Focus on strengthening cooperation and coordinated management

bi-annual Director General The (DG)-level border talks between India and Bangladesh commenced in Delhi on Tuesday, with the Border Security Force (BSF) planning to address several critical issues concerning the India-Bangladesh border. Key issues on the agenda include obstructions in fencing work, along with attacks on BSF personnel and Indian civilians by Bangladeshi miscreants.

This is the first high-level meeting between the BSF and Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) after the fall of Sheikh Hasina's government in August 2024. The 55th Director General-level Border Coordination Conference is being held at the BSF headquarters in Lodhi Road, New Delhi, following a ceremonial guard of honour and welcome extend-

The Bangladeshi delegation arrived in India on Monday, where they were received by BSF Director General Daljit Singh Chawdhary at the IGI Airport.

The talks will focus on preventing attacks by Bangladesh-based miscreants, addressing trans-border crimes, and resolving concerns regarding the construction of a single-row fence along the border. The last round of these bi-annual talks took place in Dhaka in March 2024, and this meeting marks a significant step toward reinforcing cross-border security and cooperation between the two neighboring nations.

BJP To Launch Campaign On 3-Language Policy From March 1 In Tamil Nadu

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in Tamil Nadu has launched a door-to-door campaign in support of the Centre's proposed three-language policy, reigniting the ongoing debate over language in the state. The campaign aims to garner public support for the policy, which has sparked significant opposition from the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) party.

The BJP has strongly criticized the DMK for its resistance to the three-language policy, asserting that the opposition is a violation of



the Constitutional principles laid down by Dr. B.R. Ambedkar. According to the BJP, the policy aligns with the foundational values of the Indian Constitution, which promotes national integration while respecting regional languages and diversity.



Odisha Govt Orders Probe into Police Brutality at **KIIT University**

The Odisha government has launched a high-level fact-finding committee to investigate allegations of police brutality against Nepali students protesting the suicide of their colleague at the Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT) University in Bhubaneswar. The incident has triggered protests



On Sunday, Prakristi Lamsal, a thirdyear engineering student at KIIT, was found dead in her hostel room. The university confirmed her death as a suicide, citing suspicions that it may have been linked to a love affair with another student. Following her death, several Nepali students at the university staged protests, demanding justice and answers.

However, the protests took a violent turn when security personnel at the university reportedly used force against the demonstrators. The situation worsened further when Nepal's Prime Minister, KP Sharma Oli, intervened, expressing concern over the treatment of the students. In response, Nepal dispatched two embassy officials from New Delhi to Odisha to address the matter.

The Odisha government swiftly reacted by ordering a thorough investigation



into the allegations of police brutality. The state administration also took immediate action by arresting security guards allegedly involved in beating the students during the protest. Several officials responsible for the misconduct have been suspended pending further inquiry.

An official statement from the Odisha government confirmed that the institution had been placed under notice, and legal and administrative action would follow based on the findings of the fact-finding committee. The statement also emphasized that any individuals found guilty of using excessive force against the students would be held accountable according to the law.

The investigation is set to examine not only the actions of the university's security staff but also the broader context of how the protests were handled by the authorities. The case has drawn significant attention both in India and Nepal, with calls for justice growing louder from both governments.

Prosecution Seeks Death Penalty for Sajjan Kumar in 1984 Anti-Sikh Riots Case


The prosecution in the 1984 anti-Sikh riots case has called for the death penalty for former Congress MP Sajjan Kumar, who was convicted for the brutal killings of a father-son duo in Delhi's Saraswati Vihar area. The two victims, Jaswant

Singh and Tarundeep Singh, were murdered on November 1, 1984, during the horrific riots that targeted the Sikh community.

On February 17, Additional Public Prosecutor (APP) Manish Rawat filed written submissions urging the court to impose the death penalty, citing guidelines from the Nirbhaya case and other similar cases. The special court, led by

Judge Kaveri Baweja, has scheduled further hearings on February 21 to deliberate on the sentencing. Both the defense and victims' counsel have been asked to file their written arguments before the next hearing.

Senior advocate H.S. Phoolka, representing the victims, plans to submit his arguments, emphasizing the severity of the crimes and the long-delayed justice. Meanwhile, the defense counsel, unable to attend due to a lawyers' strike. requested more time to present their case.

In February, Kumar was convicted in connection with the killings of the father-son pair. He is currently serving a life sentence for his involvement in another 1984 anti-Sikh riots case in Delhi Cantonment. Defense attorney Anil Sharma had argued that Kumar's name was not included initially and raised concerns

about delays in identifying him. He also pointed out that Kumar's earlier conviction in a similar case is under appeal at the Supreme Court.

H.S. Phoolka argued that police investigations in riot cases were deliberately slow to protect the accused, emphasizing that this case was part of a larger pattern of violence and genocide, with over 2,700 Sikhs killed in Delhi alone. The defense contended that international law should not influence the proceedings, but Phoolka stressed the

Manipur Crisis Driven By Demand for Separate Administration, Meitei Group Tells Governor

The Coordinating Committee on Manipur Integrity (COCOMI), a key umbrella organization representing the Meitei community in Manipur, has urged Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla to take steps towards restoring an elected government in the state within a month. This request follows the imposition of President's Rule on February 13, after the resignation of Chief Minister N Biren Singh, amid ongoing violence in the region.

A delegation from COCOMI met with Governor Bhalla at the Raj Bhavan in Imphal, where they submitted a 13-point memorandum outlining measures that the Governor could take to address the crisis and bring peace to the state. According to the memorandum, COCOMI believes that the ongoing law and order situation in Manipur has been exacerbated by groups pursuing the demand for a separate administration, with no clear agenda for peaceful resolution from the Meitei community.

One of the key points raised in the memorandum was the need for a comprehensive initiative to identify, dismantle, and evict illegal



villages that have reportedly sprung up across the state. COCOMI emphasized that these unauthorized settlements pose a threat to both the demographic balance and the environmental integrity of Manipur.

Furthermore, COCOMI called for an end to violent activities and the unauthorized movements of armed groups. They emphasized the importance of halting all such actions to restore peace and stability in the state. The group also requested that measures be implemented to ensure security for all affected villages, along with providing amnesty to civilian village defense forces, who are under threat due to the ongoing violence.

Dirt On Mind: Supreme Court Relief, **Scathing Rebuke For Ranveer Allahbadia**

The Supreme Court on Tuesday expressed strong disapproval of social media influencer Ranveer Allahbadia's "obscene" comments made during a recent episode of the YouTube show *India's Got Latent*. Allahbadia had been under scrutiny following his remarks, which were widely criticized for being inappropriate and offensive. The court's remarks came during the hearing of Allahbadia's plea to club multiple FIRs filed against him over the controversial statements.

While hearing his request for relief, the bench questioned Allahbadia's conduct, with one of the judges remarking, "If this is not obscenity, what is it? Why should we quash or club FIRs against you?" This comment highlighted the seriousness with which the court viewed the nature of the remarks made by Allahbadia on the show.

Despite the harsh criticism, the Supreme Court granted interim relief from arrest to the social media influencer while the legal proceedings continued. The court's decision allowed Allahbadia some temporary respite, but it also set a tone of disapproval regarding his actions.

The case revolves around remarks made during an episode of *India's Got Latent*, which airs on Allahbadia's YouTube channel. The comments were deemed offensive by many viewers, leading to several FIRs being filed against him in different parts of India.

The Supreme Court's remarks are a part of a broader conversation on accountability and responsibility for social media influencers, especially in relation to their impact on public discourse and social values. The case continues to unfold, with Allahbadia now awaiting further legal proceedings and potentially facing consequences for his actions.

The bench, led by Chief Justice Sheel Nagu and Justice Harmeet Singh Grewal, issued the directive while resolving the petition filed by advocate Kanwar Pahul Singh on February 17.

The petitioner, Singh, called for the establishment of "emigration check posts" and an updated list of "certified recruiting agents" to curb

Ensure Terror Provisions In New Laws Are Not Misused: Amit Shah Tells J&K Admin

This meeting and Shah's directive reflect the government's focus on ensuring the fair implementation of the updated legal provisions while safeguarding against potential misuse, particularly in sensitive regions like Jammu and Kashmir. The review also aimed at assessing the effectiveness of these new laws in maintaining law and order while balancing the protection of citizens' rights.

Disrespectful for PM, HM to have made midnight decision to appoint new CEC: Rahul Gandhi

TPN Correspondent| Delhi Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Tuesday condemned the government's late-night decision to appoint Gyanesh Kumar as the new Chief Election Commissioner (CEC), calling it "disrespectful" and "discourteous" while the selection process is under Supreme Court scrutiny. The appointment was finalized on Monday night, just hours after the Prime Minister-led selection committee's meeting, despite objections from Gandhi.

As a member of the three-person selection panel, alongside Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah, Gandhi had urged the government to postpone the meeting until the Supreme Court hearing on February 19, 2025. He submitted a dissent note, stating that proceeding with the appointment while the matter is being legally contested undermines democratic institutions and the spirit of India's Constitution.

Gandhi cited a March 2, 2023, Supreme Court ruling that mandated the inclusion of the Chief Justice of India (CJI) in the CEC selection panel, along with the Prime Minister and Leader of Opposition (LoP). However, the government later passed a law in August 2023, excluding the CJI and replacing them with a Union cabinet

minister, effectively reversing the court's directive. Gandhi argued that this legislative change weakened electoral integrity and reflected growing public distrust in India's election process.

BJP puts off meet to pick Delhi CM, AAP smells 'internal strife: Atishi

The BJP has once again postponed its legislature party meeting to select a new Delhi Chief Minister, rescheduling it for Wednesday. However, the party has yet to appoint observers to facilitate discussions with its newly-elected MLAs, raising concerns about the delay in forming the government.



As the decision is postponed, the BJP has begun preparing for an elaborate swearing-in ceremony at the Ram Lila Ground, which is expected to be attended by the party's top leadership. Despite this, the repeated delays in finalizing a Chief Minister have sparked criticism from opposition parties, who accuse the BJP of being unable to swiftly form a government.

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has been particularly vocal in its criticism, claiming the BJP is embroiled in an internal conflict. A senior AAP leader questioned why the people of Delhi should suffer due to the BJP's internal issues, arguing that the party's groupism has Minister Narendra Modi was already begun to show. "If they are taking 10 days just to decide on a Chief Minister and cabinet, one can only imagine how long they will take to make decisions for the welfare of Delhi's people," the leader said.

Outgoing Chief Minister Atishi also condemned the BJP for failing to announce a Chief Minister even 10 days after the election results were declared. She suggested that Prime

aware that BJP MLAs lacked the necessary skills to govern effectively, which might be contributing to the delay.

The ongoing delay has led to growing concerns about the BJP's ability to expedite the formation of a new government in the national capital, as opposition parties continue to question the party's internal struggles and decision-making process.

BJP MLAs in West Bengal staged a protest on Tuesday, accusing Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee of being anti-Hindu over her controversial remarks about the ongoing Maha Kumbh Mela. The protest followed Banerjee's comments in the West Bengal Legislative Assembly, where she criticized the Uttar Pradesh government for its handling of the mega religious event in Prayagraj.

Banerjee referred to the gathering as a "Mrityu Kumbh" (Death Kumbh), claiming that the Uttar Pradesh government had mishandled the event, offering VIPs special treatment while failing to make proper arrange-

ments for the poor. She emphasized the lack criticism from the BJP, led by Opposition of adequate facilities for the common people, even though the event is a significant demned the remarks, accusing Banerjee of religious occasion for millions of Hindus.

In his address, Stiell emphasized that countries leading the charge in renewable energy stand to benefit economically, and India is already on a path to reap those rewards. The country's proactive approach to energy access, particularly its success in electrifying every village ahead of schedule, has further strengthened its position as a global leader in sustainable development.

However, Stiell urged India to take the next step by strengthening its climate plan, suggesting a focus on expanding growth in sectors like wind and solar energy, living standards, and job creation. He noted that this approach would supercharge India's economic growth while simultaneously addressing climate change.

Acknowledging the global clean energy race, Stiell also pointed out that nations must adopt an integrated approach, involving governments, businesses, and societies, to ensure effective research, investment, and training for a cleaner future. He reminded richer nations of their responsibility to provide adequate climate finance to support developing countries in their climate actions.

The UN Climate Chief also recognized India's leadership in promoting the "Lifestyle for Environment" (LiFE) initiative, which encourages individuals and communities to take action to protect the environment. Stiell concluded by highlighting that the global clean energy revolution is unstoppable and that India is well-positioned to lead in this transformative movement.

The Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) has once again extended the would be available from deadline for candidates to apply for the Civil Services 28, allowing candidates Preliminary Examination 2025. The new deadline is set for February 21, 2025, at 6 PM. This marks the second time the application deadline has been extended for this year's examination.

The Civil Services Examination, one of the most competitive exams in India, is conducted annually in three stages: the ed for the extension, but preliminary examination, the mains, and the interview. It selects candidates for various prestigious positions, including officers for the Indian Administrative Service (IAS), Indian Police Service (IPS), and Indian Foreign Service (IFS), among others.

The notice issued by UPSC confirmed the extended deadline and also mentioned that a correction window for applicants February 22 to February to make any necessary changes to their applications.

The second extension follows complaints from aspirants about technical issues with the online application system, which the Commission has acknowledged and worked to address. No specific reasons have been providit offers a further opportunity for candidates to complete or correct their applications.

Recklessly Driven Audi Rams Into Scooter In Delhi, BBA Student Arrested

The Delhi High Court has sought responses from the Centre, Delhi Police, and other concerned authorities regarding a plea that calls for the creation of guidelines for testing both the accused and minor survivors in sexual offences for sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) and sexually transmitted infections (STIs).

A bench consisting of Chief Justice D.K. Upadhyaya and Justice Tushar Rao Gedela issued notices to the Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, the Delhi government, Delhi Police, and the Delhi Commission for Protection of Child Rights. The court directed the concerned parties to submit their responses by the next hearing scheduled for March 28.

The petitioners, including Aishwarya Sinha, who filed the plea, are seeking the formulation and implementation of a set of guidelines that would clarify the roles of various stakeholders in the process. These stakeholders include the investigating officers,

hospitals, and child welfare committees, among others. The guidelines would ensure that both the child survivors and the accused in sexual offence cases undergo testing for STDs and STIs in a timely manner.

According to the petitioners, such guidelines would provide a strong legal framework that prioritizes the health and rights of child survivors of sexual violence. It aims to ensure that these survivors receive prompt medical attention to prevent any long-term health complications from possible exposure to STDs or STIs. The petition emphasizes that clear protocols would also assist in maintaining accountability in the handling of sensitive cases involving minors, further protecting their well-being.

The plea has highlighted the need for clarity and prompt action in addressing the health concerns of minors who may have been exposed to sexual violence, calling for a more organized and compassionate approach to handling such cases.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) attributed the weather changes to a western disturbance that has been influencing the region, causing partially cloudy skies. The IMD also forecast isolated drizzles in parts of Delhi for the next few days. The drizzle or very light rain could affect isolated areas of Delhi NCR on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday.

On Monday, the maximum temperature in Delhi reached 29°C, and it is expected to remain between 27°C and 29°C on Tuesday. The minimum temperature on Monday was recorded at 11.2°C.

The air quality in Delhi has been a consistent concern. The Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) categorizes the AQI in different ranges: 0-50 is considered "good," 51-100 is "satisfactory," 101-200 is "moderate," 201-300 is "poor," 301-400 is "very poor," and anything over 400 is considered "severe." With an AQI of 211, Delhi's air quality remains in the "poor" category, which can affect individuals with respiratory conditions and other vulnerable groups.

Morning walkers in areas like Lodhi Garden had to contend with both the cool, gloomy weather and the lingering pollution. As Delhi continues to face these air quality challenges, residents are being advised to take necessary precautions, especially those with pre-existing health issues.

A student was arrested late Monday night after allegedly driving a red Audi convertible recklessly and colliding with a scooter in the upscale Lodhi Road area of South Delhi. The crash, which took place near the Jor Bagh post office, left two men on the scooter injured, one of whom is in critical condition.

According to police officials, the Audi, driven by one of two Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) students, collided with the scooter before smashing into a tree. The two men on the scooter, identified as Naitik and Tushar, were rushed to AIIMS Trauma Centre for medical treatment. While one of the victims is stable, the other remains in critical condition, prompting serious concern.

The authorities registered a case of rash driving and endangering public safety after the driver of the Audi was apprehended at the scene of the incident. Video footage from the scene reveals the extensive damage to the vehicle, with the front of the Audi completely smashed. The hood of the car was severely bent, one of the wheels

was facing sideways, and the car's signature four-circle logo was detached, found near the tree where the vehicle finally stopped. These significant damages suggest that the car was traveling at a high speed when the crash occurred.

Shubham, a relative of Naitik, described the accident and confirmed that Naitik had sustained a leg injury. He mentioned that while the details regarding Tushar's condition were unclear, both the accused individuals had been arrested by the police. The severity of the crash has raised concerns about road safety, particularly regarding reckless driving in the area.

This incident occurred just hours after two other students in Hyderabad were arrested for performing dangerous stunts in a Fortuner and a BMW on a busy road. CCTV footage from the scene showed the Fortuner making donuts in the middle lane of Outer Ring Road, while the BMW performed similar dangerous maneuvers on the side. Both drivers were arrested by the police, drawing attention to the growing issue of reckless driving by young individuals.

High Faecal Bacteria In River Water At Some Locations In Maha Kumbh: Pollution Board

The National Green Tribunal (NGT) on Monday addressed concerns regarding water quality at various locations in Prayagraj during the ongoing Mahakumbh Mela. A report from the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) revealed that the water in the Ganga and Yamuna rivers did not meet the primary bathing water quality standards, particularly with regard to faecal coliform levels.

Faecal coliform, a key indicator of sewage contamination, has a permissible limit of 2,500 units per 100 ml, as per CPCB guidelines. The report highlighted that at multiple monitoring locations during the Mahakumbh, the faecal coliform levels exceeded this threshold, which could pose health risks to the thousands of devotees who bathe in the rivers during the religious event.

charge into the rivers. The CPCB's report dated February 3 noted repeated violations of water quality standards, with high faecal coliform concentrations observed in the river water at different points.

The bench also pointed out that the Ut-

PCB) had failed to comply with an earlier directive to submit a detailed action report on measures taken to improve water quality. Instead, the UPPCB had only submitted a covering letter with some water test results, which still showed concerning levels of faecal and total coliform.

The NGT granted one day for Uttar Pradesh's counsel to review the report and submit a response. The tribunal also directed the Member Secretary of UPPCB and other relevant state authorities to attend the next hearing virtually, scheduled for February 19, 2025. The tribunal emphasized the importance of immediate action to ensure the safety of the river water, especially with large numbers of devotees participating in the ongoing Mahakumbh Mela.

ED Raids Multiple Locations in Kerala Over Rs 1,000 Crore Fake CSR Scam

The Kochi unit of the Enforcement Directorate (ED) conducted raids at 12 locations across Kerala on Tuesday in connection with the Rs 1,000 crore corporate social responsibility (CSR) fund scam. The raids focused on the residence and offices of K.N. Anandakumar, Chairman of the NGO Confederation and a prominent social activist in the state. Anandakumar is accused of receiving Rs 10 lakh per month from Ananthu Krishnan, the 26-year-old mastermind of the scam.

The ED also raided the residence of Laly Vincent, a senior Congress leader and the legal

counsel for Krishnan. The scam, orchestrated by Krishnan, allegedly promised high-value products such as scooters, laptops, and sewing machines at half the market price. Many unsuspecting individuals were convinced by Krishnan's aggressive marketing tactics and invested their savings in what seemed to be an irresistible offer.

The timing of the raids coincided with the lower court's decision to pronounce the verdict on Anandakumar's anticipatory bail plea. Meanwhile, Krishnan, who was arrested last week, is currently in custody after a court in Ernakulam district granted the police two days to question him further. The police have revealed that Krishnan maintained 21 bank accounts, 11 of which saw a total of Rs 548 crore in transactions.

The police also discovered that Krishnan had collected Rs 143.50 crore from around 25,000 victims, promising them discounted two-wheelers. However, the whereabouts of the collected funds remain unclear, and the investigation is still in its early stages. The Crime Branch of Kerala Police is handling the case, which has led to over 500 complaints of cheating. Authorities are continuing to piece together the financial trail in a bid to uncover the full extent of the scam.

India's Paradox: Booming Economy, But Where Are The Jobs?

The real paradox lies not in the absence of jobs but in the lack of skilled professionals who meet industry demands. An alarming 83% of India's unemployed workforce is between 15 and 29 years old, highlighting a mismatch between education and employability. Although India produces 50 lakh graduates annually, nearly half of them are unemployable—not due to lack of knowledge, but because of essential skill deficiencies, including communication, problem-solving, and interpersonal skills.

India, with the world's largest youth pop- This skills gap is further exacerbated by low youth workforce participation, leading to rising frustration among young professionals and deepening economic strain for families that invest heavily in education, only to see their children unable to secure stable jobs. The inability of the job market to absorb this growing unemployable workforce, particularly in fields like research and development, hampers innovation and productivity, which are vital to sustaining India's economic growth.

Efforts like the National Education Policy (NEP) and skill development programs are commendable but haven't fully addressed the skills gap. These initiatives encourage alignment between academia and industry needs, yet many graduates remain unemployable due to deficiencies in real-world skills.

Additionally, rural youth face a further disadvantage, with limited English proficiency hindering their entry into urban job markets, where English fluency is often a requirement for multinational companies. For India to continue its growth trajectory, it must bridge this skills gap to ensure that economic expansion translates into equitable job creation. The solution lies in realigning education with industry needs, fostering lifelong learning, and investing in skills development. If done correctly, India's demographic dividend can become a major economic asset, transforming its youth into a powerhouse of innovation and progress. The time for reform is now.

Trump's Blunt 'No' To Europe Could Change Everything



A new phase in the Ukraine war is unfolding, as the Trump administration seeks to engage Russia without involving Ukraine or Europe. The Saudis are stepping in as mediators, with key figures like US Secretary of State Marco Rubio, Trump's Middle East special envoy Steve Witkoff, and National Security Adviser Mike Waltz playing central roles. This shift marks a dramatic departure from the US's policy of the past three years and leaves Europe scrambling to respond. Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has strongly opposed any deals made without Ukraine's involvement, but the US seems ready to walk away from its commitment to Euro-

pean security. US officials, including Vice-President JD Vance, have emphasized that Europe must take on a greater role in its own defense, with US Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth stating that Ukraine returning to its pre-2014 borders is unrealistic, while also downplaying Ukraine's NATO aspirations.

Beyond Deportation: Joint Efforts a Must to Curb Illegal Immigration

Failure of Planning: Will Vaishnaw Take Blame for Stampede?



The treatment of deportees has been another point of contention, with many arriving in India still shackled despite the country's protests to the US authorities. While these issues cannot be ignored, they should not divert attention from the larger challenge at hand. A key task for both the central and state governments moving forward will be to prevent deported individuals from resorting to similar illegal attempts to migrate again. Equally important is to dissuade potential migrants from taking dangerous and desperate measures in pursuit of the elusive "American dream." To truly curb illegal immigration, it is essential for India to adopt a holistic and collaborative approach. Rather than focusing solely on deportation, efforts must be directed toward addressing the socio-economic factors that drive people to take such drastic steps. Only through coordinated action across all levels of government, along with the involvement of civil society, can India hope to solve this pressing issue and prevent further harm to its citizens.



The tragic stampede at New Delhi station, which claimed 18 lives during the Maha Kumbh Mela rush, was not merely an accident. It was a catastrophic failure of planning, foresight, and accountability by the authorities. As thousands of pilgrims descended on the station to board trains to Prayagraj, the lack of preparation to manage the massive influx of passengers became tragically apparent. The event's scale was not unexpected—such large gatherings have long been part of the Mela, and the resulting strain on railway infrastructure is well-documented. The fact that authorities failed to anticipate and implement proper crowd control measures is a glaring oversight that ultimately led to the deaths of innocent people.

Former Railway Minister Pawan Kumar Bansal was blunt in his assessment of the situation,

asserting that the ultimate responsibility lay with the current Railway Minister, Ashwini Vaishnaw. While the government hastily announced compensation for the victims' families—Rs 10 lakh for each deceased and Rs 2.5 lakh for the seriously injured-ethical concerns arose when reports emerged of cash being distributed at the station. The distribution of money in violation of the 2023 compensation guidelines, which limit cash payouts to Rs 50,000, only served to highlight the government's inability to address systemic issues properly. The optics of handing out large wads of cash amid chaos seemed insensitive and inadequate in the face of such a preventable tragedy. The demand for Vaishnaw's resignation is gaining momentum, especially after the government initially dismissed the stampede as a "rumor." Such deflection of responsibility highlights a deep-

er reluctance to acknowledge the failure in managing the situation. Historically, railway ministers such as Lal Bahadur Shastri and Nitish Kumar demonstrated moral responsibility by resigning following similar disasters. This raises the question: will Vaishnaw follow suit and take accountability for the loss of life under his watch?

While resignations might offer a symbolic gesture of responsibility, what is needed now is not just individual accountability but a comprehensive overhaul of the railway system. Effective crowd management protocols must be instituted, especially during major religious and festival events. It is time to put in place robust systems that prioritize passenger safety, preventing such disasters from occurring in the future. Without this, no amount of compensation will be able to undo the damage done.





India, Qatar Elevate Ties To 'Strategic **Partnership' As Emir Meets PM Modi**

India and Qatar have officially agreed to elevate their bilateral relationship to a strategic partnership, marking a significant milestone in their diplomatic ties. The agreement was finalized following a meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the Emir of Qatar, Sheikh Tamim Bin Hamad Al-Thani, in New Delhi.

The leaders engaged in extensive discussions at Hyderabad House, focusing on key areas such as trade, investment, technology,



energy, food security, culture, and people-to-people exchanges. One of the highlights of the talks was a potential free trade agreement, with both nations aiming to double bilateral trade to \$28 billion over the next five years.

Energy security also featured prominently in the discussions, with both sides exploring ways to broaden their cooperation in this sector. Additionally, the two countries agreed on measures to prevent fiscal evasion and avoid double taxation concerning income taxes. An agreement on this front was also exchanged.

Maharashtra Cabinet Approves Formation Of 6th Finance Commission

In a significant move, the Maharashtra Cabinet has approved the establishment of a Sixth State Finance Commission to assess the financial position of panchayats and municipalities and recommend necessary financial measures. The Cabinet authorized Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis to propose the names of the Chairman and members of the Commission to the state Governor, C.P. Radhakrishnan. Additionally, an officer with at least a Junior Administrative Grade Officer rank will be appointed as the Member Secretary of the Commission.

The Finance Commission will be responsible for reviewing the financial status of local government bodies and recommending the allocation of state revenue from taxes, duties, tolls, and fees among panchayats and municipalities. The Commission will also suggest the principles for the distribution of grants-inaid and measures to improve the financial health of local bodies. The recommendations will be based on the 2011 Census population data to determine the fair share of taxes and subsidies. The Commission's work will be supported by necessary resources, including office space and a dedicated budget for recurring and non-recurring expenses.

In addition to the Finance Commission approval, the Cabinet greenlit a major solar power project for the Mysal Lift Irrigation Scheme under the Krishna-Koyna Lift Irrigation Project. This energy-efficient initiative, with a budget of Rs 1,594 crore, aims to meet the annual electricity needs of approximately 398 million units for the scheme. The project will benefit drought-prone areas in Sangli and Solapur districts by providing irrigation water to over 1 lakh hectares.

Furthermore, the Cabinet approved the revised budget of Rs 1,275.78 crore for the Varkhede Londhe Barrage project in Jalgaon. Another notable decision was the establishment of an anti-drug task force, with 346 posts created to strengthen efforts in combating substance abuse in the state.

Indian Embassy Assures Investigation into Nepalese Student's Alleged Suicide at KIIT

The Indian Embassy in Nepal has promised a thorough investigation into the alleged suicide of Nepalese student Prakriti Lamsal at Odisha's Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT). The third-year B Tech student was found dead in her hostel room on Sunday, triggering protests on the KIIT campus where nearly 1,000 Nepali students are enrolled.

Gyanesh Kumar appointed as CEC; Vivek Joshi election commissioner

On Monday, Gyanesh Kumar was appointed as the next Chief Election Commissioner (CEC), according to the law ministry. Kumar's appointment marks a significant moment as he becomes the first CEC to be appointed under the new law that governs the appointment of members to the Election Commission (EC). His term will extend until January 26, 2029, just before the expected announcement of the schedule for the next Lok Sabha election.

Vivek Joshi, a 1989-batch Haryana-cadre Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer, was also appointed as an Election Commissioner. Joshi, born on May 21, 1966, will serve in this role until 2031, in line with the law stipulating that CECs and ECs retire at the age of 65 or serve for a six-year term.



Before his appointment, Sushil Chandra had resigned from his position as the Chairman of the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) to become an Election Commissioner. Joshi, a former Haryana Chief Secretary, had been on central deputation since January 2019.

During his tenure as CEC,

Kumar will oversee several crucial state elections, including the Bihar Assembly elections later this year, as well as the Kerala and Puducherry Assembly elections in 2026. He will also supervise the Assembly elections in Tamil Nadu and West Bengal, which are scheduled for 2026.

Kumar, a 1988-batch Kerala-cadre IAS officer, played a vital role in implementing decisions related to the abrogation of Article 370 during his tenure in the Union Ministry of Home Affairs. He took over as Election Commissioner on March 15, 2024.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has directed the immediate enforcement of the UNRWA law, following the Knesset's passage of the legislation with broad support. The law mandates the cessation of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA) operations within Israeli territory, including East Jerusalem.

The law, passed in October 2024, prohibits Israeli authorities from engaging with UNRWA and calls for the agency to vacate all premises in occupied East Jerusalem by January 30, 2025. Israel's Prime Minister's Office (PMO) confirmed the directive in a post on social media, stating there are no restrictions on its implementation. UNRWA, a vital relief and human development agency, was established in 1949 to provide services to Palestinian refugees who lost their homes and livelihoods in the 1948 Arab-Israeli war. For decades, the agency has provided essential humanitarian aid, including health facilities, schools, and vocational training, primarily in the West Bank and Gaza Strip.

Russian Delegation Arrives in Saudi Arabia for High-Level Talks with US Officials

The US and Russian delegations have agreed to address ongoing tensions in their bilateral relationship, according to a statement from US State Department spokesperson Tammy Bruce following talks in Riyadh on Tuesday. The discussions, which focused on the Ukraine conflict and future economic cooperation, marked a significant step toward improving relations between the two countries.

US Secretary of State Marco Rubio, who participated in the meeting, revealed that both sides had agreed to form a 'high-level team' tasked with negotiating peace in Ukraine and fostering economic cooperation. The aim, he said, was to find a sustainable, enduring solution to the conflict that would be acceptable to all parties involved.

Bruce emphasized that the US is committed to finding a resolution to the war in Ukraine "as soon as possible," while ensuring that the solution is long-lasting and acceptable to all sides. However, despite the discussions, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky expressed concerns about the talks, warning that Ukraine would not accept any agreements made about the country's future without its direct participation.

The meeting, which was hosted by Saudi Arabia, was significant for its lack of Ukrainian representation at the table, highlighting the complexities of the peace process. Zelensky's statement underscored the importance of Ukraine's involvement in any discussions related to its sovereignty and future.

In addition to the peace talks, Bruce noted that the US and Russia would explore opportunities for future cooperation on matters of mutual geopolitical interest. This includes potential economic and investment opportunities that could arise from a successful resolution to the conflict in Ukraine.

Secretary Rubio acknowledged the complexity of the process, calling the Riyadh talks "the first step of a long and difficult journey." He also hinted that the European Union (EU), which has imposed sanctions on Russia, would likely need to be involved in future negotiations. Rubio suggested that EU involvement would be crucial to reaching a comprehensive and lasting peace agreement.

The Knesset's decision to end UNRWA's operations in Israeli-controlled areas has drawn international criticism. UN Secretary-General António Guterres expressed concern, warning that the effective ban could have devastating consequences for Palestinian refugees. Joyce Msuya, the acting head of the UN aid coordination office, called the move "dangerous and outrageous." UNRWA's Commissioner-General Philippe Lazzarini also condemned the decision, claiming that the legislation would increase suffering among Palestinians and amounted to "collective punishment." Earlier this month, U.S. President Donald Trump also signed executive orders to cut U.S. funding to UNRWA, further isolating the agency. As tensions surrounding the issue continue to rise, the implementation of the UNRWA law reflects Israel's stance on the ongoing Palestinian refugee situation and its efforts to limit the agency's influence in the region.

Pope Francis, who is currently in the hospital for a "complex" respiratory infection, will not participate in this weekend's Holy Year events, the Vatican announced on Tuesday. The 88-yearold pontiff has been suffering from the infection for over a week and was admitted to Rome's Gemelli hospital on Friday.

As a result of his health condition, the Vatican confirmed that a public papal audience scheduled for Saturday has been canceled. However, a papal mass set for Sunday will still be held but will be led by a senior Vatican official in place of the Pope.

On Monday, the Vatican shared that doctors had modified the Pope's medication for the second time during his hospitalization in an attempt to address his "complex clinical situation." The infection is described as a "polymicrobial" one, which can involve a combination of viruses, bacteria, and fungi affecting the respiratory tract.

Pope Francis, who has faced various health challenges over the past two years, including bouts with influenza, continues to receive medical care. Despite these ongoing health struggles, his condition is described as stable, although his public engagements are being reduced for now to ensure his recovery.

About Ukraine, Without Ukraine": Zelensky Slams US-Russia Talks

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky has voiced strong opposition to the ongoing discussions between the United States and Russia regarding the war in Ukraine, highlighting that these talks are being held without Ukraine's participation. The talks, which are taking place in Saudi Arabia, involve high-level officials from both the US and Russia, but Zelensky expressed his frustration over Ukraine's exclusion from these crucial conversations.

Speaking during his official visit to Turkey, Zelensky criticized the discussions, stating, "Talks are taking place between representatives of Russia and representatives of the United States of America. About Ukraine – about Ukraine again – and without Ukraine." His comments reflect grow-



ing dissatisfaction in Kyiv over the fact that decisions regarding Ukraine's future are being made without the country having a seat at the table.

Zelensky's remarks underscore Ukraine's longstanding position that any peace talks or negotiations involving the country must include direct Ukrainian participation. Ukraine has consistently maintained that it should have the opportunity to actively engage in any diplomatic conversations related to the war, especially considering the profound impact these discussions have on the nation's sovereignty, territorial integrity, and security.

The ongoing war between Ukraine and Russia, which began in February 2022, has led to significant loss of life, displacement, and destruction. Hasina vows to return, blames Yunus for 'terrorism and lawlessness' in Bangladesh

In a strong condemnation of the interim government in Bangladesh, former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has blamed Chief Advisor Muhammad Yunus for causing "terrorism and lawlessness" in the country. Speaking virtually to her supporters from exile in India, Hasina, who was ousted from power in August 2024, accused Yunus of destroying Bangladesh's social fabric and allowing terrorists to wreak havoc on the population.

Hasina's remarks came as she criticized Yunus for his silence during violent student-led protests last year, which saw dozens of police officers killed. She accused Yunus' administration of being ineffective and unable to manage the country, particularly in terms of addressing the violence and civil unrest that erupted during her government's downfall.

"He has no experience in running a government. He dissolved all inquiry committees and unleashed terrorists to butcher people. They are destroying Bangladesh," Hasina said. She vowed to return to Bangladesh and promised that the perpetrators of the violence would be held accountable for their actions.

Hasina's comments were aimed at rallying support for her political party, the Awami League, which she leads. She pledged that her return would be marked by justice for those who had suffered under Yunus' leadership, adding, "Inshallah, we will oust this government of terrorists. The killers will face justice in Bangladesh."

India's fiscal deficit target for FY2026 is projected to be set at 4.5% of the country's GDP, marking a reduction of 25-30 basis points compared to the anticipated fiscal deficit of 4.8% in FY2025. This follows the government's efforts to rein in fiscal deficits while continuing to support economic growth through infrastructure and capital spending.

Domestic credit rating agency ICRA has emphasized the need for the government to prioritize capital expenditure (capex), estimating that the target for Budget 2025 should be ₹11 lakh crore. ICRA Chief Economist Aditi Nayar highlighted that the current year's budgeted capex of ₹11.11 lakh crore is likely to fall short by around ₹1.4 lakh crore, and next year's capex target should align with the previous year's level to stay within borrowing limits. Nayar also noted that the capex spending for FY2025 is currently trailing the required run rate, indicating a potential shortfall.

Between April and November 2024, the government's capex spending amounted to ₹5.13 lakh crore, which accounts for 46% of the budgeted target of ₹11.11 lakh crore. Nayar stressed that a large capex shortfall is expected for the current fiscal year, and for FY2026, maintaining a fiscal deficit target of 4.5% of GDP would be realistic. This would enable a capex allocation of ₹11 trillion, marking an 11-12% growth compared to FY2025's feasible capex figure.

Nayar also warned that setting a higher capex target could be "imprudent," as larger borrowing and a higher fiscal deficit would increase yields. Over the past few years, India has ramped up its capex spending to stimulate the economy, with increases from ₹4.39 lakh crore in 2020-21 to ₹10 lakh crore in FY2023-24. This push has been vital in stimulating economic growth and generating a positive cycle that benefits other sectors.

In conclusion, while India aims to reduce its fiscal deficit in FY2026, prioritizing capital expenditure remains crucial to sustaining economic momentum and supporting infrastructure development.

Samsung Electronics announced on Tuesday that it will cancel 3 trillion won (\$2.01 billion) worth of treasury stocks as part of its ongoing buyback initiative aimed at enhancing shareholder value. The company will retire approximately 50.1 million common shares and 6.9 million preferred shares, according to a regulatory filing.

This move follows a decision made by the Samsung board in November 2024 to repurchase a total of 10 trillion won worth of shares over the course of the upcoming year. The initial phase will involve the buyback of 3 trillion won worth of shares within three months, which will then be fully canceled. By reducing the number of outstanding shares, Samsung aims to improve its earnings per share (EPS) and support its stock price, ultimately benefiting its investors. idend earner in South Korea last year. According to a survey by corporate data tracker Leaders Index, Lee received 346.5 billion won in dividends for 2024, marking a 7.1% increase from the previous year. The survey, which covered 560 companies, revealed that these firms collectively distributed 40.7 trillion won (US\$28.2 billion) in dividends, reflecting a 10.4% increase from 2023.

Hyundai Motor Group's Honorary Chairman Chung Mong-koo and Executive Chair Euisun Chung ranked second and third for dividends, receiving 189.2 billion won and 174.7 billion won, respectively. 3rd in a row: Goods exports shrink 2.4%



India's merchandise exports saw a decline for the third consecutive month in January 2025, with exports falling to \$36.43 billion, representing a 2.38% drop compared to the same month last year. The dip in exports has raised concerns about the country's trade performance as global demand remains sluggish.

The merchandise trade deficit also widened, reaching \$22.99 billion in January, an increase from \$16.56 billion in January 2024 and \$21.94 billion in December 2024. This growing trade gap highlights the challenges faced by India's export sector, which has been struggling to recover from various global and domestic economic pressures.

Several factors have contributed to the suggest that there is a need for increased

decline in exports, including weakening demand from major trading partners and the global slowdown in economic growth. Key export sectors, including petroleum products, gems and jewelry, and engineering goods, have seen reduced demand. This trend is in line with broader global economic conditions, which have been characterized by lower consumer spending and slower growth in both advanced and emerging economies.

The widening trade deficit is a cause for concern as it could exert pressure on India's foreign exchange reserves and contribute to the depreciation of the rupee. As India continues to grapple with challenges in the global market, experts suggest that there is a need for increased

focus on diversifying export markets and enhancing the competitiveness of Indian goods.

Despite these challenges, the Indian government has emphasized its commitment to boosting exports and addressing structural issues in the trade sector. Measures to improve logistics, enhance export credit availability, and provide incentives for export-oriented industries are expected to play a role in supporting India's long-term trade growth.

The outlook for India's export sector remains uncertain, but officials remain hopeful that recovery will take place with the right policy measures and favorable global conditions in the near future.

This deep-sea station will not only advance scientific knowledge but also give China greater control over one of the world's most contested and resource-abundant maritime regions, further strengthening its strategic influence in the South China Sea.

Within minutes, the rupture unleashed between 128,000 and 323,000 gallons (4.85 lakh -12.2 lakh liters) of beer onto the streets. 

USA Breaks India's 1985 Record for Successfully Defending Lowest Total in ODI

Tn a remarkable achieve-Iment, the USA broke India's long-standing record for successfully defending the lowest total in a full men's ODI. On Tuesday, the USA, after posting a modest 123 runs in their first innings, managed to defend it and defeated Oman by 57 runs in their ICC Men's Cricket World Cup League 2 match.

India's previous record was set in 1985 during the Rothmans Four-Nations Cup, when they defended a total of 125 runs against Pakistan in Sharjah. India emerged victorious by 38 runs in that match, which had stood as the lowest total ever defended in an ODI for nearly four decades.

The USA-Oman match was a unique encounter, with the entire game being dominated by spin bowling. All nine bowlers used in the match were spinners, marking the first game in ODI history after 4,671 matches in which no pacer bowled a single delivery. This rare scenario added a distinctive flair to the contest. The match also witnessed a record-setting 19 wickets falling, the same number as the ODI between Pakistan and Bangladesh in 2011 in Chattogram, where spinners claimed all the wickets. 
