Tensions Escalate in Gram Sabha

Public Outcry Over Welfare Scheme Beneficiary Selection

The selection process for beneficiaries under four major welfare schemes in Telangana has led to unrest in Gram Sabhas across the state. Villagers have raised allegations against officials, claiming that despite meeting eligibility criteria, their names have been excluded from the lists. The schemes in question include Indiramma Houses, Rythu Bharosa, Ration Cards, and Indiramma Aathmiya Bharosa, triggering dissatisfaction and protests among the public. Villagers throughout Telangana have confronted officials during Gram

The government has emphasized its intent to ensure that only eligible beneficiaries receive aid, with Ministers claiming that funds were misused in the past by favoring ineligible individuals.

Four Additional Judges Appointed to Telangana High Court

Hyderabad, Jan 23: The President of India has appointed four additional judges to the Telangana High Court. Justice Tirumala Devi, Justice Renuka Yara, Justice Narsing Rao Nandikonda, and Justice Madhusudhan Rao are set to take charge on Friday.

As per the President's order, Justice Tirumala Devi will serve as an additional judge until June 1 of the following year. Meanwhile, Justice Renuka Yara, Justice Narsing Rao Nandikonda, and Justice Madhusudhan Rao will serve for a term of two years.

These appointments are expected to alleviate the increas-

ing workload in the Telangana High Court, ensuring more efficient handling of cases. The new judges will play a crucial role in the functioning of the court, which has been under pressure due to a growing number of pending cases.

Additionally, Justice Sujoy Pal has been appointed as the Chief Justice of the Telangana High Court, marking another key development in the judiciary of the state.

The appointment of these judges is expected to strengthen the judicial framework in Telangana and contribute to timely delivery of justice, further enhancing the legal system's capacity to meet public needs.

Sanatana Dharma, commonly known as Hinduism, advocates for a society liberated from the limitations imposed by caste distinctions, asserting that caste is not an intrinsic characteristic linked to one's birth. This belief is founded on the idea that an individual's actions, character, and decisions shape their identity, rather than the family caste of their birth. This principle is clearly expressed in Chapter 4, Verse 13 of the Bhagavad Gita, which states that societal divisions are determined by qualities and actions (guna and karma) rather than by family and birth lineage. Lord Sri Krishna was born into the Yadu roy-

al family and, by nature, embraced the role of a cowherd caretaker. However, when the circumstances required it, he transformed into a warrior, engaging in battle against demons such as Kamsa and Narakasura. He served as an ambassador for the Pandavas, acted as Arjuna's charioteer, and emerged as a universal teacher through the teachings of the Bhagavad Gita. He exemplified the various roles associated with the divisions of labor, including Shudra, Kshatriya, and Brahmin. Additionally, Lord Krishna's sister married Arjuna, highlighting the acceptance of inter-caste marriages. This illustrates the fundamental message that individuals can assume any role based on greatness comes their preferences and inherent qualities.

The narrative of Lord Shiva, often portrayed as a wanderer in cremation grounds, serves as a compelling representation of this principle. Known as Layakaradu, he transcends societal conventions and embodies the notion that divinity is not restricted by caste or social status. His connection to the cremation grounds symbolizes a profound relationship with the cycle of life and death, reinforcing the idea that spiritual advancement is available to everyone, irrespective of their social position.

In a similar vein, the tale of King Satyaharichandra, who assumed the role of a caretaker in a cremation ground, exemplifies the rejection of caste hierarchies. His actions reflect a deep sense of duty and service, illustrating that nobility and honor stem from one's deeds rather than their

The character of Dronacharya, a Brahmin teacher who fought bravely on the battlefield of Kurukshetra, further exemplifies this principle. Despite his Brahmin background, his courage and dedication to his role as a warrior emphasize that an individual's place in society is defined by their choices and actions, not solely by their caste identity.

The Rishi Vedavyas, born to a fisherwoman, is well-known for his pivotal role in the survival of the Kuru dynasty and as the author of the Mahabharata epic. These examples collectively demonstrate that greatness and leadership can emerge from any background, effectively challenging the rigid caste system.

Hyderabad, Jan 23: The Income Tax (IT) department is continuing its raids on the residences of prominent film industry figures, including director Sukumar, for the second consecutive day. Sukumar's residence, along with the offices of producer Dil Raju, Telangana Film Development ing.

Raids target Sukumar, Dil Raju, and Corporation (FDC) Chairman, and major production companies like Mythri Movie
IT officials have also questioned Dil Raju Makers, Mango Media, and Venkateswara Creations, are being searched by IT officials.

> The investigation focuses on Sukumar's remuneration for the film Pushpa 2, his sources of income, and related tax payments. IT teams have conducted coordinated raids at multiple locations, including Banjara Hills, Jubilee Hills, Kondapur, and Gachibowli. A total of 55 teams are involved in the searches across eight locations in Hyderabad since Tuesday morn

regarding investments and income related to films produced by his companies. BJP MP Rajender Calls for Justice Over Land Disputes

Hyderabad, **Jan 23:** BJP MP Eetala Rajender has expressed strong concerns over the demolition of houses built by poor families in Korremula village, Hyderabad, in the name of land clearance. Speaking at the BJP office, he condemned the unjust demolitions, which, he says, are part of a larger effort to snatch lands from the poor.

Rajender outlined the background of the incident, stating that plots numbered 739 to 749 in Korremula village were bought legally by 276 people in 1985. These plots, he clarified, were not agricultural land. However, he accused a person named Srinivas of demolishing the houses of these families. Additionally, he mentioned that a man named Venkatesh had been involved in illegal activities and intimidation in the area.

The BJP leader demanded an explanation from Chief Minister Revanth Reddy regarding the safety and security of the affected families. He criticized the government's failure to protect the poor and expressed his intent to seek justice through the Human Rights Commission and courts.

Rajender reiterated that the BJP stands by the poor and called for a government committee to investigate the land disputes around Hyderabad. He also emphasized that while he had no personal animosity, the authorities responsible for creating fake documents and selling lands should be held accountable.

Rajender concluded by stressing that despite any legal challenges, he would continue to fight for the rights of the poor.



Minister Offers Another Opportunity for Scheme Applicants

Seethakka Slams BRS for Chaos in Beneficiary Selection

Deputy CM Bhatti Unveils Electrical Engineers' Diary

Hyderabad, Jan 23: Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka unveiled the Telangana Electrical Engineers' Association's New Year 2025 diary and calendar at Praja Bhavan on Wednesday. The event saw the participation of State President Nehru, General Secretary Bhaskar, and other members of the state committee.

During the program, a memorandum was submitted to Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao, highlighting several issues faced by electrical engineers. The engineers requested that those appointed between 1999-2004 be provided with General Provident Fund (GPF) and pension facilities, similar

to those enjoyed by state government employees.

The memorandum also called for the construction of an 8 MW thermal power project at KTPS Palvancha and an 800 MW thermal power plant under the auspices of GENCO at Ramagundam, aiming to boost the state's energy infrastructure.

State leaders Balaraju, Mohan Rao, D. Srinivas, Pandya, Madhu Krishna, Venkataramana, and others attended the program and voiced their support for the engineers' demands. The event was seen as a significant step toward addressing the concerns of electrical engineers in the state.

Congress failed to continue development projects initiated by KCR

Villagers Protest Against MLA Kambham Anil Kumar

Bhuvanagiri, Jan 23: Villagers in Anantaram, Yadadri Bhuvanagiri, have expressed their frustration with the Congress party over unfulfilled promises made during the last elections. The state government had planned to implement four new welfare schemes from January

26 and organized village and ward meetings to select beneficiaries. However, the situation took an unexpected turn as villagers began protesting against Congress MLAs, leaders, and activists.

During a recent gram sabha in Anantaram, Congress MLA Kambham Anil Kumar Reddy faced strong protests from locals. The villagers asked, "When will the schemes be implemented for us?" expressing disappointment over the lack of action. They raised concerns about whether the schemes would be allocated only to Congress activists, leaving deserving people out.

MLA Anil Kumar Reddy, who attended the gram sabha, was confronted by the villagers,

who questioned the fairness of the process and the delay in scheme implementation. The growing unrest reflects the anger among the people, who are demanding immediate action and transparency in the distribution of welfare benefits.

Hyderabad, Jan 23: The Telangana government is planning to construct 11 radial roads connecting the Regional Ring Road (RRR) and the Outer Ring Road (ORR), with a focus on enhancing connectivity and easing traffic. While the original plan included the construction of new (greenfield) roads, the government has decided to utilize existing (brownfield) roads in areas in certain sections due to issues such where land acquisition and technical challenges make greenfield development difficult.

MLAs Protest Footpath Demolitions in Hyderabad

Danam Warns of Law and Order Issues Footpath Demolitions Spark Protests **Tense Standoff Over Shop Demolitions MLAs Protest Against Encroachment Removal**

Hyderabad, Jan 23: Tensions escalated in Chintal Basti and Nampally after local MLA Danam Nagender and Nampally MLA Majid Hussain intervened to stop the demolition of encroachments on footpaths. The demolitions, carried out by Baldia officials and traffic police, targeted footpaths in front of Khairatabad Shadan College, triggering anger among locals and leaders.

Danam Nagender, furious that officials had not informed him of the demolitions, demanded that the process be halted immediately. He expressed concern for the poor residents affected by the action and warned that it would lead to a law and order issue if not stopped. "Stop demolitions until CM Revanth Reddy returns from Davos. If not, I will protest right here," Nagender threatened.

Meanwhile, tensions also flared in Nampally as GHMC officials and the



trader shops from footpaths. MLA Majid Hussain intervened, sitting in protest and arguing with the authorities. He questioned the selective demolitions, fearing a clash between two communities. However, the situation was defused after the police convinced Hussain to leave, citing potential unrest.

Horrific Crime in Hyderabad: Man Murders Wife, Cooks Her Remains

Hyderabad, Jan 23: A shocking and gruesome incident has emerged in Meerpet, Hyderabad, where a man brutally murdered his wife and engaged in chilling actions following the crime. The accused, identified as Gurumurthy, who worked as a security guard in Kanchanbagh, allegedly killed his wife, dismembered her body, and cooked parts of it in a pressure cooker. Reports suggest that Gurumurthy could not cook certain body parts, so he dried them under the sun and crushed the bones into powder using a pestle. The remains, including the cooked body parts and

powdered bones, were later disposed of in the Jillelaguda lake.

The incident came to light when Gurumurthy filed a missing person report for his wife on January 18, along with her parents, in an attempt to mislead the authorities. However, the police grew suspicious of him during their investigation. Upon being detained and questioned, Gurumurthy reportedly confessed to the horrific crime. The community is in shock over the brutality of this act, and the police investigation is ongoing to uncover more details surrounding the motive and circumstances of this tragic event.

Vivekananda Criticizes Congress for Empty Promises

Serilingampally mandals have been directed to review the documents of those obstructing the work, appropriately mark the plots, and submit the report to GHMC town planning officials. Krishna Rao also urged the filing of a complaint at the local police station against the offenders. The officials have been instructed to ensure the completion of the drainage pipeline work before the upcoming monsoon season.



Farmers' Mahadharna in Nalgonda on 28th, KTR to Attend

Nalgonda, Jan 23: The High Court has granted permission for the BRS farmers' Mahadharna in Nalgonda, scheduled for January 28th, from 11 am to 2 pm at the Clock Tower Center. The court imposed certain conditions on the protest. Initially planned for January 21st, the protest was delayed after the police refused permission, prompting BRS leaders to approach the High Court.

The Mahadharna aims to protest the state's failure to implement promises made to farmers. Key issues include the reduction of farmer insurance from Rs. 15,000 to Rs. 12,000, as well as the non-implementation of schemes such as the Rs. 4,000 pension, Rs. 2,500 for women, and scooties for female students. BRS leaders accuse the government of deceiving farmers by not fulfilling these commitments.

KTR, BRS working president, is expected to attend the Mahadharna. On January 17th, BRS town president Devender applied to the police for permission, but the delay in approval led to frustration among party leaders, questioning the last-minute denial of permission despite prior arrangements.

Fire accident in Sangareddy Causes Rs. 13 Lakh **Loss to Formers**

Sangareddy, Jan 23: A fire broke out on the outskirts of Gousabad village in Mogudampalli mandal, Sangareddy district, on Wednesday evening, leading to substantial losses for local farmers. The incident occurred when a lorry, loaded with freshly harvested sugarcane, came into contact with overhead electric wires. The resulting spark ignited the sugarcane, setting the vehicle and its contents on fire.

Farmer Sanjeeva Reddy, the owner of the lorry, quickly alerted the fire brigade. Fire department officials responded swiftly, managing to control the fire, though the lorry and its cargo were partially destroyed. In addition to the sugarcane from Reddy's 10-acre field, equipment including drip irrigation systems and a pump set were also burnt, causing an estimated loss of Rs. 10 lakh.

Another farmer, Devi Singh, faced a similar fate as his three-acre sugarcane plantation was also consumed by the flames, resulting in a loss of Rs. 3 lakh. The fire highlights the vulnerability of agricultural operations near electrical infrastructure, prompting concerns over future precautions to prevent such incidents.

The Next 20 Months: A Defining Period for Congress in Karnataka



As the Congress government in Karnataka marks 20 months in office, it finds itself at a crucial juncture in its five-year term. With a third of its tenure already completed, the next 20 months will determine the party's future in the state. Historically, Karnataka has seen a trend where governments tend to lose their focus in the second phase, which often leads to a decline in governance and eventual electoral defeat. The state has experienced a revolving-door politics cycle since 1985, with no ruling party managing to retain a clear majority by the end of its term.

Empirical evidence shows that governments are more likely to be re-elected when voters perceive them as delivering on essential governance indicators. A post-poll study by Lokniti after the 2024 Lok Sabha elections revealed that Congress's improved performance, particularly among women voters, was driven by the successful implementation of key guarantees. This was a significant factor in their recent by-election sweep. Therefore, maintaining a focus on governance that addresses the aspirations of different voter segments is a critical path to success. However, public perception can change dramatically in the face of scandals or controversies involving government leaders, which can shift focus from governance to crisis management. For Karnataka's Congress, the next 20 months will test whether it can overcome current challenges and maintain its governance momentum.

Avoiding Internal Divisions

Unity within the ruling party has

always been a crucial factor in ensuring electoral success. The Congress won the 2023 Assembly elections by presenting a united front, despite internal differences over the Chief Minister's post. However, since coming to power, internal strife has resurfaced, particularly between the camps of Siddaramaiah and D.K. Shivakumar. The Congress party has had to address these tensions, even as the BJP struggles with its own internal divisions. The next 20 months will be critical for both parties as prolonged infighting could lead to significant political fallout. A stable, unified leadership with a clear focus on policy continuity is essential for Congress to retain its hold on

Building Confidence and Social Harmony

The third pillar of good governance is social harmony, which includes ensuring law and order, women's safety, and peaceful inter-group relations. Maintaining social stability requires proactive measures and efforts to build confidence among various societal groups. In the coming months, the government will need to demonstrate its ability to manage these challenges effectively. Any failure to uphold social harmony can erode public trust and impact the Congress's standing in the state.

While some argue that they are a necessary reminder, others believe they reflect deeper issues that need addressing.

A Return to Basics: Why These **Rules Matter**

Many of the 10 diktats, such as mandatory availability for domestic cricket, attending all scheduled practice sessions, and staying with the team even after a Test series concludes early, were already in place. The concern now is that certain players, perhaps emboldened by their stardom, have ignored or bypassed these rules, potentially affecting team cohesion. The BCCI's move to reinforce these rules is not just about discipline; it's about fostering a sense of unity and accountability among players.

However, this intervention raises the question: Why were these basic principles not enforced earlier, especially when the team was performing well? Often, when a team is winning, complacency sets in, allowing star players to operate outside the established norms. Only when things start to unravel, as seen in recent Test performances, does the need to revisit these rules emerge.

Despite these challenges, the rule about family travel is not new; it was part of player contracts since 2018 and was relaxed during the COVID-19 pandemic. Nevertheless, enforcing uniformity in such matters is crucial to maintain discipline within the team.

While these places aren't bad, they hardly reflect the best of what the city has to offer. Missing iconic spots like Grand Hotel, Fanooz, and Biryaniwalla & Co. is a glaring omission. Even more perplexing is the exclusion of Nayaab Hotel, a local favorite for kheema-roti and khichdi khatta, both beloved breakfast dishes. These dishes are staples of Hyderabad's Old City and should be on any list of must-try foods. Moreover, while the list rightly includes Haleem, it overlooks kheema-roti, a dish that holds a special place in the hearts of Hyderabadis. For a true taste of local breakfast culture, Nayaab Hotel is unbeatable its absence from the list feels almost criminal.

A Disservice to Hyderabadi Food

One major issue with TasteAtlas's list is the



inclusion of mirchi ka salan in its 'Originally From Hyderabad' category. While this dish is indeed commonly served with biryani, it is a side dish, not a main attraction. Its status on the list would likely infuriate most Hyderabadis, who take their food culture very seriously. Similarly, the listing of MoMo Cafe as a traditional Hyderabad restaurant is baffling. This multicuisine spot has little to do with the city's rich culinary traditions, and mentioning it in such a list does a disservice to the many trueblue Hyderabad eateries.

My Hyderabad Food Recommendations

If you're truly looking for the best food in Hyderabad, here's my take. Start your day at Nayaab Hotel with some kheema, gurda, and khichdi khatta for breakfast. Don't miss out on their kesar biryani either—it's excellent. For biryani, skip the overhyped spots like Paradise and head to Fanooz or Biryaniwalla & Co. These places offer a more authentic, home-style experience. CBI Seeks Death Penalty For RG Kar Rape Convict, Approaches Calcutta HC

The lower court had sentenced Roy to life imprisonment, but the CBI argues that the sentence is inadequate given the heinous nature of the crime. In a move that has sparked significant controversy, the CBI contended that only the union government or the agency itself could challenge the sufficiency of the lower court's sentence. Saif Ali Khan Attacker **Reveals Motive Behind the Crime**

Bangladeshi national admits to attacking actor due to financial hardships and desire to help sick mother.

Shariful Fakir, the Bangladeshi national arrested for attacking Bollywood actor Saif Ali Khan, has disclosed the reasons behind his crime. Fakir revealed that severe financial strain and his mother's illness in Bangladesh drove him to rob a wealthy individual to fund her medical treatment.

In a police statement, Fakir explained that on the night of January 16, he targeted Saif Ali Khan's residence with the intention of stealing valuables. He had hoped to flee to Bangladesh with the loot and use it to support his ailing mother. Fakir confessed to randomly selecting Khan's residence as the victim, intending to steal from a rich target.

Fakir, who was working with a housekeeping company, had lost his job in December 2024, leaving him with limited funds. He had previously worked at a restaurant in Worli, earning ₹13,000 per month, most of which he sent to Bangladesh for his mother's treatment. Surviving on just ₹1,000 in Mumbai, Fakir saw the robbery as a desperate option after his second job

The attack on Saif Ali Khan occurred in the early hours of January 16, when Fakir stabbed the actor multiple times, including one injury to the neck. Khan was rushed to Lilavati Hospital, where he underwent emer-

Fakir was apprehended on January 19 at Hiranandani Estate in Thane while attempting to flee to his home country.

JDU Manipur Chief Pulls Support From BJP Govt In State, Party Sacks Him

Following this, the lone JDU MLA in the state assembly, Md. Abdul Nasir, has moved to the Opposition benches. However, the party immediately acted against him, removing him

Top Maoist Leader Evaded Cops For Decades..

Jayaram Reddy, a top Maoist leader and mastermind behind the 2008 Nayagarh attack, was killed this week in a joint operation by central and state forces along the Chhattisgarh-Odisha border. Known by his alias "Chalapati," Reddy had evaded security forces for decades, but a selfie with his wife led to his identification and eventual de-

Reddy, who carried a bounty of ₹1 crore, was notorious for his role in the Nayagarh attack in Odisha, where 13 security personnel were killed, and the police armoury was looted. He had masterminded the escape plan for the Maoists and blocked police reinforcements by felling trees to obstruct roads. Reddy's elusive nature made him a significant target for authorities.

The turning point came in May 2016, when a selfie with his wife, Aruna (also known as Chaitanya Venkat Ravi), was found on an abandoned smartphone following an encounter in Andhra Pradesh. This discovery led to his identification, and a reward was announced for information on his whereabouts. To avoid detection, Reddy had started traveling with a personal security detail of 8-10 guards. Reddy's escape from Chhattisgarh's Bastar region and relocation near the Odisha border did not save him. He was

In First Quad Meet Under Trump 2.0, Clear Warning Sent to China

On his first day in office, US Secretary of State Marco Rubio convened the inaugural Quad ministerial meeting under President Trump's second term. Held in Washington, the meeting brought together Australia's Penny Wong, India's Subrahmanyam Jaishankar, and Japan's Takeshi Iwaya to discuss regional stability in the Indo-Pacific. The meeting concluded with a joint statement signaling firm opposition to any attempts to alter the status quo through coercion or force an implicit warning to China.

The Quad ministers reaffirmed their commitment to maintaining a Free and Open Indo-Pacific, emphasizing the importance of upholding democratic values, sovereignty, and territorial integrity. In a joint statement, they declared, "We strongly oppose any unilateral actions that seek to change the status quo by force or coercion." This was widely interpreted as a stance against China's claims over Taiwan and its assertive actions in the South China Sea.

- **US Secretary of State Marco Rubio** emphasized countering China's influence as a top priority.

China has consistently criticized the Quad, labeling it a US-led effort to encircle its rise in Asia. The grouping, initially envisioned by Japan's late Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, gained prominence as a leaders' summit under the Biden administration and now continues its strategic focus under President Trump.

The Quad's discussions reflected shared within hours of the inauguration of the Indo-Pacific, particularly regarding

Trump administration. This underlines territorial disputes involving the Philippines, a US ally. Analysts see the meeting as a message that countering Beijing remains a top priority for the Trump administration. SoftBank, Oracle, OpenAI to Build \$500 Billion AI Infrastructure in the US

Major tech companies team up for groundbreaking AI infrastructure project in the US.

US President Donald Trump announced a historic collaboration between SoftBank, Oracle, and OpenAI to invest up to \$500 billion in artificial intelligence (AI) infrastructure in the United States. The ambitious initiative, named Stargate, is set to transform the AI landscape with a focus on building both physical and virtual infrastructure necessary for the next generation of AI advancements.

The first construction phase is underway in Texas, with more sites under consideration.

At the White House on Tuesday, Trump hailed the project as a "monumental undertaking" that reflects immense confidence in America's technological potential. The collaboration, spearheaded by OpenAI's CEO Sam Altman, SoftBank's CEO Masayoshi Son, and Oracle founder Larry Ellison, will involve a \$100 billion initial investment, with a potential total investment of \$500 billion over the next four dominance in the global AI landscape.

"This is a resounding declaration of confidence in America's potential," Trump remarked, noting the scale and strategic importance of the project.

Stargate aims to develop "colossal data centers" and other critical AI infrastructure to meet the growing demands of AI technology. The project also intends to play a key role in the re-industrialization of the United States, with national security considerations at the forefront, according to OpenAI.

Key players in the project include the UAE's MGX technology fund, with major technology partners such as Arm, Microsoft, NVIDIA, Oracle, and OpenAI contributing to its development. The first phase of construction is underway in Texas, with further sites being evaluated across the country.

"This venture is not only about advancing AI, but also about ensuring that America remains at the forefront of the technology race," Altman said during the announcement. The news was followed by a surge in SoftBank's stock prices, reflecting the market's optimism surrounding the project. This investment comes at a time when the US tech sector is looking to secure its

Panama Canal Was "Not Gift From US"

Panama's President Jose Raul Mulino firmly rejected US President Donald Trump's claims regarding the Panama Canal during a panel at the World Economic Forum in Davos. 22 US States Sue Trump Over **Birthright Citizenship Order**

A coalition of 22 Democratic-led states, civil rights groups, and immigrant organizations has filed lawsuits challenging US President Donald Trump's executive order to end birthright citizenship. The controversial order, signed hours after Trump took office, declares that individuals born in the United States will not be granted automatic citizenship if their mother was in the country unlawfully and their father was not a citizen or lawful permanent resident.

Legal experts argue the order directly contradicts the Citizenship Clause of the 14th Amendment, which has guaranteed citizenship to anyone born on US soil since 1868. This constitutional provision, established after the Civil War, was reinforced by the Supreme Court's 1898 ruling in United States v. Wong Kim Ark, which affirmed citizenship rights for children of immigrants regardless of their parents' status.

Massachusetts Attorney General Andrea Joy Campbell emphasized the constitutional stakes, stating, "President Trump does not have the authority to take away constitutional rights." Civil rights groups have also highlighted the broader implications, including loss of access to federal programs and voting rights for affected individuals.

The lawsuits, filed in federal courts across Boston, Seattle, and Maryland, argue that Trump's order exceeds presidential authority. Legal experts suggest that while the President can direct federal agencies to interpret citizenship narrowly, such an action would inevitably face legal challenges.

According to Saikrishna Prakash, a constitutional expert at the University of Virginia Law School, "Ultimately, this will be decided by the courts... This is not something he can decide on his own." Amending the Constitution to end birthright citizenship would require overwhelming bipartisan support, a near impossibility given the current political landscape.

The lawsuits underscore a broader opposition to Trump's immigration policies, with many viewing the order as part of his administration's agenda to curb unauthorized immigration. Federal courts are expected to issue temporary restraining orders while the cases progress, potentially culminating in a landmark Supreme Court decision.

Canada Warns of Strong Response to Trump's Tariff Threats

Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau issued a stern warning to US President Donald Trump on Tuesday, vowing a robust response if the US imposes a 25% tariff on Canadian imports, as Trump has threatened. Trudeau confirmed that Ottawa's reaction would be "robust and rapid," with a dollar-for-dollar matching of the tariffs.

Trudeau's remarks came at a cabinet retreat where officials strategized how to respond to economic threats posed by the new US administration. Trump had announced on his first day in office that he planned to impose tariffs on Canada and Mexico, citing concerns over immigration and the flow of illicit drugs like fentanyl.

The tariff announcement could affect a significant portion of Canadian exports, especially energy and auto sectors, which make up the majority of goods sent to the US. A Canadian government source revealed that potential counter-tariffs could include steel, ceramics, glassware, and orange juice, targeting specific US goods.

The economic ramifications of a trade war could be severe, with some forecasts predicting a 5% reduction in Canada's GDP, a spike in unemployment, and rising inflation. Trudeau warned that while the US would feel the impact, Canada would bear costs as well, but would not back down from defending its economic interests.

Australia Probes Possible Foreign Funding Behind Anti-Semitic Attacks

Australia is investigating whether foreign funding is behind a series of anti-Semitic attacks that have occurred in recent weeks. Prime Minister Anthony Albanese revealed on Wednesday that local criminals may have been paid by foreign actors to target Jewish communities in the country.

The wave of attacks includes the firebombing of a synagogue in Melbourne in December, the torching of a Sydney childcare center, car fires in predominantly Jewish neighborhoods, and vandalism of synagogues with red paint and graffiti. Albanese stated that some of these incidents appeared to be the work of "paid actors" rather than individuals with ideological motivations.

"It's unclear who or where the payments are coming from," Albanese said. The Australian Federal Police (AFP) have launched an investigation into whether these attacks were funded by overseas sources. Commissioner Reece Kershaw mentioned that authorities are exploring the possibility that local criminals were paid by foreign entities to carry out these crimes. So far, authorities have charged a 33-year-old man with attempting to set fire to a Sydney synagogue, and eight others have been charged in connection with a series of hate crime-related incidents dating back to November.

India's Refined Petroleum Consumption Set to Reach New High in FY26

India's consumption of refined petroleum products is poised to hit a new peak in the financial year 2025-26 (FY26), driven by continued growth in energy demand across various sectors of the economy. According to the latest projections from the Petroleum Planning & Analysis Cell (PPAC) under the Ministry of Petroleum, petroleum product consumption is expected to rise by 4.7% over the revised estimate for FY25, reaching a total of 252.93 million tonnes.

Diesel demand remains robust, supported by the transportation and industrial sectors, and ATF consumption is expected to grow with the recovery in the aviation industry as travel demand rebounds post-pandemic.

Petroleum coke, which is used in industries like aluminum, cement, and steel production, is also seeing a steady rise in demand. These trends highlight the broad-based nature of India's growing reliance on refined petroleum products, as the country's economic recovery continues to gain momentum.

As India advances its economic development and urbanization, the demand for energy is expected to keep climbing, further contributing to the country's increasing petroleum consumption. The projections underscore the crucial role of the energy sector in supporting India's growth, with petroleum products continuing to be a key component in meeting the country's energy needs.

Hindustan Unilever Reports 19.18% Growth in Q3 Net Profit



Hindustan Unilever Ltd (HUL) reported a 19.18% increase in its consolidated net profit for the December quarter, reaching Rs 2,989 crore, up from Rs 2,508 crore during the same period last fiscal year. The growth was primarily driven by the sale of its Pureit business, the company stated in a regulatory filing.

The company reported an underlying sales growth of 2%, though its underlying volume growth (UVG) remained flat for the period. Despite strong absolute volume growth, this was offset by a negative product mix. HUL's CEO and Managing Director, Rohit Jawa, mentioned that while FMCG demand trends remained subdued, particularly in urban areas, the rural market showed gradual recovery.

Strategic Acquisitions and Future Outlook

In line with its strategy to expand into fast-growing sectors, HUL announced the acquisition of a 90.5% stake in Uprising Science Pvt Ltd, the company behind the premium beauty brand Minimalist. The acquisition, worth Rs 2,670 crore, will be funded through a combination of secondary buyouts and primary infusion. HUL plans to acquire the remaining stake in two years. Jawa emphasized that the acquisition aligns with HUL's goal to enhance its beauty and wellbeing portfolio and capitalize on the growing masstige beauty segment. HUL's homecare segment posted strong volume growth, while its beauty and wellbeing category saw momentum in hair care, though skincare was impacted by delayed winter conditions. The company's personal care revenue faced challenges due to a decline in the hygiene segment of skin cleansing. Looking ahead, Jawa expressed confidence in HUL's medium- to long-term prospects despite short-term economic uncertainties, reaffirming the company's potential in India's FMCG sector.

Uncovering **Ancient Ice Sheets Beneath** the North Sea: **New Insights into Climate History**

andforms buried beneath the North **L**Sea, formed by a massive ice sheet that existed around 1 million years ago, have been uncovered using advanced high-resolution imaging. These newly discovered features, dating back to the mid-Pleistocene transition (MPT), provide valuable insights into the glacial dynamics of the past and how they relate to shifting climate patterns.

A study published in Science Advances highlights the findings, which were detected using sound wave data. Researchers, including Christine Batchelor, a senior lecturer in physical geography at Newcastle University, suggest that these structures were left behind by a single, expansive ice sheet that covered regions from present-day Norway to the British

theories that multiple smaller ice sheets shaped the region during the MPT.

The ice sheet's movement created distinct patterns under more than 1 kilometre of sediment, offering a glimpse into how it advanced and retreated over time. These patterns are key to understanding the mechanics of past ice sheet dynamics. Grounded ice sheets sculpt the underlying sediment, producing both erosional and depositional features. Batchelor notes that streamlined features aligned with the ice flow direction were created during the ice's advance, while transverse imprints, such as crevasse-squeeze ridges, formed as the ice sheet retreated. These ridges develop when soft sediment is pushed into

Isles. This discovery challenges previous cracks at the base of the ice before it lifts off, often aided by water undercutting the ice.



She explains that brewing tea is a gentler process that helps maintain its delicate flavors and health-promoting compounds. "When tea leaves are brewed at the right temperature, they release their full potential. However, boiling the tea at high temperatures can destroy these delicate compounds, making the tea more bitter and less beneficial," Chandurkar said.

Furthermore, she acknowledged that Indian masala chai, which is typically boiled at high temperatures, could have some adverse ef-

fects if consumed regularly over time. The prolonged exposure to high heat during boiling can degrade the tea's antioxidants and other beneficial compounds, making it less effective in promoting overall health.

While brewing tea at the right temperature can preserve its flavor and health benefits, it's important to note that occasional consumption of boiled tea isn't likely to cause harm. However, for those seeking the maximum health benefits from tea, brewing it gently and avoiding excessive boiling could be a wise choice for the long run.



India's pace spear-head, Jasprit Bumrah, continues to hold the top position in the ICC Test Bowler Rankings, cementing his status as the world's No. 1 bowler. Bumrah has consistently performed at the highest level, and in the latest rankings, he has achieved a career-best rating of 908 points, surpassing his previous record of 907 points set ahead of the fifth Border-Gavaskar Test against Australia in January. 


