

Hyderabad, Jan 13: A heated argument erupted during a review meeting at the Karimnagar Collectorate when Jagityala MLA Sanjay was speaking. The argument quickly turned physical, with the two attempting to attack each other.

The confrontation took place in the presence of three ministers, making the scene even more dramatic. As the situation escalated, police were forced to intervene and escort MLA Kaushik Reddy out of the Collectorate building.

Speaking to the media later, Kaushik Reddy expressed his discontent, stating that an MLA who had won under the leadership of KCR (K. Chandrashekar Rao, the Chief Minister) should fol-

low KCR's agenda. He also emphasized that nobody would remain silent in the face of such provocative statements. Kaushik Reddy criticized the government's handling of various issues, including the demands for Rs. 15,000 for farmers, Rs. 6,000 for the disabled, and government fulfilled its promises.

Kaushik Reddy further stressed that if KCR continues to speak on behalf of Congress, despite his victory under KCR's leadership, they would not accept it. He also demanded that the Mughals resign, further intensifying the tension.

The argument between the two MLAs and the subsequent disruption of the meeting have sparked considerable attention, with political observers closely watching the developments in the region.

CM Calls for Unity and Cooperation in State's Development

Hyderabad, Jan 13: Chief Minister Revanth Reddy emphasized the need for unity and cooperation among all political parties for the development of Telangana, irrespective of their differences. Speaking at a program in Hyderabad, the Chief Minister launched the autobiography of former Maharashtra Governor Chennamaneni Vidyasagar Rao, titled Unika.

Reddy highlighted the importance of major infrastructure projects like Metro Rail, Regional Ring Road, and Regional Ring Rail in transforming Hyderabad into a global city. He expressed concern over the decline of Hyderabad Metro, which was once ranked Reddy further emphasized that 60% of Tel-

Hyderabad Metro Expansion

- New LB Nagar to Hayat Nagar Route Announced

Hyderabad, Jan 13: As part of the ongoing second phase of Hyderabad's Metro Rail expansion, the proposed route from LB Nagar to Hayat Nagar is set to enhance the city's public transport system. The new 7-kilometer stretch will feature six stations along the way, improving accessibility for commuters in the southern parts of the city.

The route map, shared by Hyderabad Metro X on Twitter, outlines the stations on the LB Nagar to Hayat Nagar corridor. Starting from LB Nagar Metro Station, the route will pass through Chintal Kunta, Vanasthalipuram, Autonagar, Lecturers Colony, RTC Colony, and finally Hayat Nagar. These stations are expected to significantly reduce travel time for residents along the corridor.



This project is part of the second phase of the metro's expansion, aimed at enhancing connectivity across Hyderabad. The newly proposed corridor will connect with the existing Miyapur-Patan Cheru

extension (Corridor 1), which is already operational from Miyapur to LB Nagar. The extension to Hayat Nagar will create a seamless 50-kilometer metro route, linking the city's north-west to the southeast, making it easier for residents to travel across these areas.

Rail is working diligently to complete this project, which will play a crucial role in easing traffic congestion and providing a sustainable transport option for the growing population of the city. The completion of the LB Nagar to Hayat Nagar section is expected to bring significant

improvements to public transportation in the region, benefiting both daily commuters and visitors alike.

With this expansion, Hyderabad is moving closer to establishing a robust metro network that will offer smooth and efficient travel across the city. The new route is anticipated to be a key milestone in the metro's development, promoting better mobility for all.

Kaushik Reddy Warns Congress Leaders

Demands Support for Farmers and Dalits

Hyderabad, Jan 13: Huzurabad BRS MLA Padi Kaushik Reddy has issued a stern warning to Congress leaders, stating that they have no fear of threats and will continue to stand by farmers and Dalits. Reddy, who has been vocal about issues in his constituency, expressed frustration over the inadequate loan waiver. He claimed that only 50 percent of

the loans had been waived in his area, and he has demanded the remaining 50 percent to be cleared.

Reddy also reminded that during Chief Minister KCR's tenure, Dalit Bandhu was extended to 18,500 families, and he demanded the second installment be provided. He accused Congress leaders of abusing them when funds were requested for these initiatives.

Reddy took a jibe at Congress MLA Dr. Sanjay, alleging that he had been given the MLA post as a "bequest" from KCR and dared him to resign and contest elections with a Congress ticket if he had the courage. He criticized Sanjay for claiming to be a Congress MLA after winning with a BRS ticket and expressed anger over the sit-

uation.

Reddy warned that they would not back down from questioning Sanjay's actions and reiterated that KCR would return as Chief Minister in the next three years. He further emphasized that no one, including officials, would be spared. Reddy's comments come amid increasing political tension in the region.

Rythu Bharosa Guidelines Issued

Telangana, Jan 13: In a festive boost for Telangana farmers, the state government has announced key updates regarding the Rythu Bharosa scheme. On the occasion of the Sankranti festival, the Telangana government revealed that the Rythu Bharosa scheme will be implemented from January 26, with an increase in investment assistance to farmers. The government will provide Rs. 12,000 per acre as investment assistance under the scheme, a significant boost for agricultural activities in the state.

The government has issued clear guidelines for the implementation of the scheme. The financial assistance will be available only for arable lands registered in Bhoobharati, and non-agricultural lands will be excluded from the program. However, farmers with ROFR (Right of Forest Dwelling) pattas will also be eligible for the assistance.



In line with the digital transformation, the Rythu Bharosa funds will be directly deposited into the farmers' bank accounts through the Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) method, ensuring a seamless and transparent transaction process.

CM Revanth Reddy's Foreign Tour Schedule Announced

Hyderabad, Jan 13: Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's foreign tour schedule has been officially released. The CM will embark on his trip on January 17, accompanied by a personal team, several ministers, and officials.

On January 18, the Chief Minister will visit Singapore, where he will inspect the construction of shopping malls and sports stadiums. He is also scheduled to meet with industrialists in the city-state to discuss business and investment opportunities.

Following his visit to Singapore, CM Revanth Reddy will travel to Davos, Switzerland, on January 19 to attend the prestigious World Economic Forum (WEF). He will engage with global leaders and industry experts during the forum, which is set to



conclude on January 23.

The foreign tour is scheduled to begin after the Sankranti festival, marking a significant international engagement for the Chief Minister. The trip aims to attract investment and enhance Telangana's global presence in sectors like infrastructure and in-

Govt Assures Indiramma Homes, **Ration Cards for Poor**

Hyderabad, Jan 13: State BC Welfare and Transport Minister Ponnam Prabhakar has assured that ration cards and Indiramma houses will be provided to all eligible beneficiaries. The announcement was made during a meeting held at the GHMC Head Office on Sunday, attended by Hyderabad district public representatives and officials.

The Minister highlighted that the government is committed to ensuring transparency in the selection process. Following the Chief Minister's review with district collectors and state-level officials, two schemes—ration card distribution and Indiramma housing—are being prioritized for Hyderabad. Beneficiaries will be selected based on field verification from January 16 to 20, followed by ward-wise gram sabhas between January 20 and 24.



The Minister revealed that 3,500 Indiramma houses are allocated per constituency, and data entry for the list of beneficiaries will be completed by January 25. New ration cards will be distributed starting January 26. Of the 10.7 lakh applications received in Greater Hyderabad, 50% have been surveyed, with 9,913 applicants identified as having house land.

Acknowledging the unique land challenges in Hyderabad, the government is exploring solutions, including developing multi-story buildings and improving slums. Minister Prabhakar assured that no eligible person would face injustice and urged people to participate in the process voluntarily.

The government has also introduced various welfare measures, including free electricity for 200 units, loan waivers, en-

hanced health coverage under Arogya Sri, and free bus travel for women.

The press conference was attended by Mayor Gadwal Vijayalakshmi, Commissioner Ilambarthi, Deputy Mayor Srilatha Shobhan Reddy, and other officials. The Minister reaffirmed the government's dedication to addressing the housing and welfare needs of the poor in Hyderabad.

Kavitha Demands Minority Declaration

Nizamabad, Jan 13: MLC Kalvakuntla Kavitha has accused Congress Chief Minister Revanth Reddy of having RSS roots, which, she claimed, is the reason for his alleged discrimination against minorities. Speaking in Nizamabad, Kavitha expressed anger over the Congress party's treatment of minorities, who, according to her, had initially supported Congress due to their faith in the Gandhi family.

Kavitha emphasized that under the leadership of

Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR), no communal riots occurred Telangana, in stark contrast to the year when Congress came to power. She questioned why CM Revanth Reddy has failed to take measures to prevent communal unrest, accus-



ing the Congress of sowing discord in a state known for its harmonious Ganga-Jamuna Tehzeeb.

The MLC also criticized the Congress for neglecting the promises made to minorities, particularly the Minority Declaration. She demanded the immediate release of the Minority Declaration, pointing out that less than 25% of the budget allocated for minorities had been spent. Of the Rs. 3,000 crore allocated, only Rs. 700 crore has been utilized, Kavitha noted.

Kavitha further criticized the Congress for not fulfilling commitments made under the Shadi Mubarak scheme, such as providing Rs. 1.6 lakh and a tola of gold. She demanded the District Collector take responsibility for the arrangements for the Tablighi Jamaat program in Nizamabad, reminding the officials of the large-scale arrangements made during the BRS regime.

Tension in Yadadri: BRS Leaders House-**Arrested Amid Protest Plans**

Bhuvanagiri, Jan 13: Tensions escalated in Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district as police imposed strict measures to prevent a grand dharna organized by the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS). The protest was planned in response to an alleged attack on the BRS party office by Congress supporters.

Police denied permission for the dharna and set up barricades at Ambedkar Square in Bhuvanagiri town. Large num-

bers of police personnel have been deployed to maintain law and order. Several BRS leaders, including former MLAs Paylla Sekhar Reddy and Kusukuntla Prabhakar Reddy, as well as senior leaders Bhullu Bhikshamaya Goud and Kyama Mallesh, were placed under house arrest.

Reports suggest that BRS leaders across various sion, with residents witnessing heavy police mandals in the district were taken into cus-

tody and shifted to police stations to prevent their participation in the protest. The arrests have sparked anger among BRS leaders, who accuse the police of treating them unfairly.

Municipal Chairman Shankaraiah from Aleru

was also placed under house arrest, further fueling tensions. BRS leaders have condemned the police actions, comparing their treatment to that of "rowdies and terrorists." Despite the crackdown, they have vowed to make the dharna a success under any circumstances.

Five Naxals Killed in Bijapur Encounter, **Police Recover Weapons**

Bijapur, Jan 13: In a major security operation, five Naxalites were killed in an encounter between security forces and Naxal militants in the Maddedu forest area of Bijapur district, Chhattisgarh. The encounter, which broke out in the early hours, has continued as security forces maintain their position at the scene.

During the operation, the police recovered a cache of weapons, including automatic rifles, one SLR (Self-Loading Rifle), two 12-bore guns, two single-shot firearms, a BGL (Breech-loading grenade) launcher, and a Burmar, all believed to have been used by the Naxal group.

The encounter has drawn widespread attention, and the bravery of the security personnel involved in the operation has been lauded. Chhattisgarh's Chief Minister, Vishnu Dev Sai, took to social media to salute the courage and dedication of the soldiers, posting a tribute on the platform "Express."

The police have confirmed that the operation is ongoing, with additional reinforcements deployed to secure the area and ensure no fur-

ther threats from the Naxal group. The encounter is part of a continued effort by security forces to curb the growing Naxalite influence in the region.

Bhatti Slams BRS Over Debt, Failed Projects

Nagarkurnool, Jan 13: Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka addressed a public meeting at the Nagarkurnool district headquarters, chaired by local MLA K. Rajesh Reddy, and called on Congress cadres to spread awareness about the government's welfare schemes. He emphasized the importance of ensuring Congress' victory in the upcoming local body elections, especially in the Palamuru district.

The Deputy CM announced the distribution of ration cards to poor families starting January 26 and highlighted the provision of free household electricity to 48 lakh families. Additionally, he underscored the government's commitment to farmers, including free electricity for 28 lakh agricultural pump sets, costing ₹12,000 crore annually, and ₹8,400 crore allocated for farmer insurance.

Bhatti revealed plans to construct Indiramma houses with a budget of ₹22,500 crore, providing ₹5 lakh to each beneficiary. The government is also implementing the Indiramma Atmiya Bharosa Scheme, allocating ₹2,000 crore to support poor



laborers with ₹12,000 annually.

creation despite incurring a debt of ₹7 lakh crore. He highlighted the collapse of the Kaleshwaram project, constructed at a staggering ₹1.25 lakh crore, as a symbol of the previous regime's inefficiency.

Reaffirming Congress' legacy, Bhatti pointed out the party's historical achievements in building water projects on the Krishna and Godavari rivers, contrasting them with the alleged shortcomings of the BRS administration.



Former Minister Jagadish Reddy Arrested **Ahead of BRS Protest**



Former Nagar Kurnool MP Manda Jagannadham Passes Away

Hyderabad, Jan 13: Nagar Kurnool's former MP, Manda Jagannadham, passed away recently while undergoing treatment at NIMS Hospital in Hyderabad. His health had been critical for the past few days, and he succumbed to his illness earlier this evening.

Manda Jagannadham served as MP of Nagar

Kurnool constituency four times. He entered politics in 1996, winning his first election as a Telugu Desam Party (TDP) candidate. He continued his winning streak in 1999 and 2004 under the same party banner. Later, he joined the Congress Party and won the 2009 elections from the same constituency.



In 2014, he shifted to the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) but lost the elections. He was not given a ticket in the 2019 elections. In July 2022, he was appointed as a special representative of the Telangana government in Delhi by the then Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao. In November 2023, he left the BRS and joined the Congress Party but could not

secure a ticket. Subsequently, he joined the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP).

Manda Jagannadham's demise marks the end of a significant political career that spanned decades and multiple parties. He is remembered for his contributions to the Nagar Kurnool region.

Nampally Court Shocks Daggubati Family Over Deccan Kitchen Demolition Case

Hyderabad, Jan 13: The Nampally 17th Court has issued a major order against the Daggubati family, directing the Film Nagar Police to file an FIR and conduct a detailed investigation into the alleged illegal demolition of the Deccan Kitchen Hotel. Despite pending litigation in the City Civil Court and a High Court directive to maintain the status quo, the hotel was allegedly demolished in violation of court orders.

Following a petition by Nandakumar, the owner of the Deccan Kitchen Hotel, the court instructed police to investigate the role of actor Venkatesh Daggubati, producer Suresh Babu, actor Rana, and Abhiram in the demolition incident. On Saturday, the Film Nagar Police registered an FIR under Sections 448, 452, 458, and 120B of the IPC and began their investi-

The dispute arose from a land conflict between Nandakumar and the Daggubati family, which had previously reached the



courts. In November 2022, partial demolition of the hotel was carried out by GHMC staff with bouncers, despite court orders. However, the entire hotel was allegedly demolished in January 2024, prompting Nandakumar to approach the Nampally Court again.

The court has now directed the police to investigate the demolition and take appropriate action against the accused for violating court orders. Nandakumar, who has been fighting for justice for years, continues his legal battle against the Daggubati family.

Gas Leak Triggers Fire in Old House at Hayathnagar, Elderly Couple Safe

Hyderabad, Jan 13: A fire broke out in an old house in Hayathnagar, where an elderly couple has been living on rent for the past few months. The incident oc-

curred while they were preparing traditional dishes for the Sankranti festival.

The fire was reportedly caused by a gas leak, leading to panic in the neighborhood. However, the timely response of local residents and the swift action of the fire department averted a major disaster.



The fire brigade arrived promptly and managed to extinguish the flames, preventing further damage to the property and neighboring houses. No casualties

were reported.



Around 350 veterans and their dependents attended the camp, which was well-received as a gesture of gratitude towards the veterans for their service to the nation.


Jackal Attacks Villagers in Sircilla, Woman Injured

Time for Youth-Led Politics in India?



India, with the world's largest youth population, stands at a pivotal moment in its history. Approximately 27.3% of India's total population falls between the ages of 15 and 29, representing a powerful force that can shape the future of the nation. As Prime Minister Narendra Modi highlighted at the Viksit Bharat Young Leaders Dialogue 2025, the nation is waking up to the untapped potential of its youth. The direct engagement between Modi and nearly 3,000 young leaders reflects a growing recognition that India's youth is crucial to the country's progress.

The youth population is India's greatest asset. With an ever-growing number of young, digitally savvy, and dynamic individuals, the country has a unique opportunity to harness their potential for global influence. However, despite their enthusiasm in the electoral process—youth voters aged 18-29 made up 22.3% of the electorate in the 2019 elections—young people remain woefully underrepresented in political leadership roles. In 1952, 33.74% of Members of Parliament (MPs) were between 25 and 40 years old. However, by 2024, this figure dropped to just 10.68%. This underrepresentation highlights a serious disconnect between India's youthful population and its political leadership.

The average age of MPs has risen steadily over the decades, with the average age reaching 55.6 years in the 2024 elections. This increasing age gap between lawmakers and the electorate raises con-

cerns about whether India's government is truly reflecting the demographic makeup of its population. The Youth Representation Index (YRI), which measures the representation of youth relative to their population share, has dramatically fallen from 156 in 1957 to just 41 in 2024. Clearly, there is a need for more young voices in policy-making.

One possible solution is lowering the minimum age to contest elections. Currently, the age requirement for Lok Sabha candidates is 25. If young citizens are responsible enough to vote, they should be given the opportunity to directly shape policies. Opening up the political arena to younger candidates can inject fresh ideas and perspectives while maintaining the balance of experience.

Government initiatives aimed at promoting youth participation, such as increased funding for education and skill development, show promise. However, more needs to be done to level the playing field. Barriers like societal biases, financial constraints, and political dynasties prevent many talented young individuals from entering politics. These barriers must be dismantled for youth-led politics to thrive.

By 2047, the centenary of India's independence, a politically empowered youth could lead the country to new heights, prioritizing issues like sustainability, innovation, and social justice. The future of India's democracy lies in the hands of its youth—it's time for them to take the reins.

The Rise of Ultra-Wealthy Individuals in Politics: Musk's Influence and the Threat to Democracy

The impending US presidential inauguration casts a long shadow, with many uncertainties looming over the political landscape. Among the most troubling concerns is the potential role of Donald Trump's close associate, Elon Musk, the world's richest individual, whose influence is growing both in the US and beyond.

Musk, known for his often reckless public statements, has earned notoriety not just in the tech world but also in global politics. His vitriol extends to countries such as Britain, where he has described the nation as a "tyrannical police state" and expressed a bizarrely violent hostili-

ty toward its political establishment. Such inflammatory rhetoric is just one example of how Musk's influence extends far beyond his business empire, raising questions about the potential for excessive concentration of power in the hands of a few ultra-wealthy individuals.

Historically, money has played a significant role in shaping politics, with the rich often buying influence or supporting political figures who align with their interests. While figures like Rupert Murdoch may not directly bribe politicians, they have exerted considerable influence through the fear they instill in leaders who depend on media favor. However, what is particularly striking in 2025 is the increasingly visible role that the ultra-wealthy are playing in government, either by directly holding political power or by seeking it.

Musk's attempt to influence politics took a more direct form when he reportedly discussed donat-



ing a staggering £100 million (\$125 million) to the UK Reform Party, a far-right political group. This would have been the largest political donation in British history and an overt attempt to sway an election. However, the prospect of such a political maneuver became more distant when Musk withdrew his support, possibly realizing the damage it could cause to his reputation and standing.

The growing involvement of billionaires like Musk in political matters signals a troubling trend. Their immense wealth allows them to shape policy, influence elections, and potentially undermine democratic institutions. As ultra-wealthy individuals increasingly step into the political arena, they threaten to consolidate power and influence in ways that could marginalize the public and diminish the voice of ordinary citizens. This shift in political dynamics underscores the growing power of the elite and the potential dangers it poses to democracy as we know it.

INDIA Bloc Faces Growing Challenges, Congress Must Lead to Keep It United



Jammu & Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah has stirred up tensions within the INDIA alliance by questioning its future, suggesting it should be dissolved if it's only meant for the upcoming parliamentary elections. His comments have targeted two key allies — the Congress and AAP — both of which are at odds in the Delhi Assembly elections. Abdullah's remarks come shortly after RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav also implied that the alliance was intended solely for the 2024 Lok Sabha polls.

In response, senior INDIA leader Farooq Abdullah, Omar's father, tried to reassure the public by emphasizing that the alliance's purpose is to "strengthen India and eliminate hatred." However, his attempts to rally support for the bloc's long-term future appeared unconvincing, signaling that cracks within the alliance are widening. The unity of the INDIA bloc, which had shown promise after its strong performance in the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, now seems increasingly fragile.

The key question is: who is steering the ship? The Congress, which had assumed leadership of the alliance, has seen its grip loosen following electoral defeats in Hary-

ana and Maharashtra. These setbacks, combined with the Congress' diminished standing in Jharkhand and Jammu & Kashmir, have made it clear that the party no longer enjoys the same influence it once did within the opposition camp.

Despite these challenges, the responsibility of maintaining the alliance remains largely with the Congress, as highlighted by Uddhav Thackeray's Shiv Sena faction. The Congress, still the largest party in the opposition, must take decisive action to keep the bloc intact. The Gandhis — Rahul, Sonia, and Priyanka — along with Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge, need to engage with disgruntled allies and ensure that they set the agenda for the year ahead. Fostering unity and collaboration within the INDIA bloc is crucial if they hope to present a credible challenge to the BJP in the 2024 elections.

If the Congress fails to act, it risks allowing the alliance to drift further apart, ultimately benefiting the BJP. The coming months will be pivotal for the opposition, and the Congress must rise to the occasion if the INDIA bloc is to survive and remain a force in Indian politics.



The Impact of Bangladesh's Crisis on Hindu-Muslim Relations in India

Bangladesh has recently garnered international attention due to political unrest, with significant developments affecting its Hindu minority. The protests that began in July 2024 against Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's government have escalated, especially after her departure in August. Amid these disturbances, there has been a sustained campaign of persecution against Hindus, including the destruction of religious sites, arrests, forced resignations, abductions, and other forms of violence. These leaders, who command large audiences, could play a pivotal role in shaping the public discourse on Hindu-Muslim relations, adding another layer of complexity to the situation.

Gautam Adani announces ₹65,000 crore investment for projects in Chhattisgarh

Do Not Legitimise Afghan Taliban Rule: Malala Yousafzai To Muslim Leaders

Nobel Peace Prize laureate Malala Yousafzai called on Muslim leaders to refuse to "legitimise" the Taliban's government in Afghanistan and to "show true leadership" by opposing the severe restrictions the regime has placed on women and girls' education. Speaking at a summit on girls' education in Islamabad, Pakistan, Yousafzai urged Muslim leaders to use their power to stand up against the Taliban's policies, which she described as an affront to true Islam.

Yousafzai's impassioned speech came during the two-day conference, attended by ministers and education officials from numerous Muslim-majority countries and backed by the Muslim World League. Since the Taliban's return to power in 2021, the government has enforced a harsh interpretation of Islamic law, leading to what the United Nations has termed "gender apartheid." This includes the banning of girls from attending secondary school and university, prohibiting women from many government jobs, and forcing them out of public life altogether.

Despite being invited, delegates from the Yousafzai, who was shot by the Pakistani



Taliban government did not attend the event. Pakistan's Education Minister Khalid Magbool Siddigui confirmed their absence. Taliban in 2012 for advocating for girls' education, said of the Taliban's treatment of women, "Simply put, the Taliban do not see women as human beings. They cloak their crimes in cultural and religious justifica-

In her speech, Yousafzai emphasized that the Taliban's mission is clear: to eliminate women and girls from public life and erase their presence from society. "They want to erase us," she said.

The international community is divided on how to address the Taliban's policies. While many nations condemn the regime's actions, opinions differ on whether diplomatic engagement or isolation would be more effective in pressuring the Taliban to reverse their stance on women's rights.

Though no country has officially recognized the Taliban government, some regional powers have engaged with Kabul on issues of trade and security, adding further complexity to the debate over how best to handle the situation.

Elon Musk Calls for Opposition to Scholz, **Endorses Far-Right AfD in Germany Election**

Tesla CEO Elon Musk has stirred controversy by calling on the German public to "say no" to Chancellor Olaf Scholz and endorsing the far-right Alternative for Germany (AfD) party ahead of the country's snap election scheduled for February 23. Musk's comments were made on social media platform X, in response to news reports about Scholz's re-nomination by his party, the Social Democrats (SPD), and a story about a woman receiving a longer prison sentence than the migrant gang rapists she offended.

In his post, Musk urged: "Sag Nein zu Scholz!" which translates to "Say No to Scholz." He has also expressed strong support for the AfD, calling its co-leader Alice Weidel "very reasonable" and urging Germans to vote for the party. During an audio livestream with Weidel, Musk claimed that AfD was the only party that could "save Germany," likening the political situation in Germany to that of the United States during the Trump era. Musk suggested that if Germans were dissatisfied with their current situation, they should vote for change by supporting AfD.

Weidel, in turn, praised Musk for his support and condemned the treatment of former U.S.



President Donald Trump in Germany. She also made controversial comments about protecting Israel and combating what she described as "Muslim crime," positioning AfD as Germany's protector of Jewish life.

Global Leaders, Tech Giants, and Corporate Donors **Eye Trump's January 20 Inauguration**



As Donald Trump prepares for his swearing-in as the 47th President of the United States on January 20, a wide array of world leaders, tech magnates, and business tycoons are seeking coveted passes to attend the high-profile event at the Capitol building in Washington D.C. Alongside Trump, Vice President JD Vance will also take the oath during the historic ceremony, with invites extended to major world powers and key U.S. allies, including India.

India will be represented by External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar, who will attend the inauguration at the invitation of the Trump-Vance Inaugural Committee. The Indian government confirmed that Dr. Jaishankar will also meet with key representatives of the incoming administration and other dignitaries during his visit. With an eye on maintaining momentum in U.S.-India relations, New Delhi hopes the inauguration will add further strength to the bilateral ties that have seen significant growth in recent years.

In a departure from tradition, Trump has extended personal invitations to several world leaders, including Chinese President Xi Jinping. This move is significant given the ongoing geopolitical tensions between Washington and Beijing. Although Xi is unlikely to attend, China may send a high-ranking representative, such as Vice President Han Zheng or Foreign Minister Wang Yi. Other leaders invited include El Salvador's President Nayib Bukele, Italy's Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni, and Argentina's President Javier Milei, according to Trump's team.

The corporate sector has also been eager to ingratiate itself with the incoming administration. According to reports, the inaugural committee has raised over \$170 million, with industry giants like Boeing, Google, Meta, Microsoft, Amazon, Uber, Apple CEO Tim Cook, and OpenAI's Sam Altman each contributing substantial donations. These large donations are aimed at securing access to the inauguration's VIP events, where major donors typically gain valuable opportunities for influence and networking.

Despite the overwhelming demand, several high-profile donors have been informed that VIP passes have run out due to limited space. As a result, those who had hoped for access to exclusive events will have to rely on free tickets available through members of Congress, though these passes offer less access than the VIP packages typically sought by major donors.

Israel's Netanyahu Sends Mossad Chief To Qatar For Gaza Hostage Deal Talks



Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has dispatched a high-level delegation, including Mossad Director David Barnea, to Qatar for ongoing negotiations aimed at securing the release of hostages taken by Hamas during its October 7, 2023 attack on Israel. The Israeli delegation, which also includes heads of the Shin Bet security agency and military officials, is working towards a ceasefire in Gaza and the immediate freeing of hostages, Israel's Prime Minister's office confirmed in a statement on Saturday.

This diplomatic move comes after several months of mediation by the United States, Qatar, and Egypt. US officials, including President Joe Biden's representatives, have been involved in facilitating talks since the onset of the war. Biden, in his final days in office, acknowledged "real progress" in these indirect talks. However, the urgency of the situation remains high, with Trump, who will assume office on January 20, threatening severe consequences if hostages are not released by his inauguration.

The hostage situation emerged after Hamas launched an attack on Israel that killed over 1,200 people, mostly civilians. The attack also saw 251 individuals taken hostage, with 94 still held in Gaza, including 34 people whom the Israeli military has declared dead.

The escalating conflict in Gaza, which followed Hamas's assault, has resulted in significant casualties, with over 46,500 people killed in Gaza, mostly civilians, according to figures from the Hamas-run health ministry. This number is considered credible by the United Nations.

The announcement of the negotiations was positively received by the Hostages and Missing Families Forum, a group advocating for those held by Hamas, which described the move as a "historic opportunity" to secure the return of all hostages. The group emphasized the importance of exhaustive efforts to ensure the safe release of everyone still held in Gaza.

Impeached South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol to Skip First Hearing Over Safety Concerns

South Korea's impeached President, Yoon Suk Yeol, will not attend the first hearing of his impeachment trial scheduled for Tuesday, citing safety concerns, according to a statement from his lawyer, as reported by South Korean news agency Yonhap News. The hearing, which will take place at the Constitutional Court, will be pivotal in determining whether Yoon will be removed from office or reinstated.

The trial comes after Yoon faced widespread criticism and calls for his removal, with allegations of corruption and misconduct surrounding his administration. His impeachment was passed by the National Assembly earlier this year, leading to the formation of the Constitutional Court panel to evaluate the charges against him.

The decision to skip the hearing is significant, as it underscores the tense political environment in South Korea. Yoon's legal team has raised concerns regarding potential threats to his safety, adding another layer of complexity to the proceedings. The trial will see arguments from both sides, as Yoon's supporters seek to overturn the impeachment, while critics argue for his removal due to the charges against him.

Union Budget 2025 :CII suggests 10-point agenda on ease of biz reforms



Ahead of the upcoming Union Budget, the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) has outlined a 10-point agenda aimed at driving reforms to improve the ease of doing business in India. The agenda focuses on reducing compliance burdens, simplifying regulatory frameworks, and enhancing transparency to foster a more conducive business environment.

One of the key recommendations from the industry body is that all regulatory approvals at the central, state, and local levels should be mandatorily processed through the National Single Window System (NSWS). This system is designed to streamline approvals and reduce bureaucratic hurdles by providing a single platform for all regulatory requirements. CII argues that mandating the use of NSWS would create a more efficient and transparent process for businesses seeking approvals.

In addition to regulatory streamlining, CII has emphasized the need for faster dispute resolution mechanisms. The body has urged the government to improve the capacity of courts and increase reliance on alternative dispute resolution (ADR) methods. Avenue Supermarts, the parent company of DMart, India's leading food and grocery retailer, reported its financial results for the quarter and three guarters ending December 2024. The company saw a 4.9% increase in its consolidated net profit, reaching Rs 724 crore compared to Rs 690 crore in the same period the previous year.

However, despite the rise in profit, the company's net profit margin slipped to 4.5% for the quarter, down from 5.1% in Q3 of the last fiscal year. Total revenue for the quarter grew by 17.7%, reaching Rs 15,973 crore, up from Rs 13,572 crore in the previous year's corresponding

period. The Earnings Before Interest, Tax, Depreciation, and Amortization (EBITDA) for Q3 stood at Rs 1,217 crore, up from Rs 1,120 crore in the previous year, although the EBITDA margin decreased to 7.6% from 8.3% in Q3 2023.



For the nine months ending December 2024, the total revenue amounted to Rs 44,486 crore, compared to Rs 38,062 crore in the same

period of 2023. The EBITDA for this period was Rs 3,532 crore, an increase from Rs 3,160 crore last year, though the EBITDA margin also decreased slightly to 7.9% from 8.3% in the previous year.

Neville Noronha, CEO and Managing Director of Avenue Supermarts, commented on the company's performance, highlighting the increased intensity of discounting in the FMCG category, which has impacted store turnover in metro areas. He reaffirmed the company's commitment to being the preferred value retailer for customers near DMart stores or fulfillment centers.

In line with the growing trend in grocery e-commerce, DMart has seen a significant rise in demand for home delivery services, which now outpaces pick-up point sales. The company will continue to offer both delivery options but has increasingly shifted to home delivery in several towns.

India's Steel Demand to Grow by 8-9% in 2025, But **Supply Challenges Persist**

India is poised to maintain its position as one of the fastest-growing steel-consuming economies in 2025, with an anticipated demand growth of 8-9%, according to a report by CRISIL's Market Intelligence and Analytics. This growth will be largely driven by an increase in steel-intensive construction activities within the housing and infrastructure sectors, as well as stronger demand from engineering, packaging, and other industrial segments.

Despite the positive outlook, demand the report highlights concerns about domestic supply. While steel demand in India is estimated to have grown by 11% in 2024, challenges



persist in meeting this demand through domestic production alone. The supply concerns are further exacerbated by a rise in competitive imports and a decline in exports, which contributed to weaker production growth in 2024.

Finished steel imports surged by 24.5% in 2024, while exports declined by 6.4%, leading to a 3.2 million-tonne increase in finished steel availability in the domestic market. This accounted for 2% of total finished steel demand. The influx of imports, particularly from key exporters like China, Japan, Vietnam, and South Korea, has put additional pressure on domestic steel prices.

For example, between 2022 and 2024, finished steel imports from China more than doubled, with hotrolled coils (HRC) imports increasing by 28 times. HRC is used as feedstock for producing downstream products, and its imports, often priced lower than domestic HRC, have created price competition for Indian producers.



He expresses his disbelief, stating, "After seeing this, I don't want to open the other two," and urges Zomato to investigate the



matter further.

He tagged the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) and advised others to be careful when consuming food from outside establishments. He also added,

Emimah Rodrigues scored her maiden century in 50-over cricket, leading India to a dominant total of 370 for 5 in the second Women's ODI against Ireland in Rajkot on Sunday. "It has been a long wait to get this hundred," Rodrigues said during the innings break. "Glad that the team gave me a role at No. 4 and I could deliver."

Reflecting on her partnership with Deol, Rodrigues explained, "Initially, we took time to assess the conditions. While I took my time, Harleen spoke to me to keep believing in myself." She also highlighted the importance of staying till the 50th over, emphasizing the need for composure in such a high-scoring game.


