

PM Modi Tasks BJP Workers to "Expose" AAP Through Booth-Level Campaign

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, during the 'Mera Booth Sabse Majboot' program, called upon BJP booth-level workers to expose the shortcomings of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government in Delhi. Addressing workers across 13,000 booths, 70 assembly constituencies, and 256 mandals, he urged them to highlight civic issues by documenting poor conditions in their areas and sharing them with precise locations.

"You should take pictures of every street in your booth, make videos of areas with dirty water, broken drains, and garbage heaps, and share these with people," Modi instructed. The initiative is part of the BJP's strategy to connect with grassroots issues and emphasize the alleged failures of the AAP-led government in providing basic amenities.

The Prime Minister underlined the goal of forming a BJP government in Delhi to resolve the city's pressing problems, stating, "The resolution to make Delhi a developed capital of a developed India can only be fulfilled by freeing it from the troubles created by AAP."

Criticism of AAP and Congress

PM Modi sharply criticized both AAP and Congress for betraying the trust of Delhi's citizens during their respective tenures. Referring to the AAP as "two steps ahead of Congress in adopting destruc-

tive governance," he remarked, "Congress took decades to accumulate evils, but AAP inherited them within months and doubled them in nine years." Addressing the aspirations of Delhi's middle class, Modi lauded the BJP-led central government's contributions to infrastructure development. He highlighted initiatives like the expansion of the Metro network, national highways, and expressways, aimed at improving the ease of living and travel in the national capital.

"The middle class is the backbone of the economy, and the BJP has worked to meet their aspirations with modern facilities in education and health. In contrast, the AAP government has only burdened them with troubles and inefficiency," the Prime Minister added.

Call to Action for Booth Workers

Expressing confidence in the BJP organization's strength in Delhi, Modi encouraged workers to focus on grassroots efforts to secure a decisive victory. "With three to four generations of committed workers in every booth, I am confident that BJP will achieve massive success in the assembly elections," he said.

The Prime Minister's remarks come as Delhi prepares for a three-way electoral battle on February 5, with votes to be counted on February 8. The contest pits the ruling AAP against the BJP and Congress.

Arvind Kejriwal's Seven Demands for Middle-Class Relief

AAP Chief highlights tax burdens, asks Centre to address key concerns

New Delhi Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leader Arvind Kejriwal, in a strong appeal to the Centre, demanded substantial relief for the middle class, terming it "the government's ATM" and a victim of "tax terrorism." His statements come just two weeks before Delhi's February 5 elections. In a video message, Mr. Kejriwal criticized successive governments for neglecting the middle class while catering to vote banks based on caste, religion, or industrialist donations. He highlighted how the middle class shoulders massive tax burdens vet receives little in return, with over 50% of their income going to taxes.

Mr. Kejriwal emphasized that the middle class seeks basic aspirations like stable jobs, quality education, healthcare, and safety. Yet, high taxes and limited government support force young couples to reconsider family planning and even drive many to leave the country.

He outlined Delhi's achievements, citing increased education budgets, transformed public schools, and curbs on private school fee hikes. Additionally, he highlighted the success of mohalla clinics in middle-class neighborhoods and reduced utility bills.



AAP's seven demands from the Union Budget include

- 1. A hike in education and health budgets.
- 2. A nationwide cap on private school fees.
- 3. Subsidies for higher education.
- 4. Tax removal on health insurance premiums.
- 5. Zero income tax on annual earnings up to ₹10 lakh.
- 6. GST exemption on essential commodities.
- 7. Free treatment, robust retirement plans, and 50% train fare concessions for senior citizens.

Calling the middle class the country's backbone, Mr. Kejriwal urged the government to prioritize their welfare in the upcoming Budget. AAP MPs, he assured, will raise these concerns in Parliament.

Surge in Donations to Political Parties

Donations routed through electoral trusts following the ban on electoral bonds.

After the Supreme Court's landmark decision to scrap the electoral bonds scheme in February 2024, there has been a significant surge in donations to political parties through electoral trusts. The Prudent Electoral Trust, which received the largest share of contributions, directed most of its funds to the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), which emerged as the biggest beneficiary of this

According to reports from the Election Commission of India (ECI), the Prudent Electoral Trust received a total of Rs 1,075.7 crore in the 2023-24 financial year, with a significant portion, Rs 797.1 crore, coming in after the Supreme Court's verdict. This marked a sharp rise in donations compared to the previous year, when the trust raised Rs 363.16 crore.

Key corporate donors to the Prudent Electoral Trust included ArcelorMittal Nippon (Rs 100 crore), DLF (Rs 99.5 crore), Maatha Projects (Rs 75 crore), Maruti Suzuki (Rs 60 crore), and CESC (Rs 60 crore). In total, the BJP received Rs 723.8 crore from the trust, while the Congress, Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS), and YSR Congress also benefited, receiving Rs 156.35 crore, Rs 85 crore, and Rs 72.5 crore, respectively.

Similarly, the Triumph Electoral Trust reported contributions totaling Rs 132.5 crore, with Rs 130 crore com-



ing in after the Supreme Court ruling. Major donors to the trust included Cholamandalam Investment (Rs 50 crore), CG Power Industrial (Rs 30 crore), and Coromandel International (Rs 25.5 crore). The trust allocated Rs 127.5 crore to the BJP, while Rs 5 crore went to the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK).

Jayabharat Electoral Trust Sees Donations for the First Time

Meanwhile, the Jayabharat Electoral Trust, which had no donations the previous year, reported Rs 9 crore in contributions, with funds allocated to various parties. The BJP received Rs 5 crore, DMK received Rs 3 crore, and the All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (AIADMK) received Rs 1 crore.

The tragedy unfolded when passengers aboard the Pushpak Express, traveling from Lucknow to Mumbai, noticed sparks during braking and panicked, mistaking it for a fire. In a bid to escape the perceived danger, several passengers jumped onto the tracks, only to be struck by the incoming Karnataka Express.



H-1B Visa: We Have To Have Quality People Coming In

President Trump on the importance of skilled foreign workers for US businesses.

TPN Correspondent | Washington DC : US President Donald Trump weighed in on the ongoing debate over the H-1B visa program, which allows foreign workers to fill high-skilled positions in the US. Speaking at a joint news conference with notable business leaders including Oracle CTO Larry Ellison, SoftBank CEO Masayoshi Son, and OpenAI CEO Sam Altman, Trump reiterated his support for bringing "very competent people" into the country, noting that he himself has used the program.

"I like both sides of the argument, but I also like very competent people coming into our country," Trump told reporters. He emphasized that skilled workers, particularly in industries like technology, are crucial for expanding businesses and supporting innovation. While some of Trump's allies, such as Elon Musk, ad-

vocate for the H-1B visa to attract talented engineers, many of his supporters oppose it, arguing that it leads to job loss for American citizens. Trump, however, maintained that the need for skilled labor outweighs these concerns, stressing the value of highly qualified workers across various fields.

"We have to have quality people coming in," Trump added, referring to the essential role that foreign workers play in sectors ranging from engineering to hospitality. "People like Larry, he needs engineers; Masa also needs engineers. They need engineers like nobody's ever needed them."

Trump's comments reflect his broader stance on immigration, underscoring the importance of attracting skilled professionals to maintain US competitiveness in the global economy.

"Needs To End Now...": Court to Police on Bail Pleas of Umar Khalid, Sharjeel Imam

The Delhi High Court on Tuesday emphasized the need to conclude the prolonged bail hearing of Umar Khalid, Sharjeel Imam, and others accused of masterminding the February 2020 riots. The violence, which erupted during protests against the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) and National Register of Citizens (NRC), left 53 dead and several injured.

A bench of Justices Navin Chawla and Shalinder Kaur directed the police to specify the roles of each accused in the alleged conspiracy behind the riots. "This has to end. This can't go on like this. We can't give you endless time," the court told the police counsel.

that Sharjeel Imam and others delivered inflammatory speeches, including Imam's call for a "chakka jam" and references to "cutting the chicken neck" to block access to Assam. He argued

these speeches undermined the sovereignty of the country and were part of a premeditated plan.

The police claimed that the accused used women for stone pelting, managed protest sites strategically, and incited violence, resulting in the registration of 751 FIRs. The hearing has been adjourned to February 12 for further arguments.

Warmer Days for Delhi as Winter Chill Temporarily Eases

Delhi and parts of North India experienced a sudden rise in temperatures, with the city recording a minimum of 9.3°C on Wednesday, which is 1.8°C above the seasonal average. The increase in temperature is attributed to a strong western disturbance and southerly winds reaching the region.

Dr. Soma Sen Roy, a scientist at the India Meteorological Department (IMD), explained the phenomenon, stating, "This morning, Delhi's minimum

temperature was around 12°C due to a strong western disturbance and the arrival of southerly winds. Temperatures in north India will rise by 1-2°C, though no significant further increase is expected in Delhi."

- · Delhi's minimum temperature recorded at 9.3°C; maximum reached 24°C.
- A western disturbance and southerly winds caused the temperature rise.
- · Rain predicted in Delhi-NCR, Punjab, Haryana, and Rajasthan on January 23. The IMD also forecasts rain

for Delhi-NCR, Punjab, Haryana, Western Uttar Pradesh, and North Rajasthan today and tomorrow, as the western disturbance progresses. However, temperatures in Delhi may dip slightly from January 24 onwards as the disturbance moves away.

Despite the warmth, air qual-

ity in Delhi remained in the

'poor' category, with an Air Quality Index (AQI) of 262 at 9 AM, according to the Central Pollution Control Board. The maximum temperature is expected to hover around 24°C. January has already seen record-breaking warmth, with Delhi clocking its warmest January day in six years on January 19, when the maximum temperature reached 26.1°C. The last higher January maximum temperature was on January 21, 2019, at 28.7°C. Meanwhile, dense fog conditions persist in states like Ut-

tar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand,

Bengal, and Odisha.

Parvesh Verma accuses AAP of misusing Punjab's resources; Mann demands apology

The ongoing Delhi Assembly election campaign has sparked a fresh controversy, with BJP leader Parvesh Verma accusing AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal of misusing Punjab government resources and installing Chinese CCTV cameras in Delhi's slums. Verma claimed that the cameras, allegedly set up in haste, pose a security risk.

"Amit Shahji, you can't secure the country's borders or Delhi. Thousands of Bangladeshis and Rohingyas enter the country, yet you're labeling • Verma claims Chinese CCTV Punjabis as a threat. You owe

an apology to Punjabis," Mann said on X.

Kejriwal echoed Mann's sentiments, accusing BJP of disrespecting the sacrifices of Punjabis, including refugees who settled in Delhi after partition. "BJP's statements insult the martyrs and sacrifices of Punjabis," Kejriwal said in a post. With the Delhi Assembly polls set for February 5 and results on February 8, the clash over governance and campaign strategies has added fuel to the heated contest.

Delhi Polls Sees Most Number of Candidates On Arvind Kejriwal's Seat

Delhi is set to vote in a singlephase assembly election on February 5, with the counting of votes scheduled for February 8. A total of 719 candidates will be vying for 70 seats in the Delhi Assembly, with the New Delhi constituency seeing the most intense contest,

featuring 23 candidates.

- 719 candidates will contest the 70 Delhi Assembly seats. • New Delhi constituency sees the highest number of candidates-23.
- Kejriwal faces BJP's Parvesh Verma and Congress' Sandeep Dikshit.

Among the 719 candidates who made it past scrutiny, Arvind Kejriwal, the current Delhi Chief Minister and AAP leader, will be defending his seat against tough competition from Parvesh Verma, son of former Delhi CM Sahib Singh Verma, and Sandeep Dikshit, son of Sheila Dikshit. The high-profile contest in New Delhi underscores the growing political stakes in the capital. While New Delhi has the highest number of candidates, Patel Nagar and Kasturba Nagar have the fewest, with only 5 candidates each.

The election battle has grown increasingly heated, with AAP, BJP, and Congress accusing each other of corruption mismanagement, and heightening the drama as voting day approaches.

AAP, BJP, Congress Offer Cash Transfers, **Chase 'Women Power' in Delhi Poll**

With the Delhi Assembly elections just around the corner, all eyes are on the growing influence of women voters. On February 5, voters, including women, men, and non-binary individuals, will cast their ballots, and the results will be revealed three days later on February 8. This election sees the three major political parties—Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), and Congress—intensifying their efforts to secure the support of women voters, a group that has been the focal point of recent electoral strategies.

Women voters have become a critical factor in elections, with their votes contributing significantly to the results in states like Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh, where welfare schemes targeting women helped political parties secure strong victories. In Delhi, women make up over 46% of the electorate, with around 71 lakh women registered to vote, and this number continues to grow.

Recognizing the significance of this demographic, all three parties have introduced various women-centric schemes and financial incentives. The AAP was the first to announce a Rs 2,100 monthly cash transfer to women voters. This followed the BJP and Congress, who introduced their own promises, with both parties offering Rs 2,500 per month.

AAP's Women-Centric Prom-



ises The ruling AAP, led by Arvind Kejriwal, was quick to unveil its plans for women voters. Kejriwal, who is currently facing corruption charges, promised Rs 2,100 per month in cash transfers to women if they voted for his party. This amount is an increase from elections. the previous Rs 1,000 scheme, BJP's Support for Pregnant which was already in place. Additionally, Kejriwal promised to continue and expand the "free travel for women" initiative in state-run buses, which will now extend to female students. A 50% discount on Metro fares for women was also announced as part of the party's proposal.

Congress' 'Pyari Didi' Scheme Not to be outdone, the Congress party introduced its own women-focused welfare program. The party promised Rs 2,500 per month to women and announced that every woman would receive a "ration kit" every month. This kit would include essential items such as rice, sugar, cooking

help offset the rising cost of living. This initiative follows the success of the Congress' "Gruha Lakshmi" scheme in Karnataka, which saw women receiving Rs 2,000 per month and played a pivotal role in the party's victory in the 2023 state

Women The BJP, led by JP Nadda, is targeting pregnant women with a special welfare initiative. The party promised a one-time payment of Rs 21,000 to pregnant women, along with additional amounts for the first and second child. In addition, the BJP proposed Rs 2,500 per month for women. This focus on pregnant women is part of the BJP's broader strategy to appeal to women voters by addressing their health and financial concerns. As Delhi heads to the polls, the outcome of this election could depend largely on the decisions of women voters, whose increasing registration and interest in the election signal oil, grains, and tea leaves to their growing political power.

Congress Accuses AAP of ₹382 Crore Scam in Healthcare Sector

Congress leader Ajay Maken on Wednesday alleged that the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government in Delhi had committed a massive corruption scam worth ₹382 crore in the healthcare sector. Maken made these allegations during a press confrom the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG).

Maken accused the AAP government of misleading the public, stating that although the party had promised timely completion of projects while saving money, CAG reports revealed serious corruption. He highlighted that only three new hospitals had been constructed in the past 10 years, all of which were initiated during the Congress government's tenure.

Maken also pointed out that the construction of Indira Gandhi Hospital, Burari Hospital, and Maulana Azad Den-

ference, citing multiple reports tal Hospital faced significant delays—ranging from three to five years—and incurred additional costs. He emphasized that the CAG report noted ₹382.52 crore had been spent over and above the tendered amount for these projects.

Additionally, Maken referred to the acquisition of 15 plots by the Delhi government between 2007 and 2015, where no work had commenced. Furthermore, he revealed that ₹2,623 crore allocated for infrastructure projects between 2016-17 and 2021-22 had lapsed, suggesting poor financial management under the AAP government.

Sanjay Singh Alleges BJP Plans to **Privatize Education in Delhi**

Illegal Migrants In Millions...": Vice President Flags "Demographic Disruption" Concerns

No Bail For Tahir Hussain, Ex-AAP Leader And **Delhi Riots Case Accused**

Hussain, now a member of Asaduddin Owaisi's All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM), had sought temporary release to campaign for the Delhi Assembly elections scheduled for next month.

The bench, comprising Justice Ahsanuddin Amanullah and Justice Pankaj Mithal, delivered a split verdict on the matter. Justice Amanullah expressed concerns about the lack of progress in the investigation, criticizing Delhi Police for failing to examine key witnesses in the five years since the charges were brought. He pointed out that despite the serious charges against Hussain,

the murder of Intelligence Bureau officer Ankit Sharma, the trial had not progressed sufficiently, with only a handful of witnesses being questioned. However, Justice Mithal disagreed, emphasizing that Hussain's involvement in multi-

ple serious cases, including the Delhi riots, weakened his claim to be granted bail. Justice Mithal argued that allowing him to be released for campaigning purposes could set a dangerous precedent for other prisoners seeking similar reliefs for political reasons. In the hearing, Hussain's counsel argued that the police's failure to complete the investigation and frame charges in the UAPA case against him had led to prolonged detention. Hussain has been an undertrial for five years, and his lawyer sought a brief 15-day bail to enable him to campaign for the upcoming election.

Despite the compelling arguments from Hussain's legal team, the Supreme Court ultimately denied the bail plea, with the matter set to be taken up by a larger bench for further hearings.

India Mulls Lower Tariffs, More Imports to Counter Trump's Trade Threats

India considers trade strategies to address US President Trump's potential actions on trade surplus and tariffs.

India's government is actively considering a range of measures to counter potential trade actions by US President Donald Trump aimed at narrowing India's trade surplus with the United States. As India's largest trading partner, the US had a trade surplus of \$35.3 billion with India for the year ending March 31, according to the Ministry of Commerce.

In response to Trump's threats of increased tariffs and other trade restrictions, officials in the Narendra Modi-led administration have drawn up various scenarios. Among these options, India is weighing the possibility of reducing tariffs, striking a trade deal, and increasing imports of goods from the US. Some specific goods being considered for additional imports include whiskey, steel, and oil.

Chaudhry and Sana Amjad, back online after kidnap, torture, 'Will not bow down'

Pakistani YouTubers Sohaib Chaudhry and Sana Amjad have reappeared after being missing for over three weeks, alleging abduction and torture by members of a political group. Both vowed to continue their work despite threats against their lives.

In their first public appearances since their return, the duo claimed they were targeted due to their content, which often highlights comparisons between India and Pakistan and advocates peaceful relations. Sohaib Chaudhry shared his traumatic ordeal, stating that armed men entered his



home, kidnapped him, and pressured him to stop creating content.

Chaudhry, in a video shared after his return, issued a defiant statement, saying, "Sohaib Chaudhry was not afraid. He is not; he will never be. I'll expose those harming Pakistan while staying within the law." He hinted at releasing evidence of his ordeal, stating, "I don't know if I can upload another video. But if I can, I'll strip Pakistan's enemies naked."

Sana Amjad also detailed her harrowing experience, revealing that her family was victimized in an attempt to silence her. Despite the trauma, Amjad reaffirmed her commitment to continue creating

The Next 20 Months: A Defining Period for Congress in Karnataka



As the Congress government in Karnataka marks 20 months in office, it finds itself at a crucial juncture in its five-year term. With a third of its tenure already completed, the next 20 months will determine the party's future in the state. Historically, Karnataka has seen a trend where governments tend to lose their focus in the second phase, which often leads to a decline in governance and eventual electoral defeat. The state has experienced a revolving-door politics cycle since 1985, with no ruling party managing to retain a clear majority by the end of its term.

Key Principles for Success

There are three key principles that shape the fate of any state government: efficiency in governance, unity within the ruling party, and social harmony. A look at past administrations reveals that most have struggled with at least two, if not all three, of these elements. Failure to meet the expectations of governance, resulting in a loss of focus or efficiency, has historically led to the downfall of several governments.

Responding to Public Aspirations

Empirical evidence shows that governments are more likely to be re-elected when voters perceive them as delivering on essential governance indicators. A post-poll study by Lokniti after the 2024 Lok Sabha elections revealed that Congress's improved performance, particularly among women voters, was driven by the successful implementation of key guarantees. This was a significant factor in their recent by-election sweep. Therefore, maintaining a focus on governance that addresses the aspirations of different voter segments is a critical path to success. However, public perception can change dramatically in the face of scandals or controversies involving government leaders, which can shift focus from governance to crisis management. For Karnataka's Congress, the next 20 months will test whether it can overcome current challenges and maintain its governance momentum.

Avoiding Internal Divisions

Unity within the ruling party has

always been a crucial factor in ensuring electoral success. The Congress won the 2023 Assembly elections by presenting a united front, despite internal differences over the Chief Minister's post. However, since coming to power, internal strife has resurfaced, particularly between the camps of Siddaramaiah and D.K. Shivakumar. The Congress party has had to address these tensions, even as the BJP struggles with its own internal divisions. The next 20 months will be critical for both parties as prolonged infighting could lead to significant political fallout. A stable, unified leadership with a clear focus on policy continuity is essential for Congress to retain its hold on

The third pillar of good governance is social harmony, which includes ensuring law and order, women's safety, and peaceful inter-group relations. Maintaining social stability requires proactive measures and efforts to build confidence among various societal groups. In the coming months, the government will need to demonstrate its ability to manage these challenges effectively. Any failure to uphold social harmony can erode public trust and impact the Congress's standing in the state.

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) recently introduced a set of 10 guidelines aimed at curbing the growing "superstar culture" within the Indian cricket team. These rules, which echo standards from previous eras, have sparked significant debate. While some argue that they are a necessary reminder, others believe they reflect deeper issues that need addressing.

A Return to Basics: Why These **Rules Matter**

Many of the 10 diktats, such as mandatory availability for domestic cricket, attending all scheduled practice sessions, and staying with the team even after a Test series concludes early, were already in place. The concern now is that certain players, perhaps emboldened by their stardom, have ignored or bypassed these rules, potentially affecting team cohesion. The BCCI's move to reinforce these rules is not just about discipline; it's about fostering a sense of unity and accountability among players.

However, this intervention raises the question: Why were these basic principles not enforced earlier, especially when the team was performing well? Often, when a team is winning, complacency sets in, allowing star players to operate outside the established norms. Only when things start to unravel, as seen in recent Test performances, does the need to revisit these rules emerge.

CBI Seeks Death Penalty For RG Kar Rape Convict, Approaches Calcutta HC

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has approached the Calcutta High Court, seeking the death penalty for Sanjay Roy, the convict in the RG Kar rape and murder case. The lower court had sentenced Roy to life imprisonment, but the CBI argues that the sentence is inadequate given the heinous nature of the crime. In a move that has sparked significant controversy, the CBI contended that only the union government or the agency itself could challenge the sufficiency of the lower court's sentence. Bangladeshi national admits to attacking actor due to financial hardships and desire to help sick mother.

Shariful Fakir, the Bangladeshi national arrested for attacking Bollywood actor Saif Ali Khan, has disclosed the reasons behind his crime. Fakir revealed that severe financial strain and his mother's illness in Bangladesh drove him to rob a wealthy individual to fund her medical treatment.

In a police statement, Fakir explained that on the night of January 16, he targeted Saif Ali Khan's residence with the intention of stealing valuables. He had hoped to flee to Bangladesh with the loot and use it to support his ailing mother. Fakir confessed to randomly selecting Khan's residence as the victim, intending to steal from a rich target.

Fakir, who was working with a housekeeping company, had lost his job in December 2024, leaving him with limited funds. He had previously worked at a restaurant in Worli, earning ₹13,000 per month, most of which he sent to Bangladesh for his mother's treatment. Surviving on just ₹1,000 in Mumbai, Fakir saw the robbery as a desperate option after his second job

The attack on Saif Ali Khan occurred in the early hours of January 16, when Fakir stabbed the actor multiple times, including one injury to the neck. Khan was rushed to Lilavati Hospital, where he underwent emer-

Fakir was apprehended on January 19 at Hiranandani Estate in Thane while attempting to flee to his home country.

JDU Manipur Chief Pulls Support From BJP Govt In State, Party Sacks Him

Following this, the lone JDU MLA in the state assembly, Md. Abdul Nasir, has moved to the Opposition benches. The JDU's state unit chief, Ksh Biren Singh, officially communicated the withdrawal of support to Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla, stating that the decision aligns with the party's affiliation to the INDIA opposition bloc. However, the party immediately acted against him, removing him

from his position.

Top Maoist Leader Evaded Cops For Decades..

Jayaram Reddy, a top Maoist leader and mastermind behind the 2008 Nayagarh attack, was killed this week in a joint operation by central and state forces along the Chhattisgarh-Odisha border. Known by his alias "Chalapati," Reddy had evaded security forces for decades, but a selfie with his wife led to his identification and eventual de-

Reddy, who carried a bounty of ₹1 crore, was notorious for his role in the Nayagarh attack in Odisha, where 13 security personnel were killed, and the police armoury was looted. He had masterminded the escape plan for the Maoists and blocked police reinforcements by felling trees to obstruct roads. Reddy's elusive nature made him a significant target for authorities.

The turning point came in May 2016, when a selfie with his wife, Aruna (also known as Chaitanya Venkat Ravi), was found on an abandoned smartphone following an encounter in Andhra Pradesh. This discovery led to his identification, and a reward was announced for information on his whereabouts. To avoid detection, Reddy had started traveling with a personal security detail of 8-10 guards. Reddy's escape from Chhattisgarh's Bastar region and relocation near the Odisha border did not save him. He was

In First Quad Meet Under Trump 2.0, Clear Warning Sent to China

On his first day in office, US Secretary of State Marco Rubio convened the inaugural Quad ministerial meeting under President Trump's second term. Held in Washington, the meeting brought together Australia's Penny Wong, India's Subrahmanyam Jaishankar, and Japan's Takeshi Iwaya to discuss regional stability in the Indo-Pacific. The meeting concluded with a joint statement signaling firm opposition to any attempts to alter the status quo through coercion or force an implicit warning to China.

The Quad ministers reaffirmed their commitment to maintaining a Free and Open Indo-Pacific, emphasizing the importance of upholding democratic values, sovereignty, and territorial integrity. In a joint statement, they declared, "We strongly oppose any unilateral actions that seek to change the status quo by force or coercion." This was widely interpreted as a stance against China's claims over Taiwan and its assertive actions in the South China Sea.

- **US Secretary of State Marco Rubio** emphasized countering China's influence as a top priority.

China has consistently criticized the Quad, labeling it a US-led effort to encircle its rise in Asia. The grouping, initially envisioned by Japan's late Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, gained prominence as a leaders' summit under the Biden administration and now continues its strategic focus under President Trump.

The Quad's discussions reflected shared within hours of the inauguration of the Indo-Pacific, particularly regarding

Trump administration. This underlines territorial disputes involving the Philippines, a US ally. Analysts see the meeting as a message that countering Beijing remains a top priority for the Trump administration. SoftBank, Oracle, OpenAI to Build \$500 Billion AI Infrastructure in the US

Major tech companies team up for groundbreaking AI infrastructure project in the US.

US President Donald Trump announced a historic collaboration between SoftBank, Oracle, and OpenAI to invest up to \$500 billion in artificial intelligence (AI) infrastructure in the United States. The ambitious initiative, named Stargate, is set to transform the AI landscape with a focus on building both physical and virtual infrastructure necessary for the next generation of AI advancements.

The first construction phase is underway in Texas, with more sites under consideration.

At the White House on Tuesday, Trump hailed the project as a "monumental undertaking" that reflects immense confidence in America's technological potential. The collaboration, spearheaded by OpenAI's CEO Sam Altman, SoftBank's CEO Masayoshi Son, and Oracle founder Larry Ellison, will involve a \$100 billion initial investment, with a potential total investment of \$500 billion over the next four dominance in the global AI landscape.

"This is a resounding declaration of confidence in America's potential," Trump remarked, noting the scale and strategic importance of the project.

Stargate aims to develop "colossal data centers" and other critical AI infrastructure to meet the growing demands of AI technology. The project also intends to play a key role in the re-industrialization of the United States, with national security considerations at the forefront, according to OpenAI.

Key players in the project include the UAE's MGX technology fund, with major technology partners such as Arm, Microsoft, NVIDIA, Oracle, and OpenAI contributing to its development. The first phase of construction is underway in Texas, with further sites being evaluated across the country.

"This venture is not only about advancing AI, but also about ensuring that America remains at the forefront of the technology race," Altman said during the announcement. The news was followed by a surge in SoftBank's stock prices, reflecting the market's optimism surrounding the project. This investment comes at a time when the US tech sector is looking to secure its

Panama Canal Was "Not Gift From US"

22 US States Sue Trump Over **Birthright Citizenship Order**

A coalition of 22 Democratic-led states, civil rights groups, and immigrant organizations has filed lawsuits challenging US President Donald Trump's executive order to end birthright citizenship. The controversial order, signed hours after Trump took office, declares that individuals born in the United States will not be granted automatic citizenship if their mother was in the country unlawfully and their father was not a citizen or lawful permanent resident.

Legal experts argue the order directly contradicts the Citizenship Clause of the 14th Amendment, which has guaranteed citizenship to anyone born on US soil since 1868. This constitutional provision, established after the Civil War, was reinforced by the Supreme Court's 1898 ruling in United States v. Wong Kim Ark, which affirmed citizenship rights for children of immigrants regardless of their parents' status.

Massachusetts Attorney General Andrea Joy Campbell emphasized the constitutional stakes, stating, "President Trump does not have the authority to take away constitutional rights." Civil rights groups have also highlighted the broader implications, including loss of access to federal programs and voting rights for affected individuals.

The lawsuits, filed in federal courts across Boston, Seattle, and Maryland, argue that Trump's order exceeds presidential authority. Legal experts suggest that while the President can direct federal agencies to interpret citizenship narrowly, such an action would inevitably face legal challenges.

According to Saikrishna Prakash, a constitutional expert at the University of Virginia Law School, "Ultimately, this will be decided by the courts... This is not something he can decide on his own." Amending the Constitution to end birthright citizenship would require overwhelming bipartisan support, a near impossibility given the current political landscape.

The lawsuits underscore a broader opposition to Trump's immigration policies, with many viewing the order as part of his administration's agenda to curb unauthorized immigration. Federal courts are expected to issue temporary restraining orders while the cases progress, potentially culminating in a landmark Supreme Court decision.

Canada Warns of Strong Response to Trump's Tariff Threats

Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau issued a stern warning to US President Donald Trump on Tuesday, vowing a robust response if the US imposes a 25% tariff on Canadian imports, as Trump has threatened. Trudeau confirmed that Ottawa's reaction would be "robust and rapid," with a dollar-for-dollar matching of the tariffs.

Trudeau's remarks came at a cabinet retreat where officials strategized how to respond to economic threats posed by the new US administration. Trump had announced on his first day in office that he planned to impose tariffs on Canada and Mexico, citing concerns over immigration and the flow of illicit drugs like fentanyl.

The tariff announcement could affect a significant portion of Canadian exports, especially energy and auto sectors, which make up the majority of goods sent to the US. A Canadian government source revealed that potential counter-tariffs could include steel, ceramics, glassware, and orange juice, targeting specific US goods.

The economic ramifications of a trade war could be severe, with some forecasts predicting a 5% reduction in Canada's GDP, a spike in unemployment, and rising inflation. Trudeau warned that while the US would feel the impact, Canada would bear costs as well, but would not back down from defending its economic interests.

Australia Probes Possible Foreign Funding Behind Anti-Semitic Attacks

Australia is investigating whether foreign funding is behind a series of anti-Semitic attacks that have occurred in recent weeks. Prime Minister Anthony Albanese revealed on Wednesday that local criminals may have been paid by foreign actors to target Jewish communities in the country.

The wave of attacks includes the firebombing of a synagogue in Melbourne in December, the torching of a Sydney childcare center, car fires in predominantly Jewish neighborhoods, and vandalism of synagogues with red paint and graffiti. Albanese stated that some of these incidents appeared to be the work of "paid actors" rather than individuals with ideological motivations.

"It's unclear who or where the payments are coming from," Albanese said. The Australian Federal Police (AFP) have launched an investigation into whether these attacks were funded by overseas sources. Commissioner Reece Kershaw mentioned that authorities are exploring the possibility that local criminals were paid by foreign entities to carry out these crimes. So far, authorities have charged a 33-year-old man with attempting to set fire to a Sydney synagogue, and eight others have been charged in connection with a series of hate crime-related incidents dating back to November.

Uncovering **Ancient Ice Sheets Beneath** the North Sea: **New Insights into Climate History**

andforms buried beneath the North **L**Sea, formed by a massive ice sheet that existed around 1 million years ago, have been uncovered using advanced high-resolution imaging. These newly discovered features, dating back to the mid-Pleistocene transition (MPT), provide valuable insights into the glacial dynamics of the past and how they relate to shifting climate patterns.

A study published in Science Advances highlights the findings, which were detected using sound wave data. Researchers, including Christine Batchelor, a senior lecturer in physical geography at Newcastle University, suggest that these structures were left behind by a single, expansive ice sheet that covered regions from present-day Norway to the British

theories that multiple smaller ice sheets shaped the region during the MPT.

The ice sheet's movement created distinct patterns under more than 1 kilometre of sediment, offering a glimpse into how it advanced and retreated over time. These patterns are key to understanding the mechanics of past ice sheet dynamics. Grounded ice sheets sculpt the underlying sediment, producing both erosional and depositional features. Batchelor notes that streamlined features aligned with the ice flow direction were created during the ice's advance, while transverse imprints, such as crevasse-squeeze ridges, formed as the ice sheet retreated. These ridges develop when soft sediment is pushed into

Isles. This discovery challenges previous cracks at the base of the ice before it lifts off, often aided by water undercutting the ice.



Apeksha Chandurkar, a nutritionist and the founder of Balanced Bite, supports Agarwal's stance on brewing tea as a healthier alternative. She explains that brewing tea is a gentler process that helps maintain its delicate flavors and health-promoting compounds. "When tea leaves are brewed at the right temperature, they release their full potential. However, boiling the tea at high temperatures can destroy these delicate compounds, making the tea more bitter and less beneficial," Chandurkar said.

Furthermore, she acknowledged that Indian masala chai, which is typically boiled at high temperatures, could have some adverse ef-

fects if consumed regularly over time. The prolonged exposure to high heat during boiling can degrade the tea's antioxidants and other beneficial compounds, making it less effective in promoting overall health.

While brewing tea at the right temperature can preserve its flavor and health benefits, it's important to note that occasional consumption of boiled tea isn't likely to cause harm. However, for those seeking the maximum health benefits from tea, brewing it gently and avoiding excessive boiling could be a wise choice for the long run.






