State Education, IT, and Electronics Minister Nara Lokesh attended the program held at Bapatla Municipal High School as part of the mega parents-teachers meeting. During the event, Lokesh made some interesting comments and shared childhood memories with the students.

"After seeing you, I remembered my school days. When I was a child, my mother used to come to our school whenever there was a parent-teacher meeting. My father was already a state teacher, so he didn't have time to come

to my school. I see God in children. All the children seem like my son Devansh. My father is from Hyderabad and I am from Amaravati. I cannot even play with him," Lokesh said.

He further expressed, "No matter how stressed I am or how much work I have, if I see children, I stop. I play with them for a while to have fun. I am lucky to be the Education Minister who shapes the golden future of children. Teachers are the ones who shape them, no matter what profession they take up. I have great respect for teachers. As the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi, said, our government strongly believes that social change is possible only through

education. Honorable Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu, with his visionary ideas, is helping us bring the Andhra model to make our education system an ideal one for the country."

"We announced the Mega DSC with 16,347 posts as soon as we came to power. We will complete the process of filling teacher posts in six months. We will conduct the Mega DSC process transparently," Lokesh promised.

Lokesh said, "Looking at the Mega Parents-Teachers Meeting, it seems like the Sankranti festival has come early. Through Mega PTM, the bond between government schools, teachers, students, and parents is strengthened. If

a system is to improve, everyone must participate in it."

He further mentioned, "The CM said that social participation is essential for the education system to be ideal. With the Chief Minister's instructions and suggestions, there is a need for the future of the school to be studied by the children, their parents, the teachers who teach, the headmasters who guide, the school management committees, donors, alumni, and voluntary organizations."

Lokesh emphasized, "Teachers should only teach education. It is not their responsibility to take photos of toilets and meals. We have already given orders on

I am responsible for making children lightning bolts. We are changing the KG to PG curriculum." Despite being the CM and the minister, both sat on the floor and ate without any pomp. After the meal, Nara Lokesh himself took the plate that his father, Chandrababu, had used and put it aside, which impressed everyone.

Weather Alert, Heavy Rains Expected in Telugu States for Three Days

The Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a warning for Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, forecasting heavy rains due to a newly formed low-pressure system in the Bay of Bengal. This comes as the effects of Cyclone Fengal begin to diminish.

The IMD reported that a surface circulation at an altitude of 3.1 km above sea level has developed into a low-pressure area in the southeast Bay of Bengal. This system is expected to move west-northwestwards and intensify further by December 12. As a result, heavy rains are predicted in several districts of Andhra Pradesh, including Alluri Sitarama Raju, East Godavari, Kakinada, Konaseema, Palnadu, NTR, Prakasam, West Godavari, Nellore, and Chittoor. On Saturday, light to moderate rainfall was already reported in Parvathipuram Manyam, Srikakulam, Anakapalle, Kakinada, and Visakhapatnam. Gusty winds



and significant downpours are also expected in Yanam and South Coastal Andhra Pradesh over the next two days.

In Telangana, heavy rains are forecasted for districts such as Jayashankar Bhupalapally, Mulugu, Bhadradri Kothagudem, Khammam, and Nalgonda. Light rains have been observed in parts of Hyderabad, with the sky remaining overcast and temperatures dropping across the state.

Both states are experiencing an intensified cold wave, with nighttime temperatures falling due to winds from the south and southwest. Severe cold has been reported in areas like Nirmal, Adilabad, and Hyderabad in Telangana, as well as Parvathipuram Manyam, Visakhapatnam, and nearby regions in Andhra Pradesh.

Residents are advised to stay indoors during heavy rains, monitor weather updates, and prepare for potential disruptions caused by strong winds and rainfall. Authorities are closely monitoring the situation and will provide timely updates to ensure public safety.

Later, Pawan Kalyan joined students for lunch to inspect the quality of the Dokka Seethamma mid-day meal scheme, further connecting with the community. The science experiment by class 10 students impressed Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan. The experiment was designed to assist the elderly, people suffering from paralysis, and those with disabilities, aiming to alleviate the difficulty of crossing platforms at railway stations.

The Deputy Chief Minister specially congratulated the students for coming up with such a brilliant idea at such a young age.

Pawan Kalyan revealed that there is a reason why he chose Kadapa for the parent-teacher meeting, noting that it is a place rich in libraries and described it as a land of education.

Additionally, he stressed that it is the responsibility of parents to monitor their children's social media usage, ensuring that smartphones are used for educational and developmental purposes rather than leading them down harmful paths. Pawan Kalyan assured that the government is sincere about addressing the issues faced by students and schools, and would strive to find solutions even within limited budgets. He warned that any encroachment on school premises would result in legal action under the Goonda Act.





Minister Anagani Satyaprasad Praises Lokesh for Reviving Education System

Cherukupalli, Dec - 8 Revenue Minister Anagani Satyaprasad has lauded Minister Nara Lokesh for his efforts in correcting the education system that, he claimed, was mismanaged during the previous YSRCP government. Speaking at a mega Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM) held at Cherukupalli High School, the minister criticized the policies implemented by Jagan Mohan Reddy's administration, which he alleged caused significant damage to the education sector over the last five years.

Protection to BC Farmers and Fishermen from Corporate Exploitation

fishermen affected by the Kakinada Special

Economic Zone (SEZ). He appealed for immediate measures to ensure justice for the communities that have suffered due to land acquisition and envi-

nearly 10,000 acres of land by poor BC communities, resulting in displacement, as well as severe sea and air pollution affecting their livelihoods. He accused YSRCP ministers and local MLAs of exploiting the situation by coercing farmers into selling their lands at low prices.

To address these issues, Yanamala proposed forming a committee comprising members from the Pollution Control Board, National Green Tribunal (NGT), and other relevant departments. He urged the government to conduct a thorough investigation into the land transactions, cancel illegal registrations, and return the lands to their rightful owners. The senior leader emphasized the need for democracy to protect vulnerable communities and reiterated that justice must prevail for the BC farmers and fishermen. He also revealed that letters had been sent to the NGT in Chennai, the Union Environment Ministry, and the AP Pollution Board to resolve the ongoing issues.

YS Sharmila Demands Investigation into Bribes and Solar Power Contracts

Andhra Pradesh, Dec - 8 Congress state president Y.S. Sharmila has launched a scathing attack on the Andhra Pradesh government, questioning the lack of investigation into alleged bribes in solar power contracts during the YSRCP regime. She accused the government of negligence and demanded a fast-track inquiry into the alleged corruption, which reportedly involves ₹1,750 crore in bribes.

Sharmila praised the government for forming a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to tackle ration rice smuggling but questioned the selective focus on issues. "Why is there no investigation into the solar power contracts signed under YSRCP? Are the reports provided by U.S. investigative agencies, alleging that Chief Minister Jagan took bribes, being ignored?" she asked.

Highlighting alleged favoritism, Sharmila pointed to Adani's involvement, demanding clarity on "illegal contracts" and whether fear of potential arrests for Jagan and Adani is influencing the lack of action. She criticized the government's reluctance to investigate the allegations despite earlier accusations by the TDP, which Minister Chandrababu Naidu to initiclaimed massive corruption in solar energy agreements signed with SECI. Wave of Resignations **Continues in YCP**, Key Leader **Quits in Kakinada**

The Yuvajana Sramika Rythu Congress Party (YCP) faces another setback as a prominent leader in Prathipadu constituency of Kakinada district has resigned. Eleswaram Mandal party president Partha Sarathi has stepped down, adding to the ongoing wave of resignations by dissatisfied leaders in Andhra Pradesh.

The discontent stems from the party's recent decision to appoint Mudragada Giri as the constituency in-charge, which has reportedly caused widespread displeasure among local leaders. This follows a series of changes in the constituency's leadership, including the removal of MLA Parvatha Prasad and the unsuccessful candidacy of former MLA Varupula Subbarao in the previous elections.

Sources suggest that Partha Sarathi's resignation reflects deeper frustrations within the party's leadership dynamics in the constituency. Leaders have expressed dissatisfaction with decisions perceived as favoring individuals from outside their base, such as Mudragada Giri, whose appoint-



ment has been controversial. Adding to the tension is Mudragada's change of surname to Reddy, which some see as an attempt to align with a different caste identity, despite his Kapu community background.

These developments highlight internal discord within the YCP as it gears up for upcoming elections. The party leadership's efforts to restructure and assign responsibilities have not been well-received in several constituencies, leading to resignations and growing discontent. How the high command addresses these challenges remains to be seen, as the resignations pose a significant hurdle in maintaining unity and voter confidence in key regions.

TPN CORRESPONDENT Bapatla District YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) President Merugu Nagarjuna launched a scathing attack on the current government during a media conference, accusing it of dismantling government education policies to favor private institutions. Persecution of Hindus: A Blindspot of Global and Indian Liberal Intelligentsia

For decades, self-proclaimed intellectuals in both India and the West have positioned themselves as defenders of marginalized communities, often using their platforms to advocate for minorities. However, their advocacy has often ignored or downplayed the systemic persecution of Hindus in countries like Pakistan and Bangladesh. These nations, formed on the basis of Islamic identity, have subjected Hindus to state-engineered oppression, yet this reality is rarely acknowledged by the liberal intelligentsia.

A key issue is the tendency to draw false equivalences between isolated incidents of violence in India and the systemic, return the property, over 26 lakh dia's treatment of its Muslim mistate-sponsored persecution of Hindus in neighboring Islamic states. While India has its social issues, the treatment of minorities there cannot be equated with the institutionalized discrimination Hindus face in Pakistan and Bangladesh. In Bangladesh, the Vested Property Act of 1974 allowed the government to seize Hindu lands, claiming they belonged to "enemy" sympathizers of India. Successive governments have continued to expropriate Hindu property, with political allies and goons taking control of land and forcing Hindus into displacement. Despite some attempts to



acres of Hindu-owned land remain seized, displacing over a million Hindus. The erasure of nearly 8 million Hindus from Bangladesh's census further illustrates the magnitude of this persecution.

Meanwhile, in Pakistan, Hindus face similar challenges, often livviolence, forced conversions, and If the global and Indian intellidiscrimination. The state has actively sidelined Hindu citizens through legal and social systems designed to maintain Islamic hegemony, further fueling their marginalization.



Jasprit Bumrah: The Ideal Candidate for India's Next Test Captain

Indian cricket is currently at an exciting juncture, with a third consecutive World Test Championship final and a potential hattrick of Test series wins in Australia on the horizon. As India dominates the ICC rankings across formats and continues to produce a strong supply of talent, one key question looms: who will be India's next Test captain once Rohit Sharma retires? The answer seems clear—Jasprit Bumrah, the current vice-captain and pace spearhead.



A Test match against Australia in Perth in 2022 showcased Bumrah's impact. His match figures of 8/72 earned him the Man of the Match award, underlining his ability to turn the game with his bowling. Test cricket is often decided by the collective performance of the team, but Bumrah's brilliance made the difference. He has that rare ability to dominate conditions and deliver decisive blows, reminiscent of Kapil Dev, India's only other fast-bowling Test captain.

Bumrah's brief stint as captain in the 2022 Birmingham Test against England further highlighted his leadership potential. Although India lost the match, Bumrah's five-wicket haul and his calm, practical approach to leadership left a strong impression. His humility and job awareness stood



out, as he took the captaincy in stride, saying, "You have to do the job."

Moreover, Bumrah's rapport with teammates is another strength. His down-toearth nature and willingness to guide juniors, like Harshit Rana during the recent Perth Test, show his ability to foster a supportive and encouraging environment. His leadership style emphasizes learning and collaboration, key traits for any successful captain.

Fast bowlers often face skepticism about captaining, with many preferring batters due to the strategic demands of the role. However, Bumrah's ability to manage his workload and make tactical decisions during a match makes him a strong candidate. Despite recent injury concerns, Bumrah's return to form and his captaincy of India's B-team during a successful T20 series against Ireland demonstrate the selectors' trust in his leadership.

With Rohit's eventual retirement on the horizon, Bumrah stands out as India's next Test captain—someone who can inspire with his performance, lead by example, and provide a fresh, effective approach to leadership.

Unpopular and facing growing domestic opposition, Yoon declared martial law unexpectedly, perhaps hoping to strengthen his grip on power. However, his move was quickly thwarted as South Korea's parliament, media, and public resistance brought an abrupt end to the situation.

Deadlock at UN Talks on Plastic Pollution: Production Cuts Remain Unresolved



For those who value freedom, democracy, and human rights, the global political climate has been worrying for over 18 years, according to Freedom House. The world has been experiencing a democratic recession, with more and more nations veering away from democratic norms. This decline seems to be accelerating, impacting not only developing countries in Africa but also established democracies in the West.

In Hungary, Viktor Orban has spent 14 years consolidating power and dismantling democratic institutions. Under his leadership, the country's media, judiciary, universities, parliament, and business sectors have all been methodically brought under his control, transforming Hungary into an autocracy, though still officially a democracy. Orban's tactics have made him a role model for other strongmen, including former U.S. President Donald Trump, who has expressed similar intentions of curbing democratic checks and balances in the United States.

This authoritarian wave has sparked numerous

While the global trend toward authoritarianism is concerning, it also reveals a key resilience in democratic societies: their ability to resist overreach and authoritarian impulses. Whether in South Korea or elsewhere, democratic institutions—such as an independent press, judicial checks, and vibrant public debate-have proven to be powerful safeguards. These structures allow democracy to adapt and survive, even in challenging times.

In the face of rising authoritarianism, the question remains whether democracy can withstand the forces working to erode it. But as Nietzsche's words suggest, adversity may ultimately strengthen democratic institutions, making them more robust and capable of defending freedoms even in the darkest times.



Negotiating Committee (INC-5) meeting, held in Busan, South Korea, aimed to create a legally binding global treaty to tackle plastic pollution. However, like the recent COP29 climate change conference, the week-long talks ended in deadlock, primarily over a dispute on cutting plastic production.

Over 200 countries attended the meeting, where negotiations focused on how to address the growing plastic crisis. A key point of contention was the proposed reduction in plastic production. More than 100 nations supported a draft resolution calling for legally binding cuts in production, viewing it as essential to addressing the root of the problem. However, a group of oil-producing nations, including Saudi Arabia, Iran, and Russia, opposed such measures. They argued that the real issue was plastic pollution itself, not the production of plastics.

Saudi Arabia, in particular, stated that the problem lay in pollution, not plastics as materials, and resisted efforts to reduce production. This disagreement highlights the ongoing tension between countries that see the reduction of plastic production as a necessary step and those whose economies are tied to the fossil fuel industry, which is responsible for much of plastic production.

The fifth United Nations Intergovernmental The UN had passed a resolution in 2022 calling for global efforts to end plastic pollution, acknowledging the severe environmental harm caused by plastic waste. While plastics have practical uses, they are notoriously harmful to ecosystems, with their indestructibility leading to pollution of land, seas, and air. Microplastics, which result from the breakdown of larger plastic items, are particularly concerning. Studies have shown that microplastics can accumulate in the human body, including in internal organs, breast milk, and even the linings of arteries.

> At the INC-5 meeting, one delegate remarked that attempting to reduce plastic pollution without cutting production was like trying to dry the floor with the tap still running. Recycling, often touted as a solution, is not always feasible on a global scale. As the negotiations concluded without agreement on significant production cuts, it became evident that finding common ground on this issue remains a significant challenge.

> The deadlock underscores the complexities of addressing plastic pollution on a global scale, with industrial interests and environmental concerns at odds. Until a consensus is reached, the battle against plastic pollution will likely continue to be hindered by this critical issue.





Calls 'Rahul Gandhi traitor of highest order'

BJP accuses US State Dept of trying to 'destabilise' India

In a fiery statement, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has accused the United States' State Department of attempting to "destabilise India" by allegedly targeting Prime Minister Narendra Modi. BJP spokesperson Sambit Patra and MP K Laxman claimed that the US "deep state" was working against the Indian government, with the US State Department allegedly playing a key role.

The BJP also leveled severe accusations against Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, calling him a "traitor of the highest order" and linking him to international forces purportedly aiming to disrupt India's stability. The party alleged a connection between Gandhi, billionaire investor George Soros, the US-based investigative media platform Organized Crime and Corruption Reporting Project (OCCRP), and other international agencies. Referring to a report by French media outlet Mediapart, Patra stated that the OCCRP, which

collaborates with over 50 media partners globally, relies heavily on funding from Soros and US agencies. "If 70 percent of their resources come from



one source, they cannot be neutral," he argued. Patra accused Gandhi of using OCCRP reports to criticize the Modi-led government on various occasions, including controversies such as the Pegasus spyware allegations and claims surrounding the Covaxin vaccine deal with

Brazil.

Patra further alleged that Rahul Gandhi's press conferences and public criticisms based on such reports were part of a "dangerous triangle" aimed at inciting public discontent and forcing regime change. He referenced a 2021 instance where Gandhi attacked the BJP government following an OCCRP report on Brazil canceling a \$324 million order for Covaxin. The BJP spokesperson dismissed the report as an attempt to malign India, claiming that Gandhi's actions only fueled baseless allegations.

The BJP raised the issue in the Lok Sabha, leading to heated debates and eventual adjournments amid uproar from both sides. The ruling party's claims mark a significant escalation in its rhetoric against international organizations and opposition leaders, reflecting heightened tensions over political narratives as the country approaches upcoming elections.

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has attached fresh assets worth ₹388 crore in connection with the Mahadev online betting case, bringing the total value of seized and frozen assets to ₹2,295.61 crore. The investigation, which centers around money laundering and illegal betting operations, has also implicated high-ranking politicians and bureaucrats from Chhattisgarh.

The newly attached assets include investments made by Mauritius-based Tano Investment Opportunities Fund, linked to Dubai-based hawala operator Hari Shankar Tibrewal, through Foreign Portfolio Investment and Foreign Direct Investment channels. Properties in Chhattisgarh, Mumbai, and Madhya Pradesh, owned by betting app promoters and their associates, were also seized.

The ED alleges that the Mahadev app acts as a syndicate enabling online betting, creating user IDs, and laundering money through proxy bank accounts. The agency has filed four chargesheets and arrested 11 individuals, including key operators Sourabh Chandrakar and Ravi Uppal, both from Chhattisgarh. Efforts are underway to extradite Chandrakar from Dubai.

Assets seized so far include ₹19.36 crore in cash, valuables worth ₹16.68 crore, and movable assets like bank balances and securities totaling ₹1,729.17 crore. Previous operations recovered ₹5.39 crore in cash and ₹15.59 crore in bank balances. The ED has also summoned Bollywood celebrities linked to the case. The investigation continues to unravel the nexus of political, financial, and offshore networks tied to the Mahadev app, making it one of the largest money laundering probes in recent years.




On Mamata Banerjee Leading INDIA, Congress' Caution, Samajwadi's Support TPN CORRESPONDENT

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's remarks about potentially leading the opposition INDIA bloc have stirred diverse reactions from allies within the coalition. Speaking to a news channel on Friday, the Trinamool Congress (TMC) supremo expressed frustration over the alliance's leadership and coordination, hinting at her willingness to take charge if needed. "I had formed the INDIA bloc. Now it is up to those leading it to manage. If they can't run the show, what can I do? Everyone needs to be taken along," Banerjee said. She added, "If given the opportunity, I would ensure its smooth functioning. I don't want to go outside West Bengal, but I can run it from here." Banerjee's remarks triggered speculation about her intentions, prompting TMC spokesperson Kunal Ghosh to clarify. "She never expressed personal ambition for leadership. Her focus is West Bengal, and she is not seeking a chair in Delhi. If the INDIA bloc demands her leadership, she will lead from Kolkata," Ghosh said. The comments drew mixed responses from allies. CPI(M) leader D Raja acknowledged the INDIA bloc's limited meetings but emphasized the alliance's broader goal of removing the BJP. "The situation is not uniform across states, and coordination is crucial," he said. The Congress, the largest party in the bloc, responded cautiously. Congress leader TS Singhdeo said, "She has her opinion and intent. Leadership decisions will naturally involve collective discussions." Congress MP Tariq Anwar reiterated that such decisions require consensus. "Leadership in a coalition like this is decided collectively, not unilaterally," he said. Congress leader Rashid Alvi highlighted that other leaders, including Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, have also shown interest in leading the bloc. "Leadership decisions are not about individual ambitions but collective agreement," he remarked. Another Congress MP, Tanuj Punia, suggested that these matters should be addressed internally, involving Rahul Gandhi and other senior leaders. Amid cautious responses, Samajwadi Party leader Udaiveer Singh voiced support for Banerjee. "She is a senior leader with significant experience. Our party has a good relationship with her and trusts her leadership. If a decision to make her the leader is taken, we will support it," Singh said. The TMC's recent bypoll victories in West Bengal, defeating the BJP, have solidified Mamata Banerjee's position as a formidable anti-BJP leader. TMC MP Kalyan Banerjee recently called on Congress and other allies to set aside egos and recognize her leadership potential within the INDIA bloc. Despite its formation to counter the BJP's dominance, the INDIA bloc continues to grapple with internal divisions and leadership challenges. While the coalition saw mixed electoral performances in states like Haryana and Maharashtra, differences over strategy and coordination have raised questions about its effectiveness.





Was Khan Sir Arrested Amid Protests By **Bihar Civil Service Aspirants?**

Patna witnessed unrest as civil service aspirants protested against the "normalisation" process in the Bihar Public Service Commission's (BPSC) preliminary test. Amid reports on social media suggesting that renowned educator and You-Tuber Faizal Khan, popularly known as Khan Sir, was arrested during the protests, Patna Police issued a statement denying the claims.

Dr. Anu Kumari, Sub-divisional Police Officer of Sachiwalaya, called the allegations "baseless, misleading, and provocative." She clarified that Khan Sir had voluntarily visited the Gardanibagh police station and was later escorted to his vehicle upon his request.

The protests stem from changes to the examination process for the upcoming 70th BPSC Preliminary Examination, scheduled for December 13, 2024. Aspirants are demanding that the exam be conducted in a single shift with a single paper, eliminating the need for the normalisation process. Protesters argued that the current system could disadvantage some candidates due to variations in question paper difficulty.

On Thursday, police resorted to a mild lathi charge near the BPSC office to disperse aspirants staging a sit-in. The crackdown escalated tensions, leading to public outrage and



Russia Plans to Deploy Hypersonic Oreshnik Missiles in Belarus by 2025

Russian President Vladimir Putin announced on Friday that Russia could deploy its newly developed hypersonic Oreshnik missiles in Belarus by the second half of 2025, as production of the missile ramps up. The Oreshnik, a nuclear-capable weapon, was recently unveiled by Russia after being used in a strike on the Ukrainian city of Dnipro, marking an escalation in the ongoing conflict.

Putin made the statement during a televised meeting with Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko in Minsk. He confirmed that the missile deployment would be possible once "serial production" of the Oreshnik missile is scaled up in Russia.

The missile, which experts believe can travel at ten times the speed of sound, is reported to have a range of up to 5,500 kilometers (3,400 miles), making it capable of striking targets deep within enemy territory. This advancement in missile technology comes amid Russia's ongoing military operations in Ukraine and the broader strategic alliance between Moscow and Belarus.

South Korean President Apologizes for Martial Law Attempt but Resists **Calls to Resign**

South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol apologized on Saturday for his recent attempt to impose martial law but firmly resisted calls to resign, even as pressure mounted from within his own ruling party. His apology came just hours before a planned impeachment vote, where political opponents were pushing for his removal from office.

Yoon's decision to declare martial law marked the first such action in South Korea since 1980. He acknowledged the gravity of the situation and expressed regret for his actions, admitting that the decision was made out of a sense of desperation. Despite the apology, the president made it clear that he would not seek to evade legal or political responsibility for the controversial move.

The attempted declaration of martial law, which was quickly opposed by political leaders, civil rights groups, and the public, followed escalating protests and political unrest in the country. Critics argued that such drastic measures were an overreaction to the demonstrations, which had been primarily driven by economic and political grievances.

Yoon's decision to press ahead with martial law had prompted widespread criticism, including from some members of his own party, who voiced concerns about the long-term impact on South Korea's democracy. Even though he issued the apology, the call for his resignation remained strong, as many questioned his judgment and leadership.

In response to the growing unrest, President Yoon stated that he would engage in further consultations with political leaders and the public to resolve the crisis. However, the apology did little to quell the calls for his departure, and the looming impeachment vote remained a significant challenge to his presidency. The incident has highlighted the deep divisions within South Korean politics and raised concerns about the future stability of Yoon's administration.

Imran Khan Calls for Rally and **Civil Disobedience in Pakistan Amid Deadly Protest Clashes**

Imran Khan, Pakistan's jailed former Prime Minister, has called for a rally on December 13 in the city of Peshawar, following a deadly protest march in Islamabad led by his political party, Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI). Khan, who remains incarcerated, used social media platform X to issue a call to action, urging his supporters to join the rally in Peshawar, the capital of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, which is governed by PTI. Khan's call comes in the wake of the November 25 protest, which was met with a violent crackdown by authorities. The former prime minister claimed that at least 12 of his supporters were killed during the clashes. He has demanded a thorough judicial investigation into the events of the protest, accusing the government of using excessive force against peaceful demonstrators.

In 2023, Russia had already deployed tactical nuclear weapons in Belarus, strengthening the military ties between the two nations. These tactical nuclear weapons are designed for use on the battlefield and are smaller in scale than strategic nuclear weapons, which are capable of obliterating entire cities. However, tactical nuclear weapons remain highly destructive and represent a significant escalation in the military capabilities of the two countries.

Belarus, a close ally of Russia, has played a key role in supporting Moscow's military actions during the war in Ukraine. The deployment of the Oreshnik missiles to Belarus further solidifies the partnership between the two nations, as they continue to bolster their military cooperation in response to increasing tensions in the region. As Russia advances in its missile capabilities, concerns over security in Europe and the broader international community continue to grow.

"The ongoing violence against Hindus and others across Bangladesh is unacceptable and must end immediately," Krishnamoorthi said. "I strongly urge the government of Bangladesh to take decisive steps to reduce tensions peacefully now." He stressed the importance of safeguarding peaceful protests and providing arrested individuals with proper legal representation.

The unrest began after sedition charges were filed against Chinmoy Krishna Das for allegedly raising a saffron flag above Bangladesh's national flag in Chittagong on October 25. His arrest on November 25 sparked protests, leading to violent clashes between his followers and law enforcement on November 27, outside the Chattogram Court Building, which resulted in the death of a lawyer. The violence intensified following additional arrests.

ISKCON Kolkata reported that two monks, Adipurush Shyam Das and Ranganath Das Brahmachari, were detained on November 29 after visiting Chinmoy Krishna Das in custody. The situation worsened further when rioters vandalized an ISKCON center in Bangladesh. The Bangladesh Hindu Buddhist Christian Unity Council condemned the charges filed against 70 minority lawyers and two journalists, describing them as "false and harassing."

In addition to the rally, Khan threatened to initiate a civil disobedience movement across the country if the government fails to address his demands for accountability. His statements suggest escalating tensions between his party and the ruling government, which has already faced multiple protests and political challenges since Khan's ousting in 2022. The call for civil disobedience echoes Khan's previous efforts to challenge the government, with PTI organizing widespread protests and marches since his removal from office. Khan's supporters have rallied behind him, viewing his imprisonment as politically motivated, while the government insists that his legal troubles stem from corruption charges and other criminal cases.

Assad Loses Another Syrian City, Rebels March Towards Damascus

Bashar al-Assad's grip on power, Syrian government forces have lost control of Daraa city, which is considered the birthplace of Syria's 2011 civil uprising. Daraa, located about 100 kilometers from Damascus, became the epicenter of nationwide protests after the Assad regime detained and allegedly tortured a group of boys for anti-government graffiti. What began as peaceful demonstrations soon escalated into a violent conflict that has claimed over 500,000 lives and displaced millions.

According to the UK-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, opposition forces now control over 90% of Daraa province, with regime forces retreating in multiple waves. Daraa's fall follows the earlier losses of Alep-

In a significant blow to President po, Syria's second-largest city, and Hama in the central region. These key victories have encouraged rebel forces to push south toward Homs, Syria's third-largest city, and even closer to Damascus, the heart of Assad's power. Leading the offensive is Hayat Tahrir al-Sham (HTS), a group with origins in Al-Qaeda, which seeks the overthrow of Assad despite being designated a terrorist organization by Western nations.



FM Sitharaman: GDP Slowdown in Q2 Not Systemic, **Q3 to Offset Moderation**

 $\mathbf{F}_{ ext{la Sitharaman has re-}}^{ ext{inance Minister Nirma-}}$ assured the public that the slowdown in India's GDP growth during the second quarter (Q2) of the financial year is not indicative of a systemic issue. She emphasized that the moderation observed in Q2 is expected to be temporary, with the third quarter (Q3) likely to compensate for the slowdown.

India's GDP growth decelerated in Q2, reflecting a decrease in economic momentum, driven by factors like weak global demand, inflationary pressures, and challenges in key sectors. However, Sitharaman asserted that the economy remains re-

silient, and the current dip is a temporary blip in the broader growth trajectory.

Highlighting that the moderation was not a reflection of any underlying structural problems, Sitharaman pointed out that many factors were at play, including a normalizing base effect and seasonal fluctuations. She expressed confidence that India's economic fundamentals remain strong, citing positive indicators like rising exports, robust domestic consumption, and an uptick in investments.

The Finance Minister stressed that the Indian economy has shown remarkable resilience in the face of global uncertainties and that the government remains committed to supporting growth through targeted fiscal measures and reforms. In this con-



text, Sitharaman expects the economy to regain its momentum in Q3, driven by the festive season, improved industrial output, and a recovery in global demand.

Additionally, Sitharaman reassured investors and businesses that the government is monitoring the situation closely and will take any necessary corrective actions to support the economy's recovery. Despite global challenges, including geopolitical tensions and inflation, India's economic outlook remains positive, she emphasized.

Looking ahead, the Finance Minister remains optimistic about achieving the country's growth targets for the fiscal year, maintaining that India is on track for a strong and sustainable recovery in the coming quarters.

India's Exports Surge 67% in FY2023-24, **Reaching \$778 Billion**

ADB Approves USD 350 Million Loan to Modernize India's **Logistics Sector**



Tndia has seen a remarkable surge in its Lexports, reaching approximately \$778 billion in FY2023-24, a 67% growth compared to \$466 billion in FY2013-14. This strong performance has elevated the country's global standing, with its share in world merchandise exports improving from 1.66% to 1.81%, propelling India from 20th to 17th in global rankings, according to Union Minister of Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal.

This growth can be attributed to several government initiatives aimed at sustaining and accelerating export performance. The positive momentum was also reflected in India's trade performance in the first quarter of the current fiscal year, as reported by NITI Aayog's Trade Watch report. The report indicated a stable and moderate growth trend, with India's total trade in H1 2024 increasing by 5.45% year-on-year to reach \$576 billion.

Merchandise exports showed a 5.95% rise in Q1 FY25, reaching \$110 billion, while imports grew by 8.40% to \$173 billion, widening the trade imbalance. Despite these challenges, the export growth to Free Trade Agreement (FTA) partners stood strong, with a notable 12% increase. Exports to North America accounted for 21% of India's total exports, followed by the European Union at 18.61%. Meanwhile, the country's imports primarily came from Northeast Asia, West Asia, and ASEAN countries, which contributed to 51% of total imports.

However, not all sectors saw positive growth. Exports of iron and steel saw a significant decline of 33% in Q1 FY25, driven by weak domestic demand and excess supply in China's steel market. Despite these challenges, India's strategic focus on high-growth sectors such as electronics and semiconductors has yielded positive results, with the country improving its rank among the top 10 global suppliers.

Overall, India's export growth highlights its growing presence in the global market, with continued efforts from the government to diversify and sustain this upward trajectory.


Doctor Shows 'Weekends Only' Drinker's Liver vs Non-Drinker, Sparks Debate

Dr. Cyriac Abby Philips, known as "The Liver Doc" on social media, recently shared a striking post on X (formerly Twitter) to challenge the misconception that drinking alcohol only on weekends has no harmful effects. The post featured a comparison of two livers: one from a 32-yearold man who drank alcohol exclusively on weekends and another from his wife, a non-drinker. The image quickly went viral, sparking a heated debate on the health risks associated with alcohol consumption.

In his post, Dr. Philips ex-

plained that the liver in question belonged to a man who had consumed alcohol only on weekends, while the healthy liver belonged to his wife, a non-drinker. The man later received his wife's liver transplant to survive and watch their daughter grow up. Dr. Philips added that this was a wake-up call for many who underestimate the damage caused by even occasional drinking. His post has garnered more than 100,000 views.

The conversation around the liver comparison quickly caught the attention of many social media users. Some users were shocked at the state of the liver, suggesting the man's alcohol consumption might be more frequent than just on weekends. Dr. Philips responded to these comments by reinforcing his point, urging people to look beyond their biases and learn from experience.



Dr. Philips' post also generated comments from individuals sharing their personal family experiences with cancer, arguing that alcohol consumption should not be the sole cause of health issues. In response, the doctor dismissed such counterarguments, emphasizing that alcohol is a toxic substance that can lead to severe liver damage, including fatty liver, cirrhosis, and liver failure.

The World Health Organization (WHO) has long stated that "there is no safe amount" of alcohol for human health. The WHO has classified alcohol as a Group 1 carcinogen, meaning it carries the same cancer risks as tobacco and asbestos. Alcohol has been linked to at least seven types of cancer, including bowel and breast cancer. The WHO stresses that any beverage containing alcohol increases the risk of developing cancer, regardless of its quality or cost.

Google DeepMind Unveils GenCast for Enhanced Extreme Weather Tracking

¬ oogle DeepMind has Gintroduced a new AI-powered weather forecasting tool named *GenCast*, designed to provide superior predictions, especially for extreme weather events like deadly storms. In a blog post on December 4, 2024, DeepMind revealed that the tool can offer more accurate forecasts than traditional systems, including the European Centre for Medium-Range Weather Forecasts (ECMWF) ENS, for up to 15 days in advance.

The GenCast model works by generating

a range of possible weather scenarios rather than relying on a single forecast. This method, as opposed to traditional models that provide deterministic forecasts, is more reliable because it accounts for uncertainties in weather predicapproach helps improve forecast accuracy, particularly when dealing with unpredictable extreme weather events.

To assess GenCast's capabilities, researchers conducted a comparison of its forecasts with those produced by traditional weather systems. They evaluated predictions for a variety of weather factors at different lead times, totaling



probabilistic ensemble forecasts, which predict 1,320 different combinations. The results showed that GenCast consistently outperformed the top operational system, ECMWF ENS, demonstrating its potential as a game-changer in weather prediction.

Humans and Dogs Became Friends 2,000 Years **Earlier, Study Finds**

A recent study has uncovered that the bond between humans and dogs began around 12,000 years ago, much earlier than previously believed. This research, conducted by the University of Arizona and published in *Science Advances*, reveals that this close relationship between humans and their canine companions dates back approximately 2.000 years earlier than earlier records in the Americas.



A^{150-million-year-old} Stegosaurus fossil, which became the most expensive dinosaur fossil ever sold earlier this year, is now on display at the American Museum of Natural History in Manhattan. Nicknamed *Apex*, the Stegosaurus was purchased by billionaire Kenneth C. Griffin for a record-breaking \$44.6 million. He has generously loaned the fossil to the museum, where it will be on display for the next four years. After this period, a cast replica will take its place.

specimen was unveiled to reporters, photographers, and museum staff ahead of its public debut, which is set for Sunday, December 8. The fossil is expected to draw large crowds as it offers a unique opportunity to view a dinosaur that has become a familiar icon for many.

"This is one of the dinosaurs that every kid knows how to draw," said Sean M. Decatur, president of the museum. "This is a unique opportunity

to have something that resonates in the public imagination about dinosaurs, but also provides valuable insights for research. It's a pretty special specimen." Decatur hopes that visitors will be just as awe-struck by *Apex* as the museum team is.

Kenneth Griffin expressed his excitement about lending the fossil to the museum, stating that *Apex* provides a "unique window into our planet's distant past." He expressed gratitude that millions of visitors and researchers would have the The rare and impressive chance to study the magnificent specimen. "The joy and awe every child feels coloring a Stegosaurus will now be brought to life for millions of people who have the opportunity to see this epic dinosaur in person," Griffin said.

> This isn't the first time Griffin has shown his support for dinosaur exhibits. In 2017, he donated \$16.5 million to Chicago's Field Museum to fund an exhibit featuring the largest Tyrannosaurus rex skeleton ever discovered.

The study, led by Francois Lanoe, an assistant research professor at the School of Anthropology, focuses on archaeological remains found at Swan Point, a long-standing site in Alaska. In 2018, researchers uncovered the tibia, or lower-leg bone, of an adult canine. Radiocarbon dating determined that the dog lived around 12,000 years ago, near the end of the Ice Age. The remains also indicated that the dog had a close connection with humans.

Chemical analysis of the canine's remains revealed significant traces of salmon proteins, suggesting that the dog was regularly consuming fish. Interestingly, local wild canines typically hunted only on land, so the presence of fish in the diet suggests that the dog might have relied on humans for its food.

Francois Lanoe emphasized the importance of this discovery, noting that it offers crucial evidence about the early relationship between humans and dogs in the Americas. "This is a significant contribution," Lanoe said. "It shows that people and canines had closer relationships earlier This groundbreaking research offers new than previously known."

In a related discovery, an 8,100-year-old canine jawbone found at a nearby site in June 2023 also showed signs of close inter-

action with humans, further supporting the idea that early humans and canines had developed strong bonds. However, scientists caution that it is still too early to say for certain that these early canines were fully domesticated.


