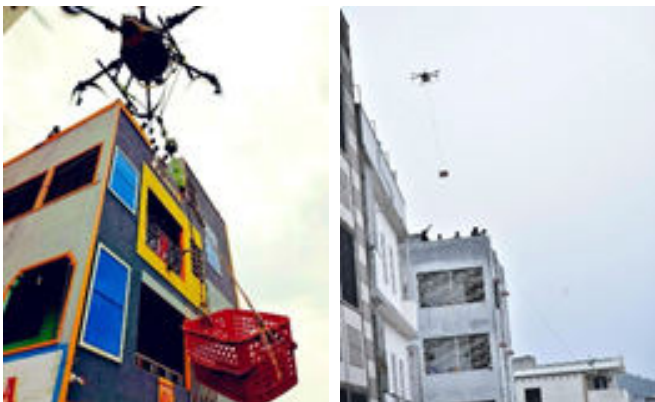

## Ambati Rambabu: Pawan Kalyan Acts Like 'Another Chief Minister'

TPN, Andhra Pradesh: YCP leader Ambati Rambabu held a press conference today, launching a strong criticism against the leaders of the coalition government, particularly targeting Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan. In his remarks, Ambati accused Pawan of trying to portray himself as "another Chief Minister" amidst the ongoing crisis caused by the Vijayawada floods.

## YCP Leader Lella Appireddy Arrested

TPN, Andhra Pradesh: In a major development in the case of the attack on the TDP central office, Mangalagiri police have arrested YCP leader Lella Appireddy. His arrest follows that of former YCP MP Nandigam Suresh, who was apprehended earlier. Appireddy, who had been evading capture, was reportedly detained in Bangalore

and is now set to be presented in court by the police.

The incident, which involved an attack on the TDP headquarters, has led to a series of arrests and a heightened police investigation.

Nandigam Suresh, a key suspect in the case, has already been remanded to 14 days in Guntur Jail. Police are also intensifying their

search for other accused individuals, including YCP leaders Devineni Avinash and Talashila Raghuram, forming 12 special teams to track them down.

The Andhra Pradesh High Court had earlier denied anticipatory bail to the YCP leaders accused in the case, leading to a crackdown by law enforcement. With the arrests of prominent YCP figures, the investigation continues to gain momentum, with more arrests expected in the coming days.



# Union Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan Conducts Aerial Survey of Vijayawada Flood Areas

**TPN, Vijayawada:** Following Prime Minister Narendra Modi's directives, Union Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan conducted an aerial survey of flood-affected areas in Vijayawada today. The region has been hit hard by severe flooding, causing significant damage to infrastructure and displacing many residents.

Accompanied by Andhra Pradesh Minister Nara Lokesh, Shivraj Singh Chouhan observed the flood-hit areas from a helicopter, including the Budameru catchment areas and localities such as Jakkampudi Milk Factory, Kandrika, and Singh Nagar. During the survey, Nara Lokesh provided

a detailed briefing on the extent of damage caused by the floods and the challenges faced by the local population.

Union Minister of State Pemmasani Chandrasekhar, AP Ministers Achchennaaidu, and BJP MLA Sujana Chaudhary were among those who welcomed the Union Minister at Gannavaram Airport before the aerial survey commenced.

This visit, initiated by the Union Government, reflects the Centre's concern and commitment to assessing the flood damage firsthand. Further relief measures and support are expected to be

discussed based on the findings of the survey.

Union Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan commented on the Budameru flood, describing it as a deluge that severely affected several areas. He assured that the coalition government at the center would extend full support to the state. After personally inspecting the conditions at Budameru and Prakasam Barrage, he stated that the central government would announce aid after reviewing the loss estimates. "The Center is ready to support the state," he affirmed, emphasizing the government's commitment to providing necessary assistance in the wake of the flood damage.



## High Court Issues Key Directions in Kadambari Jethwani Case

**TPN, Vijayawada:** In a significant development in the Kadambari Jethwani case, the Andhra Pradesh High Court has issued crucial directions to the police amid the ongoing investigation. The case, which involves allegations by Mumbai actress Kadambari Jethwani against YCP leader Kukkala Vidyasagar, has caused a stir in the state. Kadambari accused Vidyasagar of filing a false case against her at the Ibrahimpatnam Police Station and harassing her.



A petition was filed in the High Court seeking to block the media discussions surrounding Kadambari's allegations. However, during the hearing, the High Court declined to issue immediate orders to halt media discussions on the matter. Instead, the court focused on the integrity of the ongoing investigation.

The High Court instructed the police to preserve all evidence gathered in the case so far, with directions to ensure the evidence is secured until the next hearing, scheduled for September 11. This evidence will play a crucial role in determining whether further investigation is required.

The state government is preparing for a possible CID investigation based on Kadambari's accusations. Meanwhile,

Vijayawada Commissioner of Police has formed a special team, led by ACP Sra v nti Roy, to verify the validity of the case filed at Ibrahimpatnam PS. The team is tasked with determining whether the allegations made by Vidyasagar hold any merit.

On the other hand, Vidyasagar approached the High Court to prevent the government from initiating a parallel investigation. The High Court's decision in the next hearing will determine if the government can proceed with an independent CID investigation in addition to the current inquiry.

The court's decision is expected to be pivotal, as it will decide the course of the investigation into the high-profile case. All eyes are now on the upcoming hearing, where the High Court will rule on whether a parallel probe by the government is warranted.

## AP JAC Amaravati Extends Support to Flood Victims in Vambe Colony

**TPN, Vijayawada:** In response to the devastating floods caused by the overflowing Budameru River, which has submerged Vijayawada for the past four days, the AP JAC Amaravati and the AP Panchayat Raj Engineers Association have stepped forward to assist the affected residents of Vambe Colony, one of the poorest areas in the city.



On Thursday, led by APJAC Amaravati Chairman Bopparaju Venkateshwarlu, employees of the association pledged to donate one day's wages to the flood victims. In a show of solidarity, AP JAC Amaravati distributed essential food items and drinking water to those displaced by the floods. The initiative also included the distribution of water bottles to every household in Ward A to G of Vambe Colony, benefiting approximately 60 homes.

The distribution was carried out under the leadership of AP Panchayat Raj Engineers Association State President and AP JAC Amaravati Treasurer Kanaparathi Sangeetha Rao, along with

former President VV Muralikrishna Naidu and AP JAC Amaravati Women's Wing Chairperson Smt. VV. Their collective efforts ensured that relief reached the most vulnerable sections of society.

The flood relief initiative by AP JAC Amaravati was inspired by Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu's commitment to addressing the crisis, even at the age of 75, motivating the employees to extend their support. This act of generosity is a reflection of the organization's dedication to standing by the victims during this difficult time.

As the situation in Vijayawada remains critical due to the flooding, such relief efforts provide much-needed respite to the displaced residents of Vambe Colony, offering hope and aid to those in desperate need.

## Prakasam Barrage Damaged Due to Boat Collision, Central Team to Assess Situation

**TPN, Vijayawada:** In a concerning incident, three boats collided with the Prakasam Barrage in Vijayawada amidst the heavy flooding of the Krishna River, leading to potential damage to the structure. The state government suspects that the barrage sustained damage due to the force of the collision and has initiated an investigation, calling upon dam expert Kannayya to assess the situation. The central government has also stepped in, with a team conducting an inspection of the barrage to determine the extent of the damage.



The incident occurred last week when heavy floods in the Krishna River caused three boats, traveling at speeds of 30 to 40 kilometers per hour, to drift from Gollapudi and crash into the pillars of the Prakasam Barrage. Witnesses reported that the boats collided with the barrage pillars before coming to a halt across the barrage gates, obstructing the flow of floodwaters. The boats remain lodged in place, and due to the ongoing flood conditions, they have not yet been removed.

Initial assessments suggest that the collision caused damage to several pillars of the Prakasam Barrage, as well as the weight of one of the gates. However, expert Kannayyanaidu has stated that there is no immediate threat to the overall structure of the barrage. The government is awaiting the completion of the inspection by the central team before deciding on the next steps.

With the floodwaters still flowing steadily at the barrage, removing the boats remains a challenge. The government is expected to review both Kannayya Naidu's findings and the report from the central team to make informed decisions on repairing the damage and ensuring the barrage's stability. Authorities estimate that it may take several more days to extract the boats from the barrage, depending on the flood situation.

The collision and its aftermath have drawn significant attention, as the Prakasam Barrage is a crucial infrastructure piece in managing floodwaters and ensuring the safety of nearby areas. Further updates are expected once the central team's report is finalized.

## Aren't you the cause of this evil Jagan?: Devineni Uma



**TPN, Vijayawada:** Senior TDP leader Devineni Uma launched a scathing attack on former Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, blaming him for the recent floods in Vijayawada and accusing him of stopping crucial flood diversion works initiated by the previous TDP government. Speaking to the media at the TDP office, Uma criticized Jagan for holding a "consolation ceremony" in Vijayawada, accusing him of shedding "crocodile tears" while blaming others for the disaster.

Devineni Uma stated that during Chandrababu Naidu's tenure as Chief Minister, the government had called tenders worth ₹464 crores to divert 37,555 cusecs of floodwater from the Budameru Diversion Canal to the Krishna River. He revealed that ₹150 crores had already been spent on the project before it was halted during the YCP regime. Uma blamed the stoppage of these works for the current floods, directly holding Jagan responsible for the crisis. "Aren't you the cause of this evil, Jagan?" he questioned.

He further pointed out that under Chandrababu's leadership, ₹68,000 crores were spent on infrastructure over five years, compared to just ₹32,000 crores during Jagan's rule. Uma asked why the Budameru canal works were halted, demanding answers on behalf of the flood victims.

Uma sharply criticized Jagan's decisions, accusing him of making "selfish" and "stupid" choices, such as reverse tendering, which he believes contributed to the destruction caused by the floods. He also accused the current government of attempting to pressure agencies into filing false

cases against Chandrababu Naidu and Devineni Uma.

Addressing the government's response to the floods, Uma expressed outrage at Jagan's recent visit to Vijayawada, accusing him of coming only to "throw mud" and derive "satanic pleasure." He highlighted that the previous TDP government had constructed 2.3 kilometers of embankment walls at a cost of hundreds of crores to protect Vijayawada from floods, only for the YCP government to stop these works. When TDP leaders staged protests, the YCP government resumed the projects, but Uma mocked Jagan for now taking credit for these initiatives.

In contrast, Uma praised former CM Chandrababu Naidu's proactive efforts in managing flood relief operations. He mentioned that Chandrababu himself stayed at the district collectorate and oversaw the relief measures, ensuring that machinery and JCBs were deployed to assist the victims. Uma emphasized that the TDP government prioritized the welfare of flood victims, providing milk to children and ensuring food for all affected by the Budameru floods.



# Congress Eyes Haryana with Alliance Talks and No CM Face Strategy

As the Haryana assembly elections approach, scheduled for October 5 with results to be declared on October 8, the Congress party is refining its strategy. With a significant decision not to announce a chief ministerial candidate, the party is opting for a collective leadership model, aiming to curb internal factionalism while simultaneously appealing to a broad voter base.

The Congress has also resumed talks with the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) about a potential alliance, which could prove crucial in the upcoming election. Though both parties contested the 2024 general elections together, initial reports suggested they might go their separate ways in the assembly polls. However, renewed discussions have sparked hopes for a united front to take on the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP).

Confident after matching the BJP in the 2024 general elections with five seats each, the Congress believes it has a strong chance in the state elections. During the general elections, the BJP led in 44 assembly segments, the Congress in 42, and AAP in four. In terms of vote share, the BJP secured 46%, the Congress 44%, and AAP 4%, indicating a close competition in the state.

After a meeting of the Congress Election Committee (CEC), Congress leader Ajay Singh Yadav confirmed that the party would not project a chief ministerial candidate for Haryana. The decision on leadership will be taken by the party's high command after the election results are in. This move is seen as a tactical decision to manage factionalism within the party and prevent infighting from derailing its electoral efforts.

AAP Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh has emphasized the priority of defeating the BJP, which he says should be the focus of the INDIA alliance. Singh stated that the party's National General Secretary, Sandeep Pathak, would lead discussions with Congress if an alliance proposal gained traction. A final decision will be made by AAP National Convenor Arvind Kejriwal. AAP's Haryana chief, Sushil Gupta, has also expressed concerns about limiting AAP's stake to just four or five seats, while leaving the ultimate decision to Kejriwal. There are reports of AAP MP Raghav Chadha engaging in back-channel talks with the Congress leadership to iron out the details of the potential alliance.

Former Haryana Chief Minister Bhupender Singh Hooda is currently spearheading Congress's campaign in the state. However, tensions exist within the party, as factions led by Kumari Selja and Randeep Surjewala reportedly remain dissatisfied with Hooda's dominant role. These internal divisions have previously threatened the party's unity. Kiran Choudhury, another key figure in the party, left for the BJP

after her daughter was denied a ticket in the Lok Sabha elections. The decision not to announce a chief ministerial candidate is seen as a way to temper these rivalries and appeal to a wider electorate. Congress hopes to avoid a contest framed around Jat versus non-Jat interests—a division that the BJP has leveraged successfully in past elections.

Hooda, perceived as a leader representing Jat interests, has faced challenges as the BJP used these dynamics to divide the electorate. Congress is now banking on a coalition of Jats, Dalits, and Muslims to secure votes. Dalits, who make up around 20% of the population, are a crucial demographic in this strategy. By not naming a CM candidate, the Congress aims to keep Kumari Selja, a Dalit leader, in play, maintaining the hope of Dalit representation in the leadership.

A post-election study by the Centre for the Study of Developing Societies (CSDS) shows that the INDIA bloc, to which both Congress and AAP belong, secured 64% of the Jat vote and 68% of the Dalit vote in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. The Congress hopes this decision will help retain these votes in the upcoming assembly polls.

Talks of an alliance between Congress and AAP are gathering momentum, given their relatively successful partnership in the general elections, where they jointly won five seats and secured a 48% vote share. AAP contested the Kurukshetra Lok Sabha seat and led in four assembly segments, earning a 4% vote share. However, if AAP runs independently, it could split the opposition vote, potentially aiding the BJP.

In the 2019 Haryana assembly elections, the Jannayak Janata Party (JJP), led by Dushyant Chautala, took 10 seats, mainly in Jat-dominated areas, which hurt the Congress's chances. The Congress is keen to avoid a similar split of the opposition vote this time around. Both Congress and AAP had initially planned solo campaigns for the upcoming elections, but high-level talks between the two parties have reignited alliance discussions. AAP is reportedly asking for 10 seats, while Congress is offering two to three seats.

In terms of demographics, the Bania community (4%), Aroras, Punjabis, Khatri (7%), and Sikhs (5%) are key voter groups. AAP has influence among these groups, particularly in urban pockets close to Delhi and Punjab, which could help Congress strengthen its position in traditionally weaker areas. In the 2024 general elections, the BJP led in 19 of 23 urban seats, while Congress dominated in 34 of the 60 rural seats. AAP's presence could help bridge Congress's urban-rural divide.

By allowing Congress to focus on its Jat-dominated strongholds while leveraging AAP's urban influence, the alliance could be a winning strategy for both parties in the Haryana assembly elections.



## India's Semiconductor Journey: From Setbacks to a Promising Future

On August 23, 2023, as Chandrayaan 3 successfully landed on the moon, engineers at the government-run Semiconductor Laboratory (SCL) in Mohali quietly celebrated a personal victory. The chips and semiconductors they had developed played a critical role in the mission, enabling communication and navigation. Despite this success, SCL, India's only known chip-making foundry, remains far behind global leaders like Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Company (TSMC).

While TSMC, founded in 1987, produces 90% of the world's advanced semiconductors, SCL has been left making legacy chips of 100 nm and above. TSMC's clients include giants like Apple and Nvidia, while SCL's primary customer remains ISRO. Once poised to be a major player, SCL's trajectory was dramatically altered by a mysterious fire in 1989, which destroyed much of its facilities. Though it eventually resumed operations, India's semiconductor ambitions were severely delayed, leaving the country decades behind in the race.

For years, India's semiconductor dreams were marked by failures, with several multinational companies abandoning plans for chip production in the country. However, there is finally hope on the horizon. In August 2022, Micron Technology laid the foundation for a cutting-edge semiconductor assembly, testing, and packaging facility in Gujarat. This \$2.75 billion project is expected to be operational soon and represents a significant milestone in India's semiconductor journey. Since then, other projects have been announced, including a fabrication unit by Taiwan's Powerchip Semiconductor Manufacturing Corporation (PSMC) and Tata Electronics. If successful, this could be India's first private-sector fab unit, marking a critical step forward.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision to position India as a leader in semiconductor manufacturing is ambitious but not unattainable. India has already made significant strides in becoming a hub for mobile phone manufacturing, and the government hopes to replicate this success in the semiconductor industry. While India currently lacks large-scale semiconductor fabrication facilities, it has established a robust ecosystem for chip design, with major global players like Intel, Qualcomm, and AMD having significant R&D centers in the country. Indian engineers are already playing a crucial role in designing advanced chips for cutting-edge technologies like 5G and artificial intelligence.

However, creating a full-fledged semiconductor ecosystem requires more than just design capabilities. India must develop infrastructure

for fabrication, research, testing, and packaging, as well as secure a stable supply of the materials and chemicals needed for chip production. Building a state-of-the-art semiconductor fabrication facility could take up to 10 years, with initial investments running between \$10 billion and \$40 billion. India has already committed \$15 billion to its semiconductor project, but it needs significantly more private investment to compete with countries like China and the US, which have poured billions into their semiconductor industries.

India also faces challenges in securing the necessary materials and creating a stable environment for the semiconductor industry. Manufacturing microchips requires over 150 types of chemicals and 30 types of gases, which are currently sourced from a handful of countries. Additionally, basic infrastructure like a stable power grid and consistent water availability must be addressed before large-scale chip production can begin.

Political will is another critical factor. The semiconductor industry is capital-intensive and time-consuming, requiring long-term commitment from both the government and private players. Successive Indian governments will need to stay the course if the country is to achieve its semiconductor ambitions by 2047, when PM Modi envisions India as a developed nation.

A skilled workforce is also essential to the success of India's semiconductor mission. While India has a large pool of engineers, it lacks the specific expertise needed in the semiconductor industry. Addressing the issue of brain drain could help accelerate India's progress. Many Indians currently occupy leadership roles in global semiconductor companies, but India will need to create the right conditions to attract them back. Taiwan and South Korea successfully kickstarted their semiconductor industries by luring talent back home, offering competitive salaries and better work conditions. India could follow a similar path, but it will require significant improvements in professional environments and compensation packages to stop its best talent from leaving.

As India prepares to launch new semiconductor projects, the success of the Micron factory will be crucial in determining the future of its semiconductor industry. Industry experts believe that India could become a global player in 10 to 20 years if it stays focused and committed. The journey will be long, but with the right strategy, India can finally reverse its semiconductor misfortune and establish itself as a major player in the global chip race.





## Trump Mentioned During Supreme Court Hearing on Arvind Kejriwal's Arrest

In a Supreme Court hearing today on Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's petition challenging his arrest, former U.S. President Donald Trump found an unusual mention. Senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi, representing Mr. Kejriwal, humorously remarked that "Trump" has become a "dangerous word" nowadays. While presenting his argument, Singhvi emphasized that the prosecution's efforts to restart the case should be overridden by Article 21 of the Constitution, which guarantees the right to life and liberty. He quipped, "Article 21 of the Constitution will trump... Nowadays, Trump is a dangerous

word," referring to Trump's current bid for a second U.S. presidential term. The Supreme Court bench, led by Justices Surya Kant and Ujjal Bhuyan, is hearing Kejriwal's petition to challenge his arrest, which occurred on June 26 following a CBI investigation into the Delhi excise policy case. Kejriwal has spent over five months in jail and was previously denied bail by the Delhi High Court on August 5, which upheld his arrest as legal. Singhvi's comments came as the court deliberates on whether to grant Kejriwal bail. The Delhi High Court ruled that Kejriwal's arrest was justified, citing the possibility

that the AAP chief could influence witnesses in the ongoing investigation into alleged irregularities in the excise policy. The outcome of this Supreme Court hearing is critical for Kejriwal, who, despite receiving interim bail in a related Enforcement Directorate case, remains in prison. The excise policy at the center of the controversy was scrapped in 2022, following allegations of corruption and irregularities in its formulation and execution. Both the CBI and ED allege that undue favours were extended to license holders under the policy, leading to a wide-ranging investigation.

## Delhi High Court Issues Contempt Notice to Wikipedia Over ANI Defamation Case

The Delhi High Court on Thursday issued a contempt of court notice to Wikipedia for failing to comply with orders to disclose information about edits made to a page related to news agency ANI. The court warned Wikipedia to adhere to Indian laws, stating, "If you don't like India, please don't work in India... we will ask the government to block your site."

The case stems from ANI's defamation claim against Wikipedia after an edit described the news agency as a "propaganda tool" of the Indian government. ANI argued that Wikipedia allowed defamatory edits and failed to disclose details of three accounts responsible for the changes, despite a court order. ANI also pointed out that Wikipedia had not clarified whether the three individuals were official editors.

In its defence, Wikipedia explained that the delay in providing the requested information was due to the submission of certain documents, further complicated by the fact that Wikipedia is not based in India. However, Justice Navin Chawla expressed dissatisfaction, warning Wikipedia about potential consequences, including a government block on the website.

"It is not a question of the defendant not being an entity in India. We will close your business transactions here. We will ask the government to block Wikipedia... Earlier also you took this position," the judge stated.

The court has ordered a representative of Wikipedia to appear at the next hearing scheduled for October. The Wikimedia Foundation, which runs Wikipedia, released a statement earlier identifying itself as a "technology host" that does not control content, which is managed by a global community of volunteer editors.

## Rebellion Hits BJP After First List of Candidates for Haryana Assembly Polls

A day after the BJP released its first list of 67 candidates for the October 5 Haryana Assembly polls, the party is facing internal dissent. Energy and Jails Minister Ranjit Singh Chautala, 79, and MLA Lakshman Dass Napa quit the party after being denied tickets. Chautala, son of former deputy prime minister Devi Lal, announced his decision to contest the elections as an Independent after consulting his supporters. Napa, MLA from Ratia, also resigned and is set to join the Congress after meeting former chief minister Bhopinder Singh Hooda. Former minister Karan Dev Kamboj stepped down as state BJP's OBC Morcha chief after his candidacy was ignored, expressing disappointment over the party's treatment of loyal members.



The BJP's first list has sparked discontent among several sitting legislators, including Sanjay Singh and Sandeep Singh, who were not renominated. Kavita Jain, a senior BJP leader, was also upset after being passed over for the Sonipat seat, despite her years of service to the party.

With BJP aiming for a third consecutive win in Haryana, it now faces challenges from internal rebellion and a resurgent Congress looking to capitalize on anti-incumbency sentiment. The election results will be declared on October 8.

## Congress Prepares for Haryana Assembly Polls, Eyes Alliance with AAP

The Congress party is gearing up for the Haryana Assembly elections scheduled for October 5, 2024, with results expected on October 8. The party has decided not to project a chief ministerial candidate, instead opting for a combined leadership approach to curb internal factionalism and broaden its appeal. Former Haryana CM Bhopender Singh Hooda is leading the Congress campaign, although some factions within the party, including leaders like Kumari Selja and Randeep Surjewala, have expressed concerns about Hooda's consolidation of power.

The Congress is currently in talks with the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) about a potential alliance. Although both parties contested the 2024 general elections together, early signs suggested they might go their separate ways in the assembly polls. AAP is reportedly demanding 10 seats, but Congress has offered only two to three, with further negotiations expected to be led by AAP National Convenor Arvind Kejriwal.

Congress is focusing on a coalition of Jats, Dalits, and Muslims to counter the BJP's traditional strength in non-Jat and urban areas. Dalits, who make up 20% of the population, are a key constituency, with Kumari Selja emerging as a significant figure in maintaining their support.

The Congress-AAP alliance proved successful in the general elections, securing a 48% vote share and matching the BJP's five seats. Both parties aim to avoid splitting the opposition vote, which could benefit the BJP in critical assembly segments. As Congress focuses on rural areas dominated by Jat voters, it hopes AAP can attract urban voters, particularly in regions bordering Delhi and Punjab, to maximise electoral gains.

## Uttarakhand Government Removes IFS Officer Rahul as Director of Rajaji Tiger Reserve

The Uttarakhand government has removed Indian Forest Service (IFS) officer Rahul from his position as Director of Rajaji Tiger Reserve, following directions from Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami. The Forest Department issued an official order on Tuesday, September 3, relieving Rahul of his duties, with the decision presented to the Supreme Court on Wednesday.

The government took this step after the Supreme Court raised concerns regarding Rahul's appointment due to his previous removal from Corbett Tiger Reserve over allegations of illegal tree cutting. His role as Director of Rajaji Tiger Reserve came under scrutiny as the court took exception to his posting.

According to a government statement, Rahul has been reassigned as Chief Forest Conservator, Monitoring, Evaluation, IT, and Modernisation, based in Dehradun. The decision, after "due consideration," was formalized on September 3. The Deputy Secretary of the Forest Department issued the official orders for his transfer, aligning with the instructions of Chief Minister Dhami.

During a hearing related to the case, the government informed the Supreme Court of the action, leading to the dismissal of a related petition.

Forest Minister Subodh Uniyal commented that the decision to appoint Rahul to Rajaji Tiger Reserve had been made unilaterally by him and the Chief Minister. However, the recent transfer reflects the government's response to the concerns raised by the judiciary.

Rahul, a senior IFS officer, had previously been involved in multiple transfers within the state's forest department, including a tenure as Director of Corbett Tiger Reserve, before being moved to Rajaji. He will now oversee monitoring and modernisation initiatives in his new role.

## DPCC Bans Idol Immersion in Yamuna, Imposes ₹50,000 Fine Ahead of Festivals

The Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC) has prohibited idol immersion in the Yamuna River and other water bodies, ahead of Ganesh Chaturthi and Durga Puja, imposing a fine of ₹50,000 on violators. In an order issued on Wednesday, the DPCC instructed local civic bodies to establish temporary immersion sites or artificial ponds near residential areas for eco-friendly idol immersion.

This decision aligns with directives from the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG), which prohibited idol immersion in the Ganga and its tributaries in 2019 and 2021, specifying similar fines for violations. The DPCC has mandated the Delhi Police and municipal bodies to enforce the guidelines and take action against illegal idol-making operations, particularly those using toxic materials.

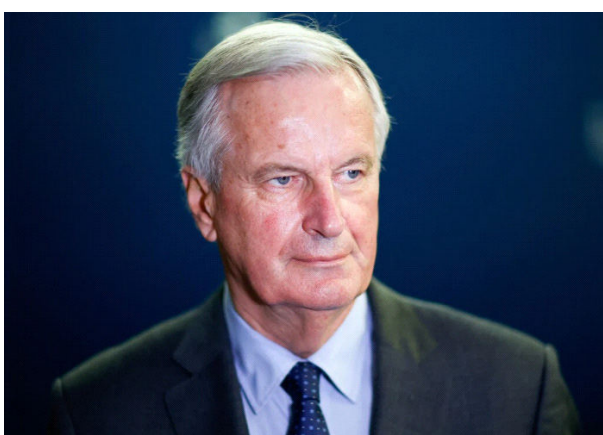
The order explicitly prohibits the use of Plaster of Paris (POP) idols, which contribute to significant water pollution. Toxic chemicals like mercury, lead, chromium, and cadmium used in idol-making leach into water bodies during immersions, causing harm to aquatic life and potentially posing health risks to humans.

Vehicles transporting prohibited idols will be closely monitored, and violators of the guidelines face fines of up to ₹50,000. Continued non-compliance could result in additional penalties ranging from ₹10,000 to ₹15,00,000, the DPCC warned.

To mitigate pollution, the DPCC is promoting eco-friendly idol immersion practices. Residents are advised to use designated immersion sites or artificial ponds. Decanted water from these sites should be repurposed for gardening, while biodegradable materials from idols should be composted.

The DPCC has also announced plans for water quality assessments before, during, and after the immersion process to ensure environmental compliance. Awareness campaigns are being launched to educate the public on the importance of using eco-friendly idols and following the new guidelines.





## Macron Appoints Former EU Brexit Negotiator Michel Barnier as French Prime Minister

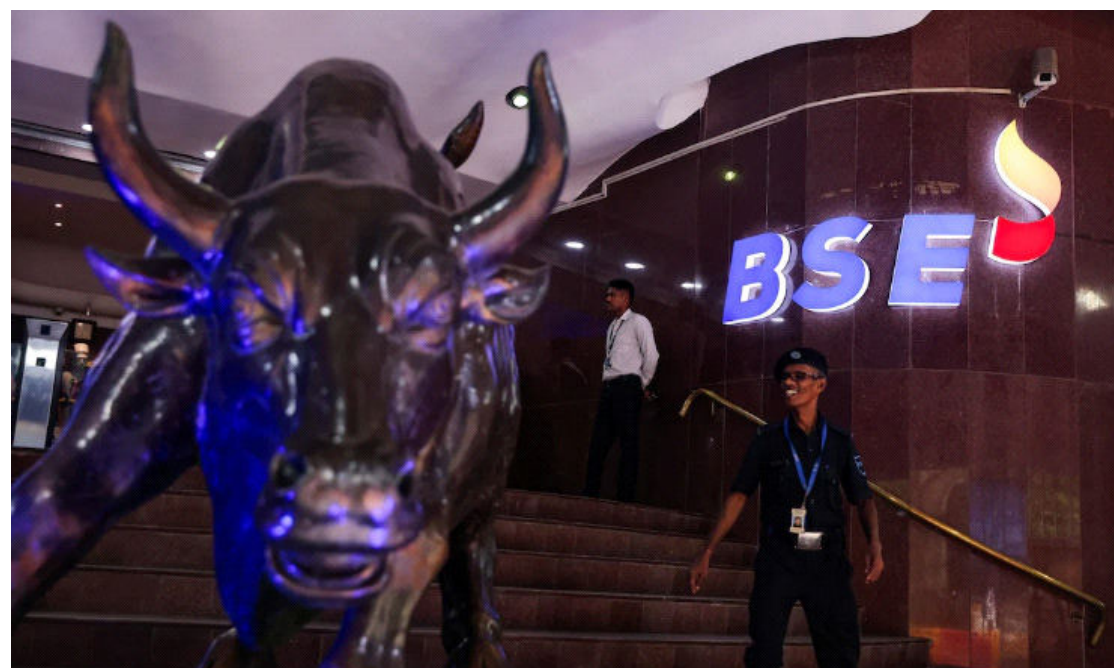
French President Emmanuel Macron has appointed Michel Barnier, the European Union's former chief Brexit negotiator, as his new prime minister following weeks of negotiations after an inconclusive snap election in July. Barnier, 73, a seasoned conservative politician, previously held key roles in French governments and as an EU Commissioner.

The appointment comes amid political deadlock, as no party secured a majority in the recent parliamentary elections. Macron's centrist coalition lost significant seats, and despite the left's New Popular Front alliance winning the most votes, Macron ruled out forming a government with them.

The far-right National Rally (RN), one of the largest parties in parliament, signaled cautious openness to Barnier's appointment, provided he addresses immigration and electoral reforms. However, RN lawmakers emphasized the demand for proportional representation and the dissolution of parliament by next July.

Political uncertainty remains, with doubts over whether Barnier's government will be able to pass reforms in a hung parliament.

## India Emerges as Top Emerging Market Pick for Morgan Stanley, Set to Overtake China in MSCI Index



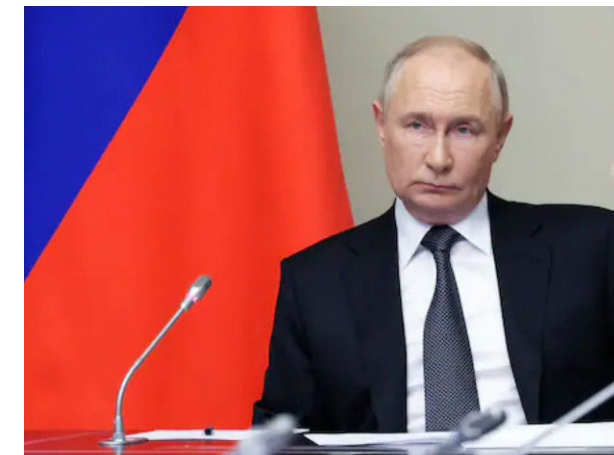
Morgan Stanley has reaffirmed India as its top pick among emerging markets, placing it as the second favorite behind Japan in the Indo-Pacific region. The investment bank noted that India is on the verge of surpassing China as the most influential country in the MSCI Emerging Markets Index, potentially attracting more foreign investment and boosting the ongoing stock market rally.

India's weightage in the MSCI Emerging Markets Index rose to 19.8% following a recent adjustment in August, narrowing the gap with China, whose weightage has fallen to 24.2% from 39.1% in December 2020. India's share has nearly doubled since 2020, driven

by foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) who have poured in over ₹531.78 billion (\$6.33 billion) into Indian equities so far in 2024.

Morgan Stanley analysts, led by Ridham Desai, predict that India's stock market rally, with a 16% gain in the Nifty 50 this year, is only "past the halfway mark." They expect continued inflows, driven by policy stability, global interest rate cuts, and domestic institutional investors, to fuel the next phase of market growth.

Morgan Stanley remains bullish on India, favoring cyclical sectors and large-cap stocks, with an overweight stance on financials, technology, consumer discretionary, and industrials.



## Putin Acknowledges India's Role in Efforts to Resolve Ukraine Conflict

Russian President Vladimir Putin has named India as one of three countries he is in regular contact with regarding efforts to resolve the ongoing Ukraine conflict. During the plenary session of the Eastern Economic Forum (EEF) in Vladivostok, Putin highlighted the involvement of India, along with China and Brazil, in seeking peaceful solutions to the crisis, according to Russian state news agency TASS.

"If there is a desire for Ukraine to continue negotiations, I am open to that," Putin reportedly said. His comments come two weeks after Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's historic visit to Ukraine, where Modi engaged in talks with President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, urging Russia and Ukraine to resolve their differences diplomatically.

Russian Presidential Spokesman Dmitry Peskov also emphasized the "highly constructive" relationship between Modi and Putin, noting India's potential to mediate between the conflicting parties. Peskov stated that Modi's open communication with both Putin and Zelenskyy presents a valuable opportunity for India to influence the global dialogue on the conflict.

Although no specific plans for mediation are in place, Peskov acknowledged India's potential to help facilitate peace discussions. PM Modi's visit to Ukraine, the first by an Indian prime minister, underscored India's commitment to peaceful resolution, with Modi offering India's assistance in ending the war.

Modi's nearly nine-hour stay in Kyiv on August 23 followed his summit talks with Putin six weeks prior, which sparked concern in some Western capitals. During his talks with Zelenskyy, Modi reiterated that India stands for peace and is willing to contribute actively to finding a resolution.

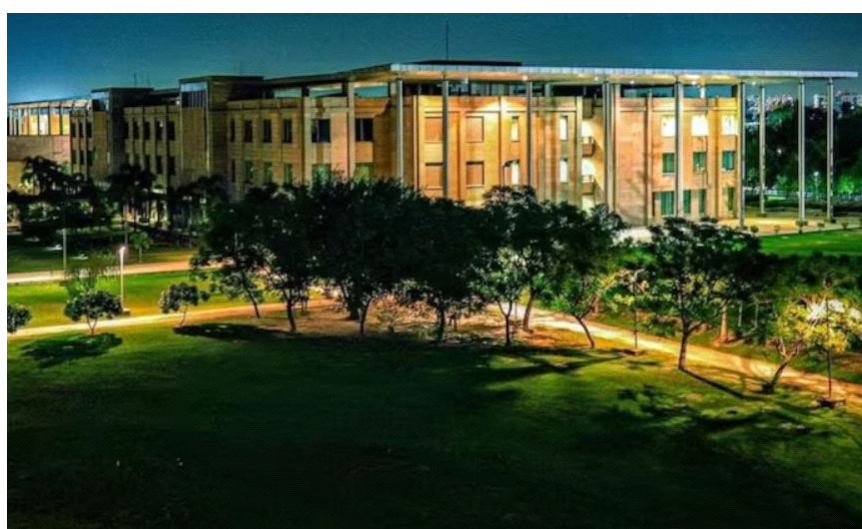

He further emphasized the upcoming challenge posed by the Conservatives under Pierre Poilievre, warning against potential cuts to social services and benefits for workers, retirees, and families.

The NDP-Liberal agreement, forged in 2022, was meant to keep Trudeau's government afloat until October 2025. However, NDP insiders suggest the decision to end the deal had been under discussion for two weeks before Singh's sudden announcement.



## Xi Pledges \$51 Billion in Support for Africa Amid Accusations of China's "Debt Diplomacy"

Chinese President Xi Jinping has pledged nearly \$51 billion in financial aid and investment for Africa, reinforcing China's role as the continent's largest bilateral lender. Speaking at the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation (FOCAC) Summit in Beijing, Xi committed to boosting infrastructure projects, creating 1 million jobs, and supporting economic development across the debt-distressed continent.

Xi's promises include 360 billion yuan (\$50.7 billion) in assistance, with 210 billion provided through credit lines and 70 billion in fresh investments by Chinese companies. The funding will be used for industrial, agricultural, and infrastructure projects, as well as the launch of 30 clean energy initiatives across Africa.

Although Xi did not address Africa's rising debt in his speech, the summit's Beijing Action Plan for 2024-2027 outlined terms for debt repayment postponements. The plan also proposed establishing an African rating agency to improve financial assessments.



## Muhammad Yunus Urges Sheikh Hasina to Remain Silent During Exile in India

Muhammad Yunus, head of Bangladesh's interim government, has expressed displeasure over former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's political remarks during her exile in India, calling it an "unfriendly gesture" that strains relations between the two nations. In an interview with PTI, Yunus emphasized that while Bangladesh values its strong ties with India, Hasina's public statements are causing discomfort.

Yunus, appointed Chief Advisor following Hasina's ouster after widespread anti-government protests, said her continued commentary from India complicates efforts to restore peace in Bangladesh. He asserted that Hasina must remain silent until Bangladesh officially requests her extradition.

"If India wants to keep her until Bangladesh needs her back, the condition should be that she has to keep quiet," Yunus said, adding that her speeches from abroad have been detrimental to both countries.

Hasina fled to India after resigning on August 5, following mass protests against her government. Her stay in India has fueled speculation, and Yunus hinted that her public remarks, including a recent demand for justice over violence in Bangladesh, have created unnecessary tensions.

Yunus also criticized the narrative that portrays Sheikh Hasina as the only leader capable of maintaining stability in Bangladesh, urging India to move beyond this perception. "India is captivated by the narrative that Bangladesh will turn into Afghanistan without Hasina. This needs to change," Yunus remarked. He dismissed concerns raised by India regarding attacks on Hindu minorities in Bangladesh as exaggerated, stating that such incidents are being used as a political excuse.



## Market Declines Amid Pressure from Reliance, Bharti Airtel

Pharma Hits Lifetime High, Titan and ITC Resist Losses

Stock market indices closed lower today as shares of Reliance and Bharti Airtel fell. After a stagnant start, the benchmark indices fluctuated within a narrow range before hitting intraday lows. Lack of support from European and international markets contributed to the decline. Titan and ITC managed to avoid losses, while the market breadth on the BSE favored buyers, with 2,260 stocks gaining and 1,667 losing. The rupee settled at 83.97 against the dollar.



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The BSE Sensex opened at 82,469, up from the previous close of 82,352, and touched an intraday low of 82,130. It reached a high of 82,617 before closing at 82,201, down by 151 points. The NSE Nifty opened at 25,250, dipped to a low of 25,127, and peaked at 25,275, eventually closing 53 points lower at 25,145. Nifty Bank gained 72 points to settle at 51,473.

Among the Nifty50, 17 companies gained while 33 lost. Titan, LTI Mindtree, Wipro, BPCL, and ITC were among the gainers, whereas Cipla, Dr. Reddy's, Coal India, Reliance, and Britannia were notable losers. Sector-wise, indices for Bank, Finance, IT, Media, Metal, PSU Bank, Private Bank, and Consumer Durables saw slight rises. Oil and gas, realty, pharma, FMCG, and auto indices also rose.

In corporate news, Reliance Industries approved a bonus share issue and an increase in authorized share capital. PTC Industries received orders from Israel Aerospace, and Ease My Trip will set up a new company for electric buses. Honeywell Automation began manufacturing battery storage systems, and Max Estates raised Rs.800 crore under the QIP scheme. MOIL shares surged as production hit record levels.

## Gold Prices Drop to Two-Week Low

The precious metal dropped to its lowest level in two weeks, reflecting the impact of shifting expectations around the Fed's upcoming policy meeting.

Spot gold prices declined by 0.2%, trading at \$2,486 per ounce, while US gold futures also dipped by 0.2% to \$2,518.30 per ounce. In the domestic market, 10 grams of gold on the Multi Commodity Ex-

change (MCX) saw a decrease of ₹170, bringing the price to ₹71,200 per 10 grams. Similarly, gold on the Comex fell by \$9 per ounce, reaching \$2,483 per ounce.

The decline in gold prices comes amid growing speculation that the US Federal Reserve might implement a 0.50 basis point rate cut at its policy meeting scheduled for the 18th of this month. This potential cut has fueled uncertainty in the market, pushing investors to adopt a cautious approach, contributing to the continued weakening of gold prices.

## Indian Merchandise Exports Expected to Improve in H2 2024 Amid Global Trade Upturn



The World Trade Organization (WTO) has reported a potential boost for Indian merchandise exports in the latter half of 2024, following an uptick in global trade volume, as indicated by the WTO Goods Trade Barometer. Despite this positive outlook, uncertainties remain due to shifting monetary policies in advanced economies and ongoing weakness in export orders.

Indian goods exports have faced significant challenges recently, largely due to decreased demand from Western markets. For the financial year 2023-24 (FY24), India's merchandise exports experienced a decline of 3.1 percent. The drop has been more pronounced in labour-intensive sectors such as textiles, leather, and gems and

jewellery, which have struggled to maintain previous levels of output and demand.

The anticipated improvement in exports is contingent on several factors, including the stabilization of global trade conditions and resolution of the uncertainties surrounding monetary policies. The WTO's positive projection offers a glimmer of hope for Indian exporters, who are eagerly awaiting a rebound in global demand and more favorable trade conditions.

As the global trade environment continues to evolve, Indian exporters will be closely monitoring these developments to adapt and capitalize on potential growth opportunities in the second half of the year.

## India's Digital Payments Surge: UPI Dominates Market

India's digital payments sector is experiencing remarkable growth, with transaction volumes increasing by 42% year-on-year (YoY) in FY 2023-24, as revealed in a new PwC report. The industry is projected to expand threefold, with transaction volumes expected to climb from 159 billion in FY 2023-24 to 481 billion by FY 2028-29.



The market value of transactions is also set to nearly double, growing from INR 265 trillion to ₹593 trillion over the same period. The Unified Payments Interface (UPI) remains a key driver of this growth. UPI saw a substantial 57% YoY increase in transaction volume in FY 2023-24, surpassing 131 billion transactions.

By FY 2028-29, UPI transactions are an-

anticipated to reach 439 billion, representing an impressive 91% of India's retail digital payment transactions. In FY 2023 alone, UPI accounted for over 75% of the total transaction volume, underlining its central role in the digital payments ecosystem. This growth trend has continued into FY 2024, with UPI transactions valued at ₹199.9 trillion.

Additionally, the digital payment infrastructure is rapidly growing across India, including Tier 2, 3, and 4 cities. QR code usage has surged by over 30% in FY 2023-24, and innovations like soundboxes and new activation strategies are further driving the adoption of digital payments, particularly in smaller cities.

The PwC report forecasts that daily UPI transactions may hit 1 billion by FY 2027-28 and could soar to 1.4 billion by FY 2028-29, reflecting UPI's expanding market penetration and technological advancements. As UPI usage rises, debit card transactions are declining, with consumers increasingly favoring UPI for its convenience.

## Adani Group Seeks \$1.5 Billion in Dollar Bond Sales to Refinance Debt

Billionaire Gautam Adani's conglomerate is negotiating with global banks to raise at least \$1.5 billion through dollar bond sales, marking a significant move in its recovery from a short seller attack. The funds are intended to refinance existing project debt, with the Adani Group aiming to complete the bond sales in multiple tranches by the end of February, according to sources who requested anonymity.

The bonds will primarily be issued by Adani Green Energy Ltd. and Adani Energy Solutions Ltd., as well as through special purpose vehicles. The issuance plan includes both green and sustainability-linked bonds, with discussions ongoing with over ten banks across Japan, Europe, and the Middle East.



The Adani Group, however, did not immediately respond to requests for comment on these developments.

This move follows the conglomerate's return to the dollar bond market in March, its first since a report by short seller Hindenburg Research in early 2023. The report accused the Adani Group of fraud and stock manipulation, allegations which the group has consistently denied. India's market regulator SEBI has also cleared the group of wrongdoing.

Despite these developments, the performance of Adani's 18-year bonds, issued earlier this year, has been lackluster. The bonds have seen a steady decline in the secondary market, trading at approximately 96 cents on the dollar as of Thursday.





# The IC-814 Hijacking and Its Lasting Impact on India's Counter-Terrorism Strategy

The hijacking of Indian Airlines flight IC-814 in December 1999 is a chilling reminder of how vulnerable even large nations can be to acts of terrorism. The crisis, which unfolded over eight harrowing days, tested the Atal Bihari Vajpayee-led Indian government in ways that would leave a lasting imprint on the country's counter-terrorism policies. The actions of the Pakistan-based terrorist group Harkat-ul-Mujahideen (HuM), their demands, and the subsequent release of three dangerous terrorists in exchange for the hostages left a bitter aftertaste that continues to shape India's response to such crises.

The hijacking began on December 24, 1999, when Indian Airlines flight IC-814 took off from Kathmandu for Delhi. What should have been a routine two-hour flight turned into an eight-day nightmare for the 176 passengers and crew aboard the Airbus A300. The hijackers—operatives of the Harkat-ul-Mujahideen—commandeered the plane and took it on a journey that saw it touch down in Amritsar, Lahore, Dubai, and finally, Taliban-controlled Kandahar, Afghanistan. Once in Kandahar, the situation spiraled out of India's control, forcing the government into difficult negotiations.

## A Hostage Crisis with Far-Reaching Demands



The hijackers' initial demands were extreme, seeking the release of 36 terrorists, the body of militant commander Sajjad Afghani, and a \$200 million ransom. These demands were rejected as "un-Islamic" by the Taliban, leading to revised negotiations where Indian officials, including Ajit Doval, faced pressure to release Maulana Masood Azhar in exchange for 15 hostages. Though initially rejected, the escalating crisis and concern for the hostages led the Indian government to ultimately release three notorious terrorists—Masood Azhar, Mushtaq Ahmed Zargar, and Ahmed Omar Saeed Sheikh—who later played pivotal roles in global terror activities.

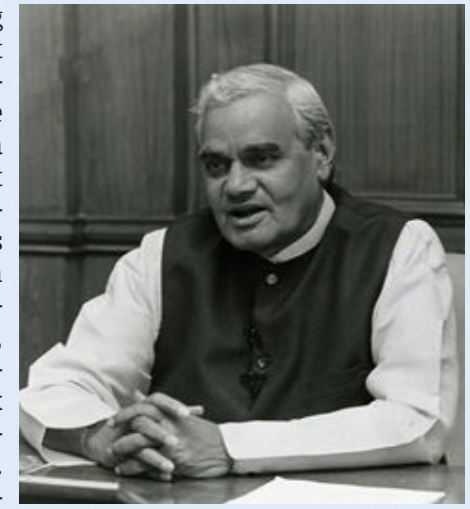
## The Terrorists Behind the Demands



Sajjad Afghani, a commander of Harkat-ul-Ansar, was killed in 1999 during a failed jailbreak. His cellmate, Maulana Masood Azhar, later became a notorious terrorist, founding Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM), responsible for major attacks like the 2001 Indian Parliament and 2019 Pulwama attacks. Azhar's release during the IC-814 hijacking had significant consequences, with his ties to Al-Qaeda and Pakistan's ISI strengthening his global terror influence. Ahmed Omar Saeed Sheikh, also released during the hijacking, later gained infamy for the 2002 murder of journalist Daniel Pearl, further complicating the hijacking's legacy.

## Negotiating with Terrorists: A Double-Edged Sword

The IC-814 hijacking was not just a test of India's diplomatic and intelligence capabilities; it was a moral quandary that laid bare the difficult choices nations must make when faced with terrorism. On one hand, the Vajpayee government could not risk the lives of 176 passengers and crew. On the other, negotiating with terrorists—and worse, agreeing to their demands—was likely to embolden future terrorist activities. The release of Masood Azhar, Zargar, and Sheikh undoubtedly had lasting repercussions, with Azhar's Jaish-e-Mohammed becoming one of the most lethal terror groups targeting India.



Ajit Doval, who was part of the negotiating team, later admitted that the ISI's involvement played a crucial role in the outcome of the hijacking. Without the backing of Pakistan's intelligence agency, he suggested, the situation might have been resolved differently. Kandahar, where the negotiations took place, was not just a Taliban stronghold but also a base for Osama bin Laden's Al-Qaeda network. The Taliban's control of the area, combined with the presence of global jihadist forces, created a perfect storm for India, one that left the government with few viable options.

## The Aftermath and Lessons Learned



The IC-814 hijacking forced India to reevaluate its counter-terrorism strategies and security protocols. It exposed the vulnerabilities in airport security, intelligence gathering, and crisis management. In the years since, India has made significant strides in improving its counter-terrorism capabilities. However, the specter of the Kandahar hijacking still looms large over the nation's approach to dealing with terrorism.

One of the biggest takeaways from the crisis was the need for a more coordinated global response to terrorism. The role of state actors like Pakistan in supporting terrorist activities has long been a point of contention between India and the international community. The hijacking underscored the importance of international cooperation in tackling terrorism, especially when state-sponsored groups are involved.

## Conclusion

The IC-814 hijacking remains one of the darkest chapters in India's modern history. It not only exposed the deep-rooted ties between terror groups and state actors but also highlighted the difficult choices governments face when negotiating with terrorists. The legacy of that incident continues to shape India's counter-terrorism strategies and serves as a stark reminder of the global nature of terrorism. While the lives of the hostages were saved, the long-term consequences of releasing Masood Azhar and others have left an indelible mark on India's fight against terror.





## EU to Review Google's Compliance Proposals on Fair Competition



European Union antitrust regulators are set to seek feedback next week on Google's latest proposals to comply with new tech regulations designed to foster fair competition, according to sources familiar with the matter. This review will determine whether Google faces formal charges for alleged antitrust violations.

In March, the European Commission initiated an investigation into Google to assess whether the tech giant favors its own vertical search engines—such as Google Shopping, Google Flights, and Google Hotels—over competing services. The inquiry also aims to determine if Google discriminates against third-party services in its search results.

This investigation was prompted by complaints from rivals, including comparison shopping sites, who allege that Google has not fully adhered to the EU's Digital Markets Act

(DMA). The DMA is intended to curb the dominance of major tech companies and ensure a fair competitive landscape for smaller businesses.

In response to the criticism, Google has put forward proposals to address these concerns. The company's plan includes creating a separate section in its search results for rival services, positioning it below its own product listing ads box. Additionally, Google has proposed to set up two adjacent boxes: one for intermediaries and another for direct suppliers such as airlines, hotels, and retailers.

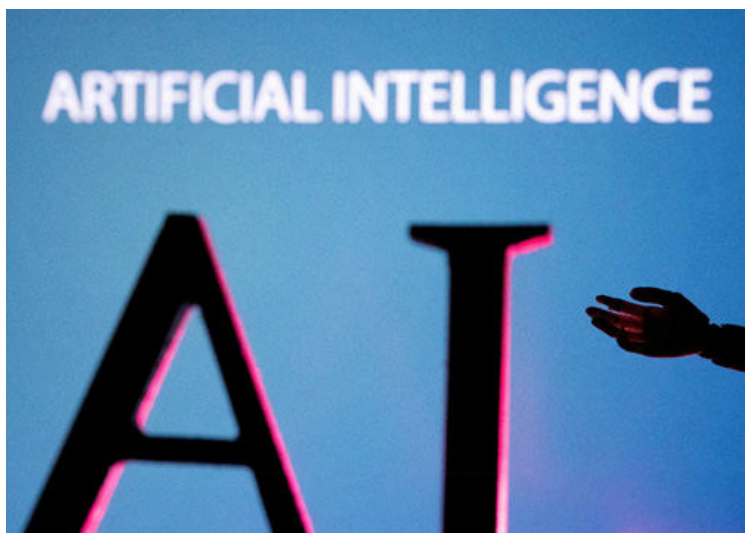
These measures aim to address the EU's concerns by providing more visibility and equal opportunity for competitors in search results. The effectiveness of these proposals will be evaluated through the upcoming feedback process, which will play a crucial role in shaping the regulatory outcome for Google.

## Australia to Introduce New AI Guidelines

Australia's centre-left government announced plans to introduce targeted artificial intelligence (AI) regulations aimed at ensuring human intervention and transparency amid the rapid adoption of AI technologies. Industry and Science Minister Ed Husic revealed 10 new voluntary AI guidelines and opened a month-long consultation to explore the possibility of making these guidelines mandatory in high-risk scenarios.

Husic emphasized that while AI offers significant benefits, there is a strong public demand for safeguards to prevent potential misuse. "Australians want stronger protections on AI; we've heard that, we've listened," Husic stated. The guidelines stress the importance of maintaining human control throughout an AI system's lifecycle to manage unintended consequences and ensure meaningful oversight. Companies will also be required to be transparent about AI's role in content creation.

Global concerns about misinformation and fake news fueled by AI tools have led to stringent regulations elsewhere. For instance, the European Union recently enacted comprehensive AI laws imposing strict transparency requirements on high-risk AI systems. In contrast, Australia's approach has been more flexible, relying on voluntary compliance until now.



The report also highlighted that current regulations are insufficient for managing high-risk AI scenarios. Husic noted that only a third of businesses using AI are adhering to responsible practices concerning safety, fairness, accountability, and transparency. With AI expected to create up to 200,000 jobs in Australia by 2030, Husic stressed the importance of equipping businesses to develop and utilize AI responsibly.

Australia has previously introduced eight voluntary principles for responsible AI use but has yet to implement specific AI laws. Husic's announcement indicates a shift towards more robust regulatory measures to address the evolving challenges posed by AI technologies.

## iPhone 16 Pro Max Could Feature Up to 2TB Storage

As the pineapple method gains traction, it underscores a desire for more meaningful, face-to-face encounters over the impersonal nature of online dating platforms.



## Historic Day for India at Paralympics: Harvinder Singh and Dharambir Shine

Harvinder Singh made history as the first Indian archer to win gold at the Paralympics, adding a remarkable achievement to India's already impressive performance at the Games. On the same day, Dharambir delivered a record-breaking throw in the club throw event, showcasing the prowess of Indian athletes.

Harvinder Singh, who previously secured a bronze medal in Tokyo, surpassed his earlier success with a commanding 6-0 victory over Poland's Lukasz Ciszek in the archery final. The 33-year-old from Haryana, who has overcome physical challenges from a young age, secured his place in Paralympic history with this gold medal. Dharambir also made headlines with an Asian record-breaking throw of 34.92 meters in the F51 club throw final, maintaining his lead throughout the competition. His performance was complemented by Pranav Soorma, who finished second with a throw of 34.59 meters. The F51 club throw event is designed for athletes with severe impairments, requiring them to generate power using only their shoulders and arms.



Adding to India's medal tally, world champion shot-putter Sachin Sarjerao Khilari won silver with a throw of 16.32 meters, setting a new Asian record and surpassing his previous best. Despite a strong challenge from Canada's Greg Stewart, who defended his gold, Khilari's performance was a significant highlight of the day.

India's overall medal haul now stands

at 24, including five gold, nine silver, and ten bronze medals, placing the nation 13th in the standings. This is India's best-ever performance at the Paralympics, with three days of competition still remaining.

In contrast, Indian shooters Nihal Singh and Rudransh Khandelwal did not advance to the finals in the mixed 50m pistol (SH1) event, with both finishing outside the top positions.

## Jos Buttler Out of England vs Australia T20Is; Phil Salt to Lead



England captain Jos Buttler has been ruled out of the T20I series against Australia due to a persistent right calf injury. The England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) has also expressed concerns about his availability for the ODI series against Australia later this month. In Buttler's absence, Phil Salt, who recently captained the Manchester Originals in The Hundred, will lead the England side for the T20Is. All-rounder Jamie Overton has been added to the squad as well.

Jordan Cox, currently with the Test squad for the final match against Sri Lanka at The Oval, has been included in the ODI squad as cover. The three-match T20I series will commence on September 11 at the Rose Bowl in Southampton.

Following the T20Is, England will face Australia in a five-match ODI series starting September 19 at Trent Bridge. This series marks the beginning of a new chapter for

England cricket, with the team looking to rebound after failing to defend their ODI and T20 World Cup titles.

Marcus Trescothick will serve as interim coach for the series against Australia following the dismissal of Matthew Mott. Brendon McCullum is set to take over as head coach at the start of 2025.

## Pant Urges India to Stay Focused Ahead of Test Series Against Bangladesh

Wicketkeeper-batter Rishabh Pant has urged the Indian cricket team to avoid underestimating Bangladesh in their upcoming two-Test series. Pant emphasized the need for India to continuously improve to maintain their edge over competitors. Bangladesh, fresh from a 2-0 series victory over Pakistan in Rawalpindi, will face India in the first Test in Chennai on September 19, followed by a match in Kanpur. India is set to play 10 Tests over the next

five months, starting with this series against Bangladesh, then moving on to three Tests against New Zealand at home in October-November, before a five-Test series against Australia for the Border-Gavaskar Trophy.

Pant noted that teams like Bangladesh, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka excel in Asian conditions due to their familiarity with the wickets. "As the Indian cricket team,

we focus solely on our own standards and how we can improve. Regardless of the opposition, we strive to play with the same intensity and give our 100 percent every single day," he said.

He highlighted that no series can be taken lightly, given the narrow margins in international cricket. "The gap between international teams is very small, and you can't take any series lightly," Pant warned.

## Jannik Sinner Reaches First US Open Semi-Final with Win Over Daniil Medvedev

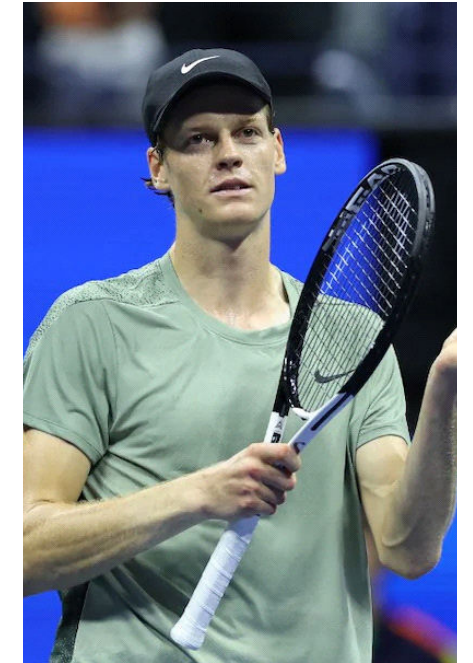
World number one Jannik Sinner secured his first US Open semi-final berth on Wednesday, overcoming 2021 champion and two-time runner-up Daniil Medvedev in a gripping four-set clash. Sinner, aiming for his second major title of the year after winning the Australian Open, triumphed 6-2, 1-6, 6-1, 6-4. He will next face Britain's 25th-ranked Jack Draper for a spot in the final.

At 23, Sinner is the sole top-10 player in the semi-finals. He will face number 12 Taylor Fritz or US compatriot Frances Tiafoe, ranked 20, in Friday's other semi-final. Sinner had previously defeated Medvedev from two sets down at the Australian Open, but the Russian avenged that loss in another five-set battle at Wimbledon.

Sinner commented on the match, "It was very tough, I knew it would be very physical. It was strange in the first two sets; whoever got the break seemed to gain momentum." He expressed anticipation for his match against Draper, noting their friendship off the court and Draper's impressive performance in the tournament so far.

In Wednesday's quarter-final, Sinner dominated the first set with two breaks, while Medvedev

committed 15 unforced errors to Sinner's six. Medvedev responded by breaking twice to win the second set. Sinner bounced back strongly, winning the third set in just 30 minutes. Despite Medvedev



saving two break points in the sixth game of the fourth set, Sinner secured a crucial break for a 4-3 lead and closed out the match.

Medvedev struggled with 57 unforced errors and had to save 10 of 15 break points, falling short of reaching his 10th Grand Slam semi-final.



## New Zealand Arrives in Greater Noida for One-Off Test Against Afghanistan

New Zealand's cricket team has arrived in Greater Noida ahead of their one-off Test match against Afghanistan, scheduled to start on September 9. This Test will mark the first-ever red-ball fixture between the two teams and will be played at the Greater Noida Sports Complex Ground.

The BlackCaps have assembled a strong squad for this Test, led by veteran pacer Tim Southee. The team features former captain Kane Williamson, who had earlier opted out of a central contract this year, as well as Devon Conway, Glenn Phillips, and Rachin Ravindra. Tom Latham remains the vice-captain.

New Zealand's squad includes five spin options: Michael Bracewell, Mitchell Santner, Ajaz Patel, and part-timers Phillips and Ravindra.

The team is set to hold their first practice session on Friday in preparation for the match.

This Test against Afghanistan is part of New Zealand's preparation for their upcoming two-match series against Sri Lanka, which will be crucial for the World Test Championship (WTC) standings. Following the series in Sri Lanka, New Zealand will return to India for a three-match Test series against the Indian team, led by Rohit Sharma. These matches, also part of the WTC calendar, will be played in Bengaluru, Pune, and Mumbai from October to November.

Currently, New Zealand holds the third position in the ICC WTC points table, trailing behind last edition's finalists, India and Australia.

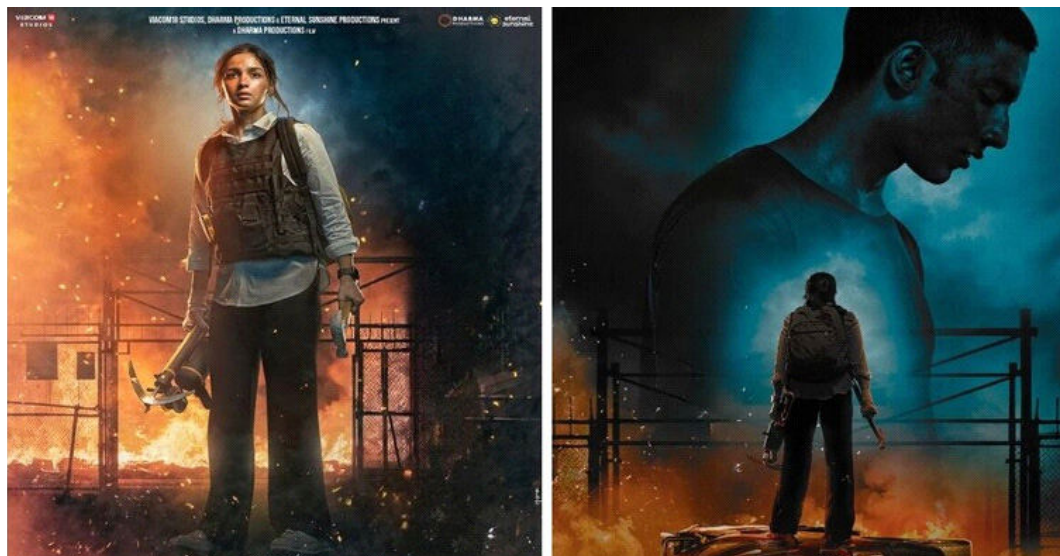

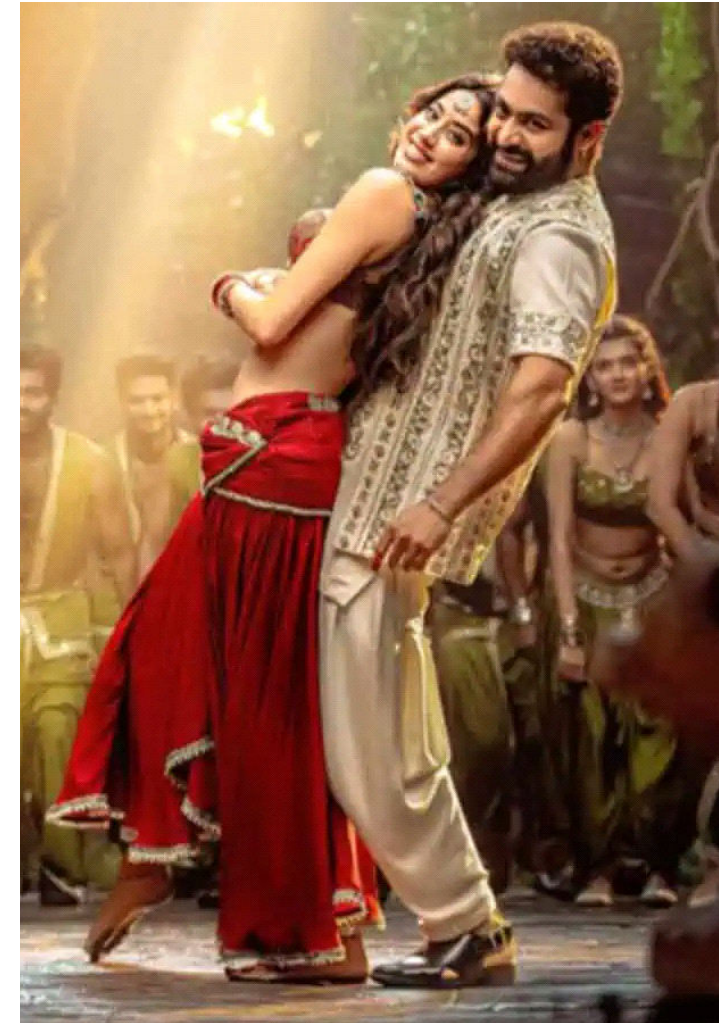

This wouldn't be Prabhas's first cameo in Bollywood. He

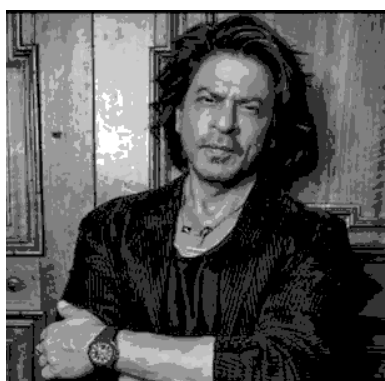


previously appeared in "Action Jackson," dancing alongside Ajay Devgn as a favor to director Prabhu Deva.
