

YS Jagan **Announces Statewide Protests** from Dec 11th

YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) chief and Andhra Pradesh Leader of the Opposition, YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, has announced a series of statewide protests targeting the NDA government. The protests are scheduled to take place on three different dates between December 11 and January 3, focusing on key issues affecting the state. In a detailed media briefing today, Jagan unveiled his plan of action, declaring that the protests would address pressing concerns such as farmers' welfare, increasing electricity charges, and delays in the reimbursement of educational fees. He emphasized his commitment to fighting for justice on these three issues and urged public participation in the demonstrations.

The first protest will center on demanding justice for the farming community, highlighting their ongoing struggles. The second protest will address the recent hike in electricity tariffs, which Jagan described as a burden on the people. The final agenda will focus on the delays in the fee reimbursement scheme, which has been a cause of concern for students and their families across the state. Jagan had previously announced plans to hold party cadre-level meetings starting at the end of January. While many expected this to be his first major political activity post-elections, he has now shifted focus to these public protests. This strategic move is seen as an effort to increase pressure on the NDA government while rallying public support for the YSRCP's causes. With Jagan preparing to take his protests to the streets, political observers are keen to see how Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu and the ruling TDP government will respond to this challenge. The protests are expected to amplify the political discourse in Andhra Pradesh in the coming weeks.

CM Naidu Buys 5 Acres in Velagapudi

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu has purchased a house in the Amaravati capital region. Chandrababu, who has often stated that he would build his own house after the completion of Amaravati's construction, has now acquired approximately 5 acres of land within the Velagapudi revenue limits. This plot, covering about 25,000 square meters, is located adjacent to the E-6 road.

The plot is well-connected, with roads on all four sides. Additionally, it is in proximity to several key landmarks, including judges' bungalows, the temporary High Court, VIT, and NGO residences. The Seed Access Road, a critical route to the capital, also runs next to this plot.

The land is a returnable plot registered in the names of three farmers from the same family. Reports suggest that payment has already been made to these farmers. Part of the plot will be used for constructing the house, while the rest will be allocated for vehicle parking, staff quarters, and a lawn. For the past ten years, Chandrababu Naidu has been staying at a guesthouse owned by Lingamaneni Estates on the Undavalli Karakatta road, located on the banks of the Krishna River.

A multi-disciplinary team comprising officials from the Revenue, Police, Customs, Port, and Civil Supplies departments conducted a detailed inspection of the Stella ship at Kakinada port. The ship, allegedly involved in smuggling ration rice intended for the poor, has been under scrutiny since it was stopped by Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan's intervention at the port.

The team, formed by the Andhra Pradesh government to investigate ration rice smuggling, collected samples of the rice and began ascertaining facts about its origin and intended destination. The Kakinada District Collector had earlier announced on November 27 that the ship contained 640 tons of ration rice, meant for distribution to low-income families.

The case took a political turn when Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan visited the Kakinada port on November 29 and made sensational comments regarding the smuggling racket. He immediately ordered the seizure of the ship, emphasizing the need for strict action against those involved. In light of these developments, today's inspection by the team is a critical step in the ongoing investigation to determine the extent of the alleged smuggling operation. Further action will be based on the findings of the multi-disciplinary committee.

The Gudivada One Town police arrested nine followers of Kodali Nani and transferred them to the Pedaparupudi Police Station. A case has been registered against them under IPC Sections 143, 144, 145, 188, 427, and 506 read with Section 149.

Meanwhile, Kodali Nani's key follower, Kali, remains absconding. Police have traced his location to Assam, and a special team has been formed to apprehend him.

Dr. Buragadda Srinadh Leads Shankaravam 2025

A Unified Voice for Hindu Rights in Krishna District

In a significant move aimed at strengthening right-wing organizations in Andhra Pradesh, Dr. Buragadda Srinadh, President of the Krishna District Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP), has been appointed as the Krishna District Convenor for the Shankaravam Committee. This pivotal committee, which includes prominent right-wing organizations such as the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) and Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), will spearhead the Shankaravam event scheduled for January 5, 2025, in Kesarapalli village, Gannavaram Mandalam, Krishna District.

Dr. Srinadh, known for his unwavering commitment to Hindu causes, has been a dedicated member of the RSS since his college years. His leadership credentials were established early when he became the first General Secretary of the National Medicos Organization in Jammu and Kashmir, a role that highlighted his organizational acumen and passion for service.

The Shankaravam Committee's focus this year is to amplify public discontent over government control of Hindu temple properties and to unite Hindu organizations under a single platform. Dr. Srinadh's selection as convenor underscores his reputation as a unifier and a leader with deep roots in the ideological framework of the RSS and the VHP.

Dr. Srinadh also carries a rich political legacy. His late father, Niranjan Rao, was a prominent political figure who



opposed the Congress party, winning an independent legislative assembly seat in 1967 and later contesting as a Janata Party candidate for the Machilipatnam parliamentary constituency. This lineage, combined with Dr. Srinadh's own contributions, makes him a key figure in Krishna District's socio-political landscape.

The upcoming Shankaravam event is being seen as a major opportunity for right-wing organizations to consolidate their base and rally public support for their causes. Under Dr. Srinadh's leadership, the VHP and its allied organizations are expected to mobilize significant participation, setting the stage for a unified voice on issues affecting Hindu society.

Former AP CID Chief N. Sanjay Suspended

The Andhra Pradesh government has suspended N. Sanjay, former Chief of the Andhra Pradesh Crime Investigation Deularities. The suspension follows an inquiry by the Vigilance and Enforcement Department, which uncovered significant misconduct during his tenure as Director General of the Fire Services Department. According to the Vigilance report, Sanjay allegedly facilitated payments of ₹1 crore to Sautrika Technologies and Infra Pvt. Ltd. despite no visible progress in the assigned work. The report also accused him of bid rigging and favoritism in

awarding tenders, thereby undermining the tendering process and violating ethical norms.

The Vigilance Department recommended stringent actions against Sanjay and the involved company, citing violations partment (CID) and a senior IPS officer, of the Central Civil Services Conduct following allegations of financial irreg- Rules. The report called for criminal proceedings against the firm and appropriate legal measures against Sanjay to uphold accountability and transparency. In response to these findings, the state government issued suspension orders, barring Sanjay from leaving the headquarters during the suspension period. This development has raised questions about the transparency and accountability within government departments, with many calling for swift legal action to address the matter.



Do not Sell Grain to Middlemen at Lower Prices

State Civil Supplies Minister Nadendla Manohar has assured farmers that the government will purchase every grain they harvest and deposit the payment in their accounts within 24 hours of procurement. The minister urged farmers not to sell their grain to middlemen at lower prices and reiterated the government's commitment to fair grain procurement practices.

On Wednesday, Shri Nadendla Manohar, accompanied by local legislator Mandali Buddha Prasad, conducted a field inspection in Challapalli and Ghantasala mandals under the Avanigadda constit-



uency in Krishna district. During the visit, they inspected grain dried along roadsides and interacted

with farmers to understand challenges in the procurement process. The minister instructed officials to ensure the procurement of grain, even if the moisture content varies due to weather conditions, and emphasized completing the purchase of all prepared paddy by evening. Field inspections were conducted in several villages, including Pata Majeru, Mangalapuram, Challapalli, Kasanagaram, Pedaprolu, and Lankapalli, to monitor the process and address farmers' concerns. This proactive approach by the

government is aimed at ensuring timely and transparent grain procurement, offering much-needed relief to farmers during the ongoing harvest season.

Free Electricity for All Eligible SC and ST Families in AP

The social media war in Andhra Pradesh over the free electricity scheme for Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) families continues to escalate. Amidst claims and counterclaims, Andhra Pradesh Power Minister Gottipati Ravikumar made a key announcement, addressing the misinformation surrounding the scheme.

The minister stated that the coalition government is providing free electricity of up to 200 units to all eligible SC and ST families. He emphasized that allegations about the scheme being discontinued are baseless and urged people not to believe such false propaganda.

Minister Gottipati Ravikumar clarified that the free electricity scheme benefits 15,17,298 SC families and 4,75,557 ST families, totaling 19,92,885 families across the state.



He highlighted that the government is spending ₹477.30 crores per month to support this initiative. The minister reassured that the scheme continues to benefit low-income families from weaker sections and urged the public to ig-

nore misinformation intended to create obstacles to the program's implementation.

Minister Ravikumar accused the opposition YSRCP of spreading deliberate lies about the scheme to undermine the coalition government. He stated that the current government has been providing free electricity to SCs and STs for a long time, and this was a pioneering initiative by the TDP government for Dalit tribals. He further alleged that the opposition is unable to tolerate the success of the government's schemes, including the Super Six schemes, and is resorting to spreading false propaganda.

Indian Railways Extends Ticket Booking Hours

In a move to enhance passenger convenience, Indian Railways, which boasts the world's fourth-largest rail network, has announced changes to its ticket booking rules effective from December 1. The key change is the extension of the ticket booking window by two hours daily, making it more accessible for travelers. Passengers can now book tickets from 8 AM to 8 PM through the official IRCTC app, website, and private ticket booking platforms. Previously, ticket booking was allowed only be-


tween 10 AM and 8 PM. However, the rules for tatkal ticket bookings and cancellation charges remain unchanged. Booking tickets through the IRCTC app or website is significantly cheaper than using private ticket booking apps. The IRCTC platform does not charge convenience fees, agent service charges, or payment gateway charges, making it a cost-effective option. In contrast, private apps levy these additional charges, leading to a price difference of up to ₹150 per ticket.

Despite the cost savings, many passengers prefer private apps due to their user-friendly interface and faster booking

process, especially when dealing with captcha challenges on the IRCTC app. To counter this trend, the Railway Board aims to create awareness about the financial benefits of using IRCTC for ticket bookings.

The Railway Board is actively encouraging passengers to transition to the IRCTC platform to save money. Efforts are underway to simplify the IRCTC booking process and educate passengers on its advantages.

Indian Railways continues to innovate and adapt its rules, ensuring a smoother and more cost-effective experience for its vast passenger base.







Who's Blocking Nagababu's Path to the Rajya Sabha?

AVINASH | TPN : The political scene in Andhra Pradesh is heating up as efforts are underway to fill three vacant Rajya Sabha seats following the resignations of YSRCP leaders Beda Mastana Rao, Mopidevi Venkata Ramana, and R Krishnaiah. With the numerical advantage in the state assembly, the three parties in the alliance-TDP, BJP, and Jana Sena-are expected to secure these seats. However, the initial buzz around Nagababu from Jana Sena being a frontrunner for one of these seats seems to have diminished, raising questions about who will ultimately be selected. The Election Commission has announced by-elections for the three



vacant Rajya Sabha seats, sparking intense negotiations within the alliance. Mopidevi and Beda Mastana Rao, who have joined TDP, are set to benefit from this development, with Beda Mastana Rao reportedly guaranteed a Rajya Sabha seat as part of the alliance agreement. Meanwhile, R Krishnaiah, after discussions with BJP leaders, resigned from his MP post and is expected to return to Rajya Sabha under BJP's nomination. This leaves one remaining seat, sparking competition among aspirants from TDP and Jana Sena.

Initially, a proposal was made to allocate the three seats to each of the al-

liance partners, with Nagababu being promised a Rajya Sabha berth on behalf of Jana Sena. This was reportedly a compensation for his inability to contest from Anakapalle in the recent elections, as that seat was given to BJP under the alliance's electoral arrangements. Pawan Kalyan himself had earlier expressed clarity on this arrangement during his visit to Delhi. However, political dynamics seem to have shifted. The TDP, under Chandrababu Naidu's leadership, is said to have finalized Sana Satish for one of the two seats allotted to them. Satish, who had previously sought to contest as an MP from Kakinada, appears to have been rewarded with a Rajya

Sabha seat due to her close ties with the Jana Sena-TDP alliance. Meanwhile, senior TDP leaders like Devineni Uma, Galla Jayadev, and Kambhampati Rammohan Rao continue to lobby for the other seat.

The tenure of the vacant seats adds another layer to the intrigue. Mopidevi's seat is valid until January 2026, while the terms for Mastana Rao and Krishnaiah extend to June 2026. Reports suggest that Nagababu has been assured a full-term Rajya Sabha seat when new vacancies arise in 2026. Until then, the political maneuvers within the alliance will likely continue to be closely watched as parties finalize their strategies.

Devineni Avinash's Followers Appointed as Special Officers

Summons to Relatives of YS Jagan in Viveka Murder Case

TPN CORRESPONDENTKadapa : The investigation into the high-profile murder case of YS Vivekananda Reddy has gained momentum following the change of government in Andhra Pradesh. In a significant development, Pulivendula DSP Murali Nayak has issued summons to several individuals, including close relatives of YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) chief YS Jagan Mohan Reddy.

Those summoned include Jagan's brother-in-law EC Surendranath Reddy, Kadapa MP Avinash Reddy's fatherin-law Manohar Reddy, younger brother Abhishek Reddy, YSR Trust member Janardhan Reddy, and lawyer Obul Reddy. Notices were also sent to five additional witnesses, bringing the total to ten individuals who have been asked to appear for questioning on December 5.

This action stems from a private complaint filed on December 15 last year by Krishna Reddy, the former personal assistant (PA) of Vivekananda Reddy. The complaint also named Viveka's daughter Sunitha, her husband Rajasekhar Reddy, and CBI officer Ram Singh. Krishna Reddy was questioned by the police about ten days ago, during which his statement

YS Vivekananda Reddy, a former minister and uncle of Jagan Mohan Reddy, was allegedly murdered just before the 2019 elections. However, progress in the investigation stalled during YSRCP's tenure in power. With the party losing the general elections earlier this year, the case has seen renewed activity under the new government.

The latest summons mark a critical step in the ongoing probe, as the authorities intensify efforts to uncover the truth behind Viveka's death. The questioning on December 5 is expected to shed new light on the case, which has remained unresolved for over four years.

One of the main points of contention involves the appointment of Galla Seshu Kumar, son of former Kamma Corporation Director Galla Padmavati, as a special officer in the I&PR department. Activists allege that despite Padmavati's resignation, her son was given the post just 20 days later, with a monthly salary of ₹120,000 and an additional allowance of ₹50,000. Critics highlight that this appointment mirrors practices during the previous YSRCP government, where a social media analyst earning ₹30,000 per month and known for posting controversial content against TDP leaders was similarly promoted.

Further allegations point to Devineni Avinash's followers, ac-



cused of attacking the TDP party office, being appointed as special officers. MLA Gadde Rammohan Rao is said to have supported these appointments, ignoring the contributions of dedicated TDP activists in the Vijayawada East constituency, where over 20,000 young men and women work for the party. Activists claim that more than 50% of these workers have been overlooked in favor of individuals previously aligned with the YSRCP.

Adding to the controversy, every minister in the coalition government has been provided a 30-member social media team, with each member earning ₹30,000 per month. However, re-



The minister also acknowledged that recent heavy rains had caused floods, leading to the postponement of previously scheduled conferences. He confirmed that revenue conferences are now being conducted across 17,564 villages, from the 6th of this month to the 8th of the next. Additionally, discussions on issuing new ration cards will take place during these conferences.

9.91 Lakh Metric Tons of Grain Already Procured

TPN CORRESPONDENT , Avanigadda : State Civil Supplies Minister Nadendla Manohar highlighted the coalition government's efficient and transparent approach to grain procurement, assuring farmers of timely payments and strong support during challenging times. The Minister chaired a constituency-level review meeting on grain purchase at the Revenue Conference Hall in Avanigadda on Wednesday.

Speaking at the meeting, Minister Manohar announced that 9.91 lakh metric tons of grain have already been procured across the state, with ₹2,283 crore disbursed to farmers, including ₹2,067 crore paid within 24 hours of procurement. He emphasized that issues caused by the 40day grain purchase disruption due to the cyclone were resolved efficiently within

Mangalagiri AIIMS to Get Clean Water Supply Soon

TPN CORRESPONDENT, Mangalagiri : The Mangalagiri AIIMS, which has been grappling with water shortages, is set to receive a steady supply of clean water as the government takes swift action to address the issue. Until now, drinking water has been supplied to the AIIMS staff and patients through tankers. However, with new infrastructure developments, the problem is expected to be resolved soon.

The government has completed the construction of 5 km pipelines from Guntur Channel and Atmakur Lake, alongside the establishment of purification plants within the AIIMS premises to treat and supply water from the pipelines. These efforts are part of the coalition government's initiative to expedite long-delayed projects, which had been stalled by the previous administration.

The Chalo Vijayawada protest on December 10 is expected to witness significant participation as employees across the state rally together to demand pension reforms.



Preparations for the Teacher MLC by-election in the Godavari districts are almost complete. The election has become highly prestigious this time, with fierce competition among candidates. The government has implemented key measures, including the temporary closure of liquor shops, to maintain peace during the election process. The closure is in effect today and tomorrow.

The by-election was necessitated by the death of Teacher MLC Sheikh Sabji in a road accident on December 15 last year. While polling will take place on Thursday, the counting of votes is scheduled for March 9 at Kakinada JNTU.

for Lord Venkateswara **Devotees** Laddu Production to Increase

TPN CORRESPONDENT, Tirumala : The Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) has announced a plan to significantly boost the production of its iconic laddu prasadam to meet the growing demand from devotees. Renowned for their spiritual significance, these laddus are cherished as sacred offerings and often shared with loved ones. However, the high demand has led to limitations in purchases, leaving many devotees disappointed.

To address this, TTD is set to recruit 74 Vaishnavas and 10 non-Vaishnavas to its workforce, enabling a substantial increase in production. The temple aims to produce an additional 50,000 small laddus, 4,000 large laddus, and 3,500 vadas daily. While the current production meets routine demand, special occasions like weekends, festivals, and Brahmotsavams see a significant surge in requests.

Currently, each devotee visiting Lord Venkateswara receives one small laddu free of cost, with around 70,000 free laddus distributed daily. With increased production, TTD will also be able to sell additional laddus to devotees who wish to purchase more.

At present, TTD produces 3.5 lakh small laddus, 6,000 large laddus (Kalyanam laddus), and 3,500 vadas daily. These are distributed across Tirumala and other TTD-managed temples in cities like Chennai, Hyderabad, Bengaluru, and Tirupati.

This initiative promises to fulfill the expectations of devotees and enhance their spiritual experience, especially during peak seasons and festivals.

India Navigates US Trade and BRICS Currency Disputes Amid Tariff Threats

India's economic stability. India is particularly wary of China's growing influence within BRICS, fearing that a shared currency could further enhance Beijing's geopolitical power at the expense of other member nations.

Moreover, India's robust trade ties with the US present a significant challenge. Trump's tariff threats could severely impact Indian exports, particularly in industries such as pharmaceuticals, IT services, and textiles. Small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs), which rely heavily on exports to the US, would be hit hardest by such tariffs, threatening India's export-driven growth.

India's Strategic Autonomy and Future Prospects

India's strategy focuses on maintaining its strategic autonomy by balancing its relations with the discussions on alternatives to the dollar. India supports the concept of de-dollarisation but is cautious about antagonizing its most important trading partner.


Changing Conditions and Mindsets

With India on the brink of achieving a historic hat-trick of series wins in Australia, their confidence and self-belief continue to grow, making them a force to be reckoned with in world cricket.

China's ongoing anti-corruption campaign, under the leadership of President Xi Jinping, has targeted not only government officials but also the country's powerful military. This phase of the campaign, which traces its roots to the fall of former Politburo member Bo Xilai, has seen the military face a "zero tolerance" approach to corruption. Since the 18th National Congress of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP), the purge has resulted in investigations into numerous high-ranking military officials, including 14 generals and 85 major generals, highlighting the breadth of the effort.

Last week, Miao Hua, a senior figure in the Military Commission, was placed under investigation, continuing a pattern of high-profile military figures being scrutinized. Meanwhile, former Foreign Minister Qin Gang's whereabouts remain unclear, fueling further speculation about possible purges within the CCP. Additionally, reports suggest that Defence Minister Dong Jun is facing corruption charges, following the dismissal of his predecessor, Li Shangfu, on similar grounds. These developments raise critical questions about the trustworthiness of the People's Liberation Army (PLA) and whether there is growing discontent or internal rifts within its ranks.

Corruption within China's government and military is not a new phenomenon. Historical anti-corruption campaigns date back to the early days of the People's Republic of China (PRC), such as the 1951-1952 crackdown that targeted over 100,000 cadres. However, the issue became more pronounced following Deng Xiaoping's economic reforms. Under Xi, the campaign has evolved into a broader tool not only to tackle corruption but also to neutral-



ize opposition and potential political rivals.

Chinese citizens largely support the anti-corruption efforts, viewing them as necessary for national security and dignity. There is widespread agreement that corruption, especially within the government and military, needs to be addressed. However, opinions diverge on whether Xi's campaign-style approach is the right solution.

While there is public support for the idea of cleaning up corruption, critics argue that Xi's campaign approach may not be sustainable. Some Chinese commentators suggest that corruption will resurface once the focus on individual purges fades. A more institutional approach, they argue, is necessary to address the systemic links between power and wealth, which enable corruption to thrive. Without structural reforms, these critics warn, anti-corruption campaigns will remain superficial.

Despite these concerns, Xi's anti-corruption campaign is unlikely to significantly alter China's foreign or military policies, as decisions are ultimately made by him.



Devendra Fadnavis Elected BJP Leader, Set to Become Maharashtra CM for Third Term

Devendra Fadnavis will be sworn in as Maharashtra's Chief Minister for the third time on Thursday, December 5, following his unanimous election as the leader of the BJP legislature party. The announcement came after intense discussions and negotiations within the Mahayuti alliance. The oath-taking ceremony will take place at Azad Maidan in Mumbai at 5 pm, with Prime Minister Narendra Modi attending, alongside around 40,000 supporters and nearly 2,000 VVIPs.

The event will also be graced by central ministers, governors, and prominent figures from across Maharashtra. In keeping with the state's diverse cultural heritage, the ceremony will also feature religious leaders, artists, and writers. Fadnavis thanked the alliance leaders, including Eknath Shinde and Ajit Pawar, for their support, emphasizing the historic nature of the recent election victory.

Fadnavis, who previously served as CM in 2014 and 2019,



now returns to power after the BJP secured a significant 132 seats in the 288-member Maharashtra assembly. Despite the Shiv Sena's earlier insistence on Eknath Shinde continuing as CM, Shinde has accepted the deputy CM position, clearing the way for Fadnavis's leadership.

This marks a remarkable political comeback for Fadnavis, who had faced a tumultuous period after the 2019 power struggle with the Shiv Sena and his brief stint as deputy CM after Shinde's defection. The ceremony will be carefully monitored, with extensive

security measures in place due to the expected large crowd.

Fadnavis's third term as CM is expected to reinforce the strength of the Mahayuti alliance and usher in a new phase of governance in Maharashtra.

Kuwaiti Foreign Minister Abdullah Ali Al-Yahya Arrives in India

Kuwaiti Foreign Minister Abdullah Ali Al-Yahya arrived in India on Tuesday for an official visit aimed at further enhancing the multifaceted relationship between India and Kuwait. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) extended a warm welcome to the visiting dignitary, emphasizing the significance of his trip in strengthening the long-standing ties between the two nations.

"Further strengthening India-Kuwait multifaceted relations. Warm welcome to FM Abdullah Ali Al-Yahya MoFA Kuwait as he arrives in India on an official visit," the MEA stated on the social media platform X. Dr. S. Jaishankar, India's External Affairs Minister, also welcomed Al-Yahya's arrival in New Delhi, expressing anticipation for productive discussions during the visit.

According to an official press release, the visit will include a series of high-level meetings, starting with a call on Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday at the PM's residence. The Kuwaiti foreign minister will also meet with External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar at Hyderabad House in the national capital before concluding his visit and departing for Kuwait the same evening.

The bilateral relationship between India and Kuwait is historically strong, rooted in centuries of trade and cultural exchanges. Even before Kuwait's independence in 1961, India played a pivotal role in its economy, with the Indian Rupee being its legal tender. Maritime activities like shipbuilding, pearl diving, and trade flourished between the two nations, with India exchanging spices, textiles, and wood for pearls, dates, and Arabian horses from Kuwait.

The Indian community in Kuwait, now numbering over a million, is the largest expatriate group in the country. Indians contribute significantly to various sectors, including engineering, IT, medicine, and business. The economic ties are further solidified by Indian business interests in Kuwait, with major brands like Lulu Hypermarket and Centre Point finding a place in the Kuwaiti market. Additionally, over 200 Indian associations in Kuwait organize events to promote



Assam, the Assam Cattle Preservation Act of 2021 already regulates the transportation, slaughter of cattle, and the sale of beef and beef products. The law aims to protect cows and regulate the beef trade, with specific restrictions in place to safeguard religious sentiments.

"We had earlier introduced a bill to protect cows, and we have been successful," Sarma said, referring to the legislation passed by the state assembly in 2021. "Going forward, we have decided that beef will not be served in any hotels or restaurants in the state. It will also not be served during any public function or

in any public place."

The existing law bans cattle slaughter and beef sale in areas with a majority Hindu, Jain, or Sikh population, as well as within a five-kilometre radius of temples or satras (Vaishnavite monasteries). Sarma further revealed that the government has decided to expand these restrictions to additional areas beyond the five-kilometre radius.

The Assam Cattle Preservation Bill was passed in the state assembly in August

2021 through a voice vote, despite objections from the opposition, who called for the bill to be sent to a Select Committee for further discussion. Under the provisions of the bill, violations could result in imprisonment ranging from three to eight years, along with a fine between ₹3 lakh and ₹5 lakh.

The new ban on beef consumption in public spaces is expected to have significant implications for the state's culinary and cultural landscape, impacting both local communities and the tourism sector.

Indian Foreign Secretary to Visit Bangladesh

Indian Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri is expected to visit Bangladesh next week for a Foreign Secretary-level meeting, amid growing tensions between the two nations following the recent political changes in Bangladesh. The meeting, which is part of the Foreign Office Consultation (FOC), is scheduled to take place in Dhaka on December 9 or 10, according to Bangladesh's Foreign Adviser Md Touhid Hosain.

This will mark the first high-level visit by a senior Indian government official to Bangladesh since the interim government, led by Muhammad Yunus, assumed power on August 8. Yunus' government came into power after the ousting of former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, a move that has strained diplomatic relations between the neighboring countries.

Hosain, speaking at the Foreign Ministry, reiterated Bangladesh's desire for a strong relationship with India, emphasizing that the two nations must work



towards building ties on a reciprocal basis. "It is very clear that we want a good relationship with India," he stated, while highlighting the need for both sides to commit to mutual cooperation and respect.

Despite the current tensions, the scheduled meeting offers a glimmer of hope for mending ties between the two South Asian nations. The discussion will likely focus on various bilateral issues, including trade, security, and regional cooperation, with an emphasis on resolving ongoing challenges. The visit is seen as an important step towards ensuring that both nations can navigate the complexities of their relationship in a constructive manner. It also comes at a crucial time when India and Bangladesh are seeking to manage regional concerns, including security and economic challenges, while ensuring stability in their bilateral relations.

Kejriwal alleges many forces involved in attack on Sukhbir Badal

Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) convenor and former Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Wednesday alleged that multiple forces were involved in the attack on former Punjab Chief Minister Sukhbir Singh Badal. The incident occurred when a shooter, identified as Narain Singh Chaura, fired a bullet at Badal during his visit to the Golden Temple in Amritsar. The bullet missed Badal and struck the wall behind him, allowing the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) leader to escape unharmed.

While addressing the Delhi Assembly, Kejriwal condemned the attack and emphasized that it was part of a larger conspiracy aimed at defaming Punjab and its people. "A big incident was averted today. Someone tried to shoot at Sukhbir Singh Badal, but he is safe. There is a big conspiracy behind this to malign Punjab. There are several forces involved in it," said Kejriwal.

The incident occurred when Badal was undergoing 'tankhah' (religious penance) as instructed by the Sikh clergy. He was performing the penance by washing utensils, cleaning shoes, and attending to other chores as part of the punishment prescribed by the Akal Takht.

Kejriwal also praised the swift response of the Punjab Police, acknowledging their role in averting a potential tragedy. "The Punjab Police did exemplary work in preventing the incident. However, questions are being raised about the law and order situation in Punjab. What about Delhi's law and order situation?" Kejriwal remarked.





South Korean Opposition Moves to Impeach President Yoon After Martial Law Declaration

On Wednesday, South Korea's opposition coalition filed a motion in Parliament to impeach President Yoon Suk Yeol, following his unexpected imposition of martial law, which triggered mass protests across the nation. The opposition Democratic Party (DP) submitted the impeachment motion after lawmakers clashed with security forces in an attempt to block the controversial decree.

Kim Yong-min of the DP announced that the impeachment motion had been prepared urgently, though the exact timing of the vote is yet to be decided. The motion could be put to a vote as soon as Friday. The opposition currently holds a majority in South Korea's National Assembly, which has 300 seats, and needs a two-thirds majority to pass the motion. If President Yoon is removed or resigns, Prime Minister Han Ducksoo would temporarily assume presidential duties, according to the South Korean constitution.

The opposition has also indicated plans to file charges of "insurrection" against President Yoon, his defense and interior ministers, and key figures in the military and police involved in the martial law imposition. The move has sparked



widespread political unrest, with even Yoon's own party leader calling the martial law declaration "tragic" and urging accountability for those involved.

The political chaos has had significant economic repercussions. South Korean stocks tumbled, with the Kospi index falling over 1% and dipping by as much as 2.3% at one point. The country's currency, the won, also hit multi-year lows. In response, the South Korean finance ministry and the central bank

promised to provide financial stability and liquidity to reassure markets.

Despite the political upheaval, life in Seoul returned to normal on Wednesday, with people going about their daily routines, although many residents expressed confusion and fear after the martial law was announced and later rescinded. Thousands of protesters gathered in the streets demanding Yoon's resignation and the reversal of the martial law order.

French Government Risks Falling In No-Confidence Vote

On Wednesday, France's government, led by Prime Minister Michel Barnier, faced a no-confidence vote that could mark the end of his brief administration, plunging the country into political turmoil. If toppled, Barnier's government would be the shortest-lived in France's Fifth Republic, lasting only three months, and President Emmanuel Macron would face the difficult task of finding a viable successor.

The National Assembly was set to debate two no-confidence motions, presented by the far-left and far-right factions, over next year's budget. Tensions escalated after Barnier pushed through a social security financing bill without a vote, which further deepened the rift with opposition parties. The far-right National Pally (DN) led by Marine La Pan, is expected to

Rally (RN), led by Marine Le Pen, is expected to support the motion brought forward by the left, giving it enough backing to pass.

Barnier, speaking on French television, expressed hope that his government could survive, citing a "higher interest" in overcoming political divisions. However, analysts largely predict that the government is doomed, given the unlikely alliance between the far-left and the far-right.



This crisis follows a snap election in the summer called by Macron, which failed to stop the rise of the far-right and resulted in a fractured parliament with no clear majority. Barnier's government has been held hostage by the RN, which has the power to bring it down at any time. With no new elections possible within a year of the previous legislative polls, Macron's options are limited.


Macron, currently on a state visit to Saudi Arabia, rejected calls for his resignation, dismissing them as "political fiction." He expressed confidence in his mandate, having been elected twice by the French people, and vowed to serve his full term until 2027.

Should the government fall, the uncertainty facing the French people before Christmas would only increase. Opposition figures, including Socialist party leader Olivier Faure, have urged Macron to address the nation directly. The outcome of the no-confidence vote could reshape France's political landscape as Macron's leadership is increasingly questioned.

Yale Report Links Putin to Forced Adoption of Ukrainian Children

A new report from Yale University has accused Russian President Vladimir Putin and senior Kremlin officials of authorizing a program to forcibly foster and adopt Ukrainian children during the ongoing war in Ukraine. The investigation, led by Yale's Humanitarian Research Lab, provides compelling evidence that these actions were carried out under direct orders from top Russian leaders, including Putin himself.

The report, released Tuesday, strengthens the case for war crimes charges against Putin and other Russian officials. It reveals that at least 314 Ukrainian children have been placed in Russian institutions or adopted by Russian families as part of a systematic program designed to forcibly separate them from their homes and families. According to the findings, this program was not only a response to the ongoing conflict but part of a larger effort to assimilate these children into Russian society.



jing on Tuesday, Nepal and China signed nine agreements aimed at strengthening bilateral ties. However, the absence of any significant mention of the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) in these agreements has raised questions, suggesting that internal political conflicts within Nepal may have influenced the nature of the agreements.

The signing of these memorandums of understanding (MOUs) followed a meeting between Prime Minister Oli and Chinese Premier Li Qiang. The two leaders discussed various aspects of Nepal-China cooperation, including infrastructure, trade, and development. Despite the broad range of topics covered, there was no major reference to the Belt and Road Initiative, which is a key part of China's global strategy to expand trade and infrastructure connections across Asia and beyond.

The lack of focus on the BRI is notable, especially considering that Nepal had previously shown interest in joining the initiative, which would have included significant investments in infrastructure projects like roads, railways, and energy systems. However, internal political divisions within Nepal's ruling coalition, particularly between the two major political parties, have led to a more cautious approach towards the initiative. These divisions may have contributed to China's decision to limit the scope of the agreements, avoiding the inclusion of BRI-related projects that could provoke further political controversy in Nepal. frontline villages—one in the Donetsk region and the other in the Zaporizhzhia region.

In his nightly video address, Zelensky emphasized the critical need for increased support, particularly in the Donetsk region, where the fighting has been most intense. He stressed that Ukraine's military success depends heavily on timely and consistent weapon supplies from Western allies. "The Donetsk directions require significant reinforcement, particularly the supply of weapons from our partners," Zelensky stated. He added that strengthening Ukraine's firepower and technological capabilities is essential to countering Russia's offensive potential and safeguarding Ukrainian soldiers.

Zelensky specifically highlighted the need for enhanced long-range capabilities, advocating for increased domestic weapons production to bolster Ukraine's defense. This comes after the United States, the largest supplier of military aid to Ukraine, announced a \$725 million military assistance package on Monday. However, Ukraine remains concerned about the future of its weapon supplies, particularly with the uncertainty surrounding President-elect Donald Trump's stance on the war. The Yale report exposes a disturbing level of state involve-

ment in the practice, implicating Russian authorities at the highest levels. The researchers suggest that the adoption program goes beyond the initial understanding of Russia's war crimes and reveals a more sinister aspect of the conflict. This discovery could strengthen the case against Putin and Russia's Commissioner for Children's Rights, Maria Lvova-Belova, both of whom have been named in an arrest warrant issued by the International Criminal Court (ICC) in March 2023 for their roles in the forced deportation of Ukrainian citizens.

In response, the Kremlin has denied any involvement in war crimes, insisting that the program is part of a humanitarian effort to protect children from the dangers of war. However, Ukrainian officials, along with members of the Yale research team, are scheduled to present their findings to the UN Security Council on Wednesday. The case has drawn significant international attention, further increasing pressure on Russia and its leadership as evidence of war crimes continues to mount.

Swedish PM Postpones Visit to South Korea Amid Political Tensions

Swedish Prime Minister Ulf Kristersson has postponed his planned visit to South Korea, originally scheduled for this week, in light of recent political developments. The decision was confirmed by his spokesperson on Wednesday, following a tense situation in South Korea.

Kristersson had been set to meet with South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol to discuss bilateral relations and key issues. However, the visit was put on hold after South Korean President Yoon declared martial law on Tuesday. The controversial decision was later overturned after the South Korean parliament rejected the martial law move,



leading to heightened political uncertainty in the country. In a statement, Kristersson's spokesperson explained the rationale behind the postponement, saying, "Given the recent developments, we have decided to postpone the visit. We have been in contact with South Korea this morning and will now work together to find a new time for the visit in the future."

The Swedish government remains committed to strengthening diplomatic ties with South Korea, but due to the ongoing political instability in Seoul, officials felt it would be prudent to reschedule the visit.

The move follows growing concerns

over political stability in South Korea, where President Yoon's declaration of martial law sparked criticism and raised fears of escalating tensions within the country. Although martial law was lifted quickly, the incident has caused some unease, prompting foreign leaders like Kristersson to reconsider travel plans.

The new date for the visit is yet to be announced, and it remains to be seen how South Korean politics will evolve in the coming weeks. Both Sweden and South Korea have expressed interest in maintaining strong ties, and once the political situation stabilizes, Kristersson's visit is expected to be rescheduled.



Markets Close Flat as Investors Await RBI Policy Decision

Indian stock markets closed flat on Wednesday amid cautious trading ahead of the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) Monetary Policy Committee meeting. While indices opened strong and posted significant early gains, they hit daily lows later in the session as investor sentiment turned mixed due to global market signals and low expectations of a repo rate cut. Despite this, banking and finance stocks rallied on speculation that the RBI might reduce the Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR). The BSE Sensex closed at 80,956, gaining 110 points after hit-

ting an intraday high of 81,245 and a low of 80,630. The NSE Nifty rose 10 points to settle at 24,467, having touched a high of 24,573. The Bank Nifty surged 571 points, closing at 53,266. Among the Nifty50, 20 stocks gained while 30 declined. Top gainers included HDFC Life, HDFC Bank, Bajaj Finserv, Apollo Hospitals, and NTPC, while Bharti Airtel, Cipla, Bajaj Auto, Tata Motors, and Adani Ports were the top losers. Auto, FMCG, Metal, Pharma, and Oil & Gas indices closed in the red, while banking, finance, PSU banks, and realty stocks performed well.

possibility of incorporating the Action Button into future versions of the iPhone, iPad, and Mac.



Spotify Wrapped first launched in 2015 as a "Year in Music" feature, offorms like X (formerly Twitter) and fering users insights into their mostplayed artists and songs. In 2016, it was rebranded as "Spotify Wrapped," quickly becoming a yearly tradition. Over the years, Spotify has enhanced the feature with engaging visuals and interactive storytelling, making

it more immersive each time. Users also enjoy sharing their Wrapped highlights on platforms like Instagram and TikTok, and playlists like "Your Top Songs 2024" provide an easy way to revisit their favorite tracks from the year.

Though Wrapped 2024 is a bit delayed compared to previous years— Wrapped 2023 was released on November 29, 2023, and earlier editions arrived in late November-the anticipation is palpable as fans eagerly await their personal music recap.

Denmark Introduces World's First Belch and Manure Tax to Combat Climate Pollution

Denmark, renowned for its creative restaurants and cutting-edge design studios, is about to make headlines for something far more basic: the world's first tax on belches and manure. This groundbreaking move comes in response to the country's agricultural sector, which is responsible for a significant share of Denmark's climate pollution.

With a population of just over 5 million people, Denmark has more pigs and cows than people-near-



A groundbreaking discovery in Ken-ya has provided direct evidence of two ancient human species coexisting 1.5 million years ago. Published in *Science* magazine, the study analyzes ancient footprints found at the Koobi Fora site in East Turkana. Discovered in July 2021, the footprints belong to two different hominin species: *Homo erectus* and *Paranthropus boisei*. The close proximity of the prints suggests that these species walked the same lakeshore area within hours or days of each other.

"This is the first snapshot we have of these two species living on the same immediate landscape, potentially interacting with one another," says Kevin Hatala, a paleoanthropologist at Chatham University in Pittsburgh, and co-author of the study.

The mud-preserved footprints offer an extraordinary insight into the lives of early humans, revealing intricate details like foot arch heights, toe shapes, and walking patterns. These findings give scientists an unprecedented view into the physical traits and behaviors of these species.

Tracy Kivell, a paleoanthropologist at the Max Planck Institute, described

the discovery as "a snapshot in time" that helps researchers piece together human evolution. Although prior studies suggested that different hominin species lived alongside each other, this is the first direct evidence of their coexistence.

"These fossilized footprints are as close as we are going to get to having a time machine to take us back to an eastern African lakeshore 1.5 million years ago," said Bernard Wood, a paleoanthropologist at George Washington University.

The study employed 3D X-ray imaging to analyze the footprints, revealing significant differences in foot structure compared to modern humans. The site also contained footprints from 30 relatives of cattle, three horse-like animals, and 61 bird species, including the extinct giant stork, *Leptoptilos falconeri*, providing further context about the environment during that period.

Researchers hope that combining data from these footprints and other fossils will provide a more detailed understanding of early human life and the ecosystems they inhabited.

ly five times as many. Two-thirds of the country's land is dedicated to farming, making agriculture the largest contributor to the nation's climate emissions. These emissions primarily come from methane, a potent greenhouse gas produced by the animals through their manure, farts, and burps.

In response, Denmark's coalition government, consisting of three parties from across the political spectrum, has agreed to introduce a tax aimed at curbing methane emissions from livestock. This tax will target the planet-heating gases expelled by animals and is part of a larger strategy to tackle agricultural pollution.

Rasmus Angelsnes, 31, a Copenhagen resident, expressed support for the measure, saying, "I think it's good. It's kind of a nudge to make different choices, maybe more climate-friendly choices." The tax is expected to encourage more sustainable farming practices and consumption choices, nudging both farmers and consumers towards

greener alternatives.

This new tax is part of a broader environmental package designed to address Denmark's agricultural pollution. The government also plans to restore some farmland to its natural state, particularly peatlands, which are highly effective at sequestering carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases from the atmosphere.

While the belch and manure tax may seem unusual, it highlights Denmark's commitment to reducing its environmental footprint and tackling one of the lesser-discussed sources of climate change. As the world's first such tax, it is likely to inspire other nations to consider similar measures in the fight against climate change.

WhatsApp to Stop Supporting Older **iPhones Starting May 2025**

WhatsApp users with older iPhone models may soon be unable to access the app, as the messaging service is updating its policy to require a more recent version of iOS. This change will impact several older devices, which will no longer be compatible with WhatsApp starting in May 2025.

As reported by WABetaInfo, iPhone models such as the iPhone

be affected by the update. These models, which are limited to iOS 12.5.7, the last software version they received, will no longer support WhatsApp's latest features and updates.

WhatsApp frequently updates its app to improve security and add new features, and this policy change is in line with its ongoing efforts to ensure us-

As newer versions of iOS are released, older devices become increasingly unable to support the app's advanced functionalities. With iOS 12.5.7 being the final update for these older iPhones, users of these devices will need to upgrade to a newer iPhone model to continue using WhatsApp.

This move follows similar decisions

made by other app developers, who have phased out support for older operating systems in favor of more recent versions. While this may affect a portion of WhatsApp's user base, it is also a step toward ensuring that the app remains secure and reliable for all users, especially as new technologies and security measures emerge.

For iPhone users with affected models, upgrading to a newer device will be necessary to keep using WhatsApp beyond May 2025. Users are encouraged to check their iPhone's compatibility with future software updates to avoid interruptions in service. This shift marks another chapter in the evolving landscape of smartphone technology, where app compatibility is increasingly tied to the latest operating systems.


