

US President Donald Trump is set to unveil a sweeping tariff plan on April 2, dubbed "Liberation Day," targeting imports worth trillions of dollars. The move is expected to escalate global trade tensions as the administration focuses on "reciprocal tariffs" to counter trade barriers imposed by other nations, including key US allies.

Trump, emphasizing economic nationalism, stated that the US has been "ripped off by every mains comcountry in the world, friend and mitted

foe," and pledged that the new tariffs would generate "tens of billions" in revenue. While hinting at some flexibility, he maintained that the primary goal is to ensure fair trade through reciprocal measures.

Targeted Tariffs and **Economic Impact**

Unlike previous blanket tariff hikes, the upcoming measures will be more selective, focusing on trade blocs or nations that Trump deems as engaging in unfair practices. The plan excludes a few countries but does not involve separate sector-specific tariffs as previously suggested. During his first two months in office, Trump raised tariffs on nearly \$800 billion in imports from China, Mexico, and Canada, triggering stock market volatility and fears of a recession. Delhi HC Withdraws Judge **Yashwant Varma** From Active Duty

Justice Yashwant Varma of the Delhi High Court has been removed from active duty following the discovery of burnt cash at his residence on Holi. The decision, announced by Chief



Justice DK Upadhyaya on Monday morning, comes amid an ongoing Supreme Court investigation into the matter.

A three-member committee, comprising the chief justices of the Punjab and Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, and Karnataka High Courts, has been set up to probe the allegations. Justice Varma has denied any connection to the money, asserting that neither he nor his family members were responsible for storing cash in the outhouse. He also described the incident as a "conspiracy" against him.

Minister DK Shivakumar on es where the Constitution had Monday refuted allegations that he proposed changes to the Constitution to extend reservation to Muslims, accusing the BJP of deliberately distorting his statement. He warned that he would take legal action against those misquoting him.

The controversy erupted after Shivakumar's remarks in a television interview were interpreted as advocating constitutional amendments to provide a 4% quota for Muslims under Category 2B in government tenders and procurements. The issue led to an uproar in Parliament on March 24, with BJP leaders criticizing the Congress leader's statement.

"I have been in the Assembly for 36 years and have basic common sense. I only referred to instanc-



been amended to comply with court orders. I never said we are going to change the Constitution for this issue. The BJP has distorted my statement for political gain," Shivakumar clarified to reporters in Bengaluru.

When asked whether the media had misquoted him, he defended journalists, stating, "No, this is not the media's fault. The BJP has twisted my words and dragged my name into unnecessary controversy."

Shivakumar alleged that the BJP was diverting attention from its failures by raking up non-issues. "This is a political conspiracy against me and the Congress," he asserted.

TPN Correspondent | Bengaluru Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah convened a crucial meeting with the President of the Karnataka Cooperative Milk Producers' Federation Limited (KMF) and the heads of district milk federations to discuss the proposed increase in milk prices. The meeting focused on balancing farmers' demands with financial discipline within

After listening to the federation's concerns, the Chief Minister issued strict instructions, stating that while the government is open to price revisions, the increased amount must be fully transferred to farmers. He emphasized that milk unions should focus on reducing unnecessary expenses rather than passing additional

Siddaramaiah noted that many unions are facing financial losses due to excessive administrative expenditures, particularly unnecessary contractual appointments. He directed all unions to cut administrative costs by 2.5% within the next three months and to further bring expenses below 2% within the following quarter.

Acknowledging that Karnataka's milk prices are lower than in oth-

er states, the Chief Minister said that increasing prices could lead to higher production. However, he reiterated that the government's primary concern is ensuring that any financial benefit from the price hike goes directly to farmers. The government's firm stance aims to promote transparency, financial efficiency, and sustainability in the dairy sector while safeguarding the interests of milk producers.

Crimes Against Children Surge in Karnataka, **Over 10 POCSO Cases Reported Daily**

- 8,233 child crime cases registered in 2024, up from 7,854 in 2023

Crimes against children have risen sharply in Karnataka, with an alarming average of 10 Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) cases reported daily in the first two months of 2025.

According to police data, 8,233 cases of crimes against children were recorded in 2024, up from 7,854 in 2023. Among them, POCSO cases alone surged to 4,003, a 38.89% increase in four years from 2,882 cases in 2021. The disturbing trend continues in 2025, with 348 cases in January and 264 in February.

Despite this surge, the conviction rate remains worryingly low. Between 2021 and 2024, out of 13,990 registered cases, only 353 resulted in convictions, while 3,662 cases ended in acquittal and 202 were classified as false cases.

Beyond POCSO cases, child marriage and child labour remain pressing issues. In just the first two months of 2025, 23 child marriages and 16 child labour cases were

reported. Data from the State Crime Records Bureau indicates that in 2024 alone, police registered 105 child labour cases, 142 cases under the Juvenile Justice Act, and 152 under the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act. Additionally, 3,766 cases of child kidnapping and abduction were reported. Child rights activist Vasudev Sharma noted that while increasing reports suggest greater awareness, the justice system's failure to punish offenders remains a challenge. "Most cases of child sexual abuse involve someone known to the vic-

Senior advocate Rajalaxmi Ankalagi emphasized the need for mandatory psychological counseling for victims. "The trauma inflicted on children leaves deep scars. Many cases go unreported due to stigma and police apathy," she added.

The Janata Dal (Secular) finds itself in a tricky situation over the Karnataka government's decision to

provide a 4% reservation for Muslims in government contracts under the 2B category. While its alliance partner, the BJP, is strongly opposing the move, JDS is yet to clarify its position.

The Congress government passed the Karnataka Transparency in Public Procurements (Amendment) Bill, 2025, on Friday, leading to sharp reactions from BJP leaders, who accused the government of appearement politics.

Union Minister for Steel and Heavy Industries and former Karnataka Chief Minister HD Kumaraswamy, who also serves as the JDS state president, is expected to clear his party's stand in New Delhi

on Monday. Party sources suggest that JDS is likely to extend support to the BJP's opposition against the quo-

JDS Legislature Party leader CB Suresh Babu stated that the party would take a final decision after consultations with Kumaraswamy and former Prime Minister HD Deve Gowda. "It was Deve Gowda who ensured a 4% quota for Muslims under 2B for education and employment. However, the community has distanced

itself from our party in elections. We will discuss and decide our stand on the latest quota bill after deliberations," he said.

Additionally, JDS is expected to demand an extension of the quota to other backward classes, including the Madivala and Uppara communities. Meanwhile, BJP has strongly opposed the bill, calling it unconstitutional. A delegation led by BJP opposition leader R Ashoka met Governor Thaawarchand Gehlot to submit a complaint. JDS leader Suresh Babu was also part of the delegation, raising speculation about the party's possible stance against the bill.

SC Appoints Retired Judge to Mediate Anegundi Brindavana Dispute

SC appoints Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul as mediator

The Supreme Court has intervened in a longstanding dispute between Uttaradi Mutt and Raghavendra Swamy Mutt over the rights to perform puja and aradhana at one of the Brindavanas at Nava Brindavana, near Anegundi in Koppal district. In an order dated March 19, the apex court referred the matter for mediation under former SC judge Justice Sanjay Kishan

A division bench comprising Justices MM Sundresh and Rajesh Bindal directed both parties to maintain the status quo until the mediation process is completed. The decision follows an earlier Karnataka High Court (Dharwad Bench) ruling that temporarily restricted Raghavendra Swamy Mutt, Mantralayam, from performing puja at the disputed Brindavana.

The issue arose when Mantralavam Mutt claimed that one of the Brindavanas at Nava tiple courts. Brindavana belongs to Shri Jayateertha Swamiji, whereas Uttaradi Mutt asserts that it is the Brindavana of Shri Raghuvarya Teertharu. Uttaradi Mutt's general power of attorney holder, Shri Vidyadhishacharya, stated



that their mutt possesses sufficient evidence proving the rightful identity of the Brindavana and welcomed the Supreme Court's direction for mediation.

He further clarified that the Brindavana of Shri Jayateertharu is located at Malkhed in Kalaburagi district, countering Mantralayam Mutt's claims. The matter has been ongoing for four years, with legal battles across mul-

Karnataka Assembly Speaker U T Khader has warned that he will take "extreme steps," including year-long suspensions, if MLAs continue to disrupt Assembly proceedings. Speaking to the media in Mangaluru on Monday, he defended his recent decision to suspend legislators and emphasized the importance of respecting constitutional posts.

"Suspension of MLAs should not be seen as punishment. They must reform and set an example through their conduct.

If they continue to insult the 'chair' and create disturbances, I will not hesitate to take stronger action," Khader stated.

Referring to the chaos during the passing of the Finance Bill, he pointed out that past leniency had led to repeated misconduct.

"Had strict action been taken earlier, such incidents would not recur. Some MLAs assumed they would only face a day's suspension as it was the last day of the budget session. My decision was made as per the Constitution," he explained.

Khader emphasized the the anti-defection law, stating,

"If the Finance Bill wasn't passed, government employees wouldn't receive salaries, and development works would halt," he remarked.



Suspension of BJP MLAs Undemocratic: Former CM Shettar

The suspension of 18 BJP MLAs from the Karnataka Assembly has sparked a political controversy, with senior BJP leaders terming the move "undemocratic" and accusing the ruling Congress of silencing opposition voices.

Belagavi MP and former Chief Minister Jagadish Shettar criticized the decision, stating that BJP MLAs were peacefully protesting against the state government's handling of the 4% quota for minorities in government contracts and the ongoing honey-trap controversy. He maintained that the protest was directed at government policies and not against the Speaker.

"When the government failed to respond properly, our MLAs staged a peaceful protest, which was not undemocratic. Let me reiterate, there was no protest against the Speaker's

post. This suspension is unjust. I urge the Speaker to withdraw the order and call upon Chief Minister Siddaramaiah to take the initiative in revoking it," Shettar stated.

Haveri MP and former Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai went a step further, accusing the Congress government of suppressing democracy in Karnataka.

"There is no democracy in Karnataka—only anarchy. Ministers in the government are being honey-trapped, and allegations are being raised against the government itself. When we questioned this in the Assembly, our MLAs were thrown out. This is a blatant attempt to silence the opposition," Bommai alleged.

However, Karnataka Assembly Speaker U T Khader defended the suspension, stating that it was necessary to maintain order and uphold the dignity of the House.

He said the Speaker, despite holding the responsibility of ensuring smooth proceedings, has acted against democratic principles, setting a dangerous precedent.



BBMP Targets Property Tax Defaulters, Calls for Public Support

Bengaluru's civic body, the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP), has revealed that 3.49 lakh property owners have defaulted on tax payments, owing a total of ₹390 crore. Meanwhile, nearly 17 lakh property owners have paid their dues on time, highlighting the disparity between compliant taxpayers and chronic defaulters.

According to BBMP officials, 1.73 lakh property owners have been identified as chronic defaulters, while another 1.76 lakh properties have yet to clear their tax dues for the 2024-25 financial year. Among the city's zones, Mahadevapu-

TPN Correspondent | Ban- ra has the highest number of defaulters (81,481), followed by Bommanahalli (57,786) and RR Nagar (47,873), areas primarily located on the city's outskirts.

> Despite repeated notices, SMS reminders, and direct calls, many defaulters continue to evade payments. The BBMP had previously introduced a one-time tax settlement scheme that allowed defaulters to clear dues without penalties and interest, but a significant number did not take advantage of this opportunity.

Speaking on the issue, BBMP Special Commissioner (Revenue) Munish Moudgil defended the civic body's firm stance against defaulters. "Supporting

BMTC Deploys 5 Mobile Service Vans to Boost Bus Maintenance in Bengaluru

The Bengaluru Metropolitan Transport Corporation (BMTC) has introduced five newly-procured Mobile Service Vans (MSVs) to enhance bus maintenance and improve service efficiency across the city. The initiative, launched on March 24, 2025, is expected to reduce delays caused by mechanical issues and ensure uninterrupted public transport services.

BMTC operates a vast fleet of 6,835 buses, running an average of 5,875 trips per day, serving thousands of commuters. With such a large network, breakdowns and technical issues are inevitable. To address these challenges, BMTC has been using two mobile service vans at key locations one along the Outer Ring Road in Marathahalli and another stationed at Kempegowda Bus Stand. The incident took place on the night of March 3 and 4 along West of Chord Road in Rajajinagar. A police team, led by sub-inspector Manjunatha NV, along with constables Karthik UK and Dhareppa Tonne, had set up barricades to inspect vehicles during their night patrol. Around midnight, Mahadevaswamy approached the checkpoint in a Tata Altroz. Instead of stopping when signaled, he allegedly accelerated and attempted to run over the two constables.

The entire act was captured on a nearby CCTV camera. The suspect's car came to a stop about 200 meters ahead, prompting the officers to chase after him on their department-issued two-wheeler.



cle and asked him to step out, Mahadevaswamy reportedly made a sharp turn, trying to hit them again. The car collided with the two-wheeler, knocking the officers down and causing them injuries. Before they could restrain him, the suspect managed to flee the scene.

Following the attack, the Magadi Road police registered a case against Mahadevaswamy. After reviewing CCTV footage and tracking the vehicle's registration, the police successfully identified and arrested him. He has been charged under multiple sections of the Indian

"Kunal Kamra Stands Amid Controversy"

Comedian Kunal Kamra has told the Mumbai police that he has no regrets over his "gaddar" (traitor) remark, which was perceived as a reference to Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Eknath Shinde. According to sources, Mr. Kamra stated that he would only apologise if directed by the courts, despite Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis demanding an apology.

Mr. Fadnavis, addressing the Assembly, argued that freedom of expression could not be extended to "low-level comedy" that disrespects the Deputy Chief Minister. Speaking from Tamil Nadu, Mr. Kamra also denied allegations that he was paid by the opposition to target Mr. Shinde, even offering to let the authorities examine his fi-


nances to verify this claim.

The controversy escalated after a Mumbai studio that hosted Kamra's show was demolished by the city's civic body, citing an unspecified violation. The demolition followed an attack on the studio by Shiv Sena workers loyal to Mr. Shinde. On Sunday night, the vandals stormed the Habitat Studio in Mumbai's Khar area, damaging property and hurling chairs. Videos of the attack surfaced online, showing a mob running amok.

Later, protesters burned Mr. Kamra's photograph outside a police station in Thane, a region considered Mr. Shinde's political stronghold. Despite the vandalism, all 11 people arrested were granted bail within hours. The owners of Habitat Studio distanced themselves from Mr. Kamra's comments,

stating that they could not be held responsible for statements made by performers. They later announced the temporary shutdown of the venue, citing concerns over safety and the ability to provide a platform for free expression.

The controversy stems from Kamra's remark, which allegedly referred to Mr. Shinde's 2022 rebellion against former Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray, a move that led to the Shiv Sena split and the fall of the Thackeray-led government. Mr. Shinde subsequently aligned with the BJP to form the current Maharashtra government. Multiple police complaints have been filed against Kamra, including one by Maharashtra Transport Minister Pratap Sarnaik. Meanwhile, opposition leaders, including Aaditya Thackeray, criticized

Bengaluru Streets Covered in **Mysterious White Foam After Rain**

After a heavy downpour on Saturday, Bengaluru's streets were blanketed in an unusual white foam, resembling snow. While the rain provided relief from the city's scorching heat, the appearance of foam in the NIMHANS Dairy Circle area left many puzzled. Videos and images of the bizarre sight quickly went viral on social media, sparking curiosity and speculation about its cause.

An Instagram user named Milan captured the strange phenomenon and shared a video with the caption: "Does anyone know what's happening? Bangalore's streets turned into a foam party after an unexpected summer rain!" The footalong the edges. The post drew widespread attention, with several users attempting to explain the mysterious foam. Some linked it to soapnut tree flowers, which are known to produce foamlike substances when mixed with rainwater. One user commented, "It's due to the soapnut tree. During the first rains,

these flowers create a foamy substance when they come in contact with water. Risky for two-wheelers as it's slippery." Another user explained, "This happens when soapnut fruits (Shikakai) fall from trees and age showed roads covered in interact with rainwater and thick foam, with water pooling vehicle movement. "Chennai Techie Accuses Wife, Police of Harassment"

Prasanna Sankar, co-founder of the multi-billion dollar HR-tech startup Rippling, has accused his estranged wife, Dhivya, and the Chennai police of harassment amid a bitter divorce and custody battle over their nine-year-old son. In a series of posts on X, Sankar alleged that the police were attempting to extort ₹25 lakh from him while investigating a kidnapping complaint filed by his wife. He claimed that authorities were illegally tracking his phone, car, UPI transactions, and IP address despite no formal FIR against him. Fearing wrongful arrest, he said he was "on the run" with his son.

Sankar claimed that his wife had been having an affair, leading to their separation. He alleged that she was unhappy with the financial settlement during their divorce proceedings and, in response, filed false complaints against him, including allegations of

rape, and circulating her private videos. According to Sankar, the Singapore police investigated these claims and cleared him of all charges. He further accused Dhivya of "abducting" their son to the U.S., which forced him to file an international child abduction case. He stated that a U.S. court ruled in his favor, leading to a Memorandum of

Understanding (MoU) under child's passport in a shared which he had to pay his wife ₹9 crore and ₹4.3 lakh per month while sharing joint custody of their child.

According to Sankar, Dhivya later asked him to come to Chennai to continue their shared custody arrangement. However, conflicts escalated when she allegedly refused to comply with the MoU, particularly over depositing their



locker. She then declared the agreement invalid and threatened to return to the U.S. to file for divorce again. This led Sankar to approach the courts, stating he would only share custody if the passport was secured. Instead of attending court, he claimed, Dhivya visited his hotel late at night and attempted to lure their son to the lobby. When he intervened,

she called the police and filed a kidnapping complaint against him.

As police arrived at his residence, Sankar fled with his son, fearing an unfair arrest. He alleged that despite providing proof of his child's safety, the police continued to pursue him, even raiding his mother's house. He also claimed that authorities detained his friend, Gokul, who had helped

a warrant. According to Sankar, Gokul was held without an FIR and was being pressured to force Sankar's surrender. He further accused the police of seizing the phone of a caretaker he had paid ₹200 via UPI and raiding an Airbnb where he had stayed.

Sankar alleged that police and his wife were preparing a joint press conference to accuse him of multiple crimes. He stated that officers had asked his friend to sign a document discrediting his social media claims and that he was being blackmailed into deleting his posts. He further accused the police of demanding ₹25 lakh for Gokul's release, claiming they were targeting him because of his financial success. However, a top police official in Chennai denied these allegations, calling them "baseless."

Meanwhile, Dhivya countered Sankar's claims, alleging that he forcibly took their son and never returned him. She

Nehru's Obsession with RSS

Nehru's policies, driven by a desire to project an image of secularism and liberalism to secure minority votes and gain international recognition, often came at the expense of Hindu interests. In his quest to be seen as a champion of minority rights, he inadvertently marginalized the Hindu community, making them scapegoats for various socio-political issues. This approach fostered an environment where Hindu identity was often viewed with suspicion, leading to a growing sense of alienation among Hindus.



In contrast, many developed nations have historically placed a strong emphasis on citizenship and the rule of law as foundational elements of their democratic frameworks. These nations have built their political identities around the idea that citizenship entails not only rights but also responsibilities, and that the rule of law is essential for ensuring justice and equality for all individuals. This focus on citizenship has fostered a sense of belonging and accountability among citizens, reinforcing the idea that everyone, regardless of background, is entitled to equal treatment under the law.

India, however, presents a unique case. The Congress Party, under Nehru's leadership,

Rippling founder shares 'Heartbreaking' Legal **Disputes with Wife**

\$10-billion tech company Rippling, is embroiled in a highly publicized legal dispute with his wife, leading to a dramatic turn of events. Facing serious allegations including assault and rape, which he strongly denies, Prasanna claims he is fleeing Tamil Nadu to escape what he describes as police harassment and retaliation over a settlement dispute.

The conflict arose from Prasanna's divorce proceedings with his wife,

Dhivya. He alleges that after refusing to pay more than the agreed ₹9 crore settlement, she retaliated with fabricated accusations. The dispute intensified when Dhivya allegedly took their son to the United States without leading consent, Prasanna to file an international child abduction case. A US court reportedly

ruled in his favor, ordering the child's return to India.

Prasanna insists he has full custody rights under a Memorandum of Understanding and claims that his son was handed over to him voluntarily. However, he says his legal troubles escalated due to police pressure, forcing him into hiding.

Prasanna has detailed his ordeal in a series of posts on Twitter (now X), alleging police intimidation and unlawful detentions. He accused Chennai police of picking up his friend Gokul from Bengaluru without a warrant and holding him in custody to force him into removing his social media

"If I do not remove my Twitter posts, he'd be in trouble," Prasanna wrote,

Prasanna Sankar, co-founder of the highlighting what he sees as an abuse of power. He also claimed to be moving between cities with his 9-year-old son, evading authorities while seeking legal relief.

> Despite the severe allegations, Prasanna remains defiant. "I built an empire from nothing. I can handle this even if a state is on the other side. I'm a survivor, not a victim," he declared. He plans to file a court petition on March 24, seeking protection from police harassment.



Social Media Reactions

Prasanna's revelations have sparked widespread debate online. Many users sympathized with his situation, expressing frustration over alleged misuse of legal provisions.

"Read it once. Then twice. And somewhere between the words, I felt something break. A man. A husband. A father," wrote one user.

Another remarked, "This breaks my heart! The sad state of justice in our country hits harder when things like these happen closer to the neighborhood and to someone who has a lot." As the legal battle unfolds, the case has ignited discussions about **custody** rights, police actions, and the fairness of legal proceedings in domestic disputes.



Plea In Top Court Challenges 1991 Ruling On Immunity To Judges

A petition has been filed in the Supreme Court challenging the 1991 judgment in the K Veeraswami case, which grants immunity to judges from criminal proceedings without prior approval from the Chief Justice of India (CJI). The plea also seeks a directive to the Delhi Police to register an FIR over the alleged discovery of semi-burnt cash at the residence of Delhi High Court judge Yashwant Varma.

The alleged cash discovery followed a fire at Justice Varma's official residence in Lutyens' Delhi at 11:35 pm on March 14, prompting the fire department to respond and extinguish the blaze.

In response to the controversy, CJI Sanjiv Khanna withdrew judicial work from Justice Varma and formed a three-member in-house committee to conduct an inquiry. The Delhi High Court Chief Justice D K Upadhyaya was also directed not to assign judicial duties to Justice Varma until fur-

The petition, filed by advocate Mathews J Nedumpara and three others on March 23, argues that the immunity granted to judges violates the constitutional principle of equality before the law and undermines judicial accountability.

Court ruling, which stated that "no criminal case shall be registered against a High



Court or Supreme Court judge without prior permission from the CJI." The petitioners contend that this decision was made "per incuriam" (in ignorance of law) and "sub silentio" (without explicit legal consideration).

The plea demands the recognition of a cognizable offence in the alleged cash recovery case, urging the Delhi Police to register an FIR. It also seeks a declaration that the in-house inquiry committee lacks ju-The plea challenges the 1991 Supreme risdiction to investigate the incident and calls for the prohibition of external interference in law enforcement duties related

to the case. Additionally, it advocates for the implementation of the Judicial Standards and Accountability Bill, 2010, which aimed to curb judicial corruption but lapsed.

The plea asserts that "equality before law is a fundamental principle of the Constitution" and that the judiciary should not be treated as a special class immune from penal laws. It also questions why, despite the alleged cash recovery, no FIR has been filed against Justice Varma so far.

The Supreme Court is expected to take up the matter for consideration soon.

Sanitation Worker Finds Burnt Rs 500 Notes

Outside Justice Yashwant Varma's House

In a new twist to the 'cash at judge's home' controversy, a sanitation worker discovered burnt ₹500 currency notes while sweeping outside Justice Yashwant Varma's residence at 30, Tughlak Road in central Delhi on Sunday.

The incident caused a minor stir in the high-security area, which is close to the Tughlak Road police station. The sanitation worker, employed by the NDMC, clicked photos of the burnt notes and informed his seniors, who then alerted the police.

This discovery seemingly supports the police's claim that currency notes were burnt in a fire that broke out on Holi night (March 14) in an outhouse of Justice Varma's official residence. However, Justice Varma has strongly denied any presence of cash on his premises, calling the entire episode a conspiracy to malign him. The controversy has led to Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna ordering a probe and directing the Delhi High Court Chief Justice not to assign any judicial work to Justice Varma until the investigation is completed.

On Friday, Chief Justice Khanna constituted a three-member committee to probe the allegations against Justice Varma. The committee has not been given a fixed deadline, and further

action will be decided based on its findings once the report is submitted.

MPs' Salaries Hiked To Rs 1.24 Lakh Per Month; Allowances, Pensions Also Raised

The Union government has increased the salaries, allowances, and pensions of Members of Parliament (MPs), with the revised pay structure coming into effect from April 1, 2023. The Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs issued a gazette notification announcing the revision, marking

the first major salary hike since 2018. According to the notification, the monthly salary of Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha MPs has been increased from ₹1 lakh to ₹1.24 lakh. The daily allowance provided to MPs during parliamentary sessions has also been revised, rising from ₹2,000 to ₹2,500. Additionally, the pension for former MPs has been raised from ₹25,000 to ₹31,000

per month. The additional pension for every year of service beyond five years has been increased from ₹2,000 to ₹2,500 per

The allowances covering constituency and office expenses are also set to rise. As per the 2018 revision, MPs received ₹70,000 per month as a constituency allowance and ₹60,000 per month as an office allowance. These figures will now see an upward revision, though exact details are yet to be disclosed.

Apart from salaries and pensions, MPs continue to enjoy several benefits, including 34 free domestic flights annually for themselves and their families, first-class train travel, and a mileage allowance for road travel. They are also entitled to 50,000 free electricity units and 4,000 kilolitres of water annually.

MPs receive rent-free housing in New Delhi for the duration of their tenure, with hostel rooms, apartments, or bungalows allocated based on seniority. Those opting out of official accommodation are eligible for a monthly housing allowance.

The latest revision comes amid the ongoing budget session of Parliament and is aimed at adjusting MPs' compensation in line with inflation and rising living costs.

"Elitists Hired As Paid Agents To Divert Attention"

- Shiv Sena MP On Kunal Kamra Row

Shiv Sena MP Milind Deora on Monday slammed comedian Kunal Kamra, accusing him of being a "paid agent" used to divert public attention from critical issues like the Disha Salian case. His remarks come after Kamra mocked Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Eknath Shinde in his show, leading to an angry backlash from Shiv Sena workers.

Deora alleged that political elites have hired classist elitists like Kamra to serve their interests. "I can say this clearly—those who are entitled monarchists in Indian politics have, in a way, hired classist elitist people to do their work, to protect them, and to distract from the Disha Salian case," he said, referring to the death of celebrity manager Disha Salian, which has been a subject of controversy. He also pointed out that Salian's father had filed a petition, suggesting that Kamra's act was a diversion tactic.

While acknowledging the role of comedy in democracy, Deora emphasized the difference between humor and elitism. He criticized Kamra for mocking a leader from a humble background, stating, "We take pride in the fact that the Deputy Chief Minister of India's second-largest state was once an auto-rickshaw driver. We take pride that the Prime Minister of the world's largest democracy was once a tea seller. But the language Kamra used exposes him as a paid agent."

Deora also took aim at Congress for defending Kamra's right to free speech, questioning their selective outrage. "What did the Chief Minister of Telangana say recently? He said journalists should be stripped and beaten publicly. Did Congress react to that? When Aditya Thackeray's father was CM, what did he do for Kangana Ranaut's safety when she was just a Bollywood actress, not an MP? They demolished Kangana's office. Such people have no right to speak about democracy and the Constitution." Earlier, Shiv Sena workers stormed Mumbai's Habitat Studio, where Kamra was performing, and vandalized the venue. The

police later summoned them for questioning. During his show, Kamra had taken a dig at Shinde, using a modified version of a song from 'Dil To Pagal Hai', saying, "Meri nazar se tum dekho toh, gaddar nazar wo aaye. Haaye." The remark, referring to Shinde's 2022 rebellion that led to the split of Shiv Sena, drew laughter from the audience and was later shared by Kamra on social media platform X.

Hindi Was Compulsory 3rd Language **During Congress Rule**

Protests Escalate Following Mayor's Arrest

Turkey is witnessing one of the most significant outbursts of public unrest in over a decade, triggered by the controversial arrest of Istanbul's mayor, Ekrem Imamoglu. The protests, which began on Wednesday following his detention, have spread rapidly across the country, despite government-imposed bans on public gatherings. Imamoglu, a key figure in Turkey's opposition movement, was arrested during a pre-dawn raid by hundreds of police officers, leading to widespread condemnation from his supporters and opposition parties.

In a passionate speech to the crowds gathered outside Istanbul's City Hall, Imamoglu's wife, Dilek Kaya Imamoglu, declared, "He will defeat you! You will lose!" She described the injustice faced by her husband as symbolic of the struggles many ordinary citizens face under the current government. Her words resonated deeply with the protesters, with many expressing that Imamoglu's plight echoed their own frustrations with the state of democracy and governance in Turkey.

The opposition Republican People's Party (CHP) has labeled Imamoglu's arrest a "political coup," arguing that the charges against him were fabricated to eliminate a strong challenger to President Recep Tayyip Erdogan in the upcoming 2028 elections. Imamoglu, who became the mayor of Istanbul in 2019 and was re-elected in 2024, is considered one of the most prominent figures capable of challenging Erdogan's long-standing rule.





Allegations and Charges Against Imamoglu

Imamoglu is facing serious charges including corruption, bribery, and links to terrorism due to his political dealings with a pro-Kurdish party. The Turkish authorities claim that he was involved in creating a criminal organization, rigging tenders, and accepting bribes. Pakistan: Islamabad High Court restores biweekly meetings for Imran Khan in Adiala Jail

Allowed to meet family, lawyers, and friends biweekly, but visitors are prohibited

In a significant ruling on Monday, the Islamabad High Court (IHC) restored biweekly meetings for former Prime Minister Imran Khan, who has been incarcerated in Adiala Jail since August 2023. However, the court imposed strict conditions, particularly prohibiting visitors from making political statements following their meetings with Khan.

According to the court's order, Imran Khan will be allowed to meet his family and legal team on Tuesdays, while friends can visit him on Thursdays. Only those individuals authorized by his coordinator, lawyer Salman Akram Raja, will be permitted to meet the PTI leader.

During the hearing, IHC's Acting Chief Justice Sarfaraz Dogar raised concerns over the use of jail meetings for political purposes. He specifically mentioned that visitors should "meet and leave" without engaging in any political discourse. Additionally, the court emphasized that speaking to the media after these meetings would be unnecessary and should be avoided. Visitors were instructed to sign an undertaking agreeing not to make any public statements related to the meetings.

The decision came after the jail authorities defended the consolidation of Khan's meetings into a single day due to security concerns. They had previously cited the risks involved in allowing sep-

arate meetings on different days. However, the court rejected this argument, reaffirming a prior ruling that allowed biweekly meetings.

Imran Khan's legal team, led by his lawyer Zaheer Abbas, argued that their client's scheduled meetings were being arbitrarily denied. For instance, they claimed that a scheduled meeting on March 20 was not allowed despite repeated requests.

Justice Dogar also directed Imran Khan's legal team to approach the trial court separately if they sought permission for his children to visit him. This decision comes as Khan continues to face multiple legal challenges, with his conviction in corruption cases transforming his status from under-trial to convicted prisoner, which has affected his privileges in prison.

The court's ruling marks a minor relief for the PTI leader and his supporters. However, the prohibition on political statements during meetings indicates that the judiciary intends to prevent jail visits from being used as a platform for political messaging. Any violations of this new rule, particularly regarding media engagements, could result in further legal actions, according to reports from The Express Tribune.

This ruling has been interpreted as a balancing act, allowing Khan's supporters to meet with him but curbing the political messaging that has surrounded his imprisonment.



South Korean Court Dismisses PM Han Duck-soo's Impeachment Over Martial Law

Minister Choi Sang-mok assumed acting president role during the court's review.

South Korea's Constitutional Court ruled on Monday to strike down the impeachment of Prime Minister Han Duck-soo, reinstating him to his position as acting president. This decision followed Han's brief tenure as acting president after the suspension of President Yoon Suk Yeol last year due to his declaration of martial law. Han had been impeached by lawmakers in December, just weeks after stepping into the leadership role in the wake of Yoon's suspension.

The impeachment motion against Han was dismissed with a 7-1 vote by the court's eight justices, with two justices voting to reject the motion entirely. The impeachment, which led to Han's suspension, was primarily based on allegations of his role in the martial law incident, as well as his refusal to appoint three more justices to the Constitutional Court, a demand from the opposition-led parliament.

Han's brief time as acting president began after President Yoon's suspension on December 3, 2024, following his controversial declaration of martial law. The martial law, which lasted only six hours after a strong parliamentary vote to reject it, caused widespread political upheaval. It raised alarms both domestically and internationally, as allies like the United States expressed concern over Yoon's ability to lead in the wake of the crisis. During the turmoil, Han was seen as a stabilizing figure with his extensive political experience, having served in various leadership roles for over three decades under five different presidents.

Despite his long career and reputation for bridging partisan divides, Han became embroiled in the political conflict when he was accused of not doing enough to oppose the martial law decision. This led the opposition-dominated parliament to impeach him in late December. During the impeachment hearings, Han denied any involvement in the martial law declaration and called for the impeachment to be dismissed.

In the meantime, Finance Minister Choi Sang-mok temporarily took over as acting president while the Constitutional Court deliberated on the cases of both President Yoon and Prime Minister Han. Han's reinstatement marks the latest twist in the political crisis that has gripped South Korea since the martial law declaration and the subsequent suspensions of its top leaders.

US Gold Card Scheme A Hit?

Trump's 'Gold Card' Scheme Sees Promising Start with 1,000 Sold in a Single Day

Donald Trump's newly launched 'Gold Card' or 'Golden Visa' program, which offers permanent residency and optional citizenship in the United States for a hefty price of \$5 million per card, is reportedly off to a strong start. According to US Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick, the program has already gained significant traction, with 1,000 Gold Cards sold in a single day.

Speaking on the 'All-In Podcast,' Lutnick shared that the program would officially roll out in about two weeks, adding that tech mogul Elon Musk is currently working on the software needed for the initiative. Lutnick's revelation about the rapid



sales of Gold Cards paints a picture of high demand for this exclusive opportunity to secure permanent residency in the US. The Gold Card grants individuals permanent residency in the United States without the obligation to pay global taxes, a key feature of the program. Lutnick explained that while the cardholders will not be forced to become US citizens, they will have the right to live in the country indefinitely. This arrangement is appealing to foreign nationals, particularly those from countries with high global tax rates, as the Gold Card holders will only be taxed on income earned within the US.

Lutnick elaborated on the potential benefits for wealthy individuals, citing an example where someone might purchase multiple Gold Cards for their family, ensuring access to the US in times of crisis or instability. "It's a safety net," Lutnick said, emphasizing the freedom and security the card offers. Research by the Trump Administration reportedly shows that around 37 million people worldwide could afford to buy the Gold Card. With the potential for large-scale sales, President Trump has expressed confidence in selling up to a million cards. The funds raised from this program will be used to address the US fiscal deficit and national debt. The Gold Card scheme has no annual cap on issuance, meaning it could generate substantial revenue. If the trend continues, with \$5 billion in sales just 24 hours into the program, it looks set to be a highly profitable venture for both investors and the US government.

Unified Pension Scheme Notified for Govt Employees

The Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority (PFRDA) has officially notified the Unified Pension Scheme (UPS) for central and state government employees, marking a significant shift in the pension structure. This new scheme will come into effect from April 1, 2025, ensuring a structured and assured pension for eligible em-

The UPS aims to provide a guaranteed pension of 50% of the average basic pay drawn over the last 12 months before retirement. This approach ensures stability in post-retirement earnings for government employees. The scheme was approved by the Union Cabinet led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on August 24, 2024, as an improvement over the existing National Pension Scheme (NPS), which is primarily linked to market returns.

Eligibility Criteria

The scheme is applicable to central government employees who are currently un- mainly in government securities.

der NPS as of April 1, 2025, allowing them the option to switch to UPS. Additionally, newly recruited employees on or after April 1, 2025, will automatically enrolled under this scheme. Around 23 lakh central government employees are eligible to choose between NPS and UPS, depending on their preference for pension security.

Employees can access the enrollment and claim forms online from April 1, 2025, through the official website of Protean CRA at https://npscra.nsdl.co.in. For those preferring an offline process, physical form submissions will also be accepted, as per the notification.

Key Features of UPS

The Unified Pension Scheme ensures an assured pension of 50% of the average of the last 12 months' basic pay before superannuation. To qualify for the full pension benefits, an employee must complete a minimum of 25 years of service. Unlike the old pension system, UPS requires employees to contribute 10% of their basic salary and dearness allowance (DA), while the government will contribute 18.5% toward their pension fund. The final pension payout under this scheme will be partially influenced by market-linked investments,

"Vast Underground City" Discovered Under **Egyptian Pyramids, Claim Scientists**



Acontroversial new study has claimed the discovery of a underground city" beneath Egypt's iconic pyramids. Using advanced radar technology, researchers led by Filippo Biondi of the University of Strathclyde and Corrado Malanga of the University of Pisa

believe they have uncovered hidden structures beneath the Giza Plateau.

The scientists, working on what they call the "Khafre Project," assert that their radar scans detected eight vertical cylinder-shaped artefacts stretching over 2,100 feet beneath the pyr-

amids. Additionally, they claim to have identified various unidentified structures at a depth of 4,000

The team suggests that their findings may be linked to the legendary "Halls of Amenti," a mythical chamber thought to contain ancient records beneath

the Great Sphinx and the pyramids. The study claims to have found five small, room-like structures inside one of the pyrchallenging previous archaeological assumptions about burial sites.

Experts Dismiss Findings as "Fake News" Leading Egyptologists he did acknowledge have strongly denied that smaller ancient these claims, calling them unverified and misleading. Zahi Hawass, Egypt's former Minister of Antiquities, dismissed the research, stating that the methods used were "neither scientifically approved nor validated." He emphasized that decades of studies using advanced techniques like gravimetry and muon tomography found no evidence of

such massive subterranean structures. Radar specialist Pro-

fessor Lawrence Conyers also labeled the findings "a huge exaggeration," arguing that no existing radar technology could produce images from thousands of feet underground. However, structures or ceremonial chambers might have been built under pyramids, similar to Mesoamerican traditions.

the bold Despite claims, the findings have yet to undergo peer review or independent verification. Egypt's Supreme Council of Antiquities has not commented on whether further investigations will be conducted.






