Modi spreading false propaganda against Telangana

- * Maharashtra BJP leaders are spreading false propaganda against Telangana

TPN, Telangana: Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, during his visit to Mumbai on Saturday, accused Prime Minister Narendra Modi and BJP leaders of spreading false propaganda against the Congress-led Telangana government. Reddy warned that if Modi continues with misleading statements, he will respond by highlighting the truth.

Reddy noted that Maharashtra, with its rich history and influential figures such as Mahatma Jyotiba Phule, Bal Gangadhar Tilak, Savitribai Phule, and Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, should resist BJP's divisive tactics. He criticized Modi for shifting 17 major projects from Maharashtra to Gujarat, calling it a betrayal of the state's interests.

Highlighting his government's achievements, CM Reddy stated that within ten months, Telangana filled over 50,000 government jobs and launched the Mahalakshmi scheme, providing gas at Rs. 500. He reported that 50 lakh citizens have benefited from 200 units of free electricity, and 4 crore women have availed free bus travel through an investment of Rs. 3,541 crores into the RTC. The state also offers a support price of Rs. 500 for rice.

Reddy mentioned the implementation of a Rs. 2 lakh loan waiver for farmers, totaling Rs. 17,869 crores for 22,22,067 farmers in just 25 days. He urged Modi to include the Telangana caste census in the 2025 national census.

Concluding, Reddy called on the people of Maharashtra to reject the BJP, which he claimed had failed them, and uphold their state's proud legacy.

TPN, Hyderabad: After a prolonged period of silence, Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) president and former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekhar Rao expressed strong confidence that his party would reclaim power in Telangana. Addressing party workers from the Palakurthi Assembly Constituency at his residence in Erravalli, KCR pointed to the rising dissatisfaction among different sections of society and the frequent protests against the Congress-led government as clear signs of public discontent.

KCR noted that it has been 11 months since the Congress assumed power, during which time the people have realized the void left by the BRS's absence. He emphasized that the BRS had a proven track record of nurturing Telangana, implementing over 90 percent of its promises, and even launching additional initiatives beyond its original commitments. According to him, this legacy has not been matched by the current administration.

Highlighting the current challenges, KCR criticized the Congress government for its approach, arguing that governance should be defined by tangible actions rather than mere words. He questioned whether the Congress was genuinely using its mandate to serve the people or squandering it on ineffective rhetoric. He reassured party members that the BRS did not make empty promises and stood by its commitment to creating an equitable society



that benefits all.

In his speech, KCR also addressed the increasing challenges faced by BRS leaders and supporters, including what he termed police high-handedness, cases filed against them, and other forms of pressure. He urged the party cadre not to be intimidated by illegal cases or threats of arrest, emphasizing the importance of fighting these battles legally and remaining committed to the party's goals.

The gathering also witnessed leaders from various political backgrounds joining the BRS, reflecting shifting political alignments ahead of the next election. KCR concluded by assuring party members that public trust in the BRS remains strong and that with continued hard work and determination, the party is poised for a victorious return.


TPN, Hyderabad: BRS leader and Huzurabad MLA Padi Kaushik Reddy was arrested on Saturday, November 8, for demanding

the release of the second phase of Dalit Bandhu funds in Karimnagar district. Following his arrest, Reddy complained of chest pain and was admitted to the Huzurabad government hospital for treatment.

Earlier, Reddy announced plans to invite applications from eligible Dalits for the second phase of the Dalit Bandhu scheme. On Saturday morning, hundreds of Dalits gathered at his residence, joining him in a march toward Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's statue in the town. During the protest, police intervened and forcibly arrested the MLA, during which he reportedly sustained injuries.

Reddy, later taken to the Huzurabad police station, accused Chief Minister Revanth Reddy of orchestrating violence against him. "CM Revanth Reddy is planning to murder me. They beat me up and tore my clothes. You can see how a circle inspector held my collar," Reddy stated before being transferred to the hospital.

BRS working president KT Rama Rao (KTR) condemned the arrest, questioning whether it was wrong for an MLA to demand the release of welfare funds. He warned that police officers involved in arresting BRS leaders would face consequences once the party returns to power. TPN, Hyderabad: Union Minister Kishan Reddy made strong statements while inspecting rice procurement centers in Pochampally village, Yadagirigutta-Bhuvanagiri district. Speaking to the media, he criticized Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's remarks, describing them as "degenerate." Kishan Reddy asserted that while they support the Moosi river cleanup project, they oppose the demolition of houses belonging to the



The Union Minister also accused the Congress government of betraying farmers by not fulfilling promises made during the election. He highlighted that despite

announcing a bonus of Rs. 500 for farmers, the government later limited it to only small farmers. He expressed skepticism about the Congress's plans for the Moosi cleanup, estimated to cost Rs. 1.5 lakh crore, questioning their financial strategy and timeline for implementation.

Minister Uttam Urges Swift Action on **Paddy Procurement Process**



Supplies and Irrigation Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy has directed officials to expedite the paddy procurement process across the state. Speaking at a Cabinet Sub-Committee meeting on paddy procurement on November 8, the minister emphasized the need for faster procurement and smooth storage, particularly in districts where millers were not cooperat-

Uttam Kumar Reddy commended the procurement arrangements in most districts but noted that some areas required faster action. He instructed the Civil Supplies Com-

godowns if millers failed to cooperate. The state has arranged 30 lakh metric tonnes of godown space with the State Warehousing Corporation for storage.

The minister reassured that the government would bear the additional costs involved in storing paddy in intermediary godowns and custom milling. "Farmers should not face any inconvenience anywhere in the state," he stressed.

BJP's Bandi Sanjay Attacks CM Revanth Reddy's Leadership



TPN, Telangana: Union Home Minister Bandi Sanjay Kumar, along with BJP workers and ABVP leaders, attended a screening of the film Jitender Reddy at Mamta Theater in Karimnagar. During the event, he congratulated the film's hero, Rakesh Varre, and the entire film unit. Afterward, he addressed the media, launching a strong critique of the state government.

Bandi Sanjay accused Chief Minister Revanth Reddy of misleading the people of Telangana by claiming that promises, including loan waivers and the implementation of the six guar-

antees, were being fulfilled. He challenged Reddy to go on a walk to explain these promises and their progress to the people. Sanjay also expressed concern about the appointment of individuals with alleged Naxalite ties to the Education Commission, questioning what message such appointments sent to society.

The BJP leader also criticized the KCR-led government, alleging that it had burdened each family in Telangana with debts exceeding Rs 1 lakh. He compared the situation to the Congress government, accusing them

of further impoverishing the people by taking on even more debt. Sanjay claimed that the people of Telangana had grown disillusioned with KCR, as the Chief Minister is only visible during elections and fails to take action during crises such as floods or farmer distress.

Sanjay also took a swipe at KTR, stating that while he was seen in rave parties, the public continued to suffer. He concluded by asserting that the people of Telangana no longer trust KCR's family or the governance of the Congress party.

KTR Warns Police Over Attack on MLA Kaushik Reddy



TPN, Telangana: BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) has issued a stern warning to the Telangana Police following a brutal attack on Huzurabad MLA Kaushik Reddy. KTR condemned the police's actions, which he described as an indiscriminate assault on public representatives. He expressed his anger, stating that the police were attacking elected officials and citizens simply for questioning the government, particularly over the second tranche of financial aid under the

Dalit Bandhu scheme.

KTR called out the government for fostering a culture of repression, referring to it as "Indiramma's kingdom" and accused Chief Minister Revanth Reddy of fearfully attacking those who questioned the promises made by the government. He criticized the CM for tolerating such brutality against individuals standing up for the public's rights.

He further warned that police officers acting inappropriately under government pressure would face consequences, asserting, "they will surely pay with mitti (mud) when they come." KTR expressed strong disapproval of the police attack on Kaushik Reddy, labeling it cowardly. He also demanded immediate action against the officers involved and called for the release of all BRS activists arrested during the incident.

KTR's remarks reflect growing tensions within the ruling BRS as public representatives increasingly voice concerns over unfulfilled promises and alleged government corruption.

Komatireddy Announces Padayatra for Musi River Revival



TPN, Telangana: Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy has reaffirmed his commitment to the Musi River revival project, stating that no BRS leaders, including KTR or Harish Rao, will stop the initiative. Speaking to the media on Saturday, Komatireddy emphasized that the Musi will be cleansed and revived, despite opposition. He announced plans to join Chief Minister Revanth Reddy in a padayatra from Vadapally to Charminar in January, to raise awareness for the cause.

Komatireddy criticized the BRS government for its ten-year tenure, during which he claimed the state accumulated a debt of Rs. 7 lakh crore. He pointed out that despite this large debt, a mere Rs. 20 crore had been allocated for the development of the Musi River. The Minister strongly condemned the lack of action and promised that the people of the joint Nalgonda district would reject BRS leaders who oppose the project.

Ibrahimpatnam MLA Malreddy Rangareddy also supported the CM's padayatra, stressing that it was crucial to understand the struggles of the Musi's residents. He criticized KTR and Harish Rao for expressing anger over the march, accusing them of speaking out of turn against the initiative.

MLA Mal Reddy Criticizes KTR, Harish Rao in Strong Words



TPN, Telangana: Rangareddy MLA Mal Reddy launched a scathing attack on KCR, KTR, and Harish Rao, accusing them of hypocrisy and corruption. He dismissed KTR's claims of being a "Gandhi," stating that it was not KCR but the people who had sold thousands of acres of land in Rangareddy district. Reddy emphasized that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, unlike KCR, did not engage in petty talk.

He also questioned Harish Rao's rise to power, sarcastically asking how Harish Rao, once seen in rubber sandals, accumulated such vast properties. Reddy remarked that Revanth Reddy had worked his way up from a ZPTC member to Chief Minister. Reddy further criticized Harish Rao's loyalty to KCR, saying that even the Yadagiri Gutta temple was more closely associated with Harish Rao's father. He warned that if they continued to attack the CM, their own faults would soon be exposed.

Maheshwar Reddy Demands Immediate Paddy Purchases

TPN, Telangana: BJP leader Eleti Maheshwar Reddy, along with BJP state general secretary Gujjula Pramender Reddy and MLA Rama Rao Patel, visited the grain buying center in Alur village, Sarangapur mandal, where farmers voiced their frustration. They explained that although a month had passed since the paddy harvest, the purchase process had still not begun, despite grain being poured into the mills.

Speaking with the Additional Collector, Maheshwar Reddy emphasized the urgency of beginning the grain purchases immediately. He also highlighted the lack



of support from the state government,

questioning why rice mills had not been allocated to agencies after months of deliberations. He demanded that all necessary facilities be set up at purchase centers statewide and that grain collection begin promptly.

Maheshwar Reddy warned that if the issue remained unresolved, farmers might take to the streets in large numbers. He also stated that the BJP state leadership would organize a movement to address the issue, pressing for the government to take immediate action to assist the farmers.

Vinod Kumar Condemns Lathi Charge on Dalits



TPN , Telangana : Former MP Boinapally Vinod Kumar condemned the actions of police forces in Huzurabad constituency, alleging that they were working on behalf of CM Revanth Reddy. Kumar strongly criticized the lathi charge on Dalits protesting for the second phase of the Dalit Bandhu scheme, stating that such actions were unnecessary and would not deter the movement. He also condemned the freezing of Dalit Bandhu beneficiary accounts under the current government, which was supposed to provide financial aid to 5,000 beneficiaries.

The protest, led by Dalit Bandhu recipients, was aimed at ensuring the continuation of the finan-

cial assistance promised by the KCR government, which had initially chosen Huzurabad as a pilot project for the scheme. Kumar and other leaders have demanded that the government lift the freeze and allow beneficiaries to access their funds. The protest continues to highlight the unfulfilled promises and growing dissatisfaction with the handling of Dalit welfare schemes under the current government.

Akbaruddin Owaisi's Key Comments: Bullet Still in My Body



HYDRA Demolitions Continue in Film Nagar



TPN , Telangana : HYDRA demolitions in Hyderabad are continuing, with a recent operation in Film Nagar. The Hyderabad Development and Reconstruction Authority (HYDRA), in coordination with GHMC (Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation) officials, removed illegal encroachments after receiving complaints from local residents about construction obstructing the road.

The inspection revealed that several constructions had encroached upon the road, prompting officials to take action. As a result, a shed and a guardhouse were demolished to clear the encroachment. The authorities acted swiftly, with HYDRA officials ensuring that the debris was immediately cleared after the demolition.

HYDRA Commissioner Ranganath, following the operation, spoke to GHMC Khairatabad Zonal Commissioner Anurag Jayanthi, suggesting the immediate construction of a road in place of the cleared encroachments to restore proper access.

The operation is part of a larger effort by HYDRA to tackle illegal constructions and encroachments across the city, addressing concerns from citizens about their impact on public infrastructure and road access. The ongoing demolitions have raised questions and concerns among some locals about the future of similar encroachments, but officials remain committed to clearing the city of such illegal structures for the betterment of Hyderabad's infrastructure.

Bitter Experience for Enumerators in Comprehensive Family Survey

TPN, Telangana: Enumerators conducting the Comprehensive Family Survey in Hyderabad faced a challenging experience on November 9. The survey, which had initially seen stickers being pasted on doors from November 6 to 8, took a troubling turn for some enumerators. Two women enumerators, Apurupa and Ramyashree, who are government school teachers in Banjara Hills, were allegedly abused while conducting the survey at a house in Arora Colony.

According to reports, the house owners became hostile and verbally abused the enumerators, even un-

leashing their dogs on them. The frightened women informed the authorities about the incident, leading to widespread attention on social media. The matter quickly went viral, prompting Telangana police to step in. Authorities have been tagged to investigate the incident and take necessary action against the individuals responsible for abandoning the dogs.

This incident highlights the difficulties faced by enumerators in the ongoing family survey, raising concerns over the safety and treatment of personnel carrying out public duties.

Food Safety Raid at CCMB Canteen Uncovers Major Health Violations

TPN, **Hyderabad:** A surprise raid by the Food Safety Department at the canteen of the Center for Cellular and Molecular Biology (CCMB) in Habsiguda, Secunderabad, on Friday, November 8, revealed numerous violations of food safety norms. The canteen was found operating without a valid FSSAI license, and serious health hazards were observed.

Inspectors discovered cockroaches and rat faeces in the kitchen's storage rack. The kitchen lacked proper window and door screens, and the floor was in poor condition with broken tiles. Several expired food items, including Kohlapur jaggery, kasuri methi, and sabudana, were found, some having expired in October.

Other violations included open dustbins attracting pests, unlabelled food items in the refrigerators, and items like wheat flour stored directly on the floor. Furthermore, the canteen did not possess the required FSSAI or Food Safety Training and Certification (FoSTaC) certificates.

The Food Safety Department is expected to take further action against the canteen for these severe violations, which jeopardize public health and safety.

Police Bust International Human Trafficking Ring, Rescue 3 Women

TPN , Hyderabad : On Saturday, November 9, the Anti-Human Trafficking Unit (AHTU) of Hyderabad police successfully busted an international human trafficking ring operated by Bangladeshi nationals. In the operation, three women were rescued, and several incriminating items were seized, including 11 mobile phones, 3 used condoms, a DVR, and a small quantity of ganja.

The accused were identified as Saleem Mondal, his wife Maria Inchem, Nadipudi Naga Narasimhababu, and Suman Kumar Guru alias Ravi Kumar, who is currently absconding. Acting on credible intelligence, the police raided rooms 104 and



204 of a hotel where the accused were found conducting prostitution activities with a customer.

The victims, aged 22, 20, and 21, hailed from Manikonda, West Bengal, and Assam, respectively.

The case has been transferred to Saifabad Police Station for further investigation, as the authorities continue their efforts to dismantle the trafficking network. The successful raid highlights the growing efforts of Hyderabad police to combat human trafficking and ensure the safety of vul-

Robbery at Minister Sridhar Babu's House Raises Concerns

TPN, Hyderabad: A theft occurred at the residence of Telangana Minister Sridhar Babu, sparking concerns about security, even in high-profile political households. The incident took place at the Minister's Quarters on Banjara Hills Road No. 12 during Diwali, where it was discovered that a cellphone had been stolen. The theft was immediately reported to the police, and Minister Sridhar Babu lodged a formal complaint.

The police have registered a case and are actively investigating the matter. CCTV footage from the area is being scrutinized to identify any potential suspects. The locals, alarmed by the theft, are raising concerns about their own safety, questioning the efficacy of security measures when even a minister's home is targeted. This incident follows a similar robbery at Deputy CM Bhatti Vikramarka's house just a month ago, amplifying the growing fears among residents.

The case has drawn attention to the rising incidents of theft in the state, leaving the public demanding stronger protective measures and swift action from the police.

High Court Chief Justice Inaugurates Additional Courts

TPN, Hyderabad: On Friday, November 8, Telangana High Court Chief Justice Alok Aradhe inaugurated additional District and Sessions Judge courts in Shadnagar and Ibrahimpatnam, located within the Rangareddy district. The event was conducted virtually from the High Court and was attended by Justices P Shyam Koshy, T Vinod Kumar, K Lakshman, and B Vijayasen Reddy.

At the Shadnagar court complex, a large television screen was set up for attendees to witness the ceremony. Justice C Ratnapadmavati unveiled the plaque for the new Additional District and Sessions Judge court, marking a significant step towards improving judicial accessibility.

Justice Alok Aradhe emphasized that the establishment of these new courts is a critical move to ensure swift justice for the public. He also inaugurated the 15th additional District and Sessions Judge court in Ibrahimpatnam, underscoring that these courts were set up following directives from the Supreme Court to enhance access to judicial services for local communities. The new courts are expected to ease the burden on existing judicial systems and facilitate quicker resolution of cases in the region.

Tension After Man Damages Temple Trishul; VHP Demands SIT Probe

TPN , Hyderabad: Tension erupted in Shamshabad on Saturday, November 9, when a man identified as Kishore damaged a 'trishul' at the Katta Maisamma temple in Siddanti village. Kishore, a local resident, was seen vandalizing the sacred trishul, which led to immediate action from the locals. They apprehended the accused and physically assaulted him before the police arrived and took him into custody. A case has been registered in connection with the incident.

The act sparked protests from local villagers, who gathered at the scene to voice their anger. The police intervened to disperse the crowd and deployed a police picket in the area to prevent further unrest.

The Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP) has strongly condemned the act, calling for a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to investigate the increasing attacks on Hindu temples in Telangana. VHP spokesperson P. Balaswamy accused the Telangana police of failing to prevent these incidents. He pointed to the lack of action in previous cases, such as the Muthyalamma temple vandalism, where he claimed Hindu protesters were unjustly beaten while the perpetrators of the vandalism were not properly investigated.



Telangana ACB Arrests Sub-Inspector for Accepting Bribe



TPN, Hyderabad: A sub-inspector (SI) of Varni police station in Nizamabad district, Krishna Kumar, was arrested by the Telangana Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) on Friday, November 8, for accepting a bribe of Rs 20,000.

The bribe was demanded in exchange for granting station bail to a farmer, Nagaraju, who had been arrested for physical assault on November 4. Initially, SI Krishna Kumar asked for Rs 50,000, but after Nagaraju expressed his inability to pay, the officer reduced the amount to Rs 20,000. Nagaraju agreed to the reduced amount but decided to report the incident to the ACB.

Following the complaint, the ACB set up a trap and apprehended SI Krishna Kumar while he was accepting the bribe. The officer was subsequently charged, and a case was registered against him. He was produced before the ACB court and remanded to judicial custody.

The ACB officials have vowed to continue their efforts to tackle corruption within the police department and ensure accountability for officers involved in unethical practices.

Six Maoist Sympathisers Arrested, Pressure Cooker Bomb Seized

TPN , Kothagudem: Six sympathisers of the CPI (Maoist) party were arrested by Cherla police, special party personnel, and CRPF 141 C battalion near the Taliperu project in Cherla mandal on Saturday. The arrests followed an operation conducted by security forces engaged in area domination near a forest area close to the project.

Manugur DSP V. Ravindra Reddy confirmed that the security forces spotted the suspects and apprehended them. During the operation, a pressure cooker bomb with electric wires attached was discovered in their possession.

Upon questioning, the arrested individuals admitted to being Maoist sympathisers and revealed their involvement in a bomb blast on October 17 in the Gorukonda area, which targeted security personnel.

The arrested individuals were identified as Madakam Deva, Sodi Unga, Sodi Kosa, Madakam Idma, Kaluma Aduma, and Kovvasi Bhimaiah, all from Chennapuram vil-



lage in Cherla mandal. The police have seized the pressure cooker bomb from them.

DSP Ravindra Reddy warned that strict action would be taken against anyone supporting Maoists, whether directly or indirectly. Senior CRPF officials Rajesh Dogra and S. Singaravel, along with Cherla SHO A. Raju Varma and SI R. Narsi Reddy, were present during the operation.

ITDA Brings Education to Doorsteps of Tribal Students in Remote Village



TPN, Kothagudem: The ITDA Bhadrachalam has launched an initiative to bring education closer to tribal children in a remote village in Dummugudem mandal. In the old Narayanaraopeta village, 30 tribal boys and girls were unable to attend school due to the distance to the nearest tribal welfare primary school.

When the village residents raised the issue with ITDA project officer B. Rahul, highlighting the logistical challenges in sending their children to distant schools, the officer responded by sanctioning Rs 4.50 lakh to build a new school in the village. The school, which features an iron-sheet roof, has now begun functioning, providing access to education for the children.

Rahul emphasized the importance of foundational learning and assured that the tribal welfare department would

support the educational needs of these children. Educational materials such as books, pencils, and other resources have been provided. He also stressed the significance of teaching children the Koya language and familiarizing them with their cultural heritage. Rahul encouraged parents to speak to their children in their native language at home to strengthen their cultural identity and academic development.

Villagers Boycott Family Survey Over Ethanol **Plant Concerns** in Nirmal

TPN, Hyderabad: Villagers in Gundampalli and Dilawarpur in Nirmal district's Dilawarpur Mandal have boycotted a comprehensive family survey, citing concerns over the establishment of an ethanol plant in their area.

In response to the boycott, Telangana BC Commission Chairman G. Niranjan contacted Nirmal District Collector Abhilash Abhinav to gather details and address the situation. Niranjan encouraged the collector to engage with the villagers, explaining the benefits of the survey and addressing their concerns to prevent further disruptions.

District authorities have assured that efforts are underway to connect with the villagers. Both sides presented their arguments on the establishment of ethanol units, with farmers questioning the benefits, while ethanol plant representatives highlighted the high production costs and the impracticality of shutting down operations.

Revanth Reddy's Effigy Burnt in Asifabad Over Controversial Remarks

Trump 2.0: Doubling Down or a Fresh Start?

The recent U.S. election results have generated both relief and shock, with Donald Trump defying predictions to secure another term as president. The outcome was decisive, marked by a strong swing to the hard right, with the Republican Party expanding control over the Senate and potentially the House of Representatives. Trump's victory has left the GOP in a powerful position, supported by a right-leaning Supreme Court and a Federal Reserve under pressure to ease monetary policy.

A Divisive Victory

While Trump's supporters celebrate, the result has stunned Democrats, mainstream media, and political analysts who largely expected a victory for Kamala Harris. The unexpected endorsement of Trump, a populist often criticized for controversial views, has raised questions about the political maturity of the electorate. Despite a booming economy with low inflation and unemployment, many American voters were swayed by Trump's rhetoric on issues like immigration, globalization, and personal economics, signaling a deep-seated discontent with the political status quo.

Trump's Domestic Agenda: **Bold Moves Expected**

In domestic policy, Trump 2.0 is likely to double down on the agenda that first brought him to office. Trump's early actions may include firing officials he considers adversarial and granting presidential pardons, catering to his core base with promises to put "America First." Immigration is expected to be a top priority, with Trump aiming to restrict illegal entries and ramp up deportations, though many of these measures could face legal hurdles.

Though Trump touted these moves as successes, many were short-lived or left unresolved, requiring careful handling in a more complex geopolitical landscape.

Since Trump's last term, the global order has evolved, with new alliances forming and middle-power countries like India, Brazil, and On the economic front, Trump has Saudi Arabia asserting themselves. Traditional allies, such as the UK, Japan, Australia, and Israel, may still support Trump, but their governments are now more cautious, mindful of the instability that Trump's previous term brought to the international stage. Trump will need to engage with both adversaries and allies in a way that prioritizes diplomacy over discord, a challenge for a leader known for his unorthodox style.

be whether to maintain the isolationist tendencies of his first term or to reengage with multilateral institutions. Analysts suggest that America's influence has waned, with hard and soft power diminished, limiting Trump's ability to enforce his policies without cooperation. To address issues like climate change, the China-Russia nexus, and ongoing tensions in the Middle East, Trump may have to balance his "America First" agenda with practical diplomacy, a shift from the often combative tone of Trump 1.0.

Moving Forward: Trump's Second Chance?

As Trump prepares to return to the White House, he has a unique opportunity to reshape his legacy. The choices he makes—whether to revisit the brash tactics of Trump 1.0 or adapt to the changing political landscape—will determine the impact of his second term. His critics remain skeptical, but his supporters hope he will rise to the occasion, invoking the sentiment captured by John Wayne's words: "A man deserves a second chance, but keep an eye on him."

With the power he now wields, Trump's decisions could redefine America's role on the world stage, reinforcing or rewriting the story of Trump 2.0. Whether he doubles down or shifts direction remains to be seen, but the world will be watching closely.



India-US Relations Flourished During Trump's First Term

During Donald Trump's first presidential term, India emerged as an indispensable partner of the United States, with strategic, defense, and economic ties advancing significantly. From heightened defense cooperation to increased energy trade and a shared stance on global security, Trump 1.0 laid a solid foundation for India-US relations, setting a precedent for the years to come.

One of the most significant aspects of the India-US relationship under Trump's presidency was the alignment on counterterrorism. Following the 2019 Pulwama attack, the US strongly supported India's stance at the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) by endorsing the designation of Jaish-e-Mohammed chief Masood Azhar as a global terrorist. This acknowledgment of India's concerns at an international level strengthened India's position against cross-border terrorism. Similarly, in 2018, the US backed the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) in grey-listing Pakistan, emphasizing a shared commitment to holding nations accountable for harboring terrorist organizations. This collaborative stance underscored India and the US's alignment on regional security issues and sent a strong message to nations supporting terrorism.

The growing defense relationship between the two countries further cemented their strategic partnership. In 2019, India's defense procurement from the US rose to an impressive \$18 billion annually. This marked an upward trajectory in defense cooperation, facilitating the acquisition of advanced American technologies that bolstered India's military capabilities. Additionally, India's elevation to Tier I of the Strategic Trade Authorization (STA) license exception opened up high-level American defense technologies, symbolizing Washington's trust in New Delhi as a reliable strategic partner. This status, previously reserved for NATO allies, allowed India access to critical US defense technologies, strengthening its capacity to counter potential regional threats.

The Trump administration's commit-

ment to supporting India during the Galwan Valley skirmishes with China in 2020 highlighted the US's strategic role in regional security. During the skirmishes, India and the US shared intelligence, which proved crucial as tensions between India and China escalated. Trump's stance on China as a global threat resonated with India, encouraging deeper collaboration on security in the Indo-Pacific region and emphasizing the importance of balancing China's influence in Asia.

The energy sector was another area where India-US relations witnessed unprecedented growth. In just two years (2018-19), the value of India's crude oil and liquefied natural gas (LNG) imports from the US skyrocketed to \$6.7 billion from zero, making the US India's sixth-largest source of hydrocarbon imports. This diversification reduced India's reliance on traditional suppliers, creating an interdependence that bolstered the bilateral relationship.

Economically, the US emerged as India's largest trading partner under Trump, with bilateral trade in goods and services growing by over 10% annually from 2016 to 2018, reaching \$142 billion. However, Trump often pushed for better tariffs from India and a more predictable regulatory regime, seeking to address trade imbalances. Although these demands occasionally created friction, they underscored a mutual interest in bolstering economic ties, showing Trump's commitment to establishing a fair trading environment.

Ultimately, Trump's most consequential contribution to India-US relations was firmly establishing China as a strategic threat, a stance that aligned closely with India's security concerns. By elevating India within its strategic framework, the Trump administration fostered a robust partnership with long-term potential, creating a legacy that continues to shape India-US relations today. This period of mutual understanding and cooperation set a new standard, demonstrating the advantages of a close partnership between two of the world's largest democracies.

After U.S. Election Loss, What's Next for Kamala Harris?

Following her election loss to Republican rival Donald Trump, U.S. Vice President Kamala Harris faces an uncertain political future. Addressing a reflective crowd at her alma mater, Howard University, Harris vowed to continue fighting for the causes that powered her campaign. Yet, with only 72 days left in office, the 60-year-old leader has announced no specific plans for her next political steps, leaving the nation speculating on what lies ahead for the former Democratic nom-

Preparing for 2028

One of Harris's most straightforward options could be preparing for a renewed bid in 2028. Many politicians have rebounded after an election loss to later take on significant roles. John Kerry, for instance, lost the 2004 presidential race to George W. Bush but remained in public service, eventually becoming Secretary of State under President Barack Obama. If Harris considers a return to the national stage, taking the time to reassess and build her profile could set the groundwork for another White House bid in four years.

Return to the Senate?

Another potential path could be for Harris to return to her legislative roots. A former Senator



from California, Harris could consider re-entering state politics, leveraging her political experience to contribute from the Senate. However, returning may be challenging; reports indicate Harris faces a mixed reception among donors and constituents in California. Longtime Democratic donor Mark Buell expressed the disappointment that many feel over her recent loss. "Everybody is devastated," he remarked, reflecting widespread feelings among her supporters. Additionally, Richie Greenberg, a San Francisco-based Republican commentator, suggested that Harris might struggle to regain the robust

the option to reestablish her base within California remains a possible pathway if Harris chooses to stay connected to legislative work.

A Leadership Role Within the **Democratic Party**

Harris's broad recognition and experience within the Democratic Party could make her a strong spokesperson and advocate for key party issues. Given her background, she could assume a role similar to prominent party figures, offering her voice on central issues, helping shape the Democratic message, and possibly mentoring emerging leaders. However, challenges exist in reigniting her base and securing financial support. Greenberg notes that Harris may struggle to rekindle the enthusiasm she initially generated in San Francisco and beyond. Still, her national name recognition could serve her well in influencing the party's direction and agenda.

Exploring Writing and Personal

A post-election endeavor that has been popular among former candidates is the pursuit of personal projects, such as writing a memoir. Many prominent political figures, including Hillary Clinton and Al Gore, turned to writing

financial backing she previously enjoyed. Still, and media projects to share their experiences and reflect on their campaigns. Clinton's book *What Happened* became a bestseller after her 2016 loss, while Gore's documentary *An Inconvenient Truth* won critical acclaim. For Harris, a tell-all book or documentary could offer her a platform to discuss her vice presidency, challenges, and vision for America, potentially reconnecting with her supporters and broadening her influence.

Time Away from Politics

Perhaps the most understated option is for Harris to step back from the political spotlight entirely, taking time to recharge and reflect. Shortly before the election, she jokingly promised herself some rest, stating, "I plan on putting on some pounds after this is over... They're working me to the bone." Harris could, like Clinton, step away to focus on personal endeavors while staying engaged in advocacy behind the scenes.

Whatever her choice, Kamala Harris's next steps will be closely watched as she transitions from her historic role as Vice President. Whether she chooses a direct return to politics, a leadership role in the Democratic Party, or a quieter path, her future will continue to influence the evolving political landscape and shape discussions for the 2028 election.

This development comes at a critical time, just days before Jharkhand's assembly elections. CM Soren's Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM), in coalition with Congress, RJD, and left-leaning parties, faces strong opposition from the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) in the state.

In a related legal matter, Hemant Soren was granted bail by the Jharkhand High Court in June in connection with an alleged land scam. The Chief Minister had been arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) earlier in January on charges of money laundering related to the alleged scam. Soren's political position and recent legal troubles have added complexity to the already high-stakes election race.

The 81-member Jharkhand Assembly will hold elections in two phases, on November 13 and 20, with vote counting scheduled for November 23. As the election approaches, the raids are likely to heighten political tensions and further intensify the battle between the JMM-led alliance and the BJP-led NDA.

Bihar MP Pappu Yadav Receives Another Threat from Lawrence Bishnoi Gang

Bihar MP Pappu Yadav has once again received death threats allegedly linked to the Lawrence Bishnoi gang. His personal secretary, Mohammad Sadiq Alam, received threatening WhatsApp messages in Delhi, prompting him to file an FIR at Connaught Place police station. The messages, which arrived early on November 7, allegedly claimed that "six individuals have been contacted for the murder of Pappu Yadav." The sender also shared an image of a Turkish-made pistol, suggesting it would be used against Yadav.

This threat follows a similar incident in which an individual associated with the Lawrence Bishnoi gang issued threats to Yadav, leading to an arrest by Purnia Police. Addressing the media in Purnia, Yadav expressed frustration over the repeated threats, noting that he has already filed six FIRs in response to similar incidents. Despite informing senior officials, including the Director General of Police, the Inspector General, and even the Home Minister, Yadav criticized the lack of decisive action.

Yadav speculated that the continued threats could be linked to political motives or systemic issues that enable such intimidation. He highlighted other individuals potentially involved, including Mayank Singh, reportedly based in Malaysia, the Aman Sahu gang from Jharkhand, and unidentified persons from Nepal. Yadav expressed disappointment that, despite one arrest, multiple individuals continued to issue threats, questioning why these individuals remained at large despite clear evidence.

Despite the persistent threats, Yadav stated he remains undeterred and committed to his principles. He urged authorities to take swift action, warning that further delay would contribute to a climate of impunity. As the threats escalate, Yadav's call for a thorough investigation emphasizes the need for prompt and effective measures to address security concerns surrounding public officials in India.


Who Ate Himachal Pradesh CM's Samosas?

In an unusual incident, five police officers in Himachal Pradesh face a CID probe after consuming samosas originally intended for Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu. The situation escalated after media reports framed the inquiry as an investigation into the "missing samosas," prompting the Chief Minister to clarify that the probe focused on alleged "misbehavior" by officials, not the snacks themselves.

CID Director General Ranjhan Ojha attempted to downplay the incident, explaining, "Officials were having tea in the office when someone casually asked what happened to the food items brought for the event, and we simply requested clarification." He confirmed that no formal action or notice had been issued and stressed that the matter should not be politicized.

Third Assassination Plot Against Trump

"Iranian Asset" Charged in Alleged Murder Scheme

An alleged "Iranian asset" has been charged with plotting to assassinate U.S. President-elect Donald Trump, who survived two previous attempts on his life this year. The Department of Justice has accused Farhad Shakeri, 51, of working with Iran's elite Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) in an attempt to kill Trump. Trump, who is slated to return to the White House in January, was previously injured in an assassination attempt in July, sustaining a gunshot wound to his ear.

According to the Justice Department, Shakeri was tasked by the IRGC in early October to devise a plan to eliminate Trump. Although Shakeri claimed he did not intend to meet the IRGC's deadline, prosecutors allege he coordinated with criminal networks to carry out Iran's plans against prominent figures, including Trump.

Attorney General Merrick Garland emphasized the seriousness of the charges, stating, "The Justice Department has charged an asset of the Iranian regime tasked with directing criminal associates to advance Iran's assassination plots against its targets, including President-elect Donald Trump."

The IRGC, designated as a terrorist organization by the U.S., has previously been implicated in threats



cials critical of the Iranian government. FBI Director Christopher Wray highlighted ongoing concerns, noting that the IRGC has been linked to criminal networks targeting Americans on U.S. soil. "This behavior will not be tolerated," Wray said.

Shakeri, identified as an Afghan national who immigrated to the U.S. as a child, was deported in 2008 after a robbery conviction. He is currently believed to be in Iran. In addition to Trump's case, Shakeri faces charges for allegedly hiring two associates in New York to murder a U.S. citizen of Iranian origin who publicly opposed the Iranian government. Those associates, Carlisle Rivera and Jonathan Loadholt, are now also facing charges for their involvement.

The recent incidents underscore heightened security concerns as Trump prepares for his second term. The U.S. Secret Service has ramped up protective measures around Trump's Mar-a-Lago residence, including deploying robotic dogs for additional surveillance.

Reflecting on his close encounters, Trump remarked in his victory speech that he believes his survival was divinely guided to "save our country and restore America to greatness."

India's Russian Oil Purchases Helped Prevent Global Price Surge, Says Minister

Union Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister Hardeep Singh Puri defended India's decision to purchase oil from Russia amid global tensions, claiming it helped stabilize oil prices and prevent them from surging to \$200 a barrel. Speaking at the ADIPEC energy conference in Abu Dhabi, Puri explained to CNN's Becky Anderson that India's actions contributed to global market stability, benefiting both consumers and the energy market at large.

"If we hadn't bought Russian oil, the global oil prices would have gone up to \$200 per barrel," Puri stated. He also expressed optimism for future price stability, predicting a reduction in oil prices as more energy sources enter the market by 2026.

Responding to questions on India's recent reduction of Russian oil imports by 10% in October, Puri attributed the decrease to competitive pricing from other suppliers, underscoring that India's energy decisions are driven by market forces. He clarified, "If you don't get it from one, you get it from someone else."

In a post on X (formerly Twitter), Puri emphasized that India's decision to buy Russian oil benefited the global economy, helping to keep prices stable and affordable. He also criticized commentators who suggested restrict-



ing India's energy imports, pointing out that European and Asian nations had similarly purchased significant amounts of energy from Russia.

Puri stressed that India prioritizes energy affordability and sustainability for its citizens, noting, "India is the only major consumer where fuel prices have significantly dropped in the last three years, despite global price increases." As the world's third-largest oil consumer, India is committed to ensuring a steady, affordable energy supply for its citizens, he concluded.

Indian Official Meets Taliban Minister, Offers Chabahar Port Access and Discusses Humanitarian Aid

In a notable diplomatic development, an Indian delegation led by J P Singh, Joint Secretary of the Pakistan-Afghanistan-Iran division in India's External Affairs Ministry, met Afghanistan's acting Defence Minister Mullah Mohammad Yaqoob. The delegation proposed the use of Iran's Chabahar Port for Afghan businesses and discussed India's ongoing humanitarian support to Afghanistan. The Indian team also met with former Afghan President Hamid Karzai, senior ministers, and UN agency representatives to explore ways to deepen assistance.

External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal highlighted the potential benefits of Chabahar Port for Afghanistan's trade, stating, "The Chabahar Port can be utilised by the Afghan business community for export and import, facilitating broader transactions." Despite not recognizing the Taliban government that took

control in 2021, India has consistently provided humanitarian aid, including wheat, medicines, and medical supplies, to the Afghan people.

India's outreach reaffirms its longstanding ties with the Afghan population. "We have a historic relationship with Afghanistan, and these ties will continue to guide our approach toward the country," Jaiswal emphasized. Earlier this year, India signed a 10-year contract with Iran to develop and operate the Chabahar Port, which India helped construct, aiming to strengthen regional connectivity.

India's diplomatic approach signifies a commitment to support the Afghan people while navigating complex regional relationships. The offer of Chabahar Port access could provide Afghanistan with an essential trade route, bolstering its economy amidst challenging times.

Israeli Football Fans Return Home After "Frightening" Amsterdam Violence

Israeli football fans returning home from Amsterdam have shared accounts of violence that targeted Jewish supporters following a Europa League match between Israel's Maccabi Tel Aviv and Dutch club Ajax. The fans described the scenes as "frightening," with attackers allegedly waiting at multiple corners throughout central Amsterdam after the game, which ended in a 5-0 victory for Ajax.

One returning fan, Eliya Cohen, reported seeing "Muslims looking for Jews to beat them up" as he navigated the city, eventually deciding to leave to avoid becoming involved in the violence. Kobi Eliyahu, another fan who

attended the game, recalled that people with their faces covered were present "on every single corner," and described the experience as eerily similar to the 1930s in Europe. He called on fellow Israelis and Jewish people to avoid traveling to Europe, describing the event as an orchestrated anti-Semitic attack.

Despite a substantial police presence, at least five people were hospitalized due to the violence. Fans reported blasts and shouts in Arabic through the night, and some expressed frustration over the apparent lack of immediate police intervention. "We never heard the police," said Nadav Zer, another returning fan, who claimed that he and his companions had to flee back to their hotel to avoid attacks.

Tensions reportedly flared before the match, with incidents on both sides, and social media footage appeared to show some Maccabi Tel Aviv fans chanting inflammatory slogans. Dutch and Israeli officials condemned the violence as anti-Semitic, with the CEO of Maccabi Tel Aviv, Ben Mansford, labeling it "tragic" and noting that the violence "was not connected to football." He described the postgame violence as targeting Maccabi Tel Aviv fans once they left the stadium.

Elon Musk's Net Worth Soars Past \$300 Billion Following Tesla's Stock Surge

Elon Musk's net worth has crossed the \$300 billion mark, making him the only individual on the planet to surpass this milestone. According to *Forbes' Real-Time Billionaires* list, Musk's wealth surged to \$304 billion following a 30% increase in Tesla's stock price over the past five days. This spike came in the wake of Donald Trump's recent victory in the U.S. presidential election.

Tesla shares saw an 8.19% rise on Friday alone, closing at \$321.22 per share, propelling Musk's wealth by 4.71% in a single day. Before the election results, Musk's net worth was around \$250 billion, but the post-election rally in Tesla stock boosted his fortune by approxi- Musk's alignment with Trump's admately \$54 billion.

A contributing factor to Musk's indicate Musk was part of a recent wealth surge appears to be his public support for Trump during the campaign. Musk attended Trump's rallies, with Trump openly endorsing the Tesla CEO, strengthening investor confidence in Tesla and sparking market enthusiasm for Musk's companies.

Zomato and Swiggy Found in Violation of Antitrust Laws, CCI Probe Reveals

An antitrust investigation by the Competition Commission of India (CCI) has found that food delivery giants Zomato and Swiggy engaged in anti-competitive practices that unfairly favored certain restaurant partners. The probe, initiated in 2022 following a complaint from the National Restaurant Association of India (NRAI), highlighted exclusivity arrangements that hindered market competitiveness.

According to non-public documents reviewed by Reuters, Zomato allegedly entered "exclusivity contracts" with specific partners, offering lower commission rates in exchange. Swiggy reportedly guaranteed business growth for certain restaurants that listed exclusively on its platform. The CCI's

investigative arm noted that such arrangements prevent healthy competition in the market, allowing Swiggy and Zomato to wield significant influence over restaurant pricing and exposure.

A further issue outlined in the documents is the requirement for restaurants to maintain price parity across platforms, preventing them from offer-

ing lower prices on alternate sites. This practice, the CCI found, directly restricts competition and limits restaurant autonomy over pricing strategies.

The CCI's findings were shared confidentially with Swiggy, Zomato, and restaurant complainants in March 2024. While Zomato declined to comment, Swiggy and the CCI did not respond to queries. Both platforms have significantly reshaped the food delivery landscape in India, driving demand as smartphone usage surged, particularly during and after the pandemic.

With Swiggy preparing to close bids on a \$1.4 billion IPO, India's second-largest of the year, the CCI case arrives at a critical moment. The final phase of the CCI's investigation involves a decision on potential penalties or mandated changes to the companies' business practices.

Swiggy's IPO Oversubscribed 3.59 Times on Final Day Amid **Strong QIB Demand**

Online food delivery platform Swiggy's Rs 11,327 crore IPO received strong interest on its last day of bidding, with a subscription rate of 3.59 times. Despite a slow start, with the IPO subscribed only 0.12 times on day one and 0.35 times on day two, the final day saw a surge, led primarily by qualified institutional buyers (QIBs).

The QIB portion was oversubscribed 6.02 times, reflecting high confidence from institutional investors. Retail individual investors (RIIs) and employee portions were subscribed 1.14 times and 1.65 times, respectively, while the non-institutional investors (NIIs) segment recorded 0.41 times subscription. Swiggy set a price range of Rs 371 to Rs 390 per share, with shares expected to list on the NSE and



BSE on November 13, and allotment scheduled for Novem-

Market Position and Competitive Landscape

Swiggy currently holds a 34% market share in India's food delivery sector, ranking behind its main competitor, Zomato, which leads with a 58% share. In the quick commerce market, Swiggy's Instamart holds a 20-25% market share, while Zomato's Blinkit commands 40-45%.

Financial Performance

Swiggy's financial performance has shown steady revenue growth despite ongoing losses. In FY 2021-22, Swiggy's revenue was Rs 6,119.78 crore, with a net loss of Rs 3,628.90 crore. By FY 2022-23, revenue rose to Rs 8,714.45 crore, though net losses widened to Rs 4,179.31 crore. FY 2023-24 saw further revenue growth to Rs 11,634.35 crore, while net losses reduced to Rs 2,350.24 crore. In the first quarter of FY 2024-25, Swiggy reported revenue of Rs 3,310.11 crore and a net loss of Rs 611.01 crore.





Goa Tourism Sees Significant Decline Amid Rising Competition and Challenges

Once a prime destination for tourists worldwide, Goa's appeal appears to be waning, as foreign tourism struggles to rebound to pre-Covid levels. Known for its beautiful beaches and vibrant nightlife, Goa has long been a preferred choice for travelers seeking sun, sand, and a lively atmosphere. However, a report from CEIC Data reveals that foreign tourism in the state is still lagging, with only 1.5 million foreign visitors in 2023, a steep drop from the 8.5 million in 2019. This decline is attributed to a combination of factors, including increased travel costs, unregulated hotel rates, and inadequate tourist experiences that have driven travelers to look for alternative destinations.

Competing seaside locations in Southeast Asia, such as Sri Lanka and Thailand, have become more attractive to international tourists, including regulars from Russia and the United Kingdom, who were once Goa's mainstays. These countries offer affordable accommodations, exciting nightlife, and well-regulated tourist infrastructure, drawing visitors away from Goa's sun-kissed beaches. The Covid-19 pandemic accelerated this trend, with tourism numbers taking a significant hit, and the industry has yet to see a full recovery.

Social media has also played a role in highlighting Goa's current issues, particularly the so-called "Goa taxi mafia." Many tourists have shared negative experiences with local taxi services, recounting incidents of overcharging, harassment, and even threats when taxi drivers opposed them giving rides to foreigners. The taxi unions' stronghold over transportation in the state dates back to 2014 when popular ride-hailing ser-



vices like Ola and Uber were effectively banned following a taxi union-led strike. This lack of modern transportation options has not only added to the inconvenience for travelers but also inflated travel costs within the state, impacting overall tourist satis-

Tn a unique auc-**⊥**tion, a 77-yearold slice of Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip's wedding cake £2,200 fetched (approximately Rs 2,39,915). The piece, a remnant of the iconic 9ftfour-tier fruitcake served to over 2,000 guests at the royal wedding in 1947, was gifted to Marion Polson, housekeeper at The Palace of Holyroodhouse. Along with the cake, Polson re-

ceived a personal thank-you letter from Queen Elizabeth II, which accompanied the slice at auction.

The thank-you letter, signed "Elizabeth," expressed the Queen's appreciation for Polson's gift of a "delightful dessert service" for the newlyweds. The letter read: "My husband and I are deeply touched to know that you shared in giving us such a delightful wedding present. We are both enchanted with the dessert service; the different flowers and the beautiful colouring will, I know, be greatly admired by all who see it."

Polson kept the slice carefully preserved until her passing in the 1980s, after which her family stored it un-

der a bed in a suitcase in Scotland. Discovered still intact in its original presentation box, the slice was evaluated at £500 (Rs 54,526) by auctioneers earlier this year. The rare collectible sparked global interest, with fierce bidding from buyers around the world. Ultimately, a Chinese bidder won the slice over the phone.

James Grinter, a royal expert from the Reeman Dansie auction house, described the item as "a real little find." This nostalgic auction moment has captivated collectors and royal enthusiasts alike, providing a taste of history from Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip's November 20, 1947 wedding.



New Earth-Like Planet Discovered Orbiting White Dwarf, Offers Insight into Humanity's Future

Astronomers have discovered an Earth-sized rocky planet orbiting a white dwarf star 4,000 light years away in the constellation Sagittarius, a finding that could offer crucial insights into the future of Earth and humanity. The planet, designated KMT-2020-BLG-0414, has a similar mass to Earth and orbits at a distance double that of Earth from the sun. Alongside it is a massive brown dwarf, a planet-like object 17 times the mass of Jupiter.

This discovery provides a glimpse into Earth's potential fate when the sun reaches its final stages of evolution. White dwarfs are the remnants of stars like our sun, which, after exhausting their nuclear fuel, expand into red giants before shedding their outer layers and contracting. As our sun ages, it will expand to engulf its inner planets—Mercury and Venus are the most vulnerable—before likely shrinking to a white dwarf. The extent of its expansion remains uncertain, leaving the fate of Earth in question.



The study, published in *Nature Astronomy*, was led by researchers from the University of California, Berkeley, who observed the system using the Keck Telescope in Hawaii. According to Jessica Lu, an associate professor of astronomy at UC Berkeley, the white dwarf's companion planet may support theories that planetary orbits can shift outward as a star loses mass and expands. "Whether life can survive on Earth through that (red giant) period is unknown. But certainly, the most important thing is This newfound Earth-like planet near a that Earth isn't swallowed by the Sun when white dwarf not only opens doors for studyit becomes a red giant," Lu noted.

Keming Zhang, the study's lead author, ex-

plained that Earth's habitability is limited to roughly another billion years, as the sun's increased heat will eventually evaporate the planet's oceans. However, should Earth avoid engulfment, outer regions of the solar system could offer refuge. As the sun swells into a red giant, its habitable zone will shift outward, potentially warming the icy moons of Jupiter and Saturn, such as Europa, Callisto, and Enceladus, making them possible havens for life.

"In any case, planet Earth will only be habitable for another billion years, at which point Earth's oceans would be vaporized by the runaway greenhouse effect," Zhang added. "Humanity could migrate out there," he suggested, envisioning a future where humanity seeks refuge on ocean worlds in the outer solar system.


