Speaking to reporters, Mann expressed confidence in the party's unity and criticized those who claimed the party was fragmenting, attributing such assertions to rivals from Congress and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) who, he argued, were prone to switching sides.

The meeting, which included discussions on the results of the

Delhi assembly elections and matters of governance, was described as a platform to strengthen the party's resolve in Punjab.

Minister Harpal Singh Cheema, who was present at the meeting, echoed Mann's sentiments, emphasizing that AAP was united under Kejriwal's leadership. "No force can break AAP in Punjab," Cheema asserted, adding that the party would continue working harder in the state for the welfare of its people.

Mann also addressed the gathering outside Kapurthala House, expressing gratitude for the hard work put in by Punjab's MLAs and cabinet critical sectors such as infrastructure and healthcare. "We are learning from the work done in Delhi... Together, we have to work to make Punjab a model for the country," he He also pointed out that AAP's volunteers and workers were unwavering in their commitment, unaffected by external temptations. "Our volunteers are dedicated and are not going to fall for any lure," Mann emphasized, reinforcing the idea that AAP's core strength lies in its grassroots support.

Punjab minister Balbir Singh, another attendee at the meeting, said Kejriwal urged AAP leaders to work even harder in the next two years. He dismissed the reports of a potential split within the party, signaling the leadership's confidence in maintaining a unified front.

The Delhi assembly elections, where winning 48 seats to AAP's 22, were also a key topic of discussion during the meeting. Despite AAP's setback in Delhi, the focus in Punjab remains firmly on the party's developmental agenda for the state.

Delhi MCD to Present Revised Budget Estimates for 2024-25 and 2025-26

Delhi's Municipal Corporation (MCD) is set to present its revised budget estimates for 2024-25 and budestimates for 2025-26 at a special meeting scheduled for February 13. MCD officials stated that the budget presentation and

approval process must be completed between February 13 and 15.

As per the Delhi Municipal Corporation (DMC) Act, the MCD's budget estimates are typically required to be presented before the standing committee no later than December 10. However, this timeline was delayed due to the non-formation of the standing committee. The announcement of Delhi's elections further complicated the process when the model code of conduct (MCC) was imposed, preventing the budget from being presented on time. With the lifting of the MCC, the MCD decided to proceed with presenting the budget after receiving approval from the mayor, according to officials.

As per the DMC Act, once the budget estimates are presented before the standing committee, the panel will review and amend them before forwarding them to the house of councillors for final approval. The total budget proposals for the upcoming fiscal years are expected to be approximately ₹17,000 crore. This amount will cover both new projects that MCD plans to initiate and the routine expenditures on essential services such as sanitation, public health, education, and other key areas. BJP's Delhi CM Race Heats Up as **Party Leaders Weigh Candidates**

The buzz around who will be the next Chief Minister of Delhi intensified on Monday, just two days after the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) secured a sweeping victory in the Delhi assembly elections. As speculation mounts, several BJP legislators have emerged as possible contenders for the top post.

The results of the Delhi elections, declared on February 8, saw the BJP winning 48 of the 70 seats, marking a dramatic return to power after a 27-year absence. The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), which had previously

dominated the Assembly, saw its strength reduce to just 22 seats from 62. This shift has led to heightened discussions within the BJP regarding the selection of the next Chief Minister.

At least two senior BJP leaders confirmed to HT that if the party opts for a woman CM, Rekha Gupta, the MLA from Shalimar Bagh and national vice president of the BJP's women's wing, could be a leading choice. However, Shikha Roy, the BJP legislator from Greater Kailash, who won in a closely contested battle against AAP's Saurabh Bharadwaj, is also seen as a strong contender.

Other names in the race include three-term MLA from Rohini, Vijender Gupta; Ghonda MLA



Ajay Mahawar; Laxmi Nagar MLA Abhay Verma, who represents the Purvanchali community; and Malviya Nagar MLA Satish Upadhyay. Additionally, Ashish Sood, MLA from Janakpuri and the party's Goa unit in-charge, along with Uttam Nagar MLA Pawan Sharma, the co-incharge of the Assam unit, are also being considered due to their organizational contributions.

The name of Kapil Mishra, a former AAP minister who triumphed in Karawal Nagar, has also emerged as a potential candidate, along with Parvesh Verma, who made waves by defeating AAP leader Arvind Kejriwal in the New Delhi constituency.

2 Soldiers Killed In Action As Terrorists Set Off Bomb In J&K

Two Indian Army soldiers killed in action today in a suspected Improvised Explosive Device (IED) attack by terrorists in Jammu and Kashmir's Akhnoor sector. The incident occurred while the soldiers

were conducting a "fence patrol" along the Line of Control (LoC).

The White Knight Corps of the Indian Army confirmed the casualties in a post on X, paying tribute to the soldiers for their supreme sacrifice. "White Knight Corps salutes and pays tribute to the supreme sacrifice of two gallant soldiers," the army said.

The IED attack took place in a region that has witnessed heightened tensions, and the soldiers' patrol was part of the routine security operations along the LoC. Following the attack, the army has intensified operations in the area, with search efforts currently underway to locate the perpetrators.

This tragic incident follows a recent series of hostile actions along the LoC. Just yesterday, a soldier was critically injured in the Rajouri district by gunfire from across the LoC. The soldier, stationed at a forward post in the Kalal area of the Nowshera sector, was hit by a bullet in the afternoon. Initial reports indicate that the gunfire originated from the other side of the LoC at approximately 2:40 pm. The soldier was promptly evacuated to a military hospital for treatment.

Yogi Adityanath **Defends** Maha Kumbh Arrangements, Slams **Opposition**




Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Tuesday responded sharply to opposition criticism regarding the chaos at the Maha Kumbh in Prayagraj, where devotees were reportedly stuck in massive traffic jams for several hours without access to food or water. Adityanath defended the state government's efforts, suggesting that the criticisms were coming from those accustomed to "VIP treatment."

Speaking at a public event, the Chief Minister remarked, "The people who are now criticizing the arrangements at Maha Kumbh are the same individuals who have always opposed

and indulge in disinformation campaigns." He did not name any specific individuals but made it clear that he believed these critiques were politically motivated.

Adityanath highlighted the historic significance of the event, noting that approximately 45 crore devotees had taken a ritual bath at the sacred Sangam over the past 29 days, calling it a momentous occasion. "What can be more significant than this?" he said, referring to the enormous number of devotees. He also took a dig at those trying to link the mishaps with VIP baths, accusing them of misleading the public.

Two Juvenile Boys Arrested for Murder of 24-Year-Old Man in East Delhi

The Delhi Police have arrested two juvenile boys in connection with the murder of a 24-year-old man near Smriti Van in East Delhi. The investigation revealed that one of the minors, a 16-year-old, had instigated the killing. The victim was the boyfriend of the boy's mother, and the incident unfolded after a dispute over the relationship.

The body of the victim was discovered on Monday morning by local residents, who reported it to the authorities after spotting it in a pond near Smriti Van. Upon investigation, police found injury marks on the victim's head, leading them to suspect foul play. A team from the crime branch and Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) was dispatched to the

scene to gather evidence, and the body was sent to Lal Bahadur Shastri Hospital

for a post-mortem examination.

Police officers analyzed the deceased's Call Detail Records (CDR) and found that he had been in contact with a woman who lived nearby. A police team was

sent to question the woman, who revealed that she had been in a twoyear relationship with the victim. On the night of the incident, she had asked her son, the 16-year-old, to drop the victim home.

Upon further questioning, the 16-year-old boy admitted to the crime, claiming that he was "annoyed" by his mother's relationship with the victim. He, along with his 17-year-old friend, killed the victim by hitting him on the head with bricks. The po-

lice managed to apprehend both boys and recover the brick and the bike used in the crime.

The arrest of the juveniles has raised concerns about the increasing violence among young people, with the case now under further investigation.

Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge and Congress MP Rahul Gandhi will not attend the inaugural function of the investors' summit in Bengaluru on Tuesday evening, citing their ongoing commitments in Parliament. Jairam Ramesh, Congress General Secretary for communication, informed that both leaders are preoccupied with the continuing Budget debate in the Parliament and have regretted their inability to participate in

In a post on X (formerly Twitter), Ramesh explained, "Both the Leader of the Opposition in the Rajya Sabha, Mallikarjun Kharge, and

the Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi, are extremely tied up in Parliament today on account of the continuing debate on the Budget. Hence, they have regretted their inability to attend the inauguration of the Karnataka Investor Summit this evening in Bengaluru."

Ramesh further conveyed the leaders' best wishes for the summit and expressed confidence that it would be productive and successful, highlighting Karnataka's unique competitive and comparative advantages.

However, sources suggest that the absence of Kharge and Gandhi may not only be due to their Parliament schedules. Reports indicate dissatisfaction over the presence of Union Ministers and prominent BJP leaders at the event organized by the Congress-led Karnataka government. The two Congress leaders reportedly felt uncomfortable with the political significance of BJP figures being given prominence during the summit, leading to their decision to skip the inau-

Despite their absence, the Congress party is likely to remain focused on ensuring that Karnataka continues to foster its investment-friendly environment, even as the party leaders prioritize their responsibilities in Parliament.

Count Your MLAs: Mann Hits Back At Congress Over AAP Punjab Legislators Exodus Claim

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Chief Minister of Delhi. Ahead of its election victory in Delhi, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) unveiled a series of ambitious promises, ranging from welfare schemes to tackling corruption. With a focus on delivering benefits to women, senior citizens, and the underprivileged, the BJP's manifesto emphasizes a commitment to improving the lives of Delhi's residents through various social and financial aid programs.

The BJP has vowed to continue existing welfare schemes while making them more effective by eliminating corruption. After the Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) victory in the recent Delhi Assembly elections, there has been significant speculation about who will be appointed as the Chief Minister. While the party has yet to announce the CM candidate, newly elected BJP MLA Arvinder Singh Lovely weighed in with his thoughts. He stated that the final decision on the CM post will be made by the party's top leadership, emphasizing that Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership will play a key role in the selection process.

Lovely also shared the BJP's priorities for Delhi, stating that the cleaning of the Yamuna River would be a top guarantee for the party. In the midst of this speculation, sources indicate that BJP leader Entrance Verma could be a strong contender for the CM post. Verma, who defeated AAP's national convenor and former Delhi CM Arvind Kejriwal in the New Delhi seat, has reportedly garnered support from both the BJP and RSS.

The BJP's success in this election is significant, as the party won 48 out of the 70 seats, securing almost twothirds of Delhi's legislative assembly. In contrast, AAP, which had dominated the city for the past several years, won only 22 seats, a stark drop from their commanding victories in the 2015 and 2020 elections.

FIR Filed Against AAP MLA Amanatullah Khan for Obstructing Police, Aiding Fleeing Criminal

Delhi Police filed an FIR on Mon-

day against Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) MLA Amanatullah Khan for allegedly obstructing police work, aiding a proclaimed offender's escape, and assaulting a police team in Jamia Nagar, southeast Delhi.

A senior police officer stated that while questioning Shahbaz, a group of men intervened, questioning the police and forcibly pulling Shahbaz away. J&K Legislative Assembly Holds First Full Session After Seven Years

The Jammu and Kashmir Legislative Assembly has convened its first full session after a seven-year hiatus, with a significant turnout from the 90 Members of Legislative Assembly (MLAs). A total of 82 MLAs have submitted nearly 800 questions and 80 private members' bills, demonstrating active participation and a strong desire to address critical issues.

This session marks a significant shift in the legislative process, as the introduction of bills is now subject to approval by the Law Department— a procedural change brought about following the bifurcation of Jammu and Kashmir into two Union Territories (UTs) in 2019. Previously, such a requirement did not exist when the region functioned as a state.

The decision to hold a comprehensive session is seen as a much-needed platform for MLAs to introduce reforms, engage with the concerns of their constituencies, and address pressing issues. As part of the session, the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly had instructed each MLA to submit 20 questions—10 in starred and 10 in unstarred categories—along with three private member's bills by February 10. Notably, all eligible legislators have complied with this requirement, reflecting a commitment to active participation and governance. However, since the reorganization of Jammu and Kashmir in 2019, there have been changes in the scope of legislative discussions. MLAs are no longer permitted to raise questions about the Police Department, anti-militancy operations, law and order, or All India Services, as these fall under the jurisdiction of the central government.

Prayagraj Declared 'No Vehicle Zone' Ahead Of 'Maghi Purnima Bath' At Kumbh

The Prayagraj administration has put in place a comprehensive traffic plan for Maghi Purnima on Wednesday, marking the end of the Kalpvas period during the Maha Kumbh. The special measures aim to manage the large influx of devotees expected to take a dip at the Sangam, ensuring their safety and the smooth flow of traffic.

The fair area will be designated as a 'no vehicle zone' starting from 4 am on Tuesday. The restriction will extend to the entire city from 5 pm onwards, with exceptions made for emergency and essential services. The move is intended to prevent congestion and ensure safe access for the devotees, with authorities expecting more than 10 lakh people to participate in the bathing ritual.

To avoid traffic jams, the administra-

tion has marked designated parking areas for both public and private vehicles, making it easier for devotees to reach the bathing ghats on foot. Additionally, a special traffic plan will remain in effect until the conclusion of the bathing ritual to facilitate the safe evacuation of devotees in case of any emergency.

Kalpvas, an important tradition during the Maha Kumbh, involves devotees living near the sacred river for a set period of time, focusing on fasting, self-discipline, and spiritual purification. The administration has urged all Kalpvasis to follow the rules and park their vehicles in the authorized lots.

In light of the large crowds, the administration has also decided to shift secondary schools in Prayagraj to online classes from February 7 to February 12, ensuring the safety and convenience of students. On Monday, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath reviewed the arrangements, emphasizing the importance of effective crowd and traffic management.

With the influx of devotees expected to continue, the Chief Minister directed officials to take strict action against the spread of false information, urging them to ensure accurate communication with the public to prevent confusion or panic during the event.

INDIA bloc still strong but internal discussion required: Kapil Sibal

In light of ongoing tensions, particularly in West Bengal, where Mamata Banerjee's Trinamool Congress (TMC) is reportedly considering contesting the next elections independently, Sibal refrained from making direct comments. "I have no comments on that. These are mature and responsible leaders who will sit together and decide the way forward," he remarked, emphasizing the autonomy of the leaders involved in such decisions.

The INDIA bloc is currently facing significant challenges, with Mamata Banerjee blaming the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and Congress for the opposition's failure in the recent Delhi and Haryana Assembly elections. Banerjee has also ruled out any potential alliance with Congress for the 2026 West Bengal polls. Despite these hurdles, Sibal remains confident that the alliance will continue to move forward, albeit with necessary internal discussions.


Welcome to Paris, my friend: Emmanuel Macron welcomes PM Modi ahead of Al Summit

Ukraine May Be Russian Someday: Trump Ahead Of Zelensky-Vance Meeting

US President Donald Trump has sparked controversy by suggesting that Ukraine "may be Russian someday," signaling a potential shift in American policy toward Moscow. His remarks came just days before his vice president, JD Vance, was scheduled to meet with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy. The comments also come nearly three years after Russia's invasion of Ukraine, as Russian forces continue to make steady progress on the battlefield, while Kyiv struggles with shortages of soldiers and weapons.

In an interview with Fox News, Trump discussed the ongoing conflict, saying, "They (Ukraine) may make a deal. They may not make a deal. They may be Russian someday, or they may not be Russian someday." Trump also expressed a desire for the US to secure a return on the financial aid sent to Ukraine, suggesting the possibility of brokering a trade deal for Ukraine's natural resources, such as rare earth minerals. He claimed that Ukraine had essentially agreed to provide the US with \$500 billion worth of these resources.

Ukrainian officials have previously shown interest in partnering with the US and oth-



for security guarantees, though no specifics have been disclosed regarding such an arrangement. Meanwhile, Zelenskyv has insisted on tough security guarantees from the West, fearing that any agreement without military commitments—such as NATO membership or peacekeeping forces would allow Russia to regroup for another

As part of his efforts to end the war, Trump

Keith Kellogg, to Ukraine on February 20, just days before the third anniversary of Russia's invasion. Kellogg is tasked with drafting a proposal to halt the conflict, though Trump has not yet outlined a clear strategy to bring both sides to the negotiating table. Despite his push for peace, both Zelenskyy and Russian President Vladimir Putin have previously ruled out direct negotiations, with significant barriers remaining between the two sides.

Pakistan: Imran Khan requests court to conduct open hearing of his cases

Former Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan has formally requested that his legal cases be heard in an open court, filing a petition with the Islamabad High Court. In the petition, Khan claimed that several "false" cases had been filed against him and that his trial was being conducted in a "controlled" environment at Adiala Jail. He argues that the trial in prison violated both legal procedures and the Constitution of Pakistan.

Since his arrest in 2023, Imran Khan, the founder of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), has not been presented in an open court. His trials have instead been conducted in makeshift courts set up within the jail. The petition high-

lights concerns about the lack of transparency in the proceedings, with Khan's legal team facing harassment and restricted access. It also states that the jail administration has not allowed international media to cover the trial, with only a few selected reporters permitted to attend. Additionally, the media was instructed not to use Khan's



name but to refer to him only as the "PTI munication from Khan. founder."

In the petition, Khan's legal team urged the Islamabad High Court to issue an order for an open trial to ensure fairness and transparency, as guaranteed under Pakistan's Constitution. Khan's legal representatives

argued that conducting the trial in such a restricted manner violated his fundamental rights, including the right to a fair trial and the right to public and media scrutiny of legal proceedings.

Meanwhile, Imran Khan's sister, Aleema Khan, revealed that her brother would write a third letter to Pakistan's Chief of Army Staff, General Asim Munir, next week. This follows two previous letters that Khan had sent to General Munir, which were shared with the media. The military establishment, however, has denied receiving any com-

Imran Khan's petition and his ongoing attempts to secure a fair trial have sparked widespread attention in Pakistan, raising concerns about the integrity of his legal proceedings and the state of justice in the



Bangladesh govt aims to hold polls by December: **Ex-PM Khaleda Zia**

Bangladesh is working towards holding its general elections by December, according to the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) following a meeting with Muhammad Yunus, the chief adviser to the interim government. Yunus, the Nobel Peace laureate, has been leading the caretaker government since August, when mass protests forced then-Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to resign and seek refuge in neighboring India.

The BNP, led by former Prime Minister Khaleda Zia, and Hasina's Awami League have alternated in power for most of the past three decades, marking a longstanding rivalry between the two political parties. Despite the ongoing political turbulence, there is growing anticipation for the upcoming elections as both major parties prepare for what could be a contentious battle for power.

In a statement following the meeting, a BNP official revealed that the party had once again pressed Yunus on the timeline for the elections. Yunus reassured them that efforts were underway to ensure the elections are held by December. The caretaker government, which is tasked with overseeing the election process, has been working to stabilize the country and maintain order during this transitional period.

The announcement comes amid increasing pressure from the political opposition to ensure free and fair elections, with the BNP seeking guarantees from the interim government. The opposition party has expressed concerns over the potential for election manipulation under Hasina's rule and is pushing for reforms to ensure the integrity of the election process.

As Bangladesh heads towards the critical December deadline, the country is bracing for heightened political activity, with both the Awami League and BNP gearing up for what promises to be a high-stakes election.



Be Psychologically Prepared For Terror Attack: Singapore **Minister Warns People**

Singapore's Law and Home Affairs Minister, K Shanmugam, issued a stark warning on Tuesday, urging the public to mentally prepare for a possible terror incident, as the city-state has seen a rise in radicalized individuals. The minister highlighted recent cases where a teenager, a housewife, and a cleaner were detained under the Internal Security Act (ISA) for their extremist plans.


Speaking at the Sri Thendayuthapani Temple during the Thaipusam 2025 celebrations, Shanmugam referenced a disturbing case involving an 18-year-old student who had been arrested for promoting far-right extremist ideologies. The student, who had been consuming racist and far-right propaganda, idolized the Australian white supremacist responsible for the 2019 Christchurch mosque attacks. He had plans to attack Muslims at a mosque in Singapore and had even gotten tattoos and T-shirts featuring neo-Nazi and far-right symbols.

The Internal Security Department (ISD) detained the student in December 2024. Additionally, Shanmugam noted that a housewife and a cleaner were also targeted for their support of Islamist militant groups. The housewife, a Singaporean Muslim, had been managing social media groups that supported terrorist organizations. Meanwhile, the Malaysian cleaner was arrested in November 2024 and repatriated to Malaysia.

Shanmugam emphasized that while Singapore's authorities have been proactive in combating radicalization, the increasing number of cases signals that the threat is growing. Relief to Adani? Trump pauses enforcement of foreign bribery law

In a significant move, U.S. President Donald Trump has signed an executive order directing the Department of Justice (DoJ) to pause enforcement of the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act (FCPA), a landmark law dating back to 1977. The FCPA prohibits both American companies and foreign firms from engaging in bribery of foreign government officials in exchange for business advantages. This decision has far-reaching implications, as the FCPA has been a cornerstone in some of the U.S. Department of Justice's most high-profile international corruption cases.

The executive order targets ongoing investigations into the Adani Group, a multinational conglomerate based in India. The FCPA played a crucial role in launching a bribery investigation against Gautam Adani, the group's chairman, and his nephew Sagar Adani. Last year, under the administration of President Joe Biden, the DoJ charged the Adani Group for allegedly paying over USD 250 million (around Rs 2,100 crore) in bribes to Indian offiposedly made to secure favorable terms for solar power ness practices. contracts.

UK Targets Indian Restaurants In Trump-Style Immigration Crackdown

In a move reminiscent of US President Donald Trump's tough immigration policies, the United Kingdom's Labour government has launched a nationwide crackdown on illegal working. Described as a "UK-wide blitz," the operation targeted industries such as Indian restaurants, nail bars, convenience stores, and car washes, where migrant workers are often employed under illegal conditions.

Overseen by British Home Secretary Yvette Cooper, the Home Office reported a record-breaking January, with officials raiding 828 premises – a 48% increase compared to the previous January. Arrests surged to 609, marking a 73% increase from the year before. The crackdown focused heavily on sectors like restaurants, takeaways, cafes, and the food, drink, and tobacco industries. A raid at an Indian restaurant in Humberside, northern England, resulted in

seven arrests and four deten- Amid increasing pressure from scale of the operation.

"The immigration rules must be respected and enforced. For too long, employers have exploited illegal migrants, and too many people have been able to work illegally without consequence," said Cooper. She emphasized that the



crackdown not only aimed to curb illegal working but also to prevent dangerous migration practices, such as crossing the English Channel in small boats. She also warned that the exploitation of vulnerable migrants undermines both the immigration system and the economy.

Bangladesh seeks full power supply restoration from Adani plant

Bangladesh has formally requested Adani Power to fully resume electricity supplies from its 1,600-megawatt plant in India after more than three months of reduced sales. A Bangladesh official confirmed the move, which follows a period of halved supplies due to low winter demand and a series of payment disputes.

The dispute began on October 31 when Adani Power reduced its supply to Bangladesh, citing delayed payments as the country grappled with a foreign exchange shortage. This led to the shutdown of one of the plant's units on November 1, leaving the plant operating at just 42% of its capacity. During this time, Bangladesh's Power Development Board (BPDB) struggled to meet its financial obligations, which led to the reduction in electricity supply.

In response, the BPDB stated that it had been paying approximately Rs 738 crore (\$85 million) per month to Adani Power to clear its outstanding dues. The Bangladeshi authorities have now asked the company to resume supply from the plant's second unit, as the financial situation has improved. "Right now, we are making a payment of Rs 738 crore (\$85 million) per month. We are trying to pay more, and our intention is to reduce the overdue. Now there is no big issue with Adani," said an official from the BPDB.

Paris Al Action Summit 2025: From Data to Development

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is rapidly reshaping societies around the globe, but its transformative potential remains inaccessible to many, particularly in developing nations. While wealthy countries harness vast datasets to spur technological progress, many others grapple with fragmented, unreliable, or inaccessible data. Without equitable access to high-quality, local data, the benefits of AI for development remain largely untapped. This is not just a technological issue but a critical development challenge.

The Paris AI Action Summit, held with the aim of supporting AI development in the interests of all, including developing countries, represents a step toward addressing this gap. One of the key discussions at the summit will focus on ensuring that AI innovations are accessible to all, with a particular focus on democratizing access to data.

Data is the backbone of AI development, and its importance cannot be overstated. Data-driven solutions have the potential to address complex societal challenges. For example, the Bermuda Principle's data-sharing arrangements in the 1990s, as part of the American Human Genome Project, revolutionized vaccine development. In a similar vein, the rapid creation of COVID-19 vaccines was facilitated by transparent and real-time data sharing. Locally accessible, contextually relevant data can drastically improve living standards, as seen in London's Transport for London (TfL) system, where making non-public data publicly available fostered the creation of over 600 services benefiting millions of residents.

However, in developing countries, barriers like limited computing infrastructure, lack of skilled talent, and inadequate funding prevent AI from reaching



its full potential. A critical issue is the lack of usable, local data for AI development. This challenge is compounded by underdeveloped data governance frameworks, which hinder the creation of policies that protect citizens' data while fostering innovation. These nations must balance the desire to participate in global AI development with the need to maintain control over their data resources and ensure digital sovereignty.

International dialogues such as the Paris AI Action Summit are vital to overcoming these barriers. With non-standardized systems for cross-border data sharing, countries are often isolated in their AI efforts, limiting collaborative opportunities. Developing regions still struggle to access quality datasets suited to their local needs, which exacerbates global in-

equalities in AI.

India's approach to leveraging technology for development offers valuable insights for other emerging economies. With initiatives like the Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI), India has made significant strides in financial inclusion and technology-driven growth. Prime Minister Modi's participation in the Paris AI Summit could steer global discussions toward inclusive and equitable AI-driven progress.

The Paris AI Action Summit 2025 presents an opportunity to cast AI as a tool for equitable, inclusive, and effective global development. By prioritizing collaborative policies and data democratization, the summit can help bridge the AI divide, ensuring that no region is left behind in the race for AI innovation.

How To Reproduce With Two Fathers - And No Biological Mother

In March 2023, Japanese researcher Katsuhiko Hayashi made a groundbreaking announcement at the Third International Summit on Human Genome Editing. Hayashi revealed that he had successfully reproduced mice using two male parents. This achievement was the result of his development of a complex method that transformed male pluripotent stem cells into female-like stem cells, enabling the production of eggs from male cells. His work was published in *Nature*, marking a significant milestone in genetic research.

Almost two years later, a team of Chinese researchers led by Zhi-kun Li, Wei Li, and Qi Zhou of the Chinese Academy of Sciences built upon Hayashi's findings, but with a unique twist. Their procedure also produced a baby mouse from two males, but it eliminated the need for maternal biological involvement beyond gestation. Their work, published in *Cell Stem Cell*, has once again shaken the



field of genetics

The new procedure focuses on overcoming genetic imprinting, a mammalian control system that prevents the combination of two same-sex gametes (sperm or eggs) from resulting in a viable em-

bryo. In mammals, embryos must derive genetic material from both a male and a female to survive, as certain genes are only expressed when inherited from a specific parent. The Chinese team used CRISPR gene-editing tools to deactivate this imprinting barrier, allowing sperm cells to behave like egg cells, making it possible to combine two sperm to create a viable embryo. This embryo was then gestated by a female mouse, and the resulting mice were derived entirely from two male parents.

However, there are still significant challenges with this method. The mice produced through this process are infertile and can only reproduce via cloning. Furthermore, over half of the mice born to two fathers either fail to survive, die prematurely, or do not mature properly. Previous research from this team showed that mice born from two mothers had a higher survival rate, which suggests that the process is far from perfected.



Can Gautam Gambhir Silence His Critics as India's Head Coach?

Being the head coach of the Indian cricket team is no easy feat. The immense pressure to deliver results, especially in the face of fierce scrutiny, makes the role incredibly challenging. Gautam Gambhir, a veteran with a rich cricketing legacy, is now in that hot seat. Having played a key role in India's World Cup victories and led the Kolkata Knight Riders to three IPL titles, Gambhir took over the reins as head coach with high expectations. However, his journey has been anything but smooth.

Gambhir's appointment as India's head coach was met with skepticism. Critics questioned his lack of coaching experience, drawing a sharp distinction between mentoring an IPL team and managing an international squad. The pressure grew when India faced disappointing defeats, including a historic loss to Sri Lanka in a bilateral ODI series and a whitewash in a home Test series. The critics were quick to blame Gambhir, doubting whether he was the right man for the job.

However, it's essential to understand that coaching an international team involves a different set of challenges than playing for one. A top-level athlete's individual approach to the game, honed over years, doesn't change overnight just because they transition to a coaching role. Gambhir, known for his no-nonsense attitude as a player, has carried this persona into his coaching role. While it has ruffled some feathers, it's this very tenacity that has allowed him to handle the pressure.

Gambhir's tenure has been marked by a rough start. Taking over after the high of India's T20 World Cup victory, he inherited a team with its own set of expectations, following the leadership of Rahul Dravid. His early challenges were inevitable. Critics began to point fingers when results didn't match the standards set by his predecessors. However, it's important to note that Gambhir has had less than seven months to settle into the role, a brief period to adapt to new dynamics and refine his strategies.

Recent successes, like the 4-1 T20 series win against England and a commanding 2-0 lead in the ongoing ODI series, have given Gambhir some breathing room. These victories have quieted critics for now, but the real test lies ahead, with the Champions Trophy looming large.

The ODI format, where India has seen solid results, is of particular importance as the team prepares for the upcoming Champions Trophy. Success in this format has proven vital, with players like Rohit Sharma and Shubman Gill finding form, and Ravindra Jadeja's confidence surging after his stellar domestic performance. Gambhir's emphasis on a high-risk, high-reward approach in T20s seems to be slowly filtering into the ODI setup.

Despite the recent improvements, challenges persist. India's Test team still needs attention, especially with a five-Test series in England later this year. Gambhir will need to work on finding the right balance and ensuring that players like Virat Kohli return to form. The ongoing issue with KL Rahul's form and Jasprit Bumrah's fitness will also need careful consideration.

Ultimately, the only way to silence the critics is through consistent success, particularly in ICC tournaments. If Gambhir can lead India to an ICC title, even the harshest critics will be forced to acknowledge his efforts

India's AI Moment: The Race To Catch Up With China And The US

In 2023, OpenAI's CEO, Sam Altman, made a bold statement, claiming it was "totally hopeless to compete with us on training foundation models" for any small team with just \$10 million. However, just two years later, that assertion has been proven wrong. The rise of China's DeepSeek, which trained an opensource large language model (LLM) for just \$5.6 million, has shattered the notion that only deep-pocketed companies can develop cutting-edge AI models. This breakthrough came despite the U.S.'s stringent restrictions on chip exports, signaling that necessity and innovation can overcome even geopolitical obstacles.

This raises an important question: if China can do it, why can't India?

India's AI Awakening

India, a nation that has long been a sleeping giant in AI, is now starting to awaken. The Indian government has recognized AI's strategic importance and launched the IndiaAI Mission in March 2024, with a budget of Rs 10,371 crore (\$1.2 billion). This initiative, coupled with significant increases in AI funding and the establishment of Centres of Excellence, underscores the government's commitment to AI development. In fact, IT Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw recently announced that the government is collaborating with at least six developers to build India's first indigenous LLM.

However, while financial resources are on the rise, India faces a major challenge: a talent drain.

The Talent Drain and Research Deficit



India has the potential for a thriving AI ecosystem, but much of its talent is working abroad, particularly in Silicon Valley. With India investing just 0.64% of its GDP in research and development (R&D), compared to China's 2.41% and the U.S.'s 3.47%, India lags behind in fostering innovation domestically. This research deficit could hinder India's

ability to keep pace with global AI advancements.

The Role of the Private Sector

India's private sector is stepping up to bridge the gap. Leading conglomerates like Reliance Industries, Adani Group, and Nxtra are investing heavily in AI infrastructure, including supercomputers and data centres. These investments, if executed well, will be critical for India's AI ambitions.

US GPU Restrictions: A Major Hurdle

Despite these advancements, India faces a major challenge: U.S. restrictions on high-end GPUs, essential for training AI models. However, the Indian government is exploring ways to bypass these restrictions by facilitating access to GPUs through partnerships and the

IndiaAl Mission. India's Strategic Leverage

With the geopolitical landscape shifting, India has an opportunity to use its ties with the U.S. to influence key decisions. If India can push for an end to GPU export restrictions and secure a stake in initiatives like the U.S.'s Stargate AI project, it could solidify its position as a global AI leader.



Patanjali Foods See 71% Jump In **Q3 Profit On Cooking Oil Boost**



Indian consumer goods manufacturer Patanjali Foods posted a 71% increase in its third-quarter profit on Monday, bolstered by robust demand for its flagship cooking oils. The maker of Ruchi Gold oil reported a profit of 3.71 billion rupees (\$42.4 million) for the three months ending December 31, up from 2.17 billion rupees in the same period last year.

The demand for edible oils, an essential item in Indian households, has remained strong despite the broader challenges posed by inflation. Consumers, who have been avoiding branded goods due to price hikes, continued to purchase cooking oils, even as manufacturers raised prices to offset the rising

Patanjali's revenue from its edible oils segment, which accounts for almost three-fourths of the company's total revenue, saw a growth of 22.5% during the quarter. This surge helped drive a 15% increase in overall revenue, which reached 91.03 billion rupees.

However, not all of Patanjali Foods' segments performed well. Revenue from its food and fast-moving consumer goods (FMCG) segment dropped 18%, reflecting weaker demand in the category. The company's expenses also rose by 13%, largely due to a hike in import taxes on crude and refined edible oils that came into effect in mid-September. This increase in input costs had a significant impact on the company's profitability.

Auction systems have long been seen as an effective way to determine market-driven prices, and this approach is intended to create a more competitive and equitable environment for all tea produc-

ers, big and small.

The event in Kolkata marked a critical step towards improving collaboration between different sectors of the tea industry. It highlighted the need for collective action to address issues such as price instability and access to markets, while also emphasizing the importance of sustainable practices in ensuring the longterm health of the tea industry in India.

SEBI Bars LS Industries and Promoter for Stock Price Manipulation

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has imposed a ban on LS Industries Ltd., its promoter Profound Finance, and four other entities from participating in the securities market, following an investigation into stock price manipulation. The regulator's attention was drawn by an article published on the NDTV Profit website on February 3, which highlighted the inexplicable valuation of LS Industries at Rs 5,500 crore despite having almost negligible revenue.

SEBI's investigation followed concerns regarding the company's inflated market value, raising questions about the authenticity of the stock's trading activity and the role of various entities involved in the manipulation. The regulator's actions aim to safeguard market integrity and protect investors from potentially harmful practices. The regulatory body's decision has sent a strong message to the market, reinforcing its commitment to ensuring transparency and fairness in trading practices. The case underscores the importance of scrutiny around corporate valuations and the need for regulatory oversight to prevent stock market manipu-

Chelsea Owner Todd Boehly Acquires 49% Stake in Trent Rockets, Beats KKR and Amit Jain

Todd Boehly, co-owner of Chelsea Football Club, has acquired a 49% stake in the English cricket franchise Trent Rockets, beating Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR) and Indian investor Amit Jain in the process. Boehly's real estate firm, Cain International, purchased the stake for approximately 39 million British Pounds (around Rs 420 crore), valuing the franchise at GBP 79 million. KKR, owned by Shah Rukh Khan's Red Chillies Entertainment, had been in the running to acquire the team, which would have expanded their global reach, already spanning Trinbago Knight Riders, LA Knight Riders, and Abu Dhabi Knight Riders.

Boehly's acquisition further strengthens his sports portfolio, which includes ownership of Chelsea, French side RC Strasbourg, and MLB's Los Angeles Dodgers. The Trent Rockets, based in Nottingham, represent the counties of Nottinghamshire, Derbyshire, and Leicestershire and won The Hundred tournament in 2022.

Pankaj Advani Wins Indian Snooker Championship, Secures 36th National Gold

Pankaj Advani, India's most decorated snooker player, clinched his 36th overall national title and 10th men's snooker crown at the Yashwant Club. Advani demonstrated exceptional skill and determination throughout the tournament, overcoming an early setback to defeat Brijesh Damani in the final. Damani claimed the opening frame, but Advani bounced back to win the remaining frames, including a standout 84 break in the final frame to seal the championship.

The tournament, which serves as the selection event for the Asian and World Championships, proved to be a turning point for Advani. After suffering a loss to Damani in the group stage, Advani's resilience was on full



display as he made a stunning comeback in the round of 48, saving his tournament bid and setting the stage for his eventual victory. Advani now prepares for the Asian Snooker Championship starting February 15.

India to Play International Football Matches in Shillong Ahead of AFC Asian Cup Qualifiers

The All India Football Federation (AIFF) has announced that India will play two international matches in Shillong's Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium during the FIFA international window in March. This will be the first time the stadium hosts senior men's international matches since its refurbishment last year.

India will face Maldives in a friendly on March 19, as part of their preparation for the AFC Asian Cup 2027 Qualifiers Final Round. The second



match will be against Bangladesh on March 25, marking India's first game in

the AFC Asian Cup 2027 Qualifiers.

The 15,100-seat stadium, which has hosted several domestic events like the Durand Cup and Indian Super League matches, is now set to stage international fixtures. India is placed in Group C for the AFC Asian Cup 2027 Qualifiers, alongside Hong Kong, Singapore, and Bangladesh.

India Chess Star Arjun Erigaisi Criticizes Ministry's **Decision to Stop Cash Rewards for Grandmasters**



Indian Grandmaster Arjun Erigaisi has slammed the Indian sports ministry's recent decision to end cash rewards for players achieving Grandmaster (GM) and International Master (IM) titles, a move that has sparked controversy within the chess community. Previously, players received Rs 4 lakh for a GM title and Rs 1.5 lakh for an IM or International Women Master (IWM) title. The ministry now offers rewards only for winning world-level competitions.

Erigaisi, who recently achieved a 2800 ELO rating and won the men's Olympiad gold in 2024, expressed that the removal of these rewards would demotivate parents, who often face financial strain supporting their children's chess careers. "Such incentives encouraged parents to back their children's pursuits in chess," he said.

While Erigaisi remains focused on his chess ambitions, including qualifying for the Candidates tournament, he acknowledged that the change could affect young players' mo-

Pakistan Finalize 15-Man Squad for Champions Trophy 2025, Haris Rauf Cleared for Fitness

Pakistan has confirmed its 15-man squad for the 2025 Champions Trophy, making no last-minute changes despite widespread criticism. The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) reviewed the selection after concerns about the inclusion of batter Khushdil Shah and all-rounder Faheem Ashraf. However, there will be no alterations, and the same players will represent Pakistan in the tournament.

The squad faced scrutiny for having only one specialist opener and a lone specialist spinner, Abrar Ahmed. However, captain Muhammad Rizwan defended the team, stating the emphasis would be on pace bowlers. Haris Rauf, who suffered a muscle injury in the tri-series, is expected to recover in time for the Champions Trophy opener on Feb-

Ronaldo, who turned 40 last week, joined Al Nassr in January 2023 and has scored 82 goals in 90 appearances since. In August, Ronaldo had expressed his intention to likely end his career with Al Nassr, where he feels happy and comfortable. Despite joining for a high-paying deal that initially raised eyebrows, Ronaldo's influence has helped attract other aging stars to the Saudi Pro League. Though he has not won a major trophy with Al Nassr yet, his performances continue to push him toward the milestone of 1,000 career goals.

When It Rained Meat: The Bizarre **Kentucky Meat Shower Of 1876**



Tmagine taking a peaceful **I**stroll one morning, only for chunks of meat to suddenly rain down from the sky. This bizarre occurrence took place on March 3, 1876, in Bath County, Kentucky, leaving residents utterly confused and intrigued. Known as the Kentucky Meat Shower, this strange phenomenon has puzzled historians and scientists for generations, sparking numerous theories about its origins.

The event unfolded between 11 am and afternoon when local resident Mary Crouch was outside making soap near Olympia Springs. She was stunned to witness what can only be described as a "meat storm," with pieces of meat falling over an area roughly 100 by 50 yards.
