Warangal Airport to Be Completed Under AAI Supervision Feasibility Studies Planned for Peddapalli and Bhadradri Kothagudem

Strategic Importance of Adilabad Airport Highlighted Centre Assures Full Support for Telangana's Aviation Plans



TPN, New Delhi: In a positive development for Telangana, Union Minister for Civil Aviation Rammohan Naidu announced full cooperation in the establishment and development of airports across the state. The announcement came after Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy met the Union Minister in Delhi on Tuesday, accompanied by Deputy CM Bhatti Vikramarka, Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy, and other officials.

During the meeting, CM Revanth Reddy discussed the need for multiple airports in Telangana to enhance connectivity and boost regional development. Minister Rammohan Naidu assured that the Centre would provide full support to this initiative and revealed plans to expedite the completion of Warangal

The Union Minister stated that feasibility studies would be conducted for airports proposed in Peddapalli, Bhadradri Kothagudem, and Adilabad districts. He added that if the feasibility reports for Bhadradri Kothagudem and Peddapalli are positive, the process of land acquisition would commence. Regarding Adilabad Airport, which falls under the purview of another department, Naidu assured that necessary approvals would pave the way for its development. He emphasized the

strategic importance of Adilabad Airport, situated near the borders of Chhattisgarh and Maharashtra, and its potential benefits for the region.

TPN , Hyderabad: Telangana IT Minister central government's Defense Department and BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) launched a scathing attack on Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, accusing him of making baseless allegations and misleading the public over projects tied to industrialist Gautam Adani. Speaking at a media conference in Hyderabad, KTR criticized Revanth Reddy for attributing central government projects to state initiatives and questioned his understanding of governance.

KTR claimed that former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) had previously rejected proposals from Adani, contrary to Revanth Reddy's allegations of collusion. "When we showed Adani the red signal, Revanth Reddy rolled out the red carpet," he said.

Dismissing Revanth Reddy's recent press statements as "disappointing and apathetic," KTR alleged that the Chief Minister was engaging in false propaganda. He accused Revanth of attempting to mislead the public by claiming that projects granted by the

were facilitated by his administration. "What is Rajnath Singh doing if these are state-granted projects?" KTR questioned, adding that such statements undermine public trust.

KTR also criticized Revanth Reddy for allegedly hosting a secret meeting with Adani, contrasting it with his own transparent engagements with global investors, such as Microsoft. He called it "ridiculous" for the Chief Minister to conflate a Microsoft data center with an Adani project, asserting that Revanth's lack of subject knowledge diminishes Telangana's reputation.

Highlighting a past incident, KTR reminded the public that Revanth Reddy himself had shared a photo of his meeting with Adani during the World Economic Forum in Davos. He alleged that unlike Revanth's private discussions, his own dealings were above board.



The BRS leader further criticized Revanth for neglecting grassroots concerns, mentioning the alleged suicide of a former sarpanch in Kondareddypalli who had supported Revanth's election. KTR labeled Revanth Reddy as a "sadistic Chief Minister" who prioritizes personal gains over public welfare.

The fiery remarks underline the growing tension between the BRS and Congress leadership as political rivalries intensify in Telangana.

Major Drug Racket Busted in Yadagirigutta

Ephedrine Manufacturing Uncovered at Yadadri Chemical Factory Police Seize Drugs Worth ₹24 Crores at Toll Plaza Key Accused Arrested; Search On for Five Fugitives



TPN, Yadagirigutta: A massive drug racket operating out of the Sri Yadadri Life Sciences Chemical Factory in Ramajipet, Yadagirigutta Mandal, has been uncovered by the Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district police. A total of 120 kg of narcotics, valued at approximately ₹24 crores, was seized, and three accused have been taken into custody. The gang was intercepted at the Gudur Toll Plaza in Bibinagar Mandal while transporting 100 kg of Ephedrine, a dangerous narcotic, from Yadagirigutta to Hyderabad. Following the

arrest, inspections at the factory led to the discovery of an additional 20 kg of the drug.

However, many of them, in critical condition, were transferred to the Maktal Government Hospital for further treatment. This is the third such incident in the same school within a week, sparking outrage among parents and locals. They criticized the authorities for their failure to ensure food safety in government schools, calling the repeated cases of food poisoning unacceptable.

BRS leader and former minister Harish Rao expressed serious concerns over the incident. He pointed out that it is alarming to see 100 students falling ill within ten days due to food poisoning in schools and Gurukuls across the state. He criticized the Congress government for its inaction and negligence, stating that the Chief Minister's earlier promises to ensure food safety and penalize offenders have remained mere words.

Rao questioned how many more students would need to be hospitalized or lose their lives before the government takes effective measures. He called for immediate and strict action to address the issue, ensuring the safety and well-being of children in government schools. Parents and locals have demanded swift intervention and accountability to prevent further incidents, urging the government to prioritize food safety in educational institutions.

Several students were transferred to Maktal Government Hospital due to their critical condition.

Chained Tank Damage Submerges Roads

Ranganath says roads are submerged due to damage to the chained tank system Hydra Commissioner says 61 percent of tanks have disappeared 39 percent of tanks need to be protected

Due to damage to the chained tank system



TPN, Hyderabad: Roads in Hyderabad are experiencing submergence even after minimal rainfall due to the deterioration of the chained tank system, according to Hydra Commissioner A.V. Ranganath. Speaking on the issue, Ranganath highlighted

that 61% of the city's tanks have disappeared, leaving only 39% intact. He stressed the urgent need to protect the remaining tanks to prevent further urban flooding.

The Commissioner explained that the chained tank system, once integral to the city's water management, has been heavily disrupted by urbanization and encroachments. Hydra, the Hyderabad Disaster Response and Assets Monitoring Protection agency, has launched an initiative to survey the city's tanks, determining their exact numbers, areas, Full Tank Levels (FTL), and buffer zones.

"Our priority is to protect the environment and natural resources amidst rapid urbanization," said Ranganath. He added that the state government

had established Hydra with the goal of providing a better environment and quality of life for future generations. The agency's objectives include protecting residents from natural disasters, conserving lakes, and safeguarding public properties such as parks and roads from encroachments.

Ranganath emphasized the importance of preserving the city's natural drainage systems to mitigate the impact of heavy rains. He urged collective efforts to ensure sustainable urban development while protecting Hyderabad's ecosystem.

Upon investigation, residents discovered that the water was likely polluted by chemicals being dumped into the drainage system by nearby warehouses. Angry locals blamed negligence and improper waste management for the alarming situation. They have called on authorities to take immediate action against those responsible to prevent further environmental damage and health risks.

The incident has raised serious concerns about industrial pollution and the need for stricter regulations to safeguard public health and safety in residential areas near industrial estates.



Hyderabad on Alert Against Illegal Immigration

TPN , Hyderabad : Amid unrest in questioning. In the past, illegal imm Bangladesh, police in Greater Hyderabad have intensified checks to prevent the illegal entry of Bangladeshi immigrants. Trains arriving from Kolkata, particularly at Secunderabad and Nampally railway stations, are under strict surveillance following alerts from intelligence agencies.

Police teams from Hyderabad, Cyberabad, and Rachakonda commissionerates are conducting inspections in areas with a history of illegal immigration, including Balapur, Katedan, Mailardevpally, Falaknuma, and Pahadai Shareef. Residents have been urged to report suspicious individuals in their neighborhoods. Several suspects have already been detained for

igrants, including Rohingyas and Ba ngladeshis, were found to have settled in Hyderabad, often working as vendors, industrial workers, or in the construction sector. Some were disco vered using fake documents such as passports, Aadhaar, PAN, and voter IDs. Recently, four Bangladeshis, including a minor, were detained in



Secunderabad, claiming to visit relatives in Chandrayangutta but later escaped police custody. Reports suggest that agents help illegal immigrants enter India, charging ₹5,000 to ₹6,000 per person. Hyderabad's Rajiv Gandhi International Airport (RGIA) has also emerged as a transit hub for Bangladeshi nationals heading to Gulf countries, with multiple arrests made for using forged documents. At the border, the Border Security Force (BSF) remains on high alert, particularly in West Bengal's Jalpaiguri district, where hundreds of Bangladeshis attempted to cross into India, citing violence in their homeland. The Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) later intervened, taking them back.

574 Applications Received at Prajavani



, **Hyderabad** : The Telangana government received 574 applications during the Prajavani program held on Tuesday, November 29, at Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Praja Bhavan in Hyderabad. Officials reported that the minority welfare department accounted for the highest number of applications, with 198 submitted.

Other departments receiving significant applications included the energy department (99), panchayati raj and rural development (98), revenue (55), and education (26). Additionally, 4 applications were for Pravasi-related issues, while 94 were directed to other departments.

On November 25, during a similar program attended by GHMC Commissioner Ilambarti, 126 applications

were received. Of these, 46 grievances were department-specific, with 21 concerning the town planning depar tment, followed by five for health and family welfare. Other departments, including electrical, sports, and housing, received fewer applications.

In the zonal category, Kukatpally zone led with 33 complaints, followed by Secunderabad (21), LB Nagar (14), Serilingampally (9), and Charminar (3). The Khairatabad zone reported no applications.

The previous Prajavani program on November 19 received 614 applications. State Planning Commission Vice Chairperson Dr. Chinna Reddy reviewed these submissions in person, highlighting the importance of add ressing public grievances promptly.

Tollywood Actor Sri Tej Accused of Fraud in Marriage Promise

TPN, Hyderabad: A zero FIR has been registered against Tollywood actor Sri Tej at the Gachibowli police station following allegations of deceiving a woman with a false promise of marriage. The complaint prompted the police to intensify their investigation.

This is not the first case against Sri Tej. Previously, the actor, known for portraying Chandrababu Naidu's character in films, was accused of having an extramarital affair. The affair reportedly caused emotional distress to the woman's husband, who the actor to allegedly go into hiding. tragically suffered a fatal heart attack upon learning about it. A case was subsequently filed at the Madhapur police station by the victim's family.

Old City Metro Corridor to Begin in January 2025

Hyderabad Metro Rail Limited (HMRL) Managing Director NVS Reddy shared this update during the seventh anniversary of the Hyderabad Metro's first phase. He revealed that sketches for around 800 affected properties have been submitted to the Hyderabad District Collector. Demolition work on these properties is scheduled to begin in late December.

TPN, Hyderabad: The preliminary The Old City corridor will span 7.5 km, connecting the Mahatma Gandhi Bus Station (MGBS) to Chandrayangutta, with a total investment of ₹2,741 crore. Hyderabad Airport Metro Limited (HAML) is overseeing the project implementation.

> The metro expansion faced initial opposition from All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) chief Asaduddin Owaisi during the previous government's tenure. However, his stance softened after modifications to the original plan were made.

> The project aims to improve connectivity and enhance public transportation infrastructure in the historic Old City area, benefiting thousands of commuters.



Protest in Nirmal Against Ethanol Factory Establishment



TPN , Nirmal: Members of a Joint Action Committee (JAC), along with locals and women, staged a rasta-roko in Dilawarpur mandal on Tuesday, protesting the establishment of an ethanol manufacturing factory in Gundampalli village. The protest, which lasted for about three hours, blocked traffic on the Nirmal-Bhainsa road, causing significant inconvenience to motorists.

Protesters raised slogans against the government for allowing the factory to be set up in their village, arguing that it would pollute their farmlands and disrupt their livelihoods. The demonstrators demanded that the government intervene and relocate the factory.

Police arrived at the scene and assured the protesters that their concerns would be conveyed to the authorities. Following this assurance, the protest was called off, and traffic resumed. The Hyderabad-based company behind the ethanol factory has already acquired 60 acres of land and received the necessary permissions to begin construction.

Protests at Food Poisoning Victim's Funeral

The funeral of 14-year-old Shailaja, a Class 9 student who died from food poisoning at a Tribal Welfare department Ashram school in Wankidi, was marred by intense protests against the government's handling of the case. Shailaja passed away on Monday at NIMS, Hyderabad, after being one of 64 students hospitalized following a meal at the school's hostel in late October.

As Shailaja's body arrived in her village, authorities imposed heavy security measures, restricting public and media access. Check-posts were set up up to 10 kilometers from the village, and even Shailaja's parents were reportedly denied time to mourn before the funeral. Villagers, along with local

TPN , Kumram Bheem Asifabad: organizations, staged protests, initially preventing officials from handing over the body. The protest ended after the Additional Collector assured compensation, a job, and a house under the Indiramma housing scheme for the family.

Meanwhile, several opposition leaders, including Asifabad MLA Kova Lakshmi, were prevented from visiting the village, with Kova Lakshmi placed under house arrest. Speaking to the media, she accused the government of causing Shailaja's death through neglect.

TPN, Asifabad: Asifabad MLA Kova Lakshmi was unexpectedly placed under house arrest while attempting to visit the family of Shailaja, a student who tragically died from food poisoning. Kova Lakshmi, a member of the Gulabi Party, was on her way to offer support to the grieving family when police intervened and imposed a heavy security presence at her residence.

Her arrest has sparked outrage among her supporters, who view this action as an overreach. The incident has raised questions about the nature of public administration and the restrictions placed on elected officials trying to engage with constituents. Kova Lakshmi's followers have expressed strong discontent, questioning whether such measures are justified when visiting families of victims. The political tensions surrounding the issue continue to unfold.

Ramagundam Police Destroys 521 kg of Ganja Worth Rs 1.30 Crore

TPN, Telangana: Ramagundam commissionerate police destroyed 521.544 kilograms of ganja, valued at Rs 1.30 crore, on Tuesday. The contraband had been seized in connection with 64 cases registered across police stations in Peddapalli and Mancherial districts since 2021.

The destruction took place at the Venkataramana Incinerator Factory in Manakondur, Karimnagar district, in accordance with environmental pollution norms. The process was conducted in the presence of advocates, after obtaining permission from the court under the NDPS Act. Samples of the seized gania were collected before the destruction for forensic testing.



Woman and Son Feared Dead After Jumping Into Manjeera River

TPN , Sangareddy: A woman and her son are feared to have drowned in the Manjeera River after allegedly attempting suicide in Chinthakunta village, Andole mandal, on Tuesday evening. The mother-son duo, identified as Vadla Balamani (45) and Vadla Shyam (28), reportedly jumped into the river, possibly due to family issues. The police are currently attempting to recover their bodies. Authorities are investigating the incident, and the search operation is ongoing to locate the remains. This tragic event has left the community in shock, as relatives and locals express their disbelief at the family's sudden and devastating loss.

Headquarters to Shift to Andhra Pradesh by End of **Academic Year**

TPN, Hyderabad: The Krishna River Management Board (KRMB) is set to relocate its headquarters to Andhra Pradesh by the end of the academic year, in accordance with sub-section 85 (2) of the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act (APRA) 2014. The Act mandates that the KRMB's headquarters be situated in the successor state of Andhra Pradesh.

The Andhra Pradesh government has expressed its commitment to supporting the transition, with efforts underway to provide office space in Vijayawada. This move is aligned with the state's focus on developing Amaravati as its new capital. While the previous AP government proposed office space in Visakhapatnam, the new government has opted for Vijayawada for logistical and administrative reasons.

Currently, the KRMB operates from Jala Soudha in Hyderabad, where office space is provided free of cost by the Telangana government. The Andhra Pradesh government is expected to offer a similar arrangement. Various stakeholders, including the Saaguneeti Viniyogadaarula Sanghaala Samakhya and MP Kesineni Sivanath, have supported Vijayawada as the preferred location for the KRMB headquarters.

The KRMB will continue discussions to ensure a smooth transition, fulfilling legal obligations while addressing logistical needs.

Quacks Practicing Allopathy Raided in Telangana

TPN , Hyderabad: The Telangana State Drug Control Administration (TSDCA) has raided the clinics of two individuals practicing allopathy without a valid MBBS qualification. The raids were conducted in Nelamarri village, Suryapet district, and Kawadipally village, Abdullapurmet mandal, Rangareddy dis-

trict.In the first raid, Madoju Kanakachary's clinic in Nelamarri was found to be stocking 24 varieties of drugs. In the second operation, Mohd Rawoof's clinic in Kawadipally was discovered to have 51 varieties of drugs, including high-end an-



tibiotics, steroids, painkillers, anti-ulcer drugs, and analgesics, worth Rs 54,880. Both individuals are suspected of illegally selling these drugs without the required drug licenses.

The TSDCA emphasized that stocking and selling drugs without a proper license is a violation of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act and is punishable by up to five years in prison. The Director-General of DCA, V.B. Kamalsan Reddy, urged the public to report such illegal activities via the toll-free number 1800-599-6969, available between 10:30 AM and 5:00 PM on working days.

The connection between these two financial hubs has been strengthening recently, with both nations deepening economic ties, investing in each other, and offering exchange-traded funds on their respective stock exchanges. Cathay Pacific Airways, for instance, began flying direct routes late last month, signaling growing international interest in the region.

Before embarking on the trip, my friend and I spent considerable time worrying about what to wear, anxious that we might be stopped on the street for not adhering to the conservative dress code. We were also slightly apprehensive about the road trip ahead, given that women were only granted

By-Election Results Show Favorable Trend for Ruling Parties

The recent by-elections in 46 seats across 13 states have shown a trend of favoring the ruling parties, a pattern similar to previous Assembly elections in Haryana, Maharashtra, and Jharkhand. By-elections often favor incumbent governments, and this time, the trend seems even more pronounced.

The overall results have been politically challenging for the Congress and the I.N.D.I.A. bloc, even though there were some gains in individual states. For instance, Congress lost three sitting seats to the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), but it did manage to take one seat from the AAP in Punjab. Similarly, the I.N.D.I.A. bloc, which includes the Congress, lost three seats, including an RJD stronghold, to the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) in Bihar.

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) performed well in states where it is in power, particularly in Uttar Pradesh (UP), Rajasthan, and Assam. The victory in UP is particularly significant for the BJP, as the state had been a major factor in its loss of majority in the 2019 Lok Sabha elections. The Adani Saga: A Global **Scrutiny of Business Ethics and Leadership**



Business history, much like any other, is marked by both triumphs and disasters. On one hand, businesses continuously innovate, making our lives better. On the other, there are instances when companies engage in practices that tarnish their reputation. In such moments, business leaders often find themselves at a crossroads, having to defend their credibility and chart a way forward. These challenges can define a legacy of moral leadership and provide valuable lessons for future generations.

The Indian business world is currently at a significant juncture, with the ongoing controversy surrounding the Adani Group. Despite various allegations, Indian courts and the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) have yet to take definitive action. This has raised concerns about the effectiveness of local regulatory frameworks in addressing serious charges.

Interestingly, the issue has attracted the attention of U.S. authorities, who have recently indicted top leaders of the Adani Group for bribery. While U.S. regulators, including the Securities and Ex-

change Commission (SEC), did not find any wrongdoing within the U.S., they have alleged violations based on the company's practices outside the U.S., notably in India. This stark contrast between the actions of Indian and U.S. authorities raises important questions about accountability and the application of regulations across borders.

The case first emerged in March 2023, yet Indian regulators and courts have not taken significant action, leaving the allegations largely unaddressed. The fact that U.S. authorities have identified issues when Indian bodies did not is puzzling. How is it that foreign regulators have uncovered potential wrongdoing, while local agencies have failed to do so?

This discrepancy underscores the growing global scrutiny of business practices and calls into question the transparency and effectiveness of India's regulatory framework. As the saga unfolds, it highlights the need for robust business ethics and stronger leadership to restore credibility and trust in the business environment.

The Road Ahead for the Democratic Party: Will They Learn from Defeat?

If you think the second stunning loss to Donald Trump - Donald Trump, no less – will push the Democratic Party to re-evaluate its approach to voters, you might be in for disappointment. 

"Don't Want EVMs, We Want Ballot Paper": Kharge After Maharashtra Loss

Smarting from Congress' crushing defeat in Maharashtra, following a similar loss in Haryana, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge voiced strong opposition to the use of Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) and called for a return to the traditional ballot paper system. Speaking at the 'Samvidhan Rakshak Abhiyaan' event at Talkatora Stadium in Delhi, the 82-year-old leader expressed his frustration with the current voting mechanism.

"We should all unite and move forward together and push them aside," Kharge said, referring to EVMs. "I do not wish to dwell on elections, but I will say this — the votes of the poor and oppressed communities are being wasted. They should demand voting by ballot paper," he added. Kharge's comments came on the heels of Congress's disappointing performance in the recent state elections, where the party was left questioning the integrity of the election process.



Kharge's call for a return to ballot

paper voting is significant, considering the ongoing debate around the reliability and transparency of EVMs in India. "Let them keep the EVMs, but we don't want them. We want voting on ballot paper," Kharge asserted, emphasizing that a return to the paper-based system would better reflect the true position of the voters.

Interestingly, Kharge's comments come on the same day the Supreme Court dismissed a petition requesting a return to ballot paper voting, reinforcing the legal standing of EVMs in the electoral process. Despite this, Kharge pushed for a nationwide movement to bring back ballot paper voting, likening it to the scale of Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Yatra.

"We should start this campaign from our party to make everyone aware that they should demand the return of ballot papers," Kharge suggested. He further urged Rahul Gandhi to lead such a movement, stating, "We should begin a campaign like the Bharat Jodo Yatra to bring back ballot papers."

Kharge's call reflects the deep frustration within Congress after recent electoral setbacks and highlights the party's growing skepticism about EVMs.

CM Atishi Accuses Modi Govt of Manipulating Delhi Electoral Rolls

Delhi Chief Minister Atishi accused the central government of attempting to manipulate the upcoming Delhi Assembly elections by removing Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) supporters from the electoral rolls. Addressing a press conference on Tuesday, Atishi alleged that the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) was using unfair tactics to secure a victory in the elections, fearing a defeat in the capital.

"The central government is trying to win the Delhi elections through unfair means. They are orchestrating the removal of voters from the electoral rolls, particularly those who are aligned with AAP," Atishi claimed. However, the BJP did not immediately respond to the allegations.



Atishi pointed to an order issued on October 28 by the Lieutenant Gover-

nor of Delhi, which transferred 29 Sub-Divisional Magistrates (SDMs), as the first step in this alleged plot. She suggested that the transfers were part of a larger strategy to influence the election process.

Additionally, Atishi accused a District Magistrate (DM) overseeing seven assembly constituencies of instructing officials to remove 20,000 voters from the rolls. She argued that this action was part of an effort to disenfranchise voters who were likely to support AAP in the upcoming polls.

The claims by Atishi have sparked concerns about the integrity of the election process, with AAP asserting that these actions are an attempt to tilt the electoral landscape in favor of the BJP. The allegations come ahead of the crucial Delhi Assembly elections, which are expected to be closely contested.



CM MK Stalin reviews cyclone preparedness in Tamil Nadu's Delta districts

Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin chaired an urgent meeting at the Secretariat on November 26 to assess the state's preparedness for the impending cyclonic storm 'Fengal,' predicted by the India Meteorological Department (IMD) to form from a deep depression over the Southwest Bay of Bengal by November 27. The meeting was attended by senior ministers, government officials, and district collectors from the Cauvery Delta region, which is expected to bear the brunt of the storm.

The Delta districts of Thanjavur, Tiruvarur, Nagapattinam, Myladuthurai, Tiruchirappalli, Perambalur, Pudukottai, and Cuddalore are likely to experience heavy rain and strong winds over the next few days. In light of this, Chief Minister Stalin instructed officials to ensure that relief centres are ready and that residents from vulnerable, low-lying areas are evacuated to safety ahead of the storm. He stressed the importance of safeguarding lives, property, and livelihoods, and minimising disruption to normal life.

Stalin also directed that precautionary measures be taken to protect agricultural crops from the potential damage caused by the heavy rains and strong winds. In addition, he urged for uninterrupted electricity supply in the affected areas and asked for quick coordination among relevant departments to address any power outages or other emergencies.

District collectors from the Delta region assured the Chief Minister that adequate relief camps were in place in their respective areas. Multi-departmental teams, medical units, and essential equipment such as boats, JCB machines, generators, motor pumps, and woodcutters were also mobilised for emergency response.

As part of the state's preparedness, teams from the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) and the National Disaster Re-



Despite a significant victory by the ruling Mahayuti alliance, which includes the BJP, Shinde-led Shiv Sena, and Ajit Pawar's NCP, the question of who will take the helm as the next Chief Minister remains unresolved. Kesarkar further stated that Shinde had already communicated to senior BJP leaders that whatever decision they make regarding the next CM would be acceptable to him. This ongoing uncertainty underscores the power dynamics at play within the Mahayuti alliance, as it navigates internal divisions despite its overwhelming electoral success.

As Maharashtra's political landscape continues to evolve, all eyes remain on the BJP leadership, which is expected to finalize the choice for the new Chief Minister in the coming days.





External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar recently shared his views on global issues in an interview with Italian daily *Corriere della Sera* while attending the G7 meeting in Fiuggi, Italy. During the discussion, Jaishankar emphasized the importance of India's relationship with Italy, particularly in terms of its engagement with the European Union (EU), which remains India's largest trade partner and a significant investor. He also highlighted the Joint Strategic Action Plan, announced by the Prime Ministers of India and Italy, as a key step in strengthening bilateral ties.

Jaishankar noted the complexities in EU-India trade relations, particularly with the EU's tendency to introduce non-trade issues in negotiations. He explained that these additional considerations make negotiations more challenging than typical free trade agreements (FTAs). Despite these challenges, Jaishankar stressed the importance of continued cooperation between India and the EU on trade matters.

On the topic of India's purchase of discounted oil from Russia, Jaishankar defended the decision, arguing that every country has its own strategic interests. "If everything is a matter of deep principle, then Europe itself



should have cut off all its business with Russia, but it doesn't do that," he pointed out. He further stressed that nations must consider how their actions will impact their interests, suggesting that such decisions are not always as clear-cut as they may seem.

Turning to the ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict, Jaishankar emphasized the importance of diplomacy in resolving the crisis. He reiterated that a solution will not come from the battlefield and stressed the need for negotiation. "At some stage, people will come to the table. The sooner they do it, the better, because the rest of the world is affected," Jaishankar said. India, he noted, is actively engaging with both sides in an effort to mediate and encourage dialogue.

Jaishankar also highlighted the global stress caused by ongoing conflicts, urging nations not to be passive observers but to take initiative in finding common ground, particularly in Ukraine and West Asia, to move toward a more peaceful and stable world order.

Nepal PM Clarifies No Loan Agreement with China During Upcoming Visit

Nepal Prime Minister KP Sharma Oli is set to embark on a five-day visit to China on December 2, but he has made it clear that no loan agreements will be signed during the trip. His statement comes amid growing speculation within Nepal's ruling coalition about the signing of Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) projects involving loan components.

During a recent meeting with former prime ministers and foreign ministers, Oli emphasized that the BRI deal with China was not a loan-based agreement. He dismissed concerns about taking loans from China, asserting that Nepal would only seek loans or grants based on its national interests and needs, and that such decisions would not be influenced by rumors. "We should not be swayed by baseless rumors that loans are being taken to entrap the country," he said.

Oli also reassured that Nepal's sovereignty, independence, and national welfare would remain top priorities in his foreign policy decisions. He underscored that Nepal's international relations would be guided by a commitment to global welfare alongside national interests.

Oli's comments come at a time when there is internal disagreement within

Nepal's ruling coalition. While the Nepali Congress, led by Sher Bahadur Deuba, favors receiving grants from China as part of the BRI, the Communist Party of Nepal-Unified Marxist Leninist (CPN-UML), led by Oli, is more inclined to pursue loans under the same initiative.

The visit to China is a significant departure from the tradition of newly elected Nepali leaders visiting India first, which has typically been seen as a gesture of goodwill toward Nepal's southern neighbor. However, the Prime Minister's office has justified this shift, stating that the visit to Beijing was scheduled recently and that India had not yet extended an official invitation to PM Oli.

"Urge Bangladesh To Ensure Minorities' Safety": India On **Arrest Of Hindu Priest**

India has strongly condemned the arrest of Chinmoy Krishna Das Brahmachari, a Hindu priest and leader of the religious minority community in Bangladesh, following his detention at Dhaka airport on Monday. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) expressed deep concern over the incident and called on Bangladeshi authorities to ensure the safety and security of Hindus and other minority groups in the country.

Chandan Kumar Dhar, known as Chinmoy Krishna Das Brahmachari, is a prominent former leader of the International Society for Krishna Consciousness (ISKCON) in

Bangladesh. He was also the spokesperson for the Bangladesh Sammilit Sanatan Jagran Jote, a platform advocating for the rights of Hindus and other religious minorities. On Tuesday, a Dhaka court denied him bail, further escalating concerns over his arrest.

In its statement, the MEA expressed its deep concern

about the arrest and the denial of bail, linking it to a broader pattern of attacks against Hindus and other minorities in Bangladesh. "This incident follows multiple attacks on Hindus and other minorities by extremist elements in Bangladesh," the Ministry stated, emphasizing the growing vulnerability of these communities.







Indian Rupee Strengthens Amid Regional Gains and MSCI Rebalancing



The Indian rupee surged to its strongest level in over two weeks on Monday, bolstered by a rebound in regional currencies and expected dollar inflows linked to MSCI's equity index rebalancing. As of 11:00 a.m. IST, the rupee was trading at 84.30, up 0.1% from its previous close of 84.4450, marking its highest value since November 7.

The local currency had recently touched an all-time low of 84.5075, prompting intervention by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). However, a pullback in the dollar index and U.S. Treasury yields provided some respite on Monday. The dollar index fell by 0.5% to 106.9, while the 10-year U.S. Treasury yield dropped by 6 basis points to 4.35%.

Markets gained confidence following U.S. President-elect Donald Trump's nomination of veteran investor Scott Bessent as Treasury Secretary, which contributed to the dollar's decline. Meanwhile, most Asian currencies saw gains, with the Korean won leading the pack, appreciating by 0.4%.

The rupee also benefitted from dollar sales by at least two major foreign banks, likely acting on behalf of custodial clients, according to a trader at a state-run bank. The rupee's rise was further supported by anticipated passive inflows into Indian equities, estimated to be around \$2.5 billion, driven by MSCI's equity index rebalancing, which was set to take effect after market close on Monday.

Despite the rupee's recent strength, it has faced significant pressure in recent months, requiring frequent RBI interventions to avoid sharp depreciation. These interventions, along with valuation losses, have contributed to India's foreign exchange reserves falling to a four-month low of \$657.89 billion as of November 15.

The rupee's recovery on Monday, aided by favorable regional trends and MSCI-related inflows, provided some relief after a period of volatility. However, the currency's future performance will continue to depend on global economic developments and ongoing RBI actions.

NTPC Green Energy Forms JV with MAHAGENCO for Renewable Parks

 $\mathbf{N}^{ ext{TPC}}$ Green Energy Limited (NGEL) has established a 50:50 joint venture (JV) with Maharashtra State Power Generation Company Limited (MAHAGENCO) to develop, operate, and maintain renewable energy parks in Maharashtra. The announcement was made through a filing with the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE) on Tuesday, November 26.

The newly formed joint venture is named Mahagenco NTPC Green Energy Private Limited (MNGEPL). According to the filing, MNGEPL will focus on the development of renewable ener- state. gy parks in Maharashtra under the Umbrella Scheme for Renewable Energy Parks (UMREPP), and will be responsible for allotting parks for the development of renewable energy projects in the



NTPC Green Energy is a wholly-owned subsidiary of NTPC Ltd, a state-run energy giant, while MAHAGENCO is a government-owned entity

controlled by the Government of Maharashtra. The partnership between these two entities will enable the state to harness renewable energy As part of the joint venture's formation, NTPC more effectively, aligning with India's renewable energy goals.

This JV comes just ahead of the initial public offering (IPO) of NTPC Green Energy, scheduled to launch on November 27. The IPO has already shown strong demand, with the Qualified Institutional Buyers (QIBs) and retail investor segments fully subscribed during the three-day public subscription. The QIBs subscribed 3.32 times the shares offered, while retail investors over-subscribed their portion by 3.44 times. However, the Non-Institutional Investor (NII) segment subscribed to only 81% of the shares on

offer, according to BSE data.

Green Energy has acquired 50,000 equity shares at a face value of ₹10 per share in MNGEPL, holding a 50% equity stake in the venture. The announcement regarding the JV was made after market hours on Tuesday, and NTPC Ltd's stock closed 1.90% lower at ₹361.65.

The partnership between NTPC Green Energy and MAHAGENCO is a significant step towards accelerating the development of renewable energy infrastructure in Maharashtra, and is expected to contribute to the state's growing renewable energy capacity.

Scientists Find Possible Flaw in Einstein's Theory of Space-Time



Arecent study by researchers from the Universities of Geneva and Toulouse has uncovered a small inconsistency in the predictions made by Albert Einstein's general theory of relativity, suggesting potential limitations in our understanding of the universe's expansion.

For over a century, Einstein's general relativity has been a cornerstone of modern physics. However, this new research challenges the theory's ability to fully explain certain cosmic phenomena. The study, which focused on the universe's accelerating expansion—a discovery made 25 years ago—indicates some discrepancies between Einstein's predictions and actual observations during various cosmic epochs.

Researchers from the University of Geneva and Toulouse III - Paul Sabatier analyzed data from the Dark Energy Survey to explore the accelerated expansion of the universe. Their findings, published in *Nature Communications*, revealed subtle variances that could point to issues with Einstein's equations, particularly in the context of extrasolar events. While these discrepancies do not directly disprove Einstein's theory, they suggest that there may be gaps in our

understanding of space-time and dark energy.

The study's authors examined the evolution of the Weyl potential using the first three years of data from the Dark Energy Survey. Their results have sparked fresh debates in the scientific community about the limitations of general relativity and the forces that drive the universe's expansion.

According to Einstein's theory, the fabric of space-time is curved by the presence of mass, creating gravitational wells. These wells bend the path of light, a phenomenon known as "gravitational lensing," which can be observed as light from distant stars or galaxies appears to change direction as it passes near massive celestial bodies. While this effect has been widely observed, the new study's results suggest that there might be unknown factors influencing cosmic expansion that general relativity has yet to account for.

This groundbreaking research could lead to new insights into the nature of dark energy and spacetime, and further examination may provide a clearer understanding of the universe's mysterious acceleration.

Ancient Fish-Trapping System Uncovered in Belize



An extensive fish-trapping net-work, believed to be over 4,000 years old, has been uncovered in Belize, offering new insights into how the ancient Maya civilization sustained its growing communities. The discovery reveals how the Maya engineered a complex system of ponds and earthen channels to channel fish and other aquatic species into controlled areas, securing vital food resources. This system is thought to have supported the nutritional needs of up to 15,000 individuals annually, contributing to the development of early Maya settlements.

The groundbreaking research, published in *Science Advances* on November 22, was led by archaeologist Eleanor Harrison-Buck from the University of New Hampshire. Using advanced remote sensing techniques, the team identified 167 shallow channels and nearly 60 ponds in Belize's Crooked Tree Wildlife Sanctuary. These features were mapped during the 2017 dry season, and the study suggests they were originally constructed by local hunter-gatherers around 4,200 to 3,900 years ago, during a period of drought. This environmental shift prompted the community to adapt by moving away from a maize-based diet to one that included fish, turtles, mollusks, waterfowl, and amaranth seeds.

The fish-trapping system was in use from approximately 3,200 to 1,800 years ago, a time when larger Maya urban and ceremonial centres were emerging. One of the channels identified by the team connects directly to the Maya centre of Chau Hiix, indicating that the system played an important role in feeding nearby populations.

Ongoing research will focus on further excavation of pre-Maya settlements in the area and the exploration of additional canal systems in Belizean wetlands and southern Mexico. This discovery highlights how early human societies modified their environments to ensure food security, ultimately supporting the growth of the Maya civilization. The research sheds light on the resource management strategies that helped sustain large populations and facilitated the rise of complex societies.

Meta's Threads Tests New Default Feed Feature for Users

Meta's microblogging platform, Threads, a competitor to X (formerly Twitter), is testing a new feature that allows users to choose their default feed, CEO Mark Zuckerberg announced on Monday. This feature is part of a series of updates designed to improve user interaction on the platform. Threads had recently introduced a custom feed feature, which allows users to create feeds tailored to specific topics of interest. By searching for a topic and tapping the "Create new feed" option, users can curate a feed focused on their interests. Additionally, users



can expand their feeds by visiting relevant pages and adding more topics or profiles to their custom feed via the three-dot menu.

Meta's move to offer users more control over their content feeds follows recent changes in the platform's algorithm, which emphasizes showing more posts from users' followed accounts. The new default feed feature builds upon this shift, further personalizing the user experience on Threads and offering a unique approach to content consumption.

Team India Regains Top Spot in World Test Championship

Team India has reclaimed the top position in the World Test Championship (WTC) standings (2023-25) after a comprehensive 295-run victory over Australia in the Test match held in Perth. With this win, India has taken a 1-0 lead in the five-Test series. Australia, which held the top spot prior to this match, has now slipped to second place. To secure a spot in the World Test Championship final scheduled for June next year, India must win this series with a margin of at least 4-0.

India currently leads the WTC table with a points percentage of 61.11. The team has played 15 Tests so far, winning nine, losing five, and drawing one, accumulating a total of 98 points. Australia, now in second place, has a percentage of 57.69. The Aussies have played 13 matches, winning eight and losing four. Before this match, Australia topped the table with 62.50 percent, while India followed with 58.33 percent. However, India's latest win has shifted the dynamics

In the updated WTC standings, Sri Lanka holds fourth place with 55.56 percent, followed by New Zealand at 54.55 percent, and South Africa at 54.17 percent, completing the top five.

With this victory, India is on a strong trajectory in the World Test Championship, reaffirming its dominance in Test cricket.






