





# Telangana, Singapore ITE Sign MoU

Hyderabad Jan 18: The Telangana state delegation, led by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, commenced its three-day visit to Singapore today. Accompanied by Industries Minister Sridhar Babu and senior officials, CM Reddy arrived early this morning from Delhi and was warmly welcomed by members of the Telugu community at Changi Airport.

Later, the delegation met with Singapore's Foreign Minister, Vivian Balakrishnan, to discuss strengthening bilateral ties in key sectors such as infrastructure development, power, green energy, water management, the Musi River revitalization project, education, skill development, and IT. The CM and his team also visited the Institute of Technical Education (ITE) in Changi City to explore its training programs and curriculum.

Young India Skill University Signs MoU with Singapore ITE

A major highlight of the visit was the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Young India Skill University and Singapore ITE. The agreement was formalized in the presence

of CM Revanth Reddy, Minister Sridhar Babu, and Special Chief Secretary Jayesh Ranjan.



## SC, ST Sub-Plan Funds Must Be Fully Utilized

Timely Utilization of SC, ST Funds Essential Departments Must Disclose Monthly Expenditure

Focus on Employment and Agricultural Growth Support for Displaced SC, ST Women

Hyderabad | Jan 18 : Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu has directed all departments to utilize funds allocated under the SC, ST Sub-Plan within the stipulated time. He chaired a review meeting with senior officials at the Secretariat on Friday to assess the implementation of the Sub-Plan.

Bhatti instructed officials to disclose department-wise expenditure details monthly, as mandated by the Sub-Plan Act. He emphasized that the funds should be spent effectively to improve the income levels of SC and ST communities and create long-term assets.

He directed officials to present a comprehensive report on Sub-Plan fund utilization and its impact at the upcoming review meeting on January 23. He also questioned departments that failed to meet their expenditure targets, asking for their plans to achieve full utilization within the next two months.

Officials presented a CESS report detailing the implementation of the SC, ST Sub-Plan over the past eight years. Bhatti inquired about the issues identified in the report and the corrective actions taken. He instructed CESS officers to submit their findings to the Finance and Planning departments and conduct regular follow-ups.

Emphasizing sustainable development, Bhatti proposed the use of solar-powered pump sets in forest areas and the cultivation of bamboo, avocado, and palm oil as intercropping projects. He suggested linking these initiatives with the Employment Guarantee Scheme to protect forests while enhancing Adivasi and tribal farmers' incomes.

Bhatti also directed officials to rehabilitate SC and ST women displaced by the Musi Rejuvenation Project by enrolling them in Self-Help Groups and providing interest-free loans. Additionally, he called for extensive self-employment schemes in urban areas, including the provision of transport vehicles and cleaning machines in municipalities and GHMC limits.

He urged financial support for SC, ST farmers and the restoration of lift irrigation schemes under the Indira Jala Prabha program. Bhatti instructed SC and ST department heads to collaborate with other departments to ensure optimal fund utilization before the financial year ends. Senior officials, including Special Chief Secretaries Ramakrishna Rao and Vikas Raj, Principal Secretaries Dana Kishore (Municipal Administration), Sridhar (SC Welfare), Sharat (ST Welfare), and Sundeep Sultania (Finance), attended the meeting.

# KTR Vows Resignation if allegations of Loan Waiver is Proven

KTR demands accountability on loan waivers, challenges Congress KTR takes on Revanth Reddy over unfulfilled promises to farmers BRS Working President KTR vows to expose Congress' failures

Rangareddy | Jan 18 : BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) has challenged Congress leader Revanth Reddy, stating that if it is proven that 100% loan waivers were implemented in any village of the state, all BRS MLAs would resign. KTR made the remark while addressing the Rythu Sabha in Shabad, Rangareddy district.

KTR ridiculed Revanth Reddy's recent speeches and promises, particularly those made during his visit to Delhi. "Revanth Reddy claims that he will uplift both Telangana and Delhi. But what about the promises he made here? He said he would waive loans in 100 days, but we see no results," KTR remarked. He also criticized Revanth Reddy for making exaggerated claims, calling them "nonsense."

Referring to the unfulfilled loan waiv-



er promise, KTR stated, "You said loan waivers for up to Rs. 2 lakhs would be completed by December 9, but nothing has been done. If any village in Telangana can show proof of the loan waiver, I will resign. You haven't even fulfilled the waiver in your own village, let alone the rest of the state," KTR said, targeting the Congress leader's credibility.

KTR also expressed concerns over the

scheme aimed at providing financial assistance to farmers. He accused the Congress government of withholding funds intended for farmers and claimed that the delay was politically motivated. "Under KCR's leadership, Rythu Bandhu was issued timely, especially during harvest.

Minister Prabhakar emphasized that the support price for yams has been set at Rs 7,550 per tonne, and farmers are encouraged to sell their yams at this fixed price. He assured that payments would be made to farmers



within 48 hours, along with a Rs 500 bonus for small farmers.

Regarding the Rythu Bharosa scheme, the minister explained that eligible beneficiaries, including those with agricultural land, would receive financial assistance.

Ration cards will be issued to all beneficiaries, and Rs 12.000 will be provided to landless farmer laborers. For arable lands, Rs 12,000 will be deposited in farmers' accounts in two installments annually. However, the scheme will not apply to lands with mounds, rocks, ravines, roads, and canals.

On January 7th, the minister also laid the foundation stone for the Husnabad-Ramavaram double road project in Siddipet District, which is set to be developed at a cost of Rs 25 crore. Minister Prabhakar reiterated that the new ration cards would be distributed starting January 26th, further supporting the state's agricultural community.

## KTR Alleges Corruption in Congress Leadership

BRS Leader Targets Congress on Farmer Guarantee and Corruption KTR Critiques Congress on Unfulfilled Promises to Farmers BRS to Continue Fight for Farmers' Rights and Reservations KTR Calls for Legal Action on Congress Allegations

Hyderabad | Jan 18: BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) has accused the Congress government of using the 'Farmer Guarantee" scheme as an election gimmick and claimed it will be withdrawn after the local body elections. Speaking to the media, KTR asserted that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy is only highlighting the scheme for electoral gains.

KTR announced that the BRS had launched a statewide protest in support of farmers, starting with a "Farmer Dharna" on Friday, followed by another planned in Nalgonda on the 21st. He criticized the Congress for failing to implement its promises, particularly concerning tenant farmers. "Revanth Reddy assured benefits for 22 lakh tenant farmers, but now he is silent on the issue," he remarked.

He further stated that former CM K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) had done unparalleled work for farmers, introducing schemes like Rythu Bandhu, Rythu Bima, and irrigation projects. KTR warned that the BRS would continue pressuring the government until it fulfills its promises.

KTR also challenged CM Revanth Reddy to take a live lie detector test at Jubilee Hills Palace to prove his claims. He accused the Congress government of wasting ₹10 crore in public funds on legal battles instead of using it for farmers' welfare.

Corruption Allegations Against Congress

KTR further alleged that a six-member gang, led by CM Revanth Reddy and his



associates, is extorting money from companies in Telangana. He named Tirupati Reddy, Kondal Reddy, Vem Narender Reddy, Ronin Reddy, Fahim Qureshi, and AV Reddy as part of this alleged extortion network.

He accused the Congress of engaging in land scams and blackmail tactics while attempting to divert public attention with controversies like Kaleshwaram and phone tapping. KTR also criticized the Congress government for failing to attract investments, despite promising

Furthermore, he demanded 42% reservation for BCs in local body elections and called out Congress for internal conflicts. He questioned why Rahul Gandhi withdrew a Supreme Court petition related to the National Herald case while criticizing BRS leaders for legal actions.

KTR concluded by reaffirming his commitment to exposing the Congress government's alleged misdeeds and fighting for farmers' rights.

## Narender Reddy Slams CM Over Farmer Betrayal

Former Kodangal MLA Patnam Narender Reddy strongly criticized Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy during the farmers' strike in Shabad, accusing him of betraying the farming community.

Speaking at the protest, Narender Reddy alleged that the government had deceived farmers by failing to fulfill its promises, particularly regarding the loan waiver scheme. "The Chief Minister has not even implemented 30 percent of the promised loan waiver in his own constituency," he claimed.



He further accused Revanth Reddy of having a history of sending farmers to jail in his own constituency and filing illegal cases against political opponents. "Revanth Reddy is credited with cheating even the gods by making false promises to waive farm loans," he remarked.

The farmers' strike in Shabad was organized to highlight the government's failure to support the agricultural sector. Narender Reddy emphasized that the protest was a warning to the government to fulfill its commitments and stop suppressing farmers' rights.

The event saw participation from several farmer leaders and opposition members, demanding immediate action on loan waivers and other pending promises.

#### Dharmapuri Arvind Challenges Revanth Reddy, KTR to Lie Detector Test

Telangana | Jan 18 : Nizamabad MP Dharmapuri Arvind has challenged Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) to undergo a lie detector test over their alleged involvement in corruption cases.

Speaking to the media in Delhi, Arvind demanded that both leaders be subjected to lie detector tests to uncover the truth behind the vote-for-vote case and alleged FEMA violations in the e-racing case. He questioned who instructed Re-



vanth Reddy to carry bundles of cash in the votefor-vote scandal and who guided KTR in violating financial regulations.

Arvind also accused Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal of massive corruption, alleging that Telangana leaders were taken to Delhi and involved in irregularities. He stated that he would expose the broken promises and fraudulent activities of Telangana's leadership to the public.

His remarks come after KTR, following an Enforcement Directorate (ED) inquiry, said he was willing to take a lie detector test. Arvind responded by challenging Revanth Reddy to do the same, suggesting that it would reveal the truth about both leaders.

The allegations have intensified political tensions in Telangana, with Arvind insisting that the people deserve transparency regarding the state's governance and financial dealings.

## **MP Chamala Kiran Slams** KTR, Alleges Massive Scams and Misuse of Funds

Bhuvanagiri | Jan 18 : Bhuvanagiri MP Chamala Kiran launched a scathing attack on BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR), accusing him of misgovernance and corruption during his decade-long rule. He claimed that KTR's political career was marked by inefficiency and deception.

Speaking to the media, Chamala Kiran alleged that several scams involving KTR would soon be exposed. "KTR is sure to end up in a mental hospital," he remarked, ridiculing the former minister's recent statements. He criticized KTR for failing to fulfill promises made in the 2014 and 2018 election manifestos, stating that less than 20% of the commitments were implemented.

Comparing their governance, Kiran said, "If KTR's government spent only ₹84 crore on farmers in 10 years, we have spent ₹50,000 crore in a single year . Additionally, we have waived off ₹21,000 crore in loans for 24 lakh farmers ." He justified the government's decision to provide farmer assistance only for cultivated lands, excluding roads,



land occupations.

Chamala Kiran further accused KTR of misusing HMDA (Hyderabad Metropolitan Development Authority) funds for personal gains and benefiting his associates. He insisted that KTR's remarks post-election loss were baseless and an attempt to mislead the public.

His comments add to the ongoing political battle between the ruling and opposition parties in Telangana, as leaders continue to trade allegations over governance and financial transparen-

## **Government Boosts Farmer** Welfare with New Schemes

Telangana MLC Jeevan Reddy highlighted the Congress govern-

ment's commitment to farmer welfare. stating that it is implementing initiatives unparalleled in the country. Speaking at the CLP Media Point, he criticized the previous BRS administration and the

He announced that starting September 26, the government will provide ₹12,000 per acre under the Rythu Bharosa scheme to support farmers. Additionally, agricultural laborers will receive ₹12,000 under the Atmiya Bharosa scheme. Investigations have revealed that the Amit Kumar gang, based in Bihar, is responsible for the shooting.

## **GHMC Introduces Modern Machines** for Enhanced City Cleanliness

The machine's performance will be further assessed before it is fully integrated into the city's sanitation system.

#### **Government Hospital Worker Arrested for Demanding** Rs 20,000 Bribe in Hyderabad

A senior assistant at the Government ENT Hospital in Koti, Hyderabad, was arrested by the Telangana Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) for allegedly demanding a bribe of Rs 20,000 in exchange for processing a retirement benefits file. The accused, R. Santhosh Tiwari, reportedly accepted Rs 3,000 from the complainant, with the remaining Rs 17,000 already taken.

The ACB acted swiftly upon receiving the complaint and apprehended Tiwari during the transaction. This incident highlights ongoing efforts by the ACB to tackle corruption within government departments.

In a separate incident last year, the ACB also arrested Dr. Lavudya Lachu, the superintendent of the Government General Hospital in Nalgonda, for accepting a Rs 3 lakh bribe from a medical distributor in exchange for a favor.



## Two Rajasthan Natives Arrested in Hyderabad with Heroin

Hyderabad | Jan 18: The Neredmet police arrested two Rajasthan natives for their involvement in drug trafficking on Thursday, January 16. The accused, Mahesh (28) and Mahipal (19), were apprehended with 190 grams of heroin and other incriminating materials valued at Rs 23 lakh.

According to police reports, Mahesh had traveled to Rajasthan. where he procured the heroin from a wholesale dealer in Phalodi district, paving Rs 1 lakh. He smuggled the drugs back to Hyderabad on January 10 and



them in the city. The duo used ride-hailing apps, including Uber,

joined forces with Mahipal to sell Rapido, and Potter, to transport the drugs to various customers across Hyderabad.

The police seized heroin, ten one-gram packets, two mobile phones, a motorbike, a weighing machine, and other materials. Efforts are underway to arrest the main supplier in Rajasthan and the customers who purchased the drugs in Hyderabad.

In related news, the Rachakonda police have made significant strides in curbing drug smuggling, seizing drugs worth Rs 88.33 crore from January 2024 to January 2025, including large quantities of ganja, heroin, and other substances.

## Protest at L&T Hyderabad Office Over Chairman's 90-Hour Workweek Remark

On Friday, January 17, the Centre for Indian Trade Unions (CITU) and the All India Democratic Women's Association (AIDWA) held a protest at the L&T office in Basheerbagh, condemning Chairman SN Subrahmanyan's controversial statement suggesting that employees should work 90 hours a week, including Sundays. The protestors demanded that Subrahmanyan retract his statement and issue an apology to the working class.

CITU Greater Hyderabad City president M Venkatesh, who led the protest, expressed outrage, referencing the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) report from 2022, which indicated the death of 11,486 workers across the country. He argued that implementing such a suggestion would turn workers into "slaves" by forcing them to work 15-hour days. Venkatesh also criticized the BJP-led NDA government's plans to introduce a 12-hour work shift per day with the implementation of four new labor codes from April.

The protest called for a 7-hour work shift, a 5-day workweek, a minimum wage of Rs 26,000 per month, job security, and the regularization of contract workers, as well as the elimination of the contract system. The demonstrators also denounced similar comments by Infosys chairman R Narayanamurthy.

## Shock to Telangana **Panchayat Secretaries**

- 99 Absent Secretaries Face Action



#### Fake Vehicle Insurance Scam Busted in Shamshabad

A major scam involving the creation of fake vehicle insurance policies was busted by the Shamshabad Airport Police. The fraud came to light when agents from Reliance Insurance identified counterfeit insurance documents and reported them to the police. This

scam involved a gang that deceived motorists by providing fake insurance policies, which were later rejected by insurance companies when claims were made. The police conducted a surprise raid at Thondupalli in Shamshabad and arrested three individuals: Mohammed Aves from Bahadurpura, B. Shravan Kumar Goud from Shamshabad, and M.

Shiva Kumar from Sardarnagar village. The gang was found to be involved in making fake vehicle insurance policies, as well as other forged government documents such as Aadhaar cards, voter IDs, PAN cards, and gas bills.

The police seized 22 fake insurance policies, computer hardware (CPU, hard disk, keyboard, and mouse), three smartphones, and soft copies of additional forged documents. The gang, operating as private RTA agents, used WhatsApp to share fake documents and processed fraudulent insurance policies from several major companies, including Reliance, Bajaj, and ICICI.

The accused admitted to using computer software tools like MS Office and Microsoft Paint to create these fake documents. The investigation is ongoing, with efforts to apprehend other members of the gang.

## Indiramma Housing Project Progress Reviewed

Hyderabad | Jan 18 : Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, Minister for Revenue, Housing, Information, and Civil Relations, emphasized that the construction of Indiramma Houses is an ongoing process aimed at providing homes to all eligi ble individuals. Speaking after a review meeting with Chief Secretary Shanthikumari at the Ambedkar Secretariat, Minister Reddy assured that those with house plots in the first phase would receive Indiramma Houses along with the plots in the second phase.

During the meeting, the need for establishing an engineering department dedicated to the construction of Indiramma

houses, the appointment of a revenue officer for each revenue village, and the hiring of additional surveyors were discussed in detail. The Minister directed officials to create two lists of beneficiaries in Gram Sabhas—those with residential land and those without.

Addressing concerns about the current workforce, the Minister noted that the Housing Corporation has only 274 engineers and requires 400 more for the successful completion of the project. He proposed that engineering personnel from other government departments be considered for the task.

The Minister also instructed officials to prepare an action plan for house construction within Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation limits and to ensure transparent selection processes for revenue officers and surveyors.

## Six Quintals of Fish Die in Tank in Telangana's Sircilla

Sircilla | Jan 18 : In a tragic incident, approximately six quintals of fish died in Bandam tank located in Ananthapalli of Boinpally mandal, Rajanna-Sircilla, on Friday. Fishermen discovered the mass fish mortality when they arrived at the tank for fishing in the morning.

Upon finding the large number of dead fish, the fishermen immediately alerted the fisheries department officials. The department arranged for a medical examination of the dead fish to determine the cause of the incident. While the exact cause of the fish deaths is yet to be confirmed, local fishermen suspect that the fish may have died due to the mixing of poisonous material in the water. The incident has raised concerns among the local fishing community, who are now awaiting the results of the investigation to understand the cause of this unexpected loss. The fisheries department is closely monitoring the situation and is expected to provide further updates once the medical examination results are available.



## Man Sentenced to 10 Years RI, Rs 1 Lakh Fine for Growing Ganja in Asifabad

Asifabad | Jan 18 : A man from Kishannayak Thanda in Jainoor, Rathod Pool Singh, has been sentenced to 10 years of rigorous imprisonment and a fine of Rs 1 lakh for cultivating a banned ganja crop in his agricultural field. The incident occurred in 2021 when Singh was caught raising the prohibited ganja crop in his field. ## One Nation, One Election: A Path to **Streamlining India's Electoral Process**

The "One Nation, One Election" initiative is set to transform India's electoral framework by aligning the electoral cycles of the Lok Sabha and State Legislative Assemblies. This ambitious proposal aims to address the challenges posed by frequent, fragmented elections, which often disrupt governance and lead to significant financial burdens. Backed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), the proposal was endorsed by the Union Cabinet in December 2024, paving the way for a potential legislative overhaul.

Historically, India held simultaneous elections for the Lok Sabha and State Assemblies until 1967, when some state assemblies were prematurely dissolved, leading to staggered election cycles. Since then, India has faced a continuous cycle of elections, increasing administrative costs, disrupting governance, and diverting crucial resources. The "One Nation, One Election" initiative seeks to restore the practice of synchronized elections and reduce the negative impacts of fragmented electoral processes.

#### The benefits of this proposal are manifold:

Cost Savings: Holding separate elections results in significant financial expenditure, with the 2019 general elections alone costing over Rs 60,000 crore. By holding elections simultaneously, these costs could be drastically reduced, optimizing the use of public funds.

Improved Governance: Frequent elections often lead to the imposition of the Model Code of Conduct (MCC), which restricts the government's ability to announce new policies or welfare schemes. Conducting simultaneous elections would limit these interruptions, enabling governments to focus on long-term developmental goals rather than short-term electoral gains.



Efficient Use of Resources: Elections require substantial deployment of security personnel and administrative staff. By reducing the frequency of elections, resources can be better allocated to other pressing governance tasks, ensuring smoother operations across the country.

Policy Stability: A synchronized election cycle would foster greater policy continuity, reducing the tendency for shortterm decision-making driven by imminent elections. Governments could focus on long-term strategies for national and state development.

Voter Engagement: With fewer elections, citizens would be called to vote less frequently, which could reduce voter fatigue and boost voter turnout, enhancing democratic participation. The implementation of the "One Nation, One Election" proposal would require constitutional amendments, particularly in terms of the duration and dissolution of legislative bodies. A high-level committee, led by former President Ram Nath Kovind, has recommended a phased approach to synchronization, starting with the Lok Sabha and select state assemblies. The committee also called for a unified voter ID system and a streamlined election process.

Ultimately, the successful implementation of "One Nation, One Election" promises to bring greater political stability, reduce election-related disruptions, and help India achieve its long-term goal of becoming a developed nation by 2047.

## Weakening Rupee: A **Call for Candid Economic Conversations**




The Indian rupee's recent plunge, breaching the critical 86-per-dollar mark, has raised alarms about potential economic challenges, including an economic slowdown, an expanding trade deficit, and mounting pressure on external balances. Driven by a combination of a robust US dollar and rising crude oil prices, the rupee has seen its steepest decline since early 2023. This drop has led to heightened concerns in the financial markets, with stocks and bonds feeling the strain. While the rupee remains one of Asia's more stable currencies, this recent depreciation carries inflationary risks, particularly by increasing the cost of imports.

The rupee has weakened by more than 2% since December, exacerbating the challenges faced by importers who are now confronted with the task of managing rising inflation. On the other hand, exporters may find a silver lining, as the depreciating rupee makes their goods more competitively priced on global markets. As geopolitical uncertainty looms with the upcoming Trump presidency, global markets are bracing for further volatility, adding to the pressure on the Indian economy.

One of the more immediate consequences of the rupee's decline is the likely delay of expected rate cuts by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). Despite a decrease in retail inflation to 5.22% in December, largely driven by lower food prices, the rupee's fall could prompt the RBI to hold off on rate reductions, further complicating the economic landscape.

At this juncture, it is crucial to focus on the national interest and avoid allowing politics to dictate economic decisions. A calm and measured approach is essential, with room for diverse perspectives on how to tackle the current economic challenges. A "waitand-watch" strategy could be the most prudent course, accompanied by candid discussions about the state of the economy and the potential pitfalls that lie ahead.

## 90-hour work week isn't always bad: Holidays and vacations are colonial hangover



The debate over work hours and the concept of vacations has been a topic of heated discussions in India, particularly following comments by Larsen and Toubro Chairman S N Subrahmanyan, who suggested a 90-hour work week. While some have misinterpreted his comments as advocating for extreme work conditions, it's crucial to understand that the ideals surrounding work culture in India are distinct from those in the West and should not be blindly copied.

India's work culture has always been grounded in a strong tradition of hard work, perseverance, and dedication. The rapid growth of companies like L&T, which has accomplished monumental tasks, including the construction of the Ram temple, stands as a testament to the success of such an ethos. Subrahmanyan's organization has flourished not because of an overemphasis on holidays or leisure, but through a commitment to excellence and completion of ambitious goals. Historically, India's approach to work has been shaped by ancient philosophies and practices. The values of the Bhagavad Gita and the Indian

The ideal of the "karmayogi"—someone who dedicates themselves to their work with devotion and without concern for worldly distractions—has been central to India's work culture. This focus on work over vacation is a reflection of deeper cultural values, which prioritize fulfilling one's responsibilities over seeking constant relaxation.

The idea of taking frequent vacations is often seen as a legacy of colonial rule. During British colonialism, the leisure time enjoyed by the British rulers was imposed upon Indians, not naturally part of the local work culture. This Western-centric concept of work and leisure has continued to influence the modern understanding of worklife balance, but it's important to remember that this may not suit India's unique socio-economic landscape.

Rather than focusing on reducing work hours or incorporating more vacations, India should rethink its work culture based on its values, aspirations, and needs. The focus should be on fostering an environment that promotes hard work, personal growth, and fulfillment, while still maintaining a sense of balance. By doing so, India can create a work culture that aligns with its traditions while enabling progress in the modern

# MAN DETAINED BUT NOT CONNECTED, SAY POLICE

Bollywood actor Saif Ali Khan, who was stabbed six times at his Bandra West residence on Thursday, is out of the ICU and recovering well, according to doctors at Lilavati Hospital. The actor underwent a fivehour-long surgery to remove a 2.5inch blade fragment from his spine. "Saif Ali Khan is doing excellent. He can walk well, and there is no problem or significant pain," said Dr. Nitin Narayan Dange in a press briefing. He also confirmed there is no risk of paralysis but emphasized that visitor movement would be restricted for a week to avoid infections.

The hospital's Chief Operating Officer, Niraj Uttamani, described Saif's arrival at the hospital, stating, "He walked in soaked in blood like a lion, accompanied by his son Taimur. He didn't even use a stretcher. He is a 'real hero.' If the knife had gone 2 mm deeper, the injury could have been far more serious."

# "My Husband Is Innocent," Says Detained Man's Wife

Mumbai Police have clarified that a man detained on Friday morning was not connected to the stabbing incident. Visuals showed the man being taken to the Bandra police station, and

initial reports suggested he might be linked to the attack. However, a senior police officer later confirmed no one had been arrested or detained in the case.

A new twist emerged as the police detained one Waris Ali, who was captured on CCTV exiting Saif's apartment building. His wife claimed he was a furniture worker called by Saif's manager to carry out repairs. "After finishing his

work, he went home. Cameras also show him leaving the premises," she stated. Investigations into the attack are ongoing, with no confirmed suspects or motive yet. Meanwhile, Saif Ali Khan continues to recover, with doctors monitoring his condition closely.



# Visa Operations In Bengaluru A Priority For US Visit: S Jaishankar

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar called the opening of the "long-awaited" US consulate in Bengaluru a significant milestone in India-US relations. Speaking at the site dedication ceremony for the new consulate, he emphasized the importance of starting visa operations as soon as possible and identified it as a key topic for his upcoming discussions with Secretary of State Nominee Marco Rubio.

Jaishankar noted that this consulate in Bengaluru would play a crucial role, particularly with the region's growing significance in the tech and business sectors. Referring to the high volume of passports issued by the Regional Passport Office in Bengaluru — 8,83,000 in

just one year — he highlighted the necessity of ensuring smooth travel and visa processing for citizens.

"I was checking figures, and I was very glad to see the passport numbers from Bengaluru," Jaishankar said. "This demonstrates the need for efficient visa operations in the city."

While the consulate will not immediately offer visa services, Jaishankar's address underscored Bengaluru's importance to both the tech industry and international relations. He emphasized that the city has long deserved a permanent US diplomatic presence, something the Prime Minister had raised during his US visit in June 2023.

The Minister also pointed out that India had agreed to open a consulate in Los Angeles if the US facilitated the Bengaluru consulate's establishment. This

diplomatic move, Jaishankar believes, will enhance collaborations in defense, education, and other sectors, pushing India-US relations to new heights. US Ambassador to India, Eric Garcetti, who will soon conclude his tenure, shared his pride in seeing the consulate's foundation laid during his time in India. Reflecting on the US-India relationship, he noted that India's mission was now the second-largest for the US globally, handling record numbers in visas, students, and military engagements. Deputy Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar, present at the ceremony, hailed the consulate's opening as a testament to Karnataka's growing global influence. He acknowledged Bengaluru's challenges but emphasized the city's status as the safest for global companies seeking to establish headquarters.

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has unveiled its manifesto for the upcoming Delhi elections, placing women and senior citizens at the forefront of its welfare agenda. Union Minister JP Nadda announced a one-time financial assistance of Rs 21,000 and six nutritional kits for pregnant women. Additionally, Rs 5,000 will be provided for the first child and Rs 6,000 for the second child.

The manifesto, titled Sankalp Patra, also includes the Mahila Smriddhi Yojana, aimed at empowering women through targeted benefits. Nadda assured voters that the BJP would implement the Ayushman Bharat health

scheme during its first cabinet meeting if elected, countering the ruling AAP's opposition to the central scheme. Senior citizens are promised an increased health cover of Rs 10 lakh and a pension scheme offering Rs 2,000-2,500 for those aged 60-70 years and Rs 3,000 for those above 70. The manifesto also introduces Atal Canteens in slums, providing full meals for just Rs 5.

Nadda criticized AAP's governance, labeling its Mohalla Clinics as "dens of corruption and inefficiency" and accused the ruling party of mismanaging public welfare initiatives.

The BJP's promises, particularly for women and senior citizens, signal its attempt to counter AAP's dominance in the capital while focusing on social welfare programs.

#### KANGANA RANAUT'S 'EMERGENCY' FACES PROTESTS IN PUNJAB

SGPC says 'govt will be responsible for disturbance...'

Kangana Ranaut's film Emergency is facing backlash in Punjab as the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) protests its release, accusing the film of misrepresenting Sikh history. The protests are particularly focused on the portraval of Sikh characters, especially Jarnail Singh Bhindranwale, a prominent figure during the 1984 Indian emergency. The SGPC has expressed strong disapproval of the film, calling it "politically motivated" and alleging that it tarnishes the image of the Sikh community. A member of the SGPC stated, "The history of the Sikh religion and the 1984 events has been distorted. We protested when the teaser was released, but no action was taken."

Amid heightened tensions, the SGPC has threatened to escalate protests if the film is screened in theaters. The committee has submitted letters to the Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann and the Chief Secretary, requesting a ban on the film. SGPC President Harjinder Singh Dhami stated, "We have urged the Deputy Commissioner of Amritsar to stop the release of the film. It misrepresents Sikh characters, and we will not allow this to be shown in Punjab."

A heavy police presence was seen at the PVR Suraj Chanda Tara Cinema in Amritsar, where the film was scheduled for release, as authorities braced for potential unrest.

# 'RESOLVE THIS OR WE WILL'

Top Court Warning To DMK & Governor

The Supreme Court on Friday issued a stern directive to Tamil Nadu Governor RN Ravi and the ruling DMK government, urging them to resolve their prolonged dispute over the appointment of vice-chancellors for state-run universities. The top court cautioned that if the issue remains unresolved by the next hearing, it will intervene to settle the matter.

The conflict revolves around the Governor's insistence on appointing vice-chancellors as the honorary chancellor of state universities, a move opposed by the DMK. The state government argues that the Governor is undermining the elected administration and delaying bills designed to limit his powers.

Justice SB Pardiwala, leading the bench, stated, "By the next date, if this is resolved... well and good. Otherwise, we will resolve it." The court emphasized the Governor's constitutional duties under Article 200, noting he has three options regarding bills: grant assent, withhold assent, or forward them to the President.

The DMK accuses Governor Ravi of deliberately delaying crucial bills, including those from the previous AIADMK-led government, and hindering state development. The DMK alleges that Mr. Ravi's actions reflect an attempt to "undermine the elected administration."

In November 2023, the Supreme Court criticized Mr. Ravi for keeping bills pending since 2020 and questioned his lack of action over three years. The court also addressed similar disputes involving the Governors of Punjab and Kerala.

Representing the Governor, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta argued that Governors are not mere "technical supervisors" and play a critical role in the legislative process.



## 8TH PAY COMMISSION ANNOUNCED

What Salary Hike Central Employees Can Expect?

The Union Cabinet, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the formation of the 8th Pay Commission, a move set to enhance the salaries and benefits of central government employees. The decision, announced on January 16, 2025, comes ahead of the Delhi Assembly elections and aims to support the workforce while boosting overall consumption.

On X (formerly Twitter), Prime Minister Modi lauded government employees, stat-

ing, "We are all proud of the efforts of all Government employees, who work to build a Viksit Bharat. The Cabinet's decision on the 8th Pay Commission will improve quality of life and give a boost to consumption." Key Expectations

The fitment factor serves as the multiplier used to calculate revised salaries and pensions. Under the 7th Pay Commission, it increased the minimum basic pay from ₹7,000 to ₹18,000. A similar adjustment under the 8th Pay Commission could lead to

The 8th Pay Commission will revise the existing structure set by the 7th Pay Commission, effective since January 1, 2016. While the exact salary hike percentage is yet to be disclosed, reports suggest an increase in the fitment factor from 2.57 to 2.86, potentially raising the minimum basic salary from ₹18,000 to ₹51,480.

# **ISRAEL-GAZA WAR: HOW FAR** IS THE CEASEFIRE?

NETANYAHU SAYS DEAL TO RELEASE HOSTAGES 'REACHED'

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu announced on Friday that a deal had been reached to return hostages held in Gaza, as tensions within his government and ongoing airstrikes complicated the implementation of a ceasefire to pause the 15-month war. Netanyahu's announcement followed earlier reports of last-minute issues in finalizing the ceasefire.

The deal, which would pause fighting in Gaza and secure the release of dozens of hostages held by militants, has been a subject of intense negotiations. In exchange for the hostages, Palestinian prisoners held in Israel would be released, and displaced Palestinians would be allowed to return to their homes in Gaza.

However, the ceasefire faces opposition within Netanyahu's coalition government, particularly from hardline far-right factions. On Thursday, Israel's national security minister, Itamar Ben-Gvir, threatened to resign if the ceasefire deal was approved, underscoring the political tensions surrounding the agreement.


Israeli airstrikes continued to target Gaza, with at least 72 Palestinians killed on Thursday. The violence intensified even as

Health Ministry reporting numerous casualties. Despite this, Palestinian officials expressed their hopes for the ceasefire, with reports of celebration in some areas. Egypt has played a crucial role in mediating the ceasefire talks, urging both Israel and Hamas to implement the deal without delay. As the ceasefire discussions continue, the international community is closely watching whether this deal will bring a temporary pause or lead to a more lasting resolution.

## "SUCCESS IS **UNCERTAIN**"

**Debris From Broken Starship Falls** From Space



Elon Musk's SpaceX Starship test ended in dramatic failure as the upper stage disintegrated over the Atlantic Ocean. The launch, from Boca Chica, Texas, aimed to showcase improvements in the world's largest and most powerful rocket, with the Super Heavy booster successfully decelerating from supersonic speeds. However, seven minutes after liftoff, the booster failed to maintain its integrity, causing debris to fall into the Gulf of Mexico. This marked the seventh test flight, following previous success in October, but a failure in November. Musk noted a significant oxygen/fuel leak that caused excessive pressure in the engine cavity, resulting in the mishap. He hinted at addressing the leak with fire suppression and increased venting. Despite the setback, Musk remained optimistic, suggesting that the next test could proceed by next month, pending further fixes and adjustments.



#### **CLOSER US-INDIA TIES CRUCIAL FOR SOLVING WORLD'S PROBLEMS**

The US-India partnership is vital for addressing global challenges, particularly in public health and pharmaceutical innovation, said Dr. Rahul Gupta, Director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP). As one of the highest-ranking Indian Americans in the Biden Administration, Dr. Gupta emphasized the importance of fostering stronger ties between the two nations to tackle pressing global

"Only when the United States and India work together can we truly solve the world's problems. This partnership represents where East meets West," Dr. Gupta told PTI, highlighting the transformative potential of the collaboration.

Strengthening Public Health and Counter-Narcotics

Dr. Gupta underlined three key pillars driving US-India cooperation: counter-narcotics, public health, and pharmaceutical supply chains. He praised India's ability to distribute COVID-19 vaccines globally, adding that a similar model could be extended to medications addressing addiction, diabetes, and hypertension.

## **CHINA SEES POPULATION DROP IN 2024, DESPITE INCREASE IN BIRTHS**

China's population has continued to shrink for the third consecutive year in 2024, despite a slight increase in the number of births. According to data released by the National Statistics Bureau on Friday, the total population dropped by over 1.39 million, falling to 1.408 billion. This marks a continued demographic challenge for the country, underscoring long-term risks for its economy. In 2024, approximately 9.54 million babies were born, an increase of 520,000 from the previous year. This slight rise may have been influenced by the belief that the Year of the Dragon in the Chinese zodiac is auspicious for having children. However, it still represents the second-lowest number of births since the founding of the People's Republic of China in 1949.

Demographer He Yafu attributed the uptick to many couples who had delayed childbearing during the three years of the COVID-19 pandemic. He warned, however, that the number of newborns is expected to decline again in 2025.

China's birth rate has been on a steady decline for decades, exacerbated by restrictive family planning policies, rising childcare costs, and changing social norms. The only exception to this decline occurred in 2016 when the government relaxed its one-child policy.

The shrinking population further widens the gap with India, which overtook China as the world's most populous country in 2023. India's population is nearing 1.45 billion, according to United Nations' estimates.

Bloomberg Intelligence forecasts that China's population will shrink to 1.36 billion by 2035, a level not seen since 2012. However, this projection may be delayed if couples are encouraged to have more children. In response to the demographic challenges, Chinese authorities have pledged to provide more support for families with multiple children, including assistance with housing, healthcare, and employment.

China's demographic struggles may eventually affect its economic growth, as a shrinking workforce puts pressure on productivity, while an aging population strains the pension system. In an effort to address these concerns, China announced plans to gradually raise the retirement age for the first time since 1978, despite facing public opposition.



## H1-B VISA REFORMS TO BENEFIT INDIAN TECH PROFESSIONALS

Major changes to the H-1B visa programme take effect today, January 17, aiming to streamline the process and enhance benefits for foreign professionals. The reforms are expected to significantly impact Indian techies, who constitute a large portion of H-1B

The US Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) announced that the updated rules will improve efficiency, clarify job eligibility criteria, and strengthen measures to prevent misuse. These changes align with the US government's efforts to retain global

talent and promote innovation in critical fields.

Indian professionals are set to benefit from key revisions, including simplified transitions for F-1 visa holders, expanded exemptions for nonprofit and research roles, and stricter compliance measures to ensure job authenticity.

#### Major Changes **Benefiting Indian Techies**

- F-1 visa students transitioning to H-1B will enjoy automatic extensions of their F-1 status until April 1 of the relevant year.
- This ensures lawful continuity in status and work authorisation



during the H-1B application process, easing challenges for Indian students pursuing jobs in the US.

Nonprofit and government search organisations with research as a core activity qualify for H-1B cap exemptions, even if research isn't their primary focus.

Beneficiaries spending at least 50% of their time

working for these organisations, even if not directly employed by them,

are also eligible. Employers must prove the legitimacy of "specialty occupation" roles.

- Supporting documents may be requested to verify job authenticity.
- Compliance with the Labor Condition Application (LCA) and legal presence in the US is now mandatory.

With over 755,000 individuals admitted on H-1B visas in FY2023, the programme continues to play a vital role in bridging global talent with US opportunities. ## **World Bank Projects** 6.7% Growth for India in 2025-26



The World Bank has pro-**■** jected India's economy to grow at 6.7% in the next fiscal year, beginning in April 2025, slightly higher than the 6.5% growth expected for the current fiscal year. Despite a slowdown from the previous year's 8.2% growth, India remains the world's fastest-growing major economy, outpacing both China and the

The World Bank's Global Economic Prospects report, released Thursday, highlighted the services sector's robust expansion, alongside the anticipated strengthening of manufacturing activity. This growth is expected to be supported by government initiatives aimed at improving the business environment, helping to maintain India's top position in global growth projections.

In contrast, the global economy is projected to grow at a modest rate of 2.7% annually from 2023 to 2026, with India continuing to lead the charge among large economies. China, which follows India in growth projections, is expected to grow by 4.5% in 2025,

before slowing to 4% in the following year. The United States is expected to experience slower growth, projected at 2.3% this year and 2% next year, down from 2.8% in 2024.

The report also pointed out the risks to global and Indian economic stability posed by potential adverse trade policy shifts. While the World Bank did not directly name US President-elect Donald Trump, it referenced trade tensions and tariff hikes as risks that could disrupt economic momentum. These changes in trade policies are noted as a significant threat to global growth, including for economies like India's, which are highly dependent on international trade.

India's projected growth rate aligns closely with the United Nations' forecast of 6.6% growth for 2025 and 6.8% in 2026. The World Bank attributed the current dip in India's growth to a slowdown in investment and weak manufacturing growth but expressed confidence in a rebound as structural reforms take effect.

## Indian stock market opens lower amid weak global cues

The Indian stock market opened lower ■ on Friday, with major declines in the IT and private banking sectors following weak global cues. At 9:30 AM, the BSE Sensex stood at 76,717.03, down by 325.79 points or 0.42%. Meanwhile, the NSE Nifty was at 23,225, down by 86.80 points or 0.37%.

On the National Stock Exchange (NSE), 1,118 stocks were in the green, while 1,039 stocks were in the red, reflecting a mixed market sentiment. Despite the overall decline, experts point to two positive factors that could support the market: the declining dollar index and US bond yields, as well as better-than-expected Q3 results from major companies like Reliance Industries and Infosys.

The Nifty Bank index was down by 470.55

points, or 0.95%, trading at 48,808.15, while the Nifty Midcap 100 and Nifty Smallcap 100 indices also saw declines of 0.38% and 0.10%, respectively.

Among the top losers in the Sensex pack were Infosys, Axis Bank, TCS, HCL Tech, and Kotak Mahindra Bank, while Re-

liance, Zomato, L&T, Sun Pharma, and Adani Ports were some of the top gainers.

Global markets provided little support, with the Dow Jones closing down 0.16%, the S&P 500 dropping 0.21%, and the Nasdag slipping 0.89% in the previous session. In Asia, markets showed mixed performance, with Seoul, Bangkok, and Japan trading in the red, while China, Jakarta, and Hong Kong were in the green.

Market analysts suggest that the correction in the market has made large-cap valuations more attractive. Nifty is currently trading at around 19 times the estimated FY26 earnings, making it an opportune time for long-term investors to buy quality large-cap stocks, despite the short-term volatility driven by foreign institutional investors' (FIIs) selling.





## Don't share OTP: Woman Falls to Work-From-Home Banking Scam via Instagram



A company spokesperson confirmed the disruption, explaining that users will not be

plaining that users will not be able to access notification summaries in the News & Entertainment category while using the affected beta versions. The move is seen as a temporary setback, and Apple is expected to address the issue in upcoming software updates.

This feature, designed to provide users with concise, AI-generated summaries of news app notifications, was introduced as part of Apple's efforts to improve the overall user experience. It aimed to help users stay informed with streamlined notifications, summarizing important updates without overwhelming them with excessive information.

Apple has been working to enhance its AI infrastructure, splitting costs between its own data centers and third-party cloud providers with whom it contracts. This flexibil-

ity in managing AI infrastructure helps the company optimize performance and reduce overall costs while advancing its AI technology.

The company did not specify the exact reason behind the temporary removal of the feature, but users of the beta software can expect the functionality to return once Apple resolves the issue. Until then, users can rely on traditional notification methods to stay up-to-date with news and entertainment updates.

As Apple continues to refine its software offerings, this temporary disruption highlights the challenges of integrating AI features into its ecosystem. However, it is also a reminder that software development is a continuous process, and issues like this are often addressed with updates to improve the overall user experience.

# Zepto's Discount Calculation On Checkout Page Triggers LOL Reactions

Zepto, the popular quick-commerce platform, has found itself at the center of an online debate after a Reddit user posted a screenshot of their baffling checkout page. The user, perplexed by the app's billing calculations, humorously captioned the screenshot, "I am too stupid to understand Zepto's maths, someone smart enough please help." The post quickly went viral as users on Reddit attempted to decipher the platform's puzzling calculations.

The order in question included two items: two 1-litre packs of Amul Ta-aza Toned Fresh Milk, each priced at Rs 112, and an Ambrane Type C to Type C Cable (60W) that had been heavily discounted from Rs 499 to Rs 19. Initially, the app showed the item total and GST as Rs 611.31. However,

after applying discounts, the amount dropped dramatically to Rs 231.31.

Further deductions were made, including a Rs 100 reduction from a promo voucher, listed as "Free Cash," and a handling charge that decreased from Rs 27.99 to Rs 11.99. Other fees, such as processing, rain, and delivery charges, were all displayed as Rs 0. Despite these substantial adjustments, the final bill amounted to Rs 145.29, with Zepto claiming the user saved a total of Rs 554.01.

While discounts are typically a welcomed feature in e-commerce, the perplexing nature of this cal-



culation has led to confusion and plenty of LOL reactions online. Many users questioned how the original price of Rs 611.31 was reduced to such a low final price, with some even joking that they could use a calculator to make sense of the math.

This incident has drawn attention to potential flaws in Zepto's billing system and raised concerns about transparency in pricing. While some Redditors enjoyed the humor in the situation, others expressed frustration, urging the company to clarify how discounts and adjustments are calculated to avoid further confusion for customers in the future

This victory marked Zverev's 28th Australian Open win, bringing him just one behind Boris Becker for the most by a German player.

Following the win, Zverev praised Fearnley for his remarkable progress, highlighting the 23-year-old Briton's journey from college tennis and the Challenger series to competing in the third round of a Grand Slam. "He's an incredible player," said Zverev. "Massive respect for him. He's only getting better."

Zverev, who made it to the semi-finals last year, has been consistent throughout this year's tournament, winning every set so far. He broke Fearnley early in the first set following a double fault and a welltimed rally to seize control. Despite Fearnley's resistance in the second set, another double fault handed



Zverev a break to edge closer to the victory.

In the third set, Zverev once again showed his resilience after dropping an early break. He quickly regained control, breaking Fearnley's serve to lead 4-2 before closing out the match with a final flourish.

Zverev had an outstanding 2024 season, but with runner-up finishes at the 2020 US Open and last year's French Open, the German is eager to capture his first Grand Slam title in Melbourne this year.
