Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah has made it clear that the Congress high command will take the final call on any leadership change in the state. His statement comes in response to senior Congress leader Veerappa Moily's remarks suggesting that Deputy Chief Minister D K Shivakumar will soon take over as Chief Minister. the party's central leadership is the sole authority on the matter, and individual opinions hold no significance.


Siddaramaiah reiterated that he would abide by the high command's directions, emphasizing that whatever decision is made at the top level will be final. He downplayed Veerappa Moily's comments, stating that the personal opinions of leaders do not determine the party's course of

The Chief Minister's reaction comes amid growing speculation within Karnataka's political circles about a possible leadership transition. Reports suggest that a "roing" formula was discussed when the Congress formed the government after its resounding victory in 2023. Under this reported agreement, Siddaramaiah would serve as Chief Minister for the first half of the term, followed by Shivakumar taking

Despite All India Congress Committee (AICC) president Mallikarjun Kharge's warning to party leaders against public discussions on leadership changes, several senior leaders continue to make statements on the matter. Siddaramaiah refrained from directly criticizing Moily but underlined his commitment to following the high command's instructions.

On Sunday, Veerappa Moily claimed that it was a "settled matter" that Shivakumar would eventually become Chief Minister. He insisted that no one could prevent Shivakumar's elevation, calling it only a matter of time. Moily's comments have further fueled the ongoing debate within the party.

D K Shivakumar, who also serves as the Karnataka Congress president, has openly expressed his desire to become Chief Minister, making no secret of his political ambitions. However, Siddaramaiah remains firm that only the party's national leadership will make the final decision, ensuring the matter stays within the party framework.

The Supreme Court on Monday allowed YouTuber and podcaster Ranveer Allahbadia to resume his show, The Ranveer Show, after receiving an undertaking that he would maintain standards of decency and morality in all future episodes. A bench of Justices Surya Kant and N K Singh modified its February 18 order, which had barred Allahbadia from airing any content on YouTube or other platforms after multiple FIRs were registered against him over controversial remarks made during the show India's Got Latent. The court stated that Allahbadia's content should adhere to moral standards that make it suitable for viewers of all age groups. With this condition, Allahbadia can resume podcasting while the legal proceedings continue. Allahbadia's counsel, Advocate Abhinav Chandrachud, argued that stopping his show would severely impact his livelihood and that of his 280 employees. He highlighted that Allahbadia, who interviews well-known personalities from various fields, depends on his content for income and legal representation. The court acknowledged these concerns and modified its previous order, granting Allahbadia interim protection from arrest, which will continue until further orders. The court also directed him to cooperate with the ongoing investigation. Additionally, the Supreme Court expanded the scope of the case, emphasizing the need for regulatory measures to monitor online content while ensuring there is no outright censorship. The bench requested the Solicitor General to propose guidelines balancing Article 19 rights with societal moral standards, to be opened for public consultation.
