The India State of Forest Report 2022-24 has revealed alarming figures regarding the decreasing forest area in Andhra Pradesh. The report indicates that, within the Rajahmundry Forest Circle alone, approximately 138.66 square kilometers of forest land and 46 square kilometers of tree area have vanished. Statewide, Andhra Pradesh's forest area decreased from 30,223.62 square kilometers in 2022 to 30,084.96 square kilometers in 2024, while tree area also declined from 35,470.98 to 35,424.98 square kilometers in the same period.

The primary causes of this shrinkage are attributed to the timber mafia and encroachers. Local residents and activists have expressed concerns that some forest officials are either complicit in or turning a blind eye to the illegal activities of these groups. Reports suggest that illegal logging in areas such as Gokavaram has surged significantly, with the number of vans transporting timber increasing from three to thirty.

In addition to the corruption allegations, the shortage of personnel in the Forest Department has also been highlighted as a significant factor contributing to the problem. Of the 864 positions sanctioned for the Rajahmundry circle, only 499 are filled, leaving 365 vacancies. Key positions such as Forest Range Officers (FRO) and Assistant Beat Officers (ABO) remain unstaffed,

hindering effective monitoring and patrolling.

Chief Forest Conservator for the Rajahmundry Circle, BVVN Murthy, acknowledged the staff shortages but emphasized that efforts to combat illegal timber trafficking would be intensified. However, he also pointed out that the lack of vehicles for patrolling remains a critical issue, with many of the current vehicles dating back to 2009.

With the situation growing dire, locals and environmental advocates are calling on Forest Minister Pawan Kalyan to intervene and address the growing threats to the state's forests. The question remains: will the minister take action to stop the exploitation of Andhra Pradesh's valuable forest resources?



CM Naidu Emphasizes India's Global Recognition Growing

In a media conference held in Delhi, Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu highlighted India's rising prominence on the world stage, particularly in the fields of Artificial Intelligence (AI). Reflecting on his recent visit to Davos, he noted that while IT had previously garnered international attention, AI is now the focus. "India is ahead in AI technology, and our country's name is being heard globally," he said, expressing confidence that India will become a developed nation by 2047.

CM Chandrababu emphasized that significant budget allocations have been made to align with the vision of "Vikasit Bharat," with a priority on infrastructure development. He also mentioned tax reforms and AP's pioneering efforts in electricity sector reforms. Highlighting the MSME policy as a game changer, he assured that

these efforts would attract substantial investments, fostering growth and innovation.

Addressing political concerns, CM Chandrababu urged for a shift towards inclusive growth. He criticized the current political environment in Delhi, citing air and political pollution as barriers to development. He advocated for voting for the BJP, asserting that a victory in Delhi would mark a turning point for the country's progress.

On the topic of the central budget, the CM responded to criticism over AP's exclusion, stating that despite not being mentioned by name, the state received adequate funding for various schemes. He assured that AP would maximize benefits from new central initiatives, while also stressing that the state suffered more during the previous YSRCP regime than during bifurcation. He reaffirmed that the state will seek additional funds from the Finance Commission for its recovery and develop-

Focus on Improving Quality in Engineering Education, Says Minister Lokesh

Andhra Pradesh State Education, IT, and Electronics Minister Nara Lokesh emphasized the need for improving the quality of engineering education during a meeting with the Engineering Colleges Management Association at his residence in Undavalli. Lokesh acknowledged the issues raised by the management representatives and urged colleges to prioritize enhancing educational standards.

He noted that the education system had weakened under previous administrations and that his government aims to bring transformation starting from primary education. He also highlighted the lack of reforms in intermediate education over the past decade, which his ministry has begun addressing.

The minister assured that his government's approach would be consultative, with no unilateral decisions on policy changes. He stated that Rs. 571.96 crores of the Rs. 788 crores allocated for RTF scholarships had already been released, and the remaining

funds would be disbursed shortly. Lokesh encouraged colleges to focus on improving their National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) positions, engage in research and development (R&D), and foster innovations. He also requested that colleges provide the government with regular updates on student placements.

Engineering college representatives brought up several concerns, including the timely release of fee reimbursement funds in line with the academic calendar, as well as a revision of current fee structures to make them more affordable. They also requested the release of the EAMCET schedule and the implementation of a three-counseling system for the entrance exam.

Additionally, they suggested organizing job fairs at the state level, reviving the National Institute of Technical Teachers Training and Research (NITTTR) in the state, and introducing micro-certification aligned with the National Credit and Quality Framework (NCQF). Lokesh assured that reforms would be implemented following consultations after the MLC election code ends.



The Chief Minister stressed the importance of ensuring that there is no laxity, corruption, or negligence in the execution of these schemes. He specifically directed officials to act on the feedback from the public and make necessary improvements where required.

During the review at the Secretariat, CM Chandrababu examined reports gathered through diverse methods, including IVRS and QR code scanning, on key programs such as pension distribution, Anna canteens,



fertilizer supply, medical services in government hospitals, and travel in RTC buses. He emphasized the need to thoroughly investigate complaints, especially when beneficiaries express dissatisfaction with the services provided.

The CM highlighted specific concerns, such as delays in pension delivery, issues with free gas cylinder distribution under the Deepam scheme, corruption, and dissatisfaction with hospital services. He instructed the concerned officials to address each issue promptly, identifying the root causes and taking corrective measures where necessary. CM Chandrababu reiterated that individual errors or system inefficiencies should be addressed, but negligence and corruption by employees would not be tolerated.

The Chief Minister also pointed out that gas agencies should be held accountable if there is any corruption in the distribution of gas cylinders. By focusing on continuous feedback and swift corrective actions, CM Chandrababu underscored the government's commitment to improving the lives of beneficiaries and ensuring the success of its welfare programs.

Central Home Ministry Urges AP and Telangana to Resolve Bifurcation Issues Cooperatively

Central Govt Clarifies Stance on Fund Distribution and Infrastructure Support TPN Correspondent New Delhi, Feb 04

Central Home Secretary Govind Mohan met with officials from Andhra Pradesh and Telangana to address unresolved bifurcation issues that have persisted for over a decade. The meeting, which focused on the distribution of assets and liabilities of institutions under Schedules 9 and 10 of the Andhra Pradesh Reorganization Act, brought forward key suggestions from the Central Home Ministry.

The Home Ministry emphasized that both states should work in coordination to resolve these issues, with a cooperative approach being crucial for the smooth implementation of the bifurcation provisions. It was noted that the central government would continue supporting infrastructure projects in both states. However, the Ministry urged that excessive insistence on fund distribution could lead to adverse consequences for both states.

Govind Mohan also advised that legal counsel be sought to address matters related to the institutions listed in Schedules 9 and 10, stressing the importance of a legal framework to resolve such disputes. The Home Ministry indicated that no final decisions would be made in the upcoming meeting, urging both states to continue their discussions constructively. The meeting underscores the need for a unified approach in dealing with the remaining bifurcation issues, with both the central government and the Telugu states playing a key role in resolving them.

Govt Delivers Strong Support to Farmers -Minister Nadendla



He revealed that Andhra Pradesh has received a remarkable Rs. 9,417 crores for railway development, a substantial increase from the UPA era. The state is lometers of railway tracks, with 100% electrification already completed.

Minister Vaishnaw highlighted the success of Vande Bharat trains in the region, with 8 such trains currently operating in Andhra Pradesh, connecting 16 districts. Tirupati Deputy Mayor **Election Postponed**

The much-awaited Tirupati Municipal Corporation Deputy Mayor election was postponed due to dramatic developments. including claims of violence and a lack of quorum. The election, scheduled on Monday for the post vacated by Bhumana Abhinay Reddy, saw tensions escalate between YSRCP and alliance party members.

The election officer, JC Shubham Bansal. had made all arrangements for the election at the SVU Senate Hall, but the event took a dramatic turn when alliance party leaders allegedly attacked YSRCP corporators as they arrived at the election center. Tensions further intensified as four YSRCP corporators reportedly had their bus win-

dows broken and were allegedly kidnapped by the opposition party's leaders. The election officer later confirmed that the election was postponed after only 22 out of 50 corporators showed up, leading to a lack of

Tirupati MLA Arani Srinivasulu spoke to the media, attributing the delay to the absence of YSRCP corporators, claiming that if they had attended, the election would have taken place. He criticized the actions of the opposition, accusing them of using violence and intimidation.

In a media briefing, YCP joint Chittoor district president Bhumana Karunakar Reddy accused TDP of orchestrating the violence and even claimed that bribes were being offered to corporators to sway the election outcome. He also alleged that TDP leaders and their supporters engaged in illegal activities to prevent the election from taking place, further claiming that the police acted as mere spectators during the ordeal.

Amidst the growing tension, the kidnapped corporators' families raised concerns, with some calling for police protection. The case has sparked a larger debate over the role of law enforcement and the political violence that marred the election process. The situation has led to demands for further investigation and intervention by the authorities, including the filing of a lunch motion petition in the High Court.

Raghurama Vows to Continue Fight Against Custodial Torture Case

The police in Vijayawada have come under severe scrutiny for their involvement in unlawful activities, with reports of illegal settlements and corruption surfacing across multiple police stations. The law enforcement officers, meant to uphold justice and maintain order, are instead alleged to be acting in collusion with powerful individuals and political figures, facilitating unlawful land deals and exploiting their positions for financial gain.

In a particularly disturbing case, two individuals involved in a land dispute under the jurisdiction of the West Lanka Police Station found themselves at odds with the police, despite a favorable court verdict. Allegedly, the area ACP, in collaboration with the individual who lost the case, visited the site and threatened the winning party. In a related matter, accusations have surfaced that another ACP was involved in an extramarital affair with a woman lawyer and used his influence to illegally register a rape case against a rival lawyer, sparking outrage within the Bezawada Bar Association.

Further investigations reveal that the Kothapet Police Station has also been embroiled in multiple contentious land disputes, including one involving a 30-acre government pond in Gollapudi. The case, involving a land lease agreement with YSRCP leader Omkar Reddy, al-



ficials supporting the politician's interests, while simultaneously intimidating and filing cases against protesting fishermen.

In another case, Brahmin families in Ambapuram village became victims of police interference after they sought legal recourse for land that had been wrongfully acquired. Despite a court order, the police allegedly harassed the Brahmin families,

compelling them to go through unnecessary legal and bureaucratic hurdles.

At the heart of these scandals is a senior officer in the law and order department, accused of orchestrating illegal land settlements during the previous TDP government. The officer is alleged

money from land deals, and since his return to the city, the same practices have resurfaced. His targets appear to be individuals and families who can be exploited, using his position to secure financial gains before his retirement.

Critics are now questioning the effectiveness of the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB), raising concerns over whether they are taking any action against such rampant cor-

ruption. Calls for the ACB to intervene and investigate these activities are growing louder, as the public remains anxious about the unchecked power of corrupt police officers. Will the ACB rise to the occasion, or will this cycle of abuse continue unchecked? Only time will tell.

City Police Commissioner Participates in "Say No to **Drugs**" Awareness Program

City Police Commissioner Sri. S. V. Rajasekhara Babu IPS participated as the chief guest in the "Say No to Drugs" awareness program at P.B. Siddhartha College, Vijayawada, aimed at educating students about the dangers of drug abuse and promoting a drug-free lifestyle. The event was organized under the guidance of the college and saw participation from notable guests, including Eagle Team IG Sri. A. K. Ravi Krishna IPS and SP Sri. K. Nagesh Babu.

During his address, City Police Commissioner Sri. S.V. Rajasekhara Babu emphasized the devastating effects of drug abuse on individuals, families, and society at large. He particularly pointed out the rampant cultivation of marijuana in Uttarandhra, which has been significantly reduced since the formation of the Eagle unit. He noted that marijuana is now being cultivated in only 100 acres, down from 9,000 acres in the past, with drone surveillance helping authorities identify cultivation sites. He also warned that those consuming or involved in the drug trade would face severe punishments under the NDPS Act, including being banned from obtaining a passport once their names are listed as marijuana offenders.

He further highlighted the troubling link between marijuana use and rising crime rates, including thefts and violent incidents such as the blade batch attacks in Vijayawada. The Commissioner urged students to avoid associating with drug addicts and to courageously refuse any attempts to pressure them into using drugs.

Eagle Team IG Sri. Ravi Krishna IPS explained that special Eagle units would be formed in every college, and stressed the severe legal consequences of involvement in NDPS Act cases, including potential death penalties for repeat offenders. He also encouraged students to act as "Eagle Ambassadors" and report any information about drug activities by calling the dedicated helpline 1972.

Around 500 students, along with college director Sri. Baburao, Central ACP Sri. Damodar, Machavaram Inspector Prakash, and other officials, attended the event, underscoring the collective effort needed to tackle the growing drug abuse problem in the region.

In a tragic turn of events, Chinna Anjaneyulu, a man from Undavalli village in Guntur district, took his own life by consuming pesticide, reportedly due to the stress caused by call money scams. He left behind a suicide note and a selfie video, revealing that he had been harassed by his trusted friends, who had provided him loans at exorbitant interest rates.

Anjaneyulu named Singam Shetty Harish, Gonnakutty Prasad (Nani), Mogalipuvu Mani Kumar, and Prem Kumar of Errubalem as the individuals responsible for his mental torment. In his letter, he stated that he had to pay back three times the amount he had borrowed, and that these friends had spoken about him indecently to others, pushing him to the brink. The victim's relatives allege that the accused are using political influence to manipulate the police and avoid justice. A case has been registered, and authorities are investigating the matter, as the community calls for accountability in this disturbing case.





Police Crack Down on Sufari Murder Case in Nandigama

The Nandigama police have successfully cracked down on a Sufari murder case, arresting four individuals involved in a conspiracy to kill Muvva Gopi. The incident unfolded after Kola Narasimha Rao from Aithavaram village, whose daughter had an arranged marriage 14 months ago, developed a feud with Gopi, who had helped facilitate the marriage. Rao then reportedly arranged a Sufari (contract murder) worth Rs. 1 lakh through Palampalli Vijayakumar from Kothapet,

Hyderabad.

During the Sankranthi festival, the accused, along with two other individuals, traveled to Aithavaram and stayed at Muvva Gopi's house for a three-day ritual in an attempt to carry out the murder. However, their plan failed. On further investigation, the suspects were apprehended while roaming suspiciously in Nandigama town, where they were questioned and admitted to their intentions.

ACP Tilak confirmed the arrests and stated that the four individuals have been charged and produced before the court. Police have seized four chicken knives, a bike, and Rs. 2,000 in cash during the investigation. A case has been registered at the Nandigama police station, and authorities are continuing their efforts to ensure justice is served in this matter.

Villagers Protest Biochemical Waste Dumping in Jakkampudi

In a significant move, residents of Jakkampudi, a suburb of Vijayawada, protested against the illegal dumping of biochemical waste on a vacant 133-acre plot of crop fields. The villagers stopped the loading of waste at midnight and filed a formal complaint with the police regarding the matter.

For the past two years, heavy vehicles have been bringing biochemical waste to the fields at night, dumping it in secret. The villagers claim that this waste is severely damaging the surrounding crops and making the local cattle sick. Experts have

expressed concerns that the waste poses a long-term environmental threat, warning that no plant can grow in the area for at least the next 20 years due to the toxic nature of the waste.

The biochemical waste is also affecting the local population, as it is mixed into the air, causing respiratory problems. The villagers have reported an increase in skin diseases, attributing these health issues to the waste being dumped nearby.

The waste-laden vehicle involved in the dumping is said to have a Suryapet number plate, and according to local claims, the owner of the vehicle is a resident of Mylavaram who has settled in Hyderabad and is believed to have connections with the local MLA.

The villagers are demanding a thorough investigation by the police into the factory from which the biochemical waste is originating, and they are calling for action to protect the health and safety of the community and the environment.

District Collector Shanmohan Sagili expressed gratitude to fishermen's associations and families for their cooperation with Divis Company's desalination pipeline work off the coast of Tondangi.

During a media conference at the Collectorate on Monday, the Collector stated that Divis Company had commenced the installation of a 1.5-kilometer-long desalination pipeline at a depth of 6 meters in the seabed to convert salt water into fresh water for industrial use. The work is expected to be completed in 4.5 days. He emphasized that both industrial development and the well-being of fishermen must be balanced through mutual understanding.

He assured that the economic conditions of 5,000 fishing families across 16 coastal villages had been surveyed and that a skill development survey was underway per government instructions. A special committee, under the State Pollution Control Board, has been formed to analyze the impact of industrial development on fishermen's livelihoods. Scientists from the National Institute of Oceanography have conducted studies, and their report is expected within a month.

Fishermen's representatives raised concerns about marine pollution affecting fish stocks, endangering 2,000 fishermen's livelihoods. They submitted demands, including a ₹15,000 monthly allowance per family, permanent jobs, health cards with ₹10 lakh coverage, and compensation for damaged fishing equipment. 

Contributes To Fentanyl Crisis

How China Allegedly



The United States continues to grapple with a devastating opioid epidemic, and fentanyl— a synthetic opioid 50 times more potent than heroin— is at the center of the crisis. The drug, which is cheaper and easier to produce than heroin, has claimed tens of thousands of American lives each year. Fentanyl is now the leading cause of death among individuals aged 18 to 45, and its rapid spread has been a point of contention between Washington and Beijing.

The U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) has accused China of being the primary source of fentanyl-related substances trafficked into the U.S. While China tightened its controls on fentanyl production in 2019, U.S. authorities assert that this only shifted the trafficking methods. Chemical components required to produce fentanyl are shipped to Mexico, where the drug is manufactured and then smuggled into the United States. Many of these precursor chemicals are legal in China and have legitimate medical uses, complicating prosecution efforts.

In response, Beijing has denied responsibility, asserting that there is no illegal trafficking of fentanyl between China and Mexico. However, the Chinese government has vowed to strengthen its regulations, pointing to some of the world's harshest drug laws. Despite these efforts, U.S. authorities argue that drug manufacturers continue to develop new variants of synthetic precursors faster than Chinese authorities can identify and regulate them.

The Biden administration has ramped up its efforts to curb the fentanyl crisis by targeting Chinese entities and individuals allegedly linked to the trade. In October 2023, sanctions were imposed on over two dozen Chinese firms accused of facilitating the shipment of fentanyl precursors to the U.S. and Mexico. These actions include individuals from both mainland China and Hong Kong, with U.S. officials attributing a significant portion of fentanyl-related deaths to the global supply chain that begins with Chinese chemical manufacturers.

China's cooperation in addressing the fentanyl trade remains uncertain. While U.S. and Chinese leaders agreed to restart counternarcotics talks following a summit in 2023, the effectiveness of these negotiations is still in question. Analysts note that cooperation between the two nations often hinges on the state of bilateral relations, and Chinese authorities may be less inclined to cooperate with countries with whom they have strained relations.

Learning from Past: The Importance of Disaster and Mitigating Modern **Catastrophes**



The devastating wildfires that ravaged Southern California in 2025 echo the destructive power of the Great Fire of 1910, which consumed over 3 million acres across Montana, Idaho, and Washington. Descriptions from that historic fire—such as "The forests staggered, rocked, exploded, and then shriveled under the holocaust" and "Great red balls of fire rolled up the mountainsides"—are chilling reminders of the recurring nature of such natural disasters. Similarly, the tragic events of the Wayanad disaster in July-August 2024 resonate with the accounts of a 1924 landslip in the region, highlighting the vulnerability of isolated communities in the face of natural calamities and the historical struggles of rebuilding economies after disasters.

While history may seem to repeat itself, there are valuable lessons to be learned by examining past disasters closely. Analyzing specific cases and their impacts, both immediate and long-term, can shed light on effective strategies for future disaster management and recovery. It is especially important to study historical disaster patterns and their socio-economic consequences to improve preparedness in today's world.

Disaster history has long played a crucial role in shaping how regions and nations deal with calamities. Although it has been an essential aspect of human experience, the study of disasters from a historical perspective has not always been systematically pursued. Pioneering studies, such as those on the 1755 Great Lisbon Earthquake and the 1920 dynamite explosion in Halifax, Canada, have provided insight into the multifaceted impacts of disasters, including their religious significance, social dynamics, and recovery processes. These early works laid the foundation for modern disaster studies, which have gained momentum since World War II, especially in the context of Cold War tensions.

Elon Musk and Donald Trump Target USAID, Sparking Controversy Over Government Oversight

Elon Musk and Donald Trump have the potential dissolution of USAID. Musk, a Musk's involvement in the matter is linked launched a coordinated attack on the U.S. Agency for International Development (US-AID), accusing the agency of corruption and overreach. Musk went as far as labeling it a "criminal organization," while Trump described USAID as being "run by radical lunatics." This marks a notable shift in the Trump administration's stance on government agencies, as the duo seeks to challenge what they perceive as wasteful and unchecked operations within the U.S. gov-

Trump, speaking publicly on Sunday, criticized USAID's leadership, hinting at a potential overhaul of the agency. He suggested that the current leadership would be removed and that a future reassessment of USAID's role would take place, though he provided no specific details. This comment fueled speculation that Trump may be considering a significant restructuring or even

staunch ally of Trump, escalated the attack by making unsubstantiated claims on his X platform. He accused USAID of engaging in "rogue CIA work" and "internet censorship." Additionally, Musk made controversial allegations that USAID had funded bioweapons research, including studies related to COVID-19. These accusations, which have been previously linked to Russian disinformation efforts, remain unsubstantiated and have been widely disputed by experts.

This rhetoric from Musk and Trump comes after the former president's administration previously froze aid spending, sparking concerns that USAID could face major cuts or a complete restructuring. While waivers were issued to allow humanitarian aid to continue, there are rumors that Trump plans to integrate USAID into the State Department, although no official comments have been made by his team.

to his leadership of the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), a temporary body tasked with reviewing government operations. However, DOGE does not hold official status as a federal agency, and Musk's authority to make sweeping decisions remains unclear. Reports surfaced suggesting that DOGE staff attempted to access classified USAID materials, leading to forced leave for two senior USAID officials.

Jharkhand Mukti Morcha Passes 50-Point Resolution, Rejects CAA, NRC, and UCC

The ruling Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM) passed a 50-point resolution during its 46th foundation day celebration at Gandhi Maidan in Dumka on Sunday night. Among the key points, the party strongly rejected the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), the National Register of Citizens (NRC), and the Uniform Civil Code (UCC), stating that these measures should not be implemented in Jharkhand.

The resolution also called for the strict enforcement of the Chotanagpur Tenancy (CNT) Act and the Santal Pargana Tenancy (SPT) Act, both of which aim to protect tribal land rights. Additionally, the party demanded that the central government release the "Rs 1.36 lakh crore dues" owed to the state government immediately, emphasizing the need for financial justice for the state.

Jharkhand Chief Minister Hemant Soren addressed a large gathering during the event, where he lashed out at the Centre for allegedly ignoring the state's needs. He claimed that the people of Jharkhand had been "cheated" in the Union budget, as the state's concerns had been overlooked. Soren criticized those with a "feudal mindset," suggesting that they did not want the residents of the tribal-majority state to become self-reliant.

Soren also pointed out that despite Jharkhand contributing significantly to the nation's economy, particularly through its mineral resources, the state remains one of the most backward regions in the country. He voiced his frustration over the continued neglect of Jharkhand's development needs and emphasized the importance of financial justice for the state's growth and empowerment.

The resolution passed by the JMM and Soren's comments underscore the ongoing tensions between the state government and the central authorities, particularly regarding issues related to tribal rights, state finances, and the controversial national policies like the CAA, NRC, and UCC.



Did Manipur Chief Minister Stoke Violence? Supreme Court Seeks Government Lab Report

In a significant development, the Supreme Court of India has ordered the submission of a forensic report on audio clips that allegedly feature Manipur Chief Minister N Biren Singh instigating ethnic violence. The court has instructed that the forensic findings from the Central Forensic Science Laboratory (CFSL) be submitted in a sealed cover.

The request for the forensic examination follows the presentation of audio tapes by advocate Prashant Bhushan, who is representing the petitioner in the case. The tapes, which were verified by Truth Labs with over 93 percent certainty, purportedly feature Singh's voice. In the recordings, Singh is reportedly heard discussing the protection of Meitei groups and their involvement in looting the state armoury during the ethnic clashes in Manipur. The tapes are alleged to have been recorded during a private meeting and leaked afterward, with Bhushan suggesting that the Chief Minister may have been instigating and abetting the violence.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, representing the state, raised preliminary objections, arguing that the petitioner should first approach the High Court. He also informed the court that an FIR had already been filed, and an investigation was underway. Mehta further stated that the investigating agency had contacted the Twitter accounts that uploaded the audio clips for verification and sent the tapes for forensic analysis. He also accused the petitioner of having a "separatist mindset" that could be influencing

The Supreme Court bench, led by Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna, pressed for the timely submission of the forensic report. However, Mehta suggested that the results might not be available immediately. The case highlights the ongoing ethnic tensions in Manipur, which have led to widespread violence, including the involvement of militant groups.

In a related development, a militant from the banned Kangleipak Communist Party (People's War Group) was arrested in Imphal West district for alleged extortion activities targeting government employees and the public. This arrest further underscores the volatile situation in the region.

BJP MPs' privilege motion against Sonia Gandhi for calling President 'poor thing'

BJP MPs in the Rajya Sabha have filed a privilege notice against senior Congress leader Sonia Gandhi for her controversial "poor thing" comment about President Droupadi Murmu. The MPs have called for exemplary action, accusing Gandhi of displaying an elitist and anti-tribal mindset. The notice, addressed to Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar, claims that Gandhi's remark shows a lack of understanding of the struggles faced by tribal communities and poor individuals.

The BJP MPs argue that such a statement is a violation of the established rules of conduct and Parliamentary ethics, which demand respect for constitutional offices. They emphasized that the Parliament, as the highest legislative body in India, holds the responsibility of maintaining decorum and respect for all constitutional authorities. Any deviation from this, they said, undermines the credibility and trust that citizens place in the institution.

The notice also stresses that Sonia Gandhi's comments undermine the dignity of the office of the President. The BJP MPs called her actions "disparaging" and "contemptuous," noting that they are inconsistent with the principles of mutual respect and decorum that are essential for the functioning of a healthy democracy.



Rahul Gandhi's Remarks on Foreign Policy Spark Heated Debate in Lok Sabha

The Lok Sabha witnessed a tense exchange on Monday as Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's remarks on India's foreign policy led to strong objections from the ruling BJP benches. Gandhi, while addressing the debate on the Motion of Thanks to the President's Address, claimed that External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar was sent to the inauguration of US President Donald Trump to secure an invitation for Prime Minister Narendra Modi to visit the United States. This statement quickly provoked BJP MPs, including Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju, who strongly objected, calling Gandhi's claim baseless and unfounded.

Gandhi began his speech by criticising the President's Address, claiming that it was repetitive, with the government listing the same achievements as in previous years. He also raised concerns about the rising unemployment in the country, asserting that neither the UPA government nor the current NDA administration has provided a satisfactory solution for the nation's youth regarding jobs.

On India's economic situation, Gandhi pointed out that despite the government's 'Make in India' initiative, the share of manufacturing in the country's GDP has decreased from 15.3% in 2014 to 12.6% today. He said that while the concept of 'Make in India' was a good one, the government has failed to implement it effectively. He further accused India of relying heavily on China for production, stating, "Every time we use a phone or wear Chinese products, we pay a tax to China."

In a controversial statement, Gandhi referenced the Trump inauguration, saying, "If we had a production system and were working on technologies, the US President would come here and invite the Prime Minister." This remark sparked protests from the treasury benches, with Rijiju demanding an apology for such "unverified" statements. Gandhi responded sarcastically, apologising for "disturbing their peace of mind."

India Reevaluates Cryptocurrency Stance Amid Global Shifts

India is reconsidering its position on cryptocurrencies, with the country's growing interest aligning with global trends as other nations adjust their approaches to virtual assets. A senior government official revealed this development on Sunday, noting that the shift in stance comes in the wake of crypto-friendly policy announcements, notably in the United States.

Ajay Seth, India's Economic Affairs Secretary, explained in an interview that the government is revisiting its stance on cryptocurrency, especially after witnessing changes in how various jurisdictions are embracing or regulating digital assets. As a result, the planned release of a discussion paper on cryptocurrencies, initially set for September 2024, may be delayed. Seth emphasized that cryptocurrencies, by their very nature, do not adhere to borders, meaning that India cannot adopt a unilateral approach toward the evolving global landscape of virtual assets.

Though Seth did not directly reference the United States, the timing of his remarks coincides with recent moves by U.S. President Donald Trump. Last week, Trump ordered the creation of a cryptocurrency working group to propose regulations for digital assets and explore the possibility of creating a national cryptocurrency reserve, signaling a more favorable regulatory environment for virtual currencies in the U.S.

Despite India's historically cautious stance toward cryptocurrencies, marked by high trading taxes and regulatory hurdles, the nation has seen a surge in crypto investment from its citizens. As the sector expands, the Indian government is increasingly forced to reevaluate its policies. In December 2023, the Financial Intelligence Unit (FIU) issued show-cause notices to nine offshore cryptocurrency exchanges for failing to comply with local regulations. In a related move, Binance, the world's largest crypto exchange, was fined 188.2 million rupees (\$2.25 million) in June 2024 after registering with the FIU to resume operations in India.

While some regulators in India have expressed openness to managing cryptocurrency trade, the Reserve Bank of India has consistently warned that private digital currencies pose a macroeconomic risk. This ongoing tension between government bodies signals the challenges India faces as it navigates its stance on the rapidly evolving world of digital finance.





Trump Slams Democrats for Delaying Nominees, Urges GOP to Act Tough

Trump claims Democrats are purposefully delaying his nominees, urging the GOP to respond.

- · Trump accuses Democrats of deliberately delaying his nominees.

Former President Donald Trump has accused Democrats of deliberately delaying the approval of his nominees, claiming that they are holding up the process for political reasons at the expense of the country's safety and well-being. In a post on his social media platform, Truth Social, Trump voiced his frustration with the ongoing nomination process for his administration picks.

"Democrats are purposefully delaying virtually all of my nominees. No matter how good and well-qualified someone is, they are taking maximum time for approval — and laughing about it. They're having a good time at the country's expense and safety," Trump wrote, sharing a Fox News clip in which host Mark Levin discussed how Democrats were allegedly undermining the Constitution.

Trump further criticized Democrats, claiming that even if figures like George Washing-



ton or Abraham Lincoln were nominated, they would still be delayed until the last moment. He blamed their actions on their inability to accept the results of the previous presidential election, warning that their obstructionist tactics would only increase the Republican Party's strength. "Republicans must GET TOUGH —

AND MUST GET TOUGH VERY FAST. We need our nominees NOW, for the safety and good of our country!" he added.

As of now, only eight of Trump's 114 nominees have been confirmed by the Senate, with 68 still under consideration and 38 awaiting votes, according to The Washington Post. Among those confirmed are key figures like Marco Rubio as Secretary of State, John Ratcliffe as CIA Director, and Pete Hegseth as Secretary of Defense. Notably, other high-profile picks like Pam Bondi for Attorney General, Elise Stefanik for UN Ambassador, and Doug Collins for Veterans Affairs Secretary are still waiting for Senate votes.

In response to the delays, Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer, D-N.Y., defended the right to delay nominations for candidates lacking broad support in the Senate. Schumer cited concerns over certain nominees, including Ratcliffe's qualifications to lead the Office of National Intelligence.


Homes Blacked Out, Bridge Torn Into Two: Rising Floodwaters In Australia Wreak Havoc

Rising floodwaters have wreaked havoc across northeastern Australia, forcing evacuations, cutting off communities, and causing extensive damage to infrastructure. Storms that began over the weekend have dumped more than a metre (39 inches) of rain in parts of Queensland, submerging homes, businesses, and roads under muddy waters.

In Townsville, a popular coastal tourist spot near the Great Barrier Reef, authorities have declared certain areas a "black zone" due to the severity of the floods. The state's premier, David Crisafulli, warned that the region could face additional rain and more flooding, including both flash floods and riverine flooding. "We remain prepared for the ongoing prospect of more rain," Crisafulli said during a news conference. Emergency services reported conducting 11 "swift water rescues" overnight.

More than 2,100 people were ordered to evacuate Townsville over the weekend, but about 10 percent of residents refused to leave, according



to emergency officials. Tragically, one woman in her 60s lost her life when a rescue boat capsized in the flood-hit town of Ingham, located about 100 kilometres from Townsville.

The floods also caused significant damage to infrastructure, including the collapse of a critical bridge over Ollera Creek, which severed the main coastal road, the Bruce Highway. "It's not every day you see a bridge torn in two," Cris-

afulli remarked, highlighting the scale of the destruction.

Nearly 11,000 properties remain without power across northern Queensland, with no immediate timeline for restoration, according to Ergon Energy. Townsville's acting mayor, Ann-Maree Greaney, said that communities were isolated due to road closures, and efforts were underway to deliver food and restore power.

Deadly Wildfires in Argentina's Patagonia Force Evacuations, Destroy 3,000 Hectares

A deadly wildfire has ravaged around 3,000 hectares of land near El Bolson, a popular tourist destination in Argentina's Patagonia region, prompting the evacuation of hundreds of residents. The fires, which broke out on Thursday in the Cajon del Azul hiking area in Amprale, have caused widespread devastation. High summer temperatures and strong winds helped the fire spread rapidly, leaving destruction in its wake.

The fire has claimed the life of one individual, who suffered a cardiac arrest from inhaling smoke while inside his residence, as reported by Bruno Pogliano, the mayor of El Bolson. "This disaster left one fatal victim, devastated thousands of hectares and caused enormous damage to our community," said Alberto Weretilneck, governor of Rio Negro province, where the fires are burning.

Over 800 people have been evacuated from the affected areas, as authorities work to contain the spread of the flames. The provincial government of Rio Negro has declared a state of emergency, imposing a ban on open fires and strengthening surveillance and prevention measures, which will remain in place until April 30.

Firefighters are facing a challenging task in battling the blazes, with the ongoing threat of the fires being fueled by dry conditions and unpredictable weather patterns. The region has been experiencing extreme summer temperatures, exacerbating the risk of wildfires in an already vulnerable landscape.

In response to the disaster, authorities are mobilizing resources to assist in firefighting efforts and support the affected communities. While the situation remains dire, officials are hopeful that these measures will help control the fires in the coming days.

Zelenskyy Warns Against Excluding Ukraine from US-Russia Talks on War

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy warned on Saturday that excluding Ukraine from talks between the United States and Russia about the ongoing war would be "very dangerous." He stressed the importance of Ukraine being directly involved in any discussions aimed at ending the conflict, especially as both sides work toward a potential ceasefire.

Zelenskyy expressed concern over Russia's reluctance to engage in meaningful ceasefire talks, pointing out that Moscow views any form of concessions as a loss, particularly with the current military advantage on the battlefield. He argued that the Kremlin's stance has made negotiations difficult, and he emphasized that the war could not be resolved without Ukraine's active participation in the dialogue.

In the interview, Zelenskyy highlighted that US President Donald Trump could play a key role in bringing Russian President Vladimir Putin to the negotiation table by leveraging sanctions targeting Russia's energy and banking sectors, in addition to continuing military support for Ukraine. "I think these are the closest and most important steps," Zelenskyy said, referring to the need for a strategic and coordinated approach involving Ukraine, the US, and its allies.

Zelenskyy's comments came after Trump's remarks on Friday, in which the former president indicated that US and Russian officials had already begun talks about ending the war. However, Trump did not provide further details on the discussions. Zelenskyy expressed that while Russia may have its own diplomatic channels, excluding Ukraine from the conversation would be detrimental to global stability. "Talking about Ukraine without us — it is dangerous for everyone," he concluded, emphasizing the crucial role his country plays in shaping the outcome of the war.



Panama drops Belt and Road deal with China amid Donald Trump's warning

Panama has officially announced its decision to withdraw from China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), signaling the country's intention not to renew the 2017 Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) that tied it to China's global infrastructure project. This decision comes as Panama reaffirms its sovereignty over the Panama Canal, rejecting any foreign influence or claims over the strategic waterway. President Jose Raul Mulino emphasized that Panama's control over the canal, the world's second busiest waterway, is non-negotiable.

The move comes amid growing tensions with the United States, as former President Donald Trump and US officials have voiced concerns over China's involvement in the region. Trump has repeatedly suggested that the US should regain control of the Panama Canal, a vital maritime route. "China's running the Panama Canal... that was given to Panama, foolishly, but they violated the agreement, and we're going to take it back, or something very powerful is going to happen," Trump said previously.

In response to these concerns, President Mulino clarified that Panama's neutrality treaty with the US, which governs the canal's use, remains intact. "Sovereignty over the canal is not in question," Mulino stated. The Panama Canal, which was originally built by the US in the early 20th century, was handed over to Panama in 1999. Since then, the canal has remained under Panama's control, despite ongoing disputes over its strategic importance.

Trump Threatens EU Tariffs, Cuts Funding to South Africa Amid Trade War Escalation

US President Donald Trump has announced plans to impose tariffs on goods from the European Union, following his recent moves to target Canada, Mexico, and China. Trump said on Sunday that tariffs on the EU would be implemented "pretty soon," accusing the bloc of taking advantage of the United States. This statement adds to his ongoing criticism of the EU's trade practices, which he claims have been unfair to the US.

Trump's comments on tariffs come on the heels of his recent actions, including 25% tariffs on Mexican and Canadian goods and a 10% tariff on Chinese imports. While Trump has previously threatened to impose tariffs on the EU, this latest declaration marks a potential escalation of the trade war. He reiterated his grievances over the US trade deficit with the 27-nation bloc, stating, "The European Union has treated us so terribly."

The European Union has vowed to retaliate if Trump follows through on his tariff threat. A spokesperson for the EU stated that it would "respond firmly" to any unfair tariffs imposed by the US. After that, there was a slight recovery as investors took up some buying. However, the further weakening of the rupee against the dollar increased the negative sentiment. Nifty ended with a loss of 121 points and Sensex 319 points on support from IT and healthcare shares.

The BSE Sensex, which closed at 77,505 in the previous session, opened at 77,063 today. It touched an intraday low of 76,756. It reached an intraday high of 77,260. It ended at 77,186, down 319 points. The NSE Nifty, which opened at 23,319 on Monday, touched

a low of 23,222 and a high of 23,381. It lost a total of 121 points and closed at 23,361. The Nifty Bank fell 296 points to settle at

In the Nifty50, 16 companies gained while 35 lost. Bajaj Finance, Shriram Finance, M&M, Wipro, Bajaj Finserv were the top gainers. LT, Tata Consumer, Hero Moto, Coal India, BEL were the biggest losers. Today, all sectoral indices, except IT, healthcare, auto, pharma, and consumer durables, were in the red. Bank, FMCG, metal, oil and gas indices fell the most.



Rupee hits an all-time low to go past Rs 87 against US dollar



The Indian rupee plunged to a record low of Rs 87.07 against the US dollar on Monday, following new trade tensions triggered by fresh tariffs imposed by US President Donald Trump. The rupee's sharp decline, which amounted to a 0.5% drop in early trade, reflects broader instability in the global currency markets as the US dollar strengthened significantly.

The rupee's weakness was largely a result of three executive orders signed by Trump over the weekend, which introduced new tariffs on major trading partners. These measures included 25% tariffs on imports from Mexico and Canada, along with a 10% tariff on goods from China, set to take effect on Tuesday. As the US dollar gained strength in response to these tariffs, it placed significant pressure on other currencies, particularly in Asia.

Traders anticipate continued pressure on the rupee throughout the day, with further weakness expected as global markets adjust to the news. The strengthening of the US dollar, spurred by the tariffs, contributed to the rise of the dollar index, which climbed 0.3% to 109.8. This stronger dollar has affected not only the Indian rupee but other Asian currencies as well.

Adani Power Plans Major Expansion to Boost Capacity by 1.7x by 2030

Adani Power Ltd (APL), India's second-largest thermal power generation company, is on track to significantly expand its power generation capacity. According to a report by Jefferies, APL aims to increase its capacity from 17.6 GW to 30.7 GW by 2030, marking a 1.7 times growth.

The company's strategic expansion plan comes with strong backing in terms of land acquisition and financing. APL is working closely with Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd (BHEL) for the delivery of necessary equipment. Additionally, APL's in-house engineering, procurement, and construction (EPC) team is ensuring that capital expenditure progresses according to schedule, driving the company's expansion forward.

Jefferies highlighted that India's peak power deficit situation, combined with APL's exposure to the merchant power market, provides a positive outlook for the compa-

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, paraphrasing Abraham Lincoln, described the Union Budget as "by the people, for the people, of the people." In her remarks, she highlighted Prime Minister Narendra Modi's strong support for tax cuts aimed at easing the burden on the middle class. According to Sitharaman, while the idea for tax cuts was driven by the Prime Minister's vision, it took time to convince bureaucrats to implement the changes.

The newly introduced tax rates are designed to reduce the financial strain on the middle class, leaving more disposable income in the hands of households. This move is expected to stimulate household consumption and support the economy by encouraging spending. Sitharaman emphasized that widening the tax base is an ongoing process, and it is crucial for citizens to understand the importance of tax payment in sustaining government welfare schemes.

Sitharaman acknowledged the concerns of the middle class, which had long been expressing dissatisfaction about their unmet aspirations despite being honest taxpayers. She explained that the government's decision to provide tax relief was a response to their calls for assistance, especially amid rising inflation.

However, while Prime Minister Modi was quick to approve the tax cuts, convincing the officials in the Finance Ministry and the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT), responsible for ensuring revenue collection, required more effort. Sitharaman shared that the process took some time but ultimately led to the announcement of the tax relief, which has been in the works for several months.





In the tiebreaker, Gukesh took the lead in the first game due to a blunder by Praggnanandhaa, but the latter bounced back in the second, employing the Trompowsky opening to level the score at 1-1.

The match then moved to sudden death, where Gukesh initially had an advantage, gaining a pawn. However, under pressure, he lost control, first giving away a pawn and later his last remaining knight. Praggnanandhaa capitalized on the errors with his impeccable endgame technique, securing victory.

With this win, Praggnanandhaa became the first Indian since Viswanathan Anand to win the Tata Steel Chess title. Gukesh, unfortunately, faced heartbreak for the second consecutive year, having lost the 2023 tiebreaker to
