No Cases of HMPV Reported in Telangana, Confirms DPH

Public urged to follow precautions as a safeguard against respiratory infections

TPN Correspondent, Telangana: The Director of Public Health (DPH), Dr. B. Ravinder Naik, has assured the public that there is no cause for alarm regarding reports of Human Metapneumovirus (HMPV) cases from China. In an advisory issued on Saturday, the DPH confirmed that no HMPV cases have been reported in Telangana so far.

Dr. Naik emphasized that the Health Department has analyzed data on respiratory infections in Telangana, finding no significant increase in such infections in December 2024 compared to the same period in 2023. The state's health officials are closely monitoring the situation in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MOHFW), New Delhi. "HMPV is similar to other respiratory viruses that cause common cold and flu-like symptoms during the winter season, particularly among younger and older populations. While the situation is under control, people are urged to follow precautions to safeguard against respiratory infections," Dr. Naik stated.

Allu Arjun Submits Bail Bond in Nampally Court Amid Fan Frenzy

Actor complies with court orders in Sandhya Theater stampede case

TPN Correspondent, Hyderabad: Popular cinema actor Allu Arjun appeared at the Nampally court on Saturday to comply with the conditions of his regular bail granted in the Sandhya Theater stampede case. Accompanied by his uncle Chandrasekhar Reddy, the actor submitted signed bail bond documents to the judge before heading back to his residence. The news of Allu Arjun's presence at the court drew a large crowd of fans, many of whom eagerly attempted to take photos with the actor. However, the police maintained strict control, preventing fans from disrupting the proceedings.

The Nampally court had granted Allu Arjun conditional regular bail on Friday, stipulating that two sureties of Rs. 50,000 each be furnished. The court also directed him not to influence witnesses or make any comments that could affect the case.

Additionally, it mandated that the actor

appear in person at the Chikkadapally police station every Sunday for the next two months.

The case stems from the tragic stampede incident during the premiere show of Pushpa 2 at Sandhya Theater, where a woman named Revathi lost her life, and her son, Sreetej, sustained serious injuries. The incident led to the police registering a case against Allu Arjun. Following his remand by the Nampally court, the actor was briefly sent to Cherlapally Jail before securing interim bail from the High Court. Despite these legal challenges, Allu Arjun and the Pushpa 2 team have extended financial assistance to the victims. The actor provided Rs. 1 crore to Revathi's family, while director Sukumar and the producers contributed Rs. 50 lakhs each. Meanwhile, Sreetej continues to receive treatment at KIMS Hospital, with doctors reporting gradual recovery.



Critics Owe an Apology: KTR

Demanding accountability, KTR called on critics to apologize for spreading false allegations. "Even if they spend not just a thousand crores but a lakh crores, they can't erase the identity of Telangana! Ponnam Prabhakar Criticizes Kavitha's Claims of Supporting BCs

If BRS is committed, let them empower BCs with key party positions.



TPN Correspondent, Hyderabad: Telangana Backward Classes Welfare Minister Ponnam Prabhakar has ridiculed BRS MLC K. Kavitha's call for 42% reservations for Backward Classes (BCs) in local bodies, questioning the party's sincerity

toward BC welfare.

Prabhakar accused Kavitha of hypocrisy, pointing out that her father, BRS chief and Telangana Chief Minister K. Chandrasekhar Rao (KCR), expelled prominent BC leader Eatala Rajender from the party. He criticized the BRS for failing to empower BCs politically, highlighting the absence of a BC deputy chief minister during the party's two terms in office.

"If the BRS is truly committed to BC welfare, KCR should allocate two of the three key party positions president, leader of the opposition, and working president—to BC leaders, instead of reserving them for family members," Prabhakar said.

He also accused the previous BRS government of reducing BC reservations during panchayat elections and withholding data from the Samagra Kutumba Survey that could have benefitted the community.

Congress MP Chamala Kiran Kumar Reddy joined the criticism, asserting that Kavitha lacks the "moral authority" to champion BC rights. He contrasted BRS's record with Congress's history of appointing BC leaders to significant roles, including the TPCC president position currently held by a BC leader.

Reddy suggested that Kavitha should protest at KCR's farmhouse, holding him accountable for what he termed "neglect of BCs' political empowerment."

The remarks come amid heightened political rhetoric over BC welfare as Telangana gears up for upcoming elections.

One Killed, Eight Injured in Explosion at Premier Explosives in Yadadri Bhongir

Authorities investigate the cause of the industrial accident amid concerns over safety protocols.

TPN Correspondent, Yadadri Bhongir: A powerful explosion at Premier Explosives in Peddakandukur village, Yadagirigutta mandal, claimed one life and left eight others injured on Saturday morning. The incident, which occurred at a facility manufacturing industrial explosives and detonators, led to the collapse of a building on-site. The injured were immediately transported to a hospital in Bhuvanagiri for urgent medical attention. Among them, two workers, Kanakayya and Prakash, were reported to be in critical condition. Tragically, Kanakayya succumbed to his injuries during treatment.Emergency protocols were promptly activated, with the company management sounding an emergency siren following the blast. Police and emergency services swiftly reached the scene and began an investigation into the cause of the explosion. This is not the first accident at the facility; a previous explosion also resulted in the loss of a worker's life, raising concerns over safety measures at the plant. Authorities have assured a thorough probe to determine the exact circumstances that led to the tragic incident.

Telugu Language at Risk of Disappearing: Kishan Reddy

Only 30% of the spoken language remains Telugu; we must act to preserve it, says Union Minister



TPN Correspondent, Hyderabad : Union Minister Kishan Reddy raised alarm over the diminishing presence of the Telugu language, revealing that only 30 percent of spoken Telugu remains pure, with the rest being replaced by English words. Speaking at the World Telugu Federation conference in Hyderabad, he emphasized the urgent need to preserve and promote Telugu through both spoken and written mediums.

"Telugu is disappearing without us knowing it," he said, urging families to encourage children to read children's literature in Telugu regularly. He called for the popularization of Telugu as a medium of instruction and governance.

Highlighting steps to preserve the language, Kishan Reddy advocated for introducing Telugu as the primary medium of instruc-

tion at the primary level. He also emphasized the need for conducting official affairs and court proceedings in Telugu, including arguments, counter-arguments, and judgments. Additionally, he suggested mandating Telugu for movie titles and expanding Telugu content on platforms like Wikipedia and in the digital sec-

He also stressed implementing the new education policy introduced by the central government, which supports regional languages, and called for adult participation in preserving and promoting Telugu.

Reddy highlighted the growing availability of Telugu stories and articles in audio formats and suggested leveraging the digital sector to consolidate and safeguard the language for future generations. "The responsibility to protect the mother tongue lies with all of us," he concluded.

FGG Urges Telangana CM to Restrict Rythu Bharosa Benefits to 5 Acres

TPN Correspondent, Telangana: The Forum for Good Governance (FGG) has appealed to Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy to limit the Rythu Bharosa crop input assistance to agricultural lands under cultivation, restricting it to a maximum of five acres. In a letter dated January 3, FGG President M. Padmanabha Reddy highlighted that the scheme, intended to assist farmers with purchasing seeds, fertilizers, and pesticides, should exclude fallow lands, landlords, and income taxpayers. He also called for compensation to be extended to tenant farmers, who are often overlooked. Reddy pointed out that several states, including Himachal Pradesh and Karnataka, have curtailed certain welfare schemes due to the financial strain they impose. He cautioned against Telangana's growing dependence on loans, stating, "Taking loans to repay loans has become the order of the day." He questioned the sustainability of allocating a significant portion of the budget to farming, potentially at the cost of other developmental works. Referring to Reserve Bank of India (RBI) reports, Reddy emphasized that welfare schemes dominate state expenditures, leaving insufficient resources for developmental initiatives.



BRS Government Wasted ₹22,000 Crores on Rythu Bandhu: Minister Seethakka

Congress focuses on genuine farmers and women's empowerment



TPN Correspondent, Telangana: Minister Seethakka has criticized the previous BRS government, accusing it of wasting ₹22,000 crores of public funds under the Rythu Bandhu scheme. Speaking at an event, she alleged that the scheme was riddled with irregularities and benefitted even non-Telanga-

Rakesh Reddy Criticizes **Congress Government**

Criticizing Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, Rakesh Reddy said, "Despite promising to emulate Chandrababu Naidu's governance in Andhra Pradesh, where a detailed job calendar was released, Revanth Reddy has failed to fulfill similar promises in Telangana." He noted that other states, including Tamil Nadu and Bihar, have announced job calendars with specific recruitment dates, while Telangana lags behind.

He also accused the Congress government of celebrating its power rather than addressing unemployment. Rakesh Reddy urged the government to include job announcements in its calendar, emphasizing the dire need to prioritize youth employment over political optics.

Passports to Be Issued Faster, Says Regional Passport Officer Snehaja

- Appointment period reduced to 6-8 days.
- 9.02 lakh applications processed in 2024.

- Special program for resolving passport-related issues conducted every Thursday.

TPN Correspondent, Hyderabad: Regional Passport Officer Snehaja announced that the process of issuing passports will be expedited, with the appointment period now reduced to just 6-8 days, compared to 22 days in 2023. Speaking at a media conference on Friday, she highlighted the collaboration between the police and postal departments in achieving this milestone.

Snehaja revealed that in 2024, the Hyderabad Regional Office processed 9.02 lakh applications, including passport issuance and police clearance services. With the operation of 5 Passport Seva Kendras (PSK) and 14 Post Office Passport Seva Kendras (POPSK) across the state, an average of 4,200 applications are processed daily. Additionally, general appointments in Nizamabad are now available on the next working day,



while services at POPSK centers are provided within a week.


The official also noted that Warangal has seen the highest number of applications, with more than 130 per day, while 90 appli-

cations are received at other centers. Tatkal passports are being issued within 1-3 working days, and general passports within 5-7 working days, excluding police verification

To address public concerns, a special program is held every Thursday in Hyderabad, where over 30,000 people directly raised their issues last year, and more than 10,000 email complaints were resolved. Furthermore, a mobile passport service van has been deployed for added convenience.

Attestation and apostille services are now available at the Hyderabad Regional Passport Office for the people of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. Snehaja affirmed that the office will continue to improve its services and performance in 2025.

IndiGo Flight to Vizag Makes **Emergency Landing in Hyderabad**



TPN Correspondent, Hyderabad : An IndiGo flight traveling from Mumbai to Visakhapatnam was forced to make an emergency landing at Rajiv Gandhi International Airport in Hyderabad on the morning of January 4. The flight, carrying 144 passengers, encountered a technical issue while en route. Thanks to the pilot's quick identification of the problem, the aircraft was diverted to Hyderabad and landed safely without incident.

This incident comes amid rising global concerns over air travel safety, following a recent crash in South Korea that claimed 179 lives. Additionally, over 100 flights at Delhi's Indira Gandhi International Airport were delayed due to dense fog and low visibility on the same day.

IndiGo assured passengers that safety remains a top priority and that the crew's swift actions were instrumental in preventing a potential crisis.

Monginis Bakery Factory Outlet Found Breaching Food



TPN Correspondent, Hyderabad: Food Safety Officials conducted inspections at the Monginis Bakery factory outlet in Machabollaram, Alwal, which supplies bakery products to Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. The inspection revealed alarming hygiene violations, including the presence of rats and cockroaches in areas where cakes were being prepared.

Officials found expired ingredients such as coconut powder, kesar syrup, vanilla flavor syrup, and pineapple syrup being used in the production process. Additionally, unhygienic practices were observed, including the use of unclean refrigerators and plastic drums for cake preparation.

The bakery has been issued notices for violating food safety regulations. The authorities seized expired ingredients and highlighted the negligence of the management, which reportedly continued operations despite previous complaints of food poisoning. Local residents recalled incidents where consuming stale pastries from the bakery had led to hospitalizations.

With inadequate facilities and poor sanitation, the kitchen area was found infested with pests, raising serious concerns about public health and safety. The Food Safety Department has warned the bakery management of strict action if necessary improvements are not made immediately.

HYDRAA Commissioner to **Address Public Grievances** on January 6



TPN Correspondent, Hyderabad: In a pioneering move, the Hyderabad Disaster Response and Asset Monitoring and Protection Agency (HYDRAA) has announced its decision to take complaints directly from the public. HYDRAA Commissioner A.V. Ranganath will personally address grievances at the agency's headquarters, Buddha Bhavan, on January 6, between 10:30 am and 2:00 pm.

Citizens can submit their issues directly to the commissioner, and the agency has assured that all complaints will be resolved systematically within 10 days, avoiding legal complications. Priority will be given to complaints regarding the encroachment of ponds, lakes, and drains, reflecting HYDRAA's commitment to preserving Hyderabad's natural resources.

In addition, the government is set to establish a HYDRAA police station in Hyderabad, with an inauguration expected before Sankranti. A government order (GO) regarding this initiative is anticipated on Sunday.

Once operational, HYDRAA plans to host public grievance sessions every Monday. Since its inception in July 2024, the agency has received over 5,000 complaints, demonstrating its role in addressing urban challenges effectively.



State Revenue Falls Short of Needs: CM Revanth Reddy

Employees' cooperation is vital to overcoming revenue challenges.



TPN Correspondent, Telangana: Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy disclosed that the state is grappling with a significant revenue shortfall, generating ₹18,500 crore per month instead of the required ₹30,000 crore. He emphasized that at least ₹22,500 crore is necessary to cover the state's

"minimum needs," leaving a gap of ₹4,000 crore.

Blaming the previous Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) government for what he termed a decade of administrative corruption, Reddy said his government is working to restore transpar-

ency and efficiency. "My government enue goals," he added. has been trying to fix the system since coming to power, but it will take time to overcome these economic challenges," he said.

The Chief Minister stressed the need for employee collaboration to increase revenue and assured them of addressing their concerns. "Employees' cooperation is required to raise government revenue. We are ready to resolve their problems through discussions, not protests," he said, accusing certain groups of instigating unrest for political motives.

Reddy also reiterated his commitment to regularizing outsourcing and contract employees, acknowledging the government's current financial constraints. "We will not take any harsh decisions that cause trouble for employees. Their role is crucial in ensuring the government meets its rev-

The Chief Minister also emphasized his government's intention to increase monthly revenue by ₹4,000 crore and ensure welfare schemes reach genuine beneficiaries. He assured employees that grievances would be addressed without jeopardizing their interests, urging them to work together for the state's progress.

CM asks IIT Hyderabad for report on Polavaram impact on Telangana

In relative news Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Saturday instructed IIT Hyderabad to prepare a comprehensive report on the impact of Andhra Pradesh's Polavaram project on Telangana. 

Why Bangladesh could become India's new Pakistan

The BJP has released the first list of its candidates for the upcoming Assembly elections in Delhi. The party has unveiled the names of candidates who will contest 29 out of the total 70 seats in the national capital.

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has already released the names of all its candidates for the elections scheduled in February.

In a significant development, former BJP MP Parvesh Sahib Singh Verma will challenge former Delhi Chief Minister and AAP convenor Arvind Kejriwal for the New Delhi seat.

"I thank my party's top leadership... I hope to live up to the trust the party has shown in me... During COVID-19, when Delhi needed Oxygen, Arvind Kejriwal Ji was distributing 'free bottles on every bottle'... There are many tasks in Delhi like cleaning the Yamuna and curbing pollution. When BJP forms the government, we will address these issues," Verma said.

In another notable move, former Delhi Transport Minister Kailash Gehlot, once a close aide of Kejriwal, joined the BJP months before the elections and will be contesting from Bijwasan.

Ramesh Bidhuri, the former BJP MP from South Delhi, will contest from the Kalkaji constituency against Delhi Chief Minister Atishi. Bidhuri, who was not given a ticket for the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, said, "I thank the BJP leadership for trusting me to reclaim the Kalkaji assembly seat. Delhi is suffering under Arvind Kejriwal, and the people of Kalkaji have faced 'AAPda' under Chief Minister Atishi."

Arvinder Singh Lovely, a former Congress minister in Sheila Dikshit's cabinet, joined BJP last year and will contest from Gandhinagar in east Delhi.

The Aam Aadmi Party has dominated the Delhi Assembly elections since 2015, securing significant victories, while the BJP has consistently won all seven Delhi Lok Sabha seats since 2014.

In a twist, Delhi BJP chief Virendra Sachdeva will not be contesting the upcoming Assembly elections, as confirmed by sources.

The Vande Bharat Sleeper Train has achieved a significant milestone by reaching a peak speed of 180 km/h during its trial runs, which were conducted over the last three days. These trials are part of the ongoing process to evaluate the train for official certification by the Railway Safety Commissioner.

Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw shared a video on Friday showcasing the Vande Bharat sleeper train achieving the peak speed of 180 km/h during multiple trials. The trials are expected to continue until the end of the

One of the key moments in the trial was a 30-km-long run between Kota and Laban in Bundi district of Rajasthan on Thursday. In a video posted by the minister, the water level in a glass placed next to a mobile phone remained perfectly static despite the high speed of the train.

In addition to this, the Ministry of Railways reported that a 40-km-long trial run between Rohal Khurd and Kota on January 1 saw the train reach 180 km/h. On the Kota-Nagda and Rohal Khurd-Chau Mahla sections, the train achieved speeds of 170 km/h and 160 km/h, respectively.

Trial Runs to Continue Until Month's End

The trials, supervised by the Research, Design & Standards Organization (RDSO) in Lucknow, will continue throughout January. Once completed, the Vande Bharat sleeper train will undergo a final evaluation by the Railway Safety Commissioner at its maximum speed. The official certification will follow, enabling the train to be inducted into regular service across the country.

Key Features of the Vande Bharat Sleeper Train

The Vande Bharat Sleeper Train is designed with modern amenities, including automatic doors, ultra-comfortable berths, on-board Wi-Fi, and an aircraft-like design. Currently, 136 Vande Bharat trains are in service across India, primarily for medium and short-distance travel.



Bhopal Gas Tragedy Waste Disposal: Cops File Cases Against Protestors

Protests erupt in Pithampur as 337 tonnes of toxic waste linked to the Bhopal gas tragedy are transported for disposal.

Madhya Pradesh police have filed five cases against protesters in Pithampur, Dhar district, who opposed the disposal of 337 tonnes of toxic waste associated with the Bhopal gas tragedy. The protests intensified after the waste reached Ramky Enviro company, where the incineration

The protests led to authorities imposing prohibitory orders under section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), which bans assemblies of 50 or more people around the Ramky Enviro premises. Superintendent of Police (SP) Manoj Kumar Singh confirmed that the police registered five separate cases late Friday night for disrupting public peace. Some cases were filed against identified individuals, while others were registered against unnamed protesters.

By Saturday morning, the situation in Pithampur had returned to normal, with all industrial establishments operating as usual. The protests included a march by 500-600 people to the Ramky Group's Industrial Waste Management facility, but police successfully dispersed the crowd. During the protests, two individuals attempted self-immolation but were stopped by onlookers and subsequently admitted to a local hospital.





India Stresses Importance of Skilled Professional Movement Amid H-1B Visa Debate

India has reaffirmed the importance of the movement of skilled professionals between India and the United States, highlighting how it benefits both countries economically and technologically. This comes as the debate over the H-1B visa program intensifies, with prominent figures like President-elect Donald Trump and tech billionaire Elon Musk voicing their support for the program.

Elon Musk recently defended the H-1B visa system on social media, crediting it for enabling the success of companies like SpaceX and Tesla. "The reason I'm in America along with so many critical people who built SpaceX, Tesla, and hundreds of other companies that made America strong is because of H1B," Musk stated. He further expressed his commitment to defending the program, saying, "I will go to war on this issue the likes of which you cannot possibly comprehend."

The H-1B visa debate has revealed differing opinions among Trump's allies. While some view the program as essential for the U.S. tech industry, others see it as a threat to American jobs. Despite earlier attempts to restrict visa access through an executive order, Trump has expressed continued support for the H-1B program, recognizing its value to the U.S. economy.

India's foreign ministry spokesperson,



Randhir Jaiswal, underscored the significance of the mobility of skilled professionals, calling it a key component of the strong and growing economic and technological partnership between India and the U.S. He emphasized that both nations benefit from the technical expertise provided by these professionals, with each leveraging their strengths for mutual growth.

India received around 78% of the 265,777 H-1B visas issued by the U.S. in fiscal year 2023, demonstrating the essential role Indian professionals play in the U.S. tech industry. As India and the U.S. continue to strengthen their ties, the exchange of skilled workers remains a cornerstone of their economic relationship.

This collaboration is reflected in the broader trends of increasing bilateral trade, with U.S.-India trade growing by 7.65%, reaching USD 129 billion in 2022-23. The movement of skilled professionals between the two countries remains pivotal for further deepening their economic ties.

Americans Unhappy: Trump On Flags Flying At Half-Mast During Inauguration



Donald Trump voiced his displeasure on Friday regarding the lowering of US flags to half-mast following the death of former President Jimmy Carter, asserting that "no American can be happy" about it. The decision to honor Carter, who passed away on Sunday at the age of 100, was made by President Joe Biden, who ordered flags to be lowered for 30 days at federal buildings and grounds. This gesture is a customary way to commemorate the late president as he is laid to rest during a state funeral next week.

For Trump, this act poses an awkward juxtaposition as he prepares for his inauguration on January 20. The image of the nation in mourning, with flags at half-mast, will coincide with his return to the White House after a tumultuous first term. Trump expressed his frustration with the situation in a post on his Truth Social platform, stating, "Nobody wants to see this, and no American can be happy about it." In his message, the Republican also leveled an unsubstantiated accusation at Democrats, claiming they were "giddy" about the optics of flags at half-mast during his inauguration. Trump went on to say, "They don't love our country, they only think about themselves," though he did not specify who he was referring to.



China Calls HMPV Outbreak 'Winter Occurrence', India Says 'Don't Panic'

Countries neighboring China are closely monitoring the situation, with Hong Kong reporting a few cases of HMPV.

The spread of Human Metapneumovirus (HMPV), a respiratory illness with flulike symptoms, has raised global health concerns, particularly after reports emerged of a rising number of cases in China. HMPV, discovered in 2001, is similar to COVID-19 in its symptoms, leading to comparisons with the pandemic that started five years ago. Social media platforms have shown videos and images of individuals wearing masks in Chinese hospitals, sparking worries among the

Addressing the concerns, China's foreign ministry spokesperson Mao Ning reassured both citizens and tourists on Friday, saying, "Respiratory infections tend to peak during the winter season," and emphasized that "It is safe to travel in China."

In India, which was severely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) official Dr. Atul Goel urged people not to panic over the spread of HMPV in China. Dr. Goel

explained, "Metapneumovirus is like any other respiratory virus, causing common cold-like symptoms. While it can be more serious for the very young or the elderly, there is no need for undue concern."

He further clarified that there had been no substantial increase in respiratory infections within India in December 2024, and no significant outbreaks had been reported by Indian institutions.

While the World Health Organization (WHO) has not issued an official statement regarding the HMPV outbreak, and no emergency has been declared by either WHO or the Chinese government, neighboring countries such as Hong Kong are on high alert and monitoring the situation closely.

According to the US Centre for Disease Control (CDC), HMPV is a respiratory virus that affects people of all age groups, though it poses a greater risk to young children, the elderly, and those with weakened immune systems. Common symptoms include cough, fever, nasal congestion, and shortness of breath. In severe cases, it can lead to conditions like bronchitis or pneumonia.

Netherlands Reveals 425,000 Suspected Nazi Collaborators, Sparks Debate

The Netherlands has released the names nation's wartime past. of 425,000 individuals suspected of collaborating with Nazi Germany during World War II, igniting a debate on privacy versus transparency. This move comes as part of the "War in Court" project, following the expiration of a law on New Year's Day that previously restricted public access to the archive. The names of the suspected collaborators, mostly Dutch citizens, are now available online, offering greater public insight into the

The archive, containing nearly 32 million pages, provides detailed records on individuals who worked in various capacities with the German occupiers during the war. The names are searchable along with birth dates and locations, although accessing specific details about their actions requires submitting a request. This project was made possible with the help of the Huygens Institute, which digitized

the archive, previously accessible only at the Dutch National Archives in The Hague.

While the release of this archive aims to foster transparency, it has drawn criticism from both the descendants of the accused and the families of wartime victims. Some fear that this public access could reopen old wounds and stigmatize individuals linked to this dark chapter of Dutch history.

"Risk For National Security": Joe Biden Blocks US Steel Sale To Japan's Nippon



President Joe Biden has blocked a controversial \$14.9 billion acquisition in which Japan's Nippon Steel sought to buy US Steel, citing the need to protect domestic industry and national security. The decision, made just weeks before Biden's term concludes, follows a deadlock within the Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States (CFIUS) over whether the deal posed a threat to US security.

Biden emphasized that the acquisition would place a key American steel producer under foreign control, creating risks to national security and vital supply chains. "I am taking action to block this deal," Biden stated, highlighting the importance of safeguarding the US steel industry. His move was met with support from the United Steelworkers (USW) union, which praised the president's commitment to maintaining a strong domestic manufacturing sector.

However, both Nippon Steel and US Steel expressed disappointment, calling the decision a "political" one and accusing the administration of violating due process. The companies insisted that the deal posed no credible security threat and criticized the process as being politically motivated. They also warned that the decision could deter future investments from US allies.

The Japanese government, reacting to the news, expressed "regret" over the decision, with Industry Minister Yoji Muto describing it as "incomprehensible." US Steel's stock price dropped by 6.5% following the announcement.

Biden's decision, which reflects his broader strategy of protecting American manufacturing, comes amid increasing tensions over foreign trade practices, particularly with China. The president had previously emphasized the need for a robust domestic steel industry to ensure national security, noting his efforts to bolster the sector through tariffs and subsidies.

The move highlights the ongoing political and economic challenges surrounding US trade and investment policies, as Biden balances domestic economic concerns with international relations, particularly with key allies like Japan.

Imran Khan Rejects Exile Offer, Vows to Stay in Pakistan



Imran Khan, Pakistan's jailed former prime minister, revealed that he was offered the opportunity to go into exile for three years, but he declined, asserting his commitment to staying in Pakistan. The 72-year-old former cricketer-turned-politician made the claim during an interaction with media at Rawalpindi's Adiala Jail, where he has been incarcerated since August 2023.

Khan stated, "I was offered the opportunity of a three-year exile while I was in Attock Jail, but I will live and die in Pakistan." Despite being imprisoned, Khan emphasized his unwavering resolve to remain in his homeland, rejecting the option of exile.

The former prime minister also disclosed that he had been "indirectly approached" with a proposal to be transferred to his Bani Gala residence in Islamabad. However, he reiterated his refusal, making it clear that he would not entertain discussions about his personal situation until his detained supporters and leaders were released.

In a post on social media platform X (formerly Twitter), Khan further clarified his position: "My stance is clear: release my detained workers and leaders first. Only then will I consider discussing my personal situation."

Khan's bold statements come amid ongoing political turmoil in Pakistan, with his party, Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), facing a crackdown by the government. Many of his supporters and key party leaders have been arrested, and Khan's refusal to leave the country underscores his resolve to continue his political struggle.

India's Current Account Deficit to Remain Elevated in FY26 Amid Global Trade Challenges

Tndia's current account deficit (CAD) is expected Lto remain elevated in FY26, largely due to the impact of stringent global trade policies, according to a report by JM Financial. The country's trade balance has been under pressure, with imports consistently surpassing exports, leading to a widening deficit. The report suggests that sluggish exports, exacerbated by global supply chain realignments, will keep the CAD high in the coming years.

In particular, the report highlights the potential effects of US President-elect Donald Trump's trade policies, which are expected to disrupt global supply chains. India is predicted to face greater adverse impacts on its exports compared to imports, leading to a situation where exports will trail imports well into 2025. This scenario could result in a trade deficit that continues to put pressure on the country's current account balance.

In November 2024, India's trade deficit surged to USD 37 billion, much higher than the monthly average of USD 23.5 billion recorded between April and October 2024. This widening gap is attributed to the changing dynamics of global trade, which could further affect India's export performance in the near future.

The report projects a CAD of around 1.5-1.6% of GDP for FY25, with the figure expected to stabilize at approximately 1.4-1.5% in FY26, depending on the direction of Trump's trade policies. This persistent deficit is expected to put downward pressure on the Indian rupee (INR), potentially leading to currency depreciation.

However, there is some positive news in the report. Fiscal consolidation efforts are expected to keep bond yields in check, with the government likely to meet its FY26 fiscal deficit target of 4.5%. Despite a slowdown in capital expenditure (capex) during FY25, particularly due to the election period, the government's focus on reducing debt-to-GDP levels may help stabilize the economy. The report forecasts bond yields to average 6.5% in 2025, providing some stability in the financial

Overall, while India's widening CAD and trade imbalances pose significant challenges, fiscal discipline and stable bond yields offer some relief in the years ahead.

Vedanta Ltd's Zinc Production Declines 2% in Q3 FY2024-25, **Aluminium Output Up**

Vedanta Limit-ed, a leading mining and metals company, reported a 2% drop in its zinc production in India during the October to December quarter of the financial year 2024-25. Zinc production in this period totaled 265,000 tonnes, down from 271,000 tonnes in the same quarter last year, as per the company's exchange filing.



Despite this decline in zinc output, Vedanta's total aluminium production saw a 3% year-on-year increase, reaching 614,000 tonnes in Q3 FY2024-25, compared to 599,000 tonnes in the same period in the previous year. The rise in aluminium production is part of a broader positive trend, with total aluminium output rising 3% to 1.82 million tonnes for the nine months ending December 2024, compared to 1.77 million tonnes in the previous year.

Vedanta operates two primary aluminium production plants—one in Jharsuguda and the other under the Bharat Aluminium Company Ltd (BALCO) subsidiary.

The company also saw growth in its mined metal production, which rose 1% to 784,000 tonnes in the December quarter, compared to 780,000 tonnes in the same period the

previous year. This growth was attributed to improved mined metal grades and mill recovery, which contributed to the best-ever 9-month mined metal production, according to Vedanta.

In other key production segments, Vedanta's Zinc International business saw a 12% growth year-on-year in the quarter, while its oil and gas production decreased by 19%. The company's iron ore segment reported a 10% year-on-year growth, though sales declined by 8%. Finished steel production fell by 3% to 329,000 tonnes, compared to 341,000 tonnes in the same quarter of the previous year. Power sales also dropped significantly, by 21%, to 3.2 billion units.

Despite the mixed results across its various production segments, Vedanta's share price rose by 1.8%, closing at ₹457.90, up from ₹449.80 at the previous market close.

Indians' Consumption of Pulses and Cereals Declines by 5% as Spending Patterns Shift

Tndian households have experi-Lenced a marked change in their spending habits over the past 12 years, according to a recent analysis by the State Bank of India (SBI). tial food items, with both pulses and cereals experiencing a significant drop in demand. Over the past decade, consumption in both rural and urban areas has decreased by more than 5 percent. This decline is attributed to a variety of factors, including changing dietary preferences, urbanization, and increased disposable incomes that encourage more varied food choices.

Cereals and pulses have traditionally been staples in the Indian diet, providing an essential source of carbohydrates and protein. However, in recent years, there has been a gradual shift in consumer preferences toward more processed and packaged food options, which are perceived as more convenient and modern. The increasing availability of ready-to-eat meals, fast food, and international cuisines has further driven this shift.

Additionally, with rising incomes and changing lifestyles, Indians are spending more on non-food items, such as electronics, clothing, and entertainment, leaving less room in their budgets for staple food products. The shift is especially noticeable in urban areas, where disposable incomes are higher, and where the influence of global food trends



is more pronounced. Meanwhile, rural areas have also seen a reduction in cereal and pulse consumption, though this shift is attributed to factors such as rising prices and a reduction in agricultural productivity.

The drop in cereal and pulse consumption has raised concerns about nutritional imbalances in the average Indian diet. The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has unveiled its first space robotic arm, RRM-TD, aboard the POEM4 plat-

form. A short video released by ISRO captures the robotic arm's precise movements and various operational stages as it works in space.

The video begins with the robotic arm being unlocked and lifted from its base position, followed by its intricate movement, which includes "Arm manipulation with 7 actuators." This demonstrates the arm's ability to perform complex tasks. The footage then highlights "POEM deck imaging operation" and "positioning using visual serving," a technique that uses visual data to guide the robot's motion. The arm's sequence concludes as it returns to its base, locking back into position.

ISRO described the milestone as "a proud #MakeInIndia achievement in space robotics," emphasizing the arm's precision and functionality. This demonstration aboard the POEM4 collected remotely, contributing to significant mission marks a significant step in India's advancements in space research.

The POEM4 mission, part of the PSLV-C60 Spa-DeX mission, utilizes the fourth stage of the Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV) to create a specialized platform for scientific experiments in space. The PS4-Orbital Experiment Module (POEM) enables scientists to carry out microgravity experiments for up to three months, advancing new technologies for future space missions.

The mission also carries biological experiments into space for the first time on an Indian-made rocket. The PSLV will conduct three biological experiments involving living cells, a challenging task due to the harsh space environment. After being rushed to the hospital, X-rays and a CT scan revealed that Wasim had suffered two fractures in her jaw.

"I bit into it and only made a hole, and my jaw candy again.

The 19-year-old was unable to open her mouth, and the next day, she underwent surgery to repair the damage. Bird-Inspired Wing Design Could Boost Performance of Aeroplanes, Claims Study

 $T_{dynamics}^{he}$ flight of birds have innovative research at enhancing aerowings. Featherlike flaps, designed to mimic the covert feathers found on bird wings, have shown the potential to significantly improve lift, reduce drag, and prevent stalls. These advancements could lead to

more efficient and safer aircraft, particularly during challenging maneuvers like landings or flights in turbulent conditions. The research highlights promising applications for both commercial and specialized aviation.

Research Findings A study published in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences explored the effects of lightweight, bird-inspired flaps on model airplane wings. The researchers tested the flaps in a wind tunnel and discovered that they improved airflow around the wings, boosting lift by up to 45% and reducing drag by 31%. Unlike traditional manual wing flaps controlled by pilots, these birdlike components adjust automatically in response to high angles of attack, a condition that often leads to sudden loss of lift.

Expert Insights Aimy Wissa, an engineer at Princeton University, explained to Science News Explores that

the design of these flaps operates without mechanical controls, responding naturally to aerodynamic changes. The use of multiple rows of flaps across the wing—rather than just at the front or rear—ensures a consistent airflow and prevents high-pressure air from disrupting lift at critical points.

Improved Aircraft Stability Tests on remote-controlled aircraft showed that these feather-inspired flaps enhance flight stability, especially in gusty weather or during takeoff and landing on short runways. This design could be a game-changer in aviation, offering improved performance in situations where precision and efficiency are crucial.

By borrowing ideas from bird flight, engineers aim to create aircraft that perform more smoothly and reliably in demanding conditions. These developments demonstrate the exciting potential of bio-inspired technologies to advance the future of aviation.





washbuckling Indian wicketkeeper-batter Rish-**J**abh Pant reached a significant milestone in his cricket career, crossing the 5,000-run mark in international cricket during the ongoing Border-Gavaskar Trophy against Australia in Sydney. Pant achieved this feat with a blistering knock of 61 runs off just 33 balls in India's second innings. This innings was a display of his aggressive batting, as he smashed six fours and four sixes, maintaining a remarkable strike rate of 184.85. Pant had earlier contributed 40 runs in 98 balls during India's first innings, demonstrating both patience and flair.

This performance brought Pant's career total to 5,028 runs across all formats of international cricket, with an impressive average of 33.97. His 150 matches for India include seven centuries and 23 fifties, with Test cricket being his strongest format. In 43 Test matches, Pant has accumulated 2,948 runs at an average of 42.11, including six centuries, with a best score of 159*. In One Day Internation-

als (ODIs), he has scored 871 runs at an average of 33.50, while in T20Is, he has made 1,209 runs at a strike rate of 127.26.

Pant's rapid-fire 61 in the second innings came when India needed quick runs. Despite a shaky start and a struggling top order, which saw Virat Kohli continue his issues with deliveries outside the off-stump, Pant's knock provided some entertainment and aggression. Ravindra Jadeja and Jasprit Bumrah also chipped in, but India ended the day at 141/6, with Jadeja (8*) and Washington Sundar (6*) still at the crease.

In the first innings, India had struggled to 185 all out, with Boland's (4/31) fiery bowling leading the charge for Australia. India's bowlers responded well, however, reducing Australia to just 181 runs in their first innings, with Prasidh Krishna and Mohammed Siraj taking three wickets each.

Jude Bellingham Rescues 10-Man Real Madrid with Stoppage Time Winner at Valencia

Head coach Carlo Ancelotti praised Bellingham for his resilience after missing the penalty, calling his performance extraordinary. "It gave him extra motivation," Ancelotti said. "The goal was a reward for the effort he put in."

Vinicius, who was disappointed by his red card, thanked his teammates for securing the win, saying "Sorry and thanks team" on social media. Despite Valencia's best efforts, including a late strike from Luis Rioja that hit the post, they remain in the relegation zone, four points from safety.




