Rahul Slams AAP and BJP for Anti-**Farmer Actions, Accuses Them of Colluding Against Farmers**

Two anti-farmer parties have joine hands, Berating AAP and BJP

Leader of the Opposition (LoP) in the Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi, joined Congress MPs from Punjab in a protest within the Parliament complex against the forcible eviction of farmers from the Sambhu and Khanauri protest sites on the Punjab border.

Congress president and LoP in the Rajya Sabha, Mallikarjun Kharge, strongly criticized both the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) for their actions against the farmers. Kharge accused the two parties of forming an alliance against the nation's farmers. He stated that the Punjab government had initially invited farmers for talks, only to forcibly remove them from the protest site later. He expressed his dismay on social media, calling out the actions as anti-farmer.

Kharge further condemned the detention of senior farmer leaders Jagjit Singh Dallewal and Sarwan Singh Pandher by Punjab Police, describing it as an unacceptable act. He accused the BJP and AAP of being "intoxicated" with the power they held and pointed out that the farming community of 62 crore people would never forgive these actions. He also reminded the country of past atrocities against farmers, such as the 2017 Mandsaur firing during the BJP's rule, and the tragic incidents in Lakhimpur Kheri and Rajasthan.

Congress MPs from Puniab, including Sukhiinder Randhawa, Amarinder Singh Raja Warring, Gurjit Aujla, and Dharamvir Gandhi, staged the protest outside the Makar Dwar in Parliament. They raised slogans against the AAP government in Punjab and the BJP-led central government, demanding justice for the farmers. Gandhi briefly joined the protest to express solidarity with the farmers and his fellow

The Congress leaders also displayed placards in support of the farmers' demand for a law ensuring Minimum Support Price (MSP) for crops. They criticized Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann for acting against the agitating farmers, alleging that he was working in alliance with the BJP.

Tahawwur Rana files another request with US top court to stay extradition to India

Tahawwur Rana Seeks Stay on Extradition to India in Appeal to US Supreme Court

Tahawwur Rana, the accused in the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks, has filed a renewed plea with the US Supreme Court to halt his extradition to India. This follows the rejection of his earlier review petition by US Supreme Court Justice Elena Kagan on March 6. Rana's latest emergency application has been directed to Chief Justice John Roberts, requesting a stay on the extradition process while his legal challenge remains pending. The Supreme Court's website indicated that the application will be considered by the top court's judges on April 4, 2025.

Rana's legal team argues that his extradition should be delayed due to his severe health issues, which they claim would



put his life at risk if tried in India. In the appeal, Rana highlighted that he suffers from a 3.5 cm abdominal aortic aneurysm, Parkinson's disease with cognitive decline, and a mass that could indicate bladder cancer. He stated, "If a stay is not granted, there will be no review at all,

and the US courts will lose jurisdiction, leaving the petitioner in imminent danger of death."

Rana's plea for a stay on extradition has come amid ongoing diplomatic discussions between the US and India. During Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit

to the United States last month, US President Donald Trump confirmed that his administration had agreed to Rana's extradition, referring to him as a "very evil man." The extradition is part of broader efforts to bring justice for the 166 victims of the 2008 Mumbai attacks, which were orchestrated by Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorist David Headley, a close associate of Rana.

Tahawwur Rana, aged 63, is currently held in a Los Angeles prison. In 2011, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) filed a chargesheet against him and eight others, accusing them of aiding in the planning and execution of the Mumbai attacks. Rana's extradition has remained a contentious issue between the United States and India for several years.

When will women in Delhi receive Rs 2,500 monthly honorarium: Atishi

Senior AAP leader Atishi raised concerns on Thursday about the delay in the implementation of the Rs 2,500 monthly financial assistance for women in Delhi, promised by the BJP during the recent elections. Addressing a press conference, tion in the Delhi Assembly, questioned the BJP's commitment to delivering the promised benefits to the nearly 48 lakh women in the capital aged above 18 years.

Atishi wondered if the BJP government would restrict the benefit to a small fraction of eligible women by imposing various conditions or would fulfill its promise to assist the entire group. She also highlighted that while the BJP government had approved Rs 5,100 crore for the scheme, no tangible steps had been taken yet.

The AAP leader pointed out that the BJP had formed a committee 12 days ago to



Atishi, who is also the Leader of Opposi- oversee the implementation of the Mahila Samriddhi Yojna, but the committee had not made any progress. "When will the registration process begin, and when will the money be credited to the beneficiary women's accounts?" Atishi asked.

> The Rs 2,500 monthly assistance scheme was a key election promise of the BJP in the run-up to the February 5 Delhi elections. The committee formed to manage the scheme is headed by Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, who is expected to oversee its implementation. Despite the scheme being approved and funds allocated, Atishi's concerns reflect growing doubts about the timely execution of the promise.



Health expenditure at 1.84% of GDP, moving steadily to 2.5%: JP Nadda

Union Health Minister J.P. Nadda announced on Wednesday that the government's expenditure on healthcare has risen to 1.84% of GDP, up from 1.15% in 2013-14. Nadda expressed confidence that India is steadily progressing towards meeting the target set by the National Health Policy 2017, which aims to allocate 2.5% of GDP to healthcare by 2025.

During a discussion in the Rajya Sabha on the functioning of the Union Health Ministry, Nadda highlighted the government's efforts to increase healthcare funding and ensure improved access to medical services for the population. He noted that this increase in expenditure is a reflection of the government's commitment to providing better healthcare infrastructure and services across the coun-

However, Haris Beeran, a Member of Parliament from the Indian Union Muslim League (IUML), raised concerns about the feasibility of achieving the 2.5% GDP target. He argued that the National Health Policy's goal of enhancing healthcare expenditure remains "a distant dream." Beeran emphasized that while the increase in healthcare funding is a step in the right direction, the current levels of investment may still fall short of the necessary resources to address India's growing healthcare challenges, especially in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic.

India's healthcare system has long been criticized for its underfunding, and while recent improvements have been noted, many experts believe that more significant investments are necessary to ensure universal health coverage, strengthen the public health system, and improve healthcare outcomes across the country.

RG Kar Case: Family Receives Death Certificate After Seven-Month Delay

Seven months after the tragic rape-murder of their daughter at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital, her parents finally received the long-awaited death certificate from West Bengal Health Secretary NS Nigam. The certificate was handed over to them on the evening of March 19, 2025, during a visit by Nigam, who was accompanied by the medical superintendent and vice principal of RG Kar hospital.

Nigam confirmed that no discussions took place during the visit, and the purpose was solely to deliver the original death certificate. "They needed the original death certificate. Today, I came here and handed it over to them," Nigam stated.

The victim's father, who had been demanding the certificate since the tragic incident on August 9, expressed his frustration with the delays. "We have been struggling to obtain it. We sent an email in January and had to go from one department to another, but no one cooperated," he said. Despite the repeated efforts, including the email sent earlier this year, it took months for the document to tion and led to intense demands for justice. be delivered.

The death of the young woman, who was a trainee at the hospital, had drawn massive public atten-

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge calls BJP and AAP 'anti-farmer' parties

Congress President likarjun Kharge on Thursday sharply criticized the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) for allegedly betraying the country's farmers. His remarks came in the wake of the Punjab government's decision to bulldoze protest sites at the Shambhu and Khanauri borders, where farmers had been protesting for over a year.

Kharge accused both parties of working together against the country's food providers, labeling them as "two anti-farmer parties" in a post on X (formerly Twitter). He referenced past incidents like the 2017 Mandsaur agitation in Madhya Pradesh, where six farmers were killed, and the 2021 Lakhimpur Kheri incident, where four farmers were run over by a convoy linked to a BJP leader's son.

Kharge said, "It appears that two anti-farmer parties have now joined hands against the country's food providers... First, the Punjab government called the farmers for talks and then forcibly removed them from the protest site.

Both BJP and AAP are filled with the arrogance of power." His statement underscored the growing tension between the opposition and the ruling parties over their treatment of protesting farmers.

On Wednesday, Punjab Police dismantled the protest sites at the Punjab-Haryana border and detained key farmer leaders, including Jagjit Singh Dallewal and Kisan Mazdoor Morcha leader Sarwan Singh Pandher. The farmers have been demanding a legal guarantee for the Minimum Support Price (MSP) for their crops and protesting against various farm laws.

In defense of the action, Punjab

Minister Harpal Singh Cheema stated that the prolonged blockade of highways was disrupting industries, businesses, and employment. He emphasized the need to reopen the highways, which serve as an essential economic corridor, while also maintaining that the government had engaged the farmers in discussions.

Kharge, however, criticized both the Modi government and AAP, accusing them of failing to fulfill promises made to farmers, including the unkept assurance of a legal guarantee for MSP. He concluded, "The 62 crore farmers of the country will never forgive these anti-farmer parties."

West Bengal Assembly Passes Bill: To Allow Women To Work In Bars

On Wednesday, the West Bengal Assembly passed a groundbreaking bill that will allow women to work in bars, removing long-standing restrictions under the Bengal Excise Act, 1909. The West Bengal Finance Bill, 2025, was presented by Minister of State Chandrima Bhattacharya and aims to amend the existing laws to ensure gender equality in the state's liquor industry.

One of the key provisions of the bill is the removal of the prohibition on the employment of women in 'On' category liquor shops. These are establishments where liquor is not only sold but also consumed on the premises. Previously, women were restricted from working in such places, a regulation that the bill seeks to lift as part of its broader agenda of addressing gender discrimination.

In her remarks, Bhattacharya emphasized that the state government is committed to eliminating discrimination between men and women in the workforce. By revising the outdated provision, the gov-



ernment hopes to promote larly smaller tea gardens that equal opportunities for women in the hospitality sector, aligning with its broader social and economic inclusivity goals.

The bill also includes other significant provisions aimed at improving the state's regulatory framework. It grants the state government enhanced powers to oversee the supply of raw materials like jaggery to prevent illegal brewing of liquor. This measure is seen as an essential step to combat the illicit alcohol trade, ensuring that only legally produced beverages reach consumers.

Additionally, the bill addresses the challenges faced by the state's tea industry, particu-

Delhi Govt Plans Artificial Rain Trials and Large-Scale Anti-Pollution Projects



- If successful, trials will start in outer Delhi before expanding citywide.
- Focus on pollution hotspots with new initiatives
- Artificial rain as a pollution-control method, with water sample tests ensuring safety.

The Delhi government is taking significant steps toward improving air quality and combating pollution across the city. One of the key initiatives under consideration is the trial of artificial rain, which could help mitigate the region's severe pollution levels. Environment Minister Manjinder Singh Sirsa revealed in an interview that the government is currently evaluating the potential benefits and risks of artificial rain through ongoing studies. Water sample tests will be conducted to ensure the chemicals used in the process do not pose any harm to human health or the environment.

Should the trials prove successful, a small-scale test will be conducted in an outer Delhi

detected, the plan for artificial rain will be expanded. Alongside this, the government is working on a series of largescale anti-pollution projects targeting pollution hotspots across Delhi-NCR. The aim is to reduce pollution levels significantly and ensure a lasting impact on the capital's air quality.

Manjinder Sirsa acknowledged the previous failure of the smog tower project and stated that a new plan will be announced soon to target pollution sources more directly. The government intends to focus on eliminating or reducing these sources in a multi-area approach to make a more noticeable difference.

Delhi's air quality often worsens during the winter months, with the air quality index (AQI)

area. If no adverse effects are reaching hazardous levels. To address this, the BJP-led government, which took charge of Delhi recently, has pledged to tackle pollution head-on. Sirsa emphasized the government's commitment to cleaning and beautifying the city, with efforts expected to intensify in the coming months.

> Additionally, the Delhi government has announced measures to address older vehicles contributing to pollution. Vehicles older than 15 years will no longer be allowed to refuel after March 31. Delhi Transport Department Issues Warning to Vehicle Scrapping Facilities Over Unclaimed Vehicles

The Delhi Transport Department has issued a stern warning to all Registered Vehicle Scrapping Facilities (RVSFs) regarding the deposit of scrap value from unclaimed vehicles. According to the department, RVSFs must ensure that the scrap value of such vehicles is deposited into the government's account within 15 days. Failure to comply with this directive will lead to strict action, including the possibility of being blacklisted from future operations.

This move is part of the ment's new directive to Delhi government's broader efforts to combat pollution by targeting end-oflife vehicles (ELVs), which are a significant source of air pollution. The Transport Department has made it clear that RVSFs must adhere to this timeline to ensure that the process of scrapping and recycling vehicles is carried out responsibly and in accordance with government regulations.

A senior official from the department noted that the previous drive against end-

The focus of this drive was to remove old, non-operational vehicles from the streets, as they often contribute to increased emissions, thus worsening air quality. The Transport Depart-RVSFs is aimed at tightening the monitoring process and ensuring that scrap values from unclaimed vehicles are accounted for. By enforcing this rule, the department hopes to streamline the process of vehicle scrapping while also contributing to the reduction of vehicular pollution in the city. Strict penalties will be imposed on non-compliant facilities, sending a clear message about the government's commitment to improving air quality and tackling pollution in Delhi.

Delhi Police Launches Anti-Harassment Training to Combat Women's Safety Concerns

In a bid to enhance women's safety and combat harassment in public spaces, the Delhi Police has launched a new initiative aimed at curbing sexual harassment and molestation. As part of this effort, over 300 police personnel received specialized anti-harassment training at Wazirabad's Police Training Centre on Wednesday. This training is part of a broader strategy to foster a safer environment for women in the national capital and boost public confidence, especially among vulnerable communities.

The training program comes just days after the formation of dedicated 'anti-eve-teasing' squads, which will play a pivotal role in the Delhi Police's efforts to tackle harassment. Each district has formed two such squads, with each squad led by an inspector-level officer. These squads are specifi-

cally trained to prevent, deter, and respond ing swiftly to incidents to prevent escalato incidents of harassment in real-time, in line with directives from the Delhi Police headquarters.

Delhi Police officials have emphasized that this initiative is part of a series of measures designed to combat crimes against women and make the city safer. The personnel in these squads will be equipped to handle harassment-related offenses with immediate action and a proactive approach, respond-



tion and provide support to victims.

The training focuses on increasing the awareness of police personnel regarding the nuances of harassment cases, including sexual harassment and eve-teasing, and equipping them with the tools necessary to effectively address these crimes. The aim is not only to respond to such incidents but also to proactively prevent them by creating a visible and active police presence in areas prone to such offenses.

Delhi Police's efforts to enhance women's safety are part of a broader initiative to address the rising concerns of sexual harassment and molestation in the city. The formation of the anti-eve-teasing squads, along with the specialized training, is expected to make a significant impact on reducing harassment and creating a safer public environment for women in Delhi.

Delhi High Court Issues Notices Over Rising Bird Strikes at IGI Airport

The Delhi High Court on Wednesday issued notices to several key authorities, including the Delhi Government, Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), Airports Authority of India (AAI), Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI), Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD), and Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC), in response to a petition highlighting the alarming rise in bird strikes at Indira Gandhi International (IGI) Airport.

The petition, filed by social activist Gauri Maulekhi, presented data revealing that between 2018 and 2023, IGI Airport recorded 705 bird-strike incidents, surpassing the combined total of 654 bird strikes across 29 airports in Punjab, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, and Uttarakhand. Maulekhi emphasized the sharp increase in incidents from 2022, with 183 bird strikes reported that year, compared to 94 in 2021 and 62 in 2020.

The petition also noted that Delhi's bird-strike numbers exceeded the combined total of Mumbai and Bengaluru airports (623) during the same period. Maulekhi attributed the surge to the presence of slaughterhouses, meat shops, dairy



farms, and environmental pollution near the airport. She argued that these operations violated both the Aircraft Rules of 1937 and the Bharatiya Vayuyan Vidheyak of 2024, which prohibit activities attracting birds within a 10-km radius of airports.

Maulekhi urged the court to direct the authorities to implement preventive measures, including the Bird Aircraft Strike Hazard (BASH) programme and the Bird Avoidance Model (BAM), to mitigate the risks of bird strikes. Additionally, she alleged that over 500 illegal slaughterhouses continue to operate within a 10-km radius of IGI Airport and called for stricter inspections, penalties on violators, and enforcement of regulations to curb untreated waste disposal.

The court has scheduled the next hearing for May 14, with hopes of addressing the growing safety concerns surrounding the issue.

IndiGo Passenger Deploys Emergency Slide Before Takeoff At Delhi Airport

On Wednesday, a rather unusual incident occurred at Delhi Airport when a passenger inadvertently deployed the emergency slide of an IndiGo aircraft, flight 6E 5161, which was scheduled to fly to Leh. The incident took place just before takeoff, causing a significant disruption.

In a statement issued by IndiGo, the airline confirmed that the deployment of the slide was accidental and occurred before the aircraft could leave the tarmac. The airline further emphasized that following their Standard Operating Procedures (SOP), the crew promptly reported the incident. The passenger responsible for the deployment was offloaded from the plane and handed over to the relevant authorities for further investigation.

IndiGo expressed regret over the inconvenience caused to other passengers, though it did not specify the details regarding how or why the emergency slide was triggered by the passenger. The aircraft involved in the incident was an A320, a popular and widely used model in commercial aviation. Information from flight tracking website flightradar24.com also confirmed the aircraft type.

Typically, an emergency slide is deployed during an emergency evacuation to allow passengers to exit the plane swiftly and safely. Its accidental deployment outside of an emergency situation could potentially cause delays, as the aircraft must be inspected and the slide must be re-armed before takeoff.

While such incidents are rare, they highlight the importance of strict adherence to safety protocols and the need for passengers to be aware of the emergency equipment on board. The incident also underscores the critical role of airline crews in swiftly managing unexpected events and ensuring the safety of all passengers on board.

IndiGo has reassured its passengers that measures have been taken to avoid such occurrences in the future, and the airline continues to prioritize the safety and comfort of its passengers.





Nagpur violence: 69 arrested amid row over Aurangzeb's tomb, Bangladesh angle emerges



- Clashes broke out as a large crowd attacked police
- Authorities are tracking provocative social media posts that escalated tensions.

The tomb of Mughal emperor Aurangzeb, located in Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar district, has become the focal point of a political controversy in Maharashtra, sparking violent clashes in Nagpur on March 17. According to police, 12 officers, including three Deputy Commissioners of Police (DCPs), were injured in the violence that ensued following protests over the removal of Aurangzeb's

tomb.

In response to the unrest, the Maharashtra police imposed a curfew in multiple areas of Nagpur under Section 163 of the Bhartiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), citing tensions surrounding the demand for the tomb's removal. The curfew, which remains in effect until further notice, applies to police station limits in areas such as Kotwali, Ganeshpeth, and Lakadganj, among others.

The violence began on Monday when members of the Bajrang Dal staged a protest near the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj statue in Nagpur's Mahal area, calling for the removal of Aurangzeb's tomb. Police said that rumors spread about the burning of a 'chadar' (a cloth with holy inscriptions) during the protest. Videos of the demonstration quickly went viral on social media, sparking outrage within the Muslim community.

The situation escalated when a mob of around 1,000 people engaged in stone-pelting, vandalism, and arson, injuring several police officers and causing damage to vehicles and properties. Police used tear gas to disperse the crowd, but violence spread to other areas, including Kotwali and Ganesh-

A complaint was filed alleging the burning of a holy book, prompting gatherings of Muslim community members in various parts of the city. Bajrang Dal leaders, however, denied the allegations, stating they had only burned an effigy of Aurangzeb as part of the demonstration.

In response to the violence, Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis dismissed the rumors, stating that no cloth with verses had been burned. He vowed to take strong action against those who attacked the police. Meanwhile, the Maharashtra Cyber Cell is investigating individuals who spread provocative content online related to the violence.

Bengaluru Metro Explores Cargo Transportation to Boost Revenue Amid Fare Hike Backlash

In response to a significant hike in metro fares, Bengaluru Metro Rail Corporation Ltd (BMRCL) is considering alternative revenue streams to offset the impact on commuters. One of the initiatives under consideration is the introduction of cargo transportation services during non-peak hours, aiming to generate additional income for the metro system.

Taking inspiration from Delhi Metro, which recently partnered with logistics company Blue Dart to facilitate urban freight movement, BMRCL plans to engage with logistics and e-commerce firms to assess the feasibility of the cargo transport model. A senior BMRCL official confirmed that discussions with industry partners are imminent, with Baiyappanahalli station set to be a key hub for this initiative.

The cargo transport model would integrate first-mile and last-mile connectivity with metro-based logistics solutions and As BMRCL explores these Micro Parcel Hubs, aiming to reduce road congestion and pollution while improving supply chain tive for freight movement efficiency. This strategy seeks to optimize metro infrastructure during offpeak hours, effectively utilizing spare capacity

for freight transport.

BMRCL is also pursuing other non-fare revenue avenues to mitigate the effects of the fare hike. The corporation has recently invited tenders for semi-naming and co-branding rights at select metro stations, along with advertising rights inside stations. Additionallv. BMRCL has introduced train-wrapping advertisements as another potential source of income.

While experts have supported the move, some have questioned the timing of the initiative. Transport expert Prof. M.N. Srihari welcomed the exploration of nonfare revenue models but criticized BMRCL for not considering such options before implementing the steep fare increase. He suggested that Bengaluru Metro should learn from successful cargo transport models implemented in cities like Madrid, where metro trains are used to carry parcels in collaboration with logistics partners, reducing road congestion and emissions.

Punjab farmers protest: Bulldozer, cranes at Khanauri, Shambhu; 'chakka jam' announced

Punjab Police took swift action to remove farmers from their protest sites near the Punjab-Harvana Shambhu Border, demolishing tents and temporary structures erected by protesters. Similar actions were carried out at the Khanauri protest site, where farmers had been camping since February 13, 2024, following their march to Delhi being blocked by security forces. The farmers had gathered to press their demands, including a legal guarantee for Minimum Support Price (MSP) for crops.

Footage from the scene showed bulldozers, tow trucks, and cranes being used by police to dismantle the protest setups. In one video, police officers were seen removing fans from the temporary stage erected by the farmers

at the Shambhu Border. At the Khanauri Border, another video showed police bringing in tow trucks to remove tractors, trucks, and other personal belongings of the farmers.

The crackdown also led to the detention of several prominent farmer leaders, including Sarwan Singh Pandher and Jagjit Singh Dallewal, who were apprehended in Mohali while returning from a meeting with a cen-



tral delegation. Alongside them, other leaders such as Abhimanyu Kohar, Kaka Singh Kotra, and Manjit Singh Rai were also de-

The sudden police action has sparked outrage among the protesting farmers, who had been demanding greater protections for their livelihood, including a law guaranteeing MSP for their crops. In response to the removals, farmer unions have called for a nationwide protest, mobilizing support for their cause.

The ongoing farmers' protest, which began with demands for MSP and other agricultural reforms, has seen periodic clashes with authorities. The police's latest move has escalated tensions, as farmers vow to continue their fight for their rights.

Delhi Government to Implement Ayushman Bharat Scheme with MoU Signing on April 10

The Delhi government is set to sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Centre on April 10 to implement the Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) in the national capital. Health Minister Pankaj Singh made this announcement on Tuesday, outlining the BJP-led government's commitment to providing accessible healthcare to residents of Delhi.

As part of its 100-day agenda, the Delhi government plans to enroll at least one lakh beneficiaries into the health insurance scheme within the first 30 days. Ayushman Bharat is one of the largest public health insurance schemes in India, offering an annual coverage of Rs 5 lakh per family for medical expenses, aimed at reducing the financial burden on low-income families in the event of hospitalization or critical health issues.

22 Maoists Killed, One Police Officer Dies in Separate Encounters in Chhattisgarh

In a series of intense encounters in Chhattisgarh, 22 Maoists were killed, and one police jawan lost his life during exchanges of fire in the state's Bijapur and Kanker districts. The gunfights took place as part of ongoing anti-Naxalite operations aimed at curbing Maoist activities in the region.

The first encounter occurred early in the morning around 7 am in Bijapur, near the border with Dantewada. A joint team of security forces, including the State Task Force (STF) and District Reserve Guard (DRG), were conducting an anti-Naxalite operation in the Gangaloor police station area. The operation led to a fierce gun battle with the Maoists, which resulted in the deaths of 18 Maoists. Authorities recovered numerous firearms and explosives from the scene. Tragically, during the exchange of fire, one police jawan was also killed. The operation is ongoing, with special forces continuing their efforts in the area.

dependent ones is an alarming sign of media control. Freedom of the press is a cornerstone of democracy, and journalists—whether mainstream or digital—play a vital role in holding power to account. If politicians start dictating who qualifies as a journalist, it will effectively turn the press into a state-controlled entity, undermining its credibility and independence.

The backlash from the opposition, particularly the BJP and BRS, is expected, but their own track records on press freedom aren't spotless either. Political hypocrisy aside, the larger issue remains—an increasing trend of using state machinery to suppress voices of dissent. The arrest of journalists on serious charges like criminal conspiracy and promoting hatred, rather than pursuing defamation suits, signals an intent to instill fear.

This incident is a stark reminder that political power, when unchecked, can erode civil liberties. Telangana's government must recognize that a leader's strength lies in their ability to handle criticism, not in silencing it. The Congress party, which frequently accuses the BJP of stifling dissent, must introspect. If it fails to rein in such authoritarian tendencies within its own ranks, it risks losing the moral high ground.

Revanth Reddy must clarify whether his comments were a moment of frustration or a reflection of his governance approach. Either way, such cy. The law must remain the only recourse for grievances, not threats of public humiliation.

India-New Zealand Relations: A Strategic Shift in the Indo-Pacific



New Zealand Prime Minister Christopher Luxon's visit to India in March 2025 marks a pivotal moment in bilateral relations. Historically, New Zealand has maintained a cautious foreign policy, balancing economic dependence on China with regional security concerns. However, Luxon's trip signals a shift—one that prioritizes deeper engagement with India in trade, maritime security, and regional stability within the evolving Indo-Pacific order.

Economic Diversification: The Long-Awaited FTA

A key highlight of the visit was the revival of talks on a long-delayed Free Trade Agreement (FTA), initially proposed in 2009 but stalled due to geopolitical considerations. The agreement, if finalized, could significantly boost trade in agriculture, pharmaceuticals, critical minerals, and tourism, with projections suggesting a tenfold increase in trade over the next decade.

New Zealand's economic ties have been heavily dependent on China, particularly in dairy and agricultural exports. However, shifting global supply chains and geopolitical uncertainties have underscored the risks of over-reliance on a single market. Strengthening trade with India presents a strategic alternative, providing New Zealand with access to a large and expanding consumer base, while also supporting India's ambitions to integrate into global supply networks.

Maritime Security and Indo-Pacific Cooperation

Beyond trade, Luxon's visit underscores growing security cooperation between India and New Zealand. A key takeaway was New Zealand's commitment to a "free, open, and rules-based" Indo-Pacific—aligning closely with India's Security and Growth for All in the Region (SAGAR) vision. Both nations recognize that security is not just about military alliances but also about tackling non-traditional threats like illegal fishing, maritime disasters, and climate change.

New Zealand's participation in India-led initiatives such as the Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative (IPOI) and the Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (CDRI) reinforces this commitment. IPOI, for instance, provides a platform for collaboration on maritime resource management, environmental sustainability, and capacity-building for smaller island nations. Given rising sea levels and extreme weather events affecting the Pacific, India and New Zealand can play a crucial role in developing climate adaptation strategies and strengthening regional resilience.

Strategic Realignment in the Indo-Pacific

While New Zealand remains outside formal security groupings like the Quad, its increasing cooperation with India allows for greater alignment with Quad-led initiatives on humanitarian assistance, cybersecurity, and maritime security. This reflects a broader shift toward a multipolar Indo-Pacific, where regional middle powers like India and New Zealand play an active role in shaping security dynamics beyond US-China competition.

Conclusion

Luxon's visit has injected fresh momentum into India-New Zealand ties, transforming them from a primarily trade-focused engagement into a more comprehensive strategic partnership. As both nations navigate an evolving Indo-Pacific, their strengthened collaboration holds the promise of fostering regional stability and resilience. The challenge now lies in sustaining this momentum and translating diplomatic goodwill into concrete outcomes across trade, security, and multilateral cooperation.

JD(U) After Nitish: **Implosion or Survival?**

Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar is facing the most crucial political transition of his career. As he eyes a fifth term, the question of succession looms large over the Janata Dal (United) [JD(U)]. Without a clear successor, the party risks either disintegration or a forced merger with the BJP. Nitish has always been the undisputed leader of JD(U), sidelining potential rivals within the party. His earlier attempts to groom successors, like

Prashant Kishor and RCP Singh, ended in failure. His close aides—Lallan Singh, Ashok Chaudhary, and Sanjay Jha—lack the charisma to lead. This leaves a critical leadership vacuum, making succession a defining issue for the party's survival. The buzz around his son Nishant entering politics has intensified. Though Nishant has largely stayed away from public life, his recent appearances at political events suggest a possible entry. However, Nitish has long opposed dynastic politics, and endorsing Nishant would be a reversal of his stance. If he does name his son as his suc-



cessor, senior party leaders could rebel, potentially defecting to the BJP or RJD. On the other hand, without a clear transition plan, JD(U) risks internal strife. A leadership tussle between senior figures could push the party into chaos, giving the BJP an opening to orchestrate a merger. History shows that political transitions are smoother when a party is in power, as seen with Akhilesh Yadav and Tejashwi Yadav. If Nishant has to take over, now is the right time.

For JD(U) to survive post-Nitish, it must act decisively. Either Nishant takes charge under Nitish's guidance, or the party risks being a rudderless ship headed toward collapse. The choice is between controlled succession or political irrelevance.





Curfew Lifted, Partially Relaxed in Nagpur After Three Days of Violence

of Nagpur on Thursday, while restrictions were partially eased in others, three days after violent clashes erupted in the city. The unrest began on Monday night when mobs went on a rampage in central Nagpur following rumors that a 'chadar' with holy inscriptions had been burned during protests led by Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP) and Bajrang Dal. The demonstration was held to demand the removal of Mughal emperor Aurangzeb's tomb located in Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar district.

The violent protests led to curfew being imposed in multiple police station jurisdictions, including Kotwali, Ganeshpeth, Tehsil, Lakadganj, Pachpaoli, Shanti Nagar, Sakkardara, Nandanvan, Imambada, Yashodhara Nagar, and Kapil Nagar. The clashes caused widespread panic among residents, disrupting daily life and raising security concerns across the city. To restore normalcy, law enforcement deployed additional forces in sensitive areas, and strict restrictions



further escalation.

Considering public convenience and an improvement in law and order, Commissioner of Police Ravinder Singal announced the lifting of curfew in Nandanvan and Kapil Nagar police station areas from 2 pm on Thursday. Additionally, authorities decided to partially relax curfew in five were implemented to prevent other areas—Lakadganj, Pach-

paoli, Shanti Nagar, Sakkardara, and Imambada—from 2 pm to 4 pm. This temporary relaxation allowed residents to step out and purchase essential items while maintaining security measures. Despite the easing of restrictions, police and security forces continue to monitor the situation closely. Authorities have urged citizens to maintain peace and

refrain from spreading misinformation that could incite further unrest. The administration is expected to take further decisions based on the evolving situation and security assessments. Meanwhile, appeals for calm and communal harmony have been made by both government officials and local leaders to prevent any further disturbances.

Air India Dismisses Lisa Ray's "No **Empathy" Allegation as "Unfounded"**

Air India has refuted allegations by actor and author Lisa Ray, who claimed the airline showed "no empathy" when she requested a medical waiver for her ailing 92-year-old father. Calling the claims "unfounded," the Tata Group-owned airline clarified the situation in a detailed statement. Delhi Airport's Terminal 1



Delhi International Airport Ltd (DIAL) has announced that Terminal 1 (T1) of the Indira Gandhi International Airport (IGIA) will be fully operational from April 15. As a result, all flights currently operating from Terminal 2 (T2) will be shifted to

Currently, IndiGo and Akasa Air operate from T2, handling around 270-280 air traffic movements and over 46,000 passengers daily. The temporary closure of T2 is part of a planned refurbishment project, expected to last four to six months, with completion anticipated in the September quarter.

DIAL stated that the expansion and modernization of T1 were carried out under the Phase 3A expansion project. The newly upgraded terminal was dedicated to the nation in March last year.

The revamped T1 now features 100 check-in counters, including 36 Self Baggage Drop (SBD) kiosks and 108 Common Usage Self-Service (CUSS) kiosks. Security checks will be streamlined with 20 Automated Tray Retrieval Systems (ATRS). Additionally, baggage reclaim facilities have been enhanced with 10 carousels, and baggage handling capacity has increased from 3,240 to 6,000 bags per

The terminal area has expanded significantly from 55,740 sq m to 2,06,950 sq m, integrating arrival and departure areas to improve passenger convenience. With these upgrades, T1 can now accommodate 40 million passengers annually,

while T3 handles 45 million. T2, which will undergo refurbishment, has an annual capacity of 15 million passengers.

DIAL has informed airlines of the transition and advised them to prepare accordingly. IGIA, India's busiest airport, operates three terminals—T1, T2, and T3—with T1 and T2 currently serving domestic flights. The modernization of T1 aims to enhance passenger experience and operational efficiency at one of the country's busiest aviation hubs.



Mamata Banerjee Accuses Rivals of Tarnishing Bengal's Image

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee has alleged that political opponents are engaged in an online campaign to malign the state ahead of her official visit to the UK next week. While addressing a gathering, she stated that she does not object to criticism, acknowledging that it is a part of democracy. However, she expressed strong disapproval of any attempts to defame Bengal on international platforms. "You can insult me, but don't try to tarnish the image of Bengal abroad," she asserted.

Ms. Banerjee accused certain groups of spreading misinformation through WhatsApp and email. Without naming any specific party, she claimed that these individuals had drafted false narratives about Bengal and encouraged people to send them to universities in the UK. "We do not humiliate them, but it is unfortunate that some anti-social elements (Ganashatru) are indulging in such dirty tricks," she said.

The Chief Minister is set to leave for the UK next week, where she will engage in multiple official events. She is scheduled to deliver a lecture at Oxford University and participate in a programme at the Indian High Commission on March 24. Additionally, she will attend a G2G (Government-to-Government) programme on March 26 and another in Oxford on March 27. Ms. Banerjee highlighted Bengal's strong ties with the UK, recalling their participation in the Bengal Global Business Summit.

In response to her remarks, the BJP criticized the Chief Minister, accusing her of shifting blame instead of addressing crucial issues. BJP MLA Shankar Ghosh stated that while Bengal was once celebrated as the cultural capital of India, it has now gained notoriety for rising crime rates. "If you check the pending cases in Calcutta High Court, the highest number of rape cases are registered there. Kolkata has now turned into the 'rapist center' of India under her rule," he alleged.

The BJP maintained that its criticism of the government is valid and necessary for accountability, rejecting claims of an organized campaign to malign the state. As political tensions escalate, the Chief Minister's visit to the UK remains a topic of heated debate in West Bengal's political landscape.



UP Professor Arrested for Raping and Blackmailing **Students**

Uttar Pradesh police have arrested Rajnish Kumar, a 50-year-old Geography professor accused of sexually abusing his students and blackmailing them with videos of his assaults. Kumar, who served as the Chief Proctor at Seth Phool Chand Bagla PG College in Hathras, had been on the run for 72 hours before being captured. The scandal came to light earlier this week when police received a USB drive containing 59 videos of Kumar sexually assaulting students. The professor allegedly recorded these acts and used the footage to blackmail victims into further abuse. Disturbingly, police sources revealed that Kumar did not recall the number of students he had abused over the

During interrogation, Kumar admitted that he began recording his crimes accidentally when a webcam unintentionally captured a molestation. This incident, which occurred in 2009, allegedly inspired him to continue recording and blackmailing students. Investigators also discovered that he accepted bribes from students and parents in exchange for higher grades and job placements, which he used to demand sexual favors. According to Superintendent of Police Chiranjeev Nath Sinha, Kumar installed special software on his computer to secretly record these assaults. Over 65 videos have been recovered, some of which were uploaded to pornographic websites. Kumar, who was married in 1996, was appointed as a teacher at Bagla College in 2001 and promoted to Chief Proctor last year. His reign of abuse allegedly began in 2008, leaving behind a shocking trail of exploitation and trauma. Police are now investigating whether more victims are yet to come forward.



Trump, Zelenskky agree; US-Ukraine to continue working together to bring about end to war

Discuss Path to Ceasefire and Peace Amid Ongoing Conflict

US President Donald Trump and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy held a productive phone conversation on Thursday, agreeing to continue working together toward ending the war in Ukraine. According to US Secretary of State Marco Rubio and National Security Advisor Mike Waltz, both leaders expressed optimism about achieving lasting peace under Trump's leadership.

During the call, Zelenskyy thanked Trump for his previous support, especially the delivery of Javelin missiles, and for his ongoing efforts to bring about peace. Trump updated Zelenskyy on his recent conversation with Russian President Vladimir Putin, focusing on the situation in Kursk. Both leaders agreed to share information closely, as battlefield dynamics continued to evolve.

This agreement was seen as a crucial first step in bringing the war to an end and ensuring security for Ukraine.

Sri Lanka to Hold Local Council Elections on May 6

Sri Lanka's Election Commission announced on Thursday that the country's local council elections will take place on May 6, 2025. The election is set to be a significant political event, with voters across the island heading to the polls to elect councillors for 340 local councils.

Elon Musk's X Sues Indian Government Over Alleged Censorship and IT Act Violations

Social media platform 'X' (formerly Twitter), owned by Elon Musk, has filed a lawsuit against the Government of India in the Karnataka High Court, challenging what it claims is unlawful content regulation and arbitrary censorship. The lawsuit specifically targets the government's interpretation of Section 79(3)(b) of the Information Technology (IT) Act, arguing that it violates Supreme Court rulings and undermines online free expression.

'X' asserts that the Indian government is using Section 79(3)(b) to create a parallel content-blocking mechanism that bypasses the structured legal process defined in Section 69A of the IT Act. According to 'X,' this approach contradicts the 2015 Supreme Court ruling in the Shreya Singhal case, which established that content can only be blocked through a judicial Indian Penal Code. However, 'X' con-



process or a legally defined route, like Section 69A.

Section 79(3)(b) requires online platforms to remove illegal content if directed by a court order or government notification. If a platform fails to comply within 36 hours, it risks losing its safe harbor protection and could be held accountable under the

tests this interpretation, arguing that the provision does not grant the government independent authority to block content, and that it is being misused to impose arbitrary censorship without following due process.

Under Section 69A, the government can block digital content deemed a threat to national security, public order, or sovereignty, but only through a regulated review process. 'X' argues that the government is bypassing these safeguards by using Section 79(3)(b) as a shortcut, allowing content removal without necessary scru-

Additionally, 'X' opposes the government's Sahyog portal, created by the Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C) to streamline content takedown requests. 'X' argues that the portal acts as a censorship tool that pressures platforms to remove content without legal review, further undermining judicial oversight.

Israeli Army Bans Traffic on Gaza's Main Artery **Amid Renewed Ground Operations**

The Israeli Defense Forces (IDF) on Thursday imposed a ban on traffic along the main north-to-south artery of Gaza, known as Salaheddin Road. This move came a day after the IDF announced the resumption of ground operations in Gaza, marking a significant escalation in the ongoing con-

IDF spokesman Avichay Adraee stated on X that the military had begun targeted ground operations in central and southern Gaza to expand the security zone between the northern and southern parts of the Gaza Strip. As part of the operation, movement along Salaheddin Road is prohibited for safety reasons.

Instead, travelers from northern Gaza to southern areas are being rerouted to the Al-Rashid coastal road. The Israeli army did not clarify whether this restriction also applies to movement from the south to the north, leaving some uncertainty about the full scope of the traffic ban.

The closure of Salaheddin Road fol-



lows an earlier action on Wednesday, when Israeli forces shut down Netzarim Junction, located just south of Gaza City. Tanks were reportedly deployed at the junction after the withdrawal of American special security forces, who had been stationed there since February as part of a ceasefire agreement brokered earlier this year.

The ceasefire, which expired earlier this month, has been a point of contention, with Israel rejecting negotiations for the second phase of the agreement. Instead, Israel demanded the return of all hostages, further stalling progress toward a lasting ceasefire. In response to the deadlock, Israel resumed its air campaign in Gaza on Tuesday, which drew widespread international condemnation.

On Wednesday, the IDF confirmed it was also resuming ground operations in Gaza, heightening the tensions in the region once again. The ongoing conflict continues to have devastating humanitarian consequences, with both sides suffering heavy losses.

Netanyahu Accuses "Leftist Deep State" of Weaponizing Justice **System, Sparks Controversy**

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has stirred controversy after accusing the "leftist Deep State" of weaponizing the justice system against him. In a post shared on his official X (formerly Twitter) account, Netanyahu said, "In America and in Israel, when a strong right-wing leader wins an election, the leftist Deep State weaponizes the justice system to thwart the people's will. They won't win in either place! We stand strong together." However, the post was deleted within an hour, and Netanyahu reposted the same message from his personal account.

Netanyahu's remarks came amid ongoing investigations into alleged corruption involving his aides. Reports from The Times of Israel revealed that two suspects were detained in connection with an investigation into whether Qatar funneled money to Netanyahu's team. One suspect was released under unspecified conditions, while the other remained under interrogation.

The controversy surrounding Netanyahu has been further fueled by his controversial plans to overhaul the judicial system, which include increasing political control over the judiciary and firing top officials, including Shin Bet chief Ronen Bar. These moves have sparked significant anti-government protests in Jerusalem, with Netanyahu's critics accusing him of undermining the rule of law.

President Isaac Herzog responded by expressing his full confidence in Israel's judicial system. "Israel's strong and independent judicial system is an asset to our democracy, and the president of Israel is very proud of it," Herzog wrote on X. Opposition leader Yair Lapid, head of the Yesh Atid party, strongly criticized Netanyahu's statements, accusing him of losing touch with reality. "He's gone off the rails," Lapid's party posted, calling Netanyahu's rhetoric "dangerous conspiracies" that undermine the rule of law.

Indian Stock Market Soars on Strong IT Rally and Fed's Rate Cut Projections

Indian stock markets surged on Thursday, March 20, 2025, propelled by a rally in IT stocks and positive momentum from U.S. equities, following the Federal Reserve's decision to maintain its rate cut projections for this year.

The 30-share BSE Sensex rose by 478.13 points to reach 75,927.18 in early trading, while the NSE Nifty gained 149.1 points, climbing to 23,056.70. The rally was largely driven by strong performances from leading IT stocks, including Infosys, Tata Consultancy Services, and HCL Tech, as well as other significant gainers like Bharti Airtel, Zomato, and Mahindra & Mahindra. However, some stocks, including Bajaj Finance, UltraTech Cement, Adani Ports, and Tata Steel, faced declines.

Vikas Jain, Head of Research at Reliance Securities, noted that the domestic market is likely to continue its positive trajectory due to strong global momentum, especially following the U.S. Federal Reserve's announcement of planned interest rate cuts this year.

While Asian markets displayed mixed performance—Seoul traded positively, while Shanghai and Hong Kong were lower-the U.S. markets saw a significant surge on



March 19, 2025, indicating a broader shipping. global market recovery.

The Federal Reserve's decision to hold rates steady and its projection of two interest rate cuts this year, alongside an expected growth rate of 1.7% and an inflation forecast of 2.8% for 2025, aligned with expectations. V.K. Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strategist at Geojit Financial Services, highlighted two key trends in the Indian market: strong domestic consumption themes and growing interest in underperforming sectors such as defense and ues to boost global equities.

Global oil prices also saw a slight increase, with Brent crude climbing 0.54% to \$71.16 per barrel. In terms of investor activity, Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) sold equities worth ₹1,096.50 crore on March 19, while Domestic Institutional Investors (DIIs) bought equities worth ₹2,140.76 crore.

Overall, market sentiment remains positive as the anticipation of further rate cuts from the Fed contin-

London Tops UK Cities Where Women Suspect Partners of Cheating on Tinder



A Rare and Exotic Breed The buyer, S Satish, president of the Indian Dog Breeders Association, is known for owning expensive and rare breeds. Cadaboms Okami is a cross between a wolf and a Caucasian Shepherd, making it the first of its kind in India. The New York Post reports that the dog was originally bred in the United States before arriving in India. "I spent ₹50 crore on this pup because I love dogs and want to introduce unique breeds to India," Mr. Satish told The Sun. At just eight months old, Okami weighs over 5 kilograms and has a special diet of 3 kg of raw meat every day. According to the American Kennel Club, the wolfdog is a guardian breed known for its intelligence and

protective instincts.

A Profitable Investment

Apart from his passion for rare dogs, Mr. Satish also earns a fortune from them. He reportedly charges between \$2,800 (₹2.3 lakh) for a 30-minute appearance to \$11,700 (₹9.7 lakh) for five hours at events where people pay to see his exotic pets. "People love to take selfies and pictures with my dogs. They attract more attention than movie stars," he said.

Luxury Care for Elite Pets

This isn't his first high-profile purchase. Last year, he bought a rare Chow Chow for ₹27 crore (\$3.25 million). His elite pets live in a seven-acre farm where each dog has a 20ft by 20ft ken-

"There is enough space for them to walk and run, and six caretakers look after them," Mr. Satish said, adding that air conditioning isn't required due to Bengaluru's cool climate.

His latest purchase has once again captured the attention of dog lovers and luxury pet enthusiasts worldwide.

Tahawwur Rana files another request with US top court to stay extradition to India

Tahawwur Rana Seeks Stay on Extradition to India in Appeal to US Supreme Court

Tahawwur Rana, the accused in the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks, has filed a renewed plea with the US Supreme Court to halt his extradition to India. This follows the rejection of his earlier review petition by US Supreme Court Justice Elena Kagan on March 6. Rana's latest emergency application has been directed to Chief Justice John Roberts, requesting a stay on the extradition process while his legal challenge remains pending. The Supreme Court's website indicated that the application will be considered by the top court's judges on April 4, 2025.

Rana's legal team argues that his extradition should be delayed due to his severe health issues, which they claim would

put his life at risk if tried in India. In the appeal, Rana highlighted that he suffers from a 3.5 cm abdominal aortic aneurysm, Parkinson's disease with cognitive decline, and a mass that could indicate bladder cancer. He stated, "If a stay is not grant-

ed, there will be no review at all,

and the US courts will lose jurisdiction, leaving the petitioner in imminent danger of death."

Rana's plea for a stay on extradition has come amid ongoing diplomatic discussions between the US and India. During Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit

to the United States last month, US President Donald Trump confirmed that his administration had agreed to Rana's extradition, referring to him as a "very evil man." The extradition is part of broader efforts to bring justice for the 166 victims of the 2008 Mumbai attacks, which were orchestrated by Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorist David Headley, a close associate of Rana.

Tahawwur Rana, aged 63, is currently held in a Los Angeles prison. In 2011, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) filed a chargesheet against him and eight others, accusing them of aiding in the planning and execution of the Mumbai attacks. Rana's extradition has remained a contentious issue between the United States and India for several years.

When will women in Delhi receive Rs 2,500 monthly honorarium: Atishi

Senior AAP leader Atishi raised concerns on Thursday about the delay in the implementation of the Rs 2,500 monthly financial assistance for women in Delhi, promised by the BJP during the recent elections. Addressing a press conference, tion in the Delhi Assembly, questioned the BJP's commitment to delivering the promised benefits to the nearly 48 lakh women in the capital aged above 18 years.

Atishi wondered if the BJP government would restrict the benefit to a small fraction of eligible women by imposing various conditions or would fulfill its promise to assist the entire group. She also highlighted that while the BJP government had approved Rs 5,100 crore for the scheme, no tangible steps had been taken yet.

The committee formed to manage the scheme is headed by Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, who is expected to oversee its implementation. Despite the scheme being approved and funds allocated, Atishi's concerns reflect growing doubts about the timely execution of the promise.



Health expenditure at 1.84% of GDP, moving steadily to 2.5%: JP Nadda

Union Health Minister J.P. Nadda announced on Wednesday that the government's expenditure on healthcare has risen to 1.84% of GDP, up from 1.15% in 2013-14. Nadda expressed confidence that India is steadily progressing towards meeting the target set by the National Health Policy 2017, which aims to allocate 2.5% of GDP to healthcare by 2025.

During a discussion in the Rajya Sabha on the functioning of the Union Health Ministry, Nadda highlighted the government's efforts to increase healthcare funding and ensure improved access to medical services for the population. He noted that this increase in expenditure is a reflection of the government's commitment to providing better healthcare infrastructure and services across the coun-

However, Haris Beeran, a Member of Parliament from the Indian Union Muslim League (IUML), raised concerns about the feasibility of achieving the 2.5% GDP target. He argued that the National Health Policy's goal of enhancing healthcare expenditure remains "a distant dream." Beeran emphasized that while the increase in healthcare funding is a step in the right direction, the current levels of investment may still fall short of the necessary resources to address India's growing healthcare challenges, especially in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic.

India's healthcare system has long been criticized for its underfunding, and while recent improvements have been noted, many experts believe that more significant investments are necessary to ensure universal health coverage, strengthen the public health system, and improve healthcare outcomes across the country.

RG Kar Case: Family Receives Death Certificate After Seven-Month Delay

Seven months after the tragic rape-murder of their daughter at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital, her parents finally received the long-awaited death certificate from West Bengal Health Secretary NS Nigam. The certificate was handed over to them on the evening of March 19, 2025, during a visit by Nigam, who was accompanied by the medical superintendent and vice principal of RG Kar hospital.

Nigam confirmed that no discussions took place during the visit, and the purpose was solely to deliver the original death certificate. "They needed the original death certificate. Today, I came here and handed it over to them," Nigam stated.

The victim's father, who had been demanding the certificate since the tragic incident on August 9, expressed his frustration with the delays. "We have been struggling to obtain it. We sent an email in January and had to go from one department to another, but no one cooperated," he said. Despite the repeated efforts, including the email sent earlier this year, it took months for the document to tion and led to intense demands for justice. be delivered.

The death of the young woman, who was a trainee at the hospital, had drawn massive public atten-
