It has come to light that the Congress high command has given Revanth Reddy the goahead for the cabinet expansion after his recent visit to Congress Leadership Clears Delhi. During this visit, Revanth reportedly submitted a list of potential candidates for the cabinet to the Delhi leadership. With approval from the top, the final decision on the timing of the expansion will likely be made after the Chief Minister returns to Hyderabad from his foreign tour.

As of December 7, 2024, it will have been a year since Congress took power in Telangana, yet six ministerial positions remain vacant. This delay has drawn criticism

Revanth Reddy is expected to return to Hyderabad on January 25, 2025, and the government plans to launch several key welfare schemes on January 26, in celebration of Republic Day. These include the Indiramma Atmiya Bharosa, Rythu Bharosa, ration cards, and Indiramma Indlu schemes. After the launch of these initiatives, the Chief Minister is likely to tour the districts. It is speculated that the cabinet expansion may coincide with these events.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between the Telangana government and STT GDC India. This 100 MW AI-ready data center will be equipped with advanced technoloand expandable infrastructure to accommodate future needs, making it one of the largest data centers in India .

Adilabad, Jan 19: A tragic incident unfolded in Adilabad district as a farmer, Jadhav Nagoharassment of bank officials. Unable to bear the pressure, he tragically took his own life by drinking pesticide in front of the bank.

While some villagers have already received their ration cards, there have been reports of confusion regarding missing names on certain cards. It is understood that individuals who applied during the caste census have already received their cards.

She recalled that under former CM K. Chandrasekhar Rao's leadership, the Telangana government officially celebrated Dasarathi since 2015, introduced

Jayanti since 2015, introduced the Dasarathi Literary Award, and named an auditorium after him. Kavitha stressed that Dasarathi's centenary is a historic opportunity to honor his legacy, urging the government to ensure his spirit and contributions are remembered by future generations .

Goud Slams Congress Over Irrigation Policies

Hyderabad | Jan 19: Former minister Srinivas Goud has accused Congress leaders of digging up the past while physically digging canals, claiming that if the irrigation sector's past mistakes under Congress rule were exposed, it would be like unearthing a pit full of snakes.

He credited former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) for the recent interim orders of the Brijesh Kumar Tribunal regarding Krishna water distribution. Goud questioned whether Section 89 of the Bifurcation Act, which was introduced by Congress, would have led to these orders if KCR had agreed to water distribution under it.

Goud pointed out that within a month of assuming office, KCR had written to the Centre demanding that water allocation be based on Section 3 of the Act. He criticized Congress leader Uttam Kumar Reddy, urging him to understand the facts before making statements.

Comparing Telangana's situation with Karnataka, he noted that while Karnataka's irrigation projects are

progressing at a rapid pace, the Congress-led government in Telangana is stuck in indecision. He accused the state government of failing to take effective steps to address the issue.

Challenging Congress MLAs from Mahabubnagar, he asserted that if they believe KCR did not contribute to the region's development, they should resign from their positions and prove their credibility by winning elections again.

Eatala Warns Government Over Demolition of Houses in Kapra

Hyderabad Jan 19: Malkajgiri MP Eatala Rajender issued a strong warning to the government following the demolition and marking of houses in Arundhati Nagar Colony, Kapra. On Saturday morning, affected residents approached him at his Shamirpet residence, seeking help after their homes were targeted. In response, Eatala immediately visited the colony to inspect the situation.

During his visit, Eatala stated that Jawaharnagar and Balajinagar are home to people from various parts of the country who have migrated in search of livelihood. He pointed out that these residents, mostly daily wage laborers, had purchased land under GVO numbers 58 and 59 by saving small amounts of money. However, he accused revenue and HUDA officials of harassing them, claiming that the land falls within their jurisdiction.

HYDRAA Takes Action Against Encroachment on Jagathgirigutta **Endowment Lands**

Hyderabad | Jan 19 : The Hyderabad Disaster Response Assets Monitoring and Protection Agency (HYDRAA) has taken note of encroachments on the endowment lands of two temples in Jagathgirigutta, Quthbullapur constituency. HYDRAA Commissioner AV Ranganath, during his inspection on January 18, revealed that encroachers have attempted to illegally seize these lands. A meeting with stakeholders will be held on January 22 to discuss the situation and initiate action against illegal structures.

Ranganath inspected the Govindaraju Swamy temple after reports of encroachment on the temple's 'gundam' (open well). He also noted illegal constructions on Venkatadri temple land by caste associations, with potential political backing. The total area under encroachment includes 14.10 acres of temple land and 66 acres of Parki Cheruvu.

The commissioner assured that legal action, including notices, will be taken against those encroaching or building unauthorized structures. A new HYDRAA police station will soon be inaugurated in Secunderabad to handle such cases. Negligence from government officials aiding encroachers will lead to strict punishment.

TGSPDCL Seeks Partners for Underground Cable Initiative

Telangana | Jan 19: The Telangana Southern Power Distribution Corporation Limited (TGSPDCL) has initiated the process of laying underground cables across the state, with a call for tenders from interested parties. This is part of the Telangana government's efforts to modernize and improve the state's power infrastructure. Companies with a proven track record of laying underground cables in major cities are encouraged to apply for the tenders, which are available on the TGSP-DCL website. Currently, Telangana has 498 substations and extensive overhead and underground cable systems. The move to underground cables is part of a feasibility study ordered by Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao, particularly focusing on the Outer Ring Road area of Hyderabad. The CM emphasized that underground cables can reduce power loss, curb electricity theft, and mitigate the effects of natural calamities. In addition, the CM highlighted plans to ensure uninterrupted power supply through alternative systems and to provide solar power and pump sets to households in tribal areas. He also called for progress updates on key substation projects, including the 400 KV substation in Parigi.



Conman Arrested After Attempting to Dupe Gold Trader



BCCI Imposes Strict Guidelines to Reinforce Discipline and **Unity in Indian Cricket Team**



Indian cricketers, particularly the male players, have long enjoyed a lifestyle of luxury and adulation, with fame and fortune accompanying their performances both on and off the field. Their popularity rivals that of Bollywood stars, and in recent years, they have delivered strong performances in international cricket, including winning the T20 World Cup in 2024 and reaching the finals of both the ODI World Cup and the World Test Championship in 2023. However, recent back-to-back losses in Test series against New Zealand and Australia have led to growing criticism and calls for accountability.

In response to these disappointing results, the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has issued a set of strict guidelines aimed at improving the discipline and cohesion of the senior men's cricket squad. These measures are designed to streamline the logistics of domestic and international tours while fostering a sense of unity among the players.

One of the most significant changes is the new travel policy, which mandates that players travel with the team for all matches and practice sessions. This move is intended to ensure that the squad remains focused and aligned, rather than allowing players to take independent trips. Along with travel rules, the BCCI has set up stringent baggage norms for players. Additionally, a new family travel policy has been introduced. While it is meant to support players' well-being by allowing family visits during tours, the policy is also designed to minimize distractions and encourage a more professional approach to the game, especially on foreign tours.

The changes are seen as part of a larger push by the team's head coach, Gautam Gambhir, who is known for his no-nonsense approach to cricket. As part of the new regulations, players will now be required to participate in domestic cricket matches in order to remain eligible for selection in the national team and retain their central contracts. Non-compliance with these new policies could result in players being excluded from lucrative opportunities such as the Indian Premier League (IPL).

While the BCCI's decision may be seen as a bold move, it reflects an increasing desire to push players out of their comfort zones and encourage greater professionalism. How the players adapt to these changes will be crucial to their continued success and performance in international cricket.

Organizing the Maha Kumbh 2025: A Blueprint for Mega Event Management



Organizing a mega event like the Maha Kumbh 2025 in Prayagraj requires meticulous planning and an unwavering commitment to ensuring a smooth and safe experience for millions of devotees. With an expected footfall of over 42 crore (420 million) people over 45 days, the Uttar Pradesh government has demonstrated exceptional organization and leadership under Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's guidance. The planning and execution of such a grand event set a benchmark in large-scale event management, one that will likely be studied in management circles worldwide.

The scale of the Maha Kumbh demands comprehensive coordination, a task that cannot rely on ad hoc measures. Infrastructure, logistics, and coordination across numerous departments are fundamental for success. The Uttar Pradesh government has declared the event area as a separate district, ensuring that the challenges of the Kumbh do not spill over into the daily life of Prayagraj city.

This district is divided into 25 sectors, each responsible for a range of essential services, including law enforcement, fire services, food supply, medical facilities, and transportation.

A key player in managing this operation is the Mela Authority, which oversees the cleanliness, safety, and maintenance of the venue. Accommodation for pilgrims, officials, and support staff is arranged through tentage contracts, with various options available based on comfort and budget. Hygiene is a priority, with food safety being closely monitored across all service

Water, sanitation, and waste management are other critical aspects of the event. With a large number of people attending, maintaining access to clean drinking water and sanitation facilities is vital to prevent the spread of disease, especially in the post-COVID era. Crowd management is another challenge. Routes are designed for optimal movement, with clear signage and

In the world of sports, retirement is a stark reality that athletes must face far earlier than corporate leaders. Most star athletes retire between the ages of 30 and 40, leaving behind not just their fame and glory but also the structure and discipline that define their lives. Unlike CEOs, who often work well into their sixties or beyond, athletes' careers are typically short-lived, and their window for success is much more limited.

Despite the early retirement, athletes put in their all during their prime, aware that their best years are fleeting and that the future will soon demand a transition to life beyond the sport. Their time at the top provides them with skills like discipline, resilience, and teamwork, which are transferable

to other aspects of life. However, many athletes struggle with the difficult leap into "normal life" post-retirement, something that most CEOs can never truly relate to. Corporate CEOs, on the other hand, have the luxury of time. They can plan their exit and groom successors over a period of years, yet many seem reluctant to let go of the power and influence they have accumulated. Just as athletes must recognize when it's time to retire, CEOs need to understand that stepping aside, with grace and foresight, can allow for new leadership and growth opportunities. Corporate India would benefit from embracing this mindset, ensuring that the next generation of leaders can flourish in an environment free from the weight of outdated legacies.4

Court Convicts Sanjay Roy in RG Kar Rape-Murder Case

Accused claims innocence, alleges being framed

The Sealdah court on Saturday convicted Sanjay Roy in the heinous rape and murder of an on-duty doctor at the state-run RG Kar Medical College and Hospital. The judgment, delivered nearly two months after the trial began, brought partial closure to a case that shook the nation on August 9,

While the victim's family welcomed the conviction, they insisted that others involved in the crime remain at large. "Sanjay's guilt was proven through biological evidence. However, he was not alone. Justice is incomplete until all the culprits are punished," the victim's mother said, citing DNA reports that confirmed the presence of four men and a woman at the crime

Sanjay Roy was found guilty under Sections 64 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita for rape, and Sections 66 and 103 (1), which deal with murder and capital punishment. The maximum

penalty includes death or life imprisonment. The sentencing is scheduled for Monday, allowing Roy a chance to present his statement before the final judgment.

As he was escorted out of the courtroom, Roy claimed innocence and alleged he was being framed. "I haven't committed this crime. The real culprits are free, and an IPS officer knows everything," he said. Roy also questioned the evidence, adding, "I always wear a rudraksha chain. If I had committed the crime, it would have been broken at the scene."

The victim's parents vowed to continue their fight for justice, demanding accountability for all perpetrators. "Until everyone involved is punished, we cannot sleep peacefully. We will keep knocking on the court's doors and seeking public support," the father said. The case, which saw an in-camera trial beginning in November, has reignited debates over safety in public institutions and the need for systemic reforms to ensure timely justice.



Suspect Detained in Saif Ali Khan **Stabbing Case**

Actor recovering after surgery; suspect apprehended in Chhattisgarh

A suspect linked to the stabbing of Bollywood actor Saif Ali Khan has been detained at Durg railway station in Chhattisgarh. The incident occurred early Thursday when an intruder attacked the 54-year-old actor in his Bandra home, leaving him with multiple stab wounds, including on his neck and near the spine.

The suspect, identified as 31-year-old Aakash Kailash Kannojia, was apprehended by the Railway Protection Force (RPF) based on leads from Mumbai Police. He was reportedly caught aboard the Mumbai-Howrah Jnaneswari Express and detained upon deboarding at Durg. Authorities confirmed his identity through a video call with Mumbai Police, and a team is on its way to Chhattisgarh to verify his involvement. Saif Ali Khan underwent emergency surgery at Lilavati Hospital, where doctors removed a 2.5-inch blade fragment lodged near his spine. The actor,

stabbed six times, is said to be recovering well. His wife, actress Kareena Kapoor Khan, recounted the harrowing attack, stating that the assailant appeared aggressive and fled without stealing any valuables.

CCTV footage captured the intruder entering and fleeing the building. Wearing a red scarf and carrying a backpack, he was later spotted at Bandra and Dadar railway stations before fleeing the city by train.

In a significant effort to capture the attacker, over 30 police teams were formed. Earlier reports suggested the detention of a carpenter who had worked at Saif's residence days before the incident, but authorities confirmed he was not the culprit.

Maharashtra's Minister of State for Home (Urban), Yogesh Kadam, stated that the motive was robbery and ruled out underworld involvement. The investigation continues as Mumbai Police work to confirm the detained suspect's role in the attack.

table development. "The exercise the Bihar government undertook was just to fool people. We do not want such a caste survey," Gandhi stated. He also pointed out that the current 50 percent cap on reservations for Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST), and Other Backward Classes (OBC) was insufficient and promised that Congress would work to raise this limit for the benefit of the majority population.

Furthermore, Gandhi took issue with RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat's recent remark regarding the true independence of India post the Ram temple consecration, calling it a direct contradiction to the principles outlined in the Constitution. He accused the BJP and the RSS of spreading hatred and undermining constitutional values, framing the ongoing political struggle as a fight between those seeking to protect the Constitution and those fostering division.

Gates, impressed by Trump's engagement, said, "I felt like he was energized and looking forward to driving innovation."



No Contradiction in Army Chief's Remarks on China Standoff: MEA

Army, MEA Aligned on Eastern Ladakh Situation

The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) on Friday dismissed claims of conflicting positions regarding the Line of Actual Control (LAC) situation in eastern Ladakh. The response came after Army Chief Gen Upendra Dwivedi remarked on the ongoing "degree" of standoff between Indian and Chinese forces in the region.

- MEA assures alignment between Army Chief's statements and official position.
- Recent disengagement at Demchok and Depsang seen as prog-
- Talks on de-escalation remain a priority for both nations.

"We do not see any contradiction between what the Army Chief has said and the position we have taken," MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal clarified. His statement followed Gen Dwivedi's comments that highlighted the need for broader mutual understanding to restore trust and calm along the border.

Recent Developments in LAC Situa-

On October 21, both nations completed troop disengagement at the remaining friction points of Demchok and Depsang, marking a milestone



in ongoing de-escalation efforts. The disengagement followed high-level discussions between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping during the BRICS Summit in Russia on October 23, where both leaders agreed to revive bilateral dialogue mechanisms.

Last month, NSA Ajit Doval traveled to Beijing and engaged in boundary talks with Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi, further emphasizing India's commitment to resolving disputes peacefully.

At a press conference earlier this week, Gen Dwivedi described the situation as "sensitive but stable," acknowledging the presence of a "degree" of standoff. He underscored the need for continued dialogue to address minor frictions, particularly those related to patrolling and

grazing rights, to prevent escalation. Addressing concerns over buffer zones, Gen Dwivedi clarified, "There is no such thing as buffer zones; these are temporary moratoriums on patrolling to avoid violence."

Reiterating External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar's statement in Parliament, Jaiswal noted, "Our objective remains ensuring patrolling to relevant points and resumption of civilian grazing as per longstanding practices. The disengagement terms reached in October 2024 continue to hold." Jaiswal also emphasized that the task of de-escalation remains unfulfilled but remains a shared goal. "There is absolutely no contradiction between the positions taken by the Army and the MEA," he affirmed. Both the Army and MEA are looking forward to the next round of Special Representatives talks on the boundary question, alongside consultations under the Working Mechanism for Consultation and Coordination (WMCC). Gen Dwivedi remarked that these meetings would provide essential guidance for future actions. With diplomatic and military channels active, India and China are focused on resolving the standoff while ensuring stability in the region.

12 Indians fighting for Russian army in Ukraine killed, 16 missing

India seeks repatriation of nationals misled into Russian combat roles.

Twelve Indian nationals have died fighting for the Russian Army in Ukraine, while 16 others are missing, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) confirmed. Among 126 Indians misled into joining the Russian Army, 96 have been repatriated, and 18 remain in combat, with efforts ongoing to ensure their

Prime Minister Narendra Modi raised the issue with Russian President Vladimir Putin during meetings last year, receiving assurances of the early discharge of Indian na-

Investigations revealed a human trafficking network lured victims to Russia under false pretenses, confiscated their passports, and deployed them on the battlefield. Police have arrested four individuals linked to the racket, while the government continues to



address cases brought to its attention. Foreign Minister S. Jaishankar strongly condemned the exploitation, emphasizing India's commitment to protecting its citizens. "It is unacceptable that any Indian is coerced into conflict roles," he stated.

Efforts are underway to bring back the remaining trapped individuals and take strict legal action against those responsible for this trafficking network.

"Suffering, **Everything Burned": Sheikh Hasina**

The 77-year-old leader, now residing in India, accused her political opponents of conspiring against her and thanked Allah for saving her life.

Sheikh Hasina fled Dhaka on August 5, 2024, with her sister Rehana, moments before a mob attacked her residence. "We escaped death by just 20-25 minutes. Allah must have a will for me, or I wouldn't have survived," she said in Bangla, referencing earlier assassination attempts, including the 2004 grenade attack and the 2000 Kotalipara bomb plot.

She tearfully added, "I am suffering, I am without my country, my home. Everything has been burned." Ms. Hasina accused her adversaries of a deliberate campaign to eliminate her. "The world has seen their conspiracy to kill me. I survived because Allah wants me to fulfill a purpose," she asserted. The political turmoil leading to her resignation stemmed from a violent student movement. Shortly after she stepped down, her bungalow was ransacked, looted, and vandalized by an angry mob. The crisis, which included attacks on Hindu minorities and clashes involving her allies, strained India-Bangladesh relations.



India's Economic Growth Set to Rebound: RBI Bulletin

India's economy is on track to rebound, with domestic demand gaining strength, according to the latest bulletin from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) released on Friday. The bulletin highlighted that rural demand continues to show growth, reflecting resilience in consumption patterns despite challenges.



The article, titled "State of the Economy," published the January edition of the RBI Bulletin, notes that India's economic growth is expected to accelerate in the second half of 2024-25. The article supports the projected pick-up in real GDP growth based on the first advance estimates from the National Statistical

Office (NSO).

However, the RBI also pointed to persistent concerns about food inflation, which remains sticky and requires close attention due to potential second-order effects. Although headline inflation eased for the second consecutive month in December, food prices continue to show significant volatility, which could affect overall economic stability.

The global economic outlook for 2025 shows mixed trends, with slower growth anticipated in major economies. While the US is expected to experience a loss of momentum, Europe and Japan are likely to see weak recoveries. Emerging markets and developing countries, including India, are projected to maintain more moderate growth profiles, while disinflation is expected to be more gradual compared to advanced economies.

Despite these global challenges, the RBI remains optimistic about India's growth prospects, largely driven by domestic demand. The bulletin emphasizes that high-frequency economic indicators show a strong upward trend in the second half of the financial year, confirming that India is on track for a stronger economic performance in the coming months.

The article was authored by a team led by Michael Patra, who recently demitted his role as RBI Deputy Governor.

India's Forex Reserves Fall by \$8.7 Billion to \$625.87 Billion Amid Market Volatility

India's foreign exchange reserves have experienced a significant drop, declining by USD 8.714 billion to stand at USD 625.871 billion in the week ending January 10, according to the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). This comes after a previous dip of USD 5.693 billion in the week ending January 3, when the reserves were recorded at USD 634.585 billion. The decline in India's forex reserves has been attributed to a combination of factors, including revaluation and interventions by the RBI in the foreign exchange market. These interventions are aimed at reducing the volatility of the Indian rupee, which has been facing pressures in recent weeks. The RBI has been active in stabilizing the rupee, a move that often requires drawing from the country's forex reserves.

The nation's forex reserves had previously surged to a record high of USD 704.885 billion at the end of September 2021, driven by a combination of robust capital inflows, foreign investments, and remittances. certainties contributing to the fluctuations. Despite the recent fall, India's forex reserves remain at a comfortable level, providing a buffer against potential external shocks and enabling the country to meet its international payment obligations. Analysts remain watchful of further developments in the foreign exchange market, particularly given global economic factors and domestic challenges.

The surveys, carried out between February and June 2024, focused on the likely existence The results of the survey reveal a of basic, complex, and intelligent extraterrestrial life. Emails were sent to astrobiologists and scientists from various related



fields, gathering a total of 521 responses from astrobiologists and 534 from non-astrobiologists.

or "strongly agreed" that it is likely that extraterrestrial life exists. This consensus supports the widely held belief that life beyond Earth is not only possible but probable, particularly in the context of basic life forms.

that there is no universal agreement on the specifics. Experts diverge when considering more complex or intelligent life forms, with opinions varying widely. The study underscores the growing confidence among experts that we may indeed find extraterrestrial life in the future, but it also reveals a cautious approach when it comes to more advanced life forms. Despite this, the overall outlook remains positive, with many experts in the field feeling that humanity is getting closer to answering one of the biggest questions in science.




