The recent deportation of 104 Indian nationals from the United States has once again highlighted the increasing use of Dunki Routes, a network of illegal migration pathways. These individuals reportedly spent up to ₹1 crore each on agent fees, fraudulent documents, and perilous travel through multiple countries, hoping to enter the U.S. undetected.

Many of these migrants began their journey in South America, traveling through countries like Ecuador, Colombia, Panama, and Mexico before attempting to

cross the U.S. border. The high cost and difficulty of securing legal visas, along with the appeal of better job opportunities and living conditions, push many Indians to take these dangerous routes.

Amid claims that the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) is facing internal turmoil following its poor showing in the Delhi elections, party national convener Arvind Kejriwal has called for a meeting with all 92 of the party's Punjab MLAs, including ministers, in New Delhi on February 11. Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann will also be present at the meeting, which is set to take place at Kapurthala House, the official residence of the Punjab CM in Delhi.

Senior Congress leader Sukhjinder Randhawa took to social media, suggesting that Punjab could face midterm elections due to the growing dissatisfaction among AAP MLAs. He highlighted the lack of governance, citing a lack of cabinet meetings and the recent cancellations as a sign of instability.

Delhi HC Grants Two-Day Custody Parole to Jailed MP Engineer Rashid for Parliament Session

The Delhi High Court granted a two-day custody parole to jailed Jammu and Kashmir MP, Abdul Rashid Sheikh, also known as Rashid Engineer, allowing him to attend the ongoing Parliament session on February 11 and 13. Justice Vikas Mahajan approved the parole, stating that Rashid would be escorted by armed police personnel to and from the Parliament.

Rashid, who represents Baramulla, is currently facing trial in a terror funding case. He is accused of financially supporting separatists and terror groups in Jammu and Kashmir. As a condition of the custody parole, Rashid was prohibited from using a cellphone or speaking to the media. The court also directed that security within Parliament would be coordinated with the secretary general.

filed a plea for custody parole after being left in limbo by the NIA court, which could not decide his bail due to the absence of a special MP/ MLA court. Senior advocate Sidharth Luthra, representing the NIA, opposed the plea, citing



security concerns over armed escorts entering Parliament. Luthra argued that custody parole is not a right for parliamentarians and raised complications regarding the presence of armed personnel.

In contrast, Rashid's counsel, senior advocate N Rashid, elected to the Lok Sabha last year, had Hariharan, argued that his constituency, Baramulla, was unrepresented during the budget session, particularly as the funds for J&K had decreased by Rs 1,000 crore. He urged the court to allow Rashid to participate, highlighting the importance of constituency representation.



Anurag Thakur Slams Rahul Gandhi Over Delhi's "Zero" Performance

BJP MP Anurag Thakur today took a jibe at Congress leader Rahul Gandhi and his party's continuous failures in Delhi elections, as Congress failed to win a single seat for the third consecutive time. Thakur also criticized Congress for its past record, referencing the "high" income tax rates during its time in

During a session in Parliament, Thakur held up a small poster that

read, "zero tax till Rs 12 lakh income," emphasizing the government's income tax reforms. He mocked the Congress party, claiming they may feel bad about the "zero," but that millions of ordinary people are benefitting from the tax changes. "Rahul ji, check the zero," he quipped, referencing an internet meme that shows Gandhi as a fuel station attendant telling a customer to "check the zero."

The new income tax slabs, introduced by Union Fi-

nance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in Budget 2025, exempt those earning up to Rs 12.75 lakh from paying income tax.

Thakur's remarks come after his earlier comments calling Rahul Gandhi an "urban Naxal" over his allegations about an electoral expansion in Maharashtra. In today's Parliament session, Thakur further

mocked the Congress party by listing its repeated electoral defeats and asking questions about the number of seats Congress had won in recent elections. Each time he asked, BJP members responded with "zero."

Thakur highlighted the Congress party's complete absence in Delhi's political scene, asking, "In the 2014 Lok Sabha elections, how many seats did Congress win in Delhi? Zero. In the 2015 Vidhan Sabha?

Zero. In the 2019 Lok Sabha? Zero." He continued, pointing out that the same result was repeated in 2020 and 2024 elections. The BJP, in contrast, secured nearly 50 out of Delhi's 70 seats in the last elections, while the AAP won 22.

Thakur concluded by blaming Rahul Gandhi's leadership for Congress's dismal performance, saying that the party had established a "record of zeroes" under

Rocket Ammunition Found During Searches In Punjab's Patiala TPN Correspondent| Patiala

At least seven rocket ammunition shells were discovered in a garbage dump on Rajpura Road in Patiala, Punjab, this afternoon, sparking panic among local residents. The police were alerted about the presence of suspicious materials in the area, prompting an immediate investigation.

According to Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Nanak Singh, the ammunition was found in a garbage pile after police received information about potentially dangerous items being discarded. "Preliminary investigation suggests that the ammunition was left behind by a scrap dealer, as it was found in a garbage dump," said SSP Nanak Singh, addressing the media.

Despite this initial theory, the police are not ruling out any other possibilities. The discovery of such hazardous materials has raised concerns regarding safety and security in the area. Authorities have cordoned off the area to ensure public safety and have begun an investigation to deter-

mine how the ammunition ended up in the garbage dump.

The police are continuing their inquiries to verify the origin of the ammunition and whether there was any malicious intent behind it. Local residents are on edge, as the discovery of such dangerous materials in a public area is causing widespread fear.

Patiala's police force has assured the public that measures are being taken to prevent any potential threats and ensure the safety of residents. The area will remain under heightened surveillance while the investigation continues.

According to the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Fiscal Year 2024 Annual Report, while Honduras, Mexico, Guatemala, and El Salvador remain the top countries for deportations, India has now overtaken China and is nearly on par with Brazil. This shift indicates a rising trend of illegal migration from South Asia, despite severe risks and financial losses.

The Indian government has also expressed concerns over the increasing number of its citizens taking illegal migration routes. Authorities are urging stricter action against fraudulent immigration agents and raising awareness about the dangers of unauthorized travel. However, unless legal migration opportunities improve, many desperate individuals may continue to risk everything for a chance at a better life abroad.

Gold Prices Surge Amid US Tariff Threats, Hit Record Highs

On Monday, gold prices soared past the \$2,930 mark on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange, as the market responded to US President Donald Trump's threats of imposing a 25% additional tariff on steel and aluminum imports. While Trump did not specify which countries would be targeted, the uncertainty surrounding the potential trade war led to increased demand for gold as a safe-haven asset.

In the domestic market, these international price shifts will be reflected on Tuesday. However, on Monday, investors and traders in India pushed up local gold prices, with Delhi seeing a surge to Rs 88,080 per 10 grams, and Mumbai reaching Rs 87,990, up from Rs 87,300 on Saturday.

Abdul Nazar, director of the All-India Gems & Jewellery Domestic Council, confirmed that the new gold price levels will take effect on Tuesday in the Indian market. The price of \$2,931 per ounce marks the highest point for gold in history when adjusted for inflation. The all-time high for gold, as per adjusted figures, remains over \$3,300, a price reached during the 1980s following a crude oil price rally and record inflation.

Colin Shah, managing director of Kama Jewelry, highlighted that the surge in gold prices is primarily driven by Trump's tariff threats, which are pushing more investors toward safe-haven assets like gold. Additionally, the possibility of a US-China trade war is contributing to market volatility, further boosting demand for gold. Shah predicts that gold prices could reach \$3,000 per ounce internationally and Rs 88,000 per 10 grams in the domestic market.

According to Reuters, gold prices rose more than 1% on Monday to hit a record high as fears of a global trade war intensified. By 19:05 IST, spot gold had risen 1.4% to \$2,931 per ounce, marking its seventh record this year. The metal has already surged more than 10% in 2025, following a 22% rally in the previous year, as geopolitical tensions and economic uncertainties continue to fuel gold's appeal.



14 Crore Excluded From NFSA Due to **Delay in Census: Sonia Gandhi**

Congress MP and parliamentary party chairperson Sonia Gandhi raised concerns in the Rajya Sabha on February 10, highlighting that nearly 14 crore people are being deprived of benefits under the National Food Security Act (NFSA) due to the delay in conducting the decadal census. She urged the Union government to conduct the exercise as soon as possi-

During her address, Sonia Gandhi praised the NFSA, introduced by the United Pro-

ernment, calling it a crucial initiative for ensuring food and nutritional security for India's 140 crore citizens. She emphasized its role in safeguarding millions from hunger during the COVID-19 pandemic and as the foundation of the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY). Under the NFSA, 75% of rural and 50% of urban populations are entitled to subsidized food grains, yet the quota for beneficiaries is still determined by the 2011 Census, which is over a decade old.

"The Census, which was origgressive Alliance (UPA) gov- inally scheduled for 2021, has been delayed for more than four years, and there is still no clarity on when it will be conducted," Gandhi noted. She further criticized the Union Budget allocations, which suggest that the updated census is unlikely to take place this year. As a result, she pointed out that around 14 crore eligible citizens remain excluded from essential benefits under the NFSA.

Gandhi emphasized that food security is a fundamental right, not a privilege, and called on the government to prioritize completing the census without further delay. Activists Anjali Bhardwaj and Amrita Johri from the Right to Food Campaign have also pointed out that had the 2021 Census been completed on time, an estimated 10 crore people would have been added to the food security net.

In the Union Budget presented on February 1, only Rs 574.80 crore were allocated for the Census, raising doubts about its completion this year. The government had initially approved the census at a cost of Rs 8,754.23 crore in December 2019.

Priyanka Gandhi Calls Manipur CM's Resignation "Long Overdue"

Congress General Secretary Priyanka Gandhi Vadra on Monday expressed that Manipur Chief Minister N Biren Singh's resignation was long overdue, given the ongoing violence in the northeastern state for the past two years. Speaking to reporters, she emphasized that the situation in Manipur had been deteriorating for an extended period, and action was necessary.

Gandhi said, "It was long overdue... for two years, violence has been continuing in Manipur." Her remarks came in response to a question about the resignation of the Chief Minister, following intense unrest in the region. The violence in Manipur has led to widespread instability and concerns over the safety and well-being of the residents.

She reiterated that the prolonged unrest in the state demanded immediate attention from the government. Akhilesh Yadav flays Adityanath govt over traffic chaos in Prayagraj

Delhi will now benefit from central schemes : Haryana CM

A day after the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) secured a decisive victory in Delhi, clinching 48 out of 70 seats, Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini lauded the party's success, calling it a historic moment for the capital. He emphasized that residents of Delhi would now benefit from various welfare schemes introduced by the Centre under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership.

fair prices for their crops, and clean, sufficient water will be provided," he said. The Haryana CM also lashed

out at Kejriwal for his past accusations against farmers and the Haryana government. "Kejriwal blamed farmers for stubble burning and falsely claimed Haryana was poisoning water sent to Delhi. But people have seen through these lies," Saini added.

In a lighter moment, the Haryana government served freshly fried jalebis from Gohana's Lala Mathu Ram, referencing Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's previous comment about selling these jalebis across the country. "Just like in Haryana and Maharashtra, jalebis are now being served in Delhi too," Saini quipped.






India Open to Energy Imports; Gas Prices to **Drop in 2026: Minister Puri**

India is open to importing energy from any source at the lowest possible prices, said Union Minister for Petroleum and Natural Gas, Hardeep Singh Puri, on Monday. Addressing the media ahead of the Indian Energy Week (IEW) 2025, Puri reassured that the country remains flexible in sourcing energy and is continuously expanding its network of suppliers. The country has increased its number of energy suppliers from 27 to 39, adding nations like Argentina to the list. Puri emphasized that tenders for energy importation are open to all suppliers, with a focus on purchasing from the most cost-effective sources.



In his statement, the minister allayed concerns regarding the impact of US sanctions on Russia's energy supplies to India. He stated that despite global uncertainties, India's energy import portfolio continues to grow. Puri also highlighted that domestic oil marketing companies are looking to expand their natural gas purchases, and prices are expected to drop significantly by 2026. He projected a major increase in the availability of natural gas, with Qatar being a potential supplier.

Additionally, Puri addressed the growing demand for liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) in India, revealing that LPG supply is nearly saturated in the country. The government's next focus is to extend the reach of piped natural gas (PNG) to households, which is 30% cheaper than LPG.

In a key development, Puri mentioned that Indian Oil, Bharat Petroleum, and GAIL are exploring the possibility of purchasing liquefied natural gas (LNG) and crude oil from the United States, with longterm contracts in the pipeline. This aligns with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's upcoming visit to the US, where energy discussions are expected to be a significant part of the agenda.

IEW 2025, which will kick off in New Delhi, is expected to be the second-largest energy event globally, attracting top ministers and CEOs. The event will also host a Clean Cooking Ministerial to advance the global transition to clean cooking solutions.

Podcaster Allahbadia Who Received Award From PM Modi Now Facing Flak For His Remark

Allahbadia's comment, in which he asked a contestant, "Would you rather watch your parents have sex every day for the rest of your life or join in once and stop it forever?" quickly went viral, receiving widespread criticism on social media. Many users expressed their disgust, with Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis warning against the misuse of freedom of speech. The National Commission for Protection of Child Rights also urged YouTube to take urgent action regarding the matter.

Allahbadia, who is also an entrepreneur, hosts *The Ranveer Show* and is the founder of BeerBiceps Media Private Limited. He runs 12 YouTube channels, which collectively have over 6 billion views. His main channel, *BeerBiceps*, features interviews with celebrities, entrepreneurs, and athletes, while his *Ranveer Allahbadia (Hindi)* channel caters to a Hindi-speaking audience. He has also co-founded several ventures, including Monk-E, BigBrainco, and Level Supermind.

This isn't the first time Allahbadia's content has attracted criticism. In 2023, during a podcast with advocate J Sai Deepak, he asked who should leave India, leading to backlash. Additionally, in April 2024, he faced scrutiny for sharing an unverified claim about a village in Kerala enforcing Islamic law. Despite the backlash, Allahbadia has remained unapologetic, refusing to take down controversial videos.

Devotees Stuck In Traffic Jam For 30 Hours In Maha Kumbh

Ahead of the Magh Purnima festival, set for February 12, a massive influx of devotees headed towards Prayagraj for the Maha Kumbh has caused significant traffic disruptions. 

Saudi Arabia Implements New Measures for Hajj 2025, **Restricts Children**

Saudi Arabia has announced new regulations for the 2025 Hajj pilgrimage, including a ban on children accompanying pilgrims. This decision aims to safeguard the well-being of young ones, who may face risks from the intense crowding that occurs each year during the pilgrimage. The Ministry of Hajj and Umrah emphasized that the safety of children is a top priority, and this measure is designed to prevent harm to them during the event.

In addition to the ban on children, the Ministry is introducing several other safety initiatives to improve the pilgrimage experience. These measures include conducting public safety awareness campaigns, implementing advanced intelligent systems to better manage the movement of pilgrims in sacred areas, and enhancing the infrastructure of the pilgrimage sites. This includes modernization of tent camps and walking routes to ensure safer and more efficient pilgrimages for all attendees.

Saudi Arabia has also reiterated its commitment to prioritizing first-time Hajj participants for the 2025 season, as is the usual practice. This ensures that those who have not had the opportunity to perform the pilgrimage before are given the chance to do so.

The 2025 Hajj season is expected to take place between June 4-6, depending on the sighting of the moon. Performing Hajj is one of the Five Pillars of Islam, and every capable Muslim is required to undertake the journey to Makkah at least once in their lifetime, provided they have the physical and financial means to do so.

In addition to these domestic measures, Saudi Arabia has also announced restrictions on issuing multiple-entry visas for certain nationalities. Affected countries include Algeria, Bangladesh, Egypt, India, Indonesia, and several others. From now on, Saudi Arabia will only issue single-entry visas for tourism, business, or family visits, indefinitely suspending the previous one-year multiple-entry visas.

For Saudi citizens and residents, registration for Hajj 2025 is available via the official Nusuk app, which allows applicants to update their health details and submit necessary documentation for Hajj packages.

Trump Announces 25% Tariffs on All Steel and Aluminium Imports

In a significant escalation of his trade policy, US President Donald Trump revealed that the United States will impose a 25% tariff on all steel and aluminium imports, with additional metal duties expected to be announced later in the week. Speaking to reporters aboard Air Force One on Sunday en route to the NFL Super Bowl in New Orleans, Trump also confirmed that reciprocal tariffs would be introduced as early as Tuesday, with the new tariffs taking effect almost immediately.

While Trump did not specify which countries would be targeted by the reciprocal tariffs, he emphasized that the US would match tariffs imposed by other nations, applying this strategy to all countries. "Very simply, it's, if they charge us, we charge them," he steel mill capacity utilization has declined in explained. This move marks another step in his ongoing trade policy overhaul.

During his first term from 2016 to 2020, Trump imposed a 25% tariff on steel and a 10% tariff on aluminium, but he later granted several countries, including Canada, Mexico, and Brazil, duty-free quotas. Former President Joe Biden continued these exemptions, extending them to the United Kingdom, Japan, and the European Union. However, US



recent years, raising concerns about the effectiveness of these quotas.

Canada, Mexico, and Brazil are the largest sources of US steel imports, followed by South Korea and Vietnam. Canada is also the largest supplier of primary aluminium to the US, accounting for 79% of total imports in the first 11 months of 2024, while Mexico is a major supplier of aluminium scrap and alloys. Trump has long expressed dissatisfac-


tion with the European Union's 10% tariff on US auto imports, which he claims is much higher than the 2.5% tariff the US levies on European cars. The US maintains a 25% tariff on pickup trucks, a key product for Detroit automakers like General Motors, Ford, and Stellantis' US operations. The average US trade-weighted tariff rate stands at about 2.2%, according to World Trade Organization data, compared to higher rates in countries like India (12%), Brazil (6.7%), Vietnam (5.1%), and the EU (2.7%).

Shift Palestine To Saudi Arabia? Netanyahu Suggestion Draws 'Fantasies' Jibe

Saudi Arabia has strongly rejected Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's recent proposal suggesting that the Palestinian state be established within Saudi Arabia's territory. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Saudi Arabia issued a statement on Sunday, February 9, condemning Netanyahu's remarks, which it claimed were aimed at diverting attention from Israel's ongoing actions in Gaza. The statement highlighted the "continuous crimes" committed by Israeli forces, including what it described as ethnic cleansing against Palestinians.

The Saudi government reaffirmed that the Palestinian people have an inherent "right to their land" and are not "intruders or immigrants" to be displaced at will by Israeli occupation forces. The statement emphasized that the Palestinian cause is a matter of justice and sovereignty, rejecting any suggestion that Palestinians should be resettled outside their homeland. The controversy began when Netanyahu, during a televised interview on February 6, discussed potential diplomatic normalization between Israel and Saudi Arabia. A misstatement by Israeli journalist Yaakov Bardugo initially suggested that no progress could be made without the creation of a Saudi state, which was later corrected to "Palestinian state" by Netanyahu. However, Netanyahu added, "Unless you want the Palestinian state to be in Saudi Arabia. They have plenty of territory."

Sri Lankan Navy arrests 14 Indian fishermen, remands them till February 19

Fourteen Indian fishermen were arrested by the Sri Lankan Navy for allegedly crossing the maritime border and entering Sri Lankan waters near the North Mannar zone, officials reported. AAP MP Raises Alarm Over Drone Activities on India-Pakistan Border

Sandeep Pathak, Member of Parliament from the Aam Aadmi Party, submitted a Zero Hour notice in Parliament on Monday, urging the government to address the growing issue of illegal drone activities on the India-Pakistan border. Pathak raised concerns about the illegal supply of weapons and drugs to Punjab districts, facilitated by drones operating across the border from Pakistan.

In his notice, Pathak emphasized the alarming rise in drone activities, particularly the smuggling of drugs into Punjab. He called for urgent and stringent actions from the Centre to tackle the issue,

urging the deployment of advanced counter-drone technologies on the Indo-Pak border. Pathak pointed out that security forces have been seizing an increasing number of drones involved in illegal activities. In 2023 alone, 107 drones were confiscated along the Punjab border, and by November 2024, nearly 200 drones had been seized, many of which were found to be carrying drugs and weapons.

The AAP MP also highlighted Pakistan's role in fueling narcotics and violence in Punjab, revealing that drones are frequently detected near agricultural fields in Pakistan. He described the situation as a serious national security threat, asserting that the internation-

The Vital Role of Ideology in Political Alliances: The **Case for the INDIA Bloc**



In the wake of election results, it is tempting to rush to conclusions about the fate of political alliances, especially in the context of India's evolving political landscape. However, a hasty evaluation can be misleading. While media and social media may thrive on instant reactions, serious political analysis requires patience and context. This is particularly important when it comes to assessing the significance of coalitions like the INDIA bloc, which has gained attention leading up to the 2024 Lok Sabha elections.

The INDIA bloc was conceived as a strategic alliance to challenge what many saw as authoritarian governance. Its formation was not an arbitrary decision but a calculated effort to unite parties sharing a common vision for India's future. While the bloc's cooperation has occasionally led to intra-coalition competition at the state level, it has nevertheless proven effective as a platform for national coordination, as seen in parliamentary floor management. Electoral politics can be analyzed at three levels: tactical, strategic, and foundational. Tactical politics is about

winning at all costs, sometimes compromising core beliefs for short-term gains. This approach weakens voter trust in the long term. On the other hand, strategic politics focuses on long-term goals and alliances based on shared principles. It is about working together for the greater good without sacrificing core values. Finally, foundational politics refers to the bedrock principles of democracy, transparency, justice, and development, which should never be compromised for immediate electoral success.

A party's ideological commitment plays a central role in its identity. The clear ideological stance helps define its values and vision, guiding policy decisions and uniting its members. Parties that deviate from their core principles for tactical advantage risk losing their credibility and alienating their base. The recent Delhi elections serve as a reminder of the importance of ideological consistency in retaining voter loyalty. Voters are keenly aware of whether parties stand by their principles or change their stance to appease the whims of the moment.

Why the Delhi Result Matters **Beyond Delhi**

The Congress Party may argue that the Delhi election is not a validation of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership but a rejection of Arvind Kejriwal's deceitful politics. There's some truth to this assertion, yet the BJP has its own reason to celebrate, claiming that Modi's charisma and Amit Shah's strategic prowess remain intact. However, the AAP, while conceding the Delhi seat to the BJP, can take pride in the fact that its influence remains strong, as evidenced by its 42% vote share.

Kejriwal and his colleagues can claim that they forced the BJP to change its approach in several significant areas. Firstly, the BJP had to abandon its usual Hindu-Muslim rhetoric. During the early stages of the Delhi campaign, BJP ticket aspirants used divisive slogans, such as "ek hai to safe hai," which were first seen in Maharashtra. But, as the election progressed, the BJP shifted its focus, criticizing the AAP government's governance rather than playing the communal card. The BJP's restraint in this regard was likely due to Kejriwal's influence, signaling that the middle-class electorate in Delhi had little appetite for polarizing politics.

Biren Singh's Resignation: The End of a Populist Era in Manipur



On February 9, Biren Singh resigned as the Chief drawal of support by the National People's Party Minister of Manipur, seemingly the only honourable option left to avoid an inglorious exit and maintain some dignity for the BJP. Unlike his earlier resignation drama on June 30, 2023, when he skillfully diverted national media attention to Rahul Gandhi's visit, this time his resignation was swiftly accepted by the Governor. This marked a stark contrast to the past, highlighting the erosion of his populist appeal and the BJP's national leadership's growing recognition of his political liability.

Singh's resignation came after intense political pressure, including an open revolt from several BJP members in the valley areas, and the with(NPP) in November 2024. The impending threat of a no-confidence motion in the upcoming session of the Assembly, scheduled for February 10, made it clear that Singh and the BJP could no longer afford to face the political fallout. The resignation reflects the culmination of the internal tensions within his leadership, which had been building for some time.

During his tenure, Singh's leadership was defined by his efforts to reinvent his image and position himself as a father-like figure to the Meitei ultranationalists. Early in his first term (2017-2022), he used his political acumen to co-opt influential hill tribal leaders, stabilizing his position despite significant internal opposition within the BJP, particularly from figures like Biswajit Singh and Konthoujam Govindas. However, with the BJP's comfortable majority in the 2022 assembly elections, Singh's political fragility persisted, leading him to adopt a more aggressive populist approach.

Singh's attempt to rejuvenate Meitei indigenous politics, particularly through the revival of Sanamahism, became a central aspect of his leadership. This initiative, aimed at appealing to Meitei ultranationalists, was seen as a way to strengthen his political base. However, the revival of indigenous cultures, while a populist move, was never considered a threat to the broader Hindutva agenda of the BJP and the Sangh Parivar.



Action to be taken if gold auction norms violated by banks, NBFCS: Sitharaman

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Monday assured that strict action would be taken if banks or Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs) violate the established processes for auctioning gold when a borrower defaults on their gold loan payments. Speaking during the Question Hour in Lok Sabha, Sitharaman emphasized that both NBFCs and Scheduled Commercial Banks (SCBs) are governed by similar rules regarding gold loan auctions.

Sitharaman explained that the auction process is well-regulated, with clear guidelines to ensure fairness and transparency. When a borrower fails to repay their gold loan, both banks and NBFCs follow a defined process. This includes sending several notices to the borrower informing them about their default status and providing ade-



quate time for repayment.

The Finance Minister further clarified that in cases where a borrower still does not pay, the institutions are required to follow strict procedures be-

fore proceeding with the auction. The goal is to ensure that the borrower has been given every possible opportunity to settle the loan before the gold is auc-

India to prioritize energy infrastructure in capex shift from FY25-30

India's capital expenditure (capex) from FY25-30 is expected to shift focus from public-led transport infrastructure to a more balanced investment in energy infrastructure, including electricity generation and the integration of power grids for efficient transmission and distribution, according to a BNP Paribas report. This transition reflects India's commitment to sustainable development and energy security.

Despite global trade uncertainties and shifting monetary policies, India's economy is projected to remain resilient. Unlike smaller, trade-dependent nations, larger economies such as India, China, and the US are less reliant on external trade, which provides some insulation from the economic risks posed by tariff wars and interna-



tional disruptions.

The report highlights India's inward-focused economy, which is expected to experience lower volatility in trade compared to more export-reliant nations. The US 10-year bond yield has surged from 3.7% in September 2024 to 4.5%, while India's 10-year yield has remained stable, fluctuating between 6.7% and 6.9%. This narrowing of the yield gap has led to a 3% depreciation of the Indian Rupee (INR) since September 2024.

BNP Paribas economists predict that US inflation will face continued upward pressure, likely preventing any rate cuts in 2025. In contrast, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) may adopt a dovish stance and implement rate cuts to support domestic economic growth, which could further compress the yield gap and apply downward pressure on the INR. In the Indian stock market, sectors like consumer staples and industrials are trading at a premium compared to historical valuation averages. While industrials have benefitted from India's strong manufacturing momentum, the consumer staples sector is expected to undergo a period of time correction.

India Launches EFTA Desk to Strengthen **Economic Ties with Europe**

India has launched a dedicated desk to foster deeper economic engagement between India and the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) countries, namely Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, and Switzerland. The formal launch took place at Bharat Mandapam, with Union Minister for Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal, representing India at the event.

The newly established EFTA Desk aims to assist businesses from the four EFTA countries in preparing for the opportunities created by the EFTA-India Trade and Economic Partnership Agreement (TEPA), signed on March 10, 2024. The desk will act as a central point of contact for EFTA businesses looking to expand into India, offering support and guidance on market entry, investment opportunities, and resolving potential issues.



While the TEPA is still in the process of being ratified, businesses across the EFTA nations are already exploring investment opportunities and strengthening their commercial ties with Indian partners. Over 100 EFTA businesses are visiting India this week to explore potential collaborations, an outcome of ongoing efforts by EFTA countries to raise awareness about the benefits of the agreement.



Google Messages Could Soon Integrate WhatsApp Video Calling

oogle Messages is reportedly working on a new feature that will allow users to make video calls via WhatsApp directly from the app. According to an Android Authority report, this feature is still in development and not yet active for users. The discovery was made within the code of Google Messages version 20250131.

The feature is said to activate when the caller does not have Google Meet installed on their device, offering an alternative option for making video calls. In the current version of Google Messages, video calls are only possible through Google Meet, and users are prompted to install it if it's not already on their device. However, with the upcoming WhatsApp integration, users will be able to initiate video calls via WhatsApp without leaving the Google Messages app. The call will open directly in full-screen mode, saving time and reducing clicks, especially for those who primarily use Google Messages



for communication.

It's important to note that this feature will only work in individual chats. For group chats, video calls can still only be initiated through Google Meet. Additionally, if the recipient doesn't have WhatsApp installed, the feature won't be triggered.

Along with this new feature, there's

another update to Google Messages. The camera viewfinder and gallery picker have been merged when opening the camera option, streamlining the photo-taking process.



A top-two finish in the group will secure a quarterfinal spot, but advancing further will require exceptional performances from the team.

India has never won the gold in the Asia Mixed Team Championships but has had notable successes in team events, including Thomas Cup gold in 2022 and a silver at the 2024 Badminton Asia Team Championships. Key players like HS Prannoy, Lakshya Sen, Ashwini Ponnappa, Satwiksairaj Rankireddy, and Chirag Shetty are expected to carry the team's hopes, along with rising stars in women's doubles, Gayatri Gopichand and Treesa Jolly.

With the tournament's last three editions dominated by China and Japan, India will have to overcome a challenging field to make history in this prestigious competition.
