Strict Action on Grain Procurement Fraud: CM

them efficiently.

TPN , Telangana: A tense situation unfolded in Vikarabad district when farmers and villagers attacked District Collector Prateek Jain and other officials during a public consultation regarding the establishment of a pharmaceutical company in Lagacharla village. The district government had planned to acproject, prompting the visit of Collector Jain, Kodangal Urban Development Authority (KUDA) Special Officer Venkat Reddy, Additional Collector Linganay-

ak, Sub Collector Umashankar Prasad, and other officials to gather villagers' opinions. Initially, a public meeting was arranged in the suburbs of Dudyala, but when villagers failed to attend, the authorities moved to Lagacharla village, where tensions rapidly escalated. The officials were greeted by chants quire land in the village for the of protest, and soon, some villagers began throwing stones and attacking with sticks. The situation turned violent when a woman struck Collector Jain on the back, forcing security

personnel to quickly evacuate him to a vehicle. As the protests continued, three vehicles were damaged, and KUDA Special Officer Venkat Reddy was injured. The police have deployed additional forces in the village to identify those responsible for the attacks. In response, district officials and employees have strongly condemned the assault, calling for the arrest of the perpetrators.

Minister Ponguleti Slams KTR Over Delhi Visit



TPN , Hyderabad : The war of words between Congress and BRS leaders escalated after former Telangana minister K.T. Rama Rao's recent visit to Delhi. KTR had earlier accused the government of involvement in the Amrit scam, sparking a series of retaliatory comments from Congress ministers, who alleged that KTR's statements were an attempt to evade ongoing legal cases.

In a sharp response, Telangana Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy made sensational remarks about KTR. Speaking to the media, Reddy said, "KTR's name will soon be associated with Lakshmi Bambo and Tusu Bambo," implying that KTR's situation was worsening and would soon become widely known. Reddy further mocked KTR, questioning why he was fleeing to Delhi, suggesting that the BRS Working President was attempting to avoid the mounting legal cases against him.

Reddy claimed that KTR's trip to Delhi was a calculated move, as the minister was aware he would receive clearance from the Governor to testify in an ongoing case. He also pointed out that phone tapping allegations against KTR were not a trivial matter, further fueling the tension between the two political parties.

The verbal exchange between Congress and BRS has intensified, with both sides accusing each other of corruption and political maneuvering.

Revanth's Rule Hurts Vikarabad Farmers

TPN, Hyderabad: Former Minister Harish Rao has strongly condemned the Vikarabad pharmacy incident, accusing Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy of mismanagement and alienating farmers. Speaking to the media on Monday, Rao likened Revanth's governance to a "stone in the hands of a madman," claiming that it has fallen on the farmers of Vikarabad, the Chief Minister's home district.

Rao sharply criticized Revanth Reddy's decision to promote the Pharma City project, suggesting that it would harm green crop fields. He stated, "If Indira Gandhi called for 'Garibi Hatao,' then Revanth is calling for 'Kisan Hatao' in the name of Pharma City." Rao alleged that the ruling government is ignoring farmers' concerns, especially after 15,000 acres of land were acquired for the project, and environmental clearances were bypassed.

The tense situation escalated when farmers in Vikarabad protested against the Pharma Village project. In a dramatic turn, a woman farmer attacked District Collector Prateek Jain, and stones were thrown at the vehicles of government officials. Three cars were damaged, and the protestors expressed their frustration with the government's actions.

Rao demanded that Revanth Reddy reconsider the decision to establish the Pharma City in the green fields, stating that the move was driven by a conspiracy to use the land for real estate purposes rather than development. He urged the Chief Minister to refocus on administration and address the farmers' grievances.

Komati Reddy Unveils Plan for Pothole-Free Roads



TPN, Hyderabad: Telangana's Roads, Buildings, and Cinematography Minister Komati Reddy Venkat Reddy has announced a comprehensive plan to address the state's pothole problem using advanced technology. The Minister outlined the ambitious initiative to fill potholes across 9,000 kilometers of roads, ensuring safer and more efficient travel for

Speaking at a press event in Chilukur village, Moinabad Mandal, Rangareddy District, Reddy expressed concerns over the neglect of roads under the previous government, which he claimed had failed to construct new state — mentally friendly. highways or secure funding for national highways. "KCR's rule is like placing a lamp in the wind and asking for blessings," Reddy said, criticizing the lack of infrastructure de-

The Minister highlighted the use of eco-friendly technologies to repair potholes efficiently. Along with R&B Department Special Chief Secretary Vikas Raj and Special Secretary Mrs. Dasari Harichandana, Reddy inspected the performance of the "Air Pressure Jet Patcher" and "Pothole and Road Maintenance Machinery." These machines can fill potholes on 10-20 kilometers of road per day,

significantly speeding up the repair process compared to traditional methods. Reddy also pointed out that these methods reduce carbon emissions by 90%, making them environ-

Reddy further emphasized that the previous government's negligence had caused significant damage to the state's roads. He stressed that under the new administration, efforts are being made to repair roads promptly, reduce accidents, and cut down on maintenance costs. With these plans, the government aims to provide pothole-free roads, improving the quality of life for the people of Telangana.

Government Chief Whip Mahender Reddy, local MLA Kale Yadayah, and other local leaders were also present at the event.

KTR Visiting Delhi to Escape **Accountability for Corruption**



TPN, Telangana: In a series of sensational remarks, Minister Ponnam Prabhakar has accused BRS working president K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) of being involved in irregularities related to Formula One racing and the Amrit scheme. Minister Prabhakar alleged that KTR has been involved in "money laundering" in connection with Kateyare car racing and is visiting Delhi to avoid accountability. He further questioned KTR's innocence, suggesting that if the leader is not guilty, he should cooperate with ongoing investigations.

Prabhakar also pointed out that KTR's visit to Delhi is aimed at protecting himself from allegations of irregularities in the Amrit scheme. The Minister claimed that KTR's attempt to align with the BJP in Delhi is linked to efforts to cover up corruption in the tenders related to the scheme. He remarked that KTR should admit his mistakes rather than evade responsibility.

Additionally, KTR is scheduled to meet Union Minister Manohar Lal Khattar in Delhi, where he is expected to lodge a complaint about alleged corruption in the Amrit scheme tenders. This follows KTR's earlier accusations against CM Revanth Reddy's cousin, Srujan Reddy, over illegal tenders related to the scheme.

Jagdish Reddy Accuses Ministers of Exploiting Farmers



TPN, Telangana: Former Minister Jagdish Reddy has strongly criticized the state government, accusing it of failing to support farmers and providing necessary irrigation water. Speaking to the media on Monday, Reddy blamed the current ministers for enabling exploitation of farmers by brokers, and he warned that he would soon expose everyone, including the Nalgonda district minister and CM Revanth Reddy, over the ongoing is-

Reddy stated that farmers are revolting against the government and revealed that the government's conspiracy against them will be exposed soon. He also claimed that the Congress-led government's days are numbered, citing increasing public dissatisfaction. Reddy lambasted the administration for its failure to meet its promises, leading to a situation where threats of violence are being made to suppress public protests.

He further criticized the government for halting development and causing the collapse of various government departments. According to Reddy, the police department remains the only functional institution in Telangana, primarily focused on suppressing dissent. He pointed out that basic services, including healthcare, are failing, with children dying in schools, and essential medicines unavailable at dispensaries.

BRS Party of Spreading False Propaganda-Minister Sitakka

TPN, Telangana: Minister Sitakka criticized the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) for spreading false propaganda and conspiring to benefit the BJP in Maharashtra. She accused BRS

of working as the BJP's "B team" to avoid legal cases. Sitakka highlighted that since the announcement of Maharashtra elections, BRS has intensified its campaign with a strategy to attack the public government through false narratives.

She particularly targeted BRS's criticism of the state's free travel scheme for women, clarifying that the scheme provides essential travel support during emergencies, even when women

don't have cash. Sitakka also condemned BRS for instigating protests against auto drivers, questioning why they did not raise concerns when ride-sharing services like Ola and Uber were introduced.

Additionally, she lambasted the BRS government for failing to waive crop loans for 20 lakh farmers during their tenure. Sitakka emphasized that the loan waivers provided by BRS were inadequate, covering only the interest, and expressed frustration over the party's lack of meaningful support for farmers.

Etala Rajender Criticizes Govt. Over Farmer Payments



TPN , Telangana: Malkajigiri MP Etala Rajender (R) condemned the state government's practice of paying "porter paise" to farmers, calling it an injustice. During a visit to grain buying centers in Janagama on Monday, Rajender highlighted how the central government is supporting farmers by purchasing rice through FCI, covering all costs including transport and handling charges. He accused local market owners of exploiting farmers by not informing them about these payments.

Rajender urged the government to take responsibility for the porter's fees and called for more transparency in the payment process. He also discussed the challenges faced by cotton farmers, who are receiving less than the MSP of Rs. 7,521 per quintal due to pressure from millers. He emphasized the importance of strengthening procurement systems for both rice and cotton to ensure farmers receive fair prices.

Govt Cheating Farmers, Announces Statewide Tours

TPN, Telangana: BJP MP Laxman criticized the state government for its handling of the farming crisis, accusing it of colluding with millers to exploit farmers. Speaking about the mounting issues farmers face, Laxman pointed out that their grain has been sitting unsold for over a month, with no one to purchase it. Despite reaching out to the collector, Laxman claimed that the government's response was insufficient, stating that the authorities had yet to take meaningful action.

He criticized the state government for its failure to support farmers, especially after untimely rains, questioning the role of sleeping ministers and the


lack of proper systems in place. Laxman emphasized that while the central government has been providing generous support to farmers, the state government was allowing them to sell grain at a loss of Rs 1,000 per quintal.

The BJP MP also accused the government of neglecting promises made to farmers, including the Rythu Bharosa scheme and other financial support measures. Asserting that these unfulfilled promises have left farmers without security, Laxman announced that the BJP would begin statewide tours to highlight the plight of farmers and demand action from the government.



Kaushik Reddy Warns Revanth Reddy **Amid Growing Farmers' Discontent**

TPN, Telangana: Huzurabad MLA Padi Kaushik Reddy has strongly criticized Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, alleging that farmers are increasingly dissatisfied with his leadership. Reddy pointed to a recent incident in Kodangal, the CM's own constituency, where agitated farmers protested by attacking government officials and damaging vehicles. In a dramatic display of frustration, the farmers reportedly hung the collector. Kaushik Reddy expressed concern that if the Dalit Bandhu scheme is not implemented fairly in Huzurabad, similar protests might take place in his constituency as well.

Phone Tapping Notice to Ex-MLA Chirumurthy Lingaiah

TPN, Hyderabad: In a significant turn of events in the phone tapping case linked to the previous administration, police have issued notices to former MLA Chirumurthy Lingaiah. This marks the first instance of a politician being formally notified in connection with this case. The notices direct Lingaiah to appear before the Assistant Commissioner of Police (ACP) at Jubilee Hills.

The basis for the notice is Lingaiah's reported phone contact with an individual named Thirupatanna, who is involved in the investigation. However, Lingaiah informed the investigating officers that he was unwell and unable to attend the hearing on the designated day. He has requested additional time to comply with the summons.

Chirumurthy Lingaiah's political journey has he joined the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS). seen various milestones. He was elected as an MLA from Nakirekal in 2009. Following the agitation for a separate Telangana state, he resigned in 2010, although the Speaker did not accept it. Lingaiah resigned again in 2011 and later successfully contested the 2018 elections as a Congress candidate. Subsequently,



This development underscores the widening scope of the phone tapping case and could signal further investigations involving prominent political figures. The outcome of Lingaiah's response to the notice is awaited as authorities continue to probe the matter.

Police Ban Protests Near Telangana Secretariat

TPN, **Hyderabad**: Hyderabad Police Commissioner CV Anand has imposed a ban on public gatherings, protests, and rallies within a 500-metre radius of the Telangana secretariat. The directive, issued on Monday, November 11, is aimed at maintaining public order and security amid potential protests.

An exception is made for peaceful protests and dharnas held at Indira Park Dharna Chowk. The commissioner cited public safety concerns as the reason for the restriction, noting that exemptions apply to police and military personnel on duty, funeral processions, and individuals with prior clearance from the authorities.

The order is enforced under Section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita 2023 (formerly Section 144 of the Criminal Procedure Code), restricting gatherings of five or more people within the specified area. The mandate will be in effect from November 11, 2024, until further notice.

Previously, the Hyderabad police had implemented a similar month-long ban on public gatherings and demonstrations across Hyderabad and Secunderabad, effective from October 27 until November 28 at 6 p.m. This action was also taken to safeguard public order and maintain peace in the region.

HYDRAA Removes Footpath Encroachments



TPN, Hyderabad: HYDRAA dismantled illegal footpath encroachments in busy areas, including Shastripuram, Vattepalli Road, and Filmnagar in Jubilee Hills. These unauthorized structures, including sheds in front of shops,

HYDRAA officials highlighted that such encroachments disrupt traffic flow and diminish the city's visual appeal. To address these issues, HYDRAA Commissioner A.V. Ranganath directed teams to continue identifying and removing encroachments across Hyderabad in coordination with the traffic police.

A coordinated plan is being developed to tackle encroachments citywide, aiming to encourage pedestrians to use designated footpaths rather than walk on roads, thus improving safety and accessibility.

In addition, HYDRAA is planning a special awareness campaign to educate pedestrians on proper footpath use and ensure paths remain unobstructed. In response to public complaints, Commissioner Ranganath has urged the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) to conduct a thorough review of grievances. Following this review, HYDRAA will carry out further removal actions to maintain safe, accessible walkways for pedestrians.

Two Women Found Dead in Separate Incidents in Hyderabad

TPN, Hyderabad: In the Gulshannagar area of Film Nagar, a 23-year-old techie, Iram Nabidaar from Jammu and Kashmir, was found dead in her apartment. Employed at a multinational bank, she had not reported to work since November 7, prompting her colleagues to alert Jubilee Hills police. Officers forced entry into her apartment and discovered her deceased. Preliminary information from her parents indicated she had been troubled by issues related to a love affair. Police have registered a case and investigations are ongoing.

In a separate incident, 25-year-old Sridevi, a newlywed from Andhra Pradesh, was found dead in Petbasheerabad, Quthbullapur, on November 8. Employed at a private firm in Hyderabad, Sridevi was reportedly unhappy with her recent marriage, arranged against her wishes. Police suspect suicide. Following a postmortem at Gandhi Hospital, her body was handed over to her parents. Investigations continue in both cases.

Massive Fire Erupts in Hyderabad; No Casualties Reported

TPN, Hyderabad: A massive fire broke out on Monday afternoon in Arangar, Hyderabad, behind a Mahindra showroom. The blaze, which originated in a godown, caused thick smoke to engulf the area. Police and fire officials promptly arrived and managed to control the fire. Preliminary investigations indicated that a short circuit was the cause.

In a separate incident, a fire erupted in a scrap warehouse in MM Pahadi under the Attapur police station. Witnessing the flames, locals quickly evacuated the area. The fire was brought under control with the help of two fire engines, and no injuries were reported.

Residents expressed relief as there was no loss of life in either incident. Authorities have urged precautionary measures to prevent future occurrences.



Worm-Infested Food Found at Hyderabad Cafeteria

The post quickly gained attention online, with the woman tagging food safety department officials in hopes of prompt intervention. However, as of now, neither the cafeteria management nor the food safety authorities have provided an official response.

Chandrashekar Rao's leadership, questioning the logic behind the current prolonged process. Yadav further raised concerns about how the state plans to proceed with Sarpanch elections and BC reservations without first completing the survey. The MLA called for the government to reconsider its approach to avoid further public unrest and confusion.

Preliminary investigations suggest that the girl may have taken her own life due to "family issues." A suicide note, addressed to her parents and brother, was found at the scene.

The student was originally from Nizamabad district. Authorities have initiated further investigations into the matter to determine the exact cause of the tragedy.

Forest staff are monitoring the tiger's movements daily. Preliminary investigations suggest that the tiger may have strayed from Maharashtra, likely in search of new territory and a mate, as it is the mating season for tigers.

Authorities have advised the public to avoid any interaction with the tiger, stressing that efforts are being made to ensure its safe passage while also protecting the safety of travelers on the highway. Forest officials are actively tracking the animal's movements to ensure there are no risks to human life.

Thieves Loot 10 Houses in Nalgonda, Steal Rs. 2 Lakh and Gold

As the investigation continues, the people of Sunshine Colony are hopeful that the authorities will address their concerns and take swift action to resolve the issue.


MLA Payam Criticizes KTR, Warns Ponguleti's Critics

Cotton Farmers in Adilabad Face Struggles in Selling Produce



TPN, Adilabad: Cotton farmers in are levying extra charges, including Adilabad are facing numerous challenges as they try to sell their produce, after raising commercial crops in hopes of a profitable season. Initially, the farmers struggled with delays in the commencement of cotton procurement by the Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) and insufficient procurement centers. This forced them to transport their cotton to neighboring districts, incurring significant costs.

Now, farmers are being exploited by private traders who offer prices below the Minimum Support Price (MSP) of Rs. 7,521 per quintal, citing high moisture content in the cotton. Additionally, unauthorized traders

a 2.5% commission and Rs. 25 per bag for handling fees.

For example, Swami from Pippalikoti was forced to sell his cotton for Rs. 6,700 per quintal after CCI rejected it due to 16% moisture content. Farmers have expressed frustration, claiming the CCI is not supporting them, and that elected officials only raise their concerns during elections.

Meanwhile, farmers are struggling to find labor for cotton picking. To address this, they are offering Rs. 10 per kilogram, up from Rs. 7 last year, but still face a shortage of workers, relying on migrant labor from neighboring Maharashtra.

Myanmar's Military Leader's Visit to Kunming: A Diplomatic Tightrope Amid Regional Tensions

Myanmar's military leader, Senior General Min Aung Hlaing, recently made a three-day visit to Kunming, the capital of Southwest China's Yunnan Province, to attend the 8th Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS) Summit from November 6 to 7, 2024. While his presence at the summit was not officially framed as a state visit, it none-theless attracted significant attention, given the ongoing political crisis in Myanmar and the international scrutiny surrounding its military government.

The Greater Mekong Subregion is a regional cooperative initiative aimed at fostering economic integration and sustainable development across the Mekong River basin. The GMS includes six countries: Cambodia, China, Laos, Myanmar, Thailand, and Vietnam. The summit is a crucial platform for discussing regional cooperation on infrastructure, economic integration,



and environmental sustainability, with an emphasis on improving trade and connectivity across the region.

General Min Aung Hlaing's participation in this summit marks his second

major international appearance since the February 2021 military coup that ousted Myanmar's democratically elected government. The coup sparked widespread protests, violent crackdowns, and international condemnation, especially from Western nations.

Despite this, Myanmar's military leadership has sought to strengthen its ties with neighboring countries, particularly those with which it shares geographic proximity, such as China.

While Min Aung Hlaing's visit to Kunming was primarily focused on the GMS summit, it also offered a diplomatic opportunity to engage with Chinese officials on bilateral matters. Myanmar and China have long maintained close economic and strategic relations, with China being Myanmar's largest trading partner and a key supporter of its military regime. During his visit, Min Aung Hlaing was expected to discuss ongoing infrastructure projects and further economic cooperation under the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), which includes Chinese investment in Myanmar's energy and transport sectors.

Trump's Return

Impact on US-Canada Relations and India



With Donald Trump poised to return to the White House, the dynamics of international relations, particularly between the US, Canada, and India, are set to shift. For many in India, Trump's reelection is a cause for celebration, as his first term saw a close personal relationship with Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Trump's admiration for India and Modi was evident in high-profile events like the "Howdy Modi!" rally and the "Namaste Trump!" event in Ahmedabad, which left many hopeful about future US-India ties.

However, Trump's return is not without its complications, especially for Canada. While some in India may anticipate a shift in focus away from the Biden administration's criticisms of India, Canada is bracing for the potential fallout from a second Trump term. Canada's concerns center on three major areas: tariffs, NATO contributions, and the renegotiation of the US-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA). Trump has hinted at imposing a blanket 10% tariff on imports, which would heav-

ily impact Canada, as over two-thirds of its exports go to the US. Additionally, Canada is already behind on NATO's defense spending targets, which could lead to tensions if Trump demands increased contributions. Moreover, with the USMCA set for a review in 2026, Canada fears Trump might push for even tougher terms than those agreed upon in 2020.

Trump's relationship with Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau has been contentious, with past remarks calling him "weak" and "two-faced." Yet, Trudeau's pragmatism means that he's already preparing for the challenges ahead. His government has been in discussions with Trump's campaign team for months and has reestablished a Cabinet committee to focus on US-Canada relations. Trudeau's approach highlights the delicate balance Canada must strike, given its deep economic, defense, and cultural ties with the US.

Despite the challenges, Canada remains part of the Five Eyes intelligence alliance, which could help bolster its stance in the face of India's growing tensions over allegations of involvement in the killing of a Sikh separatist. Whether Trump will side with India or continue to push Canada on these issues remains uncertain, but one thing is clear: US-Canada relations will be pivotal in the years to come.

The Rise of India's Startup Ecosystem: A Transformation Under Modi's Leadership



The Startup India initiative, launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in 2016, has been a game-changer for the Indian entrepreneurial landscape. Aimed at promoting innovation, economic growth, and job creation, this initiative has led to the birth of new startups at an unprecedented pace. As of June 2024, the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) has officially recognised 140,803 startups. This surge in entrepreneurship has not only boosted economic activity but also created over 1.55 million direct jobs, reflecting the success of the government's focus on fostering a dynamic, job-creating environment.

A particularly encouraging trend is the increasing participation of women in the startup ecosystem. Nearly 67,500 of these recognised startups have at least one woman director, highlighting a significant shift towards gender inclusivity in business leadership. Furthermore, the rise of GenAI startups in India has added a new dimension to this growth, with over 100 such

companies now operational, attracting more than \$600 million in funding since 2019. Notably, 79% of startups with a woman founder were established after 2012-13, marking a significant shift in the post-2014 era.

Before 2014, India's startup scene was almost nonexistent. There were only around 350 startups, with just four home-grown unicorns. This stagnation occurred during the Congress-led governments, which dominated Indian politics for much of the first six decades after independence. During this period, India's business environment was heavily controlled by large corporations, and the entrepreneurial spirit struggled to take flight. The focus on big business over small and medium enterprises left little room for the kind of in-

novation that drives a thriving startup ecosystem.

Since the launch of the Startup India initiative, the number of startups in India has skyrocketed from just 350 in 2014 to over 1.4 lakh in 2024, under the leadership of Narendra Modi. India now boasts more than 118 unicorns, a sharp increase from just four in 2014. This remarkable transformation underscores the success of "Modinomics"—a set of policies that have nurtured a culture of meritocracy and innovation, while reducing bureaucratic interference.

Today, India is home to the world's third-largest startup ecosystem, a testament to how a supportive policy environment, coupled with a focus on innovation, can unleash the entrepreneurial potential of a nation. Under Modi's leadership, the Indian startup ecosystem continues to evolve, positioning the country as a global leader in entrepreneurship and technology.

The Battle of Galwan: A Fight for Survival in October 1962



In August 1962, the Alpha company of 5 Jat Regiment, stationed at Chushul, was tasked with taking control of Hot Springs in the Galwan Valley. Initially, Major Ajit Singh's Bravo company was designated to occupy the Galwan post, but when he insisted on staying at Hot Springs, the responsibility unexpectedly fell to Alpha. In October, around 60 soldiers from the company arrived at the Galwan post, unprepared and under-equipped, unaware of the tough battle that

lay ahead.

The Alpha company's position at Galwan was perilous. The area was heavily snowbound, and the Chinese posts blocked off all land routes. As a result, the soldiers at Galwan were entirely dependent on air supplies, which sometimes fell into enemy hands. The Chinese soldiers also kept up a psychological campaign, circling the posts and chanting slogans like "Hindi Chini"

Bhai Bhai" to demoralize the Indian soldiers.

The company was split into four posts, with limited communication between them. Major Srikant Sitaram Hasabnis commanded the head-quarters post, while Subedar Hoshiar Singh, Naik Inder Singh, and Subedar Nihal Singh led their respective platoons. Despite these efforts, the soldiers were ill-prepared, and many were left without weapons. Radio communication was restricted to scheduled intervals, adding to the isolation. The atmosphere was one of fear, with the men feeling as though they had been abandoned to face certain death.

The Assault Begins

On the morning of October 20, Major Hasabnis was in his tent when he heard the rattle of a machine gun. As he peeked outside, he was met with a barrage of fire from the Chinese side. Gunfire from rifles, machine guns, and artillery began to rain down on the Indian positions. In an attempt to alert the battalion, Major Hasabnis tried to use the radio, only to discover that it was radio silence, leaving him with no way to call for reinforcements.

With no external support, the Alphas found themselves fighting alone. One soldier, who was unarmed, sat outside in the open, waiting for the inevitable shot to kill him. Meanwhile, Major Hasabnis was armed only with a pistol, a stark contrast to the heavy artillery fire they

Fighting Relentlessly

Subedar Nihal Singh's post was also heavily shelled, but despite the brutal assault, he continued to move from man to man, urging them to hold their ground. In the chaos, Sepoy Bhopal Singh, who was wounded, ran to aid a fallen officer, moving him to safety. Upon returning to his position, he found his weapon damaged but continued to fight with grenades until he was killed in action.

Elsewhere, Major Hasabnis and his remaining men continued to resist the Chinese forces. Captain Doctor HN Paul, who had been advised to seek cover in a trench, was tragically presumed dead when his tent caught fire from an incendiary round. Company Havildar Major Banwari Lal, who had been organizing ammunition supplies, was also killed by shellfire while making a dash for more supplies.

Despite the overwhelming odds, the Indian soldiers at Galwan fought valiantly, with many giving their lives in the defense of their post. The battle at Galwan became a symbol of courage, sacrifice, and resilience, as the soldiers stood their ground against a superior enemy force.





"Saints, Sages Have Helped Humanity **Realize Its Purpose": PM Modi**

CM Siddaramaiah Challenges Modi to Prove Allegations or Resign from Politics Karnataka Chief Minister Siddara-

"I am surprised to see the Prime Minister of this country lie so much," Siddaramaiah remarked, questioning the validity of Modi's claims about extortion in Karnataka. "He says Congress collected Rs 700 crore through the excise department to send to other states. These allegations are far from the truth."

Siddaramaiah then issued a challenge directly to Modi, stating, "I challenge Narendra Modi that if he can prove these allegations, I will retire from politics. If you cannot prove them, then you should retire." His comments were met with applause from the



crowd, as he accused the Prime Minister of using baseless accusations for political gain.

The controversy began during Modi's public meeting in Akola, where he alleged that extortion linked to the Karnataka excise department had doubled during election season. The Prime Minister claimed that the Congress party had raised the Rs 700 crore through liquor shops in the state to fund elections in other regions.

Siddaramaiah's response reflects the growing political tension between the Karnataka state government and the central leadership of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), as both parties prepare for upcoming elections. His challenge has now set the stage for a high-stakes political confrontation, with the focus on whether Modi can substantiate his claims or whether the allegations will be dismissed as part of the ongoing political rhetoric.

Justice Sanjiv Khanna Sworn in as the 51st **Chief Justice of India**

Justice Sanjiv Khanna was sworn in as the 51st Chief Justice of India (CJI) on Monday, following a ceremony at Rashtrapati Bhavan where President Droupadi Murmu administered the oath of office. Justice Khanna takes charge with a clear goal of reducing pendency and speeding up the delivery of justice in India.

Born on May 14, 1960, Justice Khanna will serve as the CJI for just over six months, retiring on May 13, 2025, upon turning 65. He succeeds Justice DY Chandrachud, who demitted office the previous day. The swearing-in ceremony was attended by several dignitaries, including Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal, and former CJI JS Khehar, alongside Justice Chandrachud.

Justice Khanna, who became a Supreme Court judge in January 2019, has played a role in several landmark rulings. These include upholding the integrity of Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs), declaring the electoral bonds scheme unconstitutional, supporting the abrogation of Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir, and granting interim bail to Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal in the excise policy case.

A third-generation lawyer, Justice Khanna hails from a distinguished legal family. His father, Justice Dev Raj Khanna, served as a judge in the Delhi High Court, and his uncle, Justice HR Khanna, is remembered for his dissent in the 1976 ADM Jabalpur case during the Emergency. HR Khanna's principled stance, which led to his supersession as Chief Justice of India, remains a defining moment in the history of the Indian judiciary.

Justice Sanjiv Khanna, a graduate of Delhi University's Campus Law Centre, has a long and illustrious legal career. He was a senior standing counsel for the Income Tax Department and served as the standing counsel for the National Capital Territory of Delhi. His extensive experience also includes acting as an amicus curiae and arguing significant criminal cases in the Delhi High Court.

Netanyahu Confirms Israel's Role in September 17 Pager Attack on **Hezbollah in Lebanon**

For the first time in nearly two months, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's administration has officially acknowledged Israel's involvement in the deadly pager and walkie-talkie attacks in Lebanon, which were used by Hezbollah militants. The attack, which took place on September 17, 2024, resulted in at least 37 deaths and over 3,000 injuries after explosions were triggered in communication devices used by Hezbollah operatives.

During a Sunday cabinet meeting, Netanyahu confirmed Israel's role in the operation, which targeted Hezbollah's leadership, including an assassination attempt on its leader, Hassan Nasrallah. "The beeper operation and the elimination of Hezbollah's leader Hassan Nasrallah were launched despite the opposition of senior officials in the security establishment and the political echelon in charge of them," Netanyahu reportedly told his cabinet, according to Israeli media.

This acknowledgment marks the first official confirmation from Israel regarding its involvement in the September 17 attack, in which handheld pagers and walkie-talkies detonated over two consecutive days in Lebanon. The blasts were designed to target Hezbollah militants, causing significant casualties and shockwaves across the region. Israel's military and intelligence agencies, including the Mossad and Shin Bet, were reportedly involved in the operation, though Netanyahu's confirmation sheds light on the political division within Israel's leadership over the operation.

Israel's spokesperson, Omer Dostri, confirmed that Netanyahu had personally approved the operation, stating, "PM Netanyahu confirmed Sunday that he greenlighted the pager operation in Lebanon."

The attacks, which have raised significant international concern, were carried out amid tensions surrounding Israel's ongoing conflict with Hezbollah and other regional actors. At the time, former Defense Minister Yoav Gallant praised the operation's success, stating that the Israeli Defense Forces (IDF), in collaboration with intelligence agencies, had achieved "impressive results."

China Reaffirms Support for Pakistan in Counter-Terrorism Efforts

Beijing: On Monday, China reiterated its commitment to supporting Pakistan in its fight against terrorism, emphasizing the need to protect Chinese nationals working on various projects in Pakistan. The statement came from Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Lin Jian, who underscored that China's support for Pakistan in its counter-terrorism efforts would remain steadfast, despite ongoing challenges in the region.

The Chinese government has long been involved in infrastructure and development projects in Pakistan, particularly under the framework of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC). With numerous Chinese workers and companies operating in Pakistan, Beijing has expressed growing concern over the safety of its nationals in the face of increasing attacks by militant groups.

Lin Jian acknowledged the security challenges faced by Pakistan, particularly in the areas where Chinese nationals are stationed, but reassured that China would continue to assist in ensuring their safety. "China will continue to work closely with Pakistan to enhance security cooperation and ensure the safety of Chinese



personnel working on joint projects," Lin said during a regular press briefing.

Pakistan has been grappling with rising terrorism, particularly in regions bordering Afghanistan, where various insurgent and militant groups operate. Chinese nationals working on large-scale infrastructure projects, including energy plants, roads, and railways, have been targeted by extremist factions in the past. These incidents have raised concerns in Beijing about the safety of its citizens in Pakistan, leading to calls for enhanced security measures.

Calls for Kamala Harris to Become First Woman President

Jamal Simmons, a former communications director for Vice President Kamala Harris, recently suggested that President Joe Biden should resign and hand over the presidency to his deputy, Kamala Harris, making her the first woman president of the United States, albeit for a short time. Simmons, who made this proposal both in a social media post and during a CNN interview, argued that such a move would fulfill a final promise Biden could make as president and could have lasting political ramifications.

"Joe Biden has been amazing, but he should fulfill one last promise—to be transitional," Simmons stated in his social media post and reiterated during an interview on CNN's *Situation Room*. By doing so, Biden would also "dominate the news" and present a fresh, dramatic turn for the Democratic Party at a time when many believe they need to reinvent their image.

Simmons further argued that such a gesture would disrupt Donald Trump's narrative, forcing him to rebrand his campaign and reshaping the political landscape. "It would make it easier for the next woman to run," he noted, implying that Harris could serve as a stepping stone for future female candidates.

While the proposal remains a long shot, Simmons' idea has sparked conversations about the future of the Democratic Party and Kamala Harris' role in shaping it.

Arab Leaders Meet in Saudi Arabia to Discuss Gaza, Lebanon, and Trump's Re-election

Arab and Muslim leaders convened in Saudi Arabia for a high-stakes summit addressing the ongoing conflicts in Gaza and Lebanon, with significant focus on sending a message to U.S. President-elect Donald Trump. The summit, announced by the Saudi foreign ministry in late October, comes after a year marked by heightened tensions in the region, particularly due to the war in Gaza.

This gathering follows a similar one in Riyadh last year where leaders from the Arab League and the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) condemned Israeli military actions in Gaza. The current summit is seen as an opportunity for regional leaders to signal their expectations for the incoming Trump administration, especially in terms of U.S. involvement in Middle East peace processes and relations with Israel.



"The message will likely be one of dialogue, de-escalation, and calling out Israeli military campaigns in the region," said Anna Jacobs, senior Gulf analyst at the International Crisis Group. The war in Gaza, sparked by Hamas's unprecedented attack on Is-

rael on October 7, 2023, has resulted in staggering civilian casualties, with over 43,600 people killed in Gaza alone, according to local health authorities.

During his first term, Donald Trump was a staunch supporter of Israel, moving the U.S. embassy to Jerusalem and endorsing Israeli settlements in the occupied West Bank. His administration also brokered the Abraham Accords, normalizing relations between Israel and several Arab nations, including the UAE and Bahrain. How-

ever, Saudi Arabia, while maintaining friendly ties with Trump, did not join the accords, citing the need for a Palestinian state as a precondition for diplomatic recognition of Israel.

Umer Karim, an expert on Saudi politics, suggested that the summit aims to reaffirm Saudi Arabia's position as a key partner for the U.S. in the Muslim world. "If you want to extend American interests in the region, Saudi Arabia is your bet," Karim noted. He also anticipates that the summit's final statement will strongly condemn Israel's actions while calling for increased American diplomatic leverage on the Palestinian issue.

The summit comes at a time of evolving regional dynamics, including Saudi Arabia's rapprochement with Iran, highlighting shifting alliances in the Middle East as Trump prepares for his second term.

SEBI mulls process to seek waiver of interest on penalty payment



On Monday, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) put forward a proposal outlining a procedure for individuals and entities to request a waiver or reduction of interest related to recovery proceedings initiated by the regulator for non-payment of penalties. This new framework is aimed at offering a more structured process for those seeking relief from the interest charges that accrue on unpaid penalties.

According to the proposal, SEBI has suggested that applicants can approach the regulator to submit requests for the waiver or reduction of interest in cases where penalties were levied but not paid within the stipulated timelines. The request would be considered on a case-by-case basis, with SEBI evaluating the reasons behind the delay in payment and the circumstances surrounding the case.

The move comes as part of SEBI's ongoing

efforts to streamline the penalty and recovery process and make it more transparent. The regulator has been increasingly focused on ensuring compliance with market regulations, but it has also recognized the need to be flexible in certain situations, particularly when genuine financial difficulties or extenuating circumstances may have prevented the timely settlement of penalties.

Under the proposed procedure, the applicant would be required to submit detailed documentation explaining the reasons for the delay, along with any supporting evidence. SEBI would then review the application and make a decision on whether the interest charge should be waived or reduced, based on the merit of the case. This approach aims to strike a balance between maintaining stringent regulatory enforcement and offering relief to those who may be facing genuine challenges in meeting their obligations.

The move to introduce this procedure is likely to be welcomed by market participants who have faced difficulties in settling penalties due to unforeseen circumstances. SEBI's intention is to ensure that its regulatory functions are carried out effectively, while also maintaining fairness in the treatment of individuals and entities involved in recovery proceedings.

RBI Unveils New Framework for FPIs to Convert Investments into FDI



The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Monday introduced a streamlined operational framework allowing foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) to convert their investments into foreign direct investment (FDI) when their equity holdings in Indian companies exceed the 10% thresh-

Under current regulations, FPIs are restricted from holding more than 10% equity in a listed Indian company. When this limit is surpassed—often inadvertently by FPIs and their investor groups—it can

lead to regulatory complications. To address this, the RBI's new framework provides a clear and structured process for FPIs to convert their excess investments into FDI, thereby bringing them into compliance with Indian FDI norms.

This regulatory change is expected to offer greater flexibility to FPIs, particularly those who find themselves in a situation where their holdings unintentionally breach the 10% limit due to stock price movements or other market dynamics. Instead of liquidating the

excess shares or facing regulatory issues, FPIs will now have the option to transition the surplus equity to FDI, which typically carries fewer restrictions than FPI investments.

The move is seen as a step toward streamiining foreign investment processes, reducing administrative hurdles, and encouraging longterm foreign investments in India. By allowing FPIs to seamlessly convert their holdings into FDI, the RBI aims to promote stability in the Indian equity market and provide clarity to foreign investors looking to deepen their exposure to Indian companies.

The new framework also ensures that the process remains aligned with India's overall FDI policy, which is more favorable to longterm investors and allows for higher investment limits in certain sectors. This change is expected to benefit both foreign investors and Indian companies by encouraging more foreign capital inflows, which can aid in business expansion, technological advancements, and job creation within the coun-

iPhone's New Reboot Feature **Makes Devices** Harder to Unlock for Thieves

Apple has quietly introduced a new feature in iOS 18.1 designed to enhance the security of iPhones, making it significantly harder for both thieves and law enforcement officials to crack the device's password. The feature, known as "inactivity reboot," automatically restarts iPhones that remain unlocked for a certain number of days, according to a recent report by 404 Media, citing multiple security experts.

The new feature, which is part of iOS 18.1, appears to be specifically aimed at thwarting digital forensics tools used to access locked devices. If an iPhone is left unlocked for an extended period, it will automatically reboot. When the phone powers up again, it becomes more difficult to unlock using conventional forensic techniques, which rely on extracting data from the device's operating system.



The feature has raised concerns among US law enforcement agencies, who have reportedly noticed iPhones in their custody mysteriously rebooting during forensic examinations. These reboots appear to interfere with attempts to extract information from the devices, making it more challenging for authorities to investigate smartphones in criminal cases.


According to messages shared by forensic expert Christopher Vance, who works for Magnet Forensics, a company that provides

investigative tools for law enforcement, the "inactivity timer" was identified within iOS 18 and later versions. Vance explained that the timer causes a device, when in an "AFU" (Accessed Forensic Unit) state, to reboot to a "BFU" (Boot Forensic Unit) state after a set period of inactivity. This reboot effectively disrupts forensic attempts to bypass the device's security measures.

While Apple has not officially confirmed the existence of this feature, the reports suggest that it may be part of the company's broader effort to improve user privacy and security. The "inactivity reboot" feature could make it significantly more difficult for unauthorized individuals, including criminals and digital forensic specialists, to access sensitive data stored on iPhones, further bolstering Apple's commitment to data protection.

Scientists have uncovered a groundbreaking discovery: a new species of marine invertebrate, the comb jelly *Mnemiopsis leidyi*, that defies the traditional cycle of birth, aging, and death. Unlike most animals, which follow a predictable life cycle of development, aging, and eventual death, this species has the remarkable ability to revert to a younger version of itself, effectively "de-aging."

This unusual phenomenon was first observed by Joan J Soto-Angel, a co-author of the study, who noticed a larval comb jelly in his lab's tank, where an adult version of the jellyfish species had been residing. Upon further investigation, Soto-Angel realized that the larval jellyfish was, in fact, the same adult animal, suggesting it

had reverted to a younger stage of development.

Soto-Angel and his team at the University of Bergen conducted experiments to understand what triggered this de-aging process. They found that under extreme stress, the adult comb jelly could regress back to a larval stage, reshaping its body and changing its behavior in the process. Over several weeks, the comb jelly not only physically transformed but also adopted the feeding behaviors typical of its larval form, known as cydippid larvae.

"This discovery challenges our current understanding of animal development and body plans," Soto-Angel said. "It opens new avenues for the study of life cycle plasticity and rejuvenation, and raises important questions about how widespread this ability is across the animal kingdom."

Interestingly, comb jellies are believed to have existed for over 700 million years, potentially making them one of the earliest animals on Earth. This ability to reverse their biological clock has led some to compare them with the "immortal jellyfish," *Turritopsis dohrnii*, another species known to exhibit similar de-aging prop-

The findings could have profound implications for understanding the aging process in humans, as well as offer insights into the developmental biology of other animals.



Link Between Technology and Loneliness: How Social Media **Affect Mental Health**

Recent research by Harvard University's Laura Marciano sheds light on a troubling trend: teenagers, despite spending significant time on social media and online, are increasingly experiencing loneliness. Over the summer, Marciano conducted a study where 500 teenagers completed surveys three times a day about their social interactions. Surprisingly, over 50% of participants reported not speaking to anyone in the past hour, either in person or online, highlighting a disconnect between online activity and genuine socialization.

This growing sense of loneliness is not confined to teenagers. A study by U.S. Surgeon General Dr. Vivek Murthy found that loneliness has reached epidemic levels in the U.S., with one in two adults reporting feelings of social isolation. Experts are now investigating whether technology, particularly smartphones and social media, is contributing to this loneliness. While there's little evidence that tech directly causes loneliness, there is a strong correlation between the two. Many who feel isolated also tend to engage in unhealthy tech habits.

Many people compare themselves to others on platforms like Instagram, leading to feelings of inadequacy or "FOMO" (fear of missing out). Research by Chia-chen Yang, a professor at Oklahoma State University, found that judgmental comparisons on social media — such as comparing appearances or lifestyles — often lead to negative feelings and isolation. To counter this, experts recommend using social media in a more constructive way, like following accounts that provide helpful or uplifting content, and hiding like counts to reduce the pressure of validation.

While texting has become the primary form of communication, it can often hinder authentic connection. Marciano's study showed that many teenagers experience anxiety when waiting for responses or feeling disconnected through brief text exchanges. In contrast, one-on-one conversations via phone or video calls were linked to lower feelings of loneli-

Some individuals, especially those feeling lonely, become absorbed in binge-watching shows or streaming content, which can keep them isolated and indoors, further deepening the cycle of loneliness.

To combat these negative effects, experts suggest balancing tech use with more personal forms of communication, such as phone or video calls, and practicing self-reflection when social media use leads to negative feelings.

WhatsApp Beta Bug Turns Screen Green for Android Users

WhatsApp beta testers on Android have encoun- effectively, and the screen remains green until tered a significant bug in the latest version of the app, *WhatsApp Beta 2.24.24.5*, causing devices to become unresponsive and display a green screen. The issue arises when users open a chat or tap on a message, causing the entire screen to turn green and rendering the device unresponsive until the app is closed.

This is not to be confused with "green lines" that some users may experience on OLED screens due to permanent damage, where a single line of LEDs turns green. In this case, the problem affects the entire display, causing a full-screen green overlay whenever WhatsApp is accessed. The bug has been reported by multiple beta testers, with the issue affecting devices across different models.

The green screen glitch seems to be isolated to the specific beta version *2.24.24.5* and appears when interacting with chats or messages within the app. This bug prevents users from navigating the app

WhatsApp is closed or the device is restarted. While this may not cause permanent damage to the device, it does create a frustrating experience for users, especially those testing the app's new features.

WhatsApp's beta testing is crucial for identifying issues before rolling out new features to the general public. However, this bug highlights the risks of using early software versions, as beta testers often encounter unforeseen issues like this one. The company is expected to release a fix for the bug in a future update, though it's unclear when that will happen.

For now, users affected by the green screen issue should consider downgrading to a stable version of WhatsApp or waiting for the official patch. As always, those interested in beta testing new features should be prepared for potential glitches and bugs that may arise during the process.



In other Bundesliga action, Wolfsburg defeated Heidenheim 3-1, while Hoffenheim's Pavel Kaderabek set the record for the joint-fastest yellow card in league history after just eight seconds in a goalless draw with Augsburg.

For the ODI series, South Africa has made some key inclusions. Experienced pacer Masabata Klaas returns to the squad after missing the T20 World Cup in the UAE last month. Fast bowler Ayanda Hlubi also makes her first 50-over call-up since the tour to Australia earlier this year. Left-handed batter Lara Goodall, who reached her 50th ODI cap in April, returns after missing the ODI series against India in June.

Proteas Women's Convenor of Selectors, Clinton du Preez, explained that the squad selections were focused on strengthening the team for white-ball cricket. "The T20I series offers us a great opportunity to assess players who have been on the radar based on their domestic performances," he said.
