TPN , Telangana : The Telangana government, led by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, has made a significant decision to halt the land acquisition process for the proposed Pharma Village in Lagacharla, Vikarabad district. The move comes in response to growing opposition from local farmers and residents, who expressed concerns about the project. A government statement confirmed the withdrawal of the notification issued on August 1, 2024, which had aimed to acquire 632 acres from 580 farmers.

The Pharma Village was intended to boost industrial development in the area, with a focus on creating employment opportunities for the locals. However, when officials, including the district collector, visited the village to gather feedback, they faced protests that escalated into clashes. The government is also investigating alleged political conspiracies behind the unrest.

Chief Minister Revanth Reddy emphasized that his administration prioritizes

public welfare and does not wish to impose hardships on citizens. While some farmers supported the initiative, others expressed concerns, particularly about potential pollution caused by pharmaceutical industries. Acknowledging these apprehensions, the government decided to reassess its plans.

In a bid to address unemployment in the region, the government is now considering alternative industries that are less likely to face public resistance. Sources suggest that plans are underway to establish a textile industrial park instead, which is expected to create substantial job opportunities without posing environmental risks. A new land acquisition notification may be issued in the coming days for this purpose.

This proactive approach demonstrates the government's commitment to balancing development with the concerns of its citizens while ensuring sustainable growth in Vikarabad district.

Govt Unveils Full Details of Dilavarpur Company Permits

Controversial Permits for Ethanol Plant Environmental Violations Uncovered Central and State Approvals Scrutinized

TPN, **Telangana**: The Telangana government has disclosed comprehensive information regarding the permits granted to the ethanol company located in Dilavarpur, Nirmal district, which were issued during the previous BRS government. Allegations have surfaced suggesting that permits were granted under misleading pretenses, especially concerning environmental and regulatory violations.

According to the information released, the Central government only authorized the production of fuel ethanol. However, the Cabinet of the former BRS regime extended approvals for a broader range of products, including ethanol, extra neutral alcohol (ENA), industrial spirit, and absolute alcohol, under the guise of fuel ethanol production. This move is being criticized for bypassing key regulatory processes, particularly environmental permits.

The government further revealed that while the Central guidelines required the company to obtain the NOC (No Objection Certificate) from local bodies, the PMK Distillations company proceeded without securing the necessary local approvals. Additionally, a compound wall was constructed without the appropriate permissions. These violations allegedly occurred with the support of the former BRS government.

Notably, the former government's actions in 2022, including issuing a letter of indent and granting approval for the production of 600 lakh liters of ethanol and other products, have come under scrutiny. The Cabinet ratified these decisions in December 2022, and the company was granted exemptions from public consultation based on its self-certification. The Central government had granted its permits for fuel ethanol production in February 2023, with water allocations approved in June 2023 and final permissions processed through TSIPASS in December 2023.

This disclosure is sparking controversy, as critics claim that the previous government's leniency towards the company has led to significant regulatory lapses and potential environmental concerns.

This move will result in increased salaries for thousands of employees in these sectors. The Finance Department of Telangana issued orders to provide a 5% interim relief on the current basic salary for employees in government institutions, cooperative societies, and universities. This follows a similar decision made in October of the previous year when the government had granted a 5% interim relief to state government employees and pensioners. At that time, only government employees benefited from the decision. However, in response to requests from other employee groups, particularly following public victories, the government de-

cided to extend this benefit to other sectors. CM Revanth Reddy instructed the Finance Department to issue orders ensuring that employees in government institutions and cooperative societies receive the same interim relief. This decision is expected to positively impact thousands of teachers in universities and colleges, as well as staff in cooperative societies, by increasing their salaries and allowances. Employees in these sectors have expressed their happiness, calling it a timely and much-needed gesture from the government. Many are celebrating the government's decision, viewing it as a New Year's gift after a year of governance under the Revanth Reddy administration.

TPN, **Telangana**: In a fresh political feud, Telangana Minister Konda Surekha has made sensational allegations against BRS leader RS Praveen Kumar. She claimed that Praveen Kumar was behind conspiracies involving the state's Gurukuls and welfare hostels, accus-

ing him of appointing his followers as staff during his tenure as secretary. Surekha criticized the previous government for neglecting welfare hostels, alleging that poor conditions, including food contamination, led to significant student grievances during that period.

hostel under her government, Surekha urged the opposition not to politicize the tragedy, emphasizing the special medical attention the student received. She also took aim at KTR, accusing him of repeatedly claiming he would go to jail for the people, saying his statements stem from his past wrongdoings.

Surekha, a former MLA during the BRS government, slammed both KCR and KTR for ignoring the concerns of legislators. She questioned their lack of communication with fellow MLAs and ministers, further criticizing KTR's dramatic claims of bringing down the government if given the chance to rule.

Komatireddy Unveils Key Farmer and Infrastructure Plans

TPN, **Telangana**: Minister Komatireddy Venkatreddy made significant announcements regarding farmer support and infrastructure development during a meeting with Congress workers at Ramreddy Garden near Nizamabad on November 29. The Minister confirmed that farmers would receive an assurance of Rs 7,000 per acre for Sankranthi, offering relief to many in the farming community.In addition, Komatireddy revealed plans to launch the Indiramma House Scheme next month, a move aimed at addressing housing issues for the poor. He also criticized the Kaleshwaram project, stating that it had been built with a borrowing of Rs 7 lakh crore but had ultimately collapsed.

Komatireddy emphasized that in the next three years, BT roads would be laid in every village, with roads expanded from the mandal level to district centers. He outlined this plan as part of the government's broader effort to improve rural infrastructure and connectivity.Turning to political matters, Komatireddy strongly countered former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao's Deeksha Divas, calling it a "fake fast." He claimed that KCR had taken glucose, saline, and vitamins during his fast and mocked the event as a staged show of sacrifice. The Minister contrasted KCR's actions with his own, recalling his 11-day fast in Nalgonda for the formation of Telangana.

Komatireddy also criticized KCR for failing to deliver even a single double-bedroom house for the poor in the last decade. He added that the Telangana government's current condition was increasingly criticized, predicting the government's fall soon.

This series of announcements and statements reflect Komatireddy's commitment to addressing key issues and his growing criticism of the BRS leadership.







Tummala Says Farmers Prefer Bonus Over Rythu Bandhu



TPN, **Telangana**: Telangana Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao made a bold statement regarding the state's flagship farmer welfare scheme, Rythu Bandhu, suggesting that farmers believe a bonus is better than the benefits provided by the scheme. Tummala's comments have gone viral, with the minister criticizing the previous government's approach to farmer welfare.

In a public address, Tummala claimed that farmers have expressed a preference for bonuses of up to Rs. 15,000 per acre over the existing Rythu Bandhu scheme, which offers financial assistance for crops. He acknowledged that while the government has made efforts such as loan waivers, insurance, and farmer assurances, it may have been misguided in some areas.

Tummala emphasized that his priority is to listen to farmers and implement measures that they believe will benefit them the most. His remarks come amid claims from the opposition that the Congress government is planning to hold a "Rythu Bandhu bandh" to protest the scheme.

The minister's comments reflect the growing debate over how best to support Telangana's agricultural community, with some advocating for more direct financial aid in the form of bonuses.

Vinay Bhaskar Calls for KCR's Return as Chief Minister

TPN, **Telangana**: Vinay Bhaskar, along with other BRS leaders, organized the Deeksha Diwas program at the party office in Balasamudram, where he made significant remarks about the future leadership of Telangana. Bhaskar emphasized that K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) should once again be appointed as Chief Minister, citing his pivotal role in the movement for Telangana's statehood.

Recalling the struggles and challenges faced during the Telangana movement, Bhaskar highlighted how the current government is allegedly troubling the people and failing to deliver on promises. Furthermore, Bhaskar announced that the party will begin a movement demanding local job opportunities in Kazipet, reflecting the party's ongoing commitment to regional development.



Kasam Venkateswarlu Criticizes Congress for Failing to Deliver



TPN, **Telangana**: BJP state general secretary Kasam Venkateswarlu strongly condemned the arrest of BJP leaders across Telangana, labeling the house arrests as "evil." He expressed concern over the Congress government's handling of state affairs, claiming it is misleading the people under the guise of "Prajapalan" (people's rule), but is, in reality, engaged in destructive governance.

Venkateswarlu stated that the Congress party has failed multiple times in its administration, not only in short-term evaluations but also in long-term assessments. He questioned whether the government, which has not passed basic tests of governance, had any right to celebrate its failures.

He pointed out the inconsistency of the government's actions, citing the arrests of BJP leaders in Nalgonda while a Chief Minister's meeting was scheduled in Mahabubnagar. Venkateswarlu demanded the immediate release of arrested BJP leaders, questioning the need for permission to submit a petition. Furthermore, he criticized the Congress government for blaming others without conducting any investigation into food poisoning incidents, showing a lack of accountability.

Rajagopal Reddy Criticizes Gurukul Staff Over Poor Food Quality



TPN, **Telangana**: Munugodu MLA Komatireddy Rajagopal Reddy voiced strong displeasure during a surprise inspection of the Mahatma Jyothibapule BC Girls Gurukul hostels in Munugodu town. The MLA was angered by the substandard quality of the food being served to the students, especially the rice, curries, sambar, and curd. He criticized the cooking agency staff for serving stale rice and ordered them to improve the quality immediately.

Rajagopal Reddy pointed out that despite the Congress government increasing mess charges to ensure better welfare for students, the food quality remained poor. He expressed frustration with the staff, demanding better meals for the students and emphasized that such negligence was unacceptable. His sharp remarks targeted both the cooks and the administrators of the cooking agency, urging them to take immediate corrective action.



TPN, **Telangana**: Former Minister Prashanth Reddy expressed sharp criticism of the current Telangana government during his participation in the BRS Deeksha Diwas. He concluded by asserting that the BRS was unafraid of police cases and promised to restore the state's true progress in the future, as the eyes of Congress leaders have now been "wide open."

Ayilaiah Vows Action After Discovery of Expired Injections

TPN, **Telangana**: Aleru MLA Beerla Ayilaiah has expressed serious concerns after discovering expired injections in a local government hospital during a surprise inspection. On Friday morning, Ayilaiah visited government hostels and ashram schools in his constituency, where he also conducted an inspection of food quality and basic facilities. After speaking with students at the Jyothirao Phule hostel, he expressed satisfaction with the food served but warned the staff that with the recent increase in diet charges, quality must be maintained. He emphasized that any failure to provide adequate food would lead to strict action.

In his visit to the local government hospital, Ayilaiah discovered expired injections in the hospital's injection box, which he described as a serious lapse in medical care. He criticized the negligence of doctors and hospital staff and vowed to take action against any neglect of medical services.

The MLA also urged BRS leaders to refrain from politicizing issues concerning children and the welfare of students. He promised to ensure that necessary steps were taken to improve facilities in government hostels and maintain high standards in the healthcare sector.

Minister Komatireddy Reviews Development Projects

TPN, **Telangana**: Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy conducted a detailed review of ongoing development projects in Nizamabad district at the Collector's office. He assessed the progress of state and national highways and road constructions, commending Collector Rajiv Gandhi Hanumanthu for completing 95% of the district's survey work.

The minister prioritized road repairs, directing officials to fill 250 kilometers of potholes starting from the 1st of the month. He set a target for pothole-free roads by Sankranti and ordered the completion of the Indalwai-Bheengal road within two days. Additionally, Komatireddy urged for the expedited revised estimate for the



Nizamabad flyover project.

On grain procurement, the minister confirmed a target of 5 lakh tonnes, with Rs 736 crore already paid. He emphasized the timely payment of dues and assured support for farmers, despite opposition criticism.

Komatireddy also addressed issues with Mission Bhagiratha, questioning delays in water supply despite a Rs 3 crore allocation. He instructed officials to resolve the issue promptly.

In support of the RRR project, the minister announced meetings with Prime Minister Modi and Union Minister Gadkari to

push for further progress, reaffirming the government's commitment to development and welfare.





Relief for Patnam Narender Reddy in **Telangana High Court**

Nampally Court Summons Konda Surekha in **Defamation Case**



HC Dismisses KA Paul's **Petition on Defected MLAs**

TPN , Hyderabad: The Telangana High Court on Thursday, November 28, dismissed the petition filed by Praja Shanti Party president Kilari Anand Paul, which sought to prevent defected MLAs from the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) who joined the Congress, from attending the Telangana Assembly sessions. The petition also sought to bar the defected MLAs from participating in legislative debates and casting votes. Paul argued that the defected legislators violated the Tenth Schedule of the Indian Constitution, which deals with disqualification due to defection. He claimed that the MLAs, who had contested the elections on the BRS ticket and later joined the Congress, should be disqualified under the anti-defection law.

The division bench, led by Chief Justice Alok Aradhe and Justice J. Sreenivas Rao, dismissed the petition, emphasizing that the Speaker of the Assembly must first adjudicate the disqualification petitions in accordance with the prescribed procedures under the Members of Legislative Assembly (MLA) (Disqualification on the Ground of Defection) Rules, 1986. The bench further clarified that no action could be taken against the defected MLAs until the Speaker's ruling on their disqualification. The court acknowledged concerns raised by the state advocate general, A. Sudershan Reddy, regarding the potential violation of the constitutional separation of powers, and modified a previous order that had set a specific timeline for the Speaker's action. While the bench removed the time frame, it stressed the need for the Speaker to resolve the disqualification petitions promptly.

FPN , Hyderabad : The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has initiat ed a suo motu inquiry into the tragic death of a 25-year-old surrogate woman in Hyderabad's Raidurg area, who allegedly died by suicide to escape sexual abuse. The woman, originally from Odisha, was reportedly brought to the city under a surrogacy arrangement with her husband.

The NHRC issued notices to the state's chief secretary and the director general of police, demanding a detailed report within two weeks, which should include the status of the FIR and any related cases of harassment under the surrogacy arrangement in Telangana.Local reports suggest that after the couple arrived in Hyderabad, the woman was made to stay alone in a separate room in a high-rise apartment. On November 26, she fell from the ninth floor of the building, and initial investigations suggested suicide. However, further investigation revealed sarees and a dupatta tied to the balcony railing, indicating she might have tried to escape.

Her husband later accused the man who hired her for surrogacy of inappropriate behavior and alleged attempts to abuse her. Authorities have registered a case of abetment to suicide against Rajesh Babu, the alleged abuser, and are pursuing the investigation.

Fire Breaks Out Near Navy VLF Station Site in Damagundam Forest

Due to the absence of a qualified cook, food is being prepared by daily wage workers. The inspection revealed a troubling sight in the storeroom: rotten potatoes, moldy vegetables, and packets of salt without ISI certification. When the cooks attempted to prepare dal, they served water-based sambar instead, falling short of the menu's nutritional requirements.

Adding to the concern, when eggs were cooked, they were found to be rotten. Despite the onset of winter, students have not received their uniforms, and blankets were yet to be provided. This lack of basic necessities further highlights the neglect faced by students at the school.

Deepak Tiwari, who was horrified by the conditions, has ordered an investigation into the matter. The incident has raised serious concerns about the management of Gurukul schools and the well-being of students enrolled in these institutions. Authorities are now under pressure to take immediate corrective actions to address the situation and ensure the safety and welfare of the students. The incident has sparked widespread outrage, with many calling for accountability and urgent reforms in the management of Gurukul schools across the state.

Pakistan In Turmoil Again

Pakistan is grappling with a deepening crisis as violence and political unrest continue to disrupt the nation. On November 27, 2024, security forces fired tear gas at thousands of supporters of former Prime Minister Imran Khan, who had stormed the capital, Islamabad, demanding his release from prison. At least six people were killed, and many others were injured in the ensuing clashes. Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaaf (PTI) supporters, led by his wife Bushra Bibi and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur, had planned a sit-in at D-Chowk, near the parliament, in a last-ditch effort to pressure the government. However, the Pakistani government, led by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, launched a major crackdown, arresting many protesters and dispersing the rally.

This protest comes at a time of national turmoil. Over the past several months, Pakistan has been embroiled in an ongoing battle between PTI supporters and the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) government. Khan, who was overthrown in a parliamentary no-confidence vote in 2022, has since accused the current government of being complicit with the military to remove him from office. Khan was imprisoned in August 2023 after being convicted in nearly 150 cases. Despite his imprisonment, Khan remains highly popular, particularly in the provinces of Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, where his supporters have regularly organized protests, even though these movements have been short-lived due to government crackdowns.

The political chaos is further exacerbated by increasing sectarian violence, particularly in the northwest Kurram district in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Recent clashes between Shia and Sunni communities have resulted in the deaths of at least 82 people, following retaliatory attacks after gunmen killed 40 Shia Muslims in late November. Additionally, the insurgency in Balochistan continues to escalate, fueled by the province's opposition to Chinese investments and a history of separatist movements.

Ukraine conflict, the US, alongside the UK and France, granted Kyiv permission earlier this month to use long-range weapons against Russian targets. This move came in response to Russian aggression and Moscow's deployment of North Korean troops in Kursk. Within 24 hours of receiving approval, Ukraine launched a series of missile strikes, firing six ATACMS missiles into Bryansk and storming Russian air defense positions in Kursk with Storm Shadow cruise missiles.

In retaliation, Russian President Vladimir Putin approved revisions to the country's nuclear doctrine, lowering the threshold for nuclear weapon use. This development marks a dangerous escalation, with Russia also testing a new hypersonic missile, the Oreshnik, targeting a defense facility in Dnipro, Ukraine. This marked the first time Russia had deployed medium-range ballistic missiles in combat, bringing the conflict closer to the possibility of nuclear confrontation.

Ukraine's request for long-range weap-

In a significant shift in the ongoing Biden as early as September. However, the request went unanswered until Russia's Security Council proposed changes to its nuclear policy, prompting a decision to grant Ukraine the necessary weapons. Despite former President Donald Trump's election victory in November and his apparent desire to broker peace and end the conflict, President Biden remains committed to supporting Ukraine, ensuring continued US involvement in the war.

> The tempo of the conflict has rapidly escalated. After Russia's strike on Dnipro, Ukraine retaliated with a salvo of ATACMS missiles, targeting the Kursk region. Ukraine now has the capability to strike up to 300 km into Russian territory, including key military installations in regions like Smolensk, Tula, and Rostov-on-Don. These areas are crucial to Russia's military infrastructure, and Moscow perceives these attacks as direct signs of increased Western involvement in the war.

In response, Russia has escalated its strikes on Ukraine. According to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelons had been considered by President ensky, Moscow has launched over 800

bombs, 460 drones, and 20 missiles since Ukraine's first long-range strike. Ukraine's territorial losses are mounting, particularly in Kursk and Donbass, where Russian forces, bolstered by North Korean troops, are gaining ground.

Amid the escalating conflict, Russia's updated nuclear doctrine has raised alarms. It now allows for the potential use of nuclear weapons in response to conventional attacks, a departure from its previous policy that reserved nuclear strikes for nuclear threats or existential attacks. This nuclear saber-rattling continues to intensify as the war drags on.

As all eyes turn to the potential return of Donald Trump to the White House, Russian officials hope that his peace plan could bring the war to a close. Trump has expressed a desire to end the conflict, but the evolving situation in Ukraine may force him to continue supporting Kyiv, mirroring policies of his predecessor, President Biden. The outcome of the next US administration could significantly influence the trajectory of the conflict.

A ceasefire between Israel and Hezbollah officially took effect, bringing some relief after weeks of intensified conflict. The deal, brokered by the Biden Administration with France's support, was welcomed by many as a necessary step to halt the devastating violence that had claimed thousands of lives, with Lebanon reporting over 3,500 casualties. This ceasefire marks a pivotal moment in a long-running conflict, but its sustainability remains uncertain.

The recent escalation saw Israel targeting Hezbollah's infrastructure and leadership, aiming to eliminate a key player in the 'Axis of Resistance' alongside Iran. Israel's military operations included precision strikes designed to decapitate Hezbollah's leadership, including its leader Hassan Nasrallah, hoping to cripple the group's capabilities. In response, Hezbollah unleashed missile barrages and other high-precision weaponry, even hitting Israel's symbolic targets, including the home of Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu.

The goal of the ceasefire is to bring stability to the region, allowing for the return of displaced residents, particularly in areas like Dahiyeh in Beirut. It also aims to pave the way for political dialogue that could address the underlying issues fueling the conflict. While this truce provides a temporary respite, the complex web of alliances and grievances between Israel, Hezbollah, and regional powers raises questions about how long it will last.

The international community, led by the United States and France, has pushed for this ceasefire to prevent further escalation and the loss of civilian lives. The Biden Administration sees this as a necessary step to manage the crisis, especially after the failure to deter Hezbollah's involvement in the broader conflict. However, despite the ceasefire, Hezbollah's military strength and ideological commitment to confronting Israel will continue to pose a significant challenge.

In conclusion, the Israel-Hezbollah ceasefire offers a fragile hope for peace but serves as a reminder of the ongoing volatility in the region. While the ceasefire has allowed for temporary relief, both parties remain deeply entrenched in their positions, and the path to lasting peace remains fraught with uncertainty.

Siddaramaiah meets PM Modi, urges action on farm loans and water projects

Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah met Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday to address several financial and infrastructure issues facing the state. During their discussion in the Parliament complex, Siddaramaiah raised key concerns, including a significant reduction in agricultural credit for the state and the delay in crucial infrastructure projects.

One of the major issues highlighted by Siddaramaiah was the 58% cut in Karnataka's short-term agricultural credit limit by the National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD). The loan limit for 2024-25 was reduced from Rs 5,600 crore in the previous year to just Rs 2,340 crore. The Chief Minister warned that this drastic reduction would push over 35 lakh farmers towards private lenders, further straining the agriculture sector. He urged the central government to restore the previous loan limits to ensure the stability of the farming community.

Siddaramaiah also sought immediate financial assistance for the Upper Bhadra Project, a critical irrigation initiative designed to address drought concerns in central Karnataka. He requested the release of Rs 5,300 crore to expedite the project's completion. Additionally, he pressed for faster clearances for two other key water-related projects—the Mekedatu Balancing Reservoir and the Kalasa Banduri water diversion project—both of which are stalled due to pending approvals from the Jal Shakti and Environment ministries.

The Chief Minister also advocated for the development of Bengaluru's infrastructure, a vital part of the state's economy. He requested Rs 10,000 crore to enhance infrastructure across 13 emerging city corporations, under the Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT). This funding is expected to boost urban development and improve the city's growing infrastructure needs.

Siddaramaiah further raised concerns over Karnataka's reduced share in tax allocation under the 15th Finance Commission and called for compensation grants. He emphasized the need for a fair distribution of funds under the 16th Finance Commission to ensure that states contributing significantly to national revenues are not unfairly penalized.

Further talks will continue, and we will announce the final decision when it is made," said the outgoing Chief Minister. He emphasized that he would not be an obstacle in the government formation process and would respect the decision taken by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Amit



Shah.

"I value the 'ladka bhau' (beloved brother) title more than anything else," Shinde said, underlining his commitment to the collective leadership of the alliance. He also noted the importance of respecting the people's mandate, which had re-elected the alliance with a strong majority, rather than focusing solely on positions.

The meeting with Shah and Nadda was described as a productive one, with Shinde stating that there was good coordination between the alliance partners. He reiterated that the priority was to honor the people's mandate and swiftly form the government.

Atishi Jokes About Bus Marshals, **Targets BJP MLA in Delhi Assembly**

In a light-hearted exchange during Friday's Delhi Assembly session, Chief Minister Atishi humorously suggested that reinstating bus marshals would guarantee the victory of the ruling Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) in next year's Delhi Assembly elections. "At a meeting on November 10, we discussed the issue. By November 13, we had submitted a report to the Lieutenant Governor (LG)," Atishi said, adding, "Now, the proposal is still pending with him." She then humorously told Gupta, "You keep saying that the marshals were removed because Kejriwal asked for it, but now I am the Chief Minister, and I am saying, 'Please bring them back."

Atishi didn't miss an opportunity to make a playful comment about Delhi's Lieutenant Governor, VK Saxena, with whom the AAP government has had frequent disagreements. "If the LG listens to everything a Chief Minister says, then he should listen to me and reinstate the bus marshals," she quipped, smiling broadly.





UK PM Keir Starmer Announces Plans to Cut Migration Following Record Highs

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer announced on Thursday that his government would introduce new measures to reduce migration, including reforms to the UK's pointsbased immigration system. This decision comes after the release of official data showing that net migration to the UK in 2023 exceeded initial projections, reaching a record 900,000.

The data has raised concerns, prompting the government to take action to manage the growing influx of migrants. While Starmer's government has introduced stricter visa rules in recent months, which have already led to a decline in the number of arrivals, the Prime Minister's announcement signifies a more comprehensive approach to controlling migration levels.

In a statement, Starmer emphasized that the UK's immigration system needed to be better aligned

The government's points-based system, which was introduced after Brexit, aims to select migrants based on skills, qualifications, and job offers. However, with net migration figures soaring, critics argue that the system has not been effective in preventing high levels of immigration, particularly from low-skilled workers. Starmer's government has promised to tighten regulations around non-skilled migration and ensure that entry into the UK is granted based on more stringent criteria.

While the new plans are still in development, they are expected to be a key part of Starmer's agenda as the government prepares for the upcoming general election. The issue of migration has long been a contentious topic in British politics, and with migration numbers reaching historic highs, it is likely to be a central focus in the coming months.

India has raised "serious concern" with Bangladesh over the increasing incidents of violence against the Hindu minority and the growing extremism in the country. The MEA emphasized that New Delhi has consistently raised the issue with the Bangladesh government, urging them to uphold their responsibility to protect all citizens, particularly vulnerable minority communities.

"We are concerned about the surge of extremist rhetoric, increasing incidents of violence, and provocation," the Ministry stated, underlining that these developments could not be dismissed as mere media exaggeration. The ongoing attacks



has formally recognized the massacre of West African soldiers by the French Army in 1944, offering an official acknowledgment in a letter to Senegalese authorities. This recognition comes ahead of the 80th anniversary of the tragic event, which took place on December 1, 1944, in the village of Thiaroye, located just outside the Senegalese capital, Dakar. Macron's statement marks the first time the French government has officially termed the killings as a "massacre."

The victims of the massacre were between 35 and 400 West African soldiers, many of whom had fought for France during World War II as part of the Tirailleurs Senegalais, a colonial infantry unit. These soldiers had served in the Battle of France in 1940 but were later involved in disputes over unpaid wages. On December 1, 1944, tensions escalated, and French soldiers opened fire on the unarmed West African troops, killing them in what was described as a brutal retaliation for a suspected mutiny over the wage issue.

Macron's recognition comes at a time when France's influence is waning in West Africa, where former French colonies have increasingly sought independence from French political, military, and economic control. This shift in regional power dynamics has placed additional pressure on France to confront its colonial past and address historical injustices, particularly regarding its treatment of African soldiers who served in the French military.

By acknowledging the massacre for the first time, Macron is responding to longstanding calls for justice from the descendants of the victims and African leaders. This move is seen as an important step in addressing France's colonial legacy and healing relations between France and its former colonies, particularly in West Africa.

Russian President Vladimir Putin has expressed concern for the safety of US President-elect Donald Trump, following several attempts on his life. Speaking to reporters in Kazakhstan after a summit, Putin described Trump as an experienced and intelligent politician but noted his belief that Trump is not safe, citing assassination attempts on the former president.

Trump was wounded in a July 2024 assassination attempt in Pennsylvania, and in a separate incident in September, a man was arrested for allegedly attempting to assassinate Trump at one of his Florida golf courses. These incidents have raised alarms about the risks Trump faces, according to Putin.

Putin expressed shock at the tactics used during the US election campaign, calling them "absolutely uncivilized" and pointing to the multiple assassination attempts as evidence of the extreme measures taken against Trump. "In my opinion, he is not safe now," Putin stated, adding that while Trump is intelligent, he must remain cautious given the potential threats. Putin, who himself is heavily protected, also condemned the political attacks on Trump's family, describing them as "revolting" and noting that such tactics would not even be used by "bandits" in Russia. He emphasized the personal toll such criticism can take on Trump's family and children.

Turning to international affairs, Putin weighed in on the ongoing conflict in Ukraine, particularly regarding the Biden administration's approval of long-range Western missiles for Ukraine. He suggested that this decision could be part of a larger political strategy to either help Trump by giving him something to potentially roll back or, conversely, to complicate his relationship with Russia further.

Australia's PM Albanese Shifts Focus to Election Campaign Amid Rising Living Costs



Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese is shifting gears toward election mode, aiming to regain voter confidence by addressing the growing concerns around high living costs, particularly housing. This comes after a flurry of legislative activity, with 31 new laws passed in a marathon session late Thursday night, including a groundbreaking social media ban for children-a first in the world. The swift legislative action has sparked speculation that Albanese may call a national election before February, though the official date must be set by May 17. Albanese's center-left Labor government, which came to power in 2022, faces a challenging contest against the conservative Liberal-National coalition in the upcoming election. Polls indicate a decline in public support for the prime minister, as Australians grapple with the rising costs of housing, food, and energy, exacerbated by global inflation.

In a press conference following the midnight legislative session, Albanese acknowledged the difficulties that Australian households are fac-

ing due to these cost-of-living pressures. "We know that we have more work to do on cost of living, but we're making progress," he said. The prime minister emphasized his government's understanding of the economic strain on families and reiterated that addressing these issues remains a priority.

The surge in living costs has been a major point of contention for Albanese, who is now focused on policies that can alleviate the financial burden on ordinary Australians. While his government has enacted a series of reforms, including measures aimed at housing affordability, it remains to be seen whether these initiatives will be enough to win back voter support ahead of the election. With the election looming, Albanese's government is betting on its legislative agenda to secure its political future. However, as inflation continues to affect household budgets, the upcoming months will be crucial in determining whether the Labor government can turn the tide and regain its footing in the polls.





Nifty, Sensex Rally on Heavyweights and Sectoral Gains



Domestic stock markets surged today, driven by heavyweights like Bharti Airtel, Reliance Industries, and Sun Pharma, closing with significant gains on Friday. Despite mixed signals from global markets, investors showed confidence. The easing of fears regarding the US economy also supported the rally. As a result, Nifty 50 and Sensex rose substantially, with the latter gaining 700 points. The pharma and healthcare sectors saw notable buying activity.

The BSE Sensex, which closed at 79,043 in the previous session, opened at 79,032 today. It touched an intraday low of 79,026 and an intraday high of 79,923 before closing at 79,802, up 759 points. The NSE Nifty opened at 23,927, hit a low of 23,927 and a high of 24,188, and finally settled at 24,131, up 216 points. Bank Nifty rose 148 points to close at 52,055.

In the Nifty50 index, 43 companies

advanced, while 7 declined. Bharti Airtel, Sun Pharma, Cipla, M&M, and Tata Consumer Products were the top gainers. On the other hand, Power Grid, Shriram Finance, Hero MotoCorp, HDFC Life,

and Nestle India saw losses. Except for PSU Bank and Realty, all sectoral indices ended in the green, with Auto, Media, Pharma, Healthcare, Oil & Gas showing strong momentum.

Out of 2,870 stocks traded on the NSE, 1,742 gained, and 1,043 declined. Shares of 66 companies touched all-time highs, while 20 stocks hit their 52week lows.

The rupee ended flat at 84.49 against the US dollar. Among stock-

India's Economic Growth Slows to 5.4% in July-September Quarter



India's economic growth slowed to a near two-year low of 5.4% in the July-September quarter of the 2023-24 fiscal year, down from 8.1% in the same period last year, according to official data released on Friday. This decline was primarily attributed to weaker performance in the manufacturing sector, which experienced a significant slowdown.

Despite the dip in growth, India continues to be the fastest-growing major economy, surpassing China, whose GDP grew by 4.6% during the same quarter. The last time India recorded such low growth was in the third quarter (October-December) of the 2022-23 financial year, when the economy expanded by just 4.3%.

The data, compiled by the National Statistical Office (NSO), showed that the agricultural sector saw a notable improvement, with Gross Value Added (GVA) growth accelerating to 3.5% in the July-September period, up from 1.7% a year earlier. This rise was driven by favorable monsoon conditions and higher agricultural output. On the other hand, the manufacturing sector faced a sharp deceleration, with GVA growth slowing to just 2.2% compared to 14.3% during the same quarter in 2022. The sluggishness in manufacturing growth, which is a critical driver of India's economy, had a significant impact on the overall GDP performance.

The overall GDP growth for the first half of the current fiscal year (April-September 2023) stood at 6%, a decrease from 8.2% in the first half of the previous fiscal year. The growth in the first quarter (April-June) of 2023-24 remained steady at 6.7%, indicating that the slowdown was more pronounced in the second quarter.

While India's economy faces challenges in key sectors, particularly manufacturing, it still holds a relatively strong growth trajectory compared to other major economies. However, policymakers will need to address these weaknesses to sustain growth in the coming months.

Oil Prices Fall Amid Eased Supply Concerns, Heading for Weekly Drop

Sensex Jumps 759 Points, Nifty Hits 24,100; Airtel and Pharma Lead

O il prices dropped on Friday, heading toward a weekly decline of more than 3%, as concerns over potential supply disruptions from the Israel-Hezbollah conflict eased, alleviating earlier fears.

Brent crude futures fell by 55 cents, or 0.8%, settling at \$72.73 per barrel by 0758 GMT. Meanwhile, U.S. West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude futures were at \$69.52, down 20 cents, or 0.3%, compared to Wednesday's

close.On a weekly basis, Brent futures were down by 3.3%, and the U.S. WTI benchmark had fallen 3.8%.

The tensions between Israel and Hezbollah, which had raised concerns about oil supply disruptions, appeared to calm after both sides traded accusations over alleged ceasefire violations on Thursday. A ceasefire deal had been brokered earlier in the week, initially reducing the risk of a broader conflict that could disrupt Middle Eastern oil supplies.

Despite these geopolitical tensions, oil supply from the Middle East has remained largely unaffected during Israel's conflicts with both Hezbollah in Lebanon and Hamas in Gaza.

In other developments, OPEC+ (the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries and allies including Russia) postponed its next policy meeting from December 1 to December 5 to avoid a scheduling conflict. It is widely expected that OPEC+ will extend its current production cuts at the meeting.

BMI, a unit of Fitch Solutions, revised its Brent price forecast for 2025, lowering it to \$76 per barrel from \$78, citing a "bearish fundamental outlook" and expectations of continued weakness in the oil market. BMI analysts warned that despite OPEC+'s efforts to curb production, it may not be enough to eliminate the anticipated production surplus in the coming year.

Meanwhile, geopolitical risks remain high. Russia recently targeted Ukrainian energy facilities for the second time this month, which analysts at ANZ said could spark retaliation that might affect Russian oil supply.

In Iran, the U.N. nuclear watchdog reported that Tehran plans to install over 6,000 additional uranium-enriching centrifuges, raising concerns about the potential impact on global oil markets. Goldman Sachs analysts have predicted that Iranian oil output could decrease by up to 1 million barrels per day next year if Western sanctions enforcement tightens. Indian equity markets ended the week on a high note, with both the BSE Sensex and NSE Nifty50 closing significantly higher. The Sensex surged by 703.38 points, or 0.89%, to settle at 79,747.12, within a range of 79,923.90 to 79,026.18. Similarly, the Nifty50 climbed 216.95 points, or 0.91%, to close at 24,131.10, extending a positive sentiment across sectors.

Airtel was a key driver of the market rally, rising by 4%, followed by strong performances from Cipla, Sun Pharma, Mahindra & Mahindra, and Tata Consumer, all seeing substantial gains. On the flip side, Power Grid Corpora-

tion, Shriram Finance, Hero MotoCorp, HDFC Life, and Nestle India were the top losers, with declines reaching as much as 1.35%.

Among the heavyweights, Reliance Industries (RIL) stood out, gaining 1.63%. In the broader market, the Nifty Midcap100 and Nifty Small-cap100 indices also posted positive returns, rising by 0.16% and 0.75%, respectively.

Sector-wise, the pharmaceutical and healthcare industries were the standout performers. The Nifty Pharma index rose 2.35%, while the Healthcare index gained 2.04%. These gains were supported by strong performances in stocks such as Sun Pharma and Cipla.

Looking ahead, market attention will shift towards India's Q2 GDP data and trends in Asian markets. Investors will also be closely watching foreign institutional investor (FII) activity



after a recent brief period of net buying. Data from the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) revealed that FIIs sold stocks worth Rs 11,756.25 crore on November 28, while domestic institutional investors (DIIs) were net buyers, purchasing shares worth Rs 8,718.30 crore.

In corporate news, shares of Easy Trip Planners Ltd surged over 16%, as the stock traded ex-bonus and the company launched its new business travel platform, EMT Desk, for corporate clients.

Additionally, the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE) announced a change in the expiry day for derivatives contracts, moving it from Friday to Tuesday, starting January 1, 2025. This change is expected to impact market dynamics in the new year.

ECB Bans Players from PSL During Domestic Season

The England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) has made a significant move to prevent its players from participating in the Pakistan Super League (PSL) and other franchise leagues that clash with the domestic summer. This decision, which excludes participation in the Indian Premier League (IPL), comes as part of a new policy aimed at prioritizing domestic commitments.

According to a report in *The Telegraph* on

November 28, the ECB's decision means that English players will not be allowed to take part in the PSL or any other franchise leagues during the domestic season, which typically runs from April to September. However, the board has confirmed that players will still be available for the IPL for the next three seasons.

The timing of this move is significant, as for their international careers. it limits the opportunity for English cricketers to participate in the highly lucrative PSL, a competition that has grown in prominence over the past few years. This ban could negatively impact the earnings of several top English players who have made a name for themselves in the PSL, but the ECB maintains that this is a necessary step to ensure the health and competitiveness of the domestic game.



The policy change is expected to have a mixed reaction within the cricketing community. While some argue that it will help bolster the quality of England's domestic competitions, others fear it could restrict opportunities for players to earn significant money from other leagues. Additionally, it might limit the exposure of English cricketers to different playing conditions and experiences, which could be valuable

Tndian Grandmaster D Gukesh and defending World Chess Champion Ding Liren played out a largely risk-free draw in the fourth round of their 14-round World Chess Championship match in Singapore on Friday. After 42 moves, the two players agreed to a draw via repetition, leaving them both with 2 points each after four games. The first player to reach

7.5 points will be crowned the champion.


