Hydra's Restoration Efforts Bring Rare Birds Back to Aminpur Locals Decry Demolition of Homes Under FTL Norms Nature Lovers Celebrate the Return of the Red-Breasted Flycatcher **CM Revanth Reddy Defends Environmental Protection Measures Balancing Conservation and Community Welfare: The Aminpur Debate**

TPN , Pardhu : The restoration of Aminpur Lake by the Hyderabad Disaster Response and Asset Protecting Agency (Hydra) has sparked mixed reactions. While nature enthusiasts are rejoicing over the sighting of the rare red-breasted flycatcher bird at the lake, local residents are expressing anger and frustration over the measures that led to the destruction of their homes.

Nature's Revival Through Hydra's Efforts

Hydra has been lauded for its work in restoring several lakes and ponds in Hyderabad, including Aminpur Lake. The agency claims that its efforts have brought back the lake's former glory, allowing rare species such as the red-breasted flycatcher to return. This small bird, known for its striking appearance, migrates from Eastern Europe to South Asia during winter. Hydra has highlighted this as a significant achievement, stating that it



showcases the revival of biodiversity in the area.

Residents' Grievances

However, the joy of nature lovers contrasts sharply with the grievances of local residents. Many homes near the lake were demolished under the Full Tank Level (FTL) norms. Residents allege that their houses, painstakingly built with years of hard work and savings, were destroyed without adequate compensation or rehabilitation.

"Hydra is celebrating the return of birds, but what about us? They have taken away our shelter and left us to fend for ourselves," lamented one of the affected residents. Others expressed concern about repaying bank loans taken to build their homes, now reduced to rubble. They also criticized the government for failing to provide alternative housing, such as the promised double-bedroom houses under welfare schemes.

CM Revanth Reddy Defends the Efforts

Amid the controversy, Chief Minister Revanth Reddy defended the actions, emphasizing the importance of environmental protection. In a tweet, he stated, "When we care for nature, nature takes care of us. The return of rare birds to restored lakes like Aminpur is a testament to our commitment to safeguarding biodiversity."

The CM also pointed out that several water bodies and green spaces have been reclaimed from illegal encroachments to ensure the preservation of Hyderabad's natural resources.



Questionable Actions Without Rehabilitation

Despite Hydra's success in reviving the lake and attracting rare wildlife, the agency's approach to enforcing FTL norms has come under scrutiny. Residents argue that while environmental restoration is vital, it should not come at the cost of displacing families without providing proper rehabilitation. The situation at Aminpur highlights the delicate balance between environmental conservation and the rights of local communities, sparking an ongoing debate on how best to achieve sustainable development while ensuring social justice.

Hyderabad : The phone TPN, tapping case that has shaken Telangana politics has taken a new turn with a case being registered against former minister and Siddipet MLA Tanniru Harish Rao. The Panjagutta police filed the case following a complaint by Congress leader Chakradhar Goud, who alleged illegal surveillance of his communications.

Serious Allegations Against Harish Rao

Chakradhar Goud, a Congress leader from Siddipet, filed the

members, was tapped during the BRS regime. He claimed he received an alert from Apple indicating the breach and previously raised the issue with senior police officials, including the DGP.

Goud alleged that then-Task Force DCP Radha Kishan Rao, under Harish Rao's direction, coerced him to join the BRS party, threatening him with false cases and harm to his family. Based on his allegations, the police registered the case under IPC Sections 120(B), 386, 409, 506, and relevant sections of the IT Act.

Police Investigation Intensifies

The Panjagutta police have launched a thorough investigation into the complaint, examining evidence provided by

Chakradhar Goud.

Addressing a public meeting, CM Revanth Reddy emphasized his government's commitment to transforming Hyderabad into a global city. He criticized the previous government for deceiving the public with unfulfilled promises and announced significant investments in Hyderabad's infrastructure and beautification. He outlined plans under the ******Musi Sundari Karana** initiative to develop Hyderabad as a world-class city capable of competing with global metropolises like New York and Tokyo.

The CM highlighted Hyderabad's unique identity and its role as an employment

PJR and Andhra Pradesh CM Chandrababu Naidu, for their contributions to the city's growth. He also mentioned ongoing projects like the Regional Ring Road, allocated Rs. 7,000 crore for city development.

Challenge to Kishan Reddy and **Criticism of KCR**

CM Revanth Reddy challenged Union Minister Kishan Reddy to secure Rs. 10,000 crore in central funds for Hyderabad's development, particularly for Musi River rejuvenation. He criticized the minister for inaction, accusing him of failing to bring any funds from the central government.

Targeting former CM K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR), Revanth accused him of mismanaging Telangana's resources for a decade and obstructing current development efforts. He urged KCR to reveal his policy plans and offered to debate the policies of BRS and BJP.

Cabinet Sub-Committee for City Development

Reaffirming his commitment to Hyderabad's growth, the CM announced the formation of a cabinet sub-committee led by the Deputy Chief Minister to oversee city development. He called for an all-party meeting to gather suggestions from opposition parties, emphasizing collaborative governance for Hyderabad's future. The festival concluded as a celebration of governance and a call for collective efforts to elevate Hyderabad's global stature.

Forest Permissions Approved for RRR

Union Ministry Approves Forest Land for RRR Komatireddy Announces 90% Land Acquisition Completion Work on Hyderabad RRR Set to Begin Soon

TPN , Telangana: Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy announced that the Union Environment Ministry has granted forest permissions for the northern part of the ambitious Regional Ring Road (RRR) project in Telangana. This approval

is a significant step in advancing the construction of the Hyderabad Regional Ring Road (HRRR), part of the Bharatmala Pariyojana Phase-1.

The permissions were conveyed through a letter from Kailash Bheem



Rao Bhavar, Assistant Inspector General of the Central Forest Department, as per the Union Ministry's approval. The letter confirms that the Telangana government's proposal for forest permits, submitted on July 26, 2024, under the Forest Conservation

Act-1980, has been approved. The Regional Empowered Committee (REC), after reviewing the proposal, granted "in-principle" approval during its 69th meeting on September 19, 2024.

City Infrastructure and Beautification Projects Minister Sridhar Babu emphasized the government's commit-

ment to urban development. Key initiatives include: - Construction of two elevated corridors spanning 18 km, including a 5.2 km corridor from Paradise Junction to Dairy Farm. - A city beautification drive with extensive greenery projects, including a 214 km-long even plant initiative.

- Allocation of ₹2,400 crores for GHMC development, focusing on pond restoration and greenery enhancement.

Water and Sewage Management

The government plans to connect Godavari water to Hyderabad's twin reservoirs and has established a comprehensive sewage drainage system. Sewage plants along the Musi River have also been set up to ensure clean water and prevent sewage overflow onto roads.

Despite previous setbacks, the metro rail will soon extend to Hyderabad's old town, enhancing public transport options. A master plan is being prepared for all towns in Telangana to support rapid urbanization. Minister Babu assured citizens that the government is working to protect the interests of all families while adhering to legal frameworks, emphasizing their vision for cleaner air and water in Hyderabad.

The approval covers a total of 72.3536 hectares of forest land across three districts: 35.5882 hectares in Medak, 28.2544 hectares in Siddipet, and 8.511 hectares in Yadadri-Bhuvanagiri. These lands are essential for the construction of the HRRR, which will be implemented by the Project Implementation Unit (PIU) Gajwel under NHAI. Minister Komatireddy stated that the Ministry of Environment had been informed about the need for land acquisition, which will proceed in compliance with relevant rules. He confirmed that once the forest permissions are in place, the process of calling tenders and initiating work can begin. With 90 percent of the land acquisition already completed, the minister expressed confidence that minor legal issues will be resolved soon. He thanked Union Minister for Forest and Environment, Bhupender Yadav, for supporting the project and facilitating the necessary approvals.

Harish Rao Denies Phone Tapping Allegations

Harish Rao Slams Allegations as Politically Motivated FIR Filed Against BRS Leader Over Phone Tapping Claims **Rao Vows to Continue Fighting for Justice Amid Baseless Charges**

TPN, Hyderabad: Senior Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) leader and Siddipet MLA, T Harish Rao, on Tuesday, December 3, stro ngly dismissed the FIR filed against him in the phone tapping case, calling it "false" and "baseless." The former health minister made the statement following the registration of a case against him by the Punjagutta police under various sections, including Section 120(B) (Criminal conspiracy), 386 (Extortion), 409 (Criminal breach of trust), 506 (Criminal intimidation), and Section 66 of the Information Technology Act.

Harish Rao alleged that the charges were a politically motivated conspiracy by the Congress-led government. He expressed his frustration on social media, claiming that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and his government were fabricating cases against him because



they could not tolerate being questioned. "You (CM Revanth Reddy) are making illegal cases against me because you can't tolerate being questioned. You are exposing your true nature at every step," he stated.

ish Rao was filed by businessman G Chakradhar Goud, who alleged harassment, threats, and unlawful surveillance of his phone. Goud, a prominent figure in charitable activities, claimed that Harish Rao had developed a grudge against him

In his latest post on X (formerly Twitter), Harish Rao refuted the allegations, calling the case filed at Begum Bazar police station another "false" claim. He also mentioned an unrelated cybercrime case filed against him, based on a social media post shared by someone else.

Harish Rao emphasized his determination to continue his questioning of the government, despite what he referred to as attempts to silence him. "No matter how many false cases you file, I will not stop questioning on behalf of the people. I will continue until justice is served, and you are held accountable by a public verdict in the court of the people," he wrote.

Panic Grips Komuram Bheem District After Tiger Attacks

Tiger Attacks Spark Fear in Komuram **Bheem District** Fatal Incident Leads to Protests and Promises of Compensation **Intensive Search Operations Underway to Capture Roaming Tiger**



TPN, Komuram Bheem Dis**trict:** A series of tiger attacks in the forests of Komuram Bheem have left local residents in fear. The tiger, believed to be roaming in the Itikyal Pahad forest area near Kagaznagar, has already attacked two people, including a fatal attack on a young woman. The victim, Mohirle Lakshmi, was attacked while working in a cotton field in Nazrul Nagar on Friday morning. Despite being rushed to the hospital, she succumbed to her injuries. In the wake of the incident, locals protested in front of the forest department, demanding action. The authorities have promised an ex-gratia of Rs. 20 lakh, five acres of land, and a job for a family member.

continues, forest officials are utilizing drones and trap cameras to locate it. Ten special

teams are on the ground, but so far, only the tiger's footprints have been fou nd, with no photos captured. Officials are analyzing the tiger's movements, speculating that if it is identified and its behavior understood, they may be able to safely capture or relocate it.

Meanwhile, restrictions have been imposed in 15 villages in the affected areas, with Section 144 in place to prevent farmers and workers from going to the fields. The tiger's increasing attacks have heightened tension, with locals blaming the forest department for failing to identify the tiger's movements earlier. Another attack occurred within 24 hours of the fatal incident when a farmer, Suresh, was injured in As the search for the tiger Dubbaguda by the same tiger. The search operations continue, but the fear among residents remains palpable.

Reddy emphasized the revival of the Musi River, asserting that its restoration would improve the city's global image and offer a better future to those living along the riverbed.

The Chief Minister also introduced an Electric Vehicle (EV) policy aimed at reducing

pollution in the city. This policy, effective until December 2026, will see the phased introduction of electric buses in Hyderabad's RTC fleet to help combat pollution. Minister Ponnam Prabhakar criticized the

Union Government for neglecting Hyderabad's development, accusing Union Minister Kishan Reddy of failing to bring funds for the city's growth.



BRS Doesn't Want Musi Area's Development: Bhatti Vikramarka



Tammineni Slams Revanth on

TPN, **Telangana:** During the Telangana Rising Festival at Knuckles Road, Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka criticized the BRS, accusing them of neglecting the development of the Musi catchment area. He challenged BJP leader Kishan Reddy to live in a hut in the Musi area for more than one day, questioning the authenticity of his claims about the region. Bhatti stated that the BRS, which has governed for 10 years, has failed to invest in the area's development.

He highlighted that Hyderabad's growth occurred under the Congress government, emphasizing that the current administration is focused on transforming Musi into a clean, living river. Bhatti assured that the public government is committed to making Hyderabad a pollution-free city, ensuring it does not face issues like those in Delhi. He also mentioned plans to turn Hyderabad into a worldclass city, one that the country can be proud of.

BRS Supports Caste Census, Says Srinivas Goud

However, BRS social media convener Satish Reddy revealed that Chakradhar Goud had multiple criminal cases against him, including charges for criminal conspiracy, cyber fraud, and even attempted rape. Reddy criticized the Congress government for conspiring to frame individuals like Goud and using him to target opposition leaders.

Congress Must Clarify SC Classification Policy: NVSS Prabhakar

TPN , Telangana : BJP leader and former MLA NVSS Prabhakar criticized the Congress government for its unclear stance on SC classification, pointing out that despite Revanth Reddy's promises, no progress has been made. He mentioned that Revanth had pledged to implement the classification within hours of the Supreme Court's verdict, but no action has been taken. Prabhakar accused the Congress of neglecting the Madiga community politically and weakening the sub-plan. He called out the contradiction in Congress leaders' actions, with some celebrating while others fail to address critical issues.

Prabhakar further questioned whether Revanth Reddy would discuss the implementation of the sub-plan for the year and criticized KCR for failing to fulfill his promise of making a Dalit the Chief Minister. He stated that Congress will struggle to answer the BJP's charge sheet and claimed that BRS has no moral authority to file one.

Unfulfilled Promises

TPN, **Telangana:** Tammineni Veerabhadram, senior leader, raised concerns over the Congress government's handling of public issues, questioning its priorities during a recent statement. He remarked that while it is fine for the Congress government to hold festivals, it has failed to address the real problems faced by the people. He pointed out the lack of clarity on the farmer loan waiver and farmer assurance schemes, emphasizing that six of the promised guarantees remain unimplemented.

Tammineni criticized Revanth Reddy's leadership, accusing him of not fulfilling his promises. He stated that, aside from putting women on buses, nothing significant has been done to implement the commitments made during the election. The promises made to farmers and women, he said, have not been addressed, and the government is using politics to divert attention from these failures. On the issues surrounding Hydra and Musi, Tammineni stressed that while cleaning efforts are necessary, modernization should not come at the expense of the poor. He



opposed the introduction of harmful chemicals into Hyderabad and called for proper purification factories. Additionally, he criticized the government's actions against the poor, accusing officials of evicting people from their homes in the middle of the night.

Tammineni concluded by accusing Revanth Reddy of practicing oppression rather than democracy, claiming that Revanth's words promise democracy, but his actions reflect the opposite. **TPN**, **Telangana:** At the 3rd National Conference of the All India Federation for Social Justice held at Maharashtra Sadan, former Telangana Minister Srinivas Goud expressed support for the caste census, emphasizing the need for greater justice for OBCs, who make up 60% of the country's population. Goud pointed out the paradox of having an OBC Prime Minister yet no separate ministry for BCs, stressing the need for a dedicated ministry for BCs in the government.

He criticized the inadequate representation of BCs in Telangana's cabinet, with only two BC ministers, and advocated for minorities to be given vacant ministries. Goud also highlighted that people in Telangana are wary of the caste census but clarified that BRS is not opposed to it. The conference, which included MPs and BC leaders from across India, focused on caste census, women's rights, and reservations as pillars of social justice.





Telangana High Court Dismisses Petition to Stop Release of Pushpa-2



TPN, **Hyderabad:** The Telangana High Court has dismissed a petition filed by Sararapu Srisailam, who sought to halt the release of the movie *Push-pa-2*, alleging that it encourages red sandalwood smuggling. The court, led by Justice Mousami Bhattacharya, ruled that the film's release cannot be stopped based on speculative claims. The Deputy Solicitor General, representing the Censor Board, confirmed that the movie had been cleared for release after required modifications. The court also imposed a fine on the petitioner for wasting court time, directing the amount to be given to women victims of trafficking and child welfare organizations.





Friend Brutally Murdered Over Loan Dispute in Hyderabad

TPN, Hyderabad: A shocking murder occurred in Hayatnagar police station limits, where a man named Kasirao was brutally killed by his friend Shekhar. The incident took place after Kasirao, a resident of Bhagyalatha Arunodaya Colony, went to Shekhar's flat to demand the repayment of a loan amounting to four lakh rupees.



Shekhar, who works as a Swiggy delivery boy, became enraged during the confrontation and slit Kasirao's throat with a knife. Kasirao, who was seriously injured, died at the scene. Shekhar fled after the murder.

Kasirao's wife discovered blood stains on him

as he went out, and upon checking, found him lying in a pool of blood. She immediately alerted the police, who arrived at the scene, collected evidence, and sent the body to Osmania Hospital for postmortem.

The police have initiated an investigation based on a complaint from Kasirao's wife. Special teams have been formed to apprehend Shekhar, who remains on the run. Authorities are investigating whether financial differences over the loan were the motive behind the murder or if there were other factors involved.

High Court Orders Action on Mulugu Encounter **Adjourns Hearing to December 5**

TPN , Hyderabad : The Telangana High Court continued hearings on the Mulugu encounter case today, where the petitioner's lawyer argued that the deaths were a result of a fake encounter. The lawyer pointed out multiple injuries on the bodies, calling for a re-postmortem of the preserved bodies.

In response, the High Court directed the state government to take further action, including providing the postmortem

report. The court ordered that Mallaiah's body be preserved until Thursday, while the remaining bodies should be handed over to their respective families. The next hearing was scheduled for December 5.

In the previous hearing, the High Court had already ordered the preservation of the bodies. During today's proceedings, the petitioner's lawyer emphasized concerns over



the postmortem process, claiming it had been conducted in the dark and without proper documentation. He called for a re-postmortem, citing these irregularities.

On the other hand, the government's lawyer defended the original postmortem, stating that it had been conducted following NHRC guidelines and with the involvement of eight medical experts. He also claimed

that the deaths occurred in crossfire, dismissing the allegation of a fake encounter. The lawyer further stated that the bodies needed to be released to prevent any law and order issues.

The court, while acknowledging the petitioner's concerns regarding potential poisoning and sub-

sequent killings, decided to wait for the postmortem examination (PME) report before making further judgments. It ordered the submission of the PME report along with details of the encounter and actions taken afterward. The next hearing will focus on these submissions, and the court will decide further action based on the findings.



Singareni Aims for 2.5 Lakh Tons of Coal Daily

The company aims to produce and transport 2.5 lakh tons of coal per day to supply thermal power plants with sufficient fuel.

Winter Session of Parliament: **Deadlock, Distractions, and Unanswered Questions**

Winter Session, the first week was largely unproductive due to a deadlock between the Opposition and the Union government. The Opposition, including parties like the Trinamool Congress and the Samajwadi Party, is demanding discussions on critical national issues such as price rises, unemployment, the situation in the North East, especially Manipur, the deprivation of funds from states, and the violence in Sambhal, Uttar Pradesh. The Congress, the principal Opposition party, has also called for a discussion on alleged financial irregularities involving the Adani group. However, a deadlock remains.

Recent media reports suggest that the deadlock might be resolved with an agreement between the government and the Opposition, according to which a discussion on the Constitution will take place in mid-December, almost two weeks from now. While an agreement on future discussions is important, it raises questions. Why wait for two weeks to implement an agreement made now? Why not start the discussions immediately instead of further delaying parliamentary proceedings? The Modi-led NDA coalition appears to be delaying important debates, causing frustration among those demanding urgent attention to pressing issues.

Historically, the BJP has downplayed the significance of active and productive parliamentary sessions. As BJP stalwarts like Arun Jaitley and Sushma Swaraj have noted, sometimes the obstruction of Parliament can serve democracy. However, the Modi government's track record in Parliament speaks volumes. In the 15th Lok Sabha (2009-14), seven out of ten bills were sent to committees for scrutiny, whereas, in the 17th Lok Sabha (2019-24), only two bills were sent for scrutiny. Furthermore, numerous bills are rushed through with minimal discussion,

As Parliament enters its second week of the often with zero or incomplete consultations.

Adding to the dysfunction, not a single notice from the Opposition has been accepted for discussion under Rule 267 in the Rajya Sabha for the past eight years. The Prime Minister has also failed to answer any questions in Parliament, undermining the principles of accountability and transparency. This behavior raises concerns about the current government's willingness to engage in meaningful debates.

On the topic of the Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC), Opposition parties have demanded its formation to investigate alleged financial irregularities. However, given the ruling party's dominance in Parliament, the credibility of any JPC is in question. The committee's composition is determined by the ruling party's strength, and key decisions—such as choosing witnesses and approving reports-would be controlled by the Treasury benches, compromising its independence. Historical JPCs, such as those during the Bofors scandal and the Harshad Mehta scam, have been marred by boycotts and dissent, as the Opposition's views were consistently sidelined. Even when JPCs issue recommendations, they are often ignored or diluted. The 2001 JPC on the stock market scam and the 2011 JPC on spectrum allocation both saw crucial reforms overlooked, highlighting the inefficacy of such committees in delivering tangible results.

Manipur stands as a stark example of mishandling an internal security problem. The recent escalation, including the deaths of 10 militants from the Hmar tribe in November, and protests against the state government's failure to restore order, highlight the increasing volatility. On November 17, the National People's Party (NPP), a key ally of the BJP-led Manipur government, withdrew support, citing the government's inability to address the growing crisis.

The Government of India has failed to learn the critical lesson in handling tribal unrest. While military action is essential to curbing violence, it must be paired with significant political initiatives to address the underlying grievances. 

Amit Shah Congratulates Chandigarh, **First City To Implement Criminal Laws**

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday congratulated Chandigarh for becoming the first city in India to fully implement three significant new criminal laws: the Bharatiya Nyay Sanhita (BNS), Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam (BSA). These laws, Shah stated, will be implemented across the entire country within the next three years.

Addressing a program to dedicate these laws to the nation, Shah called it a "golden day for the Indian criminal justice system," as Chandigarh became the first jurisdiction to fully adopt the comprehensive legal framework. The laws are now operational across police, judicial, prosecution, jail, and forensic departments.

Shah criticized the previous colonial-era laws, such as the Indian Penal Code (IPC), Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC), and the Evidence Act, which were enacted by the British Parliament. He emphasized that these laws were designed to protect British interests rather than those of the Indian people. In contrast, the new laws are crafted by Indians, aiming to deliver justice, not punishment. Shah assured that the new laws, which focus on fairness and justice, will be implemented nationwide in three years.

Among the significant changes, Shah high-

lighted the creation of the post of Director

of Prosecution to combat corruption, as well



as the replacement of the term "sedition" with "treason" in the legal framework. Additionally, Shah revealed that over 11 lakh FIRs had been filed under the new system, with nearly 9,500 cases already resolved within just four months.

Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Stalin expressed his condolences following a tragic landslide incident in Tiruvannamalai on December 1, which claimed seven lives. The disaster occurred when a massive boulder and mudslide collapsed onto a house on 11th Street in V.O.C. Nagar, following heavy rainfall in the region. In response to the loss, Stalin announced a compensation of ₹5 lakh each to the families of the victims.

The victims, identified as Rajkumar (36), Meena (27), R. Gowtham (9), R. Iniya (7), S. Ramya (7), M. Vinothini (14), and S. Maha (7), tragically lost their lives despite rescue tional Disaster Response Force (NDRF). In the aftermath of the incident, over 500 residents from the nearby areas were safely relocated to community halls for protection.



Experts have raised alarms about the potential for future landslides in the area, especially given the encroachments near the efforts by about 40 personnel from the Na- hills. Retired IIT Chennai professors Mohan, Naravana Rao, and Bhoominathan inspected the site following the incident on the Chief Minister's request. They advised that while light rainfall may not pose a significant threat, heavy rainfall could trigger further landslides. They also recommended that individuals planning construction near the hills consult qualified engineers to ensure safety.

Harbhajan Singh **Issues Stern Warning** to Pakistan

Former Indian cricketer Harbhajan Singh has delivered a strong message to Pakistan, suggesting that the country's absence from future ICC events in India will not have significant consequences. His remarks come amid rising tensions and debates surrounding the ICC Champions Trophy 2025, with Pakistan's refusal to participate in the tournament unless a hybrid model is introduced.

Pakistan has been adamant about its demand for a hybrid model for all ICC events hosted in India until 2031, following India's stance on not traveling to Pakistan for the 2025 Champions Trophy. The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) has emphasized the need for the hybrid model, which would allow matches to be played in



neutral locations, due to the ongoing political tensions between the two countries.

However, Harbhajan Singh, known for his outspoken views, made it clear that Pakistan's absence would not affect the success or prestige of any tournament hosted in India. "If Pakistan doesn't come to India, it won't make much of a difference," Harbhajan said. He pointed out that India is more than capable of hosting successful cricket events without Pakistan's participation.

Harbhajan further added that while cricket fans in both countries cherish the rivalry, the sport must continue regardless of any political disputes. His comments underline the fact that India has hosted and will continue to host major international events with or without Pakistan's involvement.

The region, part of the Tiruvannamalai range, is home to seven Reserved Forests (RFs), including Chippakadu, Athipakkam, Adinamalai, and Sorakolathur. Cool Drinks Classified as 'Sin Goods' Alongside Cigarettes

The Group of Ministers (GoM) on GST rate criticized for their high sugar content, have rationalization, headed by Bihar Deputy Chief Minister Samrat Chaudhary, has proposed a significant tax hike for products categorized as 'Sin Goods,' including tobacco, tobacco products, and aerated drinks. Currently subject to a 28% GST rate, the proposed slab would increase this to 35%, ef-

fectively aligning cool drinks with tobacco and alcohol in terms of taxation.

Sin taxes are levied on goods deemed detrimental to society, such as liquor, tobacco products, and gambling. Aer-

ated drinks already face an additional 12% compensation cess, bringing their total tax have fueled massive consumption, eviburden to 40%. With the new GST hike, this could rise to a staggering 47%. Critics argue that while these taxes are justified as a deterrent for harmful consumption, governments continue to permit the sale of these products, reaping significant revenues under the guise of public health concerns.

If the GST Council approves these recommendations, the cost of aerated drinks, popularly known as cool drinks, will likely soar. These beverages, which are often been linked to severe health issues such as obesity, diabetes, cardiovascular diseases, and even infertility. India's status as the global leader in obesity and diabetes only underscores the gravity of the problem.

Despite these health concerns, the afford-



ability of aerated drinks remains a critical issue. Small bottles can cost as little as ₹20, while larger 2.25-liter bottles are priced around ₹100-₹110, with online platforms and supermarkets offering hefty discounts. This

widespread availability and low pricing denced by the Indian carbonated soft drink market's revenue of \$18.25 billion in 2022, with a consumption volume of 9.29 billion liters.

Industry stakeholders are now advocating for a tax system based on sugar content rather than a blanket hike. Several countries, including the UK, France, and Thailand, have adopted a sugar-tiered tax approach, which incentivizes companies to reduce sugar levels in their products.

Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla on Tuesday issued a stern warning to Members of Parliament (MPs) regarding further disruptions in the House. He stated that if adjournments continue, he would have no choice but to extend the proceedings over the weekend to compensate for lost time. Birla's statement came in the wake of ongoing protests and adjournments that have marred the smooth functioning of the House.

The warning follows an agreement between the government and opposition parties to end a week-long deadlock in Parliament. This breakthrough paved the way for a much-awaited discussion on the Constitution, marking its 75th year of adoption. The Lower House will conduct the discussion on December 13 and 14, while the Upper House will take up the debate on December 16 and 17.

"If the adjournments continue, we will have to hold the proceedings on Saturday and Sunday to make up for the time lost," Birla said, adding that he had not approved any adjournment notices for the day. His comments came shortly after the Question Hour, which had been disrupted due to protests by opposition MPs on various issues.

In recent days, the Lok Sabha proceedings had been severely disrupted due to protests related to the Adani indictment issue, violence in Uttar Pradesh's Sambhal district, and other matters raised by opposition members. These disruptions resulted in a washout of the House's functioning for several days last week.

With the new announcement, Birla emphasized the importance of maintaining the decorum of Parliament and ensuring that the legislative work is completed without further delays. The government and opposition have agreed to resume discussions, and the Speaker's warning highlights the urgency of using the available time effectively to address key issues.






Biden Administration Approves \$1.17 Billion Helicopter Equipment Sale to India

The Biden administration has approved the sale of significant defense equipment to India, weeks before the completion of its fouryear term. The U.S. government notified Congress on Monday about its decision to approve the sale of MH-60R Multi-Mission Helicopter Equipment and related systems, valued at approximately \$1.17 billion.

According to the Defense Security Cooperation Agency (DSCA), the proposed sale is aimed at enhancing India's defense capabilities, specifically in the area of anti-submarine warfare. The MH-60R helicopters, which are versatile, multi-mission aircraft, will help India strengthen its maritime security and ability to deter both current and potential future threats in the region.

The MH-60R helicopters are designed for a variety of roles, including surveillance, reconnaissance, and combat operations, making them a critical asset for India's defense strategy.

The U.S. government has emphasized that the sale aligns with the ongoing defense partnership between the two countries and supports their shared interests in promoting peace and stability in the Indo-Pacific re-



gion. India has been increasingly strengthening its military ties with the United States as part of efforts to counterbalance growing regional security challenges, particularly from China.

President Yoon emphasized that his decision was made to safeguard the free and constitutional order of the Republic of Korea. He voiced concerns over growing threats from North Korean communist forces and alleged domestic pro-North Korean anti-state groups, which,

according to him, were undermining the nation's freedom and security.

In pivot from India, Nepal PM visits China to seek investment

Nepal's veteran communist politician, K P Sharma Oli, has returned as the country's prime minister for the fourth time this year, and his first foreign visit since taking office in July was to China. Oli aims to revive momentum for planned infrastructure projects between the two nations during his days-long visit. This visit marks a shift from Nepal's usual diplomatic focus on India, with which Kathmandu shares centuries-old ties.

During his visit, Oli is set to meet Chinese President Xi Jinping and Premier Li Qiang for detailed discussions about strengthening ties and advancing key infrastructure projects. Xi Jinping had previously expressed China's commitment to helping Nepal transform from a landlocked nation to a "land-linked" one. This is part of China's broader ambition to expand its Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), which aims to build infrastructure and promote trade across Asia and beyond.

Although India remains Nepal's dominant trade partner, accounting for two-thirds of its international trade, China has been increasing its influence. Currently, China holds 14 percent of Nepal's foreign trade share, but it has also emerged as a significant creditor. According to World Bank data, China has lent more than \$310 million to Nepal, surpassing India by \$30 million in two-way loans. These loans are part of China's growing presence in Nepal, particularly through infrastructure projects like highways, hydropower plants, and airports.

Oli's visit is expected to focus on boosting economic cooperation and securing funding for several key infrastructure projects. The discussions with Chinese leadership will explore new avenues for bilateral cooperation, with the goal of improving Nepal's connectivity and reducing its dependence on India for trade. This visit signals Nepal's broader strategic effort to balance its relationships with both China and India, especially as Beijing's influence continues to grow in the region.

While the full scope of martial law has not been disclosed, the measure is expected to lead to significant political and social ramifications in the coming weeks. The international community will be watching closely as South Korea navigates these turbulent waters. harshest retaliation, asserting that "those responsible will be hit harder than anybody has been hit in the long and storied History of the United States of America."

Israel's retaliatory airstrikes in Gaza have led to a devastating toll on the region, with more than 44,000 reported deaths, according to Gaza's health ministry, a figure considered reliable by the United Nations.

Trump, a staunch supporter of Israel, has voiced frustration with Biden's diplomatic handling of the situation. He has previously promised to pursue bold actions and a stronger stance in securing the release of hostages and bringing an end to the ongoing conflict in Gaza.

At COP16, Saudi Arabia Bets On Climate Tech To Make Deserts Bloom

Saudi Arabia is investing heavily in green technologies to transform its desert landscapes, but its efforts are being met with skepticism, with some critics accusing the country of greenwashing. The Gulf nation is hosting the United Nations COP16 conference on drought and desertification, issues that are particularly relevant to the kingdom, which aims to restore 40 million hectares of degraded land. However, while Saudi Arabia is a major investor in climate tech, its continued defense of oil and critics' claims of limited environmental benefits raise concerns about the sincerity of its green initiatives.

In 2023, Saudi Arabia accounted for nearly 75% of Middle Eastern investment in cli-



mate technology start-ups, according to a report by PwC. However, the majority of this investment is focused on energy solutions, with \$363 million channeled into climate-friendly energy technologies—nearly ten times the amount allocated to innovations in food, agriculture, and land-use. One notable project in the kingdom is a wastewater treatment facility at the King Abdullah University of Science and Technology (KAUST). The facility uses microorganisms to reduce the energy cost of wastewater treatment and generates energy from methane produced in the process. The purified water can be used to irrigate plants, combat desertification, or produce feed for livestock.

In addition, Saudi Arabia's Middle East Green Initiative aims to plant 10 billion trees and rehabilitate 74 million hectares of land. However, experts like Himanshu Mishra at KAUST believe efficient water and soil management are crucial to these goals.

Pak Ex-PM Imran Khan Placed on 14-Day Judicial Remand in Seven New Cases

Pakistan's former Prime Minister Imran Khan has been placed on a 14-day judicial remand by the Anti-Terrorism Court (ATC) in connection with seven new cases, as reported on Monday. The ATC hearing, presided over by Judge Amjad Ali Shah, resulted in the court approving Khan's remand in the New Town police station case and six other cases related to protests held on September 28, October 4, and October 5, 2023.

Currently held in Adiala Jail, Imran Khan's arrest follows his previous bail in the Toshakhana 2.0 case. His legal troubles stem from protests organized by his party, Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), which resulted in multiple charges. Despite requests for physical remand in six other cases from the protests during the mentioned dates, the court decided to send Khan to jail on judicial remand.

In addition to these cases, Imran Khan faces further legal battles, including 28 cases linked to the November 24 protest, for which no arrests have been made as of now. The ATC is also set to hear 13 cases related to the May 9, 2023, violence, alongside the remand of 1,494 PTI workers arrested during the November 24 protest march in Islamabad.

The ATC proceedings continue, with PTI lawyers planning to appear in the Adiala Jail for the hearing of Imran Khan's case. The hearing is expected to be followed by a visit from the judge to Adiala Jail for further remand proceedings. Imran Khan's sister, Aleema Khan, might also attend as Imran has not been able to meet with his lawyers or family in the past 10 days.

New Clues Point To Possible Alien Life Beneath Mars' Surface



Scientists Discover New Deep-Sea Mollusc After Two Decades of Research

Ateam of researchers from the Monterey Bay Aquarium Research Institute (MBARI) has officially identified a new species of sea slug, known as *Bathydevius Caudactylus*, or more commonly, the "mystery mollusc." The discovery, published in the journal *Deep-Sea Research*, marks the culmination of over 20 years of research.



was found in deep-sea environments, a region that has long been difficult for researchers to explore due to its challenging conditions. The team used MBARI's advanced ROVs to observe the creature and collect samples for analysis. This discovery not only sheds light on the biodiversity of deepsea ecosystems but also highlights the importance of continued exploration in the world's oceans.

Mars, once a warm and wet world, may still hold the potential for life deep beneath its surface. A team of scientists led by Andrea Butturini believes that microbial life, particularly methanogens, could be lurking in the subsurface of the ancient Martian plain, Acidalia Planitia. This area, located in the northern hemisphere of Mars, has piqued the interest of researchers as a possible haven for life.

By analyzing data from various Mars missions, including orbiters and rovers, the team identified a subsurface zone between 4.3 and 8.8 kilometers deep that may harbor conditions suitable for microbial activity. This environment, shielded from the planet's harsh surface conditions, could retain remnants of ancient water and geothermal heat—two crucial ingredients for life. While the idea of Martian microbes may seem speculative, this discovery fuels hope and provides a compelling reason to continue searching for extraterrestrial life.

Acidalia Planitia, a vast 3,000-kilometer-wide plain, seems to offer the right conditions for methanogens—bacteria that produce methane. The researchers suggest that these microbes could thrive in the deep subsurface, where they would be protected from the planet's extreme surface temperatures and radiation. The findings provide a promising target for future missions aimed at searching for evidence of life on Mars.

However, uncovering evidence of life on Mars is no small feat. The researchers note that to verify the existence of microbial life, future missions would likely need to drill several miles beneath the Martian surface. Despite the challenges, this discovery opens up exciting new possibilities for the search for life on Mars and could reshape our understanding of extraterrestrial biology.

As space exploration continues, this research adds to the growing body of evidence suggesting that Mars may still harbor the potential for life, sparking new interest and enthusiasm for the Red Planet's exploration. The mystery mollusc was first spotted in February 2000 during a research mission using the remotely operated vehicle (ROV) Tiburon. Since then, the elusive creature has intrigued scientists, but its true nature remained a mystery. Thanks to continued observations and extensive research, the team was able to classify it as a species of nudibranch, a type of sea

E-Commerce Platform Meesho Was Defrauded Of ₹ 5 Crore By Fake Seller

In a major breakthrough, the cyber police have uncovered a fraud that caused a loss of over ₹5 crore to the popular e-commerce platform Meesho. Three individuals have been arrested in connection with the scam, which involved posing as fake sellers and placing fraudulent orders on the platform.

According to the cyber police, the suspects operated under the name "OM Shree Enterprises," a fake company based in Surat. They used fake names and addresses to place orders

on Meesho, only to later claim refunds by alleging that the products were damaged. To support their claims, they sent videos of the damaged goods to the company. Once the products were returned due to the fraudulent addresses, the criminals replaced them with damaged items and collected refunds.

The scam operated between January and July of this year, during which the fraudsters managed to siphon off ₹5.5 crore through



various bank accounts. The scale of the operation prompted Meesho's nodal officer to file a complaint with the cyber police in July, leading to the investigation and the formation of a special team to track the culprits.

The cyber police traced the bank accounts and mobile numbers used by the suspects, eventually leading to their arrest in Surat on November 21. During questioning, the suspects confessed to their involvement in the fraud and revealed the

identities of their associates. Efforts are now underway to locate the other members of the group.

The suspects were also found to have been involved in a similar fraud case in 2023, which further highlights the sophistication and scale of their operations. The police are continuing their investigation into the matter, with plans to further investigate the extent of the fraud and bring all involved to justice.


