

Parthasarathi Apologizes to TDP Workers

Clarifies Misunderstanding Over Jogi Ramesh's Presence

TPN Correspondent Vijayawada, Dec-18:

Andhra Pradesh Information, Civic Relations, and Housing Minister Kolusu Parthasarathi has expressed regret over an incident that occurred during the unveiling of a bronze statue of Sardar Gauthu Lachanna, a leader known for his fight for social justice and the upliftment of weaker sections. Addressing a press conference at the TDP central office in Mangalagiri, Parthasarathi clarified his position and sought forgiveness from TDP workers who were upset over the presence of former YSRCP minister Jogi Ramesh at the event.

The minister emphasized that the program, organized by the Gowda Sangham, was planned independently and without any involvement from the TDP leadership, including national or mandal-level office bearers. He said he was unaware of Jogi Ramesh's participation and explained the sequence of events leading to his presence at the ceremony.

Parthasarathi recalled that the Gowda Sangham approached him for assistance in organizing the event, and he agreed to support the unveiling of the statue. The program's date was finalized based on his suggestion after consultations with the Sangham members. However, due to his commitments with an I&PR meeting, he initially informed them that he could not attend. The organizers, however, rescheduled the event to accommodate his presence, and he attended after completing his prior obligations. "I was shocked to see 'that person' (referring to Jogi Ramesh) at the event. Since it was entirely organized by the Gowda Sangham, I had no involvement in the arrangements or guest in- mitment to party principles and the ability to win the local body elections.



vitations," Parthasarathi clarified. He reiterated his respect for Chandrababu Naidu and Nara Lokesh, adding that their trust and the unwavering support of TDP workers have been invaluable to him.

No Personal Ties with Jogi Ramesh

Parthasarathi categorically denied any personal relationship with Jogi Ramesh, asserting that allegations of his association with YSRCP were false and baseless. He reminded workers of his consistent stance against YSRCP and his efforts to strengthen the TDP since joining the party before the elec-

Addressing accusations regarding his role in the recent water association elections, Parthasarathi clarified that he did not interfere in the process or endorse any candidates, except to insist on the inclusion of SC, ST, and BC

One Nation, One Election!! TDP and YSRCP Align, but with Different Motives

The long-awaited One Nation, One Election bill took a decisive step forward as it was tabled in Parliament on tuesday. Union Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal introduced two bills aimed at facilitating simultaneous elections to the Lok Sabha, state assemblies, and Union Territories.

With the NDA government holding a clear majority, the bill sailed through the house with 269 MPs voting in favor and 198 MPs opposing it. The Congress party, which led the opposition, criticized the bill, calling it a violation of the constitutional framework.

"The Congress party firmly and comprehensively rejects the One Nation, One Election bill. We oppose its introduction and demand its referral to a Joint Parliamentary Committee for further scrutiny. This bill is unconstitutional," stated the Congress leader-

In a notable political development,

Telugu Desam Party (TDP) and YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) both supported the bill, albeit for contrasting rea-

As an ally of the NDA, the TDP's backing of the bill was expected, aligning with its coalition commitments. Meanwhile, YSRCP's approval appears to be driven by political strategy. The party reportedly sees the bill as a potential accelerator for early elections, which it hopes will offer an opportunity to recover from its recent electoral setbacks.

With the bill now passed, it will move to a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC), which will oversee the planning and framework for its implementa-

However, despite its swift approval in Parliament, the One Nation, One Election bill is not expected to be operational immediately. Experts confirm that the proposed changes will likely come into effect only after the 2029 elections, allowing time for necessary structural and logistical preparations.



Former Deputy CM Alla Nani to Join TDP Today

Former Deputy Chief Minister Alla Nani, who resigned from the YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) two months ago, is set to formally join the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) today at 11 a.m., TDP MLA Badeti Chanti confirmed.

Chanti acknowledged that while there were reports of discontent among certain party members over Alla Nani's induction, the TDP leadership carefully deliberated and made a decisive call. "We respect the leadership's decision," he asserted.

He also hinted at a growing shift in political alignments, stating that several leaders, including former ministers and MLAs close to the YSRCP leadership during Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy's tenure, are now leaning toward the

Sources close to the development emphasized that Alla Nani is joining the TDP voluntarily, without seeking any promises or specific assurances from the party leadership.

Ration Rice Scam: Lookout Notices Issued Against Perni Nani's Family

Authorities have issued lookout notices against the family of former minister Perni Nani in connection with the ongoing ration rice scam to prevent them from fleeing the country. The notices follow allegations of large-scale misappropriation related to missing ration

rice sacks.

The accused had filed bail petitions, but the hearing, scheduled for yesterday, was postponed to December 19. In response to official demands for repayment of the value of the missing rice, Perni Nani's family submitted three demand drafts worth ₹1 crore on December 13 as the first installment. Yester-

day, they made an additional payment of ₹70 lakh through drafts, raising the total to ₹1.7 crore so far. Critics argue that these payments may allow Perni Nani's family to sidestep legal consequences. While the initial reports cited 3,708 sacks of ration rice as missing, officials now suspect the actual number could be much higher. A revised

statement confirming the quantity

is expected soon. On December 10, police filed cases against warehouse owner Jayasudha and manager Manas Teja for their alleged involvement in the scam. Jayasudha, considered a key player, filed a bail petition on December 13, but the hearing was deferred to Thursday. To ensure she

Requests Pending Funds for AP

He also emphasized that, over the last five years, about 93 central government schemes were not implemented in AP, but under the current coalition govern-



ment, efforts have been made to revive these programs.

As part of the government's efforts to rectify this, Payyavula Keshav informed the Union Minister that 73 central schemes have been revived and are now being im-

plemented in the state. The state government has already contributed its share to these schemes in the last five months. In light of this, Minister Keshav requested the release of the funds that are still pending from the central government.

4840 Bags of Rice Missing from Perni Jayasudha's Godown

Announces Investigation and Legal Action





State Civil Supplies and Food Minister Nadendla Manohar addressed the media on December 17, 2024, revealing alarming details about the disappearance of ration rice from the JS godown, owned by Perni Nani's wife, Perni Jayasudha. Minister Manohar confirmed that not 3,000, but 4,840 bags of rice had gone missing, prompting a thorough investigation by the police, revenue, and civil supplies departments.

The investigation follows suspicions that the missing rice was being diverted and evidence destroyed. Minister Manohar expressed outrage at attempts to cover up the theft, warning that those responsible would face severe legal consequences. "We will not spare anyone who has done wrong," he stated, stressing that evidence of the misconduct would be made public. He also mentioned that further suspicions surround the second godown linked to the JS godown.

Minister Manohar outlined the steps taken to uncover the truth. Following the implementation of a new "Warehouse Management System" by Civil Supplies MD Shri Manajir on November 26, the department conducted inspections to track stock levels. On December 4, based on stock records, it was confirmed that 3,708 bags were missing—far more than initially reported. Subsequently, the Civil Supplies MD imposed penalties and blacklisted JS godown, filing a police complaint for criminal action.

A special three-member committee, including officials from the RDO, Civil Supplies, and Legal Metrology Departments, was formed to investigate. Despite issuing notices for inspections on December 16, JS godown management did not cooperate, prompting authorities to conduct a panchanama and move the remaining stock to mandal-level stocking points for further scrutiny. Minister Manohar also accused JS godown management of tampering with stock registers and Weybridge systems to destroy evidence, with an FIR already filed. The minister reiterated that all illegal activities would be thoroughly investigated, and justice would be served.



Heavy Rainfall Expected in Andhra Pradesh Due to Low Pressure Area

The Andhra Pradesh Disaster Management Authority (APDMA) has issued a weather alert, warning of heavy to very heavy rainfall in AndhraPradesh over the next two days. A low-pressure area has developed over the southwest Bay of Bengal, with the depression extending up to 5.8 km above sea level. The system is expected to intensify and move west-northwestward toward the Tamil Nadu coast. The APDMA has predicted significant rainfall in several districts, starting with Wednesday, December 18. Heavy to very heavy rainfall is expected in isolated areas of Vizianagaram, Visakhapatnam, and Anakapalle districts. Light to moderate rain is also expected in parts of Srikakulam, Parvathipuram, Alluri Seetharamaraju, Konaseema, East Godavari, West Godavari, Eluru, Krishna, Nellore, YSR, Annamayya, Chittoor, and Tirupati districts.

On Thursday, December 19, Srikakulam, Vizianagaram, Alluri Seetharamaraju, Visakhapatnam, Anakapalle, Kakinada, and Konaseema are expected to experience heavy to very heavy rainfall. Light to moderate rainfall is likely in Parvathipuram, East Godavari, West Godavari, Eluru, Krishna, and Nellore districts.

Farmers have been advised to take necessary precautions while conducting agricultural work. The public has been urged to remain alert and prepared for possible weather disruptions.

This information was shared by Ronamki Kurmanath, Managing Director of the AP Disaster Management Authority, urging the public to stay updated on the latest weather forecasts.



Minister Narayana Criticizes YSRCP

Andhra Pradesh Municipal Administration Minister Ponguru Narayana accused the YSRCP government of mismanaging public funds and neglecting urban development in Nellore over the past five years. Speaking at the swearing-in ceremony of Srinivasulu Reddy (Seenayya) as the chairman of the Nellore Urban Development Authority (NUDA), Narayana pledged full government support for NUDA's development and emphasized the importance of prioritizing urban growth.

Narayana claimed that the YSRCP government had misused Rs. 3,200 crore in taxes collected from Nellore's residents, setting aside laws and regulations. "The previous TDP government created 14 urban development authorities and implemented various projects, but the YSRCP weakened these institutions during its tenure," he said.

The minister highlighted the growing urban population in Andhra Pradesh, which has risen from 24% to 36% and is projected to reach 50% by 2030. "Urban authorities must be proactive in addressing this growth. Projects such as underground drainage and 365-day

drinking water supply for Nellore city will soon be completed," Narayana added.

He criticized irregularities in urban planning, such as the unauthorized approval of 9-meter-wide roads in areas requiring 12-meter-wide roads, and assured that the government would simplify permissions for multi-story buildings. Narayana also announced forthcoming regulatory changes aimed at streamlining urban development processes by the end of the month.

Drawing comparisons, he suggested emulating the Mumbai Sikko Urban Authority for sustainable development. He stressed the need to secure land for future projects and revealed plans to generate funds for NUDA by selling plots on government lands within its juris-

Looking ahead, Narayana pledged to revive stalled projects, including the construction of Necklace Road and TIDCO housing for eligible beneficiaries, and to allocate 10% of TIDCO premises for handicraft artisans. "NUDA's development requires strategic planning, and we are committed to ensuring its success under the leadership of Chairman Srinivasulu Reddy," Narayana concluded.

Claiming his wife, Kalingiri Shanti, was taken away by Vijayasai Reddy, Madan Mohan accused the MP of not only breaking his family but also looting prime lands worth ₹1,500 crore from RK Beach to Bhimili in Visakhapatnam.

Madan Mohan alleged that Vijayasai Reddy used his influence

to send him to America between 2022-23, during which the MP allegedly cohabited with his wife, Shanti, and fathered a child. "I strongly believe that Vijayasai Reddy is the father of the child born in my absence," he stated, demanding DNA tests to confirm his claims.

He revealed that he had approached the President, the



Malladi Vishnu Criticizes Chandrababu for Dismantling



Minister Kollu Ravindra **Alleges Massive** Corruption by Perni Nani

State Mines, Underground Resources, and Excise Minister Kollu Ravindra launched a scathing attack on former minister Perni Nani during a press meet, accusing him and his family of involvement in large-scale corruption, including a massive ration rice scam.

Minister Ravindra alleged that Nani was caught red-handed in the illegal smuggling of Public Distribution System (PDS) rice. He claimed that 3,708 bags of rice, equivalent to 187 tons and valued at approximately ₹90 lakhs, were smuggled from Nani's own godown via lorries to the port. "This is only the tip of the iceberg. Many more irregularities will come to light soon," he added.

Ravindra criticized Nani for exploiting the poor, stating that the godowns used for smuggling were constructed by seizing lands from the underprivileged and illegally excavating soil. "The rice meant for the poor has been stolen and sold corruptly. Nani's actions have not only cheated the needy but also ruined the livelihoods of workers in Chilakalapudi and Karagraharam godowns," he said.

The Minister lambasted the YSRCP, calling it a "party of thieves," and accused its leaders, including Jagan Mohan Reddy, of indulging in widespread

corruption. "The central government itself has reported that nearly 5 lakh tonnes of ration rice have gone missing," he alleged. Ravindra also pointed to irregularities in civil supplies during the tenure of former Civil Supplies Minister Kodali Nani, claiming that officials favorable to him facilitated these scams.



The town planning officials are reportedly neglecting the structural integrity of decades-old buildings, some of which lack fitness certificates. Regardless of the type of construction, officials are allegedly approving projects on government lands as long as bribes are paid. This has led to a complete disregard for government rules, raising questions about the effectiveness of the department.

on political pressure, citing the local corporator, Nelibandla Bala Taluka.

There are widespread allegations that tens of lakhs of rupees have exchanged hands in this illegal construction. It is also claimed that the current city planning officer is being transferred, and

a successor is vying for the position by allegedly paying a bribe of ₹1 crore to the local MLA. If true, this raises serious concerns about the integrity of the department and the extent of corruption within its ranks.

Citizens are growing increasingly frustrated as illegal constructions flourish, while lawful remodeling and safety protocols are ignored. Despite repeated complaints, the department remains inactive, fueling demands for immediate action from Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) officials.

The rampant allegations highlight the urgent need for accountability and transparency in Vijayawada's town planning system. With public safety at stake, all eyes are on the authorities to take swift and effective action to address the corruption and enforce regulations.

A recent example involves the Urvashi Matching Center, whose owners purchased a 30-year-old building near Navrang Theater on Congress Office Road. Despite the absence of a fitness certificate, they have begun remodeling the structure without any intervention from the town planning of-



1,320 Tons of PDS Rice Seized from Ship at Kakinada Port



TPN Correspondent ,Kakinada: Kakinada District Collector Shanmohan Sagili has announced the seizure of 1,320 tons of Public Distribution System (PDS) rice found aboard the Stella L Panama ship. Speaking at a press meet, the Collector confirmed that the discovery followed a comprehensive inspection ordered by Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan.

A special team comprising five departmental units inspected the vessel, initially confirming the presence of 640 tons of rice. However, a detailed examination revealed a total of 1,320 tons of PDS rice onboard.

"The government has directed that the rice be removed within 48 hours, and the panchnama process will be completed before seizing the cargo," said Collector Sagili. He emphasized that strict action would be taken against anyone found exporting PDS rice and reiterated the government's focus on maintaining transparency and accountability in trade operations.

The Collector also clarified that while business at Kakinada Port is encouraged, illegal activities such as the export of ration rice will not be tolerated. "Kakinada Port is open for legitimate business, but traders must adhere to the law. The government is committed to the development of Kakinada, and strict measures will be enforced against violators," he added.

Meanwhile, port operations continue to thrive, with 12 ships ready for loading at Kakinada Anchorage Port. The swift action by the authorities has highlighted the government's commitment to curbing illegal practices and ensuring the efficient functioning of Kakinada's trade network.




One Nation, One Election: A Controversial Reform Facing Opposition

The BJP-led NDA government's proposal for **One Nation, One Election** (ONOE), a reform aimed at synchronizing parliamentary and state assembly elections, has sparked significant opposition as the government prepares to introduce two key Bills in the Lok Sabha. These include the **Constitution (129th Amendment) Bill**, which seeks to facilitate simultaneous elections at the Centre and state level, and the **Union Territories Laws (Amendment) Bill**, which aims to synchronize assembly polls in Delhi, Jammu & Kashmir, and Puducherry. However, the government has delayed the introduction of these Bills, which were initially slated for presentation today, to later in the week, toward the end of the current winter session of Parliament.

ONOE is seen as a potentially transformative electoral reform, one that the BJP and its allies argue would save valuable time, money, and resources while eliminating the disruptions caused by frequent impositions of the Model Code of Conduct. Supporters believe this change could streamline the election process, ensuring that elections occur simultaneously, reducing the frequency of electoral campaigns and their impact on governance.

However, Opposition parties, particularly the Congress, have raised concerns, arguing that ONOE could undermine



India's federal structure. They fear that synchronizing national and state elections would lead to an undue advantage for the party in power at the Centre, as voters may be more inclined to vote for the same party at both levels. This could stifle regional diversity in voting preferences, as seen in recent elections where state-level outcomes have diverged significantly from national results. For instance, while the BJP-led alliance emerged victorious in Maharashtra's Lok Sabha elections, the Congress-led coalition, Maha Vikas Aghadi, triumphed in the subsequent assembly polls, highlighting how separate elections can produce differing outcomes. Another important aspect of the ONOE

proposal is its long timeline for implementation. Even if the Bills pass Parliament, experts suggest that it could take up to a decade to fully implement the reform. Given the significant implications for voters, political parties, and the country's democratic framework, critics question the urgency behind pushing for such a monumental change.

In light of these concerns, a more democratic approach would be for the government to refer the Bills to a **Joint Parliamentary Committee** for further scrutiny and for efforts to be made to build a broad consensus across political parties before moving forward with this high-stakes reform.



As the world of cricket continues to evolve, the future of Test cricket remains a topic of significant debate. Despite the massive popularity of T20 formats, particularly franchise leagues, Test cricket continues to capture attention, but for how long? With shifting viewership patterns, shorter formats like T20 are dominating the cricketing landscape, but the allure of Test cricket still has a place, even if it's dwindling.

In 2024, 23 bilateral men's Test series are scheduled, but most feature fewer matches than in the past. Of these, 12 consist of just two games, five have three, and only two series—England vs India and India vs Australia—will have five matches. This reduction reflects a growing trend where Test series are becoming more compact and less frequent, with many teams playing fewer Tests against each other.

Interestingly, the viewership patterns are showing a dichotomy. While the demand for Test cricket may have shifted towards T20, some high-profile Test matches continue to draw large crowds. For example, the day-night Test between Australia and India in Adelaide attracted over a million viewers per session, while the Perth Test set a record for stadium attendance. This reveals a crucial fact: Test cricket still commands a solid fanbase, especially when major cricketing nations are involved. But outside of these marquee matchups, many



especially when their own country isn't participating.

This poses a significant challenge for the format's future. While T20 leagues, such as the Big Bash League, continue to grow in popularity, attracting global audiences—particularly from India—Test cricket is struggling to capture similar attention. The rise of franchise-based made by players themselves. For instance, Quinton de Kock retired from Test cricket at 29 to focus on T20s, while Kane Williamson stepped down as New

fans are less inclined to watch Tests, Zealand's white-ball captain to participate in the SA20 tournament. These developments raise questions about the long-term sustainability of Test cricket in an age dominated by shorter formats. Moreover, the stark gap between the top cricketing nations and lower-ranked teams creates another hurdle. While teams like Australia, India, South Africa, and England maintain high interest, lower-ranked nations like Afghanistan, T20 leagues is evident in the choices Zimbabwe, and Ireland rarely generate excitement. For Test cricket to regain its appeal, it needs more unpredictable results—such as when Afghanistan upset Australia in the 2024 T20 World Cup.

Another Pandemic Is Inevitable: Are We Prepared?

er warning that the H5N1 bird flu is steadily advancing toward a potential pandemic. Despite the lessons learned from the Covid-19 pandemic that struck just a few years ago, the U.S. still lacks a comprehensive plan to manage a new crisis. Furthermore, there has been little effort from government leaders to incorporate the lessons from their flawed response to Covid-19 into future preparedness strategies.

The Covid-19 pandemic highlighted significant shortcomings in the public health system. Many lives were lost because authorities were slow to issue warnings, delayed in creating essential testing protocols, and sluggish in adjusting their response to evolving data about the airborne transmission of the virus. One of the biggest criticisms was the handling of lockdowns, which, had they been implemented

> Unfortunately, the same mistakes are already emerging in the response to H5N1. Originally confined to poultry, the virus has now begun affecting dairy cows in the U.S. Last week, the U.S. Department of Agriculture announced it would begin testing the nation's milk supply for the virus. In California, a recall was issued for certain raw milk and milk products after they tested positive for the H5N1 strain. The slow and reactive response echoes the failures seen during the earlier pandemic and raises concerns about the nation's preparedness for a more widespread outbreak.

The lack of preparedness is further compounded by the political landscape. President-elect Donald Trump's appointments to lead public health

on data about risk levels, could have entists and health experts. One controversial pick is Robert F. Kennedy Jr., a vocal vaccine skeptic with ties to the California farm involved in the recent milk recall. Appointing such figures to lead crucial health agencies raises serious concerns about the direction of the U.S. pandemic response, especially if H5N1 begins spreading more rapidly. Without these steps, the country remains vulnerable to the next pandemic, whether it's H5N1 or another viral threat.

Congress Promoted water Disputes Between States, Does Little For Farmers: PM Modi

The 'One Nation, One Election' proposal has been a subject of intense political discourse, with supporters arguing that simultaneous elections would reduce election-related costs, prevent election fatigue, and bring about greater governance stability. Critics, however, argue that it could weaken India's federal structure by diminishing the autonomy of state governments and potentially sidelining resolutions are found to provide a processing forces of patients and potentially sidelining resolutions.

The introduction of these Bills marks an important step in the government's push for electoral reform. Uddhav Thackeray Meets Devendra Fadnavis For 1st Time After Poll Rout

In a surprising move, Uddhav Thackeray, the leader of the Shiv Sena (Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray), met Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis in Nagpur on Tuesday for the first time since last month's Assembly elections. Despite his party's ongoing protests regarding the credibility of Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) after their poor performance in the polls, Thackeray congratulated Fadnavis on the victory of the ruling coalition.

Aaditya Thackeray, Uddhav's son and a senior leader in the party, accompanied his father to the meeting and described it as a step toward political cooperation. Speaking to the media, Aaditya emphasized that both parties needed to demonstrate political maturity. "We may be in the opposition, and they may be in the ruling coalition, but we are all elected representatives. They (the ruling parties) can also listen to us, and this could lead to constructive actions for Maharashtra's benefit," he said.

Sources revealed that the meeting, held in Fadnavis' chambers at the Vidhan Bhavan during the ongoing winter session of the Assembly, was a courtesy call. Thackeray, who was the leader of the united Shiv Sena before parting ways with the BJP in 2019, congratulated the Chief Minister on the coalition's victory. The Shiv Sena, under Thackeray, had been in an alliance with the BJP until a disagreement over the Chief Minister's post led to a split. Thackeray later formed a government with the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) and Congress, but his administration collapsed in 2022 following a rebellion by Eknath Shinde, who later became the Chief Minister with Fadnavis as his deputy.

The meeting marks a significant moment, given the history of rivalry between Thackeray and Fadnavis. Both leaders have clashed over ideological differences, particularly regarding the interpretation of 'Hindutva.' While Thackeray's alliance with Congress and NCP had a strong showing in the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, it faced a crushing defeat in last month's Assembly polls, with the BJP winning a landslide.

Despite this, the Shiv Sena, NCP, and Congress have continued to raise concerns about the integrity of the elections, claiming that the ruling coalition's success was due to alleged EVM manipulation. This controversy has sparked protests and accusations within the Assembly.

One Nation, One Election: Kiren Rijiju slams Congress for 'baseless' opposition

Union Minister Kiren Rijiju on Tuesday strongly criticized the Congress party for its opposition to the 'One Nation, One Election' (ONOE) proposal, calling their stance "baseless and contradictory." Rijiju's comments came in response to Congress' claims that the initiative would harm India's federal structure and was unconstitutional. He pointed out that similar elections were held simultaneously for two decades after 1947 under the leadership of Jawaharlal Nehru, asking, "If elections were held together then, was the Nehru government unconstitutional?"

Rijiju, who has been vocal in defending the proposal, emphasized its importance for India's progress. He also took aim at Congress' historical governance, stating, "Congress ruled for six decades and left the country in poverty. Under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership, India is now moving towards becoming a 'Viksit Bharat.' Yet, Congress continues to obstruct national progress instead of collaborating."

Rijiju's remarks were made on the same day the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) introduced the ONOE bill in the Lok Sabha, with the party issuing a three-line whip for MPs to attend the session. While opposition leaders raised concerns about potential difficulties, such as the dissolution of Assemblies or scenarios where the state or Union government may fall before completing their tenure, Rijiju urged them to view the proposal from a broader perspec-



tive of national development.

The minister also weighed in on the ongoing controversy surrounding Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs). The Congress party has raised questions about the reliability of EVMs, even though the party has benefited from them in past elections. Rijiju pointed out that Congress won elections in 2004 and 2009 using the same EVMs, asking, "Were their victories illegal?" He further criticized Congress for questioning a system that has helped their own party come to power.

Rijiju concluded by urging opposition parties to work constructively for the nation's development instead of hindering reforms.

Amit Shah Accuses Congress of Treating Constitution as 'Private Fiefdom' to Retain Power

Union Home Minister Amit Shah launched a strong critique of the Congress party on Tuesday, accusing it of treating the Indian Constitution as the "private fiefdom" of one family and making several amendments to ensure its continued grip on power. Speaking during a discussion on the "Glorious Journey of 75 Years of the Constitution of India," Shah said that the Congress party had altered the Constitution for its own benefit rather than for the greater good of the nation.

Shah highlighted various amendments made by the Congress over the years, suggesting that these changes were designed to serve the party's interests and help it maintain political control. He also took aim at the Congress for its stance on reservations, accusing the party of being "anti-reservation" and claiming that it had failed to work for the advancement of backward classes.

The Home Minister's remarks extended to the issue of electronic voting machines (EVMs), with Shah criticizing the Congress for blaming the EVMs after its electoral defeats. He referred to the party's complaints about the credibility of EVMs as an attempt



to avoid responsibility for their loss in elections.

Shah emphasized that the Indian Constitution, which marks its 75th anniversary, has played a crucial role in strengthening the country's democracy by ensuring peaceful transitions of power. He praised the Constitution for its resilience and the smooth transfer of power, which, according to him, happens without any violence or bloodshed.

The Home Minister's statements served as a sharp reminder of the long-standing political battle between the Congress and the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), with Shah accusing the opposition party of undermining the integrity of India's democratic institutions. His remarks on the amendments, reservations, and the controversy over EVMs were a direct attack on Congress's track record and its approach to governance.



Trump Urges Zelenskyy To Prepare For Negotiations To End Russia-Ukraine War

WASHINGTON: Former President Donald Trump has urged Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy to be ready to negotiate a deal to end the ongoing Russian invasion. Speaking at his Mar-a-Lago club in Florida, Trump downplayed the importance of recovering occupied territories and emphasized the need for a settlement to stop the bloodshed. He stated, "He should be prepared to make a deal, that's all," adding that too many lives were being lost in the conflict.

Trump, reflecting on the devastation of Ukrainian cities, argued that it could take a century to rebuild areas leveled by Russian forces. He questioned the value of recapturing the territory, saying, "You look at some of those cities, and not one building standing. So you know, when you say, 'Take over the country,' take over what?" Trump emphasized the long-term challenge of reconstruction, calling it a "110-year rebuild."

The former president also criticized the Biden administration for its approval of using U.S. weapons, including Army Tactical Missile Systems (ATACMS), to strike deeper into Russian territory. The missiles have a range of about 300 kilome-



ters (190 miles). Trump suggested that such actions might escalate the conflict and indicated that, under his leadership, U.S. support for Ukraine would be significantly reduced.

Trump's remarks signal a shift in his approach to the conflict, suggesting that if he were president, he would pursue a more isolationist stance regarding Ukraine. He argued that Russia would not have invaded Ukraine if he were still in office, further criticizing President

Biden's handling of the situation. While Trump's position contrasts with the Biden administration's support for Ukraine's right to decide its course of action, the White House reaffirmed that it is up to Zelenskyy to decide when and under what terms to negotiate with Russia. National Security Council spokesperson John Kirby emphasized, "Nothing about Ukraine without Ukraine," underlining the administration's commitment to supporting Ukraine's sovereignty and decisions regarding negotiations.

"Preposterous": China On Spying Claims Involving UK's Prince Andrew

BRITAN: China has dismissed claims that businessman Yang Tengbo used his links with Prince Andrew to spy for Beijing, calling the accusations "preposterous." The allegations, which emerged last week, have raised significant concerns within the UK government, leading to heightened scrutiny of China's actions in the country.

Yang, a businessman who had been banned from entering the UK, was reportedly invited to Prince Andrew's birthday party in the past. He has strongly denied the spying allegations, asserting that he had "done nothing wrong or unlawful." In a statement, Yang claimed to have been caught in a shifting "political climate" and emphasized that the label of "spy" was completely untrue. He also noted that he had waived his anonymity and was appealing the UK's decision regarding his exclusion.

The UK government has expressed growing concern about China's increasing influence, particularly regarding alleged espionage activities. Prime Minister Keir Starmer, speaking during a visit to Norway, acknowledged the challenge China poses but defended his strategy of "engagement" with Beijing. He emphasized that Britain seeks to cooperate with China on issues like climate change, while also challenging Beijing when necessary.

In response to the allegations, a spokesperson for China's foreign ministry stressed that accusations of espionage were unfounded, calling them "preposterous." Lin Jian, the spokesperson, also underscored the importance of developing strong China-UK relations, which he argued were beneficial for both countries and crucial for addressing global challenges. The UK's decision to ban Yang from entering the country was upheld by British judges, who agreed that the government's actions were justified. The judges noted that Yang's position made him well-placed to foster relationships between senior Chinese officials and prominent UK figures, potentially leading to political interference.

Former PM Imran Khan And Bushra Bibi's Bail Extended In Toshakhana Case

ISLAMABAD: Pakistani court has extended the interim bail of former Prime Minister Imran Khan and his wife, Bushra Bibi, in the second Toshakhana case until January 7. The hearing was conducted on Tuesday at the District and Sessions Court in Islamabad, where Judge Muhammad Afzal Mujoka presided over the bail petitions.

Khan, who remains in custody due to other ongoing cases, and his wife Bibi, who was released in October following the Islam-

abad High Court's approval of her post-arrest bail, both face charges related to the alleged violation of Toshakhana rules during Khan's tenure as prime minister. The case involves accusations that they illegally retained a set of Bulgari jewelry gifted to them during a trip to Saudi Arabia in May 2021.

Saudi Arabia in May 2021.

The Toshakhana case, often referred to as Toshakhana 2.0,

centers on allegations that the couple unlawfully kept valuable gifts from foreign dignitaries, violating the rules of the state gift repository. In the latest development, both Khan and Bibi were formally indicted last week by a trial court, where Special Judge Shahrukh Arjumand read out the charges against them. Following the indictment, the court postponed further proceedings until December 18, when the prosecution, led by the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA), is set to present its first batch of witnesses.

The ongoing case has drawn significant attention, given Khan's high-profile political career and his contentious relationship with the ruling government. The Toshakhana case is one of several legal battles the former cricketer-turned-politician faces. Khan's political future remains uncertain as he confronts multiple charges, with the legal proceedings continuing to unfold.

India's Diplomatic Move In North Korea Marks Significant Shift In Policy

DELHI: As global attention remains focused on the conflicts in the Middle East and Europe, India has quietly shifted its focus eastward, pursuing its Act East policy. One of the significant developments in this strategy is New Delhi's renewed efforts to strengthen diplomatic ties with North Korea, a country often shrouded in secrecy.

In July 2021, India made the decision to shut its embassy in Pyongyang, with Ambassador Atul Malhari Gotsurve and the entire diplomatic staff returning to New Delhi via Moscow. Although the Indian Ministry of External Affairs never officially declared the embassy's closure, the government attributed the withdrawal to the COVID-19 pandemic when questioned. Since then, there had been no updates on India's diplomatic presence in North Korea. However, in a surprising move this month, India decided to resume normal operations at its



embassy in Pyongyang. A team of technical and diplomatic personnel was dispatched to North Korea to reestablish the mission, which had been closed for over three years.

The embassy now requires a thorough inspection and cleaning before it can resume full functions. Given North Korea's reputation for surveillance and espionage, the embassy building will need

to be carefully checked and "debugged" before it becomes operational. This process, along with the bureaucratic delays common in North Korea, suggests that the arrival of a new ambassador and the full diplomatic team could take several months.

North Korea's growing military capabilities, particularly in nuclear and missile technology, make its diplomatic importance significant for India. Maintaining a presence in Pyongyang is crucial for India, especially to prevent any transfer of such technology to adversaries like Pakistan. Furthermore, North Korea's increasing alignment with Russia, China, and Iran poses a challenge to the Quad alliance, which includes the US, Japan, India, and Australia. With strong ties already established with Moscow and Tehran, India's cautious engagement with North Korea remains vital to countering this growing geopolitical influence.

Reverse Gear To Overdrive: Ajit Doval's Top China Meet To Boost Border Talks

DELHI: India and China have shown a renewed commitment to improving their bilateral ties, especially following the disengagement along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) just over a month ago. The relationship between the two countries had been strained since the military standoff in Ladakh more than four years ago. However, in a surprising turn of events, both sides seem to be accelerating efforts to repair their ties, recognizing the importance of resolving their boundary dispute for lasting peace in Asia.

National Security Adviser Ajit Doval is set to meet Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi on December 18 for high-level discussions on the boundary issue. Although New Delhi has not officially confirmed the meeting, Beijing's foreign ministry has announced it. This marks the 23rd meeting in a series of talks between the two countries aimed at finding a resolution to the long-standing boundary question.

The two nations, which share a border spanning over 4,000 km, have often experienced military face-offs due to their differing perceptions of where the LAC lies. The LAC, located in the harsh and challenging terrain of the Himalayas, lacks clear demarcations, which has contributed to regular border tensions. Historically, the boundary between India and Tibet was understood as the boundary between India and China after China's takeover of Tibet in 1959. Over the years, multiple military clashes have occurred, notably the deadly skirmish in Galwan Valley in 2020, which led to casualties on both sides.

The last such high-level meeting was held in December 2019, but the progress in discussions halted after the Galwan Valley clash. It took over four years of diplomatic and military dialogue to reach an agreement for disengagement, with both sides reaching an understanding in October 2023. This agreement culminated in a rare meeting between Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping on the sidelines of the BRICS summit in Russia.

As India and China continue to prioritize the resolution of their border dispute, the upcoming meeting between Doval and Wang Yi is seen as a critical step toward de-escalation and peaceful coexistence between the two nations.



Sri Lankan President Dissanayake Prays at Mahabodhi Temple

BIHAR: Sri Lankan President Anura Kumara Dissanayake visited Bodh Gaya in Bihar's Gaya district on Tuesday, where he offered prayers at the Mahabodhi Temple, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Dissanayake's visit marked a significant moment as he paid his respects at one of the holiest sites in Buddhism, associated with the life and enlightenment of Lord Buddha.

Upon his arrival at Gaya International Airport, the Sri Lankan President was warmly received by Bihar ministers Prem Kumar and Santosh Kumar Suman, along with senior district administration officials. Dissanayake, accompanied by key local figures including Gaya District Magistrate Thiyagarajan SM and Mahashweta Maharathi, the secretary of the Bodhgaya Temple Management Committee (BTMC), made his way directly to the historic Mahabodhi Temple.

The Mahabodhi Temple, which dates back 1,500 years, is one of the four primary sites that commemorate significant events in Lord Buddha's life, particularly his attainment of Enlightenment. India's Iron and Steel Imports Drop 28% Amid Concerns from MSMEs



India's iron and steel imports saw a significant decline of **1**28% in November, according to official data released on Monday. The fall, from \$2.4 billion in November of the previous year to \$1.7 billion this year, has raised concerns among Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) regarding the availability of affordable imported steel.

The reduction in imports comes as the Steel Ministry faces delays in issuing No Objection Certificates (NOCs) for steel consignments at ports, which has hindered the timely entry of cheaper imported steel into the market. The import restrictions have been further exacerbated by the lobbying efforts of large steel manufacturers, who have pushed for the imposition of safeguard duties to limit the entry of foreign steel. These efforts aim to protect domestic steel producers but have sparked concerns among smaller businesses, particularly MSMEs.

MSMEs, which rely heavily on access to affordable steel for manufacturing and production, have expressed fears that these protective measures could severely impact their operations. They argue that the restricted access to cheaper imported steel would lead to higher costs for raw materials, making it difficult for them to compete in the market. Additionally, smaller businesses may find it challenging to meet the increased prices of domestically produced steel, which could ultimately affect their production capacity and exports.

The Indian government's move to curb steel imports through safeguard duties has drawn mixed reactions. While large steel companies argue that these measures are necessary to protect domestic industries and jobs, MSMEs stress that such steps could have a detrimental effect on the broader economy, particularly for smaller enterprises that do not have the same bargaining power as larger manufacturers.

As the debate over import restrictions continues, MSMEs are calling for a balanced approach that ensures affordable steel remains accessible to all businesses, without harming the growth prospects of small and medium-sized enterprises that are crucial to the country's industrial ecosystem.

India Sees Rise in Per Capita Availability of Fruits and Vegetables: Report

Lcant increase in the per capita production and supply chains availability of fruits and vegetables over the past decade, according to a recent report by SBI Research. The availability of fruits per person has risen by 7 kg, while vegetables have increased by 12 kg. The report highlights that the primary growth in production has been observed in states such as Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, and Jammu & Kashmir, where agricultural output has seen substantial improvements.

Currently, India produces 227 kg of fruits and vegetables per person annually, which exceeds the general dietary recommendation of 146 kg per person each year. However, despite the increase in production, a significant portion of the produce is lost due to its perishable nature. Losses occur during harvesting, storage, grading, and transportation, reconsumption.

Tndia has witnessed a signifi- adversely affected agriculture in recent years. The report indicates a negative correlation between foodgrain production and extreme weather conditions in most states. For example, the Indian Council for Agricultural Research notes that a 1-degree Celsius rise in temperature above 30 degrees Celsius during the grain-filling period can reduce wheat yields.

These climate shocks have also contributed to a rise in food inflation, pushing prices up by 3-4% in recent years. Additionally, the report mentions that increased urbanization in states like Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan is also contributing to higher demand for fruits and vegetables. Urbanization, which has grown by more than 5% in the past decade, is driven by factors such as rising incomes and better job opportunities in cities, leading to ducing the actual availability for a greater need for fresh produce.

As urbanization continues to The report also sheds light on increase, the demand for fruits and vegetables is expected to rise, further shaping India's agricultural landscape and consumption patterns.



India's Q2 Economic Growth Weaker Than Expected: FM Sitharaman

 $F_{ ext{Nirmala}}^{ ext{inance Minister}}$ raman on Tuesday downplayed lower-than-expected GDP growth rate of 5.4% for the second quarter of the fiscal year, calling it a "temporary blip." She reassured lawmakers that the Indian economy would see healthy growth in the coming quarters, asserting that the country continues to be the fastest-growing major economy in the world.

During a debate in the Lok Sabha on the first batch of Supplementary Demands for Grants, Sitharaman highlighted that India's GDP growth has averaged 8.3% over the past three years, reflecting "steady and sustained" growth. The second quarter's 5.4% growth was a dip from the 6.7% growth recorded in the first quarter (April-June) of the year, but the finance minister emphasized that there was no cause for long-term concern.

Sitharaman further stated that there is no broad-based slowdown in the manufacturing sector, noting that half of the sectors within the overall manufacturing basket remain robust. She attributed the minor dip in growth to temporary factors and insisted that the econo-



my would recover strongly in the upcoming quarters.

On inflation, the finance minister pointed out that inflation control has been more effective under the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) government, contrasting it with the double-digit inflation witnessed during the United Progressive Alliance (UPA) era. Sitharaman highlighted that retail inflation for the period of April-October 2024-25 stood at 4.8%, the lowest since the Covid-19 pandemic, further bolstering the government's track record on economic stability.

With these remarks, Sitharaman assured the Parliament that the Indian economy, despite the temporary slowdown, remains on a solid growth trajectory, supported by strong fundamentals and effective governance.

Is Alkaline Water Good For Health?



Alkaline water has recently gained popularity, with many health influencers promoting its supposed benefits. A First Check reader asked whether drinking alkaline water offers any health advantages. This query reflects the growing interest in alkaline water, which is often marketed as a solution to health issues such as weight loss and acidity. But is it really beneficial?

Alkaline water, also known as alkaline ionized water, has a higher pH level than regular drinking water. pH measures the acidity or alkalinity of water on a scale from 0 to 14, with 7 being neutral. While regular drinking water typically has a pH between 6.5 and 8.5, alkaline water is artificially created by adding minerals such as calcium and magnesium, then electrolyzing the water to produce a pH of 9-10. Proponents suggest that drinking alkaline water can help neutralize acid in the body, improving health and aiding in weight loss.

However, the idea that altering the body's pH with alkaline foods or drinks can lead to significant health benefits is unsupported by scientific evidence. The body maintains a tightly controlled pH balance, espe-

cially in the stomach, where the pH typically ranges from 1 to 3.5. Even if alkaline water slightly raises the pH of the blood, the kidneys quickly work to restore balance, making any lasting changes from drinking alkaline water negligible.

One minor benefit of alkaline water is that it may provide temporary relief from acidity and heartburn by neutralizing excess stomach acid. However, there is no solid evidence to support long-term health benefits, and drinking large amounts of alkaline water may have unintended side effects. For example, water with a pH of 9 or above can have a bitter taste and may interact negatively with certain medications, especially those used to reduce stomach acidity. It can also potentially harm individuals with kidney disease by altering potassium levels, leading to conditions such as hypokalemia, which can result in serious issues like cardiac disease or kidney failure.

In conclusion, while alkaline water may offer short-term relief from acidity, there is no compelling evidence to suggest it provides any significant health benefits.




One In A Billion Perfect Sphere Egg Sold For Around Rs 21,500 In England

Arare spherical egg has been sold for £200 (around Rs 21,500) in Oxfordshire, England, after being donated to the Iuventas Foundation, a non-profit organization that supports young people with mental health issues, life coaching, and mentorship. The egg, originally bought by Ed Pownell, was sold as part of a charity auction that raised a total of £5,000 for the foundation's programs.

Roz Rapp, a representative for the Iuventas Foundation, expressed her delight over the sale, stating, "We're delighted and thrilled that the egg is sold, as it means we can continue our work." She clarified that the spherical hen's egg was just one of many items featured in the auction. The funds raised will go toward helping 13–25-year-olds struggling with mental health challenges, enabling the foundation to support more young people who are on long waiting lists for assistance.

The rare egg was originally discovered in a box of eggs from a local grocery store in Ayr, Scotland, by a woman who found the spherical shape unusual. According to David Miller from the auction firm Thomson Roddick Callan, where the egg was sold, spherical eggs are considered a "one-in-a-billion" phenomenon. This unique feature contributed to the egg's appeal at the auction, making it a highly sought-after item.

The money raised from the auction will help the Iuventas Foundation extend its outreach to more youths in need, providing crucial support for mental health and well-being. This sale highlights the power of community involvement, where a rare item can make a significant impact on a worthy cause, enabling the charity to reach more young people who need help and guidance.



The massive iceberg A23a, which is ■ both the largest and oldest iceberg in the world, has resumed its northward movement after being trapped in a rotating water column near the South Orkney Islands for several months. Weighing around one trillion tonnes and covering an area twice the size of Greater London, A23a had been stationary in the Weddell Sea for over three decades before beginning its gradual drift in 2020. Recent reports indicate that it is now being carried by the Antarctic Circumpolar Current, which could potentially lead it towards South Georgia.

A23a's temporary stall was caused by a rare oceanographic event known as a Taylor Column. This phenomenon occurs when rotating water above an underwater seamount prevents objects from moving freely. The Taylor Column trapped A23a in the Weddell Sea, stalling its anticipated drift. Dr. Andrew Meijers, an oceanographer at the British Antarctic Survey (BAS), explained the significance of this change in movement. He noted that the BAS team is now eager to track whether A23a will follow the same path as other large Antarctic icebergs, and assess its potential effects on the surrounding marine ecosystems.

Scientists aboard the British Antarctic Survey vessel, RRS *Sir David Attenborough*, have been monitoring A23a to better understand its impact on local ecosystems. The iceberg's influence on nutrient distribution and carbon cycles is a focus of the BIOPOLE project, which aims to assess how large icebergs affect the Southern Ocean's ecology. Laura Taylor, a biogeochemist involved in the study, stated that large icebergs, like A23a, often enrich the waters they pass through, stimulating biodiversity in otherwise barren areas. Further research will investigate how the size and origin of an iceberg influence these environmental processes.

As A23a continues its drift, its effects on the Southern Ocean ecosystem remain a key area of study for scientists monitoring this colossal iceberg's journey.

The statement also clarified that Mudryk had categorically denied knowingly using any banned substances and pledged to work with the relevant authorities to determine the cause of the adverse result.

Mudryk himself addressed the issue on Instagram, expressing shock at the news. He said, "I have been notified that a sample I provided to the FA contained a banned substance. This has come as a complete shock as I have never knowingly used any banned substances or broken any rules, and am working closely with my team to investigate how this could have happened." He added that he is confident he has done nothing wrong and remains hopeful about returning to the pitch soon. He also emphasized his commitment to maintaining confidentiality as the investigation continues.
