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Rural Andhra Pradesh Vital for Vikasit Bharat Vision, Says Dy CM Pawan Kalyan



Deputy Chief Minister and Minister for Panchayati Raj and Rural Development, Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan, emphasized the crucial role of rural Andhra Pradesh in achieving the national vision of Vikasit Bharat. Addressing the 16th Finance Commission at the State Secretariat on Wednesday, he highlighted the state's efforts to empower Panchayats through economic and environmentally friendly development.

Pawan Kalyan stated that comprehensive rural development can improve employment opportunities, reduce migration. and ensure food security. He reiterated the importance of financial autonomy for 13,371 Gram Panchayats, 660 Mandal Parishads, and 26 Zilla Parishads. The State Government estimates a funding gap of ₹62,515 crore for local bodies from 2026-2031. He stressed that direct fund transfers to Panchayats will accelerate development. Proposals submitted to the Commission included strengthening infrastructure, constructing pothole-free roads, enhancing rural digital connectivity, and improving marketing for local products. To promote national spirit in villages, the operational budget for celebrations was increased tenfold. Steps are also being taken to boost local economies through eco-tourism, timber plantations, and support for media and film sectors. Pawan Kalyan affirmed that transforming local disadvantages into opportunities remains a core policy. He noted reforms in staff recruitment, unified services, and grassroots leadership under the Panchayat Raj system. As part of a transparency initiative, 13,326 Gram Sabhas were held on a single day across the state.

As per sources, the SIT found that funds from the distilleries were routed through these companies. That is why they raided Areti Hospitals and Kasireddy Rajasekhar Reddy's residence.

Reportedly, Mr. Kasireddy will be arrested very soon. Sources say he will become an approver, and subsequently, Mr. YS Jaganmohan Reddy will become the main accused in the liquor scam. By correlating the details revealed by Vijayasai and Kasireddy, a case will be filed against Jagan, leading to his imminent arrest.

Capital City Amaravati Construction Gains Momentum

Minister for Municipal Administration and Urban Development P. Narayana has reassured farmers who contributed land for the construction of the capital city that their sacrifices will not go in vain. Addressing concerns and alleged misinformation being spread about Amaravati, the minister called upon farmers not to harbor doubts or fears about the future of the capital or the proposed airport.

Speaking to the media, Minister Narayana clarified that no final decision has been taken on acquiring 30,000 acres of land for the international airport proposed in Amaravati. He said options including land pooling and land acquisition are being explored, and consultations are ongoing.

The minister said that Amaravati is being developed not just to provide basic infrastructure but to build a future-ready city with smart industries that can generate large-scale employment.

He said Amaravati's growth depends on the arrival of industries that are clean, green, and job-generating. He added that industrial development will stabilise and potentially increase land prices for the farmers who pooled land. CM Chandrababu Naidu has envisioned an international airport over 5,000 acres to ensure global connectivity and attract foreign investors. Administrative approval has been granted for projects worth ₹64,000 crore in Amaravati. The minister informed that the tenders have been completed for most projects, and construction work is underway. Residences for officials will be completed within one year. Trunk roads will be completed in one and a half years. Layout of roads will be completed in two and a half years. Iconic buildings will be completed in three years, he said.

Minister Narayana reiterated the government's commitment to develop Amaravati into a world-class capital city and assured farmers that their contributions and concerns are being fully respected and addressed.

Andhra Pradesh secures Rs 1,370 Crore investment from TCS for IT Hub in Visakhapatnam

In a major boost to the state's IT sector, Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) will set up a state-of-the-art development center in Visakhapatnam with an investment of Rs 1,370 crore.

The project is expected to generate 12,000 new jobs, marking a significant milestone in the state government's ambitious goal of creating 20 lakh jobs over the next five years. The state government has allocated 21.16 acres of prime land to TCS at a nominal lease rate of 99 paise, signalling its strong commitment to attract top-tier IT investments. This strategic move comes after sustained efforts by IT and Industries Minister Nara Lokesh, who has been leading the government's investment promotion initiatives. Minister Lokesh visited TCS headquarters in Mumbai in October 2024 and personally met Tata Sons Chairman N. Chandrasekaran to pitch Visakhapatnam as an emerging IT hub. Following continued negotiations, the state succeeded in secur-



ing TCS's commitment, marking a turning point in Andhra's drive to revive and expand its IT ecosystem. The development center is expected to catalyze Visakhapatnam's transformation into a major IT destination, with the state already witnessing growing interest from top tech firms. "This is not just an investment, it is a signal that the state is back on the IT map," said a senior official in the industries department.

To build a conducive environment for investment, the state has announced several forward-looking policies, including the Andhra Pradesh Electronics Manufacturing Policy, Semiconductor & Display Fab Policy, IT & Global Capability Centers Policy, and Data Center Policy for 2024–29. These offer some of the most competitive incentives in the country.

Minister Lokesh's proactive leadership has already yielded significant outcomes. Over the past 10 months, Andhra Pradesh has attracted investment proposals worth Rs 8 lakh crore, with the potential to create more than 5 lakh jobs. Global companies that had distanced themselves from the state in recent years are now returning with renewed interest.

In addition, a week-long tour of the United States by Minister Lokesh in October 2024, including roadshows in Silicon Valley, Seattle, and New York, helped draw attention from global tech giants like Tesla, Google, Apple, Microsoft, Adobe, and Salesforce. Over 100 companies were engaged to explore the investment opportunities in the state .

The TCS project in Visakhapatnam is now being hailed as a landmark achievement, not only for job creation but also for restoring confidence among investors and industry leaders. It stands as a testament to the renewed momentum in the state's industrial growth under the leadership of Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu and Minister Lokesh.

"He is among the very few Chief Ministers to personally deliver such a detailed economic and governance roadmap," said Dr. Panagariya, recalling his association with Naidu since 2015 during the Swachh Bharat and UPI development phases.

The Commission has visited 23 states so far in its ongoing 9-month consultation journey. "We still have five states left and cannot make any decisions until all consultations are complete," the Chairman clarified.

Highlighting AP's requests, Dr. Panagariya stated the state is seeking a rise in vertical devolution from 41% to 50%. It also proposed adjusting horizontal devolution criteria: population and area weights reduced to 5% each, forest cover weight halved, and a new 15% weight for increase in forest cover. AP also recommended shifting from income distance (45%) to include agriculture's contribution (20%).

The CM argued for a balanced demographic performance criterion-raising its weight to 20% and recognizing southern states' challenges due to declining fertility and aging populations. Dr. Panagariya noted similar concerns from Assam and Tamil Nadu.

Regarding special category status, he clarified it's no longer a valid classification since the Planning Commission's abolition. However, Andhra Pradesh's post-bifurcation financial burdens and debt legacy will be considered seriously.

He concluded that, for the first time, the Finance Commission is working without constraints from the Centre, granting them full freedom to formulate recommendations, expected after nationwide consultations conclude.

TDP High Command Warns Ganta Srinivasa Rao Over Critical Tweet

- Ganta's tweet on Visakhapatnam-Vijayawada flight woes sparks political stir
- Comments seen as giving ammunition to YSRCP, triggering High Command's response
- Told to raise issues internally, reminded Aviation Minister Rammohan Naidu is accessible

A tweet by senior TDP leader and former minister Ganta Srinivasa Rao has stirred up internal friction within the party, prompting a sharp response from the TDP High Command. His post, which criticized the poor air connectivity between Visakhapatnam and Vijayawada, has been viewed as inadvertently aiding the YSRCP narrative, at a time when the party is focusing on development narratives.

Ganta, in his tweet titled "Andhra to Andhra via Telangana," expressed frustration over having to travel from Visakhapatnam to Vijayawada via Hyderabad due to flight cancellations. He recounted his journey starting from Visakhapatnam Airport at 8 AM, reaching



Hyderabad by air, and then flying to Vijayawada, finally landing at Gannavaram Airport by 1 PM. He lamented that this was the harsh reality for many passengers, including trade representatives from CII and FICCI, who were also head-

ed to meet CM Nara Chandrababu Naidu.

He also pointed out the absence of the Vande Bharat train on Tuesdays, further complicating travel options. "It is painful that to reach Amaravati, the administrative cap-

ital, from Visakhapatnam, the financial capital, one has to travel via Hyderabad," Ganta wrote, striking a chord with passengers but raising eyebrows within his party. Sources said the TDP High Command took serious note of the public criticism, especially when the Aviation portfolio is held by party MP Rammohan Naidu. The leadership conveyed that such grievances should be brought directly to the party's attention or discussed with Rammohan Naidu, who, as they noted, is "also a grandson" and accessible for party members.

The leadership has reportedly advised Ganta to avoid similar public comments in the future and to address such concerns through internal channels, as open criticism could provide political opponents with unnecessary leverage.

Blow After Blow for Kakani: Former Minister on the Run, **YSRCP Cadre Joins TDP**

The YSRCP continues to reel under a series of setbacks post the 2024 Assembly elections, and the situation appears particularly dire in the Sarvepalli constituency of the united Nellore district. Former minister and Sarvepalli MLA Kakani Govardhan Reddy is at the center of a storm, as police have registered cases against him and formed special teams to locate his whereabouts. Kakani has been absconding for nearly a month, evading police surveillance in Hyderabad, Bengaluru, Chennai, and other locations.

The fallout of Kakani's disappearance is being deeply felt in his own political stronghold. Once a bastion of the YSRCP, Sarvepalli is now witnessing a mass exodus of party cadre. Reports indicate that surveillance has intensified at the residences of Kakani's relatives and close aides, and lookout notices have been issued to prevent him from leaving the country.

Meanwhile, confidence in Kakani has dwindled significantly among the local YSRCP leadership and workers. Many have decided to switch loyalties. On Wednesday, senior YSRCP leader Akkem Sudhakar Reddy, along with around 40 families, formally joined the Telugu Desam Party. The group included prominent local figures such as Pedamallu Srinivasulu Reddy, Sesha Reddy, Ramana Reddy, Venkateshwarlu Reddy, and Sekhar Reddy.

TDP's local MLA Somireddy Chandramohan Reddy welcomed the new entrants by offering party scarves in a well-attended event. The political shift marks a significant blow to YSRCP in Sarvepalli and further isolates Kakani, whose future remains uncertain amidst mounting legal troubles and loss of cadre support.

With YSRCP's tally reduced to just 11 seats after aiming for a complete sweep with the "Why Not 175?" slogan, the party's setbacks in constituencies like Sarvepalli reflect a growing sense of disillusionment within its ranks. For Kakani Govardhan Reddy, the phrase "blow after blow" is fast becoming the reality.

YCP Social Media Activist Paleti Krishnaveni Arrested by AP **Police**

Her arrest has already begun drawing attention on various platforms, with YCP supporters expressing concern and demanding clarification on the charges. The case is expected to develop further once she is formally booked in Dachepalli.

Alliance's No-Confidence Move Against GVMC Mayor **Sparks Outrage: Gudivada Amarnath**

The political atmosphere in Visakhapatnam heated up after the alliance moved a no-confidence motion against the YS-RCP-led Greater Visakhapatnam Municipal Corporation (GVMC) mayor Hari Venkata Kumari. Former minister and YSRCP leader Gudivada Amarnath strongly condemned the move, accusing the alliance of lacking sufficient strength and resorting to undemocratic means. Amarnath alleged that a targeted conspiracy is underway to

remove a Backward Class (BC) woman from the mayor's seat, which was given by YSRCP chief Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy as a mark of respect for women's representation. He criticized the opposition for what he described as "Viceroy Hotel-style politics" and called on Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu to put an end to such tactics.

He revealed that YSRCP corporators have been facing threats and coercion for the past month in an attempt to weaken their unity. In response, a whip has been issued to all YCP corporators, instructing them not to



participate in the no-confidence proceedings scheduled for the 19th of this month. Amarnath affirmed that the party has enough strength to defeat the motion and retain the mayor's position.

Mayor Hari Venkata Kumari also responded emotionally, stating that it was Jagan Mohan Reddy who gave her the opportunity to lead the city as a gesture of empowerment to women and the Yadav community. She highlighted that Jagan even allocated 50 cents of land for the construction of a building at the request of the Yadavs, and now attempts are being made to unjustly remove her from office. The unfolding events suggest a tense political showdown ahead, with both sides preparing for the decisive vote on April 19.

KA Paul Moves AP HC Over Pastor Praveen's Death

TPN Correspondent | Amaravati The Andhra Pradesh High Court on Tuesday issued key directions in the case surrounding the controversial death of Pastor Praveen, following a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) filed by Praja Shanti Party leader KA Paul. While the police have maintained that Pastor Praveen died in a road accident supported by CCTV footage, several Christian organizations and community leaders, including Paul, continue to raise doubts about the official narrative. KA Paul approached the High Court with serious allegations, claiming that Pastor Praveen



was murdered in a planned manner. He urged the court to order a CBI investigation to uncover the truth behind the incident. According to Paul, the vi-

suals released by the police were morphed, and local authorities including the district SP allegedly threatened people not to speak about the case. He also asserted that Pastor Praveen did not consume alcohol and questioned why the post-mortem report has not been made public. During the hearing, the government reiterated its stance, stating that the incident was a road accident and that there was no foul play involved. However, the High Court, taking the matter seriously, directed the government to file a counter affidavit with full details related to the case and the investigation con-

ducted so far.

This development comes amidst growing pressure from certain sections of the Christian community who have expressed dissatisfaction with the police version of events. Paul's petition has added fresh momentum to the controversy, placing the spotlight on the state government's handling of the case. The High Court is expected to take up further hearing after the

government files its response. With KA Paul sticking firmly to his claims and seeking a CBI probe, the case is likely to draw further attention in the coming days.





Vijayawada Student Akarsh **Chittineni Secures Admission** to 40 US Universities

In addition to academics, Akarsh is a national-level badminton player and a member of the NASA HERC 2023 team, where he helped secure the Carpentry Award. He has authored four research papers, interned with four companies, and even set an Indian record by reciting the most digits of the square root of five. His commitment to social service is equally commendable, his non-profit, Sarve Vidya, has impacted over 7,000 students. He also founded Telugu Pandits, a cultural revival initiative that has helped 1,000+ students connect with their roots.

"My journey has been about finding purpose through learning and giving back. I'm excited to be part of Duke University, where I can grow as a leader, innovator, and changemaker," said Akarsh, who is heading to the U.S. this fall.

His mother, Prasanthi Chittineni, couldn't hold back her pride. "Akarsh's discipline and sincerity have brought him this far. We always believed in his vision, and seeing it come true is beyond overwhelming. He inspires us every day."

As Akarsh prepares to step onto the global stage at Duke University, ranked 6 in the QS World University Rankings 2025 his story stands as a powerful reminder of what passion, hard work, and purpose can achieve.

Rare Surgery Saves 5-Year-Old Girl's Life in Nellore

In a remarkable medical achievement, doctors at Nellore Medicover Hospital performed a rare and complex surgery to save the life of a 5-year-old girl suffering from severe respiratory distress. The girl, who had been battling cough, fever, and breathing difficulties, was brought to the hospital in critical condition.

During a detailed medical examination and chest scan, doctors discovered that her left lung was completely damaged, prompting further investigation by the interventional pulmonology department. Upon performing a bronchoscopy,

Using a Fogarty balloon and a zero-tip basket, doctors carefully maneuvered and removed the nut from the lung. Dr. Kaushik Reddy explained that the airway was fully obstructed, making the surgery extremely challenging. However, after the successful removal, the girl's lung re-expanded, and she began breathing normally again.

"This was a very delicate procedure, and

now made a full recovery," said Dr. Kaushik Reddy at a press conference held on Wednesday. He emphasized that advanced equipment and highly skilled specialists at the hospital made the successful outcome possible.

The medical team included Dr. Uday Kirti (Pediatrics), Dr. Ranganath, and Medical Superintendent Yashwanth Reddy, who were also present during the announcement. 'Shakti' Teams Flagged Off to Protect Women and Children: SP E.G. Ashok Kumar

Kadapa District Superintendent of Police E.G. Ashok Kumar officially launched the 'Shakti' teams and their 56 two-wheelers at the Pennar Police Conference Hall on Wednesday. These special teams have been formed to safeguard women and children from anti-social elements and ensure swift action in distress situations.

Addressing the gathering, SP Ashok Kumar stated that the Shakti teams were constituted under the state government's directive to prevent harassment, violence, and crimes against women and children. He emphasized that the teams should maintain a strong presence in colleges, parks, bus stations, shopping malls, and public intersections to act as a visible deterrent and offer immediate help to victims.

A total of seven teams have been formed—two for Kadapa HQ, and one each for Maidukuru, Proddatur, Pulivendula, and Jammalamadugu. Each team comprises six personnel, including two women staff, three constables, and an SI-level officer. Vehicles were distributed based on area requirements: 17 to



9 to Jammalamadugu, and 7 to Pulivendula.

The SP instructed teams to respond swiftly to distress calls received via the Shakti app, dial 112/100, 181, 1098, and 1930. On receiving an SOS alert, teams must immediately reach the scene, offer assistance, and hand over the perpetrators to the nearest police station.

He also stressed the need to widely promote the Shakti mobile app, which features an SOS button, live tracking, Kadapa, 15 to Maidukuru, 8 to Proddatur, audio-video evidence sharing, and the ability to report crimes, missing persons, or illegal activities. It also provides info on night shelters, emergency contacts, and safe travel options.

Officials including Additional SPs K. Prakash Babu and B. Ramanaiah, Women Police Station DSP S. Ramakanth, and other senior officers were present. The SP expressed confidence that the Shakti teams would instill confidence among women and become a symbol of safety and justice across the district.

MLA Bojjala Sudheer Reddy **Cracks Down on Corruption in Thottambedu Sub-Register Office**

Ending her speech with a powerful remark, Sharmila Reddy declared, "Satyameva Jayate", signaling that truth will ultimately prevail over political vendettas.





Delimitation Dilemma: Bridging India's North-South Divide After a 50-Year Freeze

The 50-year freeze on the delimitation of parliamentary constituencies in India, initiated during the Emergency in 1976, has now erupted into a politically sensitive debate—pitting southern and northern states against each other. Originally enacted to ensure balanced development amid differing population growth rates, the freeze is now being questioned for fostering deep representational inequities. As highlighted by scholar Ravi K Mishra in his book Demography, Representation and Delimitation, the current discourse is clouded by misinformation and oversimplification.

Delimitation refers to redrawing constituency boundaries based on population, a task governed by Articles 81 and 82 of the Constitution. While Article 81 defines the composition of the



Lok Sabha, Article 82 mandates seat Historically, the strength of the Lok readjustments after every census. Sabha has been gradually increased to reflect population changes, but the ress would undermine federal prin-42nd Amendment froze this adjustment until 2001, later extended by the 84th Amendment to 2026.

This freeze, though politically expedient, has led to glaring disparities. Some MPs now represent less than 500,000 constituents, while others serve more than three million. Southern states, which have successfully implemented population control measures, fear that they will be penalised with reduced representation, while states with higher fertility rates gain more seats.

The southern political leadership from the Congress' Shashi Tharoor to TDP's Chandrababu Naidu and DMK's MK Stalin—have voiced strong opposition, arguing that penalising prog-

ciples. Critics warn that the exercise could fracture India's political fabric, with Justice KM Joseph and historian Ramachandra Guha cautioning against potential damage to Indian federalism.

Had delimitation proceeded incrementally, as originally envisioned, the transition might have been smoother. But the long pause has created a high-stakes situation. Moving forward, policymakers must approach the 2026 delimitation with consensus, transparency, and constitutional wisdom-balancing demographic realities with the integrity of India's federal structure. The looming challenge now is not just numerical parity but political equity and national unity.

India should reconsider its decision to shelter Sheikh Hasina

In a recent meeting of the Consultative Committee on External Affairs, held in March, External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar acknowledged a growing anti-Hasina sentiment in Bangladesh that culminated in her ouster on August 5 last year. While the Indian government was aware of the shifting political winds in Dhaka, Jaishankar candidly admitted that New Delhi lacked the leverage to influence internal developments in Bangladesh. He stated that India's role was limited to offering counsel and not exerting any real pressure—a significant indication that Sheikh Hasina's political decline was largely the result of internal dynamics, not external interference.

This admission brings into focus the contentious question of India's decision to grant asylum to the former Bangladeshi Prime Minister. Her continued stay in India has added strain to an already sensitive diplomatic relationship with Bangladesh's interim government. While New Delhi may have acted out of humanitarian or political consideration, the move has complicated its standing with the new leadership in Her presence in India, therefore, puts New Dhaka.



Delhi in a difficult position. On one hand, it must weigh humanitarian considerations and long-standing ties with the Awami League; on the other, it risks alienating a new regime in Dhaka that is already seeking to reframe its foreign policy priorities. For India, navigating this situation requires a delicate diplomatic balance—supporting regional stability while avoiding actions that may be interpreted as interference. As South Asia's geopolitical landscape continues to evolve, Hasina's asylum may serve as a test of India's ability to manage complex regional transitions with tact and strategic foresight.

Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025: **A Constitutional Crossroad for Minority Rights**

The enactment of the Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025, has sparked intense concern among minority communities, legal experts, and civil society, as it marks a significant shift in how Waqf properties—donated land meant for religious and charitable purposes—are governed. Waqf, rooted in the Islamic concept of Sadqa-e-Jaaria (continuing charity), traditionally ensures that once a property is designated for divine purposes, it cannot be sold, gifted, or transferred. The new amendment, however, facilitates the conversion of Waqf land into private or government property, triggering fears of widespread dispossession.

This legislative move starkly contradicts long-standing constitutional principles and judicial pronouncements, notably the Supreme Court's assertion that "once Waqf, always Waqf." The law also undermines Article 26 of the Indian Constitution, which guarantees every religious denomination the right to manage its own affairs. Moreover, the removal of the requirement that the Waqf Board CEO be a by survey commissioners and established le-Muslim, and the inclusion of non-Muslims in key Waqf bodies, has raised questions about the erosion of minority autonomy.



Adding to the concern is the empowerment of district collectors—government appointees—to adjudicate Waqf disputes. This is problematic since the government itself is often a party to these disputes. Traditionally, such matters were determined by Waqf Tribunals, guided gal processes. The amendment bypasses these mechanisms, increasing the likelihood of biased or flawed outcomes.

Unlike her father, Sheikh Mujibur Rahman who remains an iconic figure in India for his leadership during Bangladesh's liberation in 1971—Sheikh Hasina does not enjoy the same level of popular support or emotional resonance within the Indian political landscape. Mujibur Rahman's historical stature helped foster deep bilateral goodwill; however, Hasina's controversial political legacy and perceived authoritarianism have made her a more divisive figure, both domestically in Bangladesh and in the broader region.

The comparison with the Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanam (TTD), which recently removed non-Hindu employees, underscores the perceived double standards in the treatment of religious institutions. While Waqf properties are now vulnerable to state appropriation, similar protections are fiercely upheld in other religious contexts.

The new law is also based on misconceptions chief among them being that Waqf Boards arbitrarily declare land as Waqf. In reality, the declaration involves a structured process involving government oversight. Claims that the Waqf Board could have declared Parliament as Waqf property are not only misleading but intended to inflame public sentiment.

MS Dhoni: A Legend at the Crossroads of Legacy and Reality

In the emotionally charged arena of spite his reduced role, sponsors and modern sport, public opinion can shift dramatically. A hero can become a villain in a matter of matches. Fans who once idolized a player are often quick to turn on them after a string of poor performances. Unfortunately, this seems to be the case with MS Dhoni — once hailed as a cricketing king, now facing harsh criticism as both he and his team, Chennai Super Kings (CSK), struggle.

At 44, Dhoni is no longer the dynamic force he once was. Once a master tactician and fearsome finisher, his recent performances have left fans disappointed and pundits perplexed. CSK, under his leadership, has appeared rudderless, with defeats piling up and morale visibly sagging. Even Dhoni's brief return as captain against Kolkata Knight Riders failed to inspire the turnaround fans hoped for.

Social media, never kind during downturns, has mocked the legend. Memes showing an aging Dhoni in a wheelchair, still holding a bat for CSK, are cruel reminders of how quickly reverence can turn into ridicule. De-

PR teams are working hard to sustain the Dhoni brand. Critics argue that his batting strike rate is artificially inflated by his placement in the lower order, where he scores a few big hits in lost causes—adding little to the team's actual chances.

The situation has drawn sharp commentary. Former Indian opener K. Srikkanth accused CSK of living off nostalgia and urged bold, unconventional decisions. Cricket writer Boria Majumdar warned that even the most celebrated brands risk losing shine if they don't evolve, calling CSK's current gameplay a relic of a bygone era of T20 cricket.

Yet, amidst the criticism, Dhoni's loyal fans remain. To them, he is "Thala"—a leader beyond the scoreboard. But admiration must be tempered with realism. Respect should never turn into blind worship. To preserve Dhoni's legacy, it's vital to remember him for his triumphs, not let his image be eroded by unwise decisions made in the twilight of a remarkable career.







IAS Officer Reposted AI Image Sparks Probe

Senior IAS officer Smita Sabharwal has received a notice from Cyberabad Police for reposting an AI-generated image related to a controversial 400-acre land parcel in Kancha Gachibowli, near the University of Hyderabad. The land, claimed by the Telangana government, has been at the center of protests over its proposed auction for urban infrastructure and IT development.

On March 31, Sabharwal reshared an image originally posted by another user on 'X' (formerly Twitter). The AI-generated image depicted earthmoving equipment on the land, along with two deer and a peacock—an apparent nod to the ecological concerns raised by protesters.

Following the repost, police issued a notice to Sabharwal under Section 179 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) on April 12. This section empowers the police to summon an individual as a witness in an investigation. Officials clarified that the notice was procedural, not accusatory, and aimed at gathering information.

Smita Sabharwal, a Telangana-cadre officer, currently serves as Principal Secretary of the Department of Tourism and Culture. While she did not comment publicly on the matter, her repost has fueled debate on the responsible use of social media by civil servants, es-



pecially in sensitive land disputes.

The land in question is under legal scrutiny, with proceedings ongoing in both the Telangana High Court and the Supreme Court. The state government has maintained that it rightfully owns the land and intends to use it for developmental projects. However, environmental activists and the University of Hyderabad Students' Union have raised strong objections, citing the area's ecological significance.

Protesters argue that converting the land into an urban zone would damage local biodiversity, including habitats for various species, as highlighted in the viral AI image. The image's realism, despite being artificial, helped amplify public sentiment around preserving the site.

As legal and public battles unfold, this incident underscores how digital content, even AI-generated, can influence high-stakes policy debates and lead to official action—even against senior bureaucrats.



Govt Bans 35 Unapproved FDC Drugs

In a significant regulatory move, the Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO) has banned the manufacture, sale, and distribution of 35 fixed-dose combination (FDC) drugs across India. These include commonly used painkillers, nutritional supplements, and anti-diabetic medications that were found to be unapproved under existing drug safety regulations.

The CDSCO has issued formal directions to all State and Union Territory drug controllers, instructing immediate action to halt the circulation of these FDC drugs. The regulatory body emphasized the need for stringent adherence to the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940, and its associated rules, urging regional authorities to ensure full compliance.

Fixed-dose combination drugs are pharmaceutical formulations that contain two or more active ingredients in a single dosage. While some FDCs are developed for convenience and enhanced therapeutic benefits, unregulated combinations can pose serious health risks due to potential interactions, incorrect dosages, or lack of clinical validation.

The banned list includes a mix of widely available products, prompting an urgent review of approvals previously granted at the state level. CDSCO has also directed local drug regulators to assess their internal processes for granting licenses to such formulations, many of which were found to be lacking in proper clinical evaluation and central authorization.

Officials highlighted that several of these combinations were being sold in violation of national safety norms, with some manufacturers bypassing the requirement for CDSCO approval by securing licenses from individual states. The crackdown aims to curb such regulatory loopholes and ensure that only thoroughly evaluated and approved drugs reach the market.

Public health experts have welcomed the move, calling it a necessary step to protect consumers from potentially unsafe drug combinations. They also called for better awareness among healthcare providers and pharmacists about the dangers of prescribing or selling unapproved FDCs.

India, China Near Deal on Kailash Yatra

Indian and Chinese officials are intensifying efforts to finalize an agreement to resume the Kailash Mansarovar Yatra, which has remained suspended since 2019. With the deadline to select pilgrims approaching next month, both sides are pushing for a breakthrough within weeks, sources familiar with the talks confirmed.

The annual pilgrimage, which typically runs from June to September, was halted first due to the COVID-19 pandemic and then indefinitely postponed following necessary infrastructure, and en- is scheduled next week to assess rising tensions along the Line of Actual Control (LAC), especially after the Galwan Valley clashes in 2020 that claimed lives on both sides.

India to Grow 6.5%, Tops Globally

India is set to grow by 6.5% in 2025, retaining its position as the fastest-growing major economy, according to the latest report by the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD). Despite a slight dip from the estimated 6.9% growth in 2024, India's economy continues to show strong momentum driven by robust public spending and a supportive monetary policy environment.

The report, titled Trade and Development Foresights 2025 – Under Pressure: Uncertainty Reshapes Global Economic Prospects, was released on Wednesday. It warns of a slowing global economy, with worldwide growth projected to shrink to 2.3% in 2025 due to rising trade tensions, financial instability, and pervasive economic uncertainty.

UNCTAD attributed India's resilience to recent economic decisions, including the Reserve Bank of India's move in February to cut interest rates by 25 basis points—the first such cut in five years. The rate cut is expected to stimulate household consumption and encourage private sector investment, contributing to the country's growth trajectory.

South Asia as a region is forecast to grow at 5.6% in 2025. This outlook is bolstered by declining inflation rates, which allow central banks in the region to adopt more accommodative monetary policies. However, UNCTAD cautioned that food price volatility



and complex debt challenges continue to weigh on economies like Bangladesh, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka.

The global economic environment, the report notes, is under strain. Escalating trade disputes and unpredictable policy shifts are disrupting supply chains, delaying investments, and reducing job creation. Trade policy uncertainty is reportedly at its highest in decades.

For developing nations, particularly the most vulnerable ones, the risks are amplified. Many face a trifecta of external financial stress, high debt burdens, and slowing domestic growth—posing serious threats to their developmental progress.

Amid this turbulence, UNCTAD highlights the growing importance of South-South trade. With developing countries now accounting for about one-third of global trade, deeper economic integration among them could offer much-needed resilience and growth opportunities in the coming years.

SC Questions Inclusion of Non-Muslims in Waqf Bodies

The Supreme Court on Wednesday raised critical questions about the Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025, particularly challenging the constitutional validity of allowing non-Muslims to be part of waqf administrative bodies. A three-judge Bench led by Chief Justice of India (CJI) Sanjiv Khanna conducted a detailed two-hour hearing on a batch of nearly 100 petitions challenging the contentious law.

The court asked the Centre whether Muslims could be permitted to serve on the governing boards of Hindu religious endowments, drawing a sharp comparison to the provisions now allowing non-Muslims to participate in waqf governance. "Can there be reciprocal participation? Would the same principle apply in Hindu endowments?" the Bench inquired, urging the government to respond.

The 2025 amendment, passed earlier this year, has stirred significant controversy. It de-recognized the category of "waqf-by-user"—a status historically granted to properties used informally but continuously for religious or community purposes—and granted state governments the authority to determine whether a property belongs to the Waqf Board or is government-owned.

One of the most contentious changes introduced by the Act is the inclusion of non-Muslims in waqf administrative bodies, a move critics argue violates the religious autonomy guaranteed under Article 26 of the Constitution. The petitioners argued that such provisions infringe upon the minority community's right to manage its own religious institutions.



During the proceedings, CJI Khanna expressed concern over recent communal violence in West Bengal, which has been linked to tensions arising from the Act's enforcement. He described the reports as "very disturbing" and said the situation demanded careful judicial scrutiny.

The Centre, represented by the Solicitor General, defended the law as a reform measure aimed at improving transparency and administration in waqf properties, but the Bench sought clearer justifications for the sweeping changes.

The court has reserved further hearings for next month and asked the government to file a detailed response. The case could have far-reaching implications on the interpretation of religious rights, minority protections, and state intervention in religious institutions across India.



China now faces up to 245% tariffs from US: White House

The trade war between the United States and China has escalated further, with the US announcing a 245% tariff on Chinese goods. The White House attributed the move to China's retaliatory actions, as tensions continue to mount between the two global superpowers. The announcement coincided with President Donald Trump authorizing an investigation into the national security risks posed by the US reliance on imported critical minerals, such as cobalt, lithium, nickel, and rare-earth metals, used in smartphones, electric vehicle batteries, and military equipment.

the US's dependence on foreign sources for these materials, warning that such reliance makes the country vulnerable to supply chain disruptions. The White House argued that these risks threaten



national security, technological growth, and economic prosperity. Trump's executive order highlights In response to the growing tensions, the US had already imposed a 145% tariff on Chinese imports, while China retaliated with a 125% tariff on American goods and restrictions on the export of certain products used by aerospace and

military contractors.

On the Chinese side, a senior official acknowledged that the US tariffs were exerting pressure on China. However, China's economy showed resilience, with first-quarter growth exceeding expectations at 5.4%, industrial output rising by 6.5%, and retail sales climbing 4.6% year-on-year. Despite these positive figures, Beijing warned that the global economic environment was becoming increasingly complex and severe, calling for more efforts to stimulate growth and consumption.

President Trump, however, maintained that China must take the first step in negotiations, stating that "the ball is in China's court." He has repeatedly criticized China, along with other countries such as India and Brazil, for imposing higher tariffs on American goods than the US imposes on theirs.

In response, China has imposed its own tariffs and restrictions, including a suspension of imports of sorghum, poultry, and bonemeal from the US. The tariff war has also led Beijing to seek support from India and the European Union, as it seeks to counterbalance US economic influence.

Biden Slams Trump Administration's Social Security Overhaul, Warns of Lasting Damage

In his first public address since leaving office, former U.S. President Joe Biden strongly criticized the Trump administration's handling of the Social Security Administration (SSA), calling recent changes "destructive" and "breathtaking" in scale. While Biden refrained from naming Donald Trump directly, his remarks at the National Conference of Advocates, Counsellors and Representatives for the Disabled (ACRD) in Chicago were pointed and unambiguous.

Biden alleged that the current administration—led in part by tech billionaire Elon Musk's Department of Government Efficiency—is pushing through a massive overhaul of the SSA, resulting in significant staff reductions and drastic policy shifts. "There are 7,000 employees out the door already. They're about to push thousands more," Biden said, expressing concern over how these actions are affecting millions of Americans who rely on the agency.

The former president likened the administration's approach to that of a disruptive startup, saying, "They're following that old line from tech startups—'move fast, break things.' Well, they're certainly breaking things." He further condemned the effects of these personnel cuts, especially in the agency's tech division, which he claimed had been "cut in half," leading to website crashes and limited access to critical online services.

Biden also accused Republicans of undermining Social Security as a strategic move to raid its trust fund to finance tax cuts for billionaires and large corporations. "They want to wreck it so they can rob it," he asserted, warning that the push to make the 2017 tax cuts permanent could cost the nation \$5 trillion, further inflating the national debt.

India Rejects Religious-Based Parameters for UN Security Council Reform

Advocates Regional Representation

India has strongly opposed attempts to introduce new parameters like religion and faith for representation in a reformed United Nations Security Council (UNSC), asserting that this approach undermines the established principle of regional representation. India's Permanent Representative to the UN, Ambassador P. Harish, made this statement during the Inter-Governmental Negotiations (IGN) on UNSC reform, emphasizing that regional representation has been the accepted basis for UN representation.



of Council members from 15 to 25 or 26, with 11 permanent members and 14 or 15 non-permanent members. India, having served as a non-permanent member in 2021-22, emphasized that expanding only the non-permanent category would not shift the power dynamics within the Council, reinforcing the dominance of existing permanent members.

Harish noted that efforts to stall meaningful UNSC reforms, such as claims that a larger Security Council would be inefficient, were misguided. He argued that a reformed Council with proper working methods and accountability mechanisms would be effective in addressing global challenges. Harish further stressed that without expanding both permanent and non-permanent categories, any reform would fail to address the fundamental inequities of the existing system, perpetuating the status quo.

Speaking on behalf of the G4 nations—Brazil, Germany, Japan, and India—Harish reaffirmed that regional representation remains crucial for UNSC reform. The G4 rejected the introduction of religious affiliation as a criterion for representation, calling such proposals counterproductive and overly complex. The G4 nations highlighted the outdated nature of the current UNSC structure, asserting that the geopolitical landscape has drastically changed since the Council's formation, necessitating reform.

The G4's proposed reform model calls for an increase in the number

Additionally, the G4 stressed the importance of text-based negotiations for achieving real UNSC reforms, urging the UN Chair to initiate these negotiations promptly. The Group reiterated that the decision on permanent membership must be made democratically by the General Assembly. Meanwhile, the Uniting for Consensus (UfC) group and the Arab bloc voiced their own positions on expanding non-permanent seats and ensuring equitable Arab representation, respectively.

Addressing the growing political divide, Biden said, "It's never been this bad. Roughly 30% of this country has no heart. But we can't walk away from fairness-that's the America we believe in."

In response, the Social Security Administration denied Biden's claims, accusing him of "lying" and asserting that Trump remains committed to protecting Social Security, citing a \$16.5 million investment in modernizing phone services and a proposal to eliminate taxation on benefits.

Shehbaz Sharif Hails China as Pakistan's 'Most Sincere Friend' for IMF Bailout Support

Terming China as Pakistan's "most sincere friend," Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Wednesday expressed deep gratitude towards Beijing for its vital role in securing Pakistan's recent agreement with the International Monetary Fund (IMF). Speaking at a ceremony organized for Pakistani agriculture graduates selected for specialized training in China, Sharif highlighted the critical nature of China's economic support in stabilizing the country's struggling economy.

Under the new initiative, 1,000 Pakistani agriculture graduates will be trained in China in advanced farming techniques, digital crop management, and climate-resilient agricultural practices. The program will roll out in phases, with the first batch of 300 students set to depart soon for a three-month training course. Two more groups will follow over the next year.

Sharif praised China's continuous support, noting particularly the one-year extension of a \$2 billion loan repayment granted last month, which helped bolster Pakistan's foreign exchange reserves during a period of acute financial strain. This move, alongside financial backing from Saudi Arabia and the UAE, enabled Pakistan to secure a \$7 billion bailout package



from the IMF in September 2024, staving off a looming balance of payments crisis.

"China is Pakistan's most sincere friend and it played a decisive role in stabilising Pakistan's struggling economy," the Prime Minister said. He emphasized that the IMF bailout would not have been possible without China's unwavering assistance.

Reflecting on his recent visit to China, Sharif shared that he was impressed by the advancements in agricultural research and innovation in Chinese universities. Inspired by what he witnessed, he initiated the program to send Pakistani students to learn and benefit from China's expertise.

Israeli Fighter Jet Drops Munition Near Gaza Border **Community Due to Technical Malfunction**

An Israeli Air Force fighter jet unintentionally dropped a munition near the southern Israeli community of Nir Yitzhak, located close to the Gaza border, due to a technical malfunction, the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) confirmed on Tuesday. Fortunately, no injuries or casualties were reported.

In an official statement, the IDF said, "A short while ago, a munition fell from an IDF fighter jet that was on its way to a mission in the Gaza Strip. The munition landed in an open area near Nir Yitzhak due to a technical malfunction."

The incident occurred approximately two miles from the Gaza border, in a largely unpopulated area adjacent to the 550-resident community, according to Israel's Central Bureau of Statistics. Emergency protocols were swiftly activated, and military units secured the area to ensure public safety.

The mishap coincided with Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's rare visit to Gaza, where he met with troops in northern Gaza amid the military's ongoing operations in the region. Addressing soldiers on the frontlines, Netanyahu declared, "They are striking the enemy and Hamas will continue to suffer blow after blow. We insist that they release our hostages and we insist on achieving all of our war objectives." The IDF resumed its offensive against Hamas on March 18, effectively end-



ing a two-month ceasefire that had briefly de-escalated hostilities. Since then, Israeli forces have made significant territorial advances across Gaza, leading to the displacement of hundreds of thousands of residents amid intensified air and ground assaults.

Top Israeli officials, including Netanyahu, have maintained that only sustained military pressure will compel Hamas to release the remaining hostages held since the conflict began. The war, which has resulted in extensive casualties and destruction, continues to draw international attention and concern over the humanitarian toll.

The IDF has launched an investigation into the technical failure that caused the accidental munition drop, aiming to prevent similar incidents during ongoing and future operations.

India's Organic Exports Surge 34.6% in FY 2024-25 to Reach USD 665.96 Million



Tndia's organic product exports witnessed a ro-■ bust growth of 34.6% in the financial year 2024-25, rising to USD 665.96 million from USD 494.8 million in the previous fiscal, according to data released by the Commerce Ministry. This sharp increase is attributed to rising global demand for Indian organic products, particularly in developed markets, including categories like pulses, essential oils, and fresh fruits and vegetables.

In terms of volume, exports grew over 4% to reach 368,155 tonnes during the fiscal. Officials noted that this upward trend reflects increasing international preference for Indian organic items, supported by consistent quality and compliance with global standards. The demand surge has opened new avenues for Indian farmers and exporters to strengthen their presence in key markets.

Among the key segments driving this growth, organic pulses stood out with exports increasing to USD 17.89 million in 2024-25 from just USD 5.25 million in the previous year. Organic essential oils also witnessed a jump in demand, with exports rising to USD 12.35 million from USD 4.52 million. Similarly, exports of fresh fruits and vegetables climbed to USD 9.2 million, doubling from USD 4.52 million in 2023-24.

To further enhance India's organic export potential, the Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA) has made significant revisions to the National Programme for Organic Production (NPOP). These changes aim to make the regulatory framework more farmer-friendly while aligning it with global standards to support the country's target of reaching USD 2 billion in organic food exports by 2030.

The NPOP serves as India's central standard for organic production and certification, ensuring harmonisation with international regulations. Its credibility has been crucial in enabling Indian organic products to access foreign markets with ease. With increasing export figures and policy reforms in place, India's organic sector is poised for further expansion, offering both economic and





US Tariffs on China Open Rare Export Opportunity for Indian Small Manufacturers: GTRI Report

m cent\ import\ tariff\ by\ the\ United}$ States on Chinese goods has unexpectedly created a rare short-term export window for Indian small manufacturers, according to a new report by the Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI) released on Wednesday.

The GTRI notes that this sharp increase in US tariffs presents an opening for Indian producers to expand their presence in the American market, particularly in sectors where China has traditionally dominated. In 2024, the US imported over \$148 billion worth of tariffed goods, with China accounting for \$105.9 billion, nearly 72 per cent of the total. By contrast, India's share was just \$4.3 billion, or 2.9 per cent.

"Indian producers already manufacture many of these products—such as locks, plasticware, and kitchenware—but largely at a small scale," the GTRI said. With the right government support, including export incentives, easier access to financing, and compliance certifications, Indian MSMEs could scale up to meet demand in the US market.

Among the high-potential products identified for export growth are:

Fireworks: US imports worth \$581 million annually, with China supplying 96.7%. India's current share is just \$0.24 million.

Plastic tableware and kitchenware: US imports total \$4.97 billion,



with China contributing 80%. India's share is 0.49% (\$171.65 million). Rising post-tariff prices (from \$1.25-\$16 to \$2.81–\$36) offer scope for clusters in Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman, and Gujarat to step in.

Locks: US imports are worth \$1.196 billion, with China supplying 66.3%. India's current share is \$30.7 million (2.57%).

Hand tools (pliers, spanners): US market worth \$1.138 billion. China holds 52.9%, while India contributes 17.7% (\$202 million).

Sensex and Nifty Rebound as Banking Stocks Lead Rally; Flls Return Amid Cooling Inflation

The Indian stock markets **L** staged a strong comeback on Wednesday, April 16, 2025, reversing early losses to close firmly in the green. The benchmark BSE Sensex surged over 300 points to settle just below the 77,050 mark, while the NSE Nifty50 advanced more than 100 points to end the session at 23,437.



This positive shift in market sentiment was primarily driven by renewed buying in heavyweight banking stocks and the return of foreign institutional investors (FIIs). The upbeat mood was further supported by encouraging macroeconomic data, particularly retail inflation, which dropped to a nearly six-year low in March. This has sparked hopes of additional rate cuts by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) in the near future.

Among the top gainers on the 30-share Sensex were IndusInd Bank, Axis Bank, Adani Ports, Asian Paints, and Bharti Airtel. On the flip side, Maruti Suzuki, Infosys, Tata Motors, Larsen & Toubro (L&T), and NTPC ended the session with losses.

The broader market also reflected bullish trends, with the Nifty Bank index rising 1.41 per cent. Sector-wise, the PSU Bank index outperformed with a 2.37 per cent gain, followed by the Media index, which climbed 1.88 per cent.

Exchange data revealed that FIIs made a strong comeback, pumping in Rs

6,065.78 crore into Indian equities on Tuesday. This infusion of foreign capital played a crucial role in boosting investor confidence.

Commenting on the market movement, Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services, stated, "Despite global market consolidation and escalating tariff tensions, Indian markets showed resilience. The drop in consumer price inflation (CPI) to near six-year lows has strengthened expectations of future rate cuts, adding a layer of optimism."

He also noted that while the earnings season has begun on a quiet note, investor caution may lead to profit-booking at higher levels.

On the global front, European markets traded in the red, mirroring the trend in US markets from the previous session. Asian markets were mixed, with indices in South Korea, Japan, and Hong Kong closing lower, while China's Shanghai Composite ended in positive territory. Meanwhile, Brent crude rose 0.91 per cent to \$65.22 per barrel.


Bullet trains, especially Japan's Shinkansen models, are known to reach speeds up to 300 km/h. At such high velocities, early models encountered a problem: a loud sonic boom whenever the train entered a tunnel. The air pressure built up and exploded out the other end, causing discomfort and concern among people living nearby.

The breakthrough came in the 1990s, thanks to Eiji Nakatsu, an

engineer at Central Japan Railway and an avid birdwatcher. Observing how kingfishers dive into water with barely a splash, Nakatsu saw the potential for a similar design in trains. The kingfisher's beak, perfectly evolved to cut through both air and water with minimal resistance, became the inspiration for a revolutionary redesign.

By reshaping the train's nose to mimic the kingfisher's beak, engineers managed to eliminate tunnel booms, reduce air resistance, and improve energy efficiency. The latest Japanese ALFA-X Shinkansen even features a 22-meter-long nose, not just for style, but to improve stability, comfort, and safety.

This innovation has since influenced bullet



trains around the world. While metros like Delhi's do not require such features due to lower speeds and frequent stops, even they create air displacement felt as gusts on platforms — a reminder of the physics at play.

India's Vande Bharat trains are also adopting similar aerodynamic designs, blending speed with efficiency. Their pointed noses are more than just sleek — they reflect the global shift toward nature-inspired, energy-efficient transport design.

Ultimately, what began as a problem in train noise evolved into a symbol of biomimicry, showing how solutions in engineering often come from the natural world.


