YCP Launches Statewide Protest Against Increased Electricity Charges

The YCP has intensified its fight against the coalition government in Andhra Pradesh, with protests erupting across the state over the recent hike in electricity charges. The party, which has already organized rallies in support of farmers, held dharnas in all districts on Friday, accusing the government of burdening the people despite promises to reduce electricity charges.

YCP leaders have made it clear that they will not be intimidated by cases or threats. They emphasized that the struggle against the government's policies will continue unabated. Former Minister Ambati Rambabu, speaking during one such protest, strongly stated that YCP's fight is not motivated by fear but by the need to hold the government accountable for its actions. He dismissed claims that YCP is weakened by its reduced seat count, stressing that the party still enjoys significant support, with 40 percent of the vote share. Rambabu asserted that the party will persist in opposing the government's anti-people policies, including the electricity charge hike.

In a related criticism, MP Mithun Reddy accused former Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu of misleading the public by promising no increase in electricity charges during the elections. Instead, the state has now been saddled with a debt of Rs. 15,485.36 crore, with the government already beginning to collect Rs. 6,072.86 crore. YCP leaders revealed that another Rs. 9,412.50 crore is set to be collected starting in January. YSRCP activists have staged protests at electricity offices throughout the state, expressing their dissatisfaction with the government's actions and reaffirming their commitment to challenging the current administration's policies.

Revenue Meetings to Continue Until All Issues Are Resolved - RP Sisodia

Special Chief Secretary of the Revenue Department, RP Sisodia, announced that revenue meetings will continue across the state until all revenue-related issues are resolved. Speaking at a constituency-level revenue meeting in Pedapalaparru village, Mudinepalli Mandal, Eluru district, Sisodia emphasized that Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu has instructed officials to address people's grievances regarding revenue matters.

Sisodia highlighted that several errors, particularly related to land records, were caused by faulty surveys, with some lands incorrectly recorded under Section 22A. He assured that these errors would be rectified. So far, 1.35 lakh petitions have been received through the revenue meet-



ings, which are aimed at resolving local issues. However, Sisodia clarified that these meetings will not address issues pending in court. He also assured that petitions submitted during the meetings would be acknowledged, and no fees would be charged for filing them.

Kaikaluru MLA, Kamineni Srinivas, also spoke at the meeting, emphasizing the need for permanent solutions to long-standing revenue issues in the constituency, including vyvaka lands and Kolleru lands. Despite paying taxes, the occupants of these lands have been unable to claim ownership. Kamineni urged the government to address these concerns and provide lasting solutions. Villagers raised issues regarding incorrect issuance of joint Land Possession Memos (LPMs) for multiple

lands due to a resurvey carried out by the previous government, leading to disputes among landowners. They also complained about the inconvenience caused by combining patta lands with gram kantham lands. The meeting was attended by Eluru District Joint Collector Dathri Reddy, Eluru RDO Ambareesh, Mudinepalli Tahsildar Subani, and other officials.







Minister Durgesh Pledges Govt Support at Graphite Crucible Industry Centenary

Crowds Flood AP Registration Offices as Charge Hike Looms

Registration offices across Andhra Pradesh have been overwhelmed with large crowds as people rush to complete property registrations before an expected increase in charges. The coalition government had initially planned to implement the new registration charges starting January 1, but the decision has been postponed as the necessary procedures are still being finalized. Despite the delay, officials have already submitted proposals for the increase in registration fees, and the new charges are anticipated to be enforced soon. As a result, there has been a significant surge in visitors to sub-registrar offices throughout the state. On Friday, the registration offices saw double the usual number of transactions, with people eager to complete property deals, purchases, and sales before the fee hike takes effect. The rush has led to commotion at the registration offices, as citizens seek to finalize their paperwork ahead of the price increase. While the exact date for the new charges remains unclear, the ongoing surge in registrations indicates that many are anxious to avoid higher fees.



Raghurama Custodial Torture Case, Vijaypal's Bail and **Custody Hearing Postponed**

The hearing for the bail and custody petitions of former CID officer Vijaypal, arrested in connection with the Raghurama Krishna Raju custodial torture

case, has been postponed. The hearing, which was scheduled for today, will now take place on the 30th of this month.

Vijaypal, the former Additional SP of CID, was arrested in relation to the alleged torture of AP Assembly Deputy Speaker Raghurama Krishna Raju during the previous government's tenure. He is currently in custody at Guntur jail. Today, the Guntur court took up the hearing for Vijaypal's bail petition and the custody petitions of CID officers involved in the case. After the arguments, the court decided to postpone the hearing to later this month. Vijaypal had earlier approached the Supreme Court seeking anticipatory



bail in the case. However, his petition was dismissed by the apex court, leading to his arrest. The investigation into the custodial torture case is being conducted under the supervision of Prakasam District SP Damodar. The case has garnered significant attention, with the alleged custodial abuse of Raghurama Krishna Raju becoming a point of controversy. The outcome of the upcoming hearing will be crucial for Vijaypal's legal battle in this high-profile case.



Minister Gummadi Sandhyarani Criticizes YCP's

Claims on Electricity Charges

Minister Gummadi Sandhyarani has expressed strong disapproval of the YCP's claims regarding the increase in electricity charges, accusing them of hypocrisy. Speaking at a press conference at the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) central office in Mangalagiri on Friday, she criticized the YCP for protesting against the very charges they imposed during their tenure.

Sandhyarani pointed out that the YCP government had raised electricity bills ten times in the last five years, leading to a burden of Rs. 32,000 crore on consumers. She emphasized that people had rejected Jagan Reddy's leadership, as evidenced by the limited support YCP received in the elections, securing only 11 seats. She also questioned the credibility of Sakshi media, which she claimed was spreading lies.

Highlighting the achievements of the TDP government under Chandrababu Naidu, Sandhyarani recalled how AP transitioned from a power deficit of 22.5 million units in 2014 to a power surplus state by 2019. She also criticized the current YCP government for its mishandling of the electricity sector, which included the cancellation of power purchase agreements (PPAs) and neglect of solar power generation, resulting in financial losses.

In response to claims about pension schemes, Sandhyarani reiterated that the TDP government provides a monthly pension of Rs. 4,000 for the elderly, significantly higher than other states. She also noted that the TDP is committed to providing free solar electricity to SCs and STs, offering an alternative energy solution to reduce the electricity burden.

Minister Sandhyarani concluded by stressing that TDP's focus is on public welfare, promising to continue working towards the betterment of the state's people.



Minister Nimmala Criticizes YCP's Protest on Electricity Charges, Suggests Dharna at Jagan's House

Minister Anagani Satya Prasad Slams Jagan Over Power Sector Burdens

Andhra Pradesh Minister Anagani Satya Prasad has launched a sharp attack on YSRCP chief YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, accusing him of crippling the state's power sector with mismanagement and heavy financial burdens during his regime. Speaking to the media on Friday, Satya Prasad criticized Jagan for what he called "irresponsible actions" that left the people of Andhra Pradesh struggling under increased electricity costs.

The minister claimed that Jagan's government had imposed a burden of nearly ₹1.30 lakh crore on the state's power sector by purchasing electricity at inflated prices of ₹8 to ₹14 per unit, instead of the standard ₹5 per unit. He further alleged that Jagan canceled solar and wind energy Power Purchase Agreements (PPAs), rendering 10,000 megawatts of renewable energy unavailable to the state.

Highlighting recent developments, Satya Prasad pointed out that the Jagan government approved a ₹17,000 crore increase in true-up charges for the 2022-2024 period, with orders from the Electricity Regulatory Commission (ERC) to implement the charges starting December. "It is shameful that Jagan is now protesting against the very electricity charges he approved," Satya Prasad remarked.

He lashed out at Jagan's "hypocritical" actions, calling him a "crazy Tughlaq" for leading protests against policies he himself enacted. The minister condemned YS-RCP's ongoing dharnas against electricity tariff hikes,



stating that they are an attempt to mislead the public and distract from the failures of Jagan's governance. Satya Prasad's remarks add to the growing criticism of Jagan's handling of the energy sector, as leaders across the political spectrum continue to voice their discontent with his administration's policies.

Judgment Reserved on Anticipatory Bail Plea of Perni Nani's Wife in Ration Rice Case

The 9th Additional District Judge's Court in Machilipatnam has reserved its judgment on the anticipatory bail petition filed by Jayasudha, wife of former minister Perni Nani, in connection with the missing ration rice case. The verdict is scheduled to be announced on the 30th of this month. Senior advocate Varadarajulu represented Jayasudha, while Special Public Prosecutor Venkateswara Rao argued on behalf of the government. Following extensive arguments from both sides, the judge decided to reserve the judgment. The case pertains to the disappearance of 3,708 bags of ration rice from a godown in Machilipatnam, which were reportedly stored under Jayasudha's name. Civil Supplies Department officials lodged a complaint with the police, leading to a case being registered against Jayasudha and the godown manager, Manas Teja. In response to the case, Jayasudha



sought anticipatory bail, arguing for protection against arrest. The court's decision will play a crucial role in determining the next steps in the legal proceedings surrounding the allegations.



Shocking Twist in Dead Body Parcel Case, **Accused Had ₹2 Crore in Bank Accounts**

Dist : In a chilling revelation, police arrested Sridhar Verma, the prime accused in the infamous "dead body parcel case" of Yandagandi, Undi mandal, West Godavari district. Key details of the gruesome crime came to light during interrogation, exposing a conspiracy involving property disputes, multiple wives, and occult practices. Sridhar Verma, along with his third wife Sushma and ten-year-old daughter, orchestrated the murder of Parlayya, a solitary villager, in a plot to seize the property of his sister-in-law, Tulasi. The accused, aided by his second wife Revathi and Sushma, conspired to intimidate Tulasi by send-

The chilling sequence of events unfolded as follows:

• The Murder: Parlayya, inebriated, was taken to a secluded location and strangled to death with a nylon rope. His body was then placed in a wooden box prepared at Sridhar's residence in Gandhinagar.

• **The Parcel:** The box containing the corpse was delivered to Tulasi's house, causing her immense distress. Using threats and coercion, Sridhar and his accomplices pressured Tulasi to sign over her property.

• The Escape: After Tulasi secretly sought help from acquaintances,

daughter, using over 40 SIM cards to evade the police.

The police eventually apprehended the trio in a rented house near Manginapudi beach in Krishna district. Dr. Manmohan Singh (September 26, 1932 - December 26, 2024) was a distinguished economist, politician, and reformist who played a pivotal role in shaping India's economic policies. As the 13th Prime Minister of India (2004-2014), Singh left an indelible mark on the nation's development trajectory. Notably, he was the first Sikh and the first leader from a minority community to hold the office of Prime Minister.






Academic Excellence and Professional Journey

Dr. Singh's academic journey began with a Bachelor's and Master's in Economics from Panjab University (1952, 1954), followed by his Economic Tripos from Cambridge University in 1957 and a D.Phil. in Economics from Oxford University in 1962.

His career spanned academia, government service, and international organizations. After teaching at Punjab University and the Delhi School of Economics, he joined the Government of India in 1971 as Economic Advisor in the Commerce Ministry, later becoming Chief Economic Advisor in 1972. He also served as:

- Governor of the Reserve Bank of India
- Deputy Chairman of the Planning Commission
- Secretary in the Finance Ministry

• Chairman of the University Grants Commission Dr. Singh was also the Secretary General of the South Commission in Geneva (1987–1990). His vast experience prepared him for his role as a transformative policymaker.

The Prime Ministerial Era (2004-2014)

Dr. Singh's tenure as Prime Minister saw India achieve an average growth rate of 7%, with GDP growth averaging 6.7% during his leadership. His handling of the 2008 global financial crisis minimized its impact on India through monetary easing and fiscal stimulus.

He introduced landmark social welfare programs such as the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), which provided 100 days of guaranteed employment to rural households, significantly reducing poverty.

Dissolves Parliament To Pave Way For Feb Snap Elections



BERLIN: German President Frank-Walter Steinmeier dissolved the country's lower house of parliament on Friday, triggering snap elections set for February 23, following the collapse of Chancellor Olaf Scholz's three-way coalition government. The move comes after Scholz lost a confidence vote earlier this month, stemming from the departure of Finance Minister Christian Lindner's Free Democrats, which left his government without a legislative majority.

The dissolution of parliament sets the stage for intense election campaigning, with conservative challenger Friedrich Merz gaining significant traction in recent polls. Merz, who is widely expected to challenge Scholz for the chancellorship, criticized the outgoing government for imposing excessive regulations that he believes have hindered Germany's economic growth.

In recent polls, the conservative bloc holds a commanding lead over Scholz's Social Democratic Party (SPD), with a gap of more than 10 points. The far-right Alternative for Germany (AfD) party is also making gains, slightly ahead of the SPD, while the Greens have dropped to fourth place in the standings.

The presence of the AfD in German politics complicates the situation for the mainstream parties, as they have consistently refused to enter into coalitions with the far-right group. This dynamic is expected to make coalition-building more challenging after the elections, with the likelihood of unwieldy and fragmented government alliances.

India's Economy **Expected to Grow at** 6.5% in FY2024-25



Tndia's economy is projected to grow Lat 6.5% in FY2024-25, according to the Finance Ministry's Monthly Economic Review released on Thursday. This optimistic outlook comes as agricultural and industrial activities are expected to gain momentum in the second half of the fiscal year, following a slowdown in the first half.

India's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth rate fell to 5.4% in Q2 of FY2024-25, marking the lowest growth in seven quarters. This slower growth, which has persisted for three consecutive quarters, led to a 6% growth rate for the first half of the fiscal year.

Despite this, the Finance Ministry remains optimistic about the prospects for the third quarter. "The outlook for Q3 appears bright," the report states, citing improved agricultural conditions due to higher minimum support prices (MSP), favorable reservoir levels, and sufficient fertilizer availability for rabi crop sowing. Additionally, industrial activity is expected to pick up in the coming months.

The end of the monsoon season, along with anticipated increases in government capital expenditure, is expected to boost key sectors like cement, iron, steel, mining, and electricity. The services sector also continues to perform strongly, providing further optimism for the economy's growth in the latter half of the year.

The report acknowledged that the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) monetary policy stance and macroprudential measures may have contributed to the slowdown during the first half. However, it noted the recent reduction of the cash reserve ratio (CRR) from 4.5% to 4% by the RBI, which could provide a boost to economic activity moving forward.

Overall, while India faced a dip in growth during the first half of the fiscal year, the Finance Ministry's review highlighted key factors driving optimism, including a recovery in agriculture, industrial activities, and government investments, which are expected to support the economy's rebound in the second half.

Sebi Withdraws Recognition of Indian **Commodity Exchange, Marking Its Exit from Bourse Business**

The Securities and Exchange Board of India previous years. (Sebi) has officially withdrawn the recognition granted to the Indian Commodity Exchange Ltd (ICEX), marking the exchange's exit from the bourse business. The decision follows Sebi's approval on December 11, allowing ICEX to exit after it had met necessary regulatory requirements.

Sebi issued a notification on December 24 confirming that the recognition of ICEX, which had been granted under the Forward Contracts (Regulation) Act, 1952 (FCRA), was officially withdrawn. The notification marked the formal end of ICEX's role as a recognized stock exchange.

In its exit order, Sebi stated that it had reviewed ICEX's valuation report, compliance submissions, and undertakings before making the decision. Additionally, the regulator outlined certain compliance obligations for ICEX post-exit, including settling its tax liabilities under the Income Tax Act, 1961, changing its name, and refraining from using the term "stock exchange." Sebi also directed ICEX to maintain a comprehensive database of all transactions conducted on its platform in

ICEX, which is based in Surat, Gujarat, had originally received permanent recognition in 2009 under the FCRA. Following the merger of the Forward Markets Commission with Sebi in 2015, ICEX became a recognized stock exchange under the Securities Contracts (Regulation) Act, 1956 (SCRA). However, in May 2022, Sebi derecognized ICEX due to non-compliance with minimum net worth requirements, infrastructural deficiencies, and inspection findings.

Although ICEX appealed to the Securities Appellate Tribunal (SAT) and was allowed to temporarily retain its recognition, the exchange faced challenges raising the necessary funds due to Sebi's stringent shareholding cap of 5% for investors. ICEX requested a relaxation to allow investors to hold up to 51% equity for five years, but Sebi declined the request. Subsequently, in May 2023, ICEX shareholders approved the voluntary surrender of the exchange's recognition, leading to the initiation of the exit process.





Climate Change Weakens Plant Nutrition, Threatening Ecosystems

More than one-third of Earth's animals, ranging from in-sects to large mammals, depend on plants as their primary food source. However, plants, particularly those that herbivores consume, are often low in calories, making it difficult for these animals to obtain enough energy for survival. The reduced nutritional value can also hinder their growth, reproduction,

Research has shown that climate change is already diminishing the nutritional value of human food crops, particularly in vital micronutrients like iron, zinc, and magnesium. Livestock also face challenges, as lower protein levels in grasses negatively affect weight gain and profitability. Wild species, such as giant pandas, are similarly impacted, with rising temperatures diminishing the nutritional content of bamboo, their primary food source.

Insects, which play a crucial role in pollination and food webs, are also suffering. Herbivorous insects like caterpillars and grasshoppers are seeing reduced reproduction rates and smaller body sizes due to nutrient-poor plants. 

Tndia faced a dra-I matic collapse after a costly run-out of Yashasvi Jaiswal, leaving the team at a precarious 164/5 on day two of the fourth Test against Australia in Melbourne. Despite his fluent innings, Jaiswal's 82-run knock off 118 balls was cut short due to a mix-up with Virat Kohli. Attempting a quick single, Jaiswal was caught well short of his crease, handing Australia a crucial breakthrough at a critical moment.

The collapse came after India had been in a relatively solid position at 153/2. However, in just four overs, three wickets tumbled,

leaving India in dire straits. At the time of Jaiswal's departure, India was already 310 runs behind Australia's commanding first innings total of 474, with 111 more runs needed to avoid the follow-on.

The run-out turned the game on its head as India's middle order struggled to cope with the pressure. The decision to send nightwatchman Akash Deep to the crease, as suggested by head coach Gautam Gambhir, also backfired, adding to India's growing list of questionable decisions.



In a matter of minutes, cricket's unpredictable nature was on full display. Jaiswal had driven the ball toward midon and immediately called for the single. Kohli initially responded, taking a step forward before deciding to retreat. The miscommunication led to the disastrous result, with Jaiswal left stranded and a crucial partnership broken.

As India looks to recover on the third day, the team needs a strong performance from the remaining batsmen to stave off further collapse and reduce the deficit.


