Delhi Suffered ₹2,002-Crore **Loss Due to Liquor Policy**

Excise rule violations led to favoritism.

- Wholesaler margin hike linked to kickbacks.
- Private shops sold more top liquor brands.
- AAP leaders jailed over liquor policy scam.

The Delhi government incurred a massive loss of ₹2,002.68 crore due to the controversial liquor policy implemented in November 2021 and scrapped in September 2022, according to a report by the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG). The report, tabled in the Delhi Assembly on Tuesday, flagged multiple financial and procedural irregularities, sparking uproar and leading to the suspension of several AAP MLAs.

The liquor policy has remained a contentious issue, leading to the arrests of several AAP leaders, including former Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and ex-Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia. Allegations of corruption sur-

to have played a crucial role in AAP's defeat in this month's Assembly elections, allowing the BJP to return to power in Delhi after 26 years.

Breakdown of Losses

The CAG report detailed how various policy decisions and omissions led to the ₹2,002.68 crore revenue loss. The most significant loss of ₹941.53 crore resulted from liquor shops not being allowed to operate in non-conforming areas, which do not meet land-use norms for opening liquor vends.

Another ₹890.15 crore was lost due to tenders not being issued for 19 zones where licences had been surrendered. The report criticized the government for failing to put in place alternative

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quor retail in these zones, leading to a complete loss of excise revenue from them.

Additionally, the Delhi government suffered a ₹144-crore revenue loss due to the waiving of fees for licensees under the pretext of COVID-19 relief. Another ₹27 crore was lost due to the incorrect collection of security deposits from zonal licensees.

Regulatory Violations and Favoritism

The report highlighted regulatory lapses, particularly the failure of the Delhi Excise Department to implement Rule 35 of the Delhi Excise Rules, 2010. This rule prohibits the issuance of multiple licences—wholesaler, retailer, and HCR (hotel, clubs, and restaurants)to related parties. The lapse, according to sources, benefited certain businesses and led to monopolization.

One of the most controversial aspects of the liquor policy was the increase 12%. The Enforcement Directorate had previously claimed that half of this increased margin was meant to be recovered as kickbacks for AAP leaders. The report stated that the justification given for the increase—setting up government-approved laboratories at warehouses to check for sub-standard liquor and covering local transportation costs—was unconvincing, as these quality-checking labs were never made operational.

The policy also enabled monopolization, with just three wholesalers—Indospirit, Mahadev Liquors, and Brindco—accounting for 71.7% of liquor sales in Delhi. Of the 367 Indian-Made Foreign Liquor (IMFL) brands supplied by 13 wholesalers, Indospirit supplied 76 brands, Mahadev Liquors 71 brands, and Brindco 45 brands, giving them significant market dominance.

Revenue Loss Due to Private Retailers

whiskey brands were sold significantly more at private shops than at government-run liquor outlets, leading to a direct revenue loss for the Delhi government. For instance, only 9.25% of Royal Stag Reserve/Premier whiskey sales occurred at government shops, with the remaining 90.75% happening at private vends. Similarly, only 2.26% of "MCD No.1" (likely McDowell's No.1) whiskey sales took place at government-run stores.

The findings of the CAG report have further intensified the political controversy surrounding the liquor policy. The policy, which was introduced by the AAP government as part of excise reforms, has now emerged as a major factor in the party's electoral downfall and legal troubles for its top leaders. With key figures like Kejriwal and Sisodia behind bars, the issue continues to haunt the AAP as the BJP strengthens its hold on Delhi politics.

Did Right Thing: Atishi Defends AAP's Excise Policy After CAG Reports

Following the presentation of the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) reporton Delhi's excise policy in the Delhi Assembly, Leader of Oppositionand AAP leader Atishicame to the defense of the previous Arvind Kejriwal-led governmentAtishi argued that the report highlighted the shortcomings of the old excise policy, which the AAP government had previously exposed and replaced with a new, revised policy.

In a press conference on Tuesday, Atishi stated, The excise audit report presented today in the Assembly covers seven chapters on the excise policy from 2017-21, while one chapter focuses on the new excise policy. The AAP government was the first to highlight the flaws and corruption in the old policy to the people of Delhi.

She went on to point out that the previous policy led to the illegal sourcing of liquor from neighboring states, such as Haryana and Uttar Pradesh, resulting in financial lossesfor Delhi. She said, "This report is reiterating what we have been saying all along—that the old policy was causing financial harm to the people of Delhi. The decision to remove it was the right one."

Atishi further accused the previous excise policy of corruption, revealing that the report showed 28 percent of liquor sales were tainted by corruptionShe alleged that con-



tractors involved in the liquor trade had manipulated pricing, leading to black market sales with profits lining the pockets of brokers. The AAP leader also suggested that the connections between liquor contractors and political parties were well known, raising questions about the policy's integrity.

The report, which was tabled by the BJP-led government in Delhi under Chief Minister Rekha Guptafocused on the performance audit of the regulation and supply of liquorin the National Capital Territory from 2017 to 2021According to the CAG's findings, the Delhi governmentlost over Rs 2,000 crore during the period under review due to the 2021-2022 excise policy. The audit also raised concerns about the **ineffectiveness of the Excise Departmentin monitoring and regulating liquor distribution.

The presentation of the CAG report comes as one of 14 pending reports concerning the previous AAP government's performance.

It will 100% Happen: Punjab Congress buzz over Kejriwal's possible Rajya Sabha entry

Amid growing speculation about Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) National Convenor Arvind Kejriwal's potential entry into the Rajya Sabha, Punjab's Leader of Opposition and Congress leader, Partap Singh Bajwa, asserted that Kejriwal's entry is certain. Bajwa revealed that Kejriwal initially considered entering the Rajya Sabha through the seat of the late AAP MLA Gurpreet Gogi, but backed out due to concerns that it would provoke a strong backlash in Punjab, where locals might not support an "outsider" taking the seat.

Bajwa, speaking to ANI, stated, "This will 100 per cent happen," when asked about the speculation surrounding Kejriwal's Rajya Sabha ambitions. He further explained, "Kejriwal initially wanted to come through Gurpreet's seat, but realized this would have a massive reaction in Punjab. So, he took a step back." Bajwa added that there could be some truth to the information suggesting that AAP's Rajya Sabha MP Sanjeev Arora may contest the Ludhiana West Assembly bypoll.

In another twist, Bajwa made explosive allegations against Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, claiming he is secretly in talks to join the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). Bajwa accused Union Minister Ravneet Bittu of facilitating covert discussions between Mann and BJP leaders. "Bittu is pretending to protest outside the CM's residence while secretly arranging meetings between the CM and BJP leaders," Bajwa claimed.

Bajwa also predicted that the AAP government in Punjab might collapse within the next four to five months, drawing a parallel to the political upheaval in Maharashtra, where Shiv Sena MLAs defected to form a new government. He further claimed that 32 AAP MLAs are in touch with him



and ready to switch to Congress, likening this to the way people pre-book tickets for Diljit Dosanjh's concerts. "These MLAs are doing 'advance booking' to join Congress," Bajwa said.

As the Leader of the Opposition in Punjab, Bajwa emphasized that Congress is not attempting to destabilize the AAP government but rather that AAP MLAs are voluntarily seeking to join Congress, sensing no future within AAP. He added that once elections are called, these MLAs would be formally welcomed into the party.

In response, Punjab Minister Harpal Singh Cheema slammed Bajwa for engaging in "low-level politics" and accused him of trying to secure a position within the BJP. Cheema also reaffirmed AAP's unity, asserting that no MLA from the party is leaving.

Meanwhile, BJP leader Tarun Chugh also commented, claiming that leaders from both AAP and Congress are eager to join the BJP, further intensifying the political drama in Punjab.



Former Congress leader Sajjan Kumar was sentenced to life imprisonment by a special court on Tuesday in connection with the 1984 anti-Sikh riots, where he was convicted of involvement in a murder case. The court had previously found him guilty on February 12, and today's sentence marks a significant moment in the long-running legal proceedings related to the tragic events of 1984.

The case stems from the violence that erupted after the assassination of Prime Minister Indira Gandhi in 1984, which led to widespread anti-Sikh riots across India. Sajjan Kumar was accused of orchestrating and inciting violence against the Sikh community, particularly in the aftermath of Gandhi's death.

In accordance with a Supreme Court order, the court had sought a report from the authorities at Tihar Central Jail regarding Kumar's psychiatric and psychological evaluation. This was in response to the Supreme Court's directive, which applies to cases that could attract the death penalty. Although the minimum punishment for murder is life imprisonment, the court also considered the possibility of a death sentence before ultimately imposing life imprisonment as the penalty for Kumar's conviction.

Sajjan Kumar's conviction and sentencing represent a significant step in the pursuit of justice for the victims of the 1984 riots, a dark chapter in India's history. His role in the events has been a subject of intense scrutiny, and his conviction follows a prolonged legal battle that spanned several decades.

While the case has sparked mixed reactions, with some expressing satisfaction over the verdict, others believe more needs to be done to hold accountable all those responsible for the violence. The 1984 anti-Sikh riots remain a painful memory for many, and today's verdict serves as a reminder of the ongoing struggle for justice and accountability.

Clean Delhi, excellent education system: Delhi L-G unveils BJP govt agenda

On Monday, Lieutenant Governor (L-G) of Delhi, Vinai Kumar Saxena, presented a 10-point agenda for the BJP-led Delhi government during the opening session of the Delhi Assembly. The L-G's address set the tone for the government's priorities over the next five years.

The agenda focuses on several key areas, including promoting a corruption-free and efficient administration, empowering women, improving welfare for the poor, and enhancing health facilities. The government also aims to create a world-class education system, improve road transport, ensure a clean and pollution-free environment, and prioritize the revival of the Yamuna river. In the coming months, the government's primary focus will be resolving issues related to roads, drains, sewer lines, health services, and the provision of clean drinking water.

Amid some pandemonium in the assembly, the L-G emphasized that the government's approach would be practical and focused on the welfare of the common people. With the 10-point agenda, the Delhi BJP-led government has outlined a clear roadmap for development, with specific attention to public infrastructure and essential services.

SC Directs NCR States to Submit Waste Management Plans by March

The Supreme Court of India on Monday directed the states in the National Capital Region (NCR) to submit comprehensive waste management plans, emphasizing the importance of segregating waste at source for environmental protection. The court highlighted that such segregation is essential to ensure effective waste management and to meet sustainability goals.

In its order, a bench led by Justice Additionally, the court called for AS Oka, with Justice Ujjal Bhuyan, questioned how cities could be considered "smart" without adhering to Solid Waste Management Rules. The bench underlined the need for proper waste management practices as a key component of urban development. It directed the NCR states to file affidavits by March, detailing their plans for waste management, including timelines and designated implementing agencies. The affidavits must cover all urban local bodies within the NCR.

The Supreme Court also instructed the states to outline the "best practices" they intend to implement in managing solid waste. These plans are expected to align with the national waste management regulations, which have been in place since 2016.



a report from the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) regarding the environmental impact of waste-to-energy projects. This move aims to assess the efficacy and environmental consequences of these initiatives, which are often promoted as part of urban waste management solutions.

The order was issued as part of the ongoing case regarding the implementation of the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016, in the NCR. The region includes Delhi and surrounding districts in Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, and Rajasthan. The Supreme Court's focus on waste segregation and effective management underscores its commitment to improving environmental standards and ensuring cleaner, smarter cities across the NCR.

AAP MLA Amanatuliah Khan Granted Anticipatory Bail in Obstruction of Arrest Case



- Court questions Delhi Police's handling of the arrest - Khan denies wrongdoing; investigation continues

AAP MLA Amanatullah Khan was granted anticipatory bail by a Delhi court in an obstruction of arrest case, after being accused of preventing police from arresting Shahwez Khan, a proclaimed offender. The court, presided over by Special Judge Jitendra Singh, set the bail amount at Rs. 25,000 along with one surety in a like amount.

The case stems from an incident that occurred on **February 10, when the Delhi Police registered a case against Khan for allegedly obstructing public servants in the Jamia Nagar area. Khan had been granted ** interim protection from arrest earlier, which was extended until Monday. The court also extended the protection for a day after questioning the police's actions during the arrest attempt.

During Monday's hearing, Special Judge Singh raised questions regarding the police's handling of the situation, particularly the presence of Shahwez Khan inside a shop for 20 minutesafter securing anticipatory bail. The judge inquired, "What were the police officers doing with him inside a shop for 20 minutes?" This raised concerns about the conduct of the

police and their actions during the attempted arrest.

The Delhi Police had sought Khan's custody to question him regarding his presence at the scene of the alleged attack, citing CCTV footage and witness statementsas evidence. The police accused Khan of lying about his whereabouts during the incident and obstructing their duties by allegedly interfering with the arrest of Shahwez Khan.

Khan, on his part, denied any wrongdoing and maintained that he was not present at the location of the incident. His supporters also stood by him, claiming that he was being falsely implicated. Meanwhile, the Delhi Police insisted on interrogating Khan to understand his role and ascertain the full extent of his involvement in the case.

Khan has been booked under various sections, including Section 221 (obstruction of public servants while performing their duties) and Section 132 (criminal force or assault against a public servant). As the investigation continues, the case has sparked political debate and scrutiny over the actions of both the police and the legislator.

Delhi Speaker Expels Atishi And 12 AAP MLAs **Amid Protests During L-G Address**

Delhi Speaker Vijender Gupta expelled 12 Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) MLAs, including Leader of Opposition Atishi and senior leader Gopal Rai, from the Delhi Assembly for the day on Tuesday. The expulsion came after the MLAs raised slogans during Lieutenant Governor VK Saxena's address.

The expelled MLAs included Veer Singh Dhingan, Mukesh Ahlawat, Chaudhary Zubair Ahmed, Anil Jha, Vishesh Ravi, and Jarnail Singh, among others. The protest was sparked by AAP's allegations against the BJP-led administration in Delhi regarding the removal of BR Ambedkar's portrait from the Chief Minister's office.

Atishi, speaking to the press, accused the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) of disrespecting Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar by replacing his portrait with that of Prime Minister Narendra Modi in both the Delhi Secretariat and the Assembly. "The BJP has shown its true colours by removing Babasaheb Ambedkar's portrait. Does it believe Modi can replace Babasaheb?" she questioned, highlighting the perceived insult to the Dalit icon.



Atishi further argued that when AAP MLAs raised slogans in support of Ambedkar, they were suspended, but BJP MLAs who raised slogans in praise of PM Modi faced no such action. "This means the BJP hates Dr. Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar," Atishi said.

Meanwhile, Delhi's new BJP-led government, under Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, was set to present 14 reports by the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) during the assembly session. These reports, expected to highlight financial irregularities under the previous AAP government, are seen as a key move by the BJP to hold AAP accountable for alleged corruption. Delhi BJP chief Virendra Sachdeva criticized the AAP government and emphasized that the CAG report would reveal the party's "black deeds" to the people of Delhi.

The heated exchanges reflect the ongoing political tensions between the AAP and BJP, with both sides accusing each other of disrespecting the legacy of Dr. Ambedkar and engaging in corruption.

Bihar CM Nitish Kumar meets BJP president JP Nadda in Patna

Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar met with BJP president JP Nadda on Tuesday in Patna, where the two leaders engaged in discussions regarding political developments in the state. The meeting took place at the State Guest House, where Nadda had been staying after arriving in Patna.

The short yet significant interaction between the leaders was centered around the upcoming Bihar Assembly elections, which are scheduled to take place later this year. Although details of the discussions were not made public, the meeting highlighted the ongoing political activity in the state as parties prepare for the election season.

Nadda arrived in Bihar on Monday to attend a wedding hosted by a BJP leader in Gaya. Following the wedding, he continued his visit to the state and is expected to stay for the centenary celebrations of the Patna Medical College and Hospital. The event will be graced by President Draupadi Murmu, adding further prominence to Nadda's visit.



The meeting between Nitish Kumar and JP Nadda is seen as a part of the larger political discourse as various parties gear up for the upcoming elections, especially with the continued political dynamics between the ruling JD(U) and BJP in Bihar. Both parties, which were once in alliance, have since parted ways, leading to a more contentious political climate in the state.

Kumar and Nadda's brief meeting further fueled speculations on the potential strategies each party will adopt as they approach the polls. With the election season on the horizon, both the BJP and the ruling JD(U) will likely continue to engage in high-stakes political maneuvers.

SP govt aided only its own people; we work for every UP resident: Adityanath

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Tuesday criticized the Samajwadi Party (SP), accusing it of selectively distributing financial aid to individuals affiliated with the party during its rule and branding welfare initiatives under the party's name. In contrast, Adityanath asserted that the BJP government is committed to serving all residents of the state, emphasizing impartiality in its welfare programs.

Responding to opposition ques-

the Chief Minister highlighted several key government initiatives. He stated, "It is no longer difficult for any poor person to receive medical treatment in Uttar Pradesh." Under the Ayushman Bharat scheme and the Chief Minister's Jan Arogya Yojana, approximately 10 crore people in the state are provided with health insurance coverage of up to Rs 5 lakh per year, Adityanath said.

Further elaborating on healthcare accessibility, Adityanath mentioned that all government employees are eligible for free healthcare under the tions in the legislative council, Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Cashless Health Scheme. He also pointed out that elected officials such as MLAs and MLCs can allocate funds from their annual budgets to assist those in financial need.

The Chief Minister also took the opportunity to underline the transparency and fairness of the BJP government's financial aid distribution. "Over the past seven-and-a-half years, funds from the Chief Minister's discretionary corpus have been allocated without any bias based on caste, region, or language," he stated. Adityanath emphasized that if a district magistrate submits a report within three days, the required funds are released immediately, ensuring timely support to the people in need.

Adityanath's remarks come amid growing political tension between the ruling BJP and opposition parties, particularly as the state gears up for future elections. His defense of the BJP's welfare schemes is seen as part of the party's strategy to consolidate its support base ahead of the polls.

Tharoor hailed the revival of longstalled Free Trade Agreement (FTA) negotiations between India and the UK, expressing his enthusiasm for the renewed talks on social media. "It was good to exchange words with Jonathan Reynolds, in the company of Piyush Goyal. The revival of FTA negotiations is most welcome," Tharoor wrote on X (formerly Twitter).

While the post attracted attention for its content, it also sparked a political debate due to its timing. The selfie and Tharoor's positive remarks on the FTA came just days after the Congress leader's controversial article in an English-language daily. In the piece, Tharoor had praised the Left Democratic Front (LDF) government in Kerala for its efforts in improving the state's investment climate, which led to a backlash from some Congress leaders in Kerala.

Critics within the Congress



raised concerns over Tharoor's apparent praise for the LDF, with many questioning the article's tone and content. However, the Communist Party of India (Marxist) - CPI(M) welcomed Tharoor's views, viewing them as a positive endorsement of Kerala's entrepreneurial growth. Tharoor later clarified that his article was not intended to praise the ruling CPI(M)-led government but was instead focused on Despite the controversy, Thahighlighting Kerala's progress in the start-up sector and its evolving business environment.

The controversy surrounding his article intensified as

the BJP seized the opportunity to comment on Tharoor's position within the Congress. BJP IT department head Amit Malviya suggested that Tharoor's marginalization within the party was inevitable, especially after he contested the Congress presidential election against the "Gandhi family nominee," Mallikarjun Kharge.

Punjab Assembly Passes Resolution Against Centre's Draft Policy On Agriculture

- Punjab rejects Centre's farm policy draft
- Claims it revives repealed farm laws
- CM Mann defends APMC mandis

The Punjab Assembly on Tuesday unanimously passed a resolution rejecting the Centre's draft of the National Policy Framework on Agricultural Marketing, asserting that it seeks to reinstate provisions of the three controversial farm laws that were repealed in 2021 following widespread protests from farmers.

The resolution was introduced by Punjab's Agriculture Minister, Gurmeet Singh Khuddian, on the last day of a two-day assembly session. Notably, two BJP MLAs were absent when the resolution was passed.

The Centre had shared the draft of the National Policy Framework with the state government last year, seeking its feedback. The policy aims to "build a vibrant marketing ecosystem" that allows

farmers to find markets where they can achieve the best prices for their produce. However, the Punjab Assembly expressed concerns that the policy would reintroduce provisions that had sparked major unrest during the farm law protests.

The resolution stated, "The House feels that this draft policy is an attempt to bring back the contentious provisions of the three farm laws repealed in 2021 by the Government of India." It also stressed that agricultural policies should remain under the jurisdiction of individual states, in accordance with the Constitution. and that the Centre should not impose such policies on states.

Further, the resolution recommended that the Punjab government take a strong stance against the policy to protect and strengthen the state's Agricultural Produce

Market Committee (APMC) mandis. These mandis, which operate under a transparent regulatory framework, are seen as essential for safeguarding farmers' interests.

The resolution warned that the policy's push to promote private markets would lead to the dilution of APMC markets, putting farmers at the mercy of private market owners. Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann voiced his opposition to the draft policy, reiterating that his government had already rejected it and would not allow the rights of the states to be undermined.

The resolution also criticized the Centre for withholding Punjab's rural development fund, adding to the tension between the state and the central government.

Three-Language Imposition Is Wrong: Ranjana Nachiyaar **Resigns from BJP**

Actor-turned-politician Ranjana Nachiyaar resigned from the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Tuesday, citing opposition to the imposition of the three-language formula. In her resignation statement, she criticized the central government's push for the policy, which she described as a wrong move, particularly in the context of Tamil Nadu's linguistic preferences.

This resignation comes amid escalating political tensions in Tamil Nadu over the language issue. AIADMK Member of Parliament M Thambidurai accused the ruling Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) government of using the language debate as a political tool ahead of the upcoming elections. Thambidurai questioned the state government's stance on the New Education Policy (NEP), pointing out the contradiction between the government's opposition to Hindi and its approval of CBSE schools, which offer multiple languages, including Hindi.

"The current government allows numerous CBSE schools, which teach several languages, yet they raise concerns over Hindi. If Stalin accusing the central government is so committed to the language issue, he should insist on removing

all CBSE schools from Tamil Nadu. Then the language problem would be solved," Thambidurai said, referring to Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M. K. Stalin.

The AIADMK MP suggested that the DMK's political stance on the language issue was merely a strategy to garner votes ahead of the elections. "The government is responsible for providing welfare and facilities to the people. The language issue is being used to divert attention from more pressing concerns," Thambidurai added.

On Monday, DMK supporters organized a protest near the central bus stand in Tiruchirappalli, strongly opposing the threelanguage system. The protest saw party members distributing pamphlets to raise public awareness about their opposition to the policy.

The DMK has consistently opposed efforts to make Hindi more dominant in Tamil Nadu, arguing that such policies would undermine Tamil culture and identity. Party spokesperson TKS Elangovan had earlier expressed concerns about the NEP's potential impact on Tamil Nadu's education system, of attempting to impose religious ideologies through education.

15 Firearms Surrendered in Manipur After Governor's Appeal for Voluntary Disarmament

At least 15 firearms were voluntarily surrendered to the police in three districts of Manipur on Tuesday, following a recent appeal from Manipur Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla for residents to hand over looted and illegally held weapons. This initiative came in the wake of ongoing ethnic violence between the Meitei and Kuki-Zo communities that has left over 250 dead and thousands displaced since May 2023.

According to officials, four firearms, including an SMC Carbine and a double-barrel gun, along with three hand grenades, were handed over at the Singjamei Police Station in Imphal West district. In Imphal East, a self-loading rifle was surrendered to the Andro Police Station, while five firearms were turned in at the Sagolmang Police Station. Additionally, one 9 mm pistol and ammunition were surrendered at Heingang Police Station, and four guns were given up in Churachandpur.

Bhalla had Governor made a public appeal

on February 20, urging the people of Manipur to voluntarily surrender any looted or unlawfully possessed weapons within a week. He assured that no punitive action would be taken against those who complied during this period. Authorities had set the deadline for February 27, after which security forces would begin taking action to recover any remaining illegal arms.



Delhi To Jaipur In 30 Mins? India's First Hyperloop Test Track **Is Ready**


India has taken a significant step toward the future of highspeed transportation with the completion of its first hyperloop test track at IIT Madras. This groundbreaking project, developed with support from the Ministry of Railways, features a 422-meter-long test track, marking a major milestone in the pursuit of hyperloop technology. The system, once fully operational, will enable travel between cities at incredible speeds, making it possible to cover a distance of 350 km in just 30 minutes. This means you could travel from Delhi to Jaipur, a journey of about 300 km, in less than half an hour.

Union Minister for Railways, Ashwini Vaishnaw, shared the exciting news on X (formerly Twitter), praising the government-academia collaboration for driving innovation in futuristic transportation. He expressed optimism about the potential of the hyperloop, stating, "The first pod of 422 meters will go a long way in developing technologies." He also an-

nounced that after the initial two grants of one million dollars each, a third grant of one million dollars will be provided to IIT Madras to further develop the hyperloop project.

The hyperloop concept, often referred to as the "fifth mode of transport," involves highspeed trains that travel within vacuum tubes. These trains use special capsules that levitate through electromagnetic forces, reducing friction and air drag, and enabling speeds of up to Mach 1.0 (around 761 miles per hour). This technology promises to revolutionize long-distance travel by offering speeds that exceed those of airplanes, while also being immune to weather disruptions and ensuring a collision-free commute.

The Ministry of Railways plans to launch India's first commercial hyperloop project soon, marking a significant leap toward futuristic, high-speed transport systems. With low power consumption, energy storage capabilities for 24-hour operation, and the potential for cutting-edge travel, the hyperloop holds the promise of reshaping how we commute in the future.

Tamil vs Hindi: The Unending Tussle Over NEP

The ongoing confrontation between the Tamil Nadu government and the Centre over the National Education Policy (NEP) is poised to dominate the political landscape in the state, especially with the 2026 elections on the horizon. At the heart of this dispute is the Centre's insistence on implementing a three-language policy, which the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) vehemently opposes. While the Centre maintains that there will be no imposition of Hindi, the DMK refuses to back down, citing concerns of linguistic and regional identity.

The History of Tamil Nadu's Two-Language Policy

The roots of this debate can be traced back to 1968 when the DMK, under the leadership of Chief Minister C.N. Annadurai, adopted the two-language policy. This policy rejected the central government's push for a three-language formula and emphasized Tamil and English as the primary languages of instruction in the state. Over the years, Tamil Nadu has steadfastly defended this policy, viewing the protection of Tamil as crucial to the state's identity.

Dravidian politics in Tamil Nadu has always been closely tied to the protection of Tamil. The strong opposition to Hindi, a symbol of North Indian dominance in the eyes of many in the South, has been one of the most defining features of the political narrative since the state's formation in 1949. The protests against Hindi imposition in the 1950s, culminating in the creation of linguistic states in 1956, set the stage for Tamil Nadu's unique relationship with language politics.

Language: Still a Defining Issue in Politics?

Given this historical backdrop, the current confrontation over the NEP's three-language policy is not surprising. The policy suggests that any Indian language could be taught as a third language, but the DMK remains suspicious. Its leaders argue that, in practice, Hindi would become the third language in most schools. This suspicion has been heightened by recent comments from Union Minister Dharmendra Pradhan, who stated that the Centre might withhold funds from Tamil Nadu if the state refuses to implement the NEP. The DMK's narrative positions this as an assault on the state's linguistic rights, fueling the party's political stance in the lead-up to the 2026 elections.



The Ukraine Peace Talks: A Dangerous Game Played by Trump and Putin

This week, US-Russia peace talks over the fate of Ukraine have begun—but one glaring issue stands out: Ukraine itself has been notably excluded from the discussions. While this omission has rightfully drawn criticism, the underlying problem is far more complex. A peace deal could theoretically be brokered with an intermediary, but only if the talks acknowledge the harsh realities of the situation. The actual obstacles to peace—such as enforcing a ceasefire across a 1,000 km front

line—are barely being addressed. What's unfolding is less a serious diplomatic effort and more a chaotic game of chess, where one side doesn't understand the rules, and the other is making them up as it goes along.

Donald Trump, the self-proclaimed "artist of the deal," has confidently declared that he could end the war in a single day. Meanwhile, Vladimir Putin and his inner circle are laughing behind the scenes. Humiliating the United States has long been a goal for the Russian leadership, and now, with Trump's assistance, they are enjoying just that. Pu-



tin is not negotiating in good faith; this is not his style. Whether in Georgia or Donbas, ceasefires have served as strategic traps in the past, and there's no reason to believe this time will be any different. Despite the mounting costs of the war, Putin remains steadfast in his demands: full control over Ukraine, either through annexation or by installing a puppet government. For Russia's conservative elites, Ukraine is seen as vital to Russia's imperial ambitions, while economic oligarchs covet its vast mineral resources and the potential for sanctions relief. Trump, amplifying Kremlin propaganda, helps legitimize the war in the eyes of ordinary Russians.

While these talks may not result in Putin securing his ultimate goal of Ukraine, they are serving his broader objectives: easing sanctions, humiliating the US, and weakening NATO. With Trump's collaboration, Putin is getting exactly what he wants. The irony here is that Ukraine may not be the biggest loser in this situation. Kyiv has seen a decrease in US military aid, but it has also ramped up its own weapons

production and sought additional support from Europe. Today, Ukraine is in a much stronger position than it was three years ago, and it will continue to fight, with or without Washington's help.

The real casualty in these talks is the United States. Trump is willing to trade the country's global standing for the entertainment of Putin and the confusion of US allies. The world watches as the US president echoes the rhetoric of one of its greatest adversaries. The long-term damage to the US's reputation and to international security may be far greater than Trump realizes.

The Three Dimensions of the Debate

The DMK's opposition to the NEP can be understood in three key dimensions. First, it sees the issue as a matter of federalism, arguing that education should remain under the state's control, not the Centre's. Since 1976, education has been placed on the Concurrent List, which allows both the Centre and states to legislate on the matter. The DMK contends that this has led to the gradual introduction of Hindi in Tamil Nadu schools, even though Tamil is the state's official language.

Second, the DMK frames this debate as one of Hindi imposition, alleging that the Centre is pushing Hindi onto non-Hindi speaking regions through its policies. Third, the confrontation is depicted as a broader ideological battle between Dravidian politics and Hindutva, which the DMK claims is being advanced by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and its ideological partner, the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS).

BJP's Caution in Handling the Issue

As the DMK continues to project the NEP debate as a fight for Tamil identity, the BJP and the Centre must tread carefully. Any perceived coercion could bolster the DMK's position, especially with the party's narrative gaining traction in the state. The BJP must avoid turning the issue into a polarizing political battle, as this would only solidify the DMK's stance and alienate regional allies.

At the same time, the question arises whether the linguistic divide in Tamil Nadu still holds the same weight it once did. Can one truly advocate for the protection of Tamil while appreciating the cultural richness of Hindi and other languages? The intellectual discourse on language must evolve, moving away from political confrontations and instead focusing on the idea that the celebration of one language does not diminish the value of another.

As Tamil Nadu continues to grapple with this issue, one thing is clear: the emotional charge surrounding language in the state remains a potent force. Whether the debate will evolve or continue to fuel political campaigns remains to be seen. But one thing is certain—the tussle over the NEP will not die anytime soon.

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, who recently came under heavy criticism for her "Mrityu Kumbh" comment, today issued a strong rebuttal, specifically targeting Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath and his remarks. Banerjee defended herself, stating that her criticism had been "distorted" and turned into "complete lies."

"I will not get blisters from any abuses that Yogi Saheb hurls at me. I respect him as a Chief Minister," Mamata Banerjee said during a press conference. She also expressed concern about the lack of post-mortem certificates and death certificates for those who died in the incident in Uttar Pradesh. "We conducted post-mortems of the bodies that reached here. I don't know what happened in other states. And if you have announced compensation, you should give them the money," she added, referring to the deadly stampede at the Kumbh Mela, which led to at least 30



fatalities and more than 60 injuries.

Banerjee's remarks come after The West Bengal Chief Minis-Uttar Pradesh Assembly, where he had sharply criticized critics of the Kumbh Mela. He made a comparison, saying, "Vultures got dead bodies. Pigs got filth... whereas sensitive people got a beautiful picture of relationships, traders got business, devotees got clean arrangements." His comments were met with

applause from the members of the Uttar Pradesh Assembly.

Yogi Adityanath's address in the ter also used the opportunity to highlight her state's handling of large crowds during festivals, drawing parallels to the preparation required for events in Bengal, such as the Gangasagar Mela and Durga Puja. "One should always consider one's capacity. How many can go, how many can stay... preparations that are necessary even for a wedding

feast," she stated, adding that the "hype" surrounding the Kumbh Mela was unnecessary.

Banerjee reiterated that her original remarks had been misrepresented. "What they have been saying are untruths. Complete lies. I have never disrespected any religion in my life and will never do that," she stressed.

The Chief Minister also referred to the tragic fire at a Kolkata hospital and the swift actions of her government in managing the aftermath. "We do not sleep for days. We keep an eye on things. We plan minutely, else the people suffer," she said, emphasizing the need for meticulous planning and quick response in handling such incidents.

Her controversial "Mrityu Kumbh" remark, made in reference to the stampede, had stirred significant backlash from the BJP, particularly as it came at a time when the Opposition had already been critical of the handling of the Kumbh Mela disaster.

Sword Over South States: MK Stalin Slams Delimitation, 'Hindi Imposition

The upcoming delimitation exercise, which involves redrawing parliamentary constituencies based on population levels, has become the latest flashpoint in the ongoing tensions between Tamil Nadu's ruling DMK and the BJP-led central government. This exercise is expected to significantly alter the proportion of Lok Sabha MPs from southern states, and Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin has raised alarms over its potential impact on the state's representation in Parliament.

In a statement on Tuesday, Stalin called for an all-party meeting to discuss the issue, warning that the state's voice in the national legislature could be "crushed." He emphasized that Tamil Nadu, which has been successful in controlling its population growth, could either see minimal gains of only two additional seats or, more dramatically, lose up to eight seats if the centre opts for a redistribution of the 543 existing seats. Under such a scenario, the total number of Lok Sabha seats would increase, with Uttar Pradesh—a BJP stronghold—gaining additional seats, potentially making it easier for the BJP to win in the future.

Critics argue that this change could be skewed in favour of BJP-dominated states like Uttar Pradesh, leaving southern states like Tamil Nadu at a disadvantage. In response, Stalin reiterated that this issue is about Tamil Nadu's rights and asked all political parties to unite in defense of the state's representation.

Simultaneously, the state remains embroiled in a contentious debate over the National Education Policy (NEP) and the three-language policy, which the DMK has strongly criticized as an imposition of Hindi. This issue has sparked a renewed call for a "language war," evoking memories of fierce language riots in the 1930s and 1960s. Stalin's son, Udhayanidhi Stalin, has echoed the call, and the DMK has opposed any move to impose Hindi in Tamil Nadu's schools.

This move marks a significant step towards reorganizing the party, particularly in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) region, where party leadership changes have been ongoing.

According to PTI's Secretary General, the decision is aimed at providing Junaid Akbar, the newly appointed president of PTI's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa chapter, the necessary space to restructure the party effectively. The party leader emphasized that this decision would grant Akbar a free hand in managing party affairs in the province,



which has been central to PTI's political operations.

The reshuffling of leadership began last month when Imran Khan made the decision to remove Ali Amin Gandapur, the former Chief Minister of KP, from his position as the provincial president of PTI. In his place, Khan appointed Junaid Akbar,

Donald Trump calls France 'Oldest Ally, Macron stresses shared vision for peace

In a statement posted on X, Trump underscored the long-standing diplomatic relationship between the two nations, emphasizing their shared commitment to global peace, freedom, and prosperity. He acknowledged that France's support for the United States during the American Revolution marked the beginning of a cherished partnership that has been a force for good in the world.

Trump's remarks came at a time when global discussions around security, diplomacy, and economic collaboration are prominent. He reaffirmed the strength of the US-France alliance and its importance in addressing key global challenges. Trump's statement was a reminder of the historical significance of the relationship, which spans centuries of cooperation, including during world wars, diplomatic agreements, and economic partnerships.

French President Emmanuel Macron also reaffirmed the enduring bond between the two countries. In a statement, Macron expressed France's ongoing commitment to working with the United States in upholding peace and cooperation on the international stage. He emphasized that both nations share a long-standing dedication to global stability and continue to collaborate on key international issues such as NATO commitments, economic growth, and counterterrorism efforts.

Experts predict that a verdict could be delivered by mid-March, with some drawing comparisons to past cases. This has led to speculation that Yoon's case could follow a similar timeline.

Legal scholars largely agree that the court will likely uphold the impeachment. Experts argue that Yoon's refusal to cooperate with prosecutors and his handling of martial law make it difficult to justify his commitment to the constitution. Unlike Park's case, which involved multiple corruption issues, Yoon's trial is relatively straightforward, focusing solely on his declaration of martial law.

However, Yoon's legal troubles don't end with the impeachment trial. He faces charges of insurrection for his martial law declaration, with the potential for life imprisonment or even the death penalty if convicted. His criminal trial could stretch on for one to two years, with a possible heavy sentence if he is found guilty.

If Yoon is removed from office, South Korea would be required to hold fresh elections within 60 days. The current frontrunner in the polls is Lee Jaemyung, leader of the opposition Democratic Party. However, analysts caution that the political landscape remains fluid, especially given Lee's own legal challenges, including a suspended prison sentence for election law violations.

The deal, initially proposed by Ukraine as part of Zelensky's "victory plan" in September, aimed to offer business incentives to Trump in exchange for continued US security support. However, the latest draft of the agreement reportedly asks for 50% of Ukraine's mineral revenue without providing the security guarantees Ukraine desperately needs in its fight against Russia. Zelensky rejected an earlier draft, fearing the long-term financial burden it would place on future generations. These new rules, which took effect in February, grant Canadian border officials broad powers to alter the visa status of students, workers, and migrants at any time, potentially leading to the cancellation of permits, visas, and even residency.

The Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations now give border personnel the authority to deny or cancel temporary resident documents, such as electronic travel authorizations (eTAs) and temporary resident visas (TRVs). This includes work permits and student visas. The new regulations also allow border

These regulations bring a level of uncertainty for tens of thousands of international students and workers in Canada, with Indians forming the largest group in both categories. If their permit is canceled while already in Canada, they will be required to leave by a specified date.

In addition to students and workers, Canada also experiences a significant influx of tourists from India, with more than 360,000 Indians having received travel visas in the first half of 2024 alone. These travelers are also subject to the new temporary permit regulations.

India Imports €49 Billion Worth of Russian Oil in Third Year of Ukraine Invasion



ICRA Predicts 7-8% Revenue Growth for India Inc in Q4

Domestic rating agency ICRA projected that Indian companies are likely to see a 7-8% revenue growth during the March quarter of the current fiscal year, driven by a revival in rural demand and increased government spending. However, the agency also highlighted that the private expenditure capital (capex) cycle is expected to remain subdued

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India, the world's third-largest oil consumer and importer, purchased crude oil worth 49 billion euros from Russia in the third year of Moscow's invasion of Ukraine, according to a recent report by the Centre for Research on Energy and Clean Air. India, which traditionally relied on oil from the Middle East, significantly increased its imports of Russian crude after the invasion in February 2022.

This surge in Russian oil imports can be attributed to the steep discounts on Russian crude, a result of Western sanctions and some European nations halting purchases. As a result, India's imports of Russian oil grew

dramatically, rising from less ued reliance on discounted Rusthan 1% of its total oil imports to around 40% in a short span of time.

The report highlights that Russia's dominance in new markets has solidified in the third year of the invasion. The three largest buyers of Russian fossil fuels-China, India, and Turkey-accounted for 74% of Russia's total revenues from fossil fuel exports. Specifically, China bought oil worth €78 billion, India €49 billion, and Turkey €34 billion.

India's imports of Russian oil showed an 8% year-on-year increase, underscoring the contin-

sian crude. Meanwhile, Russia's total global earnings from fossil fuels in the third year of the invasion reached 242 billion euros, adding to a cumulative total of 847 billion euros since the start of the war.

This trend marks a significant shift in global energy markets, with India emerging as a key buyer of Russian oil amid the ongoing geopolitical conflict. However, the growing reliance on Russian crude continues to raise concerns about the longterm implications for both global energy security and India's foreign policy.

ICRA noted that despite these challenges, certain sectors, particularly those receiving government support through production-linked incentive schemes, will continue to thrive. These include sunrise industries such as electronics, semiconductors, and electric vehicles (EVs), which are set to see increased investments.

The agency further mentioned that the recovery in operating profit margins (OPM) for India Inc. observed in the past quarter is likely to be sustained, with expectations of margins staying between 18.2-18.4%. This growth will be supported by rising demand, bolstered by improved consumer sentiments.

ICRA also emphasized the outlook for rural demand, which is expected to remain robust

in the first half of CY2025. This will be supported by strong output from the kharif crops and a favorable forecast for the ongoing rabi season. However, the outlook for agriculture will depend on the arrival of a normal and well-distributed monsoon in 2025.

Urban demand, which has been weak in recent quarters, is anticipated to improve. This recovery will be driven by factors such as the significant income-tax relief in the Union Budget for 2025, monetary easing by the Reserve Bank of India, and expectations of a moderation in food inflation, which would aid discretionary consumption, according to Kinjal Shah, Senior Vice President and Co-Group Head of Corporate Ratings at ICRA.

Adani Green Energy Secures 1,250 MW Energy Storage Project in UP

Adani Green Energy Limited (AGEL), India's largest renewable energy company, has received a Letter of Award (LOA) from Uttar Pradesh Power Corporation Limited (UPPCL) for the development of a 1,250 MW energy storage capacity through Pumped Hydro Storage Projects (PSP). This project, named Panaura PSP, will be located in the Sonbhadra district of Uttar Pradesh and is expected to be completed within the next six years. The project will have a minimum commitment period of 40 years, reinforcing AGEL's long-term focus on clean energy infrastructure.

This move is aligned with India's clean energy goals, which emphasize the need for large-scale utility storage projects to integrate renewable energy into the grid and provide consistent,

round-the-clock energy. The storage capacity will help manage the intermittent nature of renewable sources like solar and wind, making the grid more stable and efficient.

In line with this strategic goal, Adani Green Energy is expanding its portfolio to include energy storage solutions alongside its existing solar, wind, and hybrid projects. The company has ambitious plans to add over 5 GW of hydro PSP capacity by 2030. 

IIT Madras Creates Concrete To Help Build Homes On The Red Planet



A team from the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Madras, led by Dr. Piyush Chaunsali, Associate Professor in the Department of Civil Engineering, has made a significant breakthrough in extraterrestrial construction. The team, known as Extraterrestrial Manufacturing (ExTeM), has developed a unique type of concrete specifically designed for use on Mars. What sets this concrete apart is that it does not require water—a major challenge for future Mars colonization.

While studies have suggested that water may exist in small quantities in Mars' crust, no large, accessible sources have been found, making it difficult to plan long-term human settlements. The new water-free concrete developed by ExTeM could be a game-changer in overcoming this limitation. The innovative concrete is strong, durable, and meets Earth's construction standards, thanks to a special compound that is mixed with sulphur—a material readily available on the Martian surface. Adithya Plato Sidharth, a postdoctoral researcher with ExTeM, explained in an interview with India Today that the team used sulphur-based compounds to create concrete that can withstand the harsh Martian environment. "We used a compound mixed with sulphur, which is abundant on Mars, to develop a concrete that matches Earth standards," said Sidharth.

This breakthrough could play a pivotal role in building sustainable infrastructure on Mars, as water-free concrete would eliminate the need for importing water or relying on scarce Martian resources. The development is part of ongoing research aimed at addressing the challenges of establishing human presence on Mars, focusing on utilizing local materials for construction. The innovative concrete is not only a technical achievement but could also pave the way for more efficient, resourceful colonization efforts on the Red Planet, allowing future generations to build habitats and other necessary structures without the constraints posed by the lack of water.

hinese influencer Gu Xixi is making waves after revealing that she earned a staggering 3.03 lakh yuan (approximately Rs 35 Lakh) in a single day—all by simply lying in bed. On another platform, her sales reached 89.4 lakh yuan within a week.

"Today, I spent the entire day lying in bed, did nothing, and still made 11.6 lakh yuan in sales on my Douyin shop, with an estimated commission of 3.03 lakh yuan," she said. Xixi, who has amassed a large following, made it clear that she doesn't just aim to earn a few hundred thousand yuan monthly. Her goal is far more ambitious: earning that much every single day. "It is not about earning hundreds of thousands of yuan per month; it is about earning hundreds of thousands of yuan per day. Understand?" she added.

Her unorthodox approach to business and success has garnered both admiration and criticism. While some are impressed by her entrepreneurial skills, others argue that such claims perpetuate unrealistic expectations. Regardless, Gu Xixi's rise in the influencer world demonstrates the growing power of social media platforms, where individuals can generate enormous income with innovative approaches.

SC Grants Relief to Dil Raju in Mr. **Perfect Copyright Case**



Producer Dil Raju has received relief from the Supreme Court in the copyright case filed against his 2011 film Mr. Perfect. The apex court has put a stay on the City Civil Court's order, which had directed action against him over alleged copyright infringement.

The case was initially filed in 2017 by writer Mummudi Syamala Devi, who accused Dil Raju of copying the storyline of her novel Naa Manasu Ninnu Kore. Following her complaint, the Madhapur Police registered a copyright case against the producer. After hearing arguments and examining the evidence, the City Civil Court had

ruled in favor of the writer and ordered action against Dil Raju.

Challenging this decision, Dil Raju approached the Supreme Court seeking a stay on the lower court's order. On Monday, a bench comprising Justice JB Pardiwala and Justice R Mahadevan took up the case and, after hearing the arguments, stayed the City Civil Court's orders. The next hearing has been scheduled for two weeks later.
