



TPN Correspondent | Srinagar A "mystery illness" that caused panic in Jammu and Kashmir's Rajouri district has been traced to cadmium poisoning, according to Union Minister Jitendra Singh. At least 17 people, including 14 children, lost their lives in Budhal village over the past month. Earlier investigations ruled out viral or bacterial causes. Cadmium, a highly toxic metal, was detected in the victims' bodies during tests at the Indian Institute of Toxicology Research, Lucknow. It can enter the body through polluted air, contaminated food, or water. Authorities are investigating how the toxin reached the victims, with Minister Singh emphasizing that any foul play will be uncovered. The victims suffered from neurotoxins that caused severe brain swelling or ede-

ma, confirmed Dr. AS Bhatia, principal of GMC Rajouri. Despite extensive testing at premier labs, including the NCDC and NIV Pune, no other infections were

identified. The district administration, under DC Abhishek Sharma's supervision, relocated affected families to safer locations. GMC Rajouri has bolstered its medical team, adding child and anesthesia specialists to manage emergencies. Chief Minister Omar Abdullah visited Rajouri earlier this week, assuring residents of state and central efforts to address the crisis. An inter-ministerial team is further investigating the unexplained deaths.

AAP, BJP in war of words over Punjab Police's security for Arvind Kejriwal

TPN Correspondent New Delhi New Delhi: Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leader Arvind Kejriwal made allegations serious against the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) ahead of the Delhi Assembly elections, claiming that the party is distributing money, gold chains, shoes, and other items to voters with the protection of the Delhi Police. In a video message on Friday, Kejriwal said, "These elections

A fresh political battle has erupted between the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) after Punjab Police withdrew security for AAP leader Arvind Kejriwal in the national capital. This move came after the Delhi Police, under the Union Ministry led by the BJP, raised concerns with the Election Commission regarding the presence of Punjab police personnel protecting Kejriwal.

AAP leaders, including Delhi CM Atishi, who succeeded Kejriwal, labeled the move "shameful" and linked the recent attack on Kejriwal in Hari Nagar to the withdrawal of his security detail. Atishi accused Union Home Minister Amit Shah of influencing the decision and questioned the Election Commission's role in ensuring Kejriwal's safety.

"Do Modi and Shah want to play with Kejriwal ji's life? Will the Election

Commissioner remain a mute spectator?" Atishi wrote on social media. In response, BJP's Parvesh Verma, who is contesting against Kejriwal from the New Delhi constituency, mocked the allegations, stating that Kejriwal was merely preparing for another "attack drama" as the elections approach. "He is busy writing a script for his next attack story," Verma posted.

As the Delhi Assembly elections near, the battle over security has added fuel to the ongoing rivalry between AAP and BJP. Voting will take place on February 5, with the results scheduled for February 8. in Delhi are different. One and a half months ahead of the elections, open distribution of money, shoes, bedsheets, sarees, ration, gold chains started. Nobody has any fear of the Election Commission or that someone would stop them. This distribution is being done under Police protection... This is very dangerous for our country."

The Delhi Chief Minister further alleged that BJP leaders were behind this distribution and urged voters not to "sell their votes." He questioned the source of the money being used to buy votes, linking it to corruption and the "looting" of the country.

"Accept whatever they are distributing

but remember one thing, do not sell your votes... Vote for anyone you want but not for those who are trying to buy your votes. They are corrupt. They are traitors. They are enemies of the nation," Kejriwal asserted.

He reminded voters of the sacrifices made by leaders like B R Ambedkar to secure their right to vote, emphasizing that a purchased vote undermines democracy. "If our votes can be purchased, then our democracy will end. There will only be the rule of the wealthy," he said.

Kejriwal also took to X, further accusing BJP's Parvesh Verma of distributing money and goods among voters in the New Delhi seat, where both leaders are contesting.



He will be the Chief Guest at India's 76th Republic Day celebrations on January 26, alongside holding several high-level meetings.

Union Minister of State for External Affairs Pabitra Margherita welcomed President Subianto at the airport. The Ministry of External Affairs highlighted that the visit would bolster the India-Indonesia Comprehensive Strategic Partnership.

Over the next three days, President Subianto is scheduled to meet President Droupadi Murmu, Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, and External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar. Discussions will focus on enhancing cooperation in politics, defence, trade, and security, with multiple agreements expected to be signed. President Subianto's visit also includes the 3rd CEO Forum and bilateral discussions aimed at expanding economic and maritime cooperation. India and Indonesia share strong ties under the Act East Policy, with their partnership elevated to a Comprehensive Strategic Partnership in 2018. FIITJEE Coaching Centres Shut Across UP, Delhi As Teachers Quit Over Unpaid Salaries

TPN Correspondent, New Delhi In a major setback for students preparing for board and entrance exams, several FIITJEE coaching centres across North India have abruptly shut down due to a mass resignation by teachers protesting unpaid salaries. Centres in Noida, Ghaziabad, Bhopal, Varanasi, Delhi, Meerut, and Patna have closed their doors in the past week, leaving students and parents frustrated and without clear guidance.

The crisis escalated when teachers at these institutes quit due to months of unpaid wages. A Meerut branch that tried to continue with teachers from Noida could not sustain the operations, resulting in its isfaction. shutdown. Many parents have now filed police complaints, demanding refunds and compensation. Videos and images of parents protesting outside the closed centres have gone viral, with parents alleging that the institution had assured continued classes despite the faculty departures.

One parent shared that they had already invested ₹6 lakh in the coaching institute, but after being promised continuity, were left with no classes. Another parent, who had paid ₹4 lakh in fees, revealed that outgoing teachers had confirmed the salary issue, prompting widespread dissat-

volved.

The closure of these branches comes amidst a broader crisis at FIITJEE, with reports of financial troubles and regulatory issues, including violations of fire safety and licensing rules at various centres. The issue intensified after the conclusion of the JEE Mains 2025 Session-1 exams, which occurred from January 22 to 24. FIITJEE, founded in 1992 by IIT Delhi graduate DK Goel, operates over 70 centres across 41 cities, training students for engineering and medical entrance exams like JEE and NEET.

Delhi Excise Dept Sezies 20,000 Bottles Of Illicit Liquor

TPNCorrespondent New Delhi Excise Intelligence Bureau ana, identified as a hotspot for Efforts to curb the illicit liquor menace in the capital intensified as the Delhi excise department seized nearly 20,000 bottles of illicit alcohol, worth ₹50 lakh, in the past fortnight. The seizures followed the implementation of the Model Code of Conduct (MCC) for the Assembly elections, officials revealed on Friday.

The department also impounded 32 vehicles, bringing the total worth of the confiscated items, including 15,376 liters of liquor, to ₹1.5 crore. Since the MCC came into effect on January 7, 52 cases have been registered, with the excise department accounting for about 25% of the total seizures made, including those by the Delhi Police.

(EIB) teams have been conducting raids and monitoring key areas, focusing on liquor smuggled from neighboring Haryana. On Thursday night, the EIB intercepted two vehicles, seizing 5,000 bottles containing 3,600 liters of liquor, valued at ₹12 lakh, from Burari and Mahipalpur.

In one operation, a truck carrying 3,036 bottles labeled "For Sale in Haryana Only" was chased for 14 kilometers and intercepted in Burari. Another mini-truck was caught in Mahipalpur, carrying 151 cases with 1,812 bottles.

The department, working under limited resources, has ramped up patrolling and inspections at inter-state borders, particularly with Harysmuggling. Non-conforming areas without liquor vends have also been closely monitored.

As per Election Commission (EC) directives, the excise department has instructed hotels, clubs, and bars to avoid "coupon-based and mass bookings" during the poll period. Inspections of bonded liquor warehouses and CCTV systems have also been intensified to prevent malpractices. With voting for the 70-member Delhi Assembly scheduled on February 5 and counting on February 8, the excise department has declared both days as "dry days" to ensure smooth electoral conduct.







Battle of Freebies!!

AAP and BJP Woo Delhi Voters

As the Delhi assembly elections approach, the two main contenders. the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), are locked in a fierce competition, armed not only with promises but also sharp rhetoric. The 70seat Delhi assembly vote on February 5 has turned into a battle of manifestos, with each party releasing its pledges in carefully timed instalments.

The BJP's manifesto, or Sankalp Patra, has been particularly methodical. Released in three parts, its first instalment focused on women's welfare, promising a one-time financial aid of ₹21,000 for pregnant women, along with nutritional kits and monthly assistance under the Mahila Smriddhi Yojana. BJP chief J.P. Nadda even accused AAP of failing to fulfill its earlier promises, branding their governance as inconsistent and hollow.

The second instalment shifted focus to youth and education, with lofty promises of free schooling from kindergarten to post-graduation for underprivileged students in government institutions. The BJP also dangled benefits for aspirants of competitive exams, including financial assistance and an aapda (disaster). "Delhi de-

reimbursement of exam fees. Former Union Minister Anurag Thakur announced a proposal for a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to probe corruption allegations against the AAP government, marking a direct attack on Kejriwal's administration.

For AAP, the stakes are equally high. After three consecutive wins, Arvind Kejriwal faces the challenge of retaining his hold over Delhi while countering BJP's aggressive campaign. Confident of support from lower-income groups and minorities, thanks to his extensive freebies, Kejriwal has now turned his attention to wooing middle-class voters, often perceived as BJP's stronghold. However, his "demands" to the Centre for middle-class relief have drawn mixed reactions. with critics calling it a desperate attempt to broaden his voter base.

Within BJP circles, opinions are divided on AAP's prospects. While some leaders acknowledge AAP's continued influence in slum areas, others believe its failure to deliver on essential services, such as piped water and sewage systems, could alienate voters. PM Modi himself has criticized Kejriwal's tenure, referring to it as

serves better," Modi declared in his campaign, urging voters to give BJP a chance to transform the city.

Meanwhile, the Congress party has emerged as an unexpected wildcard. Despite its lackluster presence in recent elections, Congress leaders, including Rahul Gandhi, have ramped up attacks on AAP, using corruption allegations to question Kejriwal's credibility. The party's improved organization and newfound determination could play spoiler, cutting into AAP's vote share and indirectly aiding the BJP.

Adding to the drama, UP Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has been roped in to spearhead BJP rallies. Known for his fiery speeches. Yogi has questioned AAP's governance, even challenging Kejriwal to take a dip in the Yamuna to showcase his government's success in cleaning the river.

With Delhi's urban voters holding the key, both parties are working overtime to outdo each other. For now, it's a game of promises, punches, and plenty of political theatrics. Whether Delhi opts for more freebies or a new narrative remains to be seen on February 5.

Alka Lamba slams AAP over Yamuna's condition: 'Congress will clean it'

Yamuna river becomes a focal point in Delhi's political discourse, Congress candidate Alka Lamba has launched a strong criticism against both BJP and AAP, accusing them of politicizing the issue. Waqf Bill Panel Meet, 10 Opposition MPs, **Including A Owaisi, Suspended**

Ten opposition MPs, including AIMIM's Asaduddin Owaisi, the Trinamool's Kalyan Banerjee, and DMK's A Raja, were suspended for the day from the Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) discussing amendments to the Waqf Act of 1955. The suspensions followed disruptions during Friday's proceedings, which saw heated debates over the proposed changes to the law.

The Waqf Amendment Bill proposes significant modifications to the administration of Waqf boards, including add-

and at least two women to the boards. Opposition MPs accused the ruling BJP of rushing the amendments without sufficient deliberation, leading to clashes during the session.

During the session, the Mirwaiz expressed concerns about the amendments, stating that they risk disempowering Muslims and urged the government to reconsider. He emphasized that Waqf-related matters hold significant importance, especially in Jammu and Kashmir, and warned against interference.

Opposition leaders, includ-

ing non-Muslim members ing Congress's KC Venugopal, claimed the amendments violate constitutional rights, particularly Articles 15 and 30, which protect religious freedoms and minority rights. Critics argue that provisions such as limiting donations from "practicing Muslims" undermine community autonomy and freedom of religion. The JPC's earlier report submission deadline of November 29 has been extended to February 13, the last day of the Parliament's Budget Session, to allow for further deliberations.

Explosion At Maharashtra Ordnance Factory



Eight workers confirmed dead in the explosion.

The blast at the ordnance factory in Bhandara district, Maharashtra, has claimed the lives of eight workers, with seven others injured. The explosion occurred around 10:30 am in the LTP section of the factory, leading to a roof collapse and trapping several workers. Rescue operations, involving firefighters and medical teams, were quickly initiated.

The blast's intensity was so severe that it was heard from from Nagpur.

Fire Rumour By Tea-Seller Led To Jalgaon Train Tragedy

Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar on Thursday attributed the Jalgaon train tragedy to a false fire alarm raised by a tea-seller inside the Pushpak Express. The incident led to confusion and panic among passengers, resulting in 13 fatalities and 15 injuries.

The tragedy occurred on Wednesday evening when some passengers of the Lucknow-Mumbai Pushpak Express, alarmed by the rumor, jumped off the train after an emergency chain-pulling incident.

They were tragically struck by the Karnataka Express heading from Bengaluru to Delhi on the adjacent tracks in Jalgaon district.

Addressing the media, Mr. Pawar revealed, "A tea-seller from the pantry shouted about a fire in a coach, which caused panic. Two passengers from Uttar Pradesh heard this and spread the false alarm to others." Terrified passengers from the general and adjoining coaches began jumping off the train.

When the train came to a halt due to the

chain pulling, more passengers disembarked, unknowingly stepping into the path of the speeding Karnataka Express. The powerful impact caused severe casualties, with several bodies mutilated. The Deputy CM confirmed that of the 13 deceased, 10 have been identified. The two passengers who initially spread the rumor were among the injured. Authorities and the district guardian minister responded promptly to restore train movement in both directions.

Saif Ali Khan records statement on January 16 attack

Actor Saif Ali Khan recorded his statement with the Bandra police on Thursday, recounting the harrowing attack at his Bandra home on January 16. The incident left Mr. Khan with multiple stab injuries after an intruder, later identified as Shariful Islam, entered his residence on the 11th floor of the Satguru Sharan building. Mr. Khan revealed that he and his wife, actress Kareena Kapoor Khan, were in their bedroom when they heard their younger son Jeh's nanny, Eliyama Philips,



scream. Rushing to their son's room, they found the alleged attacker confronting the nanny while Jeh cried in fear. Despite be-

ing injured in the neck, back, and hands during the struggle, Mr. Khan managed to push the intruder into the room, allowing Ms. Philips to escape with Jeh and lock the attacker inside.

The attacker reportedly demanded ₹1 crore during the incident and was later arrested after a three-day manhunt. Shariful Islam, a Bangladeshi national who entered India illegally last year, was tracked to Thane after he used Google Pay for a meal.

Illegal infiltration from Bangladesh could affect Manipur, warns CM Biren Singh

Manipur Chief Minister N Biren Singh on Thursday expressed concern over illegal infiltration issues, warning that undetected migrants from Bangladesh entering Assam could pose a risk to Manipur. He emphasized the need for vigilance along the state's borders to address infil-

tration from neighboring countries. Highlighting Manipur's inter-state border with Assam (204 km), Mr. Singh stated that Assam and Tripura, sharing 263 km and 856 km borders with Bangladesh respectively, are also grappling with infiltration concerns. While most parts of these borders are fenced, some sections remain vulnerable, raising security chal-

lenges.

The Chief Minister underscored that in addition to security forces, indigenous people must stay vigilant to prevent illegal infiltration. He stressed that any lapse in monitoring in Assam could allow illegal migrants to move into Manipur, exacerbating the situation.

Elon Musk Comments on Satya Nadella's \$80 Billion Investment in Azure

Satya Nadella, CEO of Microsoft, responded to Elon Musk's remarks about the Stargate project by reaffirming Microsoft's commitment to investing \$80 billion into its cloud computing platform, Azure. The exchange began after U.S. President Donald Trump announced the Stargate project, a

joint venture involving OpenAI,

SoftBank, and Oracle, aimed at investing at least \$500 billion in AI infrastructure in the U.S. Elon Musk, a close ally of Trump, expressed doubts about the group's financial capability, claiming, "They don't actually have the money," and questioned SoftBank's financial position.

OpenAI's CEO, Sam Altman, rejected Musk's comments, offering him the chance to

visit the project's first site. In a CNBC interview, Nadella, when asked about Musk's doubts, confidently responded, "I am good for my \$80 billion. I am going to spend \$80 billion building out Azure, and customers can count on Microsoft."

In a response shared on social media, Musk acknowledged, "On the other hand, Satya definitely does have the money." Nadella, in a light-hearted reply, emphasized that the investment in AI is about creating practical solutions, not just hype.

The Stargate project is set to invest \$500 billion over the next four years to build AI infrastructure. SoftBank will manage finances, while OpenAI will handle operations. Key technology partners include Microsoft, Arm, NVIDIA, Oracle, and OpenAI.

Ola and Uber Deny Allegations of Fare Disparities for iPhone Users

CCPA issues notices after reports suggest higher charges for iPhone users compared to Android users

Ola and Uber have responded to allegations of fare discrepancies based on the type of mobile phone used, after media reports claimed that iPhone users were being charged more than Android users for identical rides. Both companies have categorically denied the claims, stating that they maintain a uniform pricing structure for all customers, regardless of the device used.

The controversy began when the Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) intervened, following consumer complaints and media reports highlighting the pricing disparity. Consumer Affairs Min-

Ola also confirmed that it had provided a detailed clarification to the CCPA to address any concerns.

Similarly, Uber issued a statement denying the claims, stating that it does not set fares

CBI Busts Rs 350 Crore Crypto Ponzi Scam

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has busted a massive Rs 350 crore crypto Ponzi scam, with search operations conducted across seven locations in multiple states. The accused, involved in seven separate modules, allegedly deceived investors by promising high returns on cryptocurrency investments. These fraudulent schemes were reportedly promoted through various social media platforms, targeting unsuspecting individuals. The accused individuals op-

erated in cities such as Delhi, Hazaribag, Bathinda, Ratlam, Valsad, Pudukkottai, and Chittorgarh. After analyzing bank transactions and cryptocurrency wallets, the CBI revealed that the proceeds from these scams were converted into cryptocurrencies, making it difficult to trace their origins. Over the course of the schemes, the transactions are believed to have exceeded Rs 350 crore.

Following the registration of the case, CBI teams conducted searches in Delhi, Jharkhand, Punjab, Madhya Pradesh, Gu-

jarat, Tamil Nadu, and Rajasthan. During these searches, the agency seized digital assets worth approximately USD 38,414, as well as cash amounting to Rs 34.2 lakh. Additionally, several devices and incriminating documents were recovered, including mobile phones, laptops, hard disks, and more.

The CBI registered the case under sections of the Indian Penal Code and the Information Technology Act, accusing the perpetrators of criminal conspiracy, cheating, and fraud. Investigations have revealed that the scam operated without approval from regulatory bodies like the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), with victims being lured into unregulated deposit schemes. The accused used various deceptive tactics, such as online loans, lucky orders, and UPI frauds, to defraud investors.

The probe has also uncovered numerous bank accounts and Virtual Digital Asset (VDA) wallets associated with cryptocurrency exchanges like CoinDCX, WazirX, Zebpay, and BitBns. These accounts saw transactions exceeding Rs 350 crore over two years, further highlighting the scale of the operation.

Vijay's move follows the lessons learned by Tamil cinema colleagues Kamal Haasan and the late Vijayakanth, who struggled to make electoral impacts without aligning with dominant Dravidian parties.

Vijayakanth's Desiya Murpokku Dravida Kazhagam (DMDK) gained 8% vote share in the 2006 assembly elections but won only one seat. However, his 2011 alliance with the AIADMK secured 28 seats. Similarly, Kamal Haasan's Makkal Needhi Maiam (MNM) saw limited success in the 2019 and 2021 elections, eventually aligning with the DMK. Vijay's acknowledgment of coalition power-sharing underscores the necessi-

While hurdles persist, the groundwork for a cohesive anti-DMK front is being laid. If successful, such an alliance could alter Tamil Nadu's political trajectory, demonstrating the enduring need for strategic partnerships in a polarized electoral landscape.

Repatriation of Illegal Immigrants: A Challenge for India Amid U.S. Policy Shift



The repatriation of illegal immigrants and trade tariffs are emerging as two key challenges for India, especially in the wake of United States President Donald Trump's recent policies. One of the most immediate threats to India is the potential deportation of thousands of undocumented Indian nationals living in the U.S.

Under the new administration, nearly 18,000 illegal immigrants from India could be repatriated, as part of Trump's commitment to protect the American public from the negative effects of unlawful migration. With approximately 725,000 undocumented Indian immigrants in the U.S., Indians represent the ninth-largest group of illegal immigrants, making up around 6.6% of the total, according to 2022 statistics.

While it may not be feasible to deport all of these individuals to India in a short period, the symbolic action of sending back a significant number could occur as Trump seeks to fulfill his promise. However, he may eventually recognize that the U.S. economy relies on both low-skilled and high-skilled migrant workers, which could make a large-scale repatriation more challenging.

In the past, undocumented Indian immigrants have already faced deportation from the U.S. In the 2024 fiscal year, over 1,500 Indian nationals were deported, and the U.S. has been repatriating Indian immigrants for several years. For example, in October 2023, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security collaborated with the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement to send back Indian nationals who were unable to legally stay in the U.S.

India has been working on agreements to manage the mobility of its labor force through Labour Mobility Agreements with countries like Qatar, Kuwait, and Saudi Arabia. Additionally, India has Migration and Mobility Partnership Agreements with nations like France, the UK, Germany, and Italy to streamline migration processes and address issues related to deportation and legal stay. These agreements may help India manage the potential impact of a large-scale repatriation from the U.S.

AI videos from China are coming for the world

Chandrababu Naidu Calls for More Children: A Demographic Solution in a Growing State



Chinese artificial intelligence (AI) companies are relentlessly pushing forward in an effort to close the development gap with the United States. Despite Washington's ongoing efforts to restrict the growth of China's AI industry, Chinese firms are proving their ability to remain competitive with Silicon Valley's best.

One example of this innovation is Vidu 2.0, an AI video generator released last week by Shengshu Technology, a Beijing-based startup with strong ties to Tsinghua University, a key institution in China's AI development. Vidu 2.0, which has been touted as a domestic rival to OpenAI's Sora, allows users from around the world to generate short videos from images.

While I experienced some inconsistencies during my tests, such as strange facial expressions, unnatural limb movements, and other clear signs of AI involvement, I was most impressed by the platform's speed. Within seconds, I was able to produce video clips, including one of Donald Trump crying and another of him embracing Elon Musk in a romantic setting.

What's even more impressive is Vidu 2.0's cost-efficiency. The platform claims to produce short-

form video content at 55% lower costs than the industry average, showcasing China's ability to cut production costs in AI-driven technology.

Vidu 2.0's release follows another notable AI development from China: DeepSeek-V3, a large language model launched late last month. The model not only performed impressively on global AI benchmarks but was also reportedly developed at an astonishingly low cost. Andrej Karpathy, a founding member of OpenAI, remarked on the budget for DeepSeek-V3, calling it a "joke of a budget."

These consecutive advancements serve as a clear signal to the U.S. administration, highlighting the limitations of its export controls and policies aimed at stalling China's AI progress. They underscore the fact that Beijing's AI capabilities are advancing at an accelerated pace, making it evident that the U.S.'s current strategy may not be as effective as intended in hindering China's technological ambitions. China's rapid strides in AI innovation could reshape the global technology landscape, challenging the U.S.'s historical dominance in this field and prompting a reevaluation of how both nations navigate the future of artificial intelligence.

a surprising move, In Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu has called for families to have more children, a stance that seems out of sync with the global trend of population control, especially in a country that is set to become the world's most populous nation. Known for his progressive policies, Naidu's recent decision to amend the rules for local body elections, allowing candidates to have more than two children, has raised eyebrows. This policy reverses a law introduced three decades ago, which capped the number of chil-



dren public representatives could have.

The catalyst behind this change stems from Naidu's recognition of a demographic imbalance in the state. With Andhra Pradesh's Total Fertility Rate (TFR) at 1.7, below the replacement level of 2.1, the state's population is expected to peak at 54.4 million by 2034 and then begin to decline. This trend, combined with the growing elderly population—predicted to surpass the number of children by 2046—has prompted the Chief Minister to reassess the need for a policy that encourages larger families.

This shift is not solely based on population dynamics. There are political considerations at play, as well. Southern states like Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu, which have successfully managed to reduce birth rates, are concerned about losing political representation during the upcoming delimitation process. The number of Lok Sabha seats allocated to states is determined by population, and with northern states still experiencing higher growth rates, southern states fear their voices will be diminished in the future.

Historically, this has been a point of contention. In 2001, when the delimitation exercise was frozen until 2025, southern political leaders argued that states with controlled population growth should not be penalized. This concern has only grown more pressing as the demographic gap between the south and the north widens.

While Naidu's call for larger families may be driven by a desire to counterbalance the ageing population, encouraging a return to the "Small is Beautiful" mentality, which advocates limiting families to two children, will not be easy. Social norms take time to change, as evidenced by Japan's struggle to overcome similar demographic issues.

Ultimately, this debate is about more than just population numbers; it's about finding a balance between political representation and social sustainability. As India moves towards its goal of becoming a developed nation by 2047, policymakers must engage in thoughtful discussions to address demographic shifts pragmatically.

Madhya Pradesh CM Takes a Step **Toward Liquor Prohibition with Ban in 19 Sacred Cities**

Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav has announced a landmark decision to prohibit liquor sales in 19 religious cities and rural areas, marking a significant step towards a potential statewide alcohol ban. Starting April 1, a total of 47 liquor outlets will be shut down without relocation options, underscoring the state's resolve to enforce the prohibition.

Gold Prices Surge Past ₹83,000 for the **First Time Amid Global Uncertainty**

Gold prices continued their rally for the eighth consecutive session, crossing the ₹83,000-mark per 10 grams for the first time in history. On Friday, gold of 99.9% purity surged ₹200 to hit ₹83,100 in the national capital, according to the All India Sarafa Association. This milestone reflects increasing investor interest amid global market uncertainties.

The yellow metal's 99.5% purity variant also climbed ₹200, reaching a record high of ₹82,700 per 10 grams. Silver prices followed suit, rising ₹500 to ₹94,000 per kilogram. Analysts attribute this trend to escalating geopolitical and economic concerns.

Gold prices hit ₹83,100 per 10 grams, marking an all-time high in India. Silver prices climbed ₹500 to reach ₹94,000 per kilogram. Market volatility driven by U.S. tariff uncertainties boosts safe-haven assets.

The Multi Commodity Exchange (MCX) mirrored this bullish sentiment, with February gold futures gaining ₹334 to ₹79,960 per 10 grams. Intraday trading saw prices approach ₹80,050, nearing the October 2024 peak of ₹80,282. Similarly, silver futures for March delivery surged ₹835 to ₹91,984 per kilogram.

Globally, Comex gold futures rose \$15.50 per ounce to \$2,780.50, while silver increased 1.53% to \$31.32 per ounce. These gains were driven by concerns over U.S. tariff policies under President Trump and expectations for critical economic data releases.

Experts like Saumil Gandhi from HDFC Securities and Deveya Gaglani from Axis Securities emphasized that safe-haven demand will likely persist. Upcoming events, including the Union Budget and U.S. Federal Reserve's policy decisions, will be pivotal in determining future trends for bullion prices.

Sri Lanka government slashes ministerial privileges

The Sri Lankan government has introduced stringent regulations to curtail the benefits afforded to Cabinet and deputy ministers, addressing widespread public discontent over political privilege and accountability.

A circular issued by President Anura Kumara Dissanayake on Thursday limits Cabinet ministers to two official vehicles. Caps have also been placed on fuel allowances and monthly payments for office, residential, and mobile phone expenses. The support staff is restricted to 15 for Cabinet ministers and 12 for deputy ministers. Notably, family members or close relatives are barred from holding key advisory roles such as Private Secretary or



Media Secretary.

Ministers limited to two vehicles and capped allowances.

Restrictions on hiring relatives for key positions.

Move follows debate over privileges of former President Mahinda Rajapaksa. These reforms come amid mounting criticism over the treatment of former President Mahinda Rajapaksa, whose state-provided security was reduced from over 300 personnel to just 60 in December. Rajapaksa was also asked to vacate his state mansion, drawing sharp reactions from opposition leaders.

Sagara Kariyawasam, a spokesman for Rajapaksa's party, accused the government of political revenge, stating, "Mahinda Rajapaksa's personal security is under threat. The government wants to put him out on the road." Opposition members argue that benefits extended to former presidents are constitutionally protected and backed by legislation passed in 1986.

Micheal Martin, 64, previously served as Prime Minister from 2020 to 2022. Under the coalition arrangement, Simon Harris of Fine Gael is slated to succeed Martin as Prime Minister in 2027. Harris, currently positioned to take over as Deputy Prime Minister, is expected to serve as Foreign Minister initially.

Budget 2025 : Sitharaman Marks Final Preparations With Traditional 'Halwa' Ceremony

Paytm Shares Drop 9% Amid ED **Probe, Company Denies Allegations**

Shares of One97 Communications, the parent company of Paytm, plunged by as much as 9% to an intraday low of Rs 773.90 on Friday following reports that the Enforcement Directorate (ED) is investigating the company in connection with a cryptocurrency scam. The news sent shockwaves through the stock market, with Paytm's share price hitting Rs 773.05 on the NSE before partially recovering to trade 3.32% lower at Rs 820.95 by mid-morning.

In response to the reports, Paytm issued a clarification, stating that it had not received any inquiry or communication from the ED. The company described the media reports as "factually incorrect and misleading" and denied any new notices from the ED regarding the alleged investigation.

"We confirm that we have not received



any such new notice, communication, or query from the Enforcement Directorate," Paytm said in a stock exchange filing. The company added that the news article was based on incorrect information and clarified that they had not been contacted by the media before the publication of the report.

Paytm is one of several payment gateways, including Razorpay, PayU, and Easebuzz, under investigation by the ED in relation to the HPZ Token cryptocurrency scam, allegedly operated by Chinese nationals. The ED has been investigating the matter for

the past two years, freezing nearly Rs 500 crore in virtual accounts across various platforms, including Paytm.

According to the ED, the accused defrauded investors of over Rs 2,200 crore, with illicit funds being transferred out of India. Paytm is reported to hold around Rs 2.8 crore of the alleged "proceeds of crime," while other platforms like PayU and Easebuzz have larger amounts involved in the scam.

In addition to the ongoing investigation, Paytm's parent company, One97 Communications, recently posted a narrower consolidated loss of Rs 208.5 crore for Q3 FY25, compared to a loss of Rs 221.7 crore in the same period last year. However, the company's revenue from operations dropped by 35.8% to Rs 1,827.8 crore, primarily due to declines in payment processing, financial services, and marketing services.

Adani Power Ltd's growth is being fueled by enhanced coal availability and its business expansion, according to brokerage firm Ventura. The firm has set a target price of Rs 806 for the stock over the next 24 months, which indicates a potential upside of 54.5% from its current trading price of around Rs 522.

India's rising power demand, driven by increased manufacturing activities and the growing use of white goods and gadgets, has created a significant energy gap. As renewable energy is unable to meet the country's growing power needs, the gap between peak demand and supply highlights the need for a stronger thermal power capacity. Adani Power, India's largest private pure-play thermal power producer, is well-positioned to meet this demand with its aggressive capacity expansion plans.

Ventura has revised its price target for Adani Power, recommending a "BUY" with an upwardly adjusted DCF-based price target of Rs 806 (13.8X FY27 EV/EBITDA), representing an upside of 54.5%. The brokerage firm noted that the company's installed capacity of 17.55 GW and its capacity to source coal from both domestic and international markets provides a strong competitive edge.

The firm also highlighted the company's operational improvements. Adani Power's plant load factor (PLF) surged from 48% in FY23 to 72% in H1 FY25, marking the highest level in seven years. This increase in PLF, along with improved coal availability and lower imported coal prices, has significantly boosted Adani Power's operational efficiency.

In FY24, the company recorded a year-on-year revenue growth of 29.9%, reaching Rs 50,351 crore, with EBITDA rising 81% to Rs 18,181 crore. Ventura also anticipates steady growth for the company, with revenue and EBITDA expected to grow at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 11.8% and 11%, respectively, over the FY24-27 period.

Adani Power is targeting a total capacity of 30.67 GW by FY31, which would increase its share in India's thermal power sector from 6% in FY24 to 11% by FY31.

ChatGPT outage: Netizens unable to access OpenAI's chatbot services globally

OpenAI's popular archatbot, ChatGPT, is back online after experiencing significant outages earlier today. The disruptions affected millions of users globally, preventing access to the platform for hours.

The issue was traced to a "bad gateway error," which typically indicates

a communication problem between the website's servers. Users were unable to interact with the chatbot for several hours, leading to widespread frustration, particularly among those who rely on ChatGPT for work, education, and various other tasks. Many took to social media to express their disappointment, with one user on X sharing, "Can't believe ChatGPT is down! I was in the middle of a project and now I'm stuck."

According to OpenAI, the problem was resolved at 15:09 GMT, and users can now access the service again. However, OpenAI has not yet provided a detailed explanation of the cause behind the outage. While service has been re-



stored, the outage had sparked a wave of disruption, as users across the globe reported being unable to use the chatbot for essential tasks.

This incident highlights the growing reliance on AI tools like ChatGPT, which have become integral for a wide range of activities. Whether for quick answers, brainstorming ideas, or solving complex problems, users are increasingly turning to AI for assistance, making such outages a significant inconvenience.

As of now, OpenAI's status page confirms that the issue has been resolved, and users are once again able to access the AI chatbot without interruption.

Tn a stellar year for Test Lcricket, Pat Cummins has been named captain of the ICC Test Team of 2024, which includes three Indian players— Jasprit Bumrah, Ravindra Jadeja, and Yashasvi Jaiswal. The squad also features prominent names from England, New Zealand, and Sri Lanka, but notably no players from South Africa, Pakistan, or the West Indies.

Jasprit Bumrah was a standout performer in 2024, taking 71 wickets at an exceptional average of 14.92, making him the highest wicket-taker in Test cricket that year. His dominant performances,

including a remarkable 32 wickets in the Border-Gavaskar series against Australia, cemented his place in the team. Bumrah's ability to perform consistently against top teams, including a stunning 19-wicket haul against England, solidified his reputation as one of the greatest bowlers of all time.

Ravindra Jadeja also made his mark in 2024, contributing both with the bat and ball. Jadeja scored 527 runs at an average of 29.27 and picked up 48 wickets at an impressive average of 24.29. His all-round prowess played a crucial role in India's Test campaigns throughout the year.

Young opener Yashasvi Jaiswal's breakthrough year saw him become one of India's brightest batting stars. He amassed 1,478 runs at an av-



erage of 54.74, with two double centuries and three fifties to his name. Jaiswal's consistent performances, including a top score of 161 in the Border-Gavaskar Trophy, helped him secure a spot in the all-star team.

Pat Cummins, the lone Australian in the squad, led his side to series victories over the West Indies, New Zealand, and India. He took 37 wickets in 2024 at an average of 24.02 while contributing 306 runs with the bat, showcasing his leadership and all-round skills.

Other notable players in the team include England's Joe Root, New Zealand's Kane Williamson, and Sri Lanka's Kamindu Mendis, who impressed with their batting exploits during the vear.

Djokovic Withdraws from Australian Open Semifinal Due to Injury

Novak Djokovic was forced to retire from his Australian Open semifinal match against Alexander Zverev on Friday due to a torn muscle in his left leg. After losing the first set 7-6 (5) in a tiebreaker, Djokovic walked around the net to concede the match to Zverev. The crowd reacted with boos as the Serbian champion made his way off the court, but Djokovic responded with two thumbs-up gestures to acknowledge his supporters.

During a post-match press conference, Djokovic explained the severity of the injury, stating, "It was getting worse and worse." He revealed that the pain in his left leg, which he initially injured during his quarterfinal win over Carlos Alcaraz earlier in the week, had become unbearable. Despite losing the


first set, Djokovic admitted that even if he had won, it would have been a tough battle to continue playing through the pain.
