The rare neurological disease Guillain-Barré Syndrome (GBS), which has been causing alarm in Maharashtra, has now claimed its first victim in Telangana. A 25-year-old woman from a month ago when she experienced Seetarampally, Siddipet Rural Mandal, Siddipet District, succumbed to the disease while undergoing treatment in Hyderabad.

According to reports, the woman was diagnosed with GBS ten days ago. Despite receiving intensive medical care at multiple hospitals, including NIMS in Siddipet and Hyderabad, her condition deteriorated, leading to her demise. This marks the first reported GBS-related death in Telangana.

Former Minister and senior BRS MLA T. Harish Rao has held Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy responsible for the worsening real estate crisis in Telangana, linking it to a series of suicides among struggling realtors.

Harish Rao cited the recent deaths of icized the administration for ignoring Kompally-based real estate businessman Venugopal Reddy and Adibatla-based Narasimha Goud, stating that



financial distress was driving many in the sector to desperation. He warned that the crisis was escalating rapidly, devastating families and threatening the state's economic stability.

Reacting to the tragic suicides, Harish Rao accused the Congress government of stalling Hyderabad's growth, blaming poor governance as a major roadblock for the real estate sector. He critwarnings from survey agencies, which had predicted a downturn in the industry over the past 18 months.

He pointed to policy missteps such as the HYDRAA demolitions, the stalled Musi Riverfront Development project, the cancellation of Pharma City, and changes to the Hyderabad Metro expansion plans. According to Harish Rao, these decisions have significantly affected investor confidence, driving businesses away from the state.

Targeting Revanth Reddy directly, he remarked that, given the Chief Minister's background in real estate, he should recognize the gravity of the situation and take corrective measures before Telangana's decade-long progress is undone.

Harish Rao also demanded immediate financial aid for the family of Narasimha Goud and urged the government to intervene swiftly to prevent further tragedies in the real estate sector.

Bandi Sanjay: "How Can Muslims Be in BC List?"

Union Minister of State for Home Affairs Bandi Sanjay Kumar made strong remarks against the Congress party, questioning its move to include Muslims in the BC list. Speaking at an MLC election workshop at the BJP district office in Nalgonda, he lashed out at both Congress and BC organizations, accusing them of failing to protect the rights of backward communities.

"How can Muslims be included in the BC list? What is your caste? Do you want your uncle to own a jagir? We have birth stars, clan names, and traditions—this is our identity," he said, criticizing the Congress for allegedly blurring caste distinctions. He questioned whether Hindus should be forced to beg while the government prioritizes others.

Bandi Sanjay further alleged that the Congress and BRS have formed a secret alliance to defeat the BJP

in the upcoming MLC elections. He claimed that BRS is deliberately not fielding a candidate to help Congress win, in return for protection from corruption cases related to the Kaleshwaram project, drugs, and the Formula E Race. He accused the Congress of being the first ruling party in history to lack suitable candidates for the MLC elections.

He also warned that if the current situation continues, Muslims will contest and dominate BC-reserved seats in the state. Citing past GHMC elections, he alleged that Muslim candidates took BC seats while Hindutva activists and BC organizations remained silent. He urged all Hindus, especially BCs, to unite and teach the Congress a lesson in the elections.

Bandi Sanjay also called on graduates and teachers to question Congress leaders about their unfulfilled promises before casting their votes in the MLC elections.

Centre Not Cooperating with Telangana: Minister Tummala

Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao criticized the central government for not extending necessary support to Telangana, particularly in irrigation and road development. Speaking at a party meeting, he emphasized that despite the challenges, the Congress government is implementing welfare schemes at an unprecedented level.

Tummala asserted his unwavering commitment to the party, urging workers to remain united and take elections as a challenge. "We must work with dignity and ensure victory without giving any chance to the opposition. The days will come when positions will be offered to you," he said.

He stressed the importance of party

loyalty, stating that betraying the party is akin to betraying one's own mother. He also cautioned against trusting opportunists and urged workers to strengthen the party's foundation.

Highlighting the achievements of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, Tummala stated that the government has allocated ₹1,400 crore for the Khammam constituency. "The CM is implementing welfare programs beyond his capacity, but the Centre is not cooperating and is withholding necessary funds," he alleged.

Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and the State Election Commission (EC) regarding unanimous elections in local body The ruling Congress and opposition polls have sparked a heated debate. In a recent meeting with MLAs, CM Revanth Reddy urged party members to ensure a Congress majority in local body elections and to secure as many seats as possible through unanimous decisions. However, the EC appears to have a different approach, leading to political tensions.

Reports suggest that the EC is considering measures to curb unanimous elections. One key proposal under discussion is the introduction of the "None of the Above" (NOTA) option as a second contestant, even in cases where only one nomination is filed. This model has already been implemented in Haryana and Maharashtra, and the EC is exploring its feasibility in Telangana. The matter is set for discussion in a meeting with political parties on the 12th of this month. However, it remains uncertain whether the state government will support this proposal, even if political parties approve it.

parties are engaged in a fierce battle to secure the maximum number of seats in local body elections. Efforts are being made to ensure the unanimous election of panchayat ward members, sarpanchs, and Mandal Parishad Territorial Constituencies (MPTCs). In some cases, negotiations and financial incentives are reportedly being used to

withdraw nominations and achieve unanimous decisions. The state government has also promised Rs. 10 lakh in grants to panchayats electing leaders unanimously, citing development benefits.

The previous BRS government had also promoted unanimous elections but later failed to fulfill promises linked to such outcomes, leading to protests. In the 2019 local body elections, 16% of sarpanch and ward member positions were filled unanimously. However, critics argue that unanimous elections undermine democracy, favoring the wealthy and influential. The Forum for Good Governance recently urged the EC to prevent such practices, asserting that they compromise the electoral process.

In response, the EC is now considering reforms, including the mandatory NOTA option, to ensure fair elections. The coming days will determine whether the state government accepts these proposals or pushes back against electoral reforms.



MLA Kadiam Srihari Ready to Face By-Elections

MLA Kadiam Srihari, who won the 2023 Assembly elections from the BRS, later joined the Congress party for various reasons. Along with him, several other MLAs also defected to Congress, prompting BRS leaders to



approach the Supreme Court against party defections. Recently, the Supreme Court issued notices to the defected MLAs, indicating that by-elections could be imminent.

Responding to the notices, Kadiam Srihari stated that he respects the court's decision and is prepared to face by-elections if required. He asserted that he has no intention of backing down from the electoral challenge.

KTR Slams Congress Over Drought Concerns

TPN Correspondent Hyderabad, Feb 10

BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) has strongly criticized the Congress government in Telangana, blaming it for the re-emergence of drought conditions in the state. He expressed concern over the rapidly depleting groundwater levels and accused the Congress of negligence, which he claims is pushing the state toward a severe water crisis.

KTR highlighted that during KCR's tenure, Telangana saw record-high groundwater levels, with ponds and reservoirs overflowing even during dry seasons. However, he alleged that under the Congress rule, paddy fields are drying up, and the state is witnessing a sharp decline in groundwater levels.



"The groundwater level has dropped by 2 meters in just four months, affecting 32 districts. This poses a serious threat to agriculture and drinking water supply," KTR stated. He blamed the

Congress government for its "political vendetta," accusing it of drying up the Kaleshwaram project and neglecting the Palamuru and Rangareddy lift irrigation systems.

KTR urged the people of Telangana to reconsider the Congress government's policies, warning that its mismanagement is endangering farmers' livelihoods. According to official data, the average groundwater level, which stood at 5.38 meters in October 2023, has now dropped to 7.46 meters as of January 2024, marking a steep decline of 2.08 meters in just four months.

With drought fears rising, KTR called on the government to take immediate corrective measures to prevent further damage to the state's water resources.

Attack on Chilkur Temple Priest

Religious Dispute Leads to Violence Priest's Home Invaded by Assailants Call for Justice After Temple Attack

The intruders reportedly assaulted the priest, causing injuries, and then left the scene after issuing threats. The Moinabad police have registered a case based on the complaint and are currently investigating the incident.

The attack has drawn widespread condemnation. BRS leader Dasoja Sravan Kumar expressed his shock on 'X' (formerly Twitter), describing the priest as "a revered scholar and



noble soul, tirelessly dedicated to protecting spiritual values, sanatana dharma, and social justice." He urged the Telangana DGP to take action against the perpetrators. This incident



has highlighted concerns over religious tensions in the area, prompting calls for community peace and respect for religious figures.

House Surgeon's Organ **Donation Saves Four Lives**

Despite the medical team's best efforts, her condition showed no improvement, and doctors ultimately declared her brain dead. In a courageous decision, her grieving family chose to donate her organs through the state-run Jeevandan organ donation program. Hospital officials confirmed that four of her organs were successfully donated, giving a new lease on life to four individuals in need.

Following the donation, the hospital staff honored their departed colleague with a heartfelt farewell ceremony, paying tribute to her selfless contribution. The incident highlights the importance of organ donation in saving lives and has inspired many within the medical community.



Midnight Gunfire in Tolichowki Over Business Dispute

woman in 2018, who had two daughters from a previous relationship.



The academics demanded the immediate withdrawal of the UGC's new guidelines, warning that such policies pose a serious threat to democratic values and the future of education in India.

Minister Jupally, MLA Megha Reddy Inaugurate Projects



Factors Behind AAP's Defeat in the 2025 Delhi Assembly Elections

The 2025 Delhi Assembly elections have as excuses, further alienating the elecdelivered a resounding defeat to the Aam torate. Aadmi Party (AAP), with party leader Arvind Kejriwal conceding defeat to BJP candidate Parvesh Sharma in the New Delhi constituency by a margin of 3,182 votes. AAP, which rose to prominence on the back of the 2011 Anna Hazare-led anti-corruption movement, has seen its political fortunes change significantly. Despite being seen as a champion of transparency and governance reforms in its early years, the party's internal issues, governance failures, and corruption allegations played a key role in the electoral outcome.

1. Anti-Incumbency and **Governance Failures**

the inevitable challenge of anti-incumbency. Despite some welfare-oriented policies, the party struggled to address the key concerns of the people, particularly the middle class, which had been a loyal voter base. The promises made in the 15-point "Kejriwal Ki Guarantee," including freebies and waivers, were not enough to convince voters. The lack of concrete plans to address critical issues like air and water pollution, sanitation, waste management, and inflation eroded public confidence. Additionally, the party's constant finger-pointing at the Centre and refusal to take responsibility for governance failures were perceived

2. Corruption Allegations and Damage to Kejriwal's Image

Kejriwal's carefully crafted image as a corruption-free, "common man" leader suffered a severe blow with the emergence of corruption allegations, including his involvement in the Delhi liquor policy scam and the "Sheesh Mahal" controversy. These scandals raised questions about his integrity and tarnished the party's image as an alternative to traditional politics. The public's disillusionment with Kejriwal's leadership was palpable, especially when it came to allegations of extravagance in the renovation of the Chief Minister's residence. AAP's decade-long rule in Delhi faced This marked the collapse of the narrative that had made AAP a popular choice Ultimately, the defeat of AAP in Delhi for voters seeking transparency and gov- is a reminder that no government, reernance reform.

3. Internal Discord and the **Congress Factor**

The failure of AAP and the Congress to form an electoral alliance in Delhi played a role in the party's loss. The internal tensions within the opposition bloc, including the Congress's strategic decision to undermine AAP following its setbacks in Punjab and Goa, left the party isolated. This internal discord was exacerbated by Congress's focus on weak-

ening AAP rather than uniting against the BJP. This disunity, combined with the BJP's campaign strategies, made it difficult for AAP to maintain a strong opposition front.

BJP's Strategy and the Shift in Delhi's Political Landscape

While AAP struggled to address these issues, the BJP capitalized on its aggressive campaigning strategy. The party effectively consolidated its voter base across various demographic and caste lines, while also winning over disillusioned AAP supporters. The BJP's extensive digital campaign, spearheaded by platforms like the NaMo app, and its ground-level outreach through key leaders, contributed significantly to the party's victory.

Is Air Pollution Making India Age Faster?

The blanket of smog that envelops numerous cities worldwide, including India's capital, Delhi, is not just a health hazard that chokes our lungs but also a significant contributor to premature aging. Studies have shown that air pollution can accelerate biological aging, shortening our lifespans. India, with its vast population, faces this grim reality daily, as several major cities, including Delhi, Kolkata, and Mumbai, consistently rank among the most polluted cities

globally, according to real-time data from IQAir.

Air pollution has long been a critical issue, particularly in urban areas, where concentrations of particulate matter (PM) and toxic gases such as sulphur dioxide, nitrogen dioxide, and carbon monoxide are dangerously high. Fossil fuel emissions, primarily from the energy and transportation sectors, are the primary culprits behind this problem. The health risks posed by air pollution are profound. A 2021 study estimated



that 10.2 million premature deaths occur globally each year due to particulate matter from fossil fuel emissions, with nearly 5 million attributed to outdoor air pollution alone. These numbers are expected to rise, with a projected 4.3 million urban deaths by 2050.

India, the world's most populous nation, bears a significant portion of this burden. The country ranks third globally in air pollution levels, and with 65% of its population under the age of 35, the long-term impacts on the younger population are particularly concerning.

A key biological factor in aging is telomere length. Telomeres are protective caps at the end of chromosomes, which shorten each time a cell divides. Over time, this shortening contributes to the aging process. Recent studies have shown a direct connection between air pollution exposure and shorter telomere length, effectively speeding up the biological aging of cells. As toxic substances like reactive oxygen species (ROS) generated by pollutants damage our cells, inflammation and stress follow, accelerating telomere deg-

Delhi Elections: How BJP's Strategy of No CM Face Worked in Its Favor




In the Delhi Assembly elections, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) achieved a remarkable victory, marking the third consecutive win for the party in 2023, following triumphs in Haryana and Maharashtra. These states were initially seen as tough battlegrounds for the BJP, but Prime Minister Narendra Modi's influence has only grown since the general elections. His leadership continues to shape the party's dominance, even in states once considered challenging.

The BJP's victory in Delhi is especially significant, not only because it marks a return to power after 27 years but also due to the scale of the mandate. From a mere eight seats in the previous Delhi assembly, the BJP surged to 48 out of 70 seats, turning a tough contest into a sweeping victory. In contrast, Arvind Kejriwal's Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), which had secured 62 seats in the previous election, plummeted to just 22. This outcome reflects the power of the BJP's campaign strategy, which resonated deeply with voters.

One of the most striking aspects of the BJP's victory was its ability to defeat Kejriwal in his own constituency, New Delhi. The BJP's Parvesh Verma triumphed over Kejriwal by over 4,000 votes. Kejriwal, who rose to prominence in 2013 by defeating Sheila Dikshit, had positioned himself as an alternative to PM Modi and campaigned across multiple states. However, this overextension, coupled with scandals like the alleged liquor scam, ultimately weakened his position. Kejriwal's defeat in New Delhi demonstrated that his political stature had taken a significant hit.

Additionally, Kejriwal's closest allies, including his former deputy Manish Sisodia, suffered defeats in constituencies once considered "safe" for AAP. The entire leadership of AAP, with the exception of Atishi, faced a crushing loss. Modi's ability to deliver on promises, including better governance and infrastructure, helped dismantle the belief that Kejriwal's promises of free services would guarantee loyalty from low-income voters.

One of the key factors in BJP's success was its strategy of not presenting a Chief Ministerial face for Delhi. While the absence of a strong local leader initially seemed like a disadvantage, the BJP effectively used Modi's national appeal to counter Kejriwal.



RBI Begins Rate-Cutting Cycle Amid Economic Uncertainty

In its February 2025 policy review, the Reserve Bank of India's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) embarked on a rate-cutting cycle, driven by the evolving growth and inflation trends. The committee's decision to reduce rates comes at a time when global uncertainties loom large, reflected most notably in the depreciation of the Indian rupee against the US dollar. Despite the challenging global economic environment, the MPC saw a window of opportunity to initiate a rate cut, as domestic inflationary pressures have eased and economic growth shows signs of stabilization.

Looking back to the MPC's December 2024 meeting, the economic landscape was markedly different. At that time, India's Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation had breached the 6% mark, surpassing the upper limit of the Reserve Bank's medium-term inflation target range of 2-6%. This high inflation rate made it clear that a rate cut was off the table in December, despite the country's GDP growth decelerating to a disappointing 5.4% in the second quarter of fiscal year 2024-25. With inflationary concerns still fresh, the outlook for the economy appeared precarious.

However, by February 2025, the economic situation had shifted. CPI inflation had receded significantly, and the outlook for inflation in 2025-26 appeared more moderate. High-frequency economic indicators also pointed to a potential recovery in domestic growth, especially following the economic downturn in the second quarter. This shift in inflation and growth expectations provided the MPC with the justification to start a rate-cutting cycle, signaling a move towards more accommodative monetary policy.

Despite this, analysts predict that the rate cut cycle will likely be gradual and shallow. With ongoing global uncertainties, including geopolitical tensions and external economic pressures, the RBI faces a balancing act in fostering growth while maintaining price stability. The depreciation of the rupee against the dollar further complicates the situation, potentially raising import costs and keeping inflationary pressures alive.







CM Stalin slams Centre over US' treatment of Indian deportees, Mahakumbh deaths

Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin has sharply criticized the BJP-led central government for its handling of two major issues— the mistreatment of Indians deported from the US and the stampede deaths during the Mahakumbh festival in Uttar Pradesh.

Addressing a public meeting, Stalin condemned Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government for "betraying" Tamil Nadu. He accused the Centre of failing to release the state's rightful share of funds and neglecting the state during natural disasters. Stalin warned that if the central government did not amend its approach, it would lose the people's respect every day.

On the Mahakumbh stampede, Stalin expressed his concern over the deaths of at least 48 people, blaming the Uttar Pradesh BJP government for inadequate safety measures. While the BJP government reported 30 deaths, Stalin and others contested this figure. "The media reports suggest the death toll is 48, and some leaders believe the actual number could be higher," he said. Stalin also referenced claims by Samajwadi Party leader Akhilesh Yadav, who alleged that bodies were removed with earth movers, further emphasizing the lack of accountability in the incident. Stalin questioned the government's duty to ensure the safety of the devotees and criticized the refusal to discuss the issue in Parliament.

The CM also condemned the handcuffing and shackling of Indians deported by the US, calling it "cruel." He expressed deep emotional distress over the mistreatment of the 104 deportees, questioning External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar's response, which appeared to justify the US's actions.

Manipur CM's resignation 'belated', people now await visit by 'frequentflier PM': Congress

The Congress party on Sunday termed the resignation of Manipur Chief Minister N Biren Singh as "belated," claiming that the people of the state were now awaiting a visit from Prime Minister Narendra Modi, whom they referred to as a "frequent-flier." The remarks came shortly after Singh submitted his resignation to Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla at the Raj Bhavan in Imphal.

Jairam Ramesh, the All India Congress Committee (AICC) general secretary in charge of communications, stated that the Congress was prepared to move a no-confidence motion against Singh and his council of ministers in the upcoming session of the Manipur Assembly on Monday. Ramesh emphasized that the Congress had been demanding Singh's resignation since the violent unrest in the state began in May 2023, calling the resignation long overdue.

In a post on X, Ramesh remarked, "Sensing the climate, the Manipur chief minister has just resigned. This was a demand that the Congress has been making since early May 2023, when Manipur erupted." He further criticized Prime Minister Modi's lack of engagement with the crisis in Manipur, stating, "The chief minister's resignation was belated. The people of Manipur now await a visit by our frequent-flier prime minister who is off to France and the US now — and who has found neither the time nor the inclination to go to Manipur these past

Ramesh's comments underscore the Congress party's ongoing dissatisfaction with the government's handling of the Manipur crisis. With the resignation of the chief minister, the political focus in the state shifts to the next steps, with the Congress pushing for greater accountability and the Prime Minister's attention to the ongoing issues in Manipur.

Russia's Su-57, US' F-35 Fighter Jets To Take Part In Aero India

For the first time in history, the Aero India 2025 airshow will feature two of the world's most advanced fifth-generation fighter aircraft, the Russian Su-57 and the American F-35 Lightning II, marking a significant milestone in global defense collaboration and technological

Scheduled from February 10-14, 2025, at Air Force Station Yelahanka in Bengaluru, Aero India 2025 is set to be Asia's largest airshow to date. The event will span over 42,000 square meters, with over 900 exhibitors, including 150 international companies, confirming their participation.

Its inclusion in the airshow offers a unique opportunity for visitors to see firsthand the capabilities of one of the most advanced aircraft in the world.

Aero India 2025's theme, "The Runway to a Billion Opportunities," will provide a rare opportunity to compare Eastern and Western fifth-generation fighter technologies side by side, giving defense analysts, military personnel, and aviation enthusiasts valuable insights.

The participation of both the Su-57 and F-35 at Aero India underscores India's growing importance as a key hub for international defense and aerospace collaboration, solidifying its role in the global defense landscape.

Silent rally in Kolkata on RG Kar victim's birthday, demanding justice

On Sunday, February 9, doctors and residents of Kolkata took part in a silent rally to mark the first birthday of the RG Kar hospital medic who tragically lost her life last year. The rally, which aimed to demand justice for the victim, began at College Square near the Calcutta University campus and made its way toward RG Kar Medical College and Hospital in north Kolkata. However, it was halted at the hospital gate by security personnel.

A strong presence of Kolkata Police and CISF jawans was deployed around the hospital, with officers speaking to the rally participants. The marchers had hoped to reach a specific point inside the hospital premises, where a plaque in memory of the victim had been set up by her colleagues. The hospital has been under the protection of the CISF following the rape and murder of the post-graduate trainee, an incident that sparked widespread outrage and protests across the country.

The day also marked six months since the tragic crime occurred on August 9, 2024. The victim's parents took part in another rally in North 24 Parganas district to commemorate their daughter's birthday. They expressed dissatisfaction with the CBI's investigation into the case and reiterated their demand for the arrest of anyone else involved in the crime



and the initiation of further legal proceedings.

In a recent court ruling, Sanjay Roy, the sole accused in the case, was convicted and sentenced to life imprisonment. Despite this, the victim's family and supporters continue to call for justice, believing that there may be others who were involved.

The participants of the rally covered their mouths with black cloth and held placards demanding justice. The march, organized by 'Abhaya Manch,' was kept silent to respect the upcoming Class 10 West Bengal school board examinations. The rally served as a reminder of the ongoing quest for justice and the enduring impact of the tragedy on the community.

Lebanon Forms New Government Amid US Pressure and Reconstruction Hopes

- New Lebanese cabinet formed after weeks of negotiations, limiting Hezbollah's sway.
- US welcomes government, stressing the need for financial reforms and stability.
- Priority set on implementing UN resolution and securing international reconstruction aid.

Lebanon's newly appointed Prime Minister, Nawaf Salam, unveiled a 24-member cabinet on Saturday, marking a pivotal moment for the country amid the aftermath of a devastating war between Israel and Hezbollah. The formation of the government follows more than three weeks of political negotiations, with the country's political factions, which traditionally allocate government posts along sectarian lines, navigating the delicate balance of power.

The cabinet's primary goals are to implement financial reforms, initiate the reconstruction of war-torn areas, and execute a crucial United Nations resolution related to stability along Lebanon's border with Israel. These objectives are seen as critical for restoring Lebanon's international credibility and securing much-needed financial assistance.

The process, however, was influenced by intense external pressure, particularly from the United States, which has been vocal in its opposition to Hezbollah's influence within Lebanon's political sphere. US Deputy Middle East envoy, Morgan Ortagus, labeled Hezbollah's involvement in the cabinet as a "red line" and thanked Israel for its successful military strikes against the group, sparking protests within Lebanon. Despite this, Hezbollah's ally Amal, led by Parliament Speaker Nabih Berri, secured four ministerial positions in the new cabi-



net, ensuring Hezbollah and its allies do not have veto power in key decisions.

The new cabinet's formation is seen as an essential step toward implementing reforms that could unlock financial support from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and Gulf countries, vital for Lebanon's economic recovery. Lebanon has been grappling with a severe financial collapse, a catastrophic explosion at the Beirut port, and the aftermath of a prolonged war with Israel, all of which have devastated the country.

The United Nations has welcomed the cabinet formation, emphasizing the importance of implementing UN Security Council Resolution 1701, which calls for disarming

armed groups in Lebanon, a clear reference to Hezbollah. Prime Minister Salam emphasized that the government would prioritize this resolution, along with ensuring the withdrawal of Israeli troops from southern Lebanon and the deployment of the Lebanese army in the region by February 18. The newly formed government now faces the task of drafting a policy statement outlining its approach and priorities, after which it will need to secure a vote of confidence in Lebanon's parliament. The appointment of Prime Minister Salam, following the election of President Joseph Aoun, signals a significant shift in Lebanon's political landscape, especially in light of Hezbollah's weakened position due to recent military



Pakistan Army should return to its constitutional limits: Imran Khan

Former Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan has penned an open letter to Army Chief Gen. Asim Munir, sharply criticizing the military's unlawful actions and its continued interference in politics. In his letter, Khan urged the military to "return to its constitutional limits," addressing his concerns over the growing involvement of the armed forces in national governance.

The letter, posted on X (formerly Twitter), follows Khan's previous correspondence from February 3, where he called for the military to reassess its approach toward national security and governance. In the new letter, Khan highlighted his mistreatment in prison, specifically detailing his 20-day confinement in a death-row cell, where he had no access to sunlight or electricity. He alleged that the treatment was part of a larger effort to break his resolve, describing it as inhumane and unlawful.

Khan's latest letter also expressed disappointment over the military's response to his earlier communication. He criticized the military's dismissive and irresponsible reaction, which he said reflected a lack of concern for the reputation of Pakistan's armed forces. He warned that the widening rift between the military and the public could have dangerous consequences for the country's future.

This ongoing criticism of the military comes amid a broader political crisis in Pakistan, with Khan's party, Tehreek-i-Insaf (PTI), facing increasing pressure from both the military and the government.

Earthquake Of Magnitude 7.6 Shakes Caribbean, Tsunami Advisory Issued

A powerful earthquake with a magnitude of 7.6 struck the Caribbean Sea on Saturday evening (local time), according to the US Geological Survey (USGS). The quake, which originated north of Honduras, occurred about 130 miles (209 kilometers) from the coast of the Cayman Islands. It was recorded at a shallow depth of 10 kilometers (6.21 miles), intensifying concerns over potential tsunamis in the region.

Following the earthquake, the US Tsunami Warning System issued alerts for the Caribbean Sea, particularly affecting the coastal areas of Honduras. The warning highlighted the risk of hazardous tsunami waves within 620 miles of the epicenter, extending along the coasts of the Cayman Islands, Jamaica, Cuba, Mexico, Honduras, the Bahamas, Belize, Haiti, Costa Rica, Panama, Nicaragua, and Guatemala.

Despite initial concerns, the US National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) later clarified that tsunami waves were not expected to reach the US Atlantic or Gulf Coast. However, small sea-level changes were still anticipated. In particular, a tsunami wave of between

1 and 3 meters was forecast for parts of Cuba's coastline. Smaller waves between 0.3 to 1 meter were expected along the coasts of Honduras and the Cayman Islands

The US government monitor later canceled most of its initial tsunami warnings but maintained alerts for three countries, including Cuba, Honduras, and the Cayman Islands. In light of the warnings, several Caribbean nations took precautionary measures, urging residents in coastal areas to evacuate. Honduras, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, and the Cayman Islands issued evacuation orders for their citizens near the coastlines. The Cayman Islands government advised its residents in coastal areas to move inland to safer locations.

The earthquake and its aftershocks sent shockwaves throughout the region, and the earthquake's sudden impact served as a reminder of the seismic activity in the Caribbean. Local governments and authorities in the affected areas remain on high alert as they monitor potential aftershocks and the possibility of further tsunami waves. Despite the cancellation of some tsunami alerts, residents are still urged to stay vigilant and follow evacuation instructions to ensure safety.



Not Chomping At The Bit: Elon Musk On His Plans To Acquire TikTok

Billionaire entrepreneur Elon Musk has stated that he has no interest in acquiring TikTok, the popular short-video platform currently embroiled in national security concerns in the United States. Musk's comments were shared online over the weekend after being made during a January conference hosted by The WELT Group, part of the German media company Axel Springer SE. The Tesla CEO joined the summit via video.

"I have not put in a bid for TikTok," Musk clarified, shortly after US President Donald Trump expressed openness to Musk purchasing the app, owned by the Chinese company ByteDance. Musk further explained that he does not use TikTok personally and is not familiar with its format. "I'm not chomping at the bit to acquire TikTok; I do not acquire companies in general. It's quite rare," Musk added, pointing out that his acquisition of social media platform Twitter, now known as X, was an unusual move for him. "I usually build companies from scratch," he emphasized.

The US government has raised national security concerns over TikTok, claiming that China could compel ByteDance to share data from American users. Despite these claims, TikTok has consistently denied that it has or would ever share such data with the Chinese government. In response to these concerns, former President Trump signed an executive order that set a deadline for ByteDance to sell TikTok's US assets by January 19 or face a potential ban. Apple and Google have refrained from reinstating TikTok on their app stores due to a US law in effect since the controversy began.



Monsters: Netanyahu Vows To 'Eliminate' Hamas Amid Ceasefire Deal

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has pledged to destroy Hamas and secure the release of all Israeli captives held by the Palestinian militant group, following a fifth hostage exchange on Saturday. The exchange, which took place under a ceasefire agreement in Gaza, saw the release of three hostages who appeared visibly emaciated and were forced to speak on stage after being handed over by Hamas.

In a video statement, Netanyahu condemned Hamas as "monsters" and emphasized Israel's unwavering commitment to dismantling the group. "We will eliminate Hamas, and we will return our hostages," Netanyahu stated, reinforcing his government's resolve in the ongoing conflict. The handover of the three hostages marked a momentary pause in the conflict, but Netanyahu's rhetoric indicated that Israel's operations to neutralize Hamas would continue.

The recent hostage exchange was part of a broader ceasefire agreement aimed at de-escalating violence in Gaza. While the exchange provided some relief to the families of the hostages, the images of the captives — visibly weakened after their ordeal — underscored the brutal conditions they had endured. Their forced appearance on stage further highlighted the psychological and physical toll taken by their months in captivity.

Israel has long viewed Hamas as a significant threat, and Netanyahu's government has been adamant about its commitment to eradicating the group, which it holds responsible for the deaths of countless Israelis in previous conflicts. The Israeli military has launched multiple operations aimed at weakening Hamas's military capabilities, though the group has continued to launch attacks against Israel, fueling the ongoing cycle of violence.

India's Trade Set to Grow 6.4% Annually, Reaching \$1.8 Trillion by 2033

India's total trade is expected to grow at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 6.4% through 2033, reaching USD 1.8 trillion annually, according to a report by Boston Consulting Group (BCG). This growth is primarily driven by India's rising appeal as a manufacturing hub, with companies increasingly looking to diversify supply chains away from China.

India's government has introduced significant incentives for manufacturing, combined with a vast lowcost workforce and rapidly improving infrastructure. These factors are positioning India as a key destination for foreign investment and trade collaborations.

Geographically, India's trade expansion will be diverse. Notably, trade with the United States is projected to more than double over the next decade, reaching USD 116 billion by 2033. This growth reflects deepening political and economic ties between the two largest democracies, particularly in the defense and technology sectors.

India's trade with the European Union, ASEAN, and Africa is also expected to increase by approximately 80%. Trade with Japan and Mercosur countries is projected to nearly double, while trade with Australia and South Korea will more than triple. Additionally, India's trade with



Russia is set to surge, driven by increased imports of discounted Russian hydrocarbons.

Europe's trade with India, Turkey, and Africa is anticipated to accelerate, further cementing India's role in global supply chains. Key sectors contributing to this trade expansion will include information technology, pharmaceuticals, and manufacturing.

As India grows more cautious about Chinese investments in sensitive

sectors, due to ongoing border disputes and economic tensions, the country is increasingly seeking trade partnerships with other regions. While India's trade growth with Western economies remains strong, China's trade with the US and EU is expected to slow. In response, China is focusing on strengthening economic ties with India, Russia, ASE-AN, Africa, and Mercosur nations. However, China's trade surpluses may face resistance from India and its other trade partners.

The stock market's outlook for the upcoming week will be shaped by several key events, including the outcome of the Delhi Assembly elections, inflation data, and quarterly corporate earnings.

The Delhi Assembly election results, in which the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) secured a strong victory with 48 out of 70 seats, are expected to have a positive impact on investor sentiment. Analysts believe that this political outcome could contribute to market stability and potentially boost investor confidence.

Corporate earnings will play a crucial role in shaping market sentiment. Key companies such as Eicher Motors, Apollo Hospitals, Vodafone Idea, Hindustan Aeronautics, and Muthoot Finance are set to report their quarterly results. The financial performance of these companies will help determine the overall outlook for the stock market in the coming week.



Foreign institutional investors (FIIs) continued their selling spree last week, withdrawing Rs 8,852 crore from the market. However, domestic institutional investors (DIIs) provided some stability by investing Rs 6,449 crore. This has helped maintain a positive trend in the markets, despite the volatility.

The Nifty index managed to close positive for the second consecutive week, sustaining above the 23,450-23,500 zone, indicating potential for a bottom reversal. Market experts are maintaining a positive outlook, recommending a "Buy on Dips" strategy amid short-term volatility.

On the global front, the release of US inflation data on February 12 will be closely monitored. Any deviation from the expected figures could influence the Federal Reserve's future interest rate decisions. Other key data releases, including UK GDP and China's inflation numbers, will also affect global market trends.

FM Sitharaman: Govt's Fiscal Policies Align with **RBI's Decisions for Economic Growth**

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman stated on Saturday that the government's fiscal and monetary policies are working in harmony, which would further boost India's growing economy. This, she highlighted, is backed by the robust Budget and the recent decisions made by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).

Speaking at a post-Budget meeting in New Delhi with RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra, FM Sitharaman emphasized the good coordination between the central bank and the government, noting that both institutions respect each other's space and responsibilities. She was accompanied by Union Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary and Malhotra at the meeting.

The Finance Minister pointed out that in- While the government continues to supdustries are beginning to show signs of recovery in terms of consumption and capacity utilization. She saw this as a positive trend and suggested that the RBI's recent decision to cut the repo rate by 25 basis points would provide the necessary momentum for further growth.

"The industry is witnessing early signs of recovery, and this trend will strengthen with the combined efforts of fiscal policies and the RBI's actions," FM Sitharaman said. She acknowledged that the monetary easing from the RBI would help support consumption, improve liquidity, and encourage business investments.

"The matter was brought to our attention. We found that the notice was regarding the food menu. However,


it contained a clear typing error. The notice was immediately withdrawn as it had no official signatures, raising doubts about its authenticity."

Pakistan's bowlers, particularly pacers Shaheen Afridi and Naseem ers lacked variation and Shah, struggled to contain the Kiwis, with Shaheen conceding 88 runs despite taking three wickets, and Naseem going wicketless, leaking 70 runs.

Ramiz criticized the team's performance, saying, "It felt like New Zealand was the home team. Players looked fitter, adapted better to the conditions, and played with clear roles." He pointed out that Pakistan's bowlprecision, unable to handle the batting-friendly conditions expected at the Champions Trophy.

New Zealand set a daunting target of 331, with a

India Shuttler PV Sindhu Pulls Out of Badminton Asia Mixed **Team Championships 2025 Due to Hamstring Injury**



Tndian badminton star PV Sindhu has **⊥**withdrawn from the 2025 Badminton Asia Mixed Team Championships (BAMTC) due to a hamstring injury. The tournament, set to take place in Qingdao from February 11-16, will proceed without the 29-year-old shuttler, who was a key part of the Indian squad that won bronze in the previous edition.

In a statement on social media, Sindhu explained that she felt a twinge in her hamstring during training in Guwahati on February 4. Despite trying to push through with heavy taping, an MRI revealed that her recovery would take longer than anticipated.

Sindhu has been battling injuries since claiming her first women's singles gold at the 2022 Commonwealth Games. A left foot stress fracture during the event sidelined her for the remainder of the year, missing the World Championships and World Tour Finals.

India, placed in a tough Group D alongside South Korea and Macau, will begin their campaign on February 12 against Macau, followed by a challenging match against South Korea on February 13. Sindhu expressed her support for the team, stating that she would be "cheering from the sidelines."

Despite the solid total, England's hopes were dashed by a sensational century from Rohit Sharma. Rohit returned to form in style, scoring 119 runs off 90 balls, featuring 12 fours and 7 sixes This century marked his 32nd in ODIs, surpassing Rahul Dravid in the list of India's most prolific international century makers. Rohit now holds third place, behind Virat Kohli (81) and Sachin Tendulkar (100). Additionally, during knock, Rohit surpassed Chris Gayle in the list of batters with the most sixes in ODIs. With a total of 332 sixes, he now sits at second place, just behind Shahid Afridi (351). Rohit's explosive performance guided India to a comfortable victory, wrapping up the series with a 2-0 lead.




