Pawan Kalyan rushes to Singapore as son Mark undergoes treatment for burn injuries

Doctors say Mark is stable, smoke inhalation effects under observation

Andhra Pradesh State Deputy Chief Minister and Jana Sena Party president Pawan Kalyan flew to Singapore late Tuesday night after learning that his younger son, Mark Shankar, had been hospitalised with burn injuries and complications from smoke inhalation. Upon landing in Singapore, Pawan Kalyan headed straight to the hospital, where Mark was receiving emergency care. By Wednesday morning (IST), hospital authorities confirmed that the boy had been shifted from the emergency ward to a regular room and was in a stable condition.

Doctors briefed the Deputy CM on Mark's treatment, stating that while the burns on his hands and legs are healing, they are closely monitoring his lungs for the impact of smoke exposure. A battery of tests is being carried out to evaluate his respiratory health, and hospital sources said the next three days will be critical for observation and recovery.

The exact cause of the incident that led to the injuries has not been made public by the family. According to Pawan Kalyan the boy was affected by both external burns and internal complications due to inhaling smoke, suggesting an accidental fire-related episode.

Supporters of Pawan Kalyan and the Jana Sena Party have taken to social media, expressing concern and offering prayers for Mark's quick recovery. The family has appealed for privacy during this time, while medical teams continue to monitor the situation closely.

Scripted Drama by YCP

Home Minister Anitha, Police Officers Slam Jagan's Remarks

Andhra Pradesh Home Minister Vangalapati Anitha on Wednesday came down heavily on YSRCP chief Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy, calling the recent helicopter episode in Sri Sathya Sai district a "pre-planned political stunt." Speaking during her review visit in Srikakulam, she alleged that despite Jagan enjoying Z+ security, including 1,100 police personnel and 250 stationed at the helipad, the YSRCP falsely claimed there was no protection. "A helicopter deemed unfit took off just 15 minutes later—this appears clearly scripted to gain public sympathy," she said. Anitha also reminded people of the YSRCP's track record, accusing the party of spreading fear through violence, attacking opposition leaders, and threatening police

during its rule. She assured that the current government is committed to transparency and law and order. "We will not tolerate anyone defaming the police or disturbing peace. Legal action will be taken against those spreading provocative content," she warned.

Her comments were echoed by the Andhra Pradesh Police Officers Association, which expressed strong resentment against Jagan's controversial remarks about the police. Association President Srinivas Rao demanded a public apology from Jagan, calling his statements demoralizing and disrespectful to the entire police force. "If no apology is issued, we will pursue legal action," he warned. Rao emphasized that the police function constitutionally and should not be used as political targets.

Meanwhile, Ramagiri Sub-

Inspector Sudhakar Yadav strongly responded to Jagan's statement that he would "remove the uniforms" of police officers if voted to power. In a public video, Sudhakar questioned, "Is a police uniform a banana peel to be thrown away?" He clarified that police uniforms are earned through hard work and competitive exams, not gifted by politicians. "We wear this uniform with pride and will continue to serve with honesty," he said.

Sudhakar also highlighted irregularities in the recent Ramagiri MPP elections and warned that intimidating lower-level staff like police officers is dangerous to democracy. He appealed to CM N. Chandrababu Naidu, Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan, and the DGP to provide full protection to all government employees facing political threats.



CM Naidu Lays Foundation Stone for New Home in Amaravati

Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu has laid the foundation stone for the construction of his new residence in Amaravati, marking an emotional and symbolic moment for his family and supporters of the capital. The ceremony took place on Tuesday at a 5-acre site located next to the E9 road behind the Velagapudi Secretariat.

Chandrababu Naidu was accompanied by his wife Nara Bhuvaneshwari, son and Minister Nara Lokesh, daughter-in-law Brahmani, and grandson Devansh during the event. The Chief Minister had purchased this land from a local farmer in December last year, and the registration was completed recently. The new residence will be a G+1 structure spread over 1,455 square yards, with construction targeted for completion within a year.

The prestigious project has been entrusted to SRR Construction Company, which has been tasked with both design and execution.

Focus Shifts to Uttarandhra

Sidiri Appalaraju and Duvvada Srinivas Next in Line?

- Palasa MLA Gauthu Sirisha presses for arrest of Sidiri Appalaraju
- Kinjarapu family pushing for action against MLC Duvvada Srinivas
- Political heat builds up in Uttarandhra after Central Andhra crackdown

After a string of arrests and cases filed against YSRCP leaders in Krishna and Guntur districts, political focus has now shifted to Uttarandhra. There is growing speculation that former minister Sidiri Appalaraju and YCP MLC Duvvada Srinivas could be the next to face action. The development comes amid reports that Palasa MLA Gauthu Sirisha and the Kinjarapu family are mounting pressure on the government for swift legal steps against the two YSRCP leaders.

Following the alliance government's rise to power, several YCP leaders and sympathizers active on social media have been targeted with strict action. Arrests of figures like Posani Krishnamurali and Dorugadda Anil,



along with multiple cases against ex-ministers Perni Nani, Kodali Nani, Jogi Ramesh, and former MLA Vallabhaneni Vamsi, have stirred political circles. While Vamsi has already been arrested and others secured anticipatory bail, most of these actions were limited to



Central Andhra until now. Sources indicate the government is now turning its political strategy toward Uttarandhra. Former Minister Appalaraju, from Srikakulam, reportedly has three cases pending and is said to be keeping a low profile, fearing arrest. MLA

Sirisha is alleged to be directly pursuing his arrest, especially after previously filing a complaint against YCP social media abuse in Visakhapatnam.

On the other hand, MLC Duvvada Srinivas is facing cases for derogatory remarks against Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan. He is considered the primary political rival of Minister Achchennaidu in Nimmada, having actively challenged him during the last local elections. With Duvvada currently entangled in a family dispute, the Kinjarapu family sees this as a strategic moment for legal action. Alliance workers in Central Andhra claim the crackdown has cooled tempers locally, while leaders in Uttarandhra now demand similar action in their region. The government's intent to close pending cases quickly is seen as part of a broader political reset.

However, the court recently dismissed both petitions, firmly instructing him to attend the inquiry and assist in the probe as a witness.

Following the High Court's ruling, the SIT served a third notice to Kasireddy, summoning him for questioning on Wednesday. However, he failed to turn up, marking his third consecutive absence.

Sources in the SIT confirmed that officials are now reviewing legal options and deliberating on the next course of action in light of Kasireddy's continued non-compliance. While the notices were issued under standard procedure, authorities may now consider stricter legal steps, including issuing a warrant or seeking contempt proceedings, depending on further legal consultations. Kasireddy's repeated absence has drawn criticism from political quarters and raised questions about obstruction of justice. With the investigation gaining momentum, SIT officials are determined not to let the liquor scam probe be derailed by lack of cooperation from key individuals.

PM Modi Clears ₹1,332 Crore Renigunta-Katpadi Railway Doubling Project



- Union Cabinet approves new railway line works benefitting AP and TN
- ₹1,332 crore sanctioned for Renigunta-Katpadi doubling project
- Project to boost industry and tourism in Rayalaseema, Tirupati, and Vellore

Bringing festive cheer to the people of Andhra Pradesh, the Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has approved a significant infrastructure project—doubling of the Renigunta-Katpadi railway line. The project, estimated to cost ₹1,332 crore, is expected to benefit the entire Rayalaseema region, including major districts like Tirupati and Chittoor, as well as Vellore in Tamil Nadu. Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnav announced the Cabinet's decision and emphasized the strategic importance of the project despite the relatively short dis-

tance. He said the 104-kilometre railway line that includes the Tirupati-Pakala-Katpadi section will play a key role in improving connectivity, reducing congestion, and boosting economic activity in the region. "This is not just a doubling project; it's a developmental milestone. It will enhance travel comfort, enable faster movement of goods, and support tourism around Tirupati, a globally renowned spiritual hub," Vaishnav stated. He highlighted that the doubling work will also contribute to industrial growth, especially in the Chittoor-Vellore belt, by facilitating easier transportation

of raw materials and finished goods. The Union Minister further noted that the project strengthens inter-state rail infrastructure and reflects the Centre's commitment to balanced regional development. Both Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu stand to benefit significantly from the improved connectivity. The doubling work is expected to begin shortly, and the Railway Ministry has been tasked with ensuring timely execution. Once completed, the project is expected to not only ease travel time for passengers but also serve as a catalyst for local employment and economic upliftment.



Minister Lokesh Directs Officials to Release Mega DSC 2025 Notification Without Delay

In a significant move bringing relief to thousands of unemployed youth across Andhra Pradesh, Education Minister Nara Lokesh has instructed officials to immediately prepare and release the Mega DSC 2025 notification. During a high-level review held on Tuesday, he emphasized the urgency of the process and directed the Education Department to proceed without legal complications to recruit 16,347 teacher posts.

Minister Lokesh reviewed key reforms in the education sector, including 10th and Intermediate exam results, and asked officials to ensure their timely release via the recently launched 'Manamitra' app. He also called for the swift preparation of an alternative GO to replace GO-II7 and demanded that it be ready as early as possible. Officials informed the minister that 48% of school textbooks have already been printed. Lokesh directed the completion of the remaining stock before schools reopen. He also approved teacher transfers in Kasurba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas during the summer break, ensuring a seamless academic transition.

Looking ahead, the minister outlined plans for the construction of a central library, a training academy, and an education museum in Amaravati. He stressed the need for transparent teacher promotions and transfers and instructed officials to complete all education department reforms by the end of June. He also discussed the Supreme Court's verdict on special education posts and urged officials to take prompt steps for its implementation.



AP Unveils Mission to Create 30K Women Entrepreneurs in Urban Areas

The state has taken a decisive step toward transforming urban self-help group (SHG) members into full-fledged entrepreneurs through the launch of the Livelihoods & Entrepreneurship Acceleration Plan (LEAP). The initiative, aimed at empowering 30,000 women across the state, was formally launched on Tuesday at the Fortune Grand Hotel, Tadepalli.

The programme, led by MEPMA Mission Director N.M. Tej Bharat, in association with the India SME Forum, seeks to provide structured support for marketing, branding, and upscaling of women-led businesses. "Thousands of women in SHGs are making soaps, paper plates, incense sticks and more, but it's time we help them grow beyond survival businesses," said Tej Bharat. "LEAP is a time-bound plan set to be completed by June 8, with a focus on sustainable livelihoods and enterprise development," he added.

President and Director General of India SME Forum, Sushma Morthania, highlighted the goal of transforming 10,000 existing traders into large-scale entrepreneurs while nurturing 20,000 new women entrepreneurs. "This initiative is about creating an entrepreneurial ecosystem at the grassroots, we'll bring in skill mapping, business mentoring, and facilitation of funding and markets," she said. The state has already extended Rs 16,000 crore in loans to urban SHGs in the past nine months. MEPMA's data shows 99% of 2.74 lakh SHGs covering 28.7 lakh women have been digitally mapped, enabling focused intervention.

CM Naidu Reviews Revenue Generation, Calls for AI-based Tax Enforcement

Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu conducted a high-level review meeting on Wednesday to assess the government's revenue streams and strategize on increasing income across departments. Top officials from the Finance and Revenue departments participated in the discussion, which focused on enhancing the state's financial health.

The Chief Minister reviewed the current tax collections, non-tax revenue, and other sources of income. Expressing concern over existing gaps, Chandrababu emphasized the need to maximize revenues without burdening the public. He instructed officials to work proactively to boost collections in sectors such as property tax, registration fees, commercial taxes, and excise.

In a major push toward innovation, Chandrababu suggested the use of Artificial Intelligence and data analytics to detect tax evasion and irregularities. "We must leverage technology to track

high-value transactions and unreported assets. AI tools can identify patterns that manual systems miss," he said. The CM also called for strict enforcement of rules to prevent revenue leakages and directed departments to ensure better compliance through digitization and automation. He advised officers to study best practices from other states and adopt effective methods that suit Andhra Pradesh's framework. Further, Chandrababu instructed that monthly performance reports on revenue targets be submitted to his office. "The government's development goals are tied to financial discipline and income enhancement. Every department must contribute to this effort," he stated.

The meeting also included discussions on land monetization, user charges for public services, and optimization of government assets. The CM reiterated his commitment to building a financially robust Andhra Pradesh and called upon officials to act with integrity, urgency, and innovation.



Minister Manohar Orders Closure of Civil Supplies Outlet at AP Bhavan in Delhi

In a surprise inspection at the Civil Supplies Department-run rice outlet in AP Bhavan, New Delhi, Andhra Pradesh Civil Supplies Minister Nadendla Manohar expressed serious displeasure over irregularities in rice distribution and ordered immediate closure of the shop.

Accompanied by Civil Supplies Secretary Saurabh Gaur and AP Bhavan Resident Commissioner Lav Agarwal, the minister inspected the premises and personally checked the quality and weight of the rice bags being sold. During the inspection, Manohar found that a rice bag labelled 26 kg contained only 25 kg. Additionally, he pointed out that the weighing machine was malfunctioning and the rice being sold was of poor quality with high starch content.

"This is unacceptable. The rice being sold here is not up to standard. There's a clear weight discrepancy, and the quality is subpar. I have ordered the seizure of this shop immediately," said Minister Nadendla Manohar. "We will take steps to set up a proper ration store under the AP Civil Supplies Department within a month. Citizens deserve quality rice and essential goods at fair prices, and we will ensure that," the minister said.

The minister's inspection has triggered a larger review of Civil Supplies outlets and their functioning, particularly outside the state. Officials have been directed to ensure strict compliance with weight and quality standards and to take immediate corrective action wherever irregularities are found. The new ration store to be set up at AP Bhavan is expected to stock quality rice and essential commodities, ensuring transparency and accountability in service delivery.

If YCP Returns to Power, We'll Strip the Police of Their Uniforms - Ambati Rambabu

In a sensational outburst, YSRCP leader and former minister Ambati Rambabu launched a scathing attack on the Andhra Pradesh police, alleging that the law enforcement machinery has been completely compromised under the TDP-led government. Speaking at a press meet, he declared, "If YCP comes to power, we will strip the police of their uniforms."

Rambabu accused the police department of selectively favoring officers who "threaten and scare" YSRCP leaders, claiming that genuine complaints filed by their party members are routinely ignored. "There are postings only for those who terrorize our leaders. If we file a complaint, they won't even register a case," he said.

Targeting Assembly Speaker Gorantla Buchaiah Chowdary and TDP's leadership, he stated that even former minister Chintakayala Aunty (referring to MLA Anita) had no actual control over police transfers. "Anita does not have the power to transfer even a Sub-Inspector," he remarked, al-



leging that "before Anita Mai, it's Nara Lokesh who is leading from behind the scenes."

The comments come amid rising political tension in the state, with both YSRCP and TDP exchanging serious accusations ahead of the elections. Rambabu's remarks are being seen as a direct threat to the existing police structure, sparking condemnation from ruling party members and calls for clarification from the Election Commission.

This isn't the first time Ambati Rambabu has stirred controversy with strong words, but his latest comments have escalated friction between the opposition and the administration. Political analysts say the YSRCP is sharpening its rhetoric to energize its cadre and project victimhood in the face of recent enforcement actions.

"J-Branded Liquor Took Thousands of Lives During YSRCP Rule: Kollu Ravindra"

Excise Minister Kollu Ravindra came down heavily on the previous YSRCP government, accusing it of completely dismantling the state's excise structure and pushing thousands into liver and kidney failures with substandard liquor branded under "J brands." Speaking at the state-level excise officers' meeting held at Padmavati University, Tirupati, the minister stated that former



CM Jagan Mohan Reddy, who came to power with promises of prohibition, had instead taken control of the entire liquor busi-

ness—from distilleries to retail shops—under a manipulated system cloaked in a so-called "new excise policy." Minister Ravindra said, "Thousands of people died suffering from liver and kidney problems due to the low-quality J-branded liquor distributed under the YSRCP regime. The liquor policy was run like a monopoly." He added that the new coalition government, committed to reform, has introduced a transparent excise policy, where liquor shop allocations were done through a public draw. He assured that the new system emphasizes accountability, health, and public wel-

fare. The minister also announced the formation of 'Eagle Teams' tasked with curbing ganja smuggling and illegal transportation across Andhra Pradesh. These specialized units, Ravindra said, will play a key role in restoring law and order and ensuring the state is free from the drug menace. The meeting concluded with a call to all excise officers to enforce the new policy with integrity, keeping public health and transparency as top priorities.

"No One Will Be Spared": YS Avinash Reddy Slams Govt Over Ahmed Basha's Arrest

Kadapa MP YS Avinash Reddy made strong remarks on Wednesday while visiting former Deputy Chief Minister Amjad Basha in Kadapa, following the controversial arrest of Basha's brother Ahmed Basha. Accompanied by District YSRCP President Ravindranath Reddy and Kadapa Mayor Suresh Babu, Avinash condemned the incident and alleged political vendetta.

Avinash accused the coalition government of indulging in "demonic pleasure" by arresting YSRCP leaders under false and fabricated cases. "They brought Ahmed Basha like a terrorist to Mumbai... Is this justice? This cruelty will not be forgotten," he fumed. He issued a stern warning: "No one will be spared. Those harassing YSRCP cadre through illegal cases will be held accountable. Everything is being noted." He criticized

the TDP leadership for allegedly celebrating the arrest, calling it a shameful and provocative act.

The MP claimed that the police were acting under political pressure, and asserted that the aim of the current administration is to systematically destroy the YSRCP structure in Kadapa. He reassured Basha's family that the party stands in full support and will fight this battle legally and politically. Avinash's fiery com-



ments have intensified the political tension in Kadapa, a district already witnessing high political drama post the elections.

With YSRCP strongly opposing the coalition's actions, the region could be gearing up for a prolonged political face-off.

HC Rejects Kakani Govardhan Reddy's Anticipatory Bail in Quartz Mining Case

In a significant legal setback to senior YSRCP leader and former minister Kakani Govardhan Reddy, the Andhra Pradesh High Court on Wednesday dismissed his anticipatory bail plea in connection with the illegal quartz mining case registered in

Podalukur. The court also declined to stay police action, stating that it would not intervene in the ongoing investigation.

Kakani had moved the High Court with two petitions—one seeking anticipatory bail and the other urging the court to quash multiple FIRs filed against him. While the

court postponed the hearing on the quash petition by two weeks, it made it clear that police are free to proceed with the investigation as per law.

Facing allegations related to unauthorized mining and transport of quartz, Kakani has already received three police notices under various sections linked to mining violations. Despite these, he has reportedly remained inaccessible, complicating his legal situation further.

His legal team argued that the police were acting under political pressure and that the FIRs were motivated. However, the court did not accept these arguments at this stage, asserting that due process must be followed.

The ruling comes as enforcement agencies ramp up action on alleged

irregularities linked to the previous government, placing added pressure

on the YSRCP leadership ahead of crucial political developments.

TDP Reins Should Be Handed Over to Lokesh: SVSN Varma's Remarks Spark Buzz

In a statement that's creating political ripples once again, former Pithapuram MLA SVSN Varma has openly called for the reins of the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) to be handed over to Minister Nara Lokesh. Vallabhaneni Vamsi's Remand Extended in Gannavaram TDP Office Attack Case

In a significant setback for YCP leader and former Gannavaram MLA Vallabhaneni Vamsi, the CID court has extended his remand in connection with the Gannavaram TDP central office attack case. The court issued an order on Wednesday, remanding Vamsi and nine other prisoners until April 23.
CID officials produced Vamsi before the court, along with the other remand prisoners, in connection with the ongoing investigation into the attack on the TDP office. Vamsi's legal troubles have been escalating, with multiple cases now pending against him. This remand extension comes just a day after another court, the Vijayawada SC and ST court, extended his remand in the Satyavardhan kidnapping case. The remand in that case has been extended until April 22.
Vamsi, who was once a prominent figure in the

Telugu Desam Party (TDP), has seen his political career take a downward turn amid these legal challenges. The attack on the TDP office in Gannavaram, a key incident in the region, has led to his arrest, along with several other individuals involved in the case.
The CID investigation into the Gannavaram TDP office attack continues to unfold, with authorities seeking further details on the role of Vamsi and others in the incident. The extension of his remand reflects the seriousness of the charges against him and the ongoing efforts of law enforcement to gather crucial evidence.
Vamsi's legal battles are far from over, as the former MLA faces intense scrutiny in multiple cases. The extended remand, now lasting until April 23, will keep the political landscape in Gannavaram and surrounding areas tense, as the public awaits further developments in this high-profile case.

Another Complaint Filed Against Director Ram Gopal Varma

Controversial filmmaker Ram Gopal Varma has once again landed in legal trouble, with a fresh complaint filed against him at the Rajahmundry 3 Town Police Station. The complaint, lodged by Rashtriya Praja Congress founder president Meda Srinivas, alleges that Varma has been inciting acts of religious and social terrorism.
Addressing the media after filing the complaint, Srinivas accused Varma of deliberately creating unrest in society through his provocative comments and content, which he claimed are aimed at disturbing communal harmony. "This is not just about cinema

or creative freedom — it's about using influence to spread hatred and division. We demand strict action under relevant sections of the law," he stated. The complaint seeks police investigation into Varma's recent statements and projects, urging authorities to register a case and proceed with legal action. Srinivas said his party would not remain silent if public sentiments and social peace are being tampered with under the guise of free expression. The Rajahmundry police have acknowledged receipt of the complaint and are said to be reviewing the material submitted. So far, no FIR has been registered, but officials have indicated

that they will examine whether the allegations warrant formal proceedings. This isn't the first time Ram Gopal Varma has courted controversy. Known for his unfiltered opinions and bold portrayals in films and social media posts, Varma has frequently drawn criticism from various quarters, including political, religious, and social groups. The Rashtriya Praja Congress has stated that if the police fail to act, they will escalate the matter through legal channels and public campaigns. As of now, Ram Gopal Varma has not responded to the allegations.



Private Hospitals in Eluru Flouting Norms, Endangering Public Safety



- Rampant rule violations by mushrooming private hospitals
- No parking, fire safety, or minimum patient facilities in many centers
- Officials accused of turning a blind eye to blatant violations

The unchecked proliferation of private hospitals in Eluru district is raising serious concerns over public health and safety. Many of these hospitals are being run in violation of basic norms, with authorities allegedly ignoring repeated complaints and lapses in enforcement. Several private hospitals are operating out of rented buildings in narrow bylanes, with three to four facilities functioning from a single structure. These establishments not only lack designated parking spaces, causing severe traffic

congestion, but also flout fire safety norms—many without access for fire engines in case of emergencies. Worse, in some buildings, laboratories are being set up dangerously close to urinals, staircases, and other unhygienic areas. Hospital beds far exceed sanctioned numbers, while permissions obtained from departments like Health, Fire, Police, and Pollution Control are often limited to paperwork with no actual compliance. Sources say certain medical shop owners are converting their premises into hospitals, hiring fee-based doctors

who overprescribe medicines. Meanwhile, some doctors from the newly opened district medical college and the general hospital are reportedly practicing at these private centers after duty hours, fueling their rapid expansion. Despite clear rules requiring approvals from multiple departments—including health, pollution control, and municipal authorities—hospital administrators often understate bed numbers to pay lower fees, later adding more beds unofficially. Basic patient facilities remain poor in many of these hospitals, further endangering lives. Alarming, buildings housing several hospitals do not have fire extinguishers or emergency exits. If an accident were to occur, the risk of casualties would be high due to poor access and absence of safety systems. Locals have repeatedly urged officials to conduct inspections and enforce action, but enforcement remains lax. With complaints mounting, the public is demanding immediate intervention. It remains to be seen whether authorities will step in to ensure private hospitals prioritize safety and compliance over profit.

Groom Arrested for Attempting to Marry Two Minor Sisters

A young man who planned to marry two minor sisters was arrested after their wedding invitation went viral on social media, prompting swift action from police and ICDS officials. According to authorities, the accused, Gangaraju from Gummaiah Garipalli village in Gorantla mandal, was engaged to two underage girls, K. Srilakshmi and K. Aishwarya from Bagepalli town in Chikaballapur district, Karnataka. Shockingly, the girls are sisters and both minors. Their wedding was scheduled for April 10 at Ranga Mahal in Gorantla town. Gangaraju had printed and distributed the wedding invitations, which sparked public outrage after circulating widely online. ICDS Supervisor Rajitha, upon noticing the viral card,

launched an inquiry and confirmed the girls' minor status. She subsequently filed a complaint with the police. Gorantla police summoned both families for questioning. During the investigation, it was revealed that the groom had decided to marry both girls with the consent of their parents. ICDS officials counseled the families, stressing that child marriage is a punishable offense and marrying two minors is illegal. Despite repeated counseling sessions for Gangaraju, his brother Amaranath, and their mother Gangulamma, the family was adamant about proceeding with at least one of the marriages. As a result, police registered a case against Gangaraju, his brother, his mother, and the mother of the girls, Susheela, under sections BNS 132, 351(3), read with (5). Gorantla Circle Inspector B. Shekhar confirmed the arrests and said the investigation is ongoing.

YCP Leaders Meet Peddireddy Ramachandra Reddy in Tirupati, Raise Concerns on Welfare Delivery

She also praised the efforts of the Srikakulam SP in maintaining law and order across the district.

The idea of military action against Iran has never been far from the minds of US policymakers, especially within the Republican establishment, where calls for strikes have often been viewed as rational responses rather than radical measures. Activist groups like Code Pink have been marginalized despite their calls for diplomacy and peace. Even during Obama's tenure, fears of war persisted until more moderate Iranian leadership emerged. Still, the media's portrayal of Iran as an existential threat has fed into negative public perceptions—Americans rarely express favorable views of the country, which has deepened the divide be-



tween the people of both nations. The lesson from Iraq's devastating war, a campaign widely regarded as a strategic blunder, should have served as a deterrent. Yet Iran, with a far larger population and complex political landscape, remains under the shadow of similar saber-rattling. Internally,

Iran's leadership lacks a cohesive vision, increasingly seen as prioritizing ideological expansion over national welfare. The Revolutionary Guards' external adventurism, combined with disregard for cultural traditions and a worsening economic crisis, has alienated many Iranians. Power blackouts,

hyperinflation, and sanctions have left the public wondering about the true cost of Iran's nuclear pursuits. On the US side, foreign policy has taken a more eccentric tone. From suggestions of annexing Canada to speculation about military action in the Middle East, unpredictability defines Wash-

ington's posture. Despite this, former President Donald Trump has sought a diplomatic solution, even sending a personal letter to Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Khamenei via an Emirati intermediary. Khamenei responded by approving indirect talks, now scheduled in Oman, while also issuing a stern warning against aggression. A breakthrough seems possible but precarious, with Trump reportedly setting a two-month deadline for progress. The renewed direct military clash between Iran and Israel, triggered by attacks in April 2024, has shattered whatever restraint previously existed in their proxy conflict. Amid these tensions, figures like US envoy Steve Witkoff have attempted to reopen channels through cautious messaging, even briefly engaging with Iranian officials online over the JCPOA terms. While predictions remain speculative, and skepticism is warranted, even a limited agreement would be preferable to continued escalation. Iran's dire governance rankings reflect systemic dysfunctions that go beyond foreign policy. But any constructive engagement between Washington and Tehran could signal hope—not just for a reset in relations, but for the millions in the region who remain trapped in a cycle of conflict. The world stands to benefit whenever this overdue understanding materializes.

RBI Cuts Repo Rate by 25 Basis Points to 6% Amid Global Trade Uncertainty

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has reduced the repo rate by 25 basis points to 6%, with the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) voting unanimously in favor of the move. The decision, announced on Wednesday, is aimed at supporting economic growth and easing the interest burden on borrowers with home, auto, and other loans. However, this reduction is expected to lower the interest earned on savings for depositors.

This rate cut comes amid growing concerns over the global trade war, particularly the impact of U.S. President Donald Trump's tariffs. In light of these challenges, the MPC has also revised its growth forecast for India's GDP in 2025-26, lowering it from 6.7% to 6.5%.

This marks the second consecutive rate cut by the RBI, following a 25 basis point reduction in the previous policy meeting. The committee, led by RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra, also shifted its policy stance from neutral to accommodative, signaling a more growth-focused approach. This change indicates the RBI's growing concern about the potential impact of the trade war on domestic economic growth, rather than inflation risks. The shift in stance suggests the possibility of further rate cuts in the future to stimulate the economy.

Governor Malhotra highlighted that global uncertainty, particularly the escalating trade tensions, could dampen investment and spending by businesses and households, negatively impacting domestic growth. Additionally, higher tariffs are expected to hurt India's exports.

On inflation, Malhotra noted that while global volatility posed some risks, including currency pressures and imported inflation, the domestic inflation outlook remained relatively stable. Inflation risks are seen as two-sided, with a slowdown in global growth potentially softening commodity and crude oil prices.

Looking ahead, RBI projects India's GDP growth for 2025-26 at 6.5%, with inflation expected to remain at 4% for the year. Despite ongoing global uncertainties, the RBI remains committed to using monetary policy to ensure a balanced and stable economic environment.

India ends transshipment facility for Bangladesh exports, cites congestion

- Bangladesh-Nepal/Bhutan trade routes unaffected.
- Yunus' China remarks add diplomatic tension.
- Visa, trade issues strain bilateral ties further.

India has withdrawn the transshipment facility extended to Bangladesh due to the significant congestion it was causing at Indian airports and ports, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) confirmed on Wednesday. MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal clarified that the decision, effective from April 8, 2025, is not intended to affect Bangladesh's trade with Nepal or Bhutan.

The transshipment facility, which had been in place since June 2020, allowed cargo from Bangladesh to transit through Indian land customs stations before being sent to their final destinations using Indian ports and airports. This move was essential for Bangladesh's exports, particularly ready-made items, to third countries such as Nepal, Bhutan, and Myanmar. However, over time, the facility had resulted in logistical delays and congestion, which hindered India's own exports and led to backlogs, prompting the decision to terminate the arrangement.

Jaiswal explained that although the transshipment facility was withdrawn, it would not disrupt Bangladesh's exports to Nepal or Bhutan through Indian territory. He also emphasized that the decision was a logistical one and not



related to any political developments.

The decision follows controversial remarks by Prof. Muhammad Yunus, the Chief Adviser to Bangladesh's interim government, who visited Beijing and advocated for stronger trade ties between China and India's northeastern states using Bangladeshi ports. Yunus' statements, made during a roundtable discussion in China, were met with criticism in India, with Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma calling them "offensive and highly condemnable."

While Indian officials have refrained from confirming whether Yunus' remarks influenced the withdrawal of the transshipment facility, the timing of the move, just days before the New Year festivities in Dhaka, has been perceived as a setback to bilateral trade. This development follows ongoing concerns over the limited issuance of Indian visas to Bangladesh's business community, further straining economic ties.

The issue highlights the ongoing complexities in India-Bangladesh relations, with trade, logistics, and diplomatic considerations all playing significant roles.

Congress Demands Caste Census, Rahul Gandhi Slams Waqf Bill and RSS

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Wednesday, April 9, 2025, denounced the Waqf (Amendment) Act, calling it "anti-Constitution" and a direct attack on religious freedoms. Speaking at the AICC session held on the banks of the Sabarmati River, Gandhi raised concerns that the BJP and RSS would soon target the rights of other minorities, particularly Christians and Sikhs, following the passage of the Waqf Bill.

Gandhi claimed that the new law undermines the constitutional rights of religious minorities in India, specifically accusing the government of orchestrating an agenda to curb religious freedoms. He cited an article in an RSS-affiliated magazine that allegedly suggested that the BJP and RSS are now focused on limiting the rights of Christians, with Sikhs potentially being next in line.

In his address, Gandhi also warned of an impending "economic storm," attributing it to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's subservience to U.S. President Donald Trump, especially regarding the imposition of tariffs. He criticized Modi for failing to challenge Trump's actions, referencing a recent meeting between the two leaders where Trump's decision to impose new tariffs on Indian goods went unopposed. "Did you see the photograph of PM Modi hugging Mr. Trump? This time he ordered Modi ji that 'we



will not hug but will impose new tariffs,'" Gandhi remarked. Furthermore, Gandhi took a jibe at Modi's recent interaction with Bangladesh's Chief Advisor Mohammad Yunus, suggesting that the Prime Minister's silence on Yunus' remarks was in stark contrast to his usual bold rhetoric. "Where is the 56-inch chest?" Gandhi quipped, mocking Modi's strength and resolve.

On the issue of caste-based reservations, Gandhi reiterated his support for a national caste census, calling for an expansion of the reservation system and mentioning that Telangana had already made strides in this area. He also emphasized that the Congress party would continue to fight for constitutional values against what he described as an RSS-led push to control India's institutions. "We have truth and the love of the people on our side," he concluded.



Gold Prices Spiked Amid Global Trade Tensions and US Tariffs

Gold prices have surged, driven by concerns over a potential global economic slowdown triggered by U.S. President Donald Trump's sweeping tariffs on Chinese imports. In India, the price of 24-karat gold has risen to ₹8,972 per gram, while 22-karat gold is priced at ₹8,224, and 18-karat gold stands at ₹6,729 per gram, according to Goodreturns.

The U.S. dollar weakened ahead of the tariff rollout, making gold, priced in dollars, more attractive to foreign buyers. Trump's administration imposed a significant 104% tariff on Chinese imports and outlined plans for a baseline 10% import duty on other goods. China responded defiantly, labeling the move as "blackmail" and vowing to "fight to the end."

Tim Waterer, Chief Market Analyst at KCM Trade, explained that the downward shift in the dollar due to tariff concerns allowed gold to reclaim the \$3,000 level. Despite some volatility, Waterer indicated that gold could reach new all-time highs, citing uncertainty around global growth and inflation as key drivers.

Gold reached a record high of \$3,167.57 on April 3, mirroring the surge in 1980 during the Iranian Revolution when political risks and inflation fears dominated markets. Investor appetite for gold remains strong, with gold-backed exchange-traded funds seeing the largest quarterly inflows in three years, according to the World Gold Council.

However, rising U.S. bond yields capped some of gold's gains, as the 10-year Treasury yield hit its highest level in over a week, reducing the appeal of non-yielding bullion. Looking ahead, market participants are awaiting the release of the U.S. Federal Reserve's meeting minutes and upcoming inflation data, including the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and Producer Price Index (PPI), later this week.

Analysts, including Rahul Kalantri, VP of Commodities at Mehta Equities, remain cautious, noting that while gold surged due to short-covering and bargain buying, it lost steam after the U.S. announced the tariff changes. Kalantri suggests that gold could face support at \$2,978-\$2,955 per ounce and resistance at \$3,040-\$3,065 per ounce in global markets, with similar levels for Indian gold prices. Analysts believe that gold's upward trajectory may continue as macroeconomic uncertainties persist.

India's naval aviation gets a boost: Rafale-Marine jets approved for acquisition

In a major boost to India's naval aviation, the Cabinet Committee on Security, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the purchase of 26 Rafale-Marine fighter jets from French aviation giant Dassault, at an estimated cost of ₹63,000 crore. This acquisition is aimed at enhancing the Indian Navy's offensive capabilities, especially for operations at sea. The jets will be deployed on India's indigenously built aircraft carrier, INS Vikrant, and are expected to significantly strengthen the Navy's ability to carry out longer-range precision strikes against both aerial and maritime threats.

The deal, which includes weapons, simulators, training, spares, and maintenance support, will also fea-



ture India-specific modifications. These additions include the integration of India's Astra missile system, setting up a maintenance, repair, and overhaul (MRO) hub, and sourcing components from local suppliers. The Rafale-Marine jets are equipped with advanced armament systems, including the SCALP-EG, a 650-km range cruise missile.

These fighter jets will consist of 22 single-seater and four twin-seater variants, designed to complement the Navy's existing aircraft fleet. The Rafale-Marine's operational features include reinforced landing gear and foldable wings, allowing efficient storage aboard aircraft carriers. This capability will be crucial, as the jets can operate in the constrained space of

a carrier's deck, unlike land-based aircraft that rely on long runways.

While the deal comes at a higher price compared to the IAF's 36 Rafale jets, which were purchased for ₹59,000 crore in 2016, the cost difference is attributed to inflation, the increased exchange rates of the dollar and euro, and a decade gap between the two deals.

Additionally, in case of an emergency, these jets can be deployed to Indian Air Force bases along the northern borders, bolstering the IAF's fleet of Rafale jets. This move represents a significant upgrade to India's naval aviation, as it replaces the Russian-origin MiG-29K jets, some of which have faced operational challenges since their induction in 2011.



Russia Invites PM Modi to Attend 80th Anniversary of Victory Day Celebrations

- **Event marks 80 years since Nazi Germany's defeat.**
- **Putin accepted Modi's earlier India visit invite.**
- **Ties grow stronger in defense and diplomacy.**

Russia has extended an invitation to Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi to attend the May 9 celebrations marking the 80th anniversary of victory over Nazi Germany in World War II, as confirmed by Russian Deputy Foreign Minister Andrey Rudenko. The invitation has been sent, and preparations for the Prime Minister's visit are currently underway.

Speaking to Russian news agency Tass, Rudenko stated, "Moscow is expecting the Indian Prime Minister at the May 9 parade. The invitation has already been sent, and the visit is being worked out. It should take place this year."

Victory Day, celebrated on May 9, commemorates the signing of the Act of Unconditional Surrender by Germany in 1945, effectively bringing an end to World War II. This year's celebrations will mark the 80th anniversary of that pivotal moment in history, and Russia has invited leaders from several friendly nations to join in the commemorations.

In July 2024, Prime Minister Modi visited Russia for the first time in nearly five years. During this visit, he also extended an invitation to Russian President Vladimir Putin to visit India, an invitation that Putin has accepted. However, the specific dates for Putin's trip to India have yet to be disclosed.

Prime Minister Modi and President Putin maintain a strong diplomatic relationship, characterized by regular communication through telephone calls and in-person meetings, especially during international events. The two leaders' ongoing collaboration underscores the close ties between India and Russia, particularly in areas such as defense, trade, and geopolitical cooperation.

The invitation to Modi to participate in the Victory Day parade reflects the deepening bilateral ties between the two nations and signifies the importance of their strategic partnership on the global stage.

US Bill Threatens to End Work Visa for Indian Students, Creating Uncertainty for 300,000

A proposed bill in the United States Congress is poised to disrupt the Optional Practical Training (OPT) program, a vital work authorization initiative for international students, particularly those in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) fields. This development has caused major concern among the Indian student community in the US, with over 300,000 students potentially impacted.

The OPT program allows international students to gain practical work experience in the US for up to three years after graduation. Indian students are the largest beneficiaries of this program, with nearly 98,000 participants in the 2023-2024 academic year, according to the Open Doors 2024 report. The proposed bill could force these students to leave the US immediately after graduation, disrupting their careers and financial stability, as many rely on OPT to repay hefty student loans.

If passed, the bill would severely limit job opportunities for Indian students, compelling them to seek work in countries with more accommodating post-study policies, like Canada or those in Europe. This could also negatively impact the US job market, especially in STEM fields, where international students play a crucial role in addressing



skill shortages.

In response, many students are rushing to secure H-1B work visas, which are sponsored primarily by large tech companies. However, these visas are highly competitive, with a limited number of slots each year. Students are now scrambling to secure job offers that would enable them to apply for an H-1B visa before any changes take effect.

Legal experts, such as Poorvi Chothani of LawQuest, have stressed the urgency of the situation. The OPT program provides stu-

dents up to three years of work experience, but if the bill passes, many may be forced to leave the US immediately after graduation, losing valuable career opportunities.

Amidst this uncertainty, many students have cancelled summer travel plans, fearing they may not be allowed to re-enter the country. Prestigious institutions like Cornell and Yale have unofficially advised international students to avoid traveling home during breaks, further exacerbating the sense of instability.

Girl Dies, 20 More Including Pawan Kalyan's Son Injured In Singapore School Fire

A devastating fire at a shophouse in Singapore's River Valley Road area resulted in the death of a 10-year-old girl and left 20 others injured on Tuesday. Among the injured was the seven-year-old son of Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan.

The fire broke out at a three-storey building that housed educational and enrichment classes for children, including cooking, theatre, and robotics schools. At the time of the incident, 16 children aged six to 10 and six adults were present in the building. The fire spread quickly through the second and third floors of the building, causing severe burns and smoke inhalation among the victims.

The police confirmed that the girl who died later in a hospital was among those rescued, though several others sustained significant injuries. Eyewitnesses described harrowing scenes, with some of the children unconscious, their eyes rolled back, and suffering from burns. Mark Shankar, Pawan Kalyan's



younger son, was injured with burns to his hands and legs and suffered from smoke inhalation but is currently receiving treatment.

The Singapore Civil Defence Force (SCDF) responded swiftly, extinguishing the fire within 30 minutes using three water jets. They evacuated around 80 people from the building and surrounding areas. Approxi-

mately 20 individuals were taken to nearby hospitals for treatment.

A group of construction workers nearby acted quickly during the fire, using scaffolding and a ladder to rescue the trapped children. One of the workers, Subramanian Saranraj, expressed his concern for the children, saying, "I was scared for the children, because they were so small and couldn't climb out on their own."

The cause of the fire is under investigation, and authorities have not suspected foul play. However, the tragedy has deeply impacted the local community, with many parents anxiously awaiting news about their children's safety.

Fugitive Businessman Vijay Mallya Loses Appeal Against UK Bankruptcy Order

Indian businessman Vijay Mallya lost his appeal against a bankruptcy order issued by London's High Court on Wednesday, concerning a debt of over £1 billion (\$1.28 billion) owed to several lenders, including the State Bank of India. Mallya, who resides in Britain, has been at the center of a prolonged legal dispute with both Indian authorities and financial institutions following the 2012 collapse of his now-defunct Kingfisher Airlines.

In 2017, a group of banks obtained a ruling in India that held Mallya responsible for the massive debt tied to Kingfisher Airlines, for which he had personally guaranteed the loan. The judgment, totaling more than £1 billion, was later registered in the UK. This led to a bankruptcy order being issued against Mallya in 2021.

Mallya appealed the bankruptcy order, arguing during a February hearing that the banks had already recovered enough assets to effectively settle the debt. However, Judge Anthony Mann rejected his appeal on Tuesday, stating in his written ruling that "the bottom line... is that the bankruptcy order stands."

Mallya's legal team did not immediately respond to requests for comment on the latest ruling.

In addition to the bankruptcy case, Mallya is also facing extradition to India to stand trial for



fraud charges linked to the collapse of Kingfisher Airlines. His appeal against extradition was rejected in 2020. Despite this, Judge Mann noted in his ruling that the extradition order "has still not been enforced," adding that Mallya continues to resist extradition on other legal grounds that remain unresolved.

Mallya, who was also a co-owner of the Force India Formula One racing team, has been living in the UK since fleeing India in 2016, following allegations of financial mismanagement and defaulting on loans. The legal battle continues as both India and the UK work through the complex proceedings surrounding his case.

Myanmar In Need Of Relief and Long Term Support After Quake: Thailand

Myanmar remains in dire need of medical assistance, field hospitals, and shelter following the devastating 7.7 magnitude earthquake that struck the country on March 28. Thai Foreign Minister Maris Sangiampongsa highlighted the urgency of a coordinated regional relief effort and long-term support for Myanmar, which is still reeling from one of the strongest quakes to hit the region in a century.

The earthquake, which jolted a region home to 28 million people, caused massive destruction. Buildings collapsed, entire communities were flattened, and essential resources like food, water, and shelter became scarce. According to Myanmar's military government, the earthquake claimed 3,645 lives, left 5,017 people injured, and left 148 missing. Nearly 49,000 homes and over 2,100 government buildings were destroyed.

Maris, along with Malaysian Foreign Minister Mohamad Hasan, visited the quake-hit capital Naypyitaw on Saturday to assess the situation. In an interview, Maris emphasized the urgent need for field hospitals, as many existing medical facilities were unable to function at full capacity due to damage from the quake. Temporary shelters, mosquito nets, food, water filters, and clean water supplies are also crucial, with concerns rising about the spread of communicable diseases amid the intense summer heat. The United Nations Office for the Coordination



of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) commended the efforts of over 30 search-and-rescue teams from 13 countries who assisted in the immediate aftermath of the quake. While some teams have now departed, emergency aid continues to arrive, including a fifth batch from China, which brought 91 tonnes of supplies, including tents and mosquito nets.

The earthquake came at a time when Myanmar was already grappling with economic challenges and a civil war triggered by a military coup in 2021. The junta and rebel groups have declared temporary ceasefires to facilitate the relief effort, although tensions remain high.

Maris and his Malaysian counterpart are coordinating efforts for both immediate and long-term assistance, including reconstruction of the devastated areas. Thailand will focus on humanitarian work in Mandalay, while Malaysia will assist in the Sagaing region, both close to the earthquake's epicenter.

"Markets Rattle Under Global Tariff Tensions; Sensex Sheds 379 Points, Nifty Falls 136 Despite RBI Rate Cut"

Domestic stock markets suffered heavy losses on Wednesday. The escalation of the tariff war between the US and China, negative signals from global markets, and expectations of disruption to the supply chain worldwide have increased negative sentiment in the market. Investors remained cautious even after the RBI cut interest rates as it was not known how long the uncertainty would last. The selling spree continued in the finance, IT, media, metal and pharma sectors. Overall, the Nifty lost 136 points and the Sensex lost 379 points. The India VIX also reached 21.43.



The BSE Sensex, which closed at 74,227 in the previous session, opened at 74,103 on Wednesday. It touched an intraday low of 73,673. It reached an intraday high of 74,103. It finally closed

at 73,847, losing 379 points. The NSE Nifty, which opened at 22,460, touched a low of 22,353 and a high of 22,468. It closed at 22,399, down 136 points. The

Nifty Bank fell 270 points to settle at 50,240. Of the Nifty50, 18 companies gained while 32 lost. Nestle India, Hindustan



RBI Approves Revised UPI Transaction Limits for Person-to-Merchant Payments



Reserve Bank of India (RBI) announced that the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) has been permitted to increase transaction limits for Unified Payments Interface (UPI) payments between persons and merchants (P2M), based on evolving user needs.

UPI, a real-time payment system, enables seamless transactions between bank accounts via mobile apps. Currently, the transaction limit for UPI payments, including both Person-to-Person (P2P) and Person-to-Merchant (P2M) transactions, is capped at ₹1 lakh. However, certain P2M transactions already have higher limits, with some set at ₹2 lakh and others at ₹5 lakh, depending on the use case.

RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra stated that NPCI will revise these limits in consultation with banks and other stakeholders in the UPI ecosystem to address the changing requirements of users. Appropriate safeguards will be introduced to mitigate risks associated with these higher transaction limits. It was emphasized that while P2M payments may see revised limits, P2P transactions will remain capped at ₹1 lakh.

In addition to the UPI update, Governor Malhotra outlined other key developments. The RBI is set to review guidelines related to loans against gold jewellery, aiming to harmonize regulations across regulated entities (REs) while considering their risk-taking capabilities.

Draft guidelines for public comment will be issued soon.

Furthermore, the RBI proposes to make the Regulatory Sandbox (RS) framework 'theme neutral' and available on-demand, promoting continuous innovation within India's rapidly evolving fintech space. The central bank also plans to introduce a draft framework for the securitization of stressed assets and expand the scope of co-lending arrangements among regulated entities.

The RBI's proactive approach to regulating the fintech and lending sectors aims to streamline processes and foster innovation while ensuring the stability of India's financial ecosystem.

IRDAI Imposes ₹1.06 Crore Penalty on Flipkart for Insurance Norm Violations

The Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) has imposed a total penalty of ₹1.06 crore on Flipkart for violations related to insurance e-commerce and corporate agent regulations. The fine comprises ₹1 crore for breaching the Insurance E-commerce Guidelines, 2017, and ₹6 lakh for selling insurance policies without a valid certificate of registration.

The penalty stems from Flipkart's improper use of its Insurance Self-Network Platform (ISNP), which was initially approved for facilitating direct online solicitation of insurance policies with insurers. However, regulatory investigations revealed that when users clicked on the "buy insurance" button on Flipkart's website, they were redirected to a third-party insurance intermediary's page to complete their purchase. IRDAI found that this redirection was not merely a form of advertisement but an unauthorized method of insurance solicitation, violating regulatory norms.

While Flipkart argued that it only provided advertising space for the intermediary and had no referral agreement, the regulator determined that the financial ar-

angement went beyond advertising and constituted a violation. Following IRDAI's notice, Flipkart discontinued the redirection.

Additionally, Flipkart faced a ₹6 lakh fine for continuing to sell insurance policies after applying for the renewal of its registration certificate. The IRDAI clarified that the filing of a renewal application does not automatically extend registration, and selling policies without valid registration violated specific regulatory provisions.

IRDAI has directed Flipkart to pay the ₹1.06 crore fine within 45 days and informed the company's board of the decision. Flipkart has the option to appeal the order before the Securities Appellate Tribunal.

Although IRDAI imposed penalties for other violations, including the procurement of a large number of policies by a single individual, it refrained from pressing charges related to governance issues. Flipkart has committed to reviewing the order, maintaining its commitment to regulatory compliance and high governance standards.



SEBI Forms High-Level Committee to Address Conflict of Interest in Securities Market Regulators



The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has established a high-level committee (HLC) to review and address conflicts of interest among the board members and employees of securities market regulators. This decision follows a directive made at SEBI's board meeting last month.

In its circular, SEBI outlined that the committee would thoroughly assess and recommend improvements to the existing framework for managing conflicts of interest, disclosures, and related issues. The goal is to ensure higher standards of transparency, accountability, and ethical conduct among SEBI officials and board members.

The committee will be chaired by Pratyush Sinha, a former Chief Vigilance Commissioner, and will include several distinguished former bureaucrats and experts. Notable members of the committee include Inejit Srinivas, former Secretary at the Ministry of Corporate Affairs; G. Mahalingam, former Whole-Time Member of SEBI; Sarit Jafa, former Deputy Comptroller and Auditor General; Uday Kotak, founder of Kotak Mahindra Bank; and R. Narayanaswamy, former professor at IIM Bangalore.

The committee's mandate includes reviewing SEBI's current policies, identi-

fying any gaps, and recommending a comprehensive framework to mitigate conflicts of interest. It will also explore mechanisms that will allow the public to raise concerns regarding potential conflicts of interest within the securities market regulators.

This initiative is part of SEBI's ongoing efforts to enhance the integrity of the securities market by ensuring that its regulators uphold the highest standards of ethical behavior. The committee's recommendations will be pivotal in shaping future regulations aimed at fostering greater transparency and accountability within the sector.


Teen Marries 41-Year-Old, Starts Family

Retired Officer Attacked Over Waqf Bill

A retired Indian Army officer was allegedly attacked by a cab driver and his associates following a heated argument over the Waqf Amendment Bill during a road trip from Lucknow to Kanpur. The incident took place on April 5 in Unnao, Uttar Pradesh. The victim, Colonel Surya Prakash Singh (Retd), currently serving as the head of the District Sainik Welfare Board in Kanpur, had hired a private cab for the journey. According to Singh's complaint, the confrontation began during a political discussion with the driver, identified as Wasim from Begumpurwa in Kanpur. Singh said the situation escalated after he expressed support for the Waqf Amendment Bill, which appeared to provoke the driver. Following the argument, Wasim allegedly stopped the vehicle at the Azad Nagar intersection in Unnao and called his associates. A group of men arrived soon after and reportedly assaulted the retired officer along with the driver. Singh subsequently lodged a formal complaint with the local police against Wasim and the unidentified attackers. Authorities have registered a case and launched an investigation into the matter. The assault, believed to be fueled by ideological differences, has raised concerns over growing intolerance surrounding political and religious opinions. The Waqf Amendment Bill has been a topic of national debate, with strong sentiments on both sides, and this incident underscores the volatility such discussions can provoke. Police officials have confirmed that an inquiry is underway and assured that appropriate legal action will follow based on the evidence and testimonies gathered. No arrests have been made so far. As the investigation progresses, the case continues to draw attention as an alarming example of discourse turning into violence.

Wife Publicly Assaults Husband Over Joblessness

In a deeply unsettling incident that has gone viral on social media, a woman was captured on camera physically assaulting a man, reportedly her husband, in a public place. The video, which has stirred intense debate online, shows the woman holding the man aggressively by his collar and repeatedly slapping him while berating him for not earning. The altercation took place in front of a shop, and although a crowd gathered around the scene, no one stepped in to stop the violence or even question the woman's actions. The clip clearly captures her shouting that he doesn't contribute financially, using his alleged unemployment as a justification for the assault. The man, visibly passive and humiliated, did not retaliate, further intensifying public sympathy and concern. What shocked viewers even more was the complete lack of intervention from bystanders, raising questions about societal apathy and the perception of male victims in cases of domestic abuse. As the video spread rapidly across platforms like X (formerly Twitter), users expressed outrage, asking, "Who gave her the right?" and emphasizing that violence cannot be tolerated under any circumstance, regardless of gender. Many netizens condemned the



act, calling for accountability and urging that domestic abuse be recognized and addressed with gender neutrality. The incident has reignited conversations around men facing abuse in relationships—an often overlooked issue that remains largely unspoken due to social stigma. Legal experts and activists have

also weighed in, pointing out the urgent need for balanced discourse and protection for all victims of domestic violence. As of now, authorities have not made an official statement on the incident, but growing online pressure could prompt a formal response or investigation in the coming days.

Much-Awaited Pro Panja League Season 2 to Begin on August 5


