DK Shivakumar claims even God can't solve Bengaluru's problems overnight

Remarks spark sharp criticism from opposition and citizens

Economist Mohandas Pai questions government's lack of progress

Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar has triggered a political storm with his controversial remark that even divine intervention cannot fix Bengaluru's ongoing traffic and infrastructural woes in a short period. His statement, made during the inauguration of a workshop on road construction, has been met with sharp criticism from the opposition and citizens alike.

"Bengaluru can't be

changed in two or three years. Even God can't do that. It can be changed only when proper planning is done and executed well," Shivakumar said, acknowledging the challenges faced by the city. However, many saw his remark as an admission of failure by the Congress-led Karnataka government.

The comments come at a time when Bengaluru residents and urban planners have been raising concerns over worsening traffic congestion, delayed metro expansions, and inadequate public transport. tence. consistent, worsening the city's already crumbling road network.

Shivakumar's statement quickly went viral on social media, with many condemning it as an irresponsible remark from a senior leader. Prominent economist and Aarin Capital chairman Mohandas Pai openly challenged the minister's claim, questioning the government's lack of progress in improving Bengaluru's infrastructure.

"Minister DK Shivakumar, it has been two years since you became our Minister! We applauded and welcomed you as a strong leader. But our lives have become much worse!" Pai posted on social media.

He further alleged that major infrastructure projects remain incomplete, footpaths are in a state of disrepair, and public

transport is severely lacking. Pai called for urgent action, including the immediate purchase of 5,000 new electric buses, better pedestrian pathways, and round-theclock metro expansion work to ease the city's growing traffic problems.

Govet to Explore Legal Options on Palace Grounds Land

The Karnataka government has decided to explore legal options regarding the Bengaluru Palace Grounds land issue following the Supreme Court's direction to issue Transferable Development Rights (TDR) to the heirs of the erstwhile royal family of Mysuru.

During a cabinet meeting on Thursday, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and his ministers deliberated on the legal complexities surrounding the case. The government had earlier promulgated an ordinance to drop the TDR proposal, citing the massive financial burden of over ₹3,014 crore. The state has maintained that land acquisition under the Bangalore Palace (Acquisition and Transfer) Act, 1996, at ₹11 crore, should remain valid. However, the Supreme Court ruled that the TDR issuance is non-negotiable.

The government has already acquired a portion of the Palace Grounds for widening Ballari Road and Jayamahal Road. The issue has now taken a legal turn, with the cabinet en-



trusting Law and Parliamentary Affairs Minister HK Patil to determine the next course of action.

Speaking to the press, HK Patil said, "The cabinet has decided to consult our legal counsels in New Delhi, including senior advocate Kapil Sibal and the advocate-general. Our priority is to safeguard the interests of the people, as adhering to the TDR directive would place a huge financial burden on the exchequer. We cannot accept paying ₹3,014 crore."

Doctor's Body Recovered from Tungabhadra River After Two-Day Search

The body of a 26-year-old doctor from Hyderabad, Ananya Rao, was recovered from Ananya was closely related to a former Conthe Tungabhadra River on Thursday eve-

ning, two days after she went missing following a cliff jump in Koppal district. The incident occurred on February 18, when Ananya, who was vacationing with friends near Hampi, leapt off a cliff into the river but failed to make it back to shore.

Ananya, a recent MBBS graduate pursuing postgraduate studies, had been staying at a homestay in Sanapur village with her group. On Tuesday, she attempted the jump into the river, a popular activity among tourists in the area. However, she did not resurface, triggering

an extensive search operation.

Rescue efforts began immediately but were hampered by the challenging terrain, with rocky outcrops lining the riverbanks. Initial attempts to locate her were unsuccessful, prompting authorities to escalate the operation. Expert teams, including an underwater rescue unit from JSW, were deployed, and drone cameras scanned the area. Local fishermen also joined the effort, while officials at the Tungabhadra Dam reduced water discharge to lower river levels, aiding the

search. A 10-kilometer stretch of the river was combed before her body was finally retrieved on Thursday.

her parents, was present during the search. The family had been holding out hope as teams worked tirelessly to find her.

Following the tragedy, the Koppal district administration announced a suspension of cliff-diving activities in the area. A senior official stated, "We have halted cliff jumping and issued strict safety advisories to tour operators. Water-based activities like river swimming, coracle rides, and cliff jumping must adhere to enhanced safety protocols moving forward." The official noted that the Tung-

abhadra River's water levels had risen in recent days due to a discharge of 3,000 cusecs, contributing to the suspension. "Activities will resume only when water levels stabilize," they added.

The incident has cast a spotlight on the risks associated with adventure tourism in the region, prompting calls for stricter regulations. For now, Ananya's family and friends mourn the loss of a promising young doctor whose life was cut short during what was meant to be a joyful getaway.

Karnataka HC directs revenue officials to record injunction orders in land records

The Karnataka High Court has directed the Principal Secretary of the Revenue Department to instruct all revenue officers to mandatorily record civil court injunctions in the "other rights" column of revenue records. This move aims to prevent unnecessary litigation and uphold the sanctity of judicial orders.

Justice Sachin Shankar Magadum issued the directive while allowing a petition by Suvarna from Hennagara village in Anekal taluk. The petitioner had challenged an endorsement issued by the Special Tahsildar of Anekal on December 31, 2024, which refused to reflect a civil court's injunction in a partition suit. The court strongly criticized the Tahsildar's stance that the state was not a party to the litigation, calling it legally untenable and condemnable.

The HC quashed the endorsement and ordered the Tahsildar and the Assistant Commissioner of Bengaluru South Sub Division to immediately incorporate the injunction

order in the revenue records. The court asserted that revenue authorities, as custodians of land records, are obligated to comply with judicial directives, and failure to do so would constitute willful disobedience.

Meenakshi Negi becomes Karnataka's first woman Principal **Chief Conservator of Forests**

The Karnataka government has appointed senior Indian Forest Service (IFS) officer Meenakshi Negi as the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (PCCF) and Head of Forest Force (HOFF), making her the first woman to hold this position in the state. She is currently only the second woman PCCF, HOFF in the country, alongside Maharashtra's Shomita Biswas.

Meenakshi, a 1989-batch IFS officer, took charge on Friday, succeeding Brijesh Kumar Dikshit, who nal Plant Board and Director of Ayush. retired on January 31. PCCF (Wildlife) Subhash Malkhade had been holding additional charge in the interim. Expressing her plans, she said, "There are too many jobs on my list that I want to do. I will first take stock of the situation and then start working."

She has held several key positions in Karnataka's Forest Department since 1993, spanning wildlife conservation, social forestry, territorial management, and working plans. Between 2007 and 2015, she was on central deputation, serving under the Ministry of Ayush as CEO of the National Medici-



Returning to Karnataka, she played a crucial role in the tribal relocation programme in Kali Tiger Reserve as Additional PCCF and Chief Operating Officer, CAMPA, from 2021-23. She was also instrumental in running the Aptamitra-Covid helpline and Covid Care Centres in Ayurvedic hospitals in the state.

Until February 18, Meenakshi served as the Member Secretary of the National Commission for Women. Her appointment marks a significant milestone in Karnataka's forest administration.

Karnataka's Dandeli depot to begin e-auction of timber



The Karnataka Forest Department's Dandeli timber depot is set to open its gates for an e-auction of timber, allowing not just commercial buyers but also individual citizens to participate. The auction, scheduled to begin on February 21, will offer nearly 2,300 cubic metres of wood for sale.

Dandeli depot, one of the oldest in Karnataka, has a historical legacy dating back to the British era, with its timber used in government buildings and even during

World War II. "The wood from this region is unique and honne wood varieties. due to its high oil content and grain formation, influenced by the terrain, soil, and environmental conditions. The rosewood from Dandeli remains one of the most sought-after varieties in the auction," an official from the Kali Tiger Reserve stated.

According to the forest department, the Dandeli depot contributed ₹55 crore to the state exchequer in the last financial year through timber sales. Annually, around 5,000 cubic metres of wood is auctioned, though the volume offered ranges between 2,300 and 3,500 cubic metres. The current auction will include teak, rosewood, matti, nandi, jambe,




Officials clarified that all timber auctioned is dry and seasoned, sourced from trees marked for removal in the Anshi and Dandeli forest patches of the Kali Tiger Reserve. This ensures that buyers do not have to wait for seasoning before utilizing the

Karnataka Government's Plan to Shut 6,000 Schools **Condemned by AISEC**

BENGALURU, Feb 22: The Karnataka State Committee of the All India Save Education Committee (AISEC) has strongly condemned the state government's proposed plan to shut down over 6,000 government schools due to poor enrolment ratios. AISEC President Allamaprabhu Bettaduru accused the government of treating education as a burden and pushing for the privatisation of education.

In a media statement released on Thursday, Bettaduru criticized the School Reform Commission's earlier proposal to merge schools with fewer than ten students with nearby institutions, citing it as an illogical excuse to avoid providing quality education. Bettaduru emphasized that, if executed, this plan would result in the closure of over 25% of government schools, affecting more than 50,000 students.

Bettaduru raised concerns over the government's claim of providing

transport for students from remote villages, questioning how financially-struggling families could afford such services. He argued that this was merely an excuse to close down schools rather than addressing the root cause of low enrolment.

AISEC President called on the government to focus on improving the quality of education and address the underlying issues behind low enrolment. "The primary duty of the government is to provide universal education, and it should not be viewed through a profit-andloss lens," Bettaduru said.

He further urged the state to allocate at least 10% of its budget to save government schools and colleges. Bettaduru suggested abolishing unscientific teaching methods, introducing proven educational approaches, and filling teaching and non-teaching positions to improve the public education system.

BMCA Slams Metro Fare Hike, Demands Transparency on City Cess

The Bangalore Metro Commuters' Association (BMCA) has strongly opposed the recent metro fare hike, asserting that Bengaluru Metro remains the costliest in the country. At a press conference on Wednesday, the association called for an immediate rollback and demanded explanations from the Bangalore Metro Rail Corporation (BMRCL), the state Congress government, and the central BJP government.

BMCA has also requested full transparency regarding the special city cess collected between 1996 and 2003, intended for infrastructure projects, and criticized the government for shifting the financial burden of metro project delays onto commuters.

BMCA has submitted a petition with over 10,000 signatures to the BMRCL, voicing strong public opposition to the fare increase. To further address concerns, the association has organized a citizens' convention with 'Metroman' E Sreedharan on Sunday at the Scouts and Guides Hall, Palace



Road. The event will focus on fare reduction strategies and the negative impact of the hike.

The association pointed to a sharp decline in metro ridership, with over one lakh daily commuters shifting to other transport modes since the fare increase. This shift, they warned, could aggravate Bengaluru's traffic congestion. BMCA urged authorities to implement Sreedharan's recommendation of boosting non-fare revenue and capping metro fares at 1.5 times the non-AC bus fare.

BMCA highlighted the cost escalation of Metro Phase 2 from Rs 26,205 crore to Rs 40,614 crore, with its completion deadline extended to 2026. Despite this, BMRCL has recorded an operational profit of Rs 129.3 crore in 2023-24, following a Rs 108-crore surplus in 2022-23, and is projected to reach Rs 200 crore by 2025-26. The association questioned the necessity of a fare hike when the corporation continues to generate surplus reve-

BMCA has vowed to continue pressing for fare reductions and greater transparency from the government regarding metro project finances.

'Beyond Carlton' Calls for Verification of NCRB Fire Data Accuracy

BENGALURU, Feb 22: Beyond Carlton, a citizen-led initiative focused on fire safety, has raised concerns regarding the accuracy of National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) data, which reports a sharp decline in fire accidents over the past decades. The group urged for verification with hospital records, fire department data, and burn registries to ensure the reliability of these statistics.

The NCRB data suggests a significant drop in fire incidents, from 22,788 in 1996 to just 7,566 in 2022, sparking doubts about its accuracy. Gopal Devanahalli, Trustee of Beyond Carlton, emphasized the need for cross-verification, pointing out that while the figures indicate a decline, they might not accurately reflect the ground reality. "Triangulating with data from

burn registries and fire departments number of LPG connections has sigcould help confirm the true progress reflected by these numbers," he said. The report highlighted that despite the decline in fire deaths, fire-related fatalities from LPG incidents have decreased by over 50%, even as the



nificantly increased. Trustee RA Venkitachalam suggested that discrepancies in the classification of causes, with over 50% of cases listed under 'other causes', indicate a need for better forensic investigation.

In addition to scrutinizing the data, Beyond Carlton also launched a report titled 'Fire Safety in India - a Beyond Carlton Perspective' at the Bengaluru Press Club. The report calls for urgent reforms to enhance fire safety in the country, highlighting the need for improved enforcement, better preparedness, and stronger community involvement. Uday Vijayan, Managing Trustee, emphasized that the report is not just about identifying problems, but also offering a roadmap to save lives, given the alarming rate of fire fatalities in India.

Man, Daughter, and Brother-in-Law **Arrested for Murder in Bengaluru**

- Three family members arrested for attacking a woman and murdering her alleged lover.

- Police confirm prior disputes over the alleged extramarital relationship.Gruesome Attack in Kadugodi

Bengaluru witnessed a horrifying crime on Thursday when Kadugodi police arrested a man, his daughter, and his brother-in-law for attacking his wife and murdering her alleged lover. The accused—Yellappa (45), his daughter Pooja (21), and his brother-inlaw Venkataramana (37)—carried out the assault at Kishore's residence near Kadugodi, using machetes to attack the victims.

The victims, Kishore (38) and Arundathi (38), were allegedly in an extramarital relationship, which had caused previous tensions within the family. Around noon, the accused confronted the duo, leading to a heated argument that escalated into a violent attack. Arrests and Investigation

Following the incident, Kishore succumbed to his injuries on the spot, while Arundathi was rushed to a nearby hospital, where Ji ji jishe remains in critical condition. Police officers confirmed that the three accused were immediately taken into custody and are being interrogated.

A senior police official stated, "The suspects were detained soon after the attack. Arrest procedures have been initiated, and further investigation is ongoing." Authorities revealed that Kishore, who was also married, worked as a private school bus driver. Meanwhile, Yellappa managed agricultural land in Srinivaspur, Kolar, and Venkataramana made a living by driving an auto and taking up odd jobs.

According to police investigators, the accused had prior knowledge of the alleged affair, leading to multiple disputes in the past. On Thursday, the situation turned violent, resulting in the fatal assault.

Kadugodi police have registered a case and are conducting a thorough investigation. Officials are gathering statements from neighbors, family members, and eyewitnesses to piece together the sequence of events leading to the crime. Authorities are also examining whether the attack was premeditated.

The police are waiting for Arundathi's condition to stabilize so they can record her statement, which could provide further clarity on the case. Meanwhile, forensic teams are analyzing evidence from the crime scene.

Bengaluru Fire Department Well-Equipped, But Gaps Remain

- Upgraded Fire Safety Measures: New fire stations, modern equipment, and skilled personnel have strengthened the department.
- Persistent Gaps in Fire Safety Awareness: Many buildings violate safety norms post-clearance, increasing fire risks.
- Technological Advancements: Firefighting robots, GPS tracking, and high-rise platforms enhance efficiency.

The Bengaluru Fire and Emergency Services department has undergone significant improvements since the Carlton Towers fire in February 2010, which claimed nine lives and injured 70 people. According to Uday Vijayan, president of Beyond Carlton, these upgrades include setting up new fire

stations, acquiring modern emergency equipment, and training skilled personnel. However, the biggest challenge remains a lack of fire safety awareness among residents.

Vijayan highlighted that while buildings receive initial safety clearance, modifications made after occupancy often violate fire norms, increasing risks. To address this, the fire department has mandated biannual inspections to ensure compliance. However, he emphasized that awareness and prevention should be prioritized alongside firefighting efforts.

Dr. Parameshwara, echoing Shivakumar's sentiments, defended the Lokayukta Police's findings, underscoring that the investigation was based on their independent assessment. "How can the government give directives to the Lokayukta, which is an independent institution?" he questioned, urging respect for the integrity of the probe.

KSRTC Conductor Assaulted for Not Speaking Marathi in Belagavi

A Karnataka State Road Transport Corporation (KSRTC) bus conductor was allegedly assaulted on Friday near Belagavi for not responding to a passenger in Marathi. The incident has sparked protests from pro-Kannada activists demanding the arrest of those involved.

The 51-year-old conductor, Mahadevappa Mallappa Hukkeri, recounted that a woman passenger, accompanied by a man, spoke to him in Marathi after boarding at Sulebhavi village. When he requested her to speak in Kannada, stating he did not understand Marathi, she allegedly abused him and insisted he learn the language. Soon after, a group of people gathered and attacked him, hitting him on the head and body.

Hukkeri was admitted to the Belagavi Institute of Medical Sciences with minor injuries and is reported to be out of danger.

The attack has reignited tensions in the border region, where a section of Marathi-speaking residents has been advocating for Belagavi's merger with Maharashtra, a demand strongly opposed by the Kannada-speaking population and the Karnataka government.



Delhi's 'Lady Don' **Zoya Khan Arrested** With ₹1 Crore Heroin

Delhi Police have arrested Zoya Khan, the 33-year-old wife of jailed gangster Hashim Baba, for drug trafficking. She was caught in northeast Delhi with 225 grams of heroin worth nearly ₹1 crore while attempting to deliver the consignment.

Police had been tracking Zoya's activities based on a tip-off and set up a trap on Wednesday, leading to her arrest. Authorities believe she played a crucial role in running Baba's criminal empire after his imprisonment, managing extortion and drug distribution operations while maintaining a polished public image.

Zoya, who married Hashim Baba in 2017 after two previous marriages, regularly visited him in Tihar Jail, where he allegedly trained her in coded communication and gang management. Despite suspicions of her involvement in crime, police struggled to gather direct evidence against her until now.

Hashim Baba, currently in jail for the murder of a gym owner in South Delhi, had earlier linked fellow gangster Lawrence Bishnoi to the crime in a judicial confession. Police say Baba and Bishnoi maintained contact since 2021, even from behind bars, allegedly using secure communication channels to coordinate criminal ac-

With Zoya's arrest, police are now investigating deeper ties between the gang and its associates.

Madras HC seeks report on Isha Foundation's Mahashivratri event

The Madras High Court has directed the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (TNPCB) to verify whether Isha Foundation is complying with environmental regulations during its upcoming Mahashivratri celebrations in Coimbatore on February 26.

A division bench comprising Justices S M Sivasubramaniam and K Rajasekar issued the directive while hearing a plea filed by S T Sivagnanan, who alleged environmental violations by the foundation. The court has asked TNPCB to submit its report by February 24 and scheduled the next hearing for the same day.

The petitioner claimed that Isha Foundation lacks proper sewage treatment facilities, discharges untreated waste, and causes severe noise pollution. He requested the court to take action against the foundation and prevent authorities from granting permission for the Mahashivratri event, citing similar violations last year.

CCTV Links Two Murders in Delhi, Juvenile Accused Caught in 13 Hours

New Delhi: In a swift operation, Delhi Police solved two murders that occurred 6 km apart within 13 hours, tracing them back to the same group of juvenile accused through CCTV footage and forensic analysis. The first incident took place in New Ashok Nagar, where police received a call at 3 am about an injured man near the Jal Board Treatment Plant. Upon arrival, they found him with multiple stab wounds. He was rushed to the hospital but succumbed to his injuries.

By noon, another distress call led the Ghazipur police to an empty plot behind a liquor shop, where 49-year-old Ramesh from Kumhar Basti was found dead with deep stab wounds. CCTV footage revealed a group of juveniles attacking the victim, linking them to the New Ashok Nagar murder.

Police investigations revealed that the juveniles first killed Ramesh in Ghazipur during a drunken altercation at a birthday gathering. Later, they attempted to rob a passerby in New Ashok Nagar, stabbing him when he resisted.

Tracking their movements using surveillance footage and automatic number plate recognition cameras, police arrested all the accused by 4 pm the same day.

Whose Interests Was USAID **Really Serving in India?**

Recent revelations about the United political unrest. States Agency for International Development (USAID) and its funding in India raise important questions regardin India's electoral process. Reports uncovered by the newly formed Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), led by Elon Musk, have shed light on large sums of American taxpayer dollars being directed towards initiatives aimed at boosting voter turnout among marginalized communities in India, particularly ahead of the 2014 and 2019 parliamentary elections.

USAID has been involved in India for decades, initially focusing on food security and governance reforms. Since 2011, its Democratic Elections and Political Processes (DEPP) program has allocated substantial amounts of funding, with over \$318,000 annually given to the Consortium for Elections and Political Process Strengthening (CEPPS) for India-focused projects. In election years, funding spikes significantly, such as in FY2014, when \$21 million—about ₹182 crore—was spent on voter awareness campaigns during the national elections. However, funding dropped drastically after May 2014, suggesting an electoral rather than institutional focus. A similar funding pattern occurred in 2019, with \$486 million allocated regionally.

Despite claims by USAID of promoting democracy, US President Donald Trump raised concerns that these efforts were more about restricting democracy, questioning the need for such large sums in India's elections. In fact, USdrawn comparisons to those in other countries, such as Bangladesh, where funding from the US for "strengthening" landscape, especially when such efforts the political landscape" was linked to coincide with election cycles.

These initiatives, includ-



ing a focus on Dalit voter participation, have sparked controversy, especially as similar rhetoric later surfaced in political debates, such as Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's call for caste-based rights allocation.

The dual funding from USAID and tech giants like Google, Meta, and Microsoft to IFES has also raised concerns about conflicting interests, particularly as IFES's policy papers have promoted caste-based voter categorization. These AID's expenditures in India have often funding patterns and political alignments prompt questions about foreign influence in shaping India's political

'Hindu-Buddhist Bhai Bhai'? The Politics Behind the RSS-Buddhist Alliance at the Kumbh Mela



The grand spectacle of Hindu-Buddhist unity at the 2025 Kumbh Mela, featuring Buddhist monks alongside RSS leaders like Bhaiyyaji Joshi and Indresh Kumar, is less an eternal truth and more a political performance with deep historical precedents. This grand display of solidarity between Hinduism and Buddhism is not without its contradictions, as it reflects both the shared heritage of these traditions and the historical schisms between them. The roots of this alliance can be traced back to the early 20th century. In 1923, Anagarika Dharmapala, a Sinhalese Buddhist leader, proclaimed at the Akhil Bharatiya Hindu Mahasabha that "Buddhists are also Hindus." This was a crucial moment in the historical construction of Hindu nationalism, as leaders like Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya echoed the sentiment, positioning Buddhism, Jainism, and Sikhism as sects within the broader Hindu fold. Such attempts to incorporate Buddhism into the Hindu identity were motivated by political pragmatism rather than deep spiritual kinship, as the emerging Hindu nationalist movement sought to consolidate power and create a unified Hindu identity.

However, this narrative of harmonious unity overlooks the historical hostility between Brahmanism and Buddhism. Ancient Buddhist texts such as the Tevijja Sutta and Ambattha Sutta criticize the Brahmanical caste system, and brahminical texts often portrayed the Buddha as a heretic or disruptive force. Even during the colonial era, figures like Swami Vivekananda presented Buddhism as a misguided offshoot of Hinduism, reinforcing the idea of an antagonistic relationship between the two traditions.

In the early 20th century, Hindu nationalist leaders, facing colonial rule and internal divisions, sought to include Buddhists within the "Hindu Nation." This was a strategic move, aimed at uniting marginalized groups while excluding Muslims and Christians, viewed as external threats. Anagarika Dharmapala's involvement in these debates was driven by his desire to gain control over the Maha

Bodhi Temple in Bodh Gaya, a symbol of Buddhist heritage. The most striking example of this alliance was in 1935, when the Hindu Mahasabha invited U Ottama, a Buddhist monk from Burma, to preside over the organization, an alliance forged more out of shared anti-colonial politics than religious unity.

In the present day, the Kumbh Mela's display of Hindu-Buddhist unity is underpinned by similar political calculations. While the resolutions passed at the event condemn the persecution of minorities in Bangladesh and Pakistan, the lack of any similar critique of India's marginalized communities, particularly Dalits, is notable. This selective advocacy underscores the political nature of this alliance, which often sidelines internal dissent.

The participation of Tibetan exiles at the Kumbh Mela also signals a shift from colonial-era alliances. With Tibetans reliant on Indian support, many are forced to align with the RSS and BJP to secure their place in India, even as they remain cautious of these political forces. Thus, the "Hindu-Buddhist bhai bhai narrative at the Kumbh Mela is a performance grounded in political pragmatism, shaped by the shifting dynamics of power, history, and survival. The deep-rooted contradictions in this alliance raise questions about its durability, suggesting that alliances of convenience may not endure without tension.





India needs leaders to find solutions to global complexities: PM Modi

Spokesperson for the MEA, Randhir Jaiswal, stated, "We have seen information that has been put out by the US administration regarding certain USA activities and funding. These are obviously very deeply troubling. This has led to concerns about foreign interference in India's internal affairs." His comments came after the US government halted the funding, which was aimed at supporting voter engagement and turnout initiatives during elections in India.

The funding was part of USAID's broader efforts to strengthen democratic processes globally, including in India, but the recent developments have sparked tensions between the two countries. The Indian government's response highlights its growing sensitivity to perceived foreign involvement in its domestic matters, particularly when it comes to elections and political processes.

Qatar's Growing Influence in Middle-East Politics and Its Ties with India

In the complex and often volatile landscape of Middle-East politics, Qatar has carved out a significant role, earning a reputation as both the arsonist and firefighter of the region. In a place where radical Islam and Shia-Sunni tensions often dominate, Qatar uses its vast natural gas reserves—third largest in the world after Russia and Iran—to wield considerable political leverage, often at the expense of more traditional regional powers.

The small Gulf nation has earned international recognition for its ability to play a central role in diplomatic negotiations. Qatar hosts the largest US airbase in the Middle East at Al Udeid and has brokered significant deals, such as the US-Iran prisoner swap in 2023. It was instrumental in facilitating the US-led coalition's withdrawal from Afghanistan in 2021 by offering refuge to Taliban leadership. Furthermore, Qatar has been actively involved in peace efforts in Gaza, facilitating ceasefires and hostage releases, and has had a hand in the civil wars in Yemen, Syria, and Libya. Notably, it maintains strong ties with the Muslim Brotherhood, further amplifying its political influence.

Under the leadership of Emir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani, Qatar has become an influential power in West Asia, adept at contributing to regional problem-solving. The Emir's diplomatic acumen has led Qatar to be recognized as a key player in shaping the future of the Middle East.

Acknowledging Qatar's growing stature in the region and the country's positive relationship with India, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, along with External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, made a notable gesture of respect during the visit of Sheikh Tamim to India in February 2025. Breaking diplomatic protocol, both leaders personally greeted the Emir and his delegation at Delhi's IGI Airport, underscoring the importance of Qatar's role in the Middle East and its cordial ties with the large Indian diaspora living in the Gulf nation.

"India Needs To Cut Tariffs For Its Own Good": NITI Aayog CEO

NITI Aayog CEO BVR Subrahmanyam asserted that tariffs do not protect countries, and India needs to reduce them for its own benefit, regardless of external pressures. Speaking at the 69th Foundation Day of the All India Management Association (AIMA), Subrahmanyam emphasized that being open to global markets should be one of India's top priorities if it aims to become a developed nation.

He highlighted the need for India to finalize trade agreements with key economies such as the European Union and the United Kingdom to facilitate tariff reductions. Subrahmanyam further stressed the importance of deregulation at both the central and state levels to integrate India into global supply chains.

Subrahmanyam also observed that while there is global interest in India, many investors are choosing to explore other countries instead.

He pointed to nations like Indonesia, Vietnam, and Turkey, which have benefitted from the "China plus one" strategy adopted by global companies seeking alternatives to China.

The NITI Aayog CEO argued that India's entry into global value chains requires more than just initiatives like the Production Linked Incentive (PLI); it also demands de-



regulation and a focus on skill development. He expressed concern about the bureaucratic red tape involved in business operations, which he claimed is stifling growth, particularly for MSMEs.

Subrahmanyam shared that NITI Aayog is working on integrating India into global supply chains across various sectors, including electronics, auto components, chemicals, textiles, and footwear. He also mentioned that the Aayog is awaiting Cabinet clearance for its recommendations on the electronics component supply chain and is preparing to launch a national manufacturing mission within three months.

In addition to manufacturing, Subrahmanyam identified education and agriculture as critical areas for India's development. He stressed the need to transform agriculture by shifting focus away from traditional crops like rice and wheat toward horticulture, floriculture, and dairy production. He also emphasized that states must be open to enterprises from other regions to stimulate growth, with a free-flowing enterprise environment being key to progress.

My father is 100% t, vote for him: Nitish's son urges Bihar people

Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's son, Nishant Kumar, on Friday urged the people of Bihar to vote for his father in the upcoming assembly elections, asserting that the 72-year-old leader is "100 per cent fit" to continue serving the state. Speaking briefly with journalists at Patna airport upon returning from a wedding in Delhi, Nishant appealed to voters to back his father's leadership, emphasizing the progress Bihar has seen under Nitish Kumar's tenure.

"This is an election year. I have urged the people to vote for my father before, and I do so again. He has done so much for Bihar, and his return to power will ensure that development continues without interruption," Nishant stated. His comments came amidst growing political speculation, with the state gearing up for assembly elections later this year.

Nishant was also questioned about rival RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav's recent remarks casting doubt on the health of Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, who is set to seek a fifth consecutive term. In response, Nishant firmly stated, "My father is 100 per cent fit," dismissing any concerns regarding his father's health.

While speculation surrounding Nishant's potential political career continues, with rumors suggesting he could join the JD(U) or even contest the assembly elections from Harnaut—his father's former constituency—he refrained from commenting on these matters. Nishant quickly moved past the group of journalists and entered his car, not addressing any further questions about his own political ambitions or the future of the party leadership.



India Rejects Turkish President Erdogan's Remarks on Kashmir, Lodges Protest

India on Friday strongly rejected Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan's comments on the Kashmir issue, stating that it is an internal matter of India and does not warrant external interference. The Indian Ministry of External Affairs lodged a formal protest with the Turkish ambassador in New Delhi over Erdogan's remarks, which were deemed both "unwarranted" and "unacceptable."

Erdogan's comments were made during his visit to Islamabad on February 13, following talks with Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif. In his statements, Erdogan called for the Kashmir issue to be addressed according to a United Nations resolution, suggesting that the matter should be resolved through dialogue between India and Pakistan, while considering the aspirations of the people of Kashmir.

The remarks, which diverged from Erdogan's usual stance on Kashmir, were viewed by India as a departure from his prior silence on the issue. For nearly two years, Erdogan had refrained from publicly commenting on Kashmir, even at international fo-

rums like the UN General Assembly and the D8 bloc. His sudden remarks sparked strong reactions from New Delhi, prompting a swift diplomatic response.

Indian External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal rejected the Turkish president's comments, asserting that "Jammu and Kashmir is an integral part of India" and that no other country has the right to comment on it. He further stressed that such statements undermined India's territorial integrity and sovereignty.

In response to Erdogan's remarks, the Indian government reiterated that matters related to Kashmir are purely domestic and are not subject to international mediation. India continues to maintain that it is committed to resolving any issues through dialogue, but only within the framework of its territorial sovereignty.

As the Kashmir issue remains a sensitive topic in India-Pakistan relations, India's firm stance against Erdogan's comments reinforces its position on the matter, further asserting that external interference is neither necessary nor acceptable.





Saudi Arabia Invests in Dark Skies to Boost Astrotourism

Raises Worries Of Interference In Internal Matters: India On USAID

India's Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) recently raised concerns over the US Agency for International Development (USAID) \$21 million funding aimed at voter turnout in India in 2012, saying it "raises worries of interference in India's internal matters." The response came amid a heated political clash between Congress and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), both of which have criticized the funding as "external interference" in India's electoral process.

The controversy intensified after the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), led by Elon Musk, identified the \$21 million allocation to India as part of a broader \$486 million audit of government expenditures in the US. DOGE's audit also included grants to Moldova for political process strengthening and other countries. The revelation spurred further political discourse, with BJP leaders accusing the Congress party of allowing external forces to influence India's elections.

Congress's Pawan Khera strongly criticized BJP leader Amit Malviya's claims, pointing out that the funding was approved in 2012, when the Congress-led UPA was in power, not the BJP. Khera sarcastically asked why the Congress would invite "external interference" if it was meant to sabotage its own electoral prospects. BJP leaders Nalin Kohli and Amit Malviya, however, questioned the rationale behind such a significant financial investment by a foreign entity into India's elections.

Former Chief Election Commissioner SY Quraishi refuted BJP claims, explaining that the funding was part of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the International Foundation for Electoral Systems (IFES), intended for election training and preparation. Quraishi denied any malicious intent behind the funding, which he described as a routine partnership with international organizations.

Post-Ramzan Protests Loom as Imran Khan's Party Targets Shehbaz Sharif Government

Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa, Pakistan (February 21) – Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) President of Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa, Junaid Akbar Khan, announced plans to launch a protest movement after Ramadan and reaffirmed the party's commitment to forming a grand opposition alliance. Speaking to the media outside Adiala Jail, Khan expressed his frustration after being denied a scheduled meeting with PTI's founding chairman, Imran Khan, by authorities.

Despite government restrictions, Junaid Akbar Khan emphasized that PTI leaders would continue to stand by their chairman's call. He dismissed claims that party leaders were avoiding jail visits, affirming that they remained fully committed to supporting Khan. Khan also confirmed the party's intention to rally opposition forces and organize large-scale protests after Eid, in what is expected to be a high-profile political initiative.

While speaking to reporters, PTI leaders suggested that the possibility of a sit-in outside Adiala Jail could be considered, should the situation demand it. They strongly criticized the government for restricting their efforts to meet with Imran Khan, describing these actions as a violation of constitutional rights.

In a related statement, PML-N President Nawaz Sharif reiterated his position that the people of Pakistan would no longer tolerate disruptions to national progress. He firmly stated that the country's development would not be held back by groups lacking political and democratic understanding, a reference aimed at the opposition parties.

PTI leaders, including Khan, have repeatedly accused the government of intentionally misrepresenting their party's actions and misguiding the public about the intentions of opposition leaders. Khan further criticized the government's tactics, calling them part of a broader strategy to undermine PTI and its leaders. He rejected accusations that PTI was responsible for any uncivilized political behavior, insisting that it was the ruling party's leaders who had first engaged in unethical political attacks. As the political situation continues to evolve in Pakistan, PTI's planned protests and opposition alliance efforts signal growing tensions within the country's political landscape.



Kash Patel Confirmed as FBI Director, Vows to Restore Trust in the Agency

Indian-origin Kash Patel was confirmed by the Senate on Thursday as the new director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Patel, who is a close ally of former President Donald Trump, expressed his gratitude and commitment to rebuilding the FBI into an organization that is "transparent, accountable, and committed to justice."

In his first statement following the confirmation, Patel thanked President Trump and Attorney General Pam Bondi for their unwavering support. "I am honored to be confirmed as the ninth Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Thank you to President Trump and Attorney General Bondi for your unwavering confidence and support," Patel said in a post on X.

Patel emphasized the need to restore public trust in the FBI, acknowledging the agency's significant role in protecting the nation, from the era of the "G-Men" to its post-9/11 mission of safeguarding Americans. However, he also acknowledged that the politicalization of the justice system had eroded public confidence in the Bureau, vowing to put an end to that. "The politicalization of our justice system has eroded public trust—but that ends today," he stated.

Patel promised to rebuild the FBI into an agency that the American people can be proud of. "Working alongside the dedicated men and women of the Bureau and our partners, we will rebuild an FBI the American people can be proud of," Patel said. He also issued a stern warning to those who pose threats to Americans: "To those who seek to harm Americans—consider this your warning. We will hunt you down in every corner of this planet."

The Senate confirmation vote for Patel passed narrowly, with a 51-49 result. While Senators Lisa Murkowski of Alaska and Susan Collins of Maine opposed his nomination, the majority of Republican Senators, including Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell, supported Patel. All Senate Democrats voted against his confirmation.



Kickback Scheme, What Do I Care? Trump On USAID As BJP Slams Congress

Former US President Donald Trump has once again voiced his criticism regarding the \$21 million allocated by the US government through USAID in 2012 for voter turnout programs in India. Calling the funding a "kickback scheme," Trump expressed indifference, stating, "What the hell do I care about it? We got enough problems." He did not provide further details or evidence to back his allegations.

Speaking to a gathering of Republican Party state Governors, Trump questioned the purpose of the funds, stating, "Can you imagine all that money going to India? I wonder what they think when they get it. Now, it is a kickback scheme... they kick it back to the people that send it." He further rambled on, suggesting that whenever there is a lack of understanding about certain matters, it could indicate a "kickback" situation. He also questioned the allocation of \$29 million to strengthen the political landscape in Bangladesh.

Trump's comments were part of his broader criticism of foreign aid, and he emphasized that his administration had terminated many such projects. "We got a lot. We got enough problems," he remarked, reiterating that the US needed to prioritize domestic issues.

The remarks sparked a political firestorm, especially in India, where Trump's comments were quickly picked up by opposition parties. The BJP, in particular, linked Trump's "kickback" comment to Congress MP Rahul Gandhi's earlier remarks in the UK, suggesting that he had insulted India abroad. In May 2023, Gandhi had stated that global democracies were in decline, urging US and European nations to recognize the threats to democracy. The BJP seized upon his comments, accusing him of undermining India's image on the international stage. Meanwhile, BJP leaders like Amit Malviya and Pradeep Bhandari claimed that the \$21 million was used to sustain "deep state assets" in India, accusing Gandhi and the Congress party of benefiting from the foreign aid.



Sebi Proposes Fast-Track Framework for REITs and InvITs Fundraising



The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) has unveiled a new proposal aimed at streamlining fundraising for real estate investment trusts (REITs) and infrastructure investment trusts (InvITs). On Thursday, the regulator introduced a framework for conducting fast-track follow-on offers, a move designed to make capital raising more efficient and accessible for these investment vehicles.

The proposed framework is expected to enhance the fundraising process by offering quicker and more flexible methods for REITs and InvITs to issue additional units. This initiative aims to reduce the time required for follow-on offers, thereby benefiting both the sponsors and investors.

As part of the proposal, Sebi has recommended a lock-in period of three years for units issued to sponsors through a preferential issue. This lock-in requirement is intended to align the interests of sponsors with those of other investors, ensuring that sponsors remain committed to the long-term growth and stability of the trust.

Sebi's move comes as part of its ongoing efforts to make the Indian capital market more dynamic and supportive of various investment vehicles. With real estate and infrastructure being key sectors in the country's growth, the framework for fast-track follow-on offers is expected to facilitate smoother and faster fundraising, attracting more capital into these sectors.

This proposal is set to significantly impact how REITs and InvITs raise funds in the future, making it easier for them to tap into the market and continue their expansion efforts. The regulator's push to improve fundraising efficiency is seen as a positive development for both investors and sponsors, offering more opportunities for growth in these investment channels.

Maruti Suzuki Aims for 50% Market Share and EV Dominance by FY30



India's largest carmaker, Maruti Suzuki, has set an ambitious target to reclaim a 50% market share in the country, with a bold vision laid out in its mid-term management plan for FY25-FY30. The company, which once held a dominant share of the Indian automotive market in FY19, is keen to retake that position by securing one out of every two cars sold in the country.

Currently, Maruti Suzuki holds a market share of 41.6% as of FY23, having lost some ground to competitors like Tata Motors, Hyundai, and Kia. The company is now focusing on strategic moves to enhance its position, with plans to introduce new models, enhance its production capacity, and expand its reach across various segments, including electric vehicles (EVs).

Despite entering the EV market later than its competitors, Maruti Suzuki has big plans for electric vehicles and aims to be the country's largest producer, exporter, and seller of EVs. The company has yet to start sales of its electric vehicles but is positioning itself to make a significant impact in the segment. Maruti Suzuki's delayed entry into the EV space is expected to be addressed with the launch of new electric models in the coming years as part of its broader strategy.

The company's renewed focus on regaining its market dominance and its plans to lead the EV market reflect the broader trends in the Indian automotive industry, where electric mobility is increasingly gaining traction. With a strong brand presence and extensive distribution network, Maruti Suzuki is well-positioned to meet its ambitious goals, provided it executes its strategy effectively in the years leading up to FY30.

Market falls as auto stocks tumble; Sensex down 429 points

Domestic stock markets fell sharply on Friday, weighed down by auto stocks and weak global cues. Investors remained cautious due to the absence of positive triggers and continued selling by foreign institutional investors (FIIs). The decline in auto stocks, particularly after reports of Tesla's potential entry into India, added to the downward pressure. Analysts suggest that unless the markets stabilize and consolidate over the next few days, a trend reversal is unlikely.

The BSE Sensex, which had closed at 75,735 in the previous session, opened at 75,612 and fluctuated between an intraday high of 75,612 and a low of 75,112. It eventually settled at 75,311, down 429

points. The NSE Nifty opened at 22,857, touched a high of 22,921 and a low of 22,720, before closing at 22,795, a loss of 117 points. The Nifty Bank also dropped 353 points to settle at 48,981.

Market breadth on the NSE favored sellers, with 1,744 stocks declining against 1,100 gainers out of the 2,916 traded. While 23 stocks hit 52-week highs, 91 reached new lows. Among the Nifty50 stocks, 13 advanced

while 37 declined. Hindalco, Tata Steel, Eicher Motors, Larsen & Toubro, and SBI Life were the top gainers, while M&M, Adani Ports, BPCL, Tata Motors, and Adani Enterprises were among the



biggest losers.

The rupee weakened slightly against the US dollar, closing at 86.71. Meanwhile, Mahindra & Mahindra shares took a hit following reports of Tesla's potential India entry. Tata Steel CEO TV Narendran noted that US tariffs could impact Indian exports. Varun Beverages shares saw an uptick on high trading volume, year low.

RBI MPC Minutes

Interest Rate Cut and Focus on Economic Growth

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) recently the government's Union Budreleased the minutes from its Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting held on February 21, highlighting the rationale behind the recent 25 basis points (bps) repo rate reduction and discussing the outlook for inflation and economic growth. The decision marks the RBI's first rate cut in five years, signaling a shift in policy aimed at boosting India's economic momentum as inflation shows signs of aligning with the central bank's target.

In its first bi-monthly MPC meeting of 2025, the RBI lowered the benchmark repo rate from 6.50% to 6.25% and maintained a neutral stance. This move follows a prolonged period of restrictive monetary policy, with policymakers expressing concerns over its impact on economic growth. In his comments, RBI Governor Malhotra emphasized that the rate cut was necessary to support growth, noting that retail inflation was moving closer to the RBI's 4% target.

The MPC members were largely in agreement that India's inflation outlook was turning positive, particularly with food inflation easing. India's retail inflation fell to 4.31% in January, a fivemonth low. Governor Malhotra praised

get proposals, particularly in agriculture and fiscal consolidation, which are seen as positive for price stability and inflation expectations. He suggested that the combination of monetary easing and growth-oriented measures from the Union Budget could lead to an uptick in household consumption and investments.

However, concerns over global uncertainties, such as trade policy and weather events, were also highlighted. External MPC member Saugata Bhattacharya noted that the policy repo rate might become excessively restrictive if inflation continues on its downward trajectory, potentially harming growth.

The meeting also stressed the need for continued support for economic growth. Deputy Governor M. Rajeshwar Rao suggested that with inflation aligning with the RBI's target, the central bank had more room to address growth concerns. MPC members pointed to subdued private consumption, particularly due to low real wage growth, and urged a more accommodative policy stance to




revive private capital expenditure. The committee also expressed concerns over the subdued Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) inflows into the country and noted that growth-supportive policies would remain a priority. External member Nagesh Kumar advocated for a more aggressive 50-basis-point rate cut to signal India's commitment to growth, although the committee opted for a more cautious 25 bps reduction due to global uncertainties.

Looking ahead, the RBI revised India's GDP growth forecast for FY2025-26 to 6.7%, while maintaining its inflation target for the fiscal year at 4.8%. The next MPC meeting is scheduled for April

UK Man Creates World Record By Getting Daughter's Name Tattooed 667 Times

Mark Owen Evans, a 49-year-old man from the UK, has reclaimed the Guinness World Record for the most tattoos of the same name on his body. Evans broke the previous record by inking his seven-year-old daughter's name, "Lucy," 400 more times, bringing the total number of tattoos to an impressive 667. Evans first set the record in 2017 when he had "Lucy" tattooed 267 times on his back. His decision to attempt the record was not only to celebrate Lucy's birth but also to raise funds for the hospital that cared for her in the months following her arrival. Evans originally planned to have Lucy's name tattooed 100 times but was pleasantly surprised when tattoo artists helped him fit double that number on his back. Amazon to Shut Down Appstore for Android Devices, Discontinue Digital Program



Amazon has announced the discontinuation of its Amazon Appstore for Android devices, marking the end of a 14-year journey since its launch in 2011. The e-commerce giant revealed that the app store will be shut down for Android users on August 20, 2025. While it will no longer be available for download on Android smartphones and tablets, the Appstore will still function on Amazon's own devices, including Fire tablets, Fire TV streaming devices, and other devices running Fire OS. In addition to phasing out the Amazon Appstore for Android,

Amazon will also be winding down its digital currency program, Amazon Coins. These virtual coins, which allowed users to make purchases or in-app transactions on the Appstore, will no longer be available for purchase. Existing users will need to use any remaining Coins by August 20, 2025, or they will be refunded after that date. A new FAQ page on Amazon's website clarifies that users will not be able to download the Appstore on Android devices af-

ter the shutdown. Additionally, Amazon warns that any apps already downloaded from the Appstore may cease functioning once the store is discontinued. For users with active subscriptions, the company advises disabling auto-renewals through the account settings on Amazon's website.

While the company has not provided an official reason for discontinuing the app store on Android devices, it is possible that the decision relates to increased restrictions on sideloaded apps and new APIs introduced by Google with Android 15. These changes have made it harder for alternative app stores to thrive on the Android ecosystem, potentially influencing Amazon's decision.

Although the closure marks the end of Amazon's Appstore for Android, users with Amazon's own devices will continue to have access to the store. The shutdown of Amazon Coins further signifies the company's shift away from the program, as it transitions to other business priorities.

Rare "Doomsday Fish" Washes Ashore in Mexico, Sparks Alarm



Arare and elusive oarfish was spotted in the shallow waters of Baja California Sur, alongMexico's Pacific Coast, sparking alarm among locals and online communities alike. Known for its long, ribbon-like body and vibrant orange fins, the deep-sea fish is often referred to as the "doomsday fish" due to legends that associate its sightings with impending disasters.

The oarfish, a creature rarely seen by humans, has long been believed to be a harbinger of bad news, particularly disasters or destruction. In Japanese mythology, it is known as "Ryugu no tsukai," meaning "Messenger of the Sea God." This myth gained widespread attention when approximately 20 oarfish washed ashore ahead of Japan's catastrophic 2011 earthquake, leading many to draw connections between the fish's appearance and significant seismic events.

A video of the oarfish washing ashore in Mexico was shared by an X user named FearBuck, who wrote, "A deep-sea creature

rarely seen by humans called the oarfish has washed ashore in Mexico!" The video quickly garnered attention and sparked a flood of comments. Many users expressed their concern, with one writing, "There have actually been multiple oarfish that have been spotted on beaches recently. Does that mean doomsday is coming?"

Despite these concerns, experts disagree with the claim that oarfish sightings are always linked to impending disasters. While the fish's mysterious nature and dramatic appearance have fueled superstition, marine biologists emphasize that oarfish are naturally inclined to swim closer to shore when injured or dying, and their rare appearance doesn't necessarily predict a disaster.

While some continue to fear the arrival of a major event, others see the fish's appearance as a fascinating reminder of the mysterious creatures that inhabit our oceans. Regardless of the superstition, the sighting of the "doomsday fish" has once again captured the imagination

PCB Seeks Explanation from ICC Over Omission of Pakistan's Name in Champions Trophy Branding


