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

PIL Filed in HC Against KCR's Absence from Assembly

A public interest litigation (PIL) has been filed in the Telangana High Court challenging the continued absence of former Chief Minister and Leader of Opposition K Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) from the As-

The petition, filed by D Vijaypal Reddy, president of the Telangana Federation of Farmers' Associations, urged the court to direct the Speaker and his office to ensure KCR's participation in Assembly sessions. He pointed out that KCR has not attended the Assembly since assuming the role of Leader of the Opposition on Decem-

ber 16, 2023. Reddy also criticized the Speaker's office for not taking any action on KCR's absence, stating that elected representatives must be present to voice public concerns. He emphasized that MLA salaries were increased to facilitate active participation in legislative proceedings.

Additionally, Reddy urged that if KCR is unable to fulfill his duties, he should be relieved of the position and a new Leader of the Opposition should be appointed by BRS working president KT Rama Rao (KTR).

TGSRTC Expands Digital Payment System for Bus Tickets





TGSRTC Expands Digital Payment System for Bus Tickets

- Digital payments to be implemented across all TGSRTC buses.
- QR-based transactions introduced, with a focus on reducing processing time.
- 6,000 i-TIMS machines procured for phasewise implementation.

The Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TGSRTC) is set to expand digital payment options across its entire fleet, making it more convenient for passengers to pay bus fares without the need for exact change.

After successful trials on select routes, TGSRTC is rolling out digital payment facilities statewide. Currently, many air-conditioned long-distance buses are already equipped with this system, receiving positive feedback from passengers while also easing fare collection for staff.

A pilot project in Hyderabad, covering bus depots such as Bandlaguda and Dilsukhnagar, proved



effective in reducing the time spent on fare collection and ticket issuance. Encouraged by these results, TGSRTC is moving ahead with a broader implementation plan.

Passengers can make payments via QR codes, with transactions currently taking around 30 seconds. Officials are working to further streamline the process and resolve technical issues. To support this transition, TGSRTC has procured 6,000 Intelligent Ticket Management System (i-TIMS) machines in the first phase, out of the 10,000 required across the state. City buses will be equipped first before the system expands to other regions.

As i-TIMS machines are touch-based, bus conductors have undergone three months of training to ensure smooth operation. Challenges identified during the trial phase are being addressed based on staff feedback.

"We have tested these automatic ticketing machines for software updates, cash transfers, and accurate tracking of bus stops. A dedicated team is working to fix any technical glitches," a TGS-RTC official stated.

Telangana to Boost Agriculture with Israeli Technology: Tummala

Telangana Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao has announced plans to modernize the state's agricultural sector using advanced Israeli technology. The initiative aims to enhance farming efficiency and sustainability through innovative techniques.

During a meeting with representatives from Israeli firms MDHAI and Windponics at the Secretariat, the minister emphasized the government's commitment to integrating modern agricultural methods. He noted that Telangana is looking to leverage technologies such as precision farming, artificial intelligence, sensor-based automation, and groundwater treatment to improve farm productivity.

Nageswara Rao stressed the importance of making Israeli exper-



tise accessible to local farmers and suggested preparing a detailed project report to facilitate the collaboration. The government plans to work closely with universities to implement pilot projects, ensuring proper training and support for farmers adopting these advanced techniques.

Telangana to Send 46 Khadim-ul-Hujjaj for Haj 2025 TPN Correspondent | Hyderabad

The Telangana Haj Committee has

begun the selection process for Khadim-ul-Hujjaj volunteers for Haj 2025, with 46 candidates set to be chosen from the state. A total of 172 applications were received, and the selection process was overseen by Telangana Haj Committee Chairman Maulana Syed Ghulam Afzal Biyabani Khusro Pasha.

Following a new rule by the Central Government that reduced the pilgrim-to-volunteer ratio from 200 to 150, the number of Khadim-ul-Hujjaj selected from Telangana was adjusted accordingly. Unlike previous years, where selection was done through a lottery, this year's



process includes interviews and a computerized test to assess candidates' knowledge of Haj procedures, experience, and fitness.

Maulana Khusro Pasha emphasized that the Telangana government is committed to ensuring smooth arrangements for Haj pilgrims, with enhanced facilities at the Haj camp and airport.

Uttam Kumar Reddy blames BRS for Krishna water issue

Minister of Water Resources and Civil Supplies Uttam Kumar Reddy criticized the previous BRS government, accusing it of negligence in the Krishna River water issue and failing to complete irrigation projects in South Telangana. He

claimed that due to BRS's inefficiency, Telangana was unfairly treated in water allocation.

"The BRS leaders who served as ministers in the previous government have no moral right to talk about the projects in the

Krishna Basin. Isn't it true that they neglected the projects sanctioned during our Congress government's tenure for the last ten years?" he

questioned. He alleged that despite taking loans amounting to ₹1.81 lakh crore, the BRS government failed to ensure justice for Telangana in Krishna water allocation.

"During their tenure, not only were no projects in the Krishna Basin completed, but they were also completely negligent in allocating

funds. As a result, South Telangana lost the capacity to store 100 TMC of water annually," he stated.

He pointed out that the reservoirs through the SLBC tunnel in Nalgonda district have a capacity of 10 TMC, Dindi Lift Irrigation Scheme reservoirs have 25 TMC, and Palam-

uru-Rangareddy Lift Irrigation Scheme reservoirs have 65 TMC. "Despite these projects, the BRS government failed to allocate funds, worsening drought conditions in South Telangana," he alleged.

Uttam Kumar Reddy also accused BRS of failing to acquire land for irrigation projects and leaving canal and distributor construction incomplete. He held former Chief Minister K Chandrashekhar Rao and ex-Irrigation Minister Harish Rao responsible for the stalled projects in the Krishna Basin.

Announcing the Congress government's commitment, he assured, "Under the leadership of Revanth Reddy, we will complete all Krishna Basin projects in the next three

Telangana HC warns HYDRAA of shutdown if it violates GO 99.

The Telangana High Court strongly criticized the Hyderabad Disaster Response and Assets Protection Agency (HYDRAA) on Thursday, cautioning that it may shut down the agency if it continues to act against Government Order 99

Justice K Lakshman expressed dissatisfaction over HYDRAA's approach, noting that despite issuing over 20 orders in similar cases, the agency had failed to adhere to proper legal procedures before carrying out demolitions.

The court was hearing a petition filed by A Praveen, who alleged that HYDRAA demolished his shed in Muttangi village, Sangareddy district, without proper notice or consideration of documents proving his land ownership.

HYDRAA officials, including Inspector Rajasekhar, appeared in court, defending their actions by claiming that the demolitions were conducted only after verifying documents. They argued that the permissions granted by the panchayat in November 2023 were obtained under pressure.

However, Justice Lakshman questioned how permissions granted in 2023 could be revoked in 2025 without due legal process. He also criticized HYDRAA for taking action based on complaints from private groups like the Gayatri Members Association, rather than legal man-

Stating that determining land rights falls under civil courts and not HYDRAA, the judge directed the agency to maintain the status quo on the petitioner's property and submit a counter by March 5, deferring further proceedings until then.

Maoist Leader Accused of Killing Two Police **Officers Surrenders**

A female Maoist leader accused of killing two police officers has surrendered in Telangana's Warangal district. Vanjem Kesha, a member of the banned Communist Party of India (Maoist), turned herself in on Friday, February 21. Warangal Police Commissioner Amber Kishore Jha revealed that Kesha had been associated with the Maoist group since childhood, having been a member of Chaitanya Natya Mandali. Her father, Hidma, also a Maoist worker, is

currently in jail. "In 2017, Kesha joined CPI (Maoist) through Pamed local squad commander Gotte Kamala and worked in the Chaitanya Natya Mandali under Punnem Joga for two years. Later, she was transferred to the Abujmarh hill forest area and became a member of the Protection Group for the Central Committee led by Kadari Satyanarayana Reddy," said Commissioner

Kesha remained in the Maoist area committee until December 2022 before moving to Chhattisgarh's North Bastar division, where she met her husband, Ramesh, also a Maoist leader, who is now imprisoned in Maharashtra.

Involvement in Police Killings In April 2024, Kesha became the female commander of the Kosa Protection Group. During a gunfire exchange in Koyalibeda village, she killed a police officer and seriously injured another. She was also responsible for another officer's death in the Abujmarh hill forest area. Both attacks occurred in Maoist-affected regions of Chhattisgarh, following which the Telangana government announced a ₹4 lakh

bounty on her. Reasons for Surrender

Kesha surrendered after the Telangana government introduced rehabilitation schemes for former Maoists. Commissioner Jha assured her full assistance and safety, citing health concerns as another reason behind her decision to lay down arms.



BJP MP Warns 'Corrupt' IAS, IPS Officers of 'Saffron Book'

Eatala Rajender warns corrupt IAS, IPS officers of consequences. Criticizes Congress' caste census as a "drama" and questions its effectiveness. Urges voters to back BJP candidate Puli Sarottam Reddy in MLC elections.

Malkajgiri BJP MP Eatala Rajender has warned IAS and IPS officers engaging in corruption under political influence, stating that they will be named in a "saffron book" and face consequences from higher authorities. Speaking at a press conference in Warangal on Wednesday, February 19, during the campaign for the Warangal-Khammam-Nalgonda constituency teacher MLC elections, Rajender accused senior officials of misusing their power and assured that they would be held accountable.

He also criticized the Congress-led government's caste census initiative, calling it a mere political stunt. Rajender argued that after one survey was completed, another was ordered, exposing the inefficiency of Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy's administration.

Mocking the Congress' claim of offering 42% seats to BCs in local body elections, he pointed out that the party failed to provide official reservations, making their promise meaningless.

He also raised concerns about the practicality of conducting a nationwide caste census, citing variations in caste classifications across states. "For instance, Lambadas are considered SCs in Telangana but OBCs in Karnataka," he said.

Rajender urged voters to support BJP candidate Puli Sarottam Reddy with their first preference vote. The press conference saw participation from key BJP leaders, including Warangal district president Ganta Ravi Kumar and former MP Dr. Sitaram Naik, who reiterated the party's stance on corruption and governance

Public Inquiry into Kaleshwaram Project to Begin on Feb 24

The commission led by Justice PC Ghosh, which is investigating irregularities in the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project, is set to begin a multi-phase public inquiry from February 24. The project includes the construction of the Medigadda, Annaram, and Sundilla barrages.

Justice Ghosh is scheduled to arrive in Hyderabad on February 23 after a visit to Kolkata. The commission, which has already recorded testimonies and examined several individuals, is now expected to summon key figures from the previous BRS government, including senior bureaucrats and engineers involved in

To allow for a detailed investigation, the government has extended the commission's deadline until the end of April, as it was initially set to conclude this month. The National Dam Safety Authority (NDSA) is also expected to present its final report on construction deficiencies in the barrages during this phase of the inquiry. The commission had earlier urged the NDSA to expedite its findings, and a preliminary report has already been submitted to the Ministry of Jal Shakti. The inquiry comes amid growing concerns over the structural integrity and safety of the Kaleshwaram project, one of the largest multi-stage lift irrigation projects in the world.

RS Praveen Kumar slams **Congress for targeting Harish Rao**

Alleges political vendetta, misuse of police to silence opposition

BRS leader RS Praveen Kumar has accused the Congress government of targeting former minister T Harish Rao with fabricated cases, alleging that the ruling party is using police and legal mechanisms to suppress opposition voices.

Speaking at Telangana Bhavan on Friday, Praveen Kumar claimed that Harish Rao was being framed in corruption and phone tapping cases solely because he was effectively cornering the government on public issues. He alleged that a criminal named Chakradhar, reportedly close to Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy, had filed a false complaint at Panjagutta police station, leading to the FIR against Harish Rao.

"Harish Rao, a seven-time MLA from Siddipet, served Telangana with dedication, particularly during the Covid-19 crisis as the health minister. Unlike Revanth Reddy, who was involved in the Cash-for-Vote scam, Harish Rao has never been linked to corruption. Yet, he is being implicated through multiple cases, showing the Congress government's intent to silence him," Praveen Kumar stated.

He further accused police officials of acting under political pressure, specifically naming DCP SM Vijay Kumar for allegedly coercing individuals to falsely implicate Harish Rao. He cited the



alleged torture of Vamsi Krishna, a former associate of Harish Rao, in the phone-tapping case as an example of such pressure tactics.

Highlighting Chakradhar's criminal background, Praveen Kumar pointed out multiple cases against him, including charges of sexual assault, fraud involving job aspirants, and kidnapping. He questioned how an FIR was swiftly registered against Harish Rao based on Chakradhar's complaint despite a previous High Court writ being withdrawn.

He also criticized the selective approach of law enforcement, alleging that complaints against Congress leaders were ignored while BRS leaders like Kaushik Reddy and Erolla Srinivas were being falsely implicated. Praveen Kumar urged the DGP to ensure additional security for Harish Rao, citing threats from Congress leaders, and warned that BRS was ready to counter any politically motivated cases.

Revanth Reddy pledging Telangana to Rahul Gandhi

Congress collecting 'Rahul and Revanth tax' from builders, industrialists

TPN Correspondent | Medak Union Minister G Kishan Reddy launched a sharp attack on Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy, accusing him of pledging Telangana to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi. Speaking at a graduate and teacher MLC election campaign meeting in Medak on Friday, he alleged that the Congress was imposing a



"Rahul and Revanth tax" on builders and industrialists in the state.

Kishan Reddy claimed that Revanth Reddy had failed to deliver on his promises and had disappointed the people of Telangana. "Congress came to power promising change, but the only change we see is their leaders grabbing power and opportunities while neglecting the welfare of the people," he remarked.

He further stated that voters in the Adilabad-Nizamabad-Karimnagar and Medak graduate and teachers' constituencies would teach Congress a lesson for its false promises. Confident of BJP's future prospects, he asserted that the party would emerge victorious in all upcoming elections in Telangana, paving the way for a double-engine government.

Reddy criticized the Congress government for failing to implement key promises, including the loan waiver, Rythu Bharosa, job calendar, and unemployment pen-

Medak MP M Raghunandan Rao, BJP graduate constituency candidate Chinnamal Anji Reddy, and teachers' constituency candidate Malka Komuraiah were also present at the event.

Former Congress MLA campaigns for independent candidate in Asifabad

In a setback to the Congress ahead of the MLC polls, former Sirpur (T) MLA Koneru Konappa has distanced himself from the party's official candidate and begun campaigning for Independent candidate Prasanna Harikrishna. Sources indicate that Konappa is considering quitting Congress, though he has not made an official announcement yet.

Addressing voters in Penchikalpet mandal on Friday, Konappa urged support for Harikrishna, stating that he would be a strong voice for graduates in the Legislative Council. He praised Harikrishna's contributions to education, emphasizing that thousands of students had benefited from his efforts. His decision to back an Independent candidate has surprised many within political circles.

Konappa's move has not only exposed internal rifts within the Congress but has also dealt a blow to Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy's leadership. The development highlights the party's struggles in managing dissent and preventing defections.

On February 15, Konappa hinted at contesting as an Independent in future elections, stating that he would consult with the people before making a decision. However, he denied rumors of joining the

Konappa, who previously contested on a BRS ticket in the 2023 Assembly elections, was defeated by BJP's Dr. Harish Babu. He later joined Congress in March. He had earlier won from the Sirpur (T) segment in 2004, 2014, and 2018.

Former Minister and senior BRS leader S Niranjan Reddy accused the Congress government of neglecting Telangana's irrigation projects and misleading the public on water issues. He questioned the government's failure to complete the Palamuru-Rangareddy Lift Irrigation Project, which is crucial for the State's water needs.

"We built the Palamuru-Rangareddy project at a cost of ₹34,000 crore and finished around 90 percent of the work. Instead of completing the pending works and providing irrigation water, the Congress has sidelined it," he said, criticizing the ruling party for not allocating funds for its completion.

Addressing mediapersons in Wanaparthy on Friday, Niranjan Reddy alleged that leaders from Congress, BJP, and TDP had remained silent on Telangana's irrigation projects for political reasons. He slammed the Revanth Reddy-led government for spreading falsehoods about water supply while deliberately stalling project completion.

"They claim Telangana is not receiving adequate water, yet they refuse to clear pending contractor bills. Without funds, how will the project be completed?" he questioned.

The former Agriculture Minister also dismissed the Congress government's corruption allegations as false propaganda,



pointing out that Hyderabad is now benefiting from Kaleshwaram project water. He accused the Congress of failing to address Andhra Pradesh's alleged illegal usage of Krishna river water, stating that AP had diverted 660 TMC this monsoon while Revanth Reddy remained silent.

Niranjan Reddy further charged the Congress with failing on every major election promise-from pension hikes to Rythu Bharosa—leading to farmer suicides, auto driver deaths, and student distress.

Challenging Congress Ministers for a public debate on unfulfilled promises, he asserted that the BRS had elevated Telangana's per capita income to ₹3.26 lakh and transformed rural livelihoods.

"No matter the misinformation against former Chief Minister K Chandrashekhar Rao and the previous BRS government, people know the truth," he declared, reiterating that BRS would continue fighting for Telangana's rights.

Cyberabad Police Busts Transnational Crypto Scam; Andhra Youth Arrested

Cyberabad Cybercrime Police have busted a transnational cryptocurrency scam impersonating Morgan Stanley, leading to the arrest of a 22-year-old from Andhra Pradesh. The accused, Pathi Manikanta from Y.S.R Kadapa district, was involved in crypto and mule account trading, maintaining connections with crypto traders, agents, and Chinese nationals. Meanwhile, his associates from Haryana remain on the run, with efforts underway to apprehend them.

The fraud was exposed following a complaint from a software engineer in August 2024, who lost ₹52.3 lakh in a crypto investment scheme that falsely claimed affiliation with Morgan Stanley. According to police, scammers used UK-based Telegram and WhatsApp numbers, promising 20% daily returns to lure victims into fraudulent cryptocurrency investments.

Investigations revealed that the criminal



network used sophisticated layering techniques to launder funds across multiple crypto platforms, including Binance, Ku-Coin, and Trust Wallet. Due to the complex nature of the scam and its international links, Cyberabad police deployed a specialized team of tech experts. The probe uncovered connections to China, Hong Kong, and the UK. Officials confirmed that the accused was in direct contact with Chinese criminal groups via Telegram for the procurement and sale of mule bank accounts. With court orders, Binance has successfully seized the stolen assets. Authorities, including the Indian Cybercrime Coordination Centre (I4C) and the Financial Intelligence Unit (FIU-Ind), are now working on recovering the victim's lost funds. **Advisory to Citizens:**

Hyderabad airport set to handle 50 million passengers in five years

GMR Group investing ₹370 crore to expand cargo terminal, enhance capacity

The GMR Group, which operates the Rajiv Gandhi International Airport (RGIA), expects passenger traffic to rise to 50 million annually by FY 2031, up from the current 29 million in FY 2025.

GHIAL CEO Pradeep Panicker stated that the airport witnessed significant growth, handling 25 million passengers in FY 2024 and is projected to close at 29 million by March 2025. "As per our projections, we could be hitting close to 50 million passengers by 2031," he said. The airport was originally built in 2008 with a capacity of 12 million but has gradually expanded to accommodate up to 40 million passengers.

In a bid to enhance cargo oper- ity of 42 aircraft movements ations, GMR is investing ₹370 per hour, currently handling crore to expand the existing around 34-35 movements. cargo terminal and construct a Panicker also highlighted the

new facility, aiming to increase the total handling capacity to nearly four lakh tons annually. "The expansion of the existing terminal will cost around ₹215 crore, while the new terminal will require approximately ₹155 crore," Panicker noted. The new terminal is expected to be operational by June or July this year, while expansion work on the existing terminal has already commenced.

Rapid growth and capacity enhancements

GHIAL, one of the fastest-growing metro airports in the country, saw a rare feat last year by adding 3.6 million passengers over the previous year, a growth rate matched only by Delhi airport. The airport's runway has a declared capac-



surge in international cargo, attributing it to disruptions caused by the Red Sea crisis, which has affected global trade and shipping routes. GHIAL is expected to handle 1.8 lakh tons of cargo this fiscal, marking a 20% increase over the previous year. 

Govt Allows 24-Hour Operations for Shops During Ramzan

The Telangana government has issued orders permitting shops and establishments to operate round the clock from March 2 to March 31 in observance of the holy month of Ramzan.

Principal Secretary of the Labor Department, Sanjay Kumar, stated that employees working beyond the standard 8-hour workday or 48-hour workweek must be compensated at double their regular wages. Furthermore, those required to work on holidays should be granted an alternative day off.

Additionally, the government clarified that female employees are permitted to work night shifts as per Government Order No. 476.

Reduced Work Hours for Muslim Employees

The Telangana government has also granted Muslim government employees permission to leave offices and schools an hour early during Ramzan. This relaxation, effective from March 2 to March 31, applies to contract, outsourcing, board, and Public Sector employees, allowing them to leave by 4 PM. Meanwhile, Hyderabad is gearing up for the holy month, with traders preparing for increased business activity and mosques across the city making arrangements for worshippers. The Central Ruet-e-Hilal Committee is set to convene to determine the official start date of Ramzan based on the sighting of the crescent moon.

Jadcherla Farmers Protest Over **Udandapur Reservoir Compensation Delay**

Farmers and residents in Jadcherla mandal are protesting against the Congress government over delays in compensation payments for land acquired for the Udandapur reservoir. They are demanding compensation at market value, citing the financial strain caused by parting with their lands.

With the delay in payments, farmers have been obstructing reservoir works and recently staged protests at the site. The project, with a 15.91 TMC capacity, has affected around 4,900 acres and over 2,850 structures in Vallur, Udandapur, and five surrounding hamlets.

"Even after elections, there is no word from Congress leaders



hike," farmers alleged. "The government must increase compensation to ₹16.5-25 lakh, considering market value," landowners demanded. Of the 1,950 identified structures, only 510 have received ₹45 crore in compensation so far. Families affected by the project also cited safety risks, pointing to the tragic death of two children on February 2.

However, even after a year, there has been no progress. Farmers submitted a representation to the District Collector, warning that they would continue to obstruct the project until fair compensation is granted.

Villagers Catch Trespassers Digging for Suspected Treasure in Medak

Eight-Year-Old Girl Raped by Two Youths in Sangareddy

A horrific incident has shaken Pasalwadi village near Sangareddy town, where an eight-year-old girl was allegedly raped by two youths on Thursday evening. The assault has sparked outrage among locals and prompted a swift police response.

According to authorities, the young girl was playing near a cluster of 2BHK houses when the two perpetrators lured her with an offer, enticing her into a secluded area of bushes. There, the assailants carried out the brutal attack. The girl's cries for help alerted residents after she began bleeding from her injuries.

Local residents rushed to the scene, managing to apprehend one of the accused. Enraged by the crime, they beat the suspect before turning him over to the police. The second accused fled and remains at large, with law enforcement launching a manhunt to capture him. The victim was immediately taken to the

government hospital in Sangareddy, where she is undergoing medical examination and treatment. Police have initiated a thorough investigation to uncover further details of the incident and ensure justice is served.

The assault has left the community in shock, with authorities urging anyone with information to come forward as the search for the second suspect intensifies.

Chemical Spill at Pharma Unit in Sangareddy

Injures Three Workers; Probe Underway

A chemical spill at a pharma company's Khajipally unit in Sangareddy district left three workers injured late Thursday night. The incident occurred while employees were filling a reactor with chemicals.

Authorities are probing the circumstances leading to the spill and whether safety protocols were followed at the facility.



Several NMIMS Students in Jadcherla Suffer Food Poisoning; **MLA Slams Administration**

Several students of Shri Vile Parle Kelavani Mandal (SVKM) Narsee Monjee Institute of Management Studies (NMIMS) in Jadcherla suffered food poisoning on February 20 after consuming a meal on campus. Instead of promptly shifting them to hospitals, the university administration allegedly attempted to suppress the incident by engaging private doctors to treat students on the floor of the library and common rooms.

According to student statements, this is not an isolated incident. They have repeatedly raised concerns about the poor quality of food and drinking water, but the administration has remained negligent. On Thursday, the sick bay quickly filled with students experiencing nausea, vomiting, stomach pain, and fever. Despite the severity of the situation, no ambulances were arranged until after persistent pressure from authorities.

upon learning of the incident and reprimanded being treated on the floor without proper medical care, he demanded immediate hospitalization for the affected students. In a video, he was seen ques-

tioning the university's attempt to suppress the incident, stating, "You are only trying to protect the university. Protect the children. If anything happens, who will take responsibility? Shift them to hospitals, idiot fellows."

Following his intervention, around 15-20 students, out of more than 50 affected, were shifted to hospitals in Mahabubnagar and Hyderabad for better treatment. Meanwhile, the university administration reportedly tried to block media access to the campus but was forced to allow them in after pro-

Whose Interests Was USAID **Really Serving in India?**

Recent revelations about the United political unrest. States Agency for International Development (USAID) and its funding in India raise important questions regardin India's electoral process. Reports uncovered by the newly formed Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), led by Elon Musk, have shed light on large sums of American taxpayer dollars being directed towards initiatives aimed at boosting voter turnout among marginalized communities in India, particularly ahead of the 2014 and 2019 parliamentary elections.

USAID has been involved in India for decades, initially focusing on food security and governance reforms. Since 2011, its Democratic Elections and Political Processes (DEPP) program has allocated substantial amounts of funding, with over \$318,000 annually given to the Consortium for Elections and Political Process Strengthening (CEPPS) for India-focused projects. In election years, funding spikes significantly, such as in FY2014, when \$21 million—about ₹182 crore—was spent on voter awareness campaigns during the national elections. However, funding dropped drastically after May 2014, suggesting an electoral rather than institutional focus. A similar funding pattern occurred in 2019, with \$486 million allocated regionally.

Despite claims by USAID of promoting democracy, US President Donald Trump raised concerns that these efforts were more about restricting democracy, questioning the need for such large sums in India's elections. In fact, USdrawn comparisons to those in other countries, such as Bangladesh, where funding from the US for "strengthening" landscape, especially when such efforts the political landscape" was linked to coincide with election cycles.



ing a focus on Dalit voter participation, have sparked controversy, especially as similar rhetoric later surfaced in political debates, such as Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's call for caste-based rights allocation.

The dual funding from USAID and tech giants like Google, Meta, and Microsoft to IFES has also raised concerns about conflicting interests, particularly as IFES's policy papers have promoted caste-based voter categorization. These AID's expenditures in India have often funding patterns and political alignments prompt questions about foreign influence in shaping India's political

'Hindu-Buddhist Bhai Bhai'? The Politics Behind the RSS-Buddhist Alliance at the Kumbh Mela



The grand spectacle of Hindu-Buddhist unity at the 2025 Kumbh Mela, featuring Buddhist monks alongside RSS leaders like Bhaiyyaji Joshi and Indresh Kumar, is less an eternal truth and more a political performance with deep historical precedents. This grand display of solidarity between Hinduism and Buddhism is not without its contradictions, as it reflects both the shared heritage of these traditions and the historical schisms between them. The roots of this alliance can be traced back to the early 20th century. In 1923, Anagarika Dharmapala, a Sinhalese Buddhist leader, proclaimed at the Akhil Bharatiya Hindu Mahasabha that "Buddhists are also Hindus." This was a crucial moment in the historical construction of Hindu nationalism, as leaders like Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya echoed the sentiment, positioning Buddhism, Jainism, and Sikhism as sects within the broader Hindu fold. Such attempts to incorporate Buddhism into the Hindu identity were motivated by political pragmatism rather than deep spiritual kinship, as the emerging Hindu nationalist movement sought to consolidate power and create a unified Hindu identity.

However, this narrative of harmonious unity overlooks the historical hostility between Brahmanism and Buddhism. Ancient Buddhist texts such as the Tevijja Sutta and Ambattha Sutta criticize the Brahmanical caste system, and brahminical texts often portrayed the Buddha as a heretic or disruptive force. Even during the colonial era, figures like Swami Vivekananda presented Buddhism as a misguided offshoot of Hinduism, reinforcing the idea of an antagonistic relationship between the two traditions.

In the early 20th century, Hindu nationalist leaders, facing colonial rule and internal divisions, sought to include Buddhists within the "Hindu Nation." This was a strategic move, aimed at uniting marginalized groups while excluding Muslims and Christians, viewed as external threats. Anagarika Dharmapala's involvement in these debates was driven by his desire to gain control over the Maha

Bodhi Temple in Bodh Gaya, a symbol of Buddhist heritage. The most striking example of this alliance was in 1935, when the Hindu Mahasabha invited U Ottama, a Buddhist monk from Burma, to preside over the organization, an alliance forged more out of shared anti-colonial politics than religious unity.

In the present day, the Kumbh Mela's display of Hindu-Buddhist unity is underpinned by similar political calculations. While the resolutions passed at the event condemn the persecution of minorities in Bangladesh and Pakistan, the lack of any similar critique of India's marginalized communities, particularly Dalits, is notable. This selective advocacy underscores the political nature of this alliance, which often sidelines internal dissent.

The participation of Tibetan exiles at the Kumbh Mela also signals a shift from colonial-era alliances. With Tibetans reliant on Indian support, many are forced to align with the RSS and BJP to secure their place in India, even as they remain cautious of these political forces. Thus, the "Hindu-Buddhist bhai bhai" narrative at the Kumbh Mela is a performance grounded in political pragmatism, shaped by the shifting dynamics of power, history, and survival. The deep-rooted contradictions in this alliance raise questions about its durability, suggesting that alliances of convenience may not endure without tension.

The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) on Friday expressed concerns over the recent cancellation of a \$21 million US-AID funding by the Donald Trump administration, intended for voter turnout programs in India. The MEA described the decision as "deeply troubling" and raised alarms about potential foreign interference in the country's internal affairs.

Spokesperson for the MEA, Randhir Jaiswal, stated, "We have seen information that has been put out by the US administration regarding certain USA activities and funding. These are obviously very deeply troubling. This has led to concerns about foreign interference in India's internal affairs." His comments came after the US government halted the funding, which was aimed at supporting voter engagement and turnout initiatives during elections in India.

The funding was part of USAID's broader efforts to strengthen democratic processes globally, including in India, but the recent developments have sparked tensions between the two countries. The Indian government's response highlights its growing sensitivity to perceived foreign involvement in its domestic matters, particularly when it comes to elections and political processes.

The USAID initiative had been designed to support voter education and ensure fair electoral participation in the world's largest democracy. However, critics argue that the cancellation of the funds could undermine efforts to increase political engagement among Indian citizens, especially in remote areas.

The US move comes amid a broader conversation about foreign influence on global democracies and the need for nations to safeguard their sovereignty and electoral processes from external interference. While the Indian government has expressed its displeasure over the funding cut, it remains to be seen how this issue will impact the relationship between the US and India moving forward.

Qatar's Growing Influence in Middle-East Politics and Its Ties with India

In a place where radical Islam and Shia-Sunni tensions often dominate, Qatar uses its vast natural gas reserves—third largest in the world after Russia and Iran—to wield considerable political leverage, often at the expense of more traditional regional powers.

The small Gulf nation has earned international recognition for its ability to play a central role in diplomatic negotiations. Qatar hosts the largest US airbase in the Middle East at Al Udeid and has brokered significant deals, such as the US-Iran prisoner swap in 2023. It was instrumental in facilitating the US-led coalition's withdrawal from Afghanistan in 2021 by offering refuge to Taliban leadership. Furthermore, Qatar has been actively involved in peace efforts in Gaza, facilitating ceasefires and hostage releases, and has had a hand in the civil wars in Yemen, Syria, and Libya. Notably, it maintains strong ties with the Muslim Brotherhood, further amplifying its political influence.

Under the leadership of Emir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani, Qatar has become an influential power in West Asia, adept at contributing to regional problem-solving. The Emir's diplomatic acumen has led Qatar to be recognized as a key player in shaping the future of the Middle East.

Acknowledging Qatar's growing stature in the region and the country's positive relationship with India, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, along with External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, made a notable gesture of respect during the visit of Sheikh Tamim to India in February 2025. Breaking diplomatic protocol, both leaders personally greeted the Emir and his delegation at Delhi's IGI Airport, underscoring the importance of Qatar's role in the Middle East and its cordial ties with the large Indian diaspora living in the Gulf nation.

"India Needs To Cut Tariffs For Its Own Good": NITI Aayog CEO

NITI Aayog CEO BVR Subrahmanyam asserted that tariffs do not protect countries, and India needs to reduce them for its own benefit, regardless of external pressures. Speaking at the 69th Foundation Day of the All India Management Association (AIMA), Subrahmanyam emphasized that being open to global markets should be one of India's top priorities if it aims to become a developed nation.

He highlighted the need for India to finalize trade agreements with key economies such as the European Union and the United Kingdom to facilitate tariff reductions. Subrahmanyam further stressed the importance of deregulation at both the central and state levels to integrate India into global supply chains.

Subrahmanyam also observed that while there is global interest in India, many investors are choosing to explore other countries instead.

He pointed to nations like Indonesia, Vietnam, and Turkey, which have benefitted from the "China plus one" strategy adopted by global companies seeking alternatives to China.

The NITI Aayog CEO argued that India's entry into global value chains requires more than just initiatives like the Production Linked Incentive (PLI); it also demands de-



regulation and a focus on skill development. He expressed concern about the bureaucratic red tape involved in business operations, which he claimed is stifling growth, particularly for MSMEs.

Subrahmanyam shared that NITI Aayog is working on integrating India into global supply chains across various sectors, including electronics, auto components, chemicals, textiles, and footwear. He also mentioned that the Aayog is awaiting Cabinet clearance for its recommendations on the electronics component supply chain and is preparing to launch a national manufacturing mission within three months.

In addition to manufacturing, Subrahmanyam identified education and agriculture as critical areas for India's development. He stressed the need to transform agriculture by shifting focus away from traditional crops like rice and wheat toward horticulture, floriculture, and dairy production. He also emphasized that states must be open to enterprises from other regions to stimulate growth, with a free-flowing enterprise environment being key to progress.

My father is 100% t, vote for him: Nitish's son urges Bihar people

Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's son, Nishant Kumar, on Friday urged the people of Bihar to vote for his father in the upcoming assembly elections, asserting that the 72-year-old leader is "100 per cent fit" to continue serving the state. Speaking briefly with journalists at Patna airport upon returning from a wedding in Delhi, Nishant appealed to voters to back his father's leadership, emphasizing the progress Bihar has seen under Nitish Kumar's tenure.

"This is an election year. I have urged the people to vote for my father before, and I do so again. He has done so much for Bihar, and his return to power will ensure that development continues without interruption," Nishant stated. His comments came amidst growing political speculation, with the state gearing up for assembly elections later this year.

Nishant was also questioned about rival RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav's recent remarks casting doubt on the health of Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, who is set to seek a fifth consecutive term. In response, Nishant firmly stated, "My father is 100 per cent fit," dismissing any concerns regarding his father's health.

While speculation surrounding Nishant's potential political career continues, with rumors suggesting he could join the JD(U) or even contest the assembly elections from Harnaut—his father's former constituency—he refrained from commenting on these matters. Nishant quickly moved past the group of journalists and entered his car, not addressing any further questions about his own political ambitions or the future of the party leadership.



India Rejects Turkish President Erdogan's Remarks on Kashmir, Lodges Protest

India on Friday strongly rejected Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan's comments on the Kashmir issue, stating that it is an internal matter of India and does not warrant external interference. The Indian Ministry of External Affairs lodged a formal protest with the Turkish ambassador in New Delhi over Erdogan's remarks, which were deemed both "unwarranted" and "unacceptable."

Erdogan's comments were made during his visit to Islamabad on February 13, following talks with Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif. In his statements, Erdogan called for the Kashmir issue to be addressed according to a United Nations resolution, suggesting that the matter should be resolved through dialogue between India and Pakistan, while considering the aspirations of the people of Kashmir.

The remarks, which diverged from Erdogan's usual stance on Kashmir, were viewed by India as a departure from his prior silence on the issue. For nearly two years, Erdogan had refrained from publicly commenting on Kashmir, even at international fo-

rums like the UN General Assembly and the D8 bloc. His sudden remarks sparked strong reactions from New Delhi, prompting a swift diplomatic response.

Indian External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal rejected the Turkish president's comments, asserting that "Jammu and Kashmir is an integral part of India" and that no other country has the right to comment on it. He further stressed that such statements undermined India's territorial integrity and sovereignty.

In response to Erdogan's remarks, the Indian government reiterated that matters related to Kashmir are purely domestic and are not subject to international mediation. India continues to maintain that it is committed to resolving any issues through dialogue, but only within the framework of its territorial sovereignty.

As the Kashmir issue remains a sensitive topic in India-Pakistan relations, India's firm stance against Erdogan's comments reinforces its position on the matter, further asserting that external interference is neither necessary nor acceptable.





Saudi Arabia Invests in Dark Skies to Boost Astrotourism

Raises Worries Of Interference In Internal Matters: India On USAID

India's Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) recently raised concerns over the US Agency for International Development (USAID) \$21 million funding aimed at voter turnout in India in 2012, saying it "raises worries of interference in India's internal matters." The response came amid a heated political clash between Congress and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), both of which have criticized the funding as "external interference" in India's electoral process.

The controversy intensified after the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), led by Elon Musk, identified the \$21 million allocation to India as part of a broader \$486 million audit of government expenditures in the US. DOGE's audit also included grants to Moldova for political process strengthening and other countries. The revelation spurred further political discourse, with BJP leaders accusing the Congress party of allowing external forces to influence India's elections.

Congress's Pawan Khera strongly criticized BJP leader Amit Malviya's claims, pointing out that the funding was approved in 2012, when the Congress-led UPA was in power, not the BJP. Khera sarcastically asked why the Congress would invite "external interference" if it was meant to sabotage its own electoral prospects. BJP leaders Nalin Kohli and Amit Malviya, however, questioned the rationale behind such a significant financial investment by a foreign entity into India's elections.

Former Chief Election Commissioner SY Quraishi refuted BJP claims, explaining that the funding was part of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the International Foundation for Electoral Systems (IFES), intended for election training and preparation. Quraishi denied any malicious intent behind the funding, which he described as a routine partnership with international organizations.

Post-Ramzan Protests Loom as Imran Khan's Party Targets Shehbaz Sharif Government

Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa, Pakistan (February 21) – Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) President of Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa, Junaid Akbar Khan, announced plans to launch a protest movement after Ramadan and reaffirmed the party's commitment to forming a grand opposition alliance. Speaking to the media outside Adiala Jail, Khan expressed his frustration after being denied a scheduled meeting with PTI's founding chairman, Imran Khan, by authorities.

Despite government restrictions, Junaid Akbar Khan emphasized that PTI leaders would continue to stand by their chairman's call. He dismissed claims that party leaders were avoiding jail visits, affirming that they remained fully committed to supporting Khan. Khan also confirmed the party's intention to rally opposition forces and organize large-scale protests after Eid, in what is expected to be a high-profile political initiative.

While speaking to reporters, PTI leaders suggested that the possibility of a sit-in outside Adiala Jail could be considered, should the situation demand it. They strongly criticized the government for restricting their efforts to meet with Imran Khan, describing these actions as a violation of constitutional rights.

In a related statement, PML-N President Nawaz Sharif reiterated his position that the people of Pakistan would no longer tolerate disruptions to national progress. He firmly stated that the country's development would not be held back by groups lacking political and democratic understanding, a reference aimed at the opposition parties.

PTI leaders, including Khan, have repeatedly accused the government of intentionally misrepresenting their party's actions and misguiding the public about the intentions of opposition leaders. Khan further criticized the government's tactics, calling them part of a broader strategy to undermine PTI and its leaders. He rejected accusations that PTI was responsible for any uncivilized political behavior, insisting that it was the ruling party's leaders who had first engaged in unethical political attacks. As the political situation continues to evolve in Pakistan, PTI's planned protests and opposition alliance efforts signal growing tensions within the country's political landscape.



Kash Patel Confirmed as FBI Director, Vows to Restore Trust in the Agency

Indian-origin Kash Patel was confirmed by the Senate on Thursday as the new director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Patel, who is a close ally of former President Donald Trump, expressed his gratitude and commitment to rebuilding the FBI into an organization that is "transparent, accountable, and committed to justice."

In his first statement following the confirmation, Patel thanked President Trump and Attorney General Pam Bondi for their unwavering support. "I am honored to be confirmed as the ninth Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Thank you to President Trump and Attorney General Bondi for your unwavering confidence and support," Patel said in a post on X.

Patel emphasized the need to restore public trust in the FBI, acknowledging the agency's significant role in protecting the nation, from the era of the "G-Men" to its post-9/11 mission of safeguarding Americans. However, he also acknowledged that the politicalization of the justice system had eroded public confidence in the Bureau, vowing to put an end to that. "The politicalization of our justice system has eroded public trust—but that ends today," he stated.

Patel promised to rebuild the FBI into an agency that the American people can be proud of. "Working alongside the dedicated men and women of the Bureau and our partners, we will rebuild an FBI the American people can be proud of," Patel said. He also issued a stern warning to those who pose threats to Americans: "To those who seek to harm Americans—consider this your warning. We will hunt you down in every corner of this planet."

The Senate confirmation vote for Patel passed narrowly, with a 51-49 result. While Senators Lisa Murkowski of Alaska and Susan Collins of Maine opposed his nomination, the majority of Republican Senators, including Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell, supported Patel. All Senate Democrats voted against his confirmation.



Kickback Scheme, What Do I Care? Trump On USAID As BJP Slams Congress

Former US President Donald Trump has once again voiced his criticism regarding the \$21 million allocated by the US government through USAID in 2012 for voter turnout programs in India. Calling the funding a "kickback scheme," Trump expressed indifference, stating, "What the hell do I care about it? We got enough problems." He did not provide further details or evidence to back his allegations.

Speaking to a gathering of Republican Party state Governors, Trump questioned the purpose of the funds, stating, "Can you imagine all that money going to India? I wonder what they think when they get it. Now, it is a kickback scheme... they kick it back to the people that send it." He further rambled on, suggesting that whenever there is a lack of understanding about certain matters, it could indicate a "kickback" situation. He also questioned the allocation of \$29 million to strengthen the political landscape in Bangladesh.

Trump's comments were part of his broader criticism of foreign aid, and he emphasized that his administration had terminated many such projects. "We got a lot. We got enough problems," he remarked, reiterating that the US needed to prioritize domestic issues.

The remarks sparked a political firestorm, especially in India, where Trump's comments were quickly picked up by opposition parties. The BJP, in particular, linked Trump's "kickback" comment to Congress MP Rahul Gandhi's earlier remarks in the UK, suggesting that he had insulted India abroad. In May 2023, Gandhi had stated that global democracies were in decline, urging US and European nations to recognize the threats to democracy. The BJP seized upon his comments, accusing him of undermining India's image on the international stage. Meanwhile, BJP leaders like Amit Malviya and Pradeep Bhandari claimed that the \$21 million was used to sustain "deep state assets" in India, accusing Gandhi and the Congress party of benefiting from the foreign aid.



Sebi Proposes Fast-Track Framework for REITs and InvITs Fundraising



The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) has unveiled a new proposal aimed at streamlining fundraising for real estate investment trusts (REITs) and infrastructure investment trusts (InvITs). On Thursday, the regulator introduced a framework for conducting fast-track follow-on offers, a move designed to make capital raising more efficient and accessible for these investment vehicles.

The proposed framework is expected to enhance the fundraising process by offering quicker and more flexible methods for REITs and InvITs to issue additional units. This initiative aims to reduce the time required for follow-on offers, thereby benefiting both the sponsors and investors.

As part of the proposal, Sebi has recommended a lock-in period of three years for units issued to sponsors through a preferential issue. This lock-in requirement is intended to align the interests of sponsors with those of other investors, ensuring that sponsors remain committed to the long-term growth and stability of the trust.

Sebi's move comes as part of its ongoing efforts to make the Indian capital market more dynamic and supportive of various investment vehicles. With real estate and infrastructure being key sectors in the country's growth, the framework for fast-track follow-on offers is expected to facilitate smoother and faster fundraising, attracting more capital into these sectors.

This proposal is set to significantly impact how REITs and InvITs raise funds in the future, making it easier for them to tap into the market and continue their expansion efforts. The regulator's push to improve fundraising efficiency is seen as a positive development for both investors and sponsors, offering more opportunities for growth in these investment channels.

Maruti Suzuki Aims for 50% Market Share and EV Dominance by FY30



India's largest carmaker, Maruti Suzuki, has set an ambitious target to reclaim a 50% market share in the country, with a bold vision laid out in its mid-term management plan for FY25-FY30. The company, which once held a dominant share of the Indian automotive market in FY19, is keen to retake that position by securing one out of every two cars sold in the country.

Currently, Maruti Suzuki holds a market share of 41.6% as of FY23, having lost some ground to competitors like Tata Motors, Hyundai, and Kia. The company is now focusing on strategic moves to enhance its position, with plans to introduce new models, enhance its production capacity, and expand its reach across various segments, including electric vehicles (EVs).

Despite entering the EV market later than its competitors, Maruti Suzuki has big plans for electric vehicles and aims to be the country's largest producer, exporter, and seller of EVs. The company has yet to start sales of its electric vehicles but is positioning itself to make a significant impact in the segment. Maruti Suzuki's delayed entry into the EV space is expected to be addressed with the launch of new electric models in the coming years as part of its broader strategy.

The company's renewed focus on regaining its market dominance and its plans to lead the EV market reflect the broader trends in the Indian automotive industry, where electric mobility is increasingly gaining traction. With a strong brand presence and extensive distribution network, Maruti Suzuki is well-positioned to meet its ambitious goals, provided it executes its strategy effectively in the years leading up to FY30.

Market falls as auto stocks tumble; Sensex down 429 points

Domestic stock markets fell sharply on Friday, weighed down by auto stocks and weak global cues. Investors remained cautious due to the absence of positive triggers and continued selling by foreign institutional investors (FIIs). The decline in auto stocks, particularly after reports of Tesla's potential entry into India, added to the downward pressure. Analysts suggest that unless the markets stabilize and consolidate over the next few days, a trend reversal is unlikely.

The BSE Sensex, which had closed at 75,735 in the previous session, opened at 75,612 and fluctuated between an intraday high of 75,612 and a low of 75,112. It eventually settled at 75,311, down 429

points. The NSE Nifty opened at 22,857, touched a high of 22,921 and a low of 22,720, before closing at 22,795, a loss of 117 points. The Nifty Bank also dropped 353 points to settle at 48,981.

Market breadth on the NSE favored sellers, with 1,744 stocks declining against 1,100 gainers out of the 2,916 traded. While 23 stocks hit 52-week highs, 91 reached new lows. Among the Nifty50 stocks, 13 advanced

while 37 declined. Hindalco, Tata Steel, Eicher Motors, Larsen & Toubro, and SBI Life were the top gainers, while M&M, Adani Ports, BPCL, Tata Motors, and Adani Enterprises were among the



biggest losers.

The rupee weakened slightly against the US dollar, closing at 86.71. Meanwhile, Mahindra & Mahindra shares took a hit following reports of Tesla's potential India entry. Tata Steel CEO TV Narendran noted that US tariffs could impact Indian exports. Varun Beverages shares saw an uptick on high trading volume, year low.

As India moves toward this ambitious target, attracting both domestic and foreign investment will play a critical role in shaping its future.

RBI MPC Minutes

Interest Rate Cut and Focus on Economic Growth

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) recently the government's Union Budreleased the minutes from its Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting held on February 21, highlighting the rationale behind the recent 25 basis points (bps) repo rate reduction and discussing the outlook for inflation and economic growth. The decision marks the RBI's first rate cut in five years, signaling a shift in policy aimed at boosting India's economic momentum as inflation shows signs of aligning with the central bank's target.

In its first bi-monthly MPC meeting of 2025, the RBI lowered the benchmark repo rate from 6.50% to 6.25% and maintained a neutral stance. This move follows a prolonged period of restrictive monetary policy, with policymakers expressing concerns over its impact on economic growth. In his comments, RBI Governor Malhotra emphasized that the rate cut was necessary to support growth, noting that retail inflation was moving closer to the RBI's 4% target.

The MPC members were largely in agreement that India's inflation outlook was turning positive, particularly with food inflation easing. India's retail inflation fell to 4.31% in January, a fivemonth low. Governor Malhotra praised

get proposals, particularly in agriculture and fiscal consolidation, which are seen as positive for price stability and inflation expectations. He suggested that the combination of monetary easing and growth-oriented measures from the Union Budget could lead to an uptick in household consumption and investments.

However, concerns over global uncertainties, such as trade policy and weather events, were also highlighted. External MPC member Saugata Bhattacharya noted that the policy repo rate might become excessively restrictive if inflation continues on its downward trajectory, potentially harming growth.

The meeting also stressed the need for continued support for economic growth. Deputy Governor M. Rajeshwar Rao suggested that with inflation aligning with the RBI's target, the central bank had more room to address growth concerns. MPC members pointed to subdued private consumption, particularly due to low real wage growth, and urged a more accommodative policy stance to




revive private capital expenditure. The committee also expressed concerns over the subdued Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) inflows into the country and noted that growth-supportive policies would remain a priority. External member Nagesh Kumar advocated for a more aggressive 50-basis-point rate cut to signal India's commitment to growth, although the committee opted for a more cautious 25 bps reduction due to global uncertainties.

Looking ahead, the RBI revised India's GDP growth forecast for FY2025-26 to 6.7%, while maintaining its inflation target for the fiscal year at 4.8%. The next MPC meeting is scheduled for April

Amazon to Shut Down Appstore for Android Devices, Discontinue Digital Program



Amazon has announced the discontinuation of its Amazon Appstore for Android devices, marking the end of a 14-year journey since its launch in 2011. The e-commerce giant revealed that the app store will be shut down for Android users on August 20, 2025. While it will no longer be available for download on Android smartphones and tablets, the Appstore will still function on Amazon's own devices, including Fire tablets, Fire TV streaming devices, and other devices running Fire OS.

In addition to phasing out the Amazon Appstore for Android, Amazon will also be winding down its digital currency program, Amazon Coins. These virtual coins, which allowed users to make purchases or in-app transactions on the Appstore, will no longer be available for purchase. Existing users will need to use any remaining Coins by August 20, 2025, or they will be refunded after that date. A new FAQ page on Amazon's website clarifies that users will not be able to download the Appstore on Android devices af-

ter the shutdown. Additionally, Amazon warns that any apps already downloaded from the Appstore may cease functioning once the store is discontinued. For users with active subscriptions, the company advises disabling auto-renewals through the account settings on Amazon's website.

While the company has not provided an official reason for discontinuing the app store on Android devices, it is possible that the decision relates to increased restrictions on sideloaded apps and new APIs introduced by Google with Android 15. These changes have made it harder for alternative app stores to thrive on the Android ecosystem, potentially influencing Amazon's decision.

Although the closure marks the end of Amazon's Appstore for Android, users with Amazon's own devices will continue to have access to the store. The shutdown of Amazon Coins further signifies the company's shift away from the program, as it transitions to other business priorities.

Rare "Doomsday Fish" Washes Ashore in Mexico, Sparks Alarm



Arare and elusive oarfish was spotted in the shallow waters of Baja California Sur, alongMexico's Pacific Coast, sparking alarm among locals and online communities alike. Known for its long, ribbon-like body and vibrant orange fins, the deep-sea fish is often referred to as the "doomsday fish" due to legends that associate its sightings with impending disasters.

The oarfish, a creature rarely seen by humans, has long been believed to be a harbinger of bad news, particularly disasters or destruction. In Japanese mythology, it is known as "Ryugu no tsukai," meaning "Messenger of the Sea God." This myth gained widespread attention when approximately 20 oarfish washed ashore ahead of Japan's catastrophic 2011 earthquake, leading many to draw connections between the fish's appearance and significant seismic events.

A video of the oarfish washing ashore in Mexico was shared by an X user named FearBuck, who wrote, "A deep-sea creature

rarely seen by humans called the oarfish has washed ashore in Mexico!" The video quickly garnered attention and sparked a flood of comments. Many users expressed their concern, with one writing, "There have actually been multiple oarfish that have been spotted on beaches recently. Does that mean doomsday is coming?"

Despite these concerns, experts disagree with the claim that oarfish sightings are always linked to impending disasters. While the fish's mysterious nature and dramatic appearance have fueled superstition, marine biologists emphasize that oarfish are naturally inclined to swim closer to shore when injured or dying, and their rare appearance doesn't necessarily predict a disaster.

While some continue to fear the arrival of a major event, others see the fish's appearance as a fascinating reminder of the mysterious creatures that inhabit our oceans. Regardless of the superstition, the sighting of the "doomsday fish" has once again captured the imagination


PCB Seeks Explanation from ICC Over Omission of Pakistan's Name in Champions Trophy Branding


