

PM Modi to Visit Rameswaram Temple and Inaugurate Pamban Bridge Amid AIADMK Alliance Talks

AIADMK-BJP alliance talks intensify ahead of Tamil Nadu Assembly elections

Historic temple visit highlights Modi's emphasis on Hindu heritage.


First vertical lift railway bridge in India enhances maritime navigation.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi is set to visit Tamil Nadu on April 6, coinciding with the Ram Navami celebrations, to pay tribute at the Ramanathaswamy temple in Rameswaram and inaugurate the new Pamban Bridge. His visit comes amidst growing speculation about the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) finalizing a coalition with the Opposition All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (AIADMK) ahead of the upcoming Tamil Nadu Assembly elections.

The visit, which blends pilgrimage and infrastructure development, follows a series of high-profile meetings between AIADMK chief E. Palaniswami and BJP leaders, including Union Home Minister Amit Shah and BJP President J.P. Nadda. This has sparked discussions about the possibility of a renewed alliance between the AIADMK and BJP, which had previously fractured before the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. Key issues, including tensions between Palaniswami and Tamil Nadu BJP chief K. Annamalai, are expected to be resolved before formalizing any coalition.

The timing of Modi's visit to the Ramanathaswamy temple is particularly significant. The temple is associated with the Ramayana, and its Shiva linga is believed to have been installed by Lord Rama. Modi's previous visit to the temple in January 2024, just before the consecration of the Ram Mandir in Ayodhya, was deeply emotional



On the infrastructure front, Modi will also inaugurate the New Pamban Bridge, India's first vertical lift railway sea bridge. This new bridge will connect Rameswaram, a sacred island, to the mainland. The previous Pamban Bridge, which had suffered erosion and was unable to meet modern

The New Pamban Bridge is designed for long-term durability, with enhanced clearance for larger vessels and a lifespan of up to 58 years, marking a significant step in both heritage preservation and modern infrastructure development.



The US Senate has confirmed Dr. Jay Bhattacharya, an Indian-American professor of health policy at Stanford University, as the new Director of the National Institutes of Health (NIH). He was confirmed with a 53-47 vote in the 119th Congress' first

Bhattacharya, a health economist, was nominated by former US President Donald Trump in November. He is expected to work alongside US Health and Human Services Secretary Robert F. Kennedy Jr. to reshape the NIH and restore it as a "gold standard" institution for medical research.

A prominent researcher, Bhattacharya co-authored the 'Great Barrington Declaration' in 2020, which opposed strict lockdowns and advocated for focused protection strategies during the COVID-19 pandemic. He has an extensive background in health policy, biomedical innovation, and the economic impact of government health programs. During his confirmation hearing, Bhattacharya assured that he had no immediate plans to cut additional NIH staff, although he acknowledged that the decision might not be solely his. His appointment comes after the NIH implemented significant workforce reductions, freezing grant activities and capping research funding for universities. US Senator Mitch McConnell from Kentucky congratulated Bhattacharya, stating that his leadership would bring stability and expertise to the NIH.

Maternity scheme severely underfunded: Sonia Gandhi in RS

Calls out govt for dilution of maternity benefits



TPN Correspondent | New Delhi Congress leader Sonia Gandhi accused the Narendra Modi-led government of severely underfunding the maternity entitlements under the National Food Security Act (NFSA) of 2013. Speaking during Zero Hour in the Rajya Sabha, she questioned why the number of beneficiaries for maternity schemes, particularly the Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY), had drastically fallen.

Sonia highlighted that the NFSA,

passed in 2013 under then Prime Minister Manmohan Singh's leadership, includes a maternity entitlement of Rs 6,000 per child for pregnant women in the informal sector. The PMMVY, which was launched in 2017, seeks to fulfill this entitlement, but it provides only Rs 5,000 for the first child and an extension for the second child if it is a girl.



Delhi HC Issues Notice to PWD Minister Parvesh Verma Over Election Plea

Next hearing on May 27 with ECI and candidates expected to respond.

The Delhi High Court on Wednesday issued a notice to Public Works Department (PWD) Minister Parvesh Verma in response to a plea challenging his election from the New Delhi constituency in the 2025 Delhi Assembly elections.

Justice Jasmeet Singh directed the Election Commission of India (ECI) and 23 other candidates, including Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and Congress

leader Sandeep Dikshit, to respond to the petition. The plea, filed by Vishvanath Agarwal, claims that he was not allowed to file his nomination and participate in the election process despite being present at the returning officer's office with the required documents before the 3 p.m. deadline on January 17.

The petitioner contends that this denial

of the nomination submission affected his ability to contest the election, and he has sought a direction to declare the election result for the New Delhi constituency null and void. Agarwal has further requested that the ECI be instructed to conduct fresh elections for the seat.

In the 2025 Delhi Assembly elections, Parvesh Verma of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) secured 30,088 votes, defeating his closest rival, AAP's Arvind Kejriwal, by a margin of 4,089 votes.

Sandeep Dikshit also contested from the same constituency.

The Delhi Assembly elections were held on February 5, and the results were declared on February 8. The court has listed the matter for further hearing on May 27, and the Election Commission, represented by advocate Ankit Agarwal, is expected to respond to the plea during the next hearing.







Jaishankar and US Chamber of **Commerce President Discuss Strengthening India-US Trade**

- India-US Bilateral Trade Agreement (BTA) talks progressing.

India's External Affairs Minister, S. Jaishankar, met with US Chamber of Commerce President and CEO Suzanne Clark in New Delhi on Wednesday to discuss enhancing bilateral trade, investment opportunities, building resilient supply chains, and fortifying the strategic partnership between the two countries.

Jaishankar shared his thoughts on the meeting through a post on X, stating, "Glad to meet President & CEO @USChamber @SuzanneUS-CC today. A useful exchange on deepening trade and investments, building resilient supply chains, and strengthening India-US strategic partnership."

Earlier in March, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) highlighted the progress made in India-US bilateral trade negotiations. The two countries are working on advancing trade, improving market access, and reducing barriers in both tariffs and non-tariff areas. The goal is to create a Bilateral Trade Agreement al supply chain.

(BTA) that covers multiple sectors, benefiting both nations.

MEAs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal mentioned that Union Minister of Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal, had visited the US from March 3-7. During this visit, Goyal met with US Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick and US Trade Representative Jamieson Greer to further the discussions on the BTA.

Jaiswal said, "India and the US are actively working to build a framework for the BTA, which aims to expand trade, enhance market access, reduce tariff and non-tariff barriers, and integrate supply chains more deeply."

This effort to advance bilateral trade negotiations is also tied to the vision set forth by US President Donald Trump and Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The two leaders aim to finalize the first phase of the BTA by the fall of 2025, marking a key milestone in the growing economic and strategic ties between India and the US.

The ongoing negotiations reflect both countries' commitment to strengthening their partnership, enhancing economic cooperation, and fostering a more resilient glob-

Sambhal violence: SIT serves SP MP Barq notice at Delhi residence

The Special Investigation Team (SIT) investigating the Sambhal violence case served a notice to Samajwadi Party MP Ziaur Rehman Barq at his residence in Delhi on Tuesday. This came after the team was unable to find anyone at his house in Sambhal earlier that day. According to officials, Barq has been asked to join the probe on April 8, and he confirmed his willingness to cooperate in the investigation.

"I have received the notice. Since I am an MP and a citizen of this country, I will cooperate in the investigation. I have been called on April 8, and I will go," Barq told PTI over the phone. However, he dismissed the allegations against him as "baseless," expressing his trust in the law, Constitution, and judi-

Earlier on Tuesday, after failing to locate Barq at his Sambhal residence, Superintendent of Police Krishan Kumar Bishnoi stated that the SIT would travel to Delhi to serve the notice personally, asking

This development comes two days after Zafar Ali, the president of the Shahi Jama Masjid Management Committee, was arrested in connection with the violence during a protest on November 24, 2024. The protest was against

Nitin Gadkari, the Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways, announced ambitious plans for India's road infrastructure, stating that within two years, India's highway network will surpass that of the United States in terms of quality and efficiency. Speaking at the Times Drive Auto Summit and Awards 2025, Gadkari expressed confidence that the changes underway in the road sector would be transformative.

"I don't think there is any problem in the road sector. The changes this year and next year will be so significant that earlier I used to say our highway even better than the US," he stated.

The Minister highlighted that India's road sector is evolving rapidly, with major improvements in road quality and infrastructure. He also point-



road network would match that of ed out the economic impact of road the US, but now I say that within two accidents, revealing that India loses years, our highway network will be approximately 3% of its GDP annually due to road accidents. This underscores the importance of improving road safety and infrastructure.

States in electric vehicle (EV) adoption and manufacturing within the next five years, noting significant progress in this sector. He also mentioned that transportation between major cities like Delhi, Dehradun, Jaipur, and Bengaluru would become much faster due to these infrastructure advancements.

When asked about Tesla's potential entry into India, Gadkari welcomed competition, saying the market is open for all manufacturers. He expressed optimism that Indian car manufacturers will focus on quality over cost, ensuring competitive pricing for consumers.

The Union Minister also reiterated his commitment to reducing logistics costs in the country, with a target to bring it down to single-digit percentages from the current 14-16%. He revealed a goal to build 60 kilometers of road network daily, further contributing to India's growing infrastructure and economic competitiveness.

Justice Yashwant Varma 'cash haul': SC refuses urgent mentioning of plea seeking FIR

Supreme Court on Wednesday rejected an urgent plea for an immediate hearing regarding a petition demanding Delhi Police to file a complaint and investigate the discovery of burnt bundles of cash at the residence of Delhi High Court Judge Justice Yashwant Varma earlier this month. The petitioners, raising concerns over the delay in filing an FIR, argued that it hinted at a potential cover-up.

A bench headed by Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna told advocate Mathews J Nedumpara,

one of the petitioners, not to make "public statements" and stated that the matter would be listed in due course. The petitioners had raised alarm over the lack of immediate action when Delhi firefighters were called on Holi to extinguish a fire in an outhouse on the grounds of Justice Varma's bungalow. During the fire, the burnt piles of cash were discovered.

The petitioners questioned why the cash was not seized, no recovery document prepared, and why criminal law wasn't applied immediately. They also



expressed concerns over the delay in the public becoming aware of the incident, which they claimed suggested an attempt to cover it up. They further questioned why Justice Varma, who has distanced himself from the money, did not file an FIR.

The petitioners referred to the discovery as "open-and-shut," alleging that the cash was black money accumulated from corrupt judicial practices. They also raised doubts about Justice Varma's version of events and the overall handling of the case. Additionally, the petitioners challenged the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court's in-house inquiry committee, questioning the 1991 ruling that requires consultation with the Chief Justice of India before registering a case against high court judges.

The incident has sparked wider discussions on judicial transparency, with political parties and the union government now weighing in. Last week, the Supreme Court transferred Justice Varma to the Allahabad High Court, a move initially linked to the cash recovery, though later de-linked.

Nitish Kumar's Leadership in Bihar: A Delicate **Balance for BJP Ahead of Elections**

Why BJP needs a limping Nitish Kumar as crutch in Bihar

Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar has been under scrutiny in recent months, with several slip-ups, health concerns, and his controversial political moves raising questions about his future as the state's leader. Despite these issues, Kumar remains a key figure for the ruling BJP-led NDA alliance, particularly as the Bihar Assembly elections loom closer.

Nitish Kumar's recent actions, including laughing during the national anthem and his awkward attempts to touch the feet of attendees, have drawn criticism, especially from political rivals like the RJD and Prashant Kishor's Jan Suraj. Despite such incidents, Nitish Kumar is adamant about leading the state, with his son Nishant Kumar pushing for his continuation as CM. The BJP, while hesitant to name him as the official CM candidate, remains reliant on the 74-yearold leader, given his significant role in Bihar's electoral landscape.

Kumar's JD(U) party, though holding a smaller share of seats in the Bihar Assembly, has been an asset to any coalition it joins, particularly due to his social engineering skills and appeal among Bihar's

AIADMK General Secretary and former Tamil Nadu Chief Minister Edappadi K Palaniswami met Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday, fueling speculation that his party might revive its alliance with the BJP ahead of the upcoming Tamil Nadu Assembly elections. The meeting comes after a period of tension between the two parties following the AIADMK's decision to sever ties with the BJP in September 2023.

The AIADMK, which is currently the main opposition party in Tamil Nadu, had cut its ties with the BJP in the lead-up to the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. This decision followed growing disagreements with the state leadership of the BJP, particularly with Tamil Nadu BJP chief K Annamalai's confrontational approach. The situation escalated when senior ble.

ident J P Nadda in New Delhi and presented their concerns, including calling for an apology from Annamalai for his controversial remarks about Dravidian leader C N Annadurai or his potential removal.

In the months following the split, Annamalai's criticism of the AIADMK appeared to soften, leading to speculation about a potential rapprochement between the two parties. If the AIADMK and BJP were to reconcile, they could form a formidable opposition to the ruling DMK-led INDIA alliance in the state, which currently dominates Tamil Nadu politics.

The AIADMK has seen a decline in its vote share in recent years, and a renewed alliance with the BJP might provide the party with the necessary boost to regain its political footing. While the future of the AIAD-MK-BJP relationship remains uncertain, Tuesday's meeting suggests that discussions around a potential partnership are still very much on the ta-

Communist parties will enter 21st century, but it may only be in 22nd: Tharoor's swipe at LDF

Congress leader Shashi Tharoor took a sharp dig at Kerala's Left Democratic Front of technological progress. (LDF) government, criticizing the delay in embracing progressive changes. Tharoor's remarks came after the Kerala Assembly passed the Kerala State Private Universities (Establishment and Regulation) Bill, 2025, marking a significant shift from the CPI(M)-led government's traditional opposition to the privatization of education.

In a scathing comment, Tharoor said, "So Kerala's LDF government has finally done the right thing, by permitting private universities to open in the state. As usual, the decision comes about 15 to 20 years late, which is usually the case with those anchored in a 19th-century ideology." He

further pointed out the historical reluctance of Communist parties to accept technological advancements, recalling incidents from India's early years

Tharoor took to X (formerly Twitter) to add, "Never forget that when computers first came to India, Communist goons entered public sector offices to smash them." He also mentioned how Communist parties were among the strongest opponents of mobile phones when they were introduced in India, highlighting the delayed acceptance of technological and social changes



by the Left parties.

"The only parties to object to the introduction of mobile telephones in India were also the communist ones," Tharoor continued. He emphasized that it took the Communist parties years to realize that such advancements benefited the common people, whom they claimed to represent.

Tharoor's comments reflect his ongoing criticism of the LDF government's policies and their delayed adaptation to modernization. The Kerala State Private Universities Bill, 2025, is seen as a move toward privatizing higher education in the state, a shift that has been met with mixed reactions. While some see it as a step toward progress, others view it as a departure from Kerala's historically strong public education system.

Delhi HC issues notice in plea challenging Atishi's assembly election win

The Delhi High Court on Wednesday issued a notice in a petition challenging Atishi's election as the Member of the Legislative Assembly (MLA) from Kalkaji, accusing the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leader of engaging in "corrupt practices" and misusing her position as the Chief Minister for electoral advantage. The plea, filed by Kalkaji voters Kamaljit Singh Duggal and Ayush Rana, alleges that Atishi violated the Representation of the People Act and the Model Code of Conduct during the February 2025 elections.

Atishi had won the Kalkaji seat by more than 3,500 votes, defeating Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) candidate Ramesh Bidhuri, despite AAP's defeat in other parts of Delhi and the loss of top leaders, including Arvind Kejriwal and Manish Sisodia. A bench of Justice Jyoti Singh directed the Election Commission of India (ECI) and Delhi Police to respond to the petition and preserve all related records. The next hearing is



scheduled for July 30.

The petitioners accused Atishi of exploiting public resources, alleging that she used official vehicles and sought assistance from government officials to boost her campaign. They also claimed that Atishi's associates, working within the Delhi Chief Minister's office, bought votes on her behalf and published fake videos that falsely accused BJP candidate Bidhuri of involvement in hooliganism. Furthermore, the petition alleged that AAP workers, with Atishi's consent, arranged free transportation for voters to and from polling stations.

Additionally, the petition pointed out that Atishi failed to disclose certain criminal cases in her election affidavit. The petitioners have requested the court to declare her election as null and void due to these alleged irregularities.

While lawyers for the ECI and Delhi Police objected to being named in the petition, the court allowed them to file a response. It also granted them the opportunity to challenge the petition during the upcoming hearing.

"I'm Stopped From Speaking," Rahul Gandhi Hits Out At Lok Sabha Speaker

Accuses Speaker Om Birla of Stifling Opposition's Voice in LS

Leader of the Opposition, Rahul Gandhi, has sharply criticized Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla for allegedly preventing him from speaking in the House, calling it an undemocratic practice. Gandhi expressed his frustration with the Speaker's actions after being repeatedly denied an opportunity to address the House. Speaking to the media, the Congress leader said, "I don't know what is going on. I requested him to let me speak, but he just ran away. This is no way to run the House. The Speaker didn't let me speak and then adjourned the House without any

from Rae Bareli, pointed out that it is a well-established convention for the Leader of the Opposition to be given a chance to address the House. "Whenever I stand up, I am not allowed to speak. I did nothing. I was sitting quietly and I haven't been allowed to speak for 7-8 days. This is a new tactic. There is no place for Opposition," he added. He mentioned that even when Prime Minister Narendra Modi discussed the Kumbh Mela, he was not permitted to raise issues like unemployment or provide his perspective on the matter.

The Speaker had earlier adjourned the House and remarked that all members must maintain decorum. "Several instances have come to my notice where Gandhi, the Member of Parliament the conduct of members has not met

the high standards of this House. I expect the Leader of the Opposition to adhere to Rule 349, which governs conduct within the House," Birla said, alluding to the need for decorum.

This incident follows a recent uproar during Prime Minister Modi's address on the Maha Kumbh, where opposition members protested over the tragic stampede in Prayagraj. Gandhi had wanted to acknowledge the Kumbh as part of India's cultural heritage but also sought recognition of the lives lost in the tragedy. He further emphasized that, according to democratic principles, the Leader of the Opposition should always be given a chance to





CM Rekha Gupta Stops Her Convoy to Address Stray Cattle on Delhi Flyover

Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta's convoy was forced to make an emergency stop on the Haiderpur flyover this morning when a group of stray cattle blocked the road. Upon seeing the animals, the CM immediately got out of her car and instructed officials to find a shelter for the cows.

According to an eyewitness, a major accident was narrowly avoided when the driver of the convoy applied the brakes just in time after spotting the stray cattle on the flyover. A video released by the Chief Minister's office showed her taking a moment to inquire about the welfare of the animals on the flyover. She spent approximately 15 minutes waiting for the cows to move so her convoy could pass.

Following the incident, Chief Minister Gupta directed officials to take immediate action to prevent stray cattle from wandering onto roads and flyovers. She emphasized the importance of arranging proper shelters for the animals to ensure their safety and minimize such disruptions in the future.

The incident took place as the CM was touring various parts of Delhi, just a day after presenting the city's record ₹1 lakh crore budget. During her tour, she also took the opportunity to listen to public grievances from different constituencies.

While inspecting metro pillars during her visit, Gupta noticed several posters and hoardings hanging from them. She immediately raised concerns about the practice and ordered officials to remove the banners. Gupta emphasized that such acts not only spoil the city's aesthetic appeal but also undermine efforts to maintain a clean and beautiful urban landscape. She stated that actions like these should be discouraged and penalized.

The CM's proactive approach to addressing both the issue of stray cattle and the problem of illegal hoardings reflects her commitment to improving the city's infrastructure and maintaining order in public spaces.

Delhi weather: City sees 'hottest day' of 2025, As Temperatures Soar to 37.1°C

Delhi experienced its hottest day of the season on Tuesday, March 25, with temperatures reaching 37.1°C, according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD). This was 1.1°C above the usual seasonal average. The monitoring station at Ridge recorded an even higher temperature of 38.7°C, which was 4.9°C above normal, marking an intense heat spike in the capHumidity levels during the day fluctuated between 22% and 59%, while the minimum temperature was recorded at 16°C. The IMD had previously forecast clear skies for the day, with the temperature soaring to 37°C. Despite the heat, the minimum temperature was relatively moderate, settling at 16°C.

On Wednesday, March 26, Delhi recorded a minimum temperature of 17.7°C, slightly above the season's average by 0.4°C. The maximum temperature was expected to rise further, with predictions indicating a high of 38-39°C. The minimum temperature for the day was expected to settle around 18°C. According to the IMD, there was no significant change in temperature from the previous day, with maximum temperatures ranging from 36°C to 39°C, and minimum temperatures between 17°C

and 20°C. These temperatures are notably higher than normal, with minimum temperatures exceeding the usual range by 1-3°C and maximum temperatures soaring 4-7°C above the seasonal average.

In terms of air quality, Delhi remained in the "poor" category on Tuesday, with an Air Quality Index (AQI) reading of 234 at 4 pm. However, the Central Pollution Control Board indicated that air quality could improve, with the AQI likely shifting to the "moderate" category starting Wednesday, a trend that is expected to continue for the next two days.

As the city continues to experience intense heat and pollution, residents are advised to stay hydrated and take necessary precautions to protect themselves from the harsh weather conditions.

50K additional CCTVs to be installed in Delhi

Govt Unveils New Measures to Strengthen Women's Safety and Mobility

In a bid to enhance women's ly formed Delhi Government has announced the installation of 50,000 additional CCTV cameras across the city, which will supplement the existing 2.8 lakh cameras already operational. Chief Minister Rekha Gupta made this announcement during the presentation of the Budget on Tuesday, emphasizing the importance of security, especially for women.

"Keeping in view the security needs, especially for women, it is proposed to install 50,000 new cameras in Delhi," CM Gupta stated, underlining the government's commitment to improving safety measures. Despite the extensive CCTV infrastructure already in place, many women, including students and working professionals, still feel unsafe, particularly during late-night commutes. A past field report by The Tribune highlighted that the presence of surveillance cameras has not ful-

Alongside the CCTV expansion, another key initiative introduced by the government is the launch of travel cards for women, set to replace the current pink ticket system that offers free bus rides. CM Gupta explained that this move aims to reduce corruption and bring greater transparency to the free travel scheme for women.

These announcements reflect the Delhi Government's continued focus on improving women's safety and mobility. However, the true impact of these measures will be scrutinized closely, as previous efforts have not always led to significant improvements in women's sense of security. Budget ₹117 Crore Allocated for Tourism and Cultural Development In Delhi

Delhi to have centre for real time air, water quality monitoring: Govt

Delhi's air quality index (AQI), which had remained in the 'moderate' category for the past eight days, deteriorated and plunged into the 'poor' category on Monday. This prompted the Commission for Air Quality Management in NCR and Adjoining Areas (CAQM) to activate Stage I of the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP), which had previously been suspended when the AQI had shown signs of

improvement.

On Monday, Delhi's AQI reached 206, surpassing Sunday's reading of 194. This shift back into the 'poor' category marks the fourth such occurrence this month. In total, Delhi has experienced four 'poor' air days (AQI ranging from 201-300), 19 'moderate' air days (AQI between 101-200), and two 'satisfactory' air days (AQI between 51-100) this month.

Rs 2.36 Lakh Crore Budget Focuses on Health

Punjab Minister Announces First-Ever "Drug Census"

Punjab's Finance Minister, Harpal Singh Cheema, presented a Rs 2.36 lakh crore budget for the 2025-26 fiscal year, emphasizing key initiatives to combat the state's drug crisis, enhance healthcare, and stimulate rural development. Notably, no new taxes were introduced, and the much-discussed Rs 1,000 monthly cash grant for women, a key poll promise, was not mentioned in the budget.

A primary concern for the government is the rampant drug menace, which Cheema termed as the "biggest threat" to the state's prosperity. In response, the Punjab government will conduct a groundbreaking "drug census" next fiscal year, collecting data from every household to assess drug use and de-addiction efforts, which will inform a targeted strategy to combat the issue.

The budget outlines a major expanscheme, set to cover all 65 lakh famworth of insurance per year. Those enrolled in central government

schemes will receive an additional Rs 5 lakh top-up, with all beneficiaries receiving a "Sehat Card" for cashless treatment in hospitals throughout Punjab. The health sector allocation stands at Rs 5,598 crore, marking a 10% increase from the previous year.

The Punjab government is also rolling out a new scheme to incentivize crop diversification in Bathinda, Kapurthala, and Gurdaspur, with a focus on Kharif maize crops. A substantial Rs 9,992 crore has been earmarked for agricultural power subsidies, alongside plans for a shrimp processing unit to support waterlogged farming

Additionally, the government plans to reduce fees for doorstep delivery of government services from Rs 120 to Rs 50, aiming to make access to public services more affordable. Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann's leadership is credited for driving significant progress across the state, with Cheesion of the state's health insurance madescribing the vision for a "Badalda Punjab" (Changing Punjab), with ilies across Punjab with Rs 10 lakh a focus on inclusive and progressive development.

Gold smuggling case: Ranya Rao has admitted to using hawala channels, argues prosecution

Kannada actress Harshavardhini Ranya, also known as Ranya Rao, who was arrested in a gold smuggling case, has reportedly admitted to using hawala channels to facilitate gold purchases, according to the prosecution. This statement, made before a special court on Tuesday, March 25, 2025, strengthens the case against

The court has reserved its decision on Ranya Rao's bail plea until March 27, following detailed arguments from both the defense and the prosecution. During the hearing, Ranya Rao's lawyer, Kiran Jawali, argued for her release, while the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) lawyer, Madhu Rao, presented evidence suggesting Rao's direct involvement in the illegal transfer of funds related to gold smuggling.

As part of the legal proceedings, au-

thorities have invoked Section 108 of the Customs Act, which mandates a judicial inquiry into financial irregularities and potential violations of law. The investigation is focused on uncovering the full extent of the illegal transactions and any links to a larger smuggling network.

On March 3, gold bars worth ₹12.56 crore were seized from Ranya Rao at Kempegowda International Airport when she arrived from Dubai. Subsequently, searches were conducted at her residence, where officials recovered additional gold jewelry worth ₹2.06 crore and Indian currency totaling ₹2.67 crore.

In connection with the case, Ranya Rao's stepfather, K Ramachandra Rao, a senior officer with the rank of DGP, was placed on compulsory leave by the Karnataka government. He has been questioned by authorities in relation to the gold smuggling operations.

Meanwhile, Ranya Rao's mother has approached the Karnataka High Court with a plea seeking guidelines for media coverage in this case, which the court has issued a notice to the Centre on. As the investigation continues, the case has attracted significant attention due to the involvement of a prominent actress and her connections to senior officials.

AAP Accuses UP Government of Promoting Alcoholism with 'One Plus One Free' Liquor Scheme

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has accused the Yogi Adityanath-led Uttar Pradesh government of encouraging alcoholism by allegedly endorsing a "one plus one free" liquor scheme in the state. The allegation, made by Delhi AAP chief Saurabh Bharadwaj, claims that liquor shops in Uttar Pradesh are offering free bottles of alcohol with every purchase, sparkpublic health.

Addressing a press conference, Bharadwaj expressed his disbelief that no action had been taken against these liquor shops despite growing evidence on social media. "We are seeing many videos from across Uttar Pradesh showing long queues outside liquor shops. This is nothing but a conspiracy to make people alcoholics. I want to ask Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath why there has been ing concerns about the impact on no bulldozer action against these shops," he said.

Bharadwaj raised further questions about the approval of this scheme, asking if it had been sanctioned by the BJP's central leadership. "Has CM Yogi started this 'one plus one free' alcohol scheme after consulting the BJP leadership? If not, why is the central BJP leadership silent on this?" he queried, implying that the state government's actions could be part of a larger political strategy.

The AAP also targeted the Uttar Pradesh government in a post on social media platform X, questioning the BJP's role. "A river of liquor is flowing in BJP-ruled Uttar Pradesh. At liquor shops in Noida, a free bottle of alcohol is being given with each purchase. Do the BJP and Congress not see any scam or irregularity in this? Will the BJP central government order a CBI-ED investigation into this?" the post read, highlighting the issue as a potential scam.

As of now, there has been no official response from the Uttar Pradesh government or the BJP regarding the allegations made by the AAP.

CBI Raids Former Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel's Residence

Former Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel on Wednesday revealed that the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) conducted searches at his residences in Raipur and Bhilai ahead of his scheduled visit to New Delhi for a Congress meeting. The CBI also raided the homes of a senior police officer and a close associate of Baghel, although the agency has not disclosed specific details about the ongoing investigation.

raids are related to the Mahadev online betting app scam, which has been under scrutiny for its alleged illegal operations. Baghel's office issued a statement on social media, noting that the searches took place just before his planned departure to attend a meeting of the "Drafting Committee" for the upcoming All India Congress Committee (AICC) meeting in Ahmedabad on April 8-9.

In addition to Baghel's residences, the CBI also targeted the premises of other Congress leaders and police officials in Raipur and Durg districts, accord-

ing to sources. The CBI's silence on the details of the investigation has fueled further speculation about the timing and motivations behind the raids.

Reacting to the searches, State Congress communication wing head Sushil Anand Shukla accused the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) of using central agencies to target political opponents. "Ever since Bhupesh Baghel became the party in-charge of Punjab, the BJP has been scared. First, the Enforcement Directorate raided his residence, and now the Sources suggest that the CBI has been sent. This is a clear sign of BJP's fear," Shukla said. He claimed that when the BJP fails in political battles, it resorts to misusing agencies to suppress its rivals.

> Shukla also pointed out that earlier, the CBI had filed a case against Baghel related to an alleged sleaze CD incident, but the court recently discharged him of all charges. The Chhattisgarh government had previously handed over 70 cases linked to the Mahadev scam to the CBI. Recently, the Enforcement Directorate had also raided Baghel's residence in connection with an alleged liquor scam.

Indian Army and Assam Rifles Conduct Major Crackdown on Illegal Arms in Manipur

In a significant operation against illegal arms trafficking, the Indian Army and Assam Rifles, under the command of the Spear Corps, conducted a series of intelligence-based joint operations across five dis-March 25, 2025. The operations, which were carried out in coordination with the Manipur Police, CRPF, BSF, and Indo-Tibetan Border Police, led to the recovery of 32 weapons, ammunition, and various war-like materials.

The multi-agency operations targeted districts including Kakching, Imphal West, Imphal East, Senapati, and Bishnupur. All recovered items were handed over to the Manipur Police for further investigation. According to sources, the operation began in Kakching district on March 22, where security forces seized an improvised mortar, a .303 rifle, a modified carbine machine gun, two single-barrel rifles, and additional ammunition and war materials. In Senapati district, four bolt-action rifles were seized, while in Imphal East, two single-barrel rifles and two improvised mortars were recovered.

The following day, March 23, saw further successes, with the Army recovering one INSAS rifle, one .303 rifle, and one self-loading rifle (SLR) from Phaikot in Senapati. Assam Rifles also recovered a 2-inch mortar and a 0.32mm pistol in Imphal East. On March 24, operations continued, tricts in riot-hit Manipur and the Army seized a .22 between March 22 and rifle, a 12-bore double-barrel rifle, four 51mm mortars, and a 9mm pistol in Imphal East. In Bishnupur district, security forces recovered an AK-47, a .303 rifle, two modified rifles, and more improvised mor-

> These operations come after Manipur Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla's March 6 deadline for individuals to voluntarily surrender illegally held arms. As part of the initiative, over 300 firearms were surrendered by the public during the seven-day period, mainly from the valley districts.

Since the onset of ethnic clashes in May 2023, which have claimed over 250 lives, the state has been in turmoil. The central government imposed President's Rule in February 2025, following the resignation of Chief Minister N Biren Singh. The state assembly remains in suspended animation amid the unrest.



TIHAR JAIL TO MOVE NEW SITE

Asia's Biggest Prison Held Many Top Inmates

The Delhi government has announced plans to shift Tihar Jail, South Asia's largest prison complex, to the outskirts of the national capital to alleviate severe overcrowding. Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, in her Budget speech on March 25, allocated ₹10 crore for survey and consultancy services related to the relocation.

"In order to decongest the existing Tihar Jail Complex for the welfare of prisoners, a new scheme for the development of a new Jail Complex by shifting the existing Tihar Jail Complex to another location has been formulated," Gupta said while presenting the budget in the assembly.

The relocation is part of the ₹1 lakh crore budget presented by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government Tihar Jail has housed several after securing power in Delhi following 27 years. The move comes as the prison, designed to house around 10,025 inmates, currently accommodates over 19,000, leading to severe congestion and security challenges.

History of Tihar Jail

Established in 1958, Tihar Jail, officially known as Tihar Prisons, was initially a small facility meant to house convicts from Delhi. It functioned under Punjab's administrative control until 1966, when it was transferred to the Delhi administration. Over the years, as Delhi's crime rate increased, the jail expanded into a sprawling complex spanning over 400 acres, with nine prisons in total—six in Mandoli, one in Rohini, and the rest in Tihar.

Located in West Delhi, near Tilak Nagar and Hari Nagar, Tihar Jail has long struggled with overcrowding. The Delhi government has been working on new prison complexes in Narela to address the issue, and sources indicate that an alternative site for relocation is being sought.

high-profile inmates, including political figures, activists, and criminals. Prominent political figures such as former Union Minister P. Chidambaram, Karnataka Deputy CM D.K. Shivakumar, and anti-corruption activist Anna Hazare have also spent time in Tihar. Business tycoon Subrata Roy and Olympian wrestler Sushil Kumar are among other well-known inmates.

The recently released Netflix crime drama Black Warrant, based on the book of the same name, depicts the harsh realities of life inside Tihar Jail. The series follows the experiences of a jailer, played by Zahan Kapoor, highlighting the complex dynamics of India's most infamous prison.

Where will Tihar Jail be shifted?

Authorities have been scouting for locations to relocate the jail. Initially, a request was made for land in Baprola, but due to encroachments, it was deemed unsuitable. Tihar Jail officials have now written to the Delhi government to provide 100 acres of land elsewhere. Currently, Tihar's Jail Numbers 1 to 9 are designed for around 5,000 inmates but house over 12,000 prisoners. Meanwhile, Jail Numbers 10 to 16, meant for 3,700 inmates, currently accommodate over 3,900. Certain jails, such as Jail Number 4 in Tihar and Jail Number 12 in Mandoli, function as Mulaija Jails for first-time offenders, yet remain overcrowded.

In her budget presentation, Chief Minister Gupta also announced the formation of a new society under the Delhi Jail administration to oversee the welfare and rehabilitation of pris-

Will Kailash-Mansarovar Yatra Resume?

The recent diplomatic engagement between India and China at the Working Mechanism for Consultation and Coordination (WMCC) meeting in Beijing has reignited discussions on the future of cross-border exchanges, including the much-awaited resumption of the Kailash-Mansarovar Yatra. This development, coupled with efforts for better border management, signals a cautious yet notable shift towards stability in India-China relations. However, the larger question remains—can this diplomatic effort that may fall short of expectations?

A Renewed Diplomatic Push

The 33rd WMCC meeting saw India and China emphasizing the need for peace at the border as a prerequisite for normalizing bilateral ties. This marks a continuation of the efforts initiated by National Security Advisor Ajit Doval and Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi during their Special Representatives (SR) dialogue in December 2024. The meeting also followed Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri's recent visit to Beijing, reflecting India's sustained engagement with China on border and diplomatic matters.

The discussions were led by Joint Secretary (East Asia) Gourangalal Das from the Indian side and Hong Liang, Director General of the Boundary and Oceanic Affairs Department of China's Ministry of Foreign Affairs. The focus remained on effective border management and strengthening diplomatic and military mechanisms, which are essential given the longstanding tensions along the Line of Actual Control (LAC), particularly in eastern Ladakh.

Border Management and Military Stability

One of the critical aspects discussed in The decision to restart cross-border ex-



be a real breakthrough, or is it another the meeting was the situation along the LAC, where both India and China have stationed approximately 50,000 to 60,000 troops. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) highlighted the necessity of maintaining peace and stability in these areas, underscoring that border tranquillity is crucial for fostering broader bilateral cooperation. Interestingly, China's ambassador to India, Xu Feihong, took to social media platform X to share insights into the meeting. He mentioned that both sides engaged in a "comprehensive and in-depth exchange of views" on implementing decisions made in the SR meeting. He further stated that both nations are working on "concrete and effective measures" to ensure longterm stability in the border regions.

The Kailash-Mansarovar Yatra

Among the most anticipated outcomes of these diplomatic engagements is the potential resumption of the Kailash-Mansarovar Yatra, a significant pilgrimage for Hindus, Buddhists, and Jains. The Yatra was suspended due to COVID-19 restrictions and escalating tensions following the Galwan Valley clash in 2020. Restoring this pilgrimage route would not just be a goodwill gesture but also an indication of improving India-China relations.

changes, including the pilgrimage and discussions on trans-border river cooperation, showcases a willingness to rebuild trust. However, the skepticism remains—will China's commitment to this dialogue translate into tangible action, or will it remain a strategic maneuver to ease tensions without addressing core issues?

The Road Ahead

While the WMCC meeting and the possible resumption of the Kailash-Mansarovar Yatra are positive steps, they are not enough to resolve the deep-rooted tensions between India and China. Future engagements must focus on sustained trust-building measures, verifiable military disengagement, and increased transparency in diplomatic negotiations. India must continue its strategic patience while ensuring that border stability does not come at the cost of its security interests. China, too, needs to demonstrate a genuine commitment to peaceful coexistence, as mere diplomatic gestures without meaningful action will not lead to a long-term resolution. For now, the WMCC meeting offers a glimmer of hope, but whether it paves the way for lasting peace or remains another chapter in the complex India-China equation is something that only time will tell.



Proof of Citizenship to Vote Trump's New Order and the Future of US Elections

Hyderabad, March 27: Donald Trump's new executive order requiring proof of citizenship to vote in federal elections has sparked intense debate. The move, which also mandates that all ballots be received by Election Day, is being hailed by some as a necessary step toward election integrity, while critics argue it could lead to voter suppression. Regardless of where one stands, one undeniable fact remains—every democratic nation has its own rules for conducting elections, and the US, which often lectures other countries on electoral fairness, has long operated under a system that lacks a fundamental safeguard present in many democracies: proof of citizenship for voting.

The Case for Proof of Citizenship

In most democratic nations, voters are required to present official identification or proof of citizenship to participate in elections. Whether in India, Germany, or Canada, national voter ID systems are commonplace and widely accepted as essential tools to prevent fraud. Strangely, the US has lagged behind in this regard, allowing voter registration with minimal verification, a practice that has raised concerns over election security. Trump's executive order addresses these concerns by enforcing citizenship verification and tightening ballot submission deadlines. The directive also compels federal agencies such as the Department of Homeland Security and the Social Security Administration to share data with election officials to identify non-citizens on voter rolls. If implemented effectively, this could prevent fraudulent voting and restore faith in the electoral process.

US Elections: A Double Standard?

The irony in this situation is that while the US government has frequently criticized other countries for their electoral processes, it has failed to establish basic voting safeguards at home. Even more puzzling is that Democrats, who often advocate for transparency and fairness, have opposed voter ID laws and even pushed for measures that would allow non-citizens to vote in elections. This contradiction raises a crucial question: How can the US claim to be the beacon of democracy while neglecting fundamental election integrity measures?

For years, Democrats and their allies have argued that requiring proof of citizenship would disenfranchise marginalized communities. However, a 2023 report by the Brennan Center for Justice suggested that nearly 21.3 million US citizens of voting age lack immediate access to proof of citizenship documents. While this is a legitimate concern, it is not insurmountable. Instead of opposing ID laws altogether, efforts should be made to provide accessible and free documentation for all eligible voters.

Legal Challenges Ahead

Trump's order is expected to face legal opposition, as the US Constitution grants states the primary authority over elections. While Congress has intervened in election matters through acts like the Voting Rights Act, the states remain in control of setting rules for voter registration and ballot access. This means that states unwilling to comply with Trump's directive could challenge it in court, leading to another prolonged battle over election laws.

Is Trump's Move Good or Bad for Democracy?

Love him or hate him, Trump's decision at least makes logical sense. Every democratic country has rules to ensure election integrity, and the US should be no different. While implementation must be done carefully to avoid disenfranchising voters, ensuring that only US citizens vote in federal elections is not an unreasonable expectation. If anything, it might just be the first step toward making American elections as fair and transparent as the country claims they are.

The debate over voter ID laws will continue, but one thing is certain: Trump's move forces the US to address the contradictions in its electoral system. Whether this leads to stronger, more credible elections or an intensification of political battles remains to be seen.

India is The Right Example for The World

India, with a population of over 1.4 billion people and around 968 million eligible voters, sets a remarkable example of how elections should be conducted. In the 2024 general elections, around 642 million people exercised their fundamental right to vote, in this 312 million women voters, demonstrating a high level of civic responsibility. Despite the vast and diverse geography, elections are held efficiently across remote areas with polling booths reaching every corner of the country. India's Election Commission ensures results are delivered on time without delay, setting a global standard for free and fair elections. While China and Russia follow predictable outcomes, and Western nations struggle with outdated processes, it is India that exemplifies how a democracy should function. As the world's fifth-largest economy, India's electoral success should serve as a model for other nations instead of being on the receiving end of lectures on democracy from those who fail to uphold the same standards.

India Rejects US Religious Freedom Report, Labels USCIRF 'Entity of Concern'

India has firmly dismissed the latest report from the US Commission on International Religious Freedom (USCIRF), calling it biased, politically motivated, and a misrepresentation of India's religious landscape. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) expressed strong disapproval, emphasizing that the commission's assessments were not only inaccurate but also undermined India's democratic principles and pluralistic so-

The MEA's spokesperson, Randhir Jaiswal, addressed the media, stating that the USCIRF's 2025 Annual Report continued a long-standing pattern of issuing assessments that were neither fair nor objective. According to Jaiswal, the USCIRF's report "misrepresents isolated incidents" and projects them in a way that casts doubt on India's commitment to religious freedom. The Indian government also accused the USCIRF of pursuing a politically motivated agenda rather than addressing genuine concerns about religious freedom in India.

India, with a population of 1.4 billion people practicing various religions, including Hinduism, Islam, Christianity, Sikhism, Buddhism, and others, prides itself on its diversity and multicultural fabric. The MEA emphasized that India's pluralistic framework, which supports harmonious coexistence of its many communities, was a testament to the country's respect for religious freedom.

The MEA spokesperson went on to state that the USCIRF's report failed to acknowledge the reality of this framework, choosing instead to focus on isolated incidents that did not reflect the broader societal context. India's government further criticized the commission for being unwilling to engage with the country's constitutional safeguards, which ensure religious freedom and protect minorities. The government's response suggested that such biased assessments not only misrepresented India but also undermined the country's standing as a global beacon of democracy and tolerance.

For years, the Indian government has rejected similar reports from the USCIRF, accusing the panel of being influenced by external political and geopolitical factors rather than providing an impartial review of the situation. The government also pointed out that the USCIRF's methods were flawed, relying on unreliable sources, and ignored India's legal framework that upholds religious freedoms. India's response to the 2025 USCIRF report underscores the country's growing frustration with external criticism, particularly when such reports fail to acknowledge the complex, pluralistic nature of Indian society. The MEA concluded by stating that it was the USCIRF, rather than India, that should be considered an "entity of concern" in the context of its politically-driven assessments.

Cash Found at Justice Varma's Residence, Police Investigate

A team of Delhi Police officers, led by the Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) from New Delhi, visited the residence of Delhi High Court Judge Justice Yashwant Varma on Wednesday, March 26, 2025, following reports of cash being found at his house in connection with an ongoing investigation. According to official sources, the police team arrived at Justice Varma's residence around 1:50 p.m. and spent approximately two hours at the location. The visit was reportedly linked to an investigation that began after a fire broke out at Justice Varma's home, during which the alleged discovery of cash was made. While the police team was at the house, they did not engage with the media, and no public statements were issued during or after their visit. After completing their inspection, the police team left

Justice Varma's residence and returned to the Tughlaq Road Police Station for further proceedings. The specific details of the cash found and the investigation remain unclear, and no further information has been released by the police at this stage. The authorities are expected to provide more details as the investigation progresses. This incident has raised questions regarding the circumstances surrounding the fire and the discovery of cash at the residence of a sitting high court judge. However, for now, the police are continuing their inquiry and have refrained from making any public comments on the matter. The situation has attracted attention, given the sensitive nature of the case involving a prominent judiciary figure, and it remains to be seen how the investigation unfolds in the coming days.







"Entity Of Concern": India Shreds US Religious Freedom Body Over Demand To Sanction RAW

- India slams USCIRF for biased, politically motivated claims on minority rights.
- MEA rejects allegations of religious intolerance and misrepresentation of facts.
- Sanctions on R&AW dismissed, calls on US to ignore unfounded accusations.

India has strongly rebutted the US Commission on International Religious Freedom (US-CIRF) following its annual report that criticized the treatment of minorities in India. In a scathing statement issued by the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), New Delhi accused the USCIRF of issuing biased, politically motivated assessments and misrepresenting facts.

The MEA expressed concern over the report's claims that religious minorities in India face deteriorating conditions. It particularly objected to the panel's recommendation of sanctions on India's external intelligence agency, R&AW, over its alleged involvement in assassination plots targeting 'Khalistani' separatists and extremists overseas.

"We have seen the recently released 2025 Annual Report of the USCIRF, which once again continues its pattern of issuing biased and politically motivated assessments," the In-



dian government said. The MEA questioned the authenticity of the panel's claims, suggesting that the USCIRF's evaluations were driven by an agenda rather than genuine concern for religious freedom.

India further criticized the USCIRF for distorting isolated incidents to undermine India's image as a multicultural society. "The that India firmly rejected.

USCIRF's persistent attempts to misrepresent isolated incidents and cast aspersions on India's vibrant multicultural society reflect a deliberate agenda," the foreign ministry said. It also emphasized India's pluralistic framework, highlighting that the country is home to 1.4 billion people practicing a wide range of religions, but expressed no expectation that the USCIRF would recognize this harmonious coexistence.

Labeling the USCIRF as "an entity of concern," the Indian government made it clear that such efforts to undermine India's democracy and tolerance would not succeed. The statement further added that despite the recommendations, it is unlikely that the US government would sanction R&AW, as the USCIRF's views are non-binding.

The USCIRF report also alleged that Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the ruling BJP propagated "hateful rhetoric" against Muslims and other religious minorities, a claim that India firmly rejected.



"Clear Signal" Moscow Not Pursuing Real Peace: Zelensky On Russian Strikes

Condemns Russian Drone Attacks After Black Sea Ceasefire Agreement

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky sharply criticized Russia's latest wave of drone attacks, which saw over 100 drones launched overnight, just hours after tentative agreements for a Black Sea ceasefire were brokered. Zelensky's remarks came after the United States announced it had facilitated ceasefire discussions between the two sides in Saudi Arabia, with former President Donald Trump calling for a swift resolution to the ongoing conflict, which has now persisted for over three years.

Despite these diplomatic efforts, implementation of the ceasefire remained uncertain, as the Kremlin stated that the agreement to halt attacks on the Black Sea could only be enforced if restrictions on its agricultural sector were lifted. This condition raised doubts about the feasibility of the ceasefire taking effect anytime soon.

Zelensky condemned Russia's actions, stating that the large-scale drone strikes following ceasefire negotiations sent a clear message to the world: Moscow was not committed to pursuing genuine peace. "Launching such large-scale attacks after ceasefire negotiations is a clear signal to the whole world that Moscow is not going to pursue real peace," he wrote on social media.

Overnight, Russia launched 117 drones at Ukrainian targets, of which 56 were shot down, and 48 disappeared from radar without causing significant damage, according to Ukraine's air force. However, the strikes still inflicted damage on buildings in the central city of Kryvyi Rig and in the border region of Sumy, where images of burning structures were shared by local authorities.

The frontline areas also continued to suffer attacks, with the eastern Donetsk region reporting the deaths of three individuals in the past 24 hours, according to regional governor Vadym Filashkin. Zelensky called for stronger international pressure on Russia, urging more sanctions and robust action, particularly from the United States, to stop the ongoing strikes.

As the conflict continues, Zelensky emphasized the need for the world to act decisively to hold Russia accountable and stop the escalation of violence.



US Lawmakers Push for Sanctions on Pakistan Army Chief and Demand Release of Imran Khan

Two US lawmakers have introduced a bipartisan bill seeking to impose sanctions on Pakistan's Army Chief, General Asim Munir, accusing him of engaging in the wrongful persecution and imprisonment of political opponents, including former Prime Minister Imran Khan. The bill, named the "Pakistan Democracy Act," was introduced on Monday by Republican Representative Joe Wilson from South Carolina and Democratic Representative Jimmy Panetta from California.

The legislation accuses General Munir of "knowingly engaging in the wrongful persecution and imprisonment of political opponents," and seeks to impose sanctions on the military leader under the Global Magnitsky Human Rights Accountability Act. The proposed sanctions would include restrictions such as denial of entry into the United States and ineligibility for US visas. The bill also calls for identifying other individuals responsible for the alleged persecution and applying similar restrictions to them.

The bill gives the US President the authority to lift the sanctions if certain conditions are met, including the end of military rule in Pakistan, the restoration of rule of law, and a civilian-led democracy. Additionally, the release of all wrongfully detained political prisoners, including Imran Khan, would be a prerequisite for lifting the sanctions.

Representative Joe Wilson, in support of the bill, referred to Imran Khan, 72, as a "political prisoner" and blamed Pakistan's powerful military for his "unjust detention." The introduction of the bill comes amidst growing international pressure on Pakistan regarding its treatment of political opponents, particularly following Khan's imprisonment and the ongoing political turmoil in the country.

This move signals increasing concerns in the US over human rights violations in Pakistan and the role of the military in suppressing political dissent. The bill's passage could significantly impact US-Pakistan relations, especially if the sanctions are enforced.

Hostages To Return "In Coffins" If Israel Tries To Free Them By Force: Hamas

Hamas has issued a stern warning on Wednesday, stating that hostages could be killed if Israel continues its attempts to retrieve them by force while airstrikes persist in the Gaza Strip. In a statement, the Palestinian militant group expressed concern over the safety of the captives, saying, "Every time the occupation attempts to retrieve its captives by force, it ends up bringing them back in coffins." The group claimed it was doing everything possible to keep the hostages alive, but warned that Israeli airstrikes were endangering their lives. Israel resumed its airstrikes and launched ground operations in Gaza last week, following a period of relative calm under a ceasefire that had been in place since January. These actions have resulted in a significant escalation of violence.

Since Israel renewed its military operations, at least 830 Palestinians have been reported killed, according to Gaza's health ministry, which operates under Hamas. The violence comes on the heels of the October 7, 2023, Hamas attack on Israel that killed 1,218 people, mostly civilians, according to official figures. Israel's ongoing military offensive has resulted in devastating casualties in Gaza. According to the health ministry in the Hamas-controlled territory, the toll has reached at least 50,183 Palestinian deaths, the majority of whom are civilians. The current escalation follows the violent and deadly events of October 7 and continues to wreak havoc in the region, with no sign of a peaceful resolution in sight.




Tata Group Now Tesla's Global Supplier, Eyes Role In India Expansion

Tata Group has reportedly become a global supplier for Elon Musk's electric vehicle (EV) company, Tesla. Several Tata firms, including Tata Technologies, Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), Tata AutoComp, and Tata Electronics, are now integral to Tesla's supply chain, according to a report by The Economic Times (ET). These companies have signed global agreements to supply critical components and services to Tesla, which holds a significant share of the global automotive market.

In the fiscal year 2024, Tata firms contributed approximately \$2 billion worth of supplies to Tesla, including components such as castings, forgings, electronics, and fabricated parts. As Tesla looks to diversify its supply chain, the sourcing from India is expected to increase in the future.



Indian Stock Markets and Rupee Recover All Losses in 2025



The Indian stock markets and the rupee have successfully recovered all their losses in 2025, as investor sentiment improved significantly. On Monday, the benchmark indices, BSE Sensex and NSE Nifty, rose by 1.4% and 1.32%, respectively, as foreign institutional investors (FIIs) turned net buvers. The rupee also extended its gains for the seventh consecutive session, appreciating by 31 paise to close at 85.67 against the US dollar, bolstered by lower global crude prices and a weakened greenback.

FIIs' return to the Indian markets after a prolonged period of selling, coupled with bargain hunting at lower levels and better valuations, has supported the rally. Additionally, the Federal Reserve's signals of two rate cuts in 2025 have further boosted investor confidence.

On Monday, the 30-share Sensex surged by 1,078.87 points, reaching a six-week high of 77,984.38. During the day, it briefly rose 1.56% to 78,107.23. The 50-share Nifty also climbed by 307.95 points to 23,658.35, reflecting strong market momentum. In March alone, the Sensex gained 4,786.28 points, or 6.53%, and in just six trading days, it added more than Rs 27 lakh crore to investors' wealth.

In contrast, February saw a decline of 5.55%, and January recorded a small dip of 0.81%. The recent rally has been driven by value buying, with valuations returning to long-term averages and early signs of earnings growth recovery emerging.

Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Investments Ltd., noted that increased government spending and expectations of monetary easing are likely to drive growth in rate-sensitive sectors such as banking, NBFCs, autos, consumer durables, and real estate. These sectors are expected to outperform in the near future. However, the sustainability of the rally will depend on upcoming economic data, including PMI figures and Q4 earnings.

The broader market also saw positive movement, with the BSE midcap and smallcap indices rising by 1.32% and 1.17%, respectively. All sectoral indices closed higher, with the banking sector leading the charge, up 2.53%.

Bharti Airtel Prepaids Additional Rs 5,985 Crore in **High-Cost Spectrum Liabilities**

Bharti Airtel, alongside its subsidiary Bharti Hexacom, has prepaid an additional Rs 5,985 crore of high-cost spectrum liabilities to the Department of Telecom (DoT), further reducing its debt burden, the telecom giant announced on Wednesday.Airtel stated that the prepayment of these liabilities, related to the 2024 auctions, has fully settled the high-interest debt of 8.65%. As part of its broader financial strategy, Airtel's subsidiary, Network i2i Ltd, has also voluntarily redeemed \$1 billion worth of perpetual debt securities.

Airtel emphasized its commitment to financial prudence and operational efficiency, noting that these prepayments contribute to a reduction in both its debt and the cost of debt. So far, Airtel has prepaid Rs 25,981 crore of spectrum liabilities for the fiscal year 2025, bringing the total amount prepaid to Rs 66,665 crore. This is part of Airtel's ongoing effort to lower its debt load, with the prepayments made roughly seven years ahead of their original maturities.

The company pointed out that the interest rates on the prepaid spectrum liabilities averaged 9.74%, with previous prepayments clearing debts carrying interest rates of up to 10%. These proactive prepayments have



eliminated Rs 1.16.405 crore in scheduled instalments that would otherwise have been payable over the remaining tenure of the liabilities. As a result of these actions, Airtel has reduced its cost of debt on the residual spectrum liabilities to approximately 7.22%, based on the remaining Rs 52,000 crore in spectrum dues. These liabilities are set to be paid off in annual instalments until FY

Additionally, Airtel's subsidiary, Network i2i, has exercised its call option to redeem \$1 billion in perpetual notes, which had an interest rate of 5.65%. After this redemption, Airtel will have approximately \$479 million in outstanding perpetual notes, which are callable in FY 2026.

India's Fuel Consumption Declines in February 2025 Amid Shift to Alternative Fuels

noticeable decline in February 2025, primarily driven by a growing shift towards alternative fuel sources like electric vehicles (EVs) and compressed natural gas (CNG), according to a report by SBI Securities.

The report revealed that petrol consumption in India fell to a 12-month low of 3.1 million metric tonnes (MMT) in February, marking a 5.4% decline compared to the previous month. However, when

consumption was still 3.5% higher on a year-on-year (YoY) basis. Despite the monthly decline, this was the lowest petrol consumption recorded in the current financial year. In contrast, May 2024 had witnessed the highest petrol consumption at 3.4 MMT.



Study Suggests First Stars **May Have Created Water** in the Early Universe

Agroundbreaking study published in Nature Astronomy on March 3, 2025, proposes that the universe's earliest stars could have been responsible for the creation of water. The study, led by astronomer D.H. Whalen from the University of Portsmouth, suggests that water may have first appeared in the cosmos as these ancient stars exploded in supernovae. This discovery challenges existing theories and could push back the timeline for the emergence of life-bearing planets.

Water, the third most abundant molecule in the universe, has long remained a mystery in terms of its origins. Following the Big Bang 13.8 billion years ago, the first stars formed a few hundred million years later. These stars were primarily composed of hydrogen and helium and burned hydrogen in their cores. Once they exhausted their hydrogen, they exploded as supernovae, leaving behind remnants of oxygen and other elements.

In this new study, Whalen and his team ran 3D simulations of supernovae from population III stars, the universe's oldest stars made entirely of hydrogen and helium. They discovered that the conditions created by these stars were capable of forming water when oxygen produced during the supernovae combined with hydrogen. The formation of water in the early universe would have been crucial for creating the elements necessary for life.

While the formation of water could not have occurred before these supernovae exploded, the study suggests that the first stars might have formed enough water to significantly impact the infant universe. Water likely played a role in forming the early planets, which could have been home to life far earlier than scientists previously believed.

The findings imply that planets and even the basic elements needed for life could have been present long before the first galaxies took shape. If these results are confirmed, astronomers will have to reconsider the timeline of life's potential emergence in the universe, pushing it back billions of years earlier than previously thought.




