Key urban development projects like HYDRAA and the ₹1.5 lakh crore Musi River beautification plan have also drawn ire. HYDRAA's initial momentum, symbolized by the demolition of Nagarjuna's N-Convention Center, has since faltered amid allegations of selective targeting. The perception that the government is lenient toward influential individuals, including Revanth Reddy's own family, has further fueled discontent. Meanwhile, the Musi project,

instead of uplifting Hyderabad, has dampened investor confidence and slowed the real estate market.Hyderabad, the economic and cultural heart of Telangana, has seen little progress under Revanth Reddy's leadership. The city's infrastructure remains stagnant, and efforts to attract new investments

have yet to yield results.

angana elections, KTR has found himself in a dilemma, trying to regain public attention with bold but often misguided remarks. His approach of targeting every issue without fully understanding how it will resonate with the public has made him come across as inconsistent. While the controversy surrounding the Lagacharla land acquisition has garnered some traction, KTR's statements have not had the desired impact.

Meanwhile, former CM KCR remains in his farmhouse, leaving KTR to struggle in the opposition role, a position he is unfamiliar with. As the first time in power slips away, KTR's attempts to hold the BRS party's ground are proving futile. His frequent outbursts and unpredictable approach to opposition politics have created more confusion than clarity. Instead of strategically focusing on one issue and resolving it, KTR's scattergun approach to criticism has left his credibility in question.

The Congress-led government under Revanth Reddy has certainly made mistakes, but KTR's continuous volley of remarks is not helping the situation. His attempts to damage the ruling party seem more like loose balls, allowing Congress to escape major setbacks. As BRS cadres lose ground and the BJP gains momentum, KTR's leadership is being questioned. His inability to handle the opposition role with maturity is making him appear as a smalltime leader, rather than a formidable force.

In politics, it's essential for a leader to focus on a single issue and work towards its resolution rather than jumping from one topic to another without accomplishing anything. KTR's current strategy seems to lack this focus, and unless he changes his approach, the BRS might continue to lose its grip in Telangana.



Communication has emerged as a significant weakness for the government. The handling of sensitive issues like the caste survey and land acquisitions in Lagacharla has left the public confused and critical. The first year of a new government is often considered a honeymoon period, but for Revanth Reddy, it has been a trial by fire. Revanth Reddy has yet to assert his authority and make a distinctive mark, both within his party and among the people. The coming year presents an opportunity for him to address these challenges, rebuild trust, and steer his government toward fulfilling its promises.

He said that Nalgonda's role in the Telangana movement is unforgettable. He recalled that Srikanthachari, who sacrificed himself in the Telangana movement, was from Nalgonda district. He mentioned that when he stepped into Nalgonda, he remembered the armed peasant struggle. He pointed out that people thought that if Krishna water flowed in Nalgonda, the fluoride problem would be solved. He criticized that the projects started during the Congress rule were stalled during KCR's rule. He expressed frustration that more injustice was done to Nalgonda during KCR's rule than during the joint AP rule. TPN CORRESPONDENT, Hyderabad: The Telangana government is set to usher in a digital revolution with the launch of T-Fiber, a state-backed broadband service, on December 8. In its first phase, the service will be available in 2,096-gram panchayats across Narayanpet, Sangareddy, and Peddapalli districts, with plans to expand to the entire state in subsequent phases. Chief Minister Revanth Reddy will inaugurate the initiative tomorrow. T-Fiber is part of the central government's "Bharat Net" project, which aims to provide broadband connectivity to all villages across India. Telangana has received Rs. 2,500 crores under this scheme to establish a robust fibre network. Residents can avail high-speed internet at an affordable price of Rs. 300 per month, offering speeds of 20 Mbps. The package also includes free telephone service and access to select OTT platforms.

The initiative extends beyond households, with plans to connect schools, gram panchayat offices, and other government institutions in villages. Additionally, CCTV cameras will be installed at key junctions and linked to the Police Command Control Centre, enhancing security and surveillance across rural areas.

This move is expected to transform digital connectivity in Telangana, bridging the urban-rural divide and fostering greater access to education, services, and technology.

CM Revanth Inaugurates 800 MW Unit 2 of Yadadri Thermal Power Station

TPN CORRESPONDENT, Hyderabad: Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Saturday inaugurated the 800 MW Unit 2 of the Yadadri Thermal Power Station (YTPS), a 4,000 MW (5×800 MW) mega project by the Telangana Power Generation Corporation (TGGENCO) at Damaracherla in Nalgonda district. The project is poised to make Telangana a power-surplus state, marking a significant milestone in its energy infrastructure.

The YTPS, envisioned by former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekhar Rao, is the largest public-sector thermal plant in India. It was initiated shortly after Telangana's formation, reflecting an ambitious effort to address the state's energy needs. While delays were caused by the COVID-19



pandemic and environmental clearance hurdles, the project Telangana's energy capacity. has steadily progressed.

Stages I and II of the thermal plant are already operational and connected to the grid. The remaining units are set to be completed by May 2025. Once fully operational, the plant will generate 4,000 MW across five faced legal challenges when a

The project's foundation stone was laid by Chandrashekhar Rao on June 8, 2015. Environmental clearance was granted on June 29, 2017, and work officially began on October 17, 2017, by BHEL. However, the project

Damodar Raja Narasimha, Energy Secretary Sandeep Kumar Sultania, and senior officials.

The Yadadri Thermal Power Station, once fully operational, is expected to cement Telangana's position as an energy-rich state, meeting growing demands and fostering economic growth.

TGEJAC Meets Telangana Dy CM, Presents 54 Employee-Related Issues

On Saturday, December 7, representatives of the Telangana Government Employees Joint Action Committee (TGEJAC) met Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka at Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Praja Bhavan to submit a representation highlighting 54 key demands.

The primary demand was to halt the implementation of the compensatory pension scheme (CPS) or the UPS proposed by the Centre and revert to the old pension scheme. The employees also urged the state government to address the issues of those who lost their local status due to Government Order (GO) 317, create supernumerary posts, and provide employment for the affected employees within their local zones.

Shadnagar MLA withdraws comments against Velama community



TPN CORRESPONDENT, Hyderabad : Shadnagar Congress MLA Veerlapally Shankariah withdrew his controversial remarks against the Velama community on Saturday, December 7, following widespread backlash.

Shankariah clarified his intent, stating, "My words were not meant to target the entire Velama community but to criticize the social dominance of the Kalvakuntla family. I regret my choice of words and withdraw my comments."

The controversy began on December 6, when a video surfaced of Shankariah threatening to attack the Velama community. The remark sparked outrage, with Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) MLC K. Kavitha, a member of the Velama community, demanding clarity from Congress leadership on whether the comments represented their party's

In response, Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC) president Mahesh Kumar Goud sought an explanation from the MLA, leading to his retraction. The Velama community filed a police complaint in Jagtial, demanding an apology from Shankariah by Saturday evening and warning of protests if their concerns were not addressed. Community leaders criticized the remarks as an attempt to stir caste-based divisions and urged political leaders to reject such tactics.

The incident highlights rising tensions over caste-related rhetoric in Telangana politics, with calls for accountability and unity across party

Centre Approves Seven Navodaya Schools for TG

Cabinet has approved the establishment of 28 new Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas (NVs) and 85 new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) across India, with Telangana receiving approval for seven NVs. The schools will be set up in Jagtial, Nizamabad, Bhadradri-Kothagudem, Medchal-Malkajgiri, Mahbubnagar, Sangareddy, and Suryapet districts.

Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy and Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka had earlier requested Prime Minister Narendra Modi to establish 24 NVs in the state during a meeting in July. While the approval falls short of the original request, it marks a significant step in improving access to quality education in the state.

The initiative is part of a nationwide effort to enhance educational infrastructure, focusing on providing quality education to talented stu-

SC Fines Telangana Govt ₹1 Lakh Over Student **Scholarship Delay**

TPN CORRESPONDENT, Hyderabad: The Supreme Court has fined the Telangana government ₹1 lakh for delays in addressing a scholarship case under the Ambedkar Overseas Education Fund. The court directed the state to pay the fine within two weeks.

The case involved a student whose application for a ₹10 lakh scholarship was rejected by the state government, citing that the student's father's annual income exceeded ₹2 lakh. Challenging this decision, the father approached the High Court, which ruled in favor of the student and ordered the government to grant the scholarship for 2023.

However, the Telangana government filed a writ petition challenging the High Court's ruling after a delay of 161 days, which was dismissed on September 9. The state then appealed to the Supreme Court on October 19.

During the hearing before Justices J.B. Pardiwala and R. Mahadevan, the Supreme Court criticized the government for its significant delay and dismissed the appeal. The court imposed the ₹1 lakh fine as a penalty for the delay and failure to comply with earlier rulings.

Congress is Standing on Crutches, Will Fall Anytime, Says Nadda

Survey Predicts KCR's Comeback as **Public Loses Faith in Congress Rule**

TPN CORRESPONDENT, Hyderabad: BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) stated that a survey representative told him people are already disappointed with the Congress government after just one year in power and that KCR would return to power if elections were held again. KTR made these remarks during the preview of the short film Nammi Nanaboste, produced by BRS leader and former MLA Rasamayi Balakishan.

KTR mentioned that a representative connected to an election survey met him earlier and shared insights about public sentiment. The representative reportedly explained the current situation in constituencies where MLAs had defected from the BRS to the Congress, predicting a challenging scenario for the Congress if elections were held now.

KTR pointed out that while public opposition to a government typically emerges after three to four years, dissatisfaction with the Congress government has surfaced within a year. He credited the BRS's strong fight under KCR's lead-

ership and expressed confidence that the party would regain power if the momentum continues. He remarked that Telangana Bhavan

is bustling with activity, while Gandhi Bhavan appears subdued. KTR highlighted the efforts of the BRS legal cell team in supporting the victims of the Lagacharla incident and expressed optimism that tribal farmers currently jailed would be released. He also shared that complaints have been filed

with the National Human Rights Commission and the SC-ST Commission regarding the issue.

KTR noted that former sarpanches are demanding payment of dues, and ASHA workers are raising their grievances in the Assembly. He said that many people visited Telangana Bhavan to discuss their concerns and seek solutions.

Speaking about the short film Nammi Nanaboste, KTR described it as heart-wrenching and said it reflects the anger of Telangana's people against the Congress government. He affirmed the BRS's commitment to fighting on behalf of the people, stating, "We may have lost power, but not the energy or determination to fight."

Anti-Velama Remarks: TPCC Chief Demands Explanation from Shadnagar MLA

TPN CORRESPONDENT, Hyderabad, DEC: Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC) President Mahesh Kumar Goud has sought an explanation from Shadnagar MLA V. Shankaraiah over his controversial remarks targeting the Velama community. The MLA, in a video that went viral on December 6, was heard using derogatory language and issuing threats of physical violence against members of the community. "As the Shadnagar MLA, I'm telling you, I will resort to physical attacks against you Velamas," Shankaraiah said in the video.

Velama Community's Outrage

The Velama community reacted strongly, filing a complaint against Shankaraiah with the local police in Jagtial. Community leaders have demanded a public apology by Saturday evening, warning that failure to do so could lead to protests and further tensions.



Leaders from the community have criticized Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, accusing him of fostering caste-based politics by not addressing divisive rhetoric within his party. They emphasized that political sustainability cannot

be achieved by promoting caste divisions and called for leaders from both the Congress and BJP to denounce such tactics.

BRS Slams Congress

Controversy Over Missing Bulls from Vemulawada Goshala

TPN CORRESPONDENT, Telangana: A controversy has arisen regarding the allocation of bulls (kodelu) from the Vemulawada goshala, with allegations of irregularities and missing animals. The bulls were reportedly allocated to the Sri Rajeshwara Society in Manugoda based on a recommendation from Endowment Minister Konda Surekha, allegedly bypassing established norms.

The temple authorities had previously stopped allocating bulls to various societies and began distributing them only to farmers to prevent misuse. However, it is claimed that the allocation to the society was made in violation of these rules. Madasi Rambabu, president of the Sri Rajeshwara Society, reportedly submitted an application on August 12, 2024, requesting the bulls. The Endowment Minister allegedly endorsed the request, which led to the allocation of 60 bulls to the society.

Recent developments revealed that 49 of the bulls went missing, which came to light after a police inspection in Geesukonda on November 29, following a complaint from local youth. The Geesukonda police have since registered a case against Rambabu and requested clarification from the temple authorities.

The temple administration has denied any wrongdoing, stating that only two bulls were provided to Rambabu, and that the distribution was done following proper norms. Executive Officer Vinod Reddy emphasized that all bulls were tagged and could not have disappeared without significant alteration. He further suggested that legal action would be taken against those spreading false information.

Telangana Leads in Malware Detection **Hyderabad Ranks 3rd Among Cities**

TPN CORRESPONDENT, Hyderabad: Telangana has emerged as the state with the highest malware detection rate in India, while Hyderabad ranked third among cities, according to the India Cyber Threat Report 2025 published by the Data Security Council of India (DSCI) on December 5.

The report revealed Telangana recorded 55.90 detections per endpoint, accounting for 15.03% of the total malware detections nationwide. This is attributed to the state's robust IT sector and its alignment with national information technology trends. Hyderabad's IT corridor played a key role in the high detection rates.

The southern technology belt—comprising Telangana, Karnataka, and Tamil Nadu-accounted for 36.37% of malware detections, reflecting the region's strong presence in the tech sector and widespread digital adoption. Tamil Nadu ranked second among states with 44.54 detections per endpoint (11.97%), driven by Chennai's IT infrastructure, while Delhi stood third with 43.86 detections per endpoint due to its status as a high-value business hub.

Hyderabad ranked third among cities for malware detection, with 54.93 detections per endpoint (11.55%), following Bengaluru and Surat, which topped the list due to its industrial strength. Together, Hyderabad and Bengaluru accounted for



22.48% of the total malware detections in India underscoring their significant IT infrastructure.

Despite being India's commercial capital, Mumbai recorded a notably lower malware detection rate compared to other cities like Jaipur, Chennai, and New Delhi, which showed similar levels of detection efficiency.

The report highlights the need for heightened cybersecurity measures, particularly in tech-heavy regions, to mitigate evolving threats in the digital

Man steals ambulance in Hyderabad, leads police chase to Vijayawada

TPN CORRESPONDENT, Hyderabad: In a dramatic turn of events, a vehicle thief led police on a highspeed chase spanning over 150 kilometers on the Hyderabad-Vijayawada National Highway early Saturday. The suspect stole a 108 ambulance from Hayathnagar and drove recklessly with its siren blaring, causing chaos along the route.

Police stations along the highway were immediately alerted as the stolen ambulance sped past, evading multiple attempts at capture. In a shocking incident during the chase, the thief attempted to run over Assistant Sub-Inspector John Reddy at Chityala, leaving the officer critically injured. Reddy was rushed to a private hospital in Hyderabad, where his condition remains critical.

The chase intensified as the suspect crashed through the Korlapahad toll gate, forcing authorities to escalate their efforts. The pursuit finally ended near Tekumatla in Suryapet mandal, where police set up a strategic roadblock using trucks to halt the stolen ambulance. The suspect, reportedly involved in several major thefts, was arrested after a two-and-ahalf-hour chase.

Authorities are continuing their investigation into the incident, while ASI John Reddy's condition is being closely monitored. The incident has raised concerns over highway security and the audacity of vehicle lifters in the region.

Telangana **Government Increases Benefits for Home Guards**

In November, the commissioner's task force raided 'Sony Ginger Garlic Paste' in Secunderabad, exposing the use of substandard raw materials. Similarly, a food processing unit in Khammam was found manufacturing 960 kg of adulterated ginger garlic paste.

Earlier in October, widespread adulteration of loose tea powder was uncovered at Konark Tea in Fatehnagar, where harmful substances were being mixed before distribution.

The food safety department continues its aggressive inspections to curb adulteration and ensure public health safety.

TPN CORRESPONDENT, Hyderabad : Chief Minister Revanth Reddy has instructed officials to prepare a new tourism policy for Telangana by December 31. He suggested that the policies implemented by countries like Dubai, Singapore, and China should be studied for the development of tourist destinations.

Chief Minister Revanth reviewed the issue of formulating a tourism policy in a high-level meeting on Friday. Although there are good opportunities for the development of the tourism sector in the state, it has suffered due to the lack of a special policy over the last ten years. He emphasized that the best policy should be prepared, espe-



cially since the weather in Hyderabad is favorable 365 days a year.

The meeting discussed in detail the areas with potential for tourism development. On the occasion of the

completion of one year of the formation of the public government, a short film on tourist destinations prepared by the Tourism Development Organization was unveiled.

He suggested that tiger reserve forests should be connected with temples, and efforts should be made to increase the number of tourists in reserve forest areas. The CM also proposed focusing on concept tourism instead of routine tourism. A study should be conducted on setting up a mega convention center in Future City to attract tourists, ensuring that the center is reachable within 20 minutes from the airport.

The Chief Minister inquired about the leases of tourism department sites in the state, urging the preparation of a comprehensive report. Strict action should be taken against those who do not vacate properties after their lease expires, and court cases should

be dealt with seriously to lift stays. He said that from now on, tourist sites will be leased only to companies with a good reputation.

The heritage building of Osmania Hospital, which is to be vacated, should be developed into a prominent tourist destination. Conditions should be created to increase the number of tourists visiting Charminar. The tourism department should work hard to become self-sufficient. Minister Jupally Krishna Rao, CM's advisor Vem Narender Reddy, Tourism Corporation Chairman Ramesh R Patel, Tourism Department Secretary, and other senior officials participated in the meet-

Second Earthquake Strikes Telangana Within a Week



TPN CORRESPONDENT, MAHBUBNAGAR: Telangana experienced its second earthquake in less than a week, with a magnitude 3.0 tremor striking Mahbubnagar district on Saturday afternoon. The earthquake, which occurred at approximately 12:15 PM, was centered in Dasaripalle village of Koukuntla Mandal. Frightened residents reported feeling the tremors and quickly evacuated their homes. No immediate reports of damage or injuries have been received, and further details are awaited.

This latest earthquake follows a stronger tremor earlier this week in the Mulugu district, which registered a magnitude of 5.3 on the Richter scale. That quake, felt across a 240-kilometer radius, impacted parts of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh, sending shockwaves through an area that rarely experiences seismic activity. It was the strongest earthquake recorded in the state in two decades, leaving residents alarmed.

The recurrence of earthquakes in such a short span has raised concerns among locals and officials. While seismic activity in Telangana is uncommon, these incidents have prompted authorities to closely monitor the situation and review safety measures. Further updates are expected as investigations into the causes of these tremors continue.

Forest Department Plans Organic Sitafal and **Bamboo Projects for Adilabad Tribals**

TPN CORRESPONDENT, Adilabad: In a bid to provide sustainable livelihoods for tribal communities in Adilabad, the Forest Department has proposed two ambitious projects: the plantation of custard apple trees (Sitafal) and a bamboo rejuvenation initiative. These projects, aimed at empowering local tribes, are expected to begin soon after receiving government approval.

The custard apple plantation will cover 200 hectares in Echoda mandal, targeting Raj Gonds and Thottis, who traditionally gather fruits from forests. With an estimated cost of ₹2 crore, the initiative includes setting up a nursery and a food processing unit under the "Adilabad Forest Organic Sitafal" project. Tribals will receive training to create value-added products like ice creams, puddings, and desserts from custard apples, offering them new livelihood opportunities.

The bamboo rejuvenation project, budgeted at ₹3 crore, will span 200 hectares in the Sathnala block between Bela and Jainath mandals. This initiative aims to support the Kolam tribe, a particularly vulnerable tribal group that has relied on bamboo crafts for generations. Tribals will be trained to produce eco-friendly items such as baskets, mats, decorative pieces, and other bamboo-based products, along with guidance on marketing their crafts.

District Forest Officer (DFO) Prashanth B. Patil confirmed that discussions with higher officials regarding funding and implementation are underway. Once approved, the projects are expected to launch within the next two months, creating new livelihood avenues for the indigenous communities of Adilabad.

Five Killed as Car Plunges into Lake in Telangana's Bhongir

TPN CORRESPONDENT, Bhongir: Five people lost their lives, and one person was injured in a tragic accident in Telangana's Yadadri-Bhongir district early Saturday, December 7. The incident occurred near Jalalpur village in Bhoodan Pochampally mandal when the driver lost control of the vehicle, causing it to plunge into a lake.

The deceased have been identified as Harsha, Dinesh, Vamshi, Balu, and Vinay, all residents of LB Nagar in Hyderabad. The car reportedly skidded off the road before plunging into the water. A sixth occupant, a man from Lakshmapuram village in Valigonda mandal, managed to escape with injuries.

Local villagers and the Bhongir police initiated search operations at the site of the accident. Investigations are ongoing, and further details are awaited.

Another tiger attack: Cow manages to escape in **Mancherial**

The incident occurred when a shepherd took his herd deep into the forest. A tiger, prowling in the area, lunged at one of the cows. Despite sustaining injuries to its neck, the cow managed to break free and returned home bleeding. The rest of the herd scattered in fear, according to the shepherd.

Forest officials, alerted by locals, inspected the injured cow and confirmed that the wounds were caused by a tiger. They urged villagers to avoid taking cattle into the forest to prevent encounters with wild animals. Additionally, they cautioned against the use of electrified fences, which could harm wildlife.

Officials explained that the tiger likely migrated from Kumram Bheem Asifabad district, where it had been seeking new territory for some time. They believe this movement led to the attack on the cow.

Jasprit Bumrah: The Ideal Candidate for India's Next Test Captain

Indian cricket is currently at an exciting juncture, with a third consecutive World Test Championship final and a potential hattrick of Test series wins in Australia on the horizon. As India dominates the ICC rankings across formats and continues to produce a strong supply of talent, one key question looms: who will be India's next Test captain once Rohit Sharma retires? The answer seems clear—Jasprit Bumrah, the current

vice-captain and pace spearhead.

The obvious choice for captaincy is often the most appealing, and in Bumrah's case, it is hard to look beyond him. As vice-captain, he is naturally next in line to take over leadership duties when Rohit steps down. Bumrah's leadership qualities are evident, and his performance on the field is a crucial factor in his suitability for the role.

A Test match against Australia in Perth in 2022 showcased Bumrah's impact. His match figures of 8/72 earned him the Man of the Match award, underlining his ability to turn the game with his bowling. Test cricket is often decided by the collective performance of the team, but Bumrah's brilliance made the difference. He has that rare ability to dominate conditions and deliver decisive blows, reminiscent of Kapil Dev, India's only other fast-bowling Test captain.

Bumrah's brief stint as captain in the 2022 Birmingham Test against England further highlighted his leadership potential. Although India lost the match, Bumrah's five-wicket haul and his calm, practical approach to leadership left a strong impression. His humility and job awareness stood

out, as he took the captaincy in stride, saying, "You have to do the job."

Moreover, Bumrah's rapport with teammates is another strength. His down-toearth nature and willingness to guide juniors, like Harshit Rana during the recent Perth Test, show his ability to foster a supportive and encouraging environment. His leadership style emphasizes learning and collaboration, key traits for any successful captain.

With Rohit's eventual retirement on the horizon, Bumrah stands out as India's next Test captain—someone who can inspire with his performance, lead by example, and provide a fresh, effective approach to leadership.

From South Korea to US, democracy could die or get stronger

Friedrich Nietzsche's famous aphorism, "What imitators, some more successful than others. despair into opportunities for growth. Could this idea also apply to democracy?

For those who value freedom, democracy, and human rights, the global political climate has been worrying for over 18 years, according to Freedom House. The world has been experiencing a democratic recession, with more and more nations veering away from democratic norms. This decline seems to be accelerating, impacting not only developing countries in Africa but also established democracies in the West.

In Hungary, Viktor Orban has spent 14 years consolidating power and dismantling democratic institutions. Under his leadership, the country's media, judiciary, universities, parliament, and business sectors have all been methodically brought under his control, transforming Hungary into an autocracy, though still officially a democracy. Orban's tactics have made him a role model for other strongmen, including former U.S. President Donald Trump, who has expressed similar intentions of curbing democratic checks and balances in the United States.

But as Nietzsche's words suggest, adversity may ultimately strengthen democratic institutions, making them more robust and capable of defending freedoms even in the darkest times.



Deadlock at UN Talks on **Plastic Pollution: Production Cuts Remain Unresolved**



Negotiating Committee (INC-5) meeting, held in Busan, South Korea, aimed to create a legally binding global treaty to tackle plastic pollution. However, like the recent COP29 climate change conference, the week-long talks ended in deadlock, primarily over a dispute on cutting plastic production.

Over 200 countries attended the meeting, where negotiations focused on how to address the growing plastic crisis. A key point of contention was the proposed reduction in plastic production. More than 100 nations supported a draft resolution calling for legally binding cuts in production, viewing it as essential to addressing the root of the problem. However, a group of oil-producing nations, including Saudi Arabia, Iran, and Russia, opposed such measures. They argued that the real issue was plastic pollution itself, not the production of plastics.

Saudi Arabia, in particular, stated that the problem lay in pollution, not plastics as materials, and resisted efforts to reduce production. This disagreement highlights the ongoing tension between countries that see the reduction of plastic production as a necessary step and those whose economies are tied to the fossil fuel industry, which is responsible for much of plastic production.

The fifth United Nations Intergovernmental The UN had passed a resolution in 2022 calling for global efforts to end plastic pollution, acknowledging the severe environmental harm caused by plastic waste. While plastics have practical uses, they are notoriously harmful to ecosystems, with their indestructibility leading to pollution of land, seas, and air. Microplastics, which result from the breakdown of larger plastic items, are particularly concerning. Studies have shown that microplastics can accumulate in the human body, including in internal organs, breast milk, and even the linings of arteries.

> At the INC-5 meeting, one delegate remarked that attempting to reduce plastic pollution without cutting production was like trying to dry the floor with the tap still running. Recycling, often touted as a solution, is not always feasible on a global scale. As the negotiations concluded without agreement on significant production cuts, it became evident that finding common ground on this issue remains a significant challenge.

> The deadlock underscores the complexities of addressing plastic pollution on a global scale, with industrial interests and environmental concerns at odds. Until a consensus is reached, the battle against plastic pollution will likely continue to be hindered by this critical issue.

Calls 'Rahul Gandhi traitor of highest order'

BJP accuses US State Dept of trying to 'destabilise' India

In a fiery statement, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has accused the United States' State Department of attempting to "destabilise India" by allegedly targeting Prime Minister Narendra Modi. BJP spokesperson Sambit Patra and MP K Laxman claimed that the US "deep state" was working against the Indian government, with the US State Department allegedly playing a key role.

The BJP also leveled severe accusations against Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, calling him a "traitor of the highest order" and linking him to international forces purportedly aiming to disrupt India's stability. The party alleged a connection between Gandhi, billionaire investor George Soros, the US-based investigative media platform Organized Crime and Corruption Reporting Project (OCCRP), and other internation-



al agencies. Referring to a report by French media outlet Mediapart, Patra stated that the OCCRP, which collaborates with over 50 media partners globally, relies heavily on funding from Soros and US agencies. "If 70 percent

of their resources come from

one source, they cannot be neutral," he argued. Patra accused Gandhi of using OCCRP reports to criticize the Modi-led government on various occasions, including controversies such as the Pegasus spyware allegations and claims surrounding the Covaxin vaccine deal with

Patra further alleged that Rahul Gandhi's press conferences and public criticisms based on such reports were part of a "dangerous triangle" aimed at inciting public discontent and forcing regime change. He referenced a 2021 instance where Gandhi attacked the BJP government following an OCCRP report on Brazil canceling a \$324 million order for Covaxin. The BJP spokesperson dismissed the report as an attempt to malign India, claiming that Gandhi's actions only fueled baseless allegations.

The BJP raised the issue in the Lok Sabha, leading to heated debates and eventual adjournments amid uproar from both sides. The ruling party's claims mark a significant escalation in its rhetoric against international organizations and opposition leaders, reflecting heightened tensions over political narratives as the country approaches upcoming elections.

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has attached fresh assets worth ₹388 crore in connection with the Mahadev online betting case, bringing the total value of seized and frozen assets to ₹2,295.61 crore. The investigation, which centers around money laundering and illegal betting operations, has also implicated high-ranking politicians and bureaucrats from Chhattisgarh.

The newly attached assets include investments made by Mauritius-based Tano Investment Opportunities Fund, linked to Dubai-based hawala operator Hari Shankar Tibrewal, through Foreign Portfolio Investment and Foreign Direct Investment channels. Properties in Chhattisgarh, Mumbai, and Madhya Pradesh, owned by betting app promoters and their associates, were also seized.

The ED alleges that the Mahadev app acts as a syndicate enabling online betting, creating user IDs, and laundering money through proxy bank accounts. The agency has filed four chargesheets and arrested 11 individuals, including key operators Sourabh Chandrakar and Ravi Uppal, both from Chhattisgarh. Efforts are underway to extradite Chandrakar from Dubai.

Assets seized so far include ₹19.36 crore in cash, valuables worth ₹16.68 crore, and movable assets like bank balances and securities totaling ₹1,729.17 crore. Previous operations recovered ₹5.39 crore in cash and ₹15.59 crore in bank balances. The ED has also summoned Bollywood celebrities linked to the case. The investigation continues to unravel the nexus of political, financial, and offshore networks tied to the Mahadev app, making it one of the largest money laundering probes in recent years.



Was Khan Sir Arrested Amid Protests By **Bihar Civil Service Aspirants?**

Patna witnessed unrest as civil service aspirants protested against the "normalisation" process in the Bihar Public Service Commission's (BPSC) preliminary test. Amid reports on social media suggesting that renowned educator and You-Tuber Faizal Khan, popularly known as Khan Sir, was arrested during the protests, Patna Police issued a statement denying the claims.

Dr. Anu Kumari, Sub-divisional Police Officer of Sachiwalaya, called the allegations "baseless, misleading, and provocative." She clarified that Khan Sir had voluntarily visited the Gardanibagh police station and was later escorted to his vehicle upon his request.

The protests stem from changes to the examination process for the upcoming 70th BPSC Preliminary Examination, scheduled for December 13, 2024. Aspirants are demanding that the exam be conducted in a single shift with a single paper, eliminating the need for the normalisation process. Protesters argued that the current system could disadvantage some candidates due to variations in question paper difficulty.

On Thursday, police resorted to a mild lathi charge near the BPSC office to disperse aspirants staging a sit-in. The crackdown escalated tensions, leading to public outrage and

demands for accountability. ancies. Khan Sir emphasised, Notable educators, including Khan Sir and Motiur Rahman Khan (Guru Rahman), joined the protests, criticising the BPSC for its alleged lack of communication.

Speaking to reporters, Khan Sir expressed solidarity with the the 70th examination as it will aspirants, stating, "With just a week left for exams, it is unfortunate that students are compelled to protest. We are not against the system but are asking for fairness. We demand the removal of normalisation and an extension of the exam date."

He further urged the authorities to address aspirants' concerns rejected due to server discrep-

"We don't have personal issues with anyone. We only seek a fair process and hope the government will listen."

Amid the growing uproar, BPSC transparency and inadequate released an official clarification, asserting that the normalisation process is irrelevant for be conducted in a single shift. The exam is scheduled for December 13, 2024, from 12 PM to 2 PM. The Commission assured aspirants that no changes have been made to the advertised examination process.

The protests have underscored a significant rift between students and the examination authorities, with demands for and reconsider applications reform continuing as the exam date approaches.

On Mamata Banerjee Leading INDIA, Congress' Caution, Samajwadi's Support

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's remarks about potentially leading the opposition INDIA bloc have stirred diverse reactions from allies within the coalition. Speaking to a news channel on Friday, the Trinamool Congress (TMC) supremo expressed frustration over the alliance's leadership and coordination, hinting at her willingness to take charge if needed.

"I had formed the INDIA bloc. Now it is up to those leading it to manage. If they can't run the show, what can I do? Everyone needs to be taken along," Banerjee said. She added, "If given the opportunity, I would ensure its smooth functioning. I don't want to go outside West Bengal, but I can run it from here."

Banerjee's remarks triggered speculation about her intentions, prompting TMC spokesperson Kunal Ghosh to clarify. "She never expressed personal ambition for leadership. Her focus is West Bengal, and she is not seeking a chair in Delhi. If the INDIA bloc demands her leadership, she will lead from Kolkata," Ghosh said.

The comments drew mixed responses from allies. CPI(M) leader D Raja acknowledged the INDIA bloc's limited meetings but emphasized the alliance's broader goal of removing the BJP. "The situation is not uniform across states, and coordination is crucial," he said.

The Congress, the largest party in the bloc, responded cautiously. Congress leader TS Singhdeo said, "She has her opinion and intent. Leadership decisions will naturally involve collective discussions." Congress MP Tariq Anwar reiterated that such decisions require consensus. "Leadership in a coalition like this is decided collectively, not unilaterally," he

Congress leader Rashid Alvi highlighted that other leaders, including Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, have also shown interest in leading the bloc. "Leadership decisions are not about individual ambitions but collective agreement," he remarked. Another Congress MP, Tanuj Punia, suggested that these matters should be addressed internally, involving Rahul Gandhi and other senior leaders.

Amid cautious responses, Samajwadi Party leader Udaiveer Singh voiced support for Banerjee. "She is a senior leader with significant experience. Our party has a good relationship with her and trusts her leadership. If a decision to make her the leader is taken, we will support it," Singh said. The TMC's recent bypoll victories in West Bengal, defeating the BJP, have solidified Mamata Banerjee's position as a formidable anti-BJP leader. TMC MP Kalyan Banerjee recently called on Congress and other allies to set aside egos and recognize her leadership potential within the INDIA bloc.

Despite its formation to counter the BJP's dominance, the INDIA bloc continues to grapple with internal divisions and leadership challenges. While the coalition saw mixed electoral performances in states like Haryana and Maharashtra, differences over strategy and coordination have raised questions about its effectiveness.





Trump Travels to Paris for Notre Dame Cathedral's Reopening and Macron Meeting

Donald Trump is traveling to Paris for his first international trip as president-elect, where he will join world leaders and dignitaries for a special celebration marking the reopening of Notre Dame Cathedral. The cathedral, which was severely damaged by a fire in 2019, has undergone extensive renovations, and the event on Saturday will commemorate its restoration.

Trump praised French President Emmanuel Macron for overseeing the restoration, calling it a "wonderful job" that has returned the iconic landmark to its full glory, and perhaps even improved it. In his acceptance of the invitation earlier this week, Trump expressed his excitement about attending the event, emphasizing its significance as a global celebration of cultural heritage.

Macron, who has had a complicated relationship with Trump in the past, has actively worked to build a rapport with the pres-



ident-elect. Since Trump's victory over Vice President Kamala Harris last month, Macron and other European leaders have been keen to strengthen their ties with him, particularly in regard to maintaining support for Ukraine in its ongoing conflict with Russia.

Despite Macron's efforts to cul-

tivate a good relationship with Trump, the French presidency sought to downplay the political weight of the invitation. A statement from Macron's office clarified that other non-office-holding politicians were also invited to the event, suggesting that Trump's attendance was not unusual.

While Macron extends a warm welcome to Trump, U.S. President Joe Biden was also invited but will not be attending the event. White House press secretary Karine Jean-Pierre explained that Biden had a scheduling conflict, and the U.S. will be represented by First Lady Jill Biden instead.

The event highlights not only the cultural significance of the restoration of Notre Dame but also the diplomatic efforts underway between the U.S. and European leaders, as they look to secure ongoing support for key geopolitical issues such as the conflict in Ukraine.

South Korean President Apologizes for Martial Law Attempt but Resists **Calls to Resign**

South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol apologized on Saturday for his recent attempt to impose martial law but firmly resisted calls to resign, even as pressure mounted from within his own ruling party. His apology came just hours before a planned impeachment vote, where political opponents were pushing for his removal from office.

Yoon's decision to declare martial law marked the first such action in South Korea since 1980. He acknowledged the gravity of the situation and expressed regret for his actions, admitting that the decision was made out of a sense of desperation. Despite the apology, the president made it clear that he would not seek to evade legal or political responsibility for the controversial move.

The attempted declaration of martial law, which was quickly opposed by political leaders, civil rights groups, and the public, followed escalating protests and political unrest in the country. Critics argued that such drastic measures were an overreaction to the demonstrations, which had been primarily driven by economic and political grievances.

Yoon's decision to press ahead with martial law had prompted widespread criticism, including from some members of his own party, who voiced concerns about the long-term impact on South Korea's democracy. Even though he issued the apology, the call for his resignation remained strong, as many questioned his judgment and leadership.

Imran Khan Calls for Rally and Civil Disobedience in Pakistan Amid Deadly Protest Clashes

Imran Khan, Pakistan's jailed former Prime Minister, has called for a rally on December 13 in the city of Peshawar, following a deadly protest march in Islamabad led by his political party, Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI). Khan, who remains incarcerated, used social media platform X to issue a call to action, urging his supporters to join the rally in Peshawar, the capital of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, which is governed by PTI. Khan's call comes in the wake of the November 25 protest, which was met with a violent crackdown by authorities. The former prime minister claimed that at least 12 of his supporters were killed during the clashes. He has demanded a thorough judicial investigation into the events of the protest, accusing the government of using excessive force against peaceful demonstra-


In addition to the rally, Khan threatened to initiate a civil disobedience movement across the country if the government fails to address his demands for accountability. His statements suggest escalating tensions between his party and the ruling government, which has already faced multiple protests and political challenges since Khan's ousting in 2022. The call for civil disobedience echoes Khan's previous efforts to challenge the government, with PTI organizing widespread protests and marches since his removal from office. Khan's supporters have rallied behind him, viewing his imprisonment as politically motivated, while the government insists that his legal troubles stem from corruption charges and other criminal cases.

Russia Plans to Deploy Hypersonic Oreshnik Missiles in Belarus by 2025

Russian President Vladimir Putin announced on Friday that Russia could deploy its newly developed hypersonic Oreshnik missiles in Belarus by the second half of 2025, as production of the missile ramps up. The Oreshnik, a nuclear-capable weapon, was recently unveiled by Russia after being used in a strike on the Ukrainian city of Dnipro, marking an escalation in the ongoing conflict.

Putin made the statement during a televised meeting with Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko in Minsk. He confirmed that the missile deployment would be possible once "serial production" of the Oreshnik missile is scaled up in Russia.

The missile, which experts believe can travel at ten times the speed of sound, is reported to have a range of up to 5,500 kilometers



(3,400 miles), making it capable of striking targets deep within enemy territory. This advancement in missile technology comes amid Russia's ongoing military operations in Ukraine and the broader strategic alliance between Moscow and Belarus.

In 2023, Russia had already deployed tactical nuclear weapons in Belarus, strengthening the military ties between the two nations. These tactical nuclear weapons are designed for use on the battlefield and are smaller in scale than strategic nuclear weapons, which are capable of obliterating entire cities. However, tactical nuclear weapons remain highly destructive and represent a significant escalation in the military capabilities of the two countries.

Belarus, a close ally of Russia, has played a key role in supporting Moscow's military actions during the war in Ukraine. The deployment of the Oreshnik missiles to Belarus further solidifies the partnership between the two nations, as they continue to bolster their military cooperation in response to increasing tensions in the region. As Russia advances in its missile capabilities, concerns over security in Europe and the broader international community continue to grow.

"Unacceptable": US Congressman **Calls On Bangladesh To End Anti-Hindu Violence**



US Congressman Raja Krishnamoorthi has expressed deep concern over the escalating violence in Bangladesh following the arrest of ISKCON priest Chinmoy Krishna Das Brahmachari. In an official statement, Krishnamoorthi urged the Bangladeshi government to respect human rights, ensure legal protections, and put an end to the violence targeting Hindus and other minority groups.

"The ongoing violence against Hindus and others across Bangladesh is unacceptable and must end immediately," Krishnamoorthi said. "I strongly urge the government of Bangladesh to take decisive steps to reduce tensions peacefully now." He stressed the importance of safeguarding peaceful protests and providing arrested individuals with proper legal representation.

The unrest began after sedition charges were filed against Chinmoy Krishna Das for allegedly raising a saffron flag above Bangladesh's national flag in Chittagong on October 25. His arrest on November 25 sparked protests, leading to violent clashes between his followers and law enforcement on November 27, outside the Chattogram Court Building, which resulted in the death of a lawyer. The violence intensified following additional arrests.

ISKCON Kolkata reported that two monks, Adipurush Shyam Das and Ranganath Das Brahmachari, were detained on November 29 after visiting Chinmoy Krishna Das in custody. The situation worsened further when rioters vandalized an ISKCON center in Bangladesh. The Bangladesh Hindu Buddhist Christian Unity Council condemned the charges filed against 70 minority lawyers and two journalists, describing them as "false and harass-

Assad Loses Another Syrian City, Rebels March Towards Damascus

Bashar al-Assad's grip on power, Syrian government forces have lost control of Daraa city, which is considered the birthplace of Syria's 2011 civil uprising. Daraa, located about 100 kilometers from Damascus, became the epicenter of nationwide protests after the Assad regime detained and allegedly tortured a group of boys for anti-government graffiti. What began as peaceful demonstrations soon escalated into a violent conflict that has claimed over 500,000 lives and displaced millions.

According to the UK-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, opposition forces now control over 90% of Daraa province, with regime forces retreating in multiple waves. Daraa's fall follows the earlier losses of Alep-

These key victories have encouraged rebel forces to push south toward Homs, Syria's third-largest city, and even closer to Damascus, the heart of Assad's power. noted that it also reflects concerns over weak global demand, particularly from China, the world's largest crude importer. Rising oil production from other regions has added to the pressure on oil prices, forcing OPEC+ to delay its production increase plans.

HSBC Global Research analysts suggested that OPEC+'s decision could be seen as an implicit acknowledgment of sluggish demand. Meanwhile, Bank of America predicts that increasing oil surpluses will push Brent prices down to an average of \$65 per barrel in 2025, with oil demand growth expected to recover to 1 million barrels per day in the coming year.

FM Sitharaman: GDP Slowdown in Q2 Not Systemic, **Q3** to Offset Moderation

 $F_{ ext{la Sitharaman has re-}}^{ ext{inance Minister Nirma-}}$ assured the public that the slowdown in India's GDP growth during the second quarter (Q2) of the financial year is not indicative of a systemic issue. She emphasized that the moderation observed in Q2 is expected to be temporary, with the third quarter (Q3) likely to compensate for the slowdown.

India's GDP growth decelerated in Q2, reflecting a decrease in economic momentum, driven by factors like weak global demand, inflationary pressures, and challenges in key sectors. However, Sitharaman asserted that the economy remains re-

silient, and the current dip is a temporary blip in the broader growth trajectory.

Highlighting that the moderation was not a reflection of any underlying structural problems, Sitharaman pointed out that many factors were at play, including a normalizing base effect and seasonal fluctuations. She expressed confidence that India's economic fundamentals remain strong, citing positive indicators like rising exports, robust domestic consumption, and an uptick in investments.

The Finance Minister stressed that the Indian economy has shown remarkable resilience in the face of global uncertainties and that the government remains committed to supporting growth through targeted fiscal measures and reforms. In this context, Sitharaman expects the economy to regain its momentum in Q3, driven by the festive season, improved industrial output, and a recovery in global demand.

Additionally, Sitharaman reassured investors and businesses that the government is monitoring the situation closely and will take any necessary corrective actions to support the economy's recovery. Despite global challenges, including geopolitical tensions and inflation, India's economic outlook remains positive, she emphasized.

Looking ahead, the Finance Minister remains optimistic about achieving the country's growth targets for the fiscal year, maintaining that India is on track for a strong and sustainable recovery in the coming quarters.

India's Exports Surge 67% in FY2023-24, Reaching \$778 Billion



Tndia has seen a remarkable surge in its Lexports, reaching approximately \$778 billion in FY2023-24, a 67% growth compared to \$466 billion in FY2013-14. This strong performance has elevated the country's global standing, with its share in world merchandise exports improving from 1.66% to 1.81%, propelling India from 20th to 17th in global rankings, according to Union Minister of Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal.

This growth can be attributed to several government initiatives aimed at sustaining and accelerating export performance. The positive momentum was also reflected in India's trade performance in the first quarter of the current fiscal year, as reported by NITI Aayog's Trade Watch report. The report indicated a stable and moderate growth trend, with India's total trade in H1 2024 increasing by 5.45% year-on-year to reach \$576 billion.

Merchandise exports showed a 5.95% rise in Q1 FY25, reaching \$110 billion, while imports grew by 8.40% to \$173 billion, widening the trade imbalance. Exports to North America accounted for 21% of India's total exports, followed by the European Union at 18.61%. 

Dr. Cyriac Abby Philips, known as "The Liver Doc" on social media, recently shared a striking post on X (formerly Twitter) to challenge the misconception that drinking alcohol only on weekends has no harmful effects. The post featured a comparison of two livers: one from a 32-yearold man who drank alcohol exclusively on weekends and another from his wife, a non-drinker. Humans and Dogs Became Friends 2,000 Years Earlier, Study Finds

Arecent study has uncovered that the bond between humans and dogs began around 12,000 years ago, much earlier than previously believed. This research, conducted by the University of Arizona and published in *Science Advances*, reveals that this close relationship between humans and their canine companions dates back approximately 2.000 years earlier than earlier records in the Americas.

The study, led by Francois Lanoe, an assistant research professor at the School of Anthropology, focuses on archaeological remains found at Swan Point, a long-standing site in Alaska. In 2018, researchers uncovered the tibia, or lower-leg bone, of an adult canine. Radiocarbon dating determined that the dog lived around 12,000 years ago, near the end of the Ice Age. The remains also indicated that the dog had a close connection with humans.

Chemical analysis of the canine's remains revealed significant traces of salmon proteins, suggesting that the dog was regularly consuming fish. Interestingly, local wild canines typically hunted only on land, so the presence of fish in the diet suggests that the dog might have relied on humans for its food.



Francois Lanoe emphasized the importance of this discovery, noting that it offers crucial evidence about the early relationship between humans and dogs in the Americas. "This is a significant contribution," Lanoe said. "It shows that people and canines had closer relationships earlier This groundbreaking research offers new than previously known."

In a related discovery, an 8,100-year-old canine jawbone found at a nearby site in June 2023 also showed signs of close inter-

action with humans, further supporting the idea that early humans and canines had developed strong bonds. However, scientists caution that it is still too early to say for certain that these early canines were fully domesticated.
