New EV Policy in Telangana Promises Clean, Green Future

TPN, Hyderabad: In a major step towards reducing pollution, Telangana's BC Welfare Minister Ponnam Prabhakar announced that electric vehicles (EVs) will be exempt from registration fees starting tomorrow. This new initiative is expected to save EV owners up to Rs. 1 lakh and is part of the state's efforts to make Hyderabad a pollution-free city.

Minister Prabhakar highlighted that the state's updated EV policy aims to transform Hyderabad into a cleaner, more sustainable city, following the example of Delhi. Under the leadership of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and Deputy CM committed to tackling urban pollution.

The new EV policy, originally introduced in 2020, will remain in effect until December 31, 2026. Minister Prabhakar confirmed that there will be no cap on the number of electric vehicles in the state, and plans are in place to replace 3,000 existing buses in Hyderabad with electric ones to reduce pollution further.

With pollution intensity at 83 in Hyderabad, compared to 72 in Pathancheruvu, the government is also working to raise awareness about the benefits of EVs. Prabhakar urged residents to prior-

broader efforts to tackle pollution.

Additionally, the government is focusing on improving road safety. Prabhakar expressed concern over the high number of road accidents, which claim 1.5 lakh lives annually in the country, including 20 daily fatalities in Telangana. The government plans to collaborate with organizations to raise awareness and set up road safety parks in schools.

With more EV charging stations on the horizon, the government is urging EV companies to take the lead in setting up infrastructure to support the growing

4,696 Indiramma **Houses for Mid Manair Oustees**


TPN , Telangana : The government of Telangana has announced the allotment of 4,696 Indiramma houses to the displaced families of the Mid Manair Project, bringing much-needed relief to the affected communities. The decision, made by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's administration, comes after years of struggle and unfulfilled promises.

The Mid Manair Project, which began in 2006 and was completed in 2019, displaced approximately 11,731 families from 12 villages. While the previous BRS government offered partial compensation and house plots, many families were left to build homes with minimal support.

"If you stay there for three months, you will understand the real situation of the people living near the Musi," Goud said. He challenged the CM and Kishan Reddy to spend three months in the area to witness the harsh conditions faced by residents, many of whom suffer from various diseases.

He further accused Kishan Reddy of only emerging in public when the BRS government faces setbacks, claiming that Reddy's actions are aimed at protecting the BRS rather than addressing the concerns of the people. "What did you achieve by sleeping for one day in the area?" Goud asked, questioning the sincerity of Reddy's visit.

Goud reaffirmed the state government's commitment to the Musi River project, which will improve living conditions for those affected by the river's pollution and flooding risks. He promised that the government would provide double-bedroom homes for the residents and educational opportunities for their children.

He also took a jab at BJP's and Gujarat's political stance, saying, "Why are you treating people in Telangana like slaves in Gujarat?" Goud concluded by emphasizing that the stagnation of Telangana's development would soon end, with the state poised for significant progress. The Musi River project, which aims to clean and rejuvenate the river, remains a key focus for the state government despite ongoing political tensions.

Sanjay referred to several ongoing controversies, including phone tapping, the Kaleswaram project, and the Dharani land registration scam, calling them "rubbish" and accusing the BRS of diverting attention from crucial issues affecting farmers. He emphasized that KTR's role in the attack on the collector was a disgrace and called it shameful that KTR had not been arrested for it, blaming government negligence.

Sanjay also took aim at the alleged business connections between Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) and the family of Congress leader A. Revanth Reddy. "There are business relations be-

tween KCR and Revanth's family, and I will prove it," he said. In a bold challenge, Sanjay stated, "If it is proven that Revanth and KCR have no business ties, I will quit politics."

The Union Minister further claimed that BRS was attempting to derail the Group 1 and Constable agitations, labelling the party as "subversive" and accusing it of jeopardizing people's lives. He concluded by asserting that the attacks on officials were part of a broader strategy to distract from the government's failures in addressing farmers' issues.

Telangana Rebrands Police Insignia and State Symbols Under Revanth Reddy

TPN , Telangana : The Telangana Home Department has announced a significant rebranding of the state's police insignia and other official symbols, marking a shift from the legacy of the previous BRS government. The change, initiated by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy's Congress-led administration, will replace the

abbreviation "TS" (Telangana State) with "TG" (Telangana Government).

Special Chief Secretary Ravi Gupta confirmed that the Telangana Police logo will now be simplified to "Telangana Police," with updated



monograms on uniforms, including police caps and shoulder badges. The abbreviation "TS" will be replaced with "TG" across all ranks, from constables to Superintendents of Police (SPs). In addition to the police rebranding, the new abbre-

viation "TG" will also appear on vehicle registration plates, replacing "TS" for all new vehicles. The shift will be reflected in official documents, including government orders, reports, and communications from public sector agencies.

This move is part of a broader effort by Revanth Reddy's government to redefine Telangana's identity, distanc-

ing itself from the previous KCR-led BRS administration. The rebranding also includes plans to update cultural symbols, such as the Telangana Thalli statue and state emblem, aligning them with the new vision of the Congress government.

Mamunur Airport Expansion Gets Rs. 205 Crore Boost

TPN, Warangal: The construction of Mamunur Airport in Warangal district has taken a significant step forward with the release of Rs. 205 crore by the state government for the acquisition of 253 acres of land required for its expansion. The move is part of efforts to improve regional air connectivity and enhance infrastructure in the state.

The Roads and Buildings (R&B) Department has also written to the Airport Authority of India to prepare a Detailed Project Report (DPR) with designs for the airport's construction. The project aims to expand the runway, build a new terminal, and install essential Air Traffic Control (ATC) and navigational equipment on the newly acquired land.

In a significant development, the GMMR (Greater Manthan Media Resort) has withdrawn its contract for a 150 km stretch, which had previously posed a hurdle for the airport expansion.

Currently, the airport occupies 696 acres of land, and the expansion plan will involve some key infrastructure upgrades to accommodate larger aircraft and enhance passenger services.

Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy, a strong advocate



for new airports in the state, has played a pivotal role in pushing the project forward. His efforts aim to bring better connectivity to the region, supporting both economic growth and tourism.

Additionally, the government has sanctioned Rs. 26 crore for the construction of an "Integrated Divisional Level Office Complex" in Station Ghanpur constituency, which will offer modern amenities and improve public services for the local population.

The completion of these projects marks a significant milestone in Telangana's infrastructure development.

Konda Surekha Accuses KTR of Phone Tapping



TPN , Warangal : Minister Konda Surekha has made explosive allegations against the KCR-led BRS government, accusing it of plunging Telangana into debt and engaging in unlawful activities. During a visit to Warangal on Sunday, Surekha criticized former minister K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) over the infamous Lagacharla incident, where KTR allegedly attacked a collector. She accused KTR of attacking "from behind" and said that innocent people were being sacrificed under the current regime.

Surekha, who was addressing a victory meeting marking one year of the Congress-led government's rule, claimed that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy is focused on the development of Warangal. She highlighted the ongoing efforts to make Warangal the second capital of Telangana and mentioned the success of Rahul Gandhi's past rally in the city.

In a stunning revelation, Surekha also brought up the issue of phone tapping, alleging that officials involved in the scandal had fled abroad. She compared the BRS government to a "Tughlaq regime" and criticized BRS leaders for their actions, suggesting they needed psychiatric help. She promised that action would be taken only after the facts regarding KTR's involvement were established.

Surekha's remarks are likely to escalate tensions between the Congress and BRS as the political climate in Telangana grows increasingly charged.

Revanth Calls Kishan Reddy 'Gujarat Ka Ghulam'



TPN , Telangana : Chief Minister Revanth Reddy has strongly reacted to Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy's criticism of the Moosi River revival project, branding him as "Gujarat Ka Ghulam" (a slave of Gujarat). Revanth accused Kishan Reddy of opposing Telangana's development while simultaneously celebrating the Sabarmati Riverfront project in Gujarat, which displaced over 50,000 people.

Revanth, who is currently in Nagpur campaigning for the Maha Vikas Aghadi alliance in Maharashtra, addressed the criticism from Kishan Reddy. Speaking to reporters, he dismissed the BJP leader's comments as hypocritical, accusing him of favoring Gujarat's development while undermining similar initiatives in Telangana. "Kishan Reddy praises the Sabarmati project, which displaced thousands, but opposes the Moosi revival in Telangana. This shows his bias and hypocrisy," Revanth said. Tribal Families Allege Police Assault in Lagacherla

in Telangana have traveled to New Delhi to file complaints with the National SC/ST Commission, alleging police brutality and wrongful charges filed against them after their opposition to a proposed pharma village in their area. This move follows their earlier appeal to the Telangana State Commission for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (SC/ST).

The families also plan to approach the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) to report alleged physical assaults by Telangana Police during late-night raids. The conflict started on November 12, when a public hearing was held by the Vikarabad district administration to discuss land acquisition for the pharma village in Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy's Kodangal constituency. During the meeting, farmers and villagers raised slogans against the Congress government and reportedly attacked District Collector Prateek Jain and other officials. In response, 25 people were arrested.

Seizure of 15 Tons of **Adulterated Ginger Garlic Paste**



TPN , Telangana : In a major crackdown, officials have seized 15 tons of adulterated ginger garlic paste in Secunderabad's Boinpally area. The paste, which was being supplied to well-known hotels across Hyderabad under the brand name "Sony Garlic," was found to contain dangerous chemicals instead of natural ginger and garlic.

The paste, allegedly produced This seizure highlights the by a gang led by one Asim, was made using rotten garlic mixed with harmful chemicals, posing serious health risks to consumers. Asim and his associates were reportedly supplying large quantities of this adulterated paste—about 15 tons daily—to several popu-

lar hotels in Hyderabad. The task force, acting on a tipoff, raided the operation and discovered the extent of the adulteration. They confiscated the entire 15 tons of contaminated paste. The authorities arrested Asim, the owner of Sony Garlic, and charged him with producing and distributing adulterated food products. He was later sent to remand.

SCR Issues Eviction Notice to Sacred Heart Church in Secunderabad



month eviction notice to the Sacred Heart Church in Secunderabad, claiming that the church is located on railway land. The church, which has been serving the Catholic community in the area since its construction in 1927, occupies 3,534 square meters of land in South Lalaguda. SCR's notice, issued under the Public Premises (Eviction of Unauthorized Occupants) Act, 1971, demands that the church vacate the premises by December 12.

The church was built after land was allocated by the Nizam's Railway Company, which owned the area before the nationalization of the Hyderabad Railway system in 1951. The church community asserts that the church's presence is legitimate and that it has not violated any regulations. Many members feel the church is being unfairly targeted by railway authorities. The eviction notice has raised concerns within the local Catholic community.

KTR Slams BJP for **Shielding Congress**

TPN, Hyderabad: BRS working president KT Rama Rao launched a scathing attack on Telangana BJP leaders, including State president and Union Minister G Kishan Reddy, accusing them of shielding Congress Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy. KTR claimed that the BJP and Congress were engaging in "dirty politics" to protect their mutual interests, calling it a "drama enacted by fellow thieves."

Rama Rao questioned the BJP's sudden concern for the victims of the Musi

Kishan Reddy: Telangana Waging 'War on Poor'

TPN, Hyderabad: G Kishan Reddy, Telangana BJP chief and Union Minister, has sharply criticized the state government for what he called a "war on the poor" following the demolitions in the Musi river basin area. Reddy's comments came after an overnight stay in the region, where he raised concerns about the harsh conditions faced by local residents, particularly in light of several heart attack fatalities, which he attributed to the stressful circumstances.

Reddy questioned the state's approach to public administration, asking if it now meant demolishing homes. He pointed out that addressing the issue of sewage entering the Musi River would require significant funding and demanded the state government provide a Detailed Project Report (DPR) for the project. Reddy stressed the importance of developing the Musi river basin without forcibly displacing poor communities.

BJP MP Konda Vishweshwar Reddy echoed these sentiments, stating that while the



BJP supports the beautification of Musi, rather than being simply evicted. Both it cannot accept the destruction of homes under the guise of development. He proposed that if residents consent to the demolitions, they should be compensated three times the value of their properties,

leaders emphasized that the focus of the Musi beautification project should be on cleaning the river and improving water quality, not on demolishing houses.

Nigeria to Honor PM Modi with 'GCON' Award


Nobody should take Rahul Gandhi seriously: Nitin Gadkari

Speaking to reporters in Lima, Peru, Ishiba explained that Trump's transition team informed him that meetings with foreign leaders prior to the president's inauguration were prohibited under the Logan Act.

The Logan Act, a US law dating back to 1799, restricts private citizens from engaging in unauthorized negotiations with foreign governments. While the law is rarely invoked, it has been cited in situations where unofficial diplomatic discussions could potentially interfere with US foreign policy or undermine official negotiations.

Ishiba had been hoping to meet with Trump as part of his visit to Peru, where he was attending the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) summit. However, due to the legal limitations surrounding the pre-inauguration period, his request was declined.

The decision not to meet with the president-elect underscores the delicate nature of diplomatic interactions during the transition period between US ad-

Two Flash Bombs Fired at Netanyahu's Home, No **Damage or Injuries Reported**



Two flash bombs were fired into the garden of Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's residence in Caesarea on Saturday, marking a disturbing escalation in security threats against the Israeli leader. According to a police statement, the bombs landed in the garden, but there were no injuries or damage. Neither Netanyahu nor his family members were present at the time of the attack, and the incident did not result in any immediate harm.

The attack occurred just a month after a drone strike targeted Netanyahu's residence, heightening concerns about the rising level of violence directed at prominent political figures in Israel. While the motives behind the flash bomb incident remain unclear, authorities are treating the event seriously and have launched an investigation.

Flash bombs, typically used to disorient or distract, are non-lethal devices that emit a bright flash and a loud sound, but they can cause significant shock and panic if deployed in populated areas. The fact that they were aimed at Netanyahu's private residence has raised alarm over the potential threat to his safety and the security of his family.Israeli police have cordoned off the area and are working with intelligence agencies to identify the perpetrators. US President Joe Biden and Chinese President Xi Jinping reached a significant agreement on Saturday, underscoring the critical need for human decision-making in the control of nuclear weapons, particularly in the context of advancing artificial intelligence (AI) technologies. The leaders emphasized that nuclear weapons decisions should remain under human control and highlighted the importance of developing military AI responsibly.

A statement from the White House affirmed that both leaders acknowledged the need for caution when integrating AI into military systems, stressing the potential risks and the necessity of prudent development. "The two leaders affirmed the need to maintain human control over the decision to use nuclear weapons," the statement read. "They also stressed the importance of carefully considering the risks associated with military AI technology."

This agreement marks a significant step in the ongoing discussions between the US and China on nuclear arms and artificial intelligence—two areas where diplomatic progress has been slow and fraught with challenges. The US has been pushing China to engage in nuclear arms control talks, but progress has been limited, particularly after the brief resumption of talks in November, which saw little substantive movement.

The US Defense Department estimates that China currently has approximately 500 operational nuclear warheads, with projections indicating that number could surpass 1,000 by 2030. This rapid expansion of China's nuclear capabilities, including advanced systems like hypersonic glide vehicles and nuclear-armed submarines, has raised concerns in Washington and among US allies, especially given the backdrop of global nuclear arms competition.

While China's nuclear stockpile remains far smaller than those of Russia (1,710 warheads) and the US (1,770 warheads), its modernized nuclear arsenal and military advancements have sparked fears of an arms race. Nevertheless, China maintains a policy of "no first use" and advocates for minimal deterrence.

The Biden administration had previously updated its nuclear posture earlier this year, expressing concerns about China's growing nuclear capabilities. While the Biden-Xi agreement is a positive development, it remains to be seen whether it will lead to further talks or concrete actions to address these complex and interconnected challenges.



North Korea's 'Noise Bombing' Terrorizes South Korean Village Near DMZ

Residents of Dangsan, a small village near the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) in South Korea, are enduring a new form of psychological warfare, as North Korea has ramped up its use of loudspeakers to broadcast disturbing sounds across the border. Since July, the loudspeakers have been blaring unsettling noises for up to 24 hours a day, replacing the traditional propaganda broadcasts with eerie sounds, from gonglike crashes to ghostly screams. Villagers have described the relentless barrage as "noise bombing," a constant, maddening assault that has disrupted their lives and made daily activities unbearable.

"It is driving us crazy," said one resident, speaking to *The New York Times*. "You can't sleep at night. It's bombing without shells." The constant noise, ranging from metallic grinding to howling wolves and artillery-like blasts, has caused widespread insomnia, headaches, and stress among the villagers, many of whom are elderly. Unlike the previous propaganda broadcasts, which included music and human voices, these new sounds serve no clear message and seem designed to irritate and unnerve. "At least the old broadcasts were human sounds we could bear," said another villager, reflecting on how tensions between the Koreas have evolved.

The sonic assault is part of a broader escalation in tensions between North and South Korea. With North Korean leader Kim Jong-un abandoning dialogue with South Korea and the United States, and South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol increasing military drills with allies, the two countries have become locked in a cycle of provocative actions. North Korea's new sound strategy follows a period of retaliation against South Korean broadcasts, which included sending balloons filled with trash in response to anti-Kim leaflets and resuming propaganda broadcasts of its own.





The goal is to create a calm and contemplative environment where visitors can lie in the coffins, take time to reflect on their lives, and think about their eventual passing.

Visitors can experience the coffin cafe for a fee of 2,200 yen (around \$14), and many have found it to be a powerful way to reflect on life's impermanence. The experi-



ence has drawn a variety of guests, including couples who take photos inside the coffins and others who choose to close the lid for a moment of personal reflection.

Kiyotaka Hirano, the president of Kajiya Honten, explained that the idea for the coffin cafe came from his own experience of losing his father unexpectedly at a young age. Revolutionary Or Deceptive? China's Robotic Fish Raise Eyebrows

Alife-size robot-ic whale shark at Xiaomeisha Sea World in Shenzhen has sparked controversy, with some visitors feeling deceived after paying the hefty entry fee of 230 yuan (around Rs 2,680). The artificial creature, which was introduced after the aquarium's reopening in October, has left a section of the public upset, as they expected to see a real whale shark in the water, not a mechanical replica.



Videos of the robotic whale shark gliding through the aquarium's tanks have been circulating online, showing the lifelike appearance of the creature. However, many visitors were taken aback to discover that it was not a living animal but a technologically advanced robot. Some expressed their dissatisfaction by posting complaints on Dazhong Dianping, a popular Chinese review platform, questioning the aquarium's authenticity and accusing it of misleading customers.

One disgruntled visitor wrote, "I cannot believe the whale shark is fake. It's outrageous to charge over 200 yuan for a ticket." Another commenter went as far as threatening to report the aquarium to authorities, saying, "I will have this place shut down for tricking people with a fake whale shark."

The incident has divided opinion, with some defending the aquarium's use of technology, arguing that

the robotic whale shark offers a unique experience for visitors. Proponents of the attraction note that the artificial shark is an impressive feat of engineering, capable of mimicking the movements of a real whale shark in a way that some find fascinating.

Despite the mixed reactions, the controversy has drawn attention to the growing trend of using artificial creatures in lieu of real marine life in aquariums. World's Longest Experiment Could Last Another Century

The *Pitch Drop Exper-**⊥** iment*, recognized by the Guinness World Records as the longest-running scientific experiment, is set to continue its slow march through time, potentially for another century. Held at the University of Queensland in Australia, this experiment, which has been ongoing since 1927, is an unusual demonstration of viscosity using a substance called pitch—a tar derivative known for being the world's thickest liquid.



Originally conceived by Australian physicist Thomas Parnell, the experiment aimed to measure the fluidity of pitch, which, despite appearing solid at room temperature, behaves like a thick, slow-moving liquid. Parnell poured a sample of pitch into a glass funnel and allowed it to cool and settle for three years before cutting the funnel's stem. Since then, the pitch has been dripping, but at an extraordinarily slow rate, dropping only nine times in almost a century. The next drop is expected sometime this decade.

The experiment, which was set up as a simple demonstration, has been left in a display cabinet at the university, where it is subject to the changing seasons and varying temperatures. These fluctuations impact the rate at which the pitch flows, making the drops even rarer. Over the years, the

experiment has become a source of fascination for both scientists and the public, particularly since no one has ever been present to witness the fall of a drop due to the unpredictable timing.

Professor John Mainstone took over as the custodian of the experiment in 1961, overseeing it for more than five decades until his death in 2013. Despite the slow pace, the experiment's findings have proven significant. Pitch, though brittle and solid-looking at room temperature, flows with a viscosity 100 billion times greater than that of water. Remarkably, there is still enough pitch in the funnel to keep the experiment running for another 100 years.

In 2005, Parnell (posthumously) and Mainstone received the Ig Nobel Prize, a satirical award that celebrates odd yet thought-provoking scientific research, for their work with the Pitch Drop Experiment.

Plastic waste could double by 2050, researchers find

Anew study has raised alarm over the growing plastic waste crisis, predicting that global plastic waste could double by 2050 unless urgent action is taken. However, the research also highlights that effective policies, including increasing the use of recycled plastics and investing in improved waste management systems, could significantly reduce plastic waste by more than 90% and cut related emissions by a third.

The study, conducted by a team of researchers, warns that without substantial changes, plastic waste could increase from 460 million tonnes today to more than 1 billion tonnes by mid-century. This dramatic rise is driven by the continued use of single-use plastics and insufficient recycling efforts worldwide. The researchers emphasized that plastic pollution is not only a waste issue but also a major environmental concern, contributing to ocean pollution, landfills, and harmful emissions.

To address the issue, the study suggests several key measures. One of the most impactful solutions would be to substantially increase the use of recycled plastics. By using more recycled materials in manufacturing, the demand for virgin plastics would decrease, leading to less waste. Another crucial strategy is improving global waste management infrastructure, particularly in developing countries where many plastics



end up in landfills or oceans due to inadequate disposal systems.

In addition, the study advocates for policies to reduce plastic consumption, such as bans on single-use plastics and incentives for companies to adopt circular economy practices, where products are designed for reuse and recycling. Governments, businesses, and consumers would need to work together to implement these strategies, with the potential to drastically reduce both plastic waste and the carbon footprint associated with plastic production.

By adopting these measures, the study concludes that the world could not only curb plastic waste but also significantly mitigate the environmental damage caused by plastic production and disposal. The researchers stressed that immediate and coordinated action is necessary to prevent the crisis from worsening over the next few decades.
