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Ruckus in Karnataka Assembly Over Ambedkar's 1952 Poll Defeat

The Karnataka Legislative Assembly witnessed heated exchanges on Monday as BJP accused Congress of being responsible for Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's defeat in the 1952 Lok Sabha elections. In response, Minister Priyank Kharge countered that it was Hindutva ideologue V.D. Savarkar who played a role in Ambedkar's loss.

Kharge challenged the BJP, stating he could produce Ambedkar's handwritten letter proving Savarkar's involvement. BJP MLA Basangouda Patil Yatnal accepted the challenge and called for an open debate. Speaker U.T. Khader intervened, announcing that time would be allocated for discussion on Friday afternoon.

Chief Minister Siddaramaiah, while replying to the motion of thanks to the Governor's address, highlighted that it was the Congress government in Karnataka that implemented the Scheduled Castes Sub Plan and Tribal Sub Plan in 2013, following Andhra Pradesh. He pointed out that BJP-ruled states and the Central government had not taken similar steps.

During the debate, BJP MLA Vedavyas Kamath questioned, "Who defeated Ambedkar in the elections?" Priyank Kharge responded, "It was Savarkar," and was backed by Congress legislators, including Byrathi Suresh. As the argument escalated, BJP members countered that it was Congress and Nehru who campaigned against Ambed-

kar and later removed him from the Cabinet.

Kharge insisted that Ambedkar's handwritten letter explicitly mentioned Savarkar's role in his defeat. "Will you resign if I show the letter? I challenge you," he said, triggering further chaos. BJP MLAs, including Bellad, claimed Ambedkar had himself called Congress a "disease" and accused it of disrespecting him.

With both sides refusing to back down, Speaker Khader reiterated that a debate would be held on Friday afternoon. However, tensions continued, with BJP MLAs shouting slogans against Congress and objecting to Kharge reading the letter in the House.

CM Siddaramaiah Announces Study Chair for MD Nanjundaswamy Amid Funding Concerns

Chief Minister Siddaramaiah, in his 16th budget, has announced the establishment of a Study Chair at the University of Mysore to honor his political mentor and Raitha Sangha founder Prof. M.D. Nanjundaswamy. The move is seen as a tribute to the late farmer leader who played a crucial role in shaping Siddaramaiah's early political career.

Nanjundaswamy, known for his global vision on agriculture, strongly opposed the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) and fought against corporate control over farming, including the use of genetically mod-

ified seeds. He was instrumental in bringing Siddaramaiah into active politics by appointing him as the Mysuru district Raitha Sangha general secretary. However, the lack of financial allocation for the proposed Chair has raised concerns about its effectiveness. Experts point out that

several existing study chairs, barring a few like the Basava Chair and Ambedkar Chair, have become defunct due to insufficient funding. Currently, the University of Mysore has 26 study chairs, out of which seven are government-funded, but many remain non-functional due to financial constraints.

Retired professor and KRRS leader Prof.
Basavaraju welcomed the decision but stressed the need for dedicated financial support. He urged the government to provide sufficient funds to ensure meaningful research and activities focusing on Nanjundaswamy's contributions, agricultural policies, and farmer welfare.

Some activists believe that

instead, given Nanjundaswamy's close
association with farmer rights and agro-economics. Without proper
funding, they fear this
initiative might end
up as another symbolic gesture rather than a
functional research
center.

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Tighten Indo-Bangladesh Border, Ease Deportation Rules - Karnataka HM

Karnataka Home Minister G. Parameshwara has urged the central government to strengthen security along the Indo-Bangladesh border and simplify the deportation process for illegal immigrants. He acknowledged that while official figures exist, the actual number of illegal immigrants could be significantly higher.

During a legislative council discussion, BJP MLC P.H. Purjar claimed that over 15,000 illegal Bangladeshis have been



residing in Vijayapura district for more than two decades. He pointed out that despite differences in language and appearance, many had managed to obtain Aadhaar and ration cards. Purjar suggested verifying their birth and school transfer certificates to identify illegal immigrants.

In response, Parameshwara revealed that 33 illegal Bangladeshi immigrants have already been identified and deported. He further stated that Karnataka has also deported 10 Pakistani nationals found residing illegally in the state. "Illegal immigrants are not just confined to Vijayapura but are also found in districts like Chikkamagaluru, Madikeri, and Udupi," he said.

Highlighting the national security implications, the Home Minister called for border security measures similar to those implemented along the Indo-Pakistan border. He emphasized that illegal immigrants are spreading across the country and that a proactive approach is neces-

sary to address the issue.

The latest Invest Karnataka – Global Investors Meet (GIM) 2025, held from February 12 to 14, has seen rapid progress compared to its 2022 edition, with ₹10.27 lakh crore in MoUs and committed investments. Already, two projects have begun operations, and several others are set to be finalized

Of the total investments, ₹4 lakh crore has been approved, as confirmed by Additional Chief Secretary S Selvakumar from the Department of Industries and Commerce. Two projects already in progress include:

- Krones, a German food and beverage company, setting up a ₹315 crore bottling machine manufacturing plant in
- International Battery Company (IBC) establishing a ₹390 crore lithium-ion battery plant near Devanahalli.

Several more projects are nearing execution, such as:

- Lam Research (USA) investing ₹10,000 crore in semiconductor equipment manufacturing.
- Exide expanding its cell manufacturing with a ₹4,000 crore investment.
- Emmvee Energy committing ₹15,000 crore for a solar panel manufacturing
- Baldota Group's ₹54,000 crore steel plant in Koppal, currently facing environmental protests but expected to proceed. Across 21 districts, Vijayanagara received the highest investment (₹1.9 lakh crore), followed by Koppal (₹1 lakh crore) and Tumakuru (₹75,480 crore). The renewable

energy sector attracted ₹3.44 lakh crore,

making it the leading investment area. Compared to Invest Karnataka 2022, where only two projects were implemented out of ₹5.41 lakh crore pledged, this year's progress has been significantly faster. Authorities expect full implementation of largescale projects to take 3-5 years.

Karnataka Govt Grants Direct Admission to Class 6 for Underprivileged Children

The Karnataka government has announced direct enrolment for underprivileged children into residential schools under the Karnataka Residential Educational Institutions Society (KREIS) for the 2025-26 academic year. This initiative aims to support children of child and bonded labourers, sanitation workers, and other vulnerable groups by granting them direct admission into Class 6 without an entrance test.

As per a circular issued by the Labour Department, 50% of the 41,500 seats in these schools—amounting to 20,750 seats—are reserved for special category students. Of these, 10% will be allocated specifically for children of child and bonded labourers. The policy

also benefits orphans, children with disabilities, and those with HIV-positive or single parents.

These English-medium residential schools offer free education, food, accommodation, and essential learning materials, including uniforms, books, and stationery. Officials emphasized that this move aims to break the cycle of poverty and exploitation by ensuring quality education for disadvantaged children. To qualify, students must be permanent residents of Karnataka and have completed Class 5 in a government-recognized school during the 2024-25 academic year. Parents or guardians can apply online through the official KREIS website by submitting the necessary documents.

Dakshina Kannada Deputy Commissioner Mullai Muhilan M P, who also chairs the district sand committee, has constituted five squads to prevent illegal sand extraction, stocking, and transportation. This action follows multiple complaints about violations in various

To curb illegal activities from Addur Muloor to Gurpura Bridge, including Doninje, Kelagina Kere, and Mallur, the DC appointed the PWD Executive Engineer as the nodal officer. Similarly, the Minor Irrigation Executive Engineer will oversee enforcement from Gurpura Bridge to Adyapadi, while the Senior Geologist from Mines and Geology will monitor Thumbe, Arkula, and Farangipete. Additionally, Panambur ACP and Mangaluru Tahsildar will lead efforts in their respective jurisdictions.

The squads will operate in shifts to ensure continuous monitoring. Cases will be registered against individuals involved in illegal sand mining, with illegally stocked sand being seized. Landowners enabling illegal extraction by constructing 'dakkes' or roads will face legal action under the Karnataka Mines and Minerals Act.

Nodal officers must inspect sand stockyards, verify bills issued by leaseholders, and report unauthorized stockpiles. Weekly compliance reports on enforcement measures must be submitted to the DC's office. The DC warned that officials failing in their duties will face disciplinary action.

With these stringent measures, the district administration aims to crack down on illegal sand mining and ensure proper regulation of sand extraction activities.

Girinagar Police Have Arrested Four for Defrauding Elderly Woman in Bengaluru

The Girinagar police have arrested four individuals, including a woman deputy manager of a private bank, for allegedly defrauding an elderly woman of Rs 50 lakh. The accused have been identified as Meghana (bank employee), her husband Shivaprasad, and their associates Varadaraju and Anwar Ghosh.

According to police, the elderly couple had a joint account and Fixed Deposit (FD) accounts at the bank. Meghana, aware that they had recently sold their house for Rs 1 crore, misled the elderly woman during a bank visit, claiming that two of her FDs had matured and needed renewal.

newai. Later, Meghana visited the victim's home, obtained her signatures on multiple documents, including a Real-Time Gross Settlement (RTGS) form, and transferred Rs 50 lakh into her own account.

The fraud was exposed when the couple's son checked their mobile banking app and noticed the unauthorized transaction

Upon inquiring with the bank, they found that the money had been transferred to another account, prompting them to file a police complaint.

Following an investigation, all four accused were arrested, with police revealing that Meghana's husband and their associates had conspired in the crime and shared the stolen money. Legal proceedings are underway.



Three Killed in Car-Truck Collision Near Chikkodi

Suspected Food Poisoning in Mandya

A tragic case of suspected food poisoning in Malavalli taluk, Mandya district, has left a 13-year-old student dead, while over 40 others fell ill at Gokula Vidyasamsthe, an educational institution in T Kagepura village.

Authorities report that the affected students consumed leftover food from a Holi celebration, arranged by a local businessman on Friday afternoon. The food was later supplied to the school that evening, leading to students experiencing vomiting and diarrhea by Saturday.

They were initially treated at a primary health center before being shifted to the Mandya Institute of Medical Sciences. While most students are now stable, one critically ill student has been moved to a private hospital in Mysuru.

District officials, including Deputy Commissioner Kumara, have initiated a thorough investigation. The school had permission to operate

as a day school but was running a hostel illegally.

Delayed Development Worries Site Owners in Kempegowda Layout

- BDA awards Rs 159.92 crore roadwork contract to a single company
- Two-year timeline raises concerns among site owners
- Basic amenities still lacking since 2022

People who purchased sites in the Nadaprabhu Kempegowda Layout of the Bangalore Development Authority (BDA) are facing fresh challenges as delays in infrastructure development persist. Despite acquiring plots since 2022, residents allege that essential services like roads, electricity, and

sewage remain incomplete, making house construction difficult.

The BDA has now awarded a Rs 159.92 crore contract for internal roads in six blocks of the layout to a single company, with a two-year deadline for completion. This decision has raised concerns among site owners, who fear further delays in their housing plans.



Previously, the BDA had floated three separate tenders in March 2024 for road development in Blocks 5, 6, and 7, with a threemonth deadline. However, the work remains unfinished, increasing frustration among site owners.

Critics argue that awarding the entire roadwork contract to one company might slow progress instead of expediting it.

Adding to the delays, crucial infrastructure, including drinking water, sewage, and electricity,

remains incomplete in the six blocks. Residents question why a multi-agency approach, successfully implemented in Dr. Shivarama Karantha Layout, was not followed here. They fear that consolidating the work under a single contractor could lead to further postponements.

In response, the BDA has defended its decision, assuring residents that the company will complete the work on time. However, site owners remain skeptical, urging authorities to ensure timely execution of the project so they can finally build their homes.

Bengaluru's Mosque Road Faces Business Slump Due to Roadwork This Ramzan

The ongoing road construction on Mosque Road, Frazer Town, has severely impacted business during Ramzan, leading to an 80% decline in footfall. The area, once a vibrant food street, typically hosts 150-200 food stalls during the festive season, but open drains and poor road conditions have driven customers away.

Hoteliers say that despite repeated appeals to



authorities to speed up the work, the slow progress has shattered hopes of completion before Eid. Many have cut down their

menus to just Haleem

and Kebabs to minimize losses, while some have relocated their stalls to RT Nagar, Nagawara, and Kammanahalli.

The ban on outdoor food stalls, imposed last year due to traffic concerns, remains in effect. Although restaurants were permitted to set up stalls outside their premises, traffic police have reportedly stopped them, citing congestion due to roadwork.

Mohmeen, a restaura-

teur from Savera Restaurant, stated that their evening sales—typically the peak business hours—have plummeted, with only 80-100 customers per night. He added that online food orders offer little relief, as Ramzan delicacies are best enjoyed hot and fresh.

With businesses struggling and no clear timeline for road completion, the festive spirit on Mosque Road remains subdued this year.

Pro-Pakistan Slogans Scribbled on Factory Walls in Bengaluru



Bengaluru Tension erupted at a multinational company's factory in the Bidadi industrial area on the outskirts of Bengaluru after pro-Pakistan slogans were discovered scribbled on the restroom walls. The writings, which included "Pakistan Jai" and "Victory to Pakistan" in Kannada, were found on Friday night and later circulated on social media, leading to widespread outrage.

By Saturday morning, Kannada organisations gathered outside the factory, demanding the arrest of those responsible. The protestors also conmarks written against Kannadigas. In response, the Bidadi police rushed to the scene, inspected the premises, and launched an investigation.

With over 3,000 employees working at the factory, authorities suspect that some individuals among them may be involved in the incident. The police have reviewed CCTV footage and are gathering information from the management and workers to identify those responsible.

The factory management has since issued a notice warning employees against such acts and



urging them to maintain workplace harmony. Meanwhile, police have registered a case under Section 196 and Section 353(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), along with relevant provisions of the Information

Technology (IT) Act.

officials have assured strict action against those involved, emphasizing that such incidents will not be tolerated. Investigations are ongoing to track down the individuals behind the slogans.

Three Arrested Over Holi Clash at Bengaluru's Lalbagh

The Siddapura police have arrested three individuals in connection with a violent clash that erupted during Holi celebrations at Lalbagh Botanical Garden on Friday. The accused, identified as Rakesh, Umesh, and Ramesh, all aged between 20 and 26 and working in hotels, were taken into custody monday.

According to police, the accused were intoxicated while celebrating Holi when a dispute between two groups escalated into a physical altercation. Videos of the incident circulating on social media showed individuals fight-

ing with sticks at the Lalbagh rock, causing panic among visitors.

Taking suo motu cognizance of the incident, the Siddapura police registered a case under Section 194 of the Bharatiya

Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) for affray, as the fight disturbed public peace. After analyzing the video evidence, authorities arrested three suspects and are actively working to identify others involved.

The accused reportedly assaulted a street hawker



during the brawl. Alarmed visitors alerted horticulture department officials, but the culprits fled before authorities arrived. The police are now reviewing CCTV footage from the area to track down and arrest the remaining individuals linked to the violance.



Karnataka HC Orders CBI Probe into Kolar Congress Leader **Srinivas Murder Case**

The Karnataka High Court has ordered a Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) probe into the murder of Kolar Congress leader and former Zilla Panchayat President M. Srinivas. The decision comes after a petition by Srinivas's wife, Dr. S. Chandrakala, who argued that the local police and CID failed to conduct a proper investigation.

Srinivas, a close associate of Home Minister G. Parameshwara and former Speaker Ramesh Kumar, was brutally murdered on October 23, 2023, on the outskirts of Srinivaspur. He was attacked with deadly weapons, and his murder has been suspected to have political motives.

A bench led by Justice M. Nagaprasanna, acknowledging the lapses in the initial investigation, directed the CBI to take over the case and submit a report within three months. The court also instructed the local police to extend full cooperation to the CBI.


Dr. Chandrakala, in her petition, alleged a political conspiracy behind her husband's murder and argued that only a CBI probe could bring out the truth. Senior Public Prosecutor Hanumantharaya also supported the demand for a CBI investigation, citing failures in the current inquiry.

The High Court's order has intensified the political debate around the case, with calls for an impartial probe into the murder.

Deputy Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar has issued a strong warning to Karnataka Youth Congress leaders after unauthorized banners and flexes were put up in Bengaluru ahead of their oath-taking ceremony. The newly elected office bearers, including Youth Congress President Manjunath Gowda, had planned a grand inauguration at Palace Grounds on Monday, but the event drew criticism due to widespread rule violations. Shivakumar expressed his anger over the unauthorized display of flexes and banners, directing the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) to take immediate

action. He stated that such acts of publicity should not be encouraged and instructed party members to prove their strength in polling booths instead. "Those who have put up illegal banners should remove them immediately. If not, strict action, including fines, will be imposed," he warned.

Following his orders, BBMP Chief Commissioner Tushar Girinath led an overnight crackdown, removing over 170 unauthorized banners, including 40 large-sized flexes from Bellary Road and other key areas in Bengaluru. A penalty of ₹5 lakh has been imposed on the offenders, and officials have

been instructed to recover the costs of removal from those responsible. Additionally, authorities have warned of criminal cases against repeat violations.

The swift action comes as part of a broader effort

Kids Who Abandon Parents May Lose Property - Karnataka Minister

Karnataka Medical Education Minister Dr. Sharan Prakash Patil has directed officials to revoke property transfers made in favor of children who later abandon their elderly parents in government hospitals.

During a review meeting at Vikasa Soudha, the Director of Belagavi Institute of Medical Sciences (BIMS) reported that over 150 cases of elderly individuals being deserted at Additionally, more than 100 similar cases have been found across various government medical colleges in Karnataka.

Following this, Dr. Patil instructed all government medical colleges to report such cases and file complaints with assistant commissioners (revenue sub-division) for legal action. He also directed the Director of Medical Education, Dr. B.L. Sujatha Rathod, to take immediate measures.

Dr. Patil emphasized BIMS had been recorded. that under the Mainte-



nance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007, parents have the legal right to revoke property transfers if their children neglect them. He

which allows for property to be returned to the parent if a child fails in their duty of care.

Medical officers present at the meeting recited Section 23 of the Act, vealed that many elderly

individuals had been left at hospitals under the pretext of treatment, only to be abandoned.

While some families cited financial hardships, in many cases, abandonment occurred after the parents had transferred their property to their children.

Hospitals provide basic necessities, leading some families to leave elderly parents there intentionally. To address the issue, BIMS has already relocated 70 elderly individuals to retirement homes.

her arrival at Bengaluru's Kempegowda International Airport from Dubai. Authorities seized 14.2 kg of foreign-origin gold bars worth ₹12.56 crore from her possession.

Yatnal claimed to have detailed information on individuals involved in the case, including ministers, and vowed to reveal their names during the upcoming Assembly session. "I have collected complete information



about her connections, who helped her secure security clearance, and how the gold was smuggled. Those guilty must be held accountable," he asserted.

Reports indicate that Ranya Rao allegedly bypassed security checks multiple times using VIP protocol facilitated by

her stepfather, senior IPS officer DGP K Ramachandra Rao. Investigators noted her frequent trips to Dubai, prompting the DRI to monitor her movements. She was eventually intercepted upon her return, and 12 gold bars of foreign origin were seized.

Encounter Breaks Out Between Security Forces, Terrorists In J&K's Kupwara

An encounter broke between terrorists security forces in the Kupwara district of Jammu and Kashmir on Monday, according to officials. The confrontation occurred after security forces launched a cordon and search operation in the Krumhoora village of Zachaldara, based on intelligence reports about the presence of terrorists in the area.

This encounter is part of a broader, ongoing effort by Indian security forces to eliminate terrorist activity in Jammu and Kashmir, particularly in areas such as Kupwara, which has been a hotspot for militant activities. Further updates are expected as the situation unfolds.

generate an estimated ₹3,450 crore in the 2025-26 fiscal year through the newly-introduced Mineral Bearing Land Tax Act, which was enacted following a Supreme Court ruling last year. The ruling allows states to impose a tax on mines and minerals, paving the way for the state government to establish this tax framework.

In the current year, the state government anticipates a revenue of around ₹1,545 crore from the non-ferrous mining and metallurgical industries.

This figure is expected to rise significantly to ₹4,980 crore in the coming year, as stated in the latest budget document presented in the Tamil Nadu Assembly last week.

The Mineral Bearing Land Tax Act, which received the assent of Governor R.N. Ravi on February 20, 2025, outlines the tax rates for different categories of minerals, including both major and minor minerals, as well as for mineral oil, crude oil, and natural gas. For example, a rate of ₹250 per tonne has been set for lignite, while the highest tax rate for major minerals, such



per tonne. Rates for minor minerals range from ₹40 per tonne for clay to ₹420 per tonne for black granite. The tax on crude oil is ₹8,500 per tonne, and natural gas is taxed at ₹3.5 per cubic metre.

However, the implementation of this tax has faced opposition from certain sectors, particularly cement manufacturers. They have raised concerns that the new tax could drive up their production costs, which would likely be passed on to consumers, potentially affecting the overall price of cement in the market.



Despite these concerns, the state government is moving ahead with its plan to leverage this tax as a significant source of revenue, with the aim of bolstering the state's economy while adhering to the Supreme Court's judgment.

ASHAs Intensify Agitation in Kerala, Lay Siege to Secretariat in Thiruvananthapuram

cial Health Activists (ASHAs) in Kerala, who have been protesting for 35 days, intensified their agitation on Monday by laying siege to the Secretariat in Thiruvananthapuram. Under the banner of the Kerala ASHA Health Workers' Association (KAHWA), thousands of ASHAs from across the state blocked the North Gate of the Secretariat, bringing life to a standstill along the busy

The police had earlier blocked traffic and secured the gates of the Secretariat, but the ASHAs, undeterred, continued their sit-in protest. KAH-WA leaders vowed not to disperse until the government acknowledged their demands for basic rights and improved compensa-

The protesting ASHAs, though few in number at the Secretariat, represent the collective voice of over 10 lakh ASHAs nationwide. Their fight, centered around inadequate pay and recognition, has drawn national attention. The ASHAs, who play a crucial role in the grassroots health system, have

long faced challenges due to their underpaid and overworked status. In response to their struggles, Union Health Minister J.P. Nadda recently mentioned in Parliament that the incentive pattern for ASHAs would be revised, though no timeline was given.

At the state level, however, the Kerala government has taken a more passive stance, stating that the issue lies with the central government. The state has argued that it is up to the Centre to formalize the employment status of ASHAs, granting them minimum wage benefits rather than classifying them as health volun-

Despite calls for intervention from political figures, including Leader of the Opposition V.D. Satheesan, the Kerala government has not responded favorably. Satheesan, along with senior Congress leader Ramesh Chennithala, visited the protest site, offering solidarity and criticizing the government's lack of engagement. They accused the Chief Minister of taking a "vengeful stance" and ignoring the plight of the ASHAs.

LDF convener T.P. Ramakrishnan expressed empathy with the ASHAs' cause but reiterated that the resolution depended on the Centre's actions.



Election Commission Needs Urgent Course Correction on Voter Rolls

The Election Commission of India (ECI) ensure each voter has a unique EPIC num-service delivery to citizens. However, the is facing growing criticism from Opposition parties over discrepancies in electoral rolls and issues of duplicate Elector Photo Identity Card (EPIC) numbers. As the country approaches a significant milestone of 100 crore eligible voters, these concerns have raised alarm over the integrity of the electoral process. If not addressed swiftly, these issues could undermine the credibility of India's democratic framework.

The ECI has acknowledged that while some EPIC numbers may appear identical, other voter details such as demographic information, assembly constituency, and polling booth are different. However, this assurance has done little to quell concerns, and many believe it is insufficient. The need for a comprehensive national exercise to

ber has become critical. In addition, there must be stronger coordination between the ECI and state electoral officers to ensure accurate and updated voter databases. Lapses by these officers, particularly in managing voter records independently, seem to have contributed to these discrepancies.

A key point of contention is the ECI's move to link voter IDs with Aadhaar. Although current law allows for voluntary linking of Aadhaar details to electoral rolls, the government has assured that those who do not comply will not be removed from the voter list. This approach aims to prevent coercive actions and ensure inclusivity. Aadhaar, being a unique identifier, plays a pivotal role in eliminating duplicate voters, ensuring transparency, and improving

government must focus on resolving the current issues with voter rolls before undertaking major reforms like 'One Nation, One Election.'

The concerns raised by Opposition parties are valid, as voter roll integrity is the cornerstone of any fair election. For a democracy as vast as India's, it is crucial to ensure that the voter list is accurate and free from duplication. The ECI's upcoming high-level meeting on March 18 to discuss the Aadhaar linkage issue must result in a clear, time-bound plan to address these concerns. Failure to act swiftly and decisively could lead to widespread disenchantment with the electoral process, damaging the trust that citizens place in their democratic institutions.



Ukraine Faces Potential "Frozen" Conflict Amid **Ceasefire Talks**

Ukraine may be on the verge of a "frozen" conflict, as international pressure mounts for a ceasefire, yet both sides remain far from agreeing on a lasting peace. The recent proposal for a 30-day ceasefire, brokered by the U.S., has brought global attention to Moscow's stance. While Russian President Vladimir Putin expressed conditional support for a ceasefire, emphasizing that it should address the root causes of the war, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky has warned that Putin's intentions are manipulative and aimed at gaining further territorial

Putin's response is strategic; he recognizes that the conflict is not just a military struggle but a geopolitical one, and he aims to prolong negotiations to maximize his gains. With Russia regaining control of significant areas in Ukraine, including the Kursk region, Putin is pushing for a halt to Western military support to Ukraine during the ceasefire period, further complicating negotiations.

The situation mirrors the Korean War's armistice, where an official peace agreement was never signed, only a temporary halt to hostilities. Just as the Korean conflict remained unresolved for years, Ukraine could face a similar fate, with no peace deal in sight. Putin's demands to keep Crimea and parts of Donbas under Russian control are unacceptable to Ukraine, which remains determined to reclaim its territory.

Zelensky, meanwhile, is in a weaker position, as the Trump administration has hinted that Kyiv may have to accept significant territorial losses, including not joining NATO. The ill-fated Ukrainian offensive in Kursk last year only compounded the country's strategic challenges, with Russia regaining lost ground.

While the U.S. puts pressure on Moscow to accept the ceasefire and toughens sanctions on Russian energy and banking sectors, Zelensky is calling for guarantees to ensure Russia adheres to the ceasefire. The Kremlin, however, opposes the idea of European peacekeepers in Ukraine, with Putin preferring a role for countries like India and other BRICS nations, who have maintained neutral relations with Russia.

As talks progress, the conflict risks becoming a prolonged "frozen" war, where violence stops but a lasting peace remains elusive. For Ukraine, the challenge is to ensure its sovereignty while navigating complex international pressures.

India Must Deftly Walk the Tariff Tightrope

India faces a significant challenge in negotiating trade tariffs with the United States under President Donald Trump. The tariffs being used as leverage for non-trade objectives, such as reducing illegal immigration and bolstering the dollar, have caused global trade turmoil. While Trump's trade war strategy appears erratic, India must navigate these tumultuous waters carefully to avoid serious economic setbacks.

India's trade surplus with the U.S. has become a point of contention for the Trump administration, particularly as India runs a large overall trade deficit with the world. India's high tariffs on agricultural products, automobiles, and alcohol—ranging from 100% to 165%—have particularly drawn criticism. In response, India offered to reduce tariffs on items of American interest, like bourbon whiskey, but this gesture has not mollified Trump.

The situation has become a complex balancing act. On the one hand, India is protective of its domestic industries, such as agriculture and automobiles, where high tariffs shield local businesses and farmers from foreign competition. On the other hand, India has significant vulnerabilities. For instance, if India agrees to reduce tariffs for the U.S., it risks setting a precedent for other countries, such as the European Union and the U.K., who have long sought similar concessions. Moreover, the United States is unlikely to significantly increase its exports even if India cuts tariffs, making this trade dispute more emotional than practical.

India's economic situation is far stronger today compared to 1991, when it faced an economic crisis. The 1991 economic reforms opened up India's economy, making it the world's fifth-largest economy today. However, India's agricultural and automobile sectors remain overprotected, reminiscent of the country's pre-reform era. With growing global competition and changing economic dynamics, India must reconsider its high tariff policies.

Eliminating tariffs on agriculture and manufactured goods would help India integrate more deeply into the global economy, boosting its manufacturing sector and attracting foreign investments. This shift would also create jobs in new indus-



tries, while freeing up resources to address pressing domestic issues such as the over-reliance on agriculture. India should not only focus on tariff reductions but also harness its labor force's potential in emerging sectors like sports, entertainment, and personal services. By retraining workers and investing in global opportunities, India can ensure long-term prosperity without compromising its economic independence. In conclusion, India must tread carefully with the U.S. on tariffs, aiming to strike a deal that protects its interests while positioning itself as an open and competitive player in the global economy.



Pakistan Faces Growing Internal Crisis Amid Baloch Separatism and TTP Resurgence

Pakistan is grappling with a significant internal crisis, driven by escalating separatist insurgencies and a surge in terrorist attacks. The Baloch Liberation Army (BLA) has intensified its activities, conducting at least 14 attacks between 2020 and 2025 against Chinese nationals, killing 20 people and injuring 34. In addition, over 400 Pakistani security personnel have died in similar attacks. While the BLA's militancy continues, the Baloch independence movement is also supported by non-violent activists, such as Mahrang Baloch, advocating for provincial autonomy and social justice.

The BLA's March 13 hijacking of the Jaffar Express, a high-profile operation, has propelled the movement into the international spotlight. This event parallels other global incidents, such as the October 2023 Hamas attack, highlighting the BLA's strategy to rejuvenate the Baloch cause. However, this bold action risks triggering a harsh response from Pakistan's military establishment, which traditionally leans towards military solutions rather than diplomatic engage-

Pakistan's counterinsurgency history reveals the limits of force in resolving separatist movements. In 1971, the state's heavy-handed tactics led to the separation of East Pakistan (now Bangladesh). Similarly, while Operation Zarb-e-Azb against the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) brought temporary peace, it failed to address the underlying issues, with the TTP quickly resurfacing when the Taliban gained control of Afghanistan.

The Baloch insurgency shares key similarities with past conflicts, where the state's reliance on military might has proven ineffective. Pakistan's failure to address the grievances of ethnic minorities like the Baloch, Sindhis, and Kashmiris has prolonged regional instability. As the TTP resurges and Baloch separatism gains momentum, Pakistan faces a perilous situation where military responses alone could lead to a prolonged, unwinnable conflict.

Pakistan's military engagement across its borders, including operations along the Durand Line, and its ongoing internal conflicts threaten to undermine recent economic stabilization. With tensions rising and the situation spiraling out of control, Pakistan must reconsider its approach, shifting from forceful suppression to genuine political dialogue to prevent further destabilization.





PM Modi-Christopher Luxon meeting: India, New Zealand ink defence pact

India and New Zealand have signed a defence cooperation agreement aimed at boosting their partnership in maritime safety and security. This pact follows a bilateral meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and New Zealand Prime Minister Christopher Luxon on Monday, marking a significant step in strengthening the two nations' ties.

Following the talks, Modi emphasized the decision to strengthen and institutionalize the defence and security relationship between the two countries. He also revealed that a roadmap would be developed to guide future cooperation in the defence industry sector, ensuring more strategic collaboration.

As a member of the Five Eyes intelligence alliance, New Zealand plays a vital role in global security, and this agreement is seen as a move to

enhance both countries' strategic interests in the Indo-Pacific region. The focus on maritime safety and security is particularly significant given the increasing geopolitical challenges in the region, which call for stronger partnerships between like-minded nations.

The new agreement is expected to deepen defence engagements and facilitate greater collaboration on training, joint exercises, and the sharing of best practices in the defence sector. Both leaders acknowledged the importance of maintaining a rules-based international order in the maritime domain, and this agreement serves as a step towards enhancing peace and stability in the region.

This development also reflects India's growing global influence and its efforts to strengthen ties with key partners like New Zealand, in line with its broader foreign policy strategy to bolster defence cooperation across the Indo-Pacific.



India and Sweden Aim to Strengthen Trade and Investment Ties

Discussions focus on green technologies, smart infrastructure, and economic cooperation

India and Sweden are actively exploring ways to enhance their bilateral trade and investment relations, with a focus on fostering economic cooperation in key sectors. During a recent meeting in New Delhi, Union Minister of Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal, and Swedish Minister for Foreign Affairs, Maria M. Stenergard, discussed opportunities for collaboration in areas such as green technologies, renewable energy, smart infrastructure, and healthcare.

Sweden is currently the 21st largest investor in India, with a cumulative foreign direct investment (FDI) of USD 2.51 billion from April 2000 to March 2024. Key sectors attracting Swedish investments include automobiles, industrial machinery, engineering, electrical equipment, and metallurgy. The two countries aim to further strengthen their trade and investment ties through increased cooperation, opening up new avenues for business in both nations.

Minister Goyal emphasized the importance of these discussions, saying, "We discussed ways to further strengthen the India-Sweden bilateral trade and investment partnership, fostering economic cooperation and opening up new business opportunities in both nations." The Joint Economic Commission (JEC) continues to serve as the primary platform for government-to-government dialogue between India and Sweden.

In recent trade statistics, India's exports to Sweden reached USD 104 million in June 2024, while imports totaled USD 171 million, resulting in a trade deficit of USD 66.6 million. However, compared to June 2023, India's exports to Sweden saw significant growth of 45.2%, while imports increased by 21.6%. Key exports from India to Sweden include ready-made cotton garments, electric machinery, automobile spare parts, and iron and steel products. Imports from Sweden include iron and steel, pulp and waste paper, paper products, auto components, and industrial machinery for various sectors.

This growing engagement between the two countries comes as Sweden strengthens its global partnerships, responding to shifts in international dynamics, including the impact of Russia's invasion of Ukraine and its evolving stance toward China. Both nations continue to deepen their ties, focusing on shared goals of economic growth and mutual prosperity.



RG Kar Rape-Murder Case: SC disposes of parents' plea for fresh CBI probe – 'free to approach Calcutta HC'

The Supreme Court of India on Monday, March 17, dismissed a petition filed by the parents of a victim in the RG Kar rape-murder case, seeking a fresh investigation by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI). However, the court granted them the option to pursue their case in the Calcutta High Court.

Chief Justice of India, Sanjiv Khanna, stated, "Without making comments, we dispose of the application observing that the applicant is at liberty to pursue the proceedings before the HC," according to legal news agency LiveLaw.

The case relates to the horrific rape and murder of a 31-year-old post-graduate trainee doctor at the RG Kar Medical College and Hospital in Kolkata. Her body was discovered on August 9, 2024, within the hospital premises. Investigations revealed that the woman had been raped and murdered, sparking widespread protests across the country.

During a prior hearing, the CJI-led Bench directed hospitals and medical colleges nationwide not to penalize doctors and medical professionals who had participated in protests over the case but had returned to their duties after the Supreme Court's appeal. Senior Advocate Karuna Nundi represented the victim's parents, while Solicitor General of India Tushar Mehta appeared on behalf of the CBI.

In February 2025, a special court in Kolkata ordered the CBI to submit a progress report on the case by February 24. The CBI had taken over the investigation following a directive from the Calcutta High Court.



Centre has accorded approval for Chandrayaan-5 Mission: ISRO chief ISRO to Launch 250 kg Rover to Study the Moon

The Centre has granted approval for the ambitious Chandrayaan-5 mission, aimed at studying the lunar surface, ISRO Chairman V. Narayanan announced on Sunday. Speaking at an event to felicitate his appointment as the new head of the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), Narayanan highlighted the significance of the mission, which will carry a 250 kg rover, a substantial upgrade from the 25-kg rover 'Prayagyaan' aboard Chandrayaan-3.

The Chandrayaan-5 mission, a key part of ISRO's lunar exploration program, will focus on detailed surface studies of the moon. Narayanan noted that this mission would be a step forward in ISRO's lunar exploration capabilities, following the success of the previous Chandrayaan missions. Chandrayaan-1, launched in 2008, provided crucial data on the moon's chemical, mineralogical, and photo-geological characteristics. Despite a partial setback during the Chandrayaan-2 mission in 2019, which was 98% successful, the high-resolution camera on the spacecraft continues to send valuable images from the lunar surface.

Narayanan also spoke about the recent success of the Chandrayaan-3 mission, which achieved a significant milestone with the Vikram lander performing a soft landing on the moon's South Pole on August 23, 2023.



India, New Zealand resume FTA talks, bilateral meet held

India and New Zealand have officially resumed negotiations for a proposed free trade agreement (FTA), marking a significant step towards strengthening economic ties after a nearly decade-long pause. The two countries began discussions on the Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (CECA) in April 2010, aimed at boosting trade in goods, services, and investment. However, after nine rounds of talks, negotiations stalled in 2015.

The announcement of the resumption of talks came after Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal met with New Zealand's Minister for Trade and Investment, Todd McClay, during a high-level visit by New Zealand Prime Minister Christopher Luxon to India. The two leaders agreed to pursue a comprehensive and mutually beneficial FTA that seeks to enhance supply chain integration, improve market access, and unlock new business opportunities for both countries.

Bilateral trade between India and New Zealand has been steadily growing, surpassing \$1 billion during April-January 2025. However, a report by the Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI) suggests that the proposed FTA may offer limited benefits to Indian companies, as many already enjoy duty-free access to a significant portion of goods in the New Zealand market. The report notes that New Zealand's average import tariff is just 2.3%, compared to India's 17.8%. Despite this, the FTA negotiations aim to further enhance trade relations and unlock new opportunities for businesses and consumers. India's exports to New Zealand include clothing, textiles, refined petroleum, agricultural machinery, and basmati rice.







Trump Attempts to Void Biden's Pardons, **Raising Legal and Political Controversies**

U.S. President Donald Trump has moved to annul several of his predecessor Joe Biden's pardons, marking the latest in a series of actions to challenge political opponents. Among the pardons Trump declared void were those granted to Members of the U.S. House of Representatives investigating the January 6, 2020, Capitol attack, as well as prominent figures such as Dr. Anthony Fauci, who headed the Biden Administration's COVID-19 response, and former Joint Chiefs Chairman Mark Milley.

Trump's statement on his 'Truth Social' media platform claimed that these pardons, signed by Biden just before he left office on January 20, were invalid because they were allegedly signed using an autopen. "The 'Pardons' that Sleepy Joe Biden gave to the Unselect Committee of Political Thugs... are hereby declared VOID, VACANT, AND OF NO FURTHER FORCE OR EFFECT," Trump wrote early Monday morning.

The January 6 Select Committee, which Trump criticized, included several high-profile figures, such as Republicans Liz Cheney and Adam Kinzinger, and Democrat Adam Schiff, all vocal critics of Trump. On his first day in office, Trump had pardoned over 1,500 individuals involved in the Capitol attack, further emphasizing his controversial use of pardons.

Trump also claimed—without evidence—that Biden might not have been aware of the pardons and suggested that members of the Select Committee might have signed them on his behalf. He asserted that these individuals, who he accused of destroying evidence during their investigation, should be prepared for high-level scrutiny.

While Trump's attempt to nullify these pardons raises significant questions about executive power, he acknowledged that it would ultimately be up to the courts to decide if the rescinding of presidential pardons is legally valid. Presidential pardoning power, granted by Article II Section 2 of the U.S. Constitution, is broad but has historically been used to protect allies and family members. Despite these powers, the courts have largely refrained from limiting presidential pardons, leaving their scope open to interpreta-



Ukraine Appoints Major General Andrii Hnatov as New Chief of General Staff

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky has appointed Major General Andrii Hnatov as the new Chief of the General Staff of the Ukrainian Armed Forces, replacing Lieutenant General Anatolii Barhylevych. The decision, announced through decrees published on the presidential website, did not specify the reasons behind the leadership change.

Defense Minister Rustem Umerov confirmed the reshuffle, emphasizing that the move was aimed at improving the combat effectiveness of the armed forces. Umerov noted that the promotion of Hnatov, which he recommended, is part of Ukraine's broader efforts to transform its military. Hnatov brings over 27 years of military experience to the position, having previously commanded various units, including a marine brigade, Operational Command East, and the Joint Forces of the Ukrainian Armed Forces.

As part of the restructuring, Barhylevych has been appointed chief inspector of the Ministry of Defence. His new role will focus on ensuring compliance with military standards and reinforcing discipline within the Ukrainian military. Barhylevych had served as Chief of the General Staff since February 2024.

Competition is fine, not conflict: PM Modi on China

Prime Minister Narendra Modi stated on Sunday that cooperation between India and China benefits not only the two nations but also the global community. Speaking to Lex Fridman in a podcast, he highlighted the progress made in normalizing the situation along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) and noted that both countries are working toward restoring the pre-2020 status along the border, although the process might take

Modi emphasized that India-China cooperation is crucial for global stability and prosperity, stating, "The 21st century is the Asian century. Competition is natural, but there should not be conflict." Reflecting on the historical ties between India and China, Modi pointed out that the two countries, both ancient civilizations, have learned from each other throughout history. He noted that they once contributed to half of the world's GDP and had little history of conflict.

Looking ahead, Modi expressed India's desire to maintain strong ties with China. "Differences between neighbors are natural, and occasional disagreements are also natural.



do not escalate into disputes. We prioritize dialogue over discord," he said. Modi acknowledged that the 2020 border standoff had strained relations, but emphasized that efforts are underway to rebuild trust.

On relations with Pakistan, Modi reflected on his previous attempts to foster peace, including his invitation to Pakistan at his 2014 swearing-in ceremony. He said, "The biggest breakthrough was inviting Pakistan, but the results were disappointing." Modi criticized Our aim is to ensure that these differences Pakistan for continuing to pursue conflict

instead of peace and harmony, despite the heavy emotional toll of the Partition on India. He pointed to Pakistan's role in global terrorism, particularly its involvement in the 9/11 attacks, as a source of global instability.

Modi urged Pakistan to abandon its policy of state-sponsored terrorism, stating that such actions were harming both India and the world. He expressed hope that Pakistan would eventually choose peace and that its people, too, were frustrated with the ongoing cycle of violence.

NASA announces Sunita Williams, Butch Wilmore's return date to earth

NASA has confirmed the return date for astronauts Sunita Williams and Butch Wilmore, who have spent an extended mission aboard the International Space Station (ISS). The pair, along with fellow astronauts Nick Hague and Russian cosmonaut Aleksandr Gorbunov, will return to Earth in mid-March aboard a SpaceX capsule.

Williams and Wilmore were originally scheduled for a brief mission lasting about a week when they launched in June 2024 aboard Boeing's first astronaut flight. However, due to several issues with the Boeing Starliner capsule, which delayed their scheduled return, they ended up spending nearly nine months in space. The capsule had encountered multiple technical problems, forcing NASA to leave

On Sunday, a new SpaceX crew capsule arrived at the ISS, delivering replacements for Williams and Wilmore. The four astronauts, hailing from the US, Japan, and Russia, will spend a few days aboard the station, learn-

ing about its operations from the experienced

crew members before the pair return to Earth.

"Lack Of Trust": Israel's Netanyahu Seeks **To Fire Internal Security Agency Chief**

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu announced on Sunday, March 17, 2025, that he intends to seek the dismissal of Ronen Bar, the head of Israel's internal security agency, Shin Bet. Netanyahu's decision follows weeks of public disputes between the two, especially after the Hamas attack on October 7, 2023, which triggered the ongoing war in Gaza. Netanyahu criticized Bar's leadership and accused him of failing to prevent the attack, which resulted in over 1,200 Israeli deaths.

In a video statement, Netanyahu explained that the lack of trust between him and Bar had led to the decision, stating that the Shin Bet's leadership needed to be restored in order to meet Israel's war objectives and prevent further disaster. He claimed that Bar's actions, including alleged media leaks, had obstructed necessary reforms within the agency.

However, Bar has rejected the notion that his dismissal is tied to the failures surrounding the October attack. He argued that Netanya-



India's Wholesale Inflation Rises to 2.38% in February, Food Prices Ease



India's wholesale inflation. based on the wholesale price index (WPI), rose to 2.38% in February, slightly up from 2.31% in January, according to provisional data released by the Union Ministry of Commerce on Monday. The increase in inflation was driven by a slower pace of decline in fuel and power prices and a rise in the prices of manufactured products.

The WPI inflation in February was marginally higher than the 2.36% predicted by economists in a Reuters poll.

Food Prices Show Moderate Increase Food prices, a major contributor to the overall inflation, increased by 5.94% annually in February, although this was a decrease compared to December's 8.85% and January's 7.47%

cereal prices rose by 6.77% in February, a slight decline from January's 7.33%. Meanwhile, vegetable prices fell by 5.80%, following an 8.35% surge in January. However, the prices of onions and fruits continued to rise.

Despite the softer rise in food prices, they have remained elevated for over a year, largely due to uneven monsoon rains between November 2023 and June

Sonal Badhan, economist at the Bank of Baroda, noted that food inflation softened, helped by a broad-based slowdown. "The vegetable inflation index eased the most, followed by food grain inflation and inflation for protein-based items like milk, eggs, meat, and fish," she explained.

Rahul Agrawal, senior economist at ICRA Ltd., said that the overall uptick in wholesale inflation was primarily driven by non-food items. He added that the cooling in food inflation was offset by the narrowing deflation in fuel and power and an increase in core WPI inflation, which reached a 24-month high

Looking ahead, experts predict volatility in commodity prices due to factors like the trade war and uncertainty surrounding US Federal Reserve rate cuts.

Swiggy Shares Rise 2% as Instamart Expands to 100 Cities in India



Swiggy's shares gained nearly 2% in intraday trade on Monday, March 17, reaching ₹359.30 apiece, following the announcement of a significant milestone for its Quick Commerce platform, Instamart. The platform, which was launched in August 2020, has now expanded to 100 cities across India, responding to the growing demand for fast 10-minute deliveries, especially in Tier-2 and Tier-3 cities.

In its filing to the exchanges, Swiggy revealed that it had introduced Instamart to 32 new cities this month alone, including Raipur, Siliguri, Jodhpur, and Thanjavur. This expansion brings the convenience of rapid deliveries to millions of customers, who now have access to over 30,000 products, ranging from groceries and daily essentials to electronics, fashion, makeup, and toys, all delivered within 10 minutes.

Amitesh Jha, CEO of Swiggy Instamart, spoke about the milestone, noting that the platform has gained significant traction not only in metro cities but also in smaller towns. He emphasized that the demand for quick

commerce has grown substantially beyond Indian metros, highlighting the importance of their expansion to underserved

In 2025, Swiggy reported that one in four new users came from Tier-2 and Tier-3 cities, demonstrating the increasing demand for quick commerce in these regions. The company remains committed to offering convenience, variety, and value to a broader customer base while empowering local ecosystems by supporting dark store staff and delivery partners.

Despite a 43% drop in Swiggy's share price from its peak, analysts remain optimistic about the long-term potential of the quick commerce space. They view the recent correction as an opportunity, with some brokerages offering positive outlooks. JM Financial has set a "buy" rating with a target price of ₹500, suggesting a 34.6% upside. ICICI Securities also maintains a "buy" call with a target price of ₹740 per share.

Tata Motors to Hike Prices of Commercial Vehicles by Up to 2% from April

The iPhone 17 series has been a topic of extensive speculation, with rumors suggesting the lineup will include the iPhone 17, iPhone 17 Air (or iPhone 17 Slim), iPhone 17 Pro, and iPhone 17 Pro Max, with an expected launch in the second quarter of this year. Among these, the iPhone 17 Air was slated to be Apple's thinnest iPhone yet, potentially replacing the Plus variant in the lineup.

Bloomberg's Mark Gurman has revealed new details about the iPhone 17 Air, including an ambitious plan that Apple initially considered. According to Gurman's weekly Power On newsletter, Apple originally planned to make the iPhone 17 Air "Apple's first completely port-free iPhone." The device would have relied on wireless charging and cloud-based data syncing, eliminating the traditional charging ports altogether. This move was intended to pave the way for even slimmer models in the future, with a sleek, minimalist design that further pushed the limits of device thinness.

However, Apple reportedly scrapped this plan to avoid po-

tential regulatory issues, particularly from the European Union (EU), which has recently mandated that tech companies like Apple adopt the USB Type-C charging standard. Apple's decision was likely influenced by the need to comply with the EU's regulations and maintain its broad consumer appeal.

The iPhone 17 Air's thin design would have required a thinner battery, which could have compromised battery life. To avoid this, Apple instructed engineers to redesign key components, including the display and silicon, to optimize efficiency while maintaining performance.

Expected Specifications: The iPhone 17 Air is expected to feature a 9.5mm thick profile, including the 4mm camera bump. It may offer a 6.6-inch OLED display with a 120Hz ProMotion refresh rate and Dynamic Island. The device could house a 24MP front camera, a 48MP rear camera, and be made with a titanium frame. It may also include Apple's first 5G modem and Wi-Fi chip. Rumored pricing is between \$1,299 and \$1,500.

Amazon Echo Users Will No Longer Have Option to Process Alexa Voice Recordings On-Device



Amazon has announced that starting March 28, Echo users will no longer have the option to process their voice commands and recordings locally on their devices. Instead, all Alexa voice recordings will be sent to Amazon's cloud for processing, as the company expands Alexa's capabilities with generative AI features. This change affects all Echo devices such as smart speakers and displays.

In an email to users who had previously enabled the 'Do Not Send Voice Recordings' option, Amazon explained that on-device processing is being discontinued to enable the new AI-driven features that require the processing power of Amazon's secure cloud. The company emphasized that Alexa voice requests will remain encrypted during transmission to the cloud, where they are processed under security protections.

Although voice recordings will still be deleted automatically after processing, the new policy raises privacy concerns. Many users may be uncomfortable with Amazon having access to their voice data, especially in the context of in-home devices that can listen continuously. Amazon assures users that privacy controls will still be available through the Alexa Privacy dashboard, where they can manage how their data is handled, including the option to prevent their voice recordings from being stored at all. Amazon also announced the upcoming launch of Alexa+, a subscription-based, generative AI version of Alexa, which will include advanced features like Alexa Voice ID. This feature will allow Alexa to recognize individual users based on their voice, and share personalized content like calendar events and music. However, Amazon clarified that Voice ID may not function if users choose not to save voice recordings.

This shift in policy is part of Amazon's ongoing push to enhance Alexa's AI capabilities but raises concerns about privacy, particularly in light of past controversies surrounding the handling of user data. Notably, Amazon has faced scrutiny over allowing employees to listen to Alexa voice recordings for training purposes and other privacy violations related to its Ring doorbell cameras.

US Vending Machine Goes Viral for Duplicating Keys in Minutes






