Indian students, primarily holding F-1 visas, are facing mounting concerns over their ability to work part-time while pursuing their studies. Traditionally, students on these visas are allowed to work up to 20 hours a week on-campus, but stricter enforcement has led many to quit their off-campus part-time jobs. Those recently graduated or in their Optional Practical Training (OPT) period

are particularly worried about their visa status as job opportunities become increasingly scarce due to market slowdowns and potential changes in OPT regulations.

The latest executive orders issued by Trump, including those on birthright citizenship and the anticipated restrictions on OPT, have added fuel to the uncertainty. With rising tuition costs and living expenses, many students rely on part-time work to support themselves. However, with fewer job opportunities and tus, some students have started to explore study options in other countries such as Europe, Australia, and Canada.

Study abroad consultants like up unsafe jobs, such as working at petrol pumps or grocery stores, to make ends meet.

The fear of more stringent policies has led many students to alter their travel plans or even reconsider the US as their preon immigration, students are left grappling with an uncertain future, prompting many to look for backup options in countries like Germany, Ireland, and France.

Uttarakhand has officially implemented the Uniform Civil Code (UCC), becoming the first state in India to adopt such a framework, following Goa's longstanding legal system. The new UCC lays out uniform guidelines for marriage, divorce, property, inheritance, and adoption laws, ensuring equal rights for all citizens regardless of religion.

The Code was brought into effect nearly a year after its passage in the Uttarakhand assembly. It also fulfills a key promise made by the BJP during the 2022 state elections. Key provisions include mandatory registration of live-in relationships, with parental consent required for those involving individuals below 21 years of age.

Under the UCC, failure to declare live-in relationships or providing false information could lead to a jail term of up to three months, a fine of ₹25,000, or both. Delayed registration, even by a month,

sult in a penalty of ₹10,000 im-

prisonment for three months.

Other notable reforms include mandatory marriage registration, uniform marriage age (21 years for men and 18 years for women), and the prohibition of polygamy, child marriage, and triple talaq. The Code excludes Scheduled Tribes from its purview.

The UCC also ensures gender-neutral language in inheritance laws, referring to both sons and daughters as "child" to eliminate any gender bias. Moreover, it legitimizes children born out of live-in relationships, granting them equal inheritance rights.

This historic move is expected to set a precedent for other states, aiming to establish uniformity and equality across diverse communities.

JPC clears Waqf bill; Opposition calls it 'farcical exercise'



JPC adopts 14 NDAproposed amendments

Rejects opposition suggestions.

The Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) reviewing the Waqf (Amendment) Bill adopted 14 amendments proposed by the BJP-led NDA on Monday, rejecting all changes suggested by opposition members.

JPC chairperson Jagdambika Pal stated that the amendments were adopted by majority vote, with 16 members supporting the NDA's proposals and 10 opposing them. Opposition MPs, however, alleged that the process was undemocratic and accused the chairperson of stifling debate.

TMC MP Kalyan Banerjee criticized the proceedings, claiming the JPC functioned in a dictatorial manner and disregarded parliamentary rules. "This is a bad day for democracy," he said. Samajwadi Party MP Mohibbullah Nadvi echoed similar sentiments, alleging the bill was a "joke" with the country's minority community and an attempt to exploit the Waqf Board.

Pal dismissed the accusations, maintaining that the process was democratic and guided by majority opinion.

The Waqf (Amendment) Bill, introduced in 2022, proposes changes to the powers of state waqf boards, surveys of waqf properties, and the removal of encroachments by amending the Waqf Act, 1995. The JPC is expected to submit its report during the upcoming Budget

Delhi Family Returning from Mahakumbh Killed in Road Accident

A tragic road accident on the Lucknow-Agra Expressway claimed the lives of a Delhi-based family of four early Monday morning in Uttar Pradesh's Fatehabad area. The victims, Omprakash Singh (42), his wife Purnima (34), their 12-year-old daughter Ahana, and four-year-old son Vinayak, died on the spot after their car collided with a mini truck.

The family, originally from Motihari district in Bihar, was returning to their home in Delhi's Uttam Nagar after attending the Mahakumbh Mela and taking a holy dip at Triveni Sangam in Prayagraj.

- The accident occurred at 12:30 am when the car lost control and hit a mini truck.
- Police suspect the driver may have dozed off, causing the fatal collision.



 The vehicle was severely damaged, and bodies were extracted by Fatehabad po-

Assistant Commissioner of Police Amar Deep stated that the bodies have been sent for post-mortem, and the family has been informed. Preliminary investigations suggest that Omprakash Singh, who was driving the car, might have fallen asleep at the wheel, leading to the tragic accident. The collision left the car man-

gled, with police and emergency responders working to retrieve the bodies trapped inside. The incident highlights the dangers of fatigued driving, particularly during long journeys.

In a similar accident on January 24, two men lost their lives after their car rammed into a stationary truck on the Delhi-Agra highway in Mathura, underscoring the urgent need for road safety measures on major highways.

NGT questions CPCB over **Usage of funds**

The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has raised concerns over the Central Pollution Control Board's (CPCB) handling of environmental compensation (EC) funds collected from projects across India, particularly in Delhi. The tribunal has demanded a detailed audit of fund utilization within eight weeks, scheduling the next hearing for May 2.

The NGT's order, dated January 21, comes in response to a CPCB report filed on January 20, which revealed that only ₹223.44 crore out of ₹255.01 crore in EC collected up to September 2024 had been sanctioned for 67 projects. Despite this, a significant portion of the funds has not been used

The NGT, led by chairperson Justice Prakash Shrivastava, criticized the CPCB for spending a substantial amount on strengthening its computer network, a move deemed unrelated to environmental restoration. Additionally, funds were reportedly used for upgrading CPCB's and state pollution control boards' laboratories, which the tribunal noted should have been covered by their statutory responsibili-



for environmental restoration. The bench also highlighted the poor utilization of EC funds by several states and Union territories, including Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Jammu & Kashmir, and Delhi, where usage was less than

The tribunal dismissed CPCB's initial claim that the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) regularly audits EC funds, directing the board to provide detailed accounts and the latest annual audit report for the past ten years.

The NGT emphasized that EC funds should primarily address environmental restoration in affected areas and warned against their diversion for unrelated purposes. The next hearing on the matter is set for May 2.

Light rain expected in parts of north India from January 29

Kejriwal Claims BJP Mixing Poison in Yamuna Water

BJP Hits Back: Haryana CM Says Kejriwal is **Running Away with False Claims**

The political battle in the lead-up to the Delhi Assembly elections has intensified with a fierce exchange between Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). This time, the clash centers around Kejriwal's sensational claim that the Haryana government is "mixing poison" into the Yamuna river, which supplies water to the national capital.

Kejriwal, speaking to reporters on Monday, accused the BJP-led Haryana government of deliberately contaminating Delhi's water supply in a bid to create chaos and tarnish the Aam Aadmi Party's (AAP) reputation. He alleged that the Haryana government had added a poisonous substance—believed to be ammonia—into the Yamuna river, which flows from Haryana into Delhi. Kejriwal claimed that it was only due to the vigilance of the Delhi Jal Board (DJB) engineers that the allegedly poisoned water was stopped at the Delhi border and prevented from entering the city.

The allegations, which are not new in the political rivalry between AAP and BJP, come at a time when the Yamuna's water quality has been a significant issue in Delhi's governance. Kejriwal's admission last week that his government failed to fulfill its promise of cleaning the Yamuna and providing drinkable water has further fueled the political attacks from the opposition.

BJP's Rebuttal and Counterclaims

In response, Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini dismissed Kejriwal's accusations as baseless and reflective of his nature to accuse been monitoring the progress of these projects. ister Anil Vij, who criticized Kejriwal's leader- Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath ship, accusing him of failing to address Delhi's own water issues.

Vij, who has been vocal about the state of the Yamuna, pointed out that it is not Haryana's responsibility to clean the Yamuna once it enters Delhi, calling it a failure on Kejriwal's part. He further challenged Kejriwal to take journalists and experts to inspect the water quality where the Yamuna enters Delhi and compare it to the quality in Delhi.



AAP Seeks Election Commission's Intervention

Meanwhile, AAP leaders, including Delhi Chief Minister Atishi and Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, met with the Election Commission (EC) to seek action against Haryana for allegedly sabotaging Delhi's water supply. The EC has instructed Haryana to submit a detailed report on the issue by January 28.

Kejriwal's Past Promises and BJP's Attacks

The ongoing controversy has added fuel to the BJP's attacks on Kejriwal over his past promises regarding the cleaning of the Yamuna. In the 2020 Delhi elections, Kejriwal had assured voters that the river would be cleaned and made suitable for drinking. However, as the BJP pointed out, these promises remain largely unfulfilled, with delays in various river-cleaning projects being reported.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah, while addressing a rally at the Maha Kumbh, took a dig at Kejriwal for his unfulfilled promises, referring to his pledge to make the Yamuna as clean as the River Thames in London. Shah sarcastically reminded the people of Delhi about Kejriwal's promise to take a dip in the Yamuna once it was clean.

Delays in River Cleaning Projects

A report by the Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC) in October 2023 revealed that several river-cleaning projects are running behind schedule, including key initiatives by the Delhi Jal Board and the Delhi Development Authority (DDA). These delays have drawn attention from the National Green Tribunal (NGT), which has others without substantiated evidence. As the Delhi Assembly elections draw closer, the dispute over the Yamuna's water quality and the failure to fulfill promises of cleaning it have become a major point of contention. With both the AAP and BJP using the issue to target each other, it remains to be seen how this will impact the voters' perception in the run-up to the elections.

Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) chief Arvind Kejriwal announced on Sunday that Manish Sisodia will assume the role of Deputy Chief Minister once again if the party emerges victorious in the February 5 assembly elections in Delhi.

Addressing a public meeting in the Jangpura constituency, where Sisodia is contesting this time, Kejriwal said, "He will become the Deputy Chief Minister in the government, and with him, all of you will also become deputy chief ministers," urging voters to support Sisodia.

Manish Sisodia, a key figure in the outgoing AAP government, previously served as Kejriwal's deputy. Currently contesting from Jangpura, Sisodia has shifted his focus from Patparganj amid a tough electoral battle against BJP's Tarvinder Singh Marwah and Congress's

Kejriwal accused BJP MLAs of obstructing development in the last assembly, particularly in the eight constituencies they held. "You people should not make such a mistake again," he warned, emphasizing AAP's track record of improving government schools under Sisodia's leadership.

Highlighting AAP's education reforms, Kejriwal said, "Manish Sisodia and I have together transformed government schools for your children's future. The BJP threatens to close them if they form a government. You must choose wisely between the AAP that builds schools and the BJP that shuts them."

Manish Sisodia echoed Kejriwal's promises, assuring transformative governance. "If I win from Jangpura, every brother and sister here will become Deputy CM. No one will dare to stop the people's work here," he stated.

The assembly elections in Jangpura are expected to be a closely fought contest. Results will be declared on February 8.

Kejriwal pointed out that the people of Delhi will decide not only the city's future but also whether AAP's welfare schemes should be extended across the country. He emphasized that AAP's governance is aimed at using funds for public welfare, contrasting it with the BJP's approach of offering loans to billionaires that are later written off. He highlighted key AAP

welfare schemes, including free power, water, and bus travel for women, as well as a ₹2,100 monthly allowance for women voters. Kejriwal stated these schemes provide an average benefit of ₹25,000 per household each month, covering free education, power, and travel expenses. He argued that discontinuing these programs would burden the city's poor.

Kejriwal also criticized the BJP for calling these initiatives "freebies," pointing

out the contradictions in their own policies of offering massive tax concessions to big businesses. In response, the BJP dis-

missed Kejriwal's claims, stating that the upcoming Delhi elections are a clear choice between an "anarchic" government or a "double-engine" development government. BJP spokesperson Praveen Shankar Kapoor accused Kejriwal of corruption and failure to develop the city and declared that Delhi residents are ready to elect a BJP government in 2025.

Independent MP and Congress supporter Pappu Yadav took a sharp dig at the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) ahead of the Delhi Assembly elections, accusing both parties of corruption and neglecting key issues. Campaigning for Congress candidate Anil Kumar from Patparganj, Yadav claimed that AAP leader Arvind Kejriwal had surpassed Prime Minister Narendra Modi in dishonesty.

"I have seen Narendra Modi lie, but Kejriwal has gone beyond him. He promised not to become a VIP but is now the biggest VIP. Whether it's the Paris-like streets, cleaning Yamuna, or Mohalla Clinics, none of it matters. In terms of corruption, AAP beats even BJP," Yadav remarked.

Yadav also targeted BJP, accusing it of focusing only on

divisive politics and misusing central agencies like the ED and CBI. He asserted, "BJP has no real concern for Purvanchal or the country."

Referring to the tenure of former Delhi CM Sheila Dikshit, Yadav said, "People now recall her time when Delhi had better law and order, metro development, and greener spaces." Congress leader Sandeep Dikshit also criticized AAP and BJP for failing to address unemployment, a pressing issue in Delhi. "Both parties are offering false hopes. Welfare isn't about giving freebies but about building hospitals, schools, and houses," Dikshit said.

The Delhi Assembly elections are scheduled for February 5, with results to be declared on February 8. AAP, which swept the 2015 and 2020 elections, will face Congress and BJP as 699 candidates compete for 70

Mamta Kulkarni's Appointment Sparks Controversy Among Saints

The recent appointment of former Bollywood actress Mamta Kulkarni as the Mahamandaleshwar of the Kinnar Akhara during the Mahakumbh Mela in Prayagraj has ignited a debate among spiritual leaders. While some have celebrated her elevation, others have expressed strong reservations, citing her controversial past.

Kulkarni, now Shriyamai Mamta Nand Giri, was initiated into her new role by Laxmi Narayan Tripathi, the president of the Kinnar Akhara. The ceremony included traditional rituals that symbolized her integration into the spiritual community. However, this high-profile induction

has divided opinion within the religious fraternity.

Several saints have questioned the decision, with Shri Swami Anand Swaroop Maharaj of Shambhavi Peeth calling it a "betrayal of Sanatan Dharma." Swaroop Maharaj advised Kulkarni to reconsider her path, suggesting that her appointment could tarnish her reputation and harm the Akhara's image.



Similarly, Mahamandaleshwar Balaknanda Ji Maharaj and Acharya Mahamandaleshwar Balaknanda Ji have expressed concerns, questioning Kulkarni's qualifications for the role and whether her past aligns with the spiritual ideals of the Akhara.

Despite the criticism, some members of the Kinnar Akhara and its supporters argue that transformation and redemption are key tenets of spiritual life. They believe that Kulkarni's journey could inspire others to embrace spirituality, regardless of their past. Mamta Kulkarni's appointment as Mahamandaleshwar has brought attention to the evolving dynamics within spiritual institutions. While the controversy highlights tensions between tradition and change, it also raises questions about the criteria for spiritual leadership and the possibility of personal transformation within Sanatan Dharma.

Stalin gets relief in 'Sanatana Dharma' remark case

Tamil Nadu Deputy Chief Minister Udhayanidhi Stalin received a significant reprieve on Monday as the Supreme Court declined to entertain three writ petitions seeking criminal action against him over his controversial remarks on 'Sanatana Dharma.' The

petitions were dismissed with the liberty for petitioners to seek alternative legal remedies.

Court's Decision:

The petitions, filed by B Jagannath, Vineet Jindal, and Sanatan Suraksha Parishad, alleged that Stalin's remarks equating 'Sanatana Dharma' to diseases like dengue and malaria constituted hate speech and hurt religious sentiments.

A bench comprising Justice Bela

M. Trivedi and Justice Prasanna B. Varale questioned the maintainability of the petitions under Article 32 of the Constitution. Senior Advocate Dama Seshadri Naidu, representing the petitioners, sought permission to withdraw the petitions, which the court granted, allowing them to explore other legal remedies.

Stalin's Stance:

Udhayanidhi Stalin has consistently refused to apologise for his remarks made at the 'Sanatana Abolition Conference' in September 2023. He asserted that his statement was rooted in the ideologies of Dravidian leaders like Periyar, CN Annadurai, and M. Karunanidhi, and aimed to critique a system he believes opposes social justice and equality.

"My words were twisted," Stalin said, acknowledging the widespread criticism and legal actions. "Cases have been filed against me across India. They demanded an apology, but I stand by my words. I'm the grandson of Kalaignar, and I will not apologise."

The Controversy:

Stalin's comments, where he called for the "eradication" of Sanatana Dharma, sparked nationwide outrage, particularly from the BJP and Hindu organisations, leading to protests and multiple FIRs. His elevation to Deputy Chief Minister in September 2024 was reportedly delayed due to the backlash.

Indonesian Navy Chief Admiral Muhammad Ali's Visit to India Strengthens Defence Ties

Admiral Muhammad Ali, Chief of Staff of the Indonesian Navy, visited India alongside President Prabowo Subianto, who graced India's Republic Day Parade 2025 as Chief Guest. The visit underscored the growing defence and maritime cooperation between the two nations, highlighted by bilateral talks and significant advancements in the proposed USD 450 million BrahMos missile deal.

Admiral Ali engaged in talks with Admi-

ral Dinesh K. Tripathi, Chief of the Naval Staff of India, focusing on bolstering maritime collaboration and addressing regional challenges. Key topics included the enhancement of Exercise Samudra Shakti, cooperation in the Indian Ocean Region (IOR), and tackling illegal activities such as piracy and smuggling.

The Admiral also toured significant Indian maritime establishments like the Information Fusion Centre - Indian Ocean Region (IFC-IOR) and the Weapons and Electronics Systems Engineering Estab-

lishment (WESEE), reflecting the shared commitment to regional stability and technological collaboration.

A pivotal moment of Admiral Ali's visit was his interaction at BrahMos Aerospace Private Limited (BAPL), where discussions on advancing defence strategies took centre stage. Coinciding with President Subianto's meeting with BrahMos officials at a banquet hosted by President Droupadi Murmu, sources confirmed that negotiations for the \$450 million BrahMos missile system are nearing conclusion.

Rahul accuses BJP-RSS of insulting Ambedkar Constitution

Mumbai Cops' Probe Leads to Woman in Saif Ali Khan Attack Case

A significant breakthrough has been made in the investigation of actor Saif Ali Khan's stabbing case, with Mumbai Police questioning a woman in West Bengal, who allegedly provided a mobile phone SIM card to the Bangladeshi national responsible for the attack. According to police sources, the woman, Khukumoni Sheikh, hails from Chapra in Nadia district and was reportedly known to Sariful Islam, the Bangladeshi national who illegally entered India. The SIM card used by Islam during his stay in India was traced back

Islam, who entered India illegally through Meghalaya, lived in Bengal before relocating to Mumbai in search of a job. Police revealed that he had used a local Aadhaar card to procure the SIM card while in Bengal. In Mumbai, he worked at jobs that did not require official documentation.

During his stay, Islam used a National Identity Card and learner's driving license, both proving his Bangladeshi nationality. These

documents have been seized by the police.

On January 16, Islam stabbed Khan multiple times during a failed burglary attempt at the actor's Bandra residence. After a 70hour manhunt, Islam was arrested on January 19 in Thane. He was remanded in police custody.

Kareena Kapoor Khan, the actor's wife, described the attack as highly aggressive, recalling that she saw the intruder stab her husband repeatedly. A nurse present at the time, Eliyama Philips, mentioned that Islam had demanded ₹1 crore during the attack.

Islam admitted to attacking Khan after being grabbed by the actor, and he spent two hours hiding in the building's garden before fleeing. His father, however, denied the allegations, claiming his son was being framed.

Following the attack, doctors successfully removed a 2.5-inch piece of a broken knife from Khan's spine, which could have caused severe damage had it penetrated any deeper. The actor was discharged on January 21.

Six arrested from Kaushal Chaudhary gang, targeted killing foiled

Punjab Police successfully foiled a targeted killing plot on Monday by arresting six members of the notorious Kaushal Chaudhary gang. Director General of Police Gauray Yadav confirmed the arrests and stated that six pistols and 40 rounds of ammunition were recovered during the operation in Amritsar. Among those apprehended were key associates

Puneet Lakhanpal, also known as Sharma, and Narinder Kumar, alias Lalli.

According to the DGP, the arrested individuals had been evading capture for three years and were directly involved in high-profile murders, including the 2022 killing of kabaddi player Sandeep Singh Nangal Ambian and the 2021 murder of Sukhmeet Singh, alias Deputy.

The gang members were also involved in an indiscriminate firing incident at the Highway King Hotel in Rajasthan, demanding an extortion of ₹5 crore in September

A case has been registered in Amritsar, and further investigations are underway.

Coaching center deaths: Delhi HC grants bail to basement owners



•HC grants bail, citing limited involvement of basement owners.

The Delhi High Court has granted regular bail to the co-owners of a basement housing a coaching center where three civil services aspirants drowned during heavy rains in July 2024.

Justice Sanjeev Narula observed that the co-owners, Parvinder Singh, Tajinder Singh, Harvinder Singh, and Sarbjit Singh, appeared to have limited involvement, restricted to owning the property, with no evidence of corruption presented at this stage. The accused had been on interim bail since September

The court emphasized that granting bail aims to secure the accused's presence during the trial rather than act as punishment. It noted that while the allegations were grave, determining violations under Sections 105 and 106 of the BNS Act would depend on evidence presented during the trial.

The owners had leased the basement to Rau's IAS Study Circle, where the incident occurred. The CBI opposed their bail plea, arguing the lease was granted unlawfully for commercial use. However, the court confirmed their bail on the same terms as their interim relief, directing them to deposit ₹5 lakh with the Delhi State Legal Services Authority for the victims' families.

Three aspirants — Shreya Yadav (25) from Uttar Pradesh, Tanya Soni (25) from Telangana, and Nevin Delvin (24) from Kerala — lost their lives on July 27, 2024, when the basement flooded during heavy rains. The case was transferred from Delhi Police to the CBI following an earlier court directive.

Ex-Judge Appointed As Independent Observer For **Chandigarh Mayor Polls**

The Supreme Court of India has appointed former judge of the Punjab and Haryana High Court, Justice (retd) Jaishree Thakur, as the independent observer for the upcoming Chandigarh mayoral election, scheduled for January 30.

A bench of Justices Surya Kant and N Kotiswar Singh took note of the mutually agreeable stand from both sides and directed that the election proceedings be conducted in the observer's physical presence, which should also be videographed for transparency. The court further directed the returning officer of the mayoral election to coordinate with Justice

Justice Thakur, appointed for ensuring fairness and transparency in the process, will be paid an honorarium of ₹1 lakh by the Union Territory administration of Chandigarh within a week. The bench also ordered that necessary security arrangements be made for the observer's presence during the election.

This decision comes after a petition filed by incumbent mayor Kuldeep Kumar from AAP, seeking a "show of hands" voting system instead of a "secret ballot" to ensure fairness. However, the bench rejected the request, reaffirming that the election would proceed under the usual secret ballot system.

Thakur well ahead of the scheduled election
The Supreme Court clarified that the appoint-

ment of an independent observer was made in light of apprehensions raised by the petitioner regarding the fairness of the process. It also noted that while the court had no doubts about the authorities' objectivity, the observer's presence was necessary to ensure a free and fair election.

The decision follows a contentious mayoral poll from the previous year, where the result was overturned by the Supreme Court due to alleged tampering with ballots. The previous election saw BJP candidate Manoj Sonkar win, despite controversy over the invalidation of votes.

We Will Not Leave: Palestinians Slam Donald Trump's Idea To Clean Out Gaza

Trump's proposal to relocate Gazans sparks widespread condemnation

The latest chapter in the Gaza conflict has seen Palestinian leader Mahmud Abbas and Hamas strongly denounce U.S. President Donald Trump's suggestion to relocate Gazans to neighboring countries. Trump's proposal, described as a plan to "clean out" Gaza, was met with universal rejection from Palestinian factions and neighboring states, who labeled it as an attempt at ethnic cleansing.

Hamas, along with Islamic Jihad, pledged to thwart such initiatives, recalling past resistance to displacement plans. Abbas reiterated Palestinians' steadfastness in their homeland, rejecting any project aimed at uprooting them. Trump suggested relocating Gaza's 2.4 million residents to Jordan or Egypt temporarily or permanently. The Arab League and regional powers labeled the plan as ethnic cleansing, with Jordan and Egypt issuing strong

Displacement talks evoke memories of the Nakba, symbolizing the mass displacement of Palestinians in 1948.

The fragile truce between Israel and Hamas, entering its second week, remains under strain as disputes over hostage exchanges and humanitarian access persist. While recent swaps freed four Israeli hostages and 200 Palestinian prisoners, ongoing tensions over a civilian hostage, Arbel Yehud, have delayed the return of displaced Palestinians to northern Gaza.

The United Nations has reported dire humanitarian conditions in Gaza despite the recent surge in aid. The truce agreement, which includes phased exchanges of hostages and prisoners, offers a glimmer of hope for easing the prolonged crisis, though the path to lasting peace remains uncertain.

Neighboring Lebanon has also seen clashes, with Israeli forces reportedly targeting civilians attempting to return to border areas, further highlighting the region's volatility.

Preliminary Investigation Reveals Bird Strike as Possible Cause of Jeju Air Disaster

A preliminary investigation into the catastrophic Jeju Air crash that occurred on December 29, 2024, suggests a bird strike as a potential cause. The Boeing 737-800, traveling from Thailand to Muan, South Korea, crash-landed and erupted into flames upon hitting a concrete barrier, killing 179 of the 181 passengers and crew.

Investigators discovered bird feathers and bloodstains in both engines of the ill-fated plane.

DNA analysis confirmed the remains belonged to Baikal teals, migratory ducks common in Korea during winter.

The pilots encountered a flock of birds while approaching runway 01, and the air traffic control tower had issued a warning about bird activity just

The cockpit voice and data recorders ceased functioning one minute after the bird warning. Seconds later, the pilots declared a mayday, citing bird strikes, and attempted an emergency belly landing. Tragically, the plane collided with a concrete embankment, leading to an explosion.

The incident has raised concerns about the use of rigid concrete barriers at runways. Authorities have since announced plans to replace these barriers with "breakable structures" to enhance safety in case of similar emergencies.

Pilots' Experience and Questions Raised:

The captain, with over 6,800 flight hours, and the first officer, with 1,650 hours, were among the fatalities. Investigators are examining why the bird strike led to such catastrophic engine failure and why the concrete barricade was positioned at the runway's end.

This disaster, the deadliest on South Korean soil, underscores the need for improved bird strike prevention and airport safety measures.

Donald Trump imposes 25 per cent tariffs on Colombia for refusing deportation flights

Trade tensions between the United States and Colombia have flared after US President Donald Trump announced a 25% tariff on all imports from Colombia. The move comes in response to Colombia's refusal to allow two US deportation flights to land, carrying immigrants for repatriation.



He reiterated the importance of implementing the consensus reached by President Xi Jinping and Prime Minister Narendra Modi during their meeting in Russia last year, which aimed to reset ties strained by border tensions.

"India and China must commit to mutual support and understanding rather than suspicion," said Wang Yi. The relationship is pivotal for Asia's development and global South coop-

eration.

Misri's visit follows talks between Wang Yi and Ajit Doval last month. Wang, also China's Special Representative for the India-China border mechanism, emphasized the broader significance of their relationship, noting its impact on the global South and contributions to peace, stability, and prosperity in Asia.

The visit included discussions with Liu Jianchao, head of the Communist Party's International Department, focusing on implementing leadership consensus, enhancing dialogue, and addressing regional and international issues of mutual concern. Misri's engagement comes ahead of China's Spring Festival and the Chinese New Year celebrations, symbolizing optimism for a new chapter in bilateral relations amidst challenges.



Iran Adds Russian-Made Sukhoi-35 **Fighter Jets To Its Combat Air Fleet**

Iran has officially confirmed the purchase of Russian Sukhoi-35 fighter jets, marking a significant upgrade to its air force amidst heightened military cooperation with Moscow. Iran's air force, which comprises ageing US jets acquired pre-1979 and older Russian models, will see a considerable boost with the arrival of these advanced aircraft.

Ali Shadmani, deputy coordinator of the Khatam-ol-Anbia Central Headquarters, announced that military upgrades are underway, with outdated systems being replaced. While Shadmani did not confirm whether the Su-35 jets have been delivered, this is the first acknowledgment of the purchase by a senior Iranian official.

In November, Iran's Tasnim News Agency reported that arrangements to acquire the fighter jets had been finalized. This move aligns with a broader 20year strategic partnership signed earlier this month between Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian and Russian President Vladimir Putin in Moscow.

Key Clauses of the Strategic Partnership:

Mutual Defense Commitment: Neither nation will allow its territory to be used for acts threatening the other.

Military-Technical Cooperation: Though not explicitly mentioning arms transfers, the agreement emphasizes the strengthening of military collaboration.

Geopolitical Context:

Russia's involvement in Ukraine has strained its regional influence. Iran faces mounting Western sanctions and regional instability due to its conflict with Israel.

The collapse of Bashar al-Assad's regime in Syria has further weakened the strategic foothold of both Tehran and Moscow in the Middle East.

The purchase of Sukhoi-35 jets and the strengthening of military ties highlight Iran and Russia's shared need to counteract their geopolitical challenges, ensuring mutual security and influence in a rapidly shifting global landscape.

SEBI Bars Eight Entities for Front-Running, Impounds ₹4.82 Crore

Action taken against entities for illegal trading based on insider information

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) on Monday barred eight entities from participating in the securities market and ordered the impounding of ₹4.82 crore, representing unlawful gains from alleged front-running activities.

What is Front-Running?

stock market practice where an entity trades on advanced, non-public information about impending transactions of a major client, enabling unfair profits.

the trades of Gagandeep Consultancy Private Limited (the "big client") between September 2018 and September 2023. It revealed that Ashish Kirti Kothari, along with family members and his Hindu Undi-

vided Family (HUF), leveraged

insider information to conduct

front-running trades.

The broker, Nirav Mahendra Front-running is an illegal Sapani, employed at Anvil Share & Stock Broking, acted as the information conduit. Sapani shared confidential details about the client's trades with Kothari and his associates. Another entity, Krishna Tukaram Kadam, facilitated SEBI's investigation focused on the execution and laundering

of these trades.

SEBI's Findings and Action The investigation uncovered a systematic scheme:

Kothari and his associates placed trades ahead of the big client's transactions based on Sapani's tips.

The unlawful gains from these trades were distributed among the involved parties.

Citing violations of the Prohibition of Fraudulent and Unfair Trade Practices (PFUTP) rules, SEBI has:

Barred all eight entities from trading in securities, directly or indirectly.

Impounded ₹4.82 crore, jointly and severally, from the accused.

Future Steps

The interim order remains in effect until further notice, as SEBI continues to investigate the extent of regulatory violations. This decisive action underscores SEBI's commitment to maintaining market integrity and cracking down on fraudulent practices.

India, China Agree to Resume Kailash **Mansarovar Yatra and Direct Flights**

The implications of unchecked religious conversions extend beyond immediate demographics. The establishment of new religious worship sites in villages and mandals across Andhra Pradesh over the past five years signals an organized effort to influence the local populace. This has the potential to destabilize the region, leading to social unrest and even challenges to governance. As conversions increase, the resulting polarization could deepen existing divisions, making communities more susceptible to external influences and destabilizing national unity.

Urgent Need for Comprehensive Action To address this growing challenge, the following areas must be investigated: 1. Sources of Funding

Transparency in funding is crucial to understanding the motivations behind these conversions. Are these funds gen-

uinely for charitable purposes, or are they part of a larger strategy by foreign entities to destabilize the region? Identifying the origins of financial support is the first step in curbing any harmful agendas.

2. Oversight and Accountability

Local authorities and regulatory bodies must take responsibility for monitoring the activities of organizations involved in religious conversions. Are these entities adhering to local laws and regulations? A robust oversight mechanism is essential to prevent misuse of power or influence.

3. Nature of Activities

What events and programs are being conducted at these newly established worship sites? Are they solely focused on religion, or do they include political or divisive social agendas? Understanding the scope and intent of these activities will help identify potential risks.

4. Registration and Legitimacy

Proper registration and compliance with local laws are critical for ensuring transparency. Are these organizations operating legally, or are they bypassing regulations to further hidden agendas? Strengthening Legal and Regulatory Frameworks

The Foreign Contribution Regulation Act

(FCRA) must be enforced rigorously to ensure organizations receiving foreign funding adhere to national legal standards. Key measures should include regular audits, transparent reporting, and strict penalties for non-compliance. Additionally, central government agencies must enhance their oversight mechanisms to monitor NGO activities, ensuring they align with national priorities and ethical practices.

Proactive Measures to Safeguard National Security

Given the scale of conversions and the potential risks, a multi-faceted approach is necessary:

1. Temporary Suspension of Foreign Funding

As a precautionary measure, suspend foreign funding to religious institutions until detailed audits confirm the transparency and legitimacy of their operations.

2. Public Disclosure of Funding Details

Funding sources for these organizations must be made publicly accessible to promote accountability and discourage misuse.

3. Strengthening Local Monitoring

Equip local authorities with the resources and authority needed to oversee the activities of organizations in their jurisdictions effectively.

The People's Padma: How PM Modi Redefined India's Highest Civilian Awards

The Padma Awards, instituted in 1954, have long been a symbol of India's recognition of excellence in various fields such as arts, science, social service, and sports. Initially, the Padma Vibhushan was classified into three categories: Class I, II, and III, ranking just below the Bharat Ratna. Over time, the awards were restructured into three separate honours: the Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan, and Padma Shri. However, under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership, the Padma Awards have undergone a transformative shift, evolving into what can now be seen as true "People's Awards," celebrating inclusivity, democracy, and merit.

The most recent list of Padma Awardees underscores this evolution. It reflects a deliberate effort to recognize individuals from all walks of life, especially those contributing to society in the fields of social service, culture, and community welfare. Figures such as Nagaland's L. Hangthing, the "Fruit Man," who revolutionized fruit cultivation, and Bhim Singh Bhavesh from Bihar's Buxar district, a champion of the Musahar community, epitomize this shift. These unsung heroes, working quietly and selflessly, are driving real social change.

Noteworthy awardees like 106-year-old environmentalist Saalumarada Thimmakka, known as the "Mother of Trees," and Tulsi Gowda, a member of the Pakkali tribal community, are also celebrated for their tireless dedication to causes that go beyond personal fame. Their recognitions align with the original purpose of the Padma Awards—to honour those who embody service, dedication, and excellence, regardless of status.

A significant reform under PM Modi's leadership has been the democratization of the selection process. Prior to 2016, the awards were often seen as elitist and opaque, with selections influenced by political affiliations. In 2016, the nomination process was opened to the public, allowing any Indian citizen to nominate deserving individuals. This change has led to over 50,000 nominations annually, ensuring that selections are based solely on merit and contribution to society.

Indian Schools: Falling Short of Preparing Students for the Future

India's school infrastructure is at a critical juncture, where immediate attention is needed not only to address existing gaps but also to reimagine how schools can equip students for the challenges of the future. The Ministry of Education's recently released Unified District Information System for Education Plus (UDISE+) 2023-24 report paints a concerning picture of deficiencies in basic amenities such as drinking water, functional toilets, and electricity. But beyond these immediate concerns lies a much larger question: Are our schools ready to nurture future-ready students with the necessary skills to thrive in an increasingly complex world?

While technological advancements are reshaping education globally, Indian schools are struggling to meet even the basic needs for a future-oriented education system. Many schools lack essential infrastructure such as functional computer labs, science labs, and integrated learning devices. This points to the urgent need not just for foundational amenities, but also for advanced educational infrastructure that aligns with the demands of a rapidly changing world.

Digital Infrastructure in Schools

According to the UDISE+ report, only 57% of the 14.71 lakh schools in India have computer facilities, and of those, just 50.9% are equipped with functional systems for teaching purposes. Even more troubling is that only 8.1% of schools have integrated teaching-learning devices, and only 24.4% boast operational smart classrooms. This digital divide must be addressed immediately to ensure that no student is left behind in an increasingly digital world.

The COVID-19 pandemic has highlighted the critical role of digital tools in education, and while the need for digital infrastructure has grown, progress in upgrading this infrastructure has been alarmingly slow. Bridging the digital divide through affordable devices, reliable internet access, and teacher training should be a top priority to ensure that Indian students are prepared for future careers in a tech-driven world.

Skills for the Future

Beyond digital literacy, schools must equip students with critical skills like problem-solving, communication, adaptability, and analytical thinking. As technology continues to



redefine the workforce, subjects like coding, artificial intelligence, and data literacy should become an integral part of the curriculum. These competencies will enable students to thrive in an ever-changing global landscape.

Building Climate-Resilient Schools

As India faces the growing challenges of climate change, schools must prepare students to engage with environmental issues. The UDISE+ 2023-24 report reveals that only 10.5% of schools have solar panels, and 36.2% have kitchen gardens—resources that could play a vital role in teaching sustainability. Programs focused on waste management, renewable energy, and conservation could transform schools into hubs of environmental responsibility, providing handson experiences that foster practical learning.

Tinkering labs, which only 10.9% of schools currently have, are another critical resource for fostering creativity and problem-solving skills. Integrating environmental challenges into these labs could help students design sustainable solutions, bridging the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical application.

The Path Forward

The Ministry of Education must take a lead role in addressing these gaps and ensuring schools are equipped for the future. Investments should prioritize both foundational infrastructure—such as electricity, water, and sanitation—and advanced resources like computer labs, science labs, and smart classrooms. A focus on making schools future-ready is essential to providing equitable, high-quality education for all students.

Can India Redeem Itself in the 2023 Champions Trophy?

The ICC Champions Trophy, which India won in 2013, remains a fond memory for many cricket fans. With Shikhar Dhawan's player-of-the-tournament performance and Virat Kohli's iconic 'Gangnam Style' dance, that victory marked the last time India clinched an ICC ODI tournament. As the Champions Trophy returns in 2023 after a six-year hiatus, India faces a critical opportunity to redeem itself, especially after underwhelm-

Industrial and commercial connections also saw an increase, with 167 new consumers, bringing the total to 8,913.

The company's cumulative steel pipeline network now spans 13,082 Inch Km, highlighting its ongoing infrastructure expansion. ATGL's combined CNG and PNG volume reached 257 MMSCM, marking a 15% year-on-year increase, underscoring the growing demand for natural gas.

In terms of financial performance, ATGL saw a 12% increase in revenue from operations, reaching Rs 1,397 crore. EBITDA stood at Rs 272 crore, while profit after tax (PAT) for the quarter was Rs 143 crore. These results reflect the company's ability to maintain a strong growth trajectory despite challenges in gas supply, including a reduction in APM gas allocation.

Suresh P Manglani, ED and CEO of ATGL, emphasized the company's focus on maintaining affordability for consumers while ensuring profitability. He also highlighted ATGL's commitment to expanding PNG and CNG infrastructure, particularly in its 34 Geographical Areas (GAs), including the recently added Jalandhar GA in Punjab.

ATGL is authorized in 34 GAs, with the remaining 19 GAs being operated through a joint venture with Indian Oil Corporation Limited under the name Indian Oil-Adani Gas Private Limited (IOAGPL). In addition to its core gas distribution business, ATGL has expanded into the E-Mobility and Biomass sectors with the formation of two wholly owned subsidiaries: Adani TotalEnergies E-Mobility Ltd (ATEL) and Adani TotalEnergies Biomass Ltd (ATBL). The company has also established a 50:50 joint venture, Smart Meter Technologies Private Limited, to manufacture gas meters.



India Poised to Expand Its Share in Global Pharma Manufacturing Beyond Generics: BCG Report

India is set to capture a larger share of the global pharmaceutical manufacturing market, moving beyond its traditional focus on generic drugs, according to a report by Boston Consulting Group (BCG). The report highlights that the ongoing "China+1" strategy, where companies are diversifying operations outside China, has created new opportunities for India to become a key player in the global pharmaceutical supply chain.

The report notes that with pharmaceutical companies looking to reduce their dependency on China, India is emerging as a competitive alternative due to its cost advantage. Indian pharmaceutical services are 20% cheaper than those offered by China, making it an attractive destination for manufacturing operations.

India's expanding role in the global pharma landscape is further supported by investments flowing into the country's pharmaceutical sector, enabling it to move beyond generics and explore other avenues such as biotechnology, digital health, and Med-Tech. According to the report, pharmaceutical and biotechnology investments have received USD 9.5 billion, while health services have garnered USD 12.1 billion in funding. Additionally, digital health has seen remarkable growth, securing USD 4.6 billion in investments over recent years.

India, along with Singapore, is also emerging as a prominent hub for healthcare innovation and investment in Asia. Since 2018, the pharmaceutical and biotech sectors in Asia have attracted USD



20 billion in private equity investments, with India receiving a significant share of USD 5 billion. This investment influx, coupled with India's competitive pricing and infrastructure development, positions the country for substantial growth in the global pharmaceutical market.

The report also emphasizes that Asia's healthcare market is projected to reach USD 5 trillion by 2030, contributing 40% of global sector growth. As India continues to attract investments and expand its pharmaceutical manufacturing capabilities, it is poised to play a transformative role in the global healthcare ecosystem, benefiting both the economy and global supply chains.

Industry Players Call for Pro-Manufacturing Policies Ahead of Union Budget 2025-26

As India prepares for the Union Budget 2025-26 on February 1, industry leaders from the manufacturing sector are urging the government to introduce policies that foster local production, reduce GST on consumer durables, and implement tax reforms that would increase disposable incomes, thereby stimulating consumer spending. The government has set an ambitious target of increasing the manufacturing sector's contribution to GDP from the current 17% to 25%. In light of this, industry representatives are hoping for financial incentives to expand the Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) schemes, support for sustainable manufacturing practices, and tax exemptions that can help bolster growth.

Simarpreet Singh, Executive Director and CEO of Hartek Group, acknowledged the positive strides made by the government in supporting the manufacturing sector but emphasized the need for continued fo-



cus on enhancing domestic production capacity. He advocated for policy measures that would make manufacturing more attractive and competitive, both for local businesses and foreign investors.

Manufacturers are particularly seeking reductions in GST rates for consumer durables, which would ease the financial burden on both producers and consum-

ers. Such measures are expected to boost consumer spending, helping to accelerate demand for manufactured goods. Additionally, a more favorable tax regime that increases disposable incomes will help generate higher demand for consumer goods, creating a positive cycle of growth. The industry is also calling for expanded PLI schemes that would encourage more investment in key sectors such as electronics, renewable energy, and automotive manufacturing. These sectors are seen as vital to India's economic transformation, and the government's support in the form of incentives and reforms would allow them to flourish further. With the government focused on boosting the manufacturing sector as a key driver of economic growth, industry players remain hopeful that the upcoming budget will address their concerns and provide the necessary policy framework to achieve these objec-








South African telescope discovers a giant galaxy that's 32 times bigger than Earth's

 $\mathbf{H}^{\mathrm{igh}}$ above our heads, there's an ongoing cosmic party orchestrated by supermassive black holes. These enigmatic objects, which can have masses millions or even billions of times that of our Sun, are the driving force behind some of the most spectacular phenomena in the universe.

Astronomers believe that every galaxy harbors a supermassive black hole at its center. In many galaxies, vast amounts of interstellar gas spiral around these black holes, getting sucked in beyond the event horizon. This process generates immense friction and energy, leading to the release of enormous amounts of light across various wavelengths of the electromagnetic spectrum. It's this cosmic "rave" that's so captivating to scientists and sky-watchers



In addition to the energy released from gas falling into the black hole, some supermassive black holes also eject vast jets of plasma that stretch millions of light-years across intergalactic space. These plasma jets are so hot that they consist of electrons moving at nearly the speed of light. The jets glow brightly in radio frequencies, making them visible through radio hints at the vastness of the cosmos, where telescopes. When these jets are observed, they are called "radio galaxies," and their appearance can be likened to two glowing

sticks, each stretching out from the black hole like the arms of a cosmic dance.

As time passes, astronomers theorize that the plasma jets continue expanding outward, eventually growing into massive structures known as giant radio galaxies. 

m ew}$ Zealand has secured a direct entry into the ICC Women's World Cup 2025 following Bangladesh's loss to the West Indies in their final ICC Women's Championship match on Friday in Basseterre. Both New Zealand and Bangladesh finished the 10-team tournament with 21 points, but New Zealand's superior number of wins—nine compared to Bangladesh's eight—earned them the coveted spot.

The tournament featured all teams playing eight three-match series—four at home and four away—and New Zealand's performance ensured their direct qualification. Along with the hosts India, the top five teams in the standings—Australia, India, England, South Africa, and Sri Lanka—have secured automatic berths for the upcoming World Cup.

Australia clinched the ICC Women's Championship title with an impres-

sive 39 points, while India closely followed in second place with 37 points. England (32), South Africa (25), and Sri Lanka (22) also guaranteed their spots for the World Cup, leaving the bottom four teams to battle for the remaining qualification spot through the upcoming World Cup Qualifier.

Bangladesh (21), West Indies (18), Pakistan (17), and Ireland (eight) will join Scotland and Thailand—ranked the highest as of October 31, 2024—at the Qualifier. The details for the Qualifier will be announced soon, with two spots available for the World Cup.

India will host the 2025 Women's ODI World Cup for the fifth time, marking the first global women's tournament held there since 2016 when India hosted the T20 World Cup alongside the men's event. The 2025 edition will be similar to the 2022 tournament, with eight teams competing across 31 matches.

Jasprit Bumrah Wins ICC Men's **Test Cricketer of the Year 2024**

Tndia's fast-bowling Lace, Jasprit Bumrah, has been named the ICC Men's Test Cricketer of the Year for 2024, thanks to a remarkable year with the ball. Bumrah claimed an impressive 71 wickets in 357 overs across 13 matches, with an outstanding average of 14.92. His achievements in 2024 make him only the fourth Indian bowler to take more than 70 wickets in a calendar year, joining the ranks of Ravichandran Ashwin, Anil Kumble, and Kapil Dev. Bumrah's sensational performance earned him the prestigious award, defeating stiff competition from Sri Lanka's Kamindu Mendis and England's Harry Brook and Joe Root.

Bumrah's exceptional year saw him shine in both home and away conditions, playing a key role in India's World Test Championship campaign, although they ultimately fell short of reaching the final. His 2024 campaign began with a standout performance in India's historic Test win in Cape Town against South Africa, where he took eight wickets. He followed this up with 19 wickets in India's 4-1 series victory over England, with a notable nine-wicket match haul in Visakhapatnam,



which helped India level the series.

However, Bumrah's crowning achievement in 2024 came during the Border-Gavaskar Trophy series in Australia, where he picked up 32 wickets in five matches at an incredible average of 13.06. His performance in Australia not only earned him the Player of the Series award but also saw him become the 12th Indian bowler to surpass the 200 Test wickets milestone. His best performance came in Perth, where he took eight wickets, including

a five-wicket haul in the first innings, propelling India to a dominant 295-run victory.

At just 31 years old, Bumrah's record-breaking year also saw him set a unique Test history milestone, becoming the only bowler with over 200 Test wickets to have an average under 20, with an impressive 19.4. His exceptional skill and consistency have solidified his place as one of the best fast bowlers in world cricket today.

Frenkie de Jong, Ferran Torres, and Raphinha also found the back of the net, while Valencia struggled defensively throughout the match.

The opening goal came early, just three minutes in, when De Jong converted a cross from teenage prodigy Lamine Yamal. Barcelona's second followed shortly after, with Torres scoring from Alejandro Balde's cross. Lopez then set up Raphinha for the third, and the Brazilian winger rounded the the season.

Despite the dominant scoreline, Valencia's coach Carlos Corberan faced harsh criticism for his side's performance. Valencia defender Jose Gaya expressed his disappointment, saying, "It was an enormous step backward," and urged his team to focus on the next match.

Barcelona's victory lifted them back on track in La Liga, but their coach, Hansi Flick, emphasized the importance of maintaining this momentum as they trail leaders Real Madrid by seven points.

Noman Ali Hat-Trick in vain as Pakistan Lost the match to West Indies

Pakistan's star spinner, Noman Ali, made history on Day 1 of the second Test against the West Indies in Multan by taking a remarkable hat-trick. This achievement, which came within the first hour of the match, placed Noman among an elite group of cricketers. He dismissed Justin Greaves (1), Tevin Imlach (0), and Kevin Sinclair (0), becoming the sixth player in Test cricket history to claim a hat-trick in the opening session of a match.

Notably, Noman is only the second-ever spinner to achieve this feat in Test cricket, following in the footsteps of Australia's Billy Bates, who accomplished it in 1883. At 38 years and 139 days old, Noman also became the second-oldest player to take a Test hattrick, trailing only Sri Lanka's Rangana Herath, who was 38 years and 110 days when he achieved the same.

Despite Noman's historic performance, Pa-



kistan was unable to capitalize on his early breakthroughs, and the West Indies went

on to win the match by 120 runs. This victory allowed the West Indies to level the series 1-1, with spinner Jomel Warrican playing a key role in the win by taking five wickets. Warrican finished with nine wickets in the match, and an impressive 19 wickets in the series, leading the West Indies to their first Test win in Pakistan in nearly 35 years.

The last time the West Indies won a Test match in Pakistan was in November 1990 in Faisalabad. Despite tough tours in 1997 and 2006, the West Indies managed to defeat Pakistan on sharply spinning pitches, making this victory a historic one for the team.

West Indies captain Kraigg Brathwaite expressed his pride in the young squad, saying, "We haven't played in Pakistan for a number of years, but we haven't won here in a while, so to come here

and do it as a young group is incredible."
