KTR Reaffirms Full Cooperation with ED, Slams Political Motivations

Hyderabad Jan 17: BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) underwent a lengthy seven-hour questioning at the Enforcement Directorate (ED) office today, in connection with the Formula-E car race case. KTR arrived at the ED office at 10:30 AM, where he was grilled by the investigation team on multiple aspects of the case, particularly regarding the transfer of funds to a foreign company without permission from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).

The ED has filed another case related to the payment of funds to a foreign company, citing violations of the Foreign Exchange Management Act (FEMA). During the investigation, KTR was questioned extensively about the movement of funds from the Hyderabad Metropolitan Development Authority (HMDA) account to a foreign entity, as well as the alleged breach of financial regulations.

After the seven-hour interrogation, several BRS leaders, including Balka Suman and R.S. Praveen Kumar, gathered outside the ED office, confirming that KTR's investigation had concluded for the day. They asserted that the questioning had ended without any significant revelations.

In the wake of the investigation, KTR issued a public challenge to Telangana Chief Minis-



ter Revanth Reddy. He claimed that the cases against him were politically motivated and biased. KTR emphasized his commitment to the truth, asserting, "I have done nothing wrong. I am ready for any investigation, whether at CM Revanth Reddy's house or even at a judge's house. I am also willing to take a lie detector

KTR further accused CM Revanth Reddy of facing his own legal issues and stressed that he would fully cooperate with any investigation. "I have fully cooperated with the ED and will continue to do so, no matter how many summonses are issued," KTR stated. "I respect the Indian legal system and will attend any investigation to clear my name."

KTR concluded by urging CM Revanth Reddy to select the time and place for further investigation, claiming he was ready at any time. He also called for an end to what he described as "bogus cases" that waste the time of investigating officials.

Hyderabad | **Jan 17:** Union Minister of State Bandi Sanjay has criticized Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy for releasing a campaign poster highlighting Congress' promises ahead of the Delhi Assembly elections. Sanjay expressed strong disapproval, claiming that the promises made by Congress were fraudulent and bound to lead to another defeat for the party, similar to past electoral losses in other states.

Sanjay highlighted that Congress had made similar false promises during the Haryana and Maharashtra elections, only to face setbacks as those promises were never implemented. He pointed out that the Congress' inability to deliver on its promises in Telangana was another example of their failure to fulfill electoral commitments.

Sanjay warned that the grandiose promises made by Revanth Reddy for Delhi would meet the same fate as those made in Telangana, stressing that they would ultimately fail. He criticized the Congress' approach as misleading and deceitful, declaring that another defeat awaited the party in Delhi, just as it had in previous elections.

Sanjay's remarks serve as a pointed attack on the Congress leadership, underscoring his belief that the party's strategy of making unfulfilled promises would not resonate with the electorate in Delhi.

BRS Moves Supreme Court Against 10 MLAs

BRS Seeks Disqualification of 10 MLAs Potential Political Impact in Telangana

Hyderabad | **Jan 17**: The Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) has approached the Supreme Court seeking the disqualification of 10 MLAs who were elected on a BRS ticket in the last Assembly elections but later joined the Congress. The party has stated in its petition that despite filing a complaint nine months ago, the Speaker has not taken any action against the defecting MLAs.

BRS has filed a Special Leave Petition (SLP) against Kadiyam Srihari, Tellam Venkat Rao, and Danam Nagender, while a writ petition has been submitted against the remaining seven MLAs. The party has also informed the Supreme Court that even though the High Court issued its verdict on the matter six months ago, the Speaker has failed to act, nor have the defecting MLAs received any notices.

The party has cited the Supreme Court's judgment in the *Kesham Meghchandra case*, which mandated



that the Speaker must decide on disqualification petitions within three months. BRS has urged the Supreme Court to direct the Speaker to take a decision within four weeks.

This legal move comes amid growing political tensions in Telangana, with the BRS accusing the Congress of engineering defections to strengthen its legislative majority.

The case is expected to have significant political implications, as a ruling in favor of BRS could lead to by-elections in multiple constituencies.

Bijapur Encounter: 12 Naxals Dead

Telangana | Jan 17: In a major security operation in Bijapur district, Chhattisgarh, 12 Naxalites were killed in an encounter with police forces in the Pujari Kankeru-Maredu Baka forest area. The incident took place along the Chhattisgarh-Telangana border, with the ongoing encounter still unfolding. Police officials recovered a Self Load-

ons from the scene, confirming significant firefights between the forces and Naxalite groups. Security forces have estimated that a large number of Naxalites may have been killed in the operation, though further details are still awaited as the encounter con-

The police operation is part of ongoing

ing Rifle (SLR) and several other weap- efforts to combat Naxalite insurgency in the region. Authorities have not disclosed the exact identities of the Naxalites killed but are continuing with their mission to neutralize extremist groups in the area. The clash marks another critical moment in Chhattisgarh's efforts to combat Naxal violence along the border regions with Telangana.

Kejriwal of Corruption

Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has launched a scathing attack on former Telangana Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR), Prime Minister Narendra Modi, and former Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, accusing them of corruption and misgovernance. Speaking at a press conference in Delhi, CM Revanth Reddy alleged that KCR looted Telangana's resources, while Modi and Kejriwal failed to ensure meaningful progress in Delhi.

During his visit to Delhi on Thursday, CM Revanth Reddy released the Congress party's guarantee posters for the upcoming Delhi Assembly elections. The event was attended by Delhi PCC President Devendra Yadav, Telangana Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy, and Congress MPs Mallu Ravi, Raghuveer Reddy, Suresh Shetkar, Shabbir Ali, and Sampath, along with several Delhi Congress leaders.

Addressing the media, CM Revanth Reddy asserted that the Congress government in Telangana is successfully implementing its electoral guarantees. He emphasized that eliminating corruption allows funds to be redirected toward welfare initiatives, cit-

He also accused KCR of misappropriating state resources and promised to disclose details of investment deals secured at the Davos summit upon his return. Taking aim at the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), CM Revanth Reddy claimed that Kejriwal's political alliance with the BRS (formerly TRS) was rejected by Telangana's electorate. He vowed to ensure a similar outcome for Kejriwal in Delhi. Additionally, he credited Sonia Gandhi for the creation of Telangana, highlighting her commitment despite political setbacks.

> Criticizing governance failures in Delhi, CM Revanth Reddy stated that the capital flourished under former Congress CM Sheila Dikshit but has since deteriorated under Kejriwal and Modi. He accused them of making Delhi unsafe and unlivable due to administrative negligence, worsening air pollution, and increasing political instability. Urging Delhi voters to support Congress, CM Revanth Reddy assured them that, if elected, the party would implement its promises just as it has done in Telangana. He concluded by asserting that Congress remains the only viable alternative for real development in Delhi.

Seethakka Orders Welfare Reforms

In a review meeting at the Telangana Secretariat on Thursday, she emphasized the importance of ensuring proper nutrition for pregnant women, lactating mothers, and children. She tion of an online system to address directed district welfare officers to undergo training to enhance service delivery in this regard.

Minister Seethakka urged officials to adhere to regulations, work without fear, and uphold public trust. She stressed the importance of accurate reporting, cautioning against concealing facts for political approval. She also highlighted the necessity of cooperation among officials, warning that errors could lead to legal consequences. She encouraged consultation with subordinates to resolve issues effectively.

Announcing financial measures, she stated that pending bills in the Panchayat Raj and Rural Development Department are being cleared, with NRE-GA payments amounting to ₹300 crore recently released.

As part of governance reforms, Minister Seethakka directed the introduc-



employment issues across all departments. She also introduced a feedback mechanism where parents can share their opinions on Anganwadi services through a monthly phone-in program. She warned that action would be taken against negligent staff based on public feedback.

KTR Defends Formula E Case, Targets CM Revanth Reddy

KTR stated that introducing Formula E to Telangana and placing Hyderabad on the global map was one of his significant achievements as a minister. He emphasized that no amount of political harassment, false cases, or mudslinging could diminish the success of this event. He reaffirmed his

Raghunandan Rao Alleges Land Scam Involving ₹1,500 Crore



TPN Correspondentm, Hyderabad, Jan 17: BJP MP Raghunandan Rao has accused certain Congress leaders of attempting to seize valuable land by exploiting legal loopholes. He claimed that while Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and Congress leaders in Delhi promised to reclaim lands allegedly misused by the KCR family under the Dharani portal, some ministers are now trying to appropriate them for personal gains.

Raghunandan Rao pointed to 450 acres of surplus land located between Kondakal village in Shankarapalli mandal and Velimala village in Ramchandrapuram mandal. He stated that in 1993, tribals were farming on this land and had appealed for land titles. The government later allocated 170 acres for industrial purposes, while the remaining surplus land was allotted to Velimala village, with the government directing that titles be issued to those in

He alleged that former TRS leaders had attempted to take control of this land, and one such leader has now joined Congress. Ultimately, 85 acres remained in dispute. On the 8th of this month, the High Court ruled that police should not interfere in these lands. However, despite this order, Raghunandan Rao claimed that police officials are constructing walls on the disputed land.

He further alleged that lands worth ₹1,500 crore (₹15 billion) are being tied up with a particular individual, raising concerns about corruption and unlawful land dealings. His remarks have intensified the political debate over land allocations and government actions in

Case Filed Against Former MLA Guvvala Balaraju

TPN Correspondent, Nagarkurnool, Jan 17: A case has been registered against former BRS MLA Guvvala Balaraju for obstructing police duties at the Bhramaramba temple in Achampeta, Nagarkurnool district. SI Ramesh filed the complaint against Balaraju after an altercation took place on Thursday night. According to the complaint, the police were preventing Balaraju from entering the temple, which led to a confrontation between him, the police, and BRS leaders.

The situation escalated when a scuffle broke out between Balaraiu's fol-



lowers and the police. Balaraju and his supporters sat in protest in front of the temple. The former MLA alleged that Inspector Ravinder, in

collusion with Congress MLA Vamsi Krishna, intentionally blocked his entry to the temple.

The dispute arose when Balaraju was reportedly not allowed to enter the temple while Congress MLA Rikudu Vamsi Krishna was present. The police have registered the case and are investigating the matter. Meanwhile, the judicial system has accepted the case suo moto, and Balaraju has demanded justice. The incident has created tension in the area, and further developments are awaited.

BJP MLA Raja Singh Sends Checklist for KTR Ahead of Possible Jail Time

Rama Rao (KTR), suggesting items to pack ahead of a potential jail sentence. Raja Singh, known for his strong remarks, posted the checklist on Twitter, making reference to the idea that "karma does not spare anyone."

In his tweet, Raja Singh humorously listed items such as four sets of clothes ("fashion should be there even behind bars"), a cozy blanket



("prison is not exactly cozy"), a towel, handkerchief, soap ("to maintain that 'clean image'"), a packet of pickles ("because prison food is not fivestar"), and a warm sweater ("winter is always colder than ever").

Singh further commented on the nature of political power, stating that those who abuse it to target others will eventually face the consequences. He ended with a reminder that karma waits for the right moment and never forgets anyone. This comment comes after Singh's own experience with what he claims to be false cases filed by the Congress and BRS governments, which led to his brief imprisonment.

CM Reddy Seeks Approvals for Telangana Projects



Revanth Reddy has requested the Union Minister for Forests and Environment, Bhupender Yadav, to promptly grant permissions for several development projects in Telangana. The Chief Minister met with the Union Minister at Indira Kalikasan Bhavan in Delhi and outlined various issues hindering the state's growth.

Reddy explained that 161 projects across Telangana have been delayed due to the lack of permissions from the Central Forest Department. Specifically, 38 projects are awaiting clearance under the Wildlife Protection Acts. He requested immediate approval for these pending projects, emphasizing the critical importance of these developments for the state.

The Chief Minister highlighted that many of these projects are located in remote and Left Wing Extremism-affected areas. As a result, vital infrastructure projects, including the construction of towers on national high-



Water Dispute Escalates Over Nagarjuna Sagar

TPN Correspondent, Hyderabad, Jan 17: Tensions over water distribution between Telangana and Andhra Pradesh are expected to escalate with Andhra Pradesh's plans to convert the Nagarjuna Sagar Right Main Canal (RMC) head regulator into another Pothireddypadu. This move is feared to deprive Telangana of its rightful share of Krishna waters, as Andhra Pradesh has already been diverting a significant portion through the Pothireddypadu Head Regulator.

Andhra Pradesh's Godavari-Banakacharla project aims to increase the drawl capacity of the Nagarjuna Sagar Right Main Canal, which supplies water for irrigation and drinking purposes. The project plans to store surplus water in the Bollapalli Reservoir, but Telangana worries this will further affect its access to Krishna waters, as it already faces issues with canal breaches and limited water flow.

Telangana experts fear that the expansion of the Nagarjuna Sagar RMC** could mirror the Pothireddypadu expansion, where the initial capacity of 11,150 cusecs was increased to over 55,000 cusecs in 2006. Andhra Pradesh's growing demand for water from both the Krishna and Godavari basins has added fuel to the ongoing dispute, with both states claiming their rightful share of resources.




Passengers Stuck Upside Down in Amusement Ride at Numaish, Hyderabad

ket, 30, a housekeeping staff—are all residents of Madhya Pradesh. The victims, Divya Bindu, a sex worker from Chhattisgarh, and Ankit, a native of Madhya Pradesh, were found murdered on January 12 at Puppalaguda hillocks. Initially, the police were unable to identify the victims but later gathered information about their activi-



According to Rajendranagar DCP Ch Srinivas, the primary accused, Rahul Kumar, had been a client of Bindu's After paying Rs 4,000 for her services, Rahul began recording their intimate moments, which Bindu objected to. After a series of confrontations, Rahul, along with Raj and Sukhendra, decided to murder both Bindu and Ankit

On the day of the crime, Rahul asked Bindu to provide services to Sukhendra. While Sukhendra and Bindu were occupied, Rahul and Raj took Ankit to a nearby spot, where they stabbed him multiple times and crushed his face with a boulder. They then killed Bindu the same way. The bodies were discovered later by locals. The police arrested the three suspects and recovered the victims' mobiles from them. They were presented before the court for transit warrants.

Sons Abandon Elderly Mother at Vikarabad Bus Stand; Sajjanar Condemns Act

Hyderabad Restaurant Criticized for Reusing Leftover Food

Child Falls from Terrace While Flying Kite in Nirmal Meerpet Resident Dies After Falling from Building Schoolboy Electrocuted While Retrieving Kite in Mahabubnagar Man Falls to Death from Dhaba Terrace in Yadadri Bhuvanagiri

TPN Correspondent, Hyderabad, Jan 17: A similar incident occurred in the Ran-The festive spirit of Sankranti turned tragic in Telangana as four people lost their lives in kite-flying accidents over the past two days. The incidents were reported in Mahabubnagar, Nirmal, Rangareddy, and Yadadri Bhuvanagiri districts on Tuesday and Wednesday.

In Nirmal town, an 11-year-old boy, Mohammed Huzef, fell from the terrace of his house while flying a kite. A sixth-grade student at Telangana Minority Residential School, Huzef lost balance while playing with his friends. He sustained severe injuries and was rushed to the hospital, where he later succumbed.

gareddy district, where 39-year-old K. Mahesh Yadav fell from a building while flying a kite in the Meerpet municipal limits.

In Mahabubnagar district, a schoolboy, Manoj Kumar, died of electrocution while trying to retrieve a kite stuck in electric wires. He used an iron rod to free the kite, which led to a fatal electric shock.

In Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district, Jupally Narender, 48, fell from the terrace of a dhaba while flying a kite in Ammanabolu village, Mutakonduru mandal. The terrace reportedly lacked a parapet wall. He suffered critical injuries and was taken to the hospital, where doctors declared him dead on arriv-

US TikTok Ban: A Devastating Move with Far-Reaching Consequences



United States could face a cultural and economic upheaval with the potential ban of TikTok, the wildly popular video-sharing app that boasts 170 million American users. The fate of TikTok lies in the hands of the Supreme Court, which is set to rule on whether a law passed by Congress last April will go into effect. If upheld, the ban would remove TikTok from American smartphones, with profound consequences for both the tech industry and global relations.

TikTok's rise has been meteoric, revolutionizing social media by offering a unique blend of short-form video content and an algorithm that tailors content to individual users. Its success has reshaped the digital landscape, making it the go-to platform for creative expression, particularly among younger generations. However, the app's growing dominance has also sparked serious concerns, particularly regarding data privacy and national security. The US government claims that ByteDance, TikTok's Chinese parent company, could be forced by Chinese laws to hand over sensitive user data to the Chinese government. Though these claims lack solid evidence, the fears are nonetheless significant and have fueled bipartisan support for a ban.

TikTok's defenders argue that such a ban infringes on free speech, with 170 million Americans losing access to a platform that has become a vital outlet for self-expression and creativity. The controversy has taken an ironic twist, with former President Donald Trump, who tried to ban TikTok in 2020, now emerging as an unlikely ally. He has urged the Suto continue operating in the US, despite the national valry.

The economic implications of a TikTok ban are considerable. In 2023, TikTok generated \$16.1 billion in advertising revenue, with the US serving as one of its largest and most profitable markets. A ban would severely impact TikTok's bottom line and could have ripple effects throughout the global tech industry. Additionally, the ban could set a dangerous precedent, paving the way for further restrictions on other Chinese tech companies, particularly in the areas of social media and e-commerce. This would intensify the ongoing technological cold war between the US and China, with global markets caught in the crossfire.

Beyond the economic fallout, a TikTok ban in the US could prompt retaliatory actions from China, further escalating trade and diplomatic tensions. In 2020, India banned TikTok, and competitors like Instagram Reels and YouTube Shorts quickly moved to fill the void. The US could see a similar shift, with existing platforms poised to capture TikTok's user base. However, the broader geopolitical ramifications are more concerning, as the TikTok saga is not just about an app—it's part of a larger battle for technological and economic dominance in the 21st century.

Science, Secrecy, and the Need for **Accountability in Preventing Future Pandemics**

The Covid-19 pandemic killed an estimated 7.1 mil- presidency, may reignite efforts to hold China aclion people worldwide and significantly impacted global life expectancy, yet no one has been held accountable for the crisis. As the world grapples with the consequences, the question remains: will the incoming US administration under Donald Trump take decisive steps to uncover the true origins of the virus?

Five years since the pandemic began, the origins of SARS-CoV-2, the virus responsible for Covid-19, remain unclear. Did it emerge naturally from Wuhan's wet markets, or did it leak from the Wuhan Institute of Virology (WIV), where research on bat coronaviruses was being conducted? What is evident is that China's government mishandled the early stages of the pandemic. The Chinese authorities censored early reports and suppressed information about human-to-human transmission, allowing the virus to spread globally. This mismanagement turned what could have been a local outbreak into an international health crisis.

While international investigations into the origins of Covid-19 were initially blocked by China, some countries, including the United States, have continued to probe into the issue. The Biden administration, however, downplayed any association between the virus and China, focusing on anti-racism efforts and disregarding calls to investigate China's role. This politically driven silence has hindered any meaningful inquiry into the origins of the pandem-

In contrast, the Trump administration could potentially revive the investigation into China's responsibility. Trump, who often pointed to China during his countable for the pandemic. However, for an effective investigation, full transparency from the US government is crucial. The National Institutes of Health (NIH) had been funding research on bat coronaviruses at the WIV as early as 2014, despite warnings about the safety standards at the lab. Furthermore, the WIV has been involved in secretive research for China's military since at least 2017, raising concerns



about the diversion of US-funded research into military projects.

To uncover the truth, the Trump administration should disclose the extent of US funding for research at the WIV and make available the data from collaborative US-China scientific programs. In addition to investigating China's role in the pandemic, the Trump administration must address the broader issue of "gain-of-function" research, which involves genetically modifying pathogens to enhance their transmissibility or virulence. This dangerous research continues in some labs across China, Russia, and the West, and represents a major existential threat to humanity.

Improving India's Pension System: Key Measures for the Upcoming Budget

As India prepares for the upcoming Union Budget, there are several measures that can significantly enhance the country's pension system, ensuring better financial security for retirees. Here are some suggestions for the government to consider:

Clarification Between NPS and UPS

In August 2024, the government introduced the option for central government employees to switch from the National Pension Scheme (NPS) to a Unified Pension Scheme (UPS). While specifics of the UPS remain unclear, it is expected to offer assured returns, which could strain public finances in the long term. However, if the UPS is perceived as similar to the NPS, it might mislead non-government employees into believing that the NPS also guarantees returns. It is crucial for the government to clearly distinguish between the two schemes to prevent confusion and ensure transparency.

Enhancing Choice Between EPF and NPS

The Employees' Provident Fund (EPF), a mandatory retirement savings scheme for private-sector employees, offers assured returns, while NPS is market-linked and provides potentially higher returns with a higher risk. However, participation in the EPF is mandatory only for employees earning less than Rs 15,000 per month, and it is voluntary for those earning more. The government should clarify this provision to enable

employees to choose between EPF and NPS based on their financial needs and risk appetite. By encouraging competition between these schemes, employees could make more informed choices to secure their financial future.

Introducing Partial Withdrawals at Retirement

Currently, the EPF only allows for lump-sum withdrawal at retirement, while the NPS mandates at least 40% of the corpus be used to purchase an annuity. However, annuities may not provide optimal value, especially in underdeveloped markets, and prevent



wealth from being passed down to heirs. Introducing partial withdrawals could provide retirees with a middle ground, allowing them to withdraw funds gradually while preserving their capital. Offering flexible annuity options or systematic withdrawal plans could also be beneficial, but these changes would require amendments to exist-

Leveraging NPS and APY for Gig Workers

Gig workers, a significant part of India's informal workforce, often lack retirement security. The government should focus on integrating gig workers into the existing NPS and Atal Pension Yojana (APY), both of which are scalable and flexible. The NPS is lowcost, allowing workers with irregular incomes to contribute when possible, while the APY offers guaranteed returns, ensuring financial stability for lower-income workers. The government should invest in digital tools, simplified enrolment processes, and awareness campaigns to improve access to these schemes, helping gig workers secure their retirement.

Evaluating International Diversification of Pension Funds

Currently, India's retirement savings are invested domestically, which limits the growth potential for savers. To enhance returns and stability, the government could consider allowing pension funds to invest in international markets. While concerns about risk remain, conducting a study on the risk-return trade-offs of international diversification could provide valuable insights. A committee could evaluate global best practices and simulate the impact of international investments in India's retirement portfolios, potentially opening the door to phased diversification in the future.

By implementing these measures, the government can strengthen India's pension system, making it more inclusive, flexible, and resilient.

Will the Israel-Hamas **Ceasefire Truly Lead to Peace?**

The recent Israel-Hamas ceasefire, set to begin just before Donald Trump's inauguration in January 2025, has brought both hope and skepticism regarding its potential to bring lasting peace. While the agreement aims to halt the violence in Gaza for 42 days, key questions remain about its long-term viability and the broader conflict it seeks to

Trump, who has taken credit for pressuring both Hamas and Israel into the ceasefire agreement, claimed it was a direct result of his historic victory in the 2024 elections. He expressed satisfaction with the outcome, declaring that his administration's approach to negotiations would lead to safety and peace for Americans and their allies. Special envoy Steven Witkoff was dispatched to Tel Aviv to secure the deal, emphasizing the urgency of achieving a ceasefire before Trump's inauguration.

While the ceasefire plan was initially proposed by Joe Biden and endorsed by the UN Security Council, both Hamas and Israel stalled negotiations, with Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu refusing to make concessions. However, the pressure from Trump and regional players, such as Turkey, Egypt, and Qatar, eventually forced both sides to come to terms. The ceasefire is set to exchange hostages, provide food and supplies to Gaza, and allow displaced residents to return to their homes. Yet, the real challenge lies in the second stage of the agreement, where permanent negotiations must address the underlying causes of the conflict. Will Israel be willing to end the war for good, and will the bitterness between Palestinians and Israel allow for a lasting peace?

The third phase, which involves Gaza's reconstruction, poses even greater challenges. The destruction caused by Israel's military campaign has left much of Gaza in ruins, with the international community questioning whether it is feasible to rebuild without guarantees that Israel will not destroy it again. Moreover, the issue of who will govern Gaza remains unresolved, as Hamas, even in its weakened state, is unlikely to be accepted by Israel or the United States.



Saif Ali Khan Stabbed in Spine, **Sustains Wounds in Attack at Home**

Bollywood actor Saif Ali Khan was attacked early Thursday morning at his Mumbai residence in Bandra, suffering multiple stab wounds. The incident took place around 2:30 am, when an intruder armed with a knife broke into Khan's home. The actor sustained injuries to his spine, neck, and hand and was immediately rushed to Lilavati Hospital, where he underwent surgery.

In a statement released by his PR team, Saif Ali Khan's condition was confirmed to be stable, and the family requested privacy as the investigation unfolds. "Saif Ali Khan is currently in the hospital undergoing surgery," the statement said.

Some sources indicate that the actor was stabbed six times while descending the building's stairs with his family.

"Anti-National": Mamata **Banerjee, Union Minister Trade Barbs Over Mohan Bhagwat**

TPN Correspondent Kolkata, Jan 17

Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Thursday slammed RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat's controversial statement that the consecration of the Ram Temple in Ayodhya marked "the true independence of Bharat," calling it an attempt to distort history.

Banerjee, a vocal critic of the BJP and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, strongly condemned Bhagwat's remark, calling it "anti-national." She asserted, "We are dedicated to keeping our independence intact, and we are ready to sacrifice our lives for India, but we will not tolerate this."

In response, Junior Education Minister Sukunta Majumdar of the Union government quickly fired back, labeling Banerjee as "anti-national" and referencing her refusal to provide land for the Border Security Force to build a fence along the Bangladesh border.

Banerjee's criticism of Bhagwat's statement about India's independence drew immediate support from opposition leaders, with Congress leader Rahul Gandhi also condemning the remark. Speaking at the inauguration of the Congress' new Delhi office on Wednesday, Gandhi claimed that had Bhagwat made such a comment in any other country, he would have been arrested. "To say India did not get independence in 1947 is an insult to every single Indian," he stated. The confrontation between Banerjee and the BJP is not just over Bhagwat's remarks but also points to a larger ideological divide. Gandhi accused the RSS and BJP of having "captured every single institution of our country," while asserting that the Congress party was now fighting "the Indian State itself."

BJP President JP Nadda responded to Gandhi's comments by accusing the Congress of having links with "urban Naxals" and a "Deep State" that seeks to undermine India's integrity. Nadda further attacked the Congress, saying its pursuit of power had compromised the nation's unity. "But the people of India have rejected this rotten ideology," Nadda added.

Centre Approves 8th Pay Commission to Revise Salaries, Pensions

Is Hindenburg Trying to Avoid Probe?

Questions Arise Amid Shutdown Announcement

The decision by US-based short seller Hindenburg Research to shut down has sparked widespread speculation and raised questions about its motives, particularly in light of its high-profile targeting of the Adani Group. The announcement by Hindenburg founder Nate Anderson comes just days before the inauguration of President-elect Donald Trump, adding a layer of intrigue.

- Founder Nate Anderson claims the firm has completed its projects.
- Announcement follows Supreme Court orders for a probe into Adani allegations.
- Experts and political figures cite potential motives linked to destabilizing Indian markets.

Senior lawyer Sidharth Luthra questioned the timing of Hindenburg's disbanding, especially as Indian and US authorities consider



a joint investigation into its allegations against the Adani Group. "If he [Anderson] is so certain of his findings, he should cooperate with the probe rather than shutting down," Luthra said.

Political analyst Rajat Sethi criticized Hindenburg for its alleged influence on India's financial markets, suggesting that the firm's actions spooked investors and

caused significant losses. "This is a sad day for investors and a misstep for those who relied on external agencies rather than India's own judicial and investigative systems," Sethi said.

Rajya Sabha MP and senior lawyer Mahesh Jethmalani described the shutdown as a sign of deeper implications, potentially involving scrutiny by US authorities or fears

of investigations related to targeting Adani Group shares. Jethmalani went further, alleging that Hindenburg's actions were part of a larger plot by what he termed the "democratic deep state" led by billionaire George Soros, calling it "economic terrorism" against India. Foreign Affairs Expert Abhijit Iyer-Mitra highlighted Hindenburg's lack of transparency regarding its operations, including undisclosed funders and employees. "For a company that claims to bring transparency, their own lack of it is alarming. The timing of this shutdown raises serious questions about external pressures or potential illegality," he remarked.

Hindenburg's abrupt disbanding has led to mounting speculation over its motives and the larger implications for India's financial markets. As the fallout continues, questions about accountability, transparency, and the potential for deeper geopolitical influences remain at the forefront of the debate.

"Conflicts, Wars to Become More Violent, Unpredictable": Rajnath Singh

Speaking at the 'Gaurav Gatha' event in Pune as part of the 77th Army Day celebrations, Singh emphasized the need for the Armed Forces to transform into a modern warfare machine to address these evolving threats.

Singh emphasized the necessity of a strong security apparatus for India's transition from a developing to a developed nation. "A secure nation with strong borders is essential for meaningful societal contributions. No nation can progress without a powerful military," he said.

Highlighting progress towards achieving 'Aatmanirbharta,' Singh shared that domestic defence production reached a record ₹1.27 lakh crore in the last financial year, while defence exports exceeded ₹21,000 crore, a sharp rise from ₹2,000 crore a decade ago.

"A nation like India cannot rely on others for its security. Today, we manufacture military equipment domestically and export them, making significant strides in self-reliance," he added. The government has introduced over 5,500 items in its indigenisation lists and is advancing reforms to strengthen the defence sector.

2025: Year of Defence Reforms

Singh announced that 2025 will mark the "Year of Reforms" for the Ministry of Defence, focusing on modernizing the Armed Forces and enhancing their capabilities. "With these efforts, India is on course to become Viksit Bharat and establish one of the strongest militaries in the world," he asserted. During the event, the Defence Minister virtually laid the foundation stone for the Army Paralympic Node at Dighi, Pune. He expressed confidence that the facility would inspire specially-abled soldiers to excel and contribute significantly to the nation.

US Removes Restrictions on Three Indian Nuclear Entities

In a landmark decision, the United States has lifted restrictions on three key Indian nuclear entities—Bhabha Atomic Research Centre (BARC), Indira Gandhi Atomic Research Centre (IGCAR), and Indian Rare Earths (IRE). The announcement was made by the US Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS), marking a significant step in strengthening India-US civil nuclear cooperation.

This move comes over a week after National Security Advisor Jake Sullivan revealed plans to remove regulatory barriers to facilitate a civil nuclear partnership between Indian and American firms.

Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Export Administration, Matthew Borman, stated that the decision aligns with the broader strategic goals of the India-US partnership. "The removal of these entities enables closer collaboration to secure resilient critical mineral and clean energy supply chains," he said. The India-US civil nuclear agreement, initiated in July 2005 during the tenure of Prime Minister Manmohan Singh and US President George W. Bush, was envisioned to allow the sharing of civilian nuclear technology between the two nations. However, its full implementation has been delayed due to regulatory hurdles.

Jake Sullivan, speaking at IIT-Delhi last week, acknowledged this gap, stating, "Though former President Bush and Prime Minister Singh laid out a vision for civil nuclear cooperation nearly two decades ago, we have yet to fully realise it.

TikTok Ban in the US??

The US will officially ban TikTok, owned by China's ByteDance, on Sunday unless a last-minute deal to sell the app to a US investor or intervention from the Supreme Court occurs. This marks the first attempt to block an app with a massive user base of 170 million domestic users.

The ban stems from a law signed by President Joe Biden in April, targeting US-based services crucial for TikTok's operation. This approach limits workarounds like VPNs or altering device settings. App stores like Apple and Google will remove TikTok, ceasing updates and bug fixes, while Oracle, which hosts TikTok's US data, is expected to halt operations.

Though users won't be forced to delete TikTok, its functionality will diminish, with uploading videos likely to be the first feature impacted. The app may display messages about the ban and allow users to download their data. Experts suggest that switching phone settings or using web versions won't fully restore the app's capabilities.

The move mirrors India's decision in 2020 to ban TikTok and other Chinese apps, citing security concerns. Experts believe this US action could encourage other countries to adopt similar restrictions on Chinese apps, amplifying global scrutiny of their data practices and influence on national security.

Washington Turns Fortress for Trump's Inauguration

In an unprecedented security operation, Washington, DC, has been fortified ahead of President-elect Donald Trump's inauguration on January 20. 

In its latest report on Asia Pacific Sovereigns, Moody's highlighted that while India's growth and inflation are stabilizing, its fiscal conditions remain a significant concern.

Moody's projected only a gradual fiscal consolidation for India, with the country's debt remaining well above the median of around 57% for similarly rated Baa peers. Despite increases in government revenue over recent years, India's debt affordability is expected to remain much weaker than that of other countries with similar ratings.

This frost inhibits wind movement, causing the dunes to stay immobile until the warming spring temperatures allow the frost to sublimate, releasing the sand.

Australian Woman Slams Chinese Restaurant For Charging Rs 32,000 For Live Lobster

What was supposed to be an enjoyable Friday night out quickly turned into a jaw-dropping experience for Reanna Ho, an Australian woman, when she received an eve-popping bill of approximately Rs 50,605 at a Chinese restaurant in Perth. Ho, dining with a group of eight, had ordered a total of eight dishes at Canton Lane Chinese Restaurant. However, it was the "live lobster" that significantly inflated the final cost, with one lobster alone priced at a staggering \$615 (about Rs 32,968).

Ho was informed by the staff that the price of the lobster would depend on its weight and market price, but she claims that no specific details were provided about the cost when the dish was brought to the table. After paying the hefty bill, she decided to call the restaurant the following

day to inquire about the charges. It was then that she learned the lobster weighed 4.5 pounds (2.04 kg) and was priced at \$120 (Rs 9,916) per pound.

In a Facebook post detailing her experience, Ho shared her frustrations, stating that while she had paid the bill, something felt off. She also pointed out that the restaurant did not inform her about the additional \$15 (Rs 803) charge for extra servings of noodles, further adding to the surprise cost.

Ho's post quickly gained attention on social media, with many expressing their disbelief at the high price of the lobster and the lack of transparency about the costs. The incident has sparked a wider discussion about dining transparency and the importance of clear communication between restaurants and customers, especially regarding pricing and additional charges.

While Ho's experience may have left her with a bitter taste, it serves as a reminder for consumers to always ask for clarification on prices and potential hidden costs when dining out.

Japan's Sea Women The Guardians Of Japan's Underwater Heritage

ff the coast of Japan's Ise Oma National Park, a unique tradition has endured for centuries, with women diving into the ocean to gather fresh seafood. These women, known as ama divers or "sea women," have relied on the sea for their livelihood, using only basic tools and their diving skills to harvest sea creatures such as urchins and turban shells from the seabed.

One such diver is Aiko Ohno, who moved to Ise-Shima from Tokyo nine years ago. "I just love the sea and being in the water," she shared with CNN. Equipped with goggles, fins, a weight belt, and a sukari (a mesh net attached to a floating ring), Ohno dives to depths of up to three meters, all without the aid of an oxygen

The ama divers follow a long-standing tradition of living in harmony with nature, deeply



respecting the ocean's resources. Ohno, 46, explains, "We coexist with nature — not catching too much, and being conscious of protecting it. It's a tradition that's

been passed down for thousands of years."

Despite the occasional rough waters, Ohno and her crew of free-

divers are quick in their work, with their nets filling with seafood in under 10 minutes. Age is no barrier for the ama divers while Ohno is one of the younger members, at 46, the oldest diver in the group is a sprightly 74.

However, the ama tradition is slowly disappearing, with fewer young women pursuing the craft. Currently, only around 2,000 ama divers remain in Japan, mostly based in the Ise-Shima region. Ohno noted, "Nowadays, very few of the amas' daughters become divers themselves, so I will likely be the only one in my generation to take over. But it's something I love."

Ise-Shima, a picturesque region known for its rich traditions and natural beauty, is home to these extraordinary women, preserving a deeply rooted way of life and their unique relationship with the ocean.






Sindhu and Kiran George Power Through to Quarterfinals at India Open Super 750
