Rajya Sabha By-Elections Scheduled for **Vacancies in Four States, Including AP**

TPN, Andhra Pradesh: The Central Election Commission (CEC) has announced the schedule for by-elections to fill six vacant Rajya Sabha seats across four states, including Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, West Bengal, and Haryana. The vacancies have arisen due to resignations from the Upper House.

According to the schedule released by the CEC, the notification for the by-elections will be issued on December 3, with the last date for filing nominations set for December 10. Scrutiny of the nominations will take place tions is December 13.

Polling for the by-elections is scheduled for December 20. Vot-



ing will take place from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., followed by the counting of votes on the same day.

Minister Durgesh Highlights the Importance of Preserving the Constitution

TPN, Amaravati: State Tourism, Culture, and Cinematography Minister Kandula Durgesh emphasized the critical role of safeguarding the Constitution in shaping the country's future during Constitution Day celebrations in Amaravati on Tuesday. Deep Technology Building in Amaravati on the Lines of Hi-Tech City

TPN, Amaravati: The Andhra Pradesh government is set to build a Deep Technology iconic building in Amaravati, inspired by the success of Hyderabad's Hi-Tech City. Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu directed officials to initiate proposals for the project during a review meeting on the new IT policy held today.

Highlighting the transformative impact of Hi-Tech City on Hyderabad's IT sector, Chandrababu stated that deep technology and artificial intelligence represent the future. He emphasized the importance of leveraging the opportunities provided by deep technology and announced plans for the construction of a dedicated Deep Technology building in Amaravati.

The review meeting was attended by IT Minister Nara Lokesh, who supported the Chief Minister's vision for advancing Andhra Pradesh's IT infrastructure.

Dy CM Pawan Kalyan Comments on RGV Absconding Issue

TPN, Delhi: Deputy Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, Pawan Kalyan, who is currently in Delhi on a political mission to meet Union Ministers and discuss state matters, faced an intriguing line of questioning from the Telugu media about the ongoing Ram Gopal Varma (RGV) absconding controversy.

When asked why the Andhra Pradesh police have been unable to apprehend RGV, despite accusations of sharing offensive morphed images targeting prominent leaders, Pawan offered a measured response. The reporter highlighted how the police, known for their efficiency during the previous YSRCP regime, appear less effective now, using the RGV case as a prime example.

Pawan, taken aback by the observation, remarked, "That's an interesting perspective. However, as I am not the Home Minister, my domain lies in the Panchayat Ministry. Questions regarding the police department are best addressed by the Chief Minister or the Home Minister." He assured the media that he would bring this feedback to the cabinet for discussion.

The media further pointed out another troubling issue: the individual accused of pelting stones at former Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu during the Nandigam incident has reportedly been released and is back in public. Pawan acknowledged the concern, vowing to raise the matter with the cabinet.

The controversy has drawn attention to RGV, who remains elusive despite serious accusations. During the YSRCP's rule, RGV had stirred outrage by posting objectionable content about Chandrababu Naidu, Pawan Kalyan, and Nara Lokesh. While efforts to locate him continue, RGV appears to be evading capture with ease,



sparking further criticism of the current government's handling of such cases.

Pawan's responses reflect his intention to address these issues within the government while emphasizing his focus on the responsibilities of his own ministry.



His anticipatory bail petition was earlier rejected by the AP High Court. A special leave petition was subsequently filed in the Supreme Court, but it was also dismissed. The rejection of these petitions cleared the way for Vijaypal's arrest.

Heavy Rains Predicted Across AP as Cyclonic Storm Intensifies



TPN, Andhra Pradesh: The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has predicted heavy rainfall in several districts of Andhra Pradesh over the next 24-48 hours as a depression in the southwest Bay of Bengal intensifies into a severe cyclonic storm.

As of Tuesday, the storm is centered 310 km southeast of Trincomalee, 590 km south-southeast of Nagapattinam, 710 km south-southeast of Puducherry, and 800 km south-southeast of Chennai. The system is moving north-northwestwards at a speed of 12 km per hour and is expected to develop into a cyclonic storm by Wednesday. The IMD forecasts that it will approach the coasts of Sri Lanka and Tamil Nadu over the next two days.

In Andhra Pradesh, heavy rains are anticipated in districts such as Nellore and Tirupati within the next 24 hours, while moderate to heavy rains are expected in Annayyamma, Prakasam, Chittoor, and other Rayalaseema and South Coastal districts over the next 48 hours. Northern coastal districts could also experience moderate to heavy rains starting November 30. Additionally, strong winds ranging from 35 to 45 kilometers per hour are likely along the south coast.

Fishermen have been advised against venturing into the sea from November 27 to November 29, and a danger signal No. 1 warning has been issued across all state ports.

In light of these developments, Andhra Pradesh State Disaster Management Authority (APSDMA) Managing Director Ronanki Kurmanath has urged district collectors to implement precautionary measures. Farmers are advised to take necessary precautions during paddy harvesting and other agricultural activities. With heavy rains and strong winds predicted, authorities are on high alert to mitigate potential risks and ensure the safety of residents.

Lokesh Slams IPS Officers' Absence at Constitution Day Event

TPN, Amaravati: AP Minister Nara Lokesh proposed that the Indian Constitution should be made understandable to children. He announced plans to provide a simplified version of the Constitution to every student starting next year. The 75th Constitution Day celebration was held at the AP Secretariat, with Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu and other ministers in attendance.

Speaking on the occasion, Lokesh stated that the people of India attained true independence on November 26, 1949, with the adoption of the Constitution. He emphasized the importance of remembering the framers of the Constitution and highlighted the need to make it accessible to everyone, including children, as they represent the future of India.

Minister Kandula Durgesh remarked that the Constitution has established India as a sovereign republic on the global stage. He stressed the shared responsibility of all citizens to uphold and implement the principles enshrined in the Constitution effectively. Nara Lokesh, Andhra Pradesh Minister, has expressed dissatisfaction with the conduct of IPS officers, a sentiment he had previously voiced during the YSRCP regime. Despite his party now being in power, Lokesh remains critical of their behavior. At the Constitution Day celebrations attended by Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu and senior IAS officers, the absence of IPS officers drew sharp remarks from Lokesh, who revealed that he had already

He informed the media that he had brought the matter to the CM's attention, pointing out that only IAS officers had attended while IPS officers were notably absent.

TPN, Delhi: Deputy Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, Pawan Kalyan, spent an eventful day in Delhi, holding a series of impactful meetings with Union Ministers and dignitaries to address critical issues related to Andhra Pradesh's development.

In his first meeting, Pawan Kalyan met Union Minister for Culture and Tourism, Gajendra Singh Shekhawat, to discuss advancing Andhra Pradesh's tourism sector. He sought central assistance for developing temple, eco-tourism, adventure, and heritage tourism. Key proposals included approval for iconic tourism centers at Gandikota, Akhanda Godavari, and Suryalanka under SASCI; new circuits under Swadesh Darshan 2.0; PRASHAD projects for Arsavalli and Mangalagiri; and the establishment of Paryatak Bhavan in Amaravati. He also advocated for Blue Flag Beach certifications and a National Tourism University in Andhra Pradesh. Later, Pawan Kalyan met Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman to discuss the Andhra Pradesh Rural Roads Project (APR-RP). He emphasized the need for extending the project timeline to December 2026 and restructuring the funding pattern to 90:10 (AIIB:GoAP), while retaining AIIB's \$455 million commitment. He stressed that this proj-



ect is critical for enhancing rural connectivity and infrastructure development.

Forensic Report Clears Gudlavalleru College of Hidden Camera Allegations

TPN, Gudlavalleru: Allegations of hidden cameras in the ladies' hostel bathrooms of Gudlavalleru Engineering College sparked outrage, leading to a student protest on August 29. The students claimed that cameras were allegedly embedded in the showerheads, with videos purportedly being shared on social media.

However, a recent forensic investigation has debunked these claims. Superintendent of Police R. Gangadhar Rao announced on Monday that the Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) report and expert analysis confirmed that no hidden cameras were installed in the hostel bathrooms.

During the investigation, police interrogated several individuals, including suspects, social media influencers, and students. After thorough questioning and analysis, it was concluded that no unauthorized recording devices were found, nor was any compromising video footage uploaded or shared from the college premises. District Collector D.K. Balaji also addressed the concerns, assuring students and parents that there was no cause for alarm. "We seized and analyzed nine laptops, 14 mobile phones, and one tablet as part of the investigation. The FSL scientists thoroughly examined these gadgets and found no evidence of hidden cameras or inappropriate video content," Balaji stated.





Gadde Rammohan Rao Criticizes YCP **Govt Over Dalit Sub-Plan Neglect**

TPN, Vijayawada: MLA Gadde Rammohan Rao has strongly criticized the YSRCP government for neglecting the Dalit sub-plan scheme and undermining its importance. He was speaking at the foundation stone laying ceremony of Ambedkar Bhavan in Vijayawada East constituency.

Gadde Rammohan Rao's Remarks:

Rammohan Rao pointed out that the SC sub-plan was brought into law by Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu. He claimed that the current

Chief Minister YS Jaganmohan Reddy failed to understand the significance of the sub-plan, which has affected its implementation.

YS Sharmila Slams BJP and YSRCP, Demands Action Over **Alleged Adani Bribery**

TPN, Andhra Pradesh: AP Congress President YS Sharmila launched a scathing attack on the BJP and YS-RCP during a media conference held on Tuesday in Vijayawada. Leading a march titled "Bharat Rajyarangam March" from the Congress office to the Ambedkar statue on MG Road, Sharmila accused the BJP of undermining democratic values and the Constitution of India while also targeting YS Jagan Mohan Reddy over allegations of bribery involving

Sharmila emphasized Congress's role in the creation and preservation of the Constitution, stating, "Democracy is alive because of the Indian

Constitution. Congress has always carried the Constitution on its shoulders, whether in power or not." She praised former CM YS Rajasekhar Reddy's legacy and expressed pride in his contributions as a Congress leader.

Accusing the BJP of imposing its own version of the Constitution, she said, "The BJP, under Narendra Modi, is trampling on people's rights, silencing dissent, and manipulating institutions like the Election Commission. States where BJP is not in power are being unjustly treated."

Sharmila criticized PM Modi's unfulfilled promises to Andhra Pradesh, including special status, accusing him of betraying the state for the past decade. She also demanded a caste census to ensure justice for all communities.



Targeting YS Jagan, Sharmila said, "MLAs are constitutionally obligated to represent the people in the Assembly. If they fail, they should resign. Bribery allegations involving Jagan and Adani have been confirmed by US investigative agencies. Why hasn't the BJP-led central government ordered a CBI or ED investigation? This is because the BJP protects its allies, including Jagan and Chandrababu Naidu."

Sharmila further called for the cancellation of agreements allegedly burdening the state with ₹1.5 lakh crores and demanded a Joint Parliamentary Committee probe into the ₹1,750 crore bribery allegations. She declared Congress's commitment to fighting for justice alongside Rahul Gandhi, ensuring the protection of the Indian Constitution.

TJR Sudhakar Babu Criticized Govt for Undermining Dalit Rights

TPN, Andhra Pradesh: סוסהונטנו On Tuesday, media conference at Ycp Central Office Tadepalli, TJR Sudhakar Babu, president of the YSRCP SC/ ST Cell, criticized the Telugu Desam Party (TD-P)-led coalition government, accusing it of neglecting Dalit rights and democracy. He alleged

Curious about what Saudi Arabia is remid-2018. ally like, I decided to explore the country firsthand in early November, taking advantage of a newly launched direct route between Hong Kong and Riyadh. The connection between these two financial hubs has been strengthening recently, with both nations deepening economic ties, investing in each other, and offering exchange-traded funds on their respective stock exchanges. Cathay Pacific Airways, for instance, began flying direct routes late last month, signaling growing international interest in the region.

Before embarking on the trip, my friend and I spent considerable time worrying about what to wear, anxious that we might be stopped on the street for not adhering to the conservative dress code. We were also slightly apprehensive about the road trip ahead, given that women were only granted

Once we arrived, however, our conwarmly welcomed its visitors, and we found ourselves blending in just as easily as we would in other cosmopolitan cities like Abu Dhabi or Dubai. Surprisingly, we didn't encounter the much-feared religious police, which had been a significant symbol of strictness in the past. The atmosphere felt relatively relaxed and modern, far from the oppressive environment some might expect.

Our exploration took us to Medina, where we unwittingly wandered into the courtyard of the Prophet's Mosque, a sacred space reserved for Muslims. When a policeman kindly informed us of the mistake, his tone was apologetic, and we were quickly escorted out without issue.

By-Election Results Show Favorable Trend for Ruling Parties

The recent by-elections in 46 seats across 13 states have shown a trend of favoring the ruling parties, a pattern similar to previous Assembly elections in Haryana, Maharashtra, and Jharkhand. By-elections often favor incumbent governments, and this time, the trend seems even more pronounced.

The overall results have been politically challenging for the Congress and the I.N.D.I.A. bloc, even though there were some gains in individual states. For instance, Congress lost three sitting seats to the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), but it did manage to take one seat from the AAP in Punjab. Similarly, the I.N.D.I.A. bloc, which includes the Congress, lost three seats, including an RJD stronghold, to the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) in Bihar.

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) performed well in states where it is in power, particularly in Uttar Pradesh (UP), Rajasthan, and Assam. The victory in UP is particularly significant for the BJP, as the state had been a major factor in its loss of majority in the 2019 Lok Sabha elections. The party had faced setbacks in the state, leading to questions about Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's leadership.

However, the by-election results in UP were a confidence booster for the BJP, as it won six out of the nine seats contested. This is a major improvement compared to the four seats it previously held. In contrast, the Samajwadi Party (SP), which had performed well in the Lok Sabha elections, managed to win only two out of the nine seats it contested in the state.

Overall, the by-election results suggest that ruling parties, especially the BJP, are maintaining their political dominance, while the opposition struggles to make significant inroads. This outcome will likely influence the political landscape in the run-up to future elections.

The Adani Saga: A Global **Scrutiny of Business Ethics and Leadership**



Business history, much like any other, is marked by both triumphs and disasters. On one hand, businesses continuously innovate, making our lives better. On the other, there are instances when companies engage in practices that tarnish their reputation. In such moments, business leaders often find themselves at a crossroads, having to defend their credibility and chart a way forward. These challenges can define a legacy of moral leadership and provide valuable lessons for future generations.

The Indian business world is currently at a significant juncture, with the ongoing controversy surrounding the Adani Group. Despite various allegations, Indian courts and the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) have yet to take definitive action. This has raised concerns about the effectiveness of local regulatory frameworks in addressing serious charges.

Interestingly, the issue has attracted the attention of U.S. authorities, who have recently indicted top leaders of the Adani Group for bribery. While U.S. regulators, including the Securities and Ex-

change Commission (SEC), did not find any wrongdoing within the U.S., they have alleged violations based on the company's practices outside the U.S., notably in India. This stark contrast between the actions of Indian and U.S. authorities raises important questions about accountability and the application of regulations across borders.

The case first emerged in March 2023, yet Indian regulators and courts have not taken significant action, leaving the allegations largely unaddressed. The fact that U.S. authorities have identified issues when Indian bodies did not is puzzling. How is it that foreign regulators have uncovered potential wrongdoing, while local agencies have failed to do so?

This discrepancy underscores the growing global scrutiny of business practices and calls into question the transparency and effectiveness of India's regulatory framework. As the saga unfolds, it highlights the need for robust business ethics and stronger leadership to restore credibility and trust in the business environment.

The Road Ahead for the Democratic Party: Will They Learn from Defeat?

If you think the second stunning loss to Donald Trump - Donald Trump, no less – will push the Democratic Party to re-evaluate its approach to voters, you might be in for disappointment. These explanations can make it difficult for the party to identify a clear and actionable plan for change.

> In the end, multiple setbacks may be necessary before the Democratic Party truly confronts its weaknesses and changes its course. The fact remains that unless they experience a series of crushing defeats or an ongoing trend of losing, it's unlikely they will adopt a new direction that truly resonates with the American electorate. Until then, voters may continue to find themselves stuck with the same party strategies, regardless of how well or poorly they align with their needs.



"Don't Want EVMs, We Want Ballot Paper": Kharge After Maharashtra Loss

Smarting from Congress' crushing defeat in Maharashtra, following a similar loss in Haryana, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge voiced strong opposition to the use of Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) and called for a return to the traditional ballot paper system. Speaking at the 'Samvidhan Rakshak Abhiyaan' event at Talkatora Stadium in Delhi, the 82-year-old leader expressed his frustration with the current voting mechanism.

"We should all unite and move forward together and push them aside," Kharge said, referring to EVMs. "I do not wish to dwell on elections, but I will say this — the votes of the poor and oppressed communities are being wasted. They should demand voting by ballot paper," he added. Kharge's comments came on the heels of Congress's disappointing performance in the recent state elections, where the party was left questioning the integrity of the election process.



Kharge's call for a return to ballot

paper voting is significant, considering the ongoing debate around the reliability and transparency of EVMs in India. "Let them keep the EVMs, but we don't want them. We want voting on ballot paper," Kharge asserted, emphasizing that a return to the paper-based system would better reflect the true position of the voters.

Interestingly, Kharge's comments come on the same day the Supreme Court dismissed a petition requesting a return to ballot paper voting, reinforcing the legal standing of EVMs in the electoral process. Despite this, Kharge pushed for a nationwide movement to bring back ballot paper voting, likening it to the scale of Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Yatra.

"We should start this campaign from our party to make everyone aware that they should demand the return of ballot papers," Kharge suggested. He further urged Rahul Gandhi to lead such a movement, stating, "We should begin a campaign like the Bharat Jodo Yatra to bring back ballot papers."

Kharge's call reflects the deep frustration within Congress after recent electoral setbacks and highlights the party's growing skepticism about EVMs.

CM Atishi Accuses Modi Govt of Manipulating Delhi Electoral Rolls

Delhi Chief Minister Atishi accused the central government of attempting to manipulate the upcoming Delhi Assembly elections by removing Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) supporters from the electoral rolls. Addressing a press conference on Tuesday, Atishi alleged that the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) was using unfair tactics to secure a victory in the elections, fearing a defeat in the capital.

"The central government is trying to win the Delhi elections through unfair means. They are orchestrating the removal of voters from the electoral rolls, particularly those who are aligned with AAP," Atishi claimed. However, the BJP did not immediately respond to the allegations.



Atishi pointed to an order issued on October 28 by the Lieutenant Gover-

nor of Delhi, which transferred 29 Sub-Divisional Magistrates (SDMs), as the first step in this alleged plot. She suggested that the transfers were part of a larger strategy to influence the election process.

Additionally, Atishi accused a District Magistrate (DM) overseeing seven assembly constituencies of instructing officials to remove 20,000 voters from the rolls. She argued that this action was part of an effort to disenfranchise voters who were likely to support AAP in the upcoming polls.

The claims by Atishi have sparked concerns about the integrity of the election process, with AAP asserting that these actions are an attempt to tilt the electoral landscape in favor of the BJP. The allegations come ahead of the crucial Delhi Assembly elections, which are expected to be closely contested.



CM MK Stalin reviews cyclone preparedness in Tamil Nadu's Delta districts

Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin chaired an urgent meeting at the Secretariat on November 26 to assess the state's preparedness for the impending cyclonic storm 'Fengal,' predicted by the India Meteorological Department (IMD) to form from a deep depression over the Southwest Bay of Bengal by November 27. The meeting was attended by senior ministers, government officials, and district collectors from the Cauvery Delta region, which is expected to bear the brunt of the storm.

The Delta districts of Thanjavur, Tiruvarur, Nagapattinam, Myladuthurai, Tiruchirappalli, Perambalur, Pudukottai, and Cuddalore are likely to experience heavy rain and strong winds over the next few days. In light of this, Chief Minister Stalin instructed officials to ensure that relief centres are ready and that residents from vulnerable, low-lying areas are evacuated to safety ahead of the storm. He stressed the importance of safeguarding lives, property, and livelihoods, and minimising disruption to normal life.

Stalin also directed that precautionary measures be taken to protect agricultural crops from the potential damage caused by the heavy rains and strong winds. In addition, he urged for uninterrupted electricity supply in the affected areas and asked for quick coordination among relevant departments to address any power outages or other emergencies.

District collectors from the Delta region assured the Chief Minister that adequate relief camps were in place in their respective areas. Multi-departmental teams, medical units, and essential equipment such as boats, JCB machines, generators, motor pumps, and woodcutters were also mobilised for emergency response.

As part of the state's preparedness, teams from the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) and the National Disaster Re-

Kesarkar further stated that Shinde had already communicated to senior BJP leaders that whatever decision they make regarding the next CM would be acceptable to him. This ongoing uncertainty underscores the power dynamics at play within the Mahayuti alliance, as it navigates internal divisions despite its overwhelming electoral success.

As Maharashtra's political landscape continues to evolve, all eyes remain on the BJP leadership, which is expected to finalize the choice for the new Chief Minister in the coming days.





External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar recently shared his views on global issues in an interview with Italian daily *Corriere della Sera* while attending the G7 meeting in Fiuggi, Italy. During the discussion, Jaishankar emphasized the importance of India's relationship with Italy, particularly in terms of its engagement with the European Union (EU), which remains India's largest trade partner and a significant investor. He also highlighted the Joint Strategic Action Plan, announced by the Prime Ministers of India and Italy, as a key step in strengthening bilateral ties.

Jaishankar noted the complexities in EU-India trade relations, particularly with the EU's tendency to introduce non-trade issues in negotiations. He explained that these additional considerations make negotiations more challenging than typical free trade agreements (FTAs). Despite these challenges, Jaishankar stressed the importance of continued cooperation between India and the EU on trade matters.

On the topic of India's purchase of discounted oil from Russia, Jaishankar defended the decision, arguing that every country has its own strategic interests. "If everything is a matter of deep principle, then Europe itself



should have cut off all its business with Russia, but it doesn't do that," he pointed out. He further stressed that nations must consider how their actions will impact their interests, suggesting that such decisions are not always as clear-cut as they may seem.

Turning to the ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict, Jaishankar emphasized the importance of diplomacy in resolving the crisis. He reiterated that a solution will not come from the battlefield and stressed the need for negotiation. "At some stage, people will come to the table. The sooner they do it, the better, because the rest of the world is affected," Jaishankar said. India, he noted, is actively engaging with both sides in an effort to mediate and encourage dialogue.

Jaishankar also highlighted the global stress caused by ongoing conflicts, urging nations not to be passive observers but to take initiative in finding common ground, particularly in Ukraine and West Asia, to move toward a more peaceful and stable world order.

Nepal PM Clarifies No Loan Agreement with China During Upcoming Visit

Nepal Prime Minister KP Sharma Oli is set to embark on a five-day visit to China on December 2, but he has made it clear that no loan agreements will be signed during the trip. His statement comes amid growing speculation within Nepal's ruling coalition about the signing of Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) projects involving loan components.

During a recent meeting with former prime ministers and foreign ministers, Oli emphasized that the BRI deal with China was not a loan-based agreement. He dismissed concerns about taking loans from China, asserting that Nepal would only seek loans or grants based on its national interests and needs, and that such decisions would not be influenced by rumors. "We should not be swayed by baseless rumors that loans are being taken to entrap the country," he said.

Oli also reassured that Nepal's sovereignty, independence, and national welfare would remain top priorities in his foreign policy decisions. He underscored that Nepal's international relations would be guided by a commitment to global welfare alongside national interests.

Oli's comments come at a time when there is internal disagreement within

Nepal's ruling coalition. While the Nepali Congress, led by Sher Bahadur Deuba, favors receiving grants from China as part of the BRI, the Communist Party of Nepal-Unified Marxist Leninist (CPN-UML), led by Oli, is more inclined to pursue loans under the same initiative.

The visit to China is a significant departure from the tradition of newly elected Nepali leaders visiting India first, which has typically been seen as a gesture of goodwill toward Nepal's southern neighbor. However, the Prime Minister's office has justified this shift, stating that the visit to Beijing was scheduled recently and that India had not yet extended an official invitation to PM Oli.

"Urge Bangladesh To Ensure Minorities' Safety": India On **Arrest Of Hindu Priest**

India has strongly condemned the arrest of Chinmoy Krishna Das Brahmachari, a Hindu priest and leader of the religious minority community in Bangladesh, following his detention at Dhaka airport on Monday. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) expressed deep concern over the incident and called on Bangladeshi authorities to ensure the safety and security of Hindus and other minority groups in the country.

Chandan Kumar Dhar, known as Chinmoy Krishna Das Brahmachari, is a prominent former leader of the International Society for Krishna Consciousness (ISKCON) in

Bangladesh. He was also the spokesperson for the Bangladesh Sammilit Sanatan Jagran Jote, a platform advocating for the rights of Hindus and other religious minorities. On Tuesday, a Dhaka court denied him bail, further escalating concerns over his arrest.

In its statement, the MEA expressed its deep concern

about the arrest and the denial of bail, linking it to a broader pattern of attacks against Hindus and other minorities in Bangladesh. "This incident follows multiple attacks on Hindus and other minorities by extremist elements in Bangladesh," the Ministry stated, emphasizing the growing vulnerability of these communities.







Indian Rupee Strengthens Amid Regional Gains and MSCI Rebalancing



The Indian rupee surged to its strongest level in over two weeks on Monday, bolstered by a rebound in regional currencies and expected dollar inflows linked to MSCI's equity index rebalancing. As of 11:00 a.m. IST, the rupee was trading at 84.30, up 0.1% from its previous close of 84.4450, marking its highest value since November 7.

The local currency had recently touched an all-time low of 84.5075, prompting intervention by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). However, a pullback in the dollar index and U.S. Treasury yields provided some respite on Monday. The dollar index fell by 0.5% to 106.9, while the 10-year U.S. Treasury yield dropped by 6 basis points to 4.35%.

Markets gained confidence following U.S. President-elect Donald Trump's nomination of veteran investor Scott Bessent as Treasury Secretary, which contributed to the dollar's decline. Meanwhile, most Asian currencies saw gains, with the Korean won leading the pack, appreciating by 0.4%.

The rupee also benefitted from dollar sales by at least two major foreign banks, likely acting on behalf of custodial clients, according to a trader at a state-run bank. The rupee's rise was further supported by anticipated passive inflows into Indian equities, estimated to be around \$2.5 billion, driven by MSCI's equity index rebalancing, which was set to take effect after market close on Monday.

Despite the rupee's recent strength, it has faced significant pressure in recent months, requiring frequent RBI interventions to avoid sharp depreciation. These interventions, along with valuation losses, have contributed to India's foreign exchange reserves falling to a four-month low of \$657.89 billion as of November 15.

The rupee's recovery on Monday, aided by favorable regional trends and MSCI-related inflows, provided some relief after a period of volatility. However, the currency's future performance will continue to depend on global economic developments and ongoing RBI actions.

 $\mathbf{N}^{ ext{TPC}}$ Green Energy Limited (NGEL) has established a 50:50 joint venture (JV) with Maharashtra State Power Generation Company Limited (MAHAGENCO) to develop, operate, and maintain renewable energy parks in Maharashtra. The announcement was made through a filing with the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE) on Tuesday, November 26.

The newly formed joint venture is named Mahagenco NTPC Green Energy Private Limited (MNGEPL). According to the filing, MNGEPL will focus on the development of renewable ener- state. gy parks in Maharashtra under the Umbrella Scheme for Renewable Energy Parks (UMREPP), and will be responsible for allotting parks for the development of renewable energy projects in the



NTPC Green Energy is a wholly-owned subsidiary of NTPC Ltd, a state-run energy giant, while MAHAGENCO is a government-owned entity

controlled by the Government of Maharashtra. The partnership between these two entities will enable the state to harness renewable energy As part of the joint venture's formation, NTPC more effectively, aligning with India's renewable energy goals.

This JV comes just ahead of the initial public offering (IPO) of NTPC Green Energy, scheduled to launch on November 27. The IPO has already shown strong demand, with the Qualified Institutional Buyers (QIBs) and retail investor segments fully subscribed during the three-day public subscription. The QIBs subscribed 3.32 times the shares offered, while retail investors over-subscribed their portion by 3.44 times. However, the Non-Institutional Investor (NII) segment subscribed to only 81% of the shares on

offer, according to BSE data.

Green Energy has acquired 50,000 equity shares at a face value of ₹10 per share in MNGEPL, holding a 50% equity stake in the venture. The announcement regarding the JV was made after market hours on Tuesday, and NTPC Ltd's stock closed 1.90% lower at ₹361.65.

The partnership between NTPC Green Energy and MAHAGENCO is a significant step towards accelerating the development of renewable energy infrastructure in Maharashtra, and is expected to contribute to the state's growing renewable energy capacity.

Scientists Find Possible Flaw in Einstein's Theory of Space-Time



Arecent study by researchers from the Universities of Geneva and Toulouse has uncovered a small inconsistency in the predictions made by Albert Einstein's general theory of relativity, suggesting potential limitations in our understanding of the universe's expansion.

For over a century, Einstein's general relativity has been a cornerstone of modern physics. However, this new research challenges the theory's ability to fully explain certain cosmic phenomena. The study, which focused on the universe's accelerating expansion—a discovery made 25 years ago—indicates some discrepancies between Einstein's predictions and actual observations during various cosmic epochs.

Researchers from the University of Geneva and Toulouse III - Paul Sabatier analyzed data from the Dark Energy Survey to explore the accelerated expansion of the universe. Their findings, published in *Nature Communications*, revealed subtle variances that could point to issues with Einstein's equations, particularly in the context of extrasolar events. While these discrepancies do not directly disprove Einstein's theory, they suggest that there may be gaps in our

understanding of space-time and dark energy.

The study's authors examined the evolution of the Weyl potential using the first three years of data from the Dark Energy Survey. Their results have sparked fresh debates in the scientific community about the limitations of general relativity and the forces that drive the universe's expansion.

According to Einstein's theory, the fabric of space-time is curved by the presence of mass, creating gravitational wells. These wells bend the path of light, a phenomenon known as "gravitational lensing," which can be observed as light from distant stars or galaxies appears to change direction as it passes near massive celestial bodies. While this effect has been widely observed, the new study's results suggest that there might be unknown factors influencing cosmic expansion that general relativity has yet to account for.

This groundbreaking research could lead to new insights into the nature of dark energy and spacetime, and further examination may provide a clearer understanding of the universe's mysterious acceleration.

Ancient Fish-Trapping System Uncovered in Belize



An extensive fish-trapping net-work, believed to be over 4,000 years old, has been uncovered in Belize, offering new insights into how the ancient Maya civilization sustained its growing communities. The discovery reveals how the Maya engineered a complex system of ponds and earthen channels to channel fish and other aquatic species into controlled areas, securing vital food resources. This system is thought to have supported the nutritional needs of up to 15,000 individuals annually, contributing to the development of early Maya settlements.

The groundbreaking research, published in *Science Advances* on November 22, was led by archaeologist Eleanor Harrison-Buck from the University of New Hampshire. Using advanced remote sensing techniques, the team identified 167 shallow channels and nearly 60 ponds in Belize's Crooked Tree Wildlife Sanctuary. These features were mapped during the 2017 dry season, and the study suggests they were originally constructed by local hunter-gatherers around 4,200 to 3,900 years ago, during a period of drought. This environmental shift prompted the community to adapt by moving away from a maize-based diet to one that included fish, turtles, mollusks, waterfowl, and amaranth seeds.

The fish-trapping system was in use from approximately 3,200 to 1,800 years ago, a time when larger Maya urban and ceremonial centres were emerging. One of the channels identified by the team connects directly to the Maya centre of Chau Hiix, indicating that the system played an important role in feeding nearby populations.

Ongoing research will focus on further excavation of pre-Maya settlements in the area and the exploration of additional canal systems in Belizean wetlands and southern Mexico. This discovery highlights how early human societies modified their environments to ensure food security, ultimately supporting the growth of the Maya civilization. The research sheds light on the resource management strategies that helped sustain large populations and facilitated the rise of complex societies.

Team India Regains Top Spot in World Test Championship

Team India has reclaimed the top position in the World Test Championship (WTC) standings (2023-25) after a comprehensive 295-run victory over Australia in the Test match held in Perth. With this win, India has taken a 1-0 lead in the five-Test series. Australia, which held the top spot prior to this match, has now slipped to second place. In the updated WTC standings, Sri Lanka holds fourth place with 55.56 percent, followed by New Zealand at 54.55 percent, and South Africa at 54.17 percent, completing the top five.

With this victory, India is on a strong trajectory in the World Test Championship, reaffirming its dominance in Test cricket.






