

TPN, Kakinada: Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan has once again demonstrated his unwavering commitment to justice and national security. Known for his firm stance against corruption, Pawan Kalyan has taken decisive action against the alleged smuggling of government rice at Kakinada Port, an issue he previously fought against during the YCP regime. TPN, Andhra Pradesh: YS Sharmila has intensified her criticism of Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, raising pointed questions about his alleged dealings with Adani. Taking to social media platform X, Sharmila mocked Jagan, suggesting that his actions not only warrant a ceremonial shawl but also an Oscar for "masterfully delivering lies."

Sharmila highlighted the recent controversy surround-

ing a reported Rs. 1,750 crore bribe linked to Jagan, describing it as an event of international infamy. She questioned Jagan's with agreement Adani, asking why AP agreed to a rate of Rs. 2.49 per unit while Gujarat secured Rs. 1.99. "If there are no transmission charges, why didn't AP get the same rate as Gu-



jarat? Wasn't your Energy Department itself projecting Rs. 1.70 as the maximum transmission cost?" she asked. She further criticized the secrecy surrounding Jagan's meetings with Adani, labeling them unprecedented for a sitting Chief Minister. Sharmila also referenced reports from U.S. agencies like the FBI and SEC, which allegedly provided evidence of the financial dealings. "How can you deny the findings of a detailed 100-page report that explicitly mentions Rs. 1,750 crore being linked to the AP CM?" she questioned.

Challenging Jagan's transparency, Sharmila accused him of failing to investigate alleged irregularities in energy contracts, despite his criticism of the previous TDP government for similar issues. "Instead of addressing these concerns, you've locked the state into long-term agreements with Adani, exposing the extent of corruption," she alleged.

Finally, Sharmila threw down the gauntlet, daring Jagan to swear on the Bible and categorically deny all allegations if he believed them to be untrue. "If you're innocent, prove it. The people of Andhra Pradesh deserve the truth," she concluded.

Supreme Court Issues Notices to YS Bhaskar Reddy

TPN, Andhra Pradesh: The Supreme Court has issued notices to Bhaskar Reddy, father of YCP MP YS Avinash Reddy, in connection with the murder case of former minister YS Vivekananda Reddy. Notably, the Telangana High Court had granted bail to Bhaskar Reddy, who is an accused in this case. Following this, the CBI filed a petition in the Supreme Court seeking the cancellation of his bail.

A bench led by Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna heard the petition and subsequently issued notices to Bhaskar Reddy. The next hearing has been scheduled for March.

It has been more than five years since the murder of Vivekananda Reddy, and the CBI has been investigating the case for a considerable time. However, the investigation is yet to reach a definitive conclusion.

Taking or Supplying Drugs is a Crime: Eagle Chief A.K. Ravikrishna

TPN, Andhra Pradesh: The Andhra Pradesh government recently established EAGLE (Elite Anti-Narcotics Group for Law Enforcement) to combat marijuana and narcotics in the state. A.K. Ravikrishna has been appointed as the chief of this initiative.

Speaking to the media, Ravikrishna emphasized that both consuming and supplying drugs are criminal offenses. He stressed the importance of raising awareness about the prevention of drug and marijuana abuse. He highlighted the severity of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, urging people to understand its strict provisions.

Ravikrishna explained that, under the NDPS Act, individuals found guilty can face punishments ranging from one year to 20 years of imprisonment. Additionally, fines exceeding Rs. 2 lakh can be imposed. He also warned that if a student is charged under this act, it could severely impact their future prospects, causing irreversible losses.

Police Seek Vijaypal's Custody in Raghurama Case

TPN, Guntur: The police have arrested retired CID Additional SP Vijaypal in connection with the custodial torture case against former MP and current Assembly Deputy Speaker Raghurama Krishna Raju. Vijaypal was recently remanded after the Supreme Court denied his anticipatory bail plea. In this context, the police filed a petition in the Guntur Special Court on Thursday, seeking five days' custody of Vijaypal. Judge G. Spandana accepted the petition for hearing. The police informed the court that Vijaypal played a key role in the case, failed to cooperate with the investigation, and attempted to mislead the probe by withholding crucial information. They argued that further interrogation is necessary to uncover the conspiracy angle and details surrounding the alleged attempt to murder Raghurama Krishna Raju.

AP Secretariat Employees' Leader Venkatrami Reddy Arrested in Tadepalli

TPN, Amaravati: AP Secretariat Employees' Association leader Venkatrami Reddy has been arrested by the excise police for allegedly organizing a liquor party without obtaining prior permission. Reports indicate that a case has been registered against him under multiple sections.

It is known that elections for the Secretariat Employees' Canteen Director posts are approaching. Allegations suggest that Venkatrami Reddy was attempting to influence the

preferred candidates.

On Thursday night, acting on credible information, excise officials and local police conducted a raid at Kondapavuluri Garden in Tadepalli, Guntur district, where the liquor party was allegedly held. Venkatrami Reddy was arrested for organizing the event without proper authorization. A significant quantity of liquor bottles was also seized from the location.

TPN, Andhra Pradesh: Jana Sena leader and former minister Balineni Srinivasa Reddy launched a sharp critique against YSRCP chief YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, holding him responsible for the party's recent electoral losses. Speaking in a recent interview, Balineni accused Jagan of sidelining loyal leaders and ignoring party workers, which he claimed led to the party securing only 11 seats.

Balineni revealed that Jagan denied MP tickets to 17 leaders, including Magunta Srinivas Reddy, after they attended a function hosted by Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy. He alleged that this decision was politically motivated and unfair. "If I had been removed from YSRCP, I would have contested for another party and become a minister by now," Balineni remarked, hinting at missed opportunities.

Reflecting on Jagan's tenure, Balineni said people were fearful under his rule, especially regarding their voting preferences. "Even surveyors couldn't get honest answers from voters, as people is hard to regain," he concluded.

TPN, Andhra Pradesh: In a recent statement, Satya Prasad, the state Minister for Revenue, Registration, and Stamps, harshly criticized Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy over the ongoing Adani power scam issue, claiming that Jagan's actions have led to massive financial burdens on the state. According to Satya Prasad, Jagan's agreements with power companies, which involved high power purchase rates, have placed a two-lakh-crore rupee burden on the people of Andhra Pradesh. He accused Jagan of failing to admit the truth and instead "showing the dignity of a goat" by not addressing the core issues related to the agreement.

The Minister went on to suggest that Jagan Reddy deserves several titles and awards for his actions, adding a sarcastic tone to his critique. "Jagan Reddy can certainly be given the 'International Criminal' award for taking his

corruption empire to an international level and gaining a reputation as a world-class corrupt person," Satya Prasad stated. He also suggested that Jagan should be honored with the title "Nammaka Drohi" (Traitor to the People) for breaking his promises regarding the Amaravati capital and deceiving the public.

Further, the minister mocked Jagan with the suggestion of giving him the "Bail Bird" title for being the longest-serving economic offender out on bail in the country. Satya Prasad also criticized Jagan for lying and boasting about his achievements, earning him

Gudivada Amarnath Defends Power Deal With Adani Accused the Govt Spreading Misinformation

TPN, Visakhapatnam: Gudivada Amarnath, President of the Visakhapatnam District YSRCP, addressed the media on Friday, strongly defending the state government's power purchase agreement. He criticized certain media outlets for spreading false information about transmission charges related to the deal.

Amarnath clarified that clause 3.2 of the agreement between the central and state governments explicitly exempts the state from paying interstate transmission charges for 25 years. "The yellow media is creating unnecessary controversy without understanding Amarnath's comments come amid the agreement. How can they blame us without reading it?" he questioned. Fly Ash Transport Dispute Between JC Prabhakar Reddy and Adinarayana Reddy Reaches CMO



TPN, Amaravati: A heated dispute has erupted between former Tadipatri MLA JC Prabhakar Reddy and Jammalamadugu BJP MLA Adinarayana Reddy over the lucrative contract for transporting fly ash from the Rayalaseema Thermal Power Plant (RTPP). The conflict centers on who holds the rights to transport fly ash to the L&T plant in Tadipatri. Tensions flared when JC Prabhakar Reddy's faction sent lorries to transport fly ash, claiming ownership of the contract. However, Adinarayana Reddy's faction intervened, blocking the vehicles and asserting that the contract falls within their constituency. The situation quickly escalated as both sides halted each other's vehicles, with demands intensifying from both parties.

TPN, Vijayawada: In NTR District on Friday, Collector Dr. G. Lakshmi Sa Inspected the Drinking Water Supply at A.konduru Village, Efforts are underway to provide safe drinking water to 38 villages in A. Kondur mandal, where residents have been severely affected by kidney diseases. District Collector Dr. G. Lakshmi Sa announced that the ongoing project to supply safe Krishna water will be completed by June 2025. The project, funded by the state government with a budget of ₹50 crore, aims to ensure the long-term prevention of kidney diseases by providing clean drinking water and enhanced medical services.

During an inspection at Kudapa village in Reddygudem mandal, Dr. Lakshmi Sa reviewed the progress of the water reservoir and pipeline works. Of the planned 200 km of pipeline, 90 km has already been completed, with 22 km currently under construction. Additionally, 14 new overhead tanks are being built across A. Kondur mandal, supplementing existing ones in 38 villages. The Collector emphasized the need to expedite the project, directing officials to meet the June deadline.

Dr. Lakshmi Sa also visited the Primary Health Center and Mini Dialysis Center in A. Kondur, assessing the medical services provided to kidney patients. She expressed satisfaction with the services but stressed the importance of upgrading infrastructure to offer



better care. The Collector urged medical officials to operate the mini dialysis center efficiently, ensuring continuous and accessible support for patients. Local MLA Kolikapudi Srinivasa Rao, along with public representatives and health officials, pledged their cooperation in improving healthcare services. The Collector called for transparent and dedicated efforts from government staff in A. Kondur, Reddygudem, and Thiruvur to uplift living standards in the region. Officials, including RDO K. Madhuri, DMHO Dr. M. Suhasini, RWS SE Vidyasagar, and DPO P. Lavanya Kumari, accompanied the Collector during the inspection.

The DEO was instructed to implement the

leave procedure as outlined in G.O. No. 70.

Regarding the teacher leadership training, the Collector explained that the district's SPD had assigned the classes, but a resolution could be pursued through discussions with state-level officials. The meeting ended on a positive note, with teachers thanking the Collector for addressing their concerns in a friendly and constructive manner.

of justice. Rishiteswari, a young student from Warangal, Telangana, had written a suicide note before taking her life, blaming the harassment and ragging by senior students at the university. The note clearly stated that she could not bear the mistreatment any lontated and questioning the pursuit ger. The incident sparked widegroups and family members demanding justice. In the aftermath, a police investigation was launched, and allegations surfaced against several individuals, including Baburao, the principal of the Architecture College. It was claimed that Baburao had organized an unsanctioned freshers' party where alcohol was consumed, and senior students had participated in ragging. Despite these allegations, the court ruled On Friday that the case would be dismissed, ending the legal proceedings.

Cryptocurrency Scam in Donne Town, 300 Victims Lose ₹23 Crores

rency fraud in Donne town, Nandyal, around 300 people were duped out of nearly Rs. 23 crores by a man who promised high returns on investments. The accused, Ramanjaneyulu, a resident of Peddavaduguru village in Guthi mandal, Anantapur district, had set up a shop in Donne town under the guise of "Keva Industries Organic Herbal Company" in 2021. He lured victims by promising returns of Rs. 10 for every Rs. 100 invested in cryptocurrency. Many believed his claims, and a total of Rs. 23 crores was collected from unsuspecting investors.

However, after the initial excitement, the promised returns never materialized. No cryptocur-

ty-handed. Out of the total amount collected, Ramanjaneyulu returned Rs. 17 crores to some clients, but a significant portion of the money was still unaccounted for.

The case came to light when victims, who had lost large sums of money, turned to the police for help. In an unusual twist, rather than demanding his arrest, the victims asked the police to recover the remaining money. Despite their pleas, the police arrested Ramanjaneyulu, seizing approximately Rs. 2.40 crores in cash from him. The seized money is now set to be handed over to the Income Tax Department, as per the court's orders.

India's leadership in shifting the G20's focus was particularly evident in the New Delhi G20 Declaration, where issues like climate change, global health, and debt relief for developing nations took center stage. Despite the presidency transitioning to Brazil, India maintained its momentum by organizing a third summit aimed at continuing to push the Global South's priorities in the international conversation. Pakistan In Turmoil Again

Pakistan is grappling with a deepening crisis as violence and political unrest continue to disrupt the nation. On November 27, 2024, security forces fired tear gas at thousands of supporters of former Prime Minister Imran Khan, who had stormed the capital, Islamabad, demanding his release from prison. At least six people were killed, and many others were injured in the ensuing clashes. Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaaf (PTI) supporters, led by his wife Bushra Bibi and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur, had planned a sit-in at D-Chowk, near the parliament, in a last-ditch effort to pressure the government. However, the Pakistani government, led by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, launched a major crackdown, arresting many protesters and dispersing the rally.

This protest comes at a time of national turmoil. Over the past several months, Pakistan has been embroiled in an ongoing battle between PTI supporters and the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) government. Khan, who was overthrown in a parliamentary no-confidence vote in 2022, has since accused the current government of being complicit with the military to remove him from office. Khan was imprisoned in August 2023 after being convicted in nearly 150 cases. Despite his imprisonment, Khan remains highly popular, particularly in the provinces of Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, where his supporters have regularly organized protests, even though these movements have been short-lived due to government crackdowns.

The political chaos is further exacerbated by increasing sectarian violence, particularly in the northwest Kurram district in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Recent clashes between Shia and Sunni communities have resulted in the deaths of at least 82 people, following retaliatory attacks after gunmen killed 40 Shia Muslims in late November. Additionally, the insurgency in Balochistan continues to escalate, fueled by the province's opposition to Chinese investments and a history of separatist movements.

Israel-Hezbollah Ceasefire: A Fragile Path to Peace





Ukraine conflict, the US, alongside the UK and France, granted Kyiv permission earlier this month to use long-range weapons against Russian targets. This move came in response to Russian aggression and Moscow's deployment of North Korean troops in Kursk. Within 24 hours of receiving approval, Ukraine launched a series of missile strikes, firing six ATACMS missiles into Bryansk and storming Russian air defense positions in Kursk with Storm Shadow cruise missiles.

In retaliation, Russian President Vladimir Putin approved revisions to the country's nuclear doctrine, lowering the threshold for nuclear weapon use. This development marks a dangerous escalation, with Russia also testing a new hypersonic missile, the Oreshnik, targeting a defense facility in Dnipro, Ukraine. This marked the first time Russia had deployed medium-range ballistic missiles in combat, bringing the conflict closer to the possibility of nuclear confrontation.

Ukraine's request for long-range weap-

In a significant shift in the ongoing Biden as early as September. However, the request went unanswered until Russia's Security Council proposed changes to its nuclear policy, prompting a decision to grant Ukraine the necessary weapons. Despite former President Donald Trump's election victory in November and his apparent desire to broker peace and end the conflict, President Biden remains committed to supporting Ukraine, ensuring continued US involvement in the war.

> The tempo of the conflict has rapidly escalated. After Russia's strike on Dnipro, Ukraine retaliated with a salvo of ATACMS missiles, targeting the Kursk region. Ukraine now has the capability to strike up to 300 km into Russian territory, including key military installations in regions like Smolensk, Tula, and Rostov-on-Don. These areas are crucial to Russia's military infrastructure, and Moscow perceives these attacks as direct signs of increased Western involvement in the war.

In response, Russia has escalated its strikes on Ukraine. According to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelons had been considered by President ensky, Moscow has launched over 800

bombs, 460 drones, and 20 missiles since Ukraine's first long-range strike. Ukraine's territorial losses are mounting, particularly in Kursk and Donbass, where Russian forces, bolstered by North Korean troops, are gaining ground.

Amid the escalating conflict, Russia's updated nuclear doctrine has raised alarms. It now allows for the potential use of nuclear weapons in response to conventional attacks, a departure from its previous policy that reserved nuclear strikes for nuclear threats or existential attacks. This nuclear saber-rattling continues to intensify as the war drags on.

As all eyes turn to the potential return of Donald Trump to the White House, Russian officials hope that his peace plan could bring the war to a close. Trump has expressed a desire to end the conflict, but the evolving situation in Ukraine may force him to continue supporting Kyiv, mirroring policies of his predecessor, President Biden. The outcome of the next US administration could significantly influence the trajectory of the conflict.

A ceasefire between Israel and Hezbollah officially took effect, bringing some relief after weeks of intensified conflict. The deal, brokered by the Biden Administration with France's support, was welcomed by many as a necessary step to halt the devastating violence that had claimed thousands of lives, with Lebanon reporting over 3,500 casualties. This ceasefire marks a pivotal moment in a long-running conflict, but its sustainability remains uncertain.

The recent escalation saw Israel targeting Hezbollah's infrastructure and leadership, aiming to eliminate a key player in the 'Axis of Resistance' alongside Iran. Israel's military operations included precision strikes designed to decapitate Hezbollah's leadership, including its leader Hassan Nasrallah, hoping to cripple the group's capabilities. In response, Hezbollah unleashed missile barrages and other high-precision weaponry, even hitting Israel's symbolic targets, including the home of Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu.

The goal of the ceasefire is to bring stability to the region, allowing for the return of displaced residents, particularly in areas like Dahiyeh in Beirut. It also aims to pave the way for political dialogue that could address the underlying issues fueling the conflict. While this truce provides a temporary respite, the complex web of alliances and grievances between Israel, Hezbollah, and regional powers raises questions about how long it will last.

The international community, led by the United States and France, has pushed for this ceasefire to prevent further escalation and the loss of civilian lives. The Biden Administration sees this as a necessary step to manage the crisis, especially after the failure to deter Hezbollah's involvement in the broader conflict. However, despite the ceasefire, Hezbollah's military strength and ideological commitment to confronting Israel will continue to pose a significant challenge.

While the ceasefire has allowed for temporary relief, both parties remain deeply entrenched in their positions, and the path to lasting peace remains fraught with uncertainty.





PM Modi Slams Opposition, Highlights BJP's Growing Strength in State Polls

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday lashed out at opposition parties, accusing them of spreading constant propaganda against the BJP-led central government. Addressing party workers, he stated that the opposition's primary goal was to "mislead people and capture power," making a pointed reference to those who view power as their "birthright" but have not held power at the Centre for the past decade.

Modi further emphasized that despite not being in power in Odisha, the BJP had consistently worked towards the state's development. He claimed the party's efforts had contributed to its growing influence in the region, despite the skepticism of political experts who had dismissed the possibility of BJP forming a government in Odisha.

"The results of the Odisha elections surprised many so-called political exprospects in the state. However, BJP's growing success in states like Odisha, Haryana, and Maharashtra is a testament to the strength and dedication of our party workers," Modi said, refer-

She pointed out that since Muhammad Yunus came to power in Bangladesh, unrest in the country has intensified. Ranaut expressed her solidarity with the Hindu community in Bangladesh, praying for their safety and well-being.

The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) echoed Ranaut's concerns, condemning the rising violence against minority communities in Bangladesh. MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal remarked that the increasing attacks against Hindus should not be dismissed as media exaggerations. He urged the interim government, led by Muhammad Yunus, to take stronger action to protect the rights of all minority groups in the country.

Siddaramaiah meets PM Modi, urges action on farm loans and water projects

Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah met Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday to address several financial and infrastructure issues facing the state. During their discussion in the Parliament complex, Siddaramaiah raised key concerns, including a significant reduction in agricultural credit for the state and the delay in crucial infrastructure projects.

One of the major issues highlighted by Siddaramaiah was the 58% cut in Karnataka's short-term agricultural credit limit by the National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD). The loan limit for 2024-25 was reduced from Rs 5,600 crore in the previous year to just Rs 2,340 crore. The Chief Minister warned that this drastic reduction would push over 35 lakh farmers towards private lenders, further straining the agriculture sector. He urged the central government to restore the previous loan limits to ensure the stability of the farming community.

Siddaramaiah also sought immediate financial assistance for the Upper Bhadra Project, a critical irrigation initiative designed to address drought concerns in central Karnataka. He requested the release of Rs 5,300 crore to expedite the project's completion. Additionally, he pressed for faster clearances for two other key water-related projects—the Mekedatu Balancing Reservoir and the Kalasa Banduri water diversion project—both of which are stalled due to pending approvals from the Jal Shakti and Environment ministries.

The Chief Minister also advocated for the development of Bengaluru's infrastructure, a vital part of the state's economy. He requested Rs 10,000 crore to enhance infrastructure across 13 emerging city corporations, under the Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT). This funding is expected to boost urban development and improve the city's growing infrastructure needs.

Siddaramaiah further raised concerns over Karnataka's reduced share in tax allocation under the 15th Finance Commission and called for compensation grants. He emphasized the need for a fair distribution of funds under the 16th Finance Commission to ensure that states contributing significantly to national revenues are not unfairly penalized.

Accompanying Siddaramaiah in the meeting were Deputy Chief Minister D K Shivakumar, Energy Minister K J George, and Urban Development Minister Byrathi Suresh. Later, Siddaramaiah also met Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra to congratulate her

Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde on Friday revealed that he had held "good and positive" discussions with Union Home Minister Amit Shah and BJP president J.P. Nadda regarding the formation of the new government in the state. Speaking to reporters before his departure for Mumbai, Shinde stated that the decision on the next Chief Minister of Maharashtra would be finalized "in a day or two" during an upcoming meeting of the Mahayuti coalition in Mumbai.

Shinde, along with Deputy Chief Ministers Devendra Fadnavis and Ajit Pawar, had met with Shah and Nadda late Thursday to discuss a power-sharing agreement after the BJP-led coalition secured a decisive majority in the recent Assembly elections.

"We have held discussions, and the decision regarding the CM post will be taken in the next couple of days. Further talks will continue, and we will announce the final decision when it is made," said the outgoing Chief Minister. He emphasized that he would not be an obstacle in the government formation process and would respect the decision taken by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Amit



Shah.

"I value the 'ladka bhau' (beloved brother) title more than anything else," Shinde said, underlining his commitment to the collective leadership of the alliance. He also noted the importance of respecting the people's mandate, which had re-elected the alliance with a strong majority, rather than focusing solely on positions.

The meeting with Shah and Nadda was described as a productive one, with Shinde stating that there was good coordination between the alliance partners. He reiterated that the priority was to honor the people's mandate and swiftly form the government.

Atishi Jokes About Bus Marshals, **Targets BJP MLA in Delhi Assembly**

In a light-hearted exchange during Friday's Delhi Assembly session, Chief Minister Atishi humorously suggested that reinstating bus marshals would guarantee the victory of the ruling Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) in next year's Delhi Assembly elections. The remark was aimed at Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) MLA Vijender Gupta, who had criticized AAP's handling of safety measures for women on public transport.

"At a meeting on November 10, we discussed the issue. By November 13, we had submitted a report to the Lieutenant Governor (LG)," Atishi said, adding, "Now, the proposal is still pending with him." She then humorously told Gupta, "You keep saying that the marshals were removed because Kejriwal asked for it, but now I am the Chief Minister, and I am saying, 'Please bring them back."

Atishi didn't miss an opportunity to make a playful comment about Delhi's Lieutenant Governor, VK Saxena, with whom the AAP government has had frequent disagreements. "If the LG listens to everything a Chief Minister says, then he should listen to me and reinstate the bus marshals," she quipped, smiling broadly.





UK PM Keir Starmer Announces Plans to Cut Migration Following Record Highs

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer announced on Thursday that his government would introduce new measures to reduce migration, including reforms to the UK's pointsbased immigration system. This decision comes after the release of official data showing that net migration to the UK in 2023 exceeded initial projections, reaching a record 900,000.

The data has raised concerns, prompting the government to take action to manage the growing influx of migrants. While Starmer's government has introduced stricter visa rules in recent months, which have already led to a decline in the number of arrivals, the Prime Minister's announcement signifies a more comprehensive approach to controlling migration levels.

In a statement, Starmer emphasized that the UK's immigration system needed to be better aligned

with the country's economic needs and capacity. He explained that the new reforms would focus on reducing pressure on public services, housing, and jobs, while ensuring that immigration policies continue to support the UK's labor market.

The government's points-based system, which was introduced after Brexit, aims to select migrants based on skills, qualifications, and job offers. However, with net migration figures soaring, critics argue that the system has not been effective in preventing high levels of immigration, particularly from low-skilled workers. Starmer's government has promised to tighten regulations around non-skilled migration and ensure that entry into the UK is granted based on more stringent criteria.

While the new plans are still in development, they are expected to be a key part of Starmer's agenda as the government prepares for the upcoming general election. The issue of migration has long been a contentious topic in British politics, and with migration numbers reaching historic highs, it is likely to be a central focus in the coming months.

India has raised "serious concern" with Bangladesh over the increasing incidents of violence against the Hindu minority and the growing extremism in the country. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) made these remarks during its weekly press briefing, where it highlighted the rising communal tensions and the surge in extremist rhetoric in Bangladesh.

India has been maintaining regular communication with the interim government in Dhaka, stressing the importance of addressing the rising violence targeting Hindus and other minorities. The MEA emphasized that New Delhi has consistently raised the issue with the Bangladesh government, urging them to uphold their responsibility to protect all citizens, particularly vulnerable minority communities.

"We are concerned about the surge of extremist rhetoric, increasing incidents of violence, and provocation," the Ministry stated, underlining that these developments could not be dismissed as mere media exaggeration. The ongoing attacks



has formally recognized the massacre of West African soldiers by the French Army in 1944, offering an official acknowledgment in a letter to Senegalese authorities. This recognition comes ahead of the 80th anniversary of the tragic event, which took place on December 1, 1944, in the village of Thiaroye, located just outside the Senegalese capital, Dakar. Macron's statement marks the first time the French government has officially termed the killings as a "massacre."

The victims of the massacre were between 35 and 400 West African soldiers, many of whom had fought for France during World War II as part of the Tirailleurs Senegalais, a colonial infantry unit. These soldiers had served in the Battle of France in 1940 but were later involved in disputes over unpaid wages. On December 1, 1944, tensions escalated, and French soldiers opened fire on the unarmed West African troops, killing them in what was described as a brutal retaliation for a suspected mutiny over the wage issue.

Macron's recognition comes at a time when France's influence is waning in West Africa, where former French colonies have increasingly sought independence from French political, military, and economic control. This shift in regional power dynamics has placed additional pressure on France to confront its colonial past and address historical injustices, particularly regarding its treatment of African soldiers who served in the French military.

By acknowledging the massacre for the first time, Macron is responding to longstanding calls for justice from the descendants of the victims and African leaders. This move is seen as an important step in addressing France's colonial legacy and healing relations between France and its former colonies, particularly in West Africa.

Russian President Vladimir Putin has expressed concern for the safety of US President-elect Donald Trump, following several attempts on his life. Speaking to reporters in Kazakhstan after a summit, Putin described Trump as an experienced and intelligent politician but noted his belief that Trump is not safe, citing assassination attempts on the former president.

Trump was wounded in a July 2024 assassination attempt in Pennsylvania, and in a separate incident in September, a man was arrested for allegedly attempting to assassinate Trump at one of his Florida golf courses. These incidents have raised alarms about the risks Trump faces, according to Putin.

Putin expressed shock at the tactics used during the US election campaign, calling them "absolutely uncivilized" and pointing to the multiple assassination attempts as evidence of the extreme measures taken against Trump. "In my opinion, he is not safe now," Putin stated, adding that while Trump is intelligent, he must remain cautious given the potential threats. Putin, who himself is heavily protected, also condemned the political attacks on Trump's family, describing them as "revolting" and noting that such tactics would not even be used by "bandits" in Russia. He emphasized the personal toll such criticism can take on Trump's family and children.

Turning to international affairs, Putin weighed in on the ongoing conflict in Ukraine, particularly regarding the Biden administration's approval of long-range Western missiles for Ukraine. He suggested that this decision could be part of a larger political strategy to either help Trump by giving him something to potentially roll back or, conversely, to complicate his relationship with Russia further.

Australia's PM Albanese Shifts Focus to Election Campaign Amid Rising Living Costs



Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese is shifting gears toward election mode, aiming to regain voter confidence by addressing the growing concerns around high living costs, particularly housing. This comes after a flurry of legislative activity, with 31 new laws passed in a marathon session late Thursday night, including a groundbreaking social media ban for children-a first in the world. The swift legislative action has sparked speculation that Albanese may call a national election before February, though the official date must be set by May 17. Albanese's center-left Labor government, which came to power in 2022, faces a challenging contest against the conservative Liberal-National coalition in the upcoming election. Polls indicate a decline in public support for the prime minister, as Australians grapple with the rising costs of housing, food, and energy, exacerbated by global inflation.

In a press conference following the midnight legislative session, Albanese acknowledged the difficulties that Australian households are fac-

ing due to these cost-of-living pressures. "We know that we have more work to do on cost of living, but we're making progress," he said. The prime minister emphasized his government's understanding of the economic strain on families and reiterated that addressing these issues remains a priority.

The surge in living costs has been a major point of contention for Albanese, who is now focused on policies that can alleviate the financial burden on ordinary Australians. While his government has enacted a series of reforms, including measures aimed at housing affordability, it remains to be seen whether these initiatives will be enough to win back voter support ahead of the election. With the election looming, Albanese's government is betting on its legislative agenda to secure its political future. However, as inflation continues to affect household budgets, the upcoming months will be crucial in determining whether the Labor government can turn the tide and regain its footing in the polls.





Nifty, Sensex Rally on Heavyweights and Sectoral Gains



Domestic stock markets surged today, driven by heavyweights like Bharti Airtel, Reliance Industries, and Sun Pharma, closing with significant gains on Friday. Despite mixed signals from global markets, investors showed confidence. The easing of fears regarding the US economy also supported the rally. As a result, Nifty 50 and Sensex rose substantially, with the latter gaining 700 points. The pharma and healthcare sectors saw notable buying activity.

The BSE Sensex, which closed at 79,043 in the previous session, opened at 79,032 today. It touched an intraday low of 79,026 and an intraday high of 79,923 before closing at 79,802, up 759 points. The NSE Nifty opened at 23,927, hit a low of 23,927 and a high of 24,188, and finally settled at 24,131, up 216 points. Bank Nifty rose 148 points to close at 52,055.

In the Nifty50 index, 43 companies

advanced, while 7 declined. Bharti Airtel, Sun Pharma, Cipla, M&M, and Tata Consumer Products were the top gainers. On the other hand, Power Grid, Shriram Finance, Hero MotoCorp, HDFC Life,

and Nestle India saw losses. Except for PSU Bank and Realty, all sectoral indices ended in the green, with Auto, Media, Pharma, Healthcare, Oil & Gas showing strong momentum.

Out of 2,870 stocks traded on the NSE, 1,742 gained, and 1,043 declined. Shares of 66 companies touched all-time highs, while 20 stocks hit their 52week lows.

The rupee ended flat at 84.49 against the US dollar. Among stock-

- Sun Pharma Research shares surged to an 11-month high.
- Adani Green Energy rose by 23%.

India's Economic Growth Slows to 5.4% in July-September Quarter



India's economic growth slowed to a near two-year low of 5.4% in the July-September quarter of the 2023-24 fiscal year, down from 8.1% in the same period last year, according to official data released on Friday. This decline was primarily attributed to weaker performance in the manufacturing sector, which experienced a significant slowdown.

Despite the dip in growth, India continues to be the fastest-growing major economy, surpassing China, whose GDP grew by 4.6% during the same quarter. The last time India recorded such low growth was in the third quarter (October-December) of the 2022-23 financial year, when the economy expanded by just 4.3%.

The data, compiled by the National Statistical Office (NSO), showed that the agricultural sector saw a notable improvement, with Gross Value Added (GVA) growth accelerating to 3.5% in the July-September period, up from 1.7% a year earlier. This rise was driven by favorable monsoon conditions and higher agricultural output. On the other hand, the manufacturing sector faced a sharp deceleration, with GVA growth slowing to just 2.2% compared to 14.3% during the same quarter in 2022. The sluggishness in manufacturing growth, which is a critical driver of India's economy, had a significant impact on the overall GDP performance.

The overall GDP growth for the first half of the current fiscal year (April-September 2023) stood at 6%, a decrease from 8.2% in the first half of the previous fiscal year. The growth in the first quarter (April-June) of 2023-24 remained steady at 6.7%, indicating that the slowdown was more pronounced in the second quarter.

While India's economy faces challenges in key sectors, particularly manufacturing, it still holds a relatively strong growth trajectory compared to other major economies. However, policymakers will need to address these weaknesses to sustain growth in the coming months.

Oil Prices Fall Amid Eased Supply Concerns, Heading for Weekly Drop

Sensex Jumps 759 Points, Nifty Hits 24,100; Airtel and Pharma Lead

O il prices dropped on Friday, heading toward a weekly decline of more than 3%, as concerns over potential supply disruptions from the Israel-Hezbollah conflict eased, alleviating earlier fears.

Brent crude futures fell by 55 cents, or 0.8%, settling at \$72.73 per barrel by 0758 GMT. Meanwhile, U.S. West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude futures were at \$69.52, down 20 cents, or 0.3%, compared to Wednesday's

close.On a weekly basis, Brent futures were down by 3.3%, and the U.S. WTI benchmark had fallen 3.8%.

The tensions between Israel and Hezbollah, which had raised concerns about oil supply disruptions, appeared to calm after both sides traded accusations over alleged ceasefire violations on Thursday. A ceasefire deal had been brokered earlier in the week, initially reducing the risk of a broader conflict that could disrupt Middle Eastern oil supplies.

Despite these geopolitical tensions, oil supply from the Middle East has remained largely unaffected during Israel's conflicts with both Hezbollah in Lebanon and Hamas in Gaza.

In other developments, OPEC+ (the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries and allies including Russia) postponed its next policy meeting from December 1 to December 5 to avoid a scheduling conflict. It is widely expected that OPEC+ will extend its current production cuts at the meeting.

BMI, a unit of Fitch Solutions, revised its Brent price forecast for 2025, lowering it to \$76 per barrel from \$78, citing a "bearish fundamental outlook" and expectations of continued weakness in the oil market. BMI analysts warned that despite OPEC+'s efforts to curb production, it may not be enough to eliminate the anticipated production surplus in the coming year.

Meanwhile, geopolitical risks remain high. Russia recently targeted Ukrainian energy facilities for the second time this month, which analysts at ANZ said could spark retaliation that might affect Russian oil supply.

In Iran, the U.N. nuclear watchdog reported that Tehran plans to install over 6,000 additional uranium-enriching centrifuges, raising concerns about the potential impact on global oil markets. Goldman Sachs analysts have predicted that Iranian oil output could decrease by up to 1 million barrels per day next year if Western sanctions enforcement tightens. Indian equity markets ended the week on a high note, with both the BSE Sensex and NSE Nifty50 closing significantly higher. The Sensex surged by 703.38 points, or 0.89%, to settle at 79,747.12, within a range of 79,923.90 to 79,026.18. Similarly, the Nifty50 climbed 216.95 points, or 0.91%, to close at 24,131.10, extending a positive sentiment across sectors.

Airtel was a key driver of the market rally, rising by 4%, followed by strong performances from Cipla, Sun Pharma, Mahindra & Mahindra, and Tata Consumer, all seeing substantial gains. On the flip side, Power Grid Corpora-

tion, Shriram Finance, Hero MotoCorp, HDFC Life, and Nestle India were the top losers, with declines reaching as much as 1.35%.

Among the heavyweights, Reliance Industries (RIL) stood out, gaining 1.63%. In the broader market, the Nifty Midcap100 and Nifty Small-cap100 indices also posted positive returns, rising by 0.16% and 0.75%, respectively.

Sector-wise, the pharmaceutical and healthcare industries were the standout performers. The Nifty Pharma index rose 2.35%, while the Healthcare index gained 2.04%. These gains were supported by strong performances in stocks such as Sun Pharma and Cipla.

Looking ahead, market attention will shift towards India's Q2 GDP data and trends in Asian markets. Investors will also be closely watching foreign institutional investor (FII) activity

ECB Bans Players from PSL During Domestic Season

The England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) has made a significant move to prevent its players from participating in the Pakistan Super League (PSL) and other franchise leagues that clash with the domestic summer. This decision, which excludes participation in the Indian Premier League (IPL), comes as part of a new policy aimed at prioritizing domestic commitments.

According to a report in *The Telegraph* on

November 28, the ECB's decision means that English players will not be allowed to take part in the PSL or any other franchise leagues during the domestic season, which typically runs from April to September. However, the board has confirmed that players will still be available for the IPL for the next three seasons.

The timing of this move is significant, as for their international careers. it limits the opportunity for English cricketers to participate in the highly lucrative PSL, a competition that has grown in prominence over the past few years. This ban could negatively impact the earnings of several top English players who have made a name for themselves in the PSL, but the ECB maintains that this is a necessary step to ensure the health and competitiveness of the domestic game.



The policy change is expected to have a mixed reaction within the cricketing community. While some argue that it will help bolster the quality of England's domestic competitions, others fear it could restrict opportunities for players to earn significant money from other leagues. Additionally, it might limit the exposure of English cricketers to different playing conditions and experiences, which could be valuable


