US SC Rejects Plea of 26/11 Attack Accused Tahawwur Rana Against Extradition to India

The US Supreme Court on Thursday rejected the plea of Tahawwur Rana, a key figure linked to the 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks, who sought to block his extradition to India. The decision comes just days after US President Donald Trump approved the extradition process during his meeting with Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Rana, 64, a former associate of Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorist David Headley, has been accused of playing a crucial role in the 2008 Mumbai attacks, which killed over 170 people. He is currently serving time at a Los Angeles detention center after completing a 14-year sentence related to the attacks.

The US Supreme Court's ruling effectively clears the way for Rana's extradition to India. Despite this, Rana's legal team has raised concerns about his potential treatment in India, arguing that he could face mistreatment or even torture due to his background and associations, which include his links to LeT and the Pakistan Army. Rana had previously filed an emergency application seeking a stay on his extradition, but the court denied it, further solidifying the decision for his extradition.

Rana's legal representatives had argued that his extradition would violate international laws protecting individuals from torture, and they also claimed that his deteriorating health might prevent him from surviving long enough to face trial in India. Despite these claims, the Supreme Court has moved forward with the extradition process, following earlier decisions from lower courts that had also ruled in favor of Rana's transfer to India.

Rana's case has garnered significant international attention, especially following the approval of his extradition by President Trump during his talks with Prime Minister Modi. The extradition is a major step in holding Rana accountable for his role in one of the deadliest terrorist attacks in India's history.

Fulfil promise to give **Rs 2,500 to women:** Atishi to Delhi CM

During the run-up to the February 5 Delhi Assembly polls, the BJP had promised Rs 2,500 per month for women, surpassing the AAP's offer of Rs 2,100. This pledge was a significant part of the BJP's campaign, which ultimately resulted in a decisive victory. The BJP secured 48 out of the 70 seats, while AAP was reduced to just 22.

Karnataka Budget balances between growth and welfare

No new taxes introduced, but professional tax increased

Chief Minister Siddaramaiah presented Karnataka's 16th state budget in the Legislative Assembly on Friday, emphasizing a balance between economic growth and social welfare, particularly for women and children. The budget's central theme revolves around the Congress government's guarantee-led model, which aims to boost private sector investment while prioritizing resources for the underprivileged.

A significant ₹1,56,117 crore has been allocated to women and children-focused programs, accounting for 38% of the total budget outlay. The budget also provides ₹51,034 crore for five welfare guarantees, ensuring equitable wealth distribution.

Notably, the budget did not announce any new taxes, except for a slight increase in the professional tax for salary and wage earners from ₹200 to ₹300 per month to align with a maximum yearly limit of ₹2,500. Karnataka's budget size has crossed ₹4 lakh crore for the first time, reaching ₹4,09,549 crore.

While the budget revealed a revenue deficit of ₹19,262 crore and a borrowing estimate of ₹1,16,000 crore (28% of the total

budget size), it also highlights key developments, such as a 4% growth in the agriculture sector after a 4.9% decline the previous year. The industrial sector grew by 5.8%, while the services sector showed an 8.9% growth, contributing to the state's GSDP growth of 7.4%, outpacing the national average of 6.4%.

To improve the welfare of the low-salaried class, the budget proposed increased honorariums for various workers, including guest lecturers, ASHA and anganwadi workers, and cooks in government schools. It also proposed initiatives to support women's SHGs, including the creation of Akka Cooperative Societies and Akka Cafes in local offices.

Karnataka's contribution to the national GDP stood at 8.4% in 2024-25, with exports growing by 11.17%. The budget also included allocations for minority, OBC, and tribal welfare, and a ₹1,000 crore Local Economy Accelerator Programme to stimulate entrepreneurship in smaller towns.

With a focus on fiscal discipline, the budget has kept borrowing and fiscal deficit within permissible limits, aiming for a revenue surplus in the coming year.

Bengal Governor Calls Emergency Meeting After Violent Clashes at Jadavpur University



In the aftermath of violent clashes at Ja-University, davpur where Bengal Minister Bratya Basu was heckled by protesting students, West Bengal Governor Dr. CV Ananda Bose convened an emergency meeting with vice-chancellors to address the situation. The meeting,

scheduled for Friday, comes after the Governor received detailed reports from the officiating Vice-Chancellor of Jadavpur University, as well as from students and faculty members.

lor of Jadavpur University, stated that a fact-finding committee would be set up to investigate the events surrounding the clashes. The committee will look into all aspects of the issue, aiming to provide a comprehensive understanding of the incident.

The violence erupted on March 1 when members of CPI(M)'s student wing, SFI, and the Naxalite-affiliated AISA surrounded Minister Basu's convoy. During the protest, the protesters damaged the windscreen of Basu's vehicle while demanding the immediate announcement of student union poll dates in Bengal. As tensions escalated, the students blocked the vehicle,



deflated its tires, and prevented the minister from leaving the campus. Basu sustained injuries from shattered glass and was later rushed to the SSKM Hospital for treatment.

Dr. Bose, who also serves as the Chancel- In connection with the incident, the Kolkata Police have filed an FIR against Basu, his car driver, and Trinamool Congress leader Om Prakash Mishra. The FIR was based on a complaint by an injured student who alleged that Basu's car caused his injuries during the protest. The Calcutta High Court also reprimanded the state police for their failure to control the violence during the clashes.

> As of now, seven FIRs have been lodged, including one related to the ransacking and arson at the Sikkha Bondhu teachers' union office, which was set on fire during the protests. One individual was arrested on Sunday in connection with the incident and remanded in custody until March 12.

Producers of the show, Saurabh Bothra and Tushar Poojari, as well as the legal representatives of Jaspreet Singh and Ashish Chanchlani, also appeared before the NCW to discuss the issue. They assured the panel that the creators would be more responsible going forward and would strive to avoid any further controversies.

While the creators have now expressed regret, the incident has raised concerns about the responsibility of content creators in the digital age, particularly when their words and actions have a significant impact on their audience. The NCW's involvement highlights the growing importance of regulating online content, especially when it comes to language that could be deemed offensive or inappropriate.





Delhi BJP Government to Launch Mahila Samriddhi **Scheme on Women's Day**



- BJP to launch ₹2,500/month Mahila Samriddhi Scheme

The newly formed BJP government in Delhi is all set to launch the Mahila Samriddhi Scheme, fulfilling its electoral promise to provide Rs 2,500 per month to eligible women. Prime Minister Narendra Modi fer (DBT). Some beneficiaries had given a one-month deadline for the implementation of the scheme after the government assumed office.

The registration for the scheme will begin on March 8, in celebration of International Women's Day. He explained that sometimes divisional commissioners may stay schemes if they do not meet Central government guidelines, and it was wrongly attributed to him. Fadnavis also highlighted the significant electoral mandate the Mahayuti government received in the previous year's assembly elections, asserting

trust in the coalition to fulfill their aspirations.

Fadnavis outlined the 100day action plan for improving governance, emphasizing better office records and people-friendly services. The Quality Council of India (QCI) will evaluate departments on their performance, with top performers being felicitated on May 1. Additionally, he announced that the Metro 3 line in Mumbai, the longest underground metro line in India, would be fully operational by June 2025, with all metro lines expected to be functional by 2027.

The chief minister also targeted opposition parties for allegedly praising Gujarat's investment achievements, asserting that Maharashtra attracts three times the investment of its neighboring state. He further discussed the proposed 802-kilometer Nagpur-Goa Shaktipeeth Expressway, which aims to connect key regions of Maharashtra and boost economic development in Marathwada. Despite facing opposition in Kolhapur, Fadnavis reported that local farmers had shown support for the project.

Congress Lok Sabha MP Karti Chidambaram on Friday reiterated that Tamil Nadu does not need a compulsory third language, asserting that the state's current two-language curriculum—Tamil and English—is sufficient. Chidambaram's statement came in response to

Chidambaram further warned that if Tamil Nadu were to accept Hindi as the third language, it could lead to a shortage of Hindi teachers within the state. "The BJP government will eventually claim a shortage of Hindi teachers and would bring in non-native speakers to work in Tamil Nadu's government schools," he



TPN Correspondent| Delhi Congress General Secretary Jairam Ramesh on Friday took a sharp dig at Prime Minister Narendra Modi, accusing him of focusing more on receiving praise ("tareef") rather than addressing critical issues like tariffs. Speaking in an interview with PTI, Ramesh said that the Congress party would raise the issue of US President Donald Trump's reciprocal tariff threats in the upcoming Budget session of Parliament. He called for a "bipartisan collective resolve to deal with these threats."

Prime Minister's obsession with praise was overshadowing the real issue of tariffs, particularly in light of Trump's recent statements. He remarked, "Our Prime Minister wants to hear only 'tareef', but he is not concerned about tariffs. 'Tareef kum, aur tariff pe baat kijiye' (talk about tariffs and less about praise)."

Referring to Trump's decision statement about his strength. to impose reciprocal tariffs, Ramesh criticized the US President's approach to international trade, calling it "bizarre." He pointed out that the rules of international trade have been negotiated over years and agreed upon by 170 coun-

tries through the World Trade Organization (WTO) in 1995. Ramesh argued that Trump's "You tariff, I tariff" strategy is not how global trade functions and emphasized that the WTO is the governing body, not "World Trump Organization."

Trump recently criticized India and other countries for imposing high tariffs on US goods, announcing that reciprocal tariffs would be implemented starting April 2. Ramesh condemned this approach, asserting that India should not be subjected to such threats.

Ramesh highlighted that the The Congress leader also took aim at Modi's handling of relations with the US. He questioned Modi's silence on the issue of Indian citizens being deported from the US, and accused the Prime Minister of being overly deferential to Trump. "The Prime Minister is busy hugging Trump, but where is his '56-inch chest' now?" Ramesh asked, referencing Modi's often-quoted

Amit Shah Urges Tamil Nadu to Introduce Courses in Tamil Amid Hindi Row

Hours after Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin accused the Centre of imposing Hindi on non-Hindi speakers, Home Minister Amit Shah urged the state government to introduce medical and engineering courses in Tamil. Shah claimed that Stalin had not done enough on this front and praised Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government for implementing key policy changes that promote regional languages.

Shah emphasized that the Modi government had allowed recruitment in Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) exams to be conducted in 13 regional languages, including Tamil. "Prime Minister Modi decided that our youth will now be able to write their CAPF exam in all languages in the Eighth Schedule, including Tamil," he stated. Shah urged Tamil Nadu's Chief Minister to take immediate steps toward introducing medical and engineering courses in Tamil to further promote re-

gional languages.

This comes after the Centre approved the CAPF examination to be held in Tamil and other regional languages in 2023, shortly after Stalin had protested the Union government's initial move to conduct the exam only in Hindi and English.

Stalin, in a social media post, accused the Union government of attempting to impose Hindi through the National Education Policy (NEP) and criticized the BJP's push for a three-language formula.



He rejected the formula, asserting that Tamil Nadu's existing two-language policy, which includes Tamil and English, has been successful and that there is no need for additional languages. He also challenged the BJP to make the three-language formula a key issue in the 2026 Assembly elections.

Stalin further pointed to historical precedents where attempts to impose Hindi in Tamil Nadu were met with resistance. "Tamil Nadu will not tolerate Hindi colonialism replacing British colonialism," he said, criticizing the Union government for excessively using Hindi in official schemes, awards, and institutions.

In response, Tamil Nadu BJP President K. Annamalai dismissed Stalin's claims, accusing him of staging a "fake drama" over the issue. He claimed that the BJP's signature campaign for the three-language formula had received overwhelming support across Tamil Nadu.

Delhi govt free bus service boosted women's access to job, education: Study

A research paper released on Thursday by the World Resources Institute (WRI) India highlights the positive impact of Delhi's fare-free public transport (FFPT) scheme for women, introduced by the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) in October 2019. The scheme has significantly increased women's access to employment, education, and healthcare, while also enabling them to save money on travel across the capital.

According to the study titled Fare-free Bus Travel Scheme for Women: Lessons from Delhi, women passengers who opted for the free travel scheme reported saving up to 8% of their household income each month. The scheme allows women to travel for free on state-run buses by issuing them a pink single-journey ticket.

Delhi Police Bust Gang Using Children in Wedding Thefts

In a major crackdown, the Delhi Police arrested four members of a gang, including a juvenile, that used children to steal cash and valuables at weddings. The gang, known as the "Band, Baaja and Baarat" gang, lured poor parents from Madhya Pradesh by offering substantial sums of money to allow their children, aged between nine and 15, to participate in thefts at weddings in Delhi and surrounding areas.

The wedding season in Delhi, occurring twice a year in February-March and November-December, serves as the The gang members employed a prime time for the gang's activities, with multiple wed-

dings often occurring on the same day. The gang capitalized on this by targeting these venues and making off with gold, silver, and cash.

According to DCP (Crime Branch) Apoorva Gupta, after receiving a tip-off, the police arrested the gang members near Shastri Park Metro Depot, where they were preparing to leave for their village in Madhya Pradesh. The gang, originally from Gulheri in Rajgarh district, would travel to Delhi NCR and other metro cities during the wedding season to commit their crimes.

well-orchestrated modus operandi. CCTV footage from wedding venues revealed that they blended in with the guests, spending significant time at the venues and waiting patiently for the right moment to strike. They were dressed well to look like part of the crowd and made themselves comfortable, even having dinner at the weddings.

The police investigation uncovered the gang's recruitment process. Parents were offered ₹10-12 lakh for their children to work for the gang for a year. Once the deal was finalized, the children were trained for a month on how to steal discreetly at weddings without drawing attention.

Police recovered ₹2,14,000 in cash, silver anklets, toe rings, a waist chain, and a mobile phone from the gang members. The three adult members arrested—Ajju (24), Kuljeet (22), and Kalu Chhayal (25)had their families in Madhya Pradesh but worked with fake identities in Delhi. The police investigation continues as authorities work to identify other members of the gang involved in thefts at various wedding venues.

In a move aimed at overhauling Delhi's healthcare infrastructure, Delhi Health Minister Pankaj Singh announced on Thursday that around 250 mohalla clinics across the Capital will be shut with immediate effect. This decision is part of the current government's 100-day plan to revamp healthcare services in the city.

Addressing a press conference at the Delhi Secretariat, Singh criticized the previous Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government, which established the mohalla clinics in October 2015 as part of its vision for affordable healthcare. He claimed that many of these clinics were "fraudulent" and only existed on paper. Singh alleged that the clinics were located on rented land, with the rent expenses being misused. He further stated that an order has been passed to close such clinics immediately.

At the time of Singh's announcement, there were 533 mohalla clinics operational in Delhi, according to data from August 2023. However, the Delhi government's move to shut 250 clinics marks a significant shift in healthcare policy in the city.

Singh also hinted at plans to revamp the concept of mohalla clinics, saying that the government intends to rename them as "Ayushman Arogya Mandir" and improve the healthcare services they offer. This rebranding is aimed at enhancing the scope and quality of healthcare provided to Delhi residents.

The AAP, which initially championed the mohalla clinic initiative as a model for providing primary healthcare to underserved communities, has not responded to requests for comment regarding the closures or the proposed changes.

Sri Lankan Navy Arrests Indian **Fishermen in Latest Operation**

The Sri Lankan Navy arrested a group of Indian fishermen during a special operation conducted on Thursday night in the sea area south of Mannar. The fishermen, along with their seized boat, were brought to Talpadu Pier in Mannar. They will be handed over to the Fisheries Inspector of Mannar for further legal action, as stated by the Navy in an official release.

The Navy's ongoing patrols and operations in Sri Lankan waters aim to curb the illegal fishing practices by foreign fishing boats, which have significantly impacted the livelihoods of local Sri Lankan fishermen. These actions are part of Sri Lanka's efforts to protect its maritime resources and ensure the sustainability of its fishing industry.

This arrest follows a similar incident on February 23, when Sri Lankan authorities detained 32 Indian fishermen and seized five boats for allegedly entering Sri Lankan territorial waters. So far, the Sri Lankan Navy has arrested over 140 Indian fishermen this year for alleged illegal fishing in its waters.

In 2024, the Sri Lankan Navy reported that it had arrested more than 550 Indian fishermen in a series of oper-



ations. The fishermen issue remains a sensitive topic between India and Sri Lanka, with frequent incidents of confrontations at sea. On several occasions, Sri Lankan Navy personnel have fired at Indian fishing boats in the Palk Strait and seized their vessels for illegally crossing into Sri Lankan waters.

Karnataka budget outlay crosses **₹4 lakh crore for the first time**

Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah presented the state's budget for the fiscal year 2025-26, marking a historic milestone as the budget outlay crossed ₹4 lakh crore for the first time. The total budget outlay for the upcoming fiscal year has been estimated at ₹4,09,549 crore.

Despite the substantial increase in the budget outlay, the state continues to face a revenue deficit. The budget announced a revenue deficit of ₹19,262 crore, a reduction from last year's ₹27,354 crore deficit in 2024-25. This indicates some improvement in the state's fiscal health, though the deficit remains a concern.



The state's revenue receipts for the year are projected to be ₹2,92,477 crore. Of this, ₹2,08,100 crore will come from the state's own tax revenues, while ₹16,500 crore is expected from non-tax revenues. The Government of India is expected to contribute ₹67,877 crore in receipts.

To manage its financial requirements, the state is expected to rely on gross borrowings amounting to ₹1,16,000 crore. This borrowing strategy, along with revenue generation from taxes and central transfers, will help support the state's developmental and welfare programs throughout the fiscal year.

While the budget has prioritized continued investment in infrastructure, education, and welfare schemes, the reduction in the revenue deficit offers a glimmer of hope for improving Karnataka's fiscal discipline in the coming years. The state government remains committed to ensuring financial stability while addressing the needs of its citizens through various initiatives and projects planned for the year.

Ooha sees change beyond the system, TRANSFORMS ADIVASI LIVES

In a world where success is often measured by power and prestige, just 27 years old, Visakhapatnam's youth Dr. Ooha Mahanthi chose a different path, one defined by service and social justice. Once aspiring to join the civil services, she realised that true transformation happens not behind a desk but at the grassroots level. As the Director of the Rural Development Welfare Society (RDWS), she has dedicated her life to uplifting Adivasi women and children in north coastal Andhra Pradesh placed by natural disasters and abandoned

struggles, and fight for their rights of Adivasi girls and women," she said.

Under her leadership, RDWS with 276 volunteers has prevented over 261 child marriages, reintegrated 6,489 child laborers into education so far, and conducted large-scale health awareness programs on HIV/AIDS, menstrual hygiene, and maternal health. She has led anti-human trafficking initiatives, rescuing vulnerable individuals from exploitation, and provided shelter and relief to families diselderly individuals in need of care.

Omar Abdullah Presents Jammu and Kashmir's First Budget Post-Article 370 Abrogation

Stalin has invited Kerala's Pinarayi Vijayan, Karnataka's Siddaramaiah, Telangana's Revanth Reddy, Andhra Pradesh's Chandrababu Naidu, and Puducherry's N Rangaswamy to a meeting in Chennai on March 22 to form a collective strategy.

In his letter, Stalin criticized the Centre's proposal, calling it an attack on federalism. He emphasized that the delimitation exercise would unfairly penalize states, like Tamil Nadu, that have successfully controlled population growth. The exercise, according to Stalin, would reduce the voice of states that have implemented effective population control measures while benefiting regions with rapidly growing populations, such as BJP-



ruled northern states.

The issue of delimitation is particularly sensitive in Tamil Nadu as the state has been a strong proponent of limiting population growth. Stalin warned that the new exercise, based on current census data, could lead to a reduction in Tamil Nadu's representation in the Lok Sabha, despite the state's long-standing efforts to manage population control. He cited the 2002 amendment, which froze changes to the number of Lok Sabha seats until at least 2026, and called for this freeze to continue.

Stalin also dismissed Union Home

Minister Amit Shah's assurances that southern states would not lose seats, pointing out that the minister did not address the possibility of northern states gaining more seats. The Chief Minister stressed that Tamil Nadu should not be penalized for its success in controlling population growth. The meeting planned for March 22 aims

to unite political leaders across the country to challenge the delimitation process, which Stalin argues could undermine the federal structure and negatively impact Tamil Nadu's interests. The controversy surrounding the exercise is expected to intensify as the state heads toward elections next year.





India, China Ties Made Positive Strides After PM Modi-Xi Meet


- China hails progress in India-China relations post-Ladakh resolution
- Wang Yi credits Modi-Xi talks for improved bilateral ties

Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi on Friday highlighted the positive progress in India-China relations, noting a series of encouraging developments since the breakthrough agreement last year that ended a four-year-long military standoff in eastern Ladakh.

Wang shared these remarks during his annual press conference, addressing questions about the trajectory of bilateral relations following the resolution of the prolonged standoff. He credited the successful meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Xi Jinping in Kazan, Russia, for providing strategic guidance to improve ties.

"China-India relations have made positive strides over the past year," said Wang, emphasizing that both countries had strengthened exchanges and cooperation at all levels, achieving significant outcomes. The breakthrough in Ladakh followed a pact that facilitated the withdrawal of troops from the last remaining friction points, Depsang and Demchok, marking the conclu-



sion of years of military tension.

Following the agreement, talks between Prime Minister Modi and President Xi in October 2023 led to the revival of various dialogue mechanisms. This was followed by key meetings between National Security Advisor Ajit Doval and Wang in December, and a subsequent meeting in January between Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri and Chinese officials in Beijing. Wang reiterated that while border issues were important, they should not define or hinder the overall relationship between the two nations. "As two ancient civilizations, we have enough wisdom to maintain peace and tranquility along the border while seeking a fair and reasonable solution," Wang stated.

He further emphasized that both countries, as large neighbors, should be partners in each other's success, advocating for cooperation instead of competition. "A cooperative partnership between the dragon and the elephant is the only right choice," he said, adding that both countries should work together to oppose hegemonism and power politics, particularly in the context of global affairs.

Looking ahead, Wang expressed China's readiness to work with India to further strengthen diplomatic ties, especially as 2025 marks the 75th anniversary of their diplomatic relations.

Trump Criticizes India's High Tariffs, Announces Reciprocal Tariffs Starting April 2

US President Donald Trump has once again criticized India for its high tariffs, reiterating that reciprocal tariffs on countries imposing levies on American goods will begin on April 2. In an Oval Office address on Thursday, Trump highlighted India as a "very high tariff nation" and emphasized that countries like China and Canada also impose hefty tariffs on US products. Trump expressed his frustration with Canada's trade practices, particularly the 250% tariff on American milk products and lumber. He noted that despite such tariffs, the US doesn't rely on Canadian lumber, claiming that the country has more lumber resources than Canada. Trump's remarks came as he signed executive orders in the Oval Office, ahead of the upcoming



This is the second time in as many days that Trump has criticized India's tariff policies. During his address to the joint session of Congress, Trump singled out India, calling the high tariffs imposed on US goods "very unfair." He also mentioned that countries like the European Union, China, Brazil, Mexico, and Canada charge the US significantly higher tariffs than what the US imposes on them. Trump has previously labeled India a "tariff king" and a "big abuser." He also noted that India's high auto tariffs are over 100%, making it difficult for American products to enter the Indian market. Last month, during a joint press conference with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Trump acknowledged India's strength on tariffs but hinted at potential trade negotiations to address these issues.

Saudi Arabia to Host US-Ukraine Talks in Jeddah Next Week

Saudi Arabia has expressed its readiness to host a meeting between US and Ukrainian officials in Jeddah next week, reaffirming the kingdom's commitment to facilitating peace efforts in the ongoing Ukraine-Russia conflict. The announcement came on Friday from the Saudi Ministry of Foreign Affairs, highlighting the kingdom's continued efforts to achieve a lasting resolution to the crisis.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy confirmed his visit to Saudi Arabia on Thursday, where he will meet with Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman on Monday. Following this, talks between US officials and Ukrainian representatives are scheduled for later in the week. The meeting will take place in the Red Sea city of Jeddah, a key diplomatic hub for the region.

A brief statement from Saudi Arabia's Foreign Ministry underscored the kingdom's commitment to helping resolve the Ukrainian crisis. "The foreign ministry confirms the kingdom's continued efforts to achieve lasting peace to end the Ukrainian crisis," the statement read.

Earlier, Donald Trump's special envoy, Steve Witkoff, announced that he was in discussions with Ukraine for a potential deal framework to end the war with Russia. He indicated that a meeting with Ukrainian officials would be held next week in Saudi Arabia. This comes after a meeting hosted by Riyadh in February between US and Russian officials to explore possible peace talks, though Ukraine was not involved, raising concerns in Kyiv and among its European allies.

Trump clarified that the current tariffs are temporary and relatively small but warned that the new reciprocal tariffs, which will take effect on April 2, will be "a big game changer" for the US. He stressed that under his administration, the US would no longer allow countries to charge high tariffs while the US charges little to nothing in return. "Whatever they charge us, we're going to charge them," he said, signaling a shift in the US's trade approach. Zelenskyy had previously met with Trump at the White House on February 28, but the encounter took a tense turn, with both leaders clashing over their peacemaking approaches. The fallout from this meeting resulted in Trump suspending military aid and intelligence-sharing with Ukraine.

Meanwhile, on Friday, Russian forces carried out a missile strike on Ukrainian energy and gas infrastructure, marking the first major attack on vital infrastructure since Trump's policy changes. This attack further escalates tensions, underscoring the urgency of continued diplomatic efforts to end the war.

Court orders South Korean President Yoon released from jail for his criminal trial over martial law

On March 7, 2025, a South Korean court ordered the release of impeached President Yoon Suk Yeol from jail, more than a month after his arrest and indictment for his controversial declaration of martial law. The Seoul Central District Court ruled that Yoon should stand trial while not being physically detained, a significant development in his legal battle.

Yoon's impeachment trial hearings concluded in late February, and the court is expected to rule soon on whether to formally remove him from office or reinstate him. The court accepted Yoon's request for release, noting that the legal period of his arrest had expired before his indictment in late January. The court also stated that the investigative agency that detained Yoon before his formal arrest did not have legal grounds to investigate the criminal rebellion charges against him. Yoon's defense team welcomed the ruling and called for



his immediate release. However, South Korean law allows prosecutors to hold a suspect temporarily while they pursue an appeal. Investigators accuse Yoon of inciting rebellion with his martial law decree, which involved deploying troops to the National Assembly. If convicted, Yoon faces severe penalties, including the death penalty or life imprisonment.

The decree, which lasted only six hours, was overturned after enough lawmakers managed to convene and vote against it. The incident has sparked memories of past military rule, which many South Koreans associate with oppression. Yoon defended his actions, arguing that the decree was intended to highlight the threat posed by the opposition Democratic Party, which had undermined his policies and impeached key officials.

If the Constitutional Court upholds Yoon's impeachment, he will be officially removed from office, and a national election will be held within two months to select his successor. The ongoing legal proceedings and massive public rallies, both for and against Yoon, are intensifying South Korea's already deep political divisions.

Ukrainian President Zelenskyy to Visit Saudi Arabia for Talks on Ending War with Russia

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy is set to visit Saudi Arabia next Monday, March 10, 2025, ahead of planned talks between senior Ukrainian and U.S. officials aimed at seeking a resolution to the ongoing war with Russia.

During his visit, President Zelenskyy will meet with Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman. The discussions are expected to focus on peace efforts amid the ongoing conflict in Ukraine. Following the meeting, Zelenskyy's team will remain in Saudi Arabia to collaborate with American officials on further diplomatic steps.

Zelenskyy emphasized Ukraine's strong desire for peace, stating that the visit would be crucial in advancing discussions that could lead to the end of the war. Rupee falls 6 paise to settle at 87.12 against U.S. dollar



The Indian rupee ended its three-day rally on Thursday, March 6, 2025, with a loss of 6 paise, settling at 87.12 (provisional) against the U.S. dollar. The decline was attributed to uncertainty surrounding trade tariffs and persistent foreign fund outflows, which caused cautious investor sentiment. Forex traders noted that market participants were waiting for key data, including the U.S. weekly unemployment claims and the European Central Bank's monetary policy decision.

Despite the loss, the local currency was supported by a positive equity market, a weaker U.S. dollar in international markets, and easing crude oil prices. Initially, the rupee gained momentum following news that the U.S. had delayed implementing higher tariffs on Canada and Mexico. Additionally, the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) decision to infuse ₹1.9 trillion liquidity into the banking system further bolstered the currency.

During the day, the rupee opened at 86.96 and touched a high of 86.88 against the dollar. However, it became volatile and dropped to a low of 87.16 before settling at 87.12. On Wednesday, March 5, 2025, the rupee had registered its third consecutive gain, closing 13 paise higher at 87.06.

Anuj Choudhary, Research Analyst at Mirae Asset Sharekhan, explained that the rupee's early gains were eroded due to selling pressure by Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs). He also noted that the U.S. dollar had fallen to a four-month low, following the U.S. decision to delay higher tariffs on imports from Canada and Mexico. Choudhary added that the rupee is expected to trade within the range of 86.80 to 87.25, with positive domestic markets and U.S. dollar weakness providing support, but FII outflows could cap significant gains.

"Markets End Flat: Range-Bound Rally, Sector Strength, and Rupee Recovery Amid Mixed Global Cues"

Domestic stock markets ended flat today. They moved in a rangebound pattern throughout Friday. The markets initially fell due to mixed signals from global markets and investors acting cautiously. It ended at 74,332, down 7 points. The NSE Nifty, which opened at 22,508, touched a low of 22,464 and a high of 22,633. It rose 7 points to close at 22,552. In the Nifty50, 20 companies gained and 30 lost. Media, oil and gas, metals, commodities, infra,

India's Inflation to Ease to 4.1% in February 2025, But Food Prices May Remain High

India's consumer price inflation (CPI) is forecasted to decrease to 4.1% in February 2025, according to a report by Bank of Baroda (BoB). However, the report cautioned that certain factors, including rising global edible oil prices, inflationary tariff policies, and an anticipated hotter summer, could keep food prices elevated.

The BoB report predicts a CPI of 4.1% but also warned of potential upward pressure on food inflation. It noted that global edible oil prices remain volatile and could contribute to increased food prices.

The BoB Essential Commodity Index (ECI), which tracks key household goods, showed a slowdown in February 2025, with the index moderating to 2.4% year-on-year. This decline was largely driven by falling prices of vegetables like tomatoes and potatoes. Additionally, inflation in pulses remained under control, thanks to better supply conditions, while a recent reduction in milk prices further contributed to easing inflation.



The dollar index, which measures the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading lower by 0.15% at 104.12, while Brent crude rose slightly by 0.39% to \$69.57 per barrel.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) offloaded ₹2,895.04 crore in equities on March 5, 2025, continuing a trend of net outflows. Meanwhile, the Reserve Bank of India's monetary policy and its measures to ensure liquidity in the system remain crucial for stabilizing the rupee.

Despite these positive trends, several risks remain. Global asset price volatility, particularly in gold and base metals, has yet to significantly impact inflation. Energy prices have remained relatively low, but tariffs on metals could increase prices in the coming months. In February, rising demand pushed up prices for metals like copper and zinc.

A major concern highlighted in the report is the persistent rise in edible oil prices, which could further drive food inflation. Moreover, extreme heat conditions, which have already been recorded in states like Maharashtra, Odisha, and Bihar—major producers of onions, tomatoes, and potatoes—could lead to supply disruptions for key crops.

The Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) has noted above-normal temperatures in various states, raising concerns about the impact

on wheat crops. However, government measures aimed at improving logistics and stabilizing prices for perishable goods are expected to provide some relief.

While inflation is projected to moderate, uncertainties related to global commodity prices and weather conditions could still influence price trends in the coming months.

India's Crude Oil Imports from Russia Decline Amid U.S. Sanctions



India's crude oil imports from Russia have dropped to their lowest level in over two years, reflecting the impact of recent U.S. sanctions targeting Russia's oil trade. The sanctions, announced by the Biden administration in January before its departure, have begun to hinder the flow of Russian crude to India. As a result, Indian refiners are being forced to diversify their sources of crude oil, turning to smaller suppliers from regions such as Africa and Latin America to make up for the lost Russian volumes, according to vessel tracking data.

The U.S. sanctions specifically targeted 183 tankers involved in the transport of Russian oil, a significant portion of what is known as the "shadow fleet," which had helped Russia continue its oil exports. Additionally, two Russian oil giants and several insurance companies linked to the Russian oil trade were also sanctioned. These moves have made it increasingly difficult for Indian refiners to secure the necessary Russian crude cargoes, pushing them to find alternative suppliers.

Apart from Russia, India's key West Asian suppliers—Saudi Arabia and the UAE—also saw a sequential decline in their crude oil exports to India. However, Iraq, which remains India's second-largest crude supplier, did not follow this trend, maintaining a steady supply. This shift in sourcing is part of a broader strategy by Indian refiners to reduce reliance on Russian oil amidst the ongoing sanctions.

In response to the reduced Russian crude volumes, Indian refiners are exploring new avenues and seeking out supplies from less traditional sources, including nations in Africa and Latin America. The move highlights India's growing need to secure its energy supply amidst shifting global dynamics and the effects of international sanctions on Russia's oil industry.





Bengaluru Restaurant's "No Real Estate, Political **Discussions**" Rule Goes Viral

A Bengaluru restaurant's unusual rule banning discussions on real estate and politics has gone viral on social media, sparking mixed reactions among users. The rule, displayed on a board inside the eatery, urges diners to refrain from engaging in lengthy conversations about real estate or politics while they dine. "This facility is only for dine-in purposes, not for real estate/political discussions. Please understand and cooperate," the board reads.

The image was shared on X (formerly Twitter) by user Farrago Metiquirke, and it quickly caught the attention of social media users, amassing over 40,000 views and numerous likes. Many users in the comments pointed out that this rule is not unique to this particular reportedly displaying similar signs discouraging such discussions.




