AAP **Appoints New Heads** for Delhi, Punjab, and **Other State Units**

Saurabh Bharadwai named Delhi AAP chief, Manish Sisodia to lead in party's Punjab unit

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has appointed Saurabh Bharadwaj as the new head of its Delhi unit and former deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia as the party chief in Punjab. The announcement came on Friday, signaling a fresh leadership push within the party as it prepares for upcoming electoral challenges.

Speaking about his new role, Saurabh Bharadwaj expressed his commitment to strengthening the party. He stated that it is easier to build and fortify a party after facing electoral defeat. Bharadwaj pointed out that despite AAP losing the recent Delhi elections,





the party still garnered 43.5% of the vote share, just two percentage points behind the BJP, which secured 45.5%. "Nearly half of Delhi voted for us, despite the BJP's extensive use of police and administrative resources against us. We will continue to work hard to strengthen the party," he added.

The party also announced new leaders for several state units. Gopal Rai, the former environment minister in Delhi, will now head AAP's Gujarat unit, been significant with a focus on preparing for the next developments.

The allegations came after Delhi Public Works Department (PWD) Minister Parvesh Verma called officials "thick-skinned," raising further tensions between the two par-

During a press conference in New Delhi, AAP leader and for-

mer chief minister Atishi questioned the sudden shift in criticism against the officers who had previously worked efficiently under the AAP government. "What has changed in just one month? These are the same officers who built the Signature Bridge and transformed Delhi's government schools. The BJP is abusing them because the AAP never asked for any commission," Atishi said. She added that officers had informed them that BJP ministers were demanding a 10% cut on all government projects, and those refus-

ing were being threatened with suspension, despite such powers resting solely with the Lieutenant Governor (LG), not Delhi's elected ministers.

Earlier in the day, Minister Verma, during a field visit, commented that officers had "become thick-skinned in the last 10 years" and that they needed to "sweat" in the field. He also suspended an executive engineer over poor de-silting of a drain near the Akshardham temple.

US SC to Hear Tahawwur Rana's Renewed **Extradition Stay Request in next month**

The US Supreme Court will hear the renewed application of Tahawwur Rana, a key figure in the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks, seeking a stay on his extradition to India. Rana, a Canadian businessman of Pakistani descent, is currently incarcerated at the Metropolitan Detention Center in Los Angeles, facing charges for his involvement in the attacks, which killed 166 people.

Rana's initial extradition approval by the US court was made earlier, but he has continued to challenge his extradition to India. On February 27, 2025, he submitted an "Emergency Application for Stay Pending

India Strengthens Latin America Ties with Bolivia and Brazil

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar and Bolivia's Foreign Minister Celinda Sosa Lunda held productive talks on Thursday, marking a significant step toward strengthening the bilateral relationship between the two nations. The discussions focused on expanding cooperation across various sectors, culminating in the signing of agreements on Quick Impact Projects. These initiatives are part of a broader effort to deepen the partnership between India and Bolivia, particularly after the inauguration of India's new embassy in La Paz.

In a post on X, Jaishankar shared the outcome of the meeting, stating, "A comprehensive discussion on bilateral cooperation with FM Bolivia Celinda Sosa Lunda this afternoon. The recent opening of our new Embassy in La Paz reflects our resolve to deepen the India-Bolivia partnership. Today's signing of the agreement on Quick Impact Projects is another step forward in that direction."

The agreements signed are expected to foster closer ties between the two countries by addressing immediate development needs and



to supporting Bolivia's growth and development. These projects, designed to have a quick and tangible impact, aim to benefit loregion.

Earlier on the same day, Jaishankar also extended India's full support to Brazil for its leadership role in COP30, emphasizing India's commitment to global climate action. Mann in the middle: Why Punjab launched a crackdown on farmers

The Punjab government's decision to demolish tents at the Shambhu and Khanauri borders and end the farmers' agitation has sparked strong opposition accusations against Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann. Once seen as a mediator between protesting farmers and the Centre, Mann has recently shifted his stance, leading to allegations of backstabbing the farmers.

On Wednesday, Punjab authorities detained prominent farmer leaders Jagjit Singh Dallewal and Sarwan Singh Pandher just after their meeting with Union ministers. The farmers have been protesting since February 2022, demanding a legal guarantee for Minimum Support Prices (MSPs).

Singh Sondh defended the action, claiming the highway blockages were causing significant losses to trade and businesses. "These blockages have been detrimental to the economy," he stated, emphasizing the need to clear roads and prevent further losses. Six of the nine towers in the area had already been evacuated as a result of the protests.

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government's sudden decision to crack down on the protests has drawn sharp criticism from opposition leaders. Congress leader Pargat Singh accused AAP of siding with the BJP and allowing the farmers' movement economy and ensure future investment.

The statement in question was made by Rahul Gandhi on January 15, 2025, during the inauguration of the Congress party's new headquarters, 'Indira Bhawan.' In his address, Gandhi criticized the BJP and RSS, alleging that opposition parties, including Congress, were fighting not just the BJP but the entire Indian state itself. "Our ideology, like the RSS ideology, is thousands of years old, and it has been fighting the RSS ideology for thousands of years. Do not think that we are fighting a fair fight. There is no fairness in this. If you believe that we are fighting a political organisation called the BJP or RSS, you have not understood what is going on. The BJP and the RSS have captured every single institution of our country. We are now fighting the BJP, the RSS and the Indian State itself," Gandhi had said.

Simran Gupta had initially filed a complaint in the special MP/MLA court seeking to register an FIR against Gandhi, but the court had quashed it, citing jurisdictional issues. The complainant then filed a revision petition, and the District Judge Court of Sambhal has now issued the summon.

The case has brought attention to Gandhi's remarks, which have sparked controversy and debate, especially regarding his criticisms of the current government and its control over national institutions. The matter will be revisited in court on April 4, when Rahul Gandhi is expected to respond or appear before the judge.

J.P. Nadda Urges MPs to Promote Annual **Health Screenings Nationwide**

Government Expands Cancer Care, TB Support, and Free Health Check-ups

Union Health Minister J.P. Nadda on Friday called on all Members of Parliament (MPs) to ensure that their constituents undergo annual health check-ups to facilitate the early detection of health issues. Addressing the Lok Sabha, Nadda highlighted the government's ongoing campaign to provide free health screenings for citizens aged 30 and above, under the Ayushman Arogya Mandir initiative. This initiative focuses on detecting common health conditions such as high blood pressure, diabetes, and cancer.

The Health Minister shared impressive figures from the campaign, stating that over 35 crore people have been screened since its inception. Among those, 4.2 crore individuals were identified with hypertension, 2.6 crore with diabetes, and 1.18 ter screening 29.35 crore people. Emphasizing the importance of regular check-ups, Nadda urged MPs to lead by example and ensure that every citizen undergoes a thorough health examination every year to catch potential health problems early.

Nadda also provided an update on cancer care across the country. He mentioned that there are currently 372 day-care cancer centres, 19 state cancer centres, and 22 tertiary cancer centres operating nationwide. He pointed out that all the All India Institutes of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) have specialized cancer care facilities equipped with modern technology. Additionally, a super-speciality hospital in Jhajhar, Haryana, with 1,400 beds, stands as one of the world's premier cancer hospitals.

Further outlining the government's commitment to expanding cancer care, Nadda stated that a cancer day-care centre will be established in every district to administer chemotherapy. He revealed that 200 such centres will open this year, with plans for more in the coming years.

In response to another query, Union Minister of State for Health, Anupriya Patel, informed the House that the government had transferred Rs 3,635 crore directly to tuberculosis patients through direct benefit transfers, offering Rs 1,000 per patient for nutritional support.

'Recovery of cash' from residence of judge : Issue raised in Rajya Sabha: Ramesh

The issue of a large sum of cash allegedly recovered from the residence of a sitting judge of the Delhi High Court was raised in the Rajya Sabha. Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar responded by stating that he would explore a structured approach to facilitate a discussion on the matter.


The issue was brought up by Congress MP Jairam Ramesh during the morning session. Ramesh referred to a "shocking case" involving significant amounts of cash discovered at the residence of the Delhi High Court judge and called for a response on judicial accountability. He also reminded the Chairman about a pending notice concerning the impeachment of a judge from the Allahabad High Court.

Ramesh emphasized that the Chairman had previously expressed concerns over the need for judicial accountability and

requested that Dhankhar direct the government to present a proposal addressing this is-

In his response, Chairman Dhankhar acknowledged the seriousness of the matter, stating that he was troubled by the delayed public disclosure of the incident. He pointed out that had the cash been recovered from a politician, bureaucrat, or industrialist, it would have attracted immediate attention. He assured the House that steps would be taken for a transparent and accountable response, and that a structured discussion on the issue would be arranged by consulting with both the Leader of the House and the Leader of the Opposition.

The matter also involved a senior lawyer expressing shock over the allegations before the Delhi High Court, where Justice Yashwant Varma, the judge involved, did not hold court on the day of the proceedings.

Parliament Reconvenes Amid Tensions; BJP Urges Full Support for **Grants Discussion**

Parliament reconvened on Friday, March 21, 2025, after a day of disruptions and adjournments. The BJP-led NDA government is set to push through various demands for Grants for the fiscal year 2025-26 in the Lok Sabha, with a focus on ensuring that the motions are passed efficiently.

In a whip letter issued to its members, the BJP urged all its MPs in the Lok Sabha to be present throughout the day and support the government's position on the demands for grants. The letter emphasized the importance of a united front, given the ongoing disruptions in the session.

The previous day, March 20, 2025, saw no significant progress in the Lok Sabha as the Opposition members staged protests, leading to repeated

adjournments. Speaker Om delaying the planned legisla-Birla reprimanded the protesting MPs, who had worn T-shirts emblazoned with slogans. Birla urged them to change into more appropriate attire, highlighting the breach of parliamentary decorum. Despite these interventions, the disruptions continued, leaving no room for productive discussions.

A similar scene unfolded in the Rajya Sabha, where proceedings were briefly suspended due to a row over some DMK members wearing slogan-bearing T-shirts. The opposition's attire-related protest became a flashpoint, further

With the session having lost valuable time, the NDA government is keen on ensuring that the demands for grants are passed smoothly. The party's leadership is aiming to avoid further disruptions and push forward with crucial financial discussions that are necessary for the functioning of government schemes and the allocation of funds for the coming year. The focus on Friday is to clear the backlog and make up for lost time in the Parliament's Budget session.

The opposition, meanwhile, continues to voice its concerns, and the government faces pressure to address issues beyond the budget, including governance matters and contentious political issues raised by various parties.

Delhi Minister launches mobile dental clinics for free check-up

Six Mobile Units to Provide Essential Dental Care in Underserved Areas

Delhi Health Minister Pankaj Kumar Singh launched six mobile dental clinics aimed at providing free dental treatment to the city's residents. The initiative is a collaboration between the Delhi government and the Maulana Azad Institute of Dental Sciences,

designed to extend dental care to underserved areas of the city.

The mobile clinics are equipped with state-of-the-art dental equipment, including modern dental chairs, portable X-ray units, ultrasonic scalers, and sterilisation units, ensuring high-quality care for patients.

These clinics will travel across various parts of Delhi, particularly reaching marginalized communities and slums, where access to healthcare services is often limited.

"The mobile clinics will offer free fluoride treatments, dental sealants, and simple restorative procedures. Our goal is to make sure that dental care is accessible to everyone, regardless of their location or economic status," said Singh, a dentist-turned-politician

Fully Renovated Terminal 1 at IGI Airport to Open on April 15, Shifting Flights from T2

The fully renovated Terminal 1 (TI) at Indira Gandhi International (IGI) Airport will officially become operational on April 15, marking the beginning of renovation work at Terminal 2 (T2). The Delhi International Airport Limited (DIAL) announced on Thursday that this will lead to the relocation of all flight operations from T2 to the newly upgraded T1.

Starting April 15, all six gates at T1 will be operational, providing enhanced capacity and services for passengers. Currently, T2 approximately handles 270-280 air traffic movements daily, serving over 46,000 passengers, primarily from Akasa Air and IndiGo airlines. These flights will now shift to T1, streamlining operations as part of the airport's continued modernization.

"This shift is a significant step in Delhi Airport's ongoing modernization efforts, ensuring that we continue to provide world-class services. The expansion and modernization of T1 were part of the Phase 3A expansion project. The expanded, integrated Terminal 1 was dedicated to the nation in March last year," a DIAL spokesperson stated.

While T1 was virtually inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in March 2024, it had been operating only partially due to a tragic canopy collapse that killed one person on June 28. This incident delayed full operations, and only gates 5 and 6 were opened in August 2024. With the completion of renovations, all six gates will now be available, significantly improving passenger experience and airport efficiency.

The relocation of flights from T2 to the revamped T1 is expected to ease congestion and provide a more modern, efficient terminal for passengers, solidifying IGI Airport's status as a global hub for air travel.

Delhi to Revise Water Connection Rates to Encourage Legal Connections : Minister Parvesh

Delhi Water Minister Parvesh Sahib Singh announced on Thursday that the city will revise its high water connection rates to promote legal water connections. He emphasized that the current rates discourage residents from opting for authorized connections, and the government aims to address this issue by lowering the costs.

"We will revise the rates to make legal connections more accessible and encourage people to opt for them," the Minister said. He further added that a deadline will be set for residents to obtain legal connections, after which penalties will be imposed on those who fail to comply.

A source from the Minister's office revealed that the number of water meters in Delhi is significantly lower compared to the city's electricity meters. This highlights the gap in the system, where many residents continue to rely on illegal water connections, exacerbating the city's water management challenges.

As Delhi braces for the summer season, when water demand peaks, Singh stated that the

government will hold weekly review meetings to assess the Summer Action Plan. These meetings will focus on ensuring the proper functioning of water supply systems, monitoring connections, and addressing any gaps in supply.

In an effort to improve water distribution transparency, the Minister also mentioned that a tender is being floated for GPS-fitted water tankers. "Currently, there is no accurate record of where tankers are supplying water. To ensure transparency, every tanker will be fitted with GPS, and a list of water supply points will be maintained with proper documentation," Singh said. Additionally, the number of tanker trips will be increased to 16 per day to bolster the water supply during peak summer months.

According to the 2024 Delhi Economic Survey, the city's water requirement stands at 1,290 MGD (Million Gallons per Day) for its estimated population of 2.1 crore. However, the maximum water supply last year was around 1,000 MGD, resulting in a 22% shortfall. The government's efforts to revise water connection rates and improve monitoring are steps toward addressing this critical issue.

Delhi PWD to Install Rain Sensors to Combat Waterlogging and Prevent Rain-related Deaths

In a bid to tackle waterlogging and prevent rain-related fatalities, the Public Works Department (PWD) is set to install rain sensors at all subways and underpasses across the city ahead of the upcoming monsoon season. This initiative, announced on Thursday, aims to proactively manage water accumulation and minimize risks such as drowning and electrocution, which are often caused by heavy rainfall.

According to PWD officials, the rain sensors will monitor the water levels at key points and send out alerts when they reach a predefined threshold. Once the water level surpasses this limit, the sensors will automatically activate pumps designed to remove excess water, reducing the chances of flooding and ensuring that traffic flow is not disrupted during the monsoon rains.

The primary goal of this system is to prevent waterlogging in crucial areas like subways and underpasses, where water accumulation can cause significant inconvenience and pose

safety hazards. By automating the process of water removal, the PWD hopes to address one of the city's most persistent monsoon challenges.

The move is also part of a broader effort by the authorities to enhance the city's infrastructure and public safety. Previous years have seen incidents of drowning and electrocution, often occurring when water levels rise unexpectedly, overwhelming the existing drainage systems. By implementing rain sensors and automatic pumps, the PWD aims to reduce the likelihood of such tragic events and ensure that the city's infrastructure is better equipped to handle the pressures of the monsoon.

As the monsoon season approaches, these preventative measures are seen as crucial for safeguarding public well-being and preventing disruptions caused by severe weather conditions. With this new initiative, the PWD is hoping to create a safer and more resilient environment for both residents and commuters during the rainy season.



Delhi Police Bust Hacker Gang After Retired DRDO Scientist Duped of ₹40 Lakh

The Delhi Police have successfully busted a hacker gang involved in duping people, including a retired DRDO scientist, out of ₹40 lakh. The police arrested four members of the gang and uncovered their method of operation, which involved hacking bank accounts through malware.

Deputy Commissioner of Police Surendra Choudhary explained that the accused posed as customer care representatives, contacting victims and convincing them to install a malware-laden Android Package Kit (APK) file under the guise of resolving technical issues. Once the victim installed the file, it allowed the fraudsters remote access to the victim's device. This access enabled them to steal sensitive financial details such as banking credentials, PAN card information, and CVV codes. The gang then used these details to siphon large sums of money from the victims' accounts.

The investigation was initiated when a retired DRDO

fraudsters had stolen ₹40 lakh from his savings and fixed deposits. DCP Choudharv detailed how the victim, who had searched for customer support online, called a fraudulent number and was sent the malware through social media. Unknowingly, the victim installed the file, giving the criminals access to his bank account. Over the course of a week, the criminals systematically transferred large amounts of money.

Following the victim's complaint, an FIR was filed, and a cyber police team was assigned to the case. The police traced the operation to Deoghar in Jharkhand and Mewat in Rajasthan. Using technical surveillance, the police tracked the criminals' use of rotating SIM cards and frequently changing devices to avoid detection. Through geo-location tracking and intelligence inputs, police conducted raids and arrested four gang members: Iqbal Ansari, Sajid Khan, Salman Khan, and Narendra Ku-

Fighter Jets To Land On Assam Highways Soon: **Himanta Biswa Sarma**

Three Indian Nationals Face Death Penalty in Indonesia for Drug Trafficking

Defense Challenges Prosecution as Trial Nears Verdict

Three Indian nationals, Raju Muthukumaran, 38, Selvadurai Dinakaran, 34, and Govindhasamy Vimalkandhan, 45, have been detained in Indonesia since July 2024 on charges of drug trafficking. The trio, hailing from Tamil Nadu, are A key development in the case accused of smuggling 106 kg of crystal meth aboard the Singapore-flagged vessel, Legend Aquarius. If convicted, they face the death penalty, as prosecutors have demanded the maximum sentence under Indonesian law.

The three men, who worked in the shipping industry in Singapore, were arrested by Indonesian authorities in the Pongkar waters of Karimun district, which lies about an hour from Singapore by ferry. The arrest followed a tip-off regarding the drug shipment.

occurred on March 14, when the vessel's captain, ordered to testify in person, failed to appear in court. Instead, he appeared briefly via Zoom, which prevented the defense from cross-examining him. The defense team argued that the captain's testimony is crucial to proving the defendants' innocence, as he is ultimately responsible for all cargo aboard the ship under Indonesian law.

To bolster their case, the defense has presented expert testimony from Soleman B. Ponto, a retired Indonesian Navy officer and maritime law expert. Ponto testified that the captain holds full responsibility for the cargo, casting doubt on the claim that the three men could have smuggled such a large quantity of drugs without the captain's knowledge. The defense team insists that the actual perpetrators may have been released, with the three Indian nationals wrongfully detained.

The trial is ongoing, and the defense is working to highlight inconsistencies in the prosecution's case. The verdict is expected on April 15, 2025. Meanwhile, at a press conference in July 2024, Marthinus Hukom, head of the Indonesian National Narcotics Agency, alleged that the three were the primary drug owners and had commissioned the trip.

Rs 11,945 Crore Collected in Toll Tax on Jaipur-Delhi Highway

Gadkari Reveals Toll Revenue Exceeds Construction Cost

Union Transport Minister Nitin Gadkari has confirmed that a total of Rs 11,945 crore has been collected in toll tax from vehicles using the Jaipur-Delhi National Highway, also known as National Highway 48. This disclosure was made in response to a Parliamentary question raised by Hanuman Beniwal, the Lok Sabha MP from Nagaur, Rajasthan. Beniwal had asked whether the toll tax collected on the highway was significantly higher than the cost of its construction.

Gadkari, in his reply, provided details about the Gurgaon-Kotputli-Jaipur stretch, a key part of the highway project. The appointed date for the project

Adani Energy Solutions Wins Rs 2,800 Crore Green Power Transmission Project in Gujarat

Adani Energy Solutions Ltd (AESL) announced on Friday that it has secured a Rs 2,800 crore power transmission project in Gujarat. The project aims to supply green electricity for the manufacturing of Green Hydrogen and Green Ammonia in Mundra, Gujarat, as part of the company's ongoing efforts to support sustainable energy initiatives.

This marks AESL's sixth major order win in the current fiscal year, bringing its total order book to an impressive Rs 57,561 crore. The project, titled "Transmission System for Green Hydrogen/ Ammonia Manufacturing Potential in Mundra, Gujarat," will enhance the region's power transmission capacity and infrastructure.

As part of the project, AESL will upgrade the Navinal (Mundra) electrical substation by adding two large 765/400kV transformers. Additionally, a 75 kmlong 765kV double-circuit transmission line will be constructed to link the substation to the Bhuj substation. The project will add 150 circuit kilometers (cKM) of transmission lines and 3,000 megavolt-amperes (MVA) of transformation capacity to AESL's transmission network. This will increase the company's total transmission capacity to 25,928 cKM and 87,186 MVA, further solidifying its position as the largest private transmission company in India.

AESL secured the project under the Tariff-Based Competitive Bidding (TBCB) mechanism, with PFC Consulting Ltd acting as the bid process coordinator. The project Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) was formally transferred to AESL on March 20, 2025.

AESL is a key player in India's energy sector, with operations spanning power transmission, distribution, smart metering, and cooling solutions. As part of the Adani Group, AESL continues to expand its footprint in the energy sector, contributing to the country's growing renewable energy and infrastructure



Why Is Trump Invoking **JFK? Hint: Russia**

"Let's get out of the Defense mess before it's too late... Be brave, Jack."

Less than two years before his assassination in November 1963, U.S. President John F. Kennedy (JFK) received this letter from filmmaker Rod Serling, best known as the creator of The Twilight Zone. The poignancy of this postscript in a March 26, 1962, letter needs to be examined afresh today, especially after the latest release of another tranche of the JFK Files.

Keeping his promise, President Donald Trump recently declassified over 2,000 documents related to JFK's assassination. JFK, who lived by the media and also died on screen, continues to dominate the public imagination six decades after his death. As experts analyze more than 64,000 pages of these declassified files, conspiracy theories surrounding JFK's assassination have resurfaced.

Who'll Tell the Conspiracy Theorists?

Did the CIA have JFK assassinated to continue its Vietnam experiment? Did Lee Harvey Oswald conspire with the Soviet Union? Was the Chicago mob involved? Or did Vice President Lyndon Johnson orchestrate it? No definitive answers exist, fueling the enduring allure of conspiracy theories.

However, some question the purpose of these declassified documents, which inadvertently exposed sensitive details of hundreds of political, military, and congressional personnel.

The CIA's Role in the Cold War

The documents shed light on the CIA's vast influence during the Cold War. They reveal details about U.S. intelligence operations, including CIA bases in New Delhi and Kolkata, sabotage efforts against Cuba, and covert strategies to undermine foreign governments. Instead of painting the CIA as the villain behind JFK's assassination, the files reinforce its image as a formidable player in global politics.

Interestingly, JFK aide Arthur Schlesinger Jr. once described the CIA as possessing "many of the characteristics of a state within a state." Even today, the agency remains one of the most powerful arms of the U.S. government.

Why Is Trump Bringing Back JFK?

At a time when Trump's second term is facing domestic and international criticism, reviving JFK's legacy serves multiple purposes. The former president, who was often skeptical of intelligence agencies, has long positioned himself as an outsider challenging Washington's deep state. By declassifying the JFK files, Trump reinforces his narrative of exposing government secrets while invoking the legacy of a leader associated with peace efforts.

JFK, who campaigned for nuclear disarmament, signed the Limited Nuclear Test Ban Treaty just a month before his assassination. Today, as the Trump administration navigates strained relations with Russia, leveraging JFK's image as a peacemaker helps frame Trump's diplomatic approach in a historical context.

This isn't the first time Trump has leaned on JFK's memory. In his 2016 campaign, he promoted conspiracy theories linking his rival Ted Cruz's father to JFK's assassination. Now, as Trump seeks to shape his second-term foreign policy, invoking JFK may be a calculated effort to justify his approach to Russia.

Trump Signs Order to Begin Shutting Down the Department of Education

On Thursday, U.S. President Donald Trump signed an executive order aimed at eliminating the Department of Education, a long-standing goal of conservative factions in the country. The order marks one of the most drastic steps in Trump's overhaul of the federal government, seeking to transfer education control back to the states.

During a special ceremony at the White House, Trump signed the order while surrounded by schoolchildren. He declared, "We're going to shut it down and shut it down as quickly as possible. It's doing us no good. We're going to return education back to the states where it belongs."

While the Education Department was created in 1979, it cannot be dissolved without congressional approval. However, Trump's order aims to defund and reduce the department's staff, which could lead to its gradual dismantling. The directive tasks Education Secretary Linda McMahon with taking all necessary steps to facilitate the closure of the department and return authority over education to individual states.

The move is part of Trump's campaign promise to reduce federal government control, a

theme he has consistently championed. The president has argued that the U.S. education system lags behind those of Europe and China, and that eliminating the department will save money and improve educational standards.

The order has been met with heavy criticism from Democrats and educators. Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer condemned the action as a "tyrannical power grab." Republican leaders, including Florida Governor Ron DeSantis and Texas Governor Greg Abbott, attended the ceremony and supported the move.

Although the order seeks to dismantle the department, a smaller office may remain to handle essential functions, such as student loans and grants for low-income students. Trump's education secretary, McMahon, who has already started reducing the department's staff, emphasized the need to remove Washington's bureaucratic interference and return educational funding to the states.

The decision follows a broader trend of Trump's efforts to reduce the size and influence of federal agencies, including efforts to dismantle the U.S. Agency for International Development earlier this week, which was halted by a federal judge.



North Korea claims to test anti-aircraft missiles in response to US-South Korea military drills

North Korea announced on Friday that it successfully test-launched new anti-air-craft missiles, marking its sixth weapons test of the year. The launch occurred just hours after the U.S. and South Korean military concluded their joint Freedom Shield exercises, which North Korea considers a provocative rehearsal for an invasion.

According to North Korea's state news agency, Korean Central News Agency (KCNA), leader Kim Jong Un oversaw the missile tests on Thursday and described the newly tested missiles as a significant addition to the country's defense arsenal. This missile launch came in the wake of heightened tensions following the U.S.-South Korea military drills, which were the first major exercises held since the inauguration of President Donald Trump in January.

The U.S. and South Korea insist that their combined military exercises are purely defensive, aimed at strengthening the allies' readiness and deterrence capabilities. However, North Korea has consistently condemned the drills, viewing them as an imminent security threat. The recent North Korean missile tests were launched on the same day the two countries concluded the Freedom Shield exercise. Earlier in March, North Korea fired several ballistic missiles into the sea as the drills began, signaling its displeasure. On Friday, North Korea's Defense Ministry issued a strong statement, accusing the U.S. and South Korea of simulating operations to destroy underground tunnels in the North, targeting its nuclear weapons. The North warned of grave consequences if the two countries continued with such "provocative" actions.



Modi-Yunus Meeting Unlikely at BIMSTEC Summit Amid Strained Ties

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Bangladesh interim government chief Muhammad Yunus are set to attend the Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC) summit next month, but a formal meeting between the two leaders seems improbable, according to reports.

The sixth BIMSTEC summit is scheduled for April 3-4 in Bangkok, Thailand. While both Modi and Yunus are expected to be present, a recent Hindustan Times report, citing three unnamed sources familiar with the matter, suggested that the current state of India-Bangladesh relations would make a formal bilateral meeting difficult. The report mentioned that while an informal exchange of pleasantries might occur due to the leaders' shared presence, nothing more substantial is anticipated.

Bangladesh's de facto foreign minister, Touhid Hossain, confirmed on March 20 that Dhaka had formally requested a meeting between the two leaders on the summit's sidelines. However, sources indicated that such a meeting is unlikely due to the ongoing tensions between the two countries. "A formal meeting looks difficult, especially with the frequent criticism of India by some members of Bangladesh's interim government," one source remarked.

The bilateral ties between India and Bangladesh are at a low point, with India expressing concerns about the interim government's handling of attacks on religious minorities, particularly Hindus, in Bangladesh. Additionally, issues such as the release of violent extremists and deteriorating law and order in Bangladesh have further strained relations. Bangladesh, on the other hand, has raised concerns over the presence of former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in India and has requested her extradition.

Furthermore, the growing engagement of the Bangladesh military with Pakistan's armed forces, including interactions with the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI), has also fueled tensions. In February, India's External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar met with Bangladesh's Foreign Affairs Advisor Hossain on the sidelines of the Indian Ocean Conference in Oman, highlighting ongoing diplomatic efforts amid these challenges.

If US messes with Iran it will get hard slap: Ayatollah Khamenei

Asserts Iran Doesn't Need Proxies as Houthis Act on Their Own Motivation

Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei declared on Friday that Tehran does not require proxies in the region, clarifying that the Houthis in Yemen, who are aligned with Iran, operate based on their own motivations. Khamenei responded to US accusations, particularly remarks by President Donald Trump, who earlier stated that Iran would be held responsible for any attacks carried out by the Houthis. This comes as the US expands its military operations in the Middle East, marking the largest deployment since Trump's return to office.

Over the years, Iran has cultivated ties with various groups in the Middle East that consider themselves part of the "Axis of Resistance" against US influence and Israel. This alliance includes groups like Hamas, Hezbollah in Lebanon, and Shi'ite militias in Iraq. Despite these alliances, Khamenei strongly rejected the notion of these groups being Iranian "proxies."

In his statement, Khamenei questioned the term "proxy," saying, "Americans make a big mistake by calling regional resistance centres Iranian proxies. What does proxy mean?" He emphasized that groups like the Houthis in Yemen act on their own motivations, and Iran does not need such proxies to assert influence in the region. The Supreme Leader also addressed the escalating tensions, asserting that while Iran has never initiated conflict, it would respond strongly to any acts of aggression. He warned that any malicious actions against Iran would result in "severe slaps" in return.



Stock Markets Rally to Record Highs; **Best Weekly Performance in Four Years**

Domestic stock markets set new records. They posted their best weekly close in four years. This was due to positive signals from global markets and increased positive sentiment among investors. The strengthening rupee also contributed to this. Investors bought after the falling trendline resistance broke in the benchmark indices. They invested in media, PSE, oil, energy and healthcare shares. Overall, the Sensex gained 557 points and the Nifty 159 points. The Nifty settled at 23,350. If there is consolidation at this level and the resistance breaks, the index is sure to rise further.

The BSE Sensex, which closed at 76,348 in the previous session, opened at 76,155 on Friday. It touched an intraday low of 76,095. It reached an intraday high of 77,041. It ended at 76,905 with a gain of 557 points. The NSE Nifty, which opened at 23,168, touched a low of 23,132 and a high of 23,402. It rose by 159 points in total and closed at 23,350. The Nifty Bank rose by 530 points and settled at 50,593.

In the Nifty50, 38 companies gained and 12 lost. Media, PSE, oil, CPSE, energy, PSU bank, healthcare, pharma, private bank, infra, commodities, finance, bank, realty and auto stocks were the winners. Metal and consumer stocks were the losers. SBI Life, ONGC, NTPC, BPCL, Bajaj Finance were the top gainers. Trent, Infi, Wipro, Hindalco and Tata Steel were the biggest losers.

Market breadth turned in favor of buyers on NSE today. Out of 2988 stocks trad-



ed, 2120 gained. 804 lost. 33 shares hit 52week highs and 49 shares hit 52-week lows. 192 shares crossed the upper circuit and 53 shares crossed the lower circuit.

Markets set their best weekly record in four years. Nifty rose 4% this week. Midcap index rose 8% after April 2020. Smallcap index rose 9% for the first time since June 2020. The market capitalization of BSE listed companies increased by Rs 22 lakh crore this week. The rupee strengthened by 39 paise to settle at 85.97 against the dollar. India's Steel Imports Could Drop 50% in FY26 With **Proposed Safeguard Duty**

India's steel imports could potentially decrease by 50% in FY26, while domestic manufacturers' profitability is expected to improve, following the government's proposal to impose a safeguard duty on steel imports, experts suggest. The Directorate General of Trade Remedies (DGTR), the investigation arm of the Ministry of Commerce, has recommended a 12% provisional safeguard duty for 200 days on specific steel products to shield domestic steelmakers from the surge in imports.

The final decision on whether to impose the safeguard duty will be taken by the Ministry of Finance. However, experts view this development as credit positive for the domestic steel industry. Girish Kadam, Senior Vice President and Group Head – Corporate Sector Ratings at ICRA Ltd., believes that the duty could lead to a significant 50% reduction in India's steel imports by FY26.

With steel imports expected to drop considerably, the domestic market is anticipated to experience growth, with demand forecasted to increase at a healthy rate of 7-8% in FY26. As a result, ICRA projects that the industry's capacity utilization will improve, rising to a more comfortable level of 83% in FY26, up from the four-year low of 78% seen in the current fiscal year.

Dhruv Goel, CEO of BigMint, a market research firm, also echoed similar sentiments, pointing out that the safeguard duty would provide domestic manufacturers with an opportunity to capture a larger share of the domestic market. The anticipated reduction in imports is expected to improve the profitability of Indian steel producers, as it would give them a competitive edge over foreign suppliers.

The proposed safeguard duty aims to protect Indian steelmakers from being undercut by cheaper imports, which have been growing in recent years. If implemented, this move could help stabilize the domestic steel industry, reduce dependence on foreign steel, and boost the government's "Make in India" initiative.

India's Crude Oil Import Dependency Hits 88.2% Amid Rising Demand

India's reliance on imported crude oil has increased to over 88% during the first 11 months of the current financial year (FY25), driven by growing demand for fuel and other petroleum products, alongside stagnant domestic crude output. This upward trend suggests that the import dependency for the entire fiscal year could surpass the record high seen in the previous year.

According to the latest data from the Petroleum Planning & Analysis Cell (PPAC) of the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas, India's oil import dependency stood at 88.2% from April to February, marking a slight increase from 87.7% during the same period in FY24. For the full FY24, India's import dependence reached 87.8%.

The rising demand for petroleum products, especially in sectors like transportation and industrial activities, coupled with stagnant domestic oil production, has led to a heightened need for imported crude. Industry experts suggest that the import dependency for FY25 could exceed the current level by a small margin, just as it did in the previous fiscal year.

This growing import dependency highlights the challenges India faces in reducing its reliance on foreign oil, despite efforts to boost domestic production and diversify energy sources. As the world's third-largest oil importer, India continues to rely heavily on oil imports to meet its fuel needs, making it vulnerable to global price fluctuations and supply disruptions.

To address these challenges, the government has been exploring various strategies, including increasing domestic oil exploration, enhancing energy efficiency, and investing in renewable energy sources to reduce the country's dependence on imported crude in the long term. However, in the short term, the rising import dependency remains a significant concern for policymakers, particularly as global oil prices remain volatile.

Exponent Energy to Launch 1.5MW Rapid Charging Technology, Competing with BYD's Innovations

Bengaluru-based Exponent Energy announced on Wednesday that it will launch its new 1.5 megawatt (MW) rapid charging technology later this year, following China-based BYD's introduction of a 1MW charging system capable of charging electric vehicles (EVs) in just five minutes. Exponent Energy currently manufactures 1MW chargers for electric buses, enabling a full charge in about 15 minutes.

Arun Vinayak, CEO and Co-founder of Exponent Energy, expressed confidence in India's ability to develop and own the full spectrum of electric vehicle (EV) technology. SEBI Proposes Rule Changes to Benefit Startup Founders Holding ESOPs After IPO

Ensures Founders Retain Stock Options, Enhances Investor Protection

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has proposed a change in regulations that would allow startup founders to retain their Employee Stock Option Plans (ESOPs) even after their company goes public. This move is aimed at providing relief to founders, particularly in newage technology firms, who often receive ESOPs as part of their compensation instead of cash salaries during the early stages of their companies.

ESOPs are designed to align the interests of employees, including founders, with other shareholders. However, as startups raise investments, founders' ownership is often diluted, which complicates matters when the company eventually files for an initial public offering (IPO).



Under current SEBI regulations, founders are considered promoters when they file for an IPO. The existing rules prohibit issuing ESOPs to promoters, which creates a challenge for founders who were granted stock options before their companies went public. SEBI highlighted that employees who later become promoters due to their shareholding may be required to forgo their ESOP benefits, which could be considered unfair.

To address this issue, SEBI has proposed a clarification stating that founders who become promoters will still be able to exercise their vested and unvested ESOPs after the IPO. This clarification will be included in the Draft Red Herring Prospectus (DRHP).

However, the rule preventing the issuance of new ESOPs to promoters will remain in place.

This proposed change is expected to benefit startup founders who have received equity-based compensation, ensuring that they do not lose their ESOP benefits once their company goes public.

Additionally, SEBI has partnered with DigiLocker to enhance investor protection by allowing them to track their securities holdings securely. Through this collaboration, investors can store and access details of their demat accounts, mutual fund holdings, and other financial assets in one centralized, secure platform, helping to reduce unclaimed financial assets and improve accessibility.
