

Hyderabad's Water Vision 2050

CM Sets Course for Sustainable Growth

Water and Sewerage Strategy Boosting HMWSSB Revenue

Godavari Phase 2 Expansion Upgrading Old Pipelines

TPN, **Hyderabad**: Chief Minister Revanth Reddy has directed the Hyderabad Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board (HMWSSB) to prepare a comprehensive infrastructure plan to meet the water needs of the city's growing population by 2050. The first-ever HMWSSB board meeting, chaired by the CM, was held at the Integrated Command Control Center.

The CM emphasized studying water and sewerage requirements with the help of agencies and consultants to design sustainable solutions for the future. Officials briefed the meeting, stating that Hyderabad currently has a water distribution network spanning 9,800 kilometers, serving 13.79 lakh connections. Water is sourced from the Manjira, Singur, Godavari, and Krishna rivers.

Discussions were held on utilizing Phase 2 of the Godavari project to transport water to reservoirs like Osman Sagar and Himayat Sagar. Based on a consultancy report, the project will transfer 20 TMC of water from Mallanna Sagar, revising the earlier proposal of 15 TMC, to



cater to the city's future demands.

The CM directed officials to explore ways to enhance HMWSSB's revenue and study policies for long-term sustainability. He suggested preparing DPRs (Detailed Project Reports) for new projects and raising low-interest loans to meet funding needs.

Given the aging infrastructure, the CM ordered the replacement of old water pipelines installed in 1965 with modern

lines to ensure uninterrupted supply. He also reviewed the income-expenditure reports of the water board through a PowerPoint presentation. The meeting was attended by CM's advisor Vem Narender Reddy, Chief Secretary Shanti Kumari, and other senior officials.

This initiative aims to secure Hyderabad's water infrastructure for decades, aligning with the city's rapid urbanization and expanding population needs.

Granted Bail in Nampally Court

TPN, **Hyderabad**: Actor Allu Arjun has been granted regular bail by the Nampally Court in connection with the stampede incident at Sandhya Theatre. The court approved the bail on a bond of Rs. 50,000 and two sure-ties.

The incident occurred during a promotional event at Sandhya Theatre, where overcrowding led to a stampede. Following this, a case was filed against Allu Arjun, holding him partially responsible for the mismanagement.

As part of the bail conditions, the court directed the actor to appear before Chikkadpally Police every Sunday for further investigation.

This decision comes as a relief for the actor, who had been facing legal scrutiny over the unfortunate incident. Fans and well-wishers of the actor welcomed the court's decision, expressing their support on social media platforms.

The case highlights the need for better crowd management during large public events to prevent such occurrences in the future. Further proceedings in the case are awaited.

TPN, **Telangana**: Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka, addressing a stakeholders' meeting on the Clean and Green Energy Policy, emphasized Telangana's exemplary achievements in the green energy sector. He highlighted the state's ambitious goal of generating 20,000 MW of green power by 2030, up from the current capacity of 11,399 MW, positioning Telangana as a leader in renewable energy in India.

Driving Comprehensive Development

The Deputy CM detailed plans for future urban development with initiatives such as AI City near Hyderabad, a hub for artificial intelligence and smart technologies, and Pharma City, envisioned as a global pharmaceutical hub. These projects, along with improved connectivity through the Regional Ring Road (RRR) and Metro Rail expansion, aim to transform Telangana into a logistics powerhouse.

Renewable Energy Milestones

Telangana currently generates 7,889 MW from solar, 2,518 MW from hydro, and 771 MW from pumped storage projects. Innovative solutions like floating solar plants, green hydrogen technology, and pumped storage systems are being explored. With a wind power potential of 54,717 MW, Telangana ranks among the top eight states in India.

Focus on Electric Vehicles

The state has established 872 EV charging stations and offers incentives like tax exemptions and subsidies to attract investments in the EV sector. Telangana also leads in waste-to-energy initiatives, reflecting its commitment to sustainable energy practices.

ED to Question KTR on January 7

TPN, **Hyderabad**: The Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) has issued notices to Telangana Minister K.T. Rama Rao (KTR), summoning him for questioning on January 6 regarding the ongoing investigation into the E-Formula case.

The notices were personally delivered to KTR by ACB officials, marking a significant development in the case. Along with KTR, senior officials Arvind Kumar and BLN Reddy have also been issued notices. The ACB plans to question these officials following KTR's interrogation.

Additionally, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) had earlier summoned KTR for questioning on January 7 in connection with the same case.



The case, which has drawn considerable public attention, revolves around alleged irregularities and corruption in the E-Formula project. Authorities are now intensi-

fying their investigation to identify those responsible and hold them accountable. Further updates on the inquiry and legal proceedings are awaited.

Forest and R&B Coordination to Resolve RRR Hurdles Nagpur-Vijayawada Corridor Land Acquisition Deadline Set BT Roads for Villages to Mandal Centers Emphasized

TPN, Hyderabad: Telangana Chief The meeting, attended by Dep-Minister A. Revanth Reddy has directed officials to expedite the land acquisition process for the Telangana Maniharam Regional Ring Road (RRR) to ensure timely project completion. During a high-level review meeting at the Dr. BR Ambedkar Secretariat, the CM stressed the importance of resolving obstacles related to the Forest Department to facilitate RRR construction.

He instructed that the Forest and Roads & Buildings (R&B) departments work in close coordination and appoint dedicated officers from each department to address the issues efficiently.

uty Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka, cabinet ministers, and senior officials, also reviewed the progress of other key infrastructure projects, including R&B and National Highway works. The Chief Minister set a clear deadline, directing officials to finalize land acquisition for the Nagpur-Vijayawada corridor by Sankranti.

Highlighting the importance of connectivity, CM Revanth emphasized the need for high-quality bituminous (BT) roads from villages to mandal centers. He instructed officials to design these roads to accommodate future growth and release funds in installments to



facilitate the projects. Kishan Reddy Slams Congress for Failing Telangana Farmers

TPN , Hyderabad: BJP State President Kishan Reddy launched a scathing critique of the Congress government in Telangana, accusing it of misleading the public and failing to address the needs of farmers. Calling it a "government of words, not deeds," he alleged that Congress is cutting corners on vital schemes like Rythu Bharosa, leaving farmers in distress.

"The Congress government has data on farmers, farm laborers, and tenant farmers, yet applications for Rythu Bharosa continue. Why are farmers forced to apply for a scheme that should be automatic? There is no crop insurance, and not a single rupee has been disbursed under the scheme," Kishan Reddy remarked. He accused the Congress of following the footsteps of the BRS government in shackling farmers with false promises.

The BJP leader also questioned the delay in the fourth installment of the loan waiver, which Chief Minister Revanth Reddy promised to implement by November 30. "The money has yet to reach farmers' accounts, and this government appears to have no control over its officials," he said.



He pointed out that the central government provides substantial subsidies on fertilizers, with urea being available to farmers for just Rs 267, despite the actual cost being over Rs 2,500 per bag.

"The Modi government provides Rs 19,000 per acre through various channels and Rs 6,000 annually under the PM-Kisan Samman Nidhi, with no delays or gimmicks," he stated.

KTR Blasts Congress Over Farmer Assurance Affidavits No Rythu Bandhu Funds Disbursed Under Congress, Says KTR **KTR Accuses Congress of Sabotaging Farmer Welfare Schemes** Rythu Bandhu Delayed by Months, Claims KTR

TPN, Hyderabad: BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) has raised strong objections to the Congress government's handling of farmer welfare schemes, particularly the Rythu Bandhu program. Speaking at Telangana Bhavan, KTR questioned why farmers were being asked to provide affidavits for the assurance of benefits under the scheme.

KTR slammed the government for requiring farmers to "beg" for what is rightfully theirs. He pointed out that not a single rupee has been disbursed under the farmer assurance program so far, despite promises made during the election. "It is not the farmers who should give the declaration; it is the government that should fulfill its promis-



es," KTR asserted.

He further accused the Congress government of trying to undermine the Rythu Bandhu scheme, which was introduced by the BRS government to provide financial assistance to farmers. KTR claimed that the Congress administration had evaded approximately Rs. 26,500 crore intended for farmer welfare. He compared the current government's actions unfavorably with the BRS regime, stating, "During the BRS government, Rythu Bandhu was distributed 12 times. Since Congress took power, they have only released funds once, and that too only after we lost power."

KTR also highlighted the delayed release of funds, noting that the money deposited in farmers' accounts was delayed by three months. He accused the government of spreading misinformation about the Rythu Bandhu scheme, claiming that it had gone off track under their administration.

KTR's comments reflect growing frustration within the BRS party over the handling of crucial farmer welfare programs.

Seethakka Promises Key **Reforms for CRT Teachers**



TPN , Hyderabad: Minister for Tribal Welfare Seethakka successfully mediated talks with Contract Residential Teachers (CRTs) working in tribal ashram schools, leading to the announcement that the teachers would call off their strike. At her request, the CRTs confirmed they would resume their duties from the following day.

The government responded positively to most of the teachers' demands, excluding job regularization and minimum time scale. Among the key commitments made were the promise to issue salaries by the fifth of every month, extend 108 days of maternity leave to female teachers, and provide death bene-

fits for teachers' families.

Minister Seethakka assured that Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao would discuss the issues of job compensation and minimum time scale in a future meeting. She urged the teachers to cooperate with the government, emphasizing that the ultimate goal was the betterment of tribal students' education.

TGMC Issues Notice to Hyderabad Hospital for **Promoting 'Fake' Doctors**



TPN, Hyderabad: The Telangana Medical Council (TGMC) has served a notice to Rush Care Hospital in LB Nagar, Hyderabad, following allegations that the hospital promoted unqualified doctors. The notice, issued by TGMC Chairman Dr. Mahesh Kumar and Registrar Dr. Lalayya, addresses the hospital's alleged sponsorship of the 18th Annual Convention of the Sushruta Gramin Vaidya Sangha, held on December 25 in Nalgonda.

The event reportedly featured individuals with no medical qualifications, and the hospital's management has been accused of endorsing them as practitioners. Dr. G. Srinivas, Vice Chairman of TGMC, stated that promoting such unqualified doctors is unethical and a growing issue in hospitals, where agents market these individuals in exchange for commissions.

The notice gives Rush Care Hospital 10 days to respond; failure to do so will result in further action under the National Medical Commission (NMC) and TGMC Acts. If the hospital does not comply, the matter will be forwarded to the Ethics Committee for further investigation and potential penalties.

37.11% of Prajavani Grievances Unresolved in 2024: RTI

TPN, Hyderabad: A recent Right to Information (RTI) query filed by Siddipet Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) MLA Harish Rao revealed that only one-third of the total petitions submitted under the Prajavani program in 2024 were resolved. According to the Telangana government's response, a total of 82,955 petitions were received, of which 43,272 were classified as grievances. However, more than half of the petitions were rejected.

Out of the 43,272 grievances, 27,215 were addressed, while 16,057 remain unresolved from the previous year. Harish Rao criticized Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy for attending the program only once in 2024, a sharp decline compared to previous years. He also pointed out the ministers' lack of commitment, accusing them of not regularly attending the Prajavani sessions.

On Friday, January 3, the Prajavani program took place at Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Praja Bhavan in Hyderabad, where 359 applications were received. Issues raised included matters concerning the panchayat raj, rural development, power, revenue, and various other departments. The session was attended by state planning commission vice-chairman Dr. Chinna Reddy and special officer for public administration Divya.







PM Modi Lays Foundation for New Delhi University Campuses and Veer Savarkar College

The West Campus, located at Dwarka Sector 22, is under construction at an estimated cost of Rs 107 crore. The first phase of this campus will focus on developing an academic block, which will include 42 classrooms, two moot courts, a digital library, conference rooms, seminar halls, and separate common rooms for boys and girls. The West Campus will cover 19,434 square meters in total.

Vande Bharat Sleeper Train Achieves Peak Speed of 180 km/h During Trial Runs

Water Level in Glass Remains Static as **Train Reaches Milestone Speed**

The Vande Bharat Sleeper Train has achieved a significant milestone by reaching a peak speed of 180 km/h during its trial runs, which were conducted over the last three days. These trials are part of the ongoing process to evaluate the train for official certification by the Railway Safety Commissioner.

Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw shared a video on Friday showcasing the Vande Bharat sleeper train achieving the peak speed of 180 km/h during multiple trials. The trials are expected to continue until the end of the month.

One of the key moments in the trial was a 30-km-long run between Kota and Laban in Bundi district of Rajasthan on Thursday. In a video posted by the minister, the water level in a glass placed next to a mobile phone remained perfectly static despite the high speed of the train.

In addition to this, the Ministry of Railways reported that a 40-kmlong trial run between Rohal Khurd and Kota on January 1 saw the train reach 180 km/h. On the Kota-Nagda and Rohal Khurd-Chau Mahla sections, the train achieved speeds of 170 km/h and 160 km/h, respectively.

Trial Runs to Continue Until Month's End

The trials, supervised by the Research, Design & Standards Organization (RDSO) in Lucknow, will continue throughout January. Once completed, the Vande Bharat sleeper train will undergo a final evaluation by the Railway Safety Commissioner at its maximum speed. The official certification will follow, enabling the train to be inducted into regular service across the country.

Key Features of the Vande Bharat Sleeper Train

The Vande Bharat Sleeper Train is designed with modern amenities, including automatic doors, ultra-comfortable berths, on-board Wi-Fi, and an aircraft-like design. Currently, 136 Vande Bharat trains are in service across India, primarily for medium and short-distance travel.

Those Indulging In Politics Over My Apology Seek Unrest: CM Biren

Amid the continuing unrest in Manipur, Chief Minister N Biren Singh on Friday addressed the controversy surrounding his apology for the 20-month-long ethnic conflict in the state, accusing those politicizing his statement of seeking to prolong instability. Singh emphasized that his government's top priority is the restoration of peace in the region.

Singh urged all communities in Manipur to come together and work towards a permanent solution to the ethnic conflict that has rocked the state since May 2023. He urged people to "forgive and forget," stressing that the past should be left behind in order to build a peaceful future.

In his statement, Singh clarified that his apology was meant for the innocent victims and those who had lost their homes or loved ones during the violence. "What I said was an expression of sadness and grief," he explained, adding that it was not directed at those responsible for the violence. Singh rejected the idea of apologizing to terrorists, asserting that his words were intended to comfort the displaced and those who had suffered.

On Tuesday, Singh had publicly apologized for the ethnic conflict, which has resulted in over 250 deaths and left thousands displaced. His apology had stirred political debates, with some opposition parties accusing him of not doing enough to resolve the crisis. However, Singh rejected these claims, accusing the opposition of lacking an ideology and using the situation for political gains.

Ajay Kumar Bhalla Sworn in as the 19th **Governor of Manipur**

Bhalla, a 1984-batch Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer of the Assam-Meghalaya cadre, is recognized for his exceptional service, having held the position of Union Home Secretary for five years until his retirement in August 2024. Bhalla's appointment as the Governor of Manipur was made by President Droupadi Murmu, and he replaces Assam Governor Lakshman Prasad Acharya, who had been handling the additional charge of Manipur. Bhalla's appointment is seen as a significant move by the government, given his extensive administrative experience at the national level.

Prior to the ceremony, Bhalla arrived in Imphal on Thursday, where he was warmly welcomed by Chief Minister N Biren Singh at the Raj Bhavan. The reception underscored the collaborative spirit between the newly appointed governor and the state's leadership as they prepare to work together for the development of Manipur.

Two men set on fire over **Union Carbide waste** disposal at Pithampur

During the protest against the dumping of contaminated garbage, two men poured petrol on themselves while sloganeering. Amidst the crowd, someone allegedly lit them on fire, leading to the self-immolation incident. The incident occurred on Friday amidst a bandh (shutdown) called by local groups opposing the incineration of the hazardous waste in the industrial town.

During the protest, which was held against the planned incineration of the waste, eyewitnesses said the two men, both in their 40s, poured petrol on themselves and set themselves ablaze. A person in the crowd allegedly lit them on fire, as captured in a video filmed at the scene. The protesters had been chanting slogans against the disposal of the contaminated garbage when the self-immolation occurred.

Both men were rushed to a hospital in Pithampur, located around 30 km from Indore, and later transferred to a private hospital in Indore. Fortunately, they were reported to be out of danger. Dhar Superintendent of Police Manoj Singh confirmed that the situation was under control but remained tense. Protests also continued in other parts of the town.

Bandh and Protests in Pithampur

Shops and markets in Pithampur remained closed as part of the bandh call by the Pithampur Bachao Samiti, a local group that claims the incineration of Union Carbide waste poses a significant threat to the health and environment of the local community. Pithampur, an industrial town with a population of around 1.75 lakh, hosts nearly 700 factories across three sectors.





2,700 Cops vs. Hundreds of Yoon **Supporters in 6-Hour Standoff**

Bid to Arrest Impeached South Korean President Fails

SOUTH KOREA: Anti-corruption investigators attempting to arrest impeached South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol were blocked by his security team and hundreds of supporters, leading to a dramatic six-hour standoff. The attempt to apprehend Yoon, who faces charges related to a controversial martial law declaration in early December, ended after authorities withdrew over safety concerns.

On Thursday, about 2,700 police officers surrounded Yoon's residence in a bid to arrest the ousted president, who could face imprisonment or even the death penalty if convicted. However, Yoon's security team, supported by nearly a thousand of his supporters, prevented the investigators from gaining access to his residence. The standoff lasted until 1:30 pm, when authorities called off the operation.

This confrontation followed the imposition of martial law in early December, which had a profound impact on South Korea, rattling financial markets, damaging the local currency, and disrupting diplomatic relations. Yoon was suspended from his official duties in mid-December, with Prime Minister Han Duck-soo stepping in briefly before being impeached as well. Despite his suspension, Yoon remains defiant and has vowed to fight in court to retain his position. The attempted arrest marked



the first-ever such move against a sitting South Korean president. China's Mega Dam Project in **Tibet Raises Environmental** and Geopolitical Concerns



NEW DELHI: Last week, China revealed plans to construct the world's largest dam in Tibet, surpassing even the Three Gorges Dam. The project, situated in the environmentally-sensitive Himalayan region near the India-Tibet border, has raised alarms not only due to its potential environmental impact but also its geopolitical ramifications. The proposed dam will be built on the Brahmaputra River, which China refers to as the Yarlung Tsangpo in Tibet.

China's ambitious dam project is expected to generate 300 billion kilowatt-hours of electricity annually, significantly more than the Three Gorges Dam's 88.2 billion kWh capacity. At an estimated cost of USD 137 billion, the project will be the largest hydropower initiative in the world, surpassing any other infrastructure project globally. However, the scale and location of the project have raised concerns in India.

The dam's construction site is located in a highly seismic zone, which makes the region prone to earthquakes. The fragile geology of the area, combined with the potential environmental risks, has led to significant apprehension in India. With Tibet's proximity to India's northeastern states, especially Arunachal Pradesh and Assam, the effects of the project could be far-reaching. The dam could disrupt the flow of the Brahmaputra River, creating severe floods and droughts in the region, putting millions of people at risk downstream.

India has responded firmly, asserting its rights to the river's waters. The Ministry of External Affairs stated that New Delhi would continue to monitor developments closely and take necessary steps to safeguard its interests. It has called on Beijing to ensure that the project does not harm downstream countries, particularly India.

The environmental impact of the project could extend beyond the river itself. Large-scale hydropower projects like this one tend to alter ecosystems and agricultural landscapes, potentially causing irreversible damage to the region's biodiversity and disrupting the livelihoods of communities dependent on the river. Furthermore, the project raises the specter of forced resettlements, as seen with the Three Gorges Dam, which displaced over 1.4 million people. China has not yet disclosed how many individuals will be displaced by this new mega-project, but the scale of the dam suggests the number could be substantial.

Geopolitically, the dam could exacerbate tensions between India and China. As both nations are downstream users of the Brahmaputra's waters, the project has the potential to fuel "water wars" in the future, a concern previously highlighted by geopolitical analyst Genevieve Donnellon-May. India's long-standing fears about Chinese control over water resources may now be heightened, as the construction of this dam could shift the balance of power in the region.

The approval allows a professional-level delegation composed of experts from Israel's Mossad (intelligence agency), the IDF (military), and the ISA (internal security agency) to keep engaging in indirect negotiations. These talks, which are being facilitated by Qatar, Egypt, and the United States, have been ongoing in Doha, Qatar's capital.

Trump Blasts Biden as "Worst President" Over New Orleans Terror Attack

WHITEHOUSE: President-elect Donald Trump strongly criticized Joe Biden on Friday, calling him the "worst president" in U.S. history and blaming the current administration for the recent terror attack in New Orleans. Trump accused Biden of exacerbating America's security problems through his "Open Borders Policy," claiming it has led to an increase in violent crimes, including terrorism.

In a post on X (formerly Twitter), Trump stated that he had repeatedly warned that radical Islamic terrorism and violent crime would escalate under Biden's policies. He claimed that the situation has now reached a crisis point, far worse than he had ever imagined. Trump emphasized his belief that Biden's leadership has turned the U.S. into a "disaster" and made the country a "laughing stock" on the global stage.

Trump's criticism also extended to federal agencies, accusing them of focusing on "unlawfully attacking their political opponents" rather than ensuring the safety and security of American citizens. He expressed outrage over what he sees as the infiltration of radical elements within government institutions, warning that national security and democracy are being undermined.

The Republican leader also placed blame on



the Democratic Party, urging Democrats to feel "ashamed" for allowing what he considers a decline in American safety and values. He called for the CIA to take immediate action to address the threats facing the country, fearing it could be too late if swift measures are not taken.

China declares State of Emergency on new virus HMPV outbreak

CHINA: China is grappling with a new wave of respiratory infections, particularly a rapid spread of Human Metapneumovirus (HMPV), five years after the COVID-19 pandemic. HMPV, which typically causes coldlike symptoms such as coughing, wheezing, runny nose, and sore throat, has raised concerns across the country. The virus, though not as severe as COVID-19, has contributed to a significant uptick in hospital admissions and overwhelmed healthcare systems.

Social media posts and local reports indicate that China has seen multiple outbreaks of HMPV in recent weeks, leading to overcrowding in hospitals. In some areas, the pressure on medical facilities is so intense that people are finding it increasingly difficult to access timely care. In addition to HMPV, the country is also dealing with a surge in cases of Influenza A, Mycoplasma pneumoniae, and a resurgence of COVID-19, further exacerbating the strain on the healthcare system.

Hospitals, which are already overwhelmed, are being forced to cope with an increasing influx of patients. The situation is similarly dire at crematoriums, which are reporting a surge in demand for services, as more people succumb to these viral infections. The simultaneous circulation of multiple viruses has



put China's public health infrastructure under considerable stress, raising concerns about its ability to handle a simultaneous outbreak of so many diseases.

The rapid spread of HMPV, in particular, highlights the ongoing vulnerabilities in China's healthcare system, even as the country continues to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic. Health experts have called for heightened vigilance and preventive measures to curb the spread of these viruses and to ensure that the healthcare system can cope with the current crisis. With the winter season intensifying the transmission of respiratory viruses, China's medical and emergency response teams are facing an unprecedented challenge.





Stock Markets Plunge in a Day of Turmoil

Heavy Losses Across IT, Pharma, and Banking Sectors

Domestic stock markets witnessed a turbulent session on Friday, closing with significant losses as a mix of domestic and global factors weighed heavily on investor sentiment. Mixed signals from Asian markets, profit booking, and high domestic valuations were compounded by foreign institutional investor (FII) outflows, a weak rupee, and fears of a global economic slowdown. Uncertainty surrounding US trade policies under Trump further contributed to the bearish mood. The IT, pharma,

and banking sectors experienced sharp declines, while some resilience was observed with the Nifty closing at 24,004.

The BSE Sensex started at 80,072 but faced intense selling pressure, dipping to an intraday low of 79,109 before closing at 79,223, down 720 points. Similarly, the NSE Nifty began at 24,196, touched

a low of 23,976, and ended the day at 24,004, down 183 points. The Bank Nifty followed suit, falling 616 points to close at 50,988. Broader market activity showed nearly equal participation from buyers and sellers, with 1,470 stocks advancing and 1,349 declining out of 2,903 traded Stanley assigning an equal-weight rating to Petron the NSE.

Among Nifty50 constituents, ONGC, Tata Motors, SBI Life, Titan, and Nestle India emerged as top gainers, while Wipro, HDFC Bank, Adani Ports, Tech Mahindra, and Cipla recorded the steepest losses.

The rupee settled at 85.78 against the US dollar, adding to investor concerns. Notably, 88 stocks hit 52-week highs, while only 15 touched 52-week



lows, signaling select resilience despite overall market weakness. The NSE achieved a significant milestone in 2024 with a record 268 IPOs, raising ₹1.67 lakh crore.

Corporate updates highlighted mixed performance. IDFC First Bank reported 22% growth in loans and 29% growth in deposits for Q3, while Hero MotoCorp posted a 17.5% decline in December 2024 sales. KEC International secured orders worth ₹1,097 crore in the US and Arab countries. The Ministry of Corporate Affairs approved the amalgamation of Lanco Teesta Hydro Power with NHPC.

Brokerage recommendations included Morgan onet LNG, CLSA giving an outperform rating to and Nomura issuing buy ratings for Dixon Tech and Voltas. Meanwhile, SEBI issued a warning to JM Financial over IPO-related merchant banking issues.

Despite the steep losses, analysts remain cautiously optimistic, citing strong fundamentals in specific sectors that could offer stability in the near term. However, they advise investors to tread carefully given the prevailing global uncertainties.

Textile Industry Raises Concerns Over Quality Control Order (QCO) and Its Impact on Jobs

The Confederation of Indian Textile Industry (CITI) has raised alarms over the Quality Control Order (QCO) on key input materials, stating that it is harming jobs and stifling growth in the domestic textile sector. In its pre-Budget memorandum to the Finance Ministry, CITI emphasized that the QCO, which blocks the import and sale of materials lacking a Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) mark, is diminishing the competitiveness of the downstream indus-

try. It is also creating a significant barrier to accessing essential raw materials.

According to CITI, the BIS certification process is particularly challenging for micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs), which are crucial players in the textile industry. The complex and time-consuming process is discouraging these smaller businesses from obtaining the certification, leaving them unable to import essential materials. Moreover, CITI argued that the QCO is inadvertently contributing to the creation of monopolies in the market, with large businesses benefiting from stronger lobbying power and easier access to resources.

The textile body pointed out that countries like Bangladesh and Vietnam do not face such restrictions, allowing their industries



to freely access raw materials without any non-tariff barriers (NTBs). In contrast, India's imposition of the QCO on man-made fibre (MMF) and yarn has created an artificial trade barrier, hindering the free flow of these critical inputs. This has resulted in shortages of specialized fibre and yarn varieties, which, in turn, has driven up domestic prices, putting additional strain on the industry.

CITI stressed that the QCO is negatively affecting the textile sector's ability to meet growing demand, particularly for products that require specific, high-quality raw materials. By limiting access to these inputs, the QCO is damaging the overall competitiveness of the Indian textile industry, harming both large and small businesses, and ultimately leading to job losses in the sector.

India's Palm Oil Imports Drop to Nine-Month Low as Prices Surge



Global Food Prices Dip in December, Sugar Leads Decline

The United Nations' world food price index experienced a modest decline in December, largely driven by a drop in sugar prices, according to the latest data from the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO). The index fell to 127.0 points, down from 127.6 in November. However, it still marked a 6.7% increase compared to the same month in 2023, although it remained significantly lower—by 20.7%—than the record high reached in March 2022.



Tndia's palm oil imports fell Isharply in December, reaching a nine-month low as prices surged to a 2-1/2-year high. The increase in palm oil prices led refiners to shift their focus to alternative oils, such as soyoil, which was available at a discount. According to five dealers, this shift in purchasing patterns significantly impacted India's palm oil import numbers.

Palm oil imports dropped by 40% in December compared to the previous month, amounting to just 503,000 metric tons. This marks the lowest import volume since March 2023, signaling a significant change in demand from the world's largest buyer of vegetable oils.

The decline in palm oil imports could have a ripple effect on the global market. While it may put downward pressure on benchmark Malaysian palm oil prices, it could provide support for U.S. soyoil futures. As Indian refiners turn to cheaper substitutes, the demand for soyoil is likely to rise, potentially influencing the global supply and pricing of vegetable oils.

The shift in India's import behavior reflects broader trends in the vegetable oil market, where fluctuations in prices and the availability of alternative oils can significantly impact purchasing decisions. With soyoil now being favored due to its price advantage, refiners are adapting to market conditions in an effort to manage costs while continuing to meet domestic demand for vegetable oils.

The drop in palm oil imports may also have longer-term implications for global vegetable oil markets, as India's purchasing decisions often serve as a bellwether for other countries. As India continues to navigate price volatility and changing demand patterns, the palm oil market may experience further adjustments in the months ahead.

Sugar prices led the decline in December, dropping by 5.1% month-on-month. This decrease was attributed to improved sugarcane crop forecasts in major producing nations, which helped ease concerns over supply shortages. Despite this drop, sugar prices were still 10.6% lower than their level in December 2023, reflecting a softening trend in the global market.

Dairy prices also experienced a downturn after seven consecutive months of increases. In December, dairy prices fell by 0.7% from November, although they still posted a significant yearon-year gain of 17%. Meanwhile, vegetable oil prices dropped by 0.5% month-on-month, but remained up by 33.5% compared to December 2023, driven by strong demand and production challenges in key oilseed markets.

The FAO's monthly food price index is a key indicator for tracking global food commodity prices. While the December dip offers some relief, the broader trend still reflects a tight global food supply, especially for products like dairy and vegetable oils. As the world moves into 2025, fluctuations in crop yields, international trade dynamics, and inflationary pressures will continue to influence food prices, with sugar and other key commodities at the forefront of these developments.

RBI Likely to Cut Policy Rates by 50 Basis Points in 2025, Says Report

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is expected to reduce policy rates by 50 basis points (bps) in the first half of 2025, according to a report by Jefferies. This anticipated rate cut follows the central bank's recent shift in its monetary policy stance, where it eased liquidity measures and cut the Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR) by 50 bps during the latest Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting.

The Jefferies report suggests that after easing its approach to liquidity and reducing the CRR, the RBI may review its policy rates, with a projected

50 bps cut in the first half of 2025. This marks a significant development in the central bank's ongoing efforts to maintain economic stability.

The report emphasizes that the RBI's shift



from a "withdrawal" stance to a "neutral" liquidity position, along with the CRR reduction to 4 percent of Net Demand and Time Liabilities (NDTL)—a level last seen before the COVID-19 pandemic—paves the way for potential policy rate cuts. This

change in the liquidity position is seen as an important factor in the RBI's broader strategy to support economic growth and investment.

If the rate cut materializes, it is expected to have a stabilizing effect on regulatory momentum, fostering a more conducive environment for growth and investment. With the central bank's approach becoming more accommodating, businesses and investors may benefit from the more favorable monetary policy, helping to bolster economic activity in the near term.

As the RBI continues to adjust its policy in response to evolving economic conditions, market participants and analysts will closely monitor any further moves that could influence the pace of India's economic recovery.










