Revanth Reddy's Strong Remarks Against Modi at AICC Plenary

process for a Red Corner Notice (RCN) against Rao. A Red Corner Notice is an international request to locate and provisionally arrest a person pending extradition. Authorities believe Rao is currently outside India.

The cancellation of Rao's passport marks a serious escalation in efforts to bring him back for questioning. A senior officer in the Indian Police Service (IPS), Rao is accused of orchestrating unauthorized phone interceptions during his tenure, raising major privacy concerns and questions of misuse of official power.

Sources suggest that the phone tapping scandal involves several political and administrative figures, prompting widespread public debate on digital privacy and political surveillance.

The Red Corner Notice, once processed, will involve global law enforcement bodies, including Interpol, to assist in Rao's apprehension. This development comes amid increasing calls for accountability and transparency in handling cases related to illegal surveillance.

As the CBI continues its probe, more revelations are expected in what has become one of the most controversial cases of the year. With the passport now invalid and the RCN process underway, legal pressure on Rao is

SIT Holds Review Meeting on Online Betting App Cases

Supreme Court Expert Committee Visits HCU Land in Gachibowli

A Supreme Court-appointed expert committee is set to conduct a field visit to the disputed 400acre land adjacent to the Hyderabad Central University (HCU) in Gachibowli, to determine whether the area qualifies as forest land or not. The committee will interact separately with university officials, students, and government authorities to collect diverse viewpoints before submitting its detailed report to the apex court.

The dispute began when authorities began clearing trees in the area as part of a land-levelling effort, prompting environmental concerns and leading some petitioners to approach the Supreme Court. Until a final verdict is issued, the court has halted all developmental activity on the site.

The core question revolves around whether the land fits the legal definition of forest. According to Supreme Court guidelines, forest land should have roughly 100 trees per acre, with significant age and biodiversity. However, forest department sources argue that the trees in



sparse, and the presence of wildlife is minimal.

On the other hand, the Revenue Department has maintained that the

400 acres are clearly government land and do not belong to HCU. Forest and revenue officials will present documentary evidence to the expert committee.

Meerpet Development Projects Lie Neglected, Citizens Demand Action

The Meerpet Municipality in Maheshwaram constituency is under fire from residents for the gross negligence in maintenance of development projects. While crores of rupees were spent on infrastructure like the Rythu Bazaar, Model Market, and Overhead Water Tank, the facilities now stand either abandoned or in shambles. Locals are questioning for whom these structures were built, as they fail to serve their intended purpose.

Once a functioning facility, the Rythu Bazaar in Lenin Nagar has now become a symbol of neglect, with poor sanitation driving people away. Adjacent shops built to promote small businesses have never been opened. Similar-



ly, the overhead tank—meant to quench the thirst of thousands—now stands idle like a lifeless monument.

At Balapur crossroads, the much-hyped Model Market has also fallen into disuse, with locals alleging that it was never made functional. Adding to the woes, trunk lines left incomplete are emitting foul odors, turning colonies into unbearable zones.

Despite collecting heavy taxes from residents, the municipality cites a "budget deficit" as an excuse for inaction. Residents, along with local opposition parties, demand that MLA Sabitha Indra Reddy ensure these taxpayer-funded facilities are made operational. Concerns have also been raised over anti-social activities taking place in these deserted buildings after dark. Locals urge swift action before the situation worsens.

Two suspects, Shaikh Saheb Khan from Visakhapatnam and Mohammad Ali from Hyderabad, were caught red-handed while dealing 9.012 kg of ganja. Two mobile phones were also confiscated from them. Authorities revealed that the duo sourced ganja at low prices from Araku and sold it at higher prices in the city.

In a separate raid at Ameerpet, the SGFC team arrested Chukka Anand Babu from Bapatla, Guntur district, while he was attempting to sell gania. The accused and the seized contraband were handed

over to Ameerpet Excise Station.

Illegal Sand Transport Surges in Vikarabad's Yalal MandalLocals Demand Strict Action Against 'Sand Mafia

Rampant illegal sand transportation from the Kokat Kagna river in Yalal mandal has raised serious concerns among locals, as regulatory oversight appears to be entirely missing. With only 10 sand transport permits issued, nearly 30 tractor loads are being moved daily, pointing to largescale permit violations.

Permits legally allow sand movement between 10 AM and 5 PM, but operations start as early as 6 AM and go on past midnight. Despite rules allowing only 2–3 trips per tractor, some are reportedly making up to 10 trips daily. Even more troubling, sand is being dumped at private locations without proper permissions, bypassing the rules.

Locals say anyone who attempts to question the illegal transport faces aggressive retaliation. The lax monitoring by police and revenue officials is being exploited by the sand transporters, who are bleeding government revenue while misusing provisions meant for public works like roads and drainage.

Government Reclaims ₹1,200 Crore Worth Land in Kokapet from Encroachers

In a major operation, the Telangana state government has reclaimed nearly ₹1,200 crore worth of prime land in Hyderabad's highly sought-after IT corridor, Kokapet. The area, known for its skyrocketing land prices, witnessed illegal encroachments by unscrupulous individuals who had occupied valuable government land and constructed unauthorized struc-

According to revenue officials, about 16 acres of land in Survey Number 100 of Kokapet, near Puppalaguda and within close proximity (2–3 km) to the

Outer Ring Road and Neopolis, had been illegally occupied. Encroachers had set up houses, tin sheds, and even food courts on this high-value land.

Following a review of land records and field inspections conducted as part of a recent survey of vacant government lands in Gandipet mandal, authorities discovered the encroachments. Gandipet Tahsildar N. Srinivasa Reddy visited the site and confirmed the unauthorized permanent and temporary constructions on the

Despite issuing notices to vacate the

premises, the occupants did not comply. Consequently, on Tuesday, the revenue department, with the help of local police and enforcement teams, carried out a demolition drive and cleared all illegal constructions.

The recovered land, estimated to be worth ₹1,200 crore, has now been officially taken into government possession. Authorities have warned that strict action will be taken against future encroachments and reiterated the government's commitment to protecting public property, especially in prime real estate zones like Koka-



Lingapur Farmers Protest Demanding Irrigation Water

Mujra Party Busted in Moinabad: **20 Arrested Including 7 Women**

Cannabis Worth ₹41.50 Lakh Destroyed in Khammam

Global Boycotts of UŠ Goods

Across the globe, American products are increasingly becoming the target of consumer boycotts as citizens of various countries protest U.S. foreign policy and political actions—particularly those tied to the Trump administration. These boycotts, while not coordinated under a single umbrella movement, reflect a rising wave of politically motivated consumer activism where purchasing decisions are shaped by geopolitical sentiments. From fast-food chains and tech giants to luxury fashion and entertainment exports, US brands are feeling the ripple effects of international frustration. Protesters in cities like London, Paris, Istanbul, and Kuala Lumpur have been vocal, with rallies targeting not just political leaders like Donald Trump but also high-profile figures such as Elon Musk, symbolizing corporate America's global dominance. At the heart of these boycotts lies a growing realization: consumer culture is inextricably linked to politics. Global consumers are not passive participants; they are politically conscious actors capable of reshaping market dynamics in response to perceived injustices. The call to "vote with your wallet" has grown louder, and it's gaining traction. For Trump, this trend could be a cause for concern. While his domestic base may rally behind protectionism and "America First" rhetoric, the global marketplace plays a critical role in the strength of the US economy. What's clear is that these boycotts are more than fleeting gestures; they are part of a broader shift in global consumer behavior, where identity, ethics, and politics increasingly dictate how people shop and what they support. For American leadership, and Trump in particular, ignoring this shift could mean losing not just goodwill abroad, but valuable market ground as well.

Time to Retire Iran War Talk

The longstanding hostility between Iran and the United States remains entrenched, as both nations continue to navigate a volatile relationship marked by mutual distrust, strategic missteps, and ideological rigidity. Despite occasional openings toward diplomacy, the overarching narrative remains mired in threats and war talk that has dominated the discourse since the George W. Bush and Mahmoud Ahmadinejad era. During that time, the rhetoric was intensely confrontational, with Iran defying American might and the US listing Iran in its "Axis of Evil." These hostilities gave rise to persistent predictions of an impending war, a drumbeat that, although tiresome in its repetitiveness, still incites alarm. The idea of military action against Iran has never been far from the minds of US policymakers, especially within the Republican establishment, where calls for strikes have often been viewed as rational responses rather than radical measures. Activist groups like Code Pink have been marginalized despite their calls for diplomacy and peace. Even during Obama's tenure, fears of war persisted until more moderate Iranian leadership emerged. Still, the media's portrayal of Iran as an existential threat has fed into negative public perceptions—Americans rarely express favorable views of the country, which has deepened the divide be-



lesson from Iraq's devastating war, a campaign widely regarded as a strategic blunder, should have served as a deterrent. Yet Iran, with a far larger population and complex political landscape, remains under the shadow of similar saber-rattling. Internally,

tween the people of both nations. The Iran's leadership lacks a cohesive vision, increasingly seen as prioritizing ideological expansion over national welfare. The Revolutionary Guards' external adventurism, combined with disregard for cultural traditions and a worsening economic crisis, has alienated many Iranians. Power blackouts,

hyperinflation, and sanctions have left the public wondering about the true cost of Iran's nuclear pursuits. On the US side, foreign policy has taken a more eccentric tone. From suggestions of annexing Canada to speculation about military action in the Middle East, unpredictability defines WashPresident Donald Trump has sought a diplomatic solution, even sending a personal letter to Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Khamenei via an Emirati intermediary. Khamenei responded by approving indirect talks, now scheduled in Oman, while also issuing a stern warning against aggression. A breakthrough seems possible but precarious, with Trump reportedly setting a two-month deadline for progress. The renewed direct military clash between Iran and Israel, triggered by attacks in April 2024, has shattered whatever restraint previously existed in their proxy conflict. Amid these tensions, figures like US envoy Steve Witkoff have attempted to reopen channels through cautious messaging, even briefly engaging with Iranian officials online over the JCPOA terms. While predictions remain speculative, and skepticism is warranted, even a limited agreement would be preferable to continued escalation. Iran's dire governance rankings reflect systemic dysfunctions that go beyond foreign policy. But any constructive engagement between Washington and Tehran could signal hope—not just for a reset in relations, but for the millions in the region who remain trapped in a cycle of conflict. The world stands to benefit whenever this overdue understanding materializes.

RBI Cuts Repo Rate by 25 Basis Points to 6% Amid Global Trade Uncertainty

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has reduced the reporate by 25 basis points to 6%, with the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) voting unanimously in favor of the move. The decision, announced on Wednesday, is aimed at supporting economic growth and easing the interest burden on borrowers with home, auto, and other loans. However, this reduction is expected to lower the interest earned on savings for depositors.

This rate cut comes amid growing concerns over the global trade war, particularly the impact of U.S. President Donald Trump's tariffs. In light of these challenges, the MPC has also revised its growth forecast for India's GDP in 2025-26, lowering it from 6.7% to 6.5%.

This marks the second consecutive rate cut by the RBI, following a 25 basis point reduction in the previous policy meeting. The committee, led by RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra, also shifted its policy stance from neutral to accommodative, signaling a more growth-focused approach. This change indicates the RBI's growing concern about the potential impact of the trade war on domestic economic growth, rather than inflation risks. The shift in stance suggests the possibility of further rate cuts in the future to stimulate the economy.

Governor Malhotra highlighted that global uncertainty, particularly the escalating trade tensions, could dampen investment and spending by businesses and households, negatively impacting domestic growth. Additionally, higher tariffs are expected to hurt India's expects

On inflation, Malhotra noted that while global volatility posed some risks, including currency pressures and imported inflation, the domestic inflation outlook remained relatively stable. Inflation risks are seen as two-sided, with a slowdown in global growth potentially softening commodity and crude oil prices.

Looking ahead, RBI projects India's GDP growth for 2025–26 at 6.5%, with inflation expected to remain at 4% for the year. Despite ongoing global uncertainties, the RBI remains committed to using monetary policy to ensure a balanced and stable economic environment.

India ends transshipment facility for Bangladesh exports, cites congestion

- Bangladesh-Nepal/Bhutan trade routes unaffected.
- · Yunus' China remarks add diplomatic tension.
- Visa, trade issues strain bilateral ties further.

India has withdrawn the transshipment facility extended to Bangladesh due to the significant congestion it was causing at Indian airports and ports, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) confirmed on Wednesday. MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal clarified that the decision, effective from April 8, 2025, is not intended to affect Bangladesh's trade with Nepal or Bhutan.

The transshipment facility, which had been in place since June 2020, allowed cargo from Bangladesh to transit through Indian land customs stations before being sent to their final destinations using Indian ports and airports. This move was essential for Bangladesh's exports, particularly ready-made items, to third countries such as Nepal, Bhutan, and Myanmar. However, over time, the facility had resulted in logistical delays and congestion, which hindered India's own exports and led to backlogs, prompting the decision to terminate the arrangement.

Jaiswal explained that although the transshipment facility was withdrawn, it would not disrupt Bangladesh's exports to Nepal or Bhutan through Indian territory. He also emphasized that the decision was a logistical one and not



related to any political developments.

The decision follows controversial remarks by Prof. Muhammad Yunus, the Chief Adviser to Bangladesh's interim government, who visited Beijing and advocated for stronger trade ties between China and India's northeastern states using Bangladeshi ports. Yunus' statements, made during a roundtable discussion in China, were met with criticism in India, with Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma calling them "offensive and highly condemnable."

While Indian officials have refrained from confirming whether Yunus' remarks influenced the withdrawal of the transshipment facility, the timing of the move, just days before the New Year festivities in Dhaka, has been perceived as a setback to bilateral trade. This development follows ongoing concerns over the limited issuance of Indian visas to Bangladesh's business community, further straining economic ties.

The issue highlights the ongoing complexities in India-Bangladesh relations, with trade, logistics, and diplomatic considerations all playing significant roles.

Congress Demands Caste Census, Rahul Gandhi Slams Waqf Bill and RSS

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Wednesday, April 9, 2025, denounced the Waqf (Amendment) Act, calling it "anti-Constitution" and a direct attack on religious freedoms. Speaking at the AICC session held on the banks of the Sabarmati River, Gandhi raised concerns that the BJP and RSS would soon target the rights of other minorities, particularly Christians and Sikhs, following the passage of the Waqf Bill.

Gandhi claimed that the new law undermines the constitutional rights of religious minorities in India, specifically accusing the government of orchestrating an agenda to curb religious freedoms. He cited an article in an RSS-affiliated magazine that allegedly suggested that the BJP and RSS are now focused on limiting the rights of Christians, with Sikhs potentially being next in line.

In his address, Gandhi also warned of an impending "economic storm," attributing it to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's subservience to U.S. President Donald Trump, especially regarding the imposition of tariffs. He criticized Modi for failing to challenge Trump's actions, referencing a recent meeting between the two leaders where Trump's decision to impose new tariffs on Indian goods went unopposed. "Did you see the photograph of PM Modi hugging Mr. Trump? This time he ordered Modi ji that 'we



will not hug but will impose new tariffs," Gandhi remarked. Furthermore, Gandhi took a jibe at Modi's recent interaction with Bangladesh's Chief Advisor Mohammad Yunus, suggesting that the Prime Minister's silence on Yunus' remarks was in stark contrast to his usual bold rhetoric. "Where is the 56-inch chest?" Gandhi quipped, mocking Modi's strength and resolve.

On the issue of caste-based reservations, Gandhi reiterated his support for a national caste census, calling for an expansion of the reservation system and mentioning that Telangana had already made strides in this area. He also emphasized that the Congress party would continue to fight for constitutional values against what he described as an RSS-led push to control India's institutions. "We have truth and the love of the people on our side," he concluded.



Gold Prices Spiked Amid Global Trade Tensions and US Tariffs

Gold prices have surged, driven by concerns over a potential global economic slowdown triggered by U.S. President Donald Trump's sweeping tariffs on Chinese imports. In India, the price of 24-karat gold has risen to ₹8,972 per gram, while 22-karat gold is priced at ₹8,224, and 18-karat gold stands at ₹6,729 per gram, according to Goodreturns.

The U.S. dollar weakened ahead of the tariff rollout, making gold, priced in dollars, more attractive to foreign buyers. Trump's administration imposed a significant 104% tariff on Chinese imports and outlined plans for a baseline 10% import duty on other goods. China responded defiantly, labeling the move as "blackmail" and vowing to "fight to the end."

Tim Waterer, Chief Market Analyst at KCM Trade, explained that the downward shift in the dollar due to tariff concerns allowed gold to reclaim the \$3,000 level. Despite some volatility, Waterer indicated that gold could reach new all-time highs, citing uncertainty around global growth and inflation as key drivers.

Gold reached a record high of \$3,167.57 on April 3, mirroring the surge in 1980 during the Iranian Revolution when political risks and inflation fears dominated markets. Investor appetite for gold remains strong, with gold-backed exchange-traded funds seeing the largest quarterly inflows in three years, according to the World Gold Council.

However, rising U.S. bond yields capped some of gold's gains, as the 10-year Treasury yield hit its highest level in over a week, reducing the appeal of non-yielding bullion. Looking ahead, market participants are awaiting the release of the U.S. Federal Reserve's meeting minutes and upcoming inflation data, including the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and Producer Price Index (PPI), later this week.

Analysts, including Rahul Kalantri, VP of Commodities at Mehta Equities, remain cautious, noting that while gold surged due to short-covering and bargain buying, it lost steam after the U.S. announced the tariff changes. Kalantri suggests that gold could face support at \$2,978–\$2,955 per ounce and resistance at \$3,040–\$3,065 per ounce in global markets, with similar levels for Indian gold prices. Analysts believe that gold's upward trajectory may continue as macroeconomic uncertainties persist.

India's naval aviation gets a boost: Rafale-Marine jets approved for acquisition

In a major boost to India's naval aviation, the Cabinet Committee on Security, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the purchase of 26 Rafale-Marine fighter jets from French aviation giant Dassault, at an estimated cost of ₹63,000 crore. This acquisition is aimed at enhancing the Indian Navy's offensive capabilities, especially for operations at sea. The jets will be deployed on India's indigenously built aircraft carrier, INS Vikrant, and are expected to significantly strengthen the Navy's ability to carry out longer-range precision strikes against both aerial and maritime threats.

The deal, which includes weapons, simulators, training, spares, and maintenance support, will also fea-



ture India-specific modifications. These additions include the integration of India's Astra missile system, setting up a maintenance, repair, and overhaul (MRO) hub, and sourcing components from local suppliers. The Rafale-Marine jets are equipped with advanced armament systems, including the SCALP-EG, a 650-km range cruise missile.

These fighter jets will consist of 22 single-seater and four twin-seater variants, designed to complement the Navy's existing aircraft fleet. The Rafale-Marine's operational features include reinforced landing gear and foldable wings, allowing efficient storage aboard aircraft carriers. This capability will be crucial, as the jets can operate in the constrained space of

While the deal comes at a higher price compared to the IAF's 36 Rafale jets, which were purchased for ₹59,000 crore in 2016, the cost difference is attributed to inflation, the increased exchange rates of the dollar and euro, and a decade gap between the two deals.

Additionally, in case of an emergency, these jets can be deployed to Indian Air Force bases along the northern borders, bolstering the IAF's fleet of Rafale jets. This move represents a significant upgrade to India's naval aviation, as it replaces the Russian-origin MiG-29K jets, some of which have faced operational challenges since their induction in 2011.







Russia Invites PM Modi to Attend 80th Anniversary of Victory Day Celebrations

- Event marks 80 years since Nazi Germany's defeat.
- Putin accepted Modi's earlier India visit invite.
- Ties grow stronger in defense and diplomacy.

Russia has extended an invitation to Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi to attend the May 9 celebrations marking the 80th anniversary of victory over Nazi Germany in World War II, as confirmed by Russian Deputy Foreign Minister Andrey Rudenko. The invitation has been sent, and preparations for the Prime Minister's visit are currently underway.

Speaking to Russian news agency Tass, Rudenko stated, "Moscow is expecting the Indian Prime Minister at the May 9 parade. The invitation has already been sent, and the visit is being worked out. It should take place this year."

Victory Day, celebrated on May 9, commemorates the signing of the Act of Unconditional Surrender by Germany in 1945, effectively bringing an end to World War II. This year's celebrations will mark the 80th anniversary of that pivotal moment in history, and Russia has invited leaders from several friendly nations to join in the commemora-

In July 2024, Prime Minister Modi visited Russia for the first time in nearly five years. During this visit, he also extended an invitation to Russian President Vladimir Putin to visit India, an invitation that Putin has accepted. However, the specific dates for Putin's trip to India have yet to be disclosed.

Prime Minister Modi and President Putin maintain a strong diplomatic relationship, characterized by regular communication through telephone calls and in-person meetings, especially during international events. The two leaders' ongoing collaboration underscores the close ties between India and Russia, particularly in areas such as defense, trade, and geopolitical cooperation.

The invitation to Modi to participate in the Victory Day parade reflects the deepening bilateral ties between the two nations and signifies the importance of their strategic partnership on the global stage.

US Bill Threatens to End Work Visa for Indian Students, Creating Uncertainty for 300,000

A proposed bill in the United States Congress is poised to disrupt the Optional Practical Training (OPT) program, a vital work authorization initiative for international students, particularly those in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) fields. This development has caused major concern among the Indian student community in the US, with over 300,000 students potentially impacted.

The OPT program allows international students to gain practical work experience in the US for up to three years after graduation. Indian students are the largest beneficiaries of this program, with nearly 98,000 participants in the 2023-2024 academic year, according to the Open Doors 2024 report. The proposed bill could force these students to leave the US immediately after graduation, disrupting their careers and financial stability, as many rely on OPT to repay hefty student loans.

If passed, the bill would severely limit job opportunities for Indian students, compelling them to seek work in countries with more accommodating post-study policies, like Canada or those in Europe. This could also negatively impact the US job market, especially in STEM fields, where international students play a crucial role in addressing



skill shortages.

In response, many students are rushing to secure H-1B work visas, which are sponsored primarily by large tech companies. However, these visas are highly competitive, with a limited number of slots each year. Students are now scrambling to secure job offers that would enable them to apply for an H-1B visa before any changes take effect.

Legal experts, such as Poorvi Chothani of LawQuest, have stressed the urgency of the situation. The OPT program provides stu-

dents up to three years of work experience, but if the bill passes, many may be forced to leave the US immediately after graduation, losing valuable career opportunities.

Amidst this uncertainty, many students have cancelled summer travel plans, fearing they may not be allowed to re-enter the country. Prestigious institutions like Cornell and Yale have unofficially advised international students to avoid traveling home during breaks, further exacerbating the sense of instability.

Girl Dies, 20 More Including Pawan Kalyan's Son Injured In Singapore School Fire

A devastating fire at a shophouse in Singapore's River Valley Road area resulted in the death of a 10-year-old girl and left 20 others injured on Tuesday. Among the injured was the seven-year-old son of Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan.

The fire broke out at a three-storey building that housed educational and enrichment classes for children, including cooking, theatre, and robotics schools. At the time of the incident, 16 children aged six to 10 and six adults were present in the building. The fire spread quickly through the second and third floors of the building, causing severe burns and smoke inhalation among the victims.

The police confirmed that the girl who died later in a hospital was among those rescued, though several others sustained significant injuries. Eyewitnesses described harrowing scenes, with some of the children unconscious, their eyes rolled back, and suffering from burns. Mark Shankar, Pawan Kalyan's



younger son, was injured with burns to his the children, saying, "I was scared for the inhalation but is currently receiving treat-

The Singapore Civil Defence Force (SCDF) responded swiftly, extinguishing the fire within 30 minutes using three water jets. They evacuated around 80 people from the building and surrounding areas. Approxi-

mately 20 individuals were taken to nearby hospitals for treatment.

A group of construction workers nearby acted quickly during the fire, using scaffolding and a ladder to rescue the trapped children. One of the workers, Subramanian Saranraj, expressed his concern for

hands and legs and suffered from smoke children, because they were so small and couldn't climb out on their own."

> The cause of the fire is under investigation, and authorities have not suspected foul play. However, the tragedy has deeply impacted the local community, with many parents anxiously awaiting news about their children's safety.

Fugitive Businessman Vijay Mallya Loses Appeal Against UK Bankruptcy Order


Indian businessman Vijay Mallya lost his appeal against a bankruptcy order issued by London's High Court on Wednesday, concerning a debt of over £1 billion (\$1.28 billion) owed to several lenders, including the State Bank of India. Mallya, who resides in Britain, has been at the center of a prolonged legal dispute with both Indian authorities and financial institutions following the 2012 collapse of his now-defunct Kingfisher Airlines.

In 2017, a group of banks obtained a ruling in India that held Mallya responsible for the massive debt tied to Kingfisher Airlines, for which he had personally guaranteed the loan. The judgment, totaling more than £1 billion, was later registered in the UK. This led to a bankruptcy order being issued against Mallya in 2021.

Mallya appealed the bankruptcy order, arguing during a February hearing that the banks had already recovered enough assets to effectively settle the debt. However, Judge Anthony Mann rejected his appeal on Tuesday, stating in his written ruling that "the bottom line... is that the bankruptcy order stands."

Mallya's legal team did not immediately respond to requests for comment on the latest ruling.

In addition to the bankruptcy case, Mallya is also facing extradition to India to stand trial for



fraud charges linked to the collapse of Kingfisher Airlines. His appeal against extradition was rejected in 2020. Despite this, Judge Mann noted in his ruling that the extradition order "has still not been enforced," adding that Mallya continues to resist extradition on other legal grounds that remain unresolved.

Mallya, who was also a co-owner of the Force India Formula One racing team, has been living in the UK since fleeing India in 2016, following allegations of financial mismanagement and defaulting on loans. The legal battle continues as both India and the UK work through the complex proceedings surrounding his case.

Myanmar In Need Of Relief and Long Term Support After Quake: Thailand

Myanmar remains in dire need of medical assistance, field hospitals, and shelter following the devastating 7.7 magnitude earthquake that struck the country on March 28. Thai Foreign Minister Maris Sangiampongsa highlighted the urgency of a coordinated regional relief effort and long-term support for Myanmar, which is still reeling from one of the strongest quakes to hit the region in a century.

The earthquake, which jolted a region home to 28 million people, caused massive destruction. Buildings collapsed, entire communities were flattened, and essential resources like food, water, and shelter became scarce. According to Myanmar's military government, the earthquake claimed 3,645 lives, left 5,017 people injured, and left 148 missing. Nearly 49,000 homes and over 2,100 government buildings were destroyed.

Maris, along with Malaysian Foreign Minister Mohamad Hasan, visited the quake-hit capital Naypyitaw on Saturday to assess the situation. In an interview, Maris emphasized the urgent need for field hospitals, as many existing medical facilities were unable to function at full capacity due to damage from the quake. Temporary shelters, mosquito nets, food, water filters, and clean water supplies are also crucial, with concerns rising about the spread of communicable diseases amid the intense summer heat. The United Nations Office for the Coordination



of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) commended the efforts of over 30 search-and-rescue teams from 13 countries who assisted in the immediate aftermath of the quake. While some teams have now departed, emergency aid continues to arrive, including a fifth batch from China, which brought 91 tonnes of supplies, including tents and mosquito nets.

The earthquake came at a time when Myanmar was already grappling with economic challenges and a civil war triggered by a military coup in 2021. The junta and rebel groups have declared temporary ceasefires to facilitate the relief effort, although tensions remain high.

Maris and his Malaysian counterpart are coordinating efforts for both immediate and longterm assistance, including reconstruction of the devastated areas. Thailand will focus on humanitarian work in Mandalay, while Malaysia will assist in the Sagaing region, both close to the earthquake's epicenter.



RBI Approves Revised UPI Transaction Limits for Person-to-Merchant Payments



Reserve Bank of India (RBI) an- RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra statnounced that the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) has been permitted to increase transaction limits for Unified Payments Interface (UPI) payments between persons and merchants (P2M), based on evolving user needs.

UPI, a real-time payment system, enables seamless transactions between bank accounts via mobile apps. Currently, the transaction limit for UPI payments, including both Person-to-Person (P2P) and Person-to-Merchant (P2M) transactions, is capped at ₹1 lakh. However, certain P2M transactions already have higher limits, with some set at ₹2 lakh and others at ₹5 lakh, depending on the use case.

IRDAI Imposes ₹1.06 Crore Penalty on Flipkart for Insurance Norm Violations

The Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) has imposed a total penalty of ₹1.06 crore on Flipkart for violations related to insurance e-commerce and corporate agent regulations. The fine comprises ₹1 crore for breaching the Insurance E-commerce Guidelines, 2017, and ₹6 lakh for selling insurance policies without a valid certificate of registration.

The penalty stems from Flipkart's improper use of its Insurance Self-Network Platform (ISNP), which was initially approved for facilitating direct online solicitation of insurance policies with insurers. However, regulatory investigations revealed that when users clicked on the "buy insurance" button on Flipkart's website, they were redirected to a third-party insurance intermediary's page to complete their purchase. IRDAI found that this redirection was not merely a form of advertisement but an unauthorized method of insurance solicitation, violating regulatory norms.

While Flipkart argued that it only provided advertising space for the intermediary regulatory compliance and high goverand had no referral agreement, the reg- nance standards. ulator determined that the financial ar-

rangement went beyond advertising and constituted a violation. Following IRDAI's notice, Flipkart discontinued the redirec-

Additionally, Flipkart faced a ₹6 lakh fine for continuing to sell insurance policies after applying for the renewal of its registration certificate. The IRDAI clarified that the filing of a renewal application does not automatically extend registration, and selling policies without valid registration violated specific regulatory provisions.

IRDAI has directed Flipkart to pay the ₹1.06 crore fine within 45 days and informed the company's board of the decision. Flipkart has the option to appeal the order before the Securities Appellate Tribunal.

Although IRDAI imposed penalties for other violations, including the procurement of a large number of policies by a single individual, it refrained from pressing charges related to governance issues. Flipkart has committed to reviewing the order, maintaining its commitment to



SEBI Forms High-Level Committee to Address Conflict of Interest in Securities Market Regulators



The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has established a high-level committee (HLC) to review and address conflicts of interest among the board members and employees of securities market regulators. This decision follows a directive made at SEBI's board meeting last month.

In its circular, SEBI outlined that the committee would thoroughly assess and recommend improvements to the existing framework for managing conflicts of interest, disclosures, and related issues. The goal is to ensu re higher standards of transparency, accountability, and ethical conduct amo The committee's mandate includes reng SEBI officials and board members.

The committee will be chaired by Pratyush Sinha, a former Chief Vigilance Commissioner, and will include several distinguished former bureaucrats and experts. Notable members of the committee include Inejit Srinivas, former Secretary at the Ministry of Corporate Affairs; G. Mahalingam, former Whole-Time Member of SEBI; Sarit Jafa, former Deputy Comptroller and Auditor General; Uday Kotak, founder of Kotak Mahindra Bank; and R. Narayanaswamy, former professor at IIM Bangalore.


Teen Marries 41-Year-Old, Starts Family

Mumbai Tops Uber's **List of Forgetful Cities**



In a quirky yet revealing roundup, Mumbai has earned the distinction of being India's most forgetful city, according to Uber's latest Lost and Found Index for 2024. The report, based on data gathered from rides across the country, showcases not only the frequency but also the variety of items left behind by riders—and Mumbai's list is both amusing and astonishing. While expected items like mobile phones, wallets, bags, and keys featured prominently, the city's residents also managed to forget some truly unexpected belongings, including a wheelchair, telescope, hair wig, a dog bark control device, and even a hawan kund (a fire altar used in Hindu rituals). In one of the more surprising discoveries, a rider even left behind a gold biscuit, and another forgot their entire wedding saree. Someone managed to misplace 25 kilograms of cow ghee, while another left a cooking stove behind in the cab. These strange but true tales have put Mumbai at the top, displacing Delhi, which had held the title for the past two years. The report also notes that Hyderabad ranked as the least forgetful city in India. Aside from the bizarre items, the most commonly forgotten essentials nationwide include earphones, spectacles, clothing, and even important documents. Uber's annual index not only serves as a humorous reminder of how distracted or hurried people can be during their daily commute but also emphasizes the scale at which such lapses occur. The company encourages users to double-check their belongings at the end of each trip and also provides a lost item feature within the app for recovery assistance. While the findings may seem comical, they underscore how fast-paced life in urban India has become—where even gold biscuits and wedding attire can be left behind in a rush.



A retired Indian Army officer was allegedly attacked by a cab driver and his associates following a heated argument over the Waqf Amendment Bill during a road trip from Lucknow to Kanpur. The incident took place on April 5 in Unnao, Uttar Pradesh. The victim, Colonel Surya Prakash Singh (Retd), currently serving as the head of the District Sainik Welfare Board in Kanpur, had hired a private cab for the journey. According to Singh's complaint, the confrontation began during a political discussion with the driver, identified as Wasim from Begumpurwa in Kanpur. Singh said the situation escalated after he expressed support for the Waqf Amendment Bill, which appeared to provoke the driver. Following the argument, Wasim allegedly stopped the vehicle at the Azad Nagar intersection in Unnao and called his associates. A group of men arrived soon after and reportedly assaulted the retired officer along with the driver. Singh subsequently lodged a formal complaint with the local police against Wasim and the unidentified attackers. Authorities have registered a case and launched an investigation into the matter. The assault, believed to be fueled by ideological differences, has raised concerns over growing intolerance surrounding political and religious opinions. The Waqf Amendment Bill has been a topic of national debate, with strong sentiments on both sides, and this incident underscores the volatility such discussions can provoke. Police officials have confirmed that an inquiry is underway and assured that appropriate legal action will follow based on the evidence and testimonies gathered. No arrests have been made so far. As the investigation progresses, the case continues to draw attention as an alarming example of discourse turning into violence.

Wife Publicly Assaults Husband Over Joblessness

In a deeply unsettling incident that has gone viral on social media, a woman was captured on camera physically assaulting a man, reportedly her husband, in a public place. The video, which has stirred intense debate online, shows the woman holding the man aggressively by his collar and repeatedly slapping him while berating him for not earning. The altercation took place in front of a shop, and although a crowd gathered around the scene, no one stepped in to stop the violence or even question the woman's actions. The clip clearly captures her shouting that he doesn't contribute financially, using his alleged unemployment as a justification for the assault. The man, visibly passive and humiliated, did not retaliate, further intensifying public sympathy and concern. What shocked viewers even more was the complete lack of intervention from bystanders, raising questions about societal apathy and the perception of male victims in cases of domestic abuse. As the video spread rapidly across platforms like X (formerly Twitter), users expressed outrage, asking, "Who gave her the right?" and emphasizing that violence cannot be tolerated under any circumstance, regardless of gender. Many netizens condemned the



act, calling for accountability and urging that domestic abuse be recognized and addressed with gender neutrality. The incident has reignited conversations around men facing abuse in relationships—an often overlooked issue that remains largely unspoken due to social stigma. Legal experts and activists have

also weighed in, pointing out the urgent need for balanced discourse and protection for all victims of domestic violence. As of now, authorities have not made an official statement on the incident, but growing online pressure could prompt a formal response or investigation in the coming days.

Much-Awaited Pro Panja League Season 2 to Begin on August 5




