Rao (KTR) would already be in Chanchalguda Jail. He alleged that he was wrongfully imprisoned and harassed for minor infractions, while BRS leaders have been shielded from legal action.

Revanth recalled that he was jailed for flying a drone while he was an MP, even though the law only mandates a ₹500 fine for such an offense. He accused the previous gov-

Working President K.T. Rama ernment of using its power to silence opponents, stating that he was kept in solitary confinement for 16 days and denied basic rights. He also revealed that he was granted bail briefly for his daughter's wedding, only to be sent back to jail afterward.

The Chief Minister stated that many people are demanding the arrest of former CM KCR and KTR, but he will not resort to political vendettas. "If I wanted to take revenge, many people would have been in jail by now," he remarked, emphasizing that he does not believe in framing cases to target opponents.

Revanth Reddy also took a dig at KCR's defeat in Kamareddy, stating that the people had rejected the former CM despite his claims of being the "father of Telangana." He recalled how KCR's loss to a common man in the election was a reflection of public anger.

The Chief Minister further stated that he endured great hardships in jail but did not let bitterness guide his decisions. He remarked that the previous government had unjustly imprisoned him, kept him awake under bright lights, and treated him like a serious criminal. However, he believes that justice will prevail, saying, "God has seen their mistakes, and they are already facing the consequences."

White Ration Card Hurdle for Rajiv Yuva Vikasam Applicants

Hyderabad, March 28: The ongress government in Telangana launched the Rajiv Yuva Vikasam scheme with great ambition to provide financial assistance to youth. However, applicants are encountering significant obstacles, primarily due to the requirement of a white ration card to avail benefits under the scheme.

After coming to power, the government conducted village-level meetings under the Praja Palana (Public Administration) initiative, where people submitted applications for various welfare schemes. However, it later mandated a white ration card for eligibility, leading to widespread confusion and frustration.

During the 10-year rule of the BRS, not a single ration card was issued, leaving many without the required document. Despite this, the Congress government instructed applicants not to apply for ration cards through Praja Palana. As a result, many had to remove their names from their old ration cards to apply for new ones.

The Telangana government spent ₹2,19,307 crore out of the estimated ₹2,77,690 crore budget for the financial year 2023-24, achieving 79 percent of the projected expenditure, according to the latest report from the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG).

The report, detailing the state's financial performance, was tabled in the Legislative Assembly by Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka on Thursday.

As per the CAG report, the state government exceeded the approved budget by ₹1,11,477 crore, marking a 33 percent increase in expenditure. The total

spending accounted for 15 percent of the Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP). The state also borrowed ₹10,156 crore through ways and means advances and took overdrafts amounting to ₹35,425 crore over 145 days.

For the financial year 2023-24, Telangana allocated ₹24,347 crore for interest payments and ₹26,981 crore for salaries. Tax revenues contributed 61.83 percent of the state's total income. Despite the financial burden, the government reported a revenue surplus of ₹779 crore, with 45 percent of revenues allocated to salaries, pensions, and interest payments. The state also received ₹9,934 crore in grants from the Centre.

Assembly Passes Resolution Opposing Delimitation of LS Seats

The Telangana Legislative Assembly has passed a resolution opposing the Centre's proposed delimitation of Lok Sabha constituencies following the 2026 population census. Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy, who moved the resolution on Thursday, stated that the concerns of southern states regarding delimitation were being dismissed by Union ministers from Telangana as if the Centre had no such proposal. However, he termed these claims as "half-truths."

Revanth Reddy pointed out that the Centre had failed to in-

crease the number of Assembly seats in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh as per the AP Reorganisation Act of 2014, which mandated an increase from 119 to 153 seats in Telangana and from 175 to 225 seats in Andhra Pradesh. He argued that the Centre's handling of this issue indicated its intentions regarding future delimitation plans.

"When we requested the Centre to implement the increase in Assembly seats as per the reorganisation act, they responded that it would be done after the 2026 National Population Census. However, they have already carried out the delimitation of Assembly

said.

The Chief Minister warned that if delimitation were carried out purely based on population, the representation of southern states—Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Puducherry, and Karnataka—could drop from the current 24 percent of total Lok Sabha seats to just 19 per-

He demanded that the process consider each state as a unit and ensure an increase in Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) representation while amending the Constitution to raise Telangana's Assembly seats from 119 to

He strongly asserted that the southern states would not accept a population-based delimitation, as it would unfairly penalize them despite their adherence to the Centre's population control policies since 1971.

"In the southern states, population growth has largely stabilised. The difference between births and deaths in Telangana is just 1.8 percent. Delimitation would become a limitation for the south," he reiterated.

To further highlight the issue, Revanth Reddy announced that a massive public meeting would be held in Hyderabad

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White Ration Card Hurdle for Rajiv Yuva Vikasam Applicants

Applicants caught in a bureaucratic deadlock

A year has passed since the Praja Palana program, yet new ration cards have not been issued. This has put applicants in a difficult position, as their names have been removed from old ration cards, and they are yet to receive new ones. Without a white ration card, they cannot apply for the Rajiv Yuva Vikasam

Additionally, the scheme requires ration cards to be linked to Aadhaar, but many applicants do not have a valid ration card to complete the process. Even obtaining an income certificate requires a white ration card, making the situation even more challenging. As a result, thousands of eligible individuals are unable to apply for the scheme, prompting growing demands for the government to relax the rules and extend the application deadline.

Election-linked suspicions over the scheme

Meanwhile, speculation is rife that the Congress government introduced Rajiv Yuva Vikasam with an eye on the upcoming panchayat elections. Reports suggest that a select few might receive loans on Telangana Formation Day, while others may have to wait until after the elections.

With the state treasury reportedly under financial strain, there are doubts about whether the government can allocate ₹6,000 crore for the scheme. The key question remains: Will the Congress government modify the eligibility rules and provide relief to those without white ration cards? The coming days will provide clarity.

Lok Sabha Passes Immigration and Foreigners Bill, 2025

Four Days Left for 90% Waiver on Property Tax Interest: GHMC

The Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) has reminded property owners that only four days remain to clear their property tax under the One-Time Scheme (OTS) and avail a 90% waiver on accumulated arrear interest. The deadline for the scheme is March 31.

GHMC Commissioner K. Ilambarthi urged taxpayers to make use of this opportunity and pay their dues on time.



Payments can be made online via the MyGHMC app, at Citizen Service Centers, e-Seva Kendras, or through bill collectors visiting homes. To facilitate

payments, GHMC Citizen Service Centers will operate from interest and penalties will be 8 AM to 11 PM. Under the OTS, property owners need to pay the principal amount of their tax dues up to the 2024-25 financial year along with 10% of the accumulated interest, thereby availing a 90% waiver on total interest. The scheme covers all properties under GHMC, including residential and commercial buildings.

For those who have already paid their dues along with in-

terest and penalties, 90% of the adjusted against their future property tax payments.

To assist property owners with tax-related grievances, GHMC has also launched the Property Tax Solution (PTP) program. The program runs every Saturday from February 22 to March 29 at circle offices from 10 AM to 1 PM, addressing revision petitions, tax assessments, payment registrations, and legal disputes.

Who Will Get the Ministerial Berth?

Intense Competition Among Nizamabad MLAs

Congress plans a ministerial post for Nizamabad to strengthen its hold. Sudarshan Reddy and Madan Mohan Rao lead the race. Laxmikanth Rao and Bhupathi Reddy also in contention. Social representation and BC quota impact the decision. Final call with CM and PCC Chief.

The political landscape in the Nizamabad joint district has become chaotic due to the absence of a strong leadership presence in the state cabinet. With no senior minister from the region, the district administration has been largely unresponsive to the requests and recommendations of local MLAs, leading to governance issues.

As the Telangana Congress prepares for cabinet expansion, deliberations are underway regarding the allocation of a ministerial post to the Nizamabad joint district. The leadership believes that granting a cabinet berth will strengthen the party's foothold in the region. However, the decision has sparked a fierce contest among senior Congress MLAs.

Fierce Competition Among Aspirants Several MLAs are vying for the ministerial post, including Bodhan MLA Sudarshan Reddy, Yellareddy MLA Madan Mohan Rao, Jukkal MLA Laxmikanth Rao, and Nizamabad Rural MLA Bhupathi Reddy. While the Congress high command has already approved the cabinet expansion, Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, who recently met with top leadership

appointments.

The Telangana Congress is treading cautiously, aiming to maintain social balance while considering candidates for ministerial positions. The party is also exploring ways to appease those who do not secure a ministerial post by offering other key positions.

According to sources, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi has instructed the state leadership to prioritize MLAs who have strongly fought against the BRS and emerged victorious. Based on this, senior Congress leader and Bodhan MLA Sudarshan Reddy appears to be the frontrunner in the race.

Sudarshan Reddy vs. Madan Mohan Rao A major contest is emerging between Sudarshan Reddy and Yellareddy MLA Madan Mohan Rao. In the past, Madan Mohan Rao contested as the Congress candidate for the Zaheerabad parliamentary seat but failed to put up a strong fight against BRS's Bibi Patil, losing by a narrow margin. Despite this, he has actively worked against the BRS and is lobbying strongly in Delhi to secure the cabinet position.

On the other hand, Sudarshan Reddy, a in Delhi, has been given the final say on former minister, has significant politi-

cal backing. He shares close ties with the family of Congress veteran Jaipal Reddy and is also related to Chief Minister Revanth Reddy. Reports suggest that senior Congress leaders, including former Home Minister Jana Reddy, have discussed Sudarshan Reddy's potential induction into the cabinet.

However, some within the party question whether an MLA with more than a decade of experience should be given another ministerial opportunity, adding complexity to the decision-making pro-

Other Contenders in the Race

Meanwhile, Jukkal MLA Laxmikanth Rao is attempting to leverage his Dalit background to secure the position. However, reports indicate that his chances have diminished, especially since MLA Vivek Venkataswamy, also from the same community, is not a senior Congress leader. Nizamabad Rural MLA Dr. Bhupathi Reddy, who has repeatedly contested from the constituency and finally defeated former BRS leader Bajireddy Govardhan in the recent elections, has also intensified his lobbying. He enjoys the support of the National Medical Association and the doctors' lobby, which has urged the





state Congress to give him a ministerial post. The argument being made is that doctors with minor degrees have previously secured cabinet positions, strengthening Bhupathi Reddy's case.

Social Balance Becomes a Key **Factor**

While Chief Minister Revanth Reddy is inclined to appoint Sudarshan Reddy as a minister, the recent focus on caste-based representation has made the decision more complex. The Congress leadership is keen on maintaining a social balance by giving due representation to BCs, SCs, and

STs to avoid alienating these voter groups. Reports suggest that two ministerial berths will be allocated to MLAs from the BC community.

In the past, the in-charge ministers of Nizamabad played a crucial role in reviewing and directing district development. However, the current situation is different. Despite the leadership's commitment to ensuring ministerial representation from the joint district, the final decision rests with PCC Chief Mahesh Kumar Goud and Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, keeping the aspirants

Demands increase in Telangana Assembly seats to 153

Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy introduced a resolution in the Legislative Assembly opposing the re-division of constituencies based on population. He argued that states that led meeting rejecting the re-division based

have effectively implemented population control measures would suffer due to this move, leading to a reduction in their political representation.

The Chief Minister asserted that the existing constituencies should be retained and called for an increase in the number of Assembly seats in Telangana from 119 to 153. He also demanded a rise in the number of SC and ST-reserved seats in proportion to the present population.

Revanth Reddy pointed out

that southern states adhered to the central government's directives on population control, unlike several northern states. He warned that if constituencies are re-divided solely based

on population, the representation of southern states in the Lok Sabha would drop from 24% to 19%, weakening their political influence.

Citing a recent resolution passed by a DMK-

on population, he reminded the House that even former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee had opposed such a move. He emphasized that the Andhra Pradesh Reorga nization Act clearly mandates an increase in the number of Assembly constituencies in both Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, yet no action has been taken so far.

The Chief Minister also criticized the disparity in central funding, stating that states like Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and Madhya Pradesh receive more financial support, while

southern states are allocated significantly less. He urged all political parties to support the resolution, ensuring Telangana's political representation is not diminished.

Singireddy highlighted the achievements of the KCR-led BRS government, stating that in ten years, they waived off ₹28,817 crore worth of loans for farmers, provided ₹73,000 crore through 11 installments under the Rythu Bandhu scheme, and ensured 24-hour free electricity for agriculture by spending ₹10,500 crore per year. He also pointed out that under Rythu Bima, the BRS government further criticized the government for

who lost their breadwinners by giving each of them ₹5 lakh. However, he criticized the Congress for opposing the need for 24-hour free electricity, recalling that Revanth Reddy himself stated that three hours of electricity was sufficient, claiming that a 10 HP motor could water an acre per hour.

Lashing out at the Congress for failing to implement key welfare schemes, Singireddy said that despite making grand announcements for December 9, many promises remain unfulfilled. The ₹2 lakh loan waiver, ₹7,500 per acre under Rythu Bharosa, and ₹2,500 per girl child under the Mahalaxmi scheme have not materialized. Similarly, the ₹6,000 pension for disabled persons and the ₹4,000 pension for senior citizens, single women, and widows have also not been provided as promised. He

supported 11.10 lakh farmer families reducing Rythu Bima from ₹15,000 to ₹12,000 and excluding farmers with up to three acres from the insurance scheme. He accused the Congress of skipping irrigation projects, failing to procure crops at promised bonuses, and looting the state treasury without even paying the insurance premium for farmers.

Singireddy alleged that Revanth Reddy is distorting facts and misleading the public with media management, attempting to cover up the failures of his government. He remarked that self-proclaimed intellectuals and politically motivated individuals had spread false propaganda about the ten-year BRS rule, but the 15-month Congress government has now been exposed. He claimed that the people of Telangana, who were once deceived, would not be fooled again and are waiting for the right time to respond.

Pastor Praveen's Body Kept for Public Tribute

Following doubts expressed by several

individuals and community members regarding the cause of death, Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu has ordered a detailed probe into the incident. He directed DGP Harish Kumar Gupta to examine all aspects of the case to uncover the truth.

With large crowds expected to gather at the church to pay tribute, authorities have deployed additional security personnel to ensure order and safety. The police are closely monitoring the situation to prevent any untoward incidents. The funeral arrangements are yet to be officially announced, and further updates on the investigation are awaited.



Owaisi seeks Assembly resolution against Waqf Amendment Bill

AIMIM floor leader Akbaruddin Owaisi has urged the Telangana government to adopt a resolution rejecting the Waqf (Amendment) Bill proposed by the Centre. Speaking during the appropriation bill debate in the Telangana Legislative Assembly on Thursday, March 27, he also called for Waqf lands to be brought under the prohibited category in the Bhu Bharathi revenue portal to prevent illegal encroachments.

Addressing concerns over reservations, Owaisi criticized BJP leaders for falsely claiming that Muslims were taking away Backward Class (BC) reservations. He pointed out that Muslims are included in the OBC list even in BJP-ruled states like Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh. He further asserted that the state could surpass the 50% cap on reservations and implement



42% reservations for BCs without needing an all-party delegation to meet the prime

Owaisi also pressed the government to allocate funds for key infrastructure projects in the Old City, including: Charminar pedestrian project, Construction of a new building for Osmania General Hospital

and Development of Mir Alam Tank, Mir Alam Mandi, and Murgi Chowk

Additionally, he urged the Congress government to restore pre-matric scholarships for Muslim minority students, which were discontinued after the formation of Telangana in 2014.

Owaisi demanded the inclusion of Hyderabad's Old City in the Hyderabad Metropolitan Region 2050 Master Plan to facilitate the establishment of IT Towers, startups, and incubators to support Muslim youth.

HYDRAA Clears Illegal Barricades, Encroachments at Boyapalli Enclave

The Hyderabad Disaster Response and Asset Protection Agency (HYDRAA) took decisive action against unauthorized constructions in Boyapalli Enclave, Almasguda village, on Thursday, dismantling barricades that had obstructed major roads for years.

The illegal roadblocks had long restricted access to

several plot owners, affecting nearly half of the enclave's layout. Residents, who had been struggling with these encroachments for years, welcomed the move, expressing relief over restored access to roads and public spaces.

In addition to removing barricades, HYDRAA also reclaimed parklands that had been encroached upon. Authorities reinstated a 240-square-yard open space meant for public use, ensuring adherence to the original approved layout. Local reports confirmed that a cricket box, illegally built on a road inside the enclave, was also torn down.

The Boyapalli Enclave layout was formed in 1982, but over the years, unauthorized developments had blocked three key roads. With HYDRAA's intervention, connectivity has now been restored, reinforcing urban planning regulations.

Cops recover ₹9.5 lakh **Duped from Businessman**

The Hyderabad police successfully recovered ₹9,50,531 from cyber fraudsters who duped a 32-year-old businessman under the pretense of a lucrative business opportunity. The amount was refunded to the victim after a thorough investigation.

According to reports, the fraudsters convinced the businessman to transfer funds under various false pretenses, including registration fees, processing charges, and issuance of ISO certificates, claiming that his products had a high market demand. Once they received the money, the accused cut off all communication, leaving the victim defrauded.



Upon receiving the complaint, the Hyderabad cybercrime police registered a case under Sections 66(C) and 66(D) of the IT Act, along with Sections 111(2)(b), 318(4), and 319(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). The investigation led the police to Sector-7, Dwarka, New Delhi, where the accused were arrested.

Following legal procedures, the entire amount was successfully recovered and returned to the victim. The Hyderabad police have urged citizens to remain cautious while engaging in financial transactions online and report suspicious activities immediately.

After a brief relief due to thunderstorms and hailstorms, the heat is set to return across the state. The IMD forecast indicates that dry weather will persist, with temperatures ex-

pected to rise by 2°C to 3°C over the next few

The districts likely to experience extreme heat include Adilabad, Kothagudem, Jagtial, Jayashankar Bhupalapally, Jogulamba Gadwal, Khammam, Kumuram Bheem Asifabad, Mancherial, Mulugu, Nagarkurnool, Narayanpet, Nirmal, Nizamabad, Peddapalli, and Wanaparthy. Other districts will see temperatures between 36°C and 40°C.

On Wednesday, Adilabad recorded 41°C, while Kumuram Bheem Asifabad, Nizamabad, and Wanaparthy touched 40.9°C. Bhadradri Kothagudem, Kamareddy, Nirmal, Mancherial, and Nalgonda also registered temperatures above 40°C. Hyderabad and its surrounding districts hovered between 38°C and 39°C.

With temperatures set to rise further, residents are advised to take necessary precautions to avoid heat-related illnesses.

Kaushik Reddy accuses CM of misleading **Assembly on defections**

BRS MLA Padi Kaushik Reddy on Thursday strongly objected to Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy's remarks on the MLAs' disqualification case in the Supreme Court, accusing him of mocking the judiciary and misleading the Assembly on the issue of defections.

Speaking to media persons in the Assembly, Kaushik Reddy asserted that by-elections were inevitable and expressed confidence that the apex court would rule in BRS's favor. He vowed to continue raising the issue

until the defected BRS MLAs were disqualified.

The BRS legislator also took a dig at the Congress government's handling of law and order. He claimed that he received no response when he raised concerns in the Assembly. Referring to the attack on his residence allegedly led by defected MLA Arekapudi Gandhi and his



followers, Kaushik Reddy accused the government of inaction and police of colluding with ruling party leaders. He demanded strict action against officers who aided the attackers.

"If MLAs are not safe, what is the plight of common people?" he questioned, further alleging that despite filing a complaint about his phone being tapped, authorities had taken no action. He urged the Congress government to focus on fulfilling its poll promises instead of targeting opposition leaders.

HC Questions SBI Over Role in ₹5 Crore Cyber Fraud Case

The Telangana High Court has raised serious concerns over the role of banks in cyber fraud cases, specifically questioning the State Bank of India (SBI) Keezhmad branch in Ernakulam, Kerala, over a ₹5 crore cyber scam executed within a single day.

Justice NV Shravan Kumar has directed the SBI branch manager to submit an explanation within two weeks regarding compliance with Reserve Bank of India (RBI) norms when allowing a fraudulent entity to open a current account.

The case stems from a writ petition filed by 80-yearold AV Mohan Rao from Gopanapally, Hyderabad, who fell victim to a digital arrest fraud scheme. The fraudsters coerced him into transferring ₹50 lakh, which was later traced to an SBI account registered under the name Bharat Enterprises. Investigations revealed that the account had been used to siphon off ₹5 crore from multiple victims across the country in a single day.

Expressing deep concern over the bank's apparent inaction, Justice Kumar questioned why no alarms were raised when such a large sum was deposited and rapidly withdrawn within 24 hours. The court has now mandated the SBI branch manager to submit an additional affidavit detailing the adherence to RBI's regulatory protocols during the account opening process. The response is expected by April 5.

According to cyber police reports, Mohan Rao transferred ₹50 lakh via RTGS from his Punjab National Bank account in Yusufguda, Hyderabad, to the Bharat Enterprises account at SBI Keezhmad on September 10, 2024. The funds were withdrawn almost immediately, with only ₹50 lakh remaining in the account before it was frozen.

SBI officials confirmed that the account saw a sudden spike in transactions, reaching ₹5.5 crore before the funds were depleted. However, the bank expressed confusion over multiple court orders directing the release of funds to various victims, stating that it could not comply due to the diminished balance and the lack of clear instructions on prioritizing the orders.

Further hearings in the case will determine SBI's accountability and the possible recovery of funds for the

Telangana to Get 14 New Excise Police Stations from April 1


The Telangana government has approved the establishment of 14 new excise police stations as part of efforts to curb illegal alcohol, marijuana, and narcotics trade in the state. Of these, 13 stations will be set up in Hyderabad, while one will be established in Waran-

The proposal for these excise police stations was initially made in 2020 but faced multiple delays. Now, under the leadership of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, the green signal has been given, with orders issued to make the stations operational from April 1. Minister Jupally Krishna Rao, Principal Secretary Rizvi, and Commissioner Chevvuru Hari Kiran have formally approved the proposal.

Additional Commissioner of the Excise Department Ajay Rao has instructed the concerned Deputy Commissioners to take necessary steps for the immediate functioning of the new stations. Preparations such as the division of stations, selection of areas, and staff transfers have already been completed.

In Hyderabad, rented buildings have been secured for stations in Banjara Hills, Chikkadapally, Gandipet, Kondapur, Pedda Amberpet, Kukatpally, Aminpur, and Hasanparthi. However, suitable premises are yet to be found for the stations in Maredpally, Meerpet, Kompally, Kapra, Nacharam, and Alwal. Until dedicated spaces are secured, these stations will operate from separate rooms within existing excise police stations.

Officials believe that once these new stations are fully operational, they will enhance enforcement and provide better services in tackling illicit liquor and drug-related activities.



Govt to Disburse ₹1 Lakh Crore Through 'Stree Nidhi'

Can the Real BRICS+ Please Stand Up?

For decades, the Western-led struction of the Bretton Woods global order has dictated the rules of the game, often sidelining emerging economies despite their growing economic influence. However, with cracks forming in the transatlantic alliance and a shifting global balance of power, the BRICS+ bloc finds itself at a critical juncture. Will it finally step up as a geopolitical force, or will it remain an economic powerhouse with little political clout?

The West in Disarray—A **Perfect Opening for** BRICS+?

The U.S. decision to exclude Europe from peace talks with Russia over Ukraine stunned the continent, exposing a brutal truth—Europe had taken transatlantic unity for granted, assuming the U.S. would always have its back. When Trump doubled down, he not only praised Putin but pushed Ukraine towards a ceasefire, leaving European leaders scrambling. The European Parliament labeled this move "blackmail," with even far-right lawmakers—usually Trump's biggest supporters condemning it.

This disarray presents an opportunity for BRICS+. The bloc, which expanded to ten members last year, has long been perceived as an alternative to Western dominance. Contrary to the West's portrayal of BRICS as an anti-Western alliance, the group isn't trying to dismantle the current order—it merely seeks a fair seat at the table. In its Kazan summit, BRICS didn't demand the de-

system but advocated for reforms that would make global finance more inclusive.

Yet, while BRICS+ has economic muscle, its political impact remains questionable. With the West fumbling, will BRICS seize the moment, or will it let another opportunity slip through its fingers?

BRICS+ By the Numbers—An Economic Powerhouse

Despite its political inertia, BRICS+ is an economic giant. It represents 3.6 billion people nearly 47% of the global population. It accounts for 36% of global GDP at purchasing power parity (PPP), surpassing the G7's 30%. By 2050, projections indicate BRICS+ will control half of global wealth production, while the G7's share will shrink to 20%.

The bloc also dominates global trade, industrial production, and resource control:

- 38.3% of global industrial
- output 25% of global goods ex-
- Nearly 40% of global in-
- frastructure investments 54% of global oil production, 53% of natural gas reserves, and 40% of coal reserves
- Nearly 50% of global food production

Yet, despite these staggering figures, BRICS+ still struggles to assert itself in global institutions dominated by the West. It talks about reducing dependence on the IMF and World



Bank, yet lacks decisive action. **Bold Talk, Weak Action**

Russia's Finance Minister Anton Siluanov recently proposed a BRICS alternative to the IMF and World Bank, complete with its own rating agency and commodities exchange. Yet, other BRICS+ members responded with ambiguity. While the bloc has its own New Development Bank (NDB) and has taken steps toward de-dollarisation, its commitment wavers under Western pressure. When Trump pushed back against de-dollarisation, BRICS nations quickly softened their stance, clarifying they weren't aiming to replace the dollar—just "exploring options."

This hesitation extends beyond finance. When major global crises unfold, BRICS+ often remains silent, undermining its These aren't isolated ingeopolitical credibility. Consider these missed opportunities:

- Syria's Political Vacuum: When the Islamist militant group HTS toppled the Bashar al-Assad regime, Western powers swiftly backed a new coalition to reshape Syria. BRICS nations, despite their stance against Western interventionism, largely stayed on the sidelines instead of stepping in as a counterweight. South Africa's Diplomat-
- ic Snub: When the U.S. abruptly expelled South Africa's ambassador citing vague accusations of anti-American sentiment—BRICS nations remained quiet. Trump has long accused South

Africa of mistreating its white minority, even offering U.S. citizenship as a political stunt. The real reason behind the expulsion? Many suspect South Africa's legal challenge against Israel at the ICC. Despite being a founding **BRICS** member, South Africa received no vocal support from its allies. Ukraine Conflict Mediation: While Trump has positioned himself as a broker for peace, Europe remains adamantly pro-war, amplifying fears over Russia. BRICS+ could have stepped up as a mediator, supporting diplomatic efforts rather than passively observing. Instead, it chose inaction.

A Test of Political Will

Trump's return to the White House signals greater hostility toward BRICS. His "America First" approach dismisses multilateralism and openly challenges China and Russia—two key BRICS players. Unlike NATO or the G7, BRICS lacks a common security framework, making it economically formidable but diplomatically weak. It has failed to act decisively in global conflicts, appearing passive rather than proactive.

- Accelerate De-dollarisation Efforts: Move beyond rhetoric and expand local currency trade mechanisms.

The West's influence is waning, and the transatlantic alliance is more fractured than ever. This should be BRICS' moment to step up. Yet, if it continues to avoid difficult geopolitical battles, it risks becoming nothing more than an elite trade club—economically significant but politically irrelevant.

The world is shifting. The question is: will BRICS+ shift with it or let another defining moment pass it by?







Banking Bill Passed, Opposition Calls for Review

- Banking Bill passed, allows four nominees
- Strict action promised on bank frauds

Parliament on Wednesday passed the Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024, allowing bank account holders to nominate up to four individuals. The Bill had earlier been approved by the Lok Sabha in December 2024. While the government lauded the amendments as progressive, opposition members raised concerns and called for a more indepth review of its implications. During the debate in the Rajya Sabha, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman emphasized the government's commitment to strengthening the banking sector. She noted that while non-performing assets (NPAs) have reduced significantly, stringent action against wilful defaulters remains a priority. She highlighted that in the past five years, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) has taken up over 912 cases related to bank fraud, including those involving defaulters. Addressing concerns about loan write-offs, Sitharaman clarified that they do not equate to loan waivers, as banks continue efforts to recover outstanding amounts. She also underscored the robust performance of public sector banks, which

recorded their highest-ever profit of approximately ₹1.41 lakh crore in the last fiscal year. She expressed confidence that profitability would further increase in 2025-26. One of the major amendments in the Bill is the revision of the definition of "substantial interest" in a bank. The threshold, previously set at ₹5 lakh nearly six decades ago, has now been raised to ₹2 crore. Additionally, the Bill proposes increasing the tenure of directors (excluding the chairman and whole-time directors) in cooperative banks from eight years to ten years. This change aligns with the Constitution's Ninety-Seventh Amendment Act, 2011, and allows directors of Central Cooperative Banks to serve on State Cooperative Bank boards. The Bill also grants banks greater flexibility in deciding the remuneration of statutory auditors. More than 20 MPs participated in the four-hour discussion, with some arguing that the Bill does not fully address the evolving financial landscape. While the government defends it as a necessary reform, the opposition insists on a more thorough evaluation of its long-term impact.



GE Aerospace Delivers First F404 Engines for Tejas MK-1A Jets

Aerospace has delivered the first of 99 F404-IN20 engines to Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) for the Tejas Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Mk-1A program. These engines will power India's indigenously developed fighter jets, a key component of the Indian Air Force (IAF) fleet. HAL signed a ₹48,000 crore deal with the Indian defense ministry in 2021 for the production of 83 Tejas Mk-1A jets. The deliveries were scheduled to begin in March 2024 but were delayed, partly due to setbacks in engine supply. With the arrival of the engines, HAL is expected to begin handing over the aircraft to the IAF. The F404-IN20 engine, a custom design for India's single-engine fighter program, features the highest thrust in the F404 family, a higher-flow fan, and advanced single-crystal turbine blades. GE Aerospace has worked closely with HAL

After delays, American defense major GE over the years to tailor the engine for Tejas. GE initially supplied 65 F404-IN20 engines by 2016 but had to shut down its production line due to a lack of new orders. When HAL placed an order for 99 additional engines in 2021, GE faced challenges in restarting production, which had been dormant for five years. The COVID-19 pandemic further complicated the process. Now operational again, the production line will ensure a steady supply of engines. The Tejas aircraft, designed for air combat, offensive air support, reconnaissance, and anti-ship roles, is expected to become a mainstay of the IAF. Additionally, India's defense ministry has approved the procurement of 97 more Tejas jets, reinforcing the country's indigenous defense capabilities. GE Aerospace remains committed to maintaining high safety and quality standards as production ramps up.

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar acknowledged on Wednesday that India and China will continue to face challenges in their relationship in the foreseeable future. However, he emphasized that these issues can be managed through diplomatic channels and do not necessarily have to escalate into conflict. His remarks came a day after an Indian delegation held discussions with a Chinese team on cross-border cooperation during a border talks meeting. Speaking at an event organized by the Asia Society in New Delhi, Jaishankar underlined the importance of maintaining a balanced approach in handling the relationship between the two nations. "We have basically made two points: first, that differences should not become disputes, and second, that competition should not lead to conflict. We do compete on many issues, but competition alone should not be a reason for conflict between us. We are very said in his conversation with Kyung-wha Kang, President of the Asia Society. Reflecting on past events, he stated that while disputes are likely to persist between the two countries, there are diplomatic mechanisms in

US President Donald Trump has announced a 25% tariff on auto imports, effective from April, with an additional 25% tariff on major automotive parts—including engines, transmissions, powertrain components, and electrical parts—set to be implemented by May. This move is expected to impact Indian auto component manufacturers more than vehicle manufacturers, according to industry experts. Prior to this decision, the US imposed nearly zero tariffs on imported automotive components. India's auto component exports to the US amounted to \$6.79 billion in FY24, while imports from the US were valued at \$1.4 billion with a 15% duty. With the new tariffs, Indian suppliers may face challenges in maintaining their competitiveness in the American market. An industry executive, speaking anonymously to PTI, noted that Indian automakers are unlikely to be significantly affected since there are no direct exports of fully built cars from India to the US. However, Indian auto component manufacturers, who play a crucial role in the global supply chain, are expected to bear the brunt of these tariffs. JATO Dynamics India President and Director Ravi G Bhatia stated that India has not been specifically targeted by these tariffs, which apply to multiple countries.

Japan Vows to Explore All Options in

Response to U.S. 25% **Tariff on Auto Imports**

Japanese Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba responded to the U.S. announcement of a 25% tariff on automobile imports by stating that Japan would consider "all options on the table" in addressing the issue. U.S. President Donald Trump revealed the tariff on imported cars and light trucks starting next week, marking a significant escalation in the global trade tensions that have been a hallmark of his administration.

In a statement to parliament on Thursday, Ishiba highlighted Japan's substantial investments in the United States, emphasizing that Japan is the largest investor in the U.S. "Japan is making significant investments in the United States and creating jobs," he noted. He also questioned the fairness of applying uniform tariffs to all countries, considering Japan's sizable contribution to the U.S. economy.

Ishiba's remarks reflect the concern that the new tariff could significantly impact Japan's economy, particularly its automobile industry. According to data from Japan's Ministry of Finance, automobiles made up 28.3% of Japan's total exports to the United States in 2024, the largest share of any export category. This heavy reliance on U.S. auto exports makes the potential tariffs a major economic challenge for Japan.

While Ishiba did not provide specific details on Japan's response, he assured that the government would prioritize Japan's national interests in deciding on the most effective course of action. "We need to consider what's best for Japan's national interest," he said. "We're putting all options on the table in considering the most effective response."

This announcement comes amid rising trade tensions between the U.S. and other global powers, and analysts suggest that Japan's auto industry could face significant setbacks from these new tariffs. The situation underscores the complexities of global trade relations and the economic implications of President Trump's protectionist policies.



"Have Zero Tolerance": US Cancels 2,000 Visa Appointments By "Bots" In India

The US Embassy in India has cancelled over 2,000 visa applications following the detection of fraud-related activities involving bots and other "bad actors." On Wednesday, the embassy confirmed that it had identified major violations in its appointment scheduling system and suspended the accounts of those responsible.

"Consular Team India is cancelling about 2,000 visa appointments made by bots. We have zero tolerance for agents and fixers that violate our scheduling policies," the embassy stated in a post on X. It added that all affected appointments have been cancelled and the associated accounts' scheduling privileges have been suspended with immediate effect.

The issue comes amid significant backlogs in visa applications, especially for B1 and B2 visas, which are for business and tourism purposes. The waiting times for these visas had reached up to 1,000 days in



2022–23. In response, the US began lays were a result of the Covid–19 offering visa appointments for Indian applicants in cities like Frankfurt and Bangkok.

The visa delays have been a longstanding concern, prompting External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar to raise the issue with US officials. In 2022, during a meeting with US Secretary of State Antony Blinken, Jaishankar was told that the de-

pandemic. The issue was revisited in January 2024 when Jaishankar discussed it with US Senator Marco Rubio, noting the negative impact of long waiting periods on India-US relations.

Beyond business and tourism visas, student visa rejections have also increased sharply. During the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the US received 6.79

In contrast, in 2014, the rejection rate was just 15%. Reports indicate that Indian students faced a 38% drop in visa approvals in 2024 compared to the previous year, further impacting the flow of international students to the US.

"Not Closed All **Doors**": Iran Ready For **Indirect Talks With US,** Says Khamenei's Aide

Kamal Kharrazi, an adviser to Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, stated on Thursday that Tehran has not closed the door on resolving its disputes with the United States and is open to indirect negotiations. This shift in tone comes despite Iran's previous firm stance against U.S. President Donald Trump's ultimatum, which demanded a deal or military consequences.

Iran has long rejected Trump's warnings, with Khamenei labeling them deceptive and Foreign Minister Abbas Araqchi insisting that talks are impossible unless the U.S. alters its "maximum pressure" policy. However, Kharrazi's comments, made to the semi-official Iranian Students News Agency, indicate that Iran is willing to explore indirect talks to evaluate the U.S. position, present its own conditions, and ultimately make a decision based on those discussions.

The backdrop of this development includes the fallout from Trump's 2018 decision to withdraw from the 2015 nuclear deal, an agreement aimed at curbing Iran's nuclear activities in exchange for sanctions relief. Following the U.S. withdrawal, Iran began exceeding the deal's restrictions, particularly in its uranium enrichment program, leading to heightened concerns from Western powers about Tehran's potential to develop nuclear weapons.

While the U.S. insists that Iran's nuclear ambitions are geared toward weaponization, Iran maintains that its nuclear program is for peaceful civilian energy purposes.

Tata Motors Raises ₹2,000 Crore **Through Private Placement of NCDs Amid Market Setback**



Tata Motors, a leading blue-chip auto company, announced on Thursday, March 27, that its board had approved the allotment of 2,00,000 non-convertible debentures (NCDs) worth ₹2,000 crore on a private placement basis. This move is part of the company's ongoing efforts to bolster its financial position.

The company detailed in a filing that the Board constituted Committee approved the allotment of the NCDs, each with a face value of ₹1,00,000. The NCDs will be issued in multiple series/tranches and are set to be listed on the National Stock Exchange (NSE). The debentures have been assigned an AA+/ Stable rating by Crisil, indicating their relatively low risk.

The allotment was made across three tranches. In Tranche I, 50,000 NCDs were allocated to HDFC Bank, while Tranche II saw allocations of 10,000 NCDs to Reliance General Insurance Company and 60,000 NCDs to BNP Paribas. Tranche III involved the issuance of 2,500 NCDs to Care Health Insur-

ance, 52,500 NCDs to HDFC Bank, 5,000 NCDs to Reliance General Insurance Company, and 20,000 NCDs to SBI Short Term Debt Fund.

The company had earlier approved the issuance of these NCDs with a coupon rate of 7.65% on March 19.

Despite this positive fundraising update, Tata Motors faced significant challenges in the stock market. Its shares saw a sharp decline, dropping as much as 6.5% during the trading session, and settling at ₹668.60, a 5.56% drop from the previous day's close. The slump came after US President Donald Trump announced the imposition of 25% tariffs on all imported cars and auto parts, effective from April 2. This development is particularly concerning for Tata Motors, as the US is a key market for its Jaguar Land Rover (JLR) luxury cars, which could face higher costs due to the tariffs.

This setback is compounded by a slowdown in domestic sales, adding further pressure to the company's stock performance.

India to Double Investment Cap for Foreign Individual Investors to 10%

India's central bank is poised to raise the investment cap for individual foreign investors in listed Indian companies from 5% to 10%. This move is aimed at boosting foreign capital inflows, following a significant outflow of over \$28 billion from Indian stocks since September, driven by factors such as high valuations, poor earnings, and concerns over U.S. tariffs.

In response to this outflow, India is expanding investment benefits that were previously restricted to overseas Indians, while also increasing the limits for foreign investors. Senior government officials and documents reviewed by Reuters revealed that the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is pushing for the implementation of these changes as soon as possible to address disruptions in capital inflows from the external sector.

As part of these reforms, foreign individual investors will be allowed to



invest up to 10% in any listed Indian company, up from the previous 5% cap that applied only to non-resident Indians (NRIs) and overseas citizens of India (OCIs) under the Foreign Exchange Management Act (FEMA). Additionally, the combined holding limit for all foreign individual investors in an Indian listed company will increase from 10% to 24%, officials stated.

These changes are still under discussion between the government, the RBI, and the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI). However, SEBI has expressed concerns about monitoring compliance with foreign investment limits. The market regulator has warned that a single foreign investor or their associates could hold a stake greater than 34%, potentially triggering takeover rules, which would require an open offer for shares held by retail investors.

The government and regulators are currently evaluating these concerns and working on streamlining the rules to prevent potential regulatory arbitrage by foreign investors. Once the rules are finalized, they are expected to facilitate increased foreign investment in Indian listed companies, which is seen as crucial to support the country's economic growth.

Auto stocks slump on Trump tariff; Tata Motors tanks over 6%

Thursday, March 27, 2025, with Tata Motors leading the fall, plunging over 6% after U.S. President Donald Trump announced the imposition of a 25% tariff on auto imports starting in April. Shares of Tata Motors dropped 6.58%, closing at ₹661.35 on the Bombay Stock Exchange

Other auto companies also faced downward pressure, with Ashok Leyland falling by 4.60%, Mahindra & Mahindra dipping 1.70%, Bajaj Auto slipping 1.48%, and Apollo Tyres losing 1.41%. The BSE auto index was down by 0.86%, settling at 48,286.47.

The negative reaction was largely attributed to Trump's decision to impose a 25% duty on all car imports to the U.S., a move expected to significantly impact Tata Motors, which exports a large portion of its Jaguar Land Rover (JLR) vehicles to the U.S. V.K. Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strategist at Geojit Investments Limited, noted that Tata Motors would be directly affected by these tariffs, given its reliance on U.S. exports for its luxury car brand.

In addition to the auto tariffs, Trump also announced that further 25% tariffs would be levied on major automotive parts, including engines, transmissions, and electrical components, starting in



May. These tariffs are expected to add more pressure to auto-related stocks and the broader industry.

Despite the challenges in the auto sector, the broader equity market showed resilience. The BSE Sensex rose 427.54 points to reach 77,716.04, and the NSE Nifty climbed 135.30 points to settle at 23,622.15, recovering from early losses.





"Instagram Removes Content **Notes Feature for Low Engagement**"

Tnstagram has decided to dis-**L**continue its Content Notes feature for posts and Reels due to low user adoption. The feature, introduced in July 2024, allowed users to add temporary notes to their individual posts, photo carousels, and Reels. These notes were visible only to followers for a period of three days. Despite the initial aim of making Instagram a more interactive and social platform, the feature did not gain significant traction among users, prompting its removal. Instagram head Adam Mosseri announced the decision in a post, stating that the company introduced Content Notes to enhance engagement and create a fun way for users to share additional context on their posts. However, as the feature failed to attract widespread usage, Instagram has decided to discontinue it for posts and Reels. While the platform regularly tests new tools and features to improve the user experience, not all experiments resonate with the community. The removal of Content Notes is part of Instagram's ongoing process of refining its offerings based on user behavior and feedback.



Despite its discontinuation for posts and Reels, the Content Notes feature will remain available in Instagram DMs. In this space, the feature might still serve as a useful tool for users who want to share quick, temporary updates with friends. Instagram has not disclosed whether it plans to enhance or modify Content Notes in DMs to encourage more engagement. This decision aligns with Instagram's broader strategy of focusing on features that drive high engagement. Over the years, the platform has introduced and removed several features based on user reception. Some tools gain popularity and become inte-

gral to the app, while others do not achieve the desired impact and are eventually phased out. The removal of Content Notes reflects Instagram's adaptability in responding to user preferences and prioritizing features that contribute to a more engaging social experience. As Instagram continues evolving, users can expect further refinements to existing features and the introduction of new tools aimed at enhancing interaction. While Content Notes did not gain widespread acceptance, Instagram remains committed to exploring innovative ways to improve user engagement and keep the platform dynamic.

OpenAl Restricts ChatGPT's New Image Generation Tool to Paid Users

OpenAI has decided to limit access to ChatGPT's latest image-generation feature to paid users, despite initially planning to make it available for free-tier users as well. The company cited overwhelming popularity as the reason behind this decision, stating that demand far exceeded their expectations. The image-generation tool, powered by OpenAI's advanced GPT-40 model, was expected to be accessible to all users. However, on Monday, OpenAI CEO Sam Altman announced on X (formerly Twitter) that the rollout for free users would be delayed. In his post, he acknowledged the unexpectedly high demand, stating, "Images in ChatGPT are wayyyy more popular than we expected (and we had pretty high expectations). Rollout to our free tier is unfortunately going to be delayed for a while." As of now, only users subscribed to ChatGPT Plus or Pro can access

the new image-generation feature. The Plus subscription is priced at \$20 per month, while the Pro plan costs \$200. This means that free-tier users will have to wait indefinitely before they can use the tool, as OpenAI has not provided a timeline for its availability. Locking features behind a paywall is not uncommon in the tech industry. Many companies implement similar strategies when a tool or service becomes highly popular, requiring additional resources to maintain. OpenAI's decision follows this trend, prioritizing premium users while limiting access for those on the free plan. The image-generation tool has

gained significant attention for its ability to produce stunning, high-quality visuals, including artistic renderings in styles reminiscent of Studio Ghibli. Given its capabilities, many users were eager to try it out, making the restriction a disappointment for those who had anticipated its free release. For now, OpenAI remains focused on managing the demand and ensuring a smooth experience for its paying customers. While there is hope that free users will eventually gain access, the company has not confirmed when or if the feature will be made available without a subscription


L2: Empuraan Review – High on Style, Low on Substance
