Deepfake **Inreats Cyber Safety**

Hyderabad, Feb 19: Chief Minister Revanth Reddy emphasized the need for Telangana to be recognized as the number one state in cyber safety. He addressed the growing concerns around cybercrimes and their significant impact on the economy. According to him, Telangana should be viewed as a secure business hub, and there needs to be increased awareness about cyber threats among the public. He highlighted the toll-free number 1930 for reporting cybercrimes, urging everyone to use it to raise awareness and ensure better communication between the police and citizens.

In his remarks, CM Revanth Reddy pointed out how the nature of crime is changing, noting that while thieves once had to break into homes to commit robberies, today's cybercriminals can steal with a mere click. He lauded the Telangana police for their vigilance in combating cybercrime, noting that their efforts have been recognized with awards by the central government. However, he stressed that more needs to be done to prevent such crimes.

The Chief Minister also raised concerns about the rise of deepfake technology, warning that it is being used to create chaos and unrest in society. He called for a coordinated national approach to tackle cybercrimes, stating that Telangana is poised to lead the way in cybercrime prevention and will set an example for the rest of the country.



Huge Illegal Trade Uncovered

Hyderabad , Feb 19 : A major sand mafia operation has been uncovered in Hyderabad, where illegal sand trade is booming. The mafia is allegedly booking sand from other regions, bringing it into Hyderabad, and dumping it for resale at inflated prices. Sand that costs around ₹10,000 in the source areas is being sold for as much as ₹50,000 in Hyderabad.

Authorities discovered this illegal trade when the mafia began dumping sand in various locations across the city, where it was being sold in bulk. Task gal sand trade.

Force teams conducted raids on multiple sand dumping sites and found that the mafia was charging customers ₹50,000 per truckload. The mafia was found to be using riverbank areas as delivery points, but the sand was being transported illegally into Hyderabad.

Following the raids, the Task Force filed cases against those involved in the illegal dumping, noting that the sand was being brought into the city without proper documentation. The authorities are continuing their investigation to tackle this ille-

New Security Policy on the Horizon: Minister Sridhar Babu

Hyderabad, Feb 19: Telangana's IT and Industries Minister, Duddilla Sridhar Babu, has announced that the state will soon launch a new security policy, aligned with the Digital Personal Data Protection Act, to enhance cybersecurity. Addressing the 'SHIELD 2025' conference at HICC Novotel, organized by the Telangana Cyber Security Bureau (TGCSB), Cyberabad Police, and the Society for Cyberabad Security Council (SCSC), the Minister emphasized the importance of preempting cybercrimes and ensuring robust protection systems.

Minister Sridhar Babu outlined plans to establish a state-of-the-art Giga Watt Data Center powered by advanced Artificial Intelligence technologies. As countries compete for dominance in cyberspace, he stressed that data protection is critical in safeguarding personal privacy and national economic stability, especially as cybercriminals increasingly target data over financial assets. The Minister praised the Telangana Police's ongoing efforts in combating cybercrime, citing the recovery of Rs. 185 crore out of the Rs. 350 crore looted by cyber offenders. He also expressed concern about India's reliance on imported cybersecurity software

worth \$7 billion annually, despite being the second-largest software engineering hub globally. He called on industry leaders to innovate and develop indigenous cybersecurity solutions.

Sridhar Babu assured the state government's full support for forward-thinking innovators in the cybersecurity field and emphasized the importance of contemporary solutions over traditional methods. Reflecting on the significance of data privacy, he pointed out how tech giants like Google often know more about individuals than they know about themselves. While acknowledging the vast opportunities provided by technology, he also warned about the evolving tactics of cybercriminals, particularly with the rise of Artificial Intelligence. Addressing the growing menace of the dark web, where personal data is freely available for purchase, he highlighted the staggering \$10 trillion in global cybercrime losses annually, with India alone losing Rs. 15,000 crore. He noted that many victims of cybercrime hesitate to report incidents, making recovery difficult. He urged citizens to remain vigilant and pro-

active, emphasizing that cybersecurity is a

Minister Ponnam Prabhakar Orders Special RTC Buses for Maha Shivaratri

Keesara, and Palakurthi. He further directed that actions should be taken at bus stations with higher congestion to ensure smooth operations and a hassle-free travel experience for the devotees.

BJP Strongly Opposes Religious-Based Reservations

The BJP reiterated its stance Constitutional Amendments, that BCs must receive 42% reservations, as promised, and accused Congress of backtracking on its commitments. They called on BCs to recognize the betrayal and deceit by Congress and to hold them accountable.

On another issue, the BJP has condemned Congress for delaying local body elections in Telangana. The BJP stressed the importance of holding these elections on time, pointing out that the 15th Finance Commission's grants would be halted if elections were further delayed. They also accused Congress of violating the 73rd and 74th which mandate holding local body elections every five

BJP leaders also criticized Congress for failing to hold local elections, which they argue has brought village development to a halt. They emphasized the importance of having elected sarpanches to ensure the functioning of village assemblies and development programs.

According to the BJP, the delay in local body elections stems from Congress' fear of defeat, and they urged the party to respect the Constitution by conducting the elections without further delay.

CPI(M) State Secretary John Wesley Writes Open Letter to CM Revanth Reddy on University Development

Hyderabad, Feb 19: In an open letter addressed to Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, CPI(M) State Secretary John Wesley raised concerns over the severe lack of infrastructure in the state's universities, calling for the allocation of ₹5,000 crore in the upcoming budget for the development of educational institutions.

Wesley pointed out that students in the 15 universities across Telangana, including the prestigious Osmania University, are facing significant difficulties due to a shortage of basic facilities. He highlighted the vacancies in professor, assistant professor, associate professor, and non-teaching staff positions, which are hindering the provision of dire need for better facilities, Accreditation Council (NAAC),

Telangana Government Extends Deadline for SC Categorization Commission

TPN, Correspondent Hyderabad, Feb 19: The Telangana government has taken another crucial decision by extending the deadline for the Commission formed to study the categorization of Scheduled Castes (SC). The government issued orders to extend the timeline for the commission's work.

The commission, headed by retired High Court judge Justice Dr. Shameem Akhtar, was set up to study the categorization of SCs in the state. Justice Shameem, who assumed office on November 11, was initially tasked with submitting the report within 60 days, due on January 10. However, the government extended this period by another 10 days.

Recently, the Commission submitted its report to the government. However, leaders, including the founder of the MMPS (Madhiga Maha Parishad), Mand Krishnamadiga, and other prominent leaders, raised several objections regarding the categorization.

As the SC categorization bill is still under consideration, it is anticipated that further amendments may be required, and the Commission will need to provide opinions on these proposed changes. Therefore, the Telangana government has decided to extend the Commission's deadline again, now until March 10. The orders were issued by the government today to facilitate further examination and revisions.

Minister Jupally Forgets Revanth Reddy's Name, Refers to KTR as Chief Minister

Hyderabad, Feb 19: In a recent statement, Telangana Minister Jupally Krishna Rao mistakenly referred to KTR as the Chief Minister instead of Revanth Reddy, creating a stir in political circles. His slip of the tongue, referring to KTR as the Chief Minister instead of Revanth Reddy, has become a subject of discussion and surprise. Additionally, Congress leader Jagga Reddy also seemed to forget Revanth Reddy's name and mistakenly referred to former Chief Minister Kiran Kumar Reddy in a separate instance, further fueling the political chatter.

G.O on Ramzan is Incorrect, Says BJP MLA Raja Singh

Hyderabad , Feb 19 : BJP MLA Raja Singh has criticized the Telangana Congress government's decision regarding the Ramzan festival, calling the issued Government Order (G.O.) incorrect. The government had released a circular allowing government employees to work only until 4 PM during Ramzan. Singh questioned Chief Minister Revanth Reddy about the reason behind such a decision, particularly in light of the fact that the government did not issue similar orders during major Hindu festivals like Navaratri, which is considered one of the biggest Hindu festivals.

Raja Singh pointed out that during Navaratri, there were restrictions placed on religious activities, and

Hindu festivals like Ram Navami, the police had warned that legal action would be taken. He accused the government of showing neglect towards Hindu festivals, citing incidents where the police commissioner had threatened legal action against sound systems during Hindu celebra-

Singh further criticized the Congress government for its alleged bias in favor of Muslim votes, saying that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy only seemed to recognize Ramzan and other Muslim observances. He pointed out that the Hindu population in Telangana is significant, and such policies would negatively impact the public's perception of the government in the upcoming elections.

criticizing the CM's attitude toward bureaucrats. KTR remarked that someone who has engaged in wrongdoings would naturally assume others do the same, alluding to allegations that Revanth Reddy has been involved in "settlement" and "blackmailing" activities. He particularly expressed disapproval of CM Revanth's recent comments on IAS and IPS officers, calling them disrespectful and damaging to the integrity of the bureaucratic system.

KTR stated that bureaucrats, such as IAS and IPS officers, are the backbone of democracy and that CM Revanth's words belittle their efforts. He condemned the CM's ongoing attempts to undermine the bureaucratic

Additionally, KTR pointed out that CM Revanth Reddy had issued directives to district collectors and SPs to regularly visit and understand field-level issues. However, he accused the CM of not following through on these directives and not addressing critical problems, especially those faced by gurukuls (residential schools). KTR emphasized the importance of regular inspections and direct involvement in problem-solving for effective governance.

MLC Kavitha Accuses Congress and BJP of Creating **Distractions Over BC Census**

Hyderabad, Feb 19: In a strong critique, MLC Kalvakuntla Kavitha accused the Congress and BJP of playing "drama" to distract the public from the ongoing debate surrounding the BC (Backward Classes) census in Telangana. She alleged that the BJP and Congress parties were attempting to divert attention from the errors in the BC census by raising irrele-



vant discussions, such as whether Prime Minister Modi is from a BC community. She pointed out that this was orchestrated by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, who initiated the controversial conversation on BC census statistics. Kavitha specifically criticized BJP leader Bandi Sanjay for his attempts to question the religious background of Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, further fueling the diversion. According to Kavitha, both Congress and BJP are not genuinely concerned with the people's issues but instead are engaging in political theatrics.

She questioned why there is no attention to the correct counting of BC populations and reiterated that their demand is for an accurate enumeration of BCs. She called on the Congress to table a bill in the Telangana Assembly with precise figures and urged the BJP to approve it at the central level. Additionally, Kavitha stressed the importance of passing a BC reservation bill that would be legally sound and protect it from any potential court challenges.

However, during this time, he became addicted to drugs and eventually turned it into a business. He established connections with several people in the Tollywood industry, and used social media platforms like Instagram to target young women aspiring to work in movies.

He reportedly used to contact women who posted attractive photos on Instagram, offering them drugs through cool drinks and chocolates, and later blackmailing them with secretly recorded footage of their sexual encounters. These serious accusations have led to his arrest. The police have also turned their attention to drug parties at Mastan Sai's residence, where several individuals seen in videos are currently on the run. Special teams have been formed to track down those involved in the illicit activities.

Hefty Accident Averted at Shamshabad **Airport: Emergency Landing Successful**

Hyderabad, Feb 19: A major accident was averted at the Rajiv Gandhi International Airport in Shamshabad, Hyderabad, this morning. A Blue Dart cargo plane coming from Chennai encountered a landing gear issue. The pilot promptly alerted the airport authorities and requested permission for an emergency landing. The airport authorities took immediate action, halting the landings and takeoffs of other international flights to ensure safety. The pilot successfully landed the aircraft on the runway without any incidents. At the time of the issue, there were six crew members aboard the cargo flight, and fortunately, no one was injured.

The incident caused temporary panic at the airport, but the technical experts are currently examining the landing gear problem to prevent further issues.

Fake Education Certificates Gang Busted in Hyderabad

Hyderabad, Feb 19: In Hyderabad, a gang involved in the production of fake education certificates has been busted. The gang was manufacturing counterfeit degree and diploma certificates, using the names of various universities. Some individuals had even used these fake certificates to travel abroad. The gang was arrested within the Film Nagar Police Station jurisdiction. Task Force DCP Sudhindra explained that they had suc-

cessfully apprehended a group involved in producing fake certificates. The gang consisted of 8 members, including two from Uttar Pradesh. Authorities seized numerous certificates from various universities during



the arrest. The police were monitoring the group, and the gang had planned to leave the city, which led them to meet near the Secunderabad Railway Station.

The kingpin of the gang, Wajahat Ali, had four previous cases registered against him and is from Nizamabad. The gang mainly targeted individuals who were unemployed or unmarried and were using fake certificates for fraudulent purposes, including securing jobs. The police have warned that such activities will not be tolerated and that strict action will be taken against the culprits.

District Collector Komathi Reddy Reviews Measures for Summer Water Supply in Nalgonda

She also instructed the maintenance of overhead tanks and drinking water tanks, ensuring they are cleaned regularly with bleaching powder to prevent contamination.

The Collector emphasized the need for adequate preparation to avoid disruptions in drinking water supply, especially in the event of electricity outages. She urged that plans be in place to address any power disruptions that might affect water supply, and for ward officers to immediately in-



form the Municipal Commissioner if any such issues arise.

She also discussed the need for energy-saving measures in street lighting, advising that lights be used only when necessary and energy-efficient practices be implemented to reduce power consumption. Additionally, she stressed the importance of providing water to plants planted under the Vanamahotsav initiative to prevent them from drying out due to the heat. On the progress of drinking water tank construction within the Nalgonda Municipal limits, the Collector instructed that the work be completed at the earliest possible time. 5 Telangana Government Officials Arrested Over Bribe Demands in Separate Cases

ACB Cracks Down on Corruption with Multiple Arrests Across Different Departments

Hyderabad, Feb 19: In a series of corruption busts, five Telangana government officials have been arrested in two separate cases by the Telangana Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) on charges of accepting

The first case involved two forest officials from Bhadradri Kothagudem district. The accused were identified as Uday Kumar, the Forest Range Officer of Komararam Range, and Nunavath Harilal, the Forest Beat Officer of Ellandu Division. On Tuesday, February 18, they were arrested for allegedly accepting a bribe of Rs 30,000.

According to the complainant, the accused demanded the bribe in exchange for permitting the transportation of gravel from patta land for road construction. ACB officials apprehended the two officers red-handed, and a chemical test con- arrested for accepting a bribe of Rs 50,000. firmed traces of the tainted money on Kumar allegedly demanded Rs 75,000

their hands. An investigation is ongoing. In the second case, three police officials from Makthal in Narayanpet district were arrested by ACB officials for accepting a bribe. The accused were identified as Gundemoni Chandra Shekar, Circle Inspector of Telangana Police, and two police constables, Singasani Shiva and Kurva Nar-

Reports suggest that the three officers initially demanded Rs 40,000 from the complainant to reduce the severity of charges in an ongoing case at the Makthal police station. However, they were caught while accepting Rs 20,000 as part of the bribe. Further investigation is underway.

Earlier, on February 14, Satish Kumar, an employee working in the Southern Power Distribution Company of Telangana (TGSP-DCL) at the Gachibowli sub-division, was



from a complainant to process an already approved work completion report for a transformer and CT meter installation at an apartment, along with an additional bribe for approving another report for a separate project.

These arrests mark a significant crackdown on corruption within the Telangana state administration, with ACB officials vowing to continue their investigations.

Trump's Blunt 'No' To Europe Could Change Everything



A new phase in the Ukraine war is unfolding, as the Trump administration seeks to engage Russia without involving Ukraine or Europe. The Saudis are stepping in as mediators, with key figures like US Secretary of State Marco Rubio, Trump's Middle East special envoy Steve Witkoff, and National Security Adviser Mike Waltz playing central roles. This shift marks a dramatic departure from the US's policy of the past three years and leaves Europe scrambling to respond.

Over the past 15 years, the state has been ruled by various political parties, including the Akali-BJP alliance, the Consolutions. It is crucial for all political parties to put aside differences and prioritize the long-term interests of the state, addressing the root causes of illegal immigration in a unified manner.

The treatment of deportees has been another point of contention, with many arriving in India still shackled despite the country's protests to the US authorities. Only through coordinated action across all levels of government, along with the involvement of civil society, can India hope to solve this pressing issue and prevent further harm to its citizens.



Failure of Planning: Will Vaishnaw **Take Blame for Stampede?**



The tragic stampede at New Delhi station, which claimed 18 lives during the Maha Kumbh Mela rush, was not merely an accident. It was a catastrophic failure of planning, foresight, and accountability by the authorities. As thousands of pilgrims descended on the station to board trains to Prayagraj, the lack of preparation to manage the massive influx of passengers became tragically apparent. The event's scale was not unexpected—such large gatherings have long been part of the Mela, and the resulting strain on railway infrastructure is well-documented. The fact that authorities failed to anticipate and implement proper crowd control measures is a glaring oversight that ultimately led to the deaths of innocent

Former Railway Minister Pawan Kumar Bansal was blunt in his assessment of the situation,

asserting that the ultimate responsibility lay with the current Railway Minister, Ashwini Vaishnaw. While the government hastily announced compensation for the victims' families—Rs 10 lakh for each deceased and Rs 2.5 lakh for the seriously injured—ethical concerns arose when reports emerged of cash being distributed at the station. The distribution of money in violation of the 2023 compensation guidelines, which limit cash payouts to Rs 50,000, only served to highlight the government's inability to address systemic issues properly. The optics of handing out large wads of cash amid chaos seemed insensitive and inadequate in the face of such a preventable tragedy. The demand for Vaishnaw's res-

ignation is gaining momentum, especially after the government initially dismissed the stampede as a "rumor." Such deflection of responsibility highlights a deep-

er reluctance to acknowledge the failure in managing the situation. Historically, railway ministers such as Lal Bahadur Shastri and Nitish Kumar demonstrated moral responsibility by resigning following similar disasters. This raises the question: will Vaishnaw follow suit and take accountability for the loss of life under his watch?

While resignations might offer a symbolic gesture of responsibility, what is needed now is not just individual accountability but a comprehensive overhaul of the railway system. Effective crowd management protocols must be instituted, especially during major religious and festival events. It is time to put in place robust systems that prioritize passenger safety, preventing such disasters from occurring in the future. Without this, no amount of compensation will be able to undo the damage done.





India, Qatar Elevate Ties To 'Strategic Partnership' As Emir Meets PM Modi

India and Qatar have officially agreed to elevate their bilateral relationship to a strategic partnership, marking a significant milestone in their diplomatic ties. The leaders engaged in extensive discussions at Hyderabad House, focusing on key areas such as trade, investment, technology,



energy, food security, culture, and people-to-people exchanges. One of the highlights of the talks was a potential free trade agreement, with both nations aiming to double bilateral trade to \$28 billion over the next five years.

Energy security also featured prominently in the discussions, with both sides exploring ways to broaden their cooperation in this sector. Additionally, the two countries agreed on measures to prevent fiscal evasion and avoid double taxation concerning income taxes. An agreement on this front was also exchanged.

Both leaders also touched upon regional and global issues of mutual interest during their talks, reinforcing the strong partnership between the two nations. The Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson, Randhir Jaiswal, shared details of the discussions on social media, emphasizing the breadth of cooperation envisioned across various sectors, including innovation and technology.

In a rare diplomatic gesture, Prime Minister Modi personally received the Emir at the airport,

offering a warm handshake and a hug, underscoring the importance of the visit. The Emir's visit, which began on Monday evening, follows Prime Minister Modi's trip to Qatar in February 2024.

During the visit, the Emir was given a ceremonial guard of honour at the Rashtrapati Bhavan, where he was warmly welcomed by President Droupadi Murmu. Accompanying the Emir is a high-level delegation, including ministers, senior officials, and business leaders, further strengthening ties between the two nations.

Maharashtra Cabinet Approves Formation Of 6th Finance Commission

In a significant move, the Maharashtra Cabinet has approved the establishment of a Sixth State Finance Commission to assess the financial position of panchayats and municipalities and recommend necessary financial measures. The Cabinet authorized Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis to propose the names of the Chairman and members of the Commission to the state Governor, C.P. Radhakrishnan. Additionally, an officer with at least a Junior Administrative Grade Officer rank will be appointed as the Member Secretary of the Commission.

The Finance Commission will be responsible for reviewing the financial status of local government bodies and recommending the allocation of state revenue from taxes, duties, tolls, and fees among panchayats and municipalities. The Commission will also suggest the principles for the distribution of grants-inaid and measures to improve the financial health of local bodies. The recommendations will be based on the 2011 Census population data to determine the fair share of taxes and subsidies. The Commission's work will be supported by necessary resources, including office space and a dedicated budget for recurring and non-recurring expenses.

In addition to the Finance Commission approval, the Cabinet greenlit a major solar power project for the Mysal Lift Irrigation Scheme under the Krishna-Koyna Lift Irrigation Project. This energy-efficient initiative, with a budget of Rs 1,594 crore, aims to meet the annual electricity needs of approximately 398 million units for the scheme. The project will benefit drought-prone areas in Sangli and Solapur districts by providing irrigation water to over 1 lakh hectares.

Furthermore, the Cabinet approved the revised budget of Rs 1,275.78 crore for the Varkhede Londhe Barrage project in Jalgaon. Another notable decision was the establishment of an anti-drug task force, with 346 posts created to strengthen efforts in combating

On Monday, Gyanesh Kumar was appointed as the next Chief Election Commissioner (CEC), according to the law ministry. Kumar's appointment marks a significant moment as he becomes the first CEC to be appointed under the new law that governs the appointment of members to the Election Commission (EC). His term will extend until January 26, 2029, just before the expected announcement of the schedule for the next Lok Sabha election.

Vivek Joshi, a 1989-batch Haryana-cadre Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer, was also appointed as an Election Commissioner. Joshi, born on May 21, 1966, will serve in this role until 2031, in line with the law stipulating that CECs and ECs retire at the age of 65 or serve for a six-year term.



Before his appointment, Sushil Chandra had resigned from his position as the Chairman of the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) to become an Election Commissioner. Joshi, a former Haryana Chief Secretary, had been on central deputation since January 2019.

During his tenure as CEC, Kumar will oversee several crucial state elections, including the Bihar Assembly elections later this year, as well as the Kerala and Puducherry Assembly elections in 2026. He will also supervise the Assembly elections in Tamil Nadu and West Bengal, which are scheduled for 2026.

Kumar, a 1988-batch Kerala-cadre IAS officer, played a vital role in implementing decisions related to the abrogation of Article 370 during his tenure in the Union Ministry of Home Affairs. He took over as Election Commissioner on March 15, 2024.

Indian Embassy Assures Investigation into Nepalese Student's Alleged Suicide at KIIT

Russian Delegation Arrives in Saudi Arabia for High-Level **Talks with US Officials**

The US and Russian delegations have agreed to address ongoing tensions in their bilateral relationship, according to a statement from US State Department spokesperson Tammy Bruce following talks in Riyadh on Tuesday. Vatican cancels Pope's weekend engagements as he battles 'complex' infection



Despite these ongoing health struggles, his condition is described as stable, although his public engagements are being reduced for now to ensure his recovery.



Hasina vows to return, blames Yunus for 'terrorism and lawlessness' in Bangladesh

In a strong condemnation of the interim government in Bangladesh, former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has blamed Chief Advisor Muhammad Yunus for causing "terrorism and lawlessness" in the country. Speaking virtually to her supporters from exile in India, Hasina, who was ousted from power in August 2024, accused Yunus of destroying Bangladesh's social fabric and allowing terrorists to wreak havoc on the population.

Hasina's remarks came as she criticized Yunus for his silence during violent student-led protests last year, which saw dozens of police officers killed. India's Fiscal Deficit Target for FY2026 Set at 4.5%, Focus on **Capital Expenditure Growth**



India's fiscal deficit target for FY2026 is projected to be set at 4.5% of the country's GDP, marking a reduction of 25-30 basis points compared to the anticipated fiscal deficit of 4.8% in FY2025. This follows the government's efforts to rein in fiscal deficits while continuing to support economic growth through infrastructure and capital spending.

Domestic credit rating agency ICRA has emphasized the need for the government to prioritize capital expenditure (capex), estimating that the target for Budget 2025 should be ₹11 lakh crore. ICRA Chief Economist Aditi Nayar highlighted that the current year's budgeted capex of ₹11.11 lakh crore is likely to fall short by around ₹1.4 lakh crore, and next year's capex target should align with the previous year's level to stay within borrowing limits. Nayar also noted that the capex spending for FY2025 is currently trailing the required run rate, indicating a potential shortfall.

Between April and November 2024, the government's capex spending amounted to ₹5.13 lakh crore, which accounts for 46% of the budgeted target of ₹11.11 lakh crore. Nayar stressed that a large capex shortfall is expected for the current fiscal year, and for FY2026, maintaining a fiscal deficit target of 4.5% of GDP would be realistic. This would enable a capex allocation of ₹11 trillion, marking an 11-12% growth compared to FY2025's feasible capex figure.

Nayar also warned that setting a higher capex target could be "imprudent," as larger borrowing and a higher fiscal deficit would increase yields. Over the past few years, India has ramped up its capex spending to stimulate the economy, with increases from ₹4.39 lakh crore in 2020-21 to ₹10 lakh crore in FY2023-24. This push has been vital in stimulating economic growth and generating a positive cycle that benefits other sectors.

In conclusion, while India aims to reduce its fiscal deficit in FY2026, prioritizing capital expenditure remains crucial to sustaining economic momentum and supporting infrastructure development.

Samsung Electronics to Cancel \$2.01 Billion in Treasury Shares as Part of Buyback Plan



Samsung Electronics announced on Tuesday that it will cancel 3 trillion won (\$2.01 billion) worth of treasury stocks as part of its ongoing buyback initiative aimed at enhancing shareholder value. The company will retire approximately 50.1 million common shares and 6.9 million preferred shares, according to a regulatory filing.

This move follows a decision made by the Samsung board in November 2024 to repurchase a total of 10 trillion won worth of shares over the course of the upcoming year. The initial phase will involve the buyback of 3 trillion won worth of shares within three months, which will then be fully canceled. By reducing the number of outstanding shares, Samsung aims to improve its earnings per share (EPS) and support its stock price, ultimately benefiting its investors.

In related news, Samsung Electronics Chairman Lee Jae-yong emerged as the top dividend earner in South Korea last year. According to a survey by corporate data tracker Leaders Index, Lee received 346.5 billion won in dividends for 2024, marking a 7.1% increase from the previous year. The survey, which covered 560 companies, revealed that these firms collectively distributed 40.7 trillion won (US\$28.2 billion) in dividends, reflecting a 10.4% increase from 2023.

Hyundai Motor Group's Honorary Chairman Chung Mong-koo and Executive Chair Euisun Chung ranked second and third for dividends, receiving 189.2 billion won and 174.7 billion won, respectively. Meanwhile, SK Group Chairman Chey Tae-won ranked seventh, receiving 91 billion won in dividends. Among the surveyed companies, 285 increased their dividends, 94 maintained the same level as in 2023, and 181 reduced their payouts.

SK hynix, a key affiliate of SK Group, saw its dividends nearly double following record earnings driven by high demand for artificial intelligence (AI) chips. This trend of increasing dividends reflects a strong performance by major corporations in South Korea.

India's merchandise exports saw a decline for the third consecutive month in January 2025, with exports falling to \$36.43 billion, representing a 2.38% drop compared to the same month last year. The dip in exports has raised concerns about the country's trade performance as global demand remains sluggish.

The merchandise trade deficit also widened, reaching \$22.99 billion in January, an increase from \$16.56 billion in January 2024 and \$21.94 billion in December 2024. This growing trade gap highlights the challenges faced by India's export sector, which has been struggling to recover from various global and domestic economic pressures.

The Great London Beer Flood: When Beer Became a Tsunami

On October 17, 1814, London witnessed one of the most bizarre disasters in history: the Great London Beer Flood. Instead of rain, the streets of St Giles Rookery were flooded with beer, creating a chaotic scene that would forever be etched in the annals of odd historical

It all began at the Meux & Co Horse Shoe Brewery, located in the bustling Tottenham Court Road area. At around 4:30 PM, one of the brewery's massive wooden fermentation tanks, holding over 3,500 barrels of fermenting porter beer, suddenly gave way. The iron rings holding the tank together snapped, causing a catastrophic chain reaction. Within minutes, the rupture unleashed between 128,000 and 323,000 gallons (4.85 lakh -12.2 lakh liters) of beer onto the streets. A 15-foot wave of alcohol surged through the densely populated slum, tearing down houses and claiming the lives of eight people.

As the beer flooded the streets, locals, in a bizarre twist, rushed to scoop up the "free beer," with some even drinking it straight from the ground. Sadly, a ninth victim succumbed to alcohol poisoning

USA Breaks India's 1985 Record for **Successfully Defending Lowest Total in ODI**

Tn a remarkable achieve-**⊥**ment, the USA broke India's long-standing record for successfully defending the lowest total in a full men's ODI. On Tuesday, the USA, after posting a modest 123 runs in their first innings, managed to defend it and defeated Oman by 57 runs in their ICC Men's Cricket World Cup League 2 match.

India's previous record was set in 1985 during the Rothmans Four-Nations Cup, when they defended a total of 125 runs against Pakistan in Sharjah. India emerged victorious by 38 runs in that match, which had stood as the lowest total ever defended in an ODI for nearly four

The USA-Oman match was a unique encounter, with the entire game being dominated by spin bowling. All nine bowlers used in the match were spinners, marking the first game in ODI history after 4,671 matches in which no pacer bowled a single delivery. This rare scenario added a distinctive flair to the contest.

The match also witnessed a record-setting 19 wickets falling, the same number as the ODI between Pakistan and Bangladesh in 2011 in Chattogram, where spinners claimed all the wickets. The combined total score of both teams was just 187 runs



from 61 overs, making it the second-lowest aggregate in ODI history where both teams were dismissed. The lowest aggregate remains a 163-run game between India and Bangladesh in 2014, played in 41 overs.

Milind Kumar was the standout performer for the USA, scoring a steady 47* off 82 balls, leading

his team's efforts. Oman's bowlers, particularly Shakeel Ahmad, were impressive, with Ahmad claiming three wickets for just 20 runs. However, despite his efforts, Oman's chase of 123 faltered badly, with Hammad Mirza's 29 off 43 being the only score of note in their reply.

USA's Nosthush Kenjige was the

hero with the ball, taking an incredible five-wicket haul. His spell dismantled the Oman batting lineup, which was bowled out for a mere 65 runs, sealing a comfortable 57-run victory for the USA. This game will now be remembered as a historic moment in ODI cricket for the USA.


