During a hearing on Friday, the court extended the interim bail granted to KTR until December 31, providing temporary relief. KTR had filed a quash petition on December 21, challenging the allegations against him in the case. In an earlier order, the court had directed the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) not to arrest him until December 30. The hearing was subsequently adjourned to December 27, and after today's session, the court extended the non-arrest order until the end of the month.

Government to Take Key Decision on Issuance of New Ration Cards

TPN , Telangana : The Revanth Reddy-led government in Telangana is reportedly taking a significant decision regarding the issuance of new ration cards. According to sources, the state government is set to launch a new initiative for issuing ration cards to beneficiaries soon. In a key policy change, officials are likely to propose an increase in the income limit for eligibility compared to the previous guidelines.

Currently, the income limit for eligibility is set at Rs. 1.5 lakh per annum in rural areas and Rs. 2 lakh in urban areas. However, it is expected that the government will raise these limits by an additional Rs. 10,000 to Rs. 20,000, thereby allowing more families to benefit from the public distribution system.

The final decision on the new income limits and ration card issuance will likely be made during the Telangana Cabinet meeting scheduled for December 30. This move is seen as a step towards expanding the reach of government welfare schemes to a larger number of eligible families, aligning with the state government's focus on social welfare and support for low-income groups.

The cabinet's approval could lead to a swift rollout of the new ration cards, benefiting thousands of households across the state.

Telangana High Court News Roundup: Indiramma Housing Committees, Formula-E Case, and SI Sentencing

1. High Court Refuses to Suspend Indiramma Housing Committees The Telangana High Court has refused to grant interim relief suspending the Indiramma Housing Committees established for beneficiary selection under the State's Indiramma Housing Scheme. The scheme aims to provide financial assistance of ₹5 lakh for the construction of 4.5 lakh homes in its first phase.

The committees, composed of local leaders and members from BC, SC, and ST communities, were challenged by petitioners citing concerns over transparency and potential political bias. While a single judge upheld the committees' formation, petitioner A. Nithish Kumar appealed, questioning the lack of specific qualifications for committee members. ing Adjourned to December 31



General defended the initiative as transparent and free from corruption. The court directed the State to file a counter and adjourned further hearings to January 24, 2025.

Formula-E Case: Hear-

The High Court extended its or- rangal, to one week of imprisder protecting BRS working president K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) from arrest until December 31 in connection with allegations financial irregularities in the Hyderabad Formula-E race.

The ACB sought to vacate the "not to arrest" order, while KTR's legal team argued that the charges were politically motivated and baseless. KTR maintained that all finandealings complied with legal agreements. The court granted the State more time to respond, scheduling a detailed hearing on December 31, 2024.

3. SI Naresh Yadav Sentenced for Contempt of Court Justice K. Surender sentenced Naresh Yadav, Sub-Inspector of Tharigoppula Police Station, Waonment and imposed a ₹50,000 fine for contempt of court. Yadav was found guilty of willfully disobeying a directive to adhere to Section 41-A of the CrPC during the arrest of Golusu Narsaiah.

Despite court orders, Narsaiah was arrested without proper notice, and Yadav's affidavits revealed inconsistencies. The court rejected Yadav's defense and apology, describing his conduct as deliberate and unremorseful. In addition to the fine, Yadav was ordered to compensate Narsaiah with ₹50,000 from his personal funds.

This series of cases highlights the Telangana High Court's emphasis on judicial compliance, transparency, and accountability in governance and law enforcement.

MRPS Chief Urges Madiga Youth to Fight for SC **Sub-Classification Rights**

TPN, Hyderabad: Manda Krishna Madiga, the founding president of the Madiga Reservation Porata Samiti (MRPS), called on Madiga youth to join the fight for Scheduled Caste (SC) sub-classification rights during a meeting in Alwal on Thursday, December 26. He emphasized the community's long-standing struggle, noting that they have fought tirelessly for the cause for the past 30 years.

Madiga highlighted a historic Supreme Court ruling affirming that states have the authority to classify SCs, describing it as a significant victory for the community. However, he accused certain individuals from the Mala community of attempting to thwart SC classification efforts by engaging in "conspiracies" to undermine their progress.

Kavitha Demands Clarity on BC Reservations Before Local Body Elections

TPN, Hyderabad: BRS MLC Kalvakuntla Kavitha has demanded that local body elections in Telangana be held only after providing clarity on Backward Classes (BC) reservations. Addressing the media, she criticized the Congress government for failing to fulfill its promises made in the last election regarding BC reservations and budgetary allocations.

Kavitha expressed concern over reports that the state government is preparing to conduct local body elections without addressing the issue of BC reservations. She questioned, "How can elections be held without clarity on increasing BC reservations?" She reminded that the Congress had assured 42 percent reservation for BCs in local body elections through the Kamareddy Declaration but lacked accurate data on the BC population to support this promise.

She further stated that more than half of Telangana's population comprises BCs, and the Congress' promise of 42 percent reservation raises questions about its feasibility. Kavitha warned that elections would not be allowed if BC reservations are not increased. She announced



plans for protests under the banner of BRS and Telangana Jagruti at mandal and district levels to pressurize the government.

Kavitha also criticized the Congress for breaking its promise of allocating Rs. 20,000 crore annually in the budget for BC welfare. She demanded that elections be postponed until the BC Dedicated Commission submits its report and the BC population is revealed. "The government must honor its commitments to BCs before proceeding with elections,' she added.

The BRS leader's strong stance has intensified the debate on BC reservations, putting pressure on the Congress government to take definitive action before announcing the election schedule.

In an unrelated case, a 28-year-old woman, Deepti, also died by suicide in Nacharam after alleged harassment over financial issues. Deepti, a PhD holder working at a research institute, had been facing distress due to a complaint against her father, Sangeet Rao, who absconded after receiving Rs. 35 lakh from Anita, who had paid for a promise of securing a government job for her relative.

2. Release of collected tax funds from village panchayats and the removal of any pending freezing orders.


3. Payment for SD (Sarpanch Development Fund) checks that have been ap-

PhD Student Dies by Suicide After Alleged Harassment Over Father's Debt in Hyderabad

The tragic incident occurred in Saraswati Nagar Colony under Nacharam PS, and Deepti filmed a video before her death, which has since gone viral.

Deepti, a PhD student at IICT, was deeply distressed by the actions of her father, who had allegedly cheated Constable Anil's wife, living across their house, by taking Rs. 15 lakh in 2022. The case was registered at Nacharam PS. Although Sangeeth Rao later returned Rs. 8 lakh, he was accused of further harassing his daughter for money. Deepti's family claimed that Anil's relatives, including his uncle Somaiya, wife Anita, and brother Saidu, demanded Rs. 35 lakh from Deepti to withdraw the case, despite her having no

involvement in the matter.

In her heartbreaking video, Deepti expressed her sorrow, stating that her father had abandoned them for years and that despite her efforts to resolve the issue by filing cases and approaching the police, she had been subjected to continuous harassment. Unable to cope with the pressure, Deepti hanged herself when no one was at home. In her final message, she blamed the police harassment for her

The Nacharam police have made progress in the case, arresting three individuals, including Sangeeth Rao, Anita, and Somaiya. They have been remanded into police custody, and investigations are ongoing. The disturbing video of Deepti's suicide has sparked widespread outrage and drawn attention to police harass-

Telangana to Scrap Final-Year **Language Study for Degree Students**

Hyderabad: The Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE) is considering a significant change to undergraduate course curriculums by eliminating mandatory language studies in the final year. This move, aimed at conventional degree courses, particularly science programmes, is expected to be implemented starting the next academic year.

The decision is intended to allow students to focus more on core subjects during their final year. As per the proposed changes, students studying languages like Telugu, Hindi, and Urdu as their second language will no longer have to pursue these subjects in their third year.

"There is a growing need to equip students with core skills, especially in science disciplines. Removing languages in the final year will provide students with more time and focus on their core subjects," sources from the Council said.

This approach revisits a system that existed in the State before 2021. However, language studies were reintroduced into the final year after expert committee recommendations. Other Proposed Reforms

1. Reduction in Credits: The Council is also considering reducing the total credits for science programmes from 160 to 145 or 146, ensuring uniformity across all degree courses offered by State universities. 2. Mandatory Projects: Final-year students will be required to undertake project work relevant to their field of study, potentially in collaboration with industries. These projects will carry four credits and aim to enhance practical knowledge and employability.

3. Online Learning Platforms:

Degree students will have the option to enroll in courses on platforms like Swayam and NPTEL, with the credits earned transferable to their degree programme.

These reforms align with the State's vision to modernize and streamline higher education, equipping students with industry-relevant skills and reducing academic burdens. If approved, they will mark a significant shift in the academic structure of Telangana's undergraduate programmes.

Policemen Arrested for Selling Duty-Free Liquor in Block

TPN, **Telangana**: Two policemen, a constable and a home guard, were arrested for running a racket involving the sale of duty-free liquor. The duo, Constable Jemya Nayak and Home Guard Bandari Lingaiah, were caught by excise police while selling liquor outside the block. They had been purchasing duty-free liquor at the airport, using the names of several passengers, and selling it to people outside the block.

The excise officials seized 41 bottles of liquor, worth Rs 15 lakh, from the accused. The racket was discovered when Mahesh, an employee working at the duty-free liquor counter, became involved in the scheme with the two policemen. A total of five individuals have been implicated in the incident.

Interestingly, both the constable and the home guard are usually assigned duties when VIPs arrive, performing their roles as part of protocol. However, their involvement in the illegal liquor trade has now led to their arrest, with further investigations underway.



A Life Dedicated to India's Progress

Dr. Manmohan Singh (September 26, 1932 - December 26, 2024) was a distinguished economist, politician, and reformist who played a pivotal role in shaping India's economic policies. As the 13th Prime Minister of India (2004-2014), Singh left an indelible mark on the nation's development trajectory. Notably, he was the first Sikh and the first leader from a minority community to hold the office of Prime Minister.







Academic Excellence and Professional Journey

Dr. Singh's academic journey began with a Bachelor's and Master's in Economics from Panjab University (1952, 1954), followed by his Economic Tripos from Cambridge University in 1957 and a D.Phil. in Economics from Oxford University in 1962.



The Prime Ministerial Era (2004-2014)

Dr. Singh's tenure as Prime Minister saw India achieve an average growth rate of 7%, with GDP growth averaging 6.7% during his leadership. His handling of the 2008 global financial crisis minimized its impact on India through monetary easing and fiscal stimulus.

He introduced landmark social welfare programs such as the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), which provided 100 days of guaranteed employment to rural households, significantly reducing poverty.

"Irreparable Loss For Country": **Arvind Kejriwal Pays Last Respect To Manmohan Singh**



The motion for impeachment passed with unanimous support, as all 192 lawmakers present voted in favor of the motion.

National Assembly Speaker Woo Won-shik announced the result, stating, "I announce that Prime Minister Han Duck-soo's impeachment motion has passed. Out of the 192 lawmakers who voted, 192 voted to impeach." This marks a significant political development in South Korea as lawmakers hold Han accountable for his role during a time of intense political turmoil.

The impeachment comes after former President Park Geun-hye's controversial declaration of martial law, a move that sparked widespread protests and calls for government accountability. Han, who was serving as the Prime Minister during Park's absence, is accused of supporting the martial law decree, which led to severe public unrest. The government's decision to implement martial law was seen by many as a serious breach of democratic principles, and Han's participation in the insurrection fueled suspicions that he was complicit in efforts to maintain power undemocratically.

German President Steinmeier **Dissolves Parliament To Pave** Way For Feb Snap Elections



BERLIN: German President Frank-Walter Steinmeier dissolved the country's lower house of parliament on Friday, triggering snap elections set for February 23, following the collapse of Chancellor Olaf Scholz's three-way coalition government. The move comes after Scholz lost a confidence vote earlier this month, stemming from the departure of Finance Minister Christian Lindner's Free Democrats, which left his government without a legislative majority.

The dissolution of parliament sets the stage for intense election campaigning, with conservative challenger Friedrich Merz gaining significant traction in recent polls. Merz, who is widely expected to challenge Scholz for the chancellorship, criticized the outgoing government for imposing excessive regulations that he believes have hindered Germany's economic growth.

In recent polls, the conservative bloc holds a commanding lead over Scholz's Social Democratic Party (SPD), with a gap of more than 10 points. The far-right Alternative for Germany (AfD) party is also making gains, slightly ahead of the SPD, while the Greens have dropped to fourth place in the standings.

The presence of the AfD in German politics complicates the situation for the mainstream parties, as they have consistently refused to enter into coalitions with the far-right group. This dynamic is expected to make coalition-building more challenging after the elections, with the likelihood of unwieldy and fragmented government alliances.

India's Economy Expected to Grow at 6.5% in FY2024-25



Tndia's economy is projected to grow **L**at 6.5% in FY2024-25, according to the Finance Ministry's Monthly Economic Review released on Thursday. This optimistic outlook comes as agricultural and industrial activities are expected to gain momentum in the second half of the fiscal year, following a slowdown in the first half.

India's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth rate fell to 5.4% in Q2 of FY2024-25, marking the lowest growth in seven quarters. This slower growth, which has persisted for three consecutive quarters, led to a 6% growth rate for the first half of the fiscal year.

Despite this, the Finance Ministry remains optimistic about the prospects for the third quarter. "The outlook for Q3 appears bright," the report states, citing improved agricultural conditions due to higher minimum support prices (MSP), favorable reservoir levels, and sufficient fertilizer availability for rabi crop sowing. Additionally, industrial activity is expected to pick up in the coming months.

The end of the monsoon season, along with anticipated increases in government capital expenditure, is expected to boost key sectors like cement, iron, steel, mining, and electricity. The services sector also continues to perform strongly, providing further optimism for the economy's growth in the latter half of the year.

The report acknowledged that the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) monetary policy stance and macroprudential measures may have contributed to the slowdown during the first half. However, it noted the recent reduction of the cash reserve ratio (CRR) from 4.5% to 4% by the RBI, which could provide a boost to economic activity moving forward.

Overall, while India faced a dip in growth during the first half of the fiscal year, the Finance Ministry's review highlighted key factors driving optimism, including a recovery in agriculture, industrial activities, and government investments, which are expected to support the economy's rebound in the second half.

Sebi Withdraws Recognition of Indian Commodity Exchange, Marking Its **Exit from Bourse Business**



The Securities and Exchange Board of India previous years. f I (Sebi) has officially withdrawn the recognition granted to the Indian Commodity Exchange Ltd (ICEX), marking the exchange's exit from the bourse business. The decision follows Sebi's approval on December 11, allowing ICEX to exit after it had met necessary regulatory requirements.

Sebi issued a notification on December 24 confirming that the recognition of ICEX, which had been granted under the Forward Contracts (Regulation) Act, 1952 (FCRA), was officially withdrawn. The notification marked the formal end of ICEX's role as a recognized stock exchange.

In its exit order, Sebi stated that it had reviewed ICEX's valuation report, compliance submissions, and undertakings before making the decision. Additionally, the regulator outlined certain compliance obligations for ICEX post-exit, including settling its tax liabilities under the Income Tax Act, 1961, changing its name, and refraining from using the term "stock exchange." Sebi also directed ICEX to maintain a comprehensive database of all transactions conducted on its platform in

ICEX, which is based in Surat, Gujarat, had originally received permanent recognition in 2009 under the FCRA. Following the merger of the Forward Markets Commission with Sebi in 2015, ICEX became a recognized stock exchange under the Securities Contracts (Regulation) Act, 1956 (SCRA). However, in May 2022, Sebi derecognized ICEX due to non-compliance with minimum net worth requirements, infrastructural deficiencies, and inspection findings.

Although ICEX appealed to the Securities Appellate Tribunal (SAT) and was allowed to temporarily retain its recognition, the exchange faced challenges raising the necessary funds due to Sebi's stringent shareholding cap of 5% for investors. ICEX requested a relaxation to allow investors to hold up to 51% equity for five years, but Sebi declined the request. Subsequently, in May 2023, ICEX shareholders approved the voluntary surrender of the exchange's recognition, leading to the initiation of the exit process.

M ore than one-third of Earth's animals, ranging from inand overall survival. sects to large mammals, depend on plants as their primary food source. Livestock also face challenges, as lower protein levels in grasses negatively affect weight gain and profitability. 

The run-out turned the game on its head as India's middle order struggled to cope with the pressure. The decision to send nightwatchman Akash Deep to the crease, as suggested by head coach Gautam Gambhir, also backfired, adding to India's growing list of questionable decisions.

In a matter of minutes, cricket's unpredictable nature was on full display. Jaiswal had driven the ball toward midon and immediately called for the single. Kohli initially responded, taking a step forward before deciding to retreat. The miscommunication led to the disastrous result, with Jaiswal left stranded and a crucial partnership broken.

As India looks to recover on the third day, the team needs a strong performance from the remaining batsmen to stave off further collapse and reduce the deficit.


