# Bandi Sanjay Urges Union **Textiles Minister for Powerloom Cluster in Sircilla**

TPN. # Film Industry Stands in Solidarity with Flood Victims in Telugu States

# Six Maoists Killed in Encounter in Telangana's Bhadradri Kothagudem District

**TPN, Telangana:** In a significant encounter, six Maoists were killed during an exchange of fire with police in the Bhadradri Kothagudem district of Telangana on Thursday. The operation was launched by police following specific intelligence about the presence of Maoists in the Karakagudem mandal area.

During the operation, a group of Maoists belonging to the Lachanna Dalam, an active faction in the region, engaged with the police. Six Maoists were killed in the ensuing firefight, while a Greyhounds constable sustained injuries.

The Lachanna Dalam is known for its movements across the borders of Chhattisgarh, Andhra Pradesh, and Telangana, frequently evading police operations. Following the encounter, police have intensified search operations to determine if any other Maoists were killed or escaped. Neighboring districts have been placed on high alert to prevent further Maoist activity in the area.

The police are continuing their search efforts, ensuring the area is secured and monitoring any movement across state borders.



# Eligible Youth Should Register as Voters: Telangana Chief Electoral Officer

TPN, Hyderabad: Telangana's Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) Sudarshan Reddy has called on all eligible youth in the state to register as voters. He emphasized that individuals who have turned 18 by January 1, 2024, should ensure they are registered. The electoral roll revision process, which began on August 20, is ongoing, and a draft of the voter list will be released on October 29.

Reddy announced that objections to the draft electoral roll will be accepted until November 28, with the final list set to be published on January 6, 2024. He further revealed that Telangana currently has 3,33,27,304 registered voters. Since April 1, the state has received 8 lakh new voter applications, with 2.45 lakh applications still pending.

Training for Electoral Registration Officers (EROs), Assistant Electoral Registration Officers (AEROs), and Booth Level Officers (BLOs) has already been completed. Additionally, approximately 60 percent of voter cards have been successfully linked with Aadhaar. The CEO urged all eligible citizens to complete the registration process and ensure they are part of the final electoral roll.

# **Govt tapping my phone says BRS MLA Padi Kaushik Reddy**



TPN, Telangana: Huzurabad MLA Padi Kaushik Reddy has made serious allegations against the Telangana government, accusing it of tapping the phones of MLAs, MPs, and MLCs across the state. Speaking at a media conference in Karimnagar, Kaushik Reddy expressed anger, claiming that his phone, along with those of many other political leaders, was being monitored by the government.

In his remarks, Kaushik Reddy also criticized the government's failure to provide full loan waivers to farmers, stating that only 40 percent of farmers in Telangana have benefited from the scheme. He noted that the loan waivers were not implemented simultaneously, adding that those who lost in his constituency were still distributing cheques.

The MLA also called out Union Minister Bandi Sanjay, questioning why he did not respond matter to the High Court.

# KTR Reacts Strongly to Jainur Incident, Criticizes Law and Order Situation in Telangana

TPN, Telangana: BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) has expressed strong disapproval over the recent incident in Jainur mandal of Komurambhim Asifabad district, where an auto driver named Sheikh Magdoom allegedly attempted to sexually assault a tribal woman. KTR took to social media to voice his concerns, attributing the breakdown in law and order to the absence of a full-time Home Minister in Telangana.

KTR criticized the state government, stating that the lack of proper leadership in the Home Ministry is leading to incidents like the one

# Court Summons Issued to KCR and IAS Officer Smita Sabharwal

Telangana: Jayashankar Bhupalapally District Court has issued summons to former Telangana Chief Minister and BRS chief K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) and IAS officer Smita Sabharwal, requiring them to appear for a hearing on October 17. The summons relates to a petition filed by Rajalingamoorthy from Bhupalapally, who claims that the collapse of the Medigadda barrage resulted in a significant loss of public funds.

Earlier, the court had sent notices to KCR and seven other individuals connected to the case. Among those who re-

ceived notices, Lalita Reddy and Sukanya appeared on behalf of former minister Harish Rao, while Supreme Court Advocate Avadani and Shravan Rao represented Mega Krishna Reddy, Rajat Kumar, and L&T MD Suresh Kumar. Chief Irrigation Engineers Hari Ram and Sridhar were represented by Warangal Advocate Narasimha Reddy.

However, KCR and Smita Sabharwal did not appear in court, prompting the issuance of fresh summons for the upcoming hearing in October.

# Formal Digital Director Dilip of BRS has been taken into custody by Cyber Police

TPN, Telangana: The former Director of Telangana Digital Media, Konatham Dileep, was arrested by the CCS police on charges of spreading provocative propaganda and inciting hatred on social media. Dileep is currently being interrogated by the police, sparking a wave of condemnation from BRS leaders, including BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR), who criticized the arrest as an attempt to silence dissent.

BRS leaders have taken to social media, particularly on the BRSX platform, to condemn what they describe as the illegal detention of Dileep for merely questioning the

Telangana government's actions. KTR, expressing his strong disapproval, questioned whether public governance is now being used to suppress those who ask questions.

KTR accused the government, led by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, of stifling dissent and targeting those who criticize its inefficiency and incompetence. He pointed out that Dileep had previously been implicated in a false case, for which the High Court had reprimanded the government, but it seems no lessons were learned.

According to KTR, Dileep's arrest was carried out without providing



him with basic information about the charges, and no transparency was shown regarding the case under which he was detained. KTR warned the government that trying to rule through illegal arrests and suppressing free speech would only lead to greater opposition.

KTR further stated that regardless of how many arrests or cases are made, there will always be voices that continue to question the government. He called for the immediate release of Dileep, denouncing the arrest as a violation of freedom of speech in Telangana. KTR also alleged that for the past nine months, the state has been under autocratic rule, where dissent is being systematically suppressed.

# Tension remains in Jainoor after Tribal was sexually assaulted

TPN, Asifabad: Tension continues to grip Jainoor Mandal in Asifabad district, following communal violence that erupted on Wednesday. The unrest began after a tribal woman was sexually assaulted by an auto-rickshaw driver, identified as Maqdoom, sparking a mob attack that targeted shops and properties belonging to the Muslim community.

In response to the violence, approximately 2,000 police personnel, including the Rapid Action Force, have been deployed to maintain law and order. Senior police officials are overseeing the situation to prevent further escalation.

The unrest was triggered when tribal organizations called for a bandh on Wednesday to protest the alleged assault. The mob attacked homes in a colony predominantly housing Muslim residents, setting fire to properties and ransacking a mosque. Several people were injured during the violence.

The police have arrested Maqdoom and remanded him to judicial custody. Cases have also been registered concerning the mob violence, and a special investigation team (SIT) has been formed to probe the incidents and identify the culprits responsible for the attacks.

On Thursday, no fresh incidents of violence were reported, though the atmosphere remains tense. Prohibitory orders have been enforced, preventing political leaders, including BJP members and Majlis Bachao Tehreek leader Amjedullah Khan, from entering the affected areas. Khan was stopped by the police at the town's border as part of efforts to prevent any further unrest.

The police continue to monitor the situation closely, ensuring that peace is maintained in the region.

# Ex-Telangana Media Director Konatham Dileep Detained, Sparks Criticism

TPN Hyderabad : Former Telangana digital media director and social media activist Konatham Dileep was detained by Hyderabad Central Crime Station (CCS) police on Thursday, reportedly without informing his relatives of the reasons. Known for his outspoken criticism of the Congress government, Dileep's detention has drawn sharp condemnation from political figures.

KT Rama Rao, working president of the BRS, denounced the detention as a misuse of power by the Congress government. He accused administration of employing law enforcement to suppress dissent, calling it "tyranny under the guise of democracy." Rao demanded Dileep's



highlighting immediate release, that the activist has faced ongoing harassment due to his social media activities.

Sources indicate that police officers who detained Dileep did not disclose the charges or provide a copy of the FIR. This action follows months of alleged harassment and previous attempts to frame him in illegal cases, which were thwarted after the Telangana High Court issued directives against his

The BRS has condemned the detention, viewing it as a violation of democratic principles. Many within the party have criticized the Revanth Reddyled government for targeting political dissenters, accusing it of undermining democratic values.

# **IMD Hyderabad Forecasts** Heavy Rains, Issues Orange Alert for Telangana



TPN Hyderabad The India Meteorological Department (IMD) Hyderabad has issued an orange alert for Telangana as the state braces for four days of heavy rainfall. On Thursday, the forecast includes very heavy rains, thunderstorms, lightning, and squalls.

The weather department has issued an orange alert for today and a yellow alert for the following three days, indicating continued heavy rainfall through Sunday. In Hyderabad, residents can expect rains or thundershowers with gusty winds throughout the city

until the weekend.

During the current Southwest monsoon, Telangana has recorded 847.2 mm of rainfall, surpassing the average of 603.2 mm by 40 percent. Hyderabad has received 666.6 mm of rain, compared to the normal 486 mm, marking a 37 percent deviation. Within the city, Nampally has seen a 57 percent increase, with 756.7 mm of rainfall against the usual 480.8 mm.

The expected heavy rains over the next few days are likely to further increase the total rainfall recorded in the city this monsoon.

# CM Revanth Reddy Pushes for Reliable **Power Supply and Solar Energy Expansion**



TPN Hyderabad: In a review meeting on September 4, 2024, Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy underscored the critical need for uninterrupted power supply across all sectors to support the state's goal of becoming a major business hub. He emphasized that every effort must be made to avoid power shortages and instructed the Energy Department to work with the Information Technology and Industries departments to devise a comprehensive plan for future energy needs.

Reddy advocated for maximizing solar energy use and proposed several initiatives to meet rising energy demands. He suggested utilizing unused departmental lands for solar projects and providing solar-powered pump sets to farmers to promote clean energy solutions.

He also proposed adopting his native village, Kondareddypalle, as a pilot project for solar initiatives, aiming to directly credit solar savings to farmers' accounts. Additionally, Reddy encouraged the use of solar cylinders as a replacement for LPG, particularly through women's selfhelp groups, and called for increased solar energy use in forest areas.

Reddy set a target for generating 40,000 MW of solar power annually while reducing financial waste and addressing issues like transformer overloads to ensure a stable power supply.

# Hyderabad Excise Officials Seize Rs 12 Lakh Worth of Non-Duty-Paid Liquor

a substantial quantity of non-duty-paid liquor valued at Rs 12 lakh. The operation led to the confiscation of 415 bottles, totaling approximately 352.68 liters of alcohol.

The illicit shipment was intercepted at the airport while being transported from Goa to Hyderabad. The enforcement operation, led by Excise Enforcement Director Vibi Kamalasan Reddy, Deputy Commissioner Rangareddy Dasarath, and Assistant Commissioner K Rishan, resulted in the arrest of 12 individuals.

Officials highlighted that non-duty-paid liquor significantly impacts government finances by causing substantial revenue losses. Each bottle represents a considerable loss in potential state tax revenue. Despite strict enforcement, smugglers continue to devise ways to transport liquor illegally into Telangana.

# Congress Eyes Haryana with Alliance Talks and No CM Face Strategy

As the Haryana assembly elections approach, scheduled for October 5 with results to be declared on October 8, the Congress party is refining its strategy. With a significant decision not to announce a chief ministerial candidate, the party is opting for a collective leadership model, aiming to curb internal factionalism while simultaneously appealing to a broad voter base.

The Congress has also resumed talks with the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) about a potential alliance, which could prove crucial in the upcoming election. Though both parties contested the 2024 general elections together, initial reports suggested they might go their separate ways in the assembly polls. However, renewed discussions have sparked hopes for a united front to take on the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP).

Confident after matching the BJP in the 2024 general elections with five seats each, the Congress believes it has a strong chance in the state elections. During the general elections, the BJP led in 44 assembly segments, the Congress in 42, and AAP in four. In terms of vote share, the BJP secured 46%, the Congress 44%, and AAP 4%, indicating a close competition in the state.

After a meeting of the Congress Election Committee (CEC), Congress leader Ajay Singh Yadav confirmed that the party would not project a chief ministerial candidate for Haryana. The decision on leadership will be taken by the party's high command after the election results are in. This move is seen as a tactical decision to manage factionalism within the party and prevent infighting from derailing its electoral efforts.

AAP Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh has emphasized the priority of defeating the BJP, which he says should be the focus of the INDIA alliance. Singh stated that the party's National General Secretary, Sandeep Pathak, would lead discussions with Congress if an alliance proposal gained traction. A final decision will be made by AAP National Convenor Arvind Kejriwal. AAP's Haryana chief, Sushil Gupta, has also expressed concerns about limiting AAP's stake to just four or five seats, while leaving the ultimate decision to Kejriwal. There are reports of AAP MP Raghav Chadha engaging in back-channel talks with the Congress leadership to iron out the details of the potential alliance.

Former Haryana Chief Minister Bhupender Singh Hooda is currently spearheading Congress's campaign in the state. However, tensions exist within the party, as factions led by Kumari Selja and Randeep Surjewala reportedly remain dissatisfied with Hooda's dominant role. These internal divisions have previously threatened the party's unity. Kiran Choudhury, another key figure in the party, left for the BJP

after her daughter was denied a ticket in the Lok Sabha elections. The decision not to announce a chief ministerial candidate is seen as a way to temper these rivalries and appeal to a wider electorate. Congress hopes to avoid a contest framed around Jat versus non-Jat interests—a division that the BJP has leveraged successfully in past elections.

Hooda, perceived as a leader representing Jat interests, has faced challenges as the BJP used these dynamics to divide the electorate. Congress is now banking on a coalition of Jats, Dalits, and Muslims to secure votes. Dalits, who make up around 20% of the population, are a crucial demographic in this strategy. By not naming a CM candidate, the Congress aims to keep Kumari Selja, a Dalit leader, in play, maintaining the hope of Dalit representation in the leadership.

A post-election study by the Centre for the Study of Developing Societies (CSDS) shows that the INDIA bloc, to which both Congress and AAP belong, secured 64% of the Jat vote and 68% of the Dalit vote in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. The Congress hopes this decision will help retain these votes in the upcoming assembly polls.

Talks of an alliance between Congress and AAP are gathering momentum, given their relatively successful partnership in the general elections, where they jointly won five seats and secured a 48% vote share. AAP contested the Kurukshetra Lok Sabha seat and led in four assembly segments, earning a 4% vote share. However, if AAP runs independently, it could split the opposition vote, potentially aiding the BJP.

In the 2019 Haryana assembly elections, the Jannayak Janata Party (JJP), led by Dushyant Chautala, took 10 seats, mainly in Jat-dominated areas, which hurt the Congress's chances. The Congress is keen to avoid a similar split of the opposition vote this time around. Both Congress and AAP had initially planned solo campaigns for the upcoming elections, but highlevel talks between the two parties have reignited alliance discussions. AAP is reportedly asking for 10 seats, while Congress is offering two to three seats.

In terms of demographics, the Bania community (4%), Aroras, Punjabis, Khatris (7%), and Sikhs (5%) are key voter groups. AAP has influence among these groups, particularly in urban pockets close to Delhi and Punjab, which could help Congress strengthen its position in traditionally weaker areas. In the 2024 general elections, the BJP led in 19 of 23 urban seats, while Congress dominated in 34 of the 60 rural seats. AAP's presence could help bridge Congress's urban-rural divide.

By allowing Congress to focus on its Jatdominated strongholds while leveraging AAP's urban influence, the alliance could be a winning strategy for both parties in the Haryana assembly elections.





# India's Semiconductor Journey: From Setbacks to a Promising Future

On August 23, 2023, as Chandrayaan 3 successfully landed on the moon, engineers at the government-run Semiconductor Laboratory (SCL) in Mohali quietly celebrated a personal victory. The chips and semiconductors they had developed played a critical role in the mission, enabling communication and navigation. Despite this success, SCL, India's only known chip-making foundry, remains far behind global leaders like Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Company (TSMC).

While TSMC, founded in 1987, produces 90% of the world's advanced semiconductors, SCL has been left making legacy chips of 100 nm and above. TSMC's clients include giants like Apple and Nvidia, while SCL's primary customer remains ISRO. Once poised to be a major player, SCL's trajectory was dramatically altered by a mysterious fire in 1989, which destroyed much of its facilities. Though it eventually resumed operations, India's semiconductor ambitions were severely delayed, leaving the country decades behind in the race.

For years, India's semiconductor dreams were marked by failures, with several multinational companies abandoning plans for chip production in the country. However, there is finally hope on the horizon. In August 2022, Micron Technology laid the foundation for a cuttingedge semiconductor assembly, testing, and packaging facility in Gujarat. This \$2.75 billion project is expected to be operational soon and represents a significant milestone in India's semiconductor journey. Since then, other projects have been announced, including a fabrication unit by Taiwan's Powerchip Semiconductor Manufacturing Corporation (PSMC) and Tata Electronics. If successful, this could be India's first private-sector fab unit, marking a critical step forward.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision to position India as a leader in semiconductor manufacturing is ambitious but not unattainable. India has already made significant strides in becoming a hub for mobile phone manufacturing, and the government hopes to replicate this success in the semiconductor industry. While India currently lacks large-scale semiconductor fabrication facilities, it has established a robust ecosystem for chip design, with major global players like Intel, Qualcomm, and AMD having significant R&D centers in the country. Indian engineers are already playing a crucial role in designing advanced chips for cutting-edge technologies like 5G and artificial intelligence.

However, creating a full-fledged semiconductor ecosystem requires more than just design capabilities. India must develop infrastructure for fabrication, research, testing, and packaging, as well as secure a stable supply of the materials and chemicals needed for chip production. Building a state-of-the-art semiconductor fabrication facility could take up to 10 years, with initial investments running between \$10 billion and \$40 billion. India has already committed \$15 billion to its semiconductor project, but it needs significantly more private investment to compete with countries like China and the US, which have poured billions into their semiconductor industries.

India also faces challenges in securing the necessary materials and creating a stable environment for the semiconductor industry. Manufacturing microchips requires over 150 types of chemicals and 30 types of gases, which are currently sourced from a handful of countries. Additionally, basic infrastructure like a stable power grid and consistent water availability must be addressed before large-scale chip production can begin.

Political will is another critical factor. The semiconductor industry is capital-intensive and time-consuming, requiring long-term commitment from both the government and private players. Successive Indian governments will need to stay the course if the country is to achieve its semiconductor ambitions by 2047, when PM Modi envisions India as a developed nation.

A skilled workforce is also essential to the success of India's semiconductor mission. While India has a large pool of engineers, it lacks the specific expertise needed in the semiconductor industry. Addressing the issue of brain drain could help accelerate India's progress. Many Indians currently occupy leadership roles in global semiconductor companies, but India will need to create the right conditions to attract them back. Taiwan and South Korea successfully kickstarted their semiconductor industries by luring talent back home, offering competitive salaries and better work conditions. India could follow a similar path, but it will require significant improvements in professional environments and compensation packages to stop its best talent from leaving.

As India prepares to launch new semiconductor projects, the success of the Micron factory will be crucial in determining the future of its semiconductor industry. Industry experts believe that India could become a global player in 10 to 20 years if it stays focused and committed. The journey will be long, but with the right strategy, India can finally reverse its semiconductor misfortune and establish itself as a major player in the global chip race.

# Delhi High Court Issues Contempt Notice to Wikipedia Over ANI Defamation Case

The Delhi High Court on Thursday issued a contempt of court notice to Wikipedia for failing to comply with orders to disclose information about edits made to a page related to news agency ANI. The court warned Wikipedia to adhere to Indian laws, stating, "If you don't like India, please don't work in India... we will ask the government to block your site."

The case stems from ANI's defamation claim against Wikipedia after an edit described the news agency as a "propaganda tool" of the Indian government. ANI argued that Wikipedia allowed defamatory edits and failed to disclose details of three accounts responsible for the changes, despite a court order. ANI also pointed out that Wikipedia had not clarified whether the three individuals were official editors.

In its defence, Wikipedia explained that the delay in providing the requested information was due to the submission of certain documents, further complicated by the fact that Wikipedia is not based in India. However, Justice Navin Chawla expressed dissatisfaction, warning Wikipedia about potential consequences, including a government block on the

"It is not a question of the defendant not being an entity in India. We will close your business transactions here. We will ask the government to block Wikipedia... Earlier also you took this position," the judge stated.



The Congress is currently in talks with the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) about a potential alliance. Although both parties contested the 2024 general elections together, early signs suggested they might go their separate ways in the assembly polls. # Uttarakhand Government Removes IFS Officer Rahul as Director of Rajaji Tiger Reserve

The Uttarakhand government has removed Indian Forest Service (IFS) officer Rahul from his position as Director of Rajaji Tiger Reserve, following directions from Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami. The Forest Department issued an official order on Tuesday, September 3, relieving Rahul of his duties, with the decision presented to the Supreme Court on Wednesday.

The government took this step after the Supreme Court raised concerns regarding Rahul's appointment due to his previous removal from Corbett Tiger Reserve over allegations of illegal tree cutting. His role as Director of Rajaji Tiger Reserve came under scrutiny as the court took exception to his posting.

According to a government statement, Rahul has been reassigned as Chief Forest Conservator, Monitoring, Evaluation, IT, and Modernisation, based in Dehradun. The decision, after "due consideration," was formalized on September 3. The Deputy Secretary of the Forest Department issued the official orders for his transfer, aligning with the instructions of Chief Minister

During a hearing related to the case, the government informed the Supreme Court of the action, leading to the dismissal of a related petition.

Forest Minister Subodh Uniyal commented that the decision to appoint Rahul to Rajaji Tiger Reserve had been made unanimously by him and the Chief Minister. However, the recent transfer reflects the government's response to the concerns raised by the judiciary.

Rahul, a senior IFS officer, had previously been involved in multiple transfers within the state's forest department, including a tenure as Director of Corbett Tiger Reserve, before being moved to Rajaji. He will now oversee monitoring and modernisation initiatives in his new role.

# DPCC Bans Idol Immersion in Yamuna, Imposes ₹50,000 Fine Ahead of Festivals

The Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC) has prohibited idol immersion in the Yamuna River and other water bodies. ahead of Ganesh Chaturthi and Durga Puja, imposing a fine of ₹50,000 on violators. In an order issued on Wednesday, the DPCC instructed local civic bodies to establish temporary immersion sites or artificial ponds near residential areas for eco-friendly idol immersion.

This decision aligns with directives from the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG), which prohibited idol immersion in the Ganga and its tributaries in 2019 and 2021, specifying similar fines for violations. The DPCC has mandated the Delhi Police and municipal bodies to enforce the guidelines and take action against illegal idol-making operations, particularly those using toxic materials.

The order explicitly prohibits the use of Plaster of Paris (POP) idols, which contribute to significant water pollution. Toxic chemicals like mercury, lead, chromium, and cadmium used in idol-making leach into water bodies during immersions, causing harm to aquatic life and potentially posing health risks to humans.

Vehicles transporting prohibited idols will be closely monitored, and violators of the guidelines face fines of up to ₹50,000. Continued non-compliance could result in additional penalties ranging from ₹10,000 to ₹15,00,000, the DPCC warned.

To mitigate pollution, the DPCC is promoting eco-friendly idol immersion practices. Residents are advised to use designated immersion sites or artificial ponds. Decanted water from these sites should be repurposed for gardening, while biodegradable materials from idols should be composted.

The DPCC has also announced plans for water quality assessments before, during, and after the immersion process to ensure environmental compliance. Awareness campaigns are being launched to educate the public on the importance of using eco-friendly idols and following the new guidelines.









# **Macron Appoints Former EU Brexit Negotiator Michel Barnier as French Prime Minister**

French President Emmanuel Macron has appointed Michel Barnier, the European Union's former chief Brexit negotiator, as his new prime minister following weeks of negotiations after an inconclusive snap election in July. Barnier, 73, a seasoned conservative politician, previously held key roles in French governments and as an EU Commissioner.

The appointment comes amid political deadlock, as no party secured a majority in the recent parliamentary elections. Macron's centrist coalition lost significant seats, and despite the left's New Popular Front alliance winning the most votes, Macron ruled out forming a government with them.

The far-right National Rally (RN), one of the largest parties in parliament, signaled cautious openness to Barnier's appointment, provided he addresses immigration and electoral reforms. However, RN lawmakers emphasized the demand for proportional representation and the dissolution of parliament by next July.

Political uncertainty remains, with doubts over whether Barnier's government will be able to pass reforms in a hung parliament.

Russian Presidential Spokesman Dmitry Peskov also emphasized the "highly constructive" relationship between Modi and Putin, noting India's potential to mediate between the conflicting parties. Peskov stated that Modi's open communication with both Putin and Zelenskyy presents a valuable opportunity for India to influence the global dialogue on the conflict.



# **Jagmeet Singh Withdraws NDP** Support from Trudeau's Liberal Govt

In a significant political shakeup, Jagmeet Singh, leader of Canada's New Democratic Party (NDP), has announced the withdrawal of his party's support for Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's minority Liberal government. This move comes ahead of next year's general election and signals the end of a confidence-and-supply agreement between the two parties. The NDP-Liberal agreement, forged in 2022, was meant to keep Trudeau's government afloat until October 2025. However, NDP insiders suggest the decision to end the deal had been under discussion for two weeks before Singh's sudden announcement.



# Xi Pledges \$51 Billion in Support for Africa Amid Accusations of China's "Debt Diplomacy"

Chinese President Xi Jinping has pledged nearly \$51 billion in financial aid and investment for Africa, reinforcing China's role as the continent's largest bilateral lender. Speaking at the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation (FOCAC) Summit in Beijing, Xi committed to boosting infrastructure projects, creating 1 million jobs, and supporting economic development across the debt-distressed continent.

Xi's promises include 360 billion yuan (\$50.7 billion) in assistance, with 210 billion provided through credit lines and 70 billion in fresh investments by Chinese companies. The funding will be used for industrial, agricultural, and infrastructure projects, as well as the launch of 30 clean energy initiatives across Africa.

Although Xi did not address Africa's rising debt in his speech, the summit's Beijing Action Plan for 2024-2027 outlined terms for debt repayment postponements. The plan also proposed establishing an African rating agency to improve financial assessments.



# **Muhammad Yunus Urges** Sheikh Hasina to Remain Silent During Exile in India

Muhammad Yunus, head of Bangladesh's interim government, has expressed displeasure over former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's political remarks during her exile in India, calling it an "unfriendly gesture" that strains relations between the two nations. In an interview with PTI, Yunus emphasized that while Bangladesh values its strong ties with India, Hasina's public statements are causing dis-

Yunus, appointed Chief Advisor following Hasina's ouster after widespread anti-government protests, said her continued commentary from India complicates efforts to restore peace in Bangladesh. He asserted that Hasina must remain silent until Bangladesh officially requests her extradition.

"If India wants to keep her until Bangladesh needs her back, the condition should be that she has to keep quiet," Yunus said, adding that her speeches from abroad have been detrimental to both countries.

Hasina fled to India after resigning on August 5, following mass protests against her government. Her stay in India has fueled speculation, and Yunus hinted that her public remarks, including a recent demand for justice over violence in Bangladesh, have created unnecessary tensions.

Yunus also criticized the narrative that portrays Sheikh Hasina as the only leader capable of maintaining stability in Bangladesh, urging India to move beyond this perception. "India is captivated by the narrative that Bangladesh will turn into Afghanistan without Hasina. This needs to change," Yunus remarked. He dismissed concerns raised by India regarding attacks on Hindu minorities in Bangladesh as exaggerated, stating that such incidents are being used as a political excuse.

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Stock market indices closed lower today as shares of Reliance and Bharti Airtel fell. After a stagnant start, the benchmark indices fluctuated within a narrow range before hitting intraday lows. Lack of support from European and international markets contributed to the decline. Titan and ITC managed to avoid losses, while the market breadth on the MURTHY NAIDU PAADAM BSE favored buyers, with 2,260 stocks gaining and 1,667 losing. The rupee settled at 83.97 against the dollar.

The BSE Sensex opened at 82,469, up from the previous close of 82,352, and touched an intraday low of 82,130. It reached a high of 82,617 before closing at 82,201, down by 151

points. The NSE Nifty opened at 25,250, dipped to a low of 25,127, and peaked at 25,275, eventually closing 53 points lower at 25,145. Nifty Bank gained 72 points to settle at 51,473.

Among the Nifty50, 17 companies gained while 33 lost. Titan, LTI Mindtree, Wipro, BPCL, and ITC were among the gainers, whereas Cipla, Dr. Reddy's, Coal India, Reliance, and Britannia were notable losers. Sector-wise, indices for Bank, Finance, IT, Media, Metal, PSU Bank, Private Bank, and Consumer Durables saw slight rises. Oil and gas, realty, pharma, FMCG, and auto indices also rose.

In corporate news, Reliance Industries approved a bonus share issue and an increase in authorized share capital. PTC Industries received orders from Israel Aerospace, and Ease My Trip will set up a new company for electric buses. Honeywell Automation began manufacturing battery storage systems, and Max Estates raised Rs.800 crore under the QIP scheme. MOIL shares surged as production hit record levels.

# **Indian Merchandise Exports Expected to** Improve in H2 2024 Amid Global Trade Upturn



The World Trade Organization **▲** (WTO) has reported a potential boost for Indian merchandise exports in the latter half of 2024, following an uptick in global trade volume, as indicated by the WTO Goods Trade Barometer. Despite this positive outlook, uncertainties remain due to shifting monetary policies in advanced economies and ongoing weakness in export orders.

Indian goods exports have faced significant challenges recently, largely due to decreased demand from Western markets. For the financial year 2023-24 (FY24), India's merchandise exports experienced a decline of 3.1 percent. The drop has been more pronounced in labour-intensive sectors such as textiles, leather, and gems and

jewellery, which have struggled to maintain previous levels of output and demand.

The anticipated improvement in exports is contingent on several factors, including the stabilization of global trade conditions and resolution of the uncertainties surrounding monetary policies. The WTO's positive projection offers a glimmer of hope for Indian exporters, who are eagerly awaiting a rebound in global demand and more favorable trade conditions.

As the global trade environment continues to evolve, Indian exporters will be closely monitoring these developments to adapt and capitalize on potential growth opportunities in the second half of the year.

# Adani Group Seeks \$1.5 Billion in Dollar Bond Sales to Refinance Debt

illionaire Gautam Adani's conglomerate is ne $oldsymbol{\mathsf{D}}$ gotiating with global banks to raise at least \$1.5 billion through dollar bond sales, marking a significant move in its recovery from a short seller attack. The funds are intended to refinance existing project debt, with the Adani Group aiming to complete the bond sales in multiple tranches by the end of February, according to sources who requested anonymity.

The bonds will primarily be issued by Adani Green Energy Ltd. and Adani Energy Solutions Ltd., as well as through special purpose vehicles. The issuance plan includes both green and sustainability-linked bonds, with discussions ongoing with over ten banks across Japan, Europe, and the Middle East.



The Adani Group, however, did not immediately respond to requests for comment on these developments.

This move follows the conglomerate's return to the dollar bond market in March, its first since a report by short seller Hindenburg Research in early 2023. The report accused the Adani Group of fraud and stock manipulation, allegations which the group has consistently denied. India's market regulator SEBI has also cleared the group of wrongdoing.

Despite these developments, the performance of Adani's 18-year bonds, issued earlier this year, has been lackluster. The bonds have seen a steady decline in the secondary market, trading at approximately 96 cents on the dollar as of Thursday.





# The IC-814 Hijacking and Its lasting Impact on India's CounterTerrorism Strategy

he hijacking of Indian Airlines flight IC-814 in December 1999 is a chilling reminder of how vulnerable even large nations can be to acts of terrorism. The crisis, which unfolded over eight harrowing days, tested the Atal Bihari Vajpayee-led Indian government in ways that would leave a lasting imprint on the country's counter-terrorism policies. The actions of the Pakistan-based terrorist group Harkat-ul-Mujahideen (HuM), their demands, and the subsequent release of three dangerous terrorists in exchange for the hostages left a bitter aftertaste that continues to shape India's response to such crises.

The hijacking began on December 24, 1999, when Indian Airlines flight IC-814 took off from Kathmandu for Delhi. What should have been a routine two-hour flight turned into an eight-day nightmare for the 176 passengers and crew aboard the Airbus A300. The hijackers—operatives of the Harkat-ul-Mujahideen—commandeered the plane and took it on a journey that saw it touch down in Amritsar, Lahore, Dubai, and finally, Taliban-controlled Kandahar, Afghanistan. Once in Kandahar, the situation spiraled out of India's control, forcing the government into difficult negotiations.

# A Hostage Crisis with Far-Reaching Demands



The hijackers' initial demands were extreme, seeking the release of 36 terrorists, the body of militant commander Sajjad Afghani, and a \$200 million ransom. These demands were rejected as "un-Islamic" by the Taliban, leading to revised negotiations where Indian officials, including Ajit Doval, faced pressure to release Maulana Masood Azhar in exchange for 15 hostages. Though initially rejected, the escalating crisis and concern for the hostages led the Indian government to ultimately release three notorious terrorists—Masood Azhar, Mushtaq Ahmed Zargar, and Ahmed Omar Saeed Sheikh—who later played pivotal roles in global terror activities.


### The Terrorists Behind the Demands



Sajjad Afghani, a commander of Harkat-ul-Ansar, was killed in 1999 during a failed jailbreak. His cellmate, Maulana Masood Azhar, later became a notorious terrorist, founding Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM), responsible for major attacks like the 2001 Indian Parliament and 2019 Pulwama attacks. Azhar's release during the IC-814 hijacking had significant consequences, with his ties to Al-Qaeda and Pakistan's ISI strengthening his global terror influence. Ahmed Omar Saeed Sheikh, also released during the hijacking, later gained infamy for the 2002 murder of journalist Daniel Pearl, further complicating the hijacking's legacy.

## Negotiating with Terrorists: A Double-Edged Sword

The IC-814 hijacking was not just a test of India's diplomatic and intelligence capabilities; it was a moral quandary that laid bare the difficult choices nations must make when faced with terrorism. On one hand, the Vajpayee government could not risk the lives of 176 passengers and crew. On the other, negotiating with terror-



ists—and worse, agreeing to their demands—was likely to embolden future terrorist activities. The release of Masood Azhar, Zargar, and Sheikh undoubtedly had lasting repercussions, with Azhar's Jaish-e-Mohammed becoming one of the most lethal terror groups targeting India.

Ajit Doval, who was part of the negotiating team, later admitted that the ISI's involvement played a crucial role in the outcome of the hijacking. Without the backing of Pakistan's intelligence agency, he suggested, the situation might have been resolved differently. Kandahar, where the negotiations took place, was not just a Taliban stronghold but also a base for Osama bin Laden's Al-Qaeda network. The Taliban's control of the area, combined with the presence of global jihadist forces, created a perfect storm for India, one that left the government with few viable options.

### The Aftermath and Lessons Learned



The IC-814 hijacking forced India to reevaluate its counter-terrorism strategies and security protocols. It exposed the vulnerabilities in airport security, intelligence gathering, and crisis management. In the years since, India has made significant strides in improving its counter-terrorism capabilities. However, the specter of the Kandahar hijacking still looms large over the nation's approach to dealing with terrorism.

One of the biggest takeaways from the crisis was the need for a more coordinated global response to terrorism. The role of state actors like Pakistan in supporting terrorist activities has long been a point of contention between India and the international community. The hijacking underscored the importance of international cooperation in tackling terrorism, especially when state-sponsored groups are involved.

### Conclusion

The IC-814 hijacking remains one of the darkest chapters in India's modern history. It not only exposed the deep-rooted ties between terror groups and state actors but also highlighted the difficult choices governments face when negotiating with terrorists. The legacy of that incident continues to shape India's counter-terrorism strategies and serves as a stark reminder of the global nature of terrorism. While the lives of the hostages were saved, the long-term consequences of releasing Masood Azhar and others have left an indelible mark on India's fight against terror.







# **EU to Review Google's Compliance Proposals on Fair Competition**



European Union antitrust regulators are set to seek feedback next week on Google's latest proposals to comply with new tech regulations designed to foster fair competition, according to sources familiar with the matter. This review will determine whether Google faces formal charges for alleged antitrust violations.

In March, the European Commission initiated an investigation into Google to assess whether the tech giant favors its own vertical search engines—such as Google Shopping, Google Flights, and Google Hotels—over competing services. The inquiry also aims to determine if Google discriminates against third-party services in its search results.

This investigation was prompted by complaints from rivals, including comparison shopping sites, who allege that Google has not fully adhered to the EU's Digital Markets Act (DMA). The DMA is intended to curb the dominance of major tech companies and ensure a fair competitive landscape for smaller businesses.

In response to the criticism, Google has put forward proposals to address these concerns. The company's plan includes creating a separate section in its search results for rival services, positioning it below its own product listing ads box. Additionally, Google has proposed to set up two adjacent boxes: one for intermediaries and another for direct suppliers such as airlines, hotels, and retailers.

These measures aim to address the EU's concerns by providing more visibility and equal opportunity for competitors in search results. The effectiveness of these proposals will be evaluated through the upcoming feedback process, which will play a crucial role in shaping the regulatory outcome for Google.

# Australia to Introduce New Al Guidelines

ustralia's centre-left govern-Ament announced plans to introduce targeted artificial intelligence (AI) regulations aimed at ensuring human intervention and transparency amid the rapid adoption of AI technologies. Industry and Science Minister Ed Husic revealed 10 new voluntary AI guidelines and opened a month-long consultation to explore the possibility of making these guidelines mandatory in high-risk scenarios.

Husic emphasized that while AI offers significant benefits, there is a strong public demand for safeguards to prevent potential mis-

use. "Australians want stronger protections on AI; we've heard that, we've listened," Husic stated. The guidelines stress the importance of maintaining human control throughout an AI system's lifecycle to manage unintended consequences and ensure meaningful oversight. Companies will also be required to be transparent about AI's role in content creation.

Global concerns about misinformation and fake news fueled by AI tools have led to stringent regulations elsewhere. For instance, the European Union recently enacted comprehensive AI laws imposing strict transparency requirements on high-risk AI systems. In contrast, Australia's approach has been more flexible, relying on voluntary compliance until



The report also highlighted that current regulations are insufficient for managing highrisk AI scenarios. Husic noted that only a third of businesses using AI are adhering to responsible practices concerning safety, fairness, accountability, and transparency. With AI expected to create up to 200,000 jobs in Australia by 2030, Husic stressed the importance of equipping businesses to develop and utilize AI responsibly.

Australia has previously introduced eight voluntary principles for responsible AI use but has yet to implement specific AI laws. Husic's announcement indicates a shift towards more robust regulatory measures to address the evolving challenges posed by AI technologies.





These matches, also part of the WTC calendar, will be played in Bengaluru, Pune, and Mumbai from October to November.

Currently, New Zealand holds the third position in the ICC WTC points table, trailing behind last edition's finalists, India and Australia.


