TPN, Telangana: Telangana's Deputy Chief to the grid. During a recent visit to the power station, along with Ministers Uttamkumar Reddy and Komatireddy Venkat Reddy, the Deputy CM flagged off a coal train from Ramagundam to the Yadadri facility.

The electricity generated at Stage-1 of the Yadadri Thermal Power Station has successfully been connected to the grid, following the earlier connection of Stage-2. Bhatti Vikramarka emphasized that the remaining three plants are expected to be operational by March next year, ensuring that 4,000 megawatts will soon be available to the public.

In his address to the media, the Deputy CM highlighted the need for a new energy policy, noting that the previous government had not introduced one in the past decade. The upcoming policy will incorporate input from intellectuals and electricity experts in the state. A special meeting of the Legislative Assembly may be convened to gather diverse opinions before finalizing the new energy policy. The Deputy CM also outlined ambitious plans to generate 20,000 megawatts of green energy, aligning with global environmental standards.

## Harish Rao Slams Revanth Government for Neglecting Farmers

TPN , Telangana : Former minister and Siddipet MLA Harish Rao expressed his outrage at the Revanth government, accusing it of prioritizing the beautification of the Musi River over the needs of farmers. During his visit to Baddipadaga village in the Nangunur mandal of Siddipet district, he criticized the government for spending 1.50 lakh crores on beautification while neglecting agricultural support.

Rao inspected a grain purchase center, where farm-



ers voiced their concerns about the lack of harvesting equipment, stating that they had been bringing in paddy for a month without any progress. He pointed out that brokers were buying up to 30 percent of the paddy, leaving farmers without proper support prices. "Before the election, farmers suffered under Congress rule, and now they are facing the same issues," he stated.

## Crypto Scam Uncovered in Nandyala District: **300 Victims, ₹25 Crore Lost**



TPN, Nandyala, Andhra Pradesh: A major cryptocurrency scam involving over 300 victims has come to light in Nandyala district,

where a fraudster named Ramanjaneyulu reportedly amassed nearly ₹25 crore by promising high returns on investments in cryptocurrency. Operating under the name "Tokara" and trading on popular apps like Binance and OKEx, Ramanjaneyulu convinced investors from Kurnool, Nandyala, and Mahbubnagar districts that a ₹1 lakh investment would yield ₹10,000 per month.

Despite being detained by the police, Ramanjaneyulu has been under investigation for 45 days without any formal case registered, raising concerns among the victims. Many allege that this delay in official action suggests possible negligence or even complicity by the authorities.

Ramanjaneyulu is not new to controversy. He became known through his involvement with Keva Industries Organic Herbal Company in 2021, and he allegedly defrauded individuals of ₹90 lakhs in Anantapur before. Police have since identified him as a resident of Peddavadugur in Anantapur district.

As victims wait for justice, calls for accountability are mounting. The affected investors demand swift police action and restitution for their losses.

## Minister Ponguleti Issues Strong Warning Against Encroachment

#### Pledges Development for Warangal



TPN, Warangal: Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy has announced an ambitious development plan for Warangal, aiming to elevate the city as the second capital of Telangana. During his visit on Sunday, the Minister participated in several developmental programs, emphasizing plans to enhance the historic Bhadrakali temple and surrounding infrastructure.

Minister Ponguleti stated that the Bhadrakali tem-

ple will undergo comprehensive development, with Mada streets slated for quick completion to improve accessibility for devotees. Additionally, he promised to convert the Bhadrakali reservoir into a drinking water source, a move aimed at benefiting the local community.

Highlighting progress on the Mamunur Airport, Minister Ponguleti noted that longstanding obstacles have been resolved. He added that the airport will be operational once the central government grants final approval, further boosting Warangal's infrastructure and connectivity.

#### KTR Alleges Corruption in Congress-Led Projects, **Questions Governance in Sitarama Scheme**

TPN, Hyderabad: BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) has accused the Congress party of corruption and mismanagement in Telangana, making strong allegations on social media against its governance approach. KTR criticized the Congress for allegedly making lofty promises but failing to uphold transparency and accountability. In his comments, KTR questioned how tenders worth ₹1,074 crore were issued for the Sitarama Lift Irrigation Scheme without necessary permits. He further pointed to procedural



violations in project distributor operations, highlighting inconsistencies in Congress's decision-making. KTR accused the Congress of issuing contradictory directives, with quick tender calls in one meeting and delays in another.

He also took aim at Congress's recent criticism of the Kaleshwaram Project, a crucial initiative that has expanded irrigetion paragraphic of paragraphic Deputy CM Bhatti gation across crores of acres in Telangana. KTR challenged the Congress's scrutiny, calling it unwarranted, as the project has already proved transformative for the region.

KTR's remarks underscore the ongoing political tensions in Telangana, as he positions BRS as a party committed to transparent governance in contrast to Congress's alleged inconsistencies and corruption.

Rao emphasized that during KCR's government, every grain was purchased, unlike the current situation where farmers are staging protests due to inaction. He criticized the Revanth government for failing to set up cotton buying centers, allowing brokers from Andhra to exploit local farmers. The former minister highlighted that farmers are losing Rs. 500 per quintal and lamented that the

promised loan waivers were not fulfilled. "In Siddipet district, 3.60 lakh acres of paddy have been harvested, but the government has only bought 800 quintals," he said, questioning the effectiveness of the current administration. Rao concluded by urging officials to visit the fields and address the pressing needs of farmers, asserting that the government should focus on supporting the agricultural community rather than engaging in cosmetic projects.

#### **BJP MP Dharmapuri Arvind Criticizes Revanth** Reddy's Government for **Broken Promises**



TPN, Telangana: Nizamabad MP and BJP leader Dharmapuri Arvind expressed his outrage at Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's government, accusing it of failing to fulfill election promises. Speaking at a press conference at the BJP office in Nizamabad, Arvind stated that the current government is in a "wretched state" where guarantees cannot be implemented.

Arvind's remarks came in response to BRS working president K.T. Rama Rao's announcement of an upcoming padayatra. He challenged KTR to clarify whether this event would indeed be a padayatra or simply a political publicity stunt. "If KTR undertakes this journey, the people should welcome him with brooms and sandals," Arvind quipped, emphasizing his skepticism about KTR's intentions.

During the conference, Arvind highlighted the government's failure to deliver on promises such as the Rs. 2 lakh loan waiver for farmers and a Rs. 500 bonus guarantee. Additionally, she demanded accountability regarding the promise to fill 50,000 jobs in eleven months, asking, "Where are they?" Aruna concluded by expressing anger over the difficulties faced by women due to a lack of new applications for financial assistance.

reiterated that the Telangana caste census represents a crucial step towards social equity and should be emulated nationwide.



## **Cyberabad Traffic Police Apprehend 513** for Drunk Driving Over the Weekend

TPN, Hyderabad: In a significant crackdown on drunk driving, the Cyberabad traffic police arrested 513 individuals during weekend checks across various areas. The operation targeted drivers under the influence, resulting in 425 two-wheeler riders, 24 three-wheeler drivers, 60 four-wheeler drivers, and four heavy vehicle operators being apprehended.

Bowenpally Sub-Inspector Shiva Shankar reported that the children engaged in this act of vandalism simply for fun. The four individuals involved are aged between 15 and 16 years, with two of them having dropped out of school after completing the 6th and 7th grades, while the other two continue their studies.

Authorities are now contemplating filing a First Information Report (FIR) after seeking legal advice on the matter. This incident raises con-



cerns about youth behavior and the need for greater awareness of the respect owed to national symbols and figures. The police are considering appropriate actions to address this disturbing behavior and prevent similar incidents in the future.



#### **HMWSSB Extends Deadline** for One-Time Settlement **Scheme to November 30**

TPN, Hyderabad: In a move to accommodate consumer demand, the government has extended the deadline for the One-Time Settlement (OTS-2024) scheme until November 30. The Hyderabad Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board (HMWSSB) had requested this extension due to overwhelming interest from users.

According to a press release, the OTS-2024 scheme has already generated approximately ₹49 crore in revenue as of October 31, with around 70,335 consumers taking advantage of this opportunity to settle their outstanding connection bills.

Launched to help residents address long-pending bills, the OTS scheme allows consumers to pay their dues without incurring any late fees or interest. The extension aims to provide further relief to those who have yet to settle their bills, ensuring that more individuals can benefit from this initiative.

HMWSSB officials emphasized that the scheme is an effort to streamline the collection of accumulated dues and promote financial responsibility among consumers. The extension reflects the government's commitment to facilitating access to essential services while supporting residents in managing their water supply and sewerage charges more effectively.

#### 74-Year-Old **Hyderabad Woman** Duped of ₹37.9 Lakh in Elaborate Cyber Fraud

TPN, Hyderabad: A 74-year-old woman from Hyderabad fell victim to a sophisticated cyber fraud scheme, losing ₹37.9 lakh under the pretense of her involvement in a money laundering investigation. The incident underscores the growing threat of cybercrime targeting vulnerable individuals.

According to reports, the victim received a phone call from an individual who claimed that a First Information Report (FIR) had been registered against her at the Andheri Police Station. Following this alarming call, the scammers sent her counterfeit letters purportedly from the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). These letters alleged that her bank account was implicated in illegal transactions associated with Naresh Goel, the owner of a private airline.

The fraudsters exerted considerable pressure on the victim, demanding that she disclose her bank account details and threatening to freeze her accounts if she did not comply. They further intimidated her by suggesting that she could face arrest. In a state of panic, the woman was convinced to withdraw her entire fixed deposits, amounting to ₹37.90 lakh, and transfer the funds to bank accounts controlled by the fraudsters, who assured her that the money would be returned with interest.

Realizing that she had been deceived only after the transactions were complete, the woman promptly approached the Hyderabad Cybercrime Police. Following her report, the police registered a case and have launched an investigation to identify and apprehend the culprits behind this elaborate scam.

This created a bottleneck, allowing vehicular movement only on one side of the road. While riding a bike with his sister-in-law and her children to catch a bus, Anjaneyulu collided violently with an oncoming tractor.

The tractor driver fled the scene immediately after the accident. In response to the tragedy, local villagers blocked the road as the bodies were being transported to Tupran Hospital, demanding justice for the deceased family. The community's outcry highlights the need for road safety measures and accountability for those responsible for such tragic incidents.

#### Telangana in Debt Due to Previous **BRS Government: Minister Jupally**

TPN, Hyderabad: Minister Jupally Krishna Rao has criticized the previous Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) government for transforming Telangana from a wealthy state into a "debt-ridden" one. The protest resulted in significant traffic congestion, underscoring the critical nature of the water crisis in the area. The women demanded immediate restoration of water supply from the Mission Bhagiratha project, urging the government to take swift action to resolve the ongoing issue. Their demonstration reflects the urgent need for government intervention to ensure access to clean drinking water in the region.

Demonstrators criticized contradictory statements from officials, where urgent tender processes were demanded in one meeting while rules were reportedly ignored in another.

The protesters expressed outrage at ongoing investigations into the Kaleshwaram project, questioning the accountability measures for those responsible for perceived mismanagement. They emphasized that the issues plaguing the project reflect larger systemic corruption, calling for transparency and accountability to protect the livelihoods of countless farmers in the region. The protests underscore the community's demand for effective governance and commitment to improving agricultural conditions in Telangana.

#### **Telangana Traffic Police** Constable Dies by Suicide **Amid Financial Struggles**

TPN, Nalgonda: In a tragic incident, a 42-year-old traffic police constable from Telangana, Kankuri Ravishankar, was found dead by suicide in his flat in Nalgonda on November 2. Authorities report that he hanged himself, allegedly due to financial difficulties stemming from a recent land purchase.



Ravishankar, a resident of Cheruvugattu village in Narketpally mandal, had been on leave for Deepavali since October 30. On the day of the incident, he locked himself in his room, claiming he was tired. After hours of silence, his family forced the door open, discovering him hanging from the ceiling. Despite being rushed to the hospital, he was pronounced dead upon arrival. His wife, Swathi, who works as an RTC bus conductor, collapsed upon seeing the tragic scene and was hospitalized.

Police investigations indicate that Ravishankar had taken a loan to buy a plot of land, which contributed to his financial strain. A case has been registered by Nalgonda Town II police following a complaint from Ravishankar's mother.

The incident marks the fourth suicide among Telangana police personnel in the past two months, highlighting alarming trends attributed to financial issues, family disputes, and workplace harassment. This troubling pattern underscores the urgent need for support and intervention within the police force.

## The Complex Legacy of Indigo: From Fashion to Rebellion

What could connect modern fashion, oppressed peas- ated the peasants' grievances, ultimately disrupting the ants driven to revolt, and the censorship of commercial theatre in India? The answer lies in a color that most of us have worn: indigo. While we might admire our favorite blue jeans, few realize that this vibrant hue carries a tumultuous and violent history.

Indigo has been cultivated in India since ancient times, attracting European traders and becoming a significant commodity for the British East India Company by the 19th century. The crop thrived in the southern districts of undivided Bengal, providing immense profits to European planters at the expense of local peasants. The system of cultivation was inherently exploitative; planters owned processing factories while sourcing indigo from impoverished farmers, who suffered significant financial losses by growing indigo instead of staple crops like rice. The planters used coercion, false lawsuits, and violence to enforce the cultivation of indigo, leading to horrific abuses. Many peasants faced beatings, imprisonment, and even murder for re-

In the spring of 1859, the peasants of Bengal rose up against their oppressors, refusing to plant indigo after a magistrate's proclamation asserted their right to choose their crops. Spearheaded by leaders like Digambar Biswas, the rebellion spread rapidly, meeting fierce resistance from the well-armed planters. Despite the odds, the cultivators organized and fought back, showcasing their determination to reclaim their rights. The insurrection compelled the British government to form the Indi-


go Commission, which substanti-

The backlash culminated in the imposition of the Dramatic Performances Act of 1876, aimed at stifling dissent in the theatre.

Despite the decline of organic indigo cultivation after the advent of synthetic alternatives, its legacy persists. The transformation of denim, originally made from tough fabric dyed with natural indigo, into a global fashion staple has deep roots in this complex history. Today, as you slip into your blue jeans, consider the rich and often tragic narrative that indigo carries—a testament to resilience and the struggles against oppression.





## What will writers do if Trump wins again

When Donald Trump first won the presidency, I immediately embarked on a writing project fueled by the tumult of that era. Inspired by Hemingway's advice to "write one true sentence," I found myself drawn to the fabrications that proliferated during his campaign. Even before he took office, I began documenting daily falsehoods uttered by Trump, eventually weaving them into a narrative that culminated in my novel, \*A Time Outside This Time\* (2021). This work allowed me to process the chaos of the Trump administration while serving as a protest against the fiction of fake news.

Now, as we approach the possibility of another Trump victory in 2024, I ponder whether I could embark on a similar journey. Trump's declaration on April 27, 2020, that "fake news is the enemy of the people" resonates in my novel, where my narrator, Satya, struggles to unearth truth amidst an "infodemic" exacerbated by the pandemic. Each chapter chronicles Satya's encounters with various crises—riots, terrorism, police violence—while he seeks a language to articulate the complexities of human experience. His wife, Vaani, a behavioral psychologist, offers theories that intrigue him, yet fail to capture the full spectrum of reality.

The urgency to confront the zeitgeist through storytelling will undoubtedly remain if Trump returns to power. However, I cannot envision replicating my earlier approach. The narrative arcs that framed the initial and concluding falsehoods of Trump's presidency seemed cohesive, but the prospect of re-entering such a chaotic narrative cycle feels daunting. In the author's note of \*A Time Outside This Time\*, I reflected on the chaos of a presidency that began with a lie about Barack Obama's birthplace and concluded with Trump's claim of electoral victory on November 7, 2020. The thought of revisiting this tumult is exhausting.

During the pandemic, my friend Sloane Crosley wrote an op-ed in \*The New York Times\* suggesting we should hold off on chronicling our new reality. While she advocated for making notes, I continued writing, skeptical of the immediacy of op-eds. If Trump were to win again, I hope it inspires a wave of fiction that captures the complexities of our time, acknowledging both the dread and the electric charge of current events. Unlike op-eds, fiction can embrace ambiguity, offering expansive possibilities rather than reductive interpretations. As we navigate another potentially fraught era, I believe literature will serve as a vital conduit for exploring the real frictions of our existence, allowing truth and fiction to intertwine in meaningful ways.

# PM Modi to boost BJP's campaign in Maharashtra with rallies from November

Prime Minister Narendra Modi is set to conduct a series of election rallies in Maharashtra from November 8 to 14, leading up to the Assembly polls scheduled for November 20. He emphasized that while Sanskrit is seen as an elitist language, NEET similarly creates a hierarchy in education that disadvantages students who lack the resources and support necessary to succeed in such high-stakes testing environments. He stated, "Just as Sanskrit is not accessible to the common person, NEET is a tool that often leaves out our children who deserve a fair chance at medical education."

The Chief Minister has long opposed NEET, arguing that it undermines the state's educational system and disregards the unique cultural and linguistic context of Tamil Nadu. His government has been vocal in its demand for a return to state-based entrance examinations, which he argues would be more equitable and reflective of local educational needs.

Stalin's comments come amid a broader debate over the future of medical education in India and the impact of standardized testing on students' opportunities. He called for a collective effort to reform the entrance examination process, advocating for policies that prioritize accessibility and fairness.

By drawing a parallel between NEET and Sanskrit, Stalin sought to highlight the need for an inclusive educational framework that serves all students, regardless of their socioeconomic status. His statements resonate with many in Tamil Nadu, who share concerns about the accessibility of higher education and the need for reforms that better align with the state's values and needs.



## Vijay's Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam Opposes BJP's "One Nation, One Election" Plan

Actor-turned-politician Vijay's party, Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK), has officially opposed the BJP's "One Nation, One Election" initiative, labeling it a threat to democracy and federalism. In a recent resolution, TVK emphasized that this proposal undermines the principles that uphold India's democratic framework.

The party also criticized the BJP regarding the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET), demanding that education be transferred to the state list. According to TVK, this shift would empower the state government to independently revoke NEET, thereby aligning educational policies with regional needs. The resolution expressed frustration with the central government's stance on education, which the party claims obstructs state autonomy. Furthermore, it condemned the ruling DMK for allegedly deceiving the people of Tamil Nadu with unfulfilled promises related to education.

Moreover, TVK denounced the Waqf Amendment Bill 2024, currently under review by a Joint Parliamentary Committee, deeming it an infringement on federalism. The resolution called for the immediate withdrawal of the bill, which the party argues undermines the rights of Muslims and distorts the federal structure of governance.

During the meeting, TVK reaffirmed its dedication to secularism and social justice, vowing to adhere strictly to its ideological tenets and policies as it continues to challenge both the central and state governments on key issues affecting Tamil Nadu.

The report, produced by North Korea's Institute of Enemy State Studies and disseminated by the Korean Central News Agency (KCNA), specifically criticized Yoon's "reckless remarks" about war and accused him of undermining inter-Korean agreements while engaging in nuclear planning with the United States and seeking closer ties with Japan and NATO.

The document asserts that Yoon's military strategies have only exacerbated tensions, prompting North Korea to accelerate its nuclear weapons development. "Its

ever-worsening military moves resulted only in the paradoxical consequences of pushing [North Korea] to stockpile its nuclear weapons at an exponential rate and further develop its nuclear attack capability," the paper stated.



Yoon, who is aligned with conservative principles, has adopted a hardline stance against North Korea, which has continued to advance its nuclear arsenal and ballistic missile program in defiance of United Nations Security Council resolutions. The South Korean administration holds North Korea responsible for rising tensions due to its frequent weapons tests and its provision of military assistance to Russia amidst the ongoing conflict in Ukraine.

#### Biden Suggests He'd Like To Smack 'Macho Guys' During Final Campaign Stop

President Joe Biden made a nostalgic return to his birthplace in Scranton, Pennsylvania, on Saturday to campaign for Vice President Kamala Harris. He remarked, "There's one more thing Trump and his Republican friends want to do. They want to have a giant tax cut for the wealthy." He then seemingly referenced Trump's supporters, saying, "Now, I know some of you guys are tempted to think it's macho guys," and added, "These are the kind of guys you'd like to smack in the ass," eliciting laughter from the audience.

Later that evening in North Carolina, Trump responded mockingly, asking the crowd, "I don't even know, is he still around?" Biden's comments, while humorous to some, highlighted his tendency to stray from scripted messages—a pattern noted in recent weeks.

Earlier this week, Biden stirred controversy by responding to derogatory remarks made by comedian Tony Hinchcliffe about Puerto Rico, saying, "The only garbage I see floating out there is his supporters." This remark led to official transcript alterations by White House staff, which sparked backlash from federal transcribers.

As gender dynamics play a significant role in this election cycle, Biden's comments come at a time when Trump has emphasized traditional masculine ideals to attract male voters. In contrast, Harris has focused on women's rights and family support, pledging to protect access to abortion and increase government spending on childcare and housing.

Biden's speech in Scranton resonated deeply with attendees, many of whom were nostalgic for his early years there. He urged the crowd of around 200 supporters to recognize the significance of the upcoming election and to vote for their families and communities. "Don't forget where you come from," he implored, reinforcing his message of community and connection.



## Jaishankar begins Australia-Singapore tour with arrival in Brisbane

## **SEBI Proposes New Regulations for Securitized Debt Instruments**

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has introduced significant proposals aimed at enhancing the regulatory framework for securitized debt instruments (SDIs). One of the key recommendations is the establishment of a minimum investment threshold of Rs 1 crore for originators regulated by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and unregulated entities involved in securitization activities. Additionally, the proposals limit the number of investors in private placements to a maximum of 200; if this limit is exceeded, the issuance will be classified as a public offering.

To ensure transparency and accessibility, public offers are required to remain open for a minimum of three days and a maximum of ten days, with advertising standards aligned with SEBI's regulations for non-convertible securities. Moreover, all SDIs are mandated to be issued and transferred exclusively in dematerialized (demat) form, streamlining the transaction process and enhancing security.

Securitized debt instruments are created by pooling various types of debt-such



as loans, mortgages, or receivables—and selling them as securities to investors. This process, known as securitization, allows banks and other originators to transform illiquid assets into liquid capital, providing them with alternative funding sources. Investors benefit by receiving returns based on the performance of the underlying debt, with risk spread across multiple assets.

The current regulatory framework, established under SEBI's 2008 regulations, has been updated to reflect the RBI's 2021 guidelines on securitizing standard as-

sets. SEBI is now seeking public feedback on these proposals until November 16.

In terms of risk management, the proposals include a requirement for originators to retain a minimum risk of 10% of the securitized pool, or 5% for receivables maturing within 24 months. Furthermore, a minimum holding period for underlying receivables will be established to ensure that originators maintain a vested interest in the assets.

Additionally, SEBI suggests allowing originators an optional clean-up call, enabling them to repurchase up to 10% of the original asset value, which helps manage the pool's longevity. Liquidity facilities are also recommended to address cash flow timing mismatches, to be provided either by the originator or an appointed third party.

The updated regulations emphasize responsible management and investment in the securitization market, aiming to bolster investor confidence and market stability.

## India's Crude Oil Imports Hit 13-Month **Low Amid Geopolitical Tensions**



India's crude oil imports fell to a 13-month low in October, primarily due to maintenance-related shutdowns at several refineries and escalating geopolitical tensions in West Asia, which raised concerns over potential volatility in international oil prices. According to ship tracking data, cumulative imports from the top five suppliers—Russia, Iraq, Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, and the United States—declined, reflecting a broader trend in the oil market.

In October, Indian refiners imported an Looking ahead, industry analysts predict a average of 4.35 million barrels per day (bpd) of crude, marking a 7.6% decrease from the previous month. Supplies from Russia, India's largest source of crude, dropped 9.2% to a seven-month low of 1.73 million bpd, comprising nearly 40% of total imports. This decline was attributed not only to refinery maintenance but also to increased competition from Chinese refiners for specific grades of Russian crude.

Import volumes from Iraq and Saudi Arabia also saw reductions, falling 3.3% to 0.84 million bpd and 10.9% to 0.65 million bpd, respectively. Viktor Katona, head of crude analysis at Kpler, noted that October was a peak month for India's offline refining capacity, suggesting that refiners may have opted to delay purchases amid fears of a potential conflict between Israel and Iran, waiting instead for more favorable pricing conditions.

rebound in oil imports in November as Indian refineries are expected to resume full operations. Preliminary vessel tracking indicates that oil cargo arrivals at Indian ports could reach around 5 million bpd in the first two weeks of November, a significant increase from October levels.

As purchasing activity resumes, Russian imports are anticipated to stabilize between 1.8 and 1.9 million bpd during the early part of November, while Iraqi supplies are projected at around 900,000 bpd. This suggests a strong recovery in India's oil import activity as market conditions improve.

## Adani Cuts Power Supply to Bangladesh Amid Unpaid Bills



Amid a severe power shortage in Bangladesh, Adani Group has halved its cross-border electricity supply to the country, citing approximately \$850 million in unpaid bills. This move comes as Bangladesh struggles to meet its energy demands, prompting the state-run Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB) to operate other power plants to bridge the gap.

Rezaul Karim, chairman of BPDB, stated, "We are trying to meet the gap by running other plants," as the country faces significant load shedding of around 1,680 megawatts. The Godda power plant in Jharkhand, which is a key coal-fired facility for Bangladesh, typically provides between 7 to 10 per-

demand of 13 gigawatts. However, on Friday, it supplied only 724 megawatts out of its total capacity of 1,496 megawatts.

In September, Adani Group had issued a warning to Bangladesh regarding its mounting debts, which have now reached an unsustainable level. The company expressed concerns over fulfilling its supply commitments while managing rising receivables, stating, "It is an unsustainable situation."

Nonetheless, the current challenges underscore the critical importance of resolving the financial disputes to ensure a stable energy supply for the nation.

## **New Theory Suggests Black Holes Could Be Key to Universe's Expansion**

Agroundbreaking theory proposed by scientists may link black holes to the expansion of the universe, suggesting that these enigmatic objects could harbor a form of energy associated with dark energy, the mysterious force believed to be driving the universe's acceleration. This research was published in the \*Journal of Cosmology and Astroparti-



cle Physics\* on October 28.

Dark energy, which constitutes roughly 70 percent of the universe, was first hypothesized in the late 1990s when astronomers observed that the universe's expansion was not only continuing but accelerating. This led to the concept of dark energy as an anti-gravitational force, causing galaxies to move apart at increasing speeds. Despite significant study, the nature and origins of dark energy remain elusive.

The Dark Energy Spectroscopic Instrument (DESI) survey, which analyzes millions of galaxies, indicates a cor-

relation between black hole formation and dark energy density. When massive stars shed their outer layers to create black holes, they may emit energy that influences dark energy, while also being affected by it.

Investigating supermassive black holes in distant elliptical galaxies, the team found that these black holes have increased in mass over time. This observation supports the idea that black holes could contain vacuum energy, exerting an outward force that contrib-

Should this hypothesis gain acceptance, it could transform our understanding of both black holes and dark energy. As Gregory Tarle, one of the study's authors, noted, exploring gravitational conditions at the centers of black holes could illuminate the processes associated with the universe's early inflationary phase. Despite the promising nature of this theory, skepticism remains in the scientific community, with calls for further evidence and observations through tools like DESI to deepen our understanding of these cosmic phenomena.

# **Discovery of Exoplanet TOI-6651b:** Insights into the Neptunian Desert An international team of sciAentists led by the Physical

Research Laboratory (PRL) in Ahmedabad has made a significant discovery: an exoplanet named TOI-6651b, which is five times larger and 60 times heavier than Earth. This remarkable find was achieved using the 2nd PRL Advanced Radial Velocity Abu Sky Search (PARAS-2), a sophisticated spectroscope mounted on the PRL's 2.5-meter telescope located in Mount Abu, Rajasthan.

TOI-6651b is situated approximately 690 light years away from our solar system and is

only the fourth exoplanet ever discovered within what is known as the "Neptunian desert." This term refers to a region in space where planets similar in size to Neptune are notably absent, particularly around stars. Sub-Saturn planets, like TOI-6651b, fall between the sizes of Neptune and Saturn.

Sanjay Baliwal, the lead author and a fifth-year PhD student at PRL, highlighted the importance of this discovery for understanding the dynamics of the Neptunian desert. "TOI-6651b was located at the edge of the Neptunian desert. It is crucial for understanding the factors that shape the desert boundaries," he explained.

The research, published in the \*Journal of Astronomy



and Astrophysics\*, reveals that TOI-6651b orbits its host star—similar in characteristics to our Sun—every five days. In comparison, Earth takes 365 days to complete its orbit around the Sun. Due to its close proximity to its parent star, TOI-6651b experiences intense radiation, which has significant implications for its atmospheric composition. The intense heat likely prevents the planet from retaining a gaseous atmosphere for an extended period, potentially leaving only a rocky core behind, similar to other planets in its category.

This discovery not only expands our knowledge of exoplanets but also provides valuable insights into the processes that govern planetary formation and evolution in extreme environments.






